

Tool's New Number Sets Pace

seems to have the biggest buzz track around these hallowed offices. Apparently, the fact that Ænima has been certified Platinum and that "Stinkfist," "H." and "Ænema" have all worked so well at radio previously has programmers backing up that perception.

This week, "Forty Six & 2" (jocks be honest, aren't you glad you won't have to be back-announcing "Ænema" any more? Difficult-to-pronounce song titles are among the occupational hazards) scares up 47 adds at the more older-skewing segment, Rock Radio. Meanwhile, the song gets 43 adds at the Active Rock format; both numbers represent the best in a week stacked with second tremors.



"This is definitely one of the best tracks from a strong album," explains Chris Cair of KRQR in Chico, California. How strong is the album? Well, nearly 14 months after its release, Ænima is still in the Top 100 on our Hottest Sales Nationwide. And it's still Top 30 on our Hottest Album Airplay chart, thanks to the three previous tracks occupying #54, #92 and #103 (after more than a year on the chart, "Stinkfist" only fell off Powercuts last week). For good measure, Ænima is #7 on this week's Aggro Retail index.

One last thing: front Toolman, Maynard James Keenan, was voted "Most Artistic" by his senior classmates back in high school in Michigan. D'you suppose they envisioned this kind of art back then?

ust between you and me, I figure you can pit "Saint Of Me" against any other Rolling Stones track ever, and it stands up. In fact, I can't recall liking a Stones song this much since Mick Taylor disappeared!

When you get Rock TuneUp #174 on November 14, and totallyadult TuneUp #25, on November 7, please listen to Terese Carlton. I've been living with her debut CD, Undisciplined Fury, and I recently saw her live, and I really think she's got a bright future at several radio formats.

Mighty Joe Plum. Creed. Matchbox 20. Seven Mary Three. The Buccaneers. The Marlins. Florida's hotter than usual these days. And that's not a dry heat.

With Jakob and Bob Dylan each having great albums out right now. I'm reminded of the night that Ken Griffey, Sr. and Jr., hit back-to-back homers for the Mariners a few years back.

Note to myself: if I ever become a Program Director, don't let my jocks go through the motions when reading an "important" concert announcement like that guy here in LA did last week. And make sure the jock adds to the "excitement" by playing a song by that artist immediately following that "important" concert announcement, unlike that jock here in LA.



"Dirty Eyes" is the first single off of *Bonfire*, and continues in the venerable Aussie rockers' patented style: a kick-ass dual axe attack, courtesy of the Young brothers, overlaying Scott's raucous vocals and the rhythm section's ball-

bustin' beat. *Bonfire* also contains some never-before-heard gems from the Scott era, culled from live studio recordings, B-sides and early TV performances. Also included is the complete original studio recording of *Back In Black*, Brian Johnson's first album as Scott's replacement.



Ozzy's 12th album includes rare Black Sabbath BBC Basement Tapes from Ozzy's own collection, as well as a version of "Paranoid" recorded live with Randy Rhodes. Plus of course, you'll find all the best from Ozzy's

long, illustrious solo career. There are 15 tracks in all, including one new song, "Back On Earth." The single is pure Ozzy, with enough power chords and primeval metal sound to make any headbanger thrust his fists in the air; yet with a tremendous hook and pristine production that should make any programmer smile. "Mouth" is a perfect song for a movie full of fangs; An American Werewolf In Paris is the long overdue sequel to the 80s hit film, An American Werewolf In London. Not only will the movie have a great soundtrack (with songs from Better

Than Ezra, Butthole Surfers, Cake and Eels, among others), but it's also supposed to have incredibly realistic special effects from the team that did *Jurassic Park*.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW: Comin' at ya from behind the Orange Curtain is Fu Manchu, a four-piece sonic assault force that's bound to have parents everywhere cringing by Christmas. "Evil Eye" is the first single from *The Action Is Go*; it describes a demolition derby that Fu frontman Scott Hill happened to catch on late-night TV with

a car numbered "666" and an "evil eye" emblazoned upon it. Many of the song's lyrics are actual quotes from the driver of the car (who, by the way, won the race). The production, courtesy of White Zombie guitarist J. Yuenger, is flawless, capturing the grinding yet spacey sound of the band perfectly. Fu Manchu boasts a couple of new members: guitarist Bob Balch was recruited from the local guitar store, while drummer Brant Bjork comes to the quartet from metalmeisters Kyuss. 



WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW: The original version of "I'm Afraid Of Americans" appears on David Bowie's latest effort, *Earthling*. The remix version being worked at Rock Radio, however, is a bit different. Nine Inch Nails' Trent Reznor puts his unique stamp on the song as the producer. Reznor is again collaborating with Bowie after the successful 1995 tour The Thin White Duke did with Nine Inch Nails. That tour was an exciting event because it featured two performers who are regularly at

the forefront of popular culture and modern music. "I'm Afraid Of Americans" is interesting in the same way. The two have created a song full of inventive sounds and textures. Bowie says the song (written by himself and Brian Eno) is not as hostile toward Americans as one might think. He says it's really about the US's invasion into other indigenous cultures, impressing our culture into other people's expression of life—much like the way David Bowie has impressed himself into the past and future of rock music.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW: This is the second single from Calling All Stations, following up on the success of "Congo" (which streaked to the Top 30 on Powercuts). New vocalist Ray Wilson has stepped up to the plate and slugged it out of

the park in his Genesis debut; his vocal stylings are somewhere between those of original Genesis frontman Peter Gabriel and Pink Floyd's David Gilmour. The resemblance to the latter is especially striking on "The Dividing Line," which runs nearly nine minutes on Calling All Stations and has that longtime Genesis epic touch to it. Don't worry, though; the radio edit promises to be much more succinct! If you've enjoyed success with "Congo" or Genesis in the past, you'll want to be on the right side of "The Dividing Line.

energy burst that'll get toes tapping across the land. The production from board wizard Bob Rock (too many credits to name) is, as usual, phenomenal; he gives the arrangement breathing room while still capturing all the fury within the playing. If you've enjoyed previous success with Veruca Salt, adding this song is a no-brainer; if you haven't played them before, go "straight" to jail, do not pass Go, do not collect \$200

With Sparkle And Fade, Art Alexakis touched a

nerve in millions of people who could completely relate to the world-weary blend of wisdom, hope and cynicism he brought to such songs as the chart-topping "Santa Monica," with its anthemic chorus: "We can live beside the ocean/Leave the fire behind/Swim out past the breakers/Watch the world die." The album went Platinum on the strength of the single and a grueling tour schedule that found Everclear playing 300-plus dates a year.

Now, with So Much For The Afterglow, Alexakis and his bandmates, bassist Craig Montoya and drummer Greg Eklund, have crafted a modern rock masterpiece. From the Beach Boys-style a capella opening of the title track to the bracing first single, "Everything To Everyone" and beyond, Alexakis and his classic power trio have delivered an album that excites, surprises and is sure to surpass the highest expectations of fans and admirers. As Alexakis and I spoke on the phone about a week before the album was released, I found it hard to contain my enthusiasm for the new disc.

I have to say that I thought Sparkle And Fade was a great record, but they sent me a tape of the new album yesterday and I'm speechless. I can't tell you how blown away I was. This one has a lot more going on.

"Yeah, we took a lot longer to make this record. The last record took a month and a half, this record took 10 months."

Now, before you made Sparkle And Fade you were an indie band making your first major label record. I imagine your wildest dream could've been, "We'll get a Gold record."

"I thought Gold at the outside. I was really proud of it when it was done, but I was like, 'If I can sell 200,000 records on this first record, that's setting us up for the next record. We could get exposure, it's just a building block.' I wanted this band to develop like, remember how bands like Aerosmith developed from record to record? They don't do it anymore."

No, they don't, so in that sense you're really lucky. But now you're coming off of a Platinum record. When you were recording and writing, did you think about that?

