## Beatle film ban

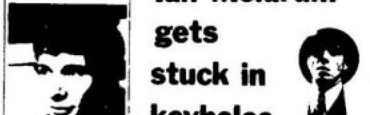

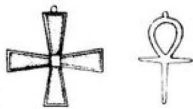

### Jazz preachers new disc of charleston-era dance

This week W. A. G. will release the first single that the Jazz Preachers have made for three years. It will be the Tapoca "Think Le Chain" (the Jewish Wedding Song) from the current film "Thoroughly Modern Millie".

The Tapoca is the theme for a Charlie-styles dance featured in the same film. The dance is to be heavily promoted in Melbourne and could prove very popular. When I heard the melody however I was intrigued by it and decided to re-arrange it on a more commercial level which would appeal to the teenage following.

The Jewish Wedding song, a beautiful melody which at first sight in the film would not seem to respond to "driving beat" treatment, transforms amazingly with slight overtones of "Midnight in Moscow".

The success of such songs in the Foundation in both England and Australia is proving that the formula of their style is becoming acceptable to a much broader audience. We now feel that the time is right to release this record.

Inspiration for a single came after the Jazz Preachers played at the scene of the Theatre in a very short time. The first and greatest of the single "Midnight in Moscow" has been the greatest response to it. It was decided to make an E.P. of the record now on the way. The E.P. will be released shortly. Two originals are included in the session and they are "Midnight in Moscow" and "The Begonia".  
Other members on the E.P. will include Thoroughly Modern Millie, Wambulance, Kenny, the B. Team, Jim & Jay, Baby, Japanese, Sandman, The Varsity, Dick, Peter, Nite, Nite and Rose of Washington Square.
