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

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RINGING IN 2019 WITH POST MALONE

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Duets Debut, With The Weeknd And Gesaffelstein Reuniting

WO HIGH-PROFILE collaborations soar onto the Billboard Hot 100, while a follow-up to a former No. 1 should vie for an entrance in the chart's upper reaches on the Feb. 2 chart.

French DJ-artist **Gesaffelstein** and **The Weeknd**'s "Lost in the Fire" lands at No. 27 with 24.3 million in airplay audience, 13.6 million U.S. streams and 13,000 downloads sold, according to Nielsen Music. The duet marks the third Hot 100 entry for Gesaffelstein, all with The Weeknd: Last April, the pair hit the tally with "I Was Never There" and "Hurt You," from The Weeknd's *My Dear Melancholy* EP.

Sam Smith and Normani's

"Dancing With a Stranger" bows at No. 33 on the Hot 100, arriving with 11.5 million in radio reach, 9.1 million U.S. streams and 24,000 sold. Normani notches her second top 40 hit (after logging four as a member of **Fifth Harmony**): Her first, "Love Lies," with **Khalid**, ranks at No. 28 after reaching No. 9.

Meanwhile, **Ariana Grande**makes a bid for the top of the next
Hot 100 with new single "7 Rings,"
which was released Jan. 18. The
song is the radio follow-up to
Grande's "Thank U, Next," which
becomes her fifth No. 1 on the
Mainstream Top 40 airplay chart
(see page 64).

"Ruin My Life" was first imagined as a duet. How did you land on this version?

My most successful song in America, "Never Forget You," was a duet [with MNEK], so I wanted this for myself as a solo artist. It's about a toxic relationship, and I don't promote that, but at the same time it's definitely something I've been through. I'm human, I've been heartbroken, and at one point, you just feel like, "Please just come back. I don't care if you ruin my life."

You turned 21 in December. How did you celebrate?

I was in Berlin with my best friend and my

sister. We were partying. I [still] have to go to Las Vegas. I wanted to do that, but none of my friends could come from Sweden, and I wouldn't want to be there without them. I do feel like I'm going to go out every single day now, just because I can.

As a Swedish artist, what does it mean to cross over in America?

I always wanted to be a commercial pop star. I want my songs on the radio; I want to do stadium tours. To come to America and see people reacting to "Ruin My Life" is a dream. If you make it here, you make it everywhere.



Although **Post Malone**'s "Sunflower (Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse)" drops from No. 1 to No. 2 on the Billboard Hot 100 after becoming his third charttopper (and duet partner Swae Lee's first as a soloist apart from Rae Sremmurd), the rapper-singer adds his sixth Hot 100 top 10 as "Wow." ascends 11-9. "Wow." ranks at No. 6 on the Streaming Songs tally (25.3 million U.S. streams, according to Nielsen Music), lands at No. 7 on Digital Song Sales (14,000 sold) and debuts at No. 37 on Radio Songs (27.1 million impressions).





Content Under Pressure

Now that Sony has parted ways with R. Kelly, music executives are thinking about how to handle allegations against artists — and wondering what will happen next

cut ties with R. Kelly, Shaunna Thomas' first reaction was relief. Thomas, the 37-year-old co-founder of the women's advocacy group UltraViolet, spent years pushing the label to drop the R&B star over the many allegations of sexual misconduct against him. After the Lifetime documentary Surviving R. Kelly aired, UltraViolet paid for a plane to fly over Sony's Culver City building in Los Angeles trailing a banner that read "RCA/ Sony: Drop Sexual Predator R. Kelly" and helped coordinate protests outside Sony's Manhattan office on Jan. 16. Two days later, the label and Kelly agreed to split.

"There is a tipping-point moment where it becomes undeniable," says Thomas, "where you can't find enough flaws in all of the survivors' stories to deny there's something really problematic going on."

The music business hasn't yet faced the kind of #MeToo reckoning that's rattling Hollywood, but some executives are wondering

whether Sony's decision to part ways with Kelly will be a watershed moment. (Reps for RCA and its parent company, Sony, declined to comment.) Given the speed at which social norms are changing, labels are preparing to deal with future allegations of misconduct, thinking about modifying contracts to give them more flexibility to deal with problematic artists and wondering how they may have to balance their obligations to shareholders with the demands of a world that's less willing to tolerate bad behavior.

Label executives say they aren't likely to change their signing decisions because of increased scrutiny of artists' personal conduct, but they are scrambling to rethink how to manage the new flood of media attention and online activism when it affects acts on their roster — deservedly or not. Some tell *Billboard* they might take a more proactive approach that would stop short of dropping the artist, which is a "dangerous precedent," according to one top label executive. (Even R. Kelly

wasn't "dropped," sources tell *Billboard*: He agreed to leave in exchange for the rights to his unreleased music that he had recorded under contract at RCA.)

Still, "every label is going to take a long, hard look at their roster after this," says one industry source. "Everybody's going to have to look at certain allegations against people they worked with and signed and feel a new type of moral obligation." Another label executive says the Kelly decision doesn't have much precedent and that "we're all kind of feeling our way through the dark" on how to react to such situations.

The problem, as one music entertainment lawyer wryly puts it, is "the music industry has a high pain threshold for bad behavior." Rule-breaking has always been part of rock'n'roll, and some of music's most iconic acts, from Michael Jackson to Dr. Dre to Led Zeppelin, have had serious accusations of misconduct leveled against them during their careers. And while times have changed, the recent explosive success of

controversial artists like **6ix9ine** and the late **XXXTentacion** has again shown that criminal allegations don't always hurt the bottom line.

"You tolerate bad behavior because some of it brings a lot of attention to the brands," says the lawyer. "And labels are not going to do anything until they have to."

Meanwhile, the Kelly controversy has motivated artists who have worked with him to take the step of removing collaborations from digital music services. On Jan. 9, **Lady Gaga** issued an apology for duetting with Kelly on her 2013 single "Do What U Want," and the song was removed from the internet less than 24 hours later. Other acts are hoping to follow: Céline Dion has moved to take down her chart-topping 1998 duet "I'm Your Angel," while a source says that The Pussycat Dolls are hoping to remove their 2008 collaboration "Out of the Club." Artists like Chance the Rapper and Phoenix also have publicly apologized for working with Kelly.

In this new era, requesting a previously released song to be taken down could become more common — for artists big enough to pull it off. Another industry source says Gaga "wanted to send a message" by removing the track, and her label, Interscope, coordinated with the major platforms to make it happen.

"She needs her brand more than she needs that money," says the lawyer. Gaga is "such a franchise player with the record company that they kind of have to agree with it."

But another music lawyer posits that removing repertoire could have a "damaging" impact on the preservation of modern music. "We have to be careful not to have a snowball effect of this kind of behavior," says the lawyer. "People have done awful, heinous things and are still valid as artists."

Now, the precedent has some asking who might be next and how to protect themselves in the future.

"It's complex, but it's necessary," says Thomas. "If this costs people money, that's a victory for survivors, because it means that going forward—in theory, at least—producers, writers and artists should be very wary about doing business with people like R. Kelly." •



Booking Music's Biggest Night

The Grammys return with a new host, a fresh slate of performers and an age-old mandate

a return to Staples Center in Los
Angeles after a year in New York,
the 61st Grammy Awards on Feb. 10
are focused on presenting "the best three-and-ahalf hours of live musical entertainment we can,"
says Recording Academy president/CEO Neil
Portnow.

This year, amid questions about the Grammys' relevance, the stakes are higher. But the first performers announced were relative newcomers; Cardi B, Camila Cabello, Kacey Musgraves,

Shawn Mendes, Janelle Monáe, H.E.R. and Post Malone will be among those taking the stage. "There are some

incredibly fresh faces [coming] to the Grammys this year," executive producer **Ken Ehrlich** tells *Billboard*.

Keys, a 15-time Grammy winner, will be the first woman to host the show since **Queen Latifah** in 2005, and she says she's looking to uplift the young female nominees. Ehrlich says Keys' wish to do so will likely play a role in the telecast, but that she was hired for her charisma, not her views. "My primary concern for the show is somebody who can get out there and feel comfortable and make the audience comfortable," says Ehrlich. "Alicia is the perfect balance between a musical personality and someone who has the chops to make the show feel inclusive."

The show's producers also hope Keys can raise ratings. 2018's viewership was 19.8 million, down 24 percent from 26.1 million in 2017, according to Nielsen. Ehrlich attributes much of the decline to

the decision to air the show starting at 7:30 p.m. EST. The ceremony will return to its usual 8 p.m. slot this year on CBS.

The performances were divided almost evenly across gender lines in 2018, but the Grammys were heavily criticized after only one woman — best new artist winner **Alessia Cara** — received a statuette onscreen. "You could've had a more diverse group accepting awards on the telecast [in 2018]," says Portnow. "But the fact is we don't know [who wins] until it actually [is announced]." This year's expansion of the "Big Four" categories and the

invitation of 900 younger, more diverse voting members "broadened the ability for artists to be recognized," he says.

Women will also figure into the telecast during a tribute for MusiCares Person of the Year **Dolly Parton** and a salute to **Aretha Franklin**. "There'll be one big tentpole every hour," says **Jack Sussman**, CBS Entertainment executive vp specials, music and live events. "It's an opportunity for us to bring special people into the building."

The 2018 telecast addressed a number of topical issues: **Kesha** referenced the #MeToo movement in a star-studded performance of "Praying," while Cabello spoke of her support for Dreamers when she introduced **U2**.

While winners can make any statement they choose, the commentary that seemed baked into the 2018 show will not return. "Our job is to entertain the audience," says Sussman. "To quote an old movie slogan, 'Sit back, relax and enjoy the show.' That's our mandate."

Streaming 'SZN'

R&B/hip-hop artists have been dominating the charts — while selling hardly any albums

For the week ending Jan. 17,

A Boogie Wit Da Hoodie topped the Billboard 200 for the second week in a row, selling fewer than 1,000 copies of Hoodie SZN each week. That's the first and second time ever that a title has hit No. 1 while missing the four-figure mark. Instead, its success was driven almost entirely by streaming, which accounted for 55,000 of its total 56,000 equivalent album units for the week.

