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## SOUTH

### With The Tides (Kinetic)

In the South dictionary, the entry for “epic” takes up at least a full page, while the one for “minimal” has been torn out, shredded and burned to ash. The U.K. trio’s debut album, *From Here On In*, took the long road to sonic victory, trading moody, anthemic guitar rock with DJ Shadow-boxing

beats as it maxed out the available space on a compact disc; but now, as *The Tides* roll in, the newly-focused three have put their heads together with the goal of crafting truly grand (and yes, “epic”) songs. Clearly unafraid to attempt a climb to the heights of majestic acts like U2 and Coldplay, South has scrapped the beat-driven instrumental interludes to pay more attention to things like orchestration, arrangements and general grandeur. The standout track, “Loosen Your Hold,” trumps just about everything else around by successfully featuring both a harpichord and a banjo, while the group’s Beatles-esque backing harmonies turn tracks like “Silver Sun” and “Natural Disasters” into sweeping dreamscapes that go well beyond any definition other than their own.

## STELLASTARR\*

### Stellastarr\* (RCA)

Stellastarr\* frontman Shawn Christensen has a way with words. It’s not the first thing you’ll notice when you listen to his band’s self-titled debut album, but after you get through the intricate song structures, the unforgettable hooks, the stylistic diversity and

the unmissable musical reference points that give the disc the weight of a planet, you *will* notice. Right around that time you’ll also realize that you’ve fallen in love with this group. With a quirky lyrical approach that undercuts everything from the dark new wave melodicism of opener “In The Walls” to the spazz-punk of “No Weather” and the triple-vocal threat of the epic “Somewhere Across Forever,” at no point do Christensen’s words resonate more clearly than when he asserts (on the latter), “I’ll be the truth for you.” Because this is one of *those* records — the kind that establishes its own reality, sets its own rules, invites you in, and then never lets you go. Never mind that the album’s closing track (“Pulp Song”) features the band repeatedly declaring, “We’ve lied to you.” You can’t fake brilliance.


### War All The Time (Island)

New Jersey phenom Thursday’s *War All The Time* could well be subtitled *Greetings From New Brunswick*. Suspend disbelief for a moment and recognize that Thursday is actually a lot like its fellow statesman, Bruce Springsteen. Sonically, the two may have nothing in common,

but aesthetically — that’s another story. Much like The Boss, Thursday uses vivid detail and gruff emotion to paint pictures that aren’t beautiful, but they’re magnetic celebrations of human imperfections. Listeners ride sidecar with feverish frontman Geoff Rickly, while he questions sexual issues, remembers growing up in the shadow of the New York City skyline and revisits a childhood suicide on the Palisades cliffs. When he roars, “Please someone/ Teach me how to swim” on the impassioned “For The Workforce Drowning,” you can actually feel the tide rising over your head. Guitarists Steve Pedula and Tom Keeley trade harmonically distorted, hardcore-meets-new-wave riffs, generating explosive middles and urgent endings. The resulting tunes are more like emotional earthquakes than songs, making an album for today’s youth looking to art for salvation and survival.

## TO MY SURPRISE

### To My Surprise

(Roadrunner-IDJMG)

To have Rick Rubin as the executive producer on your debut album, you must be doing something right — and To My Surprise definitely *does* do something right by not following trends. Although the

band’s self-titled debut disc could be described as power-pop, some of the music is deceptively heavy; M. Shawn Crahan’s pounding drums and the thick riffs of Brendon Darner and Steven Robinson’s guitars on “In The Mood” sound almost like they could have been lifted straight off an AC/DC record. As they assert when they sing, they’re “in the mood to ruin the melody.” But on the very next track, “Blue,” the melody is far from ruined; in fact, the song would fit really well on a mix tape right between Joe Jackson and a Cheap Trick classic. One can confidently describe To My Surprise as eclectic without implying any irony; catchy as a flesh-eating virus, but heavy enough to give it real muscle. The band may have traditional influences, but they combine for a very untraditional sound. — Brad Filicky




## SAVES THE DAY

**In Reverie** (DreamWorks)  
Saves The Day has the makings of a career band. The New Jersey four-piece has graduated from indie-land (after releases on Equal Vision and Vagrant) to its present major label home on DreamWorks. Not only has the group's business sense matured,

but it has also taken another musical shift to the left. Saves The Day began as a bouncy pop-punk upstart act, eventually shifting to a more "eem" sound on 1999's *Through Being Cool*. It was 2001's *Stay What You Are*, however, that hinted at the progressive power-pop tendencies that bloom all over the wistful, almost melancholic *In Reverie*. Here, the band sheds its previous skins and keeps its face forward, with barely a hint of its former style creeping into the songs. Singer Christopher Conley's high-pitched, ultra-androgynous vocals recall a younger Elliot Smith, while Pete Salloway's guitars gently weep — when they're not pouring out power-pop riffs. While the mall punks might abandon Saves The Day because of *In Reverie's* more meditative vibe, there's a whole generation of indie rockers about to become converts. — **Amy Sciarretto**

