

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8 Prayer For The Faithless

London's **Faithless** used to crank out complete records in two weeks flat. But *Outrospective*, the trio's latest full-length, kept the band chained to the production board for more than a year. The result is its

most diverse, mature and meticulous offering to date. M. Tye Comer met up with the band's resident house diva (Sister Bliss) and missionary wordsmith (Maxi Jazz) to discover the ambitions that drives dance music's most introspective outfit.

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

GILLIAN WELCH


Time (The Revelator) (Acony)

Forget the wagon-jumpers: Gillian Welch has been excavating arcane musical Americana far longer than the recent vogue towards all things old, weird and made in the mountains championed by hip reissues and innovative Hollywood filmmakers. Her well-worn, acoustic-minded songwriting style has been rooted predominantly in a past-time of sepia-toned photos and real-life myths, connected to the present only via T-Bone Burnett's modern production style. Well, no more. On *Time (The Revelator)*, Welch and her partner, guitar-paying maestro David Rawlings, have taken a sonic step backward while thematically tying the scope of history into a package that takes into account the short memories of today's modern music listeners, as well as the folks who ravenously guard their grandparents' collections of 78 RPM records. *Time's* a classic for today and any other day. Few sounds appear besides the duo's vocals and string instruments, bringing to mind the folk-country of the Carter Family and the acoustic blue ragas of John Fahey — the editorial savvy of the former melding effortlessly with the Appalachian mysticism of the latter. Inside Welch's psyche, songs about the Titanic's peril and Elvis' American dream are part of a single communal fabric, the desire to sing about rock 'n' roll can act as a revelator as naturally as watching the river flow, and the promised land's just around the bend. — **Piotr Orlov**

STEREOLAB

Sound-Dust (Elektra-EEG)

It's been a decade since Stereolab's retro-future pop visions first gave us a glimpse into the alternate universe of a Utopia-come-true. The idyllic, Marx-inspired, proto-hippie Tomorrowland never came, but that didn't stop band leaders Tim Gaine and Laetitia Sadier from writing music for it, and with *Sound-Dust* the group continues to build its impressionistic oeuvre dedicated to such a place. The album was recorded largely in Chicago with post-rock super producers John McEntire and Jim O'Rourke behind the master control, and honorary 'Lab Sean O'Hagan (High Llamas) puts the trill in the keyboards. (Note: Morgane Lhote, who formed part of the group since 1996, left the band before these recordings began.) Skip ahead to the harps, horns and harmonies on the momentum-building "Baby Lulu" lullaby, or the blips, slips, ooh-ahh, pah-pah-pah percolated sing-along "Hallucinex" for the quick on this album's celestial pop, which harkens back to the band's *Emperor Tomato Ketchup* days. And never letting up with the headiness of its song titles or lyrics (a reflection of a time when more of the brain is used?), Stereolab lets la-la-las be mistaken for "love, love, love" — the thing that makes sound, or dust such as us, come alive. — **Enrique Lavin**



PEP LOVE

Ascension (Hieroglyphics)

As part of the Bay-area based Hieroglyphics crew, Pep Love has been biding his time to release his solo debut. Previously overshadowed by his crewmates (Del Tha Funky Homosapien, Souls of Mischief, Casual), this onetime MC of The Prose's patience (as well as that of hip-hop fans) has finally paid off. On *Ascension*, Love grabs the mic and the spotlight and drops 16 solid tracks of intelligent, articulate, laid-back verse — laid-back meaning patient, not lazy or soft. The production (by fellow crew members JayBiz, A-Plus and Domino, as well as DJ Babu and Evidence) is bare, as those behind the boards know to complement the MC, not overshadow him. The simplicity of an acoustic guitar and flute make a perfect accompaniment to the positivity of the lyrics in the heartfelt and life-affirming (how many hip-hop tracks are described as "life-affirming"?!?) "Living Is Beautiful" (sample lyric: I choose the sunshine/ Even though sometimes it rains, my head never hangs in the confines of solitude/I do what I gotta do to maintain my attitude of gratitude for even breathin'). Also, be sure to check the Far East-influenced "Karma" and the booty-shakin' single, "Act-Phenom." With *Ascension*, Pep Love breathes some much-needed new life into hip-hop and shows us what it can and should be. — **Lisa Hageman**

CHOCOLATE GENIUS

Godmusic (V2)

If Marc Anthony Thompson seems audacious for calling himself Chocolate Genius, just look at the liberties he takes in naming his albums — 1998's *Black Music*, despite its impressive come-down of raggedy blues, soul and jazz forms, was hardly a treatise on modern African-American music. Likewise, its follow-up, *Godmusic*, beautifully touched as it is by spiritual dilemma and religious allegory, is probably the last thing you'd put on to accompany a Sunday morning prayer session. But herein lies the key to Anthony's real genius: His arrogance allows him to dive head-first into emotional briar patches most others would avoid, his moments of disappointment and fear belied by the confidence with which he handles his music and his persona. *Godmusic* traffics in the same kind of wasted modernist soul-blues as its predecessor, only its edges seem hazier and less defined, more disconsolate in matters of the heart — even when he's playing, at least stylistically, the part of sultry lover-man on the hushed "Love." But even when he's anguish over the all-encompassing nature of said emotion, as on "My Endless Fall," he keeps things loping along at a wonderfully cool clip, his smoke-warmed baritone accompanied by a careful mix of acoustic and electric guitars, smooth organ gloss and lightly snapping beats. This is god music we can all feel good about. — **Colin Helms**



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Money Mark Signs To Emperor Norton

Money Mark Nishita, a longtime Beastie Boys collaborator, recently signed with Emperor Norton, home of Fantastic Plastic Machine, Pepe Deluxe and Ladytron, among others.

Nishita lent his keyboard handiwork and songwriting skills to the Beasties' *Check Your Head*, *Ill Communication* and *Hello Nasty*. He also collaborated with Beck on *Odelay*.

