Who'll Win The "Oscars" ?

"COINTOONS"

For the first time in the history of the Automatic Music Industry of America there is now in progress a completely exclusive voting contest to decide which were the best money-making records as well as the most outstanding recording artists of 1946.

For years there have been such polls conducted by individual radio stations and other media. But never before has there been an attempt made in this very profitable and fertile field for the record manufacturers and their performers to decide, exclusively among the members of the Automatic Music Industry of America, just which was which and what was what as far as records and artists are concerned.

The Cash Box, after much study and thought, decided to conduct and sponsor such a poll to help gain for this industry greater recognition, more good will and better understanding. *The Cash Box* decided that these artists, and the records which would be chosen best by popular vote among all members of the industry, should be awarded with "Oscars" like those given by the Motion Picture Academy.

LABOR AND MATERIALS

UP 30% TO 50%

Need for a Better Commission Basis Becomes Imperative as Overhead Costs Zoom to New High Marks.

NEW YORK—The report of the National Industrial Conference Board just a few weeks ago shows that there has been a labor and materials increase of approximately 30% to 50%.

This increase, added to those which have already gone into effect since the end of the war, boldly and pertinently presents the complete picture for tomorrow.

There is now no excuse for not immediately increasing present percentage from the gross collections on all equipment.

Those who have held back on the theory that something would come along which would allow them greater earnings—must now realize that this is definitely not practical anymore. They simply must change to a better commission to insure themselves remaining in business on a profitable basis.

For over four and a half years now *The Cash Box* has been urging the nation's coinmen to change to 70%—30% commission basis. During the war, as *The Cash Box* has stated many times, this would have been very easy to accomplish. Now, with retailers everywhere seeking every profit-dollar they can get—this becomes more difficult.

Therefore, many coinmen who realize that to simply cut into the storekeeper's share of the take by a demand for more percentage from the

commission or a demand for "front money"—jumped to the idea of 10c, 3 for 25c play.

This 10c idea is taking hold stronger than any other plan so far proposed—and for the simple reason that tests have already indicated that 10c play will allow the operator to give the location owner 30% commission—which will earn him as much as did 50% at 5c play and sometimes even more.

Of course, there are a great many arguments pro and con. Some believe that the whole idea of juke box economical entertainment will be lost if 10c is charged per record. These coinmen claim that the cost should remain at 5c per play and that "front money" or a better commission arrangement should be made with the location owners to assure full payment of the new machines in an 18 months period.

One noted music leader claims that the average operator simply must charge his locations \$10 front money each week. "This \$10", he says, "will pay for the average phonograph in 18 months and will arrange to clear the operator of all problems for the future." He also adds, "In my estimation, this is much better than changing the cost of the play to 10c per record, 3 for 25c, or any other system."

Regardless of whatever system is

placed into effect by the phono operators—he must do so immediately—as overhead costs continue to zoom to new highs and as production gradually loosens so that more new machines enter into the market.

The operators today know that their servicing overhead cost is better than 50% of their share of the collections. (This was perfectly demonstrated in a graphic chart reproduced in *The Cash Box* sometime ago and prepared by one of the largest music operators in the country based on his collections.)

With the fact that the average nationally is today much less than the \$20 mark established during wartime—the trade is facing a very crucial period unless it immediately protects itself — as have the location owners themselves who have raised the prices of almost all merchandise they sell—by increasing their share of the take in one fashion or another immediately.

The Cash Box continues to campaign for the need for a better commission basis and notes, at long last, that other publications have now, too, entered into this crusade with it. For this *The Cash Box* offers fervent thanks—and hopes that the operators will now adopt a new and better commission basis to insure themselves profitable operating for the years to come.

PINBALL BLUES

Demand for New Games Continues to Grow Greater but Materials Hold Up All Out Production

NEW YORK—Pinball coinmen are singing the blues. Not because they can't earn profits with the games which they are buying—but simply because they can't get the new games they want in the quantity they need.

As one pinball op writes *The Cash Box*, "Regardless of price, the present pinball machines are earning good profits for the operators."

In addition, territory here and there has been opening—much more by far, than what has closed down. New games are needed, especially in re-opened territory. And the ops are constantly calling about trying to buy what they can and where they can.

At the same time, to the credit of the present pinball manufacturers, it must be reported that the products which they are producing are sturdily built with better and more interesting playing features and of such outstanding quality generally, compared to the pre-war machines, that there is little, if any, comparison which can be made.

The pinball operators need new games. The demand is growing greater each day. The profit factor is still there, according to the majority of reports. The only trouble seems to be to help the manufacturers obtain sufficient materials to construct more games. And this problem, according

to reports received from various factories, is going to persist for some-time to come.

The most optimistic statement yet made by any manufacturer was, "We expect that the materials will loosen up after the first quarter of 1947. At least", he continues, "as far as most of our needs are concerned, but, as far as cabinets are concerned, we don't know what will happen even after the first or second quarter."

Lumber is growing ever more scarce and the demands of the housing authorities are such that most lumber will go into veteran housing projects rather than to industry."

Anyway, there seems to be some hope for the blues-singing pinball ops—there may be more machines expected after and during the first quarter of 1947.

Suggestions have been made to various manufacturers regarding cabinets. Some are of the belief that plastic cabinets should be used. Others have urged that cabinets of aluminum and other lightweight metals be attempted. As yet, tho, no such cabinets have appeared.

It is also interesting to note that some of the manufacturers are planning to return to more simplified types of pinballs in an effort to crack the price situation. There are some

such games in experimental laboratories, but, none have as yet met with the appeal which the new type machines have.

The operators are hoping, tho, that when all out production comes about that the price situation will satisfactorily settle itself.

One manufacturer stated some months ago in this regard, "There is no doubt that once we are sure of getting a sufficient quantity of materials, regardless of labor costs, we shall, we believe, be able to, by manufacturing efficiency and quantity production, reduce the present price mark of the machines."

The pinball manufacturers have, time and again, demonstrated their ingenuity. There is no doubt that they will do so once more—when they can get materials in the quantities necessary to insure all out production schedules.

But, what is most impressive to all the trade, is the fact that the present type pinballs are the best ever yet produced. They are earning good profits. Their trade-in valuation is extremely high. And, from all stand-points, the only trouble remains for the manufacturers to get enough of these into the market to somewhat satisfy the terrific demand.

P. R. PROGRAM GETS GOING

Long Demand by this Publication for a "Public Relations Bureau" at Last Bears Fruit. CMI Hopes to Have Program Working Even Before Opening of '47 Convention

NEW YORK—With its very first issue *The Cash Box* urged, as one of its major policies, the creation of a "Public Relations Bureau" for the coin machine industry.

