
MUMS RECORDS LEAVES CBS

RE-DEFINING THE PARALLELS

The recent changes in Rock Radio have caused us to re-evaluate and re-define the Parallels.

Because of longer playlists, dayparting and LP cut play, the former definitions that came about 2 years ago are no longer applicable.

Today we must define a station by its position in the market, its ability to influence record sales in its market, and its influence on other stations in its region and even nationally. The new definitions are as follows:

Parallel I: Major market stations (top 30 markets) that are formal dominant*in their market and/or are the major sales influence. These stations usually play under 35 records in total.

Parallel II: Key stations outside the top 30 markets that are format dominant in their respective markets, and influence rack huying patterns for their region. This catagory also will include some major market stations that are not the dominant ratings/sales influence, but have demonstrated importance in their respective markets. These stations will usually be programming 35 or less total current selections.

Parallel III: All other reporting stations. This parallel will cover stations with long playlists. It also will cover secondary reporters that are not the format dominant station in their market but influence the market considerably.

These new definitions still strive to keep a similiarity within the individual Parallels. The similarities are now on market—dominance—within the format and playlist size and rotation factor all combined. It will be the exception to have more than one station from each market in the same Parallel.

We feel this new definition better reflects the changes in Contemporary Rock Radio, and allows for a better parallel between stations.

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RADIO

R&R: Can you briefly describe what "ERA" is?

DUFF: Well, we're a multiple approach research group. We come in and do a whole chister of research types. We do research similar to every one else's attitudinal research. where we do interviews and talk to a lot of people and see what they say. That's essentially where other research stops and then it gets into interpretation. They try to infer behavior from what people say. We'll go in and we'll interview a 1000 people, and that 1000 people will all be in a fairly narrow description of a sample, they may be all 25-49 for a middle of the road

R&R: You go into the market you're surveying for? You don't do it all out of Texas or somewhere else?

DUFF: No. we go into the market itself and survey a thousand local folk. These 1000 will all he heavy radio listeners, and they'll all be in the right age and sex group. That gives us one source of data. Then we go in and we do panel testing. We select large panels of anywhere from 40 to 80 depending on the size of the study, and do all the hehavioral observation research, which is our main thing. On the theory that people really don't know, or if they do know down inside they can't arti-culate, what it is that programmers have to get a handle on, to make decisions. You've got somehody that used to listen to our station 2 hours a day, and sometime in the last 6 months he's cut down to one hour a day. You can ask him a hundred questions and possibly never find out. he's not aware of why he tunes out sooner, he doesn't know or can't tell you what it is that chases him off, or what it is on another station that won him away. Even though they'll try, people will try to tell you. they hate to tell you they don't know, so they'll tell you something. R&R: When you test for this.

R&R: When you test for this, are you testing with an audio check of the radio station and then looking for what makes them go away?

DUFF: Right, we check a whole series of audio tapes. 160, 180 minutes of tape.

R&R: It's still in the interpretation of the reader, rather than the answers of the person being tested am I correct? DUFF: Right. Although we get a lot of answers out of the people being tested. We do a series of things on the group. the model audience. We build out of the 1000 sample we take in the field a model of the station's target audience, age, sex. socio-economics and current listening patterns. We assemble a very carefully con-structed model of their target audience and we test these people. We test them with emotional response measureWILLIS DUFF

did that finally. The other piece of information that came out of it was that it was frequently filled out by the 35-49 year old women member of the family, for the teens and for the men and everything else. Our audience reaction analyzer is that there's no memory involved, they're telling us what they think as it happens. So we by-pass the memory circuit altogether. They're giving us moment to moment votes. We analyze those, we see how the votes are distributed, how many people were voting what. We score it, we treat it numerically, and we analyze it for tune-out indicators.