## LOST IN TRANSLATION

**Soundtrack** (Emperor Norton)  
The soundtrack to Sofia Coppola's latest film — a dark comedy that tracks the feelings of two Americans lost and lonely in the urban sprawl of Tokyo's neon jungle — soundly encapsulates all the dreamy disassociation and surrealism that one can experi-

ence while drowning in a foreign culture. Squarepusher, Death In Vegas and the Jesus And Mary Chain are among those who contribute to the atmospheric culture shift with previously released songs, while Air (whose drummer served as the movie's musical supervisor) offers the exclusive "Alone In Kyoto." But it's Kevin Shields that has everyone excited; while the My Bloody Valentine guitarist hasn't released an album in over 13 years, *Lost* includes four brand new Shields solo tracks, as well as MBV's classic "Sometimes." The anti-pop white noise and crushing distortion have been left to reside in the early-'90s, but his new material ("City Girl," "Goodbye," "Ikebana" and "Are You Awake?") still drips with the Valentine's signature drone and drugged-up melodies. Whether in a distant land or safe at home, music once again proves to be something that everyone can understand. — **Louis Miller**

**Stories And Alibis** (Epitaph)  
Most bands that get tagged as "emo" will try their damndest to avoid the label; but while Matchbook Romance might get pegged with the "E" word, it's really just as much of a punk band. Experiencing the bluster of songs like "Your Stories, My

Alibis" and "Playing For Keeps" it's near impossible to believe that the Poughkeepsie, New York-based quartet will (or could) ever go in a Promise Ring-pop direction. The group's debut full-length, *Stories And Alibis* does have its tender moments ("Tiger Lily"), but they don't seem forced — and the band *really* shines when it rocks out. The harder-edged material will easily win the band allegiance with the Warped Tour faithful, and even old-school punk fans may find something to treasure here; they'll at least be able to appreciate the volatile energy these guys exude. For those out there who prefer Jawbreaker and Fugazi to Dashboard Confessional, this is an album for you; it just so happens that your younger brothers and sisters will like it too. — **Brad Filicky**

**Angst** (Wax Trax!)

With a tempo of 320 bpm and grinding guitar loops, "A Drug Against War" could be among the most potent speed metal songs you'll ever hear. The fact that it comes from a band known for industrial noise and club anthems may be a bit surprising, but in 1993 — the year *Angst* was released — the popularity of Nine Inch Nails and Ministry

had helped to make the metal-industrial hybrid a profitable sound. What those bands didn't do, however, is imbue the genre with a sense of humor. Thanks to songs like "Suck," Germany's KMFDM managed to make people laugh, even as they were checking under their beds for monsters and finding the inspiration to plug their guitars into a MIDI unit. — **Brad Filicky**

# A Question of TRUST

Leona Naess threw out her computers, holed herself up in a studio with a leak and finally wrote a record she can be proud of. Now stop talking about her personal life, OK?

In the brief interim between songs — all attacked with typically cocksure-yet-vulnerable bravado gliding from crystalline pipes, despite being at a shmooze-heavy, sardine-packed industry circle-jerk — Leona Naess needs a new guitar. The guitar tech's skinny legs, poking from tiny shorts, scurry to the stage, as he deftly passes the guitar like a marathon-runner's baton. Traditionally, a performer uses this time for a quick test strum, verifying the veracity of the ponytailed tech's tune job, validating a performance-ready instrument. Naess, however, just leans in and starts playing — no test, no pluck, no nothing. Is this naïve trust? Reckless confidence? Rocker abandon?

"That's carelessness!" laughs Leona, over a cell phone's glitches from a Pittsburgh tour stop. "I've been handed out-of-tune guitars. I should have learned my lesson by now. I should be testing them, but I just don't. I'm too 'in the moment.' Testing would be too smart."

Re-read that paragraph, replacing the word "guitars" with "relationships," and you've got the tone of the first half of *Leona Naess* (Geffen), the third album by the blue-blooded, warm-hearted, Carly-fuggin'-Simon-confessional, globe-hopping, reigning queen of the heartbreak anthem. Although she is very quick to point out that all recorded relationship talk is mostly exaggeration, the record at least *sounds* infinitely more unguarded, honest and raw than anything she's ever released. Naess eschewed the producer-heavy bloop of her previous records in favor of holing herself in a Los Angeles rehearsal

space with producer Ethan Johns (Ryan Adams, Rufus Wainwright), and banging out a Carole King-esque collection of stripped-down anti-ProTool gems — often in about three-or-four takes — with guitars bleeding into live vocal mics. No longer hiding in a production-tricked Orton hole, Naess's raw sound finally puts that guitar-grabbing trust where it naturally belongs — in herself.

**Would you say that you're a generally trustworthy person?**

Yeah, I think I am. Too trustworthy. But I think that's good. I haven't really fallen flat on my face because of it yet.

**Would you say your trustworthiness might be responsible for your high percentage of heart-break songs?**

This is so funny, because I don't really get heartbroken that much. People think I must really pick assholes and get the shit kicked out of me emotionally. A lot of the songs you're hearing, they're not even about love, even though they sound like they are. I'm a very romantic person and I think I'm very sensitive and trustworthy, but definitely not a victim. Most likely everybody has had their heart broken — it's just something I like to explore. You can get your heart broken by a friend, your father, your mother — *everyone*. I've had pretty great boyfriends.

**Does it become an issue that you're always out on the road?**

The first two tours I did, I was constantly fighting and battling with the



idea that my music was coming in between me and this person I was very in love with. And actually, I resented it and I was never *really* that happy. I wasn't enjoying myself. And this is probably the first time that I'm touring and I'm not bitter about the fact that, while I'm here, he's hanging out in a place where I'd rather be.

