STATION SET TO BE SOLD TO BLACK GROUP 96X "Diary Tampering" **Causes Miami Book Recall**

Arbitron has recalled its April/ May '78 Miami, Fort Lauderdale, and combined market rating reports as a result of "diary tampering" by three employees of 96X/ Miami now no longer with the station or the Charter Broadcasting chain. Arbitron's Connie Anthes told R&R, "WMJX gave us a call and told us that a now-former employee had possibly influenced four diary keepers." Arbitron checked the diaries, and decided to delete the diaries. Since the diary keepers (four members of a single family) live in Dade County, the Miami and Ftl. Lauderdale books, as well as the combined market report, were affected. The revised book, which mails next week, will show 96X with reduced cume and quarterhour totals, but whether a position change will occur in the market was not vet determined.

The recall comes just as an agreement in principle was reached by Charter to sell the station to Ragan A. Henry, President of WGIV/ Charlotte and chief executive of the black-owned Broadcast Enterprises Network, which owns six radio stations and has just agreed to purchase its first television operation in Rochester.

96X's role in the matter may work in its favor, as the station itself informed Arbitron of the possi-

bility of tampering. According to informed sources, an assistant bookkeeper at the station lived next door to the four-member family (two adults 35-49, two sons 18-24). When the family first was notified by Arbtron, one of the boys asked the bookkeeper, apparently innocently, if the diaries would be valuable to 96X. The bookkeeper informed the Local Sales Manager and General Sales Manager, who reportedly refused at that time. About three weeks later, the family received its diaries, and the boy proposed offering the diaries to the station in exchange for stereo equipment. At this point, the General Sales Manager allegedly agreed to "buy some insurance," and the three ex-96X employees reportedly filled out the diaries, recording about 30 hours of listening in each to 96X

Early this month, the assistant bookkeeper reportedly ran into some trouble at the station, and threatened his superior in the bookkeeping department that he'd "blow everything" on the diary tampering incident. The head bookkeeper, previously unaware of any such incident, expressed shock and dismay, informed the station management, all three involved were "summarily dismissed," and Arbitron was informed, triggering the recall.

Considered Success The National Association of Broadcasters' first Radio Programming Conference concluded Wednesday (8-23), with most of the approximately 900 participants and organizers agreeing that the event was a successful first try. The Conference, NAB's first exclusively radiooriented convention, was geared toward enhancing the organizations's image with radio executives who still perceive the NAB as dominated by television interests; with younger program directors and general managers regarded as the future core of NAB's radio membership; and with supporters of the National Radio Broadcasters Association (NRBA), staging its own annual convention in Septem-

ber in San Francisco. The Conference was marked by a keynote address by comedian/ social activist Dick Gregory, who directed a number of remarks at radio's potential power. "TV had all the power and blew it," Gregory maintained, "and it's about to come back to you ... Realize how much power there is. Understand your power and the amount of people who listen to you. They're turned off to television . . ." Gregory urged radio broadcasters to help solve society's problems.

Featured at the Conference were radio format rooms, plus workshops on research, news, programming and promotion, sales, the FCC, music, air personalities, and AM stereo. Concert appearances by Barry Manilow, Chicago, and the Dirt Band were also highlights. Representatives from the trade press also staged a seminar for the assembled broadcasters. **Prez Conference**

Another featured attraction was a session called "Meet The Prez." spotlighting the chief executives of the top radio networks. Starr Broadcasting President Bruce Johnson served as moderator for the meeting. Mutual Broadcasting System President C. Edward Little discussed his company's ambitious satellite technology, while CBS Radio Division's San Cook Diggs stressed his network's "special events programming." ABC Radio's Hal Neal called for a more sophis-ticated approach to research; and, in passing, dubbed the coming of satellite technology the "Star Wars Era of Competition" for radio. And Jack Thayer of the NBC Radio Network maintained that more important than new hard or software is "brainware"-the individual responsibility of broadcasters to excite their listeners.

Convention attendance met (or possibly exceeded) NAB expecta-



tions, and the organization expressed satisfaction at the outcome. In a final lighter touch, WDHR/ Pikeville, KY General Manager Jim Casto introduced a revolutionary new concept of music rotation.

When asked at a session to describe his rotation system, Casto stated flatly: "We play one record after another. Last time a guy tried to play two cuts at once, I fired him

WMC Jock Stabbed By **Angry Listener**

Jacque Strickland, 12-3pm air personality at WMC-AM in Memphis, was followed home Friday (8-18), attacked, and stabbed ten times by a man who had been calling her at the station for two years.

According to Stickland, "He was a regular phone caller who wouldn't call to request - just to talk. The conversations never lasted more than thirty seconds. Occasionally he'd call and say some weird things like 'Did they talk to you?' without ever identifying who 'they' were.

"I was always nice to him, not abrupt or anything," she continued, "but Friday the station was really busy, what with the police strike, so I hadn't gotten around to picking up the request line. When I picked it up it was him, and he was screaming at the top of his lungs, saying, 'Why won't you talk to me?' I said, 'I've got better things to do than answer the phones all day.' He said, 'You just be that way' and hung up and I didn't think anything of

After the show, she drove home. "I pulled into my parking lot, grabbed my purse and got one foot out of the car, looked up and there he was," she told R&R. Strickland suffered cuts to her face, arms, hands, and stomach. She was hospitalized but is recovering well, although there is no set date for her release.

Former Mental Patient

Police captured her suspected assailant, 27-year-old Cooper Baldridge, two blocks from the scene and charged him with assault to commit murder. Police said Baldridge is a former mental patient with a history of confinement in drug abuse institutions. He is being held in custody while the judge denied bond due to the brutal nature of the attack. One newspaper account claimed Baldridge said. Jacquelyn, I've got to do this."

While Jacque herself knows no reason for the attack, saying, "He was just a weird person, I guess," she maintains, "If he's ever out I won't stick around ... Jacque Strickland is going to be Teresa Margarita working in San Jose or something."

Former Nixon Aide Erlichman Signed By Mutual

POLITICAL COMMENTARY PROGRAM

The Mutual Broadcasting System announced the signing of John D. Erlichman, former aide to President Richard M. Nixon, for a political commentary program. The show will air five days a week for 21/2 minutes daily (90 seconds of commentary, 60 of spots) over the 900-station strong Mutual radio network. The program, to be prepared by Erlichman from his Santa Fe. NM home, will deal with the lessons of Watergate, the role of the press, and other political topics, and will offer a "fresh perspective," he stated. Erlichman, whose career since exiting the White House five years ago has included the writing of three books and a 15-month prison sentence for his role in the Watergate affair, said that Mutual approached him for the program, and that his compensation was not an "enormous enticement."

Mutual President C. Edward Little, in announcing Erlichman's program, expressed his belief that the show would be "one of the most



important and revealing news programs ever broadcast. The Mutual Broadcasting System views John Erlichman's program as a public service to the people of the United States." Erlichman is the second Watergate era figure to try his hand at political commentary via radio; John Dean launched a syndicated program early this year which was discontinued recently.

Morning Man Migration Mounts

Charlie Tuna exited KHJ/Los Angeles, with KDWB/Minneapolis's True Don Bleu announced as his replacement, and KCBQ/San Diego morning team Charlie And Harrigan departed for WRKO/Boston as a turbulent week for morning men unfolded.

KHJ General Manager Tim Sullivan told R&R, "It was in the best interests of both KHJ and Charlie Tuna to terminate the association based on the direction the station was going." Program Director John Sebastian expanded on that statement: "Charlie is a very talented announcer. The direction of the station and his strengths, however, are in opposite directions now, so we came to this conclusion." As for Tuna himself, the longtime Los Angeles morning personality commented, "I knew something was up when I returned from my vacation and found a dinner invitation from George Allen and Billy Martin."

