With Rise Of Internet Radio, Could Rockers Stream Multiple Formats?

Internet radio listening is growing rapidly. Microsoft has just released a new browser that contains a Windows Radio toolbar with 10 customizable buttons. And now, some modern rock programmers are wondering if that growing audience gives them the opportunity to make multiple versions of the same radio station available via the Internet.

WIPY (Y100) Philadelphia PD Jim McGuinn recently told an industry gathering that he was looking into offering multiple streams of his station on his Web site, which drew an enthusiastic response from those in attendance. And WDST Woodstock, N.Y., is already streaming a more progressive version of its modern rock format as Radio Woodstock.

McGuinn wonders "if there's a way to extend your brand without breaking it by creating virtual radio stations on your Web site and alternative formats to your broadcast format. Let's say you're an 'Extreme' alternative station, but there's no modern AC in the market. Maybe you could put up the at-work version of [it, and] with the proliferation of [automation] systems and things like that, you might be able to protect your flank."

And since it's the nature of radio that even P1 listeners will punch away when they hear a song they don't like, McGuinn asks, "Why not have them punch into something else that's yours?" As a growing contingent of listeners sample Internet radio, this

might be a way to keep them from non-broadcast offerings. "If you're going to get niched by Rolling Stone radio or MTV radio, why not pre-empt it by [creating your own niche]?"

McGuinn also sees an opportunity "to focus some revenue toward these [parallel signals]. It may be a cheaper way to get local advertisers on the air who can't afford to pay \$300 a spot but [think], 'Maybe I'll pay \$50 to be on their Classic Y100 channel.'

McGuinn says that if stations start pursuing this, the ones that are "more distinctive will have a better chance in this domain." McGuinn-consulted WEQX Albany, N.Y., has attracted a worldwide audience. "They have a more distinctive vibe than a generic McAlternative station. It's like the fringer you are, it's almost easier at this point to attract some hardcore followers."

WDST owner Gay Chetkof is counting on that. He not only streams WDST's on-air signal at www.wdst.com, but has a separate Web site, www.radiowoodstock.com, with its own, separate Internet-only radio station. WDST PD Jimmy Buff and ex-WDST PD Dave Leonard are part of the Radio Woodstock team, which has live jocks as often as it can get them on the "air."

"[When] you make a product, why limit yourself on your distribution?" Chetkof asks. "If you make a can of peas, you don't only sell it in certain areas; you try to sell it everywhere. That's what kills me about radio."

"The whole reason I even bought the station six years ago was because I knew the day was going to come when

FCC Denies Investigating Label Deals

Despite claims made in a Los Angeles Times story last week, FCC officials say there is no current investigation of promotional deals cut between any radio group and record label. On March 17, the Times quoted unnamed sources that said the FCC was looking into deals involving Chancellor Media and Emmis Broadcasting, but FCC spokeswoman Rosemary Kimball says, "There is nothing going on here."

Cumulus Media, whose exclusivity deal with independent promoter Jeff McClusky figured into the Times story, emphasizes that while the FCC has, after changes, signed off on the deal, there was never "an investigation" into the pact.

In January, Sen. Paul Wellstone, D-Minn., and Rep. John Conyers, D-Mich., asked the FCC to open a review of the deal, but the FCC has not done so.

FCC Enforcement Division Chief Charles Kelley says his office hasn't moved beyond its tangential review conducted in January, adding, "Things have not changed much." Executives with the groups cited in the story say their groups have not been contacted by the FCC.

Among the deals that were purportedly under review was a marketing pitch made to la-

bels by Emmis' modern rock WKQX (Q101) Chicago. The \$3,500 deal gave a label 10-second liners adjacent to a spin, as well as a place in Q101 displays at Tower Records and Musicland. "It was not a paid spin. It was the same spin that any new record would get. It had nothing to do with guaranteed spins," says Emmis senior VP of programming Rick Cummings.

Emmis says five packages were sold between July and January, including one sold to Mercury just before Christmas for the Cardigans' "My Favourite Game," a track that was added to Q101 Nov. 10. Other labels that purchased adjacent spot time from Emmis include Trauma Records, for the Fly's "Got You (Where I Want You)"; Restless, for Econoline Crush's "Surefire"; Virgin, for Placebo's "Pure Morning"; and RCA, for the Eve 6 track "Leech."

