Shamrock, Malrite Set 21-Station, \$300 Million Mega-Transaction

Deal creates second-largest radio-only group, instant SF duopoly

Following months of speculation, Shamrock Broadcasting and Malrite Communications announced plans to merge their radio groups in a stock-swap deal valued at over \$300 million. The merger, which is expected to close in early summer, is the second largest radio deal ever ranking just behind Group W's 1989 purchase of 10 Legacy and Metropolitan stations for \$385 million.

The merger, with Shamrock parent Shamrock Holdings as the surviving entity, will catapult the company into the top ranks of group owners. It will be the country's second-largest radio-only company (exceeded only by Infinity), with stations in half of the nation's 24 largest markets.

Nine Malrite stations (all except WEGX/Philadelphia, which is owned by a Malrite limited partnership) will be merged into Shamrock's radio group. Prior to the merger, both

Cautious Radio Trims Stern Stung by FCC, KLSX excises graphic portions of morning show; KFBI says it's done same

Once burned, twice learned. That's Greater Media's new attitude toward Howard Stern's show, which last year netted the company's KLSX/Los Angeles a \$105,000 indecency fine from the FCC.

In a bid to win a reduction of that fine and avoid further levies, the company has been monitoring – and occasionally editing – Stern's program be-

The practice came to light last Wednesday (3/10) after KLSX dumped out of Stern's show at 9:30am, some 90 minutes early. Much of the "missing" program was devoted to a discussion about the condition

Greater Media Exec. VP Tom Milewski confirmed that monitoring and editing take place, but refused further comment. Asked whether the practice was adopted with the FCC

in mind, Milewski said, "I don't want to get into that.' However, in a recent Los An-

geles Times story that he de-scribed as "substantially correct," Milewski was quoted as saying the editing is designed to "avoid further complaints to the FCC during the pendency of the litigation." An FCC staffer told R&R that Greater Media executives used a recent meeting with one commissioner to tout the monitor-and-edit system as a factor that should be weighed in the company's favor as the agency mulls the company's appeal.



KDBK & KDBQ kicked off its Hot AC "Star FM" presentation at 3pm Saturday (3/13) with 989 songs in a row. PD Chris Miller exited the stations, which are now seeking a PD, an on-air staff, and new calls.

Viacom's Los Angeles station, KYSR, also uses the Star handle, but as VP/GM Bruce Raven-Stark told R&R, "The name's the same, but there are different market tastes, attitudes, and nuances.


A flurry of format flips shook up Philadelphia, with two stations making major changes within 65 hours of each other.

In 1991, 801 million pieces of product were shipped with a value of \$7.8 billion.

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Clinton Urges Banks To Ease Credit Crunch

In an effort to spur investment and job creation, President Bill Clinton has announced changes in banking regulations designed to ease the credit crunch affecting broadcasting and many other industries.

Clinton, addressing a group of small business owners and bankers at the White House, said he wanted bankers to know that "if you make sensible loans, the government should not come down on you."

Don't look for any quick move by banks to dole out money. It will take about three months to put the administration's regulatory changes into effect. In many ways, the Clinton move expands on former President George Bush's call more than a year ago for regulators to ease up on banks to encourage lending. That first round of jawboning had little noticeable impact on lending availability.

Paul Kagan Associates analyst Bishop Cheen was optimistic that Clinton's regulatory changes would help improve the lending climate. But he warned that it will be a while before all but the largest, most credit-worthy broadcast groups are able to benefit. Cheen said middle market players won't see the lending climate improve "until the banking community sees a couple of years of growth and a couple of years of duopoly – and likes what it sees."

Small Business Tax Credits

Many broadcasters may be able to take advantage of the investment tax credit proposed as part of President Clinton's overall economic plan. A 7% tax credit would apply to property placed into service between December 3, 1992 and December 31, 1994.

The tax credit, designed to encourage investment, would reduce the effective purchase price of a radio station. In theory, it could help get lenders to sign off on a marginal deal.

Small businesses (defined as those grossing less than \$5 million a year) would be eligible for a permanent Small Business Investment Tax Credit. A temporary incremental tax credit would be available to larger companies in 1993 and 1994, but only for increased investment in qualified property (above a base calculated from 1989 through 1991 or from 1987 through 1991).

Broadcasters acquiring stations in 1993 and 1994 who didn't acquire new properties from 1989 through 1991 stand to benefit regardless of size. Since acquisition activity for the '89-'91 period was extremely light, the base calculation shouldn't be much of a restriction for station buyers.

A recovery period of more than seven years is required to qualify for the full 7% investment credit. Therefore, only a partial tax credit will be available on most broadcast assets other than towers and certain transmitting equipment.

For small businesses, the Clinton Administration wants to keep the investment tax credit even after 1994. But it would drop to 5% in 1995. Of course, all of these details are subject to change as the proposal makes its way through Congress.

RAB TO HOLD CONFERENCE More Radio Sessions Scheduled For NAB '93

While the NAB Convention is traditionally dominated by television and its issues, this year's edition will feature a significant number of radio-related sessions and events — many of them produced by the RAB.

For the first time ever, RAB will hold a conference at the NAB confab (April 19-22 in Las Vegas). In addition to general sessions focusing on the sales environment and outlook, RAB will stage a series of workshops on a variety of topics, including duopolies and LMAs, database marketing, and strategic planning.

NAB's radio offerings include

sessions on maximizing station revenue, cashing in on the Radio Broadcast Data System (RBDS), and another look at duopolies and LMAs.

Radio issues will also be discussed at several sessions with FCC and congressional officials. Among those slated to appear are FCC Commissioners James Quello, Ervin Duggan, and Andrew Barrett, Mass Media Chief Roy Stewart, and several agency staffers. NAB also expects to draw 15-20 key members of Congress. President Clinton has been invited, but has not yet responded, said NAB officials said.

The association expects to book a record 500,000 square feet of exhibition space. To help radio operators maximize their browsing time, radio-related exhibitors will once again be gathered in one designated area.

USA Digital Waiting For NRSC Details, Advancing Own Tests

W SA Digital Radio isn't committing itself to National Radio Standards Committee (NRSC) testing of its DAB system until it receives details of the NRSC deal struck by NAB and EIA (R&R 3/12). Regardless, USA Digital plans a mobile DAB demonstration at next month's NAB convention in Las Vegas.

Gannett Company VP/Finance Dan Ehrman told R&R that USA Digital's partners (Gannett, CBS, and Group W) wanted to know exactly what NAB and EIA are proposing for the NRSC tests of in-band, on-channel DAB systems before agreeing to submit their system. Ehrman noted that USA Digital had missed a deadline on EIA's testing timetable because of the dispute with NAB. Although the two have now come to terms, Ehrman said USA Digital had not received any word on whether the "window' would reopen for system submis-

NAB's DAB Task Force Chairman Alan Box told R&R that designers would soon be given another opportunity to enter the testing competition. "It'll be a quick window, and then we'll get going."

Only one in-band, on-channel system was entered in the EIA testing program, which will now move to the NRSC — Amati Communications. Besides USA Digital, Kintel Technologies is the only company known to be working on an inband, on-channel system. Kintel, which claims its technology has applications far beyond the broadcasting field, has shown little or no interest in particlpating in any DAB tests.

Field Shrinks

Regardless of whether USA Digital enters the NRSC testing, its designers are planning a mobile demonstration at next month's NAB convention. The bus may offer both AM and FM DAB — each transmitted on the same channel with an analog signal.

CBS Radio VP/EngineerIng Tony Maslello said the AM DAB system, previously transmitted alone, is now being broadcast in tandem with an analog signal at USA Digital's Cincinnati test site. USA Digital plans to use an existing Las Vegas station for its FM demonstration, but the AM broadcasts will be in the expanded band.

There are now only five applicants for nationwide satellite DAB licenses — still five too many as far as NAB and most broadcasters are concerned. Loral Aerospace has withdrawn its satellite DAB application after signing a contract to build the satellite proposed by Satellite CD Radio. Comments on the remaining applications are due at the FCC by April 9.

Scripps Howard Radio Group On The Block

onaldson, Lufkin & Jenrette has been hired to shop Scripps Howard Broadcasting's radio properties: WMC-AM & FM/Memphis, WVRT/Baltimore, and KUPL-AM & FM/Portland.

"Radio has been a very small component of our broadcast business," said President Lawrence Leser, who also heads Scripps Howard's 86% owner, E.W. Scripps Company.

Scripps Howard may not have to look very far for a buyer. The VP/GMs of the radio stations — Ed Hardy, Don Meyers, and Jim Fox — plan to make a bld. They've retained Pacific Crest Securities to find money for the deal.

In other dispatches from the business front:

• Paxson Enterprises has closed on its purchase of Florida Radio I Network from Broadcast Equities Inc. The deal was brokered by Communications Equity Associates. No terms were disclosed.

• Jacor Communications has completed a refinancing that reduced its senior debt from \$69 million to \$45 million. It also has a \$20 million credit line for future acquisitions. Banque Parlbas, First National Bank of Boston, and Continental Bank provided the financing.

