# "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round" 

## WHY HALF A RECORD AT FULL PRICE?

## by Bill Gersh

For sometime now, thruout the juke box industry, there have been complaints made to the record manufacturers as to the reasons why juke box operators were only getting half a record for full price.

In short, the average record produced by the average record manufacturer, features one late hit tune, and the reverse side usually features some old number which has long since been relegated to the junk pile.

The trade wants a full record for full price. If the operator must pay for both sides of the record, he at least wants to get two sides that he can use in his phono.

Certainly this isn't asking too much from the record manufacturers. This surely is not asking the record manufacturers for anything more than what they are supposed to have been selling the record buyer all the time.

If records are to bear the statement on their labels, "for use in coin operated musical instruments", then surely these records should be manufactured so that both of their sides can be used in a coin operated music machine.

The additional monies which will probably have to be paid for the labels to bear this very important phrase should require the manufacturer to give the juke box record buyer full value.

The trade has long asked this question of the record manufacturers, "Why only half a record for full price?".

But like many other questions which the juke box trade has asked the record manu-facturers-it, too, goes unanswered.

Now with the Buckley bill in the House of Representatives Patents Committee, and with this specter hanging over the heads of the juke box men, something should be done, once and for all time, to cure many problems which exist between the industry and the record manufacturers.

If the record manufacturer agrees to help squash the Buckley bill; if he also agrees to have his legal departments help him to put the phrase, "for use in coin operated musical instruments" on labels of records for juke box users; then he most certainly should agree to give the men in this field two good sides on each record so that the operator will be getting full value from each record.

For years the juke box industry has been too busy growing up to pay attention to its component needs.

Now the time has arrived when juke box men realize that each and every individual bit of overhead expense must be carefully watched so that they can be assured of the highest possible profits.

The record manufacturer seems to somehow believe that only during this past year or so have the juke box men suddenly begun to pay attention to what he has been selling them all along.

Perhaps this can be attributed to the fact that as record production fell to low level, the attention of the juke box men was called to the records-the most vital part of their business.

Therefore, since records are so important to their continued good livelihood, it is up to the juke box men to smooth out this part of their business to such a point where they will never again have to worry about it.

The juke box man wants, and has, a lot of problems to settle with the record manufacturers. He realizes that as the large radio plants begin to send their sales forces into the field that more and still more radio-phonograph combinations will be sold to the general public.

In New York City, one noted radio and television salesmanager predicts that over $1,000,000$ radio-phono combinations will be sold in this city alone.

This means that a very, very large number of people are going to want to buy records. And this same condition, on a comparative scale, will exist everywhere in the country.

This also means, many of the trade's leaders believe, that the juke box man is going to get pushed around even more than he has been during the past few years. Unless he can immediately arrange with the record manufacturers to allot a fair and equitable quota of their production for his use, he faces many headaches and heartaches.

Regardless of what happens with the Buckley bill in the House of Representatives, even if it should be killed in the present Patents Committee, the juke box operator must once and for all time get printed on each record label the phrase, "for use in coin operated musical instruments."

Otherwise bills like this Buckley bill will continue to pop up at regular intervals and publishers and artists and their organizations will continue to hound the juke box field for more and still more revenue.

All these problems resolve themselves down to one basic fact-immediate arrangements with the leading record manufacturers, namely: Decca, Victor, Columbia, Capitol, Majestic, et al, to have an equitable share of their production allotted to the juke box trade.

Get two sides to a record-not half a record. Get that phrase on the record so necessary to the continued good welfare of this business. Bring back dealer's prices to juke box operators. And do a great many other things which only the members of this field meeting in open conclave can arrange.

All problems which exist between the juke box trade and the record manufacturers should be cleared off the decks, so that this industry can proceed to build for its greatest, grandest and most profitable future.

Half a record is not what the juke box operator wants for the full price he pays. He wants a full two-sided record, for the full, two-sided price, that he is paying for that record. This should be made one of the major points for agreement with the record manufacturers.