Earlier in January, **21 Savage**'s *IAm > I Was* set a record for the smallest weekly sales total for a No. 1 album, selling 3,000 copies. That means that the three lowest sales weeks for a No. 1 album have been for two 2019 hip-hop releases.

That's not so surprising: Total ondemand audio streams in the United States reached 611 billion in 2018, up 49 percent over the year prior, according to Nielsen Music, while overall physical and digital album sales fell 17.7 percent after a similar decline the year before. With total album-equivalent consumption up 23 percent year over year, streaming gains are outweighing sales losses in

terms of units consumed.

Meanwhile, R&B/hip-hop sales are falling much faster than most. Overall sales were down 17.7 percent in 2018, but R&B/hip-hop's dropped 20.8 percent. As physical sales fell 15.8 percent last year, R&B/ hip-hop cratered 27.8 percent. And for the second year in a row, R&B/hip-hop albums dominated the streaming game: In 2018, the genres accounted for an astounding 25.6 percent of album-equivalent audio consumption and 30 percent of all on-demand streams. (Rock, as the No. 2 genre, had 14.2 percent of on-demand streams.)

As R&B/hip-hop streaming leads the pack, album rollout plans are changing. Boogie's team, for example, says that it prioritized streaming and never even considered manufacturing physical copies when creating the marketing plan for *Hoodie SZN*.

"Nobody does hard copies anymore — it's all about streaming now," says **Quincy "QP" Acheampong**, CEO of Boogie's Atlantic imprint, Highbridge the Label. "If Atlantic asked us if we



wanted to make hard copies, that wouldn't even have been an option. Digital is the way to go. We wouldn't have wasted our time."

In recent years, there have been several big hip-hop and R&B artists who opted for digital-only releases. In 2019, for the first time since the CD was introduced in the early 1980s, two Grammy album of the year nominees never appeared on

CD: **Cardi B**'s *Invasion* of *Privacy* and **H.E.R.**'s self-titled set.

Savage's team says that it, too, prioritized streaming, though Epic insisted on a CD version. "We did physical just to try something we've never done or cared about before," says **Kei Henderson**, Savage's comanager. "The numbers were so low they were just insignificant. Savage is a streaming artist."

Sony Shakes Up U.S. Latin Leadership

Alex Gallardo steps into the top role at the No. 1 label as the genre's boom continues



and another four as managing director—came as a surprise to the Latin music community. (Sony did not give a reason for the change.) But the announcement of Alex Gallardo, 43, as the division's new president at least reinforced its commitment to investing in A&R.

"Sony Music Latin Iberia is the home of artists and will always be," **Afo Verde**, Sony's chairman/CEO of Latin America, Spain and Portugal, tells *Billboard*. "[Gallardo] is a consummate professional, musician, A&R, lover of music and the creative process start to finish."

Gallardo, who spent six years as senior vp A&R for all of the company's regions and is known as firm an

of the company's regions and is known as firm and even, will oversee a staff of nearly 100. "What's important is to understand artists and create the best environment for their creativity," he says. In a statement, **Shakira** called Gallardo a "professional" who is "in touch with the musical landscape and

understands artists." **Ricky Martin** says, "His focus, knowledge and passion makes artists trust the process."

Gallardo says his top priority is to strengthen the U.S. A&R operation and ensure a smooth transition. "The plan is to continue as we were, collaborating," he says. "Nir did a fantastic job. The bar is high." ●

Kenny MacPherson

The career-long publisher on reaching the top 10 of his sector while maintaining a "high touch" with artists

when **Kenny MacPherson**was tour-managing Scottish
comedian **Billy Connolly**, he
got advice that sticks with him to this day.
As he admired the view of the Houses of
Parliament and the River Thames from the
London offices of Connolly's publishers, **Bill Martin** and **Phil Coulter**, Martin told
him, "You know, Kenny, if you want to be
in the music business, get into publishing—
it's a gentleman's game."

The Big Deal Music Group founder/

president recalls taking in the picturesque surroundings and thinking, "This ain't half bad, is it?"

Publishing is a "penny business," says MacPherson, 63, that has turned into a "fraction of a penny" business, which he was drawn to by a love of music while growing up in Scotland, where he realized he was more adept at organizing gigs than performing them. Sitting at his desk today at Big Deal's Encino, Calif., offices, he recalls failed attempts at writing songs with his high school

bandmates before he ultimately pivoted to a management role. "I was fascinated by the fact that people could do it," he says. "Still am today."

After working with Connolly, MacPherson took Martin's advice and got into publishing, forming Redhead Music Publishing before joining Warner/ Chappell in 1989 to run the company's New York outpost. In 2001, he joined Chrysalis Music as president of its North American division. MacPherson and his team — including future Big Deal co-founders Jamie Cerreta and Dave **Ayers** — built up the catalog, signing My Morning Jacket, OutKast, TV on the Radio, St. Vincent, Afghan Whigs, **Thom Yorke** and others, until BMG bought the parent company in 2010. That pushed MacPherson to strike out on his own again, founding Big Deal the following year for what he expects will be his "last rodeo."

"My experience at other publishing companies was really good, but they were corporations, and I came from starting my own business. So my journey has come full circle where I wanted to be an owner again," he says. "I wanted to build a place that was culturally significant and great for people to work, where manners, courtesy and high touch are important."

"Nothing would make me happier than if we could leave a legacy," says MacPherson, photographed Jan. 10 at Big Deal Music in Los Angeles. "Then they can just roll me out in a chair to tell stories."

Is publishing still a "gentleman's game"?

That depends on your definition of a gentleman. I have met really caring men and women in music publishing who really believe in what they do and are very committed. There's always hucksters and fly-by-nights in any business, but I love publishing, and I think people have tried

longer approach: Find new talent, develop that and break it. Risky business. So you need to put your seat belt on, because it's not easy. And there are moments when you're white-knuckling it, like, "Whoa, got to get this done." We haven't gone and raised hundreds of millions of dollars to acquire catalog or do anything like that. I don't think there's

of talent five-and-a-half years in, and we built the company so far across certain genres of music. You have to walk before you can run, and we are moving into what I would call alternative urban music, kind of like the way we signed alternative bands — a lot of our pop songwriters were in alternative bands and have become amazing pop songwriters.

We just started to work with Mick
Jenkins and Phoelix, who co-produced
the Noname record, and we work with a
couple of young chaps called Two Fresh
Beats. But people get too caught up in
labeling and tend to put people in boxes.
I've had people say to me, "How come
you got this person together with that
person?" You're putting them in a box.
They're human beings, songwriters,
artists. Let them get in a room, let them
talk about music, let them decide if
they're going to pick up an instrument.

really hard to make sure that songwriters get paid appropriately. There's a lot of work still to do and there are steps to that, but I think the [Music Modernization Act] is super important. It's the first time in a long time that everybody from all sides got on the same page. Maybe our government could take a lesson.

With the MMA passed, what's the biggest issue facing songwriters?

Songwriters' health insurance. I think there might be a system where all the publishers or the performing rights societies worldwide took a percentage of their gross earnings and put it into a health fund. People smarter than me will figure it out, but I just think a world without songs would be a very dull place. Some form of universal health care for songwriters is an essential thing, ultimately.

How does your vision for Big Deal compare with other companies making aggressive deals right now?

Big Deal started as a very A&R- and artist-centric company. Kind of the

anything wrong with that. There's no one-size-fits-all.

We are financially limited because of the size of the company at the moment, but our imaginations and desires and ambitions are not limited. We have to grow a certain way. Publishing is a very cash-intensive business, and it takes a while. We've had a lot of success, we've grown relatively quickly, and all along the way you need to be able to look in the mirror and say, "OK, what have we got right? What have we got wrong? Where are we going? What's our bandwidth?" before you lose that high touch. You know, the balance of being a high-touch company that can become commercially viable — that's the goal.

How does hip-hop — music's most popular genre — play into that vision? We've sort of gathered this beachhead

For the past couple of years, Big Deal has consistently ranked among the top 10 publishers for market share.
What can you discern from that?

What it means is we're having hits. People spend a lot of time dogging what other people are doing. It's a waste of energy. What we need is a strong publishing business that will support songwriters, and there's enough to go around. There's always competition, but how about first and foremost being in competition with yourself, to be the best you can at your job and serve your clients the best you can?

Country For Kids

As the 30th annual Country Cares for St. Jude Kids charity fundraising initiative gets underway, the battle against childhood cancer continues

AKING ON A TASK AS COMPLEX AS eradicating childhood cancer deaths would be daunting for any group and could easily become demoralizing. But that has been the quest of St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, and thanks to a long-standing partnership with the country music industry, it has made big strides in the 30 years the two have worked toward that goal.

This year is the 30th anniversary of the Country Cares for St. Jude Kids radio program. The campaign was launched in 1989 with the help of **Alabama** lead singer **Randy Owen**, who headed up an initiative asking country radio stations nationwide to donate two days of airtime in order to raise funds for St. Jude. Since then, the campaign has grown to include other radio formats, attracted acts like **Keith Urban**, **Lady Antebellum** and **Tim McGraw** and amassed donations totaling over \$800 million.

Held each year in Memphis, the Country Cares Seminar began Jan. 24 and features stations involved in the annual St. Jude Radiothon coming together to share ideas on how to maintain the charity drive's success. It also includes performances and award presentations from surprise musical guests and a tour of St. Jude and one of its housing facilities, allowing a look at how the money raised touches lives.

"I've said it many times over the years," says Owen. "You couldn't contribute to a better cause, because you're part of a worldwide effort. The research that they do at St. Jude is shared all around the world. I don't understand medicine, but I understand what it does, and that is save the lives of children."

The alliance between St. Jude and the country music industry has contributed to the remarkable increase of the overall childhood cancer survival rate, both from the treatments created at the Memphis-based hospital and those that other cancer centers around the world perform, with the information given freely by St. Jude. In the 50-plus years the hospital has been open, the survival rate has grown from 20 percent to more than 80 percent.

