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

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

Walking With Thee (Domino)

Not long after the release of Clinic's debut, *Internal Wrangler*, the British media machine went into overdrive, knighting the band with a deity status just shy of the Strokes and the White Stripes. Clinic's trashy, organ-charged garage-rock won the quartet a few fans, not the least of them being a little group called Radiohead. Fast-forward to 2002 and Clinic leaps over the sophomore slump with the greatest of art-rock ease on *Walking With Thee*. If you didn't get enough of the Livepudlians' discordant drones, psychotic romps and lo-fi electronics the first time, there's more than enough here to go around. Album No. 2 sees Clinic sharpening its tools and honing its cagey craft. Yet, peel the layers from the psychotic howls, ghostly melodicas and distorted organs and you'll find sugary pearls of melody from what is essentially a rock 'n' roll band disguised in sweet turbulence. Garage racket gets a fierce tune-up on the lacerating attack of "Pet Eunoch," while the group's contrasting quiet side gets wistful on "For The Wars." Another bonus? Ade Blackburn's mournful gibberish is slightly more intelligible this time around. But polished or not, Clinic's Lynchian freak-rock mantras can still blow your hair back and cause an involuntary spasm or two. Consider yourself forewarned. — **Rodrigo Perez**

The Guest (Epic)

Curse you, Phantom Planet! Don't you know that bands with popular actors in them are supposed to suck? What's a music cynic to do? The headline for this band has been that its drummer is loveable screen imp Jason Schwartzman (of *Rushmore* and *Slackers* fame), but once the opener of *The Guest*, "California," hits you, you know right away that there's so more to this story. Quite simply, it's been far too long since a classic-sounding pop record that delivers from tracks one through 12 has come along. Those hip to the *Live* EP from 2001 know the band can pull this rich power-pop off in concert as well. The Planet's strong suit is pounding out nervy little rockers like "Darkest Hour," where guitars, vocals and drums all burst the seams of a neatly-tailored pop songs. Even on the most sugary of tracks such as "Always On My Mind," with its hand-claps and Bay City Rollers harmonies, there's still an edge to the band's attack. "Nobody's Fault" reveals the band's affection for vintage Elvis Costello, as the entire album displays a similar knack for sharp songwriting that relies as much on energy as it does craft. — **Steve Ciabattoni**



RINOCÉROSE

Music Kills Me (V2)

What happens when two academic French psychologists with mod-rock guitar-playing backgrounds become obsessed with the London club scene? Enter Rinocérose, whose original mix of French pop, house, dub and '70s rock has garnered founding members Jean-Philippe and Patou quite an international cult following. The pair even made a fan out of Moby, who invited Rinocérose to join him on the 2001 Area:One tour last summer. For a group that lists among its influences Iggy Pop, the Smiths and Velvet Underground, it comes as no surprise that the duo's music has a very guitar-centric sound. In fact, at first Jean-Philippe and Patou wanted to create their house sound using only guitars; they soon learned to compromise that philosophy with the addition of Johnny Palumbo and his arsenal of electronic wizardry — but the hypnotic layers of guitars and disco rhythms remained. A touring band of three guitarists, bassist, percussionist, flautist, synth player, drummer, and Johnny at the mixing deck gives Rinocérose the musical potency of a French Sly And The Family Stone. Check out tracks like "No, We Are Not Experienced!" for the group's signature sound of layers upon layers of guitars washing over disco beats, and "It's Time To Go Now!", a song that begs to be on the next *Shaft* soundtrack. — **Louis Miller**

G Sides (Virgin)