Bleu, Tuna's successor at KHJ, had been with KDWB for almost a decade, and Program Director Dave Thomson commented that a move on Bleu's part was inevitable. "With a guy of his stature and talent, you almost have to expect he'll be leaving sometime." Sebastian told R&R: "I'm very excited about his coming, having already worked with him at KDWB. It will take very little time for him to get into it here, and yet on his side, he'll be able to open up more in this particular shift than he could in Minneapolis. It should be good for him and KHJ." Sebastian added that Bleu would probably adopt a new air name at KHJ.

Off To Boston

Charlie and Harrigan, KCBQ's comedic morning team for two years, will be leaving for WRKO September 11, following a long courtship by the Boston station and a reportedly highly-lucrative contract. The morning spot at WRKO was vacated last month when Tim Kelly moved to KF1/Los Angeles in a midday slot. KCBQ General Manager Mike Stafford commented, 'They've done such a good job in San Diego that they have been constantly besieged by offers They will now be in the top five in the country in terms of salary and . We are now going to benefits . . be looking for a new personality or team that can have the same kind of relationship with the people of San Diego.

Knight Joins WHK As PD

Russ Knight has been appointed Program Director at Country-formatted WHK/Cleveland. He replaces John Webster, who will remain at WHK as Director of Public Affairs and Special Projects. Malrite Vice President of Programming John Chaffee commented, "John owns a local recording studio and this will give him some more needed time for his own business. Plus we are really going to start using his talents in many new future projects for WHK."

Knight was most recently Program Director at WAKR/Akron, but had left that station last month to join KBOX/Dallas (owned, as is WAKR, by Group One) as PD. KBOX General Manager Chester Maxwell told R&R, "Russ was on his way to joining us, when he called to inform me his family wanted to stay in the Akron-Cleveland area because of school and friends. So we are now looking for another person to direct our programming. I'm sure Russ will do an excellent job at WHK." Knight

Another Mexican Station Aims For San Diego Market

As controversy over Baja California station XTRA-FM's proposed rock entry into the San Diego market continues, another Mexican station has boosted power and joined the competition in the American market. XHRM-FM debuted Monday (8-21) with 50,000 watts and a Black format, including some gospel programming and an unusual bilingual combination black/Spanish music show. Well-known broadcaster Ken Hawkins (WJMO/ Cleveland among others) is Gen-eral Manager of the station; Jess Williams is Program Director. XHRM is owned by Power Base Communications, headed by Ken L. Harris. The station will be the only Black format in the San Diego area, and the first to try that approach in several years


Smith Exits WOKY,

Arista Latest To Sue In Knight Case

A tangled legal web surrounding singer Gladys Knight was complicated further last week by a new \$100 million suit filed by Arista **Records** against CBS Records and the singer. Arista, which distributes **Buddah Records (Knight's former** label, which sued CBS in its own right a week ago), is seeking \$25 million each from Knight and CBS in compensatory damages, and \$50 million in punitive damages. The suit alleges that CBS, which announced Knight's signing to Columbia at its recent convention, deliberately tried to induce Knight away from her Buddah contract despite being aware of her "commitment to Buddah through an exclusive services contract" with production operation Perfection In Performance, Inc. The CBS signing, the suit says, was an "attempt by a huge entertainment conglomerate to step between a competitive company and an artist." The new suit is the latest in a series begun by Knight, who sued Buddah and Arista in an attempt to gain release from her contract, claiming Buddah was insolvent and could not provide adequate promotion.

RADIO ADS POSSIBLY NEXT TARGET

Is The FTC Becoming "Big Brother"?

Radio programming and sales departments have often been at odds with each other. People in sales were many times all business while programmers tended to be "the temperamental, creative geniuses." Three things have changed during the '70's: 1) Increased competition for the advertising dollar has forced sales departments to hire more creative talent - women have especially benefited from this, 2) Programmers are more concerned about "the radio business" and 3) Both programmers and sales people have had to share knowledge of government regulation

Sophisticated managers in both jobs have spent numerous hours reading FCC rules, and dollars traveling to conferences to learn what is expected of them. To a great extent, good radio owners have tended to view this much in the same manner as replacing worn parts or deficient equipment, ie. "preventive maintenance." However, in the future, program, operations and sales managers are going to have to be just as conversant with what's happening at the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) as the FCC.

What's An FTC?

If anyone reading R&R is unfamiliar with the Federal Trade Commission, the FTC is to advertising and potentially some programming, what the FCC is to engineering and programming. In addition to being regulators, however, they are also prosecutors. Very rapidly, the FTC is seizing as well as inventing opportunities to examine broadcast advertising. Ever since R&R began its "Washington Report" - and it is truly that, neither hype nor speculation -we have reason to mention the FTC weekly. Increasingly, we sense a concern for radio as many FTC proceedings are using front and back door approaches to scrutinize broadcast advertising. To date, the FTC has-had no occasion to single out radio ads. We think that this is more an oversight than intent and that given enactment of certain proposed rulemaking, radio will be included in their enforcement.

Congressional Wrist Slapping

It is wise in the remaining pre-Orwellian years therefore to be acquainted with one of the Federal government's most aggressive agencies. For just a moment, let's examine the FTC's current mood regarding television. In short, the FTC is seeking omnipotence in reBureau, told the Senate's Subcommittee on Nutrition that he wishes to enlarge his agency's role in food advertising beyond its traditional role of being concerned with deceptive and unfair ads to include "the bigger picture: what foods are advertised, to whom and what messages are conveyed by food advertisers as a whole."

Back Door Approach

Kramer told the Senate subcommittee that the FTC will be joining two other Federal agencies, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), in sponsoring public hearings to discuss food

gulating advertising in children's television programs. In fact, the U.S. Senate has been so bothered with the FTC's obsessive "kid-vid" inquiry that it is currently considering reducing the Commission's appropriations and telling them to stay "the hell out of it."

Stranglehold!

Regardless, the Senate's decision isn't likely to thwart the FTC's current mood of moving against advertisers. Recently, we reported (R&R 8/8) a speech given by Tracy Weston, FTC Deputy Director of the Consumer Bureau, proposing new remedies for regulating advertising. For example, the FTC views an ad's copy these days as of minimal importance. Applied to radio, an FTC staffer implied that the Commission might begin looking at music, effects and voice inflections in radio spots. Weston, it seems, was in Chicago testing the water on those thoughts in preparation for his boss's testimony on the Hill the following week. Al Kramer, Director of the Consumer labeling in five cities during late summer and fall. Kramer thinks that labeling is a step away from advertising ("both," he says, "are used by the public in food purchase decisions"). What we think merits watching, though, is how the FTC goes about its business. Unlike the manner in which the FTC has done things in the past and unlike the way in which the FCC reaches conclusions, Kramer is an advocate of approaching issues from all sides. He calls this "the total information environment." He anticipates that his agency will use information gleaned from the public meetings to enhance "our understanding of and our ability to deal with a number of advertising problems." What this boils down to, however, is the FTC homing in on a series of meetings in order to supply the Commission with data to support its contention that consumers aren't being adequately informed on nutrition issues by radio and television

The heart of the question is the extent to which the general public

needs Federal assistance in making nutritional decisions. Kramer is a noble man dedicated to saving the public - children in particular from corporations that manufacture foods that are high in sugar content, highly processed and fabricated and which use advertising to promote their products. The effects of his efforts could be as far-reaching as Congressional action taken years ago banning cigarette advertising on radio and TV. Think of how your sales and programming might be affected if you were forced to drop advertising of soft drinks, candy, chewing gum, etc. or forced to air alternative messages promoting fresh vegetables and fruits. In short, should broadcasters be singled out, AGAIN, as second class citizens to the print industry? Perhaps the FTC should review lessons learned from prohibition and the cigarette ban.

