# "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round" 

## WHAT

## ABOUT TAXES?

## By Bill Gersh

Just a few issues ago The Cash Box reported that one small community in New Jersey and another equally as small in Minnesota had decided that this was the time to plaster more heavy taxation on coin machines.

This New Jersey community, which has already received a $\$ 100$ yearly license fee per pinball machine, decided that this should be hiked up to $\$ 500$ per year. The Minnesota community, which had never before taxed coin operated equipment, believed that this was the time to slap a $\$ 120$ per year license tax on pinball, as well as a $\$ 10$ per year tax on juke boxes.

While this was occurring it was extremely interesting to read, in the daily press, that the Committee on Postwar Tax Policy had presented its findings after 16 months of study, before Congress. The Committee recommended that all taxes be instantly lowered so that business could once again be assured of more freedom of action.

It is well known that from the beginning of history, the one important question that has confronted all peoples and all rulers, has been taxes. Taxes build governments and destroy them. Low taxes mean freedom. Likewise, high taxes can mean slavery and even bankruptcy.

It is noteworthy to state here and now that almost from its very first issue The Cash Box has fought (and will continue to fight) for a "National Tax Council". It is sorrowful to state that those coinmen who have never been held in the vise of sudden and severe taxation measures have little feeling for the coinman, many miles distant, who is suddenly caught in a revenue raising tax wave.

Whether there is any link between the fact that the Federal government is being asked to tremendously lower its taxes and that certain communities thruout the country have suddenly come to the decision that this is the time to again soak the coin machine industry, is too involved and much too complicated to answer.

Suffice it to state at this time that the Federal government will be receiving less taxable revenue. In addition, there is expected to be a severe period of unemployment thruout the nation. Regardless of how many jobs reconverted factories can offer, they can never completely take care of the millions of men and women who are returning from the armed forces, plus the millions of workers who are waiting to return to their former jobs.

Therefore, each and every community in the nation seeks largr public works projects. That is also why there is a great drive afoot now to get teen age youngsters back into schools and colleges. That is also why returned service men are being asked to finish their schooling. And why women are also being urged to return to homes, instead of to their former jobs.

It all adds up to the fact that the Federal government, because there is such a demand in almost each and every bill that is being pushed thru Congress, must lower personal taxation as well as business taxes to help bring this country to a freer economy. Somewhere down the line the states, cities and villages will have to raise the differential, so that the servicemen and women, who will return to these communities, will be assured the employment which was, and is, promised them.

What is easier for a politician to attack than this coin operated machines industry? Here there is no "National Tax Council" composed of learned and expert men who can forestall higher taxation. In fact, is there any sort of group that can come to the fore and plead the cause of this business before the tax bugs who are trying to further drain the profits of those who operate the equipment of this industry?

## "The Coin Machines Merry-Go-Round"

There is not even as yet in existence a library, or a central office, where coinmen can go to obtain information regarding all the coin machine taxes thruout the country. There is no one place that contains tax information necessary to the good and welfare of the man in this business who may suddenly and desperately require it. There is no one spot where he can obtain tax records, precedents of former tax cases, tax ordinances, or other data which might prove of help to him in allaying greater taxation.

The Cash Box has offered itself and its files as a central location so that all men in this industry can have the use of these when the time for such need arises. As yet only a few have answered this appeal. It is the hope of The Cash Box that all will come to the fore and will help create a tax information center. All coinmen have at their fingertips at this time the tax data relative to their own communities. By sending this information to The Cash Box all in this industry will have one centralized location where they can obtain whatever tax data they want and need in times of stress.

A "National Tax Council" is so desperately needed that to continue to repeat more and still more reasons for this great and urgent necessity actually seems infantile. Here is something that is so vital, that the men in this industry can no longer do without it. And yet it hasn't been formed to benefit the very men of whom it is asked.

The trade must come to the realization that it no longer can hide its head in sand like an ostrich. Politicians everywhere in the country realize that this is an unorganized industry. One industry that cannot hold them back from doing their worst when matters of raising revenue arise. (Friendships count for very little when a politician's career is at stake and especially when the public want results.)

Suddenly, and seemingly from nowhere, there has again arisen demand for higher license fees on coin operated machines. Why, during this period with the war over, with demobilization under way, with all business urging that taxation be removed so that more risk investment will enter industry, should there now again arise the specter of higher taxes for this business?