**So this is your first tour where you feel free to have a good time, all the time?**

The first two tours, I was pretty much drunk the whole time. And now I really have to *be there*, present, 100 percent, and I can't really afford to be hung over. There's so much space in the songs, the voice is just so important. It's not a rock record, where I can get away with half my voice — I really have to be there and belt it. It's kind of weird... I'm *boring*, but I'm enjoying myself. It's a really sad thing to be on the road and have all your dreams come true, and yet you're like, "Ohhh, has he called?"

**You're enjoying yourself, but then you go on stage and about half your set is sad songs.**

To me, this record is a happy record, even though there are a lot of sad songs on there. It doesn't make me sad to sing 'em — it just makes me feel like I'm draining out all the negative feelings that I have.

**Your lyrics are confessional.**

Yeah, they are. I don't make shit up.

**But your diary on the Internet isn't very confessional at all.**

I've seen too many people I know get too honest and then it just backfires. There's just something really scary about it. I have met a few people on the road, fans — they come up to you and go, "Hey Leona!" I used to be a stoner, so I think I've probably hung out with this person for years and I don't even remember. So I sit down and talk to them and I think, "Oh my God, this person is a fan, and I have no idea who this person is and I have to get the fuck out."

**How is your relationship with your fans?**

What? The two of them? [Laughs] I have great fans. They give me chocolate, which is always a bonus. Spread the word. I want chocolates from every state! I'm a bit scared though, I don't want anyone to put any poison in it or anything. So the more protected they are, the more trusting I'll be of them.

**So it does all go back to trust?**

Growing up in England, you'd go trick-or-treat [with] the four people on the block that would steal the tradition from America. In America, they check the candy. In England it's, "Eat your sweets. C'mon hurry up, you silly brat." In

America, you become paranoid about everything and I've become paranoid too.

**If this is your stripped-down, back-to-basics record, then why is the version that the press received [a fancy cardboard number in a rice-paper sleeve that includes, among other things, a locket, an origami heart and a leaf] the most complicated and hard-to-open thing ever?**

It's supposed to be like an old love letter — memories from a time. It's supposed to be finicky and all that. I thought it was genius, thank you very much.

**Oh, it's nice. But you can't put it back together!**

Just shove the rest in there. It's too expensive [to make for everyone]. Only special people got it.

**It's surprising that you want to be nice to the press, since it's probably frustrating that they're always asking you about a certain famous person you've dated.**

They don't do that! When they put the interview out, *then* they just fucking add this stuff on... which is even *more* annoying because they ask me about music the whole time. I'll say something like, "I don't like bad guys." And then they'll put in brackets, "Ha ha."

That pisses me off. The person doesn't even have the balls to ask, but in the [article] it's mentioned the whole time. People want to talk about music the whole time and then they just fucking stitch me up later.

**So, do you want me to ask you about Ryan Adams?**

Well, I don't want to talk about it. I would probably say "no comment" to protect myself and [him]. If you want a quote, the only thing I'll say is he's my friend and I think he's a genius and that's all I want to say. I only have great things to say about him. It bugs me because it ends up being such a huge part, and it's such a small part when it comes to this record. The songs aren't even about it. If it was documenting my relationship with

someone who was well-known, then you could go on about it, but it's not even about [him]. Barking up the wrong tree, buddy.

**So the songs about guys on the album...**

They're just about a bunch of random people that I meet in bars. [Laughs] I'm not going to tell you what they're about! I have actually been in love before. Ryan wasn't the first person I've ever met in my life. It's just a person that people know about, so it becomes a focus... I really, *really* love the record. I've never said that before. I've always been, "Oh, it's OK. Track four is good." This time, I can really stand on my own. It's a relevant question, but it bothers me when it becomes the interview and then I look like an asshole. Because then people read it and go, "God, doesn't she have anything else to talk about?"

**OK, talk about the record.**

I made myself a hermit. I went to L.A. — I don't know *anything* about L.A. I didn't drink. I didn't do any drugs. I didn't have any friends and I only listened to old records — Carole King, Roberta Flack, Bob Dylan and John Lennon. We used tape; we didn't use any computers at all. And I *always* use ProTools when recording. We didn't have one computer in the room. We rented out a rehearsal space that's a grand a week. There

was a leak. You could hear the cars on the street. It was just three of us in a room. Ethan was playing drums, engineering and producing at the same time. Most of the vocals are first take, me playing guitar and singing at the same time, which always gets a different feel. I was more focused than I've ever been. When I was making my other records, I was more into being in love. I was pissed off that I was in the studio and I couldn't be with my boyfriend. I wasn't ready to make records. This was the first time where I was happy to be there and I didn't need to be stoned. Every moment was savored. I wasn't taking care of musicians; it was just three of us. It was very healthy and nurturing and productive and warm. No egos — except for mine, which is *huge*. **NMR**


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# 200 Moves



## SPOTLIGHT STELLASTARR\*

**O**ne year ago, Stellastarr\* was just beginning to make a splash in the indie rock pool of its native New York City. With the 2003 release of the band's debut EP, *Somewhere Across Forever*, that splash became a wave that reached far beyond the band's home territory —

from London to L.A., people were listening and awaiting a full-length offering from the quartet. Now, after signing with a major label (RCA) and touring extensively with such bands as Longwave and the Raveonettes, Stellastarr\* has finally delivered its self-titled first album. Covering a huge amount of musical territory, the disc sees vocalist/guitarist Shawn Christensen, guitarist Michael Jurin, bassist Amanda Tannen and drummer Arthur Kremer live up to their full potential as a band, while remaining true to their own philosophy of solidity and unity; the major label lifestyle may tempt other bands to musical profanity, but nothing is going to move this one away from its new wave-nourished rock roots. During one of the group's increasingly rare moments back home, CMJ sat down with Christensen and Kremer over cr me sodas and lattes to talk about the new album and the present state of their band.