Sugar As Gras

The FDA has instituted a phrase it uses for foods it thinks okay for mass consumption, "GRAS," which stands for "generally recognized as safe." Kramer's concern is not with typing the foods, but with how foods containing GRAS substances are promoted and whether or not advertising whould be restricted. In denying maneuvering on the part of the Association of National Advertisers and the American Association of Advertising Agencies to divert the FTC in its present inquiry into children's advertising, the Commission reaffirmed its commitment to follow through with its current rulemaking proceeding to determine if advertising of sugared products directed to kids may be "unfair and deceptive because of the possible health risks that may result from the consumption of sugar encouraged by such advertising."

For now, radio managers should still be more concerned about the new Ferris Commission. At the same time, R&R will continue to keep an eye on the FTC.

Washington Street Talk

ABC Radio overcomes an attempt by Mutual Broadcasting Co. to secure rights to Paul Harvey show. Harvey, who has been with ABC for 27 years, signs 7-year extension on contract, which includes Radio & TV. No figures were disclosed.

Frank Lloyd, it is rumored, might be next FCC Executive Director. Lloyd is currently administrative assistant to Chairman Charles Ferris (Lloyd was unavailable for comment). Move, it is said, would neutralize Lloyd, who has been in-fighter for Chairman, yet remain loyal to Ferris. Apparently, talk of a Lloyd transition began circulating when it was thought that current office holder might be leaving the Commission. However, Don Lichwardt, a Wiley appointee, told R&R that he plans to remain at the Commission.

Rod Porter Resigns Case

The FCC's zapping of a former employee has many overtones, among them catching someone in the "revolving door," a term used by the Carter admistration for persons flowing between government and private industry. At issue is the Commission's determination to

force a Washington communications attorney to go beyond normal legal requirements, Commission rules and regulations, and the Legal Canon of Ethics, in defending his right to try a radio case.

Rod Porter of Fletcher, Heald and Hildreth was administrative assistant to former FCC Chairman Richard Wiley in October, 1976, when the Commission granted WYOR/Coral Gables, Florida a limited license to begin operation. Up until last week, Porter was co-counsel for WYOR, which is seeking an interpretation of the FCC's allocation standards. In resigning the case, Porter denied any previous impropriety.

Porter told R&R that "it's a matter of principle. I was being asked to do something beyond the circumstances of the case." Porter has been supported by his firm and by the Federal Communications Bar Association, which contends that an attorney's signature on a pleading or notice of appearance constitutes "a representation that there are no conflict of interest matters which would bar the firm or attorney from acting as counsel." Jim Reily of Fletcher, Heald & Hildreth will continue the case. "How Much I Feel"

ABC To Purchase Initial TRAC-7, Burke Research Output

ABC Radio has announced its intentions to purchase the initial radio research output of both Audits & Surveys' TRAC-7 and Burke Broadcast Research this fall. The move, which follows NBC Radio's announced intention to purchase TRAC-7, is of considerable importance to the two rating services launching their challenge to the established Arbitron system. ABC Radio President Hai Neal stated, "There can be no more graphic illustration of the radio medium's vitality and appeal to the advertising community than the fact that two major research organizations have made substantial dollar commitments to enter the syndicated radio audience measurement field at this time." TRAC-7 plans to inaugurate its service in New York, Chicago, Los Angeles, San Francisco, and Washington, D.C., all of which have ABC O&O's. Burke plans to start with the top ten markets; ABC owns stations in seven of those cities.

RKO Radio Sales Polls Advertisers On Radio

RKO Radio Sales. under the supervision of Vice President/General Manager Thomas F. Burchill. have completed a study of over 300 advertisers and agency executives on their attitudes toward radio as an advertising medium. The study, conducted by Bill Moyes's Research Group, covered six "attitudinal areas" and its results will be used by RKO to formulate a new campaign to convince advertisers of radio's effectiveness.

Topics covered in the interviews included 'The advantages and disadvantages of radio, newspapers, and TV; ad pretesting; importance of reach and/or frequency to advertisers; image and credibility; perceptions of radio listening and radio in general; and attitude toward radio marketing services. The results apparently showed that radio has considerable work to do in educating advertisers.

95% of those polled claimed to have a good understanding of the image and credibility of the magazines they used, almost 70% claimed the same for TV, but a mere 33% had a clear view of images associated with various radio formats. 53% said they had an insufficient feel for the "right" frequency to make radio effective for advertising, but only 28% had an insufficient grasp of TV frequency. 59% pretested TV spots and 51% pretested print copy, but just 33% pretested radio commercials.

Summing up the results, RKO's Burchill stated, "There is ample evidence that dramatic increase: in advertising impact and market penetration occur when radio is included in the media mix. Yet one of the more important discoveries from this study was that there's still an overwhelming impression that radio is primarily a frequency medium. If radio isn't perceived to be the prime reach medium that in fact it is, then all of the existing evidence proving it is to no avail until that evidence has been communicated and employed . . . We had to find out what and how they (advertisers) presently feel about radio before we could formulate a marketing plan to realign their perceptions of radio."

Clarion Launches Concerted Effort On Radio, TV, Print

Clarion Corp. of America has raised its ad budget to prepare a \$2 million fall campaign tagged "A Concert In Your Car," promoting its car stereo equipment, especially the new "Hi-Way Fidelity" line. Spot radio flights will occur in the second phase of the campaign in spring, in 15-20 top nationwide markets, preceded by TV and extensive print buys.

Chevrolet Keys California Radio Campaign For '79 Models

Chevrolet will stage an all-out radio campaign on behalf of its 1979 models, with special emphasis on the Monza, in California. The initial stage of the campaign begins Sept. 12-23 in 16 California markets, followed by a second flight September 25 in seven markets.

James A. Brown VP National Spot Development At RAB

James A. Brown has been named to the newly-created position of Vice President/National Spot Development Sales Manager at the Radio Advertising Bureau. Brown had been Vice President, New Business Development at Golden West Broadcasters; and was previously VP/General Sales Manager at KSFO/San Francisco. RAB President Miles David and Station Representives Association Managing Director J.S. Kellner commented, "The selection of Jim Brown ends an intensive search for an executive to fill this newly created national sales position. Jim's sole responsibility will be to develop national spot radio business." The appointment was designed to help the RAB and SRA "accelerate growth" of national spot radio.

ABC Declares 3-2 Split, Ups, Devidend

The American Broadcasting Co. has declared a three-for-two split in its common stock, effective Sept. 19; certificates for additional shares will be mailed around October 10. The company also intends to raise its annual dividend rate in the fourth quarter to \$1.08 after the split.

Harte-Hanks To Buy KMJK/Portland

Combined Communications Corp., following its merger into Gannett Co., has reached an agreement in principle to buy KCFM/St. Louis. No price was announced. CCC had been required by FCC regulations to dispose of its FM station in Phoenix, KBBC, and KCFM is planned to replace it.

BCI Bowing Product User Evaluation System For Radio Advertisers

Broadcast Computing Inc. of New York plans to introduce a new system for evaluating radio stations by the number of product users they boast. Working with Simmons Market Research Bureau and the Webster Group, BCI has developed a system of programmed magnetic cards carrying product usage and format information. When combined with local population and ratings information, the cards can enable salespeople to demonstrate the number of product users attracted by a given station.

