

Industry Mourns **Radio Legend Jack Carney**

The November 27 death of legendary radio broadcaster and KMOX/St. Louis daytime personality Jack Carney triggered an outpouring of grief throughout the radio and entertainment industries. Carney, who was 52, apparently died of a heart attack after taking a scuba diving lesson. KMOX GM/CBS

Regional VP Bob Hyland hailed Carney as "a giant in the industry,'' adding, "There'll never be another. He had a unique style that will never be duplicated. He was one of the greatest communica-

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tors that I've seen in my history." Jack Carney

At the time of his death, Carney anchored a weekday personality/music/talk show from 9am-noon, a Saturday morning comedy program, and served as host for "Jack Carney's Comedy Show," heard on nearly 350 stations.

Among those issuing proclamations mourning Carney were the Illinois and Missouri legislatures, and the St. Louis mayor and city council. As word of Carney's death spread across the country, CARNEY/See Page 18

He indicated the sale was expected to close sometime next February.

WXGT(92X)/Columbus Station Manager Randy Rahe has been promoted to VP/GM at WXGT & WCOL/Columbus. He replaces Paul Wachsmith, who left in September.

Great Trails President Alex Williams told R&R, "Randy has been handling things so well since Paul's departure that he's earned the position of Vice President & General Manager on a permanent basis."



Rahe joined Great Trails just over a year ago, after serving as VP/GM at WBOW & WZZQ/Terre Haute and GM at KJAS & KJAQ/Cape Girardeau, MO. He commented, "We've worked hard over the past 13 months to position 92X as a leader within the marketplace, and we expect similar growth from WCOL. I've got great staffs at both facilities, and we look forward to a prosperous 1985. Fairbanks Sells KCMO-AM & FM To Summit

Summit Communications has agreed in principle to purchase KCMO-AM & FM/Kansas City from Fairbanks Communications, pending FCC approval. The specific sale price was not disclosed, but industry sources estimated the value at \$12 million.

Summit Radio Division VP Allen Shaw said. "Due to the success of our existing radio properties, we are now in a position to enter a larger marketplace. Kansas City is a dynamic and growing city, and there are no finer radio facilities there than KCMO-AM & FM."

News/Talk outlet KCMO (AM) operates with 50 kw days/5 kw nights at 810 kHz, while KCMO-FM has Country programming with 100 kw on 94.9 mHz at 1057 feet.

The acquisitions will give Summit ten radio properties, including flagship WSJS & WTQR/Winston-Salem, WCOA & WJLQ/Pensacola, WREC & WZXR/Memphis, and KXXY-AM & FM/Oklahoma City.

Fairbanks retains ownership of WKOX & WVBF/Boston and WJNO & WRMF/West Palm Beach.

FCC Okays Daytimer Compromise For Post-Sunset Operation

Daytime-only stations will soon be permitted for the first time to operate for two hours past local sunset. A compromise to that effect between daytimers and fulltimers on regional channels cleared the FCC this week. The rule changes occur December 10, and daytimers can boost power as soon as they've been published in the Federal Register.

To minimize interference to fulltimers, the daytimers will have to make a series of "stepped power reductions" as darkness grows and skywave interference worsens. Class 3 daytimers will get a minimum of 50 watts.

The Daytime Broadcasters Association (DBA) sought the compromise to prevent the Association for Broadcast Engineering Standards tying up its post-sunset authority with a threatened federal court appeal. The Commission said, "Our review convinces us that both in policy terms and in engineering particulars, the parties have proposed a sound basis for resolving the conflicting considerations" of extending daytimer hours while not causing objectionable interference to regional fulltimers on the same channels.

Class 4s Get 1 kw Nights **December 15**

The nation's approximately 1000 Class 4 AM stations got some good news last week when the FCC announced that their previously-approved quadrupling of nighttime power, from 250 watts to 1 kw, will take effect December 15. The way was cleared for the power hike last week (11-29) when Mexico and the United States reached final agreement on the new level for the two nations, plus Canada.

To make the transition a smooth one, the FCC is issuing "show cause" orders that let most stations boost power without having to file applicatons. The only stations not covered by the blanket approval are Class 4s that operate directionally, those that have less than 1 kw during the day, and ten stations whose Mexican counterparts have yet to acquire 1 kw nighttime facilities.

Danforth Chairs Senate Commerce Committee

Broadcasters have lost one of their staunchest allies on the issues of deregulation and First Amendment freedoms with Sen. Bob Packwood's (R-OR) decision to

step down as Chairman of the Senate Commerce Commit-Under the tee. Senate's seniority system, Packwood has chosen to assume leadership of the taxwriting Finance Committee, filling the vacancy created by last week's election of John Danforth

Leader.

Bob Dole (R-KS) as Senate Majority

Taking over chairmanship of the Commerce Committee, which oversees broadcasting, is Sen. John Danforth (R-MO). Regarded as a moderate Republican, Danforth has not been active in communications issues in the past.

Still undecided is who will chair the Communications Subcommittee. The post is now held by Barry Goldwater (R-AZ), who will become chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee. If he decides to give up

the communications panel, he could be replaced by either Packwood or Sen. Larry Pressler (R-SD)

Lampel Enters Race For RTNDA Presidency

WLIB & WBLS/New York News Director David Lampel is a last-minute entrant in the race for President-elect of the Radio-**Television News Directors Association** (RTNDA), which holds its annual convention this week (11/5-7) in San Antonio. Lampel's opponent in this week's balloting is WBRZ-TV/Baton Rouge, LA News Director John Spain.

The San Antonio meeting features a daylong seminar on journalism ethics underwritten by a \$10,000 grant from RKO General to recognize the election of WOR/New York VP/Director of News Lou Adler to the RTNDA presidency. Adler won the job in voting at last year's convention in Las Vegas, and has spent the past year as President-elect arranging the San Antonio meeting, which has attracted 1200 advance registrants and 110 exhibitors.

Jerald Fritz Named Fowler's Chief of Staff

FCC Chairman Mark Fowler has named Jerald Fritz, Chief/Tariff Division, to become his Chief of Staff, effective January 1. The post had been vacant for several months since Randy Nichols left the agency to become General Counsel of COMSAT.

Saying he is "delighted to bring Jerry back to the eighth floor," Fowler commented, "With his broad background in communications matters, his significant organizational skills, and as one of the primary architects of many of our recent policies, I believe he's uniquely qualified to take on this task."

Fritz served as Fowler's legal assistant for two years until 1983, when he moved to the Tariff Division to manage the complicated tariff filings and access charge proceedings associated with the breakup of AT&T.

\$5000 Upheld For Lowest **Unit Rule Violations**

WCRV/Washington, NJ has been unable to persuade the FCC to lift a \$5000 fine it imposed in June for repeated violations of the lowest unit rule for political ads. The station also discriminated improperly by requiring one candidate, but not others, to pay by certified check. In addition to being fined, the station was ordered to make \$3198 in refunds to candidates.

The FCC wasn't impressed by WCRV's assertion that the candidate forced to pay by certified check had harassed the station and was likely to stop payment on a regular check. And it dismissed WCRV's contention that candidates are only entitled to the lowest unit rate as it applies to the volume of spots they buy. In fact, said the FCC, candidates are entitled to "all discounts based on volume or frequency, regardless of how few programs or spots the candidate buys.'

WCRV's plea that it couldn't afford the \$5000 fine was dismissed because it failed to present evidence of its parent firm's financial condition.

Other Key Developments

• The FCC has added six new channels (in the 944-947 mHz band) to the nine already set aside for Aural Broadcast Studio Transmitter Links (STL) and Inter-City Relays (ICR). Despite an earlier threat to move STL/ICR users in the 942-944 band, the Commission decided to grandfather those stations.