It continued to hammer this plea home to the trade week after week. It pointed out that every industry, of any importance whatsoever, had already created a public relations bureau and that these industries were functioning with better understanding and recognition from the general public because of the good public relations effort which they were doing.

The NAMA was the first organization of national character in this field to jump into public relations effort. Over \$50,000 was immediately donated by the vending machine manufacturers for such work. They have now been conducting their own public relations program for some months and the results are noticeable to everyone in the industry.

Almost every day the press has some reference to one type of vending machine or another. Not only the nation's daily papers, but also its magazines, radio stations and much trade media has been captured by the

National Automatic Merchandisers Assn. public relations effort.

The Cash Box had hoped, for some years, that all the trade would enter into such a program as a single unit—thru the creation of a "National Coin Machine Board of Trade"—which would act as the common meeting ground for everyone in the coin operated machines industry. In this way a united and concerted program for bettering public relations could be placed into effect to cover all types of equipment.

Gradually, as *The Cash Box* has stated time and again, the industry is drifting apart. It is no longer the solid unit it was ten or more years ago. The music machine trade is entering on its own course. The merchandise machine manufacturers, operators, jobbers and suppliers have already taken their turn in the road.

The CMI has tried, and is continuing to work, to help bring all elements and divisions of this field into a single organization.

It is now fervently hoped by *The Cash Box* that, with the public relations program of CMI getting under

way within a few short months, this will tend to bind together all members of the field, regardless of the type equipment which they may favor, for then, and only then, will the greatest possible recognition and good will for this industry be obtained.

The Cash Box has, and will, continue to offer suggestions like that for the creation of a "Public Relations Bureau". It now continues on with greater hope and confidence that these others like a "School for Coin Machine Mechanics", a "National Coin Machine Board of Trade" and the many others it has recommended will all, eventually, come into being.

This is, therefore, the time for everyone who is in any fashion whatsoever connected with the coin machine industry, to enter wholeheartedly into the work now being started by the CMI.

If every coinman, regardless of his likes and dislikes, will help in this work—this industry will forge ahead to create a greater and grander business for him as well as for all concerned with this outstanding division of America's entertainment industries.

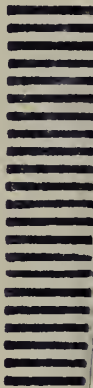

● Rhumba with a very definite "bump" is to be found in this Latin novelty offering, "I'm Learning To Speak English," as done by the Carlos Molina Orchestra. Feature of the record is the suggestive lyrics delivered by Bobby Rivera. The instruments worked by the crew present the quick-tempoed melody in a manner to please where they want to dance a rhumba as well as listen and for locations where they do, this disk has a place. Flipped, the boys slow it up for "Palabras De Mujer" (I'll Dream Some More), once again a rhumba, fit for locations where they like Latin melody. Bobby Rivera does the romantic vocal in Spanish, and he does it well.

"Sooner or Later" "Stardust"

BILLY BUTTERFIELD ORCHESTRA
(Capitol 306)

● Best feature for most boxes in this pleasant side called "Sooner Or Later" is the vocal delivered by Pat O'Connor. She really sells it. As presented here, and considering that the number is from the forthcoming Walt Disney production, "Songs of the South", the side should net good action. Of course, Billy Butterfield's trumpet is spotlighted, and it's one of the better trumpets to be heard around, especially for what he does with the flip, "Stardust," as a result, the side comes up as a worthy for the younger set and wherever else they can use a good vocal and dance side. "Stardust", of course, is strictly for the listeners, presenting top trumpet; but from other aspects, there have been better interpretations for the boxes.

"Gotta Gimme Whatcha Got" "Lies"

JULIA LEE
(Capitol 308)

● Julia Lee really socks it in this "race type" novelty called "Gotta Gimme Whatcha Got", and if you've got spots where they want 'em fast and hot, with enough breezy lyrics to make the side interesting, you should do business with this one. In addition, the combo on the instruments are first class rhythm and melody makers, and they are given enough spotlight to suit the more critical customers. Flipped, all hands slow it up to sad blues pace for "Lies", a number that's fondly remembered by everybody. Julia fits her style to make most of this oldie, and the crew go down low to back her beautifully all the way. Peg Julia and this disk as a comer for the "race" locations.

"Zip-Dee-Doo-Dah" "Sooner Or Later"

SAMMY KAYE ORCHESTRA
(RCA-Victor 20-1967)

● The younger set should contribute in interesting quantity for this latest pair of sides offered by the Sammy (Swing and Sway) Kaye Orchestra. Headlining the disk, according to the Victor press agents, is "Zip-Dee-Doo-Dah", which is a sparkling little novelty to which the Three Kaydets and orchestral chorus offer a snappy vocal on catchy lyrics. However, it's this reviewer's opinion that it's the "B" side, or "Sooner Or Later" that has the greatest appeal for the trade. And lots of it is thanks to a gal named Betty Barclay, who adds to the very fine instrumental provided by the crew a truly stellar performance. Her style is in the "I'm A Big Girl Now" pattern, and all that adds up to the opinion that this side offers the best version of the number out to date. Hear it.

DISK O'THE WEEK

"For Sentimental Reasons"
THE KING COLE TRIO
(Capitol 304)



THE KING COLE TRIO

● Top choice as a moneymaker on the boxes this week is this offering by The King Cole Trio of "(I Love You) For Sentimental Reasons." It really has the stuff from which big hits are made. It's a romantic ballad, light and tender, with many of the qualities to be found in "The Gypsy" and "To Each His Own," but, in its own right, it has a pleasant simplicity in melody and lyrics that's refreshing. As handled by the King Cole crew, it gets a soft restrained interpretation on the instruments which adds up mightily, while the vocal, done by King Cole, gets just about perfect treatment. Wherever they want top grade ballads by top grade artists, this disk will be among those to lead the parade. Better snatch it. Flipped, the lads offer "The Best Man," a really worthwhile support side in almost anybody's phono. They step up the tempo for this light novelty ballad, and seem to come up just a bit on volume, but checked from an overall view it's a fine little listener's item that'll do better than earn its way.

"So They Tell Me"

"I Want A Grownup Man"
ORRIN TUCKER ORCHESTRA
(Musicraft 15092)

● A platter lacking in punch is this contribution by the Orrin Tucker Orchestra, and for that reason ops can examine it merely as a support item if they need one. Actually, the side featuring "I Want A Grownup Man" does draw some interest for the song it carries, but the way it's handled here by the ork, and by Scottee Marsh on the vocal, leaves much to be desired. Built along the lines of "I'm A Big Girl Now," the artists do it straight, and to poor advantage. With "So They Tell Me," with Orrin Tucker on the vocal, they fare little better. Orrin can use a vocalist, and his crew can use some better arrangements.