While that is great news for many, **Rick Shadyac**, president/CEO of ALSAC, the fundraising and awareness organization for St. Jude, points out that the 20 percent mortality rate still touches a significant number of families.

"Despite all the progress we've made, the simple fact remains that cancer is still the leading cause of death by disease in U.S. kids today," says Shadyac. "[But] I can't think of another industry that has a more meaningful impact on a charitable cause like country music has had on St. Jude Children's Research Hospital." •

I Am The Highway: A Tribute To Chris Cornell

INGLEWOOD, CALIF., JAN. 16

HOW CAN YOU FULLY HONOR CHRIS CORNELL — THE Soundgarden/Audioslave frontman and solo artist who died in May 2017 at age 52 — in a single evening? The answer was to pack The Forum in Inglewood, Calif., with some of the world's top rockers for the I Am the Highway tribute concert. Metallica ripped through renditions of early Soundgarden songs like "Head Injury" and "All Your Lies," while Foo Fighters' Dave **Grohl** dedicated a tear-jerking take of "Everlong" to his departed friend. The most affecting moments of the night came from those who had been closest to him, such as when Cornell's daughter, Toni, moved the crowd with a tender cover of **Bob Marley**'s "Redemption Song" alongside Marley's eldest son, **Ziggy**. As Soundgarden and Pearl Jam drummer Matt Cameron said during his introduction: "There's so much I miss about Chris, but what I miss most is him walking into a room. Chris is with us tonight. He's got the best seat in the house." -corbin reiff





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"WE GET PEGGED AS BEING EMO and death-obsessed," says Conor Oberst, gesturing to singersongwriter Phoebe Bridgers with his half-finished milkshake. "Things that we are," she counters with a grin. On a dreary December day, Oberst and Bridgers are at a Pasadena, Calif., diner discussing Better Oblivion Community Center, their supersecret collaboration and the band's surprise new self-titled album.

It's not actually such a surprise that the former **Bright Eyes** boy wonder, 38, and the newly minted prodigy, 24, would decide to pool their respective sadness. But it is unusual for an independent rock act to drop an album unannounced. "We were trying to leave a trail of breadcrumbs," says Phil Waldorf, co-founder and head of marketing for Dead Oceans, Bridgers' and the band's label. (Oberst is currently indie.) Those breadcrumbs included mystery-stoking social media missives, pamphlets left in record stores and one Los Angeles bus bench advertising the Scientologyesque name and a phone number where the outgoing message is from country-folk singer Christian Lee Hutson, with whom the artists worked, posing as a reverend.

The idea came from Bridgers, who acknowledges that surprise album drops have become a staple in hip-hop. Oberst points out that **Radiohead** did the same with its 2007 release of *In Rainbows*. But, he admits, "We are rolling the dice for sure. We're not nearly as famous."

(Similarly, Robert Earl Keen and Randy Rogers independently released their secret collab as The Stryker Brothers in September.)

On their album, Oberst and Bridgers' confessional storytelling is front and center, but amplified by contributions from Yeah Yeah Yeahs guitarist Nick Zinner and members of Dawes, it has a harder sound than one might expect. It's wistful, but with bleating synths ("Exceptions to the Rule") and distorted, guitar-driven duets ("Big Black Heart"). Oberst jokingly calls it "the 2019 version of the Sheryl Crow Tuesday Night Music Club," referencing the ad hoc group of musicians who worked on Crow's 1993 debut of the same name.

Oberst — who has been releasing music since before Bridgers was born and whose 20-something albums with various outfits have amassed over 43.4 million on-demand streams, according to Nielsen Music — first caught one of her performances in 2016 at a secret showcase he hosted at Los Angeles' Bootleg Theater.

"I committed a cardinal sin that night," he says, recalling how he dug the last song of her set without realizing it was a cover of **Elliott Smith**'s "Whatever (Folk Song in C)."
She interjects: "He was like, 'No, that's not Elliott Smith. I know Elliott Smith's songs.' "They both laugh at his botched attempt at mansplaining. They have a sibling-like rapport: Bridgers, with her typically platinum hair now tinted periwinkle, is playful and teasing while Oberst, smelling faintly of cigarettes, readily plays

His Role

"My job was to take the creative idea and square it with how that works within commerce," says Waldorf, who founded the Dead Oceans label in 2007. "We kept this under wraps eight weeks more than we typically would. We would have a song at radio right now, and we don't. We thought we could make a moment out of this."

The Challenge

"We wanted the wondering that goes on in places like Reddit or Facebook, but we didn't want fans to have the whole story. It's hard to control: letting publicists do their jobs while having information embargoed on a global scale. You have to trust they're corresponding with people who will adhere [to it]."

along. An L.A. native from a musical family, Bridgers discovered Oberst when she was in eighth grade, circa Bright Eyes' 2007 album, *Cassadaga*. "I hope you paid for it," says Oberst.

"No, LimeWire," she quips.
After the showcase, Oberst
guested on a track for Bridgers'
2017 debut, Stranger in the Alps.
Since then, they have been casually
working on their own album in spurts
in Los Angeles, even writing together
— a first for them both, despite
past collaborations. For Monsters
of Folk, Oberst's group with Mike
Mogis, M. Ward and Jim James,
he would solitarily draft songs to
workshop later; as would Bridgers
for her boygenius side project with
fellow singer-songwriters Julien

Baker and Lucy Dacus.

"If I write when I'm really emotional, I'll write one of the bad **Taylor Swift** songs," says Bridgers. "I love Taylor, but every once in a while, she's overly sincere." And that's where Oberst came in. "Once Christian and I were struggling with a song while Conor was tripping mushrooms in the other room," she recalls. "Then he walked in completely out of his mind and wrote the entire thing."

They had only one disagreement, over the tambourine-forward jam "My City." Oberst heard it as early **R.E.M.** pseudo-funk, while Bridgers pushed for something more nuanced. Bridgers won. Having an elder statesman defer to her was a pleasant change of pace. "On my album, I [lost] a lot of arguments or didn't stick with an idea because nobody else really saw it," she says. (Her standout single "Motion Sickness" is about a regrettable fling with 44-year-old Ryan Adams, on whose label she released her first 7-inch in 2015.) "Men have a really special knack for being fucking assholes," she says. "My bad experiences didn't make me generalize, but it certainly taught me what sort of people to avoid."

She likes that Oberst isn't jaded, and learned from him not to worry about taking a formulated trajectory. He says that working with Bridgers taught him to slow down and be more discerning.

"I taught you patience?" she responds, laughing.

"Is that a meme?" he asks warily.

"It's an **Ariana Grande** lyric," she explains, referring to the chorus of "Thank U, Next." He rolls his eyes. •

'I PUSHED THE ENVELOPE'

On **Eminem**'s Grammy-nominated 2018 song, "Lucky You," 30-year-old **Joyner Lucas** raps: "All my life I want a Grammy but I'll prolly never get it." Now the Massachusetts native is up for two — best rap song and best music video — for his own track, the controversial "I'm Not Racist." (It begins with a white man in a Make America Great Again hat spitting off racial stereotypes and slurs at a young black man.) He wrote, directed, shot, edited and released the video in one week.

How do you think a Grammy win could change the course of your career?

It's like winning a degree. I look at it like you go to school, become a doctor, get a Ph.D.—you work for that. That's an actual degree you can feel, touch, put on your wall. You show people, "This is what I've earned." A Grammy is a symbol of what would be a musical degree. That's something that no one could ever take away from me. That just puts you in [another] conversation. It gives you a whole new level of respect.


The video for "I'm Not Racist" was polarizing — what message did you want to convey?

We have to live in a world with people that we don't like. We have opinions that we don't agree on. But we still [have] to live together. And we have to figure out how we're going to continue to live together under the same roof. That's the message I wanted to convey: "Let's agree to disagree and move on."

Are you and your team campaigning for the Grammy?

Nah. I feel like "I'm Not Racist" changed a lot of things, and it caused a lot of damage and opened up room for conversations. Like I pushed the envelope for people like **Childish Gambino** to come out and make "This Is America." I feel like I made him comfortable enough to make a record like that. I love that video. I think he's going to win [best music video] — I hope he wins it. But

Either I win or I
don't. If I don't, I'm
grateful that I was
even a part of it.



I'm an independent artist now. No label deal. No publishing

deal. Going through life as a signed artist, I started realizing a lot of these things I could be doing on my own. That's no disrespect to the label. It just means so much more to not have anything else tied to your art besides you, for you to own 100 percent of everything that you do and not have someone else's entity, label or name tied to it.



OR DECADES, MOST BOX SETS WERE JUST THAT: CDS IN BOXES. BUT NOW, AS streaming continues to take over and normal CD sales decline, box sets and collectors' editions account for a growing share of the revenue from physical music, and labels are tapping into the creative potential of tactile accourrements. Of the five nominated for best boxed or special limited edition package at this year's Grammys, two stand out for their elaborate presentation: Squeeze Box: The Complete Works of "Weird Al" Yankovic (Annie Stoll, Meghan Foley and Yankovic are up for the award) and the 19-CD Grateful Dead set Pacific Northwest '73-'74: The Complete Recordings (Lisa Glines, Doran Tyson and Roy Henry Vickers).







We're Foreign To This

Famous major-label acts like **Ozzy Osbourne**, **Metallica** and **Slipknot** have long dominated the best metal performance category at the Grammy **Awards**. But this year the field is more in tune with the underground: Four of the five nominated acts are signed to independent labels, including first-time nominee **Deafheaven** (ANTI-). The San Francisco band, which formed in 2010, earned a nod for its *Ordinary Corrupt Human Love* track "Honeycomb," an 11-minute primer on its experimental sound.

Vision of fame

The daughter of Albanian immigrants, Ava

impressed even her mother, a trained opera
singer, she realized her budding talent could

She struggled locally.