TV News

Networks Gird For New Season

The three networks have more or less firmed up their fall schedules (barring inevitable lastminute changes). Most of the holdover hit shows are remaining in the same time slots as last year, with exceptions: ABC's "Soap" moves from Tuesdays 9:30 to Thursdays at the same time, and "Welcome Back Kotter" goes from 8:00 Thursday to the same time Monday. As always, a host of new hopefuls await viewer dissection, trying to grab that initial Nielsen rating base. Monday nights feature CBS's radio-slanted comedy "WKRP in Cincinnati," touted as a conceivable smash; along with "People," a frothy news show based on the approach of the magazine. ABC debuts a new MTM comedy, "Taxi," on Tuesdays at 9:30, while CBS has "Paper Chase" (based on the college-slanted movie) at 8:00 and NBC has the relatively new "Operation: Runaway" at the same time. Wednesday is almost all new shows (ABC's "Vega\$," CBS's "In The Beginning," and NBC's "Dick Clark" variety program, "Grandpa Goes To Washington," and "Lifeline." Thursday, on the other hand, has NBC's "W.E.B." drama as the only newcomer. More new season rundown next week.

MUSIC ON TV – Teen favorites Kristy & Jimmy McNichol have their first variety special, "Kristy & Jimmy McNichol Present ABC All-Star Saturday," set for September 1 at 8pm. Maurice Gibb, Donny Osmond, Joey Travolta and Donny Most guest, along with excerpts from the network's Saturday morning kids' shows... John Denver returns to the tube with "Alaska: The American Child," a two-hour tribute to the state which also features three Denver songs... KC & The Sunshine Band appear on the season's first "Donny & Marie" show September 22 on ABC, along with Olivia Newton-John and (in another solo appearance) Maurice Gibb... Snail make their television debut on American Bandstand August 26... Amerama artist Charlee stars in a syndicated TV special in several markets nationwide.

ABC Wins Week Against Tough CBS Competition

As the rerun season draws to a close, ABC maintained its customary dominance by winning the Nielsen rating week ending August 13 with a 15.0 average rating. CBS was a close second with J 4.6 and NBC finished third with a 13.4. Repeats dominated the top ten, led by CBS's "One Day At A Time." Following were 2) "Three's Company" (ABC) 3) "Alice" (CBS) 4) "Fantasy Island" (ABC) 5) "MASH" (CBS) 6) "Columbo" (NBC) 7) "Love Boat" (ABC) 8) "Barnaby Jones" (CBS) 9) "Lou Grant" (CBS) and 10) "Laverne & Shirley" (ABC).

ABC had its usual near-totally dominant week in Los Angeles's Arbitron television rankings, but CBS once again edged the network leader in the New York standings. "Three's Company" was top show in New York, followed by 2) "Alice" and "Barney Miller" tied 4) "MASH" 5) a fourway tie between "All In The Family," "Good Times," "Laverne & Shirley," and "One Day At A Time," and 9) a three-way tie between "Fantasy Island," "The Jeffersons," and "Love Boat."

"Three's Company" also led the L.A. pack, followed by 2) "Laverne & Shirley" 3) "Carter Country" 4) "Barney Miller," "Fantasy Island," "Love Boat" and NBC's Big Event all tied 8) a tie between an ABC Frank Sinatra special and a Dodgers baseball game carried on Metromedia's KTTV, and 10) a five-way tie between an ABC Thursday movie, another Dodgers game, ABC's Barbara Walters special, "Happy Days," and "Quincy." CBS, which captured 6 of 11 places in New York, was shut out in Los Angeles.

Philadelphia Mayor Outlaws Outdoor Rock Concerts

Philadelphia Mayor Frank Rizzo has placed a ban on outdoor rock concerts in the city following an incident at a U.K. performance in which, according to one source, 40-50 people out of a crowd of 30,000 began throwing beer cans and bottles at the stage. The ban is apparently effective as long as Rizzo remains in office.

Intelligent Coping Machines: The Prints & The Copiers

The intelligent copier, a machine that not only copies but also makes charts and graphs, prints letters typed in on a keyboard (in a choice of several fonts), handles facsimile messages and is capable of storing up to 1,200 pages of information in electronic files, is currently being field-tested by Xerox in several locations, including the White House. Two other companies, Wang Laboratories Inc. and the Tokyo Shibaura Electric Co. are likewise readying devices similar to what Xerox calls an Advanced Muli-Function Workstation.

Mirek J. Stevenson. chairman of Quantum Science Corp., a New York market research company predicts, "By 1981, every major manufacturer of copiers will have similar products on the market." The machines are viewed as revolutionary with their ability to print with high quality as well as copy.

Tubeless Television To Debut

After a decade of development, ultrathin tubeless TV's are drawing closer to the marketplace. Although low brightness and color-tinted pictures have plagued manufacturers in the past, **Sharp** has unveiled an eightpound set with a six-inch screen that provides a clear picture inade up of 25-foot lamberts (about one-quarter the brightness of tube sets) and a 50-1 contrast ratio. However, the images continue to have a yelloworange tint to them.

The sets, which can be hung on the wall like a picture, still have no firm availability date. But one Japanese manufacturer intends to have an under-\$500 model with twice the image size and brightness of Sharp's demonstration model ready by next year.



Future possibilities include the introduction of a full-color flat-screen model which Phillps intends to comblne with a microcomputer to produce 3-D images. The Philips sets might be available in 1981.

Manager Hopes Everybody Loves A Clone

Ever wanted to see Jim Morrison. Jim Croce. Bobby Darin. Mama Cass Elliott, and Elvis Presley all on one star-studded stage? Unlikely as such a bill would have been in their prime, since all the artists above are deceased, the prospect of their appearing together seems completely ludicrous. But not to manager/entrepreneur Dennis O'Day. You may recall O'Day as the manager of one Dennis Wise, the singer who underwent plastic surgery to look exactly like Presley. Wise split from O'Day, but the manager, far from becoming discouraged, has decided to expand upon his original idea.

He's rounded up six would-be entertainers to take on the exact appearance of Morrison, Croce, Darin, Elliott, and Presley (a matched set of Elvises, one male, one female). O'Day calls this aggregation his "clone army." He expands upon his theme: "I think music is in a sad state right now. I think it's really stagnating...I also think there's a lot of people who still like to...remember their heroes the way they were. That's what I'm trying to put together. It'll be a nonstop review of people's deceased heroes."

The six future lookalikes, all of whom, O'Day assures us, are "playing with a full deck," will undergo surgery August 21 and will make their debut in Atlanta, September 1. O'Day hopes to have 15-20 "clones" of deceased superstars by November as part of his rock & roll resurrection stable. Some people may say rock & roll is dead—but O'Day hopes to prove it doesn't have to stay that way.

Household Size Dropping; Single Households Up

The Census Bureau reports that the current average household in the U.S. consists of 2.81 persons, down 11% from 1970's average of 3.14. The percentge of never-married singles households rose from 7% eight years ago to 11% of the total. The Bureau related the trend to reluctance on the part of younger people to get married and have children. In other findings, married households dropped from 70% to 62%, while households headed by divorced or separated persons numbered 12% up from 8%. Total households rose about 20%, from 63.4 million in 1970 to 76 million currently.





WCCO COLOSSUS OF THE MIDWEST

WCCO/Minneapolis is an institution and a phenomenon. After nearly 54 years on the air, the station is an integral part of Twin Cities life. Its long history of service to its listeners has won a fiercely loyal and remarkably vast audience, so that WCCO is perhaps the highest-rated major market radio station in America on a long-term basis. The station even accomplishes the phenomenal feat of beating local TV stations for ratings.

WCCO has gone through several ownership changes, and is presently under the supervision of Midwest Radio & TV, Inc., owned by a pioneering Minnesota newspaper family, the Murphys. The company, under President Tom Doar, is divided into three separate operating divisions, one each for WCCO-AM, FM and TV.