Money Mark's Emperor Norton debut is entitled *Change Is Coming*, and is set for release on Sept. 18. The album marks the artist's third solo effort. Mo Wax put out 1995's *Mark's Keyboard Repair* and 1998's *Push The Button*. Money Mark will support *Change* with a tour of the U.S. and parts of Canada.

Yet Another Call For Unsigned Musicians

The opportunities for unsigned talent to get their work heard by labels are rapidly increasing. Either a celebration of the wonders of modern technology or merely a testament to the laziness (or budget cuts) of A&R departments everywhere, the call is out.

Newly-formed electronica label LunaticWorks is seeking producers of "bedroom music" everywhere — meaning submissions from experimental electronic artists — for its new series of compilation CDs. LunaticWorks will pay for the mastering of accepted submissions, and the artist will get a royalty on sales of the compilations. Artists, in concert with the label, will also be responsible for marketing their own track within their community, an effort aimed at creating an artist-driven fan and sales base.

"With the availability, affordability and plug and playability of today's tools (computer programs, beat boxes, turntables et al.), kids are producing close to studio quality tracks in their bedrooms," said label founder Jason Whittington in a statement. "We wanted to provide an opportunity for distribution."

LunaticWorks has a distribution deal with Beyond Music/Universal Music Group.

Gravediggaz' Too Poetic Succumbs To Cancer

On Sunday, July 15, rapper Too Poetic (a.k.a. Anthony Berkeley), died at a Los Angeles hospital after a two-year battle with colon cancer. He was 35.

Poetic, along with Wu-Tang member RZA, producer Prince Paul and ex-Stetasonic member Frukwan, formed Gravediggaz in 1993. The group released its debut, *Six Feet Deep*, in 1994 and followed up with *The Pick*, *The Sickle* and *The Shovel* in 1997. A new album (sans RZA), entitled *Nightmare In A-Minor*, is tentatively scheduled for a late August release on Echo International.

"Poetic was the brother I never had," said fellow bandmate Frukwan in a statement. "I love him dearly and always will. We always had each other's back."

Added Prince Paul, "I was honored to have worked with him. Whatever he has done musically is going to live on, and I am proud to have been a part of that."

Turntable Championships To Begin

On Aug. 24, 17 U.S.-based turntablists will compete in the DMC (Dance Music Community)/Technics U.S. Finals for the honor of representing their country in the ultimate DJ battle: the DMC/Technics 2001 World Championship. The battle is scheduled to take place Sept. 22-23 at the Apollo in London.

Competing in the U.S. Finals at Club Townsend in San Francisco will be regional champions that include Presyce (New York City), Abstru (Atlanta), Rocky Rock (Seattle), Vadra (Denver), Prescision (Boston), Kico (Cleveland), Kid Drago (Los Angeles), Golden Chyld (San Francisco), Perseus (Chicago), Abilities (Minneapolis), Imperial (Puerto Rico) and 14-year-old Solution (Hawaii). Rapper Ice-T will host the event that will feature guest performances by former U.S. champions DJ Craze and DJ Swamp.

Just A Bite...

Loudon Wainwright III will release *Last Man On Earth*, the singer-songwriter's first studio album in four years, on Sept. 25. *Last Man* will mark

Wainwright's debut on the Red House Records imprint. •

Guitar maker Fender has teamed up with Rhino Records and Morling Manor Music to form its own music label, Fender Records. The first release in a guitar-driven music series called *Riff Rocks* is set for release sometime in the fourth quarter of 2001. The CDs will be sold throughout Fender's 1,500 retail outlets. •

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PRAYER FOR THE FAITHLESS

Dance music's most introspective band reaches new peaks with the entrancing *Outrospective*.

The word "faithless" contradicts the character of the British band that owns the moniker. The term's implications seem too distant and despondent to represent the poignant sensibilities that production wizard Rollo, vocal missionary Maxi Jaxx and house heroine Sister Bliss emit through their dramatic dance orchestrations. While most of their contemporaries concentrate on carefree, one-dimensional music designed to distract its listeners from the distressing reality of everyday life, Faithless has always confronted the human condition straight on, with an unwavering optimism rooted in knowledge rather than naïveté.

Although the band's unique musical output, which buffers intuitive, intelligent lyrics with haunting melodic arrangements, was initially ignored by commercial radio when the group first appeared on the scene with its remarkable 1995 *Reverence* album on London's Cheeky Records, the response to the band's amalgamation of trance, hip-hop, house and dub on the club circuit was immediate and enthusiastic. Faithless backed up its dancefloor prowess with a dynamic live show and tireless touring schedule, remaining on the road for a solid four years straight after making its debut. Four million albums sold worldwide and countless club and festival gigs later, Faithless has emerged as one of the most successful and influential outfits of its era, an act whose mastery of both dance and downbeat radiates beyond the rave and turns the ears of rockers and clubbers alike.

"There's a really beautiful vibe that exists within the band, and that translates through our music, which has a similarly uplifting, all-

inclusive feeling to it," says Maxi. "The three of us are completely different people and on our own, we'd come up with absolutely different music. The fact that all of our personalities converge as Faithless allows our music to become more universal. You don't have to be into hip-hop, you don't have to be a club kid, you don't have to be young, and you don't have to be old. It translates to you no matter what direction or level you approach it from."

The band continues to exert its influence with the recently released *Outrospective* (Cheeky-Kinetic/Arista Records). The work is the result of a year-long labor of love, one that Bliss calls their most mature and meticulously crafted offering to date. "We spent all of 17 days recording *Reverence*," she recalls. "Rollo was really impatient then and just sort of rushed everything through. This time around, we'd have Dido [Rollo's sister] come in and spend three days doing her vocal part, and then take another three months to tinker with and perfect the song."