Beloved virtual hip-hop group Gorillaz — which exhibits the tremendous talents of Dan "The Automator" Nakamura, Blur's Damon Albarn, Cibo Matto's Miho Hatori, and Tom Tom Club's Tina Weymouth and Chris Frantz — has returned to arrest listeners' imaginations, both musically and visually, with an intoxicating album of remixes, rarities and new tracks aptly titled *G Sides*. Not since the Monkees has a band named after our primate cousins so eloquently nabbed the attention of so many (okay, maybe that's a stretch). *G Sides* is a fun album; it's as addictive as underage drinking is to George Dubya's daughters and, after just a listen or two, chances are you'll be shouting, "Get your stinkin' paws off me, you damned dirty ape!" with sheer delight. Along with some reworked versions of "19-2000" and "Clint Eastwood" (from the group's platinum self-titled debut), the set boasts two new songs, "Faust" and "The Sounder," as well as three previously U.K.-only b-sides: "Ghost Train," "Hip Albatross" and "12D3." And, on the visual tip, there are some interactive features on the disc (courtesy of animator Jamie Hewlett), including clips for "Tomorrow Comes Today" and "Rock the House." Changes at EMI-North America see David Munns being elevated to Chairman/CEO, reporting to London-based EMI Recorded Music Chairman/CEO Alain Levy. Munns, who will relocate to New York City, will also retain his Vice Chairman title at EMI Recorded Music. Additionally, noted producer (matchbox twenty, Aerosmith) Matt Serletic has been tapped as Chairman/CEO of the company's Virgin Records-America division, while EMI-North America President Roy Lott has been promoted to President/ COO of Virgin. Serletic and Lott replace Co-Presidents Ray Cooper and Ashley Newton, who are exiting the company. • Ron Goldstein, President of Verve Music Group, has been promoted to President and CEO. Goldstein will report to Universal Music Group President and COO Zach Horowitz. In his new role, Goldstein will oversee all aspects of the label's operations. Tommy LiPuma remains Chairman of VMG and will also focus on A&R and producing. • Capitol Records promoted longtime regional staffer Chuck Swaney to Director/National Promotion. GOODBYE COUNTRY (HELLO NIGHTCLUB)

As London-based trio South enters the pressure-cooker of its first U.S. tour, singer Joel Cadbury finds that a room of one's own is key to the band's nearly decade-long existence — and its creatively bombastic melting-pot rock. Though South's members are barely 24, the band's already a favorite among its peers. Will America pay attention?

South singer/multi-instrumentalist Joel Cadbury is banging around his London kitchen, trying to microwave a much-deserved dinner of chicken and chips after spending nearly all day with his bandmates at the group's studio. South, a guitar-based collective that also knows its way around a good head-nod jam and a metallic beat backbone, is recording an EP while trying to rehearse for its first big U.S. tour, a month-long excursion that will see the trio — rounded out by Brett Shaw and Jamie McDonald, both of whom write songs and trade instruments with Cadbury — bringing its atmospheric songs to both coasts of our continental soil. A lot rides on the road dates (which will be shared by fellow Brits Elbow); South's label, Kinetic, is hoping its only rock-centric band makes a hefty impression here. In December, the label brought the band over for preview dates at small-sized clubs in New York City and L.A., with both dates packed with industry types. It worked: the shows were electrifying performances that certainly boosted the band's potential here.

"I can't wait to tour," Cadbury says excitedly. "It's gonna be fantastic, I think. We're really looking forward to coming over. This is more extensive than [previous tours] we've done before; I think a lot's going to depend on it in a weird way. Not to put pressure on us, but I think our energy's got to be on."

South's first proper full-length, the stunning *From Here On In*, was released overseas in 2001 to much acclaim. The fresh-faced band-mates, who've already been together for nearly nine years and haven't even seen their mid-'20s yet ("I just had my birthday," Cadbury proudly announces. "I'm 24!"), launched their reputation for swooping ambient rock with the release of three limited-edition 7-inches and a heralded 12-inch before signing to Mo' Wax in the U.K. By the time *From Here On In* — frequently described as a great "weekend (a.k.a. comedown) album" — was unleashed, the buzz had turned into solid appreciation. Kinetic president Steve Lau came calling just as the band was seeking Stateside support. "It was total coincidence," Cadbury remembers. "He was looking for us the same time we were looking for him, which was just totally weird. Our manager got in touch with him the same day he sent him an email. He said he had a European copy of our record and had been searching for us."

And that, as they say, is history. *From Here On In*'s multi-level appeal should make it a shoo-in for American fans who've been primed on rock-meets-laptop experimentalism by the likes of Radiohead, Björk and Sigur Rós, which Cadbury names as his band's primary peer. From the soulful "Keep Close" to the brow-smoothing yet ominous ballad "I Know What You're Like," South explores rock's nether regions while adding in its own mix of noir-ish keyboards, inquisitive blips and crackling beats. The two-part "Broken Head" composition, meanwhile, is a good example of the group's dedication to consistency via alchemy — a steely thread runs through Part I, while album closer Part II incorporates the same grinding, flute-like melody into a more distorted, key-driven theme that settles into an almost lounge-y vibe. Both pieces are gorgeous; both reveal a hard-working band that has much, much more up its sleeve. "We always find ourselves trying


to work out something on a different instrument," Cadbury says of the group's instrument-swapping tendencies. "Which is a nice way to be. I like gray areas; that's how you find the little gems. I don't know what makes a piece of music work, maybe it's not an obvious kind of riff, or maybe a song needs to become swampy, really, [in order to] find some clarity in it."