• Clear Channel Communications is now selling advertising for three FMs and one AM in Austin. After closing on KHFI (Clear Channel already owned KPEZ), the company signed a joint sales agreement with KMOW & KEYI. Even with four signals to sell, Clear Channel's sales team won't have a lock on this market. Combined revenues will still fall far short of market leader KASE.

 Former WBES/Charleston, WV owner (and current creditor) Don Mills has filed against a proposed bankruptcy sale to crosstown rival WVSR-AM & FM, citing cume totals (rather than AQH shares) to claim the proposed duopoly violates the FCC's 25% cap. What the petition doesn't mention, though, is that the cume for all Charleston stations runs to 175 "percent."

FCC Levies Large Fines In Small Markets

he **FCC** has slapped two small market operators with huge fines for violations of its ownership and operating rules.

Weston Properties XVIII L.P., which owns WKBR/Manchester, NH, netted an \$8000 penalty for doing an LMA that the FCC believes constituted an unauthorized transfer of control.

According to the agency, Weston abdicated all responsibility for the station when it entered into a management agreement with Brlan Dodge, who totally controlled station operations, kept all the revenue, and paid Weston a \$1275 per month "lease fee."

Meanwhile, WGZM (formerly WGGA)/Cleveland, GA is facing a \$17,500 fine for violation of the FCC's main studio rule. Seems there were no employees and no public file at the transmitter site facility that the station claimed as its "main" studio.

On a positive note, the FCC has rescinded a \$10,000 main studio fine against KALF/Red Bluff, CA after ruling that the station could figure its principal community contour using Tech Note 101 - a calculation method applied where station towers are situated on mountaintops.

Also of interest:

• Former FCC Chairman AI Sikes has Joined Hearst Corp. as chief of its New Media & Technology Group. The group will try to figure out ways to adopt existing editorial and programming products for use with emerging telecommunications technologies.

• The FCC is seeking comments on new RF radiation limits, which could pose a problem for some radio stations. One proposal would incorporate two tiers of exposure levels — with current limits applying to employees and contract engineers, but with restrictions five times stricter for areas open to the general public. That could spell trouble for stations that have had suburban neighborhoods spring up around high-power transmitters.

• The Commission last week affirmed that the "retransmission consent" provision of the new cable television law does indeed apply to radio.


That ruling means radio stations can attempt to negotiate compensation (cash or other consideration) from cable operators that carry their programming. However, because the "must-carry" section of the law does not apply to radio, cable systems are free to drop radio stations that demand too much.

Parker founded the Greater Hartford Emergency Food Bank and was also a past Chairman of the Martin Luther King Youth Fund He is survived by two children.


KSRR Says 'Adios AC, Spanish, Si'

Continued from Page 1 shelter," Sterling said. "There were instances where elderly people needing medicine were isolated, and listeners delivered it to them. In another case, a premature baby needed to be taken back to the hospital, so a listener with a four-wheel drive volunteered."

The Birmingham, AL area was also socked in by the storm. CHR WAPI-FM passed messages to stranded residents and coordinated help where it was needed. "We dropped the music and went to almost nonstop talk from midday Friday through Monday morning, noted VP/Programming Mark St. John. "I've been through earthquakes and tornados, so we were well-prepared. Radio needs to rise to the occasion when something like this hits the community " St John moved his entire staff into a nearby hotel before the blizzard began.

Listeners Volunteered

Across town, WZZK PD Jim Tice said many listeners volunteered to help move sister Oldies station WODL into WZZK's building during the storm. "We were planning to move the

"We were planning to move the station to our facilities anyway, and when the generator at the downtown site went out, listeners helped us move equipment and records on Saturday night."

Tice said fans of the station with four-wheel drives also helped by delivering some stranded staffers to the station, while another retrieved WZZK's chief engineer when he was marooned at the station's tower site for 13 hours Saturday.

News/Talk WERC (which was also heard on sister WMJJ during the weekend) stayed in snow mode until Tuesday morning. The stations also served as an on-air trading post, where people in need of such necessities as firewood, cooking kerosene, or food could call seeking help. According to WERC ND Tom Roberts, many of those pleas were answered before the caller was off the air.

"It was radio as it should be," said Roberts. "Radio stations were

the lifeline for people who were snowed in or without power."

But Roberts missed his station's shining moment: He was snowbound in Tennessee, where he had called the play-by-play for an Alabama basketball game.

Staff Dedication

WVEE/Atlanta VP/GM Rick Mack reserved high praise for the dedication of his staff. "We had a couple of people who got stuck halfway between home and the station and *walked* the rest of the way. The staff really responded and did a great job."

CHR WBSS/Atlantic City suffered when its ceilings caved in on Saturday morning. Virtually everything was damaged except its production studio. The station was forced off the air until it activated auxiliary studios at its transmitter site in nearby Vineland, NJ.

WVSR/Charleston, WV staffers drove the station's four-wheel drive

WMAL/Washington's wall-towall "Operation Storm Watch" aired through much of the weekend. OM Jim Gallant's favorite memory was the station's interview with a couple who decided to go ahead with their wedding despite the blizzard's disruption of their special day.

"It wasn't the most important item we covered, but it was so touching," said Gallant. "It was a nice respite from the other things we were doing."

Talk Hosts As Anchors

Just up I-95, WBAL/Baltimore had 31 people working on its storm coverage, which ran nonstop from 5am Saturday until 9am Monday. The station brought in two weekday talk hosts to serve as anchors. Producers, engineers, and salespeople were mobilized to field cancellation and closing calls. Station Manager Jeff Beauchamp remarked, "If you have a great staff, this is when they can shine and have fun doing it."

WEAZ/Philadelphia PD Mark Hamlin said he lives only 15 miles from the station, but couldn't get there. "I was shoveling snow that was [up to] between my knee and thigh ... I started on Saturday and didn't quit until Monday morning."

Hamlin said his midday man, Don Dawson, was on the air for 20 hours Saturday before his girlfriend managed to round up a parttimer in her four-wheel drive.

Spotload Falls

All-News WINS/New York went wall-to-wall with snow coverage from Saturday until Sunday morning, when it began including brief "in other news" capsules in its cycle. During the coverage, WINS dropped its spotload from 17.5 to 10 minutes.

Executive Editor Steve Swenson said the station used 13 reporters



Selling Your Ideas To Top Management

ou have an idea that will make a positive difference to your company. How do you get those in charge to listen? The NYC-based American Management Association suggests you submit a proposal to upper management using the following guidelines

State only the most vital details. Avoid the temptation to impress managers with your knowledge by digressing into scientific data or other impertinent information.

Write in clear, short sentences (20 words or less). Try to use only one- and two-syllable words.

Speak your reader's language. Don't alienate your reader by using technical jargon or other insider lingo.

Help readers recognize important elements in your text by underlining key phrases, adding bullet points, or using boldfaced or italic type.

Illustrate support material (i.e., examples, case studies, and comparisons) with charts and graphs.

Survey: Women Work Harder

hile most employed adults (39%) say there is no difference between men and women workers, a recent Gallup poll found that almost as many people (38%) felt women work harder. Only 19% said men work harder.

The majority (57%) of working women - and 21% of working men say women work harder. In contrast, 47% of working men - as opposed to 29% of working women believe there is no difference in work by gender,

By the way, 26% of working men, but only 11% of working women, feel men work harder than women.

Write Your Stress Away!

f talking or exercise doesn't help you see clearly through your problems, try jotting them down. Executive Female Editor Melissa Wahl suggests you devote 20 minutes per day - for three or four days - to writing down your deepest feelings about the things that trouble you most.

For a second stress management tip, Wahl recommends you make up a list of your most stressful problems, and divide it into two sections: things you can change and things you can't. Then devise ways of avoiding the ones beyond your control.

t's not easy to motivate people, even while correcting them. but it can be done. As an example, Bloomfield Hills, MI-based management consultant George J. Lumsden suggests that when someone proposes a bad idea and begins to discuss it at length you praise the worker's enthusiasm and offer to discuss the matter in private later.

Keep in mind that people's egos are intertwined with their ideas. Instead of publicly attacking an idea - and, by extension, an ego offer your criticism in private, but reserve your compliments for public situations

La Jolla, CA-based psychologist and management consultant Natasha Josefowitz recommends you leave the ultimate solution in the hands of the feuding subordinates. First, bring the two combatants into a neutral office and ask to hear each one's side of the story

Next, ask them to suggest some solutions to the problems. If they don't come up with anything, tell them they'll be left alone together until they reach an answer or a compromise.

However, if it's obvious the two of them cannot reach a truce and leaving them together may make the situation worse - either bring in an outside mediator or decide which employee should be transferred.



More Americans Living By Themselves

L iving alone has become more common within the last decade. A 1990 U.S. Census Bureau report found that an estimated 22 million people lived alone in 1989, double the number in 1970, and up four million since 1980.

