Supreme Court Upholds FCC "Dirty Words" Ban

The Supreme Court, in a 5-4 ruling, upheld a government ban on the broadcast of "dirty words." The Court claimed the Federal Communications Commission acted properly in banning the broadcast of a "dirty words" monologue during hours when children are likely to be listening.

The case in question stemmed from a New York father's complaint in 1973 after he and his young son heard over the car radio a recording entitled "Seven Dirty Words . . . " by comedian George Carlin.

Justice John Paul Stevens's majority opinion rested upon the unique characteristics of the broadcasting medium, society's right to protect children from "inappropriate speech," and the interests of unwilling adults not wishing to be affronted by offensive speech.

Justices Potter Stewart, William Brennan, Byron White and Thurgood Marshall dissented, saying that Congress intended to prevent obscene speech-not words deemed merely "indecent."

The precise words in question vere: "fuck," "shit," "piss," "motherfucker," "cocksucker,"
"cunt" and "tit."

WMAL Fined \$5000 For **Logging Violation**

WMAL/Washington, D.C. was fined \$5000 by the Federal Communications Commission for its failure to log commercial time correctly during its morning talk program, the "Hardin And Weaver

WMAL acknowledged the inaccuracies, but claimed they were unintentional and stemmed from the show's comedic nature. Station officials said it was difficult to determine where commercials end and entertainment begins on the show because Frank Hardin and Jackson Weaver joke throughout the pro-

Although the Commissioners agreed with the station's assessment of the violation; they contended that existing rules had to govern the case and voted 5-1 to levy the

Commissioner Abbot Washburn commented he would have preferred a reprimand to a fine, declaring the show should be commended for making blurbs "palatable". How-Continued on Page 13

Commenting on the decision, the National Association of Broadcasters called the Court's action "a harsh blow to the freedom of expression of every person in this country." NAB President Vincent T. Wasilewski said that the use of the words was "within a general discussion of indecent language in our society, and while the NAB in no way approves of indecent language on the air as such ... NAB fears that the FCC will not stop with the seven dirty words. It is anyone's guess where it will stop.'

Arbitron Conducts San Diego Summer Survey Experiment

Arbitron, at the urging of the San Diego Broadcasters Association, will conduct a special summer radio listening survey in the San Diego market for the period July 27-August 30. During the first two weeks (7-27 thru 8-9), a normal survey will be run, followed by a further three weeks during which all San Diego stations will broadcast an SDBA-formulated announcement

informing listeners that a diary survey is being conducted and urging them to fill it out completely.

The unprecendented survey effort is designed to test response rate arising from the announcements, set for airing every three hours from August 13 to August 30. Publication of the survey results is dependent on the response-if the re-

WXYZ Morning Man Goes Free Agent Route

WXYZ/Detroit has been experiencing a turbulent period recently, with morning man Dick Purtan splashing his "free agent" status in the daily papers and Operations Manager Joe Bacarella leaving the station.

The Purtan situation arose when the Detroit News ran a story Thursday (6-29) headlined "Dick Purtan Is Ready To Leave Detroit For A Better Offer." Reporter Alex Ben Block opened his piece, "If disc jockey Dick Purtan was a baseball player, you could categorize him as a free agent poised to cash in on the trend toward soaring salaries." With four months left on a WXYZ contract paying him \$125,000 a year, according to Block, Purtan is "sitting back letting the well-heeled suitors of AM radio bid for his services, and has hired a show business attorney "to negotiate offers."

One of the "well-heeled suitors" is rumored in the article to be Top 40 competitor CKLW, with an offer

WXYZ Program Director Jim Davis is quoted by Block as being confident that ABC Radio, which owns the station, will retain Purtan's services. "Dick is the most valuable property in Detroit radio," Davis said. "He's like having Boardwalk and Park Place. As Dick Purtan goes, so goes WXYZ."

One way WXYZ might go, according to Detroit reports, is toward a News format. However, Davis denied that the station would shift from its present Top 40 approach. Purtan's agent, meanwhile, said that air personality was not "limited to Detroit" in seeking a new deal.

Joe Bacarella, Operations Director of WXYZ and a veteran of some ten years' standing at the station, exited last week amid rumors that he may be headed for WCAR in Detroit; Bacarella had been with WCAR before joining WXYZ. Davis, who came to WXYZ as Program Director from KLIF/Dallas earlier this year, now assumes total programming responsibility.

Fox Departs KCBQ

Jimi Fox has exited KCBQ/San Diego as Program Director over a change in the station's programming direction. Fox told R&R, "I. left on very good terms." As for the reason for his departure, he explained, "First of all, (KCBQ General Manager) Mike Stafford inherited me. I was not his choice as a PD. Modern Music On Air

Pop/Adult station KDWN/Las Vegas took to the air recently with an editorial attacking modern pop music in terms which recall the hysterical anti-rock & roll sermons of the early Elvis Presley era. Station owner A.J. Williams, a former big band musician, declared:

"The following editorial message is not for the ears of teenagers, but for those who were born before the dark ages of most popular music.
"About 70 percent of today's hits

are to listenable music what spraycan graffitti is to refined art. Most are a barbaric ritual of tasteless strumming, of jungle drums and repetitious pseudo-lyrics convulsed by non-musicians and non-singers. When performed live, they are amplified to the threshold of pain. When presented on some radio stations, they become a symphony in monotony, interrupted twenty or thirty times each hour by routine mouthings of call letters and dial position, recited, robot-like, by adolescents with limited imagination and fourth grade vocabularies.