Simply, because as other industries who have their own powerful lobbies behind them and great organizations to protect them fight lower taxes-someone must make up this lost differential. And what industry is better suited for such increase than the coin machine business?

Here is an industry that sprawls over the entire nation. It has met with great approval from the general public. The words "pin games", "juke boxes", "cigarette machines", "candy venders", "scales", and all other equipment have become as familiar to the young as they have to the old.

This industry, because it is sprawled here and there over the nation, because it isn't joined together in a common cause to protect itself and to nurture and foster its greater growth, has become the easy prey of those politicos who seek the limelight of the front page and who wish to appease the thinking people. These "thinking people" realize that the treasury in their state or city must have money to keep public works projects in action for the benefit of those men and women who will return from the armed forces, as well as for the benefit of all others who will be unemployed.

This industry has as yet devised no method for its self protection in such instances. That very first essential of man, self preservation, is actually neglected by the members of an industry which has grown so great it has captured international attention. There is no one who can point to any organization in this field which could step to the fore for him today were he suddenly to become enmeshed in a severly high tax measure in his community.

There is no "National Tax Council"! There is no "National Tax Council" because the men in this industry have not come to the fore to demand and create it. Few coinmen have been able to convince those whose pocketbooks haven't as yet been affected by severe tax measures that this is the time for the single ounce of prevention to prevent the pound of cure.

It is up to the intelligent members of this industry to come together and create a "National Tax Council". It is up to only a hundred or so such coinmen to offer $\$ 500$ to start such a council for this industry. It is up to these far seeing men to create the nucleus for a "National Tax Council" which will prove to be the greatest money saver in the history of this industry.

## MUNVES JOINS SUGERMAN AND GREEN

NEW YORK - Before leaving the city for Chicago, DeWitt (Doc) Eaton, made the staggering announcement that Mike Munves, one of the best known and best loved coinmen in the country, had joined forces with Barney (Shugy) Sugerman and Abe Green, and would distribute the A. M. I. music machines in the entire states of New York and Connecticut.

Mike Munves, one of the pioneers of the coin machines business, goes way
 back to the days when coin machines were competing with the nickelodians. He established the Mike Munves Co. in 1912, and has an unbroken record of 33 years service to coinmen. During these many years, Munves has accumulated a number of friends in the business that probably includes every known operator, jobber and distributor thruout the breadth of the land.
"I'm leaving for Chicago" Eaton shouted for all to hear, "tremendously excited and pleased that I was fortunate enough to bring Sugerman and Green together with Mike Munves. As you know, I've spent considerable time in the business thruout the East, and I've never run across anybody that ever had anything to say about Mike that wasn't complimentary. As a matter of fact, some years ago I was talking with an Arcade Owner who had quite a substantial arcade running on the boardwalk of one of New Jersey's beaches. He told me that Munves had sold him the equipment and had permitted him to pay for it as he went along. And this was in the days of "cash with", but Mike banked on this party's good business ability to make grod. Today, many of these people are music operators, and it is beyond question that Mike will enjoy a great deal of prosperity with the A.M.I. line."

Sugerman could hardly be held down in his enthusiasm. "I've made plenty of deals in my time," he claimed, "but I consider this consolidation a master move on the part of "Doc" Eaton, who first conceived the possibilities of the merger. Ever since I've been in the coin machines business, I've been hearing of the wonderful things Mike has been doing. After knowing him these past years, my respect for his integrity and knowledge of the business, and the people in it, knows no limits. And now he's an associate of mine. There'll be no limit to the job we will do!"

Abe Green, who seldom says more than a few words, echoed the sentiments with one comment "We're all set. Just send us those machines".

Mike Munves, with his usual modesty, kept smiling in embarrassment as these verbal bouquets kept bouncing all around him, but managed to break in with a short statement. "It's a tremendous feeling to have so many nice things said about me, but in all seriousness the main objective of the consolidation is to present the A.M.I. machines to the operator. I'll take care of the operators in the same manner in which I always have. I'll see that they get the finest service and treatment possible, and as is my custom, I'll always be here to listen to their problems and offer my best advice and help. I've spent over 30 years building up my reputation, and shall never make one step in any direction that will reflect against it. In joining up with 'Shugy' and Abe I believe I've made the finest connection in all my years of doing business. It certainly looks like we're going to be one of the most important factors in the music field."

