The following summaries are from the just released April/May 1976 Arbitrons. Figures used are Monday-Sunday 6am to 12 midnight, Metro 1/4 hour shares for total persons 12 plus, unless specified otherwise.

DETROIT

WJR (P/A) still dominant, up 13.3 to 15.1. In the contemporary battle **WRIF** (A) pulls up to number 2 in the market with a 6.2, up from 5.4, and interestingly this format is also tops in teens with a 20.8. **CKLW** has 15.9 in teens and **WDRQ** a 15.5. **CKLW** (R) improved nicely, up to 6.3 from 5.5. **WDRQ** (R) slipped a bit 5.3 to 4.3. **WABX** (A) also down 3.5 to 2.6. **WWWW** (A) 2.9 to 2.5. **WXYZ** (R) 5.7 to 5.0. Country **WDEE** slipped back to where they were last April/May with a 4.4, down from 6.4. **WMJC** formerly **WHNE** debuted with **Julian Breen's** "Magic" Rock format with a 4.4. In Black radio **WCHB** up 3.3 to 4.8, **WGPR** 1.6 to 1.4, **WJZZ** 1.4 to 2.6, **WJLB** up 2.0 to 2.8. **WWJ** (N/T) slipped 8.3 to 5.1. In 18-49 Adults it's a close battle after **WJR** with 11.6. **WRIF** and **WMJC** tie with 6.3 each, next is **CKLW** with 6.1 and **WXYZ** with a 6.0.

ST. LOUIS

KMOX (PA/T) still super strong with a 26.4. **KSD** (P/A) slipped badly 11.0 to 8.3 and **Bartell's KSLQ** (R) surged 5.9 to 8.1, with a 27.3 in teens. **KATZ** (B) also way up 4.9 to 6.1. In AOR **KADI-FM** 5.3 to 3.8, **KSHE** 5.6 to 4.9. **KXOK** (R) up a bit 4.9 to 5.5. **WIL** (C) way up 4.2 to 5.9, their FM (C) 2.9 to 2.5. In 18-49 Adults **KMOX** has a 19.1, **KSD** 11.2, **KSLQ** 8.9, **KATZ** 7.9.

BOSTON

Good book for Rock here as **J.J. Jordan** pushes **WRKO** to number 1 in the market with a 10.4. **WVBF** (R) also up 5.7 to 6.2. **WHDH** (P/A) slipped 11.0 to 7.4 and **WBZ** (P/A) 10.0 to 9.0. **WEEL-AM** (N) 8.5 to 8.9, **WEEL-FM** (P/A) had a good book 2.2 to 3.1. **WJIB** (P/A) 8.9 to 10.3. **WCOZ** (A) holding 2.8 to 2.9, **WBCN** (A) 3.6 to 2.8. **WROR** (O) 2.7 to 3.1, **WMEX** (R) 1.3 to 3.2, **WEZE** (O) 1.7 to 1.6. In teens **WRKO** has a 41.9, **WVBF** 23.6. Adults 18-49 **WRKO** took the market with 11.4, **WJIB** next with 8.8, then **WBZ** with 8.5.

WASHINGTON D.C.

Jim Collins is holding **WPGC AM & FM** strong with a 10.0 from 9.7. In teens they have almost a 43 share, no one else comes close. **WEAM** (A) dropped 1.5 to 1.0 and has now announced they will return to a Top 40 format. **WKYS** (Disco) slipped 4.9 to 3.8. **WWDC AM** (R) up 2.8 to 3.1, **WWDC-FM** (A) using the **Burkhart/Abrams** "Superstars" format grew to 3.4 to 2.6. **WMAL-FM** (A) 2.3 to 2.5. **WHFS** (A) 1.4 to 1.8, **WASH** (P/A) up again 4.2 to 4.5. **WEEL** (P/A) 0.7 to 1.0, **WEZR** (P/A) 2.0 to 2.8, **WUST** (P/A) 1.8 to 2.6, and **WMAL** (P/A) still on top of the market with 11.9. In the three way Black battle **WOL** still on top with a 4.1, **WHUR** up 1.4 to 2.2, and **WOOK** 1.5 to 2.1. Country **WPIK** had its best book ever up 1.8 to 3.2. In the News war all are down, **WTOP** 5.4 to 4.8, **WRC** (NIS) 2.8 to 2.3 and **WAVA** at a 1.1. Interestingly **WGAY-FM** (BM) slipped from 8.3 to 6.2. In Adults 18-49 **WMAL** on top with 11.2, **WPGC AM & FM** 8.3, **WGAY AM & FM** 7.8.

