Future Sales: CDs Made At The Record Store?

IBM, Blockbuster Team Up For High-Tech Venture

IBM and Blockbuster Entertainment Corp. are working to create the technology that would enable record stores to actually make audio CDs for consumers on demand. The new venture, produced through the Blockbuster subsidiary NewLeaf Entertainment Corp., is working on technology that is still in the laboratory stage, so its eventual application or use is by no means guaranteed.



The new technology, if perfected, will give consumers instant access to CDs that might otherwise be out of stock. Retailers would enjoy the added sales and save on inventory costs, while record companies would no longer have to make thousands of copies of certain records (especially catalog product) and pay for their distribution. The hardware would also be able to produce computer software videos and video games.

Besides the technological advances, the manufacturers would also have to overcome certain logistic and financial concerns. An

agreement will have to be made with the record companies, who would supply the databases that retailers could inscribe the CDs with the musical "information." The labels will be quite reticent to supply that without adequate compensation and safeguards against piracy.

However, the biggest problem is still the technical development. Not only must the hardware be built to produce the custom CDs, but it must be created at a price that is affordable to the consumer – and profitable to the record company, artist and retailer. More than a few high-tech pundits

doubt that such an invention will see the light of day. Some consider the new venture to be just one of a slew of projects aimed at taking a piece of the futuristic multimedia field. Some industry analysts expect the multimedia industry to mushroom from just under \$2 billion last year to the \$9-10 billion range in five years.

In fact, some analysts downplay the announcement, asserting that the pitch is merely one way of (at least psychologically) turning around a less-than-rosy business climate at the two corporations. IBM, which just laid off workers for the first time in its history, and Blockbuster, whose core video rental business is being threatened by cable and pay-per-view, are aggressively moving into multimedia projects. Their NewLeaf venture is just one way of delivering digital information in the future. Whether it turns out to be a viable and profitable vehicle remains to be seen.

Then again, there were many doubters before the advent of FM, audio cassettes and CDs, too.

CH-CHANGES, PT. 2

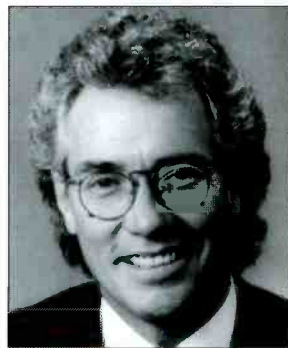

Detailed Adds And Regional Airplay

The Network Forty has reached an agreement with *The Box* where it will provide exclusive information on national and regional video airplay. This never-before-released information will appear weekly in the industry's fastest growing trade magazine, beginning this issue.

The information, presented in the "Mass Media" section on page 41, will list the most-requested videos in selected major markets. In addition, *The Network Forty* will print the weekly add schedule, a listing of all the videos added to *The Box's*

playlist. Also featured are the mini-features, "Twenty of These" and "Twenty of Those" – weekly compilations of *The Box's* top videos. In addition, research samples will be detailed and user-friendly information shared between *The Network Forty* and *The Box*.

In an unprepared statement, *The Box* VP Programming Les Garland rambled on about, among other things, "I'd like to thank all the little people for this honor," to which he concluded, "is this call being taped?" *The Network Forty* VP/GM Gerry Cagle refused comment.

Nirvana, Geffen Debunk Tiff Talk

No Label Interference In New Album

In a rare press statement, Geffen Records and members of Nirvana both categorically disputed published reports asserting that the label pressured the band to redo certain cuts on their forthcoming album. Produced by Steve Albini, the album is scheduled to be an early Fall release on DGC Records.

A *Chicago Tribune* story quoted Albini as saying the label and band management objected to the harsh, guitar-driven sound he favors. A *Newsweek* article alleged that Geffen executives judged the follow-up to the quadruple-Platinum *Nevermind* harshly and demanded changes to make the material more accessible and commercial-sounding. Not so, according to both the band and the label. Nirvana's Kurt Cobain claims that they are remixing some parts of the album at their



own discretion. "Overall, we—the band—felt the vocals were not loud enough on a few of the tracks," he says. "We want to change that."

"Being commercial or anti-commercial is not what makes a good Rock record," he adds. "It's the songs and until we have the songs recorded the way we want them, Nirvana will not release this record." The group also wrote to

Newsweek, denying any label interference.

Although it doesn't comment on such rumors as a policy, Geffen executives felt the need to respond because the situation "has snowballed out of hand." "We categorically deny rumors that we have censored the creativity of Nirvana in any way," declares President Ed Rosenblatt. "The simple truth is, as I have assured the members of Nirvana and their management all along, we will release whatever record the band delivers to us."