NAB Asks Radio's Help **To Curb Drunk Driving**

With the onset of the holiday season and the approach of next week's National Drunk and Drugged Driving Awareness Week (December 9-15), NAB is vigorously enlisting broadcasters in the campaign to curb drunk driving. The association highlighted its efforts Monday (12-3) at a crowded Washington press conference that was also exploited by advocates of a ban on beer and wine advertising.

Last week NAB sent its 4400 radio members kits containing voice copy for 50 public service announcements (PSAs), plus sample speeches, on-air editorials, newspaper op-ed pieces, and advertisements. Stations will soon receive taped PSAs, as well.

50 PSAs DISTRIBUTED

NAB's 700-member television stations have been furnished with 26 videotaped PSAs, some featuring well-known figures like Nancy Reagan, Peter Falk, and Bob Lanier. The spots were satellited to stations early this week by the Robert Wold Co. and the major television networks.


NAB President Eddie Fritts released what he called "pretty impressive statistics" showing that 91.8% of over 2000 radio and TV stations surveyed by NAB now run drunk driving PSAs (25% in prime or drive time) and 75% have aired public affairs programming on the subject. Nevertheless, he said there's a need for a "nationally-coordinated effort" by broadcasters.

Broadcasters Don't Cause Drinking

WMAL/Washington Executive VP/GM Andy Ockershausen, who heads up an NAB task force on the problem, called drunk driving "the most hideous of all crimes" and said the epidemic "transcends all demographics." Ockershausen believes four years of focusing on the problem by WMAL and other stations has helped reduce drunk-driving accidents and fatalities in the Washington area

Ockershausen and NAB Sr. VP/Public Affairs Shaun Sheehan downplayed any connection between the current campaign and lobbying by public interest groups to ban wine and beer advertising on radio and television. "Broadcasters didn't start people drinking and they're not going to stop them," said Ockershausen. Ads encourage brand-switching rather than consumption, he argued.

When the issue was raised by a reporter from his own station, Ockershausen joked,

Organizers from the pro-ban Center for Science in the Public Interest (CSPI) took advantage of NAB's press conference, making themselves available for interviews and handing out a statement from CSPI Executive Director Steven Jacobson, who said, "We are heartened that NAB recognizes there are enough serious problems with beer and wine ads to warrant more PSAs.

"We recognize that NAB's initiative focuses only on drunk driving and lasts for only a few weeks. Hopefully, however, the campaign will be a first step towards equal time throughout the year for a variety of health messages and, ultimately, an end to beer and wine commercials. "

CPSI, which coordinates Stop Marketing Alcohol on Radio and Television (Project SMART), repeated its call to ban beer and wine commercials or balance them with an equal number of PSAs on alcohol-related problems like crime, industrial accidents, cancer, birth defects, and drunk driving.

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


Stations Campaign

The Radio Executives of Baltimore, an industry group consisting of 18 local radio stations, recently announced intentions to air \$200,000 worth of public service announcements during the upcoming holiday season. While individual stations have done this sort of thing for years, the pledge takes on greater impact when virtually an entire market makes such a commitment. Since the bulk of



these holiday safety PSAs will address the problems of drinking and driving, it's hoped the effectiveness of the program will be magnified by the number of cooperating stations.



White Collar Blues


"Chronic exposure leads to deterioration of general health and well-being." No, we're not talking about toxic dumps, but quoting from a study by the Congressional Office of Technology Assessment on the hazards of working in an office.

While the report acknowledges such work is not immediately lifethreatening, it listed a number of health hazards associated with office work:

• Video display terminals — The subject of a wide range of worker complaints, ranging from the potential dangers of low-level radiation exposure to muscle, bone, and eye problems. These may be linked to the design of terminals and desks, repetitive motions, and inadequate rest breaks.

• Stress — Produced by low pay, monotonous work, production quotas (including the growing use of computers to monitor worker performance), and lack of worker participation and control. One expert claims "stress is the most pervasive health hazard facing workers today."





Arbitron Mythbusters

It's scary, that's what it is. I'm talking about the number of broadcasters who possess either wrong information or only part of the picture when it comes to the **Arbitron** ratings system.

Not a week goes by that some concerned GM or PD calls me to clarify conflicting information they may have picked up. Since this is the season when it's better to give than to receive, I'll offer a public service and try to dispel some Arbitron myths. Hope you find these hints helpful.

How Many QHs Possible?

One of the more enduring myths is centered around how many quarter hours a station can squeeze out of a 15-minute clock segment. As you may have seen in recent columns by Steve Feinstein (who suggested the catchy title . for this column-thanks, Steve), some programmers have been setting up their clocks and stopsets to allow for two nonstop five-minute periods within a 15-minute clock segment. Apparently, the hope has been that diarykeepers will religiously note listening to station A from 9-9:06 and 9:09-9:15, thus earning the station two quarter-hours out of one quarter-hour on the clock.

There's only one problem with this theory — it's wrong. While it's possible for more than one (indeed, up to three) station to receive a quarter-hour of Arbitron credit within that 15-minute segment, there's no way (unless the computers freak out in Beltsville) a station can garner more than one quarterhour's credit from a 15-minute portion of the clock.



garnered station A its credit for that 15-minute segment (9-9:15).

Once a station has been allocated its five-minute portion of the quarter-hour, it's gone as far as it can until the next 15-minute segment (i.e., 9:15-9:30) gets underway. However, since it only takes a five-minute listening span entry to snare a quarter-hour credit, it's possible that three stations could each achieve a quarter-hour within one 15-minute period of elapsed time.

The second problem with setting your programming clock this way (or sweeping across a quarter-hour from ten to 20 after) is that very few diarykeepers record their entries with regard to the vagaries of the Arbitron system. Most diarykeepers tend to round off their recorded timeframes to 15-minute blocks (7-7:15). It seems that so much energy

Two problems come into play when stations orient their programming to grab more than one quarter-hour at a time. First, the Arbitron software just doesn't allow a station more than one quarter-hour's credit within a 15-minute clock section. Plugging in our preceding example, the station would have been credited for one quarter-hour of listening based on the 9-9:06 entry. The listing of the same station between 9:09-9:15 would have been redundant as far as Arbitron's system is concerned, since the earlier entry had already

is expended in coaxing diarykeepers to respond to programming nuances nuances the average listener is oblivious to, and thus doesn't record in his/her diary.

However, there is one demographic exception to that observation. Teens, those inveterate button-pushers, often try to be exceedingly specific about their entries: It's fairly typical to see four or five entries within a 15-minute period. Assuming those entries are each three or four minutes long, no one gets any credit.

Week In Review

Arbitron Unveils Future Techniques

Jim Ridings, Arbitron's Advertiser/Agency Sales VP, has followed up comments on this page two months ago regarding new technology being considered by the ratings leader. In a speech in Chicago, Ridings told the Media Research Club that Arbitron "foresees electronic diaries and data transmission from home computers as ways they may count radio listeners in the years ahead."

In a recent interview in R&R, Arbitron President Rick Aurichio first flew a trial balloon on using electronic diaries within the next five years. Ridings spelled out some additional details and other approaches that might be considered:

An electronic diary: Like a calculator, this hand-held device could enable people to punch in their radio listening choices and transmit the data to Arbitron via phone lines.

Home Computers: As technology expands, Arbitron could query radio listeners on their personal computers and have the results sent by data transmission or a mailed floppy disc.

In addition, Arbitron's new TV meter could be used as a two-way device, and the same TV households could also serve as the data base for radio surveys — passing that information back to Arbitron through the TV meter.

New ratings technologies will be more fully explored in the January 11, 1985 issue.