"Well, there's no way you could say, 'No, I haven't thought of that.' You learn to accept where you're at for whatever reason, but I tried really hard not to. I didn't feel the pressure. Everyone else was saying, 'Oh, sophomore jinx, blah, blah, blah.' I didn't give a shit about that. All I wanted to do was to make sure that when we were done, the band and I felt, 'This album is the best we can do at this point in time. It's good enough to show to people, we're proud of it,' under the assumption that if we liked it, other people would like it."

EVERCLEAR

Yeah, my ears perked up like a dog's, "What the heck is that? Whoa!" You're just not expecting it. Coming off the heels of a Platinum record, a lot of people would say, "Oh, let's go for *Sparkle And Fade*, Part Two. It's not time to be experimental or try to take a big leap."

"Yeah. How boring, though."

I agree 100%, but unfortunately that's not always the mindset over at the companies that put these records out.

"I'm lucky, because my A&R guy, Perry Watts-Russell, used to manage [bands], and having an A&R guy who was a manager for so long is really great. He was like, 'What do you want to do on the next record?' I said, 'I wanna do something really different, I wanna make it more pop and more lush.' He said, 'Well, I'm gonna like that, but if you do plan to do this, make sure that you do two things: one, make it sound totally different than Sparkle And Fade, and two, make it sound even more like Everclear."

I think that's exactly what you've done. I know you say it's more pop and more lush, but the record still rocks like a motherfucker. It kicks ass, as they say.

"Well, we're a rock band. We're never gonna be Depeche Mode. I'm not criticizing Depeche Mode at all, I'm just saying we're a fucking rock band. We're still halfway in the garage, and I think that will always be there. I'm 35, you know; I grew up with Bruce Springsteen and..."

Sure, I just turned 36 last week, so I'm right there with you. I bought records, they had two sides, side one ended and you had to turn it over and put it on side two.

"I still think in sides, I will always think in sides.

Well, that's what I figured when I listened to the cassette. Side two starts off with an instrumental, and then it goes into my favorite song on the record, "Amphetamine."

"Really?

Oh, I love that.

"Everyone loves that song."

It's too bad you put a "fuck" in there—it'd be a perfect single.

"You think?"

I don't know, I was listening to the record and "Amphetamine" came on and I was like, "Oh my god." When it broke down to the cellos, I said, "Man, if this guy can write songs like that, where was this stuff on the last record?" [Laughter] I don't know.

"I think I'm just maturing as a writer."

Absolutely.

"We're getting better as a band, too. I think Sparkle And Fade was light years beyond the record before it [World Of Noise], and I still think it stands as a pretty great hard rock guitar record."

Oh, don't get me wrong, it's an excellent record. It just doesn't prepare you for *So Much For The Afterglow*. When the cassette started and I heard the Beach Boys thing, I thought they'd sent me the wrong tape, you know? I thought, it's Capitol Records, maybe this is some weird rarity that I've never heard, and then it turned into the first song.

"Yeah. I just wanted to do something like that, I thought vocals would be cool because it would be a nice showcase.

Yeah, the whole record has harmonies and background vocals all throughout it, a lot more than the last album. Does everybody in the band sing?

"Everybody. And we're doing that live. We have another guitar player that's touring with us and he sings as well, so it's a lot more full live and it's a lot more fun, too, with more voices screaming."

What's his name?

"Steve Birch, a great guitar player. He's been a friend since almost the inception of the band, about four or five years. He co-designed both Sparkle And Fade and So Much For The Afterglow. Basically, I'd come up with the concept and he'd help me put it together on the computer... [To someone else] I'm gonna be on for awhile; it's an interview. Sorry."

No problem.

"We're building a Japanese garden outside. I'm taking what little money I've made and putting it into our house; it's a good investment. You gotta have a great environment."

And you're putting down roots for you and your family. "Totally. I drop my kid at school every day. That is the best."

And the beauty of being in a rock band is when you're not on the road, you're home; you don't have to get up and go somewhere. You're there.