"Unfortunately, such is the tenor of our times. Today's young people

WAMO Equipment Damaged In Shooting Incident

Vandals fired several shots into the equipment of WAMO-WYJZ-FM/Pittsburgh last week, forcing the station off the air for 24 hours. The incident occurred following a public service talk program on the penal system's abuse of inmates, and possibly resulted from

that discussion, although precise motives are unknown. Acting General Manager Connie Balthrop told R&R that the station was currently conducting an investigation into the matter, but that no conclusions had yet been drawn.

RATING DISTORTION

Arbitron Holds Up Phoenix Book

Arbitron may delay the mailing of its Phoenix April/May survey book, stating in a letter to subscribers in that market that "our investigations indicate that a violation of our Rating Distortion Policies may have occurred." Phoenix had experienced a controversy over alleged rating-hypoing in contests and promotions by some stations. Arbitron Vice President/General Manager Rick Aurichio stated, "Because of the seriousness of the situation, further investigations are being made to insure that all of the facts regarding specific promotions have been gathered. We will do our best to . . . meet our published mail date, but the integrity of audience estimates has priority over delivery.

For the first time since 1934, the broadcast industry has the opportunity to comment on the way it will be governed in the future. This opportunity is rare and should not be taken lightly, especially by radio broadcasters. The NAB staff opinion of Congressman Van Deerlin's Communications rewrite bill (H.R. 13015) found many parts of it objectionable. What radio must understand is that it is difficult for the NAB to represent radio fairly in this situation, because of its television attachments. Even NAB Radio Board members such as ABC Radio President Hal Neal cannot be expected to take radio's side in total, because Neal is paid by a corporation which derives a substantial portion of its profits from television. Since the proposed rewrite will cut down much of the legal paperwork now encumbering radio, you may not even be able to depend on your attorneys for clearcut advice, as their positions will be drastically affected.

This editorial is not meant to imply immediate support or endorsement of the NRBA, as it is still too young an organization and essentially carries very little lobbying weight in Washington. What we do suggest is that every radio station owner, general manager, and programmer become deeply involved with this rewrite on a personal level. Whether you are a single-station owner or small group owner, your opinions count and should be represented. You must get to know your Congressmen and Senators. You must communicate your individual feelings to them. You are the masses—not the big groups. We cannot allow Radio/TV organizations to represent radio in the rewrite. Radio has its own problems, one of which is its continuing competition with local television for ad dollars, especially in small and medium markets.

Radio & Records was the first industry publication to outline and detail the proposals of the Communications rewrite. We'll continue to monitor and comment on potential changes in the bill as they occur. The Communications Subcommittee will be holding hearings nationwide to discuss the bill openly with broadcasters. Crocker Pleads Guilty, Fined In Tax Charge

Former WBLS/New York Program Director Frankie Crocker pleaded guilty to failure to file income tax returns for 1974, and was fined \$5000 and sentenced to three years' probation. As a result, however, a U.S. Attorney said he would attempt to have a perjury charge against Crocker dropped in a Newark Federal Court. Crocker had been convicted last year on one of two counts of lying to a 1975

Newark grand jury in a payola investigation. The conviction was overturned on appeal, and government attorneys, noting that a retrial could not produce a greater penalty than the original sentence of \$1000 fine and a year and a day in prison, declared their satisfaction in Crocker's tax plea and announced plans to have the perjury charge dropped.

Audits & Survey's TRAC-7, the new RAB sponsored syndicated rating service, has signed several top agencies including Leo Burnett USA. McCaitrey & McCail, J. Walter Thompson Co., Bozell & Jacobs. Metromedia Radio, Susquehanna Broadcasting, Southern Broadcasting and WPAT-AM-FM, as subscribers. Reports in 20 markets are due in September.

NYMRAD Names Officers For 1978-79

A new Board of Directors and team of officers was elected and installed at the Annual Meeting of the Now York Market Radio Broadcasters.

Officers elected for 1978-79 were: Chairman, Rick Devlin, VP/GM of WOR: Vice-Chairman, John A. Lack, VP/GM of WCBS: Secretary, Erica Farber, VP/GM of 99%; and Stan Cohen, WYNY GM. New Board Members are Dick Ferguson, VP/GM of WEZN: Mel Karmazin, VP/GM of WNEW-AM-FM: Nick Trigony, VP/GM of WWRL and WRVR: and Robert Richer, GM of WNCN. Continuing Board members are Neil Rockoff, VP/GM of WHN; and Ralph Guild. President of McGavren-Guild.