Those operators who state that, many times, especially in the pre-war era, they overordered on a record which proved a "flop" and were forced to sell it at whatever they could obtain to the local music stores, feel that designating a record as a "juke box recording" may not allow them to again sell it to the music stores in the post-war period, should they get stuck with any certain record.

Are these operators asking for the continuation of the very problem that is at present pointing a slashing, taxing knife at their livelihood?

Such operators should stop and consider that the records they are now purchasing can mean tremendous loss of their earning power should the Buckley bill triumph.

These operators would then pay away more in license privileges to permit them to play copyrighted music to ASCAP and MPPA and any others who might also come along, than they could ever lose in their entire careers as phono operators on bad records.

There are many problems facing the juke box trade in regard to its future. The leaders of this industry, from coast to coast, once and for all time, should get together to bring about a better understanding between the record manufacturers and the juke box field.

Such an understanding would, without a single doubt, eliminate the greatest obstacle facing the future growth of the juke box industry.

## PROTECT YOUR LOCATIONS

The average coin machine manufacturer has already entered deep into plans for reconversion. He awaits only a sufficient supply of raw materials to begin production. Coinmen should, therefore, give serious thought to the basic and most important factor of their businesses -their locations.

This is due to the fact that all leaders in the trade agree that more new blood will enter into this business than ever before in the history of this industry.

Whether or not this will prove to be the case, it is best to accept it as an assured possibility. Therefore, the members of this industry, who worked so hard to maintain themselves in this field during the trying and nerve wracking war period, should now attempt to completely assure themselves that their locations will remain their locations.

The one and only method which seems to meet with general approval, regarding properly protecting locations, at least where organizations do not exist, is the use of legal contracts signed with location owners.

These have solidity behind them. They always create a moral obligation on the part of the storekeeper. And even tho some legal minded coinmen do not believe that such agreements will stand up in court under the force of contract law, few retailers will sign a legal agreement and welch on it.

Therefore, until the time when something better can be found, it is up to every coinman to arrange to get his locations on contract. In this fashion he will at least have as good a hold on them as anything which has yet been devised.

As the new machines enter the field he will be better able to gauge his needs. He will know just how many locations he has where he can install the new equipment. This gives him a very great point of security.

But if he has no agreements signed with his locations, he will find that eventually the newcomer to the field, and many of these will be returned, maimed soldiers, may take his best locations away from him.

What is serious is the fact that some actually advise the storekeepers of the new machines and the prices of these new machines.. This not only harms the coinman, but definitely cuts down on the possibility of his ever being able to correctly adjust his commission basis.

And the time is coming when, to protect himself, the average operator will have to arrange for a much better commission for himself from his locations.

The years of no new machines and no machine buying are passed. Any day now may bring with it the news that new machines are again entering the market. Coinmen must plan how to make these machines pay for themselves. How to amortize them out of earnings without decreasing present collection averages.

At the present time - the one best method - is to get every location owner to sign a location agreement.

After that the average coinman can begin to plan ahead toward the arrival of the new machines. Can also begin to plan how to keep down bitter competition. How to foster greater earnings. How to, in every event, PROTECT HIS LOCATIONS - SO THAT THEY WILL REMAIN HIS LOCATIONS - especially after the soul grinding effort he put into them during this wartime period.

# '46 BIGGEST MUSIC YEAR 

## Trade Eagerly Awaits New Products of Manufacturers. <br> Foresee Music Dominating First Post-War Convention.

New '46 Models of Wurlitzer, Rock-Ola, Seeburg, Mills, Bally, Gable, Automatic Instrument and Others Hold Great Interest for Juke Box Field

NEW YORK - Reports from everywhere in the trade are to the effect that 1946, when juke box men believe the new music machines will first be seen, will prove to be the biggest music year in coin machine history.