"You don't have to go to work, you just take care of your kid. I'm there to take her to school, I'm there to pick her up at three. If I got interviews to do and stuff like that, I bend it around and it's nice."

She's lucky, and you're lucky too.

"It's a far cry from when I was living in LA, sleeping on floors and eating dirt."

God knows that. Now, it's no secret that you're clean and you have been for a long time. Has that helped you in being able to deal with your success?

"Totally. I look at guys like Kurt Cobain and other people who self-destruct, and I just couldn't imagine being in my early 20s, on drugs and unstable and imbalanced. I would have self-destructed too, if it had happened to me then. It's still hard on me, you know? Fame is a hard thing. Fame and attention and the pressures that people try to put on you that you have to learn how to deny and not even notice.

Sure.

"You know what's really weird? Last year, right as 'Santa Monica' was peaking, I was in LA doing three shows at the Roxy and I got a call from my manager saying that the singer for the Stone Temple Pilots would like to meet me. So I went down and talked to him; he was at Exodus [a drug treatment center in Marina Del Rey, CA], and he was a really cool guy. He was going through some hard times and, you know, was still pretty shaky, and it was, just, really weird for me going back into one of those places."

I bet.

"Creepy. Really, really, really creepy. I was just glad to be out of there. But then I got on the Marina Freeway, I was driving by the projects where I used to live, and just as I was doing that, on KROQ, 'Santa Monica' came on. And it was just like, 'This is like a bad made-for-TV afterschool movie.'"

Sure, it was like you had wings on your shoulders. "Yeah. It was just, 'This is so dorky, but I'm gonna enjoy it.'"





Rock & Roll

A generation ago, it would have seemed like a kooky proposition: an entire museum dedicated to rock & roll. But decade after decade, rock has continued to evolve, becoming more and more immeshed in our history and culture. Nowadays, rock is suitable for academic study and it's even been known to infiltrate the White House. In September 1995, the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and Museum opened in Cleveland, Ohio, carving out a comfortable niche somewhere between the hushed formality of the Smithsonian and the boisterous ambience of the Hard Rock Cafe. Onetime *Rolling Stone* editor James Henke was hired to curate for the museum half of the Hall of Fame and, as pervasive as rock & roll is, Henke admits that he was concerned about rounding up enough museum-worthy pieces to make for an interesting collection.

"The Hard Rock Cafe people were certainly the first to start collecting these kinds of things, and over the years they've amassed a pretty significant collection," Henke says. "Where we're different is that we basically have no acquisition budget to go out and buy things so we don't really take part in auctions and that sort of thing. I'd say probably 80% of what we have has come from the artists themselves, or their families or managers. Some of it's loaned, and some are donations. Over time, what I've found is that in most bands there seems to be somebody who's a real pack rat and has saved things up. With U2, for example, Larry Mullen, the drummer, had the first T-shirt they made, like, in a high school art class; the first U2 T-shirt. The band was called the Hype before they became U2, so he had a little bio they had written about the Hype and stuff like that. He had a lot of things that obviously had never been seen.

"Even though a lot of stuff has gone out to the auction world, a lot of artists have saved things. When we were first putting the museum together, I had been in touch with ZZ Top and ended up going to Texas where they have this huge warehouse full of costumes from their tours and videos, guitars—even their stage props. It was almost like a ZZ Top supermarket! So, it's not like we've been left wanting. I think we've amassed a good collection."

Before he started working for the museum. Henke had no actual curatorial experience. Jumping into his new gig with both feet, he found his journalistic experience had lots of applications in the new environment. Though he admits he sometimes misses the writing end of journalism, the Hall of Fame has presented him a whole new medium through which he can express himself.

medium through which he can express himself.

Well aware of the role radio played in the rise of rock & roll, the Hall of Fame organizers included an in-house radio station on the fifth floor of the museum. According to curator James

shop in the state-of-the-art studio.