For three years, Ava Max was unable to break into the Los Angeles scene. But her luck changed when she sang "Happy Birthday" to producer Cirkut (Miley Cyrus, Katy Perry) at a dinner party and he was blown away. He and Ava Max soon released a demo on SoundCloud that caught the attention of Atlantic, which signed Ava Max in 2017. Last October, Full Stop Management's Jeffrey Azoff and Tommy Bruce signed her as a management client. She credits her immigrant background for her perseverance: "You learn to be strong from the get-go."


...but broke through across the globe

In 2018, Ava Max released the singles "My Way" and "Not Your Barbie Girl" and collaborated with **David Guetta** and **Jason Derulo**. But it's "Sweet but Psycho," her sticky pop hit about embracing every side of your personality, that earned her mainstream attention — it reached No. 1 in 15 countries and No. 36 on the Billboard Hot 100. "Everybody has dualities to them," she says, a concept that also inspired her signature asymmetrical hair, which she cut herself.

Native flair

Ava Max is set on bringing the same spunk of "Sweet but Psycho" to her live shows in 2019. She has taken a few acting classes in preparation — "People need an experience," she says. "That's what I'm trying to bring." As for her upcoming full-length debut, due midyear, expect a song with Albanian woven in. "This whole album is really who I am. That's how people are going to relate to me."

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GARDEN OF CREATIVITY

New Brooklyn studio Electric Garden has already hosted D'Angelo and James Blake

N 1986, DREW VOGELMAN, A DRUMMER and an engineer, opened his first studio, Dessau Recording, in Manhattan. (It closed in 1999.) Twenty-five years later, when his son, Lucas, wanted to learn the business, Vogelman set up his wall of analog gear at their home in Brooklyn. The Garden was born.

Vogelman was soon inspired to expand the space, an idea he attributes to his friend and business partner, Grammy-winning engineer and producer Ben Kane (D'Angelo). And when in 2015 the two stumbled upon a former bean-sprout factory in Williamsburg, the idea found a home.

"A studio is a weird beast," says Kane. "You're trying to get inspired by the space — and make something inspiring at the same time." They enlisted visual artist Missy Ablin, who helped design the studio with circular shapes to channel feminine energy, says Kane, and installed a wobbling wooden circle above the mixing desk (think psychedelic redwood donut). Another artist, Danny Ebru, made floor panels and wall coverings with a Turkish dipping practice using oil and water. The rooms are



packed with analog gear that Vogelman has been collecting since the 1980s, including a Studer 2-inch tape deck, the kind of machine that studios were ditching 10 years ago. Adds Kane: "The whole [place] is a piece of art."

Vogelman, 57, and Kane, 35, who raised \$50,000 through Kickstarter, estimate that the actual cost of getting Electric Garden up and running as closer to half a million. (Kane says that at least 10 people did work for cost "just to contribute.") "You don't look at business plans and say, 'Hey, I want to open a studio to make money," "says Vogelman. "You'd be better off opening a laundromat."

The studio will officially open in March but has already hosted a slew of top talent: D'Angelo began sessions for his forthcoming album; James Blake dropped by to work in December; and Grammynominated R&B star H.E.R. is slated for February.

How did the studio land such top talent? Kane credits it to the overall vibe and the surplus of gear and instruments. "Why do something like this if you're not going to do it absolutely right?" he says. "It's a crazy idea to begin with." •







What didn't BILLBOARD ANYTHING make it into the Fyre festival documentaries?

Netflix and Huly recently released separate documentaries on the Fyre festival, the failed 2017 Bahamas music event that went viral after attendees tweeted photos of cheese sandwiches and hurricane tents that were their promised "luxury" food and housing. Though in-depth, both films - Netflix's Fyre. The Greatest Party That Never Happened, executive-produced by Jerry Media creator Elliot Tebele, who was involved in the festival; and Hultu's Fyre Fraud, in part produced by former Billboard executives prompted fresh questions.
 Among them: How did founder Billy McFarland spend the \$26 million he raised from investors? "He Rept Wimbst no business records, [so] it's going to take three years to figure it all out, "says **Dave** Brooks, Billboard's senior correspondent for touring and live entertainment, with appeared in Hulu's doc. In the meantime, courts are also looking into whether acts billed to perform (including Major Lazer, blink-182 and Migos) should repay the \$1.4 million they collectively received in advances from Fyre (talent agency Paradigm received the largest, at \$690,000). Meanwhile, other scams have followed in Fyre's wake. The indudural 2018 luxury XO Festival in Northern California was canceled after promoters failed to fulfill contractual obligations (its organizers had been arrested for fraud months earlier). "The festival business operates on trust, which makes individuals like McFarland dangerous," says Brooks. "The industry is more careful about who it does business with, but there will always be an unpredictable nature to live music."

ARGO PRICE IS FIVE months pregnant, so it's a bit confusing when I meet her at a low-lit sushi spot in West Hollywood where the menu is loaded with

mercury. But as it turns out, Price didn't pick the restaurant: Her pal, and our dinner date, Brandi Carlile, did.

"I've got you," Carlile reassures her as we slide into a booth. She speaks with a tender, mama-bear drawl that commands authority. "I know this menu front and back."

"Knew it!" says Price, happily tossing the leather folio onto the table. "Do your thing."

Within minutes, a rainbow spread of fresh vegetables, cooked fish, cocktails (a Rockin' Cucumber for Carlile) and mocktails ("something spicy with lime and ginger!" for Price) arrives, some of which is on the menu, some of which is not. "I'm pretty good," admits Carlile. "I love to order for the table. It's a problem. I pick out all the dishes and then forget to eat because I'm too caught up in seeing what people like."

"She does," says Price with a nod. "Just go with it."

The pair first met in 2016, when Price, then an emerging voice in Nashville's outlaw country scene, opened for the seasoned Seattle folk singer in upstate New York. They bonded over a bottle of whiskey in the greenroom (they were both drinking more back then, they say) and recognized in each other a kindred resilience shaped by hardship: Carlile's gut-wrenching ballads have traced her battles with poverty and addiction, while Price's honky-tonk meditations have mourned the loss of her family's farm and, in 2010, one of her children. (Ezra, one of Price's twin boys, died a couple of weeks after birth from a heart ailment.)

In person, Carlile, 37, exudes a mixture of toughness and earnestness, while Price, 35, is more lighthearted, with an infectious laugh. But at their core as artists, they have a lot in common. Both are plainspoken, clear-eyed songwriters who veer between folk, rock, country and Americana; write vividly about loss; and — like their staunchly feminist forebears Joni Mitchell, Joan Baez and Patti Smith — view activism as an artistic duty. "Our honesty, struggle and perseverance seem to resonate with, and maybe represent, some of America right now," says Carlile. "People want to hear real stories."



Clearly, The Recording Academy agreed: Both artists, far from the mainstream though they may be, are up for big honors at the 2019 Grammys. Price is one of six female acts nominated for best new artist, honoring her second album, *All American Made*. And Carlile, who will perform at the show on Feb. 10, is the most nominated woman of all, with nods

in six categories, including album of the year (for *By the Way, I Forgive You*, her third Billboard 200 top 10 entry), song of the year and record of the year (her tearjerker of a misfit anthem "The Joke"). She also has nominations for best Americana album, best American roots song and best American roots performance. "It must be one of the greatest anomalies in the history

of the awards that I've been nominated in this many categories," says Carlile. Price shakes her head and leans in: "This is proof that people are yearning for honest music."

Carlile and Price have always engaged with politics in their music, and as mothers with young children — Carlile has two young daughters, Elijah and Evangeline, with her wife, Catherine Shepherd, and Price has son Judah with her husband, Jeremy Ivey — they've become even more firmly dedicated to the resistance. At dinner, Price wears a leather jacket covered in pins: a gold star that says "feminist," a buffalo roaming the plains and a Native American woman emblazoned with the words "The Earth Does Not Belong to Us."

"We have to be a voice for what we believe in," says Price, and recently she and Carlile — both of whom had their best touring years as headliners in 2018 — so. The weekend before the Grammys, Price was to perform at Carlile's inaugural Girls Just Wanna music festival in Mexico alongside Indigo Girls, Maren Morris and Patty Griffin, among others. "I have so many girlfriends who will be there," says Price, who later had to cancel. Carlile lights up.

"I have these matriarch tendencies. My grandmother did too," she explains. "Everybody comes to my house for the holidays. I just love it. I want to lift other women up. I want to put bands together, I want to produce records, I want to curate lineups, you know? That's just who I am. I want to order for the table."

The two of you have been good friends for a few years now. Did you feel an immediate kinship when you met?

have done just that onstage together. In July, they played a cover of Dolly Parton's anthem of women's empowerment, "9 to 5," at the Newport Folk Festival. "Love this, ladies!" Parton later tweeted with a blue butterfly emoji, to which Price, whose voice is often compared to Parton's, replied, "Ahhhhhhh! This made my day/ week/year/life!" In September, they sang it again on the roof of Third Man Records, Price's hometown label in Nashville (Carlile is signed to Elektra Records), as part of Americanafest. Earlier that evening, they had attended the Americana Awards — where not a single woman won. "That night was odd," says Carlile, shaking her head. "But I felt a change in the room happen right then. I said, 'Something's going to happen at the Grammys."

Whether they win or not, the prospect of collaborating with more women seems to be just as exciting to the duo, if not more

I wanted to hear somebody that was loud and fierce and able to hold their ground, who had real grit and who could just deliver on all levels — emotionally, intellectually, vocally. Margo could. You can hear her strength on her records. That is not a tiny voice.

That must have felt refreshing.

PRICE Definitely. The air in the room is different when two women respect each other. It was refreshing to go out and open for someone who was not from mainstream male country. Now, every time we bump into each other, we wind up singing together.

You've been singing Dolly Parton's "9 to 5." Why that song?

PRICE It feels timely.

CARLILE Will you be pissed if I cover that a couple times? I love singing it with you so much that now I want to do it [myself].

PRICE Hell no! Go for it. I think everyone should be singing that. It has been more than 30 years since it came out, and it feels every bit as pertinent.