Bottom line: Many of the programming strategy games being played daily are too subtle for diarykeepers' notice and are unlikely to be reflected in those precious little booklets. Even if the station earns one five-minute span for diary credit, it achieves no additional payoff within that same quarter-hour should the person write in the same calls again.

Station ID: Calls Or Logos?

One thing that is true is that the overwhelming plurality of diary entries are to legal station calls. This makes sense since diary directions primarily ask for call letters (although not as persistently as one tested two years ago). However, there are those who feel that calls won't be recorded by their station's listeners. Let's look closer at this myth.

First, bear in mind the industry attitude that younger listeners (ages 12-24) respond better to "hip" logos like "Z95.5" than to stuffy old call letters such as WZZZ. This is a self-fulfilling prophecy to a certain extent. If you bombard listeners ten times hourly with "Z95.5" and mumble the calls sotto voce barely once per hour, you'd expect that virtually 100% of the diary entries would be list the station trademark logo. You might be in for a surprise, however.

Having worked with stations in a variety of formats -- Urban, AOR, CHR -which used their logos almost to the exclusion of the calls, I was surprised to see how dedicated the diarykeepers were. In one situation, station execs were amazed to find that over 50% of the station's cume had dutifully followed Arbitron's basic directions and ferreted out, then recorded the station's calls (which were practically hidden at the top of the hour). At the same time it turned out there was a slogan conflict over the station's logo. Credit was lost, owing to the Arbitron custom of ascribing diarykeeper credit whenever a nonexclusive identifier was noted in the diaries

Sometimes non-exclusive logos (such as Kiss, Magic, Classy, or FM93/95) in a congested market may not offer the max in diarykeeper payoff — no matter

what the demos. The station cited above began to use its calls several times an hour and saw its numbers rise to the top of the ratings heap.

Have you conducted a diary review to see how the market identifies your station? You might find your catchy logo isn't as dominant as you thought. Or it might be causing an Arbitron editing problem. The ratings books are full of successful, younger-skewing stations that use their calls. So don't overlook that identifier option. It might have a more viable place in your marketing plans than was originally thought.

Miscellaneous Myths

Wrapping up, I'll dispel several random items that have cropped up lately:

1. Diarykeepers do not keep their diaries for 12 weeks at a time. Each home gets one diary per person 12+, and each diary is kept no more than seven days.

2. Not all black diarykeepers receive a five-dollar premium for filling in and returning the diary. In a black household where males 18-34 reside, up to five persons will get the five-dollar incentive. Other black diarykeepers receive two dollars (the same amount as Hispanics).

3. Wednesday is not the most important diarykeeping day. Entries vary by day, but generally 45-50% of a successful station's cume will record entries for that station on Wednesday. That figure is in the midrange of percentages seen for each of the other days.

4. There is no formula for figuring exactly what one month's contribution to your latest Arbitrends share might be. However, there's probably a bright computer pirate working on that challenge right now.

So much for this edition of Arbitron Mythbusters. Call or write me about additional "truisms" you've heard, and I'll give you thumbs up or down on their veracity. Rest assured that future halftruths which cross this desk will appear anonymously in an upcoming column.

Take care. And remember there are only five days left in the fall Arbitron sweep (and that's no myth).

Network News And Syndication Specials

The last quarter of the year is traditionally the busiest period for radio. Consumer sales are up for the holidays, advertising is typically at its highest peak, and business is booming. Judging from the volume of announcements coming across the old network desk this week, this increased activity extends to the post office and overnight couriers, as well. After sorting out the timeshare vacation giveaways and carpet clearance notices, there was still more than enough material to compile a year-end, looking-ahead network potpourri of program proclamations.

• "Face The Nation," CBS News's weekly Sunday interview program broadcast on both radio and television, celebrated its 30th anniversary last month with its November 11 segment. Except for a two-year hiatus in the early 1960s, "FTN" has been heard and seen every Sunday since November 7, 1954, when Sen. Joseph McCarthy appeared as the first guest. Since that time the broadcast has played host to many heads of state. scientists, sports figures, military leaders, and social critics. The program has maintained a traditional news-interview format throughout most of its existence, featuring a panel of reporters selected on the basis of their expertise in that week's subject matter. CBS correspondent Lesley Stahl moderates the 30-minute broadcast, following in the footsteps of George Herman, Ted Koop, Paul Niven, Stuart Novins, and Martin Agronsky.

• An anniversary was also celebrated by the producers of "Morning Edition," distributed via satellite each morning by National Public Radio. Five years ago, on November 5, 1979, the two-hour daily news program went othe air with host Bob Edwards, who still sits behind the microphone. The show is divided into eight segments each hour, incorporating two newscasts, four news and feature segments, and a sports segment. Over 20 regular commentators and critics contribute to the program mix, including Red Barber, Louis Harris, Tom Shales, and Rod MacLeish.

• Expanded versions of "Top 30 USA" and "Top 40 Satellite Survey," CBS RadioRadio's weekly countdown shows, have been slated for broadcast over New Year's weekend (12/28-30). "Satellite Survey" will double its length to six hours and spin 80 of the top tunes of the previous 12 months, while "Top 30 USA" will play the top 60 A/C hits of 1984 as well as take a look at the top soundtracks and entertainment stories of the year.

• United Stations has announced that two of its present programs, "Solid Gold Country" and "Rick Dees Weekly Top 40," will be playing host to spinoffs around the beginning of the year. On Monday, December 31, the three-hour format of "Country" will be adapted to a daily one-hour feature, mixing country music with interviews and comments from artists, producers, and writers. Each day's show will focus on a particular theme, and will highlight different years and themes

"The American Music Magazine With Rick Dees" will mix Dees's inimitable comic style and cast of zany characters with music, interviews, and the latest news about personalities in the Top 40. The show will be one hour in length and will debut early in 1985.

• Westwood One is debuting two new weekly series which mark an expansion into older-skewing programs. "Musical" is a three-hour showcase of songs and performers of classic Hollywood musicals and Broadway shows, while "Encore With William B. Williams" is a two-hour program spotlighting the sounds of the Big Band era.

"Musical" will feature between 40 and 50 songs each week, and will be hosted by Chuck Southcott. The show was originally distributed by ABC Radio, and will continue to highlight the talent and memories of such stars as Fred Astaire, Julie Andrews, Gene Kelly, and Barbra Streisand. "Encore" is hosted, obviously, by WNEW/New York personality William B. Williams, and is billed as an "affectionate look at the Big Band music of the '30s, '40s, and '50s, from the 'Duke of Ellington' to the 'Chairman of the Board.""

• "Country Guest D.J.," a weekly onehour music program featuring top country artists and music, is now being distributed by London Wavelength. The program invites one artist each week to take over the airwaves to play an hour of his/her favorite country hits. All music is selected by the artist, and is balanced to consist of a blend of classic and contemporary hits. "Country Guest D.J." is targeted to Country stations which traditionally encourage artists to play "guest announcer" – but which don't always have such an opportunity. The pro-

gram is available on a market-exclusive, barter basis.

• Multi-talented rock-rapper Gary Byrd is slated to host "Dance Music International," a weekly, one-hour program showcasing the international world of dance. Features in the weekly potpourri include a global countdown, artist interviews, remastered oldies, dance music news, special club remixes, and exclusive song premieres. "DMI" will be produced through Byrd's own independent company, WGBE Productions, and will be distributed through Radio International.

• Domain Communications of Wheaton, IL, is reintroducing "Photo Tips," a 90-second program discussing a wide range of photography tips of interest to both amateurs and professionals. Topics such as fast and slow film, tricks with flash, family portraits, and the differences in lenses are approached in an informative and conversational manner.

• The Chicago Radio Syndicate, distributors of "Chickenman" and other Dick Orkin comedy features, has opened a branch office in Los Angeles. The office will be utilized to develop new programming features to be distributed via satellite and tape, and also to expand the company's consulting services for advertisers who wish to develop their own radio programs.

