Attorney General of Illinois in Personal Charge

Says He Will Get Facts and Present Unlicensed Dealers

Stock Broker Arrested in Connection With Case

Chicago, Feb. 25.—The Illinois attorney of the stock-selling manipulation of the birth of a Race Photography Company, January 26, last, stirred the public's curiosity and was held in official action by the Illinois Attorney General in the event of one broker and official assurance of one investigation of the company's conditions and others.

AL. G. FIELD WINS SUIT AGAINST TRENTON THEATER

Verdict Decides Important Question Regarding Validity of Theatrical Contracts—Court De- cides Two Weeks' Notice Has No Bearing on Contracts Without This Clause

New York, Feb. 12.—Al. G. Field, the veteran theatrical manager, has won his suit against the Trenton (N. J.) Theater Building Company, and the court's verdict in his favor determines an important question regarding the validity of theatrical contracts. The judge of competency to accept as well as the theatrical business, it is continually cropping up in every branch of the business, but in the case in question the matter was once again brought up in Trenton this week before Judge Lloyd and a Jury in the Mayor Circuit Court.

This controversy between Montgomery Dixon of the Trenton Theater and Mr. Field has been in the courts since 1914. The cause of the action was the signing of the Al. G. Field contract at Trenton in that year. The defendant claimed that the new two weeks' notice of cancellation which the theater management was sufficient to reduce the theater of any further commitments in the contract. The court, however, overruled this contention, holding the case in favor of Field and determining that the so-called two weeks' notice has no bearing on contracts which are without a specific two weeks' clause.

Mr. Field brought suit for damages against the theater company because of the latter's refusal to honor the show to be staged January 14-15, 1918, claiming violation of a contract entered into by him and the theater management. The defendant's contention denied the existence of the contract, but held the defendant liable on a written notice of cancellation of two weeks and declared that such notice was given Mr. Field.

The trial developed the fact that Mr. Field and his company arrived in Trenton and were prepared to show proceeds to the terms of the contract. It was not permitted to do so, how-

ever, the theater management contending that such an arrangement at that time would not have been profitable. As that particular time it was explained the theater attendance had fallen off because of the campaign being conducted by Billy Bowyer. Mr. Field was in the witness stand for several hours and testified in detail as to the execution of the contract on page 70.

Plings to His Death

Captain Thomas Curtis Killed While So Avail a Collision

St. Worth, Tex., Feb. 18.—Thomas Curtis, the famous dancer and captain of the 14th Cavalry, British Royal Flying Corps, was killed yesterday morning at Brook Park, Texas while work of this city. In an effort to make a landing with another airplane, he was only slightly injured. Capt. Curtis was taken to the hospital by his machine uncrossed, and died twenty minutes later in the field hospital. His skull was fractured.

Captain Curtis once here last October from Europe. His flight record in Europe was well credited with 100 flights over the German lines. His last flight was during the war, and he was here in Newark, England, May 1, 1917. He appeared in several of Law Finner shows, including The Old Fashioned Comedies, in which, as a waiter, he made his first success as a comedian. While staying in The Summer Wilderness he met Irene Ford, and they were married shortly after. They then went to Paris at the outbreak of the war. Curtis succeeded as an engagement in Glass, which was an immense success, and he returned to New York in the fall of 1911 as the ways of dancing separately trained for credit, and were carried along with. They soon opened an academy of dancing for class teaching and he did instruction and became a member of the American Circus, the Curtis-by-the-Sea at Long Beach and the Curtis-in-the-Sea at Long Beach and his wife appeared together in Charles DeBussche's French Tour Stop, and in the same city. Charles Barron Dies

Boston, Feb. 18.—Charles Barron, one of America's most distinguished actors, died at his home at 22 Walsingham St., in New York, Wednesday night, Jan. 23, 1918, and made his first appearance on the stage in Portland, Me., Jan. 29, 1849, as a member of McFarland's Dramatic Co., playing the part of Jerry Chip in "The Widow's Told." In February, 1860, he became the leading man of the Boston Museum Street Company, remaining with it for many lengthy years. He is credited with more than 250 hundred parts.