But all these shifts and change-ups make one wonder whether South is just trying to leapfrog its critics by being impossible to stereotype, or if it's simply part of the trio's creative chemistry. "That's hard, because it's such a double-edged sword," Cadbury admits. "It's like everyone says we don't wanna be pinned down, but I supposed we wanted the record to reflect a lot of stylistic things. But we don't want to appear arrogant about it, seeming we're trying to be this or that. That's the last thing we are. [*From Here On In*] has a lot of songs, and then there are songs underneath it all, too."

South hopes to pull out all the stops for its tour, which will ideally be the catalyst for the band recording its next effort. The EP the group is working on now is meant to sate European fans, who've been listening to *From Here On In* much longer than their American contemporaries have. Between finishing that and constructing a dedicated U.S. fan base, South has quite a daunting amount of pressure to succeed. How do three London boys who met in high school keep from tearing into each other? "We just built our own space so we could work at our own pace," Cadbury notes, emphasizing a Virginia Woolf-like need for one's own artistic enclave, a private place to create. "That's always suited us. We have this great space, which I think is key for us. We don't always have to be in there at once — we can go in and get songs down and just write on our own time. Then we rehearse when we need to. It's good to have space to record and write and cut yourself off a bit."

Let's just hope they don't cut themselves off for *too* long. America is waiting. **NMR**



GRANFALOON BUS

Exploded View (*Future Farmer*)
Is there such a thing as art-country? We've all heard of alt-country, but is there a term for the Sparklehorses and Lambchops of the world? If so, add Granfalloon Bus (a Kurt Vonnegut reference, if you're wondering) to that list as it

brings fiddles, country guitar-picking and a high lonesome sound into the psychedelic realm. Rustic and haunting, the music waltzes through murder balladry and chamber pop with hints of '60s prog rock. Hovering between lush and sparse by employing horns, strings, guitar and vocals, it creates a restrained and spacious affect. Felix Costanza's lazy drawl sounds like he downs a handful of Tylenol PMs before singing. Adroitly played guitar keeps the album from wandering into heady blandness, as evidenced by a Hendrix-like fury in the hangover blues of "The Bender." Knowing that the music might induce the nods, Granfalloon includes songs like "Moans Enclosed" and "Rosie" to break up the album's catatonic moments with a mid-tempo jolt. After 10-plus years of bending and blending sound, *Exposed View* has the group poised for more passengers to get on the Granfalloon Bus.


DAMIEN JURADO AND GATHERED IN SONG

I Break Chairs (*Sub Pop*)
On *Ghost Of David*, Damien Jurado strung a song called "Paxil" along a thread of lo-fi dirges about caskets, mental instability and miscellaneous misery. *I Break Chairs* isn't

quite so glum; Jurado's haunting urban-folk approach is preserved on the vocals, but his new backing band, Gathered In Song, drowns out any overbearing sorrow with heavy feedback and catchy riffs. Irony replaces woe in creepy refrains like "It's another nice day for an air show disaster," and, subject matter aside, tracks like "Paper Wings" and "Dancing" are straight-up rock 'n' roll. Produced by Pedro The Lion's Dave Bazan, *I Break Chairs* revisits the post-punk/post-grunge sound of Jurado's earliest recordings, *Rehearsals For Departure* and *Waters Ave. S.* But on this collection of sad stories about mermaids, whores and troubled teens, Jurado doesn't sound like he wants to jump out a window — he just sounds like he wants to jump around. If Paxil is indeed the fuel for this newfound energy, those pills are definitely doing the trick.


LONG WINTERS

The Worst You Can Do Is Harm (*Barsuk*)
"Give me a moment, I've been away" is an apt beginning for the Long Winters' debut in that LW nucleus and erstwhile Western State Hurricanes frontman John Roderick, *has*, whether in body (an extended, post-WSH walkabout from Amsterdam to

Istanbul) or soul (heavy drinking, apparent assholer-than-thou tendencies). Accordingly, *The Worst You Can Do Is Harm* is a lo-fi diary/act of contrition; dreary and joyous, sometimes acerbic, radiating repentance ("Give Me A Moment," "Mimi"), requital ("Unsalted Butter," "Government Loans"), relief (kooky, untitled Track 10) and renewal. Sonically, the record is fleshed out in various musical flora (the trad triumvirate of guitar-bass-drums, plus piano, glockenspiel, trap kit, optigan, metal plates and the barking of dogs) and fauna (Death Cab For Cutie's Chris Walla — who also produced — Ken Stringfellow, Harvey Danger's Sean Nelson, Alien Crime Syndicate's Mike Squires, dogs) in such a manner, that should Roderick's lyrics and vocals be omitted, his sentiments would still be conveyed. Give Roderick his moment. In fact, give him several.

