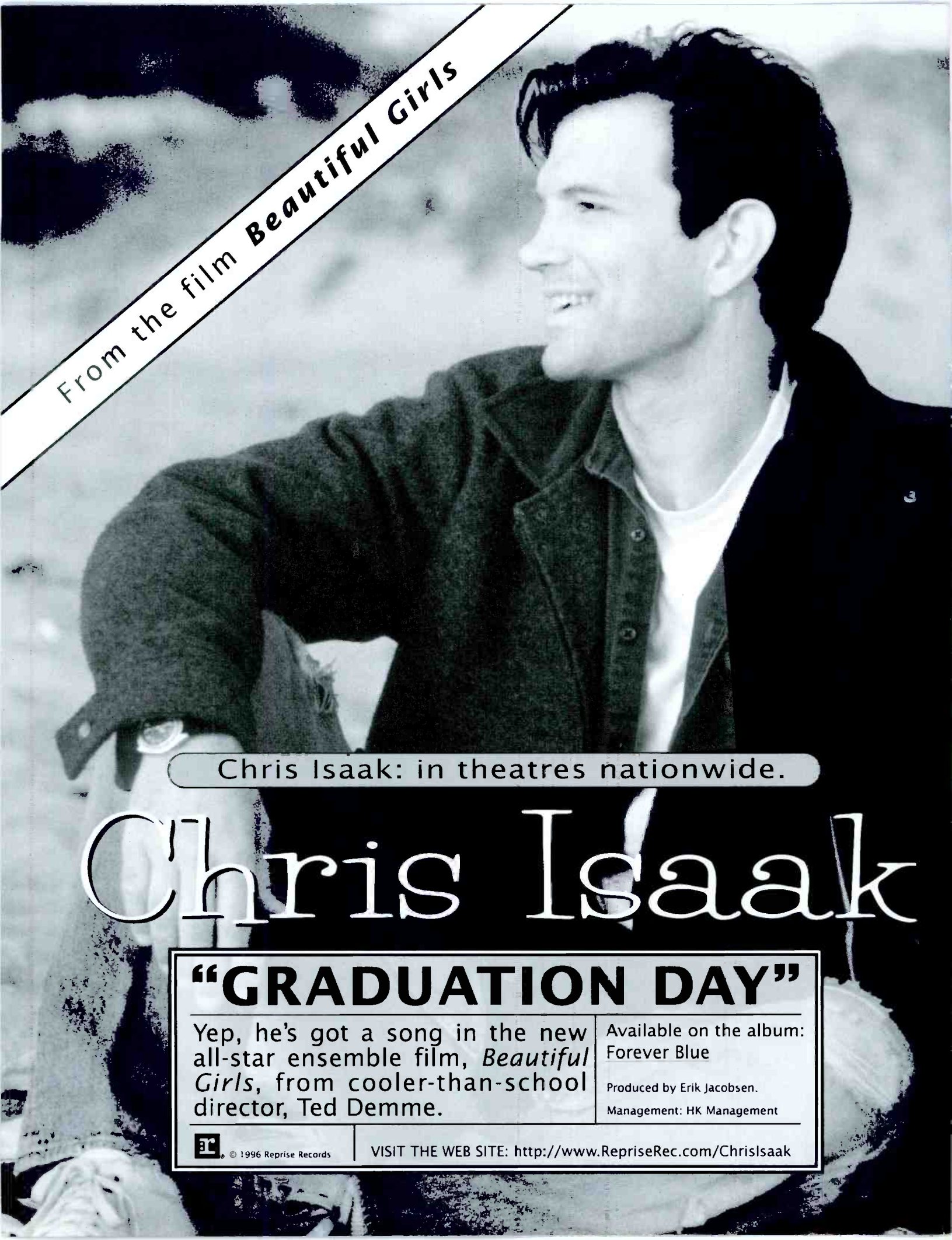

Leaves WPLY Philadelphia For WHYT Detroit PD Gig

WHYT "The Planet 96.3" Detroit named Garett Michaels to succeed Rick Gillette as Program Director. He officially starts on February 12.

