

I've been busy as hell this week setting up a brand new radio station. KYMS, Santa Ana, is now "the Orange 106" otherwise known as O-The format is 106. contemporary, a blend of album and singles product. Even though it is located within the Los Angeles market, the station will have total Orange County focus with community involvement, as if L.A. does not exist. After all, Orange County has some 2 million people and O-106 covers everything between South L.A. county and North San Diego county. So it will serve the area that its signal covers (ala last week's column.) Full details about the Orange 106, its format and staff, in next week's R&R.

I had the pleasure of speaking with Ron Shawn, the radio editor of Zoo World, a major national rock music contemporary culture consumer oriented newspaper which available on a trade basis with one station per market. The newspaper is excellent and gives the appearance of being put out by the radio station itself through a custom made center spread for each individual market. Ron followed up our interview with a brochure that explained the product much better than I could -so I suggest that if no other station in your market is affiliated with Zoo World that you give Ron a call at (305) 564-6471.



RADIO

THE R&R INTERVIEW, PART 2

Right now with most radio stations having gone through a cycle of "Q" type formats and time-and-temperature disc jockeys or "Q" card reading jocks, where do you-find (if you were going to take your ideas and format) the talent you need that can actually be creative and talk if the young talent today has not been taught that or even experienced it?

Well all I can say is that we have changed medium market radio into major market radio. We sound better than major market radio. You can't have any fun in major market radio. They won't let you. They've lost their minds. I'm not going to say who it is, but for Christ's sake, everyone knows who it is or who they are. A guy gets into a radio station and all of a sudden he can't say anything. His radio station has to have a boom and a big serious voice and act like the people walking around in the streets have frowns on their faces and don't know how to laugh at

The radio station should be like a human being. It should have emotion. It should laugh, cry; it should be curious. And human beings have to change every single day according to how things are going and so do radio stations. If a human being is to survive he has to be loose for a few months, then a radio station has to be loose in the form of freedom, fun and having a good time. And when people get tired of that, then you tighten up the station.

The jocks that come here usually come from smaller stations or maybe stations a little larger. We hire young people with very flexible minds. You hear a tape of a guy and you hear his production and you figure that this guy has something even though he may sound a little straight at the time. You bring him to the station and after I blow the whistle in his ear a few times and move him around a couple of times on the air, he loosens up and he becomes a human being.


Do you try to run it like a family?

between your programming and
your disc jockies? Do you socialize
with them?

No, I'm not talking about that. Let's say that three ideas are put on the table and the jocks have two and I have one, and I say well I've decided we'll go with this idea. Now the jock can't go on the air and change that. It's not his job to do that. He won't lose his job if the station loses, but I will. My job is to run the radio station. Ideas are exchanged everyday and I either say it's a great idea or it isn't. When a jock comes to me with an idea about a promotion or something, he usually ends up putting it together himself because I don't have the ability to. The biggest joke in this company is me doing a commercial. I have trouble erasing a cart, but I do know what does sound good and I'm a stickler when somebody else does

I'm a perfectionist. I don't want any static on it. So when we put

something on the radio, it usually comes out sounding very good. Now we're a medium market station, but we sould like a big city, and to show how well we've done, John Lodge who was the midday guy, 20 years old, went from here to KHJ-Los Angeles. Jim Madison, who is 21 years old, is now working at WFIL. Tom Dooley worked here at one time and then went to KHJ. I guess I could go a bunch of places. The night kid at WAPE is working 6 to 10 at KFRC, and I didn't even know who he was. He came from Athens, Georgia to WAPE in Jackson and the next thing you know he's at KFRC!

Our kind of people seem to leave here and do well, so we must teach them something. But they did it quickly and were all young guys. But, when they came here, they weren't such hot stuff.

Does it bother you that you lose them? That you have to keep constantly changing?

You can't keep them. If we paid them \$300 a week and WFIL calls and offers them \$450, even though the \$300, here is worth more than the \$450 there, they leave.

That brings up a very interesting point. I have heard from many of

my friends in radio and T.V. also that \$50,000 a year in the South is a lot more money than say 75 or 80 thousand in New York or Chicago, or Los Angeles.

I can tell you right now it would be very hard to get a Jay Thomas out of North Carolina. I'm a wealthy young guy in Charlotte, North Carolina. When I say \$100,000 I'm not kidding. It's a lot of fish for any market if the management will let you do that. Most guys don't stay anyplace long enough. Longevity will do it. Now if you stay in a place ten years as a disc jockey and you make all this wonderful money and you spend it on hot cars and women and then you run out of gas (which we all do) and you get on the street, then that's stupid. You're a stupid guy. But, if you make all that money, you save it, you buy things, you get insurance and you plan, and you're more interested in your life than you are in your ego, then man, you're going to make it.

In four or five years, whether I want to or not, I'll be able to tell all of them to stick it and go some place. But I don't know if I'll want to do that. You've got to invest in your life if you want to make it. I

feel sorry for poor disc jockies. They want to work in radio and they don't know what to do with their lives after they get there. After their shift is over, they don't know what to do with themselves.