"I'm Telling You"

"Chained To A Memory"
JACK GUTHRIE AND HIS OKLAHOMANS
(Capitol 309)

● Of interest to music ops with locations where "country style" music is in demand are these two sides by Jack Guthrie and His Oklahomans. "I'm Telling You", a ballad, is what a lad tells his gal he is going to do unless she mends her ways, and is served up vocally by Jack to please the country trade. Flipped, he goes into a more melancholy mood to deliver the more romantic and bluer "Chained To A Memory," which will probably be the more profitable of the two. On both sides, his crew furnish neat support, heavy with gee-tar.

"Ain't That Just Like A Woman"

"If It's Love You Want, Baby That's Me"
LOUIS JORDAN TYMPANY FIVE
(Decca 23669)

● You know "Choo Choo Ch'Boogie". Well, here's a brand new pair of sides by the same combo who gave it to you. And once again they prove themselves as one of the best rhythm-making crews in the country. The way they perform on "Ain't That Just Like A Woman" leaves no doubt about it. Unfortunately, however, the tune itself is not quite up to the standard from which "Choo Choo" was cut. Louis is capable on the lyrics, the Five do right by the instruments, and that's it. Nonetheless, the side should score on the strength of what the boys did with "Choo Choo", and so it has a better than even chance in the phonos. The flip, "If It's Love You Want", is a good running mate to the headliner and done in the same pattern. The platter is certainly worth a try.

"Sweetheart Of Sigma Chi" "Either It's Love Or It Isn't"

PHIL BRITO
(Musicraft)

● Of heavy interest to music ops with locations at which school crowds gather is this brand new cutting of the standard "Sweetheart of Sigma Chi" by Phil Brito. With the football season on, lots of your customers should contribute heavily for this memory-stirrer, and the way Phil handles it, they won't be disappointed. The arrangement offered by the Sonny Burke Orchestra is paced exactly right and provides a fine backdrop to Phil's efforts. Flipped, the disk offers Phil on a fair support number that should get some plugging thru its inclusion in the motion picture "Dead Reckoning." Phil does well by it, but the song hasn't got what it takes to soar. It's just one of those things one finds too often in back of a really worthwhile side.

"You Keep Coming Back Like A Song"

"And Then It's Heaven"
BOBBY DOYLE
(Signature)

● For a disk that should truly promote heavy coin on either side music ops can do things with this one. It features a pair of click numbers in "And Then It's Heaven" and "You Keep Coming Back Like A Song," and with Bobby Doyle doing an effective vocal job to the instrumental accompaniment of the Ray Block Orchestra, this piece of wax appears to be one of the better things ops can latch on to this week. Both songs are romantic ballads; both are enjoying a good play. You can feature either side and make money with it.

"For You, For Me, For Evermore"

"Changing My Tune"
ARTIE SHAW ORCHESTRA
(Musicraft 412)

● For a disk to draw some action from lots of customers who want to hear him in action again, this Artie Shaw waxing of "For You, For Me, For Evermore" should satisfy a demand. The Shaw clarinet is in there, not so magic as it once was, but effective. Combine that with the fact that the tune, a strong romantic ballad, is by the late George Gershwin and the vocal contributed by Mel Torme is very well handled, and you have a solid platter. Flipped, all hands come up with "Changing My Tune," a side not so effective as the headliner. The Mel-Tones join in to give the vocal choral treatment, and that helps the side along. Nonetheless, that help is not enough. "Changing My Tune" is Grade "B".

Record Reviews

"Apache Serenade" "The Whole World Is Singing My Song"

JIMMY DORSEY ORCHESTRA
(Decca 18917)

● They call "Apache Serenade" the "B" side of this platter, but if more "A" sides were released with numbers as good as this one, the trade would have cause for great gratitude. The tune, a terrific hunk of novelty, is tailor made for the Dorsey touch, and they touch it right. Dee Parker adds still more sparkle to the effect worked up by the crew with the vocal she contributes to the cause, and together they've come up with one of the better packages of wax to be heard around. There is a drawback to all this, however, and that is that neither the disk nor the song has received much plugging to date, so if you do take it, it'll probably have to sell itself. But do hear it. You owe that much to yourself and to the customers who frequent your locations. As for the flip, "The Whole World," better versions of the sock melody are to be had. The JD touch is a little too harsh with it to make hay on the phonos.

"Bang Bang" "I'm Gonna Write Myself A Letter"

JIMMIE DAVIS
(Decca 46016)

● The country-style locations should contribute heavily for this latest on wax by Louisiana's troubador Governor, Jimmie Davis, on "Bang Bang". It's a first class novelty ditty to which Jimmie does a first class job on the catchy lyrics, well assisted by instrumental and vocal accompaniment. If you have the locations where this type of melody is in demand, catch a listen. Flipped, Jimmie comes up with another original in "I'm Gonna Write Myself A Letter". The side is not up to what he does on the top deck, but it's effective "country music" in its own right, and if the other platters he has put out have made money for you, so should this one.

"Jealousy" "Espenharlem"

RAY BLOCK ORCHESTRA
(Signature 15015)

● For a pair of sides that can be expected to enjoy heavy action in your more "toned-up" location, this disk by the Ray Block Orchestra is worthy of recommendation. On "Jealousy", a well known Latin standard, the boys offer a instrumental that's a sheer delight for the customers who want their music "sophisticated." But it's the flip that should really add up in the spots where they raise little fingers whenever an elbow is bent. It's called "Espenharlem", and Ray Block and his boys really make it good for that trade. They make it so good that the effect of this combination of Latin melody and restrained swing almost borders on the classic. Still, this is a platter to place carefully. But, if you have the right locations for it, and they couldn't be too many, snatch it!

"I Got Lost In His Arms" "Bewitched"

MARIE GREENE
(Signature 15030)

● Offered here is a pair of sides suitable as "support" attractions for your locations where the hand holders gather for listening or dancing. Marie Green, a good voice, is highlighted on both "I Got Lost In His Arms" and "Bewitched", to which a crew under the baton of Dave Mann add a sweeping style instrumental heavy with strings. Marie's voice, which is patterned here for the more intimate bistros, does an effective job on the two romantic ballads, but we'd prefer to hear her on something a bit more bouncy.