Michaels comes to the station from WPLY Philadelphia, where he was PD for two years. Prior to that, he was APD/MD at WZPL Indianapolis. He started his career in the Midwest, holding programming and on-air positions at several stations in Wisconsin and Minneapolis.

Hollywood Debuts Records 420 In Colorado

New Label To Focus On Touring Artists

Hollywood Records President Bob Pfeifer announced an alliance with the new Records 420 label. Based out of Colorado, the new imprint will be run by David Frey and Jim Lewi.

Frey is a well-known artist manager who's also one of the founders of the H.O.R.D.E. festival. Lewi worked with Frey as the tour's marketing chief. Furthermore, he was co-owner and President of Advance Tour Marketing.

Not surprisingly, the duo noted that the label will focus on signing and developing artists with a strong tour-

ing base. "Touring is an essential element in music," Lewi says. "Radio, press and other marketing factors are most effective once a band has already established a strong touring presence. With that in mind, we will seek bands that have built a solid fan base through live performances, and are ready to make natural progressions to recording albums. Our relationship with Hollywood Records is based on strong mutual feelings of friendship and respect."

"We hope to sign some great bands, and then let the music do the talking,"

Frey adds. "We'd like to keep the focus on the artists—to create a proper creative environment for bands that rock. We're very comfortable with our relationship with Hollywood Records."

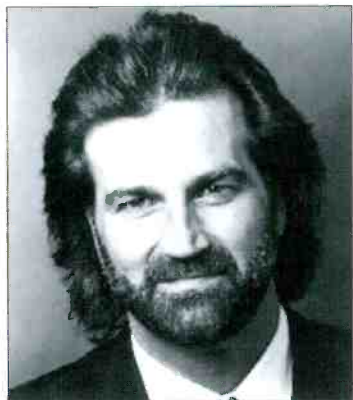
"Our goal at Hollywood Records is to seek out the best musical talent and to stick by those musicians as long as it takes," Pfeifer says. "Having known Dave and Jim for years, I know they live by that philosophy. We'll have a decidedly fluid A&R relationship between Hollywood and 420—they'll be our extended family."

Geffen Records Launches New Outpost

A&R Exec, Noted Producer And Manager Head New Label

Geffen Records has announced its partnership in a new label run by three industry veterans. Outpost Recordings will be headed up by manager Andy Gershon, A&R exec Mark Williams and producer Scott Litt.

"These three are major talents, with a wealth of experience and track records to be proud of," states Geffen Records Chairman/CEO Ed Rosenblatt. "The combination of a manager, a producer and an A&R person, all at the top of their fields, has the makings of a really special record company."

Previously, Gershon was a partner in Coffey/Gershon Management, which handles the careers of The Smashing Pumpkins, Bryan Ferry, Cocteau Twins and The Sundays. Litt has produced five R.E.M. albums as well as CDs by Nirvana, The Replacements, New Order, Liz Phair, Indigo Girls and Patti Smith.

Williams, as VP A&R for Virgin Records, signed The Smashing Pumpkins, Cracker and The Geraldine Fibbers, as well as worked with Divinyls, Ziggy Marley and Bob Mould. He also worked at A&M and I.R.S. Records, where he helped sign R.E.M.

Litt will continue to produce records and sign artists. Williams will handle A&R functions and marketing interface with Geffen Records, and Gershon will handle both the marketing and day-to-day business aspects of the company.

"We all had a variety of opportunities, which would've been a *change*," Williams says. "But we wouldn't have had the fulfillment of working with two good friends whose business accomplishments we respect."

"You can have a great business plan, but you have to know how to play off

each other's strengths to succeed," Gershon adds. "This just felt right and the idea took on a life of its own."

"It was of utmost importance that this venture was done with like-minded partners," Litt continues. "Eddie Rosenblatt and the whole Geffen records staff share the same philosophies we do. Eddie's mandate was 'just continue to do what you do best.'"

