RECORD NEWS: I.R.S. reports that the **English Beat** is frustrated in their search for new vocalists. Explains **Andy Cox**: "Soulful unusual British singers were difficult to find, unless they were Boy George imitators." Andy asks that if "there are any good vocalists in the U.S. out there, send tapes to **The Beat**." So, send your tapes, clearly recorded with little or no accompaniment, with a snapshot of yourself to: Andy's a cappella Auditions, P.O. Box 320, Birmingham 20 England. Spread the word!

Meanwhile, **Ranking Roger and Dave Wakeling's** group, **General Public**, will release their I.R.S. debut early next year. For recording purposes they have been joined by two ex-**Dexys**, **Mickey Billingham** (keyboards) and **Stoker** (drums) plus—get this—**Mick Jones** (fresh from the **Clash**) on guitar . . . The new **Go-Go's** LP will be produced by **Martin Rushent**. Look for it in February . . . **Let's Active** has been joined on the road by a fourth member, who plays keyboards and guitars . . . **Pylon** is going to be calling it quits . . . **ABC's** new single "That Was Then, But This Is Now" should be out in the UK in early November. Their new album, **Beauty Stab**, is set for simultaneous US/UK release November 14. Andy Newmark is sitting in on drums, but has not yet been named a permanent member. Oh, yeah—the band is said to be changing their image . . . **Pete Shelley** has been picked up by Elektra . . . **Specimen** has signed with Sire, and is doing a limited tour in November . . . PolyGram has signed **Rubber Rodeo**, who will record an LP with producer **Hugh Jones**. The album, **Scenic Views**, is scheduled for early '84 release . . . RCA has records scheduled for early 1984 from **Grace Slick** (with synthesizers), **Robert Hazard**, **One The Juggler**, **Eurythmics** and a live **Triumph** LP. They've also signed **Mister Mister** . . . Listen for **Peter Gabriel** singing like an angel and **Adrian Belew's** strumming on the new **Laurie Anderson** EP, **Mister Heartbreak** . . . Look for LPs by **Wang Chung** and **Madness** in January from Geffen . . . Dolphin Records will soon release a record from the **Accelerators**, produced by Don Dixon, who worked on the **R.E.M.** LP . . . **Rodney Dangerfield's** new album features a rap track . . . In one of the largest promotions in memory, Geffen Records, MTV and Westwood One have joined forces for a live, stereo international cablecast of **Asia** live from the Budokan in Tokyo. "Asia In Asia" will be broadcast December 6th at 11:00 PM (ET) on MTV and radio stations all over the world. As a promotion for the promotion, MTV will send five viewers to the show and a vacation in Japan, with a guest. And you thought dreams didn't come true . . .

JACKPOT! SINGLES, TRACKS, ETC.

★ **CULTURE CLUB** "Church Of The Polson Mind" (7" and 12") (Epic, 51 W. 52nd St., New York, NY 10019)—Just as accessible and just as distinctive as their previous hits, but with quite a bit extra, namely some terrific soulful harmonica and backing vocals, provocative lyrics (which previously weren't evident on the singles) and an unexpectedly charged energy. If you missed this as an import, jump on it now.

RE-FLEX "The Politics Of Dancing" (Capitol, 1750 N. Vine St., Hollywood, CA 90028)—Starts slowly, but works up into a grinding dance track blending synths and guitars with a neat vocal hook. Sure to hit dance clubs and new music radio, with good pop crossover potential.

SLICKEE BOYS "When I Go To The Beach" (7") (Twin/Tone, 445 Oliver Ave., South Minneapolis, MN 55405)—Inspired Ventures cum Blotto summer rock—silly, fast and fun. Play it more as the temperature drops—we're sure it'll make winter much easier to take. Originally out on Dacoit Records, Twin/Tone has blessed us with this reissue just as summer winds down. Thanks, guys.

WOMACK & WOMACK "Love Wars" (12") (Elektra, 655 Fifth Avenue, New York, NY 10022)—After a rough start, "Love Wars" settles into a smooth uptempo soul groove which will work nicely in clubs and doesn't get boring at home, even in this 8 minute plus mix. Sort of Isley Brothers meet the Trammps. Nice.