In the following article, R&R Pop/Adult Editor Mike Kasabo conducts an interview

with WCCO Program Director By Napier. Napier has been with WCCO for 11 years as Assistant PD and PD, following experience at KCRC/Enid, OK and WEAU/Eau Claire, among others. In addition to his informative interview with Napier, Kasabo has provided a series of historical vignettes relating WCCO's half-century of history to the events and atmospheres of the times. Much of the historical information was taken from a pictorial volume published by the station detailing its life and times.

WCCO's combination of rich heritage, continuing community service, and responsive programming make the station unique, and an impressive model for other radio operations to look toward for inspiration.

TOP OF THE MORNING

Five A.M. The early summer colors cover the vast Minnesota sky. Kitchen windows start to sparkle with lights as the freeways build and city buses become people movers. The CBS news feed is on the air with 50,000 Class 1-A clear channel watts of national information.

5:05. Glen Olson has two minutes before the special rapport between him and nearly 100,000 listeners begins the broadcast day at WCCO.

Olson is joined later in the five o'clock hour by **Chuck Lilligren**, who not only speaks as WCCO's Farm Service Director, but as a farmer as well. Lilligren, who came to the station in 1965, helps keep up on agricultural needs of the community by serving as an auctioneer. Chuck makes his first appearance of the day on the 5:55A.M. newscast.

A little past 6:00 A.M. enters twenty-eight year WCCO veteran Howard Viken, whose ratings rank among the most impressive in all of radio. Viken puts his show through a variety of moods, music and raps, frequently interviewing guests in person or on the phone. Throughout the morning news and weather information supplement Viken's folksy humor.

Howard Viken's first show on WCCO was an afternoon program called "Mister Nobody." Today he is the most listened to morning personality in the Twin Cities and is definitely a somebody. Commenting on his listeners, Viken explains: "It's the nature of people here to be warm, friendly and good neighbors. They're a fabulous audience."

The Boone & Erickson Show (Charlie & Roger) began on WCCO in 1963, and has been a consistent display of topical information and humor. Their show was moved from its original afternoon slot in 1971 and features skits, bits and Pop/Adult music. Their hectic pace is due in part to the fact that they write all their own material each day. As with Viken, and through the entire day, news, sports and weather information is carefully woven into their program.

After the noon news the team splits with Erickson continuing until 1 P.M. Roger thinks of himself and his partner as radio actors. "We both like to create the characters in the skits we do" he explains.

Boone, who studied theater at San Francisco State College, takes over at 1:00 P.M. Known as an excellent interviewer, Boone is also tuned into good contemporary music and does not hesitate to present performers he thinks should be heard.

With Boone & Erickson done for the day, **Dan Hertsgaard** moves in for a two hour stint from 2-4 P.M. Hertsgaard, whose father **Rolf** was a 'CCO personality in the fifties, entertains mainly with music.

Steve Cannon, along with his cast of characters called "Little Cannons", helps Twin Clty commuters get home with plenty of humor. His characters come from his background in dramatics, which he studied at the University of Minnesota. With WCCO since 1971, Steve is an avid hockey fan and serves as color man for the North Stars broadcasts.

On non-sports nights, Dan Hertsgaard returns for two more hours from 7-9 P.M.

Franklin Hobbs helps you make it through the night with his "Hobbs House" program, which features a variety of music from jazz to orchestrations and small combos to big bands. Hobbs does not take phone calls while on the air, but has made several in the interest of Individuals, such as the time he pleaded with an escaped convict, holed up in a Minnesota farm house, to release his hostage. Another time, he asked that the kidnapper of an infant to return the baby to a St. Paul hospital for needed special medication.

And that's Hobbs through the night until 5:00 A.M., when It's time for a new day to begin again the love affair between the people of Minnesota and WCCO.

R&R: You have one-60-minute news block, seven to eight AM during the week. Does this work best for you to have a full hour of news?

NAPIER: That's a fairly recent addition, it's been in about 10 years I would guess. We're very heavy news all day, all night. We do ten minutes of news every hour. This particular hour just evolved into full news because we felt it was the strongest thing we could do in that hour.

R&R: How large is your news department?

NAPIER: We have our News Director and seven fulltime news people. Part of our corporation's philosophy is to separate our AM, FM and TV divisions, so all three of us are in separate buildings, all three of us have totally different staffs, we don't cross over at all. We really consider each other competitors; we don't even socialize that much together.

R&R: Would you share a news item?

NAPIER: No, we wouldn't

R&R: In other words, if AM got a tip on something you wouldn't share it with TV NAPIER: Correct. We'd do our best to keep it away from them. The corporation feels that if they make us competitors, everybody benefits. We even refuse to advertise on television, we won't run any ads of theirs for money or otherwise, and they won't run ours.

R&R: You're heavily involved with sports.

NAPIER Yes, we do major league sports, Vikings, Twins, the soccer team, the Minnesota Kicks. We also do University of Minnesota football and basketball.

R&R: And also high school sports?

NAPIER We do a nightly five-minute feature called "Prep Parade" which is devoted to high school sports, interviews of high school athletes and coaches, as opposed to play by

play. We try to also cover the smaller sports, wrestling, track, women's involvement. We've had very good success with that, and we also feature a band of the week from high schools. It's on five nights a week.

R&R: Is there anything else you do for the younger people?

NAPIER: Certainly, we have a Young Achievers Award, which is sort of a counterpart to the Prep Parade. Every morning we salute youngsters who have achieved something other than on the athletic field. It could be a scholarship or anything like that

R&R: So obviously you do pay attention to the younger end, although you're basically an adult station 25 plus.

NAPIER: We try to do all we can. We're heavily involved among our many public service features, school closings, some

publication. Movie favorites included Harold Lloyd, Douglas Fairbanks Sr. and Jackie Coogan.

One of the people making the transition from WLAG to WCCO was Mrs. Eleanor Poehler, who remained on as Program Director, surely the first lady PD in the country in a major market. The other key individual making the move over was Paul Johnson, who was the first announcer hired by WLAG. Other early performers on WCCO included Clarence "Shorty" Booth who would take time off his electrical job for brief periods to sing on the air. Dick Long and his orchestra were the first of many to be heard on the station. Other wellknown groups were led by "Whoopee John" Wilfahrt and Wally Olson.

by Lt. Lowell Smith, Commander of the World Fliers. Preceding Smith's talk, the previous call letters, WLAG, were extinguished and the new calls WCCO were broadcast for the first time over 500 watts of power

WLAG originally occupied the 830 frequency beginning its broadcasting on Labor Day, September 4, 1922, but had fallen into receivership and had to cease transmission on July 31, 1924, airing a weather report. After many efforts by the Northwest Radio Trade Association to try and put WLAG back on

the air, the vice president of the Washburn Crosby Company (which is what the WCCO calls represented) convinced the president of the company to buy the physical properties and assets of the defunct WLAG.

When WLAG (the calls are now assigned to La Grange, Georgia) first went on the air, listeners tuned their crystal sets to programs ranging from classical music to lectures. It was a time that saw the dedication of the Lincoln Memorial. President Warren Harding died and Vice President Calvin Coolidge was sworn into office. James Doolittle flew from Jacksonville to San Diego with just one stop and Time magazine started

The very month WCCO went on the

air, construction began at the new transmitter site. On March 4th and 5th, 1925, the station moved from the Oak Grove Hotel to the Nicollet Hotel and began operation of its new 5000 watt transmitter. That first broadcast with the power increased caused a new era in broadcasting in the Midwest. It was estimated that 750,000 people throughout the state listened that day, but right within the Twin Cities some 12,000 complained they could not hear it. With good reason-they had the old crystal set receivers that were incapable of receiving the new and more powerful signal. Radio fans began a mad dash for the newly designed "tube" sets.