It sounds like you were both partying pretty hard when you met. What changed?

price At some point you've got to be a grown-up. In college I could drink these football players under the table, and it was a party trick. Then I started smoking weed, but then after I got to Nashville and was floundering — I couldn't get anywhere in the music business and then I lost my child — I started drinking again because it numbed the pain. I had a wake-up call when I hit a telephone pole and tried to outrun the cops. That was about five years ago.

And now you've developed a strain of cannabis with Willie Nelson. Was that part of a larger lifestyle change?

PRICE Yeah. Ironically, I was pregnant when it came out, so I can't even smoke it. I have it saved and sealed at home. After this pregnancy, I'm going to roll a Snoop Dogg-size blunt.

You both became mothers after many years of building your careers. Did motherhood change you as artists?

CARLILE It changed everything. It has made me so spiritually happy, and as an artist, that doesn't look like what I thought it would. I was worried about where I'd find my friction, my tension, my sadness as a mother. But my bandmate Tim [Hanseroth] said, 'When you're happy, you can do everything better, even write sad songs.' And it's true. I've written some of the saddest shit and had some of the most intense, angsty performances post-motherhood than any other time. Motherhood has set me free.

PRICE I've been trying to make it in the music business for 16 years, and it wasn't

music business for 16 years, and it wasn't until three or four years ago that things took off for me. But when I became a mother eight years ago, other musicians would ask me, "So, you going to quit now?" I was like, "No, I'm not going to quit!" It drove me nuts. Nothing lights a

fire underneath me like wanting to prove people wrong.

CARLILE Before Evangeline was born, I did an interview that still upsets me to this day. They said, "Good luck with the whole motherhood thing but, you know, don't lose your edge." Jesus Christ. Fucking edge? What are you talking about?

PRICE The shit that comes out of people's mouths when you're expecting. Recently a friend told me this pregnancy could "ruin my career."

CARLILE Three words: Prove them wrong.

These Grammy nominations must feel especially good after that.

PRICE I'm thrilled. I'm even more thrilled for Brandi because, I mean, album of the fucking year! It just means more for everybody — everybody who makes authentic music, every woman on her own path.

CARLILE Listen, I've been doing this for a long time — it's not like I didn't put in the work — but I'm the smallest artist to have been nominated at this level in a really long time. To say it's an honor doesn't serve how mystical it is. It speaks to the soul of our community and what change they want to see.

Both of you write what are often labeled as protest songs. Do you think of them that way?

PRICE What did Bob Dylan say? Something like, "All my songs are protest songs." I don't mind them being labeled that way, because ultimately they're songs written during and about a humanitarian crisis in America. I was moved from an early age to write songs for the underdog, whether it's middle-class Americans, farmers or kids who need to feel safe in school. I believe artists have a duty to be a voice for what we believe in.

exist in the artistic community three years ago. As a gay woman approaching 40 who was married before it was legal, to say it's refreshing is an understatement. Do I hate what's happening in Washington? Do I feel ashamed of the White House? Absolutely. But I'm more inspired than ever by my sisters and activists who've realized that this shit — these deportations, this institutionalized racism, institutionalized sexism, institutionalized homophobia — has been going on for way too long.

A few years ago, I was doing a photo shoot at this older woman's bar out in the country. She says to me, "Do you mind a little criticism from an old lesbian?" I'm like, "Sure." She says, "Your generation, you lack purpose. You think progress

A TALE OF TWO CAMPAIGNS

A nomination is only half the battle: Since Dec. 7 — and, really, long before then — Carlile, Price and their teams at Elektra Records and Third Man Records, respectively, have been planning every step toward a Grammy win. And though they're up for different awards, both have carefully strategized approaches in progress, aimed at educating voters and expanding their listenerships.

PLAY THE LONG GAME

Carlile's By the Way, I Forgive You was released in February 2018, so her team focused on keeping attention on it throughout the past year. "That's always a challenge," says Elektra president Gregg Nadel. "Whether it was an NPR piece or launching at triple A radio or a new video or an Austin City Limits livestream, [we wanted to] come up with something every month that we were driving to."

Because Price's album arrived in late October 2017, and because

she's up for best new artist, her mission wasn't to remind, but to inform: "She's still answering a lot of the questions she would get during the first album" rollout, says Third Man co-founder Ben Swank.

DON'T JUMP THE GUN

The music video for Carlile's "Party of One," starring Elisabeth Moss, was "done and in the can" ahead of the nominations, according to Nadel, but her team held it because the video for Carlile's duet version with Sam Smith had just dropped. The strategy worked perfectly — once Carlile's nods were announced, her team had a new piece of content to launch the following week.

After Price's nomination, Swank started retargeting her catalog with her label's distributors and digital service providers, increasing Price's presence on playlists, in stores and on radio. "She's a musician and singer, and we want to keep things focused on that," he says.

BRANCH OUT

Carlile's on a major label and Price is on an indie, which affects how their teams view the next stage of exposure before the show. "We are trying to hit every target and expose [Carlile's album] to as many different audiences as possible," says Nadel. Prior to Carlile's nominations, she appeared on Ellen and The Howard Stern Show for the first time. "Not something [you think of] when you start a campaign for a Brandi Carlile record," says Nadel of the latter, which encouraged him to explore all opportunities going forward.

Price's team is likewise pushing her to do press with outlets outside her home genre of country, but they know where to draw the line. "If all of a sudden [Margo is] glammed up on a million different advertisements, I don't think that scans well," says Swank. "We don't swing the same way as the majors. We act very instinctually."

Is that in part because it's difficult to speak out in the music business?

price Completely. The industry wants to silence it. Everybody wants music to be a distraction. I wrote "All American Made" during the Obama administration, and originally the line at the end was "I wonder if the president gets much sleep at night/And if folks on welfare are making it all right." Given the weight of the election and how it turned out, the song suddenly had a different gravity, so we changed the lyric to "I wonder how the president gets any sleep at night/If the folks down by the border are making it all right."

CARLILE It's prophetic, isn't it? **PRICE** Kind of creepy.

CARLILE I've said it before and I'll say it again: Margo has committed country music suicide.

PRICE I've always known my songs would not be accepted in Nashville, and for a long time they weren't. My first band, Secret Handshake, was inspired by The Kinks and their social and political messages. People hated it. We cleared rooms. But if you don't speak up, who will? **CARLILE** It all comes back to representation, which is a problem everywhere but especially in country music and especially at festivals. If my kids were teenagers and wanted to go to Bonnaroo, I'd say, "Let me see the poster." If women weren't headlining at least half of that thing, I'd say no. Not just because of politics, not on principle, but for safety. Representation creates an environment where women can feel at ease.

Are you pleased with the steps The Recording Academy has taken to improve representation?

CARLILE I think [outgoing academy president/CEO] Neil Portnow's exit is well-timed, and his "step up" statement was awful. But I don't think he should go down in history as a misogynist, which is an important distinction. Having said



that, the word "representation" can't be used enough, because for some people it's life or death. For queer kids, it's life or death. For me, it was life or death. When I was introduced to the Indigo Girls, k.d. lang, Freddie Mercury, George Michael or my hero Elton John, I realized this other "accepted" way of life didn't have

to be my life. I didn't have to wear the right clothes and/or say the right things or have a man. That's why it's so important.

How did you find out about your nominations? And more importantly, how did you celebrate?

PRICE Obviously I didn't drink or smoke

a giant joint. (*Motions to belly*.) Actually, I called Brandi and told her to drink a glass of champagne for me.

CARLILE Which I did.

PRICE (Winking.) I'm sure you drank maybe two for me.

CARLILE We toasted to you, too! We said, "To Margo." I found out at 5:31 a.m., and by 6:30 I had three emails from Elton John, who has been my hero since I was 11. I was him for Halloween every year. I wore homemade Elton John jewelry. My shoes said "EJ." There wasn't a single piece of my bedroom wall that didn't have his face on it. The end of every one of my records is dedicated to Elton John. The first email was, "Congratulations on your nomination, no one deserves it better than you." The second goes, "Multiple noms? Oh, my God!" The third goes, "I can't believe you can't hear me screaming from Atlanta, Georgia!" And at the end, he said, "'The Joke' is my 'Madness.'" Anyone who knows me cries when they hear that, because they know how much it means to me.

Did a part of you wonder: Why now? Why this year? Why this record?

CARLILE I made a resolution last January to change gears. After a cycle of summer touring, I was starting to feel like we were becoming a beer-garden band. We only played our uptempo stuff and shaped our setlists around which songs would make the beer drinkers stand up and clap. It fucked with my writing. After a couple of epiphany concerts and that epiphany election, I resolved to write about the things I hadn't confronted yet — healing from addiction and poverty, institutionalized homophobia, the trauma of becoming a gay mom. I think that's why this record is different. PRICE Similarly, I like to think the differentiating factor was that I wrote honestly. I wasn't afraid if the songs exposed who I was or if it was ugly. I had hid a lot of things from my family; when I got my DUI, I hid it from everyone back

Scott's third studio album, Astroworld (Epic/Grand Hustle/Cactus Jack), topped the Billboard 200 last August for the first two weeks of its release, then returned to the top spot for a third week in December. He scored his first No. 1 on the

Billboard Hot 100 with "Sicko Mode" featuring Drake (after more than 20 weeks on the chart, it has dropped to only No. 3). And Scott kicked off the year by becoming a father, with girlfriend Kylie Jenner, to perhaps the most famous baby of 2018, daughter Stormi.

Already, Scott has two major moments to look forward to in 2019: On Feb. 3, he'll perform alongside Maroon 5 and Big Boi at the Super Bowl LIII halftime show (with the stipulation that the NFL partner with him in donating \$500,000 to the social justice organization Dream Corps). And just a week later, he'll attend the Grammys as a first-time nominee, for best rap album (for Astroworld), best rap performance and best rap song (for "Sicko Mode"). Recording Academy recognition is long-awaited for Scott: After his 2016 album, Birds in the Trap Sing McKnight, failed to score any nods, he admitted that "one day, hopefully, people might finally catch on." He took a break from a recent studio session to reflect on "finally feel[ing] recognized on that scale" and the evolution of the Grammys' rap representation.