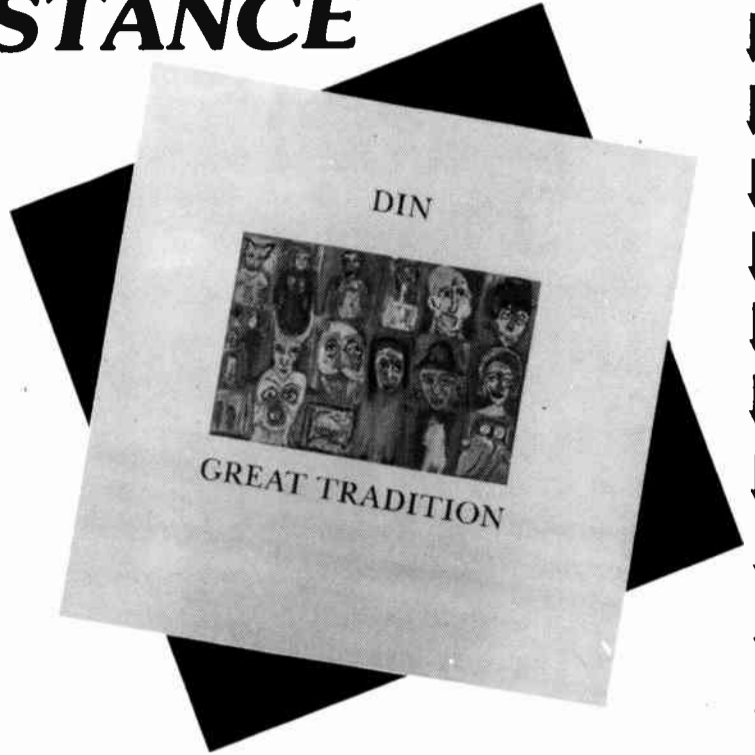

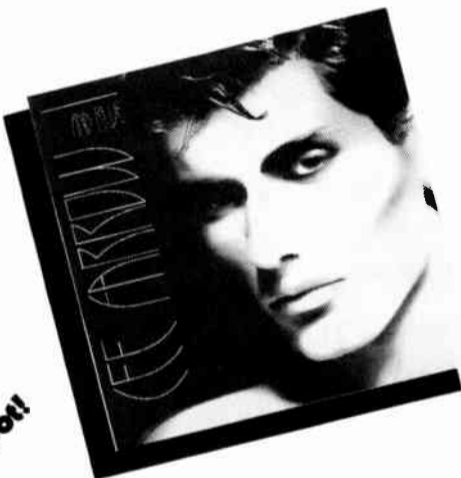
FMQB Modern Music News, 9/23/83:

Echoed In The Press

ECHO AND THE BUNNYMEN

London Royal Albert Hall

THE ALBERT Hall's ornate dome swells majestically to enclose a vast bubble of overhead space. What setting could be more appropriate for Echo And The Bunnymen, purveyors of the world's most vaulting, stratospheric rock sound? But rather than aim for the heights, which they reached in any case, Flopsy, Mopsy, Cottontail and Echo unleashed the most urgent, frontal *punk* assault I've ever seen them deliver. And I'm still reeling.

In harmony with the uplifting aspect of this opulent, Victorian cathedral of Culture, our expectant chatter hushed to the strains of Gregorian chant and stained-glass windows projected onto the backdrop. Thoughts of choirboys, altars, the sacred and profane sprung to mind. But rather than surrender to flights of religious fancy induced by the basilica-like setting, the fab four — like Dylan, the Stones, The Who, Chuck Berry and Mott The Hoople famously before them — played it as merely a gigantic rock 'n' roll cellar-club.

Strung in a line along the stage's lip like a firing-squad and shrouded in *Apocalypse Now* dry-ice, they lashed into 'Going Up' from the first album, which segued after a chorus or two into 'With A Hip' from their second. Apart from socking it to us from the whistle, this one-two knock-out exemplified how very *similar* one rabbit punch is to the next — and yet they *both* lay you flat. Echo And The Bunnymen can reproduce their style in seemingly endless permutations, yet the elements of their method are unchanging — Les Pattinson's dark, probing bass, Peter De Freitas' tautly controlled drum frenzy, Will Sergeant's orchestra of searing guitar sounds, and Ian McCulloch's rhythmic urgency on guitar and vocal grand opera Hamlet.