Faithless's members say the craft and the art of the album's songs come across in the basic structure and melodies, without losing sight of the actual production of the songs. "To create something that will connect with people for years and years, we spent a lot of time getting the balance just right and adding depth to our songs," Bliss adds.

In the spirit of *Reverence*'s "Insomnia" and "God Is A DJ," from Faithless' successful 1998 album *Sunday 8 P.M.*, "We Come 1," the first single from *Outrospective*, is the album's trump card: a fierce club tune filled with the ominous synthesizer melodies, dramatic builds

and hypnotizing house grooves that are ubiquitous to Faithless' sophisticated dancefloor endeavors.

But the other highlights on the album are anything but standard. Maxi's sharp vocal delivery adds a punctuating sting to the fluttering Philly-soul refrains of "Muhammad Ali." Dido, a regular Faithless contributor (and sister to Rollo), adds a charismatic contrast to Maxi's subtle sermonizing on the blissful "One Step Too Far." Rollo and Bliss command the dancefloor on the instrumental acid house-inspired "Machines R Us," while the vocals of chanteuse Zoe Johnston lighten the brooding downbeat groove of "Crazy English Summer."

But what song could falter when Maxi Jazz is at the vocal helm? "I'm not a mystic/ My views are realistic," he rapped on the band's first album, and the statement continues to ring true with every epiphany-inducing word he utters on *Outrospective*. His authoritative baritone vocals harness a power that could allow him to "bite like a tarantula," but he chooses to spin philosophies rather than rules during his controlled delivery. His insights are poetic without being esoteric ("You're the left eye, I'm the right/ Would it not be madness to fight," from "We Come 1"). His flow gels perfectly with Rollo and Bliss's cascading aural textures. It's almost impossible not to be entranced.

"I once received a letter from a fan who said she saw us play one time, and woke up three days later with a couple of my lyrics

running through her head," recalls Maxi, "words she didn't even realize she had taken in at the time. It's proof that people will pay attention to the messages in our music, even if they don't realize it at the time."

Faithless's missionary efforts will find the band circling the globe from Sept. 2001 to Sept. 2002. As always, the outfit will recreate its earnest, energetic music with the help of a six-member backing group onstage, freeing them from the restriction of pre-recorded tapes that suffocates the live spontaneity of most electronic acts. Bliss hopes that the tour, in addition to the pop sensibilities of the singles such as "We Come 1" and "Muhammad Ali," will help more listeners convert to Faithless outside the dancefloor in the States.

"It requires a lot of people to recreate the kinds of textures that we create in the studio. So when we go onstage, we use all of the instruments that your average rock fan can relate to," says Bliss. "That's when we play these big European festivals, we're playing the same stages as Roxy Music and Lenny Kravitz. We're not ghetto-ized into the dance tent because our music translates beyond the dancefloor."

"I get sick of the endless traveling and missing our family and friends, but you only get this kind of chance once in life and I think Faithless could be the biggest band in the world," Bliss continues. "I'm so proud of what we do, and when you find something you want to share it with people, you want to deliver it to as many people as possible. That's why we work so hard. It's evangelical in a way." **NMR**


Pretend Hits (Sugar Free)

Somewhere along the line, the home-taping contingent decided it was okay to come out of the closet and reveal its funky side. Influenced by vintage Prince, New Order and other '80s synth bands, as well as garage-sale vinyl, these analog architects employ the lo-fi, DIY esthetic to

create tracks as personal as they are progressive. On its second album, the Minneapolis-based Busy Signals, which consists solely of Howard W. Hamilton III, puts together a mix of "pretend hits" filled with cheap beats, new wave noodling, underground hip-hop flow and yearning pop naivety. The 12 tracks are tastefully varied, providing backdrops for the guest vocals of white trash soul-man Har Mar Superstar, rapper Phonte and ingénues Amanda Warner and Lisa Janssen. Hamilton plays most of the instruments here and occasionally sings in a fragile, wavering yelp, but there's enough character in his performance to keep fans coming back for more. Surprisingly disarming, *Pretend Hits* will unassumingly charm itself into your heart.

CHITLIN' FOOKS

Chitlin' Fooks

(Hidden Agenda–Parasol)

The rock-country twang of Chitlin' Fooks' self-titled debut could easily have come from the Mississippi Delta, but it's actually the output of a pair of prominent Dutch/Belgian indie-rockers. Bettie Serveert's

Carol Van Dyk and Sukilove's Pascal Deweze bring along a host of buddies to help them create a sound clearly influenced by Gram Parsons's early '70s fusion of country, blues and rock. They even cover the Flying Burrito Brothers' "Juanita," alongside songs written by Jimmie Rodgers and Kitty Wells. Despite the derivative nature of the music on *Chitlin' Fooks*, the charm of the dual-vocal harmonies and stripped-down guitar tracks is undeniable. The album is surrounded by the swirling pedal-steel guitar and quirky vocal style that is characteristic of many alt-country bands dotting the current musical landscape, but the Fooks deftly avoid this label by creating music so soulful, it will make American country revivalists green with envy.

HAUJOBB

Haujobb embraces the same kind of industrial music that Sascha Konietzko dabbled in when he transformed KMFDM into MDFMK: Massive, distorted bass drum hits, drum 'n' bass beats and dirty 303 squiggles. What the German duo brings to the table is a somewhat more sophisticated

approach to atmospherics. Rather than relying on conventional guitars and keyboards, Haujobb propels its songs with layers of swirling noise, razor-sharp drones and deep-in-the-mix ear candy. The band also displays moments of tastefulness that are uncharacteristic of today's industrial, most notably on the tiny, reverb-drenched piano line that accompanies the pounding beats of "Demon." Like so many other industrial acts, *Polarity*'s one downfall is its singing: While it's occasionally on, it too often devolves into tuneless droning. However, listen to *Polarity*'s instrumental interludes and forgive its vocal flaws and you might just be looking at one of the more notable lights at the end of industrial's tunnel.