Rock Music: A Tribute To Weezer (Dead Droid)

If you think a Weezer tribute is about as necessary as a motorized lollipop, think again. After just three albums, the L.A. group has drawn legions of obsessive fans, spawned an infinite number of copycat bands and made some of the most enduring power-pop America has to offer its guitar-hungry masses. It's timely, then, that the genre's current crop of blustery songwriters should pay homage on this compilation, which evenly splits its time between Weezer's debut and *Pinkerton* (plus a few fun rarities). Though some tracks sound a bit like a group of prom-night band contenders, Weezer's whole ethos is based in garage-studio shenanigans. The extra-explosive vocals on Affinity's "My Name Is Jonas," the super-stereophonic rendition of Further Seems Forever's "Say It Ain't So," and Impossibles' letter-perfect "The Good Life" will get your adrenaline flowing and those W-finger signs flyin'. Built From Scratch (Loud)

At a time when the DJ is garnering more and more of the musical spotlight, this master turntablist crew (Mista Sinista, Rob Swift, Total Eclipse and Roc Raida) has upped the ante to almost insurmountable heights on its latest offering. The four showcase their multiple-award-

winning organic — no samplers or sequencers found here — DJing skills by spreading themselves over multiple genres. Here, their handiwork is laid down on more old-school joints ("X-Ecutioner's Scratch") and heavier, guitar-laden offerings like "Let It Bang" and "It's Goin' Down." The beat-boxing over the electronic samples in "A Journey Into Sound" is a nice melding of synthetic and organic sounds. Not one misstep can be heard on this album; the flow is kept steady. These guys think two, three, four moves ahead, and make it a point to keep things moving forward (even when they're going backwards, ha ha). *Built From Scratch* is so tight, it will leave

some listeners scratching their heads in awe... and "Feel The Bass" may just blow their fucking minds.

The Loud Rock department has sad news to report. Paul Baloff, vocalist of the classic Bay-area Thrash Metal outfit Exodus, passed away after suffering a severe stroke on Feb. 2 in Oakland. He was 41. Baloff's vocal work on the band's highly respected 1985 debut, *Bonded By Blood*, was an inspiration to countless singers, musicians and fans in the metal format and he will be deeply missed. "Words cannot describe the pain I am feeling, was feeling, at the sudden and oh-so-premature loss of Paul," Exodus guitarist Gary Holt said in a statement. "As I sit here at the water's end of San Francisco Bay, I feel as if someone or something has torn my heart out of my body and smashed it on the rocks. Paul was my brother, my spirit, my soul... and he is gone. I wonder how I will ever recover, ever learn what it is to feel alive without him, and for this question, I have no answers." Also recommended is *Another Lesson In Violence* (Century Media), a live album featuring the classic *Bonded By Blood* lineup that was taped at a one-off anniversary concert in 1997. • Look for a double-live Iron Maiden album, titled *Live At Rock & Rio*, to drop from Columbia on March 26 followed by a DVD from the same show in April. In other Maiden news, Todd McFarlane has designed a new action figure of the band's mascot, Eddie! *HOW FUCKING COOL IS THAT?!* • Speaking of Columbia, the label will also release a live album of material from the *Pledge Of Allegiance* tour, tentatively scheduled for release on March 26, with contributions from System Of A Down, Slipknot, Mudvayne, American Head Charge, Rammstein and No One. In related news, SOAD will serve as a main-stage headliner at this summer's incarnation of the ultimate traveling metal circus,

Ozzfest 2002. Look for the System boys to issue a live DVD later this year, tentatively titled *Down In Japan*. Also set to join the flurry of 2002 DVD releases is Slipknot, which filmed its Feb. 16 show in London for inclusion on the set (tentatively due in September) and Hammerfall, which plans to issue a DVD entitled *The Templar Renegade Crusades* on May 13. • The Deftones are in the studio and have reportedly finished two tunes for their

upcoming album, which will be the band's first full-length release since its label, Maverick, folded into Warner Bros. and Reprise. • Rock bands and booze go together like gospel artists and the Bible. Expect plenty of the former when Drowning Pool headlines the inaugural *Jägermeister Music Tour*, scheduled to begin on March 8 in Orlando, Florida. Coal Chamber (whose new album will be titled *Dark Days*) and Ill Nino round out the bill. • Insane Clown Posse cronies Twiztid will join Manowar to headline the *Metal Meltdown 4*, to be held this year April 5-6 at the lovely Convention Hall in (ahem) scenic Asbury Park, New Jersey. Also headlining the already diverse bill are Deicide and New Wave Of British