"There's no fee to use the studio, and the only thing that we do ask is that the station link up from their side to cur side," explains PD Dave Hintz. "It's ISDN-equipped, so you do that or just regular phone lines. The studio has everything in it from CD players to reel-to-reel to a Wheatstone mixing board with a host mike and three guest mikes. I always like to say if we thraw a transmitter or top of the roof we could be an operating radio station in a matter of minutes. Everything is there. They don't even have to bring their headphones if they don't want to. When a station comes in, we'll work with them on accommodations, promotional materials, interviews with staff or other interviews when we have special events in town—concerts, ball games, etc. We can tie it in in many different ways. Bring a winner and a guest with you and we'll give you free access to the museum. Tour the place, we'll give you a little bit of Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and Museum official merchandise."

Henke, since the Hall of Fame opened, DJs from stations in almost every state have set up

"It takes a lot longer to put [exhibits] together and you have to think [in terms of a] longer time frame, but it's been interesting," he surmises. "I sort of approach this as if I were doing a story or a book. I mean, this is very research-intensive, and so a lot of the contacts I had built up over my career at *Rolling Stone* I've used here because we deal a lot with the artists...so there's a lot of calling managers and working with them. In some ways, I sort of equate trying to put together a museum with *Rolling Stone* in the sense that it's got its serious element to it. We do treat the artifacts the way other museums treat theirs and we do try to tell the story of the music, but at the same time, we try to make it fun and also try to do it so it appeals to a broad mix of people."

During his tenure at the museum (the Hall of Fame brought him onboard in January of 1994, before the museum opened) Henke has seen firsthand that broad mix of rock fans—from busloads of senior citizens who were teenagers when Elvis Presley's reign began to high schoolers born in the post-punk 80s who've dropped in to check out the museum's first major installation, "I Want To Take You Higher: The Psychedelic Era 1965-1969" (on display through February of 1998). The exhibit took about a year to assemble and in the process, Henke learned some valuable lessons about digging up artifacts.

One of his most profitable insights was the realization that celebrated musicians' parents are really no different than anyone else's parents: they, too, meticulously save photos and schoolwork and other random childhood memorabilia. The Everly Brothers' mother not only donated costumes and guitars from the heyday of her sons' career, but report cards from their school days. Likewise, Jim Morrison's parents provided everything from his birth certificate to a Cub Scout uniform the future Doors frontman once wore and early poems he wrote as a child. Henke is particularly pleased with these types of items because they help him present artists as people, not just stars.

"We have things like John Lennon's Sgt. Pepper uniform and a really nice Elvis exhibit that we worked on with Graceland, so there's that kind of flashy stuff," he says. "But I think people really like some of the smaller things, like the Morrison stuff or the Everly Brothers' report cards. Those kind of things really are like a window into these peoples' lives that you don't normally see."

But it's hard to deny the appeal that icons pack. "I Want To Take You Higher" features some 500 items, including hand-painted

guitars that Eric Clapton and Jack Bruce played while they were in Cream and John Lennon's psychedelic Rolls Royce. As part of the opening festivities for the exhibit, counterculture legend, Ken Kesey regrouped with his Merry Pranksters (the subjects of Tom Wolfe's book, The Electric Kool Aid Acid Test) and drove their famed school bus from Eugene, Oregon, to Cleveland. Other pieces comprising the collection were culled from sources that spanned half the globe-from San Francisco to London, Haight-Ashbury to Carnaby Street. Tracking them down involved lots of investigative skills, plus a little creative salesmanship.

"Shortly after we opened, we decided that this would be the first big exhibit, so I immediately set out searching for things." Henke recalls. "I started with people who I knew were from the era. I'd meet with them and it was like reporting in the sense that they'd say, 'Oh, but you know who really was around then that you ought to talk to is so-and-so,' and I'd talk to so-and-so. Sometimes it's the people behind the scenes who have saved things. Over in England, there were people we ended up running into who had worked at the various clubs and stuff like that. who might not be well-known but had saved things or knew where to go. It's a little bit like an investigation trail-eventually the stuff starts turning up. The other thing that's worked very well for us is when people actually see the museum, meaning artists or their managers. Another example from the psychedelic era was the Grateful Dead.