Leading music distributors state that the backlog of orders already accumulated will keep music machine factories busy for a long time to come.
Juke box operators are anxious to see the new models of the music machine manufacturers. The general belief is that these will feature many new electronic principles discovered during the wartime period.
Also of great interest to juke box operators are the new remote systems which they believe the manufacturers will present along with the new models. Many are of the belief that the new wall and bar boxes and hideaway systems will outmode anything now on the market.
There is also a belief that the manufacturers may present their new machines all at one and the same time. This may happen, the rumor claims, at the first postwar convention.
With lumber continuing to be very tight coinmen do not expect large quantity deliveries of the first new models. But they do believe that as soon as lumber restrictions are removed manufacturers can be expected to set new production records.
Also of great interest to juke box operators will be the prices of the new units. Many believe that prices will be much higher than pre-war. Some even expect new prices to be practically double former figures.

# COINMEN ELATED OVER COMING CONVENTION 

Expect First Post-War Convention to Yield Many Great Surprises. Await Official Dates.

CHICAGO - Great elation is noticeable here among leading coinmen regarding the coming first post-war convention. All await the official dates which should be decided upon by the manufacturers sometime this past week.
In every division of the industry there is expected to be many surprising innovations in the new equipment which will be shown.
Many wholesalers here are also planning to have booths at this first post-war show. All expect that more business will be transacted at this coming convention than was ever done at any former meet.

Belief here is that regardless of what dates will be agreed upon among the manufacturers for the convention, the town will be jammed with coinmen at least two weeks prior to the actual show.

Some coinmen have indicated that they intend to arrange for meeting space right in their own showrooms and offices a week or so prior to the convention itself to entertain many customers they haven't seen in sometime.
M'ARTHUR USES "PINBALL" AS "VOICE CALL" FOR JAP PLANES

MANILA, P.I.-In his instructions (Saturday, Aug. 18) to the two Jap planes flying to get the terms of surrender, General MacArthur advised:
"Air communications center will guard 8915 kilocycles with the voice call, 'Pinball'."
It is fervently hoped that the General will give the Jap no Generalunity to "tilt".
This voice call pleased coinmen and others for more than one reason. As is well known the Jap has difficulty pronouncing the letter "L", usually causing it to sound like "R". One of the first passwords the Marines used for night fighting was, "lallapaloosa", because of this.

NEW YORK - Leading wholesalers here are asking manufacturers to announce the approximate date when they expect to present their new products so as to offset any slow down on as to offset any slow down on
sales of used equipment at this sales
time.
These wholesalers are adamant that no new machines, in any real quantity, can be expected before the second quarter of ' 46 . But, they state, unless the manu facturers make this statement, operators believe that this is simply hearsay.
In the meantime, they claim, sales are hurt and will continue to be hurt unless the manu facturers make statements regard ing when they believe their new products will be coming off production lines.
They also explain that the average operator realizes that he can use this six months interim period before new machines appear to cover all open location pear to core all open location in his territory with used equipment.

## WALL STREET JOURNAL <br> TELLS ABOUT VENDERS

NEW YORK - The Wall St. Journal in an ad (Sun., Aug. 19) about vending machines wrote, "As a result, the vending machine industry has been victim of local prejudices, anti-slot machine ordinances or taxes.
"This 'gambling shadow', in dustry members believe, explains much of their trouble with petty thievery .... necessitating engineering to thwart every conceiv able method of 'beating' their machines.
"While working to change the public's attitude, they plan big expansion . . . affecting distribu tion of many consumer products
groceries, drugs, cosmetics,

## hosiery, etc."

The ad also relates the story of Hero of Alexandria who, between 100 and 200 B.C., invented a machine to dispense holy water at 5 drachmas a portion.

## WHOLESALERS ASK MFRS. TO ANNOUNCE NEW MACHINES DATE

## BIG MODERNIZING PROGRAM UNDER WAY THRU TRADE

Many Renovating Present Spots. Some Buying. Others Building.

NEW YORK-The biggest modernization program in all coin machine history is under way thruout the trade at this time

## Distributors, jobbers and even

 operators are not only renovating and moderizing their present quarters, but many are buying new places and some are even building new quarters.This is the first time in coin machine history that such effort has been put forth to greet a new machine era.
The optimism apparent thruout the trade, in this modernizing program, is extremely heartening to all. Belief is that when this program is completed it will tremendously raise the level of the industry thruout the nation.