The program ended in January after details surfaced in the press. "Perception equals reality, which is unfortunate, because it worked great for the labels," says Q101 GM Chuck Hillier.

Cummings says he would welcome an FCC review. "We can't wait for it, so we can lay it out for them."

Mason & Sheehan Sue Clear Channel

According to local press reports, veteran Albany, N.Y., morning men Mason and Sheehan have announced a lawsuit against Clear Channel, parent of classic rock WXCR, where the pair most recently hosted mornings until last summer. The two are charging fraud, breach of contract, restraint of trade, and age discrimination and are asking for \$50 million. They claim, in part, that Clear Channel lured the two from crosstown album WPYX to work at WXCR in part to get them out of the way of the Howard Stern feed carried by Clear Channel modern WQBK/WQBJ. The defendants issued the following statement: "Clear Channel Communications honors all contracts . . . Mr. Mason and Mr. Sheehan's claim has no merit."

PROGRAMMING

Veteran rock programmer Stan Main, most recently director of operations for CBS' Austin, Texas, cluster, exits radio to return to school and pursue a second career, which he says will either be law or politics.

With PD J.D. Kunes on his way to the PD job at AC WSKS Detroit, album WONE Akron, Ohio, is shifting further toward classic rock, restricting the few current slots to core artists like Tom Petty.

Album KPOI Honolulu PD Brock Whalley becomes director of programming for the four New Wave stations, working with top 40 KQMQ, country KKHN, and soon-to-be-unveiled KORL.

Classic rock KURR Salt Lake City picks up the liner "Classic rock that really rocks," as it drops a handful of its softer rock tracks. Across the street, KUMT (the Mountain), which segued to rock AC last year from triple-A, flips outright to '70s oldies as KCPX. The entire KUMT staff exits, except for Trish Griffiths, in nights.

Former modern adult KALC Denver PD Gregg Cassidy joins classic rock WOCT Baltimore as PD. WOCT, too, is opting for the "Classic rock that really rocks" liner.

Modern KZNZ/album KXXR Minneapolis marketing director Peter Johns is interim PD at KZNZ after John Lassman's departure.

Triple-A WCLZ Portland, Maine, PD Brian Phoenix gets PD/mornings at rival top 40 WRED.

Album WRKR Kalamazoo, Mich., PD/afternoons Mike Ferris heads to album WIBA Madison, Wis., as PD.

Album KMOD Tulsa, Okla., afternooner Jim Jones joins modern rival KMRX as PD/middays.

The New York Daily News reports heavy ru-

mors that album WNEW New York might switch its format, perhaps to talk. WNEW hadn't returned Monitor's calls at press time. The News story says that while staffers would not comment for attribution, privately they deny any switch.

Rock veteran Steve Brill, most recently at the late album KSD St. Louis, has exited in the wake of that station's flip to hot AC. Another rock vet, Judy McNutt, exits her PD post at R&B oldies WXXY Chicago to open the Stealth Talent and Program Support consultancy.

WLIR Long Island, N.Y., specialty-show host Jerry Rubino joins the CID Radio rock division.

Modern WDST Woodstock, N.Y., has moved its tower to provide expanded coverage into the Poughkeepsie market. The station previously simulcast on a signal into that area but sold that outlet two years ago.

Modern KHUG Little Rock, Ark., gets new calls KLEC to go with its Lick moniker.

Market veteran Dan Neer gets mornings at classic rock WAXQ (Q104.3) New York. Marc Coppola returns to nights, as Donna Donna goes to weekends.

Grego returns to album KLOL Houston for nights, as Wendy Miller returns to her old midday gig after a leave of absence to have a baby. Afternoon host Outlaw Dave re-ups with the station. PD Michael Hughes reports that KLOL is set to go decidedly more current-based.

Classic rock KJFX Fresno, Calif., PD Angie Good joins crosstown oldies KFSO for mornings.

Modern WXSR Tallahassee, Fla., PD Scott Petibone drops his role with the morning show to concentrate on programming duties.