Radio is work to me. It's hard to go into radio -- it's real hard work. I don't like it. It's tough, I like to relax. But I have to work in radio to get that money that I want to have to be comfortable. I would like to tell every jock to remember that when you go into the big_city, make sure that you can make money. Make sure that you're not leaving for less money than the cost of living. Discuss it. And every jock that has ever left here has discussed it with Stan or me, or somebody in the building. They say I just got a job offer from so and so, what do you think? And I say "it's not enough money...; If that's what he wants to do, he has to go,

Some guys we'll offer more money to decide to stay. Some guys when offered a lot more money to leave will tell them the management of the station has gone bad and you probably won't stay there long, and they've got to believe you. If it's a good station,

for Christ's sake, you probably should go. If they have a chance at really succeeding, they really should go. Mike Adams from WRKO-Boston is from here. I'm very proud of this because there are all kinds of guys that will come here -- and you know sometimes the next guy you hire is better -and it takes them a few days to start sounding like the radio station. I don't know how it was done. I don't know if I do it or who does it, but it just happens. You put the kid off the street on the radio here and he sounds good and somebody's trying to hire him and all I can say is that's what keeps my job, I guess.

For Christ's sake, the record companies have lost their minds If they think that I'm a prick or anybody else is a prick because they haven't talked to me: You know you can call me on the telephone even though it's hard to get to me, but I go by the references of the people that work for me. And my reference is also from the people who've gone places because everyone looks at those big stations. I don't think that any station, that guys who left here went to, sound any better than WAYS. In fact, some of the guys have admitted that the station they went to from WAVS didn't sound as good, but the money made them leave. That's a sad situation, but, unfortunately, it's true.

When I'm talking about radio, though, I'm not talking about the 1964 radio where we have guys talking and stuff like that. We're a tight station. We have a pretty tight play list. But when we do something, it comes off good and we have fun inside the building sometimes and it makes a guy feel good about going on the radio even if he can't be Mr. Personality of

CONCERT REVIEW:

Barry White's Opening Night Quite A Sight

The Barry White Show, which opened at the Greek Theatre last week, is even more massive that the 275 pound Mr. White himself. Highlighted by the 38 piece Love Unlimited Orchestra, and featuring the Love Unlimited group, the entire proceeding was embellished by jets of water (illuminated by colored lights), all swinging and swaying to the lush, romantic music that hallmarks every Barry White production.

The Love Unlimited Orchestra set the mood of the evening with a beautifully paced set, culminated by their million-selling single, "Love's Theme." They gave way to the Love Unlimited female trio, whose hit "Walking In The Rain" was augmented by the voice of Barry White (at this point still unseen by the audience) during the song's spoken intro.

Finally, two hours after the show began, White appeared to an adoring crowd that was already in his pocket after the first number, "I Found Someone". By the time he got around to his better known material ("Never, Never Gonna Give Ya Up," etc) the audience response had become almost carnal in nature. It is to White's credit that he was able to pull off a between-everysong monologue about "The Joys Of Love," that would have certainly appeared overly corny in the hands of a lesser artist.



For fine summer programming, I don't think you will hear a nice, more programmable single than "It's Rainin" by Rick Derringer. Perfect for the tightplaylists as it's only two minutes long. It's as different and as commercial as any single that will cross your desk. We picked up nice additions in Boston, Philadelphia, Houston, Lancing, Seattle and Tacoma. You can't get hurt -- it's such a nice record.

Dave Loggins has gone top ten and I must thank everyone who started and broke the record and all of you now playing it. You've exposed a

very deserving and creative talent.

has one of the strongest records he

WOMBLES are furry little critters

with cute feet and dunce cap shaped faces (with round black things that look suspiciously like painted ping pong balls for noses (who live under Wimbledon Common and clean up affer big people. Besides being a great step forward for mankind's environment, they are the biggest thing to hit England since "you know who" ... and they happen to play great, fun music. Their new hit record called "Wombling Summer Party" is on many of America's great radio stations, and will be on many more between the time I tell this and you read it. With three records in England's Top 50, a TV show, and every form of Womble novelty known to the industry, these critters have taken over England and are in the midst of doing the same to the Colonies.

Progress report on Chicago's "Call On Me:" as this is written, it has broken through Denver's Top 10 at both KIMN an KTLK; is 11 at WFIL; 16, 19, and 7 at St. Louis' KSLQ, KXOK and KIRL. Has jumped 26-12 in Miami at WMYQ. With the reorders, it stands to be one of Chicago's biggest single hits.

The six months on Mac Davis' "One Hell Of A Woman" continues to pay off, as it is 13 on KHJ, 14 at KKDJ, 12 at K-100, and 11 at KEZY...which pretty well covers Los Angeles. NOTES FROM JONATHAN FRICKE:

Gilley Brings 'Flower' INSIDE INSIDE IN STORY

In the sixties, Flower Power was in vogue. Mickey Gilley may be bringing it back. Not only is he popular enough to carry his relatively unknown name and unknown label (Playboy) to number one, but now his second record for Playboy is really starting to make noise. "I Overlooked An Orchid" is styled much like "A Room Full of Roses" and its airplay pattern is beginning much the same as "Roses" did. Playboy may have another number one hit. Not bad for a record label that has been trying to have a chart record for three years.