While the great majority (78%) of those who live alone reside in metropolitan areas, a slimmer majority (53%) are renters rather than homeowners.

Most people who live alone are women. They outnumber their male counterparts by a three-totwo margin. More than half (51%) of these women are also widows, whereas 48% of men living alone have never walked down the aisle.

Owners Vs. Renters

However, 77% of these widows and widowers are homeowners, compared with the less than 33% of people living alone who never married.

Consequently, women who live alone are far more likely to be homeowners than men. They also tend to be older (median age: 69 for women vs. 52 for men).

This holds true among solo women renters (median age: 56 for women, 39 for men) as well. Solo renters also pay a lower median monthly housing cost: \$366 vs. \$424 for all renters.

The majority (77% of women and 55% of men) of those who live

housing cost is \$180 - \$25 less than the median cost for all other nonmortgaged owners. One of the reasons people who live alone tend to owe less money

on their homes lies in property values. The median value of the homes of women and men with no mortgage is \$59,000 - 21% less than the median value (\$75,400) of all owner-occupied homes in America.



Imost half (45%) of single people who live alone earn between \$20,000 and \$29,999 — and their median Income is \$23,843 — according to a recent survey by Columbus, OHbased Apartment Resources.

Another 28% of single people living alone earn between \$10,000 and \$19,999, with another 18% boasting incomes of \$30,000 to \$39,999. While 4% earn less than \$10,000, only 3% bring in \$40,000 to \$49,999, and just .8% take in more than \$50,000.

Income Differences

While the household income of homeowners who live alone is significantly lower (\$14,600) than the median income for all owners (\$33,600) – mainly because many are senior citizens on fixed incomes – those paying a mortgage have a lower median housing cost (\$580 vs. \$692 for all other homeowners).

Nonmortgaged homeowners pay 23% of their current income on housing costs, compared with the 18% spent by all homeowners.

However, solo renters' median income is \$14,250, considerably less than the median income of all renters (\$19,410). The survey notes that this discrepancy is due to the inclusion of younger and multiple wage earners. (See the above story on solo salaries.)

Minority Consumer Electronics Ownership

The Miami-based Market Segment Research firm recently surveyed 1000 African-Americans and 2000 Hispanics to determine which electronic goods these respective ethnic groups were most likely to own.

Contrasting Female Purchasing Habits

In fact, 35% of twentysomething women get "a lot" of pleasure buying prerecorded cassettes and CDs, compared with 14% of boomeraged women.

Twentysomething women also prefer to purchase jewelry and watches (37% vs. 27%), leather goods (23% vs. 13%), and cars (22% vs. 17%).

What's more, nearly 75% of twentysomething women claim to enjoy the overall shopping experience, compared with the almost 66% of boomer-aged women who say they like to shop.

Spontaneous Spenders

The younger set tends to be an impulsive group of consumers: 44% plan their purchases (and

stick to their plans). More than half (55%) of thirtysomethings do the same.

Those in their 20s also are more likely to window-shop – 42% "especially like browsing" and about 25% "often" browse. Only 33% and 17% of thirtysomething women make those respective claims.

Incidentally, 46% of twentysomething women are married, compared to 71% of thirtysomething women. Meanwhile, 9% and 18% of the respective generations are separated or divorced.

Interestingly, 44% of the younger set and a mere 8% of their older counterparts have never married. More than half (51%) of twentysomethings and 86% of boomers have children.

Twentysomething women also are more ethnically and racially diverse: 78% are white (vs. 83% of boomers), 14% are black (vs. 10%), and 6% belong to another ethnic group or race (vs. 5%).

Continued from Page 12 on the street and stayed doublestaffed with editors and writers throughout the coverage. "People were working their sixth and seventh days and putting in 12- or 13-hour shifts," said Swenson.

Hot 97/NY PD Joel Salkowitz said most station employees made it into work without problem. "We really rode the storm out with the exception of getting one of our mixers to the studio after his show in Hoboken, NJ was canceled because of the storm. We sent a fourwheeler after him."

Salkowitz said his station relied on Metro Traffic for a lot of information, but noted, "Since we're not a News station, a lot of our information dealt with the cancellations of lifestyle events pertaining to our listeners."

Z100/NY VP/Programming Steve Kingston said his station took advantage of the bad weather to interact with listeners on the air while giving out weather, traffic, cancellations, and airport information.

WBZ/Boston made maximum use of its close ties to WBZ-TV during its storm coverage. In addition to reports from five radio reporters on the street, it received updates from eight TV newshounds who were also prowling the city. The station also kept listeners posted on conditions across New England via its network of stringers.

Storm Sponsors

Unlike co-owned WINS, WBZ didn't reduce its spotload. In fact, says ND Brian Whittemore, the station made money off prearranged winter storm coverage sponsorships

Buffalo, no stranger to blizzards, weathered the storm well. But when roads became impassable. Jim Meltzer, VP/GM at WGR, WGRF, and WUFX, took out rooms at a Holiday Inn for his staffers and maintained his sense of humor: "The only downside was that I didn't have enough time to work out a trade - we paid cash."

ings of nearly \$110 million. That would have made it the nation's sixth largest radio group in terms of billing, just behind Cox Enterprises and well ahead of Viacom's radio group. (Duncan's top four were CBS, Group W, Cap Cities/ ABC, and Infinity.)

Shamrock and Malrite, in a joint statement, put the value of the transaction "in excess of \$300 million," but Paul Kagan Associates analyst Bishop Cheen estimated the total value at \$325 million – \$195 million for the Malrite stations and \$130 million for Shamrock's group.

Cheen called the deal a "plus" for both groups. "It gives Shamrock the expansionary markets it has long talked about without having to reach into its pockets for cash," he said. For Malrite, Cheen called it "an opportunity for a company with a lot of leverage to merge with a company with very little leverage."

The newly created company will be owned by Shamrock's current owner, the Roy Disney family (which will own a controlling interest in the new company); Trefoil Capital Investors, a fund organized by Shamrock executives; and Malrite owner Milt Maltz. Shamrock Broadcasting Chairman Bill Clark and President Marty Loughman

Executives of Infinity did not return R&R's calls.

Another Stern affiliate, KFBI (formerly KUDA)/Las Vegas, admits to having nixed a few brief portions of the show. "There have been a few occasions when we've edited some things [that were] in violation of community standards or FCC rules," said KFBI VP/GM Scott Seidenstricker.

WLUP-AM & FM/Chicago VP/ GM Larry Wert said that while his AM station, which is fighting two FCC indecency fines, has never edited Stern's show, he wouldn't hesitate to ditch a particularly raunchy bit. "If you [hear a potentially indecent remark], it might be better to fight it out with Stern and his agent instead of [FCC acting Chairman James] Quello." will remain in their positions to run the merged group.

"This combination will create an excellent platform which can be used to take advantage of the opportunities in the radio business created by the liberalized owner-ship rules," said Shamrock Holdings President/CEO Stanley Gold. The company still has plenty of room for growth, since the only duopoly created by the merger is in San Francisco.

"With the new FCC rules in place, the strongest strategy is to own equity in a larger radio universe distributed over a wide range of major markets," said Maltz.

Maltz is reported to be nego tiating with bondholders over Malrite's 15.5% bonds with a face value at maturity (in 1994) of \$167 million. The bonds, which are held by small number of institutional holders, will not be assumed by Shamrock.

Maltz and Malrite President John Chaffee won't be joining Shamrock's management ranks. although Maltz will be a consultant and director. But don't look for Shamrock to make any quick changes in Malrite's station management. "We certainly didn't buy this group to make a lot of changes," said Clark.

Even with the \$300 million deal pending, Clark isn't ruling out other Shamrock station purchases. "That'll depend on the deal, but I don't think we'd be looking for turnarounds. We've got a lot of work to do to assimilate these two groups."

Clark said negotiations with Malrite began about six months ago.

Meanwhile, at 5am Monday (3/15), KABL brightened its presentation and became "B98." GM Mike Grinsell told R&R, "We target active 25-44 females, plaving soft hits of the '80s and '90s by Michael Bolton, Gloria Estefan, Jon Secada, Bonnie Raitt, Don Henley, and Michael Jackson. We were Soft AC; now we're a soft but very contemporary AC with a hip presentation. It's upbeat and positive and the reaction's been fabulous."

Philly Flips

Station VP/GM Dave Noll added, "This has to be one of radio's

most dramatic growth formats." Kimble, who will also handle middays, described the format as "a refreshing blend of Contemporary Jazz, New Age, and today's most exciting vocalists."

The station is owned by a Malrite limited partnership and is not part of the Shamrock-Malrite merger announced last week (see Page 1).

Following WEGX's format change, crosstown AC WKSZ/Philadelphia owner Daniel Lerner and his staff quickly filled the void, flipping the station to adult CHR and using the slogan, "Z100 - no rap, no hard stuff, no sleepy elevator music" at 6am Monday morning (3/15).