Nirvana's Kris Novoselic put the capper on the whole situation by noting: "All this press is great. How much does a full-page ad in *Newsweek* cost, anyway? I'm just waiting for a right-wing Christian group to deem the record Satanic. That would really move some units."

Odds & Ends

EPIC/NICKELODEON DEAL

Epic Records and Nickelodeon have signed an exclusive long-term agreement that allows the Sony Music label to manufacture and distribute original Nickelodeon home video and audio products in the U.S. The two parties will jointly promote the new home video and audio line.

Epic expects to release 30 to 40 Nickelodeon video titles and approximately eight audio titles during the first year of the agreement. Among the first titles set for release are *The Ren & Stimpy Show*, *Doug* and *Clarissa Explains It All*. The releases will target the 2 to 11-year-old audience, with an emphasis on the 6 to 11-year-old segment.

JACKSON SUED OVER BEATLE SONGS

57/Sunset Entertainment, the company that wants to release a compilation album of Beatle songs performed by rappers, is suing Michael Jackson and ATV Music for breach of contract, damage to reputation and punitive damages. The firm alleges that Jackson and his music publishing company reneged on a contract that

allowed 57/Entertainment the right to produce an album that would feature the most popular Rappers in the business doing their versions of songs such as "Revolution," "Lady Madonna" and "Give Peace A Chance."

An attorney for both Jackson and ATV Music claims that while 57/Entertainment's Jay Bildstein and Eric J. Kloper have the right to record the album, they can't legally release it without ATV's permission. That permission may come after Jackson and ATV evaluate how the material is performed and presented.

HAS COUNTRY MUSIC PEAKED?

Pop and Rock music enthusiasts within the record industry may be breathing a sigh of relief if the assessment of Country music leaders pans out. At a Music Row Industry Summit two weeks ago, several panelists conceded that Country music's popularity may have finally peaked. Arista Records' Nashville head Tim DuBois cited figures that showed a slight drop in Country music sales, but added that its future popularity won't

drop to the level it had at the beginning of the decade.

Ironically, the panelists spent a lot of time complaining about SoundScan, the computer-driven POS technology that first illustrated the Country music boom. Their complaints centered on how the information prompts retailers to return singles as soon as sales drop significantly and that it has cut into the amount of product the label normally gave the retailers.

Another topic of note: The labels publicly acknowledged that they're looking for ways to break new artists without radio play and that Country radio is attracting younger, more fickle buyers.

CONVENTIONAIRE'S DISEASE

With convention season upon us, *The Network Forty* provides you with a primer for attending... or several good reasons to stay home.

Rule #1: Make note of the people who are most important: record company executives who pay for all of it; major market program directors and those on the way up; and small-market program directors who add at least seven records a week and aren't claimed by an independent.

Rule #2: Your status is in direct proportion to your method of payment. If you have a small amount of cash, you're immediately identified as a fringe player at best and are shut out of the best seats and places TBS (to be seen). A personal American Express account will upgrade your seats and TBS level while the company Gold Card provides all access and the highest status – TBSW (to be seen with). Editor's note: Companies trying to limit expenses should consult Charlie Minor on how to stretch those convention dollars by sticking others with the tab.

Rule #3: If you have a good job in a major market and you're considering going to a convention, you have to ask yourself one question: why? The only answers: You're chairing a panel and want to show everyone how smart you are; you're about to be fired; you're looking for a better job; you need an excuse for a few nights away from home; you're being paid to attend. (Throw out the last one. It doesn't happen.) One reminder: Don't forget how you felt when you were a baby program director. Take time to talk with those who seek your guidance. Try to avoid the "holier than thou" attitude. After all, it's not you they're impressed with; it's the job you hold. When in doubt, hum the old Blood Sweat And Tears anthem, "What goes up... must come down."

Rule #4: If you're in a smaller market

looking to move up, conventions are the place for you. In one long weekend, you can meet and impress those who might remember you for a future opening. You can certainly cement your relationship with various record executives. Just don't let them see you sweat. Before you make the trip, determine your objectives. Seek out those in both industries who can help your career. Ask questions and state your case as briefly as possible. Remember, you're one of hundreds

seeking an audience. At the convention, keep a log of the people you see and what you talked about. One week later, follow up with a short letter. If it's someone from radio, send them an air check. If they are in the record business, be persistent. If they don't answer your first calls, try freezing your play list. That will always get a call back. If you aren't employed, don't call anyone in the record industry.