R&E: Let me ask you one thing, I realize that you're dealing a lot of times in this kind of research with the subconscious level, where people are reacting, not knowing why they're reacting to certain things, especially with the Galvanic skin response. My question has always been about anything to do with that

kind of research, when you take a bunch of people and you put them in a room, assembled and you start testing them, are they not under a different mental atmosphere different mental atmosphere than they would be either listening to a radio station in their car, or at home getting dressed, or a girl putting up her rollers, or at night doing her homework, whatever the case may be. In other words, even though you can play dayparted tapes, is there not a body chemistry that gets affected. For example if you're testing a person at 9 o'clock in the morning even if you try and come close to day parts, they're not doing the same activities, they had to get dressed to come to your place, therefore they could not be really reacting the way they do when they get dressed and go through the normal routine. DUFF: Sure, there's no ques-tion about that. This is a laboratory testing technique. It differs from real life listening circumstances in a whole bunch of ways. Nobody listens to the radio sitting in a hotel room with 40 other people wired into a machine. But all our testing is conducted under exactly the same circumstances. All of our normative data is based on this. All of our background research says that as long as we get roughly in the right daypart as long as we get morning material in mornings and afternoon and evening material in afternoon, that we're dealing with essen-tially the same body chemistries. Now the psychology of an individual's personal day, if you're listening to the radio with 4 screaming kids around you, is undoubtedly different. R&R: But how do you find out if a person likes uptempo music in the morning and

would like to reject the down tempo and mellow music? How would you find out if he doesn't want to hear certain kinds of news in specific dayparts if you're not doing it then. Isn't there more that could be done?

DUFF: In the first place we get the emotinal response measures. We find the quantity and the quality of the emotional response. We see that these people are getting off on music acts or presentation acts and we see how much they're getting off and we see how much of emotional response is positive generic response and how much of it is irritation. We get simultaneously on the same program information another line of data out of the audience reaction analyzer. Then perception tests on the jocks or the newspeople or whoever. Then at the end of the day, after it's all over, we have long discussion technique where we mix encounter techniques and focus group techniques. We've got from this very well selected panel, we have 4 inputs, we have our own observations. In the discussion groups we get that sort of thing, like I really can't stand the music to be too hard at 6 o'clock in the morning, or don't tell me about last night's TV news in the morning newscast, that sort of thing. We get a tremendous amount of at-titudinal input out of the focus groups. You know, focus group research is all the rage, practically everybody buys it.

and we've developed the same kind of data. Unless you could go into somebody house in the morning and wire them up while they're fixing breakfast, you would probably never get behavioral observation research, that has exact similarities with real listening circumstances. But, we put the people, for instance, we give them a psy-chological set that probably improves the data, we think it does, we've done it with and without it, and we think it improves the data, where when they're listening to the morning daypart, we ask them to put themselves in the frame of mind that they normally are listening to the radio at 7:30 in the morning, whatever that part is that we're checking. And we've re-established that mental set before each test. The dynamics of being tested in a room with a bunch of people is reduced to its minimum by the fact that we convince all the people we test of their anonymity.

RAR: Do you run any control tests on them? Do you try to get a universal sampling, or numbers or anything like that? DUFF: We have an on-going control situation in that we can compare the numbers that we get on specific records with the Dallas test group record. This gives us a continuing base-line to work with.

ments. I)r. Turicchi's magic weenie, we test a moment by moment real time conscious attitude testing with an audience reaction analyzer.

R&R: What is an audience reaction analyzer?


DUFF: An audience reaction analyzer is a voting machine essentially. It's similar to that used by ASI. Preview House and the Blue Button that CBS made famous, but it's our own version, a four button box where people are giving us moment to moment attitudes about what they think about what they're hearing right now. If they really love it, they press the top button, if they hate it at a tune-out level. they press the bottom button. and they have two buttons inbetween as scalers, they sort of hate it or they sort of like it. We scan that every 10 seconds, one of the problems of attitudinal research or any research that doesn't happen right on the spot is a memory problem. People, 2 hours after they have heard something, it is our estimate, only recall about 20 percent of the specifics of their reaction to some-

R&R: Must make it very hard to fill out an ARB diary.