**Tim O'Heir (Folk Implosion, Sebadoh) produced the album. What kind of influence did he have, and what did he bring out from the group?**

**Christensen:** I think he was trying to get the band to be as tight as possible. We started looking at all the songs as a whole. We felt like there were parts that were lower or higher in volume than they should have been on the original mixes, and then he came back three months later, and said, "I totally agree. Let's just go in and re-cut and remix a couple of these things." He had seen a lot of shows at that point. He basically brought it a lot closer to what it sounds like at a live show, but without sounding like a live album. I think he took our vision and really tried to put it on there as best as he could, because we're very cautious of what the song will turn into when you turn on our record, as opposed to what it is at a live show. It's really hard to capture that.

**So how do you feel about being on RCA?**

**Christensen:** I personally feel like RCA is kind of an indie label with major label power. They have a very small roster, and it's not one of those major labels where everyone seems so far away, spread across fifteen cities. We have an open dialogue with everyone over there, from the art department to the head of A&R to marketing. It's a little too intimate for us to think of it as a major label, to be quite honest with you — although it obviously is.

**And even though the band is on a major label, your album sounds very much...**

**Christensen:** Indie?

**Not necessarily indie, but untouched.**

**Kremer:** That's partially why we went to RCA. We felt comfortable with them. We felt that we didn't have to compromise anything. We knew that they weren't going to revamp our image and bring in songwriters and make sure that we were going to have a hit. They

made us feel comfortable, and they made us feel like what we want is important and a priority, and that our vision is going to come first.

**A lot of your songs are very structurally complex. What's your songwriting process like?**

**Christensen:** It starts out with a riff or a line — a bassline or a vocal melody or something — and it just sort of evolves. Some songs take longer than others, depending on what we have. Sometimes I'll come in with a couple of parts, and I'll say, "We need one more" — so that will be a little quicker. Sometimes Michael will come in with just one riff, and that will take longer, because we need to really elaborate on that. And we throw out a lot of stuff. That way, we feel like the best stuff is what makes it to the record or to the show.

**Have you seen any kind of general change in the way you present yourself on stage as you've gone along?**

**Christensen:** We're more sure of ourselves now. There are some off-nights for different members, and there are some on-nights, and I think that's what changes the show around. There are times where I've felt a little off vocally, and I can tell that Amanda is going a little crazier to make up for that. That's the way we vibe on stage. If one member is off, we try to make up for that.

**Kremer:** "Mike is fucking up; I'd better start counting harder!" [laughs]

**What about the band dynamic? Has that evolved, as well?**

**Christensen:** We're writing a lot quicker now, which is ironic, because we only rehearse once a month. But when we do rehearse that one time a month, we usually get pretty far on two or three songs. We're halfway into a second album already. It's weird for us; if we weren't touring right now, we probably would have a whole new stock of songs going on — so maybe it's good that we're touring, and we can't write as fast as we're thinking of things. Then we'd be like, "We're playing this album, but we're already on our fourth album. What's going on here?" We've definitely honed in on what we're looking for in our songs.

**You guys don't like to be labeled as a "Brooklyn band." Are you trying to distance yourselves from the New York music scene?**

**Christensen:** We don't care one way or another. We just think New York has a lot of heat on it right now, and obviously, people are waiting for bands to suck. I think that's really the next thing. The media can be a harsh mistress, and that's what New York seems to be leaning towards — a backlash. And we would have written these songs in Iowa. It didn't matter where we lived.

That being said, this is probably one of the hardest things we as a band have ever had to deal with. When you live on tour you count on that money for survival. We can't thank the other bands (**Atreyu**, **God Forbid** and **Underoath**) on the tour enough for all of their help and donations." • Former **Black Dahlia Murder** bassist **Dave Lock** and vocalist **Trevor Strnad** are forming a new death metal band. • **Exodus** has signed with Nuclear Blast. • **Throcult** vocalist **Chris Vigil** is departing the band to focus on his studies. • Vocalist **Liv Kristine** has exited goth act **Theatre Of Tragedy** due to "differences of opinion that cannot be bridged." The band will continue on without her. • A live **Opeth** gig in Britain will be filmed for an upcoming DVD, due out next year. • **Nuclear Assault** remains hard at work on its first studio effort in a decade. Let's just say there might be a vacuum cleaner involved later this evening. We're very careful with international borders. Once, we were at a border checkpoint in Texas. The INS guys hang out, and put their hands on guns, and say things like, 'Give us your stuff or we'll impound your gear! Throw your stuff over here and have a good night!'

**Jeez. That's tough. So, why did you leave Dying Fetus?**

I had a minor disagreement with John, who is still in the band. Jason left **Dying Fetus** for unrelated reasons; he was pursuing a master's degree in international relations.

**International relations? Jason can probably assist with any problems with border guards, right?**

He is abrasive with the authorities, but he should be more diplomatic. He has short hair, so we let him talk, because with us, the border guards say shit like, 'Get out of the car, longhair!' If he gets into trouble, we bail him out!