Outpost is temporarily housed at 335 N. Maple Dr., Ste. 358, in Beverly Hills, CA 90210. They'll move to a location close to Geffen Records in the Spring.

Morning Shows... Steps To A Lasting Marriage

More often than not, morning shows are the bread-and-butter of a radio station. They are sensitive, sometimes difficult to manage, extremely creative, often ego-driven shows that need a good amount of time and attention, not to mention love and support. They need the kind of attention that would drive most spouses nuts.

I deal and work with morning shows of all types around the country. I can most assuredly tell you that there are striking similarities with the most successful ones. Whether I was working with Rick Dees, John Lander, Dave Ryan or a number of other great shows, one thing is certain: These shows all have a strong desire to win. They take great pride in having a #1 morning show. They are extremely focused, competitive and energetic in their desire to be the best. This is why it is so important to them that their PD produces winning ratings outside their shows.

Yet, as much as you want to coddle these morning shows, they all want (and need) direction, feedback, and criticism. Morning shows at most stations take a lot of management, but many PDs just don't face this responsibility. For a healthy relationship, you must spend a great deal of time with them to gain their confidence. This way, you can communicate your goals to them—not only their show, but for the rest of the station as well. It can be difficult to give the show the creative freedom it feels it needs to succeed, balanced with your goals.

Exactly how you offer feedback, criticism and suggestions is crucial. If you're not careful, you can dampen or even destroy their enthusiasm. You can ruin a great show if you don't understand how to properly manage one. Doing your job and keeping them happy are often at opposite ends of the spectrum. However, that's your job! After all, putting together winning morning shows are what a great PD does.

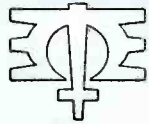
Morning shows are pretty much the same animal. They have to be a little nuts to get up at 3:30-4:30 (and even earlier in some cases) every morning. They deserve the extra attention. As I travel the country listening to morning shows, there are some basic constant themes.

Especially in this age of two-person morning shows, it is imperative that the chemistry is good. If you don't nip differences in the bud immediately, the relationship between the two might deteriorate to the point of splitting up. If you have a winning team, splitting up is the last thing you want. Just like marriage, it takes a lot of special attention to keep the harmony.

Knowing how important morning shows are, here are some steps you can take to make sure that yours is a lasting marriage.

1. *Be sure they have proper operating equipment.* This is listed first because it's often overlooked. Nothing pisses off, or causes a morning show to lose interest quicker than faulty equipment. I worked with a major morning star who was fixated on the processing of his microphone. We tried to make him happy, but the sound he liked in his headphones screwed up the sound of the station. Finally, I had the engineer put in a processor that was tuned to his liking. Little did he know that his processing was limited to his headphones and had nothing to do with the airsound.
2. *Make sure they have all the tools they need.* Too many shows are expected to get results, but aren't provided essential tools to get the job done. The cost of a monthly comedy service is minimal compared to the long-term benefits. If you're serious about winning, get serious about supporting them.
3. *Give them constant positive reinforcement.* Just like a spouse or child, a morning show can never hear good things enough. Also, if you have good things to say, put it in writing. Plus, if you have something bad to say, tell them.
4. *Make them feel special by providing spiffs when possible.* Morning shows are entertainers and should be treated differently than the rest of the staff. (Be sure to coddle the rest of your staff, too). These little things add up big-time if someone from another market comes calling.
5. *Meet with them on a daily basis. GM's should meet as often as possible, as well.* Make them feel that you're very interested in them, by asking about their personal lives as well.
6. *Make the morning show a part of the game plan; make them feel a part of the process.* When the station succeeds, they'll feel more a part of the success. If it fails, they won't be so apt to point the fingers. If things don't go according to plan, they'll be more inclined to listen to the solutions.
7. *Let your morning show sit in on focus groups.* Again, make them a part of the process. Most morning shows don't want to be a part of this area; many feel it would be a blow to their egos and don't want to risk it. I say completely the opposite. If I were a morning show and the station had the tools, I would have it written into my contract that the station conduct at least one "Morning Show Only" focus group a year. I would want to know, firsthand, what bits were working and which ones weren't.
8. *Provide them with tapes on morning shows around the country.* Make sure they're morning shows they respect. Also, look hard for morning shows and bits that are working.
9. *Make sure you have as many of the morning show services locked up as possible.* Just like hiring a good consultant to keep him out of the market, you should also look at taking everything you can get your hands on, whether you'll use it or not.
10. *When ratings are good, make sure that everyone knows!* Local press, trade publications, and everywhere else.
11. *Have a pow-wow once a quarter to discuss the show—away from the station.* This gets you out from behind the desk. Take them out to a setting that is comfortable and conducive to creativity.
12. *Have a "Show-Prep" brainstorming session with other people from the station.* Invite a number of people from the station (or even have a couple of neighbors) to take part. Have everyone bring magazines, newspapers and anything else they can think of. Explain what you want them to do. Then, let everyone contribute ideas they find interesting. It's a good exercise to help your show see things that interest other people. It takes your crew out of their normal day-to-day prep mind-set and is a great way to get feedback that they might not ordinarily be exposed to.
13. *Stop in or call when you hear a great bit.* Compliments go a long way towards keeping harmony in your show. They really appreciate it and like knowing you're listening.