WKSZ VP/GM Lloyd B. Roach told R&R, "There were five - soon to be six - AC stations in the market, and we were at the bottom. When Malrite abandoned CHR, it didn't take long to figure out there was a major opening in the market. We'll capture a lot of disenfranchised WEGX and AC listeners."

According to PD Eric Johnson, the station will continue jockless for approximately two weeks while the station prepares a large-scale outdoor and electronic media blitz. "We pulled all of this together [very quickly]. This is a great opportunity since we're positioned between what WEGX was perceived to be but younger than [cross-town AC WYXR] Star 104.5."

Still, last month's strong performance must be viewed with caution. February 1992 national revenues had fallen 18% from the previous year; therefore 1993 revenues still lag behind 1991 levels.

On the other hand, February 1993's 12% growth in local revenues comes on top of a 6% February '92 increase. For the year to date, radio revenues for Miller Kaplan's market composite are up as follows: 9% for local, 6% for national, and 8% overall.





UNDERSTANDING, REACHING AN UNTAPPED AUDIENCE

Programming For The Generation X Crowd

Douglas Copeland defined the group of people born after 1964 as Generation X. And while we've spent the last two decades chasing baby boomers into their midlife crises, this group has quietly engineered a revolution right under our noses.

Although the name may be coincidental, there was once a band called Generation X. If you're not familiar with Billy Idol's old band, you're not alone. Most radio stations ignored punk, then new wave, then post-punk, then alternative. And of course we ignored heavy metal, because research said baby boomers hated that stuff. It was music that only urban white kids and college students cared about, and they didn't listen to radio anyway.

Now, as we begin questioning our ability to attract 40-year-olds with today's music, the focus may be shifting to the 46 million Americans between the ages of 18 and 30. It's time to wake up - in only four years, there will be no baby boomers in the 18-34 demographic. This hasn't been true since 1964.

Think about it . . . this is the new youth culture. When we started researching rock listeners in the late '70s, the 18-34 demographic consisted entirely of baby boomers. But since 1981, Generation X has been creeping into the 18-34 cell, distorting our research and sending us anomalous data and mixed signals.

We assumed there was a small, extreme contingent of listeners interested in hard rock or alternative music.

Until 1988, when we could isolate Generation X in a useful demo cell (18-24), we had no idea what was going on. But then, nobody had any interest in 18-24s. CHR was selling 25-44 female numbers and we all worked under the assumption that there weren't any real 18-34 advertising dollars available, so we ignored the emerging trend. 66

It's time to wake up — in only four years, there will be no baby boomers in the 18-34 demographic.

Changing Culture

As programmers, we assumed Generation X kids would follow in their older brothers' and sisters' footsteps, and we were right. In its introductory phase, Classic Rock did well 18-34 because the music was fairly new to them. But will this generation follow in its parents' footsteps? Absolutely not! After all, Mick Jagger, once the rebellious voice of youth, is now older than President Clinton.

A fundamental shift is occurring. To profit from it, you must be informed. New Puritanism, recycled culture, and nostalgia are everywhere. And Generation X is responding. They reject their parents' conspicuous consumption, watch less network TV, read fewer magazines, and hardly touch newspapers. Generation X is more fragmented and cynical than the baby boomers. But most important, they're bored by the rehashing of the older generation's culture, angered by the lack of career-oriented jobs, and cynical about the baby boomers' ability to change the world.

True, Generation X has only half as many members as the baby boom generation, but the Roper Organization estimates their spending power at over \$125 billion , and they're being grossly underserved. Almost every station in the country is programming for and selling 30+ demos. Management is working under the assumption that buyers are only interested in 25-54-year-olds. To win in that demographic you must dominate the fattest cell: 34-45-year-olds. In most markets, inefficient levels of marketing dollars are spent to win

marketing dollars are spent to win that demographic while an underserved market goes virtually untapped. In all but the largest markets, the 18-34 cell goes unclaimed and unexploited. What would you rather do – devote precious re-

sources to developing an unexploited market or try to overcome entrenched competitors in a mature one?

There's huge potential in serving Generation X. By 2010, Generation X will be the primary target for virtually every consumer product. The baby boomers will be looking for retirement homes, toys for their grandchildren, and the safest accounts for their savings. The war over boomers' brand loyalties is in its final stages. The real war is being fought in the 18-34 demo. The young adult years are when brand loyalties are determined. Mainstream marketers know this and will soon be rushing for exposure. Radio must reinforce to buyers the value of communicating in an uncluttered, well-targeted media environment

New Ground Rules

In today's fragmented radio arena, Generation X is a great place to look for fresh cume. But to appeal to this group, you've got to follow a few basic, yet important rules:

• Forget the hype – they don't believe it. You can't be bigger, badder, or more improved; you must be different. Your benefits must be evident and your marketing messages credible. Instead of billing yourself as "The Home Of Rock and Roll," try saying "We make the work day go faster" or "We'll have your favorite new music first." Avoid words like most, best, and longest.

• Be real. Honesty is key; explain your attributes and share your weaknesses. Generation X knows nobody's perfect. Self-revelation reinforces credibility. Make fun of your spot breaks, sweepers, research, management, and staff. Throw out the big voices and communicate in a personal way. Con-

fess your inability to spend tons of money on slick television commercials.

• Avoid short-term ratings-driven programming gimmicks. Integrate longstanding promotional benchmarks to reinforce top-ofmind awareness. When your listeners offer feedback, listen to them. Use their comments to reposition your competition. Learn their language and use it, but be careful that you don't become bogged down by a bunch of useless slang.

• Be efficient. Generation X was raised on sound bites and MTV. We tell air talent they're in a race to press buttons in the studio before the audience presses buttons in their cars. Get to the next element quickly, communicate ideas concisely, and use theater of the mind to express ideas efficiently.

• Have a point of view. Generation X is suspicious of the media because it represents the establishment. They don't want to hear talking heads reading liner cards. They want to hear people — individuals who share their alienation and opinions. And while Generation X may be cynical and angry, it shares the same hope for the future of generations past. Successful air talent will bond with this audience by balancing anger and cynicism with hope and a positive outlook.

 Avoid overt commercialism. Generation X feels manipulated. They see baby boomers as having been sucked into the establishment they once rebelled against. They don't want to be guilty of that kind of hypocrisy. Don't support that with a lot of rehashed sales promotions. Focus on their primary needs: jobs, places to live, and things to do. Use database marketing and interactive phone technologies to learn about your audience as individuals. Contact them about promotions they'd be in-terested in. Talk with them about their interests, attitudes, and opinions. Open them up to new experiences and ideas that will truly benefit and interest them.

• Create niches. Generation X is more culturally diverse than any previous generation, and WASP aesthetics will not dominate its culture. Pick your target market, then integrate cross-cultural aesthetics. The best example would be MTV. Compare its creative, visuals, copy, and graphics to those of VH-1. Go to a grunge concert and look at how the audience has integrated hip-hop fashions like oversized jeans into their dress. Even Axl Rose wears a Public Enemy baseball cap in a Guns 'N Roses video.

• Be pure – don't water down your content. Instead of playing edited versions of controversial songs, daypart them. If you're going to play rap, play Ice Cube. If you're going to play hard rock, play Megadeth. Don't put yourself in a position where you could be repositioned as a sellout. Generation X smells fear a mile away.

Forget the hype they don't believe it. You can't be bigger, badder, or more improved; you must be different.


• Beware of nostalgia. People like to revisit their youth, but baby boomers' reminiscences dominate our culture to the extent that Generation X feels alienated. If you want to use "Brady Bunch" or "Partridge Family" bits, go ahead. The "Johnny Quest" theme works great as a traffic bed. Just make sure you approach nostalgia with a sense of humor and forget

the '60s. These are the keys to success with Generation X. It has plenty of disposable income, but is incredibly media-savvy. They'll see right through a poorly executed format, promotion, or marketing campaign and resent you for selling them short. Research them thoroughly before communicating with them and you'll be rewarded with their loyalty and trust into the next century.


Procedures

he First Quarter Chart Share graph at top right is the sum of the chart shares in the five song-oriented formats: AC, AOR Tracks, CHR, Country, and Urban Contemporary. Chart shares are simply the percentage of all the charting songs in a format held by each label.

You'll see under each format heading a Top 10 box. That measures total performance for each label. In the five song-oriented formats, each charting record's peak performance is assigned a point value, and each label's points are added up. The total points for those five for-mats determine the overall standings, which are listed at top left.

In the album tormats -- New Rock, NAC, and Contemporary Jazz — points are assigned to each album for its entire *chart career* during the quarter, and each labet's points are added up. Chart share leaders and total performance leaders may differ - one category measures the number of chart records, the other how well they performed once they charted.

Ronstadt Rejoins Neville On His 'Grand Tour' LP

aron Neville again teams with Linda Ronstadt, this time to perform Leonard Cohen's "Song Of Bernadette" on "The Grand Tour," Neville's second solo outing on A&M. Steve Lindsey (Alexander O'Neal, Diane Schuur) produced the 15-song set. Singing siblings Cyril, Charles, and Art Neville also guest on a new tune, "My Brother, My Brother."