SLEEPER OF THE WEEK

"The Whole World Is Singing My Song"

DENNIS DAY

(RCA-Victor 20-1978)



DENNIS DAY

● One of the best ballads to be dusted off and given to the trade again is this version of "The Whole World Is Singing My Song," which is presented here by Dennis Day, an effective tenor. The melody, currently receiving heavy plugging thanks to "The Jolson Story," is given careful treatment by the capable Russ Case Orchestra, and tying the three elements together, they've come up with a platter that can't help drawing coinage to the phonos. If that alone doesn't make this an outstanding disk, the flip-over pulls it into that rank, but definitely. It's the perennial favorite "April Showers" that Denny croons for anybody with a memory, and his interpretation of the song slants this hunk of wax into the "must" category for any op with locations where they like 'em sweet and romantic.

"Ole Buttermilk Sky" "That Little Dream Got Nowhere"

MARIE GREENE

(Signature 15040)

● Looking for a gal on "Ole Buttermilk Sky"? If so, this version offered up by Marie Greene can aptly fill the requirement. It's not the best to be heard around, but that's more because the number was intended for a guy on the lyrics than for any other reason. Otherwise this offering will do more than pass in a crowd. Flipped, she does "That Little Dream Got Nowhere," and if you can still use it, you may be able to do something with this one. The gal is effectively backed on the instruments, so as a "support" platter this is another one to consider.

"Just An Old Manuscript" "Blue Rhapsody"

GLEN GRAY ORCHESTRA

(Decca 18918)

● For your locations where they like to cut a little rug as well as listen to some well controlled stomp melody, we'd recommend this pair of all-instrumental sides by the Glen Gray Casa Loma Orchestra. The top deck, and the one most likely to succeed on the phonos, is "Just An Old Manuscript", on which Glen and the boys offer some neat instrument effects. Flipped, the boys increase their even pace just slightly for "Blue Rhapsody", which highlights a very worthy clarinet solo by Fats Daniels with a solid drum backing. Hear this platter, it's a good bet you have some spots for it.

"Lovely Things Are Always Mine"

"Pumpkin Seed"

JIMMIE DODD & JIM CASSITY

(H'wood Int'l 902)

● A brand new record label, Hollywood International, gets off to a good start with this first release, featuring the romantic ballad "Lovely Things Are Always Mine." It's a sound number for your locations where hand-holders gather, and with Jim Cassity doing well by the effective lyrics and the Nick Pelico Orchestra providing good melody on the instruments, the side has a better than fair chance to catch if given sufficient plugging. Flipped, it becomes a double reature with "Pumpkin Seed" being handled by an entirely different combo. Jimmy Dodd does the vocal and the Les Robinson ork are on the instruments of this gay and carefree ditty which should be of interest where your younger customers gather. As a matter of fact, it's a refreshing side, away from run-o'-the-mill melodies, and cut from the same patters which brought "One-zy Two-zy" to national renown. By all means give it a listening. It's worth it.

"September Song" "It's A Woman's Prerogative"

MARIE GREENE

(Signature 15027)

● What with recent reports that "September Song" is soon to be released by several of the major diskeries, this version contributed by Marie Greene merits some notice. The fact is that the number is one of the better standards to be put on wax in recent months and Marie's interpretation, one of the few featuring a female chirp. It has its shortcomings, one of them being that the melody requires better than average ability to put it across at its best, and there few of the ladies have a place, but since Marie lets the song sell her rather than the other way around, the side should draw on that merit. Flipped, however, she does one of the best jobs to be heard on wax of the famed "It's A Woman's Prerogative", from the Broadway musical "St. Louis Woman," and her performance opens a new door for the tune on the phonos. If Marie would devote more of her time giving us numbers like this one, she could draw lots more interest from the trade.

"That Woman Of Mine" "Deal 'Em"

NICK PELICO ORCHESTRA

(H'wood Int'l 3006-7)

● Very reminiscent of that favored standard "Can't Help Lovin' That Man Of Mine" is this waxing called "That Woman Of Mine", offered here by a newcomer to the wax world, Ralph Blanchard. As a result the side loses some of the effect it might have created, and to which it may be entitled. Taken objectively, it's blue, it's romantic and fitting for the phonos. Blanchard's performance is workmanlike and the instrumental department is well handled by the Nick Pelico Orchestra, but basically the disk has lots of shortcomings. Flipped, the Nick Pelico crew take the spotlight to deliver "Deal 'Em", a listener's item that may do double duty where dancing is permitted. Nick's followers should like its quick pace and the tricks the crew do with it. In territories where the lad is unknown it'll have to be sold to the phono customers.