Modern WNFZ Knoxville, Tenn., MD/nights Rover exits. Album WXTB Tampa, Fla., P/T Boner joins for nights. WRCX Chicago refugee Taz joins for afternoons, allowing PD Shane Cox to shift back to middays.

Former album WROQ Greenville, S.C., night jock Scott Mann joins classic rock WSEA Myrtle Beach, S.C., as MD/middays.

Album KRZZ Wichita, Kan., MD/night host Debbi Miller exits . . . AC WFPS Freeport, Ill., p.m. driver Jack O'Neal joins album WXRX Rockford, Ill., for overnights.

Indies, Led By Slim, Rule Modern Top Five

INDEPENDENTS' DAY: Don't look now, but we may be seeing an unexpected result of this year's label consolidations. With Fatboy Slim's "Praise You" (Skint/Astralwerks) up 6-5 this week on the modern chart, for the first time ever, three of the top five modern tracks are from independent labels—Tommy Boy and Wind-Up round out the list.

Sammy Hagar returns to No. 1 on the heritage chart with "Mas Tequila" (MCA). Hagar topped the inaugural heritage chart in the June 6, 1997, issue of Monitor with "Little White Lie," which spent a total of six weeks at No. 1. Two other tracks from his "Marching To Mars" set also reached the top three on the heritage chart: the title track and "Both Sides Now."

Buckcherry's "Lit Up" (DreamWorks) vaults onto the heritage chart at No. 23, earning the Greatest Gainer and Most New Stations designations with a 124% increase from a week ago. The track is on only 23 heritage stations but is already top 10 on six of those. It's top 10 at 16 of the 67 stations on which it was detected this week.

Perhaps last week's triple-A audience chart is a harbinger of things to come. John Mellencamp's "I'm Not Running Anymore" (Columbia) rolled to the top of that chart a week ago and maintains for a second week, stretching its lead over Tom Petty & the Heartbreakers' "Free Girl Now" (Warner Bros.) to more than 340,000 listeners with a 14% increase. That same 14% increase pushes "I'm Not Running Anymore" 3-2 on the airplay chart. Meanwhile, the Black Crowes' "Only A Fool" (American/Columbia) stepped all the way to No. 13 on the audience chart while inching 20-19 on the airplay list. This week, a 20% increase in spins fuels a 19-12 move for "Only A Fool."

Sony Music's new C2 label hits the active rock chart for the first time, as Dovetail Joint's "Level On The Inside," a pickup from Aware Records, enters at No. 39, crossing from modern.

PERSONNEL: Promotion vet Marc Benesch shutters his marketing and promotion consulting firm to become senior VP at TTVT Records . . . Former Capitol national director of promotion Frank Palombi joins Universal in a similar role based in Dallas . . . Former Maverick San Francisco rep Michael Novia joins Interscope for the same region . . . Former Red Ant VP of sales Jeffrey Grabow joins Restless for the same.

ROCK DOMINATES, BUT SALES SLIP: Rock maintained its domination of record sales in '98, according to figures released this week by the Recording Industry Assn. of America. Rock still accounts for more record sales than any other genre, but its share of all sales in '98 dropped 6.8% to 25.7%. The absence of hits from established acts, the continued decline of modern rock sales, and the shrinkage in number of buyers aged 20-24 contributed to rock's decline. For the second straight year, women outspent men, with older demos seeing significant growth in sales.

LPFM: Static Or Sound Policy?

The FCC's plan to license thousands of low-power FM stations has become focused on the normally empirical world of broadcast engineering. With broadcast owners now saying they object to microradio not on competitive but technical grounds, the engineers we queried about the potential impact of new stations on second and third adjacent channels, which are the two or three dial positions from an existing station's frequency, hardly saw the issue as cut and dried.

Lynn Claudio, the NAB's senior VP of science and engineering, says the FCC is assuming radios have become better at rejecting interference. "There are few industry tests of receivers, and they've suggested that radios have not gotten better but in fact have gotten worse," says Claudio, who concedes that most car radios have improved but adds that clock radio and portable radio makers are using cheaper parts that will be overwhelmed by LPFM signals.