NYMRAD also introduced a comprehensive marketing campaign to boost New York radio.

25 Million Paperwork Hours For Broadcasters

The FCC ranks second (trailing only the Internal Revenue Service, not suprisingly) in the amount of paperwork it requires its "regulatees" to turn in, according to the Office of Management and Budget. The FCC's standard broadcast and FM station program logging rules alone totalled a "reporting hour burden" of 18,223,940 hours to broadcasters.

An additional 4,409,808 hours of paperwork were required under TV broadcast logging rules; and applications for authority to construct broadcast stations, or to make changes in existing stations, accounted for a workload to broadcasters of 2,028,000 paperwork hours. Furthermore, applications for authorization in the auxiliary broadcast services demanded 1,626,225 hours of paperwork.

Upon releasing these figure, along with totals for other agencies, the OMB called for a more "focused program" aimed at reducing the federal paperwork burden.

Advertisers Garner Good Vibrations From Beach Boys Songs

The bright harmony-laden California rock of the **Beach Boys** is attracting considerable advertiser interest. **Sunkist's Orange** soft drink uses "Good Vibrations" as its theme, while **Eastman Kodak**'s TV commercials have been using "Fun Fun" for their **Handle** instant camera. If the trend continues, we might see religious organizations exploiting "God Only Knows" and cat food manufacturers utilizing the entire "Pet Sounds" album.

British Record Co. Buys Consumer Ad For Competing Label Artist

The British record industry has been known to be innovative in the past, but a record company taking out a full-page ad on behalf of another label's artist is certainly a novel advertising technique. The June 3 issue of the New Musical Express, the largest consumer pop weekly in Britain, carried an ad stating "This Is A Stiff Records Advert Advertising A Phonogram Artiste," and proceeded to promote the current double live album by Graham Parker & the Rumour. Elsewhere, NME assured its readers that Stiff, an independent label in no way connected with Phonogram, paid full price for the ad. There is a kicker, though... Stiff label head Dave Robinson is also Parker's manager. Still, an interesting precedent.

TV News

New Data On TV Households

The A.C. Nielsen Co. has published a new booklet containing statistical breakdowns and charts pertaining to the nation's TV households. Among the highlights: 72.9 million homes (98 percent of all U.S. households) own a TV set; 76 percent have color sets, and 46 percent have at least two sets. Almost 60 percent of TV households (41.7 million) have no children, and the average TV household contains 2.8 people, compared to 3.1 eight years ago. Among children, the 2-5 age bracket watches more TV than older kids or teens; adults over 55 are also frequent viewers. Situation comedies are the most popular format. And Sunday night is the heaviest watching night, with Friday scoring lowest. These and many other fascinating facts and figures can be found in the 20-page "Nielsen Television '78" booklet, available free from the company at 1290 Avenue of the Americas, New York, NY 10019.

NBC has captured a long-term license for telecasting "The Sound of Music." In exchange for \$21.5 million, NBC may show the popular film 20 times over a 22-year period. ABC showed "Sound Of Music" in its only previous telecast in February 1976....Leo Sayer gets his first network hosting assignment July 28 on "Midnight Special," introducing Bonnie Tyler, Randy Newman, Chuck Mangione and "Buddy Holly Story" star Gary Busey, among others....Ronnie Milsap appears live on the "Today Show" July 28....The Village People are set for Merv Griffin July 12.

ABC Repeats Success In Rating Win

ABC, paced by repeats of its perennially popular comedies, won the week ending June 25 in the Nielsen tabulations. The leader's average rating was 14.7, with CBS second at 13.5 and NBC third with 12.7 in another typically low summer rerun doldrums rating week. ABC had six shows in the top ten, including the first five, topped by "Three's Company." Following were 2) "Laverne & Shirley" 3) "Charlie's Angels" 4) "Happy Days" 5) "Love Boat" 6) "Alice" (CBS) 7) "Quincy" (NBC) 8) "MASH" (CBS) 9) "One Day At A Time" (CBS) and 10) "Fantasy Island" (ABC).

A three-network battle developed in New York's **Arbitron** standings for the week ending June 23, but ABC came close to a complete sweep in Los Angeles, losing two low placements to CBS. **ABC** had the top two New York shows, "Three's Company" and "Laverne & Shirley," followed by 3) "Alice" (CBS) 4) a tie between "Charlie's Angels" (ABC), "MASH" (CBS), and "Quincy" (NBC), and 7) a five-way tie between ABC's "Carter Country," NBC's "Becoming Jeanne" and "Police Story" Big Event, and CBS' "All In The Family" and "The Jeffersons."

In Los Angeles, "Barney Miller" topped the list for ABC, followed by 2) "Charlie's Angels" and "Three's Company" tied 4) "Starsky & Hutch" 5) a tie between ABC's Thursday and Sunday night movies 7) "Laverne & Shirley" 8) ABC's Friday Night Movie, and 9) a six-way the between CBS' "MASH" and "One Day At A Time", and ABC's "Carter Country", "Happy Days", "Operation Petticoat", and "What's Happening."