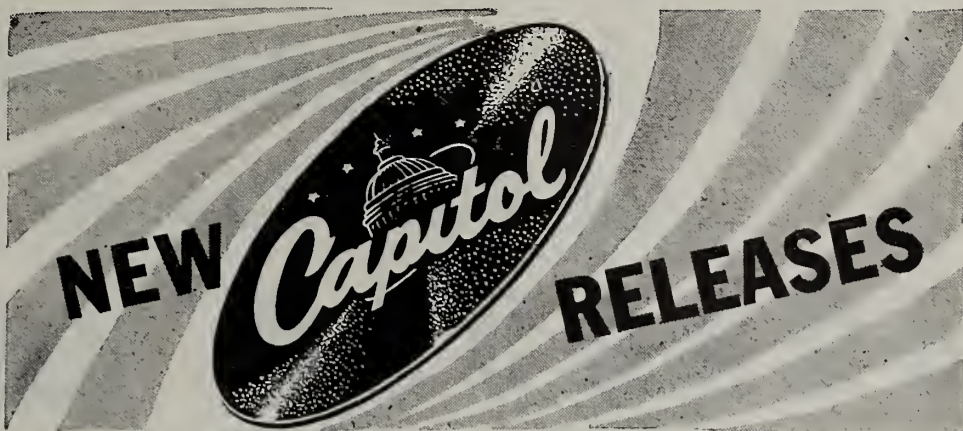

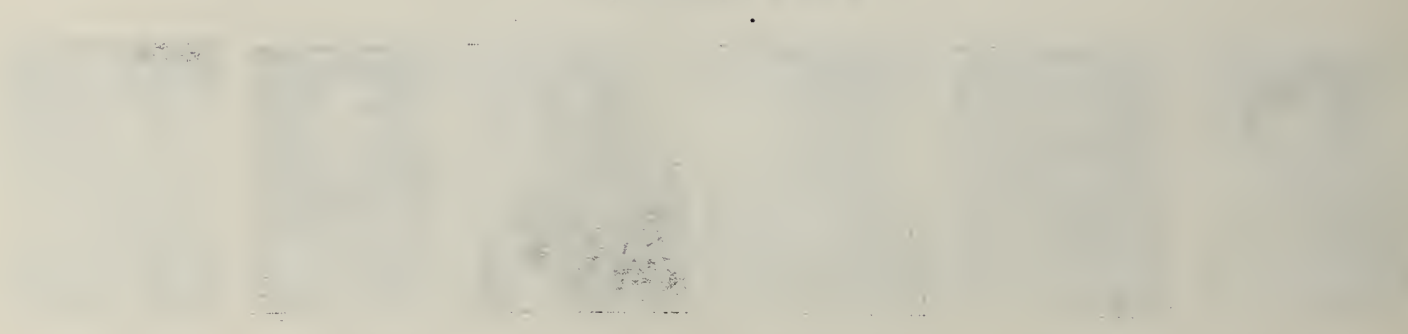

Petrillo Settles With Diskeries

No Price Rise Expected

CHICAGO — Fears of a shutdown in the record industry resulting from a deadlock in the arbitration of musicians' wage demands were dissolved here this past week with the announcement by James C. Petrillo that an agreement had been reached between the union and the record industry.

Representatives of the nation's major diskeries had been negotiating with the union here for several days before the settlement was reached. According to Petrillo, a wage rise amounting to 37½% has been agreed upon. Petrillo had originally asked for 50%.

In an effort to ascertain whether the wage increase would cause a new price rise in records to the trade, *The Cash Box* made a telephone check of several representative labels. Results of the survey revealed that current prices are not expected to be affected.

Among those who gathered here in behalf of the record industry were: Jim Conkling, of Capitol; Ed Wallerstein, of Columbia; Dave Kapp, of Decca; Ben Selvin of Majestic; Irv Green, of Mercury; Frank Walker, of MGM; Peter Hilton, of Musicraft; Jim Murray, of RCA-Victor, and Gerald Ross, of Signature.

Indiana Court Rules Playing Bells Not Betting

FORT WAYNE, IND.—An important decision which may help set a precedent for bell machine operators was passed here a few weeks ago by Special Judge James Robert Newkirk who held in Superior Court No. 1 here that while bell machines are considered illegal devices in this state, playing them does not constitute a bet or wager, in the eyes of existing Indiana law. Therefore no one can recover money lost in bell machines.

The finding was given in the case of Dennis Elick, a lodge member of Fort Wayne Aerie No. 248, Fraternal Order of Eagles, who sought to recover \$1,800 which he claims he lost playing the bell machines in the club-rooms of the lodge.

The attorneys for the lodge contended that it takes at least two persons to make a game, wager or bet and that therefore playing a bell machine does not constitute making a bet or wager.

They cited that Elick's action was brought under the old Act of 1852 which provides that when anyone betting on a game shall lose any sum of money to another he may recover for such loss if he brings action under the statute within six months after the loss occurred.

The attorneys for the Eagles claimed that, "Elick knew that when he

put a quarter in the machine, he put it in for the sole purpose of operating the machine. There is no evidence that he had any conversation with anyone connected with the Eagles Lodge relative to playing the machines."

The attorneys also stated that, "It takes two persons to make a wager or a bet and therefore Elick cannot recover for any money he claims he lost playing the machines."

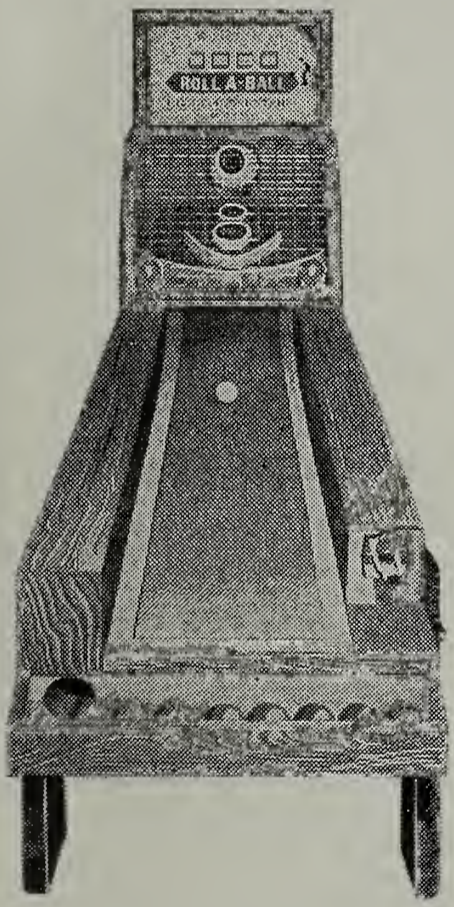
Wash. Town Gets 5% Of Gross Bell Take

OMAK, WASH. — This small town passed an ordinance this past week requiring all bell machines being operated in private clubs to pay 5% tax on the gross income of these machines.

The ordinance also requires the clubs to keep an accurate record of bell machine receipts open to inspection by city officers.

The city also passed an ordinance providing for the inspection of the books and records of private clubs that operate bell machines so as to determine their profits and the amount available for charitable and similar purposes.

Check Pins When License Take Drops

SCRANTON, PA. — A special drive was launched by the Dept. of Public Safety here when it was learned that the revenue for the past month of September from pinball license fees was only \$3,220 as against \$6,600 collected during the same month last year.

Policemen were instructed to visit all establishments in which pinballs are on display and check for licenses. The new licenses went on sale here on Sept. 1. Police here estimate that at least 50% of the machines do not have valid licenses at present.

Airfield Bus Starter Blames Drink Venders

NEW YORK — James Watkins, bus starter at LaGuardia Field here, blames drink venders for the fact that passengers lack having nickels ready when they board the bus here and therefore create tie-ups.

He says, "They have soft drink machines at LaGuardia Field and we

probably carry half the 8,000 people who work at the airport. Well, they never have any nickels for the bus because during the day they put them all in the soft drink machines. Give them a handful of nickels in the morning and they come home without one."

Seattle Council Okays Pin Permits

No More Than 200 Licenses Will Be Allowed One Firm

SEATTLE, WASH. — After holding up new pinball license applications for several months, the City Council's license committee will begin approving such licenses on a restricted basis and "with discretion", the committee chairman, James Scavotto reported.

Scavotto stated that the situation had been completely reviewed by the Council members, "We will use discretion", he said, "in issuing these licenses, for we do not wish to see the city flooded with new machines".

He also said that particular consideration would be given to licenses to place machines in new business spots which do not have pin games at this time.