Heavy Metal legends Diamond Head. For info, contact Eric, Ben or Steve at The Music Syndicate (201.864.0900), or check out the full bill online at metalfest.com. • Gorgoroth vocalist Gaahl has been sent to prison on what are presumably assault charges. A press release from the band's label, Nuclear Blast, states that the singer from the infamous Norwegian black metal band "put his fist" in the "wrong face at the wrong time." • The new Cold album will be titled *Year Of The Spider*. • On your desk now is a version of Reveille's "Inside Out (Can You Feel Me)," remixed by Scooter from Cold. The original version of the track comes from the band's sophomore effort, *Bleed The Sky*.

FIVE QUESTIONS WITH... GWAR'S ODERUS URUNGUS!

Buildings are collapsing and planes are falling from the sky, but for some reason, gas is cheaper than ever! If there has ever been a time for GWAR, it is now.

Speaking of America Must Be Destroyed... any chance on re-titling that Afghanistan Must Be Destroyed?

It was destroyed before you even got there. Your country makes me laugh! Let's drop bombs and then food! You know, some kid's mother was probably killed by a package of falling peanut butter.

I remember seeing you guys one time and you sodomized someone dressed as a nun, with a crucifix, onstage. You guys selling well in the Bible belt?

Of course! Catholics and Christians are some of our biggest fans. On this tour we're featuring Pope John Paul who is on stage every night, being eaten by Gor Gor, the giant Tyrannosaurus Rex. Hey, if there's eternal life, let's see it!

What was the inspiration behind using so many phallic symbols in your music and live performances? Does somebody in the band have a dick fetish?

Cocks are cool and we're just waiting for Planet Earth to catch up with the rest of the galaxy. In the rest of the galaxy, everyone walks around with their dick hanging out and it's cool. I don't understand all of your rules. Like these guys in the Taliban, for instance. They're all about the fundamentalism but they wear their hats inside. That's not polite!

Be sure to catch Oderus and his gang of merry murderers on the "Violence Has Arrived Blood Drive 2002" tour, infesting your town soon!



FIVE POINTE O

Untitled (Roadrunner)

Fans of Faith No More, the Deftones and System Of A Down better throw on a dry pair of Depends, because they are going to shit their pants when they listen to *Untitled*, the monster debut from Roadrunner's newest noisemakers, Five Pointe O.

Influences from all of those

aforementioned heavyweights — both musically and vocally — are widespread throughout this Chicago band's first long-player, and, while that may sound like an aural cluster-fuck, it works to the band's advantage. Numerous moments on this Colin Richardson-produced effort will have listeners pinning the tail on the inspiration; it's hard to listen to "Purity O1" and not hear vocalist Daniel Struble doing his best Zack de la Rocha. But listen to the overall product and it is evident that with *Untitled*, Five Pointe O have hacked-out a niche that's all their own. That's no easy task. *Untitled* is a must-listen and, despite it being so early in the game, the album establishes this six-piece from the Windy City as the forerunner for 2002's best newcomer. We're making our ears bleed to "King Of The Hill," "Double X Minus," the unrelenting "Untitled," "Breathe Machine," "Freedom?" and "Art Of Cope."

EARSHOT

Letting Go (3-Song Sampler) (Warner Bros.)

This sampler, which introduces three cuts from Earshot's forthcoming debut, *Letting Go*, should have no trouble establishing the band as a Loud Rock contender. With a musical conviction that outshines a large amount of the "tune-our-guitars-down-and-yell-

like-we're-mad-at-our-daddy" groups that have plagued heavy music (read: nü-metal) since Jonathan Davis set the standard by posing the indelible question "are...you...ready?" in 1995, Earshot posses a sound that's suggestive of TOOL (there's an undeniable Maynard-esque tone to vocalist Will Martin's pipes) being bitch-slapped by some old school KoRn (especially in the guitar-riff department). Overall, the band isn't re-inventing the nü-metal wheel — nor does it fully subscribe to all of the genre's quirkiness — but Earshot's contribution to the sound should not be ignored. The group will be one to watch in 2002 and should be eaten up by commercial Active Rockers. Out of the three tracks here, start with "Headstrong." Then, follow that track with "Get Away." Also, be sure to catch the band on the 2002 SnoCore tour.