RKO Registers First Quarter Increase; Parent Company Down

General Tire & Rubber Co. showed a drop in net income for the first quarter of 1978, but the RKO subsidiary, including the radio chain, made a strong showing with a 42 percent increase over last years first quarter. General Tire as a whole dropped 14 percent from \$21.8 million in first quarter 1977 to \$18.7 million, but RKO was up from \$4 million to \$5.7 million. Besides radio, RKO operates TV stations, cable systems, movie theaters, bottling plants, and has a controlling interest in Frontier Airlines. General Tire indicated that it would continue its effort to spin off RKO to shareholders this year, but might delay the move until the next fiscal year. The spinoff is reportedly designed to protect RKO broadcast licenses, as the parent company has been charged with receiving improper overseas payments and does not wish to jeopardize its licenses as a result.

Roach Appointed GCC VP

Lloyd B. Roach, General Manager of WEFM/Chicago, has been named a Vice President of GCC Communications, WEFM's parent company. Roach is an 11-year broadcasting veteran, and before becoming GM at WEFM (which recently switched from Classical to Top 40), he was General Sales Manager at WIFI/Philadelphia. He will continue his GM duties at WEFM.



Coke Reactivates Donovan Song For "Mello Yello" Soft Drink

Coca-Cola USA has introduced its new "Mello Yello" citrus-flavored soft drink (in Clarksburg, WV), and has plotted a number of ad campaign approaches, including the use of Donovan's 1967 hit "Mellow Yellow" as theme music. The drink, supposedly tasting much like Pepsi's Mountain Dew, will also be tagged "the world's fastest soft drink," because of its low carbon-tion and smooth taste. Meanwhile, Pepsi is still readying its apple-flavored soft drink, "Aspen", with test marketing believed imminent.

Pirate Radio Provides Pop For Irish Listeners

In a situation reminiscent of the heyday of British pirate radio stations in the mid-sixties, about ten Irish pirate operations are broadcasting pop music illegally to listeners across the country. The pirates, who've been on and off the air for three years, are now reportedly cutting in to audience and revenue of the state-owned RTE (Radio Telefis Elreann) system, which has traditionally been light on pop music broadcasting, according to a Radio & Record News report.

The Irish pirates, who broadcast from secret locations in Southern Ireland (in contrast to the risky seagoing operations of the 60's British pirates), have benefited from loopholes in Irish laws. Radio equipment also used as articles of furniture cannot be confiscated, which has led to some clever equipment setups; and pirate radio operations can be prosecuted only if apprehended while on the air, so thick steel doors have been constructed to delay government operatives and allow the stations to go off the air quickly. In any case, under present law Irish pirates are subject to no more than confiscation of their equipment and a 50-pound fine (under \$90), a price they seem more than willing to pay. However, the Irish government is planning to put stronger teeth into their anti-piracy laws.

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


Contacted by R&R, Williams emphasized his sincerity and deep personal convictions in making the attack. He listed "criteria" that "music of whatever kind" should have, including the absence of monotony, a melodic line, harmony, variety of instrumentation, nontrite, non-repetitious lyrics in good taste, and good singing and playing. "If you apply these principles to much of today's popular music,"

Williams stated, "you will find that almost half of them are violated in any current tune. We take the current crop of records that come into KDWN and we put them on two turntables and play four bars of one and then go into the next tune - and you can't tell the difference. They all start off with four guys hammering on drums and guitars."

Asked what kind of reaction he'd received from the Las Vegas radio community, Williams said, "Mostly four-letter words. So far, nobody has come up with any" (legitimate opposing points of view), "and I should like to have some." R&R would also be interested to hear radio reaction to Williams's editorial-proor con, let us know.

Managing To Be A Manager

It takes a lot of observation, rationality, and wisdom to be a really successful radio Station Manager. Hiring, firing, writing and delivering weighty editorials, flogging the sales staff to keep the advertising coming in...none of it is easy. 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

Russians Pull Out Of Beach Boys Concert

The Leningrad concert promoted by Bill Graham and starring the Beach Boys has been called off by Soviet authorities. Reasons for the Russians reneging on the concert, which was to have been filmed for a joint British-Soviet cinematic project, were unclear; but the cancellation was abrupt enough so that trucks already on the road to Russia with equipment had to be called back at the last minute. Although officially termed an "indefinite postponement," the cancellation seems likely to stand.

Universal is claiming a new all-time three-day initial gross for "Jaws II", which took in \$9.9 million in 654 theaters nationwide. The original "Jaws" grossed \$7.7 million in its first three days at 410 theaters in 1975. Meanwhile, "Grease" slipped away with \$9.3 million in 902 theaters in its initial three-day stand, setting a new record for Paramount.

for August distribution which may be priced as low as \$750; the company said only that the models will be "highly competitive." Japanese Victor also announced two new portable cameras compatible with any model of cassette recorder, available in July

Sample price for transferring a 400-foot roll of Super 8mm movie film to videotape is \$8.75 plus \$14.95 for the one-hour cassette, compared to \$45 from other prominent sources.