But Michael Bracey, executive director of the Low Power Radio Coalition, says the technology has not been developed because there has not been a market for it. "The goal is worthy," he says.

Pat Martin, GM of WPHT Elmira, N.Y., and WXYQ Manistee, Mich., who owns a broadcast-equipment business, is among the many owners opposing LPFM. "To add a whole new class of station is going to clutter the FM band, so you're not going to be able to pick up anything." Martin is also worried that microradio will devalue FM licenses, particularly in smaller markets, where more struggling stations are.

"I've never seen so much guessing and speculation," says Michael Brasher, GM of KANW Albuquerque, N.M., who believes concerns about competition are driving the concern

about interference. He says that in the Southwest, FM translators have been operating on second adjacent channels for years with few interference complaints. "There are legitimate spectrum concerns that need to be addressed by the FCC, but I think those concerns have been exaggerated greatly."

Meanwhile, at the NAB's request, the FCC has extended the comment period on LPFM.

TAUZIN ATTACKS FCC; WWKX FINED

FCC Chair Bill Kennard traveled to Capitol Hill last week, promising to fix what ails Congress. During a hearing, ostensibly to discuss the agency budget, House telecommunications subcommittee chair Billy Tauzin, R-La., told Kennard he is working on a comprehensive FCC reform bill that he plans to introduce late this summer.

But Rep. Ed Markey, D-Mass., said a radical restructuring could be counterproductive.

The agency is working on its own restructuring plan, to be released later this year. "While we need change, we do not need chaos," said Kennard, who vows to keep tight control over the radio spectrum. Kennard will likely propose merging a number of the FCC's agencies.

Elsewhere, Back Bay Broadcasting rhythmic top 40 WWKX Providence, R.I., has been fined \$7,000 for broadcasting what the FCC determined was indecent material during "The Real Deal Mike Neil Show," shortly after 6 p.m. in March 1998. While the words were bleeped out, the FCC says they were "recognizable, notwithstanding the editing, and the context within which they were used in this broadcast meets the Commission's definition of indecency."

Boost Sales By Boosting Your Station

Some PDs act as if attending a sales meeting is like wading in a cesspool, so they stay away from that department as much as they can. But if your radio station isn't making any money, your high ratings mean little to the owner of the station. This doesn't mean that a PD must join the sales staff and beat the street every day, but as your station's biggest cheerleader, there are times when your involvement in a sales call can make the difference in getting a client.

If you have just signed on a station, and you have no market history, a sales call allows you to fully explain your vision for the station. The average client will want to know why he or she should buy a product that has no history. Your enthusiasm will be very effective at communicating to a new client to invest in your station. Plus, few other people will be better-versed on exactly how much to reveal so that it doesn't slip into the hands of your competitors.

Other prospective clients will want to share their impressions of the station and advise you on the direction you should take. These calls can be a pain in the butt; however, if you are new to a market, these clients are sometimes full of valuable information about other stations and can provide you with market history. And the client will feel as if he or she has a special relationship with the station.

Sometimes you should join in on a sales call because the sales manager wants to impress a client by bringing several enthusiastic colleagues to the meeting—the "safety in numbers" theory. If the department has just hired a new person with a lot of potential but no experience, joining this kind of meeting helps reinforce the positive relationship between programming and sales. The new salesperson will feel more secure by being surrounded by co-workers, and your attention will make the new exec feel that he or she has a good working relationship with programming from the very beginning.

It's also important to be included on a sales call if a product is controversial or if you are going to personally endorse a product on the air. You will want to spend time with the client in order to understand fully what the client wants

you to communicate about the product. Sometimes the product doesn't fit. There are plenty of strip bars that would love to advertise on the top-rated triple-A, but that doesn't mean the station should accept this money.

One of the best times for PDs to be included on sales calls is when the sales department is trying to sell title sponsorship of station benchmarks. Whenever a client is attached to a programming feature, there are bound to be problems. Not only can your involvement help sell a client on a special feature or package, but it may help resolve any conflict that might arise.

The sales department can think of a lot of good reasons for you to join the sales staff on a call, some of them valid, many of them questionable. To lessen your aggravation, make sure you sit down with your salesperson to figure out exactly what you want to accomplish before you agree to go out on a call.