360° Remixes

(Chocolate Industries)

These five remixes of the PBO single "360 Degrees" — featuring Del, Mr. Lif and DJ Craze — highlight how a producers can change the tone and flavor of a track. In ordinary circumstances, listening to the same song, the same rhyme, back to back would

eventually drive you insane. Not so on this collection. With luminaries like El-P, Kutmaster Kurt, DJ Spinna, the Herbaliser and Prefuse-73 (whose version only appears on the CD) putting their own spin (no pun intended) on this track, each remix sounds like a completely different track. DJ Spinna adds mysterious, foggy layers and samples to his version, giving it a hazy feel. Prefuse's mix centers around the rhythmic delivery of the lyricists and works out from there, while Kurt's mix is straight and solid hip-hop. The Herbaliser's version sounds like something out of a black-sploration movie with its creeping-up-on-you funk, while El-P's mix is much more haunting and dark. An interesting look at the power of a producer's touch.

10 Seconds (Mush)

A little background information is necessary for a review of this album: The title *10 Seconds* refers to the old school sampling unit, the SP-1200, which only allows up to ten seconds of sampling (as opposed to the several minute samples heard in much of today's hip-pop) that was used to compose this multi-dimensional,

thoughtful, instrumental full-length. The unit has a dirty, unpolished sound, which Anticon producer, Jel, uses to his advantage, piling fresh, sometimes random samples high onto solid hip-hop beats while surmounting the possible limitations of programmed rhythms and sampling. Elements like the almost-undetectable snippet of doo-wop of "Define Mix," the drum solo of "Channel Assign," sudden subtle changes in tempo and time signature, and various vocal samples prove that this producer hears music in the most random places and smallest of clips. While the entire album might be somewhat overwhelming to listen to in one sitting — it requires an attention span some of us are lacking — it is an impressive compilation of a beat-maker whose close attention to detail is definitely paying off.

How many watts is your station? How many people do you reach?

We have 6,800 watts during the day. Unfortunately, the minute the sun sets we go down to about 110 watts. Our AQH is 20,000 though at any given moment we probably have about one thousand listeners.

What's the station motto/your personal programming philosophy?

"The AM Revolution." Our goal is challenge people musically. I always say that you might not always like what you hear on the station, but that's sort of the point. We want to expand listeners' musical tastes!

How long have you been and will you be MD? How do you abuse your power?

I have been MD for about two years and will be here until December when I start a semester of student teaching. There are many ways that I abuse my power: sexual harassment of the male DJs, keeping all the freebies for myself, and bringing in my favorite artist crushes for interviews. Pretty standard stuff for MDs, I think.

What do you do to build your station's audience?

The biggest thing that we do is keep the music as fresh and cutting edge as possible. Word of mouth has been a godsend for us. Second, we have a street team that promotes all over Denver and Boulder. They do everything from DJing at shows, passing out shwag and getting the word out about the station.

What was your most successful fundraiser? How much money do you raise on average?

We are not a typical station that gets a cut from the college. We have to raise all the money to run the station, so fundraisers are a huge deal for us. We have bi-annual drives and try to raise at least \$40,000 each time to stay afloat. We get more and more money each time we do one, which is great!!

Who are you most proud of bringing to the station to perform and why?

We always try to get bands to do a pretty simple (or acoustic) set when they come to the station because our space is pretty limited. The most exciting bands that have come in and completely kicked ass were: the Shins, Joey Burns from Calexico, Paula Fraser and Fantastic Plastic Machine. Our hip-hop show, "Basementalism," brings in some really great independent hip-hoppers to the station too.

What's the best line a promoter ever used on you to get you to play a record?

I love it when promoters try to tell me that all sorts of other stations are playing their record. Like just because this station is playing it I should too. Usually, that immediately makes me want to trash it.

What's the best promo item you've ever received?

I love getting candy. We just recently got Donkey Kong trading cards from the '80s. I dared our Program Director to eat the gum and it actually made him ill. My favorite thing that I got was a Beulah Japanese tour shirt. I wear it all the time.

What's the best use for a CD other than for storing music?