Rule #5: Never talk bad about someone without first checking to make sure he's not right behind you. If this happens to someone you know, the key word is "Jaybow." When you hear that word, immediately stop your conversation and check your surroundings.

Rule #6: When shaking hands with people, never look them in the eye. Always stare over their shoulder to see if you can spot someone more important.

Rule #7: Never glance at their name tags. It's the amateur's way out. If you don't know who they are, slap them on the shoulder and tell them how good they look or tell them not to move, you'll be right back. Another good ploy is to take along a date who isn't in the business. Have her introduce herself to people whose name you can't recall. Cover yourself by saying, "I'm sorry, I thought you guys knew each other."

Rule #8: Don't drink to excess. Throwing up in the lobby went out of style right after Randal Strasson blew chunks in the late Rick Sklar's lap at the *Billboard* convention in 1972.

Rule #9: Don't take every dare issued by the guys at the bar. Only Jim Davenport can streak a lobby with a lighted string of toilet paper between his butt cheeks and still be classy about it.

Rule #10: Do not remove articles of clothing in the hotel lobby. This act was officially banned after the 1975 Bobby Poe convention when several naked bodies descended on the escalator.

Rule #11: Don't approach women in the halls and ask them "How much?" They could be a record company president or a VP's wife. If it's hookers you're looking for, make the next "Tailhook" convention.

Rule #12: Always return with some promotional idea that you can use immediately. This way you can justify the cost to your boss.

Rule #13: Don't bother kissing Joel's ring. It's not politically correct anymore. (Reference: Blood Sweat & Tears' "What goes up...must come down.")

And the most important rule of all: Have fun. Remember, it's not the conventions that are a waste of time, but the people you chose to hang with. ▣

MILE HIGH HITS

Chris Davis may have made the biggest move of the '90s (so far) when he arrived in Denver from WKHQ in Charlevoix, Michigan. Initially the interim PD, Davis, who was recently promoted to Program Director, describes KS104 as "a Dance/Pop station. We're not particularly an Urban-sounding station. Our target is 12-24 and 18-34 year-olds with a decided female lean. At any time, many of those listeners are Hispanic. In fact, at any given time, between 40% and 60% of the market's Hispanic population is tuned into KS104."

Davis considers his main competition, in terms of cume duplication, to be "KDKL, an AM Urban station. In terms of actual sizable shared audience, we share more with Mix 107.5 (KRXY). I'd say about 30% of our listeners cume both The Mix and KS104, which to a degree is a holdover from when they were (Mainstream-formatted) Y108."

Clarifying his station's music mix, Davis notes that "a lot of the Rap producer goes late for us. That's partially because of a lack of a direct in-format competitor and partially just the musical tastes of Denver. We've evolved into a station where SWV or PM Dawn works early, while Rap takes a little time to develop. Eventually we'll have success with the really big Rap records like Dr. Dre, Naughty By Nature or Paperboy." KS104 also includes non-Crossover hits in the mix. "We're having a lot of success with Spin Doctors and even Ugly Kid Joe, for that matter. Both of those have been Top 10 in sales in the market."

KS104 is starting to move away from its long-running "Cash Cow" handle. "We're really looking to lose the 'Cash Cow' term on the air, although we'll probably keep the cow as a mascot in one form or another," Davis says. "I'd like to get away from

the term 'cash' because, let's face it, if you really want to win big cash, you'll simply play the Colorado lottery. On top of that, all research - especially that concerning Generation X - indicates that you can no longer buy an audience."

To exemplify a typically successful KS104 promotion, Davis describes his current on-air giveaway that snubs his competitor's claim that KS104 plays nothing but Rap and "kid stuff." "We're having some fun by giving away lots of those Barney the dinosaur dolls that are so hot with the kids right now," he explains. "We're selling the contest to the adults by even offering to 'Rap' up the gift for their kids. We're negating Mix's claims by having fun with 'Rapping up some kid stuff' and turning it into a contest that's targeted at parents. So far, it's really working for us with adult females."