HIS NAME IS ALIVE

Someday My Blues Will Cover The Earth


(4AD–Beggars Banquet)

The reason for His Name Is Alive's frequent genre hopping may lie in the fact that Warren Defever is just so freakin' talented that he finds it necessary to methodically demonstrate his

mastery of all available pop forms. You don't really need to go much farther than the first track on *Someday* to support this theory. "Nothing Special" is a tasty bit of modern soul that could sneak onto urban radio playlists. From there, Defever further explores the soulful, bluesy vibe that emerged on last year's *When The Stars Refuse To Shine*. Much of the focus is on the rich, lovely voice of Lovetta Pippen, which is effectively sultry on the electric soul-influenced title track, torchy on the classic blues drag of "Karin's Blues," and plaintive on the cello downer "Are We Still Married." Defever sometimes sounds like he's trying to be the Dr. Dre of rural Michigan. And you know, that ain't a bad thing at all.

THE WORD

The Word (Rope-A-Dope)
John Medeski and members of the North Mississippi All Stars have talked about recording an instrumental gospel record for years, but it wasn't until the kinetic keyboardist and the blues boys caught on to the sounds of sacred steel — a joyous, slide guitar-driven praise

music — that the idea really started to come together. Enter pedal steel player Robert Randolph, a bright young sacred steeler whose licks are as soulful as they are adventurous. Bolstered by Medeski and the All Stars, Randolph gives *The Word* its profound meaning. Recorded in just a handful of sessions, *The Word* is a sort of inspirational jam band record; earthy, funky, bluesy and heavenly. Randolph's blistering work on "Without God" is enough to make the Allman Brothers proclaim "We're not worthy!" With MM&W, Medeski often tests sonic limits, but his playing here is somehow sweeter and more soulful thanks to the spiritual vibe, as if to say "Everybody's welcome. Enjoy the jam."

NULSET

Nullset (Grand Royal)

Boston's Nullset's already gets one brownie point for the fact that its self-titled debut is on Grand Royal, the quality label owned and operated by the Beastie Boys. If the fiercely hip Mike D and co. like Nullset (formerly known as Gangsta Bitch Barbie until Mattel

threw its weight around) enough to put out its records, then there's got to be something super special about the band. Beasties association aside, this Beantown quintet scores another point with its musical adeptness. On the surface, *Nullset* is rap-influenced rock, but when you delve a little deeper, you realize these guys aren't taking any cues from Limp Bizkit. The guitars are brawnier, quirkier and more funkified than most rapcore, while the grooves are completely cage-rattling. Lyrically, the Nullset guys pepper their tunes with plenty of smart and witty pop culture references — and isn't that what the Beastie Boys have always done, even in their immature, beer-can throwing days? We're partial to "This Ain't California," "Smokewood," "Kingpin" and "System."

LO DEYA

Lo Deya (Lo Deya)

Although Lo Deya's foundation is set in the more straightforward, mid-tempo mortar of modern rock pop bands like Train, its strength lies in its tastefully disguised breadth of range, both instrumentally and vocally. The band's debut, *This Time*, glides from wistful

grunge-pop, à la Belly, into much darker caverns haunted by minor chords reminiscent of classic Radiohead party poopers like "Creep." Lyrically, Peira Moinester maintains a finding-myself-through-being-with-you vibe, and manages to do so from the top of her register and the base of her throat with equal success. "Holds Me Up" best showcases the efficacy of such sonic blending, while "What Little I Know" finds bassist Devin Krug temporarily taking lead vocals for further diversification. Lo Deya begs for a variety of comparisons, but *This Time* slowly spins around a mellow, melody-laden core that is all the band's own.





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

Songs In A Northern Key (Artemis)

Varnaline is back to square one, and that's a good thing. In the last five years, the one-time trio has become the sole domain of guitarist/songwriter Anders Parker, who broke off a few years ago to make the EP *A Shot And A Beer* and then never hooked

back up full time with drummer Jud Ehrbar (formerly of Space Needle) and bassist John Parker (Anders's brother). Those two play on a couple of songs here, and Kendall Meade (Mascott) contributes vocals on "Broken Song," but this is really a sample plate of Anders gems — plaintive, rootsy Neil Young-inspired acoustic melodies like the ones presented on his EP ("Murder Crow"), fuzzed-out rock songs with lots of vocal reverb ("Song"), and matter-of-fact rock songs plied with beautifully incongruous pedal steel and synthesizer ("Difference"). After the fully-realized, almost-arena rock of the band's last album, *Sweet Life*, this is a return to the raw esthetic of the four-track demos that made the band's debut, *Man Of Sin*, such a gem. — Dylan Siegler

Dyed In The Wool (Quarterstick)

Singer/songwriter Shannon Wright's third full-length may not be the perfect soundtrack for a birthday party, but its hauntingly stark songs, layered with the former Crowsdell frontwoman's sweet-yet-tor-

tured vocals, are undoubtedly something to celebrate. Poetic pop at its best, *Dyed In The Wool* features 12 tracks dripping with sad and dark (though not overly dramatic) emotion. From the jangly opening track "Less Than A Moment," through the piano-driven anger of "Hinterland" and the restrained desperation of the title track, Wright gracefully and tenderly bares her soul and remarkable songwriting prowess. *Dyed* does lean toward the forlorn, but the record is not without some notable upbeat rocking moments. The catchy "The Path Of Least Persistence (Figure II)" takes the tempo up a notch, but Wright's intensely forlorn vocals still give the track an affecting tragic feel. *Dyed In The Wool* certainly isn't a happy and light album, but it's inspirational, uplifting and beautiful just the same.