Video Views

JO JO ZEP "Taxi Mary" (Oz/A&M) directed by Rich Kids—Delightful in its smokey slipperiness, "Taxi Mary" features a bare wood floor so shiny it begs being glided upon, rumba'd over and strewn with records, and smart-looking Jo Jo Zep plus entourage who take up that glossy invitation. A whole battery of wonderful technical shots—reverse negatives imposed on video and overlapping photographic stills—augment the people verities. Rarely does a clip so meticulously put together look so easefully and grandly nonchalant—the perfect attitude to accompany a club audio as superb as this.

RICHARD THOMPSON "The Wrong Heartbeat" (Hannibal) directed by Erik Nelson—When Richard Thompson impatiently mouths his go ahead to a smoothie bunch of ScamCo clip makers bent on selling him their storyboards, he is in effect dealing with his personal abandonment of cult status in favor of becoming part of the mainstream. The resultant clip snatches within his v/c has Thompson depicting deathly cliched personas; sophisticated romantic in a restaurant replete with flung objects from Russell Mulcahy's cupboard; heavy metal freak musician on a smokebombed stage; and esoteric monk dabbling in the underbelly of the universe. Audio's lyric—here used to imply the moguls haven't a clue as to what makes him tick—and metallic ska percussion almost fated in its crookedness supply a humorous backdrop as the initially earnest hero turns befuddled before our eyes. Thompson escapes the industry's hot coals with the help of a guardian angel chauffeur. What did you expect from the most luminous face in rock 'n' roll?

BILLY JOEL "Uptown Girl" (Columbia) directed by Jay Dublin—Billy Joel looks as beefy as a butcher but rock 'n' roll's auto glory has no choice but to cast him as a garage mechanic. Accompanied by a bunch of sidekicks who ogle Christie Uptown Brinkley's pin-up, the guys prepare for conquest by massaging headlights, gliding wipes across windows and creating their own 'son et lumiere' by revving up motors and flashing motorcycle blinkers. The v/c's only aberration is the presence of two electric boogie dancers who stamp 1983 on this piece, when the clip's real dynamic is making the class and gender struggle as timelessly appealing as the propelling symmetry of audio's stomps and whoa's.

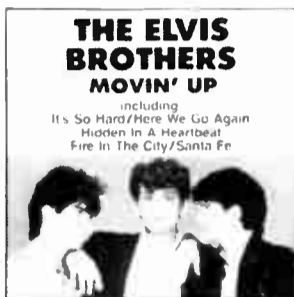
LINDA RONSTADT "What's New" (Asylum) directed by David Lewis—Audio is temperate but lush and so is La Ronstadt—chignon-coiffed and creamily fleshed out in eye-riveting black-sequined bustier against a backdrop of red walls and heavy velvet curtains. The 'girl-woman' has always been one of rock 'n' roll's most valuable assets and she incarnates here as a pop stylist bearing a real golden oldie. Just *looking* the way she does is all the movement audio needs.

HUNTERS & COLLECTORS "Talking To A Stranger" (Oz/A&M) directed by Rich Kids—The figure of nervous Mercury takes us back in time, maybe ahead. Whether it's rewind or fast forward the news doesn't look good. Creatures are pursued, shadows and beings overlap to portend the worst, and explosive night looks downright apocalyptic. The randomness of high production value image balances audio's unswerving dance tempo. Solely visceral reactions seem to work best.

Box 40804, Washington, D.C. 20016)—This top Jamaican vocal trio was first brought to the American public's attention when their classic "Rivers Of Babylon" appeared on the soundtrack to the "Harder They Come." After a six-year break from the music scene, the Melodians—Tony Brevell, Brent Dowe, Trevor McNaughton—have reemerged, sounding as strong as ever. There's a pop element within their reggae rhythms making way for a contemporary sound. The horns add a somewhat funk sound, giving a new dimension to the group's flavor. The album gives you an "irie" feeling, which is the Jamaican word for cool, the highest, at one with the universe. Best tracks are "Get Up And Dance" (you will), the title track, "Warning," "Push A Little Harder" (the last two released on a 12" mix) and "Jah Reggae." Also included are 2 classic re-cuts "Down Here In Babylon" and "You Don't Need Me."