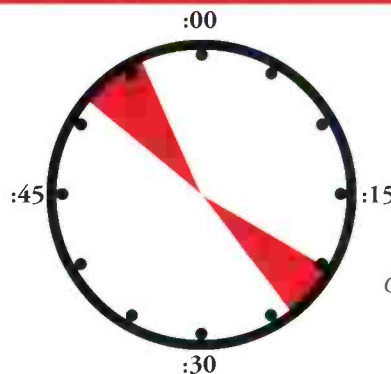

MUSIC MEETING

FREEDOM WILLIAMS "Voice Of Freedom"

(COLUMBIA)

Here, Freedom Williams lays to rest any doubts that he was anything but *the* main ingredient in C+C Music Factory's recipe for success. From the first listen, there can be no doubt that this debut single from *Freedom* will be looked back upon as one of the biggest records of the summer of '93. Your audience already knows Freedom from his days with C+C and hits like "Gonna Make You Sweat (Everybody Dance Now)" and "Here We Go, Let's Rock And Roll." When you find stations playing a song from the advance cassette, you know something big is about to happen. Freedom's charismatic persona will only heighten the buzz with upcoming personal appearances and live performances.

DEPECHE MODE "Walking In My Shoes"

(SIRE/REPRISE)

For Depeche Mode fans, the release of the album, *Songs Of Faith And Devotion*, was a near-religious experience. It has also made non-Depeche Mode fans converts. "Walking In My Shoes" is seen as the premiere cut on the album by more than a few music critics and is already getting aired on WENZ Cleveland, 99X Atlanta, KRBE Houston, KROQ Los Angeles and a handful of other majors. With a tour coming to an arena near you soon, Depeche-a-mania is about to hit a frenzied peak. With every release, Depeche Mode has sold exponentially more than their last al-

bum and *Songs Of Faith And Devotion* is certain to break all of their previous sales records.

10,000 MANIACS "Few And Far Between"

(ELEKTRA)

It's not as if 10,000 Maniacs toiled in obscurity until their recent success with *Our Time In Eden*; nevertheless this certainly has been a breakthrough album. For the first time in their existence, the band worked together on the album's songs as opposed to writing alone, then presenting songs to the group. The result has been "These

Are Days," "Candy Everybody Wants" and now "Few And Far Between." In the ever present ballad glut, "Few And Far Between" is exactly what your playlist is starved for: something upbeat.

DAN BAIRD "Look At What You Started"

(DEF AMERICAN/REPRISE)

As a member of the Georgia Satellites, Dan Baird established himself as a true good-time guy. Not one to let that image fall by the wayside, Baird's solo outing, *Love Songs For The Hearing Impaired*, has already produced the tongue-in-cheek "I Love You Period" and now "Look At What You Started." In an age of heavy message songs, Baird gives blessed relief with music that's just plain fun to listen to. "Look At What You Started" is

a rare commodity in 1993 and its sound will work well at Mainstream Top 40. Born in San Diego and transplanted to Atlanta, Baird founded the Georgia Satellites in 1980; they hit the big time with "Keep Your Hands To Yourself" in 1986. With his solo career off and running, Baird takes Southern Rock into the '90s, where it's getting a warm reception.

STONE TEMPLE PILOTS "Plush"

(ATLANTIC/AG)

When it comes to powerful vocals, check out Weiland, lead singer of Stone Temple Pilots. His pipes, coupled with the wall of guitars provided by Dean DeLeo, makes "Plush" one of the most compelling Alternative/Rock tracks of the

year. STP's debut album, *Core*, was produced by Brendan O'Brien, who has worked with the Red Hot Chili Peppers and the Black Crowes, and he pulls the maximum effort out of the band. The momentum has already started with KKYK, KMYZ, KWOD, KROQ and KEGL already playing "Plush"... and more to follow.

WAILING SOULS "Shark Attack"

(CHAOS)

When it comes to releasing a record, timing is everything. Now that warm weather is upon us, the Wailing Souls has appropriately come out with "Shark Attack." In the middle of winter, this just wouldn't sound as good, but you can easily picture your audience grabbing the boom box, heading

INXS' small venue tour brought out the industry's best in Santa Monica. The band performed *eight* new songs in the intimate setting of an airplane hanger. It was all reminiscent of the "Don't Change" video of a few years back.

Last Week's Divine Entity: San Francisco's band of rogues, Primus, has toured tirelessly over the years to create a tremendous fan base. Their work obviously paid off. Their new single, "My Name Is Mud," (Interscope) is making radio waves. The warped video fuels the buzz on the band. The single itself exudes a sullen sound accentuated by chanted lyrics. Add the sheer hip factor in the trio's name and we're done. The band's new album *debuts* at #7 in SoundScan... The divorce isn't even official yet, but Lenny Kravitz is already on the prowl. "Believe," the follow-up single to the debut smash, "Are You Gonna Go My Way," is a soothing, melodic, peaceful single with inspiring lyrics about love and esteem for one's self. This common theme threads throughout the album.