Really, all your show needs is a little tender loving care. Treat it right, and it should give you years of top-flight performance.

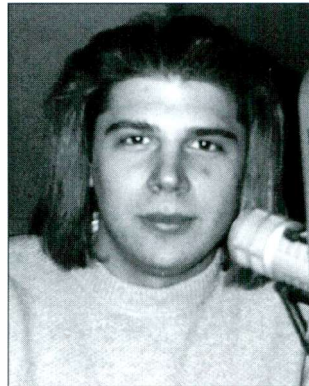

"Mix 96 is an Adult hit radio station. Although our target demo is 18-34, we try our best to lean in a female direction with our imaging and promotions. We have a very strong 50,000-watt signal that covers the entire metro. Our competition branches out in several different directions. Sunny FM (WSNK) is pretty much the 12-24 teen Pop station; we don't need to program against them because our audience is so vastly different. The true competition is between 'Lite FM' WLHT and New Rock WGRD. While breaking out the trends with our consultant Keith Hill, we were shocked to see how well we did after just two months on the air. We jumped from a 1.6 to a 4.8 with 18-34 persons over the course of one month.

"The legendary Bob & Tom from Indianapolis handle mornings from 6 am to 10 am. They're starting to really take off in West

Michigan. *The Planet*, Bob & Tom's holiday CD, sold out over the holiday; I think there's a waiting list for copies. Kim St. James does an awesome job in middays; she fits the essence of the station and has great pipes! I'm fortunate enough to still do what I love to do best—afternoon drive from 3 pm to 7 pm. Marc Hunter covers the 7 pm-to-12 am show. Hunter has the ability to keep the 18-34 adults inter-

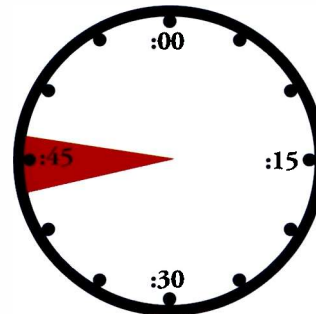
ested with an entertaining night show. Hunter was my PD two years ago and he still hot-lines me! We use Mitch Craig as our primary station voice. For the attitude and fun stuff, we use (who else but...) Scott Shannon from WPLJ New York. Scott sounds pretty cool, kicking off our music sweeps.