At this point in your career, is a Grammy nomination important to you?

Making the best music is important. It's always dope to be noticed for your work, but you always just have to remember that as long as you're making the best music, touching fans and moving spirits, that's what we all do it for.

Flash back to 2016, when *Birds in the Trap Sing McKnight* was snubbed. What were your expectations for that album versus *Astroworld*?

I go in on making music. [Birds] was my second album. At some point I was just hoping to be recognized by The [Recording] Academy. But I went back in for [Astroworld] and just tried to make good music. [Getting nominated] wasn't driving me in my mind. It's just something that kind of like, happened.

Do you think there's something specific about "Sicko Mode" that got the Grammy voters' attention?

I've always made songs with different moods and [beat] switches. It's how I feel a song should rock. To see that song ["Sicko Mode"] be nominated is definitely dope.

The Grammys haven't always recognized the full spectrum of hip-hop, but this year's rap album nominees — from Pusha T to Mac Miller to yourself — seem especially diverse. Has something changed?

Maybe people are getting more attuned, tapping more into this generation and the youthfulness of music. It's so diverse and so spread across the U.S., the world and all different types of genres. Kids are driving it, so it's showing what they're listening to. It's dope to see a mix of different people get more recognized for their music now.



WINNER'S CIRCLE

By most measures, 32-year-old singer, rapper and bandleader Anderson .Paak is at the top of his game. He has been mentored by Dr. Dre, opened for Beyoncé, been featured in ads for Google, Apple and Amazon and made a live-wire December debut on Saturday Night Live. But he has another secret weapon: the support of some of the music biz's most powerful executives. Last March, he became the first act signed to 12 Tone, the label backed by Tim Cook's Apple and run by Doug Morris and Steve Bartels, and more recently picked up management from father/son power duo Irving and Jeffrey Azoff. Now, he has scored his third Grammy nomination, for best rap performance for "Bubblin" - all without ever entering the top 10 of any major Billboard chart. "I guess the biggest thing is just patience, man, and maintaining relationships," he says — like those with these leaders who've helped map out his path to stardom. - DAN RYS

Dre, who executive-produced Anderson .Paak's latest album, *Oxnard*, met him in 2015, when working with the artist on Dre's own *Compton*. "He has given me a lot of advice as far as what to do with the people who help with your business," says Anderson .Paak. "Making sure you run audits, just making sure you're aware of everything that's going on with your monthlies, that you're signing your own checks."

Miller, a two-decade industry veteran, helped the artist form his own record label, OBE, and negotiate deals to license his music in ads and expand his reach. "He taught me things like, 'When you sign with people it's a partnership,' " says Anderson .Paak. "You don't necessarily want to take a big advance in the beginning; if anything, you want to try to get a joint venture. You want to have them invest in your own company."

A decade into honing her singular guitar-driven style, St. Vincent stripped everything back, tapped into dark pop sounds — and landed two Grammy nominations in the process

E CREATE MYTHS AS a way to get through life," says Annie Clark, the indie-rock virtuoso who has released music as St. Vincent for the

past decade. "There are myths with a capital 'M,' like Bob Dylan changing his name from [Robert Allen] Zimmerman and claiming to have traveled the railroads across America." There are lowercase ones, too: "the tiny things you tell yourself to get out of bed every day. It's all kind of the same to me."

If everything from the way you part your hair to the name you choose allows you to hide, expose or wholly

peaked at No. 10 on the Billboard 200 and landed her two Grammy Award nominations — for best alternative music album and best rock song for the title track — she gave herself permission to be something else still: darker, sadder and more pop-centric than ever before.

During the course of 13 tracks that veer between the brash and the delicate, Clark explores fear, desire, mortality and gender roles using distorted tones — including guitars that do not quite sound like guitars and her own mutable voice, at times omniscient and at others punching through the fourth wall. To get the LP just right, she recorded another version all its sheen and big hooks, the songs and the artist herself prod at the artifice of the pop genre rather than becoming it.

"It's not really my job nor interest to be the genre police," says Clark of her nominations. "But I'm glad ["Masseduction"] was nominated as a rock song. I'm thinking maybe because it has a guitar solo?" While it's true that she can seriously shred, Clark is still one of only two women nominated in the alternative category (Björk is the other) at a time when young women with guitars, like Snail Mail's Lindsay Jordan and boygenius' Phoebe Bridgers, Lucy Dacus and Julien Baker, are the most exciting new performers in the genre. "I'm not sure where it lands with me," she says. "But I am in a position of power to change the climate from within. I want to go even further with that."

For now, she's looking forward to a Grammy ceremony that, with all five female album of the year nominees confirmed to perform and Alicia Keys announced as host, already looks more inclusive than the #GrammysSoMale debacle in 2018. "I was stupidly on tour when I won for alternative album [her only other nomination], and I kick myself every day that I wasn't there for that," she says. "So I'm really excited this year."

There's also her next big project: producing Sleater-Kinney's justannounced forthcoming record. "It has been one of my favorite things I've ever done," she says. "The great thing about producing is that you aren't contending with your own ego." She knows what it means to be vulnerable inside of a vocal booth. And now she's ready to embrace yet another archetype — the unflinching pilot driving toward an artistic destination unknown. "It's like, 'We're going down a road, and if it's not the right road, we're fucking fine,' "she says. "The song will reveal itself. It just does."

Breaking Down A Bigger Big Four

As Recording Academy head Neil Portnow exits, two critics dig into a potentially watershed year, when expanded main categories could usher in a new era of Grammy inclusivity — or perpetuate the status quo

ANDREW UNTERBERGER Solet's start off with album of the year. Recent history suggests it'll go to the biggest pop act —Taylor Swift, Adele and Bruno Mars were the last three winners —but the artists you'd expect to follow in that sequence in 2019 — Ariana Grande, Justin Timberlake, Swift again weren't even nominated. There's Drake, of course, but his history of Grammy no-shows will likely rub too many voters the wrong way. The category has never been kind to Cardi B's brand of relatively traditional hip-hop. And Post Malone... Well, let's come back to him later.

Am I crazy for thinking that Brandi Carlile's *By the Way, I Forgive You* has a real shot? She has major industry support and respect, even from President

Obama; her album was unanimously acclaimed; and with the expanded pool of nominees, a left-of-center act might have a better shot of standing out.

STEREO WILLIAMS I don't think
Carlile is entirely a stretch for
album of the year. H.E.R. could
be a somewhat unexpected win:
Everyone seems fascinated by her
rise from child talent to mysterious
newcomer to mainstream star.
Black Panther makes a strong case:
A hip-hop album taking the night's
biggest honor is well overdue — it
has been 15 years since OutKast
won it.

But I really think Janelle Monáe has a strong chance to take it with *Dirty Computer*. She made an album that celebrated her sexuality while also advocating





for her art as an openly LGBTQ black woman. It's an accomplished set that defines so much about the past year, musically and culturally.

UNTERBERGER If we're talking about year-defining, we probably can't do much better than Childish Gambino's incendiary "This Is America," or Cardi B, Bad Bunny and J Balvin's cross-cultural "I Like It," for song of the year. The populist choice here, though — and this award tends to go to more traditional pop-rock songs is Lady Gaga and Bradley Cooper's "Shallow."

I'm more than slightly worried that record of the year will end up going to Post Malone's 21 Savage-featuring "rockstar," a genre-mashing major hit from a superstar well-liked within the industry. If the first hip-hop winner in the category's history comes from a white lead artist, the internet and media backlash we saw over Bruno and Adele's recent big wins will be no preparation at all for the shitstorm we'll witness in 2019.

WILLIAMS "Shallow" feels very much like a "safe" bet in a makesall-the-sense-in-the-world way. "This Is America" would be a fairly bold win: Would it be framed

as proof that the Grammys can celebrate topical art — and hiphop overall — or as a reaction to backlashes of years past?

UNTERBERGER Here's my biggest question: If you were Neil Portnow, presiding over your last Grammys, which artist would you be pulling for the hardest in these major categories? Who gives you the best narrative to ride off into the sunset with? And is a Post Malone sweep the absolute doomsday scenario for your legacy?

WILLIAMS I would think Portnow would like to go out with a show that proves the Grammys are progressing — or at least aren't as out of touch as believed. So all eyes are on album of the year, but across the board, I'm sure he wants younger, more era-defining artists winning. I believe his biggest fear would be something like a Post Malone sweep, given the push for more diversity and Post's somewhat polarizing image.

UNTERBERGER Cardi B winning big would be a best-of-all-possibleworlds scenario: an era-defining artist, a female one — the Grammys need at least some big wins by female artists after Portnow's "step

up" comments last year — and a rapper, showing that hip-hop finally has a real seat at the table in the biggest categories.

H.E.R. still feels a little too anonymous to me to take album of the year. She should have a shot at best new artist, though, which is a relatively weak crop across the board. Ascendant pop star Dua Lipa would be a deserving winner, but H.E.R.'s surprise nomination does have me thinking she has the inside track.

WILLIAMS A big Cardi night would definitely bode well for the Grammys. She's a phenomenon. As for H.E.R., I think the most likely scenario is taking best new artist. But don't underestimate the throwback appeal of Greta Van Fleet — the Grammys would love to put a stamp on a young rock act. And I also think Chloe x Halle could make a strong case. The duo made just the right amount of noise this year with an acclaimed debut album, The Kids *Are Alright*, and the ultimate seal of approval: a spot on The Carters' On the Run II tour.

Hoodie **Holds On**

A Boogie Wit Da Hoodie's Hoodie SZN spends a second week leading the Billboard 200 as the set earned 56,000 equivalent album units in the United States during the week ending Jan. 17, according to Nielsen Music (down

4 percent).

Hoodie SZN's second stanza atop the list is also the eighth straight week a rap album has been No. 1 on the tally — the longest streak for any genre since **Drake**'s *Views* spent its first eight weeks at No. 1 (on the charts dated May 28 and July 16, 2016).