**That's ironic. So with members of your band switching all the time, do you ever get disenchanted and feel like quitting music all together?**

Jason is the sole original member of **Misery Index**. For two years, it's been a changing cast of characters. I got a little flustered when [drummer] **Kevin [Talley]** left. But if the band dissolved at that point, I'd be a hired gun or play with someone somewhere. I'd figure out some way to play or I'd be doomed.

**How is it touring with Dying Fetus? Obviously, there is no acrimony.**

We're fine! Now I can be a fan again. Anything in the past is old news. We're all still friends.

## DIMMU BORGIR

**Death Cult Armageddon** (Nuclear Blast)

Peace, Christianity and random acts of kindness are no friends of Dimmu Borgir. On the band's latest, *Death Cult Armageddon*, Dimmu wastes no time revealing its intentions, as "Progenies Of The Great Apocalypse" and "Vredesbyrd" play like testosterone-pumping, Rocky-style battle hymns for Satan's soldiers as they prepare for the Black War. Throughout the disc, the Norwegian group channels all the pomp 'n' circumstance of Cradle Of Filth and the old-fashioned eeriness of King Diamond for a thoroughly evil package that leaves little doubt that Dimmu Borgir is hell's house band. And, since the blasphemers in Cradle headlined this summer's Ozzfest second stage, it's apparent that black metal is no longer hovering under the pop culture radar. With that said, the complexity demonstrated on *Death Cult Armageddon* is sure to make Dimmu the next black metal band to make heads do a 360. From "Allegiance" and "For The World To Dictate Our Death" to "Blood Hunger Doctrine," Dimmu Borgir's deadly Transylvanian medleys could turn a humid summer day into a misty, sub-zero winter morning in Scandinavia.

## MORBID ANGEL

**Heretic** (Earache)

Pioneers. That's Morbid Angel's well-deserved reputation among the death metal contingent. Despite the fact that guitarist Erik Rutan bolted to focus on Hate Eternal, and original member David Vincent left long ago to dabble in goth, guitarist Trey Azagthoth and drummer Pete Sandoval proudly soldier on. The polyrhythmic *Heretic* is vintage Morbid Angel — nothing more, nothing less. However, while Morbid Angel doesn't try to reinvent itself with *Heretic*, the album does feature many top-tier, musically gorgeous moments. Recorded as a three-piece, with Steve Tucker handling vocals, most of *Heretic* will travel through listener's skulls like a bullet rippling underneath their scalps. However, there are some painfully pretty moments on the disc, as well; Azagthoth has associated death metal with other classical forms of music, so it's no surprise that Morbid Angel tries a few moments of musical tenderness. In short, *Heretic* is a clinic in expert death metal. "Stricken Arise" and "Place Of Many Deaths" come highly recommended.

## ART ENSEMBLE BACK TO A QUARTET

With the death of Lester Bowie on Nov. 8, 1999, the Art Ensemble Of Chicago officially became a trio, consisting of Roscoe Mitchell, Don Moye and Malachi Favors. That phase is beautifully captured on the recently released *Tribute To Lester* (ECM), which has been getting lots of airplay and looks to do well on the Jazz chart. But more recently (the tribute was recorded in 2001), the guys have reunited with original mem-

ber Joseph Jarman, who departed in 1993 to focus on Buddhism and running his Brooklyn Dojo. Throughout his time away from the band, Jarman still occasionally played music, both as a sideman and a leader. He remained a good friend of the band, and was a neighbor of Bowie's in Brooklyn until the trumpeter's death. Jarman rejoined in February to record *The Meeting* (Pi), which is out in stores and will be going for adds Sept. 23. According to Pi's Seth Rosner, "It had been a couple

of years since Lester's death, and they had all worked through what they needed to. I think it dawned on them that, 'Wow, this is mortality. Maybe we need to get back together again.'" With the quartet back, the two horns give them a chance to open things back up harmonically again, getting back to the same terrain they'd been roaming for years. The quartet is booked to play San Francisco's Yoshi's Oct. 30–Nov. 1 and may play in New York before the end of the year.

## JAZZ Q&A: JASON MORAN



Jason Moran's latest trio album, *The Bandwagon* (Blue Note), is climbing the charts by leaps and bounds. An artist who names such broad influences as pianist/educator Jaki Byard, painter Jean-Michel Basquiat and Björk, Moran works in the mainstream while challenging many of Jazz's precepts by integrating non-Jazz covers like Afrika Bambaataa's "Planet Rock," and doing interesting experiments, like improvising along to a taped conversation. CMJ caught up with Moran at his home in Harlem.

### What's going on?

I'm just chillin'. I'm actually going to see Björk tonight. It's my first time seeing her, so it's a big day. I bought my tickets the first day they were on sale. Then she added a second show and tickets were on sale for forever. I was surprised. I assumed it would sell out,


so I dropped the dime immediately. So today is a good day, I'm looking forward to it.

**I've seen the acronym "JAMO" around. Is that your nod to Jean-Michel Basquiat?** Yeah, sort of. My father called me JAMO for a long time, and when I had to come up with the name of a publishing company, I figured, "Hey, why not?" He used the name Samo to sign his works, so it's a take off of that. He's a pretty big influence on a lot of the things I like in art — the rambunctious nature

of his work and the way he lived, although I'd rather read about it than live it myself.