The first single will be Diane Warren's "Don't Take Away My Heaven," which goes to radio the first week of April. While Neville himself penned "The Roadie Song," notable covers include the title track (previously a George Jones hit), Chuck Berry's "You Never Can Tell," Bob Dylan's "Don't Fall Apart On Me Tonight," the Stylistics' "Betcha By Golly, Wow," Marvin Gaye's composition for the Originals ("The Bells"), and such standards as "These Foolish Things" and "Ain't No Way." The album arrives April 20.

Porno For Pyros Bow

After disbanding Jane's Addiction, frontman Perry Farrell formed Porno For Pyros last year. Their self-titled WB debut, which he co-produced with Matt Hyde, is slated to hit the streets April 27. Former Jane's drummer Stephen Perkins is also in the band, as are guitarist Peter DiStefano and ex-Thelonious Monster bassist Martyn Le Noble. The songs "Cursed Male" and "Cursed Female" go to radio next week, both separately and segued into one nine-minute track. Among the other nine tunes are "Bad Shit," "Packin' .25," "Black Girlfriend," "Blood Rag," "Orgasm," and the title track. "Pets," the follow-up track and first retail single, is scheduled to ship April 20.

Levert's Fifth

Primus Pour 'Pork Soda'

Primus's second Interscope/Atlantic Group set is called "Pork Soda." The band produced the 15song set, which they recorded at singer/bassist Les Claypool's home studio in San Francisco. "My Name Is Mud" goes to radio March 26 and will appear on a Pro-CD as well as on a 10-inch brown vinyl disc. (The latter also offers the title cut and "Hamburger Train," an 8:21 instrumental.) The set hits stores April 20. The 10inch vinyl and vinyl LPs will be handled by the band's own Prawn Song label through Restless Records

Fluid's Major Debut

"Purplemetalflakemusic" marks the major label debut of Denver-based indie faves the Fluid. Mike Bosley and the band produced the 12-track set, which sports such titles as "Pill," "Wasn't My Idea," and "7/14." Larry Hirsch (Los Lobos) produced the quartet's Scotti Bros. debut ("Watching You"), with Rick Parashar (Pearl Jam) mixing and adding produc-tion work. The LP is due in stores March 23. "Last Crescendo" will go to radio April 1.

Figuring Out Your Optimum Music Rotation

With all of the other media distractions competing for your listeners' attention, some stations have begun to reevaluate their current rotations. This week, I talk with a number of PDs and MDs from stations with varied music leans and market situations about their rotational philosophies.

Mark Bolke

Mainstream CHR KDWB/Minneapolis PD Mark Bolke recently adjusted his station's rotations – and is pleased with the results. "Overall, KDWB rotates its music a bit slower than it used to. For example, powers used to rotate in the 2:20-2:30 range, but we've stretched that to 2:45-3:00 depending on the daypart. We've seen our TSL increase to 7:30 in the latest Arbitrend, which I consider great."

Before modifying rotations, Bolke suggests you carefully examine the situation. "We began to see burnout in some demos for some of our hottest records. Changing rotations is a doubleedged sword: You want to familiarize your music as quickly as possible, yet you don't want to burn those hits out. As a result, we've actually increased the number of records we're playing to compensate."

How does Bolke decide the frequency of his rotations? "It's gut feeling combined with research. While no two records react the same, after a while you get a general idea of how long it takes records to become familiar, become hits, and burn out."

Don Morgan

Don Morgan, PD at rock-leaning WAAL/Binghamton, says, "Our rotations have pretty much stayed

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the same over several years. I expected some changes when we flipped consultants, but Stratford Research felt the mix and rotation were right on target for the market. Powers turn over every 3:30 in mornings and afternoons, and 3:00 in other dayparts. Things will occasionally come up every 2:45 owing to all-request hours at noon, 7pm, and 3am. New records come up every five hours, and dayparted records have longer repeat spans." 66

WAAL is the market's only CHR, and Morgan notes that even with relatively slow rotations, he still gets complaints about repetition. "It's an inherent complaint about the format in general. Even if we had direct competition, I'd make few changes. They'd have to be tighter than us to make a dent, and they'd burn out in this market very fast."

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Dana Lundon

WTIC-FM/Hartford MD Dana Lundon's rhythmic music mix has undergone some recent adjustments. "Our morning clocks were modified so that 'A' records come up every 3:30, since the show is not as music-intensive. We've been rotating at 2:20 during the daytime and at 1:45 - or a bit less - at night. We recently added a nighttime 'spike' category to test records, so we're actually programming a few more currents than in the past. And we have the 'Love Down' hour Monday-Thursday at 11pm when we play R&B love songs with requests and dedications.

"We're between research companies and it's been a nice experience going back to guts, requests, and sales. The rest is just built on our programming beliefs of what we know to be right for the market and audience. I believe radio is an emotional experience for listeners, and if you want them to become emotional about your station, you need to program with emotion."

Duff Damos Mainstream WIFC/Wausau, WI

PD/afternooner Duff Damos notes,

"Rotations haven't gotten any hotter or slower at WIFC for years powers run every 3:15. It's a different world up here. With no inhouse research aside from requests, record sales, and two staffers who work parttime at local record stores, we have to be careful not to burn songs out. WIFC has a lot of at-work listening, so we really need to be sensitive to complaints about repetition.

"At night, we rotate the music at just under 3:00. We back off on the gold and recurrents, and pop in a few dayparted records – especially New Rock crossovers, which are showing great response from adult females. We try to keep in mind that even the hottest or most popular records can become sources of annoyance if the rotations get too tight in a market like this."

Steve Wyrostok

At KRBE/Houston, PD Steve Wyrostok says his slightly New Rock-leaning CHR has entered a phase where longer rotations are important to the station. "As our TSL grows, we slow the rotation to compensate and prevent burnout. We monitor that very carefully. Our rotations are 2:30 in mornings, 2:40 in afternoons, 3:30 in middays, and almost 4:00 at night – our nighttime TSL is very long.

"We chose these rotations by putting ourselves in our listeners"

Rotational Guidelines

While nobody has all the answers to defining proper music rotation, most CHR PDs take into account the following criteria:

- Gut instinct
- TSL information
- Competitive market conditions
- Available audience in dayparts
- Quality of current music

shoes and taking slices out of the day based on our TSL of 6:45. That equates to average listeners tuning in for about an hour a day and P1 [core] listeners – who give us the most ratings credit – listening even longer. Naturally, I'm most sensitive to the needs of the P1 audience, so the rotations are comfortable.

"We also try to be sensitive to research and a record's potential irritation level. For example, Whitney Houston's 'I Will Always Love You' had to come out of power rotation faster than PM Dawn's

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Comparing Power Rotations

I'd Die Without You,' which had a lower perceived rotation vs. actual rotation. The number of current titles varies depending on the amount of dayparting needed to fill out the rotations.

"The more similar the competition, the more likely you'll need a shorter list. But because we're the exclusive source for a lot of titles, we can run a longer list without the burnout. It's like the more time you spend with a friend, the more you'll need to talk about. The more time listeners spend with KRBE, we need more variety to keep them interested."

Ray Kalusa

In his three years at mainstream **KWNZ/Reno**, PD **Ray Kalusa** has maintained the status quo. "The station hasn't made many changes in its rotations since my arrival owing to the market's nature and KWNZ's history. When I arrived, we already had teens. Since then, we've been able to broaden that to where we have great 18-34 and 25-54 numbers while hanging onto that tremendous teen base.

"Our hottest music rotates at just over 3:00, and rotations lengthen for the other categories. This allows us the variety needed for the adults but is quick enough to keep the younger end satisfied and our cume in good shape. We don't even vary it much at night, since the 'Hot Nine At Nine' gets us an early repeat on the hottest currents.

"The number of titles being played depends on the current flow of music, but we're generally rotating 30-35 titles," explains Kalusa. "When there isn't enough of what I consider to be great music, I'll move a couple recurrents in to fill out my categories. While they may be a bit fried, at least they're familiar. But we try not to leave them in for too long."

Joe Dawson

Mainstream KLYV/Dubuque, IA PD Joe Dawson says, "One of CHR's inherent problems is that we play the same records over and over again. But it's core to the format's essence – people come to CHR to hear their favorites. Because of this, I've always believed in a tight rotation of the seven biggest records every 2:30. 'Bs' run every 3:45 and 'Cs' every 4:15. Our night category [songs dayparted between 6pm-2am] runs every 3:15

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so those songs can be heard about twice an evening.

"Playing to the available audience is the key to our success," maintains Dawson. "Many PDs have forgotten how to daypart properly and waste time playing the wrong records. Let's face it from late afternoon onward, it's mostly teens, so we play to them. PDs need to be aware of when factory shifts change, schools are in session, and people are in commute situations. Knowing these patterns allows me to play about 45 current titles: Seven powers, 17 records in nondayparted regular rotations, and the rest split between daytime-only and nighttimeonly records.