Hoodie SZN continues to be overwhelmingly driven by streaming activity on the chart as almost 55,000 of its total units come from streaming equivalent album units, while track equivalent album units equal 1,000, and album sales number a little under 1,000. The LP's album sales actually dip a bit from what they were a week ago — when the effort claimed the record for the smallest weekly album sales total for a No. 1 on the Billboard 200 since Dec. 13, 2014, when the chart switched from measuring album sales only to ranking total consumption.

Keep in mind: The week's top-selling album, the A Star Is Born soundtrack, sold thousands more copies (22,000) than Hoodie SZN and is No. 1 on Top Album Sales — it's just not the most *popular* album of the week, as measured by equivalent album units on the Billboard 200.

Next up, **Future**'s new Future Hndrxx Presents: The WIZRD is on course for a No. 1 debut on the Feb. 2 chart, according to industry forecasters. It could launch with 110,000-130,000 equivalent album units earned in the week ending Jan. 24. A No. 1 start for The WIZRD would give Future his sixth leader.




The Bohemian Rhapsody soundtrack climbs 76-13 (27,000 equivalent album units earned in the week ending Jan. 17, according to Nielsen Music, up 161 percent) after it regains its streaming- and track-equivalent album units for the bulk of its songs. A week ago, those units went to *Greatest Hits III & III* (falling 10-187 this issue), as it was the top-selling Queen set with those songs. SEA and TEA activity for an artist's track, when on multiple albums by that artist, goes to the LP selling more in a given week. -ĸ.c.





Both Cry Pretty (16,000 units; up 115 percent) and **P!nk**'s Beautiful Trauma (No. 105 with 8,000 units; up 207 percent) surge thanks to sales generated from concert ticket/album sale redemption offers.





Born to Die (7,000 units; up 24 percent) re-enters Catalog Album Sales (No. 12, 2,000 sold; up 99 percent) after sale pricing and promotion of its vinyl LP at Amazon. The LP re-enters the Vinyl Albums chart at No. 3.



Spider Slings To New Peak

The soundtrack to *Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse* scales new heights on the Billboard 200, rising 3-2 with 52,000 equivalent album units earned in the week ending Jan. 17 (up 6 percent), according to Nielsen Music. The companion set to the hit animated feature film includes the recent Billboard Hot 100 No. 1 "Sunflower" by **Post Malone** and **Swae Lee**.

Notably, the last four soundtracks that reached the top two all also went to No. 1: **Lady Gaga** and **Bradley Cooper**'s *A Star Is Born, Black Panther, The Greatest Showman* and *Fifty Shades Darker*.

Spider-Man is the latest soundtrack to profit on the Billboard 200 in the early part of the year. It follows other soundtracks that excelled on the list in the first few weeks of the year due to a lack of new releases crowding the chart after the holidays, many albums plummeting down the list post-Christmas and music-filled movies doing big business at the holiday and post-holiday box office (or on home video).

Spider-Man: Into the Spider-Verse has earned over \$150 million at the U.S. and Canadian box office since its release on Dec. 14, 2018. The film also captured an Academy Award nomination on Jan. 22 for best animated feature.

Other soundtracks that reached the Billboard 200's top three in January and February of previous years: The Greatest Showman (No. 1 for two weeks, beginning with the Jan. 13, 2018-dated chart), La La Land (No. 2; Jan. 28, 2017), Moana (No. 2; Jan. 21, 2017), Frozen (No. 1 for 13 weeks, beginning Jan. 18, 2014), Pitch Perfect (No. 3; Feb. 2, 2013) and Les Misérables (No. 1; Jan. 19, 2013). -Keith Caulfield

Post-Holiday Debut Blues

For the third week in a row, not a single album arrives within the top 40 of the Billboard 200. The dearth of debuts is owed to the usual post-holiday-season lull for major new releases.

In fact, a mere four debuts grace the entire list, led by rapper Comethazine's Bawskee 2 at No. 61. The album (11,000 equivalent album units earned in the week ending Jan. 17, according to Nielsen Music) is powered almost entirely by streaming activity for the short set's 10 songs (17.2 million ondemand audio streams for its tracks). Just how short is Bawskee 2? Only one of its tracks clocks in at over 2 minutes in length.

The set also starts at No. 36 on Top R&B/Hip-Hop Albums. Bawskee 2 follows, naturally, Bawskee, which debuted and peaked at No. 136 on the Billboard 200 and spent a week on the list. (It did not chart on Top R&B/Hip-Hop Albums.)

The second-highest new arrival on the Billboard 200 is Alec Benjamin's Narrated for You, which starts at No. 127, thanks to a surge in activity following a new remix of its track "Let Me Down Slowly," now featuring **Alessia Cara**. The album — which arrived in November 2018 — enters with 7,000 units (up 41 percent), mostly from streaming. Benjamin is also profiting from his Jan. 7 U.S. TV debut on CBS' The Late Late Show With James Corden, where he performed the song. Meanwhile, "Slowly" debuts on the Billboard Hot 100 at No. 79.

WayV Making Wa(y)ves

Newly formed Chinese pop group **WayV** (below) is already disrupting the Social 50, debuting at No. 4. The seven-piece boy band, a Chinese affiliate of K-pop act **NCT**, was introduced last August as NCT China, followed by its debut EP, The Vision, on Jan. 17 (led by a Mandarin-language version of NCT 127's "Regular"). WayV added 40,000 new followers to its Twitter account amid the release, alongside 93,000 mentions and 784,000 retweets on the service, according to Next Big Sound.

Meanwhile, country legend Earl Scruggs makes a rare chart appearance — his first on an artist-based list — by debuting on the Social 50 at No. 40. Scruggs, who died in March 2012 at age 88, bows thanks to 167,000 Wikipedia views that were sparked by a Google Doodle on Jan. 11 celebrating the banjo player, who would have turned 95 on Jan. 6. Scruggs earned multiple entries on the Top Country Albums and Hot Country Songs charts, both solo and with various groups, including the duo Flatt & Scruggs with Lester Flatt, whose "The Ballad of Jed Clampett" from The Beverly Hillbillies ruled Hot Country Songs in 1963.

One spot below Scruggs, another act makes its Social 50 debut: **Zé Neto & Cristiano**. The Brazilian pair reaches the list for the first time thanks mainly to an influx of YouTube subscribers — 178,000 new followers in all, up 158 percent. The duo has been releasing videos from its upcoming acoustic EP, Acústico de Novo, beginning with "Estado Decadente" on Jan. 11. The EP was released the same —Kevin Rutherford

Calboy's Climb Continues

"Envy Me" by **Calboy** (above) keeps ascending the charts, rocketing 49-21 on Streaming Songs in its third week on the ranking. The track racked up 17.8 million streams in the week ending Jan. 17, up 52 percent, according to Nielsen Music. Its boost is due to gains in nearly all streaming metrics, and nearly half (49.3 percent) of its streams are video views. The rise of "Envy" has been spurred largely by a dance challenge, and radio has taken notice in recent weeks, with the song beginning to bubble under the Mainstream R&B/ Hip-Hop Airplay chart.

As A Boogie Wit Da Hoodie's new album, Hoodie SZN, spends a second week atop the Billboard 200 (see page 58), the set's music is still rising on Streaming Songs. The leader is "Swervin" (featuring 6ix9ine) which breaks into the top 20 (22-19, 17 million; up 8 percent). "Look Back at It" scores a boost in streams, leaping 31-26 (15 million, up 15 percent), due in part to buzz following Boogie's performance of the track on Late Night With Seth Meyers (Jan. 16).

Lastly, country music enjoys its second straight week with two entries on Streaming Songs as **Dan + Shay**'s "Speechless" joins the genre's monster hit "Meant to Be" by **Bebe Rexha** and **Florida Georgia Line**. "Speechless" moves 47-42 with 12.2 million streams, equaling the peak of its predecessor, "Tequila" (No. 42, Aug. 11, 2018). —K.R.

Rhett's 'Sixteen' Is No. 1

"Sixteen" by **Thomas** Rhett (above) ascends 3-1 on Country Airplay, up 6 percent to 40.2 million audience impressions in the week ending Jan. 20, according to Nielsen Music. It's his 12th Country Airplay leader and the fifth from his LP *Life Changes*, which debuted at the summit of the Top Country Albums and Billboard 200 charts in September 2017, his first No. 1 on each ranking. "Sixteen" follows the Maren Morris-assisted "Craving You," plus "Unforgettable," "Marry Me" and the title track to No. 1, becoming just the fifth album to generate at least five Country Airplay leaders. Luke Bryan's Kill the Lights holds the record with six No. 1s in 2015-17. The other sets to achieve such a feat: Bryan's Crash My Party (2013-15), Blake **Shelton**'s Based on a True Story... (2013-14) and Brad Paisley's 5th Gear (2007-08).

Chris Stapleton

achieves his third Country Airplay top 10 as "Millionaire" rises 11-9 (23.7 million impressions). His "Nobody to Blame" hit No. 1 in 2016, and "Broken Halos" led in March 2018. Plus, **Jordan Davis** adds his second top 10 on the tally as "Take It From Me" lifts 12-10 (23.4 million). His debut hit, "Singles You Up," reigned last April. Meanwhile, **Maren**

Morris' "Girl," the first single from her forthcoming second LP, launches at No. 28 on Country Airplay with 6.6 million impressions in a half week of tracking since its Jan. 17 release. The bow marks her highest as a

halt Panic! at the Disco's 10-week run atop the Alternative airplay chart with "High Hopes," as "Guiding Light" lifts 3-1. The British band earns its fourth No. 1 on the list and first since "Believe" ruled for three weeks in April-May 2015. With "Light" having previously led Triple A Songs for 10 weeks, it's the first track to have topped both tallies since Portugal. The Man's "Live in the Moment" in early 2018. "Light" concurrently holds at its No. 2 high on the all-rock-format Rock Airplay chart with 10.5 million audience impressions, up 2 percent,

airplay chart, Mark Morton makes his first appearance apart from Lamb of God as "Cross Off" debuts at No. 29. The song features lead vocals from late Linkin Park frontman Chester Bennington, who died three months after recording his contribution in 2017; it marks Bennington's first chart appearance since Linkin Park's "Final Masquerade," which reached No. 35 in February 2015. Originally released in 1992, the track spent eight weeks on Mainstream Rock Songs that year before returning and hitting a new No. 19 high in 1996, after the band appeared on MTVUnplugged. Khalid & Kane's 'Nights' Light Up

As **Khalid** celebrates No. 1s on both Top R&B Albums (his Suncity EP rebounds 2-1 for its second overall week in charge) and Hot R&B Songs ("Better" holds for a second straight frame), the young star's new single, "Saturday Nights," rallies after Kane Brown jumped on a remix. The revamped version, released Jan. 11, pulled 4 million of the song's total 9.8 million U.S. streams in the week ending Jan. 17, according to Nielsen Music, helping it scale 9-5 on Hot R&B Songs and re-enter at No. 24 on Hot R&B/Hip-Hop Songs.