DUFF: I've heard this research quoted so often I know somebody did it. I've just never been able to pin it down, someone did a study on people filling out diaries. and there was a tremendous amount of it done the day after, and frequently not done by the person who did the listening.

R&R: Pulse did their own thing to fight the ARB diary. I guess a year and a half, two years ago when they sent out a diary and then went in earlier than had been scheduled and found most all filled out. DUFF: I'm pleased to know who

The same music inevitable in every study that we are testing concurrently in Dallas. We can get an overall level of emotional response. we can calibrate the group, if we get a group in St. Louis that happens to be a little hotter physiologically than our normal run of groups we can immediately recognize that and instead of giving every program element a 10 percent too high score. we can adjust it. So we have that kind of control.

RAR: I realize the Dallas operation Turicchi runs is not yours, he's in that with other people. But since you're using that for control, let me just bring up one thing. I have never been able to understand when, it seems to have been proven by Top 40 radio at least in the last several years that familiarity of certain records really increases their reception and their likeness by the audience. How do you account for the fact that maybe it takes 3 or 5 or 10 times for someone to finally hear a record, or hear it in different parts on the radio, and then put it all together and ten say "hey I like that."

DUFF: We think it takes from 6 to 8 times, as a matter of fact. The first time they hear it, to me it's the most interesting part of the record testing business that Tom does. A record that's gonna be a hit, will give us, on first hearing, people are listening to totally new music, we'll get the emotional response of a hit re-cord. The conscious response be way down, it's unfamiliar music, they don't know it, they'll even tell us afterwards that they didn't like it. They don't know that they got off on it, and our dual lines of data. Turicchi has started using exactly the same techniques that we use for evaluating programming now. he also has the 4 button audience reaction analyzer. Well that thing, which reflects what people consciously thing, with new and unfamiliar music will give quite low scores at first, and then at the 6th or the 8th exposure, on the average for teen to 24's, when it has reached a familiarity level, the conscious response will have come up to the emotional response level. And then they'll stay fairly parallel throughout the product life of a record, and then as it gets to the burn-out stage, or the fatigue factor, the emotional response will roll off severely. Yet the conscious reaction will stay high for weeks afterward. They're still saying they like it, they know it. they recognize it, they've been saying they like it for the last 13 weeks, they'll say they like it again, til finally it get through to their conscious level that really the song turns them off now, ve heard it too much.

R&R: Let's say we have a dominant radio station in a market, and instead of playing 25 records, they now increase their list to 30, but they make it a point that with the new records they add, instead of doing what most people do, having a hot rotation for the

super hits, let's say the new records went into sort of the "A" rotation, the hot rotation, therefore increasing the audience's chances of hearing it, 6 or 8 times over the first week. Would it be possible then to say that we would have more records that are acceptable?

DUFF: If the records were destined to be hits, if they're hit material. if they cause a good emotional response that we know relates directly to its hit potential.

R&R: Let's say Turicchi's testing records. Say we're able to decide that there are possible 15 records this month that are available that are tested in the high 36's, that means that moet likely most top 40, or top 20 radio stations could add those 15 records, put them in a fairly good rotation, and they would not be hurt. They probably would be nurt less than keeping an Elton John "Pinball Wizard" on longer, not knowing what the burn-out factor was.

DUFF: If they don't know the burn-out factor, one the biggests tune-outs that happens to a radio station after awhile is records at the hurn-out point. If you go 2 to 3 weeks beyond, if you go a week or two beyond where the conscious response starts outstripping the unconscious response, you start getting into trouble, it becomes a big tuneout. But, the new music is more dangerous, even if it's hitbound, because in that period of time between the first time they hear it and the 6th or 8th time they hear it, where their conscious reaction is still saying "I don't know what that song is, I don't know whether I like it or not,' those things are tune-outs. Even if it's gonnna be a hit, it's gonna be a hit next week, next week it's gonna be the thing that's the hottest thing on your radio station. This week it could be a tune-out because it hasn't reached that level yet. R&R: Then how do you find

R&R: Then how do you find when to add records? DUFF: I know the problem.