"I realized that if we were going to do the psychedelic era, we really had to have The Dead be a part of it. Early on, we had gotten very little from them, but I invited their manager to come out to Cleveland to [see] what we had done. So, he ended up coming out here and really enjoyed the museum. He went back to San Francisco and they had a band meeting and he talked about it and we ended up taking this circular room that had been a theater and turned it into, like, a miniature version of the Fillmore. We created a light show with the Grateful Dead's light show designer, and the Dead provided us with archival tapes of live concerts from that period. We got some of their instruments from the period and ended up doing this very cool exhibit. But again, once they saw the museum, they really understood and that's happened time and again. When bands come through Cleveland on tour or whatever, we always invite them to come by-

we've had a whole host of artists, from Silverchair to Little Richard, and most of them end up really liking it once they've seen the place and appreciate what we're doing. That tends to be the biggest selling tool that I have—the museum itself."

The installation that's most meaningful to Henke is the Sun Records exhibit, which is probably as close to the birth of rock & roll as you can get without a time machine. In addition to ordinary documents, such as log books, schedules and contracts which document the extraordinary careers of artists such as Elvis Presley, Carl Perkins, Johnny Cash, Jerry Lee Lewis and Roy Orbison, Henke supervised the museum's recreation of the Sun Studios, complete with original mixing boards, tape decks, speakers and cutting lathes, provided by Sun founder Sam Phillips.

"There were certain eras or artists who had to be represented, and one of those was Sun Records and Sam Phillips and the birth of rock & roll in Memphis during the 50s," Henke explains. "So I arranged to meet with Sam Phillips. In the beginning, he was a little dubious about the project. First off, he thought that the museum should be in Memphis rather than Cleveland, so he was unhappy with that, and I guess he really wanted to make sure that what we were doing wasn't just going to be like a theme

park and that it was going to be done the right way. Over a period of months, I ended up going down to Memphis and meeting with him on a regular basis and telling him what our plans were. We'd sit and talk, and we got to know each other, and in the end he was won over significantly. So, we have a great Sun Records exhibit. That's probably the stuff I'm most proud of getting. Like I said, it started out where he was a little dubious about what this was going to be like-and it turned out that he's become a big supporter."

Sam Phillips wasn't the only party who started off with dubious feelings about Cleveland as the site for the Hall of Fame and Museum, but Henke says that the combined efforts of the business and music communities in the city lobbied enthusiastically enough to win over the committee in charge of choosing a location. Henke, who grew up in Cleveland before embarking on his career in music journalism, had followed the Hall of Fame developments in his home town from afar, so when the directors tapped him to curate, it represented both a professional change of direction and a personal homecoming. For him, "I Want To Take You Higher" has been the auspicious beginning of what looks to be a beautiful relationship. Potential sponsors have already approached the Hall of Fame with proposals for sending the exhibit on a national tour.

"We spent most of 1996 working on it-the actual exhibit covers probably about 10.000 square feet." Henke says. "We did a documentary film that we show in the theater, the Grateful Dead room, a book that I edited and Chronicle Books in San Francisco published, and a syndicated radio special that Ben Manilla helped produce. So, there were a lot of different elements to "I Want To Take You Higher." That's what we want to do in the future. We don't want to just throw up an exhibit and hope people come to Cleveland. We do want to spread the word and have a reach that extends beyond Cleveland," 41

Ithough the controversy is only starting, there's a fight brewing over DVD, pitting the nation's #1 video retailer against some of the giants in the content and hardware industry in the video world. Have you heard of Digital Video Express, aka Divx (pronounced DIV-ix)? Divx takes DVD somewhere its original designers might not have foreseen. Instead of buying a movie on DVD for roughly \$25, a person could rent the same movie on a slightly different DVD—but pay only \$5 for a single viewing, then keep it, and pay several dollars more for each subsequent viewing. One will need a special enhancement (costing \$100 to \$200) to the DVD player which will allow the player to create a record of each viewing for later billing. From the first time a customer pushes the *play* button on a Divx movie, he'll have 48 hours to watch the movie. After that he couldn't watch it again without paying another fee. The Divx player will be connected to a phone line which will forward play and billing data to a central computer.