### So let's talk about the record.

I just wanted to capture exactly everything that [the *Bandwagon* trio] does. We had finally started to perform as a trio for a good bit. When



we did *Facing Left* something like four years ago, we hadn't really been playing a lot together — we did a gig every couple months. Before this record, we were in Europe for a couple of weeks, and we'd been playing a lot more. I just wanted to document the sound of the group because it's so raw. Not raw in an unrefined way, but because it's so real. It's been a progression from *Facing Left* to now; we've become a band that constantly evolves

together, rather than a band led by one person.

### It's definitely "live in the moment."

Yeah. I read about groups and they say stuff like, "We never know what's going to happen," or, "We improvise all the time." Then I go see them and it's just the same old, same old. I know what they're going to do before they do it. I know that the drummer is going to switch to brushes during the bass solo. I know how the song is going to end. It's almost become like a bad formula.

### That won't be a problem for you guys. What's been the reaction of the audiences to the trio playing along to taped conversations?

At first, most people were wondering what was going on, because when people go to a Jazz concert they are used to hearing piano. Then they hear the voices and realize that we are playing along with it. Once they comprehend what's going on, they realize that it's kind of heavy, because every person in the room probably makes sounds with their voice and, hopefully, they'll start to realize how musical a conversation or voice really is.



## DAVID S. WARE STRING ENSEMBLE

**Threads** (Thirsty Ear)

The mighty David S. Ware spent the '90s pumping out one high-octane free Jazz album after another, never deviating from the classic quartet format. However, change is always a good thing, and Matthew Shipp's switch from piano to synthesizer, along with

the addition of Daniel Bernard Roumain on violin and Mat Maneri on viola, brings out a new, darker, more urbane feel in Ware's music. Additionally, the saxophone great looks to expand his compositional skills here, and with the exception of his duets with drums, many of these tunes highlight the melody and group dynamic by keeping a tight rein on everyone's playing. Highlights include the cinematic and ambient "Ananda Rotation," the hard-swinging "Suffic Passages" and the haunting "Carousel Of Lightness," which sees Ware eschewing his usual bull-in-the-china-shop approach to playing for something really different and equally rewarding.

**Romare Bearden Revealed** (Marsalis-Rounder)

With *Romare Bearden Revealed*, saxophonist Branford Marsalis, his quartet, and several guests pay tribute to noted painter Romare Bearden, who often used Jazz themes to inspire his work, which surveyed the rich history of the music. Marsalis responds with an exceptionally varied nine-track album filled with some modern post-bop originals, early swing, a solo guitar piece from Doug Wamble, blues, and tunes by James P. Johnson and Jellyroll Morton. In deference to the early material, Marsalis plays quite a bit of soprano here, giving listeners a throaty tone that's mostly nice and pleasantly earthy. This is definitely more trad-sounding than you'd expect from this progressive bebopper, but that's not a bad thing at all.

## MARTY EHRLICH

**Line On Love** (Palmetto)

Not only has reedist Marty Ehrlich made many important contributions as a sideman, but he has also put out some respectable work as a leader. Here, with bassist Michael Formanek, pianist Craig Taborn and drummer Billy Drummond, Ehrlich conjures up a pleasant-sounding set of original ballads that strikes a delicate balance between structure and improvisation. Ehrlich is at his best when he opens things up, as he does on "Solace," letting the music and players stretch and explore in an unhurried way. Taborn's been playing a lot of electric lately, but here he shows that his acoustic chops are in fine order, throwing in delicate flourishes and insistent rhythms. This is a great group playing a pretty set of tunes.

RPM Q&A: **PAUL VAN DYK**

*Paul van Dyk is one of the most accomplished and recognizable names in dance music, an international DJ superstar and the producer of some of the finest dance tracks ever (all included on the recently released career-spanning CD and DVD, Global). Van Dyk's forthcoming album, Reflections, brings all that trance back to the table, with a new maturity and the aid of rock band Vega 4. CMJ caught up with the über-DJ at the New York offices of his record label, Mute, just one day before his landmark four-hour DJ set at the city's Central Park SummerStage.*

**How did you end up recording the track "Time Of Our Lives" with Vega 4?**

One evening, I was having dinner with my wife, and we had the TV running. There's this show on called *Fast Forward*, which is probably the only good indie rock TV show left on German music television. I wrote down the name of the band that was playing on the show, and it was Vega 4. The next day, I went and actually bought the record, and was blown away. People always ask me what I listen to outside of electronic music, so on one occasion, I was talking to an interviewer from a Malaysian magazine about Vega 4 and they actually read the interview. They got in contact with my office and then we met in London and became instant friends.

**Are you planning on playing the song**

**live with the band?**

Yes, of course. Unlike a lot of my colleagues, I'm actually playing everything myself in my own music. For me, it's not really difficult to play these things, and Vega 4 is a full-on band, so they are very able to play the whole thing properly. The only thing that's important to me is that it still has the electronic feel to it.