Somebody has been breaking the crappy CDs and sticking them in the ceiling over the air-board. I am always worried they will fall and stab me in the head, so I guess if you used them right CDs could make a pretty scary weapon.

Every station has that one old dude from the local town that's been doing a show since anyone can remember. Who is it at your station, what kind of show do they do, and what's their deal?

We used to have this guy called Lizard Man that did this weird, eclectic show but he

recently left to go work for NASA. Now the person that has been around the longest is a girl that goes by DJ Gundaba. She plays noise and experimental music on her show "Necessary Discomforts."

Why did you go into college radio?

I really like the idea of playing music on the air. It sounds cheesy, but it's like making a mix tape every week for all your friends.

If you could see anyone live (dead or living), who would it be and why?

I would have loved to see the Velvet Underground. I know this is a typical answer, but damn they were cool!

Are you interested in going into the music industry? Doing what?

Hell, no! It's nice to think that you can stay in the world of college music forever, but unless you are willing to do promotions, there is no chance of making any money as a DJ unless you are willing to succumb to the world of corporate radio.





COPE WITH IT

These days, the music business seems to be full of people who are more interested in pleasing stockholders, and making that bottom line, than in the artists and the music they represent. It's all about counting beans and making sure there are more beans at the end of the day than there were at the beginning. This may sound cynical and it is meant to. There was actually a time when people got into this business for the music—and that was it. Hippies (and the like) ruled the business (probably not very well) and many artists were supported simply because it was the right thing to do. Things have changed.

In today's jaded music business though, one project sticks out where many people with a long history in the business have gathered together to "do the right thing." The artist for whom they've come together is Josh Clayton-Felt (formerly of School Of Fish) and the rallying point for their support is the new release of his second and final solo album, *Spirit Touches Ground*. You see, Josh died of cancer three weeks after he finished the final mixes of this very personal work. The journey for Josh to get to that point was a long one. After leaving School Of Fish in the early '90s, Josh signed a solo deal with A&M and was placed in the hands of A&M's legendary artist-guru David Anderle. Josh's first solo project didn't do much. It was soon decided that Josh should be put into the hands

of both David Anderle and Patrick Leonard to record his second album. While that album neared completion though, so did the deal that brought A&M into the fold with Geffen, MCA, Interscope and the rest of the UMVD family at which point Josh, along with many other artists at the time, was dropped from the label.

It was bad enough to get dropped, but Josh didn't even own the rights to his own record—the one that was now not going to be released. Undaunted, Josh decided in 2000 to re-record the entire album in a home studio using his own musicians and production friends. The result? An album some say is full of the best, most honest and intimate sounding recordings of his short career. As the record neared completion, Josh's massive back pains were soon diagnosed as cancer and he was put in the hospital. Josh died at age 32—three weeks after mixing the album with close friend Chad Fischer. Steve Scully, Josh's drummer, says, "Josh's pure approach to music, his love of how it felt to play music, mirrored his vision of daily life." With Josh, music was a lifelong passion.

Josh's roots within the music business extended beyond his label and musician contacts—his sister, Laura Clayton Baker, was married to Steven Baker (who currently heads up Marketing and

The era of exclusive music must come to an end. This new-fangled trend of giving certain accounts exclusive music has got to go. It not only has an ill effect on retailers by forcing their regular customers to the completion, but it has an ill effect on many of the artists as well. Let's take for example the new Fu Manchu album on Mammoth: 1) Best Buy gets two extra tracks the rest of retail doesn't. 2) Indie retail rebels because now we have an inferior CD by comparison. 3) Subsequently, indie retail doesn't

support a band whose prior sales history comes primarily from indie stores.4) This harms the band and its possibility of being taken to "the next level," all because their label gave Best Buy 8,000 discs with two extra tracks.

What are the labels thinking—or are they really thinking at all? Then I found out Borders was going to get the new Bruce Cockburn release with extra tracks. That was a burn to us since we've supported Bruce since the beginning of time—importing his stuff from Canada when he had no American label, etc. If I were a Bruce Cockburn

fan, don't you think I'd want the CD with the extra tracks? I've already had a customer want his money back because the CD we sold him was inferior to the one his friend got at Borders. By no means am I trying to single out Hollywood and Rounder on this issue, because many labels have been at fault. Yes, indie accounts may not sell a lot of Backstreet Boys, but when you give the Best Buys and Targets of the world extra tracks on even artists like these, you drive the few customers we have buying these artists away from us. This is not good. Maybe the industry will wake up someday and say: "What

happened to all those indie stores that use to break artists for us?" Though if we wait that long, it will be too late. This trend, along with all our other new found competition in recent years—CD burning, segments of the industry finding ways to sell direct to consumers, subscription music, etc.—is taking its toll. Going to good record stores is an experience; most customers make new discoveries and meet knowledgeable people who help them find things they may like but don't know about yet.