WCCO grew rapidly and continued to add many dimensions to broadcasting in the Twin Cities

covering a total eclipse of the sun, led to a break with NBC, with remoting an address by President Calvin Coolidge, and a victory speech by Minnesotan Charles A. Lindbergh following his non-stop New York to Paris flight. The station also instituted a close relationship with rural areas with daily farm news, and the Minneapolis Symphony orchestra became a regular Sunday night attrac-

area. Some of their "firsts" were tion. It was the Symphony that which WCCO had become affiliated at the time. The network had sold and scheduled broadcasting of the Chicago Symphony for the same time period. A confrontation developed. WCCO management refused the Windy City orchestra and promptly switched affiliation to CBS, still in effect to this day.

The '30's started on shaky ground, with the nation and WCCO fight ing the Great Depression. "Life Is Just A Bowl Of Cherries" was replaced by "Brother, Can You Spare A Dime." Americans were weathering the times by listening to new radio programs on WCCO, from Roosevelt's fireside chats to "Fibber McGee and Molly." The most celebrated of all radio broadcasts, Orson Welles' presentation of "War Of The Worlds" depicting the fictitious invasion of Earth by men from Mars on October 30, 1938, brought panic to the region and the station was flooded with thousands of phone calls.

In the thirties, while Jean Harlow, Jimmy Durante and Shirley Tem-ple were the rage in the movie theaters, WCCO had its own rising star by the name of Cedric Adams. The young newspaper columnist went on to make history with the Minneapolis Star and also became the most popular radio personality up to that time. Airline pilots reported that lights in homes in WCCO's vast coverage area would darken at 10:15pm-the end of Cedric's news report.

mornings, in the midst of a Minnesota blizzard, we broadcast over 300 school closings. We certainly keep in touch with the young people in various ways.

R&R: I noticed also coverage of fishing, hunting and golf. How would you cover hunting?

NAPLER: We have outdoor shows. When hunting season opens we will probably send reporters out to hunt for the first day, and they'll phone in and chat with our personalities on the air, what the conditions are, what luck hunters are having. For fishing, what we've done in the past years, although not last year, is taken the air staff up to one of the northern resorts, and spent the weekend, where they would broadcast their shows great public relations.

R&R: You have two farm directors.

NAPIER: Well, one just retired, so we now have Chuck Lilligren, and we hope to add a second man when we can find one. Basically Chuck's function on the air is he covers all the things that effect today's farming. The farms in our region are big businesses A lot of his work is public relations, farm meetings.

R&R: You have a telephone discussion program from 11:05 to noon.

In 1932 CBS completed its purchase of WCCO from General Mills. Total price: \$450,000. Top-rated shows throughout the thirties were "Kate Smith", "The Lone Ranger", "Gangbusters", "The Hit Parade", and the humor of Edgar Bergen and Charlie McCarthy.

WCCO featured songs of the day sung by Walter Mallory and Jerry Harrington. They were accompanied by music from their Wurlitzer pipe organ, which was so big that a hole had to be cut in the roof of the studios so the organ could be lowered in.

From the CBS network came the "Lux Radio Theater", "Major Bowes Amateur Hour", and Eddie Cantor. Daytime programming included many soap operas.

In 1937 a skywriter wrote the WCCO call letters over the Minneapolis area and carried on a two-way conversation over the air describing his maneuvers with the studio announcer.

By 1937 WCCO had outgrown itself. It was so crowded that the continuity director's office was a converted bathroom.

WCCO moved from quarters in the Nicollet Hotel to a downtown building and celebrated by offering public tours of the new studios.

By the end of the thirties, the station was well established with talented personalities, strong management and was a proven advertising medium. Most important, it had already developed a large and loyal audience

NAPIER: It's part of a personality show called the Boone & Erickson show. This is basically a comedy team that have been with us for sixteen years together as a team. The telephone discussion is really just part of their show, it may be from 11:06 to 11:30 or 10:30 to 11:00, or not at all; we get guests through here that appear on most of the major TV shows.

R&R: Do they key their segment in terms of humor, human interest, or do they get political?

NAPIER: They write all their own material, and it's highly localized material. They do political satire and comment, by way of voice characterizations, which they're very good at. They have a fictional senator who is a regular guest commenting on the scene in Washington. They also have interesting guests. Susan Ford was on the other morning.

R&R: Does WCCO do any other type of talk shows?

NAPIER: We do a show on non-sports nights called "Ask on 'CCO." The host is Dan Hertsgaard. His dad Rolf was one of our announcers in the 50's. This show is general subjects of interests, seldom serious, although we have done some on cancer, heart disease and the sort. Basically we're devoting it to things that interest people. For example, after learning that collecting exotic tropical fish was one of the three top hobbies in America, we found a fish doctor and we got him on the phone and he's becoming a regular on the program now. We'll run the show on anything from horticulture to Hollywood.

R&R: What does your rate card look like? What would a 60 second spot cost me?

NAPIER: We just put a new one out, listing it at \$230 a spot in prime drive times.

R&R: Interesting to note that you advertise that WCCO beats all TV stations in the ratings.

NAPIER: It's been that way for a long, long time. Basically, research is not my area, and I hate to get into it, but a way of putting it is that more people are listening to our prime morning drive time than all four TV stations combined in their prime evening time

R&R: Do you consciously compete against television stations?

NAPIER: We don't counterprogram to them, if that's what you're saying. I suppose the reason for the station's success, one of the great things going for us is our habit of listeners that have been with us for 54 years, have grown up with us, stayed with us over the

years. We feed their habit; we also feed it with the longevity of the people on our air, one 28-year man, one 25-year man, at least four people who have been with us for over 15 years.

R&R: Let's look at the staff starting with Howard Viken.

NAPIER: Howard is on from 6-10AM, and he's been with us 28 years. Howard shares the 6-7 slot with Gien Olson, who opens the day at 5 with news.

R&R: Their shifts overlap?

NAPIER: Yes, we do a lot of that. While we have very strong personalities, we emphasize the station as much as the personalities. We never end programs, we just flow into the next one. Howard just happens to be joining Glen at 6:00. ·HR



Next week a look at overnight success. G100/Mobile is now number one in Mobile and they did it with amazing speed. We'll talk with PD Nick Alexander and GM Edd Routt to see just how they did it, and what they've got planned for an encore.

Teen Music, The Scene That's Not Heard

Somewhere between the birth of Top 40 and the advent of "mass appeal radio" a specific type of music has disappeared almost completely from the airwaves. Teen music, as defined by artists like Shaun Cassidy, Kristy & Jimmy McNichol and Leif Garrett along with others, has found airplay on Top 40 radio evaporating rapidly.

This non-airplay situation is a source of aggravation for the record companies who represent these artists because in most cases teen music sells and sells big! Shaun Cassidy's first two albums went platinum (1,000,000 units), Leif Garrett's first album sold over 600,000 units and Kristy & Jimmy McNichol's first single also sold in the hundreds of thousands. All of this retail success was without the aid of the widespread airplay usually necessary for such volume sales (Shaun Cassidy's first album was widely played before the anti-teen music syndrome had been widely established). Of course we cannot overlook the fact that Shaun and Kristy & Jimmy have weekly national TV exposure to help their record sales, but that national exposure also increases the familiarity of those artists, a familiarity that can only be a plus to today's often cautious radio programmers.

With the one-two punch of retail sales and audience familiarity why do so many Top 40 programmers choose not to program these so-called teen records?