"If there are only seven big hits at any given time, then the job of a rotation system is to properly rotate the good-sounding stiffs. If I had direct CHR competition, I'd program a bit tighter to keep the

cume up and keep listeners coming back for more. In either case, this format's mission is to play the hottest current music ... over and over again."

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Leo Davis

Mainstream WCGQ/Columbus PD Leo Davis believes in a relaxed rotation system. "Our biggest records turn every 3:00-3:30 because the TSL here is so much longer than in major markets. We mostly get complaints of repeats in middays, but we think that programming the hits any slower wouldn't be to our advantage either. At night we augment the current rotation with the 'Top 10 At Nine,' which gets the hottest music an additional play. New records get heard approximately every five hours, or about three-four times a day. Any slower rotation just won't get them familiarized.

"We're probably playing a few less titles overall [about 35] because of what's presently available, not because of competition within the marketplace. I don't worry about facing direct competition – I always pretend we have a competitor in place so we'll never have to make last-minute reactions."



"We've used a fully digitized approach to producing the station on the air, along with produced liners and sweepers. But the station is a very music-intensive and highly focused Urban AC."

Jackson Action

Birch says his organization originally found Urban AC success with WKXI-FM/Jackson, MS, which is owned by Olympia Networks President Stephen Bunyard and operated by Opus under an LMA

"WKXI-FM is the forerunner of our Savannah station," Birch comments. "Its positioning statement is the same except for using the KIXIE 107.5 moniker. KIXIE evolved from WKXI (AM), which



we owned and operated prior to the LMA in spring 1991. When we were able to work out the LMA and broadcast over what was then WMJW-FM, we gained access to a 100,000-watt Class C1 FM station that gave us almost full market distribution in Jackson

"We refined the format to make it a bit more mass appeal. KIXIE's first rating was a 9.3; we've been in double digits 25-54 and beaten our primary competitor, WJMI, in every Arbitron survey since.

"In the current book, WKXI-AM & FM pulled more than a 13 share 25-54, ranking us No. 2 behind Country WMSI; WJMI's nearly eight share ranked fourth. KIXIE has won each of the last seven Arbitrons taken since its debut in Spring 1991. What's more, WKXI-AM & FM rank first 18-34, followed by WMSI and WJMI "

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Birch adds, "WKXI's programming staff is experienced, talented, and tenured in the Jackson market. The station sports a lively morning show co-hosted by PD Stan Branson and radio/TV personality Rob Jay.

"Opus also owns Oldies-formatted WTYX-FM/Jackson. WKXI & WTYX GM Kevin Webb and OM Ron Harrell play an important role in assisting Branson and his staff with WKXI's program-ming."

Ratings = **Financial Gold**?

Are Opus's ratings successes strengthening the company's fi-nancial position? "We were planning to operate at a deficit for a year in Savannah," says Birch. "But now we're starting to get reports that we're receiving the highest rates we've ever gotten at any of our Savannah stations that includes WAEV-FM, which is a general market, mass appeal outlet. Agencies are seeing a station with double-digit numbers in the 16 share area; they're finding out what it is - and they're buying. In Jackson, we're approaching a one-to-one ratio between audience share and revenue share. We think we have the capacity to drive that share higher.

New Stations Join The Format

A dozen stations have flipped to New Rock since last March. Three people responsible for recent sign-ons explain how they arrived at their decisions.

The music is clearly part of the attraction - witness the CHRs and AORs that have adopted a "New Rock lean" - WNNX (99X)/Atlanta, WENZ (The End)/Cleveland, and KQLZ (100.3)/Los Angeles spring to mind. But what other factors spur the switch?

KPNT/St. Louis

Back in December, River City Broadcasting hired consultant Ken Anthony to help select a new format for KFXB/St. Louis. At the time, the station was half of a double-FM Rock AC simulcast with co-owned WFXB.

"They wanted to flip KFXB to something demographically and psychographically compatible with WFXB," Anthony explains. "They were looking for an audience between 25-34 - primarily male. Bolton Research had researched the market in November and suggested New Rock, but they [River City] weren't convinced it would match up.

"We investigated switching to low-end AOR or a Classic Rock that really rocks. We even applied for the call letters KSRC. We could have used the call letters for either format: 'Solid Rock' flow-end] or 'The Superstars Of Rock' [Classic Rock1.

"But I was uncomfortable with both of those directions. From a programming standpoint, there

wasn't a hole in the market for both formats. Research showed that [crosstown AOR] KSHE was a little harder and more current than ideal for persons 18-34. I wasn't comfortable with a low-end AOR that would be harder and more current than KSHE. Plus, it's a hard sell."

Anthony admits the KSRC call letters were used as a smoke-screen. "It was only a consideration for a few days, but KSHE reacted. They started using the term 'Solid Rock.' But when we decided on a mass appeal New Rock format, we decided to call it 'the Point' and change the call letters to KPNT."

Extensive market research on record sales and concerts factored into Anthony's decision to flip to New Rock. "Six of the Top 10 selling albums last year in St.Louis were 'alternative-based' records. The fastest sellouts at the Riverport Amphitheater last summer were the Cure and the Lollapalooza shows. I realized there was an audience not being served here.

"There's a huge underground music scene that had been served through specialty shows that had great ratings. There was too much of a clear opening for us to bypass a format that could create a franchise immediately. There are 135,000 registered college students. Most are commuter students, so they're at addresses that could get Arbitron diaries. Even though the ratings might not be there initially, we'll become a profitable business for the company."

KEDJ/Phoenix

Resource Media's KONC/Phoenix made a radical flip from Classical to New Rock KEDJ (The Edge) a couple months ago. KEDJ GM Sandy Gamblin explains, "I decided we needed to flip our format because we weren't getting enough advertising support, and a



noncommercial Classical station [KDAQ] was planning to sign on in the market."

"We knew at some point we'd have to change, because we couldn't compete with a noncommercial station.

Gamblin conducted in-house research on the market's demographics. "We discovered an awful lot of 25-30-year-olds who weren't satisfied with radio in the marketplace - particularly those recently out of college. Many were listening to CDs or tapes.

We did internal research to get a better understanding of the music, sales, and revenue. We examined other stations that have flipped to New Rock. We talked to KDGE/Dallas, KEDG/Las Vegas, and some of the consultants. We had pretty much decided to flip Rock prior to our conversa-New tion with [consultant] Jacobs Media. When Jacobs made their presentation, we decided to hire them and go with the format."

Unlike most New Rockers, KEDJ didn't have the luxury of en-

tering the market without a direct competitor. Phoenix already had KUKQ on AM and suburban "Crosstown KUKQ did a KFMA. nice job of introducing the music to the market," explains Gamblin. "But now it's an AM vs. FM situation We felt the listener would choose FM over AM. The two stations are really quite different.

"We felt KFMA would change formats, and they did a couple weeks after we signed on. They only covered a small percentage of the market."

WCHZ/Augusta

"The demographics of this town match the demographics of the format." explains Frank Considas co-owner/PD of WCHZ (Channel Z)/Augusta, GA . "We got hold of the census and took a look at house hold income and education. We were looking for professionals. We discovered this is a highly educated area.

"The average family income is \$44,000, which is higher than the national standard. This is an upscale community with a military base, a medical college and a lot of whitecollar people. This format attracts real hip, cutting-edge high school kids, college students, and people in their 20s, 30s, and 40s.

"Basically, the decision came down to our gut feeling. We've spent a lot of time in the market, and we've talked to people about music. Everywhere we went, we asked people what station they listened to. Many people indicated radio was so boring that they only listened to tapes.

"People kept telling us they listen to the Cure, the Red Hot Chili Peppers, Sting, and R.E.M. There was obviously a hole for this format. People were dying for this music, and no station was playing it.

"CHR is churning out the same sound, and AOR is playing the

same artists over and over. Listeners have been asking for new music."

Copsidas firmly believes New Rock is the format of the future. "New Rock is the Adult Contemporary of the '90s. But who between the ages of 25-34 considers themselves an adult? The music has been around 15 years, and there's a large base of listeners who are familiar with it. If you've been in college within the last 15 years, you're familiar with some of this music.'



Turning A Boston Pair Into A Full House

Converting WRKO & WHDH from competitiors to complements

For most Talk programmers, building and maintaining one top-rated station is more than a fulltime gig. But for David Bernstein, that's just half the job description.

As Operations & Programming Director of Atlantic Radio's Talk combo WRKO & WHDH/Boston, Bernstein is charged with nurturing 'RKO's powerhouse status while simultaneously reshaping the recently acquired 'HDH into an equally potent but complementary Talk-oriented outlet.

It's a demanding job — and one that more Talk PDs may be asked to perform as licensees start taking advantage of the revised duopoly rules. Jacor, for example, is actively looking for a second AM to accommodate the sports and talk programming that doesn't fit on its News/Talk KOA/Denver.

Information. Not News

Bernstein joined Atlantic six months ago from Group W's crosstown all-News WBZ. Since then, he's focused on transforming

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The competition has not gone away. The producer staffs may still chase after the same person to be first to get the interview on the air.