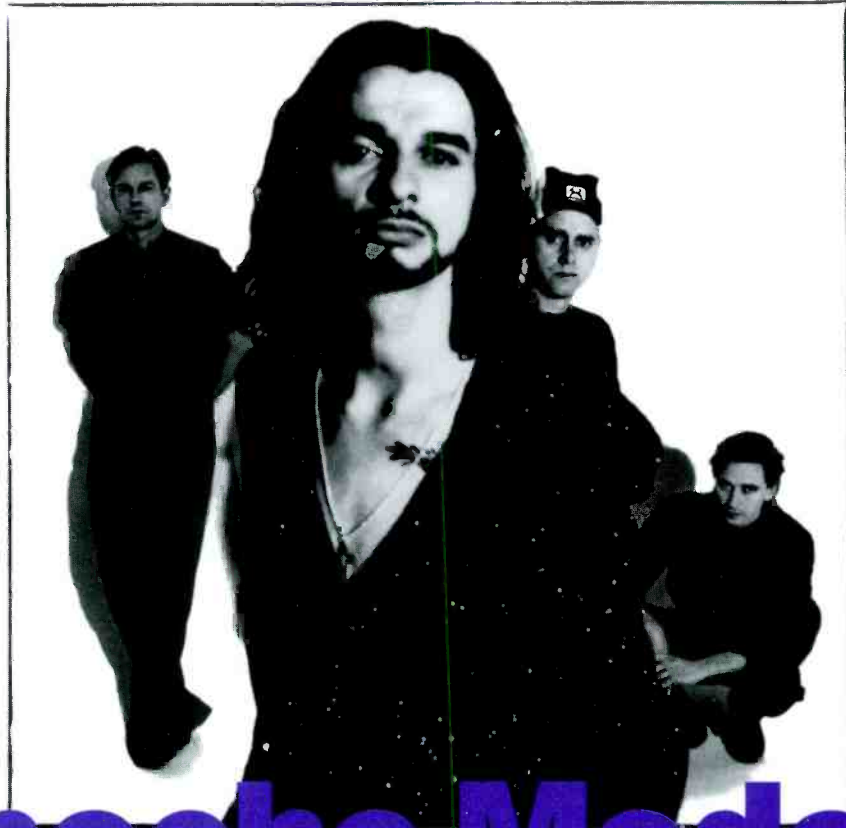
This Week's Smash: Pornos for Pyros' debut *al-boom* (WB) debuted at #3 on SoundScan... Keep your ears pierced for "Your Town." The first single from Deacon Blue (Chaos) is worth your attention. Echoed, male vocals beautifully complement instrumentation while a surreal feminine voice enriches the background. *What?* Expect an expanded lifespan for this song, courtesy of excellent remixes found on the CD pro. The sound for this song and forthcoming album, *Whatever You Say* was elaborately produced by Paul Oakenfold and Steve Osborne, best known for their work with U2.

KROQ El Lay turned us on to an import by Big Country. The Scottish band whose first claim to fame was that beer commercial soundalike, "In A Big Country," has added new *dementions* and life to David Bowie's 1973 classic, "Cracked Actor" from *Aladdin Sane*. Savor the tasty guitar crunch – and the kilted ones aren't yodeling like they used to... Mindbomb (Mercury) has just received new recognition from their peers! Ministry's Al Jourgensen has remixed "Segue" from the band's current self-titled album. Mindbomb is already out with a new, more Rock-ish single, "Do You Need Some?"... Pere Ubu's unique style and flair dates back to 1978 with *The Modern Dance* (Rough Trade). Fifteen years later, the pioneers in the American Underground are setting trends above ground. Pere Ubu's current release, *Story Of My Life* (Imago) possesses – besides the first single, "Sleepwalk" – the tasty cut, "Come Home." The latter cut boasts a thick dominating intro beat that piques your interest as singer David Thomas vocals soars from baritone lows to helium-influenced highs.

Crush (EastWest) brings together former members of Siouxsie & The Banshees and Killing Joke. Released just a short while ago to Alternative Radio, their first single, "The Rain," is ready to cross all barriers. Its blend of Alternative and Rock-styled vocals offers a contradiction in sound that is incredibly appealing.

Coming Soon: Stone Temple Pilot's acoustic version of "Plush" from MTV *Unplugged* is going to be shipped to radio in the near future. Atlantic Records is currently printing up samplers after enjoying saturation rotation on KROQ.