WCAO walked away with the Rock listeners up to 8.4 from 7.5, with an 18.8 in teens. **WLPL** (R) 5.2 to 2.7, **WDJQ** (R) 2.1 to 2.2, **WFBR** (R) 6.6 to 5.3. **WBAL** (PA/T) strong number 1 in the market with a 17.1 up from 12.1. **WCBM** (P/A) 9.8 to 9.0. **WLIF** (BM) holding with 10.6. **WWIN** (B) 6.7 down to 4.7, **WSID** (B) 4.8 to 3.2, **WEBB** 1.2 to 0.4. **WKTK** (A) up nicely 2.1 to 3.5. **WPOC** (C) 5.7 to 2.8. Adults 18 to 49, **WCBM** 13.3, **WBAL** 10.6, **WCAO** 9.9.

PITTSBURGH

KDKA (P/A) still up there with a 25.8, increasing from 20.7. **WDVE** (A) with the **Burkhart/Abrams** "Superstars" moved into the top contemporary position with a 6.8, up from 5.4. **13Q** (R) slipped 6.6 to 6.1.

WFIL'S BALLOON RACE

WFIL/Philadelphia will re-create the first hot-air balloon race in America this weekend, marking the start of the Bicentennial Freedom Week in their city. 13 balloons will travel the same route as the first manned balloon flight in the country, which occurred in 1783. The 13 balloons signify the original 13 colonies. All the WFIL air personalities will take to the winds in the balloons during the spectacular kick-off of the 200th Birthday celebration.

PYRAMID POWER

WQXI-FM/Atlanta has created a unique promotion centering around the current interest in "Pyramid Power." For several days, the station's listeners heard "construction sounds" on the air, while jocks promoted that a "mysterious project" was being readied. The campaign was kicked off with a new ID proclaiming the station as broadcasting "On The Power Of The Pyramids." Each hour Pyramid T-Shirts, books on Pyramid Energy and other related items were given away. The promotion also educated their listeners on the history and alleged powers of the pyramids with 30 second "Pyramid Raps."

"SPIRIT OF MADISON"

Madison Mayor Paul Soglin proclaimed June 17th "Spirit Of Madison" day, officially recognizing 24 hours of special programming on WISM. Community leaders will be airing their thoughts on the city's accomplishments and the challenges of the Bicentennial year. A tape of the day's programming will become a permanent part of the collection in the Mass Communications History Center.

KELLY TO PD KEEL

Steve Kelly, most recently program director of WIXY/Cleveland has been appointed Operations Manager of KEEL/Shreveport, replacing KEEL's program director, Larry Ryan, who takes over as GM of KBCL/Shreveport. Pending FCC approval, Ryan will assume ownership of that station. Howard Clark remains as music director of KEEL.

WCHL'S 3RD CLEO

An unprecedented 3rd first place Cleo Award has been won by WCHL/Chapel Hill for advertising in a small market campaign. No

radio station has been awarded this number of Cleo's in the award's history. The award, presented by the Radio Advertising Bureau and the Association of National Advertisers, was accepted by WCHL salesman David McGowan and production manager Kyle Whitford in presentation ceremonies in New York.

MAN VS. BEAST

WNOE/New Orleans recently staged a wrestling match between their morning personality Michael Henry Martin, and "Victor the Wrestling Bear." Victor weighs in at 650 pounds. The event, attended by a multitude of listeners, was held at a local shopping center. Victor won the match hands down, but according to WNOE's Kevin O'Brien, Martin and the bear are "still the best of friends."

CONCERT SURGE

KLEO/Wichita took advantage of the recent abundance of concerts in their area with numerous tie-in contests. Giveaways of tickets to the sold out Doobie Brothers and Bob Dylan concerts were held, along with a live broadcast of the Doobies' concert. Free bus rides and 200 tickets to the Wings' Kansas City shows were also provided by the station. For listeners who prefer music at home, KLEO gave away 500 "Win The One You Want" albums, with call in listeners getting their choice of albums at local record stores.