Last winter the Council passed an ordinance providing that no person could hold more than 200 licenses for pinballs.

Scavotto stated that there is now but one person or firm holding the maximum of 200 licenses and that there are but four persons or firms having more than 100 licenses.

C. W. Bolin has 200; Sigel & Marcus have 186; John J. Michael has 140; Keiter, Watson & Katz have 127 and Hawthorne & Mondschein have 112.

53 ungranted applications are now pending in the committee's files. If these are all granted there will be a total of 2,171 machines licensed here.

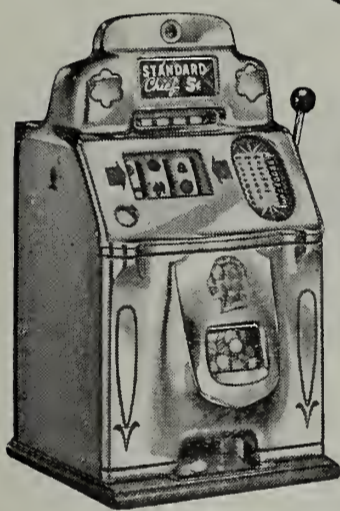

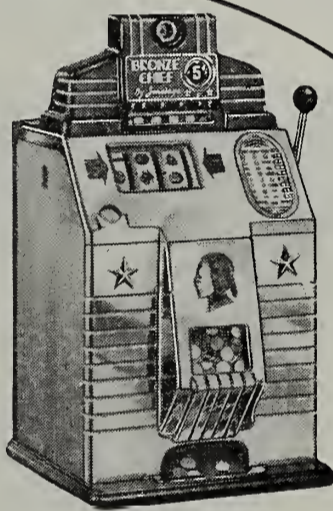

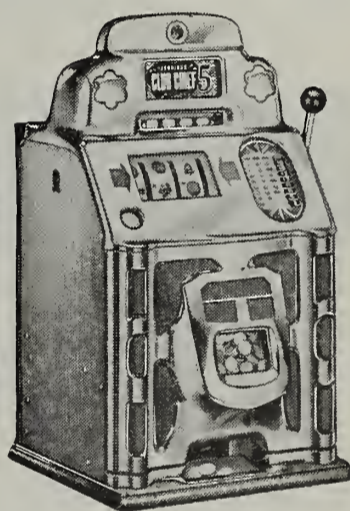

**FDR Dime & Jefferson
Nickel Jam Machines**

NEW YORK—Complaints have been received from coinmen that the new F. D. Roosevelt dime and the Thomas Jefferson nickel are jamming many machines.

One noted coinmen stated that the Roosevelt dime averages three to four thousandths of an inch thicker than the old dime.

The Jefferson nickel is reported to be from ten to fifteen thousandths of an inch thicker than the old nickel.

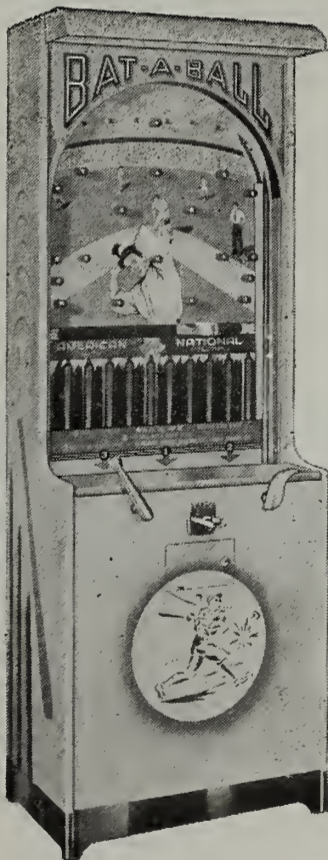
In both cases, especially in cigarette vending machines and other venders, where adjustments are very fine, the coins will jam the mechanism. Much trouble has been experienced by the merchandise machine people.

Some complaints have already been made to the director of the U. S. Mint in Philadelphia, Pa. Other coinmen who are also having trouble with these new coins are advised to lodge complaints here.

In the majority of amusement machines these coins will work. Bells and Consoles have been accepting them without trouble, according to reports.

It seems, tho, that the most trouble the coinmen have come across on these new coins is from vending machines of all sorts.

The most outstanding trouble factor is the thickness of the outer edge of the coins. On the nickel it is reported that the lettering and the figure are also somewhat thicker than on the old nickel.