TOP-40



John Leader

As more and more ARB books come in for analysis, a trend is developing. Top 40 radio is enjoying one of its best overall books in many springs. Top 40 shares are up in New York, Baltimore, Miami, Los Angeles, Philadelphia, Minneapolis-St Paul and many other markets, large and small.

Since most Top 40 stations are 85-90 percent music in their programming content, a look back at the music that was a big part of everyone's "power rotation" during the last book is definitely in order.

In speaking to the "winning" Program Directors around the country one theme kept recurring in their comments surrounding the ARB sweep: "The music sure was great during the rating period." Looking back a month prior to the beginning of the Spring ARB, songs that were making it into the prime rotational catagories were primarily from "Saturday Night Fever." The movie, which has had and continues to have an amazing impact on this country, turned out no less than six hits that were nearly universal in their appeal. The Bee Gees, Yvonne Elliman and Tavares had titles on the air for the entire period one month before and during the recent ARB.

The Bee Gees had no less than four charted songs from "Saturday Night Fever" and retained the Number One slot on our National Airplay/30 from January 27th, non-stop through April 14th! During this same period artists with a Bee Gees soundalike quality such as Andy Gibb and Samantha Sang scored top five hits that lasted and lasted. Other long-lasting hits by Kansas, Dan Hill, David Gates, Andrew Gold, Bob Welch and Eric Clapton were part of this year's "great music" during the April-May book.

I don't pretend to imply that great programming has nothing to do with great ratings. And let's not forget that most Top 40 stations program 40-50 percent recurrents and/or oldies. But the point that the music during this recent rating period was "better than usual" is valid. The nationwide mania surrounding the success of "Saturday Night Fever" as both a sound-track and movie certainly contributed to the apparent increased "tune-in" to rock radio. The amazing number of albums sold by this unprecedented phenomenon brought more new buyers into record stores than ever before. That certainly brought a new and increased awareness to the public of rock music in general and therefore, perhaps, to rock radio in general.

Hits lasted a long time during the Spring sweep, as most stations "tightened down" a bit for the familiarity factor that is so important. But this past Spring was totally dominated by music from "Saturday Night Fever," and Top 40 responded to the public demand for more and more, by delivering just that. As I said a few weeks ago, it's always easier to understand the ratings if you've kept track of what was happening when the ratings were actually taking place. Musically, Top 40 radio was playing some of the most popular music in history, apparently to the delight of its listeners.

When he returned to Cleveland almost five months ago, WZZP morning man Jack Fitzgerald told the staff (very proudly) that he'd try anything, once. He has already risked his life for the station by flying in a hot air ballon over Public Square and he even attempted to canoe the Mohican River in high water. included children, not "a two-way radio conversation between a cab driver and a dispatcher, or a telecast of an Elizabethan comedy.

"We have not decided that an occasional expletive in either setting would justify any sanction, or, indeed that this broadcast would justify a criminal prosecution," he said.

Brennan and Marshall accused the majority of "a depressing inability to appreciate that in our land of cultural pluralism, there are many who think, act and talk differently from the members of this court and who do not share their fragile sensibilities.

"The words that this court and the Commission find so unpalatable may be the stuff of everyday conversations in some, if not many, of the innumerable subcultures that comprise this nation," they noted.

The program was aired by WBAI/ New York, a noncommercial FM station operated by the Pacifica Foundation. Contemporary attitudes toward use of language was the subject for the station's "lunchpail" program.

WBAI Explains

WBAI's General Manager Anna Kosof explained that the station felt Carlin's routine was relevant to the subject matter and that they believe the decision gives the FCC authority to review all programming it views as potentially objectionable. She cited the fact that the FCC actively pursued the case, appealing to the Supreme Court following an Appeals Court decision in favor of WBAI, all on the basis of one letter of complaint. She added that the station plans to be more cautious in the future, seeking legal advice if necessary. In addition, WBAI ran a news broadcast on the decision Monday (7-3) after which they opened their lines to the public for comment

Meanwhile, George Carlin accused the Court of having "chipped away" at the First Amendment, adding that he was only "trying to find humor in our attitudes about these words" and that while "I used to say there is no list (of dirty words), now there is a list."

sponse rate is up or remains the same following the announcements, Arbitron will release a normal fourweek book, providing stations with data broken out for the two weeks in which announcements were not run and the two weeks following, with the announcements. If listening levels are down following the announcements, no book will be issued, but stations will be able to receive the data and Arbitron will conduct an analysis of the response rate drop.

The announcement to be aired by San Diego stations reads: "Many people in San Diego will soon be receiving a small diary and asked to keep close track of their radio listening habits for a one-week period. The San Diego Broadcasters Association would like to urge you to accept such a diary, follow the directions, and fill it in day by day and page by page any time you listen to your radio. Then be sure you return the diary to the company that asks you to keep it. We thank you."