• Barnett Robbins Enterprises has announced the formation of the "Big Event Radio Network," a series of 24 specially-scheduled radio programs slated to debut over New Year's weekend later this month. The first program is entitled "Hot #1s Of 1984," to be followed shortly thereafter with "Elvis – 50 Golden Years" on Presley's

birthday. The programs in the series will all be music-oriented and will run from three to six hours in length.

The company has also formed a partnership with the Mutual Radio Network to produce and syndicate "National Lampoon's True Facts," a two-minute daily comedy feature based on the humor magazine's popular column of the same name. The production deal signals an attempt by Mutual to pursue the 12-34 market.

• "The Spirit" Productions, producers of "American Christian Countdown" and "American Gospel Rock Countdown," have introduced a toll-free "Bible-Line" to provide free bibles to the needy. The syndicator has also launched "Chartline," a tollfree, 24-hour service providing weekly chart information to the Contemporary Christian music industry. The phone line will offer prerecorded messages updated weekly listing the top 20 Christian songs and top 10 Gospel songs.

• The Sheridan Broadcasting Network recently opened its new headquarters, located in downtown Pittsburgh. The new address is: Sheridan Broadcasting Network, 1500 Chamber Of Commerce Building, Pittsburgh, PA 15219. The new headquarters is also the new home of WAMO-AM & FM.

SOME PROBLEMS AND OPPOR TUNITIES

Management By Objectives

By Charles Warner

After Peter Drucker introduced the phrase "Management By Objectives" (MBO) in his 1954 book "The Practice of Management," American businesses began embracing the notion with what often amounted to evangelical dedication. During the '60s and '70s MBO was the most fashionable of all management trends. As one major executive said, "You just ain't modern if you ain't got MBO."

The steps of MBO are: 1) An employee periodically initiates a set of written performance objectives or targets, 2) The employee and his or her supervisor discuss the objectives, agreeing on the goals to which the employee then becomes committed, and 3) Periodic informal or formal review by the employee and his or her superior determine to what extent the objectives have been met or exceeded.

User Problems

Many companies in broadcasting adopted some form of MBO, which, as Drucker originally proposed, asks managers to focus on results. However, in broadcasting and other businesses MBO has often fallen into disuse, and many original MBO systems have been altered past recognition and usefulness. In a recent survey of Fortune 500 companies, it was discovered that fewer than 50% of them were currently using MBO, and only 10% were happy with their MBO system. From my experience with a wide variety of broadcasting companies, these percentages probably hold true for the broadcasting business as well.

What has happened to such a strong concept? Has MBO proven not to be as effective as first hoped? Has MBO failed? Management experts in consulting firms, business, and the academic community are in general agreement that the problems with MBO stem from the users, not from the system, which is still regarded as the best theoretical management program ever conceived. The dean of one major graduate business school said the two big problems with MBO were "adoption in ignorance and implementation in haste.'

Management By Objectives can work for you in any size station or department, if you do it right and are patient in letting it set in. First, MBO is an effective planning, control, and development system; it is not an effective performance evaluation or reward system. Second, MBO is a bottom-up planning system, not a top-down one. Third, even though MBO is supposed to focus on results, the results it focuses on should be task-oriented activities and not financially-based.

MBO is best used as a system for helping people in a station plan their objectives (or goals) for an upcoming period. General managers can use the system with their department heads, and department heads (sales, programming, promotion, engineering) can use the system with their subordinates.

Setting Objectives

Objectives should be set for the coming year and then updated

and reviewed on at least a quarterly basis—monthly reviews are even better. MBO should be used as a planning tool (what tasks are going to get done) and as a control tool (did they get done). When an analysis and review is conducted, the emphasis must be on a coaching approach by a manager with a subordinate; i.e., the planned results, could results have been better, what could have been done more effectively?

If a manager uses MBO to evaluate a subordinate's performance for the purpose of making a salary or compensation decision, then MBO loses its effectiveness. When subordinates realize they are going to be rewarded on the basis of the objectives they set, they will struggle to set them as low as possible.

On the other hand, objectives can have very strong, motivating effects if they meet the following general criteria:

1) They must be specific. Research has clearly shown that vague, ambiguous objectives not only do not motivate people, they confuse and discourage them.

2) Objectives must be moderately difficult for each person. What is perceived to be difficult for one person may be too easy for another. Objectives that are too difficult also have absolutely no motivating effect; once people realize that an objective is unachievable, they give up. Thus, an overly ambitious objective is worse than an overly easy one. At least people won't stop working when they've reached the easy one as they do when they realize the tough objective is out of reach.

3) People must be given regular feedback on how they are doing on their efforts to achieve their objectives. Feedback serves two functions: it helps keep people on target, and it serves as an incentive for greater effort. The moral-give people continual feedback on how they are doing. "The One Minute Manager" by Blanchard and Johnson calls this feedback "One Minute Praisings" and "One Minute Reprimands."

tives if they are going to have any motivational effect. Having them participate in setting objectives usually aids a great deal in having people accept the goals. This last element of objective acceptance is a vital and typically overlooked element in the MBO system. Too often objectives, usually in the form of billing or rating objectives, are handed to department heads in a preemptive manner by top management: "Here's your billing goal for next year," or "Here's the share I need next year to make my budget." When you hand down objectives to people without their having participated in a discussion and negotiation about the goals, don't expect them to accept the goals or make a really meaningful commitment to achieving them.

4) People must accept the objec-

A Tailored Fit

Remember that high achievers and low achievers each perform better under different conditions. Managers have a responsibility to help people tailor their objectives to their individual needs as much as possible. When coaching subordinates on how to set meaningful objectives, remind them that objectives must be:

- Measurable
- Attainable
- Demanding
- Consistent with company objectives
 - Participative
- Under the control of the person
- WrittenDeadlined
- Flexible

In order for an objective to be measurable, it must be specific. For example, a sales objective of 'making more calls'' is useless because "more" is not measurable. A measurable goal would be "next week and thereafter to increase the number of sales appointments to 30 per week." For a goal to be meaningful, it must also be under the control of a person. For example, goals for a salesperson should not be based on billing - it can be affected by ratings and general business conditions over which a salesperson has no control. Goals that are not written down and retained by both the manager and the subordinate are also meaningless. They are forgotten and become the basis for after-the-fact arguments about whose memory was best. Finally, goals must be flexible so they can be changed when conditions change, otherwise they become useless.

The idea that billing or financial goals are ineffective is probably foreign to most broadcast managers, but it is in this area that the original concept of MBO has veered off-track in many stations. Because general managers are evaluated on their bottom-line performance, it is easy for them to pass billing objectives down to the sales department and rating objectives needed to meet these billing objectives down to the program and promotion departments. However, it is the general manager's job to work with his or her department heads to design strategic plans to accomplish improved billing and ratings performance; if the plans are right the billing will come.

Improved revenue and ratings come from the successful accomplishment of a variety of activities, thus it is these activities that should be focused on, not the broad outcome of these activities, profit. In "The Practice of Management," Drucker pointed out that the purpose of a business was not properly defined as making a profit, but as creating a customer.

Taking Time

In Peters and Waterman's "In Search of Excellence," the president of Hewlett-Packard said, "In our strategic reviews, the critical point is the division general managers' three to five objectives (for the year). We really don't need the financials. The only reason I use them is to keep the division managers happy. If they get those objectives right, the financials will follow." Objectives at HP are activities. For example, "Get the sales force in the Western Region spending 50% of their time calling on customers of type X rather than type Y by October 31."

Finally, MBO takes time to work. The CEO of a top Fortune 500 company said it took five years to implement MBO in his company and ten years to get it right. If you give your people time to get accustomed to an MBO system, and use it properly for planning and control (not for evaluation), MBO can serve you well in any size station in any size market.