Three cheers for Jamaica's top ranking DJ and three more for CBS. . . The same label has released a dance 45 by **Jimmy Cliff**, "Reggae Nights," from his forthcoming album **The Power And The Glory**. . . **Musical Youth's** second album on MCA records will be called **Different Style**. The label has been reluctant to commit to a release date, but I suspect it will be out in November. . . Following the success of **Come On Over**, **RAS Records** is working on their second **Freddie McGregor** album. **Freddie** will be backed by **I-Three** members **Judy Mowatt** and **Marcia Griffiths**. . . The **New York Times** recently published an article stating that the **Wailers** would be reforming in the carnation of **Peter Tosh**, **Bunny Wailer** and **Junior Brathwaite**. The true story is that **Peter**, **Bunny** and **Vislon** will be getting together as the **Wailers**. The three will play their own instruments, as the **Barrett Brothers** will not be a part of this group. **Vislon** was an original member of the **Soulettes**, an early sixties ska band which included **Rita Marley**. The reggae community anxiously awaits this incarnation of the Wailers—the time is right—welcome back! . . . **Bunny Wailer's** long awaited live album is due out by the end of the month. (Yes, you've heard this before, but according to reliable sources, this time we really mean it). Apparently, the hold up wasn't so much in the production of the album, but in the completion and editing of the **Bunny Wailer** video. The album and the video will be released together as a promotional package. . . There's a brother up in Canada by the name of **Nicky Dread** who hosts a reggae show on CFRU—FM. He's started his own reggae information sheet, "The Crooked Beat Sheet" which includes record charts compiled from various sources in Canada, USA, England and Jamaica, plus upcoming releases and other reggae news. Check in with **Nicky** at CFRU-FM, 2nd Level, University Centre, University of Guelph, Guelph, Ontario, N1G 2W1, Canada. Tell him his friends at the Reggae Route sent you. The beat goes on. . . The movie "Heartland Reggae" is finally showing in NY and I got to see it for the first time. It focuses mainly on the 1978 One Love Peace Concert in Jamaica and contains the historical moment when **Bob Marley** called **Michael Manley** and **Edward Seaga** to join him up on stage where he joined the men's hands. Unfortunately, the political leaders never got to do that again until they met up in 1981 at Bob's funeral. . . **US40's** new A&M release, **Labour Of Love** is now available and the liner notes on the back of the album contain a very loving sentiment towards what we now know and love as reggae music. . . The **Ital** tour has started—they were just in New York backed by the **Roots Radics** band. The **Ital**'s harmonies are sweet and the **Radics** musicianship is killer. Check them out if you can. Wishing them much love and success on the rest of their US tour. It's nice to have you in the States. . . I had the opportunity to sit in on a recording session at A&R Studios in NYC with the all female NY-based reggae band, **Steppin' Razor**. In the producer's seat was none other than the Observer himself, **Miney** (**Third World's** "Roots With Quality"). **Bunny Brown** is co-producing. Look out for a pop-oriented, catchy reggae song (ala the **Go-Go's**) called "No More A Tourist." . . **Roots** purists will turn their noses up when the **Culture Club** is mentioned in the same breath as reggae music, but I've got to say that **Boy George** is certainly a rasta at heart. Aside from his dread-like hair style, check out the lyrics to his newest single, "Kharna Chameleon": "Loving would be easy if your colors were like my dream—Red, Gold and Green." And isn't that what it's about—love and harmony?! **Boy George** is definitely on our side!! . . . Keep the Route growing. One Love. . .