KDWB/Minneapolis Program Director Dave Thomson uses out-call research in his playlist and rotation determination and I posed the question to him. He began by asking me a question, "The big question is; is it going to help me? From an image standpoint, and this has to be generally speaking, a heavily teen and sub-teen oriented record, if anything, is going to hurt my image if I want to be talking to the 12-30 age group. If you're playing a record that's going to hurt you with a 29 year old, it's silly to play it when you already have 53 percent of all the teens (which KDWB does). So it's a matter of image more than anything else. There's no reason I need teens. I have virtually every teen listening to me. In our particular situation there's no debate about the issue-I don't need 'em."

That kind of logic from the radio level is not only hard to refute but hard to swallow for those within the record industry. Dick Kline, Vice President of Promotion for Atlantic

Records, was posed the same question: Why do so many programmers choose not to program teen records?

"I think in essence it's just insecurity on the part of the program directors. Certainly the guidepost remains, it's not what you play, it's when you play it! It hasn't hurt any of the stations that played Leif Garrett. To negate this audience's existence and not even care about it is to me a disaster in the business."

Fortunately for the teen-oriented artists there are a few radio stations and programmers around the country that are still very interested in their product. WLS/Chicago, WLCY/ Tampa and Y100/Miami are just three large market examples of stations that still program teen product.

I asked Bill Tanner, Program Director for Y100, who recently enjoyed his first-ever number one overall book in Miami, why Y100 still plays teen music?

"Because everybody in the world wants to be young! To be totally honest with you, frequently what we find in our research is that teen music appeals to teenagers.surprise! And for that basic reason we have different times of the day when we're more oriented to teenagers. We don't play Kristy & Jimmy at ten in the morning, but we do play them at the right times because I think you've got to say that something's happening when they excite an audience the way they do. . .that's not all hype. There's an audience out there (for them) and that's a Top 40 audience. It's only a segment of the total Top 40 audience, but when you play Crystal Gayle do you think you're appealing to everybody? Of course not."

Bill continued, "Let's take Foreigner. In my opinion hard rock and roll is very narrow in most of its demographics. And yet everybody races out and adds the Foreigner record as soon as it comes out. I'm not taking anything away from Foreigner, we're playing 'em too. But rock and roll, that's a very narrow, limited demographic which is not a primary Top 40 demographic. It's primarily AOR. Going on a Kristy & Jimmy has its place just like playing a Foreigner has its place. They appeal to different segments of the audience. What we really are is a mass appeal radio station."

I asked Bill about the possible damage to his station's image by programming teen music and he replied, "What about the danger in the fact that 13 or 14 year olds listen for infinite quarter hours longer than the 16-17-18 year olds who split their listening with AOR stations?"

Okay, what about losing those precious 18-year-old males who might be tuned out by a Shaun Cassidy record? Bill had some strong thoughts on that question, "You know who the 18-year-old men that they're (programmers) worried about losing are? They are, and this is my observed opinion, the 18-year-olds that are primarily AOR listeners but they will figure into our cume. They tune in a Top 40 station simply because a Top 40 station tends to be a center of activity. You can always check and if there's a Foreigner out, you might hit on it. I believe that Top 40 has a substantial number of 18-24 males. I believe a whole lot of 'em work at McDonalds or they're under grease-racks in garages and they don't really care if it's Kristy & Jimmy or Foreigner or whoever. They may have their favorites, but they like Top 40 radio."

It obviously works for Bill in Miami but is it universal? Bill was more cautious on this point, "If you're in Cleveland or Pittsburgh I think you have to be a little bit more careful about playing Kristy & Jimmy. But when you're down here, Miami is a 'good-time-town' and we play 'good-time-music' and so do Shaun Cassidy and Leif Garrett. I'll give those records a shot and I give them a shot in a selected daypart. If they prove themselves well with teens, then I play them wherever I'm interested in teens. Some of them, a good example is 'Runaround Sue' by Leif Garrett, break out and become quite mass appeal when you add that coalition of adult women who also liked that record. And the reason that happens I think gets back to something I said earlier. ...everyone listening wants to be young. They cannot listen to an AOR station and get that identification with youth. Some-

how those stations just don't sound 'young', they're way too serious in most cases. All I know is that every book (ARB) that I've played lots of teen music and made a big teen effort, everytime we do it we have a great book!"

But the fact remains that teen music is not receiving the widespread airplay that it once enjoyed and that poses some special problems for the record companies that release teen product. I asked Dick Kline about the future of teen music and he was very frank, "Due to radio, it's limited. There now must be other promotional aspects involved to make them (teen records) succeed. We're changing the direction of Leif's music to a more mature sound in hopes that we can get the airplay. The new album coming out by Leif is not in any way shape or form going to be classified a 'bubble-gum' record. Heavier promotion to draw attention to this particular type of record is definitely necessary."

Record companies have also relied on marketing techniques to sell teen music. The revival of the expensive, but easy to spot, picture record sleeve has helped many of these airplay "untouchables" rack up strong retail sales. Anyone who has ever thumbed through a Tiger Beat magazine knows the value of a color picture of Shaun Cassidy, Leif Garrett or The Bay City Rollers. When those artists release a new single, often the picture sleeve

catches the young consumer's eye at the retail level and the sale is made. Personal appearances have also served as an invaluable tool for artists like Leif Garrett, who toured the country extensively doing radio sponsored appearances at Walk-a-thons and other charity activities.

Other marketing devices have been successfully employed to stimulate retail sales when airplay has been a problem as in the specific case of Shaun Cassidy outlined by Vice President of Promotion for Warner Brothers Russ Thyret, "There's a thing we do with Shaun Continued on Page 24

that I suggested to Mike Curb right with the first album. With each of the albums that we sell by Shaun we have included a postcard which says, 'If you would like to be put on Shaun's Fan Club mailing list please return this card with your name and address.' Obviously what I do with those postcards then is send postcards back out saying that we have a new single out and that they should be on the look out for it at their record store. It works incredibly well.''

All of Shaun Cassidy's singles have sold in excess of one million copies, the last two with very little airplay. His newest album, released less than a month ago, should be certified platinum by the time you read this, and that also is with very little airplay. Russ feels that the use of the picture sleeve for Shaun's single releases (every one of his singles employed a different picture sleeve) have helped them enjoy retail success.

So what is the final conclusion? I'm not sure there can be one, at least not yet. The record companies have highly successful artists with product that does sell, but radio stations have in many cases ignored their product, labeling it teen music. True, America's demographics are getting older. Also true that less and less national business comes to radio in the form of "teen buys." And yet stations like WLCY, WLS and Y100 continue to thrive with increased ratings, revenue and healthy doses of teen music.

There can be no question that a sizable and vocal audience exists for the kind of music we have been examining. There can also be no question that the teen artists such as Leif Garrett, Shaun Cassidy, Kristy & Jimmy McNichol and The Bay City Rollers are well known in a majority of American households. If Top 40 radio has changed or moved away from teen music, then perhaps the record companies have shown to themselves that there are other ways to stimulate sales. The marketing techniques and television exposure have helped these artists achieve true "superstar status" without the radio airplay normally necessary for that to happen.

Of the two schools of thought offered by Dave Thomson and Bill Tanner, who is to say which is right? Radio, like any other business, must be pragmatic and both KDWB and Y100 are successful in their different approaches to the same problems. If there is a conclusion to be drawn from this it is simply that Top 40 radio has no set formula for success. That is as true today as it was when Top 40 was born. Teen music has come and gone before and my guess is that it will always be with us, and it's popularity with radio programmers will always be a point of spirited discussion.

Black Radig Bill Speed

More Stations Drop Numbered Lists

Over the last four weeks we've discussed some of the components of the new generation's approach to Black radio programming. In my opening column I stated "The new Black radio is moving into audience research,

and sales is only a small portion of that research. As a result many Black radio stations are and have been dropping the traditional numbered list. Black radio is getting more sophisticated in its programming. Many of the new Black radio programmers care and depend less on the national charts and sales, less so than other music formats.'