WHDH from a pure Talk outlet that competed directly with WRKO into a station that will complement 'RKO. Of course, he's hoping 'HDH will siphon off audience from WBZ, 'RKO's constant rival for the 12+ ratings crown.

"WRKO and WHDH were headto-head competitors splitting the available Talk audience," says Bernstein. "With the common ownership it just didn't make sense for them to have their rockets pointed at each other any more."

at each other any more." Accordingly, WHDH did away with its drivetime issue-oriented talk shows earlier this month. It replaced them with news-intensive programs designed to provide healthy doses of useful information as well as the "stories behind the headlines."

While Bernstein believes these new shows are as informative as WBZ's news programming – and should cut into its audience – he emphasizes that 'HDH is not evolving into a second all-Newser. "There was a void in the marketplace for a warm, humanistic approach to letting people know what's going on, as opposed to saying, "This is the news.'

"[WHDH] evokes the warmth people felt toward the Full-Service personalities of the '60s and '70s," he explains. To emphasize that distinction to listeners, WHDH never uses the word "news" to position itself. Instead, it refers to itself as "The Information Station."

NEWS/TALK

Borrowing From NPR

At the heart of WHDH'S revamped format is a new AM drive show, "Boston This Morning," which is built around brief newsmaker interviews (about five per hour) conducted by former Boston TV personality Eileen Prose.

The purpose of those conversations, says Bernstein, is to "answer the questions in the news that haven't been answered by the [media]. These [interviews] are perhaps the most important part of the show. They are what makes us different and beneficial. WBZ is a good all-News station; if we do a shoddy job, who needs it?"

Borrowing from NPR's news magazines, each chat segment ends with a 20-second musical interlude (usually a New Age, Jazz, or Classical piece) designed to give the listener a chance to reflect on the interview.

Those breaks aside, Bernstein says, the show clips along at a steady pace. Interviews are limited to three and a half minutes and wrapped in a steady stream of elements that includes CBS and local newscasts, weather, traffic, lifestyle features, and Charles Osgood.

"This is a minute-by-minute show," he emphasizes. "We provide a piece of information, and then we move on to the next element. We promote ahead heavily - you may not be interested in the topic now, but in two minutes there will be a whole new segment."

Lineup Notes

In contrast, WRKO's morning show, hosted by Mike Cuthbert and

Janet Jeghelian, frequently focuses on one topic for an hour or more with lengthy interviews and listener calls.

WHDH's PM drive is now home to "Late Afternoon Edition," another news-and-interview-laden program that emphasizes business and economic information. "There was a hole for [business news]," says Bernstein. "Allowing people to get that information at the end of the day makes us unique."

Middays remain unchanged with a mid-morning money-talk show and Rush Limbaugh filling the 10am-3pm hours. Bernstein admits Limbaugh's program is not fully consistent with 'HDH's new image, but says it's too valuable to displace.

Evenings and weekends continue to feature syndicated talk shows, including Gene Burns and Talknet.

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WBZ is a good all-News station; if WHDH does a shoddy job, who needs it?

Eventually, Bernstein confides, "Boston This Morning" will go to seven days a week and weekends will showcase locally produced specialty shows on topics ranging from home repair to pet advice to comedy.

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This new 'HDH, says Bernstein, provides the perfect formatic complement to its sister station, which is home to such famously outspoken talkers as Jerry Williams and Howie Carr. "WHDH is an upscale, less intensive presentation; it's the station that keeps you company while it informs you. 'RKO is a much harder-edged, combative, argumentative station. It delves deep into the issues, and if we need to have a screaming match to resolve the issue, we have a screaming match."

Striking A Balance


Bernstein says he is very aware of the social responsibility he bears as overseer of two major Talkoriented outlets. "We clearly feel an obligation to make sure both sides of the issues get on the air."

In fact, Bernstein notes, such considerations factored into his recent decision to hire the liberal Victoria Jones to host middays on WRKO. "If you don't like Limbaugh [on WHDH] because of his views or personality, Victoria is his antithesis on 'RKO." (Of course, as he acknowledges, it wouldn't have made much programming sense to put another conservative up against Limbaugh.)

Full Staffs, Fierce Rivals

Because of WRKO and WHDH's formatic differences – and the stations' current geographic separation – there has been virtually no reduction in programming personnel under the combined ownership. Each station has retained a full staff of producers and newspeople who have turned their fierce crosstown rivalry into sibling rivalry.

"The competition has not gone away," Bernstein says approvingly. "Each staff has a lot of pride in its own call letters. Even though the [interview] formats are different, the producer staffs may still be chasing after the same person to be first to get the interview on the air."

WBOS/Boston Finds Rock AC Niche

Following up my niche programming column (R&R 2/26), let's look at WBOS/Boston — another hard-to-define station that performed extremely well (No. 4 18-34, No. 5 25-54) in the fall Arbitron.

Among Rock ACs, WBOS is widely considered to be the closest in sound to sister Granum Communications outlet and niche pioneer WMMO/Orlando. "The same people involved with putting 'MMO on-the-air also put WBOS together," says WBOS VP/GM John Laton. "Conceptually, the stations are very similar. [WMMO PD] Cary [Pall] and [WBOS PD] Jim Herron talk to each other all the time."

However, market differences give the two stations their own distinct flavors. "We have an established Classic Rocker [WZLX], an AOR [WBCN], and a cutting-edge New Rocker [WFNX]. Unlike WMMO, we're not the only game in town. When WMMO initially played the Indigo Girls, the reaction there was, 'Oh, wow.' We weren't the only station in Boston playing the Indigo Girls."

Quality & Quantity

Describing WBOS's audience, Laton comments, "They're highincome, educated, and white-collar. We go after advertisers who fit that description; for example, real estate, banking, and high-end automotive. My only surprise is the depth of our high-qualitative audience.

"Our marketing/promoting ef-

forts have changed recently; we're now getting more agency business. The bread and butter – retailers and direct business – is the highend product line. To the buying community, we've positioned WBOS between AOR/Classic Rock and AC."

In terms of audience cells, 'BOS is geared to 25-34s. "Focus group studies confirm our comfort level because [we use] no on-air promotions, and every song is announced," Laton notes. "We've done lots of research to appeal to our audience."

Laton expects to see an increase in WBOS- and WMMO-type stations. "The format combines the best of both worlds. There's a good qualitative story. If done properly, you can generate significant ratings."

Send In The Clones

column about successful adult niche formats wouldn't be complete without mentioning Rock AC WMMO/Orlando. WMMO PD Cary Pall explains why clones of the format may — or may not — work.

Anyone involved in simple cloning will shoot himself in the foot. Those [who] find similar listener likes and dislikes in their towns will find the WMMO brand of Rock AC will work — if they have the money and fortitude to do all the things necessary to make the format work.

WMMO works when there's research that defines the needs of potential listeners, creativity that aims to delight rather than simply placate those potential listeners, values that reflect those of the listeners, and marketing that effectively gets the word out. Without all those elements in place, you don't wln.

Other than our Granum sister [WBOS/Boston] — which bears more than a little resemblance to WMMO — I know of no other station that has put all the necessary pleces together to make a station work the way WMMO has. How many stations have the loyalty to listener values necessary to turn away cash business, rather than run a loud obnoxious spot?

After two and a half years, we've finally noticed a long-overdue change in the way some agencies in our region produce spots. [This is owed] in part to the educational

efforts of GM **Bob Poe**. Protecting listeners from poor commercial content is an integral part of WMMO's success.

I suspect [former KHMX/Houston PD] Guy Zapoleon would agree that, while he was attacking a specific cluster with some slmilarities to the Rock AC lifegroup, KHMX is designed more for people who grew up listening to [CHRs] KKBQ or KRBE, rather than AOR KLOL. Therefore, it's more clearly identified as a Hot AC. Then again, It was his station — let him name it.





The Agony And Ecstacy Of CRS Week

I know I'm getting older, but it seems everybody had a harder time recovering from Country Radio Seminar 24 (3/3-6). Maybe it was the extra day of activities, perhaps it was the Citron.

Sunday morning ailments aside, though, the CRS is still country music's best week going for panels, suites, music, and those wonderful hallway chats. Here are some of the things that stood out in this attendee's beleaguered brain

Music, Music, Music

The magnitude of Country radio's recent success was summed up by Friday morning keynoter Gary Fries of the RAB. Noting that Country's local sales were up 12% last year while radio's overall gain was just 2%, he said, "The industry would have been flat or down if not for Country's growth. Country radio's as close to the American consumer as any [format] we have.'

This year's CRS was wall-to-wall music. An unofficial count puts the number of acts who performed at upward of 60. And off-campus shows gained steam again: Local clubs hosted performances by Mercury's Shania Twain, Toby Keith, and John Brannen: MCA's Mavericks; Atlantic's John Michael Montgomery; and much of Arista's roster.