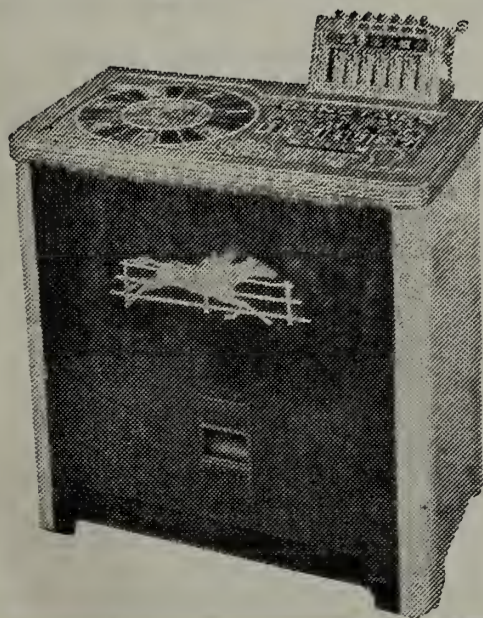

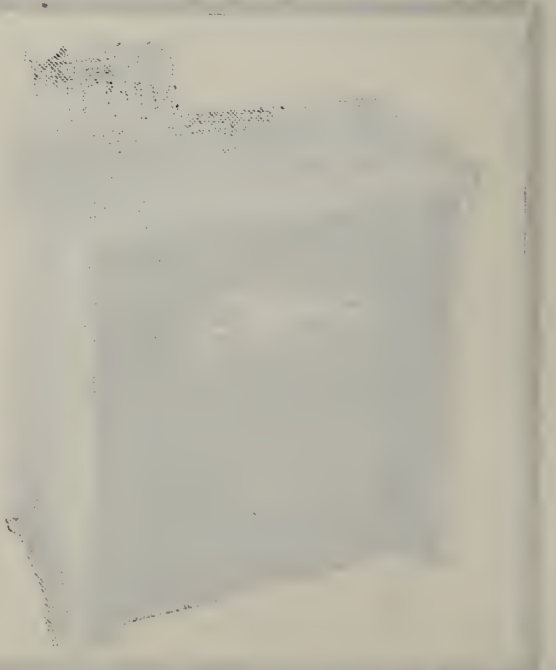

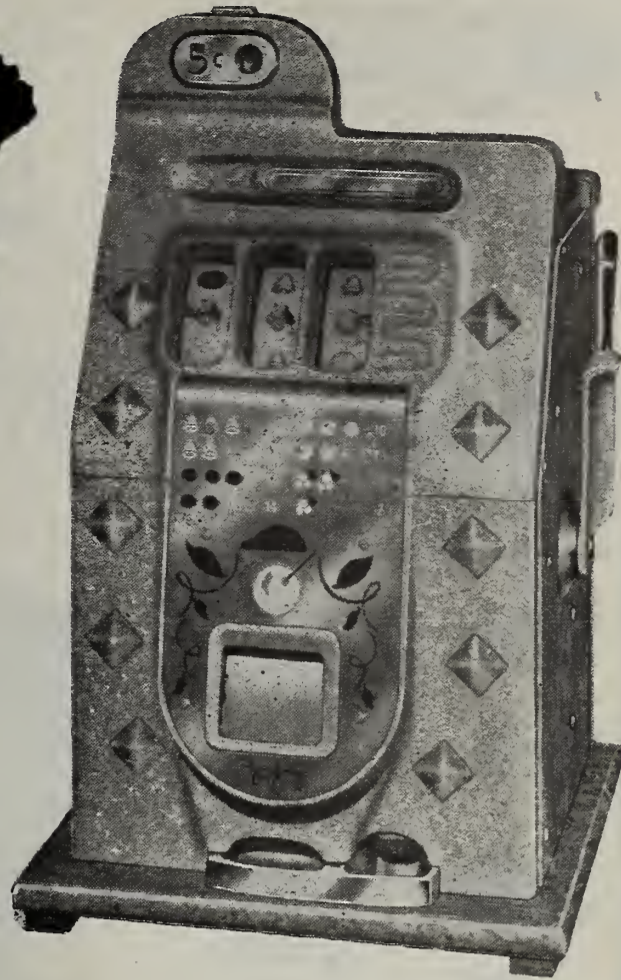

**Liquor Dealers' Assn
Protest Juke Box Tax**

PITTSSTON, PA. — A protest was lodged this past week by the Luzerne County Liquor Dealers' Association against a new ordinance which went into effect here on October 12 placing an annual tax on juke boxes.

The following is a copy of the letter which was signed by George F. Smith, president, and Martin McCloskey, secretary of the association, and was forwarded to the city council here.

"It has been brought to the attention of this association, by our members in your city, that action is pending to further tax the licensed liquor dealers.

"We feel that the liquor dealer is already so overburdened with taxes that a vigorous protest is necessary at this time.

"The city of Pittston had just turned over to it by the state \$13,100 in money collected directly from licensed liquor dealers in your city. This money was paid by the licensees as a tax collected from them before they could open their doors for business.

"And this is but one tax which we pay to do business. We also pay a tax on liquor of between \$11 and \$12 per gallon; a tax of \$9.24 a barrel on all beer; we pay a stamp tax, an amusement tax and real estate

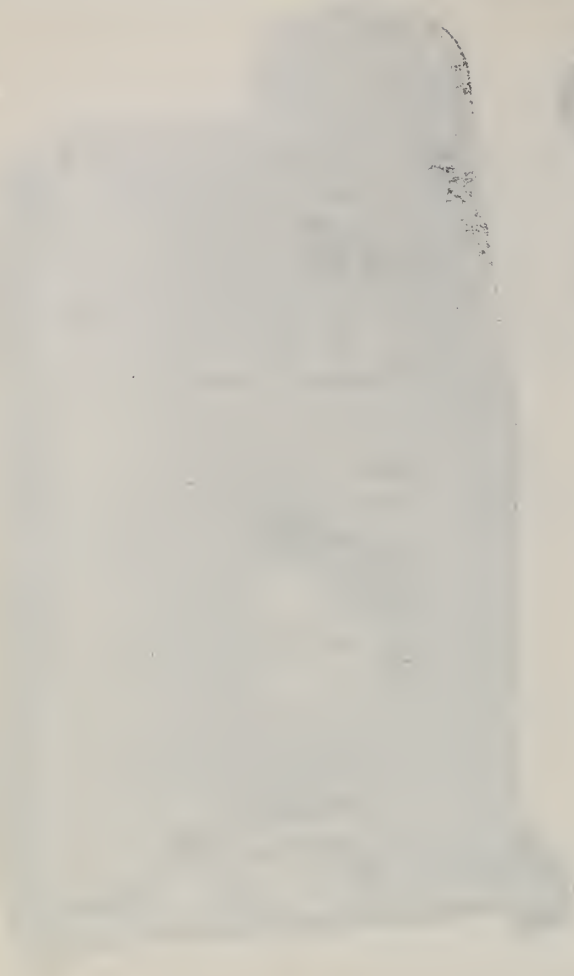

It was reported that many upstate police court justices attended this meeting and were present at this special session.

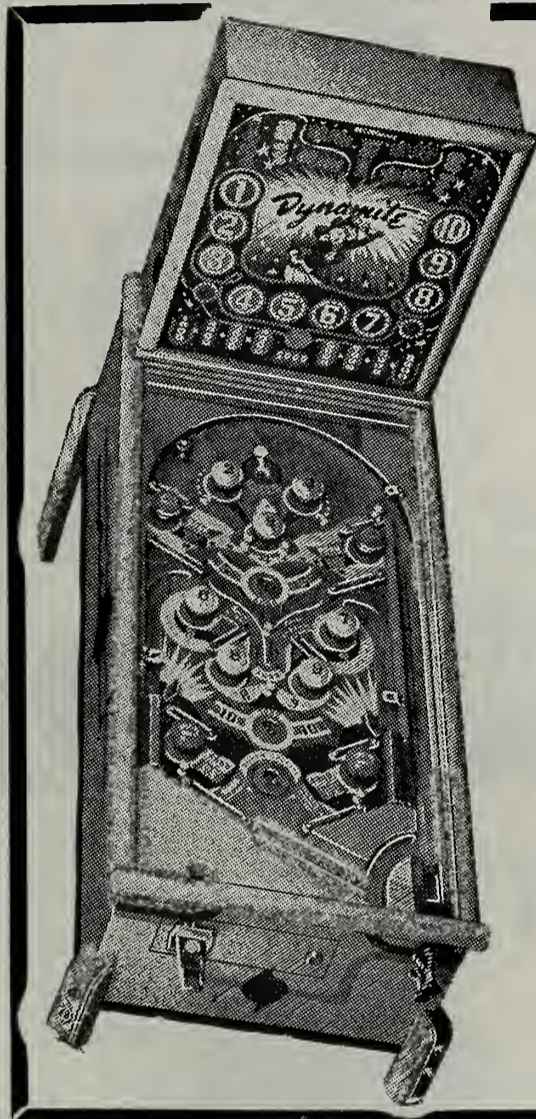

The tax on machines here, in which skill is ostensibly an element, such as pinball games, is 10% of the gross intake. On "chance" machines, such as the bells, the tax is 20% of the gross intake. It is reported here by the tax commission that there are approximately 11,000 pinball machines and 1,000 bells in operation in this state.