That statement has been the bottom line for the attitudes of many programmers who have recently dropped their numbered lists (WOL/Washington D.C., WCIN/Cincinnati, WGIV/Charlotte are the latest to do so, all dropping numbers this week). One answer was given by Don Mac, who programs WOL. He says simply, "there is no validity in numbers." Mac believes that input from the stores has no validity as far as sales go. He goes on to say, "A lot of times record companies have a priority record, so the local rep and the store work out a deal through a free goods system, where a record is listed from a particular store which in turn receives so many pieces of merchandise for the favor. The store then has pieces of merchandise for themselves to sell which is revenue for the store, and if a station has gone on the record it's wasted time on the air, because it looks like something other than what it is."

Another perspective along the same lines is WVON/Chicago Music Director Guy Brodie's. He too feels it's hard to get accurate information from the stores. Brodie goes on to say, "Numbers are significant to me as a music director. It's a hassle to deal with a record that has numbers. Too much emphasis is put on a record with a number." Brodie says further: 'Most radio stations, as well as people who buy records, don't care what number it is anyway. People like songs; the numbers are mainly for the record companies."

There are more reasons-Travis Smith, Program Director of WYLD/New Orleans, has another. He states: "I changed to compete with some of the other FM'ers. We are after the same age group, therefore my list is tighter. It's a 30-record format, giving all the records equal airtime." He also found when talking with stores that they don't keep that much excess stock around. Product moves quicker because they're aware of what's being played.

Similar attitudes are shared by Craig Scott, Vice President of Programming for Plough Broadcasting. He says his stations (WVEE/Atlanta, WHRK/Memphis, WXYV/Baltimore) are not singles oriented. "It's an album based format so the whole approach is different," he says. "We do have power records that are used probably like numbered records, but numbers have no place within the format, because it constantly changes.

Steve Woods Program Director of KDAY/Los Angeles, uses only a top ten, because he feels people in his market look at things in terms of ten. Things are judged in terms of ten, like sports, politics and many surveys, he feels, so he provides the extra service of listing the ten hottest records on the station. Woods says he's personally not in favor of numbers, but feels this is a service his listeners appreciate. He feels past ten, the accuracy is questionable

Many new and different approaches are starting to surface in Black radio. It looks as though many programmers are rolling up their sleeves and digging into their markets for music research input, moving away from traditional approaches to playlists, such as numbered lists. Many feel these moves help Black radio compete more effectively with other formats. As soon as this programming "wildfire" catches on all over, this industry may see Black radio that it never dreamed could exist







Jeff Pollack's list of AOR radio accomplishments is impressive, and more so when you realize he recently celebrated his twenty-sixth birthday. His professional radio experience began just four years ago when he worked at KFML-AM&FM/Denver as an assistant Music Director. He was quickly singled out by Frank Cody to help put a new AOR on the air in Albuquerque. Pollack was MD at KMYR (who have since gone Top 40) for a period of time, but was lured back to Denver AOR radio as Frank Felix's Music Coordinator at KBPI (where he and Cody were reunited six months down the road when Frank joined the station as Felix's assistant PD).

In early 1977 Bert Kleinman from Drake-Chenault asked Pollack to join their team as PD at KYNO-FM/ JeffPollack Fresno, where he was quickly promoted to the parent company as National Programming

Consultant for the service's eight different formats, serving one hundred radio stations nationwide. While there, he was responsible for the development of the company's automated ACR pockage, a job he found an especially intriguing challenge.

Now the lure of challenge has drawn Pollack back into the radio arena. He has accepted an offer to join Metromedia as PD of their AOR affiliate in Philadelphia, WMMR. "It's an excellent opportunity," Pollack said, "to get involved with an exciting company and with a station of such great potential." And he admitted missing the day-to-day involvement and activities of working at a single station. "Working with as many stations as I was with Drake-Chenault, it was very difficult to give all of them all the attention they deserved. I'm very excited by the thought of channeling all of my energies back into one station."

Pollack feels his backlog of experiences working with Drake-Chenault will be to his benefit at his new post. "I really feel fortunate to have worked so many different radio formats it's made me more sensitive to what works for all formats, to what is just good radio."

WMMR's ten-year history has included stints by some of AOR's legendary names, but the station's ratings have roller-coastered for years now, failing to match the ratings successes of its Metromedia AOR sister stations WNEW-FM/New York, KSAN/San Francisco and KMET/Los Angeles. As Pollack put it, "If there were an Ivy League of radio stations WMMR would certainly be amongst them. But I think they need to reflect 1978 Philadelphia now as well as they do the city's past.

"Philadelphia has some excellent AOR stations and it's an exciting challenge to take them on," Pollack continued. "I can see a tremendous potential for growth at WMMR, and I have no doubt the station will become fully competitive. That's my goal there."

His exact game plan for accomplishing that goal is yet to be determined. "I always considered it of primary importance not to have a preconceived plan before going into a new market; flexibility is essential. You have to absorb the feeling and character of the city and its people before making any major formatting judgements. The changes I'll make at the station are the ones which will enable us to be fully competitive in the Philadelphia AOR market."

And what a radio market it is: the fourth largest in America, with a total survey area of seven million people. The challenge is certainly there, and we wish Jeff Pollack all the best in meeting it.

AOR news departments are making news lately. WXRT/Chicago's multiple awardwinning news department received over 50 hours of tapes of conversations recorded at area American Nazi Party headquarters, submitted by a student doing a thesis on the group who was a fan of WXRT and thought the news department could do something special with the tapes...which they did; they turned them into a 20-minute special entitled "Saviors of the Race" which ran to excellent listener response. WXRT News Director C.D. Jaco is offering the special free to any interested AOR stations. Contact him through WXRT, 4949 W. Belmont, Chicago, IL. 60641.

Meantime, KNX-FM/Los Angeles News Director Chris Ames crafted an hourlong "Evening with Carly Simon" which elicited an excellent review from a television columnist for the Hollywood Reporter, who said that the program was better than most television specials spotlighting a single artist's music, and suggested that TV producers could learn a lot from the way the show was structured. KNX-FM PD Steve Marshall suggested that part of the show's success lay in Ames' background in news. "He approached it," explained Marshall, "as if he were doing a documentary on Carly, listening to virtually everything she has done before doing the actual interview so that he knew what directions he wanted the interview to take in order to best segue into music." While music was an important part of the show, Marshall qualified that the music was used to underscore the artist's statements, not as filler.

The show is currently unavailable for syndication, but the point to be made here is twofold: that you needn't rely only on syndicated programs for all of your station's special programming needs; and that if you do create your own shows, they'll sound better if you've really done your research homework and approach program and interviewee as worthy of serious thought and not just a way to fill an odd hour on a Sunday night.

This week's chart showed increased new album activity as older releases seem to have peaked in airplay. STONES stayed on top with hots at 85% of our reporters, and FOREIGNER kept the second spot with hots at 79% of our reporters. CRUISE inched up another notch with hots at 72% of our reporters, and WALSH moved upwards again. **BOSTON** came on like gangbusters as this week's highest debut with adds at 69% of our reporters plus significant early hots. PAR-SONS and MOODYS held steady as CARS continued their impressive upward climb. TROWER moved up as did AMBROSIA and KIHN. TRICK maintained while PRISM jumped up. COCKER and PONTY debuted with adds at 30% and 20% of our reporters respectively. CHIL-LIWACK bounced back nicely while HEADS inched further upward. REA bounced back as CRUSADERS moved up.