In 1996, consumers rented 3.700,000,000 video tapes and bought 600,000,000—a more than six-to-one advantage for rentals—but the current trend seems to be indicating that videotape rentals are declining while purchases are increasing. This may be due in part to the rapid growth of DBS satellite services around the country where pay-perview opportunities may be changing viewer habits. There are only 5,000,000 DBS subscribers so far, but at the rate this industry is growing, it remains to be seen how its growth will impact the rental-versus-purchase issue.

Circuit City. the country's #1 retailer of TVs and consumer electronics, plans to launch Divx next summer in all of their outlets, selling them side-by-side with regular DVDs. The retailer ran extensive customer surveys indicating that people loved the concept. The most mentioned benefit was never having to return the movie.

On the other side of the coin, the DVD community is split over this development. Just as DVD hardware and software promotions are gearing up for an anticipated solid Christmas, there's fear that the Divx announcement will only confuse the already overburdened consumer. Several hardware manufacturers will support the new format, but they do so still totally committed to the DVD format. Manufacturers are excited about the future of DVD, but at this point most of

them are neutral on Divx. On the software front, Paramount, Disney, Universal and DreamWorks SKG have all lined up to release their product in Divx when VHS and DVD versions will be made commercially available.

The upgraded players will not be available until next summer. Although they'll be able to play regular DVD discs as well, it does put another question mark on the timing of a decision to potentially replace an old or outdated VHS player and shifting to DVD. The current installed base of DVD owners is bound to be upset that their machines are potentially obsolete already, but the installed base is so small that this may not factor in very much.

In closing, I want to congratulate an old friend on his new gig. Phil Quartararo, a giant in the biz, is the new President at Warner Bros. Records Inc. I've known Phil a long time: a decade or two ago (sorry Phil) I remember being in a hotel room in Götenborg, Sweden, rooming next door to him. At 4am, I was wakened by the incessant pitter-patter of someone pacing in the next room. Phil was on the phone to his radio stations back in the States (he was a regional RCA promo rep then), working his records. Although he was on vacation and a guest of the band I worked with, he couldn't really ever shut it off. Even then he showed the kind of heart and energy it takes to make it in the big time. Good luck, Phil...bloody well done.

He's always been known to put the melody first, while still leaving room for musical interpretation, and this collection of songs is no different; they're filled with optimism and nostalgia, and melancholy and joy all at once. Grant McClennan is a true master.

Sticks And Stones... Oasis Vs. The Beatles, Elton John Vs. Keith Richards

It's been an old fashioned mud-slingin' war of the words in the music world recently. The first shots were fired by Rolling Stone Keith Richards, who took a swipe at Elton John, saying John's major claim to fame was "writing songs for dead blondes" (the first version of "Candle In The Wind" was in remembrance of Marilyn Menroe, the second for Princess Diana). John—not about to let the swing go unreturned—told a crew of journalists in Atlanta that Richards was "so pathetic, poor thing. It's like a monkey with arthritis, trying to go onstage and look young." It was also John's opinion that Richards has held the Stones back (by the looks of the retail charts this week, neither party is doing badly... Bridges To Babylon SoundScanned 160,000 units its first week out and "Candle In The Wind 1997" has become one of the best-selling singles in history).

Round two: we can always count on Oasis's Gallagher brothers for good ink, can't we? This week's display of glaring egocentricity goes to Liam Gallagher, who used MTV News to relay a message to one of The Beatles. "I still love George Harrison as a songwriter in The Beatles," he said. "But as a person, I think he's a fucking nipple. And if I ever meet him I'll fucking tell him. I just hope I don't get like that.

"If we mean nothing to the likes of George Harrison and Paul McCartney, that's good. I don't want to make records for 50-year-olds. I want to make records for 15-year-olds."




Bits & Pieces