So many stars have emerged from New York's Queensbridge projects that strong talent has been overlooked over the years. Nas and Mobb Deep both made an impact in the '90s with different sides of the patented Queens sound (storytelling lyrics, catchy

shout-along choruses and dark, brooding street beats), and now it's Cormega's turn to do the same. On his debut, *The Realness*, he shows all the markings of a Queens star — not as an upstart, but as a veteran who has been shining on his friends' albums for quite some time. Relapse Records, the premiere name in underground extreme audio atrocities, has signed a worldwide deal to manufacture, market and distribute all releases on Baphomet/Housecore Records — the label of Necrophagia's Killjoy and Pantera/Necrophagia/Viking Crown/Superjoint Ritual/Amicuss/Down member Philip Anselmo.

Of the partnership, Killjoy said, "Philip and I are extremely proud to announce that we have decided to work with Relapse Records in conjunction with our label." Killjoy went on to say that he and Anselmo had considered many different avenues and outlets for their record label, but after repeated meetings with Relapse President Matt Jacobson it was very apparent that Relapse was their clear choice.

"Relapse has a great grasp of the business," Killjoy said. "It has proper distribution, a hard-working, knowledgeable staff and above all a burning dedication to our scene. We intend to work in conjunction with Relapse for a long time to bring you some truly noteworthy releases."

The immediate releases that will benefit from this deal are *Southern Isolation* and *Gorelord*, with projected release dates in November. Superjoint Ritual's self-titled album will be

released in early 2002. Anselmo himself says that extreme music fans should expect nothing but quality metal from his personal label affiliation.

"It's going to be a fresh approach," he said. "It's going to be a lot of homemade shit, not major label-produced monstrosities." Spoken like the true, poseur-free metal warrior that he is, leading the charge to stamp out, destroy and kill all false metal dead.

He went on to say, "I just got permission from Elektra to independently put out all the bands that I've ever fucking done. Each band that I'm involved in outside of Pantera is a way for me to express and develop different outlets that are very much a part of me. With Pantera, it's only one side of me. I love to write and create music, and the side bands are very different from Pantera. They also show the flexibility in me as a musician; Pantera's very important in my life, but there's many other things that keep this boy here content."

Thank you Phil, for making the Loud Rock world an angrier, more brutal, less phony place.

There are a lot of *new* things about Primer 55's latest album, *(The) New Release*, besides the fact that it just came out. It contains a smarter, more mature, more distinctly new sound for the band. Its pissed-off-as-a-bull debut *Introduction To Mayhem* fit so snuggly into the rapcore mold that it got lost between

Artful Dodger's much anticipated debut album still has yet to see the light of day in America, but UK garage team have already revealed its parting of ways. A statement released in mid-July announced that the duo, Mark Hill and Pete Devereux, were splitting up after five-years as one of the most successful acts of the UK garage scene. Hill will continue on with the Artful Dodger moniker for his future productions and remixes while Devereux will continue to DJ under his own name and produce tracks for other projects. The members are reported to remain on good terms, though unconfirmed rumors report that Hill paid Devereux £200,000 to get him out of the band. Artful Dodger's debut album, *All About The Stragglers*, is still scheduled for Sept. 18 release in the U.S. on London-Sire records.

Global Underground, the independent UK label responsible for the lauded superstar DJ mix series of the same name, as well as the *Nu Breed* mix series (which focuses on up-and-coming jockeys), recently opened an office in New York City. Headed by New York hip-hop veteran Frank Toro, the new outpost will allow the label to expand its presence in the growing U.S. market, which now accounts for more than two-thirds of its overall sales. Paul Oakenfold's *New York* and Sasha's *Ibiza* stand as the most successful releases in the label's catalog, having sold 150,000 and 100,000 copies respectively in the U.S. Lift Promotion (212.974.9800) will continue to be the U.S. radio contact for all Global Underground releases. Rap pioneer, actor, "original gangsta" and self-proclaimed pimp Ice-T will host the 2001 U.S. DMC/Technics World Championship on

August 24. The 16th annual competition will find New York's Presyce, L.A.'s Kid Dragon, San Francisco's Golden Child, Miami's Infamous and 14-year-old Hawaiian wunderkind Solution and 13 other scratch masters battling it out for the U.S. championship and the right to represent the United States at the DMC World Championships, which will take place Sept. 22 and 23 in London. DJ Craze, three-time world champion and last year's winner, will retire from the competition and allow last year's Stateside runner-up, Atlanta's DJ Klever, to step in as defender of the U.S. title. Previous DMC winners include a such turntablist as DJ Swamp (best known for his work with Beck), Q-Bert and Mix Master Mike of the Bay Area's Invisible Skratch Pklz collective, Cash Money, and X-Ecutioner Roc Raida.

Q & A



DB

For the past decade New York-by-way-of-London DJ DB has been one of break-beat music's most stalwart advocates. Not only is he one of the scene's most popular and respected talents, he also played a huge role in the establishment and success of Manhattan's BreakBeat Science label and record store, which celebrates its fifth anniversary this year. Celebrating this achievement, DB recently released *The Secret Art Of Science*, a blissful drum 'n' bass mix that includes rare classics from Johnny L, Marcus Intalex, Adam F, Photek and many others.

I like the fact that *The Secret Art Of Science* doesn't rely on great tracks that we've all heard a thousand times before.

Yeah, the "secret" part of the title points to the fact that these are little known tracks, stuff I think that a lot of people may not know, but I think are great tunes that need to get out there. I play a drum 'n' bass set sometimes, and I just picked out some of the favorite tunes I've stuck with throughout the years.

This happens to be the first CD release in the history of the BreakBeat Science label. Why such a long wait?

It just didn't feel right until now. BBS is such a small company that we weren't at the level that we needed to be to do this properly. We've been building up the label over the last couple of years with our 12" releases, and we recently signed a sweet distribution deal with a company called ADA, so now the time is right.

Many people have declared drum 'n' bass to be a dead genre at this point.