"I wanted to get the sound of the station right before I hit the streets and we're at that point now. My Operations Manager, J.L. Fisk, has been a big help and always says yes to my requests! We have some club appearances underway to get the station out in the crowd and some big promotions on the way for 1996! Over the holidays, we dressed up Marc Hunter as 'Hunter Clause' for the Salvation Army. He rang the bell and raised a lot of money! We also have 'Free Ticket Friday.' Other than the snow, Grand Rapids is a great place to be right now."

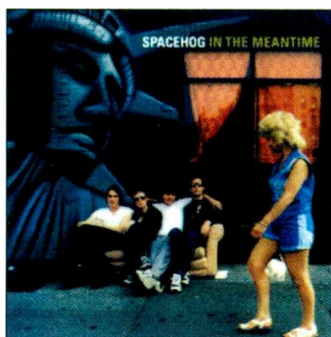

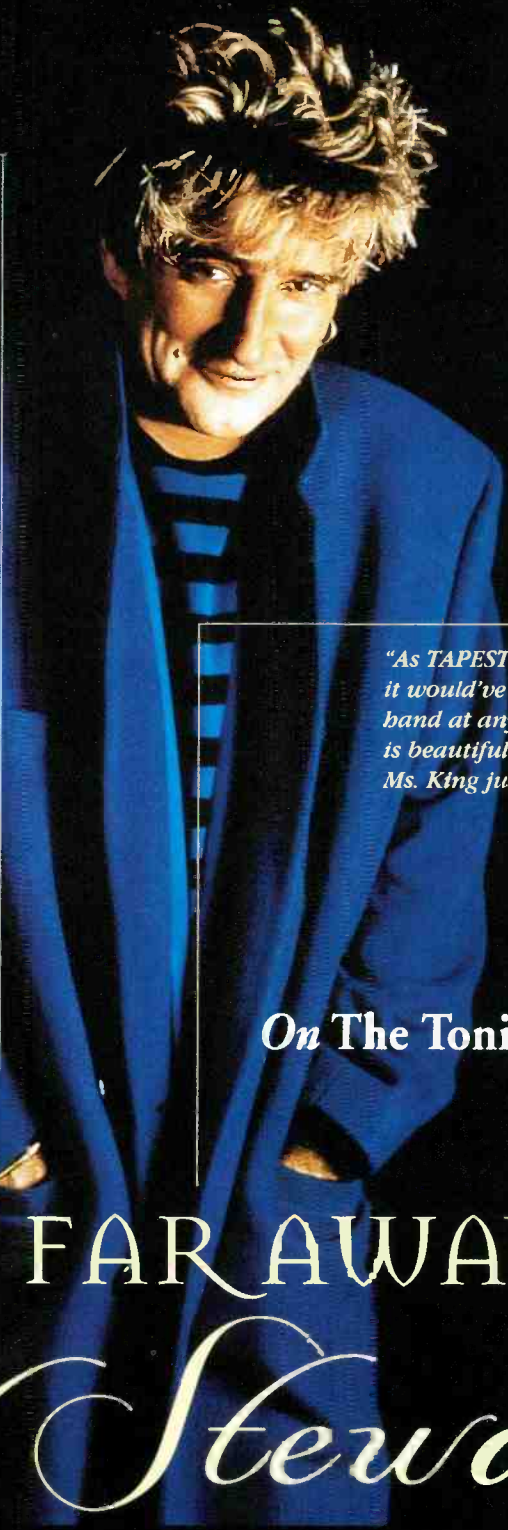

Give away on-hold tapes for businesses where the jocks entertain those on hold, plugging the station between the jokes....Put people on hold and time them; whoever holds the longest, wins....Jocks call businesses and time how long they're put on hold. Prizes to shortest and longest.

National Sauce Month

Celebrates the diversity of sauces used in cooking and UFOs. (What, you've never heard of flying sauces?) Contact: Laura Badish (212) 867-6400.

Best sauce cook-off; winners are repro'd, canned and sold as station sauces—profits go to charity....Play "guess the ingredients"...."Sauce-bobbing" for prizes....Sauce wrestling.

National Noodle Month

Celebrates the future greatness of the egg noodle—and not the pasta tense. Contact: Donna Chowning (703) 841-0818.