A Plea For Attention

In reply to Al Salone's comments (WKRB, Brooklyn) in the August 29 report: I wanted to voice myself as being in total agreement. ...Our station is a small-town, small-college radio station (15 watts) with the purpose of training DJs for the "real world." It would be great if every station could be WNEW, KROQ, or WPMR, but not only does every station not play "new music," but not every station plays music. I'm worried that not every graduate knows how to go to a town council meeting, take notes, and a comprehensive and comprehensible news story about it; or that he knows how to do the play-by-play of a football game. Forgive me if I'm tooting my own horn, but that's what I think is so great about small town colleges. Sure it would be great if I could go to Temple and take an experimenter in England, but I'd rather learn more concrete things. The students get more personalized attention from the teachers; and the station receives more attention from the community and from the school itself. The station has its own building with great equipment. I went to Pitt to visit and their station was practically a closet. A friend went to Wake Forest and told me they don't even have a sound-proof control studio, let alone a news or production studio. When I said "15 watts" it wasn't a misprint, however being at a small station with about 20 broadcasting majors leaves a lot of room for practice and the station has a big enough budget to let me talk to record companies long enough to be turned down, and then to turn around and order ten or so albums a month from Record Source International....I know that when I apply for a job, people will look at my resume' and say "WGFV? Geneva College? Where the heck's that?". But that's why I do things like take internships at WPMR in Philadelphia *(Two summers and running). That way I get a lot of respectable signatures and letters in my resume', as well as the knowledge of my small-college station....Maybe I shouldn't have called this "A Plea For Attention." I think I should have called it "A Plea For Respect". If you're a record company or radio station executive and you actually have the time to read this, then the next time a small-college graduate gives you his resume', don't laugh at them and tell them about how you don't have time for them. Have enough respect to at least investigate the situation. In Beaver Falls, we don't all drive pick-up trucks and spit Redman on our work shoes. We read Tolstoy and Camus. We study all the -ologies and -isms. We know the administrative process. We know as much as any of the other college students. And you really think this is an alternative music magazine? If you can tell me who Daniel Amos or Giantkiller are; if you know who Tonio K. or the All-Saved Freak Band are; if you've ever heard of Koinonia or Quickflight or The J.C. Power Outlet or Jerusalem or Kemper Crabb or Larry Norman or The 77's or The Resurrection Band (I could go on forever); then let me know, THEY'LL talk about music. All have at least one record on a nationally-distributed big-budget record label....All I guess I'm trying to say is--to the industry: please show us a little respect and attention, and--to the major college stations: don't be so cocky (I've met a lot of major-college jocks, and 9 out of 10 can't remember that they're still in college & learning)...Thank you very much for listening. I appreciate the time and space

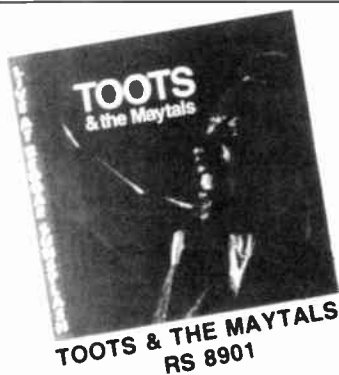

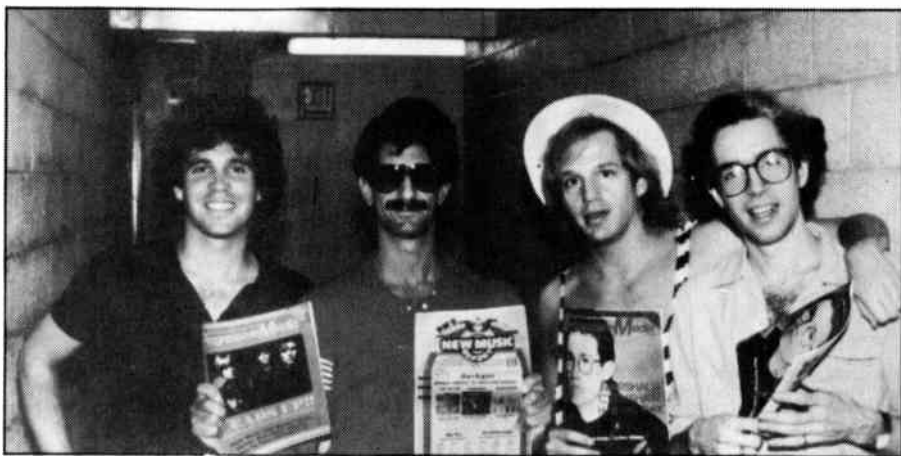

★ JACKPOT! ★

UB40 Labour Of Love (A&M, 1416 N. LaBrea, Hollywood, CA 90028)—UB40's live shows have always featured covers of classic reggae tunes, but they have never set them to vinyl. Now comes a whole LP of their favorites carefully and affectionately performed. It's their most successful LP so far in the U. K., and ought to break them here. Top cuts: "Please Don't Make Me Stay," "Red Red Wine," "Cherry O Baby."

LET'S ACTIVE Afoot (EP) (I.R.S., c/o A&M, 595 Madison Ave., New York, NY 10022)—The pivotal point on the Hoboken, NJ - Athens, GA axis is, in the great tradition of those towns, Winston-Salem, NC. And at the center of it all is Mitch Easter, producer of R.E.M., Barone/Mastro, ad infinitum, all from his own garage studio. And now he's out on his own, with one of the most unpretentious and honest pop records around. It's not as "important" sounding as some of the others he has produced, but it's downright loveable. Top cuts: "Room With A View," "Every Word Means No," "Make Up With Me."