Olivia Newton John's "If You Love Me" peaked over seven weeks ago, but is such a strong record that it continues to hold a top twenty position. Many program and music directors favor "Country Girl" from the album, but reportedly "I Love You, I Honestly Love You" will be the single. Time will tell if it was the right choice...

A very surprising record this week is Brian Collins' "A Statue of a Fool". It took a giant leap up the charts after hovering for weeks in the middle teens. It really couldn't happen for a nicer guy than Brian. Much has to be said for Dot records...especially Larry Baunach's dedicated belief in the record.

Another record that seemed to move sharply this week is Gary Stewart's RCA recording, "Drinkin' Thing."

Problems somewhere perhaps between lawyers and label seems to be holding the Marie Osmond single back. Although some stations have and are playing the record, other stations cannot obtain a copy from MGM. In the meantime, the revision of Dale and Grace's "I'm Leaving It (All) To You" by Donnie and Marie Osmond is doing very well. Seems almost to be a guaranteed chart item ... if there is such a thing.

The Pointer Sisters are gaining some footholds on the country charts at various stations. "Fairytale," the flip side of their current Blue Thumb rock hit is alive and well. Charted Number 8 at WINN, Louisville, and moved from 38 to 28 at WMC, Memphis. Top ten report from Cincinnati, and in the top twenty at about a

half a dozen other reporting stations.

The passing of **Dizzy Dean** was a shock to many in Music City for numerous reasons. Dizzy was as great a country music fan as there ever was. When he was TV'ing the game of the week back

in the mid-fifties, he would start singing his favorite country songs as quickly as Mickey Mantle would hit a home run. Dizzy always did pretty much as he pleased and those who knew him know he never really grew up. He had as much fun as anybody. Dizzie Dean was one of the celebrities who came from the first music city pro-am celebrity golf tourney in 1967. And Roy Acuff and Dizzy Dean were best of friends. In fact, Dizzy's favorite (and Roy got some good performance royalities from Dizzy's spontaneous performances) "Wabash Cannonball," was Dizzy's favorite song.

As of presstime, Ezra Carter, Father of the Carter Sisters, Helen, Anita and June (Mrs. Johnny Cash) and husband of Mother Maybelle Carter, was in serious condition and Doctors had attached a pacemaker machine to help in his breathing. Mr. Carter is 76 years old, brother of A.P. Carter, the patriarch of the legendary Carter family. A. P. Carter died in 1960. Maybelle and Sarah are the surviving members of the original group.

George Cooper, who retired early 1974 after many years as head of Nashville American Federation of Musicians, Local 257, died last Wednesday (17th) after heart surgery. Mr. Cooper headed the Nashville local through the formative and growth years while the Nashville music scene was becoming "Music City." Mr. Cooper's son, George Cooper III, is an independent record promotion man and publishes a trade weekly promopaper called "Country Collage."

Paul and Linda McCartney and their three kids left town and headed for New York last week, after spending six weeks around They rented Curly Putman's place near Lebanon for \$2,000 a week while Curly and his family were on vacation. What did he do

while here? "We visited Johnny & June Cash, Chet and Leona Atkins, the old and new Opry Houses, Printer's Alley and several drive-in movies. That's about our speed, drive-in movies. Had a session at Chet's, ended up making a record with Chet, Floyd Cramer and some brass guys theyy knew, and we had Lloyd Green, Vassar Clements, and Johnny Gimble. It was a song, "Eloise," my Dad (he's 70) wrote 20 years ago. Then we made a song called "Sally G" which I wrote after a visit to a club in Printer's Alley. I think these songs might go into an album we are going to put out next winter called "Cold Cuts."

Why did you come to Nashville? "We wanted to relax some and, hopefully, write some, and Nashville has good musical surroundings." Paul said he made some promises to write songs for several Nashville musicians, though he doubts about keeping them. "It's amazing the people who want songs -- like Johnny Cash and Charlie Rich.

Last Friday night (19th) was Marty Robbins Night at Nashville Speedway. As many race fans and professionals were there as there were music fans. Racing people from all over the Southeast were there. Marty told me once that he sings so he can afford to run the stocks. Marty also loves to work his farm. When Governor Dunn presented him with the Honorary Tennessee Colelcy, he asked what Marty had been involved in lately. Marty very calmly said: "Gettin' the hay in."

He created the vocal harmony, lead guitars and fiddle sounds on all Buck Owen's records and shows for 14 years.

He died in a motorcycle accident at 10:45 P.M., Wednesday, July 17th, 1974 near Morrow Bay, California on the way to meet his wife Marlene for a fishing holiday.


He is survived, in addition to his wife, by sons Vic and Vance, and his Mother in Olympia, Washington, his hometown.


He was a powerful, quiet force in the Buck Owen's music dynasty he helped build, the value of which cannot be calculated.

He was Buck's musical right hand. Don Rich was Buck Owen's best friend.




SIMPLY PUT: The levels (0% to 100%) represent a record's increasing or decreasing popularity with the "general mass audience" for the format being graphed.