**The songs on this record have very strong titles ("Crush," "Time Of Our Lives," "Reflections," "Never Forget," "That's Life"). How personal is this album for you?**

It's probably the most personal album, because throughout the period of writing the tracks and producing the album, I was touring a lot, and it happened that I toured in India, as well. What I saw there completely changed me as a human being. What I saw in India was completely unacceptable. It was so over-the-top — they didn't have anything at all. I saw a kind of poverty that I couldn't believe, and it completely broke me. This kind of matured me instantly, and I felt much more self-confident in writing songs about issues like this and bringing across these points in lyrics. This album is much more of a snapshot of something I experienced at a certain moment, and I felt that I had to make a song about it; even on a very personal issue like "Homage," which is about what I feel and miss about home, or something on a more political scale, like "Time Of Our Lives" or "Like A Friend."

**Your performance in India that night must have been difficult.**

We arrived in India and got picked up by an S-Class Mercedes, got driven to our hotel, had a huge suite, and went to bed.

The next morning, we drove through the city, and after 10 minutes we just stopped talking. I remember just sitting there with tears in my eyes — I couldn't believe it. These people actually live on the street and sleep on the outside line of the road. They use plastic bags that people threw away to cover themselves with. Shit like this is really not acceptable. As for the gig, I was there playing in front of six thousand kids of millionaires. Everything I earned that night I gave to charity. In terms of the music, the open-mindedness and the spirit, it was an outstanding gig. But, on the other hand, I think they adjusted themselves on the wrong level to the poverty.

**It was recently announced that three super-clubs will soon be opening in New York (Avalon, Spirit and Crobar). Considering how anti-nightclub the city has become, as a former Twilo DJ, do you think this is the right time to be opening these big clubs?**

[Searches for an answer] I just don't know. [Pause] Though, for the authorities to allow a DJ to perform at Central Park SummerStage for the first time is a huge step in the right direction. Rather than pointing fingers at the authorities, we need to turn around and make the best out of it. We need to show them that this is an art form; show them that this is not what newspapers write; show them that it's not

just about drugs; show them that it's about something rather substantial, which is totally worldwide and global.

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

## HART OF THE MATTER

The promise of lower list prices threatens to eliminate co-op dollars spent in the balance and makes its own attempt to tackle the issues mitigating Cali-retailers litigating—but from a completely different and less predictable angle. This week, we'll wrap up our interview with Rand, currently suing Best Buy for antitrust violations, and we'll take this opportunity to launch a series of retail and label Speak Outs (see below) about what this all means.

### What do you hope the Best Buy suit will accomplish?

Certainly our primary directive is to make this behavior stop.

### How did this suit get started?

Over the years, I've shared my disgust with the practice with friends who are lawyers—law professors who took an interest and began feeding me information about the California Business And Professions Code and other federal laws on the books being violated by this practice. California law impedes and prohibits loss-leadering, selling below costs and other anti-competitive behavior.

It's very clear-cut that Best Buy is violating both state and federal laws. At the end of the day, I'm not anti-Best Buy or anti-corporate; if we're competing on a level playing field, I don't think we have a problem. We offer service. We offer selection. The only thing they're offering that we can't is CDs for three dollars lower than we

pay for them—and that's a losing proposition.

### From your perspective, can labels get themselves out of the corner they've helped paint the industry into by supporting loss-leader practices?

It would seem to me, yes. The last thing I want to see is more staff cuts at the labels because I think everybody there is incredibly over-worked. If the labels can stop chasing the hard dimes and start focusing on the easier nickels then, yes, I think it could work. It's going to take some restructuring and rethinking in how things are done.

If Best Buy went away, sales would simply shift; they wouldn't go away. The sales of crap, though, probably would. Once the industry stopped being music fans and started being accountants and CFOs, there was a fundamental change. Everything became about this quarter and it had a huge impact on the ability to nurture artists and build careers. When you're looking at a short-term goal, it's about how much can we frontload and sell today.

One thing that's important to add: While they're not involved in the lawsuit, I think these practices are having a devastating impact on many of the chains as well. If you look at the erosion of market share that Warehouse has undergone, and watched how Tower has teetered on bankruptcy—they're an important part of the industry, and the idea that these marquee names are verging on extinction is a scary prospect. Their customers have much more in common with Best Buy customers than ours do, and they can't compete on that level. How can they compete at a three dollar loss?

This is the *best* thing that has happened to the music industry in five years! We have been asking for this, pounding the labels for a reasonable price change and, hopefully, this is not too late. It will be the best promotion the retail music community could hope for—customers have been telling us with their lack of sales that the price is too high. Now we have a price consumers can embrace. Music sales could triple this fourth

quarter. I, of course, don't like to see the co-op leave, but we can't have it all, can we? I've spoken to many retailers since yesterday and, even though we will make less profit because we will be covering the advertising we want, it's what we need to do for our *customers!*

### John Timmons

**Owner, ear X-tacy, Louisville, KY**

The good news: UMVD took *major* steps to lower CD prices. I'm all for lower pricing. Co-op advertising, P&P programs—gone. I'm fine with that. The bad news: UMVD's demands on *this* retailer are way out of line. To get the lower pricing for my store, I must sign an agreement that says


33 percent of my promotion space and 25 percent of my bin space must go to UMVD. I'm not sure what percentage of my bin space currently "belongs" to UMVD. What I *do* know is this: *no one* will dictate to *me* what is carried, displayed or promoted in *my* store, other than what's dictated by my customer's needs and tastes. I *do* know that UMVD is more than adequately represented in *all* aspects of my store currently, and will continue to be—as long as my customers are looking for their product. It's in *my* best interest to merchandise and promote product *well* in ways that are attractively priced to the consumer... *I already do.*

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

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It's pretty high quality, there's not many pieces in there that are crap. We don't buy 'em if they're crap," says Bryan Burkert, owner of Baltimore's Sound Garden, about what is simply one of the most formidable used CD selections on the planet—up to 35,000 pieces. "We're really active in pursuing used CDs, going to CD shows and anyplace where we can buy CDs cheap enough. Most people don't know what's out-of-print. I ran into 15 *Traveling Wilburys* once."