Many people in the media have declared it dead, but not the

people out there dancing to it every weekend. And it's fine that the media have dropped it because the press really ignored drum 'n' bass for its first three or four years anyway. It suddenly got discovered by all the trendy magazines in the UK, it exploded, but now that the press thinks it's over, it's just gone underground again. The scene in America is one of the most organic and naturally growing cultures I've ever seen. I've been DJ-ing across America for 10 years now, and I'm amazed at how large and enthusiastic the crowds continue to be. I show up in Texas and there are 7,000 people there. I play in Puerto Rico to 4,000 people. It's extraordinary.

What producers do you think are creatively expanding the sound?

The list of producers pushing the boundaries is endless. Marcus Intellex, for one. Blame has an album coming out that is really blowing my mind. Stacker and Skynet — I still like a lot of the harder stuff too, you see. I don't want people to think I've gone all soft just because I'm putting out a chill DJ mix. I've always incor-

porated into a lot of different styles into my sets.

Including 2-step, which you've been spinning quite a bit of recently.

I think that U.K. garage will have a wider audience when it gets established here in the States because of its soul and pop sensibility. It's just wicked music. It's song driven and its tempo is much more accessible than drum 'n' bass, so I think it has more of shot to crack the mainstream. The store sells out of our new 12" releases every week, so it's definitely a growing market. It's such a hybrid — you can be a fan of R&B, or of jungle, or even techno and breakbeat, and it's got all of those elements in there.

And you're heading out a three-month tour supporting *The Secret Art Of Science*, aren't you?

Yeah, I'll be out there playing across the country every weekend, much to the chagrin of my wife and nine month old baby, Max. His face is actually on the CD. When he's old enough, he's coming on the road with me...whether he likes it or not.



The constantly changing sound of modern dance floors has left most of electronic music's still-surviving heritage bands struggling for relevancy in the rave new world. Depeche Mode, however, stands as an exception. Not only does "I Feel Loved," the deep, sensual second single from the trio's

Exciter album, stand as the best dance track the band has recorded since 1990's "Enjoy The Silence," it also has a good shot at becoming the most memorable single of 2001. Thomas Brinkman litters the track's galloping bassline with squelchy acid squizzles and a taut metallic kick, while Doug Hart and Paul Freegard flesh out the track's ominous mood with their dramatically subdued "Chambers" remix. But it's Danny Tenaglia's "Labor Of Love" mix that will emerge as the classic of the crop — a brooding, yet beautiful house affair that injects tribal, techno, progressive and even garage elements into the DM's sublime, edgy orchestration without ruining the ambiance of the original track. Strange things were afoot in the bar of New York City's Mansfield Hotel on July 17. Brazilian-born saxophonist Leo Gandelman played an intimate gathering at the hotel to mark the release of his new album on Jazzateria Records, entitled *Brazilian Soul*. As it turns out, one of the attendees was former president Bill Clinton. On the day before the event, Gandelman got word that Clinton would be in the audience, so the saxophonist made the call to Brazil and put in a special order with LA Sax, the saxophone manufacturer that provides him with his ax. Clinton showed up during sound check (Clinton has two of Gandelman's albums) with the promise to return later and hang

out. Clinton returned around 11 p.m. and received a fancy new saxophone painted in the national colors of Brazil for his efforts. (Apparently, he had lost the sax-

ophone emblazoned in red white and blue, which had been given to him early in his presidency, and had been unable to play

since.) He also accepted an invitation to take it for a spin and join Gandelman in a duet, which he did on a bossa nova version of "Summertime." Clinton then shook people's hands as he made an exit with his new saxophone. "Clinton was just a really down to earth guy," says Preston Powell, Jazzateria's own commander-in-chief. "He had some food, chatted a lot with Gandelman and generally was surprisingly approachable, letting people take pictures and stuff."

Blue Note has officially announced its signing of Texas-bred, New York-based singer **Norah Jones**. More Cassandra Wilson than Diana Krall, the 22-year-old's music is definitely in the jazz vein, but also bears

the influence of singer-songwriters like Joni Mitchell and Ricki Lee Jones; she features the acoustic guitar prominently along with the jazzier sound of acoustic piano, upright bass, drums and percussion. Jones's choice of material for her nine-track debut is a mix of jazz tunes like Duke Ellington's "I Didn't Know About You" and Horace Silver's "Peace," as well as non-jazz songs like the country-ish "Lonestar" and Ray Charles's gospel-tinged "Hallelujah, I Love Him So." Guest for the session included Bill Frisell and Brian Blade. Ensuring a recipe of success, noted producer Craig Street (who seems to specialize in vocalists) mans the boards, as he has also done for Cassandra

OTHER DIMENSIONS/FLASHBACK

In this Other Dimensions column dedicated to vinyl junkies and audiophiles, I'll focus on some recent reissues from the BYG and Abraxis labels, which can be found through Runt Distribution (www.buyrunt.com). The packaging for all of these releases is spectacular, the sound is decent to above par and, honestly, it's a real treat to drop those 180-gram vinyl platters onto a turntable.

Alan Silva has sort of popped back onto the radar in recent years with a couple of albums on Eremite (his most recent was released earlier this year). That album is okay, but listening to Silva play his cheesy-sounding synthesizer is more than a little trying — the man makes Fela Kuti's questionable keyboard skills sound downright good. In his younger days, however, Silva could be found playing bass for Cecil Taylor, Albert Ayler and even Andrew Hill. He also led the Celestial Communication Orchestra, which included a star-studded revolving cast of players. Recorded in 1970, *Alan Silva And The Celestial Communication Orchestra* (BYG) is a triple slab of manic group improvisation that often reaches cacophonic levels. Swing is *not* the order of the day here; instead the 19-player orchestra takes a more European avant-garde approach, which is a surprising considering that there were Art Ensemble and other Afro-American players in the house. Nevertheless, this long-form piece flows from beginning to end, taking listeners on an epic journey.