Update: Ratings, Programming, People

In the relatively few markets that have summer Arbitron books, it appears the News/Talk format scored a draw this year. Of 27 stations measured in the summer months, I found that 11 (41%) gained, 12 (44%) lost ground and four (15%) stayed level.

That's quite a bit better than the format's performance in the spring book, where I checked standings for 123 stations. Losers outnumbered winners 53-39%, while 8% didn't move.

I thought it might be interesting to check for any longer term trends, so I compared this spring's figures for 104 stations against their 1983 spring books. Once again, slippage outranked growth 57-38%, with 5% holding steady. Admittedly, such raw figures aren't conclusive, and I'm well aware that many News/Talk people object to being measured in 12+ shares. But the numbers do seem to show that a lot of information stations are having a tough time maintaining steady growth.

ABC Talkradio Heads East

In an economy move, ABC Talkradio is consolidating operations at its new broadcast center in New York on December 31. Up to 10 Los Angeles staffers will lose their jobs, and overnight hosts **Ray Briem** and Ira Fistell of KABC/Los Angles will be dropped to cut the cost of satelliting their shows back to New York. The net is actively searching for New York-based replacements.

Michael Jackson and Drs. Susan Forward and Toni Grant will still come out of KABC. Owen Spann has already relocated from San Francisco to New York. In January he'll add a two-hour local show on WABC and swap network slots with Forward. That'll put the two issues hosts (Spann and Jackson) back-to-back, and the same for the therapists.

ABC Radio Division President Ben Hoberman says the network is absolutely committed to Talkradio, and expects the service to turn a profit in 1986. He admits growth has been a bit slower than expected, but says the affiliate count now stands at 83 stations, up from 62 at the beginning of 1984.

Speaking of growth, what's happened at CNN Radio and NBC Talknet since my columns on both early this year? CNN is up from 124 to 162 stations, while Talknet's lineup now tops 200, up from 139 in February.

CBS Sells "Inforadio"

CBS Radio Spot Sales has put 50 information stations in the top 25 markets into a single package marketed to upscale advertisers as "Inforadio." Customized Simmons data is used to show the unwired net's reach into key groups such as college graduates and \$70,000+ households.

Here's an example of how Inforadio is making a run at other media. CBS Radio Spot Sales says a four-color ad in *Time*, Newsweek, or Sports Illustrated can cost up



to \$250,000; a 30-second spot on "60 Minutes" may run \$210,000; a 30-second spot on all three TV network evening news shows can set you back \$160,000. But \$164,000 will buy you a thousand one-minute spots on the 50 Inforadio outlets.

Court In Session

KIEV/Glendale, CA, which went from daytimer to fulltimer in September, airs a unique legal show Sunday nights from 8-9. Featuring a cast of attorneys, "Court In Session" is a reenactment of an actual trial argued in a Los Angeles court. After the testimony is given, host-attorney "judge" Lou Edelberg gives legal instructions to listener-jurors, who phone in their "verdict" to the station. The case's actual outcome is announced at the end of the show.

WMCA Links U.S. And Israel

WMCA/New York is laying claim to the first, regularly-scheduled radio talk show linking two continents with "Live From Israel," airing Mondays from 4-5pm. It originates from WMCA and by satellite from the studios of Kol Israel in Tel Aviv. WMCA Chairman R. Peter Straus says the show lets New Yorkers talk directly to Israeli newsmakers.

WBBM Taps Mobile Phone Explosion

WBBM/Chicago is riding the wave of mobile telephones hitting the streets as cellular radio takes hold. Over 10,000 owners of Ameritech mobile phones in the Chicago area are encouraged to call in traffic and news tips from the road. Winners of weekly and 78-day newstip contests get cash prizes from WBBM and free phone time from Ameritech.

Win Some, Lose Some

The San Francisco Bay Area is slated for a new all-News outlet soon when Adam Clayton Powell III takes over Blackformatted KDIA/Oakland. He believes a pure news format can prosper against talk on KGO and news magazines on KCBS.

Meanwhile, word that WHUE-AM/Boston is being sold to Greater Media puts that station's fledgling all-News format in question. There's no question at KOGO/San Diego, which has ended its disappointing News/ Talk fling to try an A/C approach. Others getting out this year were WWRC/Washington and WAYS/Charlotte, while WNTR/-Washington decided to get in. Poor signal coverage is blamed for the demise of the all-comedy format on WJOK/Washington. The owners are selling WJOK, but promise a satellite-delivered joke format sometime in 1985.

VP JACK CLEMENTS would "neither confirm nor deny" the report, but he did tell R&R, "Mr. Harvey is obviously one of the preeminent personalities in radio broadcasting, and since we are in a mode of acquiring people for the Mutual stable it would be dumb of us not to have an interest in him." Mutual had a similar interest during Harvey's last contract negotiations, but couldn't compete with ABC's offer. This time, however ... Page Two!

A couple of rumors running around about **POLYGRAM** VP **HAROLD CHILDS.** Is he headed for **CAPITOL RECORDS?** Or will he take the helm of **QWEST RECORDS?** They're just rumors at this point, as Harold is still under contract to PolyGram, but we hear discussions *are* being held. More details in a couple of weeks.

DOLLY PARTON has reportedly offered nearly \$5 million in an effort to purchase **MONUMENT RECORDS.** Label President **FRED FOSTER** filed the company for Chapter 11 reorganization almost two years ago, but Parton apparently wants to reactivate the label and retain Foster as a producer.

The on-again-off-again **RECORD WEEK** magazine is now off again. Although we had prematurely reported its demise earlier this fall, this time the doors are closed on the trade that had attempted to publish definitive retail and wholesale record sales data.

JIM SNOWDEN is no longer doing mornings on WBLS/NEW YORK, although he remains under contract to INNER CITY. GARY BYRD has shifted over from sister station WLIB to handle the WBLS morning show. Former WRKS personality MARY THOMAS has returned to WBLS (where she was before shifting to WRKS) in afternoon drive. Mary's exit from WRKS leaves that outlet with a prime afternoon opening. We hear a Midwesterner will fill the bill.

Last Monday (12-3), KLAC/LOS ANGELES officially became the property of CAP CITIES — owners of KZLA-FM/LOS ANGELES. In addition to the takeover, both stations moved to new facilities. The new address is 4000 Alameda BI., PO Box 7806, Burbank, CA 91510; the new phone number is (818) 842-0500. As for the direction of KLAC, OM BILL MAYNE said "It's still KLAC; it's still Country. What's new is the sound of the radio station from both the technical and the production aspects." Two of the KLAC personalities made the switch, with **MIKE O'NEILL** staying in middays and **MAGGIE ROSS** moving from overnights to evenings. **SCOTT CARPENTER** comes in from **WCAO/BALTIMORE** for mornings and **STONEY RICHARDS** moves from KZLA to KLAC afternoons. Out at KLAC are longtime personality **GENE PRICE** and evening vet **CHRIS LANE.** Bill Mayne is looking for an overnight talent — sends T&Rs to him ASAP.

CHARLIE O'NEAL's contract wasn't renewed, so he's out as morning personality at **WMAQ/CHICAGO.** He's looking and can be reached at (312) 359-1197.

WLAV/GRAND RAPIDS OM TONY GATES, who had been charged with illegal use of a telephone to facilitate cocaine trafficking, has had all charges against him dismissed. As nice as that news is for Tony, there's something about this story that's even nicer: his employers stood with him all the way through the whole ordeal, picking up his entire legal bill. That's a vote of confidence not every employer would offer.