Creative pasta cook-off....Find prizes in a pool of pasta....Pasta art/sculpture show....Longest pasta noodle contest....Pasta fashion show.

National Pig Day

To honor the swine as one of man's most intelligent and useful domesticated animals. (Any resemblance to Editor's office is coincidental.) Contact who's hogging the spotlight: Ellen Stanley, 7006 Miami, Lubbock, TX 79413.

Pig-calling contest....Pig mud wrestling....Slop dancing....Pin-the-tail-on-the-pork chops (use a live pig, with its various meat cuts drawn on it).

Help Someone See Week (2-9)

Donate your discarded eyeglasses for distribution in the Third World. Contact: Dr. Fleming Barbour (810) 235-4752.

Listeners win for creating a "station anthem," set to tune of National Anthem ("Oh, say can you bear, by the morning show's bite...")....Give a Roseanne Award for caller who sings anthem the worst.

Promotes the benefits of relaxing by putting off everything until tomorrow. Contact: Les Waas (215) 947-9020.

Ask for callers to give you their best excuses for not doing things....Offer to give a prize to the nth caller—but never pick up the phone....Give a prize to the listener who waits the longest before taking a bath, yet still goes to work and does his other duties during his personal life.

"That is correct, sir!" etc. Nth listeners win when they call in after hearing them....Let listeners come to studio and be the jocks' sidekick for a shift....Make up a roll of stamps featuring the various jocks, send it out in a Punisher's Clearinghouse. A museum dedicated to wild-assed painter Salvador Dali opened in St. Petersburg, FL in 1982. Contact: (813) 823-3767.

Prizes to listeners who create the most surrealist drawing of your call letters....Dali moustache look-alike contest....Prizes to people who spot interns wearing Dali moustache.

8

Employee Appreciation Day

Honors all the hard work put in by employees...without giving them raises. Contact: (800) 722-7202.

Have jocks sit in for hard-working employees, so they can take an extra hour for lunch....Do remotes from businesses where honored employee can be the employer for the day....Hold a free concert or club party for honored employees cited by offices that listen to midday show.

9

Panic Day

Run around all day in a panic, telling everyone you can't take it anymore. What makes this different from any other day at the station, we don't know. Contact: Tom or Ruth Roy (212) 388-8673.

Jocks act panicky on-air all day, from hyper-traffic reports ("The 405 is totally off-the-wall, walking would be faster!") to ominous weather reports, etc....On remotes, offer free (mock) tranquilizers....At mall, give away free massages or sensory deprivation tank trips to panicky listeners.

10

It Seemed To Be A Good Idea At The Time...

In 1876, Alex Graham Bell told some clown named Watson to drop by using a contraption called a phone.

Invite listeners to a dept./appliance store where hundreds of cellular phones are in a pile. Call one of the phones. Juliet Low founded the Girl Scouts in 1912 in Savannah, GA.

Jocks try to get admitted into girl scouts....Girl Scout cookie eating contest....Help Scouts sell cookies in off-the-wall locations such as Rock concerts, biker bars, outside of weight-loss centers, etc.

13

Good Samaritan Involvement Day

Emphasizes the importance of getting involved for those who need help. Started in 1964, after Kitty Genovese was killed in Queens, NY, as 38 neighbors watched and did nothing.

Find local tragedies and encourage listener involvement....Honor local good Samaritans with prizes and free dinners, etc....Have jocks do remotes at locations where they can help out the unfortunate.

14

Moth-er Day

A day to honor moth collectors and specialists. It's almost as good as getting them a life. Contact: (703) 533-3668.

At a club or a client store in a mall, hang a bar lightbulb from the ceiling. When you turn it on suddenly, whoever swarms around underneath it wins a prize....Dare people to fill their pockets with mothballs and go to work. The last person to be called for it wins....Moth wings sculpture contest; whoever designs and wears the most colorful wings wins.