## FINDS SLOT PLAYER

NEW YORK-In the Walt Disney cartoon strip, "Donald Duck", a character with one powerfully muscled arm, compared to his other arm, is followed about by Donald who imagines this overdevelopment came from many things, such as hanging onto subway straps, until the past portion of the cartoon shows the man playing a slot machine, supposedly having over developed the muscles on his arm so doing.

## WPB ENDS LUMBER CONTROLS SEPT. 30

WASHITGION - Government controls over lumbere were eased this past week and they will be removed entirely by the ond of September.
J. Philip Boyd, director of the War Production Board's lumber division, said that all controls were bcing removed immediately with the exception of those necessary to fill priority orders.

Mr. Boyd reported that cutbacks in military orders had released large supplies of lunber, but that it would take several weeks to build up stocks in yards where supplins have been depleted. Supplies will continue tight for about 30 to 60 days, Mr . Boyd said, but by the end of the year there will be adequate supplies for "forseeable requirements".

Any lumber supplier (sawmill, concentration yard, or distributor) may now sell any kind of lumber to any person on unrated orders provided this does not interfere with the filling of priority orders.
JERSEY TOWN KICKS PIN FEE TO \$250
EAST ORATGE, N.J. - This city of about 70,000 population, on the motion of Councilman Lassans of its $3 r d$ Ward, this past week accepted Mayor Marten's recommondation to increase the present pinball license fee from $\$ 100$ to $\$ 250$ per year.

Sone councilmen favored a $\$ 500$ per year license fee, as proposed by Orange Safety Director Riley, as a means of olininating the machines entirely. A $\$ 360$ compromise fee was discussed by the council, but a majority agreed that the fee, as proposed by Mayor Martens, was high onough to keep the machines within a reasonable number. Council will authorize this amendment to its pinball ordinance at its meeting this coming woek.

## SLOTS PAY OFF U.S. OVER $71 / 2$ MILLIONS

WASFITGGON - The Internal Revenue Department reported this past weok that it had collocted $\$ 7,556,200.00$ during the 1945 fiscal year thru the $\$ 100$ tax on slots. A totol of 75,562 machines were reported for tax purposes during the 12 nonth period ending on June 30 .

Nevada, where slots aro legal, roported 1,020 machines; California, 9,015; Illinois, 6,815; Washington, 5,570; Louisiana, 6,280; Minnesota, 4,363; Ohio, 4,815; Fennsylvania, 4,065; and Wisconsin, 4,555.

Coimen are worried because the publicity which this fact received in the press all over the nation. Many believe thet this may cause campaigns to eliminate the units in some of the states mentioned by the IRD.

## DFNVER <br>  <br> SLOT <br> PLAN

DEAVER, COLO. - The Denver Post of this city headined the fact that local pastors were protesting the plan of State Treasurer Bedford to use slots to aid the state in raising revenue.

This paper stated that there are now 41.6 slots in the state paying the $\$ 100$. Federal levy. Denver is reported to lead with 28 , mostly in clubs and lodges. Canon City, Colo, ranks second with 21 slots. All other cities, featuring from 1 to 20 were listed in this front page story.

Troasurer Bedford was reported to have stated that his suggestion for the state to avail itself of this revenue producing medium was meeting with approval and widespread favor. Denver's ministers, laymon's church organizations and educational forces wore promisins concerted action to kill it.


OMAFA, NEBR. - Tony Mangano of Howard Salos Co., this city, writos, "We believe that all manufacturers should stop, or be barred from the practice of selling machines to Clubs, bars, locations, or to operators who purchase less than 5 machines.
"It certainly leaves a bad improssion with any jobber or distributor to have a product, which he has advertised and established in a certain torritory, sold by the manufacturer to individuals in that same territory.
"Such practises certainly do not create any incentive for the jobber or distributor to continue his efforts toward the increase of sales for that particular product".