The unusual Arbitron experiment arose from a controversy earlier when several San Diego stations ran announcements relating to diaries and urged listeners to list "their favorite station." If successful, the blanket announcement system could go into general use.

ever he noted it would have been unfair to other broadcasters fined for the same offense.

The case gave "much support" to proposals to deregulate radio in major market areas, according to Commissioner Joseph Fogarty. "We should consider whether in such markets the listener's hand on the tuner and the natural competitive marketplace forces provide the most effective form of regulation in the public interest," continued Fogarty.

WMAL has 30 days in which to contest the fine.

Washington Update

WBAILoses

The Supreme Court's decision upholding the FCC's chastisement in the "seven dirty words" case involving WBAI (FM) in New York (see Page 1) should be seen as a victory for former FCC Chairman Richard Wiley, who became personally involved on numerous occasions in issues involving morality in programming.

S. C. Decision Affirms Affirmative Action

Don't expect the Supreme Court's long-awaited decision admitting Alan Bakke to the University of California at Davis to have any direct effect on radio broadcasters. Ironically, last week's ruling admitting Bakke, a white, to medical school was based upon an interpretation of the 14th Amendment which was adopted after the Civil War to protect the rights of freed blacks.

Meanwhile, At The FCC

Overruling opposition from the Phoenix NAACP, the FCC uphelded its affirmative action policy for radio broadcasters and renewed licences of two Phoenix stations, KOY, licensed to Southern Broadcasting Co. and KQYT-FM, licensed to Arizona FM, Inc. Citing reasons used in similar situations, the Commission said that 1) the overall numbers of minorities in meaningful positions has increased steadily at both stations and 2) women are represented in reasonable numbers on each staff.

The NAACP was arguing that the stations were discriminating in their employment practices against blacks, but the fact is that Phoenix's black population totals less than

three per cent.

Graveyarding?

In announcing the renewals for KOY and KQYT, the Commission issued a statement that all radio licensees should note. The FCC is clearly concerned about the hour stations choose to air public affairs programming and stated "a station is expected to schedule programs . . . when the broadcast could be expected to be effective and it expected this licensee and all licensees henceforth to comply with this policy." KOY and KQYT, with one exception, broadcast their public affairs programming on Sunday mornings between 4:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. As noted here before (R&R, June 23, 1978) Chairman Ferris has asked the FCC's Broadcast Bureau to study when stations are scheduling their public service programming.

At NAB: The South Has Risen Again

Congratulations to Walter May, President of WPKE/Pikeville, Kentucky, who is NAB's new Radio Board Chairman. Walter entered radio as an announcer and now owns several stations. He claims that he never set out to be in radio, much less own a station, and attributes his entire career to luck. Obviously, his luck followed him to the NAB Board meeting last week in Toronto, Canada.

NAB's new vice chairman is Carl Venters, a very capable radio broadcaster who used to be on NRBA's board. Carl runs Durham Life Broadcasting's WFTF and WQDR-FM in

Raleigh and is President of WVWB-FM in New Bern, North Carolina.

Donald Thurston, President of Berkshire Broadcasting in North Adams, Massachusetts, continues as the Chairman of NAB's joint boards (radio and television). One piece of welcome news received by NAB's new leadership is that its radio membership is up 146 AM stations and 194 FM's over last year, for a total of 4549 radio members. NAB also has 507 TV members and 590 associate members.

New AM Station

Also down South, the FCC has given the go-ahead to Joe Henry to construct a new daytime station in Franklin, North Carolina which already has an AM/FM combination station. Joe Henry is calling his operation Mountain Broadcasting Co. and is using \$14,000 of his own money along with a bank loan of \$75,000 to get the station rolling. We wish Joe the best luck on his venture into radio.

NAB Sets Regional Meetings To **Discuss Communications Rewrite**

On the final day of their meeting in Toronto last Friday (June 30th), the NAB Board of Directors set a course of action on the proposed rewrite of the Communications Act (H.R. 13015) for the NAB staff to follow during the six months before the next board meeting. What the board advocates is the "creative blending" of current law-the Communications Act of 1934 with the "most constructive provisions" of the rewrite. The board also pledges its continued cooperation

The NAB board likes portions of the bill which relate to deregulation and license term and stability. They also like the idea of elimina-'excessive restrictions on political broadcasting, overregulation involved in the Fairness Doctrine, and unnecessary paperwork,' which they give credit to the spirit of the bill for tackling.
What they don't like is 1) the

establishment of unknown standards for future broadcast regulation, 2) the threat of revocation of license,

The National Association of Broadcasters is scheduling a series of meetings to brief broadcasters on the Communications Rewrite Bill. Three-quarters of their Radio-TV Board and the NAB staff will be involved. Asterisks indicate where the House Communications Subcommittee will also hold public hearings on the rewrite from August 18 through September 8.

As part of its efforts to acquaint broadcasters with provisions of the proposed bill, NAB will conduct eleven regional meetings between July 10th and 28th. Three of NAB's locations are identical to those already chosen by the subcommittee for a series of public hearings which are being scheduled during the Congressional recess, August 18 through September 8.