15

True Confessions Day

Since it's good for your soul, go to work today and tell all. Then do the same at your nearest unemployment office. Contact: Tom or Ruth Roy (212) 388-8673.

Do "Spill Your Guts." Listeners confide their tackiest secrets on-air....For those who express longings for someone else, send jocks to the other person and tell him/her about the infatuation....Create a mobile confessional, take it on remotes and have listeners confess for prizes (secretly mic them).

The Ides Of March

Roman emperor Julius Caesar took his cuts in 44 BC.

"Beware of the Ides of March" drops for prizes....Throw a toga party....Bottled Caesar salad dressing drinking contest....Stab a Caesar mannequin with knives; whoever pulls out the knife with "Ides" written on the blade wins because "The Ides have it."

16

"La-la-la, nice layyydeeee!!!"

French-appeal comedian Jerry Lewis is 70 today.

Have Jerry Lewis impersonator sing Top 40 hits....Hold a Jerry Lewis telethon; people "donate" requests of Jerry Lewis-sung songs—and jocks cry every time you go to "the toteboard"....Come up with ideas for new diseases Lewis should host telethons for, such as Belchomia (loud belching), Nasalese (nose picking), etc.

Do an even shorter St. Patrick's Day Parade, consisting of midgets taking one step.... Or do a parade where everyone goes sideways down the street.... Have jocks and interns become smallest St. Pat's parade; take them to offices for remote parades.

Annual Coffee Cup Washing Day

An excuse for morning people and office workers to wash their coffee cups at least once a year. Contact: (317) 271-9799.

Go to offices and judge "Ugliest/Dirtiest Coffee Cup" contest.... Give away call-lettered coffee cups at offices personally to any office listening to station when you drop by. Include free coffee and donuts.... Have a jock go to offices and clean coffee cups, then offer to trade them in for station cups.

The Birds! The Birds! The Birds!

The date for the swallows to return to San Juan Capistrano.

Hold reunions for local high schools and colleges.... Hold a bird show.... Screen Hitchcock's The Birds.... Do a remote in a high-traffic area in a mound of birdseed, then see what happens.... Give prizes to people who get birdies on a golf course.

Great American Meatout

Publicizes animal abuse and encourages vegetarianism. Contact: (800) MEATOUT.

Vegetarian cook-off.... Start a campaign to publicize plant abuse by vegetarians.... Get a cow and paint the calls and "Don't Eat Me" on its side as you walk him around town.

Proposal Day

Men and women are encouraged to propose marriage to their true love on the first day of spring. Must be the slow season for the jewelry and floral businesses. Contact: John Michael O'Laughlin (214) 721-9975.

Offer to drive men to wherever their women are to propose on-air. (If it's a VW van, call it the Love Bug). Do as many in one day as possible and have local news teams tag along.... Encourage other on-air proposals for first dates—mundane things like propose to get a paper or some coffee.

Master Gardener Day

Spotlights the Master Gardener Program, which usually consists of a gardening course and volunteer work. Contact: (219) 426-9904.

Start a communal garden, listeners win plots to grow stuff.... Recruit listeners to donate to your (and the town's biggest) compost heap, then give the fertilizer away or sell it off for charity.... Give away flower seeds and start your own flower-planting campaign.

TORI AMOS (ATLANTIC/AG)

- Tori Amos was born in North Carolina, the daughter of a Methodist preacher.
- She grew up with the music of Fats Waller, Nat King Cole, Jimi Hendrix and John Lennon.
- A gifted prodigy, she could play the piano by the age of two-and-a-half and was composing musical scores by the age of four.
- At age five, she was sent off to the Peabody Conservatory in Baltimore. Everyone expected her to be a concert pianist, but she was more interested in freedom of expression than conformity.
- She was expelled at age 11 and spent the next several years playing Gershwin standards in the gay bars of Baltimore and Washington, D.C.