Labels, I hope you don't wait till we're gone.







Picture this: Jerry Falwell screaming out of his window in Liberty University at the sinners across the street near the The Record Exchange in Lynchburg, VA (well, I exaggerate a bit, but The Record Exchange does have a location across from Falwell's school). The sinners this time? Drowning Pool fans out to meet the band. Though I'm sure Jerry was ranting it wasn't out the window this time (though I would volunteer to pose as a Tele-tubby to if that would send him over the edge).

The Record Exchange (TREX) territory reaches through North Carolina and Virginia and located in various sized markets including several college towns. In addition to the aforementioned Liberty U., TREX is also near Virginia Tech in Blacksburg and on opposite sides of the North Carolina State campus in Raleigh.

TREX began in Roanoke, Virginia over twenty years ago when Don Rosenberg—still the sole owner of the nine-store chain—began buying and selling used

LPs. Since then they've expanded into new LPs, CDs, and accessories (both trend and music) without abandoning their used CD business in the process. Of late, TREX has been experimenting with used DVD rentals.

All the store interiors are bright purple. Two of the stores have permanent performance spaces, with a collapsible stage in another, though events are held in one form or another at all TREX locations. Previous artists in-stores include Outkast, Get Up Kids, Drowning Pool, Dave Matthews, Caitlin Cary (ex-Whiskeytown) and John Doe. The TREX Army is 5000 strong and is contacted weekly by e-mail, which consists of new release info, events and special promotions like the food drive for a local charity. Bring in a can and get a discount on music—not a bad deal.

Available programs include Wild Card, which is an in-house buzz-bin with 4 titles each month; these titles are featured with in-store signage and visibility within Music Monitor, TREX's in-house publication. They also have listening stations, P&P, and print advertising programs available as well.

Creative Services for DreamWorks). There have been many discussions about what to do with Josh's finished album since his death when the obvious was addressed:

How about putting the album out through DreamWorks as a P&D deal? Great idea, but what about the publicity staff, promotion people, retail support, Internet promotion, etc.? For DreamWorks, it became about putting together a volunteer record company.

Spirit Touches Ground was released February 12, 2002 and friends of Josh have gathered to help the world learn about him and his music. Major names from the music industry have joined this volunteer company, including Johnny Barbis, Susan



Blond (publicity), Nancy Stein (radio), old A&M staffers Jack Isquith, Diana Leher, Kelly Mills, and A&M's former head of Artist Development, Larry

Weintraub, along with DreamWorks' Mo Ostin, Lenny Waronker, Joyce Castagnola, Joe Kara, Scott Van Horn, Lidia Galindo, Jed Simon and Nina Guarlnick. In

addition, the award winning video producer team of Valerie Ferris and Jonathan Dayton has agreed to make video clips. Every one of the above has offered their services gratis, for nada, no dough—free. Meanwhile, Josh's mother Marilyn has mobilized fans in twenty-two cities that have volunteered to help with local promotions.

"We gave Joyce Castagnola (Head of Sales for DreamWorks) a budget so she could do retail store placement buys, listening posts, and such things," Baker points out, "and we're hoping for some radio airplay. The adult alternative format is what we are going for, and so far there's been good feedback."

Dave Benson, program director for KFOG in San Francisco, just said he planned to add the record to the lineup of new releases the station plays on Thursdays. "For all the wrong reasons that records get put out these days," said Benson, "it's nice to participate in one that comes out for all the right reasons." This record touches everyone in its own way, and because of that Josh is getting support from all areas of the business.

Now it's retail's turn to participate. If you are a fan of Josh,

School Of Fish, good music or of just doing the right thing, there is room for you to get involved. We all know that real estate and listening posts come at a premium price these days. I ask you all to give up one slot in your store for this, Josh's final record. You won't go out of business and you will be supporting a good cause. Remember the music—that's why so many of us got into this business in the first place. Please do the right thing and support Josh Clayton-Felt. Anyone now being compared to Eva Cassidy or Nick Drake deserves your attention now, not ten years from now.

Profits from the album will be donated to the Nature Conservancy, as well as to Save The Music, the organization that brings music teachers and instruments to our public schools.

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



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




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