3) what they see as an intention of eventually breaking up all combination stations, 4) the possibility of a new allocation policy, 5) removal of all restrictions on cable television, and 6) a license fee (termed a "tax") of undefined magnitude which could conceivably be used by the government as leverage to influence news and programming decisions. Both the NAB meetings for broadcasters and the subcommittee's hearings for the public will provide the first real examination of the issues.





On The Horizon—Jazz AOR

As defined by a market researcher named Kotler in 1972, "Market segmentation is the subdividing of a market into homogenous subsets of customers, where any subset may

conceivably be selected as a market target to be reached within a distinct marketing mix." WRVR/New York is one of the first radio stations nationwide to successfully subdivide the AOR musical spectrum, picking out its jazz /rock components and programming them in a blend of more traditional jazz music

WRVR had been a traditional jazz-formatted station for over four years when Top 40 PD Dennis Waters left 13Q/Pittsburgh to take over the programming reins of the floundering jazz outlet. He made several changes, including replacing most of the station's then-current jock lineup. Says Waters, "The more classical approach to presenting jazz was to go into great detail about each cut, list musicians who were playing and such. Some of the old WRVR jocks were among the best in the world in doing that sort of thing, but it made radio very difficult to listen to. That entire approach has been streamlined to a more contemporary AOR style

delivery, with a lot less talk. Waters has found himself facing the same problem AOR radio did when it had to decide whether it was important for its jocks to understand the roots of the music they played, or just to be good radio communicators. "That's a question that continues to bother me," Waters says. "I've got some jocks that really do have a great knowledge of jazz and others who do not. Certainly there are none who don't care for the music, but some whose musical knowledge is growing gradually, along with the station."

As with most present-day AOR stations, WRVR's air personalities have limited freedom to make musical choices. "The music," according to Waters, "is very categorized. The jazz audience, as small as it is, is just as fractionalized as the rock audience, with cults and



followings of certain people and movements. We have high rotation stuff that is programmed cut by cut and for certain times as well, and other stuff on low rotation that is encoded on a card system that the jocks work from to choose the rest of their material.

The musical choices have changed a great deal since Waters joined the station in 1977. As he explains, "There are a number of artists who really stand out from the old-style jazz players: Miles Davis is one and John Coltrane is certainly another. They're thought of very highly in jazz circles; they're heroes. But while I was an MD in Pittsburgh I had noticed a great deal of street-level acceptance of a whole new generation of artists who were not getting any exposure on the radio—Stanley Clarke and David Sanborn and all the rest. I felt the time was right to expose them as well as the heavies. So we strike a 60-40 percent balance of new and old. Of course there's a huge polarization in the jazz audience between these new crossover artists and the traditional artists. We can't completely please either group but we try and strike a balance that will maximize our audience and keep the greatest number of people happy...or at least not complaining too much.'

A typical hour of WRVR music now includes such traditional artists as Jimmy Smith, Dizzy Gillesple and Woody Shaw, mixed in with AOR names like George Benson, Phoebe Snow and Al DiMeola, and blended further by the inclusion of acts like Stevie Wonder, The Brothers Johnson and Quincy Jones. Waters' experience at WRVR has shown that Jazz AOR music plays no racial favorites. "I've looked at it in a number of ways," he says. "Arbitron diaries, our own request lines, and other music-oriented research I've seen and done shows that Jazz AOR listeners are pretty evenly split, 50 percent Caucasian and 50 percent Black. The market appears to be especially strong in 25-34 year old men, and this is really in direct correlation to the process of maturation of the Woodstock generation. Essentially the same group who were getting into progressive rock radio ten years ago are

One of the interesting quirks Waters' research has brought out is that audience identification with specific Jazz AOR artists is minimal. Says Waters, "Their familiarity with exact titles is extremely low. They may not know more than three or four of the artists who are played on the station. Instead, they seem to like the sound in general. We try and mix the music so that it includes the known and the unknown in a blend that is tasty but also inoffensive.'

His programming stance of "tasty but...inoffensive" Jazz AOR music has put WRVR's ratings on an upward swing ever since Waters arrived a year-and-a-half ago, although the

station has only been in the black financially for the past six months. Waters is pleased with the station's slow but steady growth and success pattern. "It's been an enormous learning experience for me and just the challenge of taking on a market like New York with programming as eclectic as ours stimulates me.'

Waters continues, "I see WRVR's Jazz AOR programming as being one of a variety of formats that are going to evolve as the radio and records crowd grows older. I tend to view WRVR not so much as a Jazz station as it is part of the natural evolution of AOR radio, with the same basic concepts and principles."

Bobby Cole Named PD Of KWST, KMEL

After a month-long search for a PD for KWST/Los Angeles, Century Broadcasting's National PD Bob Burch revealed his choice for the position: Bobby Cole, currently PD at KMEL/San Francisco, who will maintain both positions. Cole, who will divide his work week between both locations, anticipates no programming or staff changes in the immediate future at the L.A. AOR outlet.