Sometimes the salesperson isn't very well-prepared to meet with the client and hopes that your presence will gloss over the fact that he or she doesn't know what to do. In the best possible world, the sales manager will filter out these people, but sometimes that job will fall to you. If you sit down with the ad exec to talk about what you want to accomplish during the call before you meet with the client, often the exec will discover that he or she no longer needs you to join the meeting. If you have a well-established station, and the salesperson doesn't have a clear idea what purpose you serve on the sales call, then you should probably decline the invitation and ask the sales manager to intervene.

While the ideal salesperson will understand and like your radio station, there will be times when some of the best salespeople on your staff will have no knowledge of or interest in your station. For example, one (non-New York) PD told me that a person on his sales staff wanted to know if Howard Stern could meet with that staffer to endorse a paper after his show. Don't spend a lot of time trying to convert these people. Work with the sales manager to provide the best information about your station and help out when you are able, but don't beat your head against the wall. That's the GM's job.

Chancellor's De Castro On Net Growth, Adams Deal, Anti-Rock Reputation

New Chancellor Radio and Outdoor Group president/CEO James de Castro, who was also promoted to vice chairman of Chancellor Media, has some disgruntled stockholders to mollify. Interviewed on his way to the airport, de Castro, whose promotion March 15 from Chancellor Radio Group president capped a tumultuous week for the media giant, was embarking on a mini-tour of Chancellor stockholders to assure them that better times are ahead. "As a radio company, our ability to garner listeners and advertisers has been terrific," he says. "We need to treat shareholders equally and importantly."

Market analysts widely believed that the firm was over-leveraged and burdened by corporate bureaucracy. "I was extremely frustrated that we weren't performing as well as smaller companies that were realizing a much higher multiple than we were," de Castro says. "I let my feelings be known that corporate overhead and expenditures were incorrect."

After an aborted attempt to sell the radio division, Hicks Muse chairman Tom Hicks took it

off the market and replaced president/CEO Jeff Marcus with de Castro, whose radio acumen is widely acclaimed on Wall Street. "Our commitment to walk on [the Mexican] Grupo Radio deal [and the] LIN-TV deal and then fold Petri TV into LIN instead of Chancellor demonstrated that we were hearing what people said about us being over-leveraged," de Castro says.

"There will also be significant corporate cuts, because we're putting the control of the company back in the hands of operators, as opposed to the large infrastructure in Dallas," he says. "In the last week, we've saved tremendous money in corporate personnel and overhead, without cutting at the station or operations levels. Ultimately, there will be specific financial synergies from merging the back offices of Chancellor and Capstar. In all, there will be significant cost savings, well above \$15 million."

With the Chancellor/Capstar deal approved and about to close, de Castro rebuts any notion that the former's major-market outlets and the latter's small-market operations won't mesh. "It's as hard to make a station in Jacksonville, Fla., No. 1 as a station in New York," he says. "The only difference is the amount of revenue generated. In fact, Capstar has done a better job programming in smaller markets. They've dramatically changed the fundamentals of mom-and-pop broom-closet stations by consolidating them, then getting better production and just as much cash flow as a major market."

"There will be a lot of synchronicity between Capstar and Chancellor," he says. "Capstar has proprietary-information vehicles, the [multi-market automation] Star System and Galaxy [accounting] system, that will be extremely helpful to Chancellor's large-market stations."

He disputes the notion that the Star System eliminates small-market opportunities to develop talent. "There are more stations and jobs in radio than ever. What we are getting is better product in smaller markets. For the first time, they'll have the chance to have exceptional talent, new production capabilities, and new for-

mats, all of which creates better radio."

The talent at Chancellor stations' disposal includes group programmers Steve Rivers, Ken Benson, and now Steve Smith. "We're trying to hire every good PD in America. We get the smartest PDs in a room and figure out the best way to do things," he says. "Eventually, we'll come forward with an announcement of a format-branding formula and a new programming structure. We're going to promote many of our PDs to have additional format responsibilities."