On the heels of **GANNETT**'s takeover of **KKBQ-AM & FM/HOUSTON**, the company has licensed **MIKE JOSEPH**'s "Hot Hits" phrase, becoming the third Gannett station to do so. The only market in the top ten not using the phrase is Washington, DC.

JEFF HUNTER, former KITS/San Francisco and XTRA/San Diego PD, is now consulting. He can be reached at (415) 485-1862, and his first client is KWOD/SACRAMENTO.

KRLA/LOS ANGELES Promotion Director MERIDITH MAY has been named Marketing & Promotion Director for KRLA and KHTZ. Headquartered at KHTZ, she'll report to Operations Manager JAY CLARK. KERI FRETTI will remain as Promotion Manager for KHTZ.

With the sale and impending switchover of **KSON-AM & FM/SAN DIEGO** to **JEFFERSON-PILOT**, the typical rumors of format change have abounded. However, J-P Exec VP **JIM BABB** says they are "100% committed" to making the longtime Country outlet the dominant *Country* station in town. The official takeover is set for January 1.

KQRS/MINNEAPOLIS VP/GM MIKE HENDERSON has exited the station. His slot was not immediately filled.

Speaking of the Twin Cities, what former WLS/CHICAGO staffer is about to land a programming position in Minneapolis-St. Paul? Continued on Page 27

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

13. The Primettes were: Diana Ross's first group, before they changed the name to the Supremes.


14. Texas group the Scholars featured: a young Kenny Rogers.



You don't get a lot of attention for staying in a group after a key member leaves. Thomas McClary recently complained that the press abandoned the Commodores after Lionel Richie went solo; the ironic part is that Mc-Clary didn't find a forum for his comment until he stepped out on his own. Walter "Clyde" Orange, who hits 38 today, is still in the Commodores, and the Commodores are still active. Born in Florida, Orange was both drummer and lead vocalist at the group's inception as the Jays. Like McClary, Richie, and the other four group members, Orange was also one of the group's songwriters. The Commodores have an LP ready for release shortly.

TUESDAY, DECEMBER 11

Jermaine Information

Jermaine Jackson needed explosives to prove he could do it on his own. Although he became a successful solo artist in 1972, Jermaine went for four post-J5 years with only one R&B solo hit, 1976's "Let's Be Young Tonight." Jackson returned to CHR in 1980 and brought some heavy names: Stevie Wonder on "Let's Get Serious," members of Devo for "Let Me Tickle Your Fancy," and then Michael on "Tell Me I'm Not Dreaming." Although Jermaine's been alone on R&B hits like "You Like Me, Don't You" and "I'm Just Too Shy," "Dynamite" was the first song to put him on the CHR charts by himself. Jermaine, who turns 30 today, is part of some bizarre sharing among Jacksons. First Paul McCartney switched from Michael to Jermaine for "Do What You Do." And Janet has an LP cut with Cliff Richard, whose last U.S. hit was Jermaine's first, "Daddy's Home." Other Birthdays: Brenda Lee 1942/1943, Booker T. Jones 1944, David Gates 1939

WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 12

East Orange Machine

Dionne Warwick was born in East Orange, NJ on this day in 1941. She's best known for MOR singles spanning three decades, but has a number of surprises throughout her career: an uptempo cover of Roy Hamilton's "You Can Have Her" (with the gender changed) in 1965; 1975's "Once You Hit The Road," a Thom Bellproduced number along the lines of "Then Came You"; and last year's Luther Vandross-penned modern-funker, "Got A Date." Warwick's next album, marking her reunion with both Hal David & Burt Bacharach and producer Barry Manllow, will probably have her back in A/C for the time being.

Big Pig Machine

There was a period five years ago when the Muppets had busted their way out of the TV set and into the music industry. On this day in 1979, "Muppet Movie" mania came to a head. Most of those stations that stayed on the air switched to Beatles or Lennon music. Later that evening, the RKO Radio Network ran the three-hour Lennon/Ono interview recorded on the evening of Lennon's death.



WINNING CONTEST IDEAS

Some Of The Best Bits Of 1984

If anyone thought CHR began to skyrocket in 1983, then the format approached the speed of light in 1984. More and more metros became musically and promotionally stimulated by CHR's return, sometimes by two or even three stations within a market.

CHR is dominating more and more markets in America in total shares as well as cume figures. How is this happening? It all began with the music, as CHR programmers discovered the importance of playing the hits again. Another contributing factor has been the increasing need to look to the active audience again for the hits, in-

stead of the passive. Result: big cumes. But what generated those huge AQHs? Simple: the presentation of the station. Personality is back, and in a big way. But what other element helped to set the tone for a winning CHR in 1984, and will do so in the years ahead? *Promotion!* As you head into the holidays, here are a few ideas to consider for your promotional futures in 1985.

K104 Pucks Around With Giveaway Insurance Policy

When a station in Erie, PA can give away \$104,000, then wherever you are, no matter what size market, there's no reason for not being able to come up with bucks for a promotion.

K104's Bill Shannon explained how easily any station can offer so much money. "There were three of us involved; K104, McDonalds, and Loblaws Food Stores. We all got together and took out an insurance policy which paid off \$104,000 if someone were to shoot a puck into a four-inch hole from one goal line to the other (200 feet) at the opening game of the Erie Golden Blades.

"Listeners registered at Loblaws or McDonalds and listened for their name on K104. Four of the 25 contestants were drawn from the crowd at the game. We got around the lottery problem by having an entry booth outside the entrance to the arena."

Restrictions were that contestants had to be at least six years old and had never played amateur or professionally organized hockey above the high school level. The first person to sink the puck would win and end the contest. Bill continued the story. "As luck would have it, the sixth contestant put it in the hole and the place went nuts. We got tons of TV coverage out of it as we paid 25-year-old Randy Arrowsmith a onetime payment of \$104,000."

So what did it cost for this magical insurance policy? A mere \$2000! Jersey International Insurance handled the policy. Now don't get the idea that you can finance all of your station promotions this way, because



KHIT MILLION DOLLAR CONTEST SHAKES SEATTLE — KHIT/Seattle claims it's the biggest cash giveaway in the Pacific Northwest. The station, which signed on as a CHR outlet July 4, recently launched its Million Dollar Giveaway. the premium will be figured on the odds of winning. But it's something worth exploring, especially for a one-time event.

Song Of The Day Mania Spreads

Perhaps the most successful (and most emulated) contest of 1984 was KIIS-FM/ Los Angeles's "Daily Cash Payoff." Offering up to to \$5000 a day, the contest began with morning host Rick Dees playing the "Song of the Day" at 7:10am. Listeners would then be told how much it was worth and that one would win all the money if he was the designated caller when the song was again aired

A Fleet Of Fifteen

Cars are always a hot item, and Q107/ Washington gave away 15 Pontiac Fieros for listeners who heard the sound effects of a sports car and then were the 107th caller. This proven concept of listeners anticipating a chance to "call in to win at any moment" (aided by a sound-effect which helps complete the mental picture of the contest) resulted in huge success at Q107. The station reported that a number of listeners attempted long-distance calls in order to win.

The Zoo Phenomenon

On November 9, we looked at effectively spreading the excitement generated by the morning show into other dayparts. To achieve this, morning shows are doing anything and everything to attract attention. WZUU/Milwaukee's Morning Zoo staged a "Breakfast Club," with zookeepers Buck Williams and Chris O'Connor broadcasting live from a bar. Participating were invitation-winning listeners who watched the show and ate a hearty breakfast. You name it, and you can do it in the morning show to create a lot of talk about your radio station.