In announcing his decision Burch said, "Cole's track record in San Francisco is something we feel would make sense to exploit further in terms of our west coast operations. I feel very confident that he can handle both cities. The two stations will be similar yet each will maintain its own personality.

Cole called the appointment "a great opportunity and a fantastic challenge. I'm looking forward to it and am quite geared up for it.

Burch has also named Bob Gowa as KWST's new Music Director, replacing Mike Bechtel, who will retain his weekend airshift.

The sale of KFWD/Dallas to Gulf Life Insurance Co. from Southern Broadcasting has been approved by the FCC and will become effective August 1st. PD Steve Sutton anticipates no programming or staff changes....John Cooper has exited as MD of WOUR/Utica for WQBK/Albany. Tom Starr has returned to WOUR as their Music Director....Chip Knight is the new MD at KZOZ/San Luis Obispo, from KRTH/ Los Angeles. Former MD Don Fisher is no longer with the station.... A typographic mix-up placed Cecile as MD at KZAP/Sacramento two weeks ago. She is actually still MD at KPRI/San Diego....Afternoon air personality Firefly has exited WBLM/Lewiston-Portland....Tom Sullivan is new to M105/Cleveland middays, from WHLQ/Canton....Mona Lee is back at news at WSIM/Chattanooga....New to sales at WNIC/Dearborn are Barbara Berent and Vicky Plonka....Gary Tanner has been appointed to a National AOR Promotion job for Capricorn Records, from Dallas regional promotion work for the company.

As the ratings results continue to flow in, notable are KQRS/Minneapolis under PD Tac Hammer's direction, who came up nicely this time around, and WJNO-FM/West Palm Beach, where PD Russ Morley took the station to close to two digit figures....KAWY/Casper copped two awards from the Wyoming Association of Broadcasting for their public affairs programming. They won for the Best Program and Best Commercial Service Campaign. A tip of the AOR hat to public affairs director Dave Luce for making public affairs work for the station, not against it....It was Millennium recording artists The Godz against the QFM96/Columbus airstaff in an unusual sports setting recently, when the two met headon (so to speak) in stock car races at the Columbus Motor Speedway. When the dust cleared Godz lead singer Eric Moore was in first place (next time the station should take on Snail) ... Meanwhile back in Kansas City, KY-102 morning men Dick Wilson and Jay Cooper (whose comments on their airshift helped make our Morning Men feature such enlightening reading) have begun airing "Slice of Life" newscasts. The two read news items called in by listeners. Typical announcements: "Bill Davis goes to the dentist at 8:30 this morning," or "The second annual Bong-A-Thon was held at Marty's house last night. There was a winner but no one remembers who it was." The morning team reports phenomenal response to their novel approach to "news."

WASH Cleaning Up In D.C.

In light of WASH's dramatic rise in the April/May urbitron (4.6 to 6.5) we contacted Program Director lob Hughes who offered the following explanation as to he big gain: "Going back to last summer, we could see rom our quarter-hour maintenance figures, that we had s much quarter-hour maintenance from the existing udience as we could expect. We also knew from the way ur listeners listen to radio and the way the market listens o radio that we had to walk a very narrow line. We had o do something to the programming to get some more



ume. And to us that meant a couple of things. We cut he oldies drastically, taking out the older oldies, and became much more contemporaryounding. We also became very particular as to how the records were played according to the lemographic groups that were available to listen to radio at any particular moment in Washngton. So we planned to be an 18-34 flavor at times when that would most benefit us, just as we lavor other times to the 25-49 set. Overall, the technique we used was flavoring. We looked for hose records, within our format, that would appeal more strongly to a demographic group hat would be available in greater numbers than at any other time. In terms of making the ralio station more appealing to the casual listener, dialing up and down the dial, we adjusted he rotation of some of the hits, giving them a more high profile impact. But we did it very arefully because we realize that faster rotation of the hits will tend to drive away the higher end of demographics.

We also realized that we can't rely on music for all of it, so we hired an airborne traffic idvisor. Our community ascertainment survey showed that the problem of traffic and ransportation in the city was by far the most important problem in the market. Walt Staring is our traffic guy, very heavy personality; really, the best way I can describe him is that ne's a phenomenon. His effect on this market is like that of a Paul Harvey, Dr. Don Rose or a John Gambling, in that listeners feel that he's talking just to them and trying to help them in any way he can. We feel his traffic reports were responsible for pulling in a lot of new people to this radio station.

"We also beefed up personal appearances by our air staff. During this last book they made more appearances than they've ever made. They talked to, met, and were received by upwards of 20,000 Washingtonians. Plus our jingle package is so strong that listeners have actually called and requested to hear them again, just like one would call in and request a record. It's (the jingles) a perfect distillation of what this radio station is about. Summing this up, we had everything that you could possibly have working for you going into a book working for us. I'm so proud of this staff that I just can't find words strong enough to describe