One of the great things about seminar performances is the potential for musical magic. For instance, will we ever again see Chet Atkins, Great Plains' Jack Sundrud, and Sam Bush perform as a backup band? At the ASCAP lunch, they accompanied Suzy Bogguss, whose own band was in Houston preparing for her show there later that evening

For Ms. Bogguss, it wasn't just a .. it was an adventure. seminar . She spent part of Wednesday night trapped in an elevator during the much-storied blackout (caused by a wayward auto striking an electrical substation). Luckily, she had



her cellular phone and was able to inform publicist Cathy Gurley of her plight.

But Bogguss recovered and came up with the week's best line. After Merlin Littlefield introduced her at the ACSAP lunch, the curtain didn't go up. After a few seconds, with everyone quietly waiting in the dark, this wispy little voice was heard saying, "I'm coooommming."

Mystery Cousin

The ASCAP lunch was the scene of a seminar mystery as well. Opening act Run C&W performed without the services of Russell Smith, who had been injured in an auto accident late Wednesday evening. His replacement stranger in a black hat and sunglasses who kept his head down for the entire set - was introduced only as cousin Sun Burns. Although not everybody figured out the fillin's identity, those with sharp senses recognized the distinctive sideburns and harmonies of Vince Gill.

The Write Stuff

Did you hear the story about the 40 lucky radio folks who got a chance to write a song with Gill, Mark Collie, or McBride & The Ride? During a visit to the MCA/ Nashville suite to see the artists. MCA West Coast Director/Regional Promotion Larry Hughes suggested breaking into three groups and giving the radio people a taste of what songwriting's like. The art-

ists performed the finished tune at the end of the session.

Gill reportedly pocketed his group's idea for possible later use. But don't look for the 15 co-writers' names on his next single. Everybody participating signed a waiver forfeiting any future rights . . . but what a great experience!

Speaking of experiences, those who took part in the BNA Entertainment suite's "Virtual Reality" game were raving about it. Although I didn't have the chance to try the interactive game, those who did compared it to "being on the in-side of a video game." Visored guests competed one-on-one against each other and BNA artists in the fantasy world of virtual reality.

Showcase Stages

In previous years, a number of labels hosted lavish, theme-oriented ballroom suites, many featuring artist performances. Unfortunately, there usually weren't enough rooms for all of labels who wanted them - and the rooms that were there often became so crowded that many radio people couldn't get in, much to the record companies' chagrin.

But this year's innovative "Showcase Stages" setup appeared to solve those problems, much to everybody's delight. The huge ballroom with two stages offered hours of continuous music. The music was great and you didn't feel crowded. The only "negative": some people wished there was a dance floor. Thursday night's entertainment featured Neal McCov, Brother Phelps, Stephanie Davis, Emmylou Harris, Bob Woodruff, Tim McGraw, Rick Vincent, and the Gibson-Miller Band. Friday performers included Debra Burns, Stacy Dean Campbell, George Jones, Celinda Pink. Jack Robertson, Deborah Allen, Rhonda Vincent, Zaca Creek, Doug Supernaw, Lee Roy Parnell, and the Kentucky Headhunters.

The showcases provided plenty of potential for surprises. Jones was joined onstage by current touring partner Tracy Lawrence. After putting on a great show, Parnell exchanged some hot licks with the Kentucky Headhunters. The place was rockin'. If this continues (and let's hope it does), it may become the site of some incredible future jam sessions.

New Faces

There were mixed reactions to the incredible amount of music offered at this year's CRS. It really came down to personal taste as to whether people considered the abundance of artists a delight or sensory overload. Perhaps its most detrimental effect was that the New Faces Show - traditionally the week's high point - became somewhat anticlimactic. Dolly,

Reba, Vince, George, et al., were tough acts to follow.

That perception may have been heightened by the long list of speakers and presenters taking the podium after dinner (and before the inimitable Charlie Monk emerged to skewer the helpless masses). Don't get me wrong the awards and presentations are credible and should be part of the activities, but maybe it's possible to do them during dinner. Unfortunately, the same number of people would likely be paying attention

Lost Guys

Among the presentations were the announcements of the Country Music DJ Hall Of Fame inductees. This year, Great Empire Broadcasting GM/CEO Mike Oatman and former KRAK/Sacramento PD/personality Jay Hoffer were honored, the latter posthumously.

Both this year and last, it was great to hear how much being inducted into the hall meant to the living honorees. After all, what air talent watching the festivities wouldn't want to be up there someday? Everyone seemed to be silently reviewing the names of those who'd given them a hand, contemplating the day when they, perhaps, might be given that wonderful forum to thank them.

Unfortunately, we haven't been able to learn much about the last two years' posthumous honorees. According to Hall Of Fame trustee Chuck Chellman, efforts to locate relatives of Hoffer and last year's honoree. Sammy Taylor, have been unsuccessful. They've been so fruitless, in fact, that the late honorees' beautiful induction plaques aren't even hanging in relatives' homes. Taylor's is displayed

at KWJJ/Portland; Hoffer's is on its way to KRAK. In a way, perhaps that's as it should be. But if you know how to reach either man's family, contact the CRS at (615) 327-4487 or yours truly at (615) 244-8822.

Room For Improvement

Although more people than ever descended on the Opryland Hotel for this year's seminar, things seemed to go smoothly - unless you found yourself in the interminable registration line. Or if you were one of the many (reports ranged from 10 to 200 people) who thought they had rooms for Saturday night . . . but didn't. Some found threatening notes on

their doors demanding the room be vacated. Others found their possessions had been packed up and carted away. And one woman putting on makeup in the bathroom was surprised by a gentleman who entered what he thought was his room - with a key. The real answers as to why things went wrong were very difficult to come by


Too many have been inconvenienced for too long. The Oprvland Hotel is in the convention business. The CRS has been operating for 24 years now. Why can't they get it close to right?




Springin' New Releases

Those of you who didn't get enough new music at CRS 24 can rest easy: Seven new acts from six Nashville labels are set to debut on Country airwaves by June's end.

Man From Mercury

Mercury/Nashville's newest artist needs little introduction. You've seen him for years on the big screen in movies like "Beverly Hills Cop," "Deliverance," and "Total Recall." But Ronny Cox has been singing even longer than he's been acting – his rockabilly band helped pay for his college theater degree. In 1991, he took a year's sabbatical from Hollywood to concentrate on his music, which soon caught Mercury's ears. Cox penned all but one of his debut album's 10 tunes; the first single, "The Cowboy Rides," is scheduled for release April 19.

New From Curb

The latest artist to jump onto the Curb is Billy Yates. At the ripe old age of 28, Yates has already had several careers. He's cut hair in a salon, managed his own health club, worked at a radio station promoting country concerts, and sung with the house band at a popular area resort. After several trips to Nashville, Yates moved there in 1987 and eventually signed with Curb. As gifted with paintbrushes as he is with guitars, Yates was commissioned by George Jones (who cut several Yates-penned songs on his last album) to paint a mural on the back of his tour bus. Look for Yates's first single, "Turn For The Worse," in May.

Giant Introductions

Giant/Nashville debuts two new artists this spring. Clay Walker's debut single, "Dreaming With My Eyes Open," will arrive May 18. A Texas native, Walker has been aiming for a country music career since he first started playing guitar and singing at age seven. Watts, Grigg, Summar, and Stuart were brought together by mutual friend Dave Powers in 1989 for a studio project and formed the group soon thereafter. Wallace joined later that year. And by fall of '90, Hank Flamingo was in the studio with Byron Gallimore. After catching the interest of Giant's James Stroud, the group signed a deal. Its first single is slated for a mid-June release. **Nipper's New Childs**

RCA/Nashville introduces Memphis native Andy Childs this quarter. Childs has spent the last 10 years performing around the country with artists ranging from Charlie Daniels and Ronnie Milsap to Jerry Lee Lewis and Chubby Checker. His five-week "Star Search" TV stint (he made the finals of the male vocalist competition) gained him national attention and, eventually, an RCA contract. Produced by Josh Leo and Mark Wright, Childs's debut LP is scheduled for release this summer; the first single should cross your desk in late May.

Freedom Rider

Liberty Records' newest artist hails from Athens, GA, home of the University of Georgia. John. Berry's already a favorite of Bulldog fans, having played at their postgame shows for years. He's spent plenty of time on the college circuit, but has also performed with the Judds, Randy Travis, and Alabama. Berry released several moderately successful albums on his own independent label, then was brought to Liberty's attention by Great Cumberland Music's Herky Williams. (Williams's sister, who attended Georgia, kept telling her brother about Berry.) Expect to see Berry's first single early next month.

A New Judd

Warner Bros./Nashville will introduce Judd Erickson to the country scene midway into the second quarter. Minnesota native Erickson cut his musical teeth on Minneapolis's live country scene before joining country-rock band Whiskey River. He toured extensively with the group – which cut two independent albums – before going solo and moving to Atlanta. Erickson later hooked up with producer (and Whiskey River fan) Gregg Brown and landed the deal with Warner Bros. His debut single, "Toys And Games," is expected May 4.