Even Ken Burns knows that the Art Ensemble Of Chicago spent a few years living and playing in France. *Message To Our Folks* (BYG) is not so much a letter home to the U.S. as it is a call to arms. Recorded in 1969, this album was issued before drummer Don Moye joined up. As such, listeners can experience the Art Ensemble approach, where the horn players play percussion when not soloing. The effect is pretty scattered, with odd punctuation as different members grab different instruments. The cover of Charlie Parker "Dexterity" is interesting, and there's also a funky rock tune with electric bass and guitar here entitled "Rock Out," which

sounds like James Brown would have if he was an anarchist instead of a tyrant. Not the best place to start for AEC stuff, but this does have its merits.



Archie Shepp has already had a busy year, with the release of his *St. Louis Blues* (Jazz Magnet) and a collaboration with Roswell Rudd, *Live In New York*, just out on Verve. Featuring one of the funniest album covers in recent memory, *Blaze* (BYG) sports a shot of Shepp with profoundly disinterested look on his face.

Shepp is known for his paint-peeling saxophone tone, but here he's playing pretty and often backing a couple of singers. The odd rhythm section, comprised of drum legend Philly Joe Jones and Art Ensemble bassist Malachi Favors, seems strange on paper, but they don't have any problems working through this ballad-heavy album. When they do take it up, the trio goes head-to-head on the way-out sounding "Toureg," with Jones staying right with the other two. Dave Burrell and Lester Bowie both add some nice moments to the recording as well.

Everyone knows that pianist Bob James wrote the theme for the TV show *Taxi* and is primarily known as a jazzy pop stylist. *Explosions* (Abraxis) features James in a trio with bassist Barre Phillips and drummer Robert Pozar. Recorded in 1965, the music here is about as far from instrumental pop as one could ever imagine. James sounds like he's integrated all classical avant-gardist or fluxus sound collage stuff here, and even incorporates the movement's empty space technique. James also utilizes found sound, TV sports commentary and sound distortions throughout the album. Without a harmonica or singer anywhere in sight, *Explosions* is an odd, early footnote that will certainly shock those who thought they knew the work of Bob James.

Wilson and Susana Baca. A release date has not yet been scheduled. For those New Yorkers looking for a preview, Jones is currently doing a string of Wednesday nights at New York City's Makor nightclub. Jones also appears on two tracks from Charlie Hunter's upcoming album, *Songs From The Analog Play-ground*, which hits stores on Sept. 25.



CARLOS SANTANA

Divine Light – Reconstruction & Mix Translation: Bill Laswell (Columbia Legacy)

Producer Bill Laswell shocked and delighted people with 1998's *Panthalassa*, a remix album featuring his retextualization of Miles Davis's fusion work from 1969-74. Here he goes back into the vaults to focus on Carlos Santana's jazz fusion epics *Love, Devotion, Surrender* and *Illuminations*. The celestial vibe that Santana originally went for is fully intact here, with the string-laden tracks "Bliss: The Eternal Now" and "Illuminations," both of which feature Alice Coltrane on harp and invoke comparisons with the current sounds emanating from the ambient techno scene. Santana's "Black Magic Woman" faction will dig the rocky, John McLaughlin-penned "The Life Divine." You will also experience Santana's loving covers of Coltrane's "Acknowledge-ment" (from *A Love Supreme*) and "Niama." Santana may have been a rocker turned Latin-pop star, but this album reminds younger fans that he once was and still is deeply influenced by jazz figures like Coltrane and Davis. With Laswell at the controls, this sound is remarkably timeless and altogether inspired.

STEUART LIEBIG

Pomegranate (Cryptogramophone)

Bassist Steuart Liebig straddles the line between free improvisation and mid-sized group composition. He does this using a seven-piece band called Kammerstig, which provides solid but frenetic playing. Additionally, each of the four compositions on *Pomegranate*, which sit in the 15- to 22-minute range, is specifically composed for each of the four guest soloists. Liebig gets the best of both worlds, mixing established chemistry with unexpected surprises. It's a far cry from his work with Les McCann, but it's quite obvious that Liebig has a distinct affinity for the varied guests; the track for guitarist Nels Cline sounds markedly different from the track for Tom Varner. And Vinny Golia's cut flat out rips with its fiery reed playing.

Bassist Andy McCloud has played countless sessions with such folks as Elvin Jones, Dizzy Gillespie and Don Pullen. Here he's put together a beautiful quartet that sounds like a classic Blue Note session from the early '60s. The playing starts out in a straight-ahead groove but looks to break off into adventurous improvisation whenever possible, particularly on "Waltz For A Nebulous Woman." McCloud sets the tone here with a bouncing bass style that swings deep, but in a jaunty sort of way.



A word on the Latin Grammys: Colombian pop-rocker Juanes garnered six nominations (the most ever so far) for the second installment of the Recording Academy's Latin-oriented awards. The nominations are a tremendous coup by an unknown artist in the States, and a huge nod to rock/alternative in Spanish.

Juanes's tally definitely took steam away from compatriots Aterciopelados (who nabbed three nominations), but look at the foundations laid down: Last year's big winner, Shakira (Colombian as well. Hmmm, is the Colombian music explosion next?), has one toe in the alternative world and the remainder resting on a pop pedestal. Juanes

comes from a much more rockin' background than Shakira ever did, and by all indications, he could become a household name in the U.S. – on Sept. 11 he'll be seen by millions of viewers in 120 countries, carried in the U.S. on CBS.

A lot of great albums and artists were missed, including Orishas, Sergeant Garcia, Titan and Zurdok to name a few. And there's always a question of the Academy's cred (they'll never be able to live down choosing Chris Perez's album over Cafe Tacuba's masterful *Revés/Yosoy* in 1999). But in the history books, it'll be all about Juanes — marking yet another boost for the Latin alternative world. (See complete list of nominees at www.grammy.com.)