108 SUMMER DAYS

K108/HONOLULU plays up their frequency with their season long "108 Days Of Summer" promotion. The initial contest in the series is named "The Great Beachball." Fifteen summer-oriented prizes are stuffed into the station's beachball, listeners must correctly identify the prizes in order to win the stash valued at over \$2000. Hourly clues are aired on the station.

KELLY IN THE MOVIES

KHJ/Los Angeles' Machine Gun Kelly has been cast in his second movie role in a supporting role in "Dirty Harry III." Kelly, who started his film career in the upcoming "A Star Is Born," will play a young militant priest in the Clint Eastwood film.

FATHER'S DAY PROMOTIONS

WCHL/Chapel Hill's "Spot Your Pop" Father's Day promotion invited listeners to call in their reasons why they think their father is the best. Those judged the best were played on the air, and if any member of the listener's family called

in within the hour, that Dad won a special gift.

A color TV was the grand prize in WFOM/Marietta's "Color Him Father" contest. Once per hour during Father's Day weekend, listeners called in to win albums, T-shirts and other prizes, as well as qualify for a drawing for the TV.

BICENTENNIAL BULLET

WEEO/Waynesboro listeners are currently playing the station's "Bicentennial Bullet" game. "Shots" are fired at air personalities, and callers have to guess whether they will be hits or misses. Correct guessers win such prizes as keys to the Playboy Club, clothes or other prizes.

ELTON FEATURES

WEAQ/Eau Claire's Elton John weekend featured all Elton hits, plus give-aways of his albums and special T-Shirts. A complete set of Elton albums was won by the listener who correctly guessed the total number of his records played during the special. Plans for a superstar special every weekend are in the works for the station.

WGUY/Bangor is sending the "12 Rock Bus" loaded with listeners to see Elton in his July 4th Boston appearance. Station personalities Mark Laurence and Jay Michaels will join the listeners for the trip.

CORSAIR HITS TV...

WFIL/Philadelphia personality Bill Corsair has been set for a series of appearances on a local television outlet's feature programs on late-night people in the city of brotherly love. The all night music-talk antics of Corsair will be discussed in the anthology programs.

BEATLES SPECIALS

Every other record will be a Beatles song during WORG/Orangeburg's "Beatles Rock & Roll Music" weekend. The newly-released Beatles LP will be won by callers throughout the special. Each winner will have to sing a bar of his favorite Beatles hit to score the album.

WISM/Madison "brought the Beatles back together" for their weekend special, with special showings of "Help and 'Let It Be," along with on air giveaways of giant 3X5' posters and copies of the new LP. In addition, the station is supplying 3 busses for listeners to travel to the Wings concert in Chicago.

WJBQ/Portland is also giving their listeners chances to win tickets to screenings of Beatles movies in conjunction with a local theater chain, along with T-Shirt and LP giveaways.

If the 45rpm record is still the criteria for what a Top 40 programmer programs his station by and with, why don't those stations give away singles as opposed to albums as contest prizes?

Why do record companies sell their recent hit singles to K-TEL so soon? K-TEL advertises them on the same Top 40 stations that played them just weeks earlier when they were selling at top price. The same listeners who bought the single now feel they wasted money and may not buy the next single they like, but rather wait for the next album. If this pattern continues to develop, there may be no more hit singles and no more K-TEL recent hit albums. Possibly this is already happening, as single sales are already declining.