Long-Distance Concert Travel

As budgets at both radio and records loosened a bit, stations sent listeners on trips all over the country and the world to see hot acts. Recently Z100 flew two listeners to England to catch **Rod Stewart** in concert. No doubt, the hottest concert seats this year were the Jacksons, Van Halen, Prince, and **Bruce Springsteen**. Many stations gave tickets away on the air for the correct answer to a trivia question. Some included them in a concert kit with albums and T-shirts, while others gave 'em as bonus prizes to other contests. Whatever the method, concert tickets are a hotter item than ever for a wider demo spread.

Count The Music

"Count The Music" is an old concept, but keeping track of the title and artists of songs for an entire week or weekend was too demanding a task for most listeners, even the most diehard contest pigs! Therefore, the idea was scaled down in 1984 by a number of programmers.

Many stations asked listeners to keep track of, say, the last five songs. When a jingle or sounder was played, the designated caller would be asked to repeat those last five songs at the rate of \$100 a tune. Because of the ease in which the contest can be done, PDs have found it a fast and effective way to hand out the bucks, while keeping listeners tuned into the station for long periods of time. Trivia

Trivia was always a big item in the past, but it made a strong rebound in 1984. With the success of Trivial Pursuit and People's Weekly Trivia games, the populace of America has been collectively scratching its head for answers that win prizes both big and small. The use of trivia questions is a great vehicle for quick winners and on-air audience involvement.

Cassettes Instead Of Albums

Cassettes are now outselling albums by an ever-increasing margin. For radio, this means cassettes make as good a prize, if not better, than albums. Why are record companies willing to go along with this trend and supply tapes instead of albums for giveaway? Because cassettes — even the high-quality metal or chromium-dioxide tapes — are less expensive to manufacture and ship than albums. Reason? The packaging is where labels save their dollars. Take advantage of the trend!



Ridin' The River

If you thought raft races were a thing of the past just because they don't do 'em in Atlanta anymore, think again. Q105 teamed up with the American Rafting Association to run the "Rambling Raft Race" promotion. This makes a great spring or summer function. Make sure you plan ahead, as there are a lot of details involved. Getting A Taste Of The Good Life Q105/Tampa teamed up with McDonalds to offer over \$120,000 in prizes, including a new home, two Ford Mustangs, and an 18½foot Chris Craft Scorpion. It all culminated when 150 finalists were drawn from hundreds of thousands of entries available at McDonalds. Find out about participating with major fast-food chains or a nationally advertised soft drink as a way to defer a lot of the cost of a contest, in return for a small percentage of space on a bumper sticker or in a TV spot.

Contemporary Hit Radio

We've Got The Spirit

Z106/Philadelphia got the spirit and passed it along to its listeners, staging the everpopular "High School Spirit" contest. Local prize was a video system for the school and a chance to compete in the national competition to win a van for the alma mater.

While many high school spirit contests revolve around sending in petitions, this one differed in that the 7-Up-sponsored contest looked for proposals for events that raise the sagging spirits of most American high schools. Four local finalists staged their events on four consecutive Saturdays.

Boogie Lines And Bedchecks

Always popular for nighttime programming is a "Boogie-Line" call-in feature. Using tape delay (or going live for the daring personality), calls are accepted with jokes, dedications, and school challenges. This one works well with night rocker **Bruce Vidal** on KIIS-FM.

KAY106 also shows up as doing something similar but air personality Jan Dean calls it a "Bedcheck." It originally began in January as a late-night feature from midnight-2am, and proved so popular that an extra hour was added.



BUMPER STICKERS ARE HAPPENING — That old standby was in full display in 1984. Byron Crecelius, VP/Sales & Marketing for U.S. Tape & Label, specializes in them and said it was a "record year for orders and volume of stickers. Business is up about 40%." Stations called out license numbers of vehicles spotted with their logos for prizes including cash, audio equipment, sporting goods, and cars. Window stickers abounded as stations in less temperate climates found they would get more mileage out of that approach in the cold weather. The possibilities for the uses of bumper stickers are endless. They're worthy of consideration for an upcoming spring or summertime promotion.

Two Radio Growth Industries

Efficient managers know a penny saved is a penny earned. Conservation of station resources is achieved primarily through use of the powerful word "no," and failing that, by trading out and bartering. Bosses who operate on the principle of Scrooge-onomics understand that hard cash must be spent only when absolutely necessary.

So what's considered necessary these days? One of the more visibly-successful enterprises taking generous amounts of cash from radio is the private weather service, selling customized forecasts in even the smallest markets. The emergence of private-industry weather services during the past ten years has been so lucrative that radio now supports a dozen or so, with new competitors popping up every few months.

The mailout News and Feature companies have been around a little longer. In the race toward the goal of becoming broadly based and consistently profitable, the mailout folks have been turtles and the weather people hares. The growth of mailout has been steady. One needs only a typewriter and a small amount of operating capital to launch a mailout service.

Not many of us who work as air talent will be doing it all our lives. We occasionally wonder exactly what we will be doing for a living far down the line. If I had to hop out of radio right now, I'd consider those two possibilities.

Woman Sets Air Speed Record





Straight From The Cart

Stations in formats other than AOR have been putting the cart before the record and routinely carting up all their music for some time. Given their larger number of titles and a concern for audio fidelity, few AOR stations have dumped the vinyl solution in favor of all-cart music libraries. But in this mad, mod world of high-tech and tighter libraries, the notion of turning off the turntables no longer seems as remote as it once did.

AOR A La Cart

The benefits to going all-cart are cleanliness and consistency: snap, crackle, and pop vinyl no longer assaults your airwaves, and records no longer skip, get stuck in the same old groove, or get 'wowed' because of improper cuing.

WGRX/Baltimore PD Alan Lawson first became a carted music enthusiast while working at KINK/Portland. He sees the move as a matter of quality control in two areas. "You can maintain a cleaner library, preserving the quality of your source material – record albums. Also, flat, even audio response is part of the quality image a station needs for a competitive edge," he reasons.

"You avoid the debris that collects on records that are handled constantly. You no longer have a careless jock hitting the wrong button and stopping the record while it's airing, or playing a record at the wrong speed."

During his vinyl days at WQDR/Raleigh before becoming VP/GM of the area's new AOR station, WRDU, Dave Berry remembers "noticing that a lot of our commercials were sounding cleaner than our records. When I'd talk to our engineers, I'd find that upgrading the sound of the station often came back to what we playing our music off of — the records. You're playing records that are 10-15 years old, and you just don't have the library to play a fresh copy every time. With state-of-the-art cart machines and carts, you can avoid a lot of surface noise and turntable rumble."

KXZL/San Antonio PD Ray St. James came out of CHR and is no stranger to using all carts. "It gives me more control -ajock won't take it upon himself to experiment with a cut that's not approved for airplay. It's also great not having somebody cue up the wrong cut."

Additionally, a station is assured of proper cues for tracks that are difficult to get into and out of gracefully, such as unbanded cuts on Pink Floyd albums. As Lee Roy Hansen, PD at KSJO/San Jose, says, "Now I know exactly where 'Young Lust' is going to start and end."

Hi Fi File

KSJO's Hansen says technology's caught up to the point where there's little discernible loss going from disk to cart. "Technically, you lose a generation going from record to cart, but I haven't been able to notice it in 'A-B' comparison listening I've done. The loss is short-term, if at all – records in the air-studio only stay fresh for so long, and you can only replace them so often. After a record's been played for a while, it generally ages much more than a cart would."

Any drop-off in fidelity is "negligible," Lawson agrees. "There's a little bit of tape noise added, but there's no perceptible loss if you use a clean cart, good tonearm and stylus, a flat console, and good tape machines. Keeping the music clean and avoiding records that skip outweigh any small increase in noise."

Cart Cost

It's not cheap putting an AOR library on cart, Lawson admits, but he feels the benefits are well worth the cash for carts. "They're expensive, but you're committing LP: VALOTTE fades JULIAN LENNON "Valotte" 273

money to a major upgrading of the quality of your air sound."