De Castro's not worried about having too many cooks in the kitchen. "We've got 466 stations; how can you have too many chefs? Nor are we creating another layer of management. We have so much work to do with so many stations—each one needs a formula to build on."

As for targeting nontraditional revenue, he says, "We just started AMFMI—the 'I' stands for Internet. Last week, the board of directors approved a significant investment to begin involvement in Internet and Intranet."

The latter would be a network-wide programming system. "For instance, we'll be able to take the rhythmic oldies format, including music and production elements, and offer it all on an Intranet format—not only to our stations, but to other broadcasters in other markets."

Unlike Infinity's Mel Karmazin, de Castro is bullish on Net radio. "Radio is about usage, and you often do something else while listening to the radio. People listening to music on the Net is positive usage. At-office listening is a wonderful opportunity. Once you improve the quality of streaming and the computers' speakers, why shouldn't your computer be your radio?"

And the much-publicized Chancellor record label? De Castro promises an entertainment division drawing an important synergy between airplay, hits, and record sales. "We've got to continue to capitalize on our ability to deliver listeners. If that involvement can be through catalog music and compilation CDs, so be it. But we're not about to become another Arista Records and compete with the record industry."

But maybe Rhino. "How many one-hit artists or bands without catalog came and went but, if their hits are put together, can sell a lot of records?" he asks. "Get a few of these bands together for a rhythmic oldies tour. Why not play in all the markets with rhythmic oldies stations and put out a compilation CD under a Chancellor Media label?"

Negative press surrounding Chancellor's \$237,000 marketing program for Bryan Adams' 1998 single "On A Day Like Today" won't discourage future attempts to tap label revenue through marketing deals. "Pay-for-play and payola has been swirling around radio for over 50 years," de Castro says. "It has just resurfaced in the media. Any [pay-for-play charges] related to Chancellor are much ado about nothing. Nothing we've ever done has been payola. We never guaranteed any airplay of any kind. We gave support to Adams only on stations that wanted to play his records and only in areas where he was doing a concert. I believe we need to continue to refine our relationships with artists . . . without involving ourselves in any way with pay-for-play."

Then there's the issue of Chancellor's commitment to rock radio. After WRX (Rock 103.5) Chicago went R&B oldies, rumors flew that Chancellor rock outlets in D.C. and Houston were next and that Chancellor didn't like rock radio in general. "That perception is wrong," de Castro asserts. "We have some of the biggest rock stations . . . Rock is a very popular format, where up to five male-based stations are fighting over 7 shares in a market like Chicago, which is ridiculous. We're not a proponent of having a rock station just to have a rock station. We go into a market and research it before deciding how to go."

With Rise Of Internet Radio, Could Rockers Stream Multiple Formats?

I was going to be able to create a radio super-station with the name Woodstock, because that name is an internationally known brand name," says Chetkof. "You would have to pay hundreds of millions of dollars to get that name established in the people's minds around the world."

He sees his Internet signal as even more free-form than the famously broad WDST product. "We want to be like the FM stations of the late '60s... and be able to talk and interact with the listeners, be able to explain why we just played a Jimi Hendrix cut into a Stevie Ray Vaughan cut. We want to be able to talk and really get into the listener's mind-set and have a lifestyle radio station."

Chetkof could add classic rock and modern feeds if Radio Woodstock proves successful. "But right now our focus is just on this one," he says. "We're creating an audio channel on the Internet with live DJs and with eclecticism, not highly targeted formats. One day it could happen, but right now our plan is to use this to establish the brand."

An Internet-only signal is harder for consumers to find, so Chetkof is hoping to leverage other media to drive listeners to the Webcast. He's negotiating a deal with Voice of America to carry some of Radio Woodstock's programming on its worldwide feeds and is also looking into picking up a satellite digital radio channel for his programming. He also foresees partnering with investors or advertisers to put the Radio Woodstock stream on their Web sites as well.

GIVE A HOOT, DON'T DILUTE

Some of the other broadcasters we spoke to about the possibility of Internet brand extension were concerned that such a station would deliberately dilute a station's image or ratings impact. Chancellor director of programming and album KLOL Houston PD Michael Hughes asks, "How many mixed messages are you sending? As tough as it is these days to position a single property, let alone a Web site, let alone two facets of a Web site, what are people going to end up remembering?"