Meanwhile, "Twerk" by City Girls (below), featuring Cardi B, vaults to a new peak on Hot R&B/Hip-Hop Songs as it re-enters at No. 21 following the release of its official music video on Jan. 16. The clip features scenes of the artists performing the titular dance alongside the winner of City Girls' twerk contest held in late 2018. The video drives the track to 11.6 million U.S. streams, a 186 percent surge. "Twerk" also improves at radio as it moves 28-18 on R&B/Hip-Hop Airplay with a 42 percent lift to 10.1 million in audience in the week ending Jan. 20, according to Nielsen Music.

Plus, New Orleans rapper Choppa's 2003 single "Choppa Style" debuts on Rap Digital Song Sales at No. 19, after the New Orleans Saints adopted it as a de facto anthem in recent weeks. Several players for the NFL team, whose season ended with a contentious 26-23 loss to the Los Angeles Rams on Jan. 20, posted Instagram videos of themselves dancing to the track, while the original track was featured prominently during Saints games. "Style" sold 3,000 copies in the week ending Jan. 17, according to Nielsen Music (up 661 percent), and clocked 281,000 U.S. streams, up 395 percent.

Wisin & **Yandel Back At No. 1**

The reunited Wisin & Yandel (above) collect their 11th No. 1 as a duo on Latin Airplay as "Reggaetón en lo Oscuro" climbs 3-1. The track — their first single released as a duo in five years — rises with 14.6 million audience impressions in the week ending Jan. 20, according to Nielsen Music, up 14 percent. "Reggaetón" is the pair's first leader since "Algo Me Gusta de Ti" spent one week atop the list dated Oct. 20, 2012. Since then, while recording as solo artists, Wisin and Yandel joined Ricky Martin on the No. 1 "Fiebre" (May 19, 2018).

Also in the top 10 on Latin Airplay, Sinaloan act Banda Los Sebastianes celebrates its first top 10 as "A Través del Vaso" jumps 16-9 (9.7 million in audience, up 27 percent).

On Hot Latin Songs, "Través" climbs 14-11, while "Reggaetón" steps 20-18. Elsewhere on Hot Latin

Songs, Puerto Rican singer Pedro Capo clocks his first top 10 with "Calma" (with Farruko) as the song rockets 15-6. It's the seventh top 10 for Farruko. The streamingpowered track — 7.7 million clicks for the week, up 70 percent - rises 14-7 on Latin Streaming Songs.

Lastly, **Los Ángeles** Azules notch their first No. 1 since 2000 — and second overall - on Regional Mexican Airplay as "Nunca Es Suficiente" (featuring Natalia Lafourcade) pushes 2-1 (11.3 million in audience, up 11 percent). It's the first leader for Lafourcade on the -Pamela Bustios

Daigle's Six-Month Reign

"You Say" by **Lauren** Daigle (above) leads the streaming-, airplayand sales-based Hot Christian Songs chart for a 26th week, tying Carrie **Underwood**'s 2014 hit "Something in the Water" for the longest rule by a woman in the survey's 15-year history.

The tracks share third place overall, behind Hillsong United's "Oceans (Where Feet May Fail)" (61 weeks at No. 1 starting in December 2013) and sister act Hillsong Worship's "What a Beautiful Name" (37 frames beginning in February 2017). Both of those songs were also sung by women: "Oceans" by Taya Smith and "Name" by Brooke Ligertwood.

"You Say" rules Christian Digital Song Sales for a 24th week (13,000 sold, up 7 percent, according to Nielsen Music) and Christian Streaming Songs for a 22nd week (6.6 million U.S. streams, up 15 percent) and ranks at No. 2 on Christian Airplay after logging 17 weeks at No. 1. It also continues its crossover, debuting at No. 40 on the Mainstream Top 40 airplay chart, while bulleting at No. 8 on Adult Top 40 and No. 19 on Adult Contemporary.

"Stand in Your Love" by **Bethel Music**'s **Josh** Baldwin becomes his first top 10 on Hot Christian Songs (11-10). It hikes by 7 percent to 7.9 million impressions and holds at No. 7 on Christian Airplay.

Plus, **Tamela Mann** banks her 10th Gospel Airplay top 10 with "Potter" (12-10). Mann extends her mark for the most top 10s among women and ties Kirk Franklin for third place overall, after James Fortune & FIYA (12) and Marvin Sapp (11).

Harris' 'Giant' Step

Calvin Harris (above) and Rag'n'Bone Man make a huge start on Hot Dance/Electronic Songs with "Giant" at No. 11. The collaboration bows with 13.6 million U.S. streams and 4,000 downloads sold, according to Nielsen Music. "Giant" is Harris' 36th chart hit (and rocker Rag'n'Bone Man's first), moving him to within one of **David** Guetta's record 37 in the chart's six-year history. French producer

Gesaffelstein and The Weeknd each make their first trip to the top 10, rocketing 25-3 with "Lost in the Fire." The track, which debuted on the chart a week earlier solely from radio play, soars with its first full week of streaming and sales data and enters the Billboard Hot 100 at No. 27 (see page 4). Concurrently, "Lost" launches at No. 2 on Dance/Electronic Digital Song Sales and at No. 3 on Dance/Electronic Streaming Songs, marking the artists' first top 10 on each chart.

Shifting to Dance Club Songs, singer **Kendra** Erika scores her first No. 1 with "Self Control" (2-1). The track, the third top 10 and fourth chart entry for the native of Boca Raton, Fla., was remixed by **Moto** Blanco, Dirty Werk and the tandem of **Ralphi** Rosario and Erick Ibiza, among others. It updates Laura Branigan's original, which reached No. 2 on the chart, and No. 4 on the Hot 100, in 1984.

Turning to Dance/Mix Show Airplay, U.K.-based producer SG Lewis scores his first top 10 with 'Hurting" (14-9), featuring AlunaGeorge, which adds its third. —Gordon Murray

Mars Ups His Vegas Game

After officially wrapping the two-year 24K Magic tour in Hawaii last November, Bruno Mars (above) ended 2018 on top with a twonight stint at the T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas. He grossed \$5.9 million on Dec. 30 and 31, selling 30,241 tickets, according to figures reported to Billboard Boxscore.


It's his fourth consecutive year spending New Year's Eve in Sin City. After closing out 2015 at The Chelsea at The Cosmopolitan, Mars spent 2016 and 2017 at The Park Theater before graduating to T-Mobile Arena in 2018. The Grammy-winning charttopper earned a 114 percent increase over last year's \$2.7 million gross and attendance count of 10,292.

Similarly, **Maroon 5** returned to Vegas for New Year's Eve, ringing in 2019 at Mandalay Bay Events Center for a third consecutive year. On Dec. 30 and 31, the band grossed \$2.3 million, up 4 percent from last year. While the 15,463 tickets sold are enough to make this the group's best-attended New Year's Eve stint, the \$2.7 million that the act grossed in 2016 remains its most successful two-night Vegas engagement.

Year-end concerts at the MGM dominate the chart: Anita Baker is No. 6 with three shows at The Theater at MGM National Harbor in Oxon Hill, Md. She grossed \$1.3 million on Dec. 26, 28 and 29, selling out all three performances (8,271 tickets). The gigs represent Baker's biggest engagement since a fivenight run at New York's Radio City Music Hall in 1995 (\$1.8 million; 28,285 tickets sold).

46 Years Ago MOTOWN BELIEVED IN STEVIE WONDER'S 'SUPERSTITION'

Wonder kept a classic meant for Jeff Beck and returned to No. 1

BY THE TIME THAT "SUPERSTITION" was released in 1973, nine years and five months had passed since Stevie Wonder held down the No. 1 spot atop the Billboard Hot 100. It was an eventful interval, of course, with the Saginaw, Mich.-born musical prodigy achieving 11 top 10s, including his 1963 debut single and first No. 1, "Fingertips — Pt. 2," on which he was billed as Little Stevie Wonder.

Though the track's clavinet riff is now iconic, it was never imagined that "Superstition" would be his masterpiece. Originally written for The Yardbirds' Jeff Beck, whom Wonder brought in to help with his 15th studio LP, *Talking Book*, the backing drumbeat was devised by Beck while Wonder improvised the lyrics. The plan had been to release Wonder's not-yet-finished "Big Brother" as the album's

lead single, but when they heard the demo, Motown executives couldn't let "Superstition" go.

Their intuition paid off: The song spent a week at No. 1 on the Hot 100 dated Jan. 27, 1973, and earned the artist two of his three awards at the 1974 Grammy ceremony.

At 68, Wonder has 10 No. 1s on the Hot 100 (the eighth-most in the chart's history) and a record 20 on the Hot R&B/Hip-Hop Songs list (tied with Aretha Franklin). In December, he returned to the charts as a featured artist on John Legend's "Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas," after helping out on Travis Scott's No. 1 Billboard 200 album, *Astroworld*, playing harmonica on the track "Stop Trying to Be God." And there's more music on the way, as Wonder is at work on his 24th studio album.