R&R: It will be unfamiliar, unless there's another radio station playing it in town that shares your audience.

DUFF: All radio stations have got to break some new product, irrespective of their conservatism, unless they insist somebody else makes it a hit before they play it, and that's the safest thing to do, and there's no question about it. If you've got a way to expose new product, without putting yourself in danger, if it's not in high rotation, and is always surrounded by hits, then you've got a good way particularly in smaller markets where you're the only top 40 station in town, and who the hell's gonna expose it if you don't, how's that gonna happen, and even if it's becoming a hit, if it's not getting any exposure in your market and it's becoming a hit nation-wide, unless it's being exposed on national media you're still running, you almost have to break in records on your station, but you better do it softly. You better not get a new record, even a hitbound record, in high rotation until it reaches a familiarity level.

R&R:What would happen if there was a weekly TV show, like say "Your Hit Parade" that was able to, on top of playing the hits, expose one or two new strong pieces of product, would you say that the television impact would effect radio station? And obviously the familiarity level?

DUFF: Oh sure. It would be great for the record business too. There should be places where new product gets more exposure than it does, because so many operators have had the experience of seeing a direct relationship between the amount of new product they're playing and their ratings. That we've got a nation full of fairly conservative top 40 PD's now, who are wary, and rightfully so of exposing a lot of new music, or exposing it with any sort of heavy rotation.

RaR: How do you account for the success, in the recent ARB's, of the album oriented rock stations, which are playing a lot wider selection, and obviously more unfamiliar music

DUFF: Or how could you ex-

plain the whole early success of progressive radio.

RaR: Progressive radio at one time was really hitting on one demographic. If you look at a WPLJ and a KLOS, of KPRI and WSHE, you're looking at radio stations that are holding strong 18 to 35 or up to 40 year old demographics and coming up really strong in teens. They're becoming the top 40. I'm not really saying that as a fact, I'm just saying it looks that way, they are becoming the general audience of contemporary music. I'm just asking how do you explain that. They're playing not necessarily a lot of new product, they're just playing a wider variety.

DUFF: You have the whole

business of the familiarity petterns, where does familiarity come from? Albums accounting for what, 80 percent of the dollar volume of record sales.

R&R: Yeah, I think singles are down to about 12 or 13 percent now.

DUFF: Oh, discouraging. You have familiarity coming from a lot of sources other than high exposure on the radio.

R&R: That's a good point, it just dawned on me, if there's only 12 or 13 percent buying singles, and there's 60 some odd buying the contemporary rock albums, therefore those people buying the albums take it home and are more familiar with it than they are the single.

DUFF: The whole business of presentation and style, the music is overwhelmingly important at a music radio station. directly important in ratio to the public's expectation of the station. If the public thinks it's a music station, the higher that perception the more important the music per-se is. But when you get into album oriented stations, you have generally a station person-ality. Even KLOS and WSHE stations like that have significant station personali-ties, a lot of expectations, that have to do with something other than the music, even though they're totally music radio stations. How the music is pre-sented, the relationship between the jocks and the music.

how it's sold to the public, there are other ways to sell the music than familiarity, and there are other ways to build familiarity than repetition.

R&R: Let's go back to ERA. Have you found any market similarities? DUFF: Tremendous similari-