Album KRXQ Sacramento, Calif., PD Curtiss Johnson says Arbitron's recent Internet usage study shows that the bulk of Internet radio listeners tend to stay with their local stations, meaning that multiple versions of a station would be likely to cannibalize one another.

"Station management needs to be very honest with itself when evaluating their brand's ability to stand for something more than the on-air product," adds consultant Alex Demers.

"To what degree is it a value to create loyalty to the Web-only version of the radio station?" asks triple-A WXRT Chicago PD Norm Winer. "On the other hand, if you're going to sell advertising on it, that's a different story."

Demers does see a revenue-generating opportunity in multiple feeds. "An active or alternative station creating an 'all new music' format variant that is sponsored by labels or an Internet marketer like CDnow makes sense to me."

And Winer sees the value in "beating your competition to the punch. You're still providing your audience with the music they want, as opposed to having them go elsewhere."

Chetkof sees the pitfalls and does little cross-promotion of Radio Woodstock on WDST. "I don't want to dilute 'DST in the Hudson Valley,' he says. Besides, "the goal of Radio Woodstock is to really go global, so to promote it in the Hudson Valley is kind of silly."

Still, there's the promise of more exact usage measurement on the Internet signal. "You wouldn't have qualitative data, but you'd know that 500 streams were active between 3 p.m. and 4 p.m. or something like that," McGuinn says.

And by collecting E-mail addresses and some ancillary information, you can start building up a database and interacting with these users.

For its part, Arbitron is hoping to tap that exact measuring mechanism, according to VP/GM of Internet information services Greg Verdino. The company plans to launch InfoStream later this year, which will be specifically designed to measure streaming media electronically. Meters will be inserted in the media-streaming servers with data sent directly to Arbitron. "We are literally producing a census of Internet listening," Verdino says.

The company will measure audio streaming whether it is a mirror of the on-air programming or an adjunct. However, the current plan is to not

fold that information into the over-the-air measurement released in the Arbitron books. At the moment, any mentions of Radio Woodstock that make it into a local Arbitron diary will be lumped in with regular WDST listening.

As Verdino watches Internet listening grow, he says, "strategically, it's a smart move for stations to go in that direction," because highly niched formats' loyal audiences "translate into highly loyal consumers. [The stations are] extending their brand."

When Arbitron released its Internet radio study conducted with Edison Media research, it found that Internet usage is highest with modern rock listeners. Verdino believes that's something such outlets as Spinner.com and Netradio took to heart. They specifically target modern rock listeners, prompting Verdino to ask, "How can a modern station not stream its audio? Why not go head-to-head with the Internet-only stations that offer variety and choice?"

HEADING THEM OFF AT THE PASS

WDST's experiment is taking place against a landscape of rapid technological change, one in which conventional radio's place is yet undetermined. KRXQ's Johnson ponders the possibility that with more Web listening, the rise of MP3, and other nontraditional broadcasting, Internet brand extension could be "heading something off at the pass." Or, he asks, would such feeds inspire the listener to search around for even more signals that might not come from your station's brand?

Then there's the pending issue of subscription satellite radio. Many broadcasters either fear or dismiss satellite radio, but Chetkof is an advocate. "Once you hit people in their cars, you've just changed the face of traditional radio forever." He sees it as part of the larger convergence of TV, cable, and other entertainment systems and suggests that people stop trying to delineate between the different entertainment streams in their minds. "You don't care whether the signal comes in through your cable television or your over-the-air [receiver] or your satellite dish. It's coming in to your TV."

Could the technology advance to the point that it eclipses the very radio signals that it currently emulates? McGuinn remembers an appropriate comment. "I hope it's not true," says McGuinn, "but somebody said the other day, 'As we watch these groups consolidate themselves into a frenzy, it's like they're buying up all the blacksmith shops as the automobile is introduced.' Hey, I've got the biggest blacksmith shop in the country." "Who cares? I sold my horse."

Taking a swing at baseball's return is top 40 WSTR (Star 94) Atlanta. PD Dan Bowen sent listeners to Disney's Wide World of Sports complex in Orlando, Fla., to see the Braves via the Star 94 Fanjet.