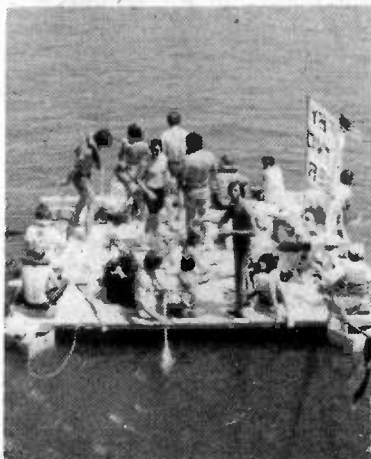
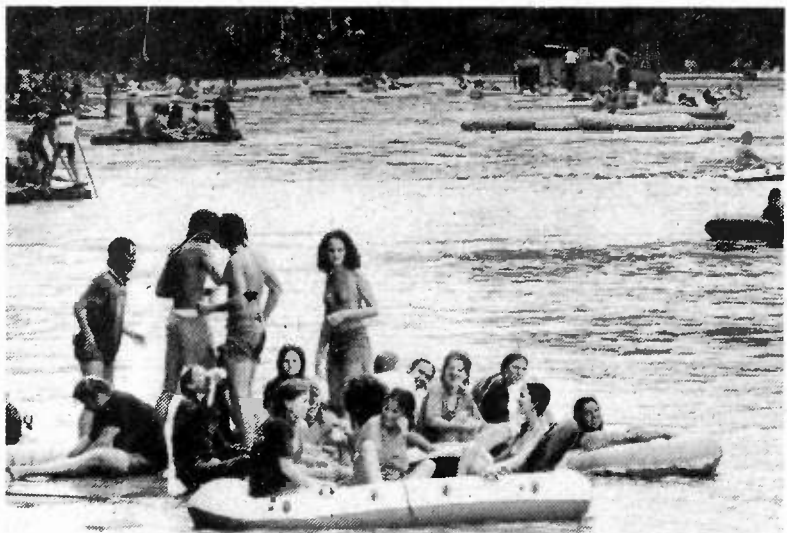


Raft Races Rampant

THE FCC [So You Can Understand It]

FCC Accepts Civil Rights License Challenges

Petitions filed by several civil rights groups challenging the license renewals of 74 Mississippi broadcast stations have been "informally" accepted by the FCC. The petitions charged the stations with employment discrimination against Blacks, concentration of ownership control, and other rule violations. The Commission dismissed the concentration of control items, and said that all the stations cited would be notified of specific information needed after their individual EEO records were analyzed.

Downe Buys Remaining Bartell Stock

Downe Communications Inc. and Bartell Media Corp. have announced that Downe will absorb Bartell's stock to make it a wholly-owned subsidiary. Downe already owns 66% of Bartell's outstanding shares. The final sale of stock is still subject to approval from lenders.

September License Renewal Hearings

Hearings on a number of broadcast license renewal re-vamping bills has been set for mid-September in the House of Representatives. Among the proposed bills that will be studied is a new one introduced by commerce committee chairman Harley Staggers, which would give radio and TV stations four year license periods. Although many broadcasters are encouraged by the House's plans for review of the bills, the Senate has no plans to bring up the issue this year.

Groups Appeal FCC Decision

A number of citizen's groups have asked a U.S. Court of Appeals to review the Federal Communications Commission's earlier decision to renew the licenses of WNOK-AM-FM-TV/Columbia, South Carolina. The groups cited questions on the stations' employment practices, past and proposed programming, and ascertainment.

White Possible FCC Member

Margita White is the expected choice to fill the FCC post vacated by Charlotte Reid. Washington speculators anticipate her to be President Ford's choice. White is currently assistant press secretary to Ford, and has previously been assistant director of the U.S. Information Agency.

S.F. FM To Bonneville

Bay Area Broadcasting Co., a subsidiary of Bonneville International Corp., has purchased KRON-FM/San Francisco from the San Francisco Chronicle. Ownership has already been transferred, and call letters changed to KOIT. Joseph L. Dorton has been appointed general manager of KOIT, as well as retaining the GM position of KBIG and KBRT/Los Angeles.

Banned In Boston

A Massachusetts District Court has ruled Penthouse magazine as obscene in a recent crackdown on girly literature. A \$500 fine was levied against a Malden, Massachusetts store owner who sold Penthouse.

Ohio Players Sued

A \$350,000 lawsuit has been filed against the Ohio Players by Dakar Records artist Hamilton Bohannon. The suit claims that the Players were in breach of contract for allegedly stopping him from appearing in a concert that he had been contracted for, which the Ohio Players headlined.

Public Wants "Natural" Claim Rules

Americans are apparently confused by such ad claims as "natural," "organic" and "Health food," according to a recent independent survey. A majority of consumers would favor Federal Trade Commission legislation to regulate the use of such terms in advertising. Many of those surveyed feel that major companies are trying to mislead the public by the use of the words in relation to products which are mass produced.