ties, every market has its own pecularities and differences, but the same-ness of humanity is a humbling thing to see; but it's really there. We work on a general concept of chosing our testing samples and how we decide who a station's target audience is. Most stations don't really know. You go in and say who's your target, you spend a long time with them helping them to find who their target is, because they haven't thought in those terms. If you describe people in two ways, if you describe them in terms of socio-eco-nomic factors that help you predict their response medium, if you combine look at their education, and of their mode of income. whether they're salaried or whether they're commissioned or fees. what type of responsibilities they have in their job. what kind of job they have, and what kind of company they work for, or whether they work for themselves, whether they're heads of households. sizes of families: that sort of information, and you assign people based on that data, you assign people into socio-économic class, or upper-lower. or a lower-middle, you assign them a nitch by these stan-dards. You look and say a socio-economic class, a lower middle class person in Topeka. in Boston and Seattle and San Francisco, they're response to media is remarkably the same. Then you define the target audience with another definition. and that is what tastes do they demonstrate by their current listening patterns? If you're testing for a middle of the road radio station, and you simply go through large sample and you look for people that somewhere in their listening pattern includes middle of the road radio, you get the right socio-economic classes and the right current listening pattern. You have a group of people who, with the exceptions of the local pecularities of a market, things as the longevity of personalities, or the history of a given radio station, like KLIF in Dallas, that sort of thing, a station with a long history in the same format. Once you remove those elements they will respond remarkably similar to social class or middle of the road people in practically any other market.

RE-DEFINING THE PARALLELS

The recent changes in Rock Radio have caused us to re-evaluate and re-define the Parallels.

Because of longer playlists, dayparting and LP cut play, the former definitions that came about 2 years ago are no longer applicable.

Today we must define a station by its position in the market. its ability to influence record sales in its market, and its influence on other stations in its region and even nationally. The new definitions are as follows:

Parallel I; Major market stations (top 30 markets) that are format dominant*in their market and/or are the major sales influence. These stations usually play under 35 records in total.

Parallel II: Key stations outside the top 30 markets that are format dominant in their respective markets, and influence rack buying patterns for their region. This catagory also will include some major market stations that are not the dominant ratings/sales influence, but have demonstrated importance in their respective markets. These stations will usually be programming 35 or less total current selections.

Parallel III: All other reporting stations. This parallel will cover stations with long playlists. It also will cover secondary reporters that are not the format dominant station in their market but influence the market considerably.

These new definitions still strive to keep a similiarity within the individual Parallels. The similarities are now on market dominance within the format and playlist size and rotation factor all combined. It will be the exception to have more than one station from each market in the same Parallel.

We feel this new definition better reflects the changes in Contemporary Rock Radio, and allows for a better parallel between stations.

The next time a record company executive tells you that he does "FM Promotion". ask him if he sells FM radios or if he promotes records to Classical, Religious, Top 40, and Background Music radio stations.

At one time, their were two types of commercial radio stations: real ones and FM ones. I recall back in the 60's, when I was breaking into FM radio, people would say things like, "I don't listen to your station because you need a special radio to pick it up." It was the second class standing of FM however that gave the original pioneers of the Progressive Rock format the opportunity to get the ball rolling because, hell, there wasn't much to lose. Nevertheless, that's all just history.

Unfortunately, in spite of the fact that it's 1975 and the commercial bands have become both equal and integrated, and the bastard child format of the late 60's has become a dominant force to be reckoned with, a great number of people in our industry, even AOR radio people, still work under the labels and use terminology that is discriminatory and creates the false illusion that the Progressive Rock radio genre is of lesser quality and importance than other popular music formats. At this point in time that is both unjustified and destructive.

What was, was and what is, is. These are the facts:

AOR RADIO IS BIG BUSINESS.
SOME OF THE SMARTEST. MOST
PROGRAMMERS ARE IN AOR.
EVEN THOUGH MOST AOR STATIONS ARE ON THE FM BAND,
THE TWO ARE NOT SYNONYMOUS.

"So what?", you may say. Here's why it is important that the old misconceptions get cleared up fast. The industry has all too long been using the cloudy, undefinable image of Progressive Rock radio as a crutch and a screen to avoid giving it the attention and recognition it deserves. The trades have been dominated by singles programmers who've never had to share the spotlight with their album programming counterparts. The impression has been given that there are ONLY A HANDFUL OF IMPORTANT PROGRESSIVE ROCK STATIONS IN THE COUNTRY. In most markets, guys who are pulling less ratings than AOR radio people are making more money.