Besides its fascination with San Diego Padres hopeful Garth Brooks, country KNIX Phoenix hosted a DARE Day for more than 3,000 kids in the drug-prevention program. The station's Steve Ludwig and Steve Goddard, local police, and members of the Oakland A's spoke to them before the A's game with the Chicago White Sox. Vicki Fiorelli said it was a big hit.

Waiting till next year is country KYGO Denver, which is helping listeners Catch the Millennium Bug by giving away a 2000 VW Bug. Says Garret Doll, "Da da da!"

Elsewhere, country WBEE Rochester, N.Y., hosted a Pillsbury Bake-off at the Strong Museum for kids. Contestants, ages 9-13, took part in cookie decorating, PB&J creations, and breakfast fun-food sampling, then received an easy-baking cookbook and museum tours with WBEE's mascot. Stephanie Hogerman cooked up great press coverage from all three majors.

Taking advantage of the NCAA's "March Madness" are album WXTB (98 Rock) Tampa, Fla., and modern KXTE (Extreme) Las Vegas. Booster Mile Oliviero notes that 98 Rock will give Final Four tickets to the winner

says Star 94's Dan Bowen. "Make sure they're prepared for the reality. Although they want immediate response [and sometimes that happens], they're really buying longer-term visibility and will see results over an extended period of time vs. just the three-hour appearance."

Then there's this surprise: "When you work with a national client, the local store may not know [about] the remote, [then] when you pull up with a station vehicle, the manager's surprised!" says country KEEY Minneapolis' Diana Buckmann. "The client could also be unhappy if very few listeners attend. The best way to combat this is to work with the client to create excitement at the location. Set up a special sale or free giveaway to entice listeners to spend time in the store and not just visit the air talent or receive a freebie from the station. A station vehicle, music, and free stuff is not always enough."

Having enough good prizes can be a problem, too. "If you do 12-15 remotes a week, you can run out of quality prizes fast," top 40 WPXY Rochester, N.Y.'s Tristano Korlou says. "The question is, 'Does the money to buy prizes come out of the promotions inventory or sales?'

"Having larger prizes and a registration box is the fairest way to go when you're short of music and trinkets," says R&B WJTT Chattanooga, Tenn.'s Wayne Collins. "It adds hype on-air."

Other tips to ensure a good remote: "Plan a remote when listeners are available to attend," KEEY's Buckmann says. "Lunch hours and weekends are best. Drive times are tough because people need to get to work or get home."

"Have a very aggressive street team standing on the street corner waving banners," says rhythmic top 40 XHTZ (Z90) San Diego's T.J. "Bring a station vehicle, banners, balloons, music, free stickers, etc. The more colorful and exciting you look, [the more] people passing the location will stop and ask questions."

"Car remotes [of which we do plenty] can get rather monotonous, so we entice listeners with free BBQ, a live band, and giveaways," says KYGO's Garret Doll. Top 40 WKRC Cincinnati's Scott Colebrook says that Q102, like several other stations, offers a spinning "wheel of prizes, or a super slot machine to award prizes."

On-air, WJTT's Collins suggests that "short, substantive breaks hit harder than lengthy descriptions. Also, the breaks should sound fun, like there's a party going on."

QUICK HITS

Top 40 KIIS-FM Los Angeles afternooner Gary Spears broadcast live from the Vidal Sassoon Academy, where winning listeners got their hair dyed pink, as well as a manicure and makeup, and tickets to see Nancy Kerrigan in "Grease On Ice." Von Freeman set up this well-oiled stunt.

This week's PD (politically defective) award goes to album rock KEGL Dallas night guys Kramer and Twitch, who hosted a Miss Tore Up Texas pageant at a local bar in front of 900 people. Contests included Ugliest Feet; Biggest Stretchmarks; Fried, Dyed, and Laid to the Side Hairdo; and others too disgusting to mention. Miss Tore Up Texas received a tiara made out of a beer can, dead flowers, \$250 of dental work, a tattoo, a case of Aquanet, and a makeover. Loren Condron takes no responsibility for this.