- After a mid-'80s Rock project, *Y Kant Tori Read?*, she returned to the piano and began composing the songs for her 1992 album, *Little Earthquakes*.
 - Recorded in rural Ireland and Louisiana, the latest album, *Boys For Pele*, was entirely written and produced by Tori.
 - Her new single is "Caught A Lite Sneeze."
- ## MARY J. BLIGE (UPTOWN/MCA)
- Mary J. Blige grew up in Slowbarn Projects Yonkers, New York, listening to The O'Jays, Sam Cooke and The Isley Brothers.
 - Years of practice in front of the mirror at home led to solo spots in the church choir and high school talent shows.
 - At 17, she sang and recorded a rendition of Anita Baker's "Rapture." It was given to Uptown CEO Andre Harrell and the rest is history.
 - In 1992, her debut album, *What's The 411?*, went double-Platinum with the help of her #1



- single, "Real Love."
- *My Life* is the autobiographical follow-up album executive-produced by Sean "Puffy" Combs and Andre Harrell.
- Blige recorded a remake of the Aretha Franklin classic, "(You Make Me Feel Like) A Natural Woman," for the soundtrack to Fox TV show, *New York Undercover*.
- Her latest project has her teaming up with some of music's hottest divas on the *Waiting To Exhale* soundtrack.
- The track is called "Not Gon' Cry."

KRIS KROSS (COLUMBIA/CRG)

- Seventeen-year-old Chris Kelly and 16-year-old Chris Smith were discovered five years ago in Atlanta's Greenbriar shopping mall.
- They were spotted by producer and So So Def Pres. Jermaine Dupri, who groomed them for success by refining their skills, writing their lyrics and giving them their trademark "Krossed Out" look.
- Kris Kross play all their own music—specifically, Kelly plays the piano and Smith plays the bass.
- They've been nominated for an MTV Award



and two Grammy Awards, and they've won two American Music Awards.

- The duo went on to tour Europe with superstar Michael Jackson, then headlined their own North American tour.
- The new album is called *Young, Rich and Dangerous* and there are guest appearances by label mate Da Brat and teen artist Aaliyah.
- "Tonight's Da Night" is the first single off the album.

- Most of the 13 songs on their debut album, *Resident Alien*, were written by Royston, with a couple of contributions from Antony.
- The first release, "In The Meantime," is rapidly moving up the Alternative charts.

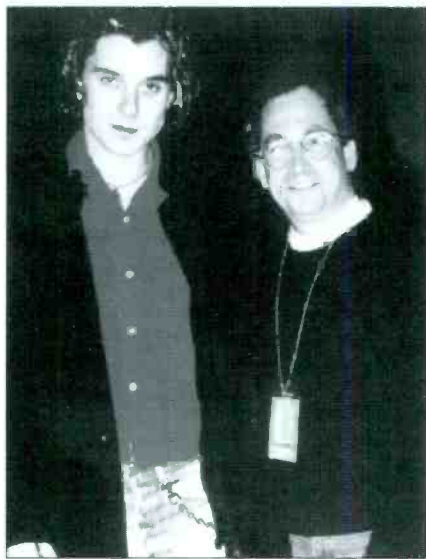

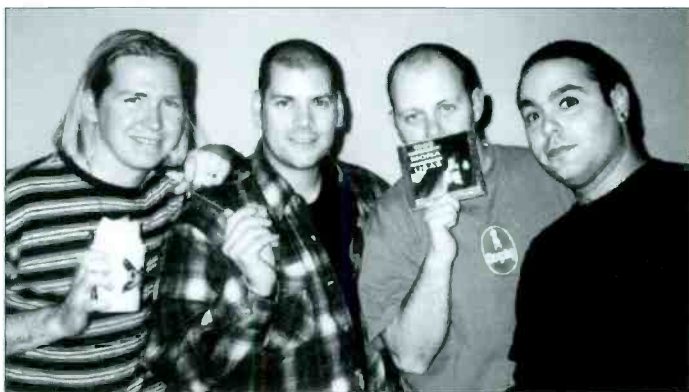