Burkert is highly active in all aspects of his business, from owning the three-store chain; to running Fletcher's, a Falls Point club made out of an unused space over a pool hall. Celebrating its 10th year in March, Sound Garden has won enough "best of" awards to be known as one of the finest places to shop in Maryland—just don't trip over Felix, the labrador curled up in front of the counter.

"It has gotten to the point where there is so many people in here, that she'd rather not be around people. There could be people sitting on her, she doesn't move," Bryan says. "People have asked if she was a statue before, because she will just lay there for hours."

**Q&A with Bryan Burkert, owner, The Sound Garden**

**What local press affects sales most?**

*Baltimore City Paper* and to some extent the *Baltimore Sun*. A lot of the indie magazines affect our sales more. For a large population, we're the only option to buy a lot of things they read about in *CMJ* or *Option* or *Wire*.

**What radio station affects sales most?**

[Commercial stations] 98 Rock and WRNR.

**Do you have in-stores?**

Since I own Fletcher's, we try to make bigger in-stores. We did *G. Love, Rocket From The Crypt, Martin Atkins*. The most outrageous in-store we had was when *Korn* was

here, just before they broke. We had 5,000 people in line waiting to get in. We let [*Korn*] borrow one of our videotapes and they never returned it—one of the *Ultimate Fighting* videotapes we had playing.

**What is your most effective program?**

We have a real good listening station program, where they get sale pricing and positioning. And if there's a CD that we really believe in as a store, then we do an excellent job of pushing it and getting it out there.

We put it on a listening station and a new release endcap. Everyone has a top 10 list in the store. The staff's been here a long time and they're real knowledgeable, so a lot of people buy things straight off their recommendations. Last year, everybody really dug the *Superdrag* album and a huge portion of their total sales came out of this one store.

**What other programs do you offer?**

We don't do a hell of a lot of co-op with the labels. Our pricing is real low for everything all the time, so that part of the game doesn't really work, where people are looking for sale pricing, because they're usually getting it anyway.

**What display materials work best for you?**

We have real high ceilings, so we put a lot of mobiles up.

**What records are your current and all-time favorites?**

The new *Put-Outs* CD is my current favorite record. They're a local band, they sound like the *Replacements*, like a power-pop album. [All-time is] *Bob Mould's Workbook*.

**What's the first record you bought? Where?**

At Home Of The Hits in Buffalo, it would have been *The Secret Policeman's Ball*

**What's the best concert you've attended?**

Last year's *Superdrag* at Fletcher's. It was just a great show.

"Cops listed it as a 'hit and run'—pretty ironic as that crane truck was about the most obvious thing in the neighborhood," says eXt promotion director **Leslie Stewart**. "They must've paid off the gas station attendants across the street. Somebody *had* to hear the sound of crunching metal, but no eyewitnesses could be found on the busiest damned street in the city!... Just another beautiful day in the music industry, baby!"

### How far is the group prepared to go?

Sometimes it feels like I'm beating a dead horse because I'm forever calling labels out on participating in this crap. But I don't want to say it's all label-sponsored. I think it's much more than co-op too. I think there are rebates going on that nobody's aware of and heavy, almost ridiculous, discounting that's only being offered to this one account. This stuff will come out in trial. "Being offered" isn't exactly the right term. I think "being extracted" is more accurate because I don't think the labels are willingly giving these discounts. What Best Buy has done is establish themselves as a go-to account for moving tonnage in the first week—subsidized or not. Their approach now is to say, "We've shown you we can move the units, now you need to 'show us the money' in order to make it profitable for us." They're putting a lot of pressure on the labels to support the practice, threatening to stop the flow of sales, stop end-capping their records if there isn't a "blank check" attached to it. I don't think the labels are willingly going down those roads; I think they're going down them at gunpoint.

Because of the Robinson-Patman allegations, this makes it a federal issue. I feel fairly confident Best Buy will throw a lot of money at this and that they're counting on the fact that it's going to be expensive for us to go up against Goliath. But this has been going on for years and no one has stepped up and done anything about it before now. For us, it's unbelievably black and white.

- "Adds" are the new and current albums that a CMJ Airplay Reporter makes available for airplay and reasonably expects will receive airplay during the forthcoming week.
- Albums reported in a CMJ Airplay Reporter's Top 30 playlist *must* represent the 30 most played current albums on the station during the preceding week. Because we are a "new" music publication whose charts are album-based, reporting re-currents (or recordings more than a year old) or singles is not necessary.
- Airplay reports that do not correlate with actual airplay, also known as "paper adds," are not permitted under any circumstances.
- When CMJ cannot vouch for the accuracy of an artist and/or recording on a station's airplay report (we do so by investigating our own internal database, searching the Internet and/or consulting with online music retailers), the listing in question will remain in its position on the playlist — however, it will be preceded by an asterisk, as in \*Beatles, to designate that it could not be verified at press time. CMJ will then utilize all available resources to verify the unverified listing either prior to the week's reporting close or before the next week's reporting period commences.

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