## EDWARDS CETS WYOMING TAX REPEALED

DOUGAS, WIO. - Bryan E. Edwards of Radio \& Electric Service, this city, who made an appenl to all coinmen thru The Cash Box a few weeks ago asking for help to offset a proposed new ordinance by this city of 2,500 population asking for ${ }^{2} 25$. per year per phono and per year licensc for each wall box, reports that he, too, as have many other coimen in the past, come to what he calls, "a rude awakening", by learning that ther was no central source (such as a "National Tax Council") where he could go to get former precendents, data or expert tax information to fight this ordinance.

Regardless of this, Edwards, who had just returned to town in time to meet with the city council, and who found them willing to listen to him, presonted his side of the argument against such taxation with a well written, logical three page brief. He also appeared in person before the council and explained that such a tax would put him and other operators here out of business. The result of this meet with the city council was to gain a repeal from this proposed ordinance.
URCES TIE UP WITH SMALL RECORD MFRS
MACON, GA. - Ed. Heath of Heath Distributing Co., this city, believes that the time has arrived for the trade to tie up with the small record manufacturers to bring larger volune production for the juke box trade.

Fie writes, "Regarding the record situation. We receive circulars every day from all over the country advertising the latest and best recordings at retail prices. The record situation has been bad in Georgia for so long that this no longer receives any comment.
"My idea for a solution is to get distributorship of all small companies who want to sell to music operators first. We nover get over $20 \%$ enough Race and Hillbilly records. I belicve any manufacturer could really prosper recording these two types, and scll only to reputablc distributors who would, in turn, sell to phono operators first."
ASKS TRADE DEAL WITH BONAFIDE OPS BIG SFRING, TEX. - Oscar Glickman of this city writes, "Hore is what I believe will do the operating business more good than anything else - get people interested who have money and aren't afraid to turn it loose.
"This business is old enough now where people know what it is, what manufacturers and distributors are good and what operators are good, too. When these old establishod fims are going to invest in new equipment, they want protection. They need it. They are entitled to it.
"Music is just as necessary to lifo as air and water. Those who are willing to invest in music are entitled to protection. As it has been, anybody with enough dovm payment on 5 machines is classified as an 'operator'. Operating is a business in itself, and big business at that. It should be run as a real business.

Miajor manufacturers like Ford, General Motors, RCA Victor, Philco, etc., before they let their lines out investigate the man and his company to see if he has sufficient capital, ability, experience, etc., to take on their lines. They give the dealer protection. If they gave anybody the line, because he could buy 5 pieces of equipment, how long would a good man stay with them?
"The coin machine manufacturers and distributors can do the same. The operator needs to be protected. 111 of this must take place before long or the operator will simply have to pass out of the picture and the locations will own their machines. At loast that's the way I seo it today."

## SUGCEST SOME STANDARDIZED PARTS

INDIANAPOLIS, IND. - C. E. Armstron of Business Stimulators, this city, writes, "The manufacturers of pinballs and phonos should use more standard parts in their equipment so that there will be less outlew parts to try and find for repairs.
"Glass sizes on pinball games should be uniform instead of tho 6 various sizes in use today. Legs for pinballs should be the same size instead of different sizes. A better way of fastening the front rails down on pinball games so that they can ${ }^{2}$ t be pried up and wires run under on ends. Remove the words 'free pley' on back glasses, use something like 'replay'. Phono manufacturers to use a standard type of radio tube so as not to have to stock 75 different sizes and types. Phono makersto protect their dealers who have been given territory the same as auto dealers are protected. One modol only should be made each year by each phono manufacturer."

Tabb writes, "You ask us to 'Speak Up', so here goes, because I know you will do your best to help the operators, as you have been doing right along.
"I would like to get after the yokel jobbers who, for an extra ten dollar bill, will sell any storekecper a juke box, and thereby put a legitimate operator out of one more stop. When an operator loses a location in this manner we should expose these yokel jobbers in the Cash Box. ind, if we stick together, we can refuse to buy from them.
"You know that 'In Unity There Is Strength'. In this way we can remove this particular evil from our industry."

"What I wish to say in this letter concerns one of the comic strips. There is one 'Kirry Drako' that has been called to my attention. Beginnin" on fugust 3, in this strip, it shows gangsters setting up slot machines over the protest of storekeepers. And this strip will continue with the same plot for 5 or 6 weeks.