Leaving the conference, it was announced that temporary headquarters will be set up at 593-595 Tenth Avenue. Permanent offices and showrooms will be opened shortly in a building that is being constructed, which will give them about 20,000 square feet of space. The new combine claim these new quarters will feature the most beautiful showrooms ever conceived in the industry.

## LESS RECORDS NOW THAN EVER

MIAMI, FLA. - Melody Music Co., this city, its patience being exhausted, wrote the following letter to the record distributors in its territory. The letter was sent to the distributors of the leading record manufacturers.
"It was our contention that when the war will end, conditions will change so that it will be possible for us to receive more records than we have been getting. For the past year, ninety to ninety-five percent of our records have been bought from retail stores, and we attributed the fact that we had to do so to war conditions.

Since the war is over, conditions have become worse instead of improving, and it is needless for us to tell you when we received our last order from you. You merely have to check your records or refer to your branch office to find out how many records we have received in the past year, month or week. It boils down to the same question - "How come that the stores can always supply us with any amount of records that we need, and there are constantly new stores opening up and they get a stock of records and we can't get them?" We shall continue to write your office each week until conditions improve and we get a fair share of records.

We regret very much that it is necessary for us to take these steps in order to stay in business."

## ALOAC URGES TAX REDUCTION

LOS ANGELES, CALIF. - Following up on the wire sent a few weeks ago to the House Ways and Means Cormmittee in Washington, Samuel (Curley) Robinson, acting for the Associated Operators of Los Angeles County, wired Senator Walter F. George, Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, urging relief from the present tax legislation.

The message sent to Senator George reads: "At the time of passage of war time revenue measures a tax of $\$ 100$. was placed on merchants operating gaming devices and $\$ 10$. on amusement devices. Ever since that time the Internal Revenue Department has interpreted this act in such a manner that the $\$ 100$. tax applied to pin ball games operated in a certain manner, whereas we believe that Congress did not intend to include pin ballgames in the same category for tax purposes as gaming devices. Now that the House of Representatives has recommended some tax relief in every other field of taxation, it seems only fair that merchants operating pin ball machines be taken out of the category of gaming devices, and placed in a definite category with amusement games. Unless some relief is afforded, hundreds of thousands of merchants thruout the nation will still have to bear this tax while all other forms of war time tax revenues have been recommended reduced by the House of Representatives. We appeal to you as Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee to give us the same consideration as others are receiving by way of tax reduction."

## PHONO RECORDS - 1933 and 1945

NEW YORK - At the 8th Annual Banquet of the Automatic Music Operators Assn. held Oct. 20 at the Waldorf, Babe Kaufman and Sam Rabinowitz related an incident to Herb Allen, Field Sales Manager for RCA Victor, whom they hadn't seen since the days when he was Sales Manager for the old Brunswick Record Company.

When Babe and Sam bought the first Wurlitzer phonos brought into New York City in 1933, their immediate problem was to get records. They went up to see Brunswick. The only person there was an old man about 90 years old. The old guy listened to them, and pointing to a few records lying on practically empty shelves, piped up in a trembling voice, "Here's all the records we have. You'd better take all you want now, because we're going out of business."

Babe and Sam get quite a kick out of this experience now, but at that time they were plenty worried. As Babe says "We'd just gone into a new business. We had a hundred machines to place, and here was this old codger telling that the record company was going out of business."

Plenty of water has passed under the bridge since, but the phono operators still have the problem of getting records. The only difference is that the recording companies aren't worried about going broke they're all trying to get more pressing plants.

Some machine prices do not change for months. The C.M.I. Blue Book, rather than show no price, retains the last lenown quotations for such equipment so that the subscriber at least has the last known quoted prices as a basis to work with. Prices continue to be very widely divergent these days. Someone on the West Coast may feel a certain machine worth $\$ 150.00$ whereas someone on the East Coast may think it worth but $\$ 75.00$. Of course, condition, serial, appearance, demand, territory, quantity, etc., must all be taken into consideration. The C.M.I. Blue Book reports each quotation exactly as it is made and depend on the subscriber to make average price adjustment to fit the peculiarities of his own territory.

## METHOD

The C.M.I. Blue Book is to be read as follows: First price listed is lowest price for the week; Second price listed is highest price for the past week. Where only one price appears this should be considered lowest price.