To sight an example, a good AOR programmer, who will go unnamed, was discussing the possibility of joining a big Top 40 chain with the head of that company, who will also go unnamed. The executive said, "I know that you've built a good reputation and that you've pulled impressive numbers....but have you ever programmed a Rock N' Roll radio station?" The programmer replied, "What the hell do you think I've been programming.... elephant farts?"

You see, for too many years, what has been commonly

You see, for too many years, what has been commonly known as Progressive Radio, has been labeled and described by subjective adjectives as opposed to objective nouns that you can get a handle on. "Underground", "Freeform", "Progressive", "Cosmic", and all the other relics are the last obstacles in the path to total maturity. In order to live up to the false and outdated standards that these labels imposed, radio stations were killing themselves. The record companies encouraged this process. The trades provided an arena for it. "ALBUM ORIENTED ROCK" tells it like it is. Quality is determined by success. Success is measured any way the individual station wants it to be, based upon their individual goals.

It is very satisfying to see the tide turning. Radio stations, record companies, and the trades are taking a different view of AOR radio. Whatever will help AOR Radio is good for everybody. You'll notice that after years of stagnation, we are starting to see a changing view and treatment of the genre. All I can say is, it's about time. Anyone party to this industry who does not make the necessary adjustments, and fast, will find themselves obsolete. In reality, one must keep an open mind to constructive change to truly be "progressive".

What's really funny is that it is now Top 40 radio that is having a difficult time knowing what it is and what to call itself.





HAROLD CHILDS, Vice Presdent in charge of Promotion. A&M Records. BIRTHDATE: May 8th BIRTHPLACE: Philadelphia. Pennsylvania SIGN:Taurus

If you happened to be in Savoy's Record store in Philadelphia in the 1950's and ran into a pint sized salesman dressed in a coat and tie pushing the latest Chuck Jackson, and Don Covay records... that was Harold. As he puts it "I was twelve going on thirtyseven! I loved selling records and also got involved in radio by holding down a second job as a runner for Buzz Curtis who was a promotion man at Mainline Distributing. He held record hops in conjunction with WIBG's Donahue, Jerry Stevenson and Hy Lit. After working at the store during the day. I would go to the hops that Buzzy was putting on and set up the equipment and play the records until the disc jockey got there. One night Gene Chandler was supposed to appear and lip sync to his "Duke Of Earl" song. Chandler didn't show and Buzzy conned me into donning a tuxedo and top hat and pretending I was the Duke of Earl. I ended up lip synching that song at six hops in one night. The only line I blew was when I had to sing "Dukedom". I cracked up everytime I had to sing it. A few weeks later we were back at the same hop and a bunch of these tough looking kids came up to me and said. "hey man weren't you the Duke Of Earl a few weeks ago?" And I said 'no" and they beat me to a pulp!

I worked for the store and Buzzy all through school and then went to work at Marnell Distributors as a promotion man after I graduated. I worked for Larry Cohen, who now works for U.A., for about a year. Then I got a job in promotion working for Liberty Records. One of the things I remember about Liberty is when they had their national convention, my roomate was the Atlanta promotion man. Mac Davis. I didn't mind rooming with Mac except that he flew his confederate flag in the room the entire time we were there. But, we got along great! After I had been working with Liberty for about two months, I was offered a re-gional spot at RCA to work for John Rosica. That was in 1964 when Rosica was the National Promotion Director. There were eight of us then. most of whom are now national men. We had Stan' Monteiro, Harvey Cooper, Augie Bloom. Chuck Meyer, Nat

Lapattan. Gordon Bossin, Joe Walker and myself. My territory included Philadelphia. Pittsburgh. Baltimore and Washington, I had only been with them a short time when I got my first artist relations assignment. Rosica wanted me to meet Eddy Arnold at the airport who was going to appear at a concert in town. So I put on my RCA blazer with the crest and my blue tie and went to meet him. I walked up to him and said "Mr. Arnold. I'm Harold Childs. I'm the RCA rep for this area." He kind of looked at me, startled or whatever. but we got along well together and the whole weekend went perfectly. Monday morning Rosica calls me and says "I just got a call from Eddy Arnold." I thought "alright, what the hell did I Arnold had said to "John. I didn't know we had a colored guy working for us?" And John said "is he?" That was John Rosica for you! He was great and I spent two and a half years working for him.