JOHN HIATT Riding With The King (Geffen, c/o Warner Bros., 3300 Warner Blvd., Burbank, CA 91510)—Simply put, John Hiatt writes and sings great rock and roll. *Riding With The King* is overstuffed with terrific material—ingenious and insightful, and often with wit and panache. The music is divided: side one is slightly more traditional, with just Hiatt and Scott Matthews playing; and side two features Noise To Go, (Nick Lowe, Paul Carrack, Martin Belmont, Bobby Irwin). From side one try "I Don't Even Try" and "Death By Misadventure," with "Falling Up" and the title cut (best of all) standouts on side two.

ANDREAS VOLLENWEIDER Cavema Magica (. . . Under The Tree, In The Cave) (CBS, 51 West 52nd St., New York, NY 10019)—Vollenweider plays an "electroacoustic, modified pedal harp" which makes intriguing noises indeed. It comes off sounding somewhat akin to Mark Knopfler or Pat Metheny, yet thoroughly distinctive. It's not really jazz—more like an adventurous sound that was once called avant garde. It's strangely beautiful, and would create a nice change of pace for jazz and progressive programmers.

DOORS Alive, She Cried (Elektra, 655 Fifth Avenue, New York, NY 10022)—We haven't heard this much conviction and passion on record in a long while—a good measure of the timelessness of this band. While it's true that old Doors material has been overplayed, overexposed, overhyped ad nauseum, this record is alarmingly refreshing, and deserves all the airplay it undoubtedly will receive. The highlight is their version of the classic "Gloria," which has never before been released. The live tracks are all superb and superbly recorded—the versions of "Light My Fire" and "Texas Radio & The Big Beat" are best.

JENNIFER HOLLIDAY Feel My Soul (Geffen, c/o Warner Bros., address above)—For those who haven't heard, Jennifer Holliday is the singer who stopped the show in *Dreamgirls* with "And I'm Telling You I'm Not Going." For her LP debut she's been teamed with Maurice White of Earth, Wind & Fire. And it works—White's production sheen plays perfectly off Holliday's earthy, passionate vocals. Top cuts: "My Sweet Delight," "Just Let Me Wait," "I Am Love," "Change Is Gonna Come."

LOS LOBOS . . . And A Time To Dance (Slash, P.O. Box 48888, Los Angeles, CA 90048)—It's hard to imagine a stranger record coming from Slash. Los Lobos sounds like a Spanish lounge band whose members learned their trade in a hip Los Angeles Holiday Inn. Still, it's great fun and occasionally—especially when the accordian chimes in—magic. To top it all off, T-Bone Burnett is co-producer, with a special thanks to the Blasters. Top cuts: "Let's Say Goodnight," "Why Do You Do," "Come On Let's Go."

BURNING SENSATIONS Burning Sensations (Capitol, 1750 N. Vine St., Hollywood, CA 90028)—More adventurous rock from Tim McGovern and crew, focusing on the upbeat tropical party atmosphere of "Belly Of The Whale" (included here) from their Jackpot EP from this past spring. A consistently intriguing record with many strong tracks, including "Beat Temptation," "Not Cloudy All Day" and the funny "Is This What You Mean."

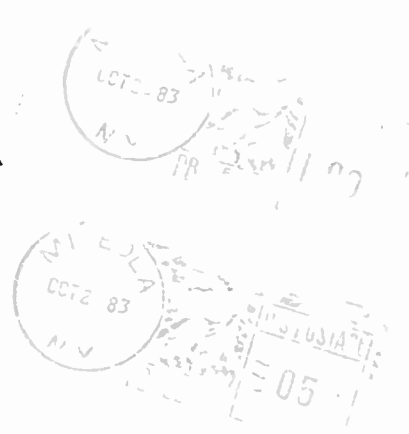
B.B. SPIN Try To Beat The Heat (Cactus, 975 Webster Lane, Des Plaines, IL 60016)—B.B. Spin plays their rock and roll straight up—with power, passion and a true Midwestern pop sensibility. "The Phantom" is the lead track (and a hit indie single in Chicago a few years ago). We also like "She's That Girl" and "Crazy Mad."

BLUEBELLS Bluebells (EP) (Sire, c/o Warner Bros., address above)—Upbeat ultra-commercial pop a la Aztec Camera and the Alarm, and just as likeable. Nice harmony. "Cath" is the lead track, with "Patriots Game" and "Sugar Bridge" not far behind.