A side bonus is the time and money both stations and record companies save by cutting back on frequent ordering and filling back catalog orders, even at a discount price. WRDU, in a start-up situation like WGRX, had jocks bring in clean copies from their personal libraries and avoided a long wait for catalog service.

Tech Talk

Lawson was hooked initially by KINK's Tom Cat cart decks, which he claims "sound better than an MCI reel-to-reel machine. At 'GRX, we use ITC Series 99 machines and Capitol Audiopak carts. They house a very high output, low noise tape."

KSJO also uses the ITC machines, opting for Scotch cartridges, as does KXZL. WRDU has the Tom Cat machines and Capitol's Audiopac carts.

Segues

Proper coding on the cart labels reminds jocks of songs' intros and endings. At KSJO, the record library has stayed in the air-studio so jocks can audition unfamiliar opens and closes, and check liner notes for biographical information. They can also audition intros and endings on the carts themselves, as the decks are able to recue carts at a high speed.

Nobody's trashing his air-studio turntables just yet, either, though WRDU has only one in its new studio. They're still necessary for a variety of situations, including for when a hot new release arrives, records that are only going to be aired once or twice, and in case of cart machine failure.

Even Levels

Another happy by-product of the all-cart system is more even levels between audio elements. "There's nothing worse than coming out of a jingle or spots and the level of a song is too low. With carts, you avoid that by bumping the intro's level when recording it," explains Lawson. "We don't bump the intros to the point where a quiet intro is made to be as loud as the middle of the song, but we will up the intro of something like 'Here Comes The Sun' to make it audible for someone traveling in traffic."

Keeper Of The Carts

Having one person do all the dubbing assures consistency of levels and uniform tightness of cart cues. Music Director Bob Walton is in charge at WRDU, and KSJO's Hansen has hired a local production pro to do all its dubbing. 'RDU's Berry advises, "You don't want a parttimer doing the carting. Your music is your main product, and you want someone in charge who knows what they're doing."

KXZL also has one person charged with the job, and a high-quality cartridge and stylus are designated to be used only for dubbing.

WGRX doesn't have the luxury of a specialist to do all its dubbing, so Lawson keeps an ear on all the dubs done by various staffers. He reminds them to clean the cart machine's heads after every dub, and to

check for phasing problems by monitoring recordings in mono.

WRDU employs a noise reduction system, similar to a Dolby, to remove extraneous noise, but none of the stations does any equalizing during the dubbing, opting for a record's built-in frequency response. Says Lawson, "We process between the console and the transmitter instead of between the record and the cart. If someone prefers more bass or high end, they have controls on their stereo."

Tips

To avoid confusion, the stations use different color labels for commercial carts and music carts or put cart numbers for commercials and music on different sides of the labels.

Inaudible secondary and tertiary tones placed on the carts give jocks two advance notices: that a record will end in 20 seconds, and then that it's time to fire the next cart.

Next Step

As convenient as carts are, Alan Lawson looks forward to the day when he can take the next step beyond carts and move to using only compact disks. "It'll save the record company having to reservice us with records, and it'll save me from spending six dollars to cart up one track from an album. Besides that, there's nothing that beats first generation audio."







Catch-Ups, Memos, Reminders...

Also, try for action or aerial shots. Don't forget to make sure your call

letters and/or station personnel are in each picture.

Unfortunately, I get far more material (especially photos) than space permits, but I'll do my best to squeeze in as much as possible every week. Mail your materials to me at 1930 Century Park West, Los Angeles, CA 90067. You're also welcome to call me anytime to talk business, and Wednesdays-Fridays are best for that. Remember our deadline for news is Tuesday.

Dear R&R:

Your recent series on CHR/Adult crossovers has spurred me to sit at the typewriter. It concerns the A/C chart and a seemingly growing problem that is restricting my ability to use it as an indicator of how a record is doing



WTKO is a full-service AM. The meat and potatoes of our 25-54 numbers lie within 35-54. Thus, it is important for me to hold on to those 35-54s, especially the cume that tunes in primarily for news. I also know this market and the fruitlessness of trying to pursue 18-34s, especially when considering the damage to the 35+. While this strategy is fine for a station such as WTKO, it is not fine for an FM music-oriented A/C, which needs to grab its share of 18-34s.

My feeling is that the chart, especially at the top end, is moving away from the fullservice AMs. I don't need research to deter-

mine that Anne Murray w/Dave Loggins did more for me than Billy Ocean. A possible solution that would help me would be to add, in addition to the main A/C chart, a couple of minor charts based on where your reporters' primary and secondary targets lie. One for the young end of the demo, and the other for the older end of the 25-49 bracket. This would be a better tool for me to use, since I begin to worry a little when I'm using a little too much gut.

Your 10/26 column on CHR crossovers to A/C struck a chord with me. Your headline (CHR Crossovers: How Much Is Enough?) echoed my concern, too. My selection of music depends on whether or not a potential hit fits the sound and tone of the station. This tone varies from season to season. If it happens to be CHR material, it will most likely become more exposed and subsequently a auicker hit. But these auick hits risk burning a lot faster. We have to consider this overexposure/burn factor in our selection.





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WAWA — Lending A Helping Hand

In light of the holiday season, I'd like to focus on an integral part of the Black/Urban format - community involvement. And one station with an active community conscience is WAWA/Milwaukee.

During a recent chat with PD Mark Christian, I heard about a WAWA cosponsored promotion eliciting huge response from Milwaukee citizens. It seems the idea originated in Jeanie Arnold's English class at inner-city Parkman Middle School. Last month her students decided they wanted to help feed Ethiopia's starving children. These students were willing to share their good fortune by donating lunch and extra candy money to the cause. Mark picks up the story here.

Dispelling A Bum Rap

"We were contacted by the Greater Milwaukee Chapter of the American Red Cross to see if our station could help the kids with their idea. We were chosen by the Red Cross because they felt we were the station in town that served the black community.

"We invited the kids, along with their teacher, to come into the studios and be on our 'Community Up-Date' talk show, hosted by Dr. O.C. White, and the children related their message to our audience. By the time they finished, our phones were jammed with callers volunteering to donate money on behalf of the starving Ethiopian children. We even had calls from local businessmen, offering to give \$100 for every \$100 the kids can raise.'

Mark continued, "The fact that they were inner-city kids did my heart good. These kids really get a bum rap as being the worst kids in town. Because there are some bad eggs at the school, they're all stereotyped because the school is predominantly black. It's not fair. Ms. Arnold wanted to let the city and the world know that not all of Park-

man's students are bad. Seeing what was taking place was wonderful for all of us. That's when we decided this could be much larger than the kids had even imagined."

WLUM Joins In

And now others have decided to get involved in the four-week promotion. The Parkman students also pleaded their case at WAWA's first community luncheon, and black community leaders pledged their support. Another source of support came from WAWA's sister station WLUM. PD Jim Brown and his group will donate half the revenues collected during an upcoming Friday night dance at a local nitery

Mark is also challenging Black/Urban outlets in other cities: "We'd like to ask all Black/Urban radio stations in the country to get involved in this worthy cause. With all the things going on in Africa, we must try and do something to help. When Israel had its seven-day war, Jews all over America not only sent money, but volunteered to go fight in Israel. The least we can do is help feed these people because they're part of us, and we're part of them.'

Working with Mark is his assistant and news anchor Lesia Wesley. "We've been assured our contributions will be channeled to the food relief fund especially created for the Ethiopian children," Mark added. "We've asked that all checks be made out to Red Cross's Greater Milwaukee Chapter, with a notation that they be used for the African Famine Relief Fund. All in all, it's going great. We're all happy to be involved in a positive venture that helps people." What a way to start the holidays!