It was fascinating doing promotion in those days because the music was changing and along with it the image of the record business. That was ten years ago and RCA was just getting into rock. Our big acts were Barry Sadler with "The Green Berets," Ed Ames. Jose Feliciano, Eddy Arnold, etc. Then we got the Jefferson Airplane who came into Philadelphia for a promotional in-troduction and there I was again at the airport in my blue RCA blazer to meet them. There were no long haired kids in Philadelphia then and the people at the airport freaked out when they saw the Airplane. In those days no one didn't wear a bra so Gracie Slick caused somewhat of a sensation! It was incredible to be walking through the airport with everyone turning their heads and you could see what was running through their minds: "Who are they?" "What do they do?" "What are they?" We had a big party for them with the white linen table cloths and the uniformed guys serving dinner — the whole number. We invited the distributors. the sales and radio people and they just couldn't believe the Airplane. They kept saying "where did you get those freaks; what is this: what is happening to this



industry?" It was really a radical change for a lot of people. But their records happened and it was a new era.I remember taking the Air-plane's "White Rabbit" single into Dean Tyler at WIP and the song was in the twenties nationally, but he wouldn't play it. He said "I'm not going to play it because it has a dope lyric." It was one of the few times I got upset because the record was a legitimate hit end I said to him "my com-eny, RCA Victor...all those tubes. all those transmitters you see in front of you...they all belong to my company and I will not stand for you not playing my "White Rabbit!" And he threw me out! I was banned from the station for awhile, but he let me come back in eventually. He never did play the record though. We ended up being friends. It was just a strange period of transition to the hard rock for a lot of stations and record companies.

I had worked for Rosics for about two years when he left to run A&M's CTI lable. Bill Mulhearn was running the New York A&M offices and offered me a job to be the National Album Promotion Director for the label which I took and moved to Los Angeles. That was in 1967 and the whole Rock thing was really taking off. One of the first things I go into was traveling around the country talking to the FM stations. One night I was taking two FM radio station men to dinner at my hotel. One of them was the PD at the biggest FM station in Cincinnati, but the hotel wouldn't let them into into the

wouldn't let them into into the dining room because they were in jeans. I had my coat and tie on so I was cool; but in those days wearing jeans was worse than being black! I continued to do the album promotion for about a year. Then Rosica left and I moved back to New York to handle sales and promotion for CTI. I worked there for a year when Bill Mulhearn left and I took over the New York offices for A&M and remained in that job for the next two and half years. Then Jerry Moss and Bob Fead asked me to come back to Los Angeles to take over the National Promotion job which was almost five years and

At that time, we only had about six guys around the country doing promotion for A&M and we worked through the independents. The label had Sergio Mendez, Baja Marimba. Herb Alpert, Lee Michaels, Quincy Jones, Wes Montgomery and Herbie Mann who was selling a lot of records; the rock scene still wasn't that heavy at A&M. My inh was to come back to L.A. and start a promotion department. That was the time that distribution was changing around the country and we felt we had to have our own people. The independent distributors have always been great for us. They were all the distributors that had started with A&M and nursed us along and believed in us. Those guys really did a job for us like Jim Schwartz and Shelton and Harold Lipschitz. But it was a changing time in the industry and the competition was so heavy out on the streets. Everyone else had their own people and we felt

we had to have our own men. The independents had so many lines and they could only do so much. We wanted our own men to concentrate just on A&M in conjunction with the independents. I started out with fifteen men and built it up to thirty around the country right now.