Court Bans Drug Price Ads

Advertising for prescription drugs which includes price information has been banned by a Texas district court. The temporary restraining order was granted after a request by The Texas State Board of Pharmacy. One drug store chain had run full page newspaper ads listing prices of 25 frequently used prescription drugs and offering discount coupons for the drugs. A hearing will be held on the issue later in the month to determine whether an earlier U.S. Supreme Court decision OK'ing ads for drugs was applicable to the Texas state laws.

No Rise In Tobacco Opposition

56% of those surveyed in a government-funded study think that "cigarette advertising should be stopped completely." The survey's figures show that there has been no noticeable reduction or increase in opposition to such ads since the radio and TV ban in 1970. The study also reported that the proportion of adults that smoke cigarettes had declined during the past 5 years, but unit sales increased, partly due to the fact that women are smoking more heavily.

To Beep Or Not To Beep

The Federal Communications Commission has once again decided to study the use of telephone beeps to protect privacy. The Commission's inquiry will study whether or not new warning techniques should be used, if additional exceptions to the beep tone requirements should be made, or if added measures of enforcement of current rules should be instituted.

Beer Spots In Spanish

A series of 30 and 60 second radio spots have been completed for Rheingold Beer. The commercials feature all Spanish music and language by jockey Angel Cordero, whose print ads have been featured for the beer this year.

Big A&W Promotion

Over \$1 million has been budgeted for A&W Root Beer's "Great Root Bear Straw Promotion." The multi-media effort is a co-op concept with free "bear straws" given to customers who purchase any drink at the outlets. Initial ads will start in 40 A&W markets, with a number of other markets scheduled to start in mid-summer.

Ask Your Uncle

Summer ads pitching the Army tell potential enlistees to "Call your Uncle, toll free." The ads then give a special Bicentennial phone number.

Downtown Center Surge

More and more U.S. cities are finding that traffic-free downtown malls are gaining popularity. New York based Downtown Research and Development Center finds that there are now 81 such malls in downtown areas, compared to a meager 35 in 1973.

COMMISSION MODIFIES POLICY

The Commission has finally modified its policy which prohibits licensees or licensee-owned sales organizations from representing separately-owned stations in the same area. Specifically, the Commission will now permit a rep or licensee who owns an AM or FM station to represent a separately-owned television station in the same area, or vice-versa.

Significantly, the Commission did not adopt rigid rules concerning combination advertising sales. Rather, the Commission stated that it will continue its policy of considering combination advertising rates on a case-by-case basis. The current policy prohibits independently owned stations serving the same area from using combination advertising rates-selling time to an advertiser on two or more independently-owned stations for one rate. The Commission did, however, adopt a policy prohibiting the offering or use of combination rates, either directly or indirectly, through a rep, by commonly-owned television and AM or FM stations serving substantially the same area.