CIRCO

No Todo Lo Que Es Pop Es Bueno (Head Music-DLN)

Newsflash: El Manjar De Los Díoses is no more. The Puerto Rican flamenco-inflected pop band killed itself to give birth to the bizzaro pop of Circo. Led by other-worldly singer-songwriter/divo José Luis Abreu (a.k.a Fofé), whose signature Robert Smith-styled sighs and

whimpers spikes his emotive lyrics of twisted love and tormented souls, Circo delves into new wave pop, neo-goth and Spaniard prima donna theatics. The group became an instant sensation at the 2001 edition of the Latin Alternative Music Conference, with both an acoustic performance in which Fofé's a cappella voice seemed to emerge from another dimension and a full set where the group's rough-and-tumble looks were a bit misleading, considering the band's pop pretensions. Calling out their contemporaries, Circo's debut, *No Todo Lo Que Es Pop Es Bueno*, comments on the vapid state of the pop world, "not everything that's pop is good," while at the same time begging for its own critique. And, yes, this Circo pop is not just good, it's crazy good! Simple guitar-driven pop melodies become the bed from which elegant electronic pillows bounce as Fofé's operatic and new world vocal chords stretch out comfortably. On "Arrastrao" ("Dragged") the band gets tropical with a little shock-treated piano-structured salsa, while on "Odiame" ("Hate Me") Spanish-flavored pop is tinged with twangy guitars as carnival-esque keyboards and horns build up to Broadway show tune-like proportions.



The Real Jamaican Ska (Epic Legacy)

Jamaica sent a contingent of Ska singers and musicians to the 1964 World's Fair. This was the first taste U.S. audiences got of the music. On the heels of the music's arrival, the original version of this compilation appeared. While it didn't encompass the big names or hits, it made a good

primer with offerings from a very young Jimmy Cliff, the Techniques and former calypso player Lord Creator. This reissue adds a couple of 1963 tracks from the Wailers (also available on another just-released compilation), including the superb "Simmer Down," to give a rounded view of what was happening in the sound systems of the loudest island in the world back then. Delving beyond the top tunes, this is not only entertainment but also a history lesson you can skank to.



Later the same month, Koité will be at Bloomington, Indiana's Lotus Festival (Sept. 19–23), which also features Benin's Gangbé Brass Band, Tuva's Yat-Kha, bluesman Corey Harris, Madagascar's Tarika, and Middle Eastern lute and violin master Simon Shaheen with the group Qantara, among some of the 25 acts. • Manu Chao's open advocacy of marijuana on "Me Gusta Tu," a track from his new

Próxima Estación: Esperanza album, caused Italian police to raid the offices of his record company and a radio station on July 13 to stamp out mention of the illicit substance, which cannot legally be mentioned in Italian advertising messages. Wonder what they do about reggae shows? • Colombian rocker Juanes garnered seven Latin Grammy nominations, while Spanish popster Alejandro Sanz walked away with five. Brazilian veterans Gilberto Gil and Caetano Veloso each received three nominations, as did another Colombian act, Aterciopelados. The Latin Grammy Awards will take place in Miami on Sept. 11. • Several world and roots music box sets are on the horizon: Topic has *The Acoustic Folk Box* due in October; English folk revivalists Shirley Collins and the Watersons will each receive their own sets; and Nonesuch is compiling a four-CD box of Youssou N'Dour's original Senegalese recordings from the last 20 years. But the daddy of them all is Revenant's massive Charley Patton seven CD box, which includes everything the seminal bluesman ever recorded, and much more.



KARSH KALE

Realize (Six Degrees)

He's recorded with Bill Laswell and plays in Talvin Singh's live band, but it's taken a while for Indian percussionist Karsh Kale to make his debut album. Nevertheless it sounds like the time's been well spent — Kale's seamless fusion of East and West is the next step beyond Asian Underground. The Indian classical

elements are there, like "One Step Beyond," with Kale's bravura tabla performance, or the *raga* mood of "Fabric." But they're completely integrated with the electronics and beats to form an inclusive whole, as on "Satellite," where Ustad Sultan Khan goes wild on the *sarangi* over the loops and programs. From Bollywood ("Light Up The Life") to the sonic journey of "Longing," Kale follows his Muse — and she doesn't let him down.



Clock Without Hands (Asylum-Elektra-EEG)

Nanci Griffith made her recorded debut with 1978's *There's A Light Beyond These Woods*, and has since become one of the most renowned and inspirational folk artists in the biz. After years of dabbling in country, pop and her self-coined

"folkabilly," Griffith reaches back to her folk roots on *Clock Without Hands*. Her first original album in almost seven years, *Clock* turns out to be one of the singer/songwriter's most introspective and heartfelt works. Despite her inventive musical arrangements, Griffith's true strength lies in her deep, heart-rending lyrics. Though she normally writes from a more a fictional standpoint, she probes her own life experiences for material here with bravura results: "Traveling Through This Part of You" was inspired by her ex-husband and friend, Eric Taylor, and "Last Song For Mother" is Nanci's ode to her mother who has recently fallen ill. With her smooth, vibrant melodies and tender, reflective lyrics, Griffith continues her reign in the aristocracy of country-folk. — Jill Goslicky

Little Lights (Compass)

Kate Rusby is no stranger to folk music. This velvet-voiced nymph grew up in Barnsley, South Yorkshire, performing in her family's *ceilidh* dance band. *Little Lights*, Rusby's third solo album, is a mixture of traditional folk covers (including a haunting rendition of Richard Thompson's "Withered And

Dyed") and her original work. The album was recorded acoustically, creating harmonies that meld together as smoothly as liquid gold. Despite the beautiful harmonies of the songs themselves, it's Rusby's wispy, angelic voice that is truly mesmerizing. Even though she's singing about lost love and the pain of death, Kate's lilting voice disguises the hurt to the point that one would think she was singing about skipping through a flowery meadow instead of mourning her dying dreams. On *Little Lights*, Kate brings folk music to the forefront of the modern music scene and she makes all the ugliness in the world seem bearable.