When I came back to L.A., I

was very lucky as several of our acts were starting to break wide open. When I got there The Carpenters had just come out with "Close To You" and Cat Stevens had just broken very strong as had Joe Cocker. Within a period of six months after I had moved back, all these acts started happening and we began hiring people and the company just started mushrooming. Promotion was so different then; it was really a trip. You didn't have the consultants then: there was Drake, Harv Moore, Dean Tyler, Jay Cook, It was a whole different feel. You had to individually know the PD and they were playing a lot more records: there was much more excitement going on. It was a personal thing between the promotion guys and the radio people. Then about a year and a half ago. I was made a Vice President which was a pleasant sur-prize. Bob Fead was VP in charge of sales/promotion. He's an extremely knowledgable guy and great to work for. He and I were running the promotion department and he answered for it, but always left it up to me to run it. So making me a Vice President was a surprize because we were still relatively small. I'm still getting used to it! Working in promotion at A&M is especially satisfying because Jerry Moss is a record man, did promotion. and under-stands the problems that come

All of us in country music were deeply saddened from the news of the death of country great LEFTY FRIZZELL. Frizzell, who was 47 at the time of his death last Saturday, was born William Orville Frizzell and was given the name "Lefty" because of his southpaw boxing knockouts while a teenager and health in the Normal was proven the same "Carrieves and the Normal was proven the same of the same o while in the Navy. He was originally from Corsicana, Texas. In 1950 his first release on Columbia records, "If You've Got The Money, I've Got The Time" and "I Love You A Thousand Ways," both became number one hits. And in 1952 he had four songs in the top 10 at one time. No other country artist has ever equalled that feat. The songs were "Mom and Dad Waltz,"
"I Love You A Thousand Ways," "Always Late," and "Travelin'
Blues." To my mind he was one of the greatest blues singers in the world and will be missed.

BOB PITTMAN has just been appointed Operations
Manager of WMAQ in Chicago. Bob told me he'll continue to
supervise the music of WMAQ, but will be more involved with promotions for on-the-air use, as well as production. For the time being, he'll remain on the air in the afternoon slot, 3-6 p.m...ED CHANDLER of KSON, San Diego was just named the Operations Manager of that country outlet in Southern

Talked with BOB FULLER this morning about some music policy changes at WSLR, Akron. After a weekend visit the LEE SHERWOOD, BOB PITTMAN and CHARLIE WARNER of WMAQ, WSLR is going to make a drastic cutback in their playlist. The station will now be playing 30 current hits, plus 10 extras. Fuller, said, "We really are not looking to break records anymore. Our goal is to play only the cream of the crop. After our visit with the staff at WMAQ, we felt the short playlist is the only way to go." Among the other recent changes to a shorter list are KBOX, Dallas and WHN, New York. I remember when I was at KSON, we cut the list back and the ratings increased. It doesnt matter what area you're in, people like to hear the hits, old and new. I don't feel a radio station, country or otherwise, should be responsible to play just anything that comes out. It's the responsibility of each radio station, in any market, to research that market and find what formula will get them the biggest audience. Some will say, "The short playlist will prevent breaking new artists." That's true to a certain degree, but if that new artist has a strong enough record it will be played. Plus, the shorter lists will make the established artist put out better quality product. Shorter lists mean more rotations for the current records, therefore when a record is put on one of these stations it will get far more exposure, which could mean more sales. [Let me get off my soapbox and on with the column:]

Rich Tortone, etc. all around the country that are motivated guys that get out and hustle. They're the ones that are doing it. You may get an award for this or that, but every National Promotion Director has to know that it has to be shared with the men in the field. I've seen it all happen from Bill Haley to the Beatles to where it is today and to be there, actually on the street, is the exciting part of it. It's much more multifaceted today. You just don't go out and get your record on the radio and then go home. You get heavily involved in the marketing aspect as well. My Mom still doesn't understand what I do. She always says "you mean they pay you for trying to get records played on the radio?"