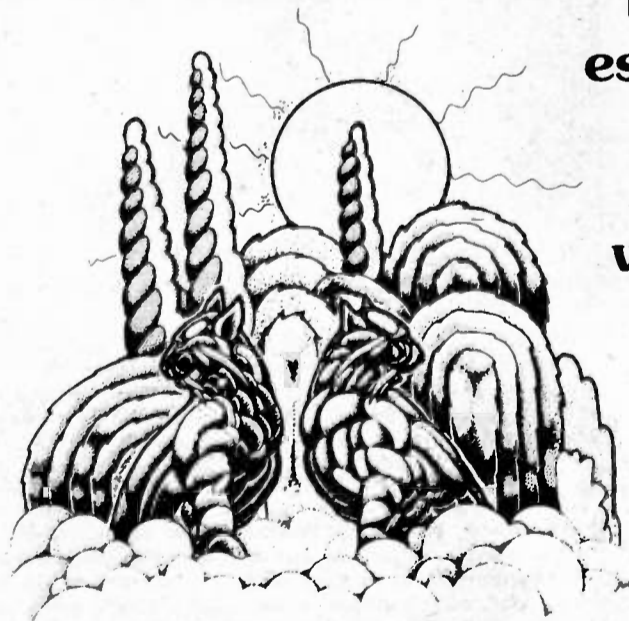

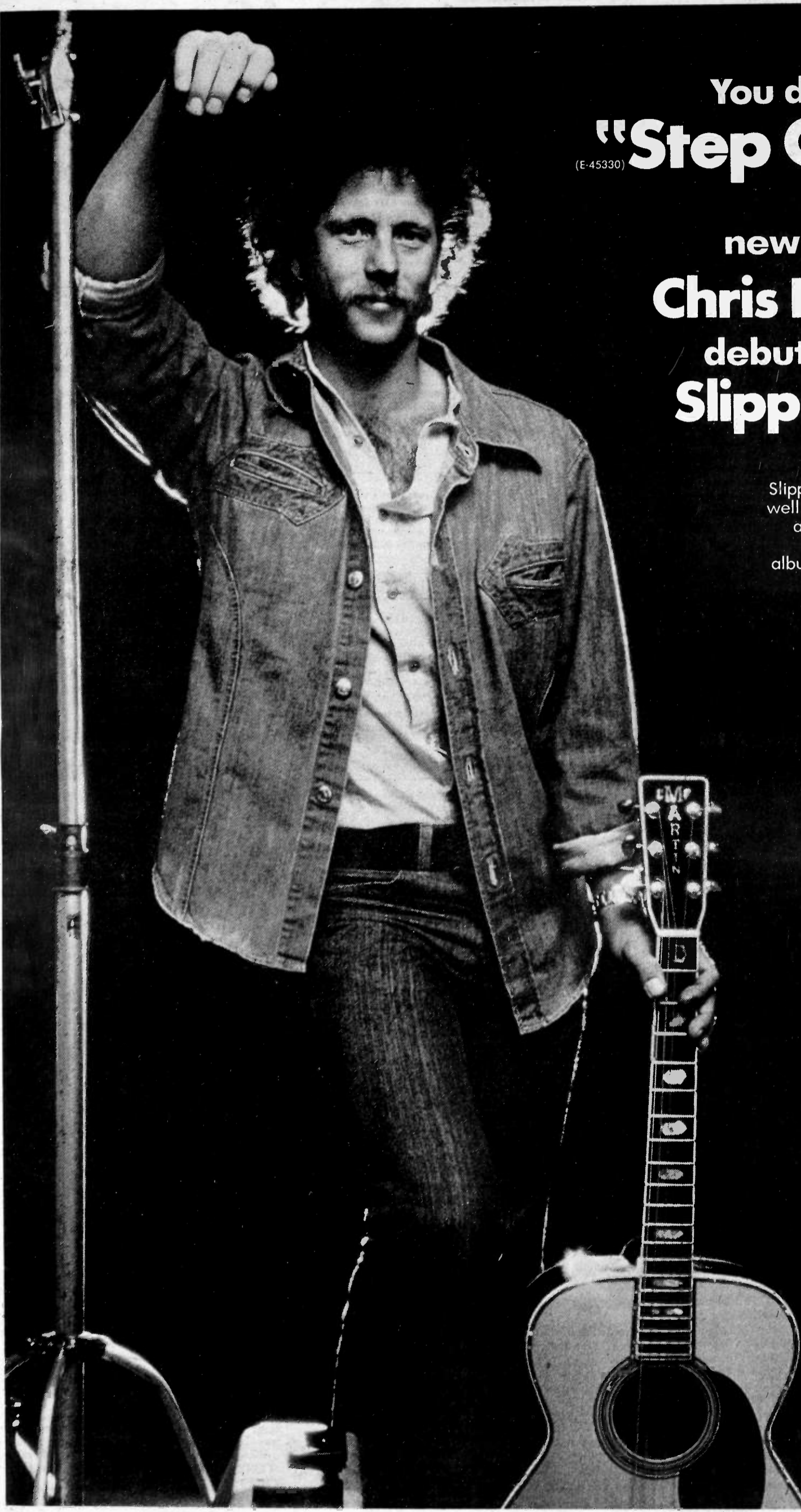

Parallels

Parallel II: Key stations (31-100 markets) that are format dominant in their respective markets, and influence rack buying patterns for their region. This category also will include some major market stations that are not the dominant ratings/sales influence, but have demonstrated importance in their respective markets. These stations will usually be programming 35 or less total current selections.

Parallel III: All other reporting stations. This parallel will also cover stations with longer playlists. It also will include secondary reporters that are not the format dominant station in their market but influence the market considerably. *Format dominance determined from latest Arbitron survey available in that market.