The bells are mostly located in clubs thruout the state and have been greatly responsible for keeping the clubs in a liquid financial condition.

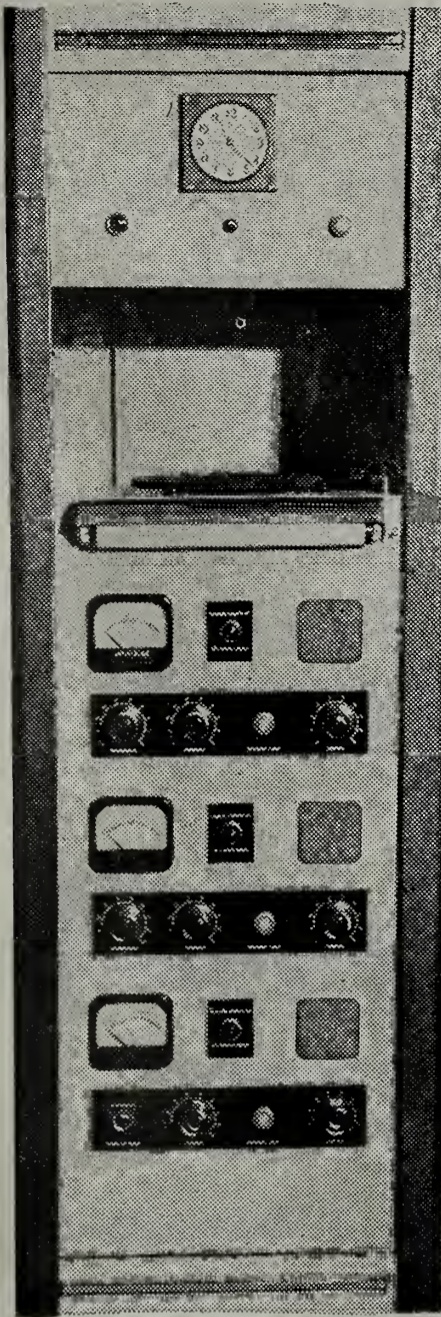

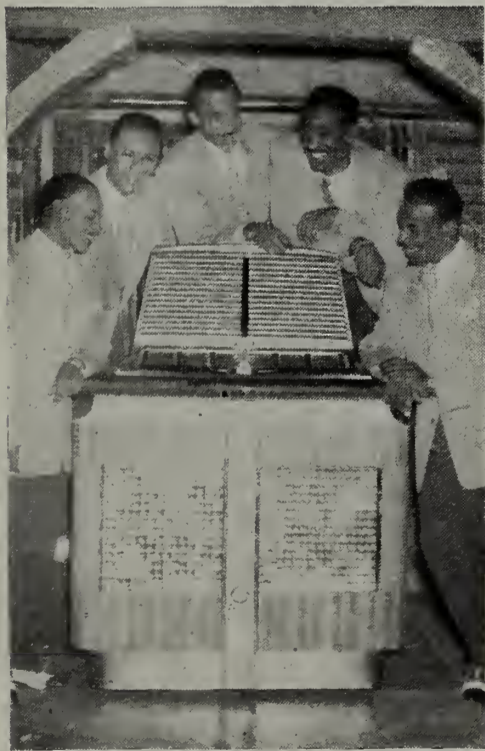

CMI NAMES MANGAN TO HEAD PUBLIC RELATIONS BUREAU

CHICAGO—The long awaited public relations program for this industry rolled into action this past week with the announcement from CMI headquarters here that an organization to be known as CMI Public Relations Bureau will be established immediately.

At the same time it was made known that James T. Mangan, of the public relations firm of Mangan & Eckland, has been named to form the bureau and to guide the long range campaign currently being planned.

The Coin Machine Public Relations Committee, composed of Walter Tratsch, A.B.T.; Herb. Jones, Bally Mfg. Co., DeWitt Eaton, A.M.I. Incorporated; J. W. Coan, Coan Manufacturing; Grant Shay, Bell-O-Matic; Dave Gottlieb, D. Gottlieb & Co.; and James A. Gilmore, Secretary of CMI; met on Tuesday, October 15, and after a five hour session decided on this set-up for CMI's public relations campaign starting at once.

A complete public relations staff operating in the offices of CMI Incorporated at 134 N. LaSalle Street will handle the public relations of the entire coin machine industry.

This bureau will be formed and controlled personally by James T. Mangan, who will be responsible to CMI and to the entire coin machine industry for the public relations job to be done by this bureau.

Mangan, a prominent and familiar figure in the coin machine trade, spent the past twenty-five years in every form of coin machine public relations, promotion and merchandising. Mangan was for more than twenty years with Mills Novelty Company and Mills Industries, Incorporated, and for the past two years has been handling public relations, merchandising and design problems for many manufacturers in the coin

machine field. He grew up in the business with amusement machines, games, vending machines, coin operated music, coin operated service machines and every other form of coin operated equipment, and is a nationally known figure in publicity.

In the year 1940 Mangan secured the top publicity project of that year with thirty-eight thousand clippings and photographs covering a certain coin operated machine. He has addressed meetings of coin machine men in almost all the large cities in the United States and Canada. He is a writer with an immense business men's following, having authored six books, among them "The Knack of Selling Yourself" and "You Can Do Anything." His Sales Manual, "Sell By Giving", has reached a distribution of four hundred thousand copies to the business men of America.

Mangan is a veteran of World War I, a member of the Chicago Publicity Club, the Chicago Society of Typographic Arts and the Chicago Athletic Association and the American Legion.

During the war Jim Mangan was one of the most active coin men in government service in the war effort. He was co-chairman of Special Events

for the U. S. Treasury, State of Illinois, and served for five years at a dollar a year with the U. S. Department of Labor as one of that department's two national promotion consultants. He was chairman of the War Committee of the Society of Typographic Arts and coordinated the work of six hundred Chicago artists creating a contribution of over five hundred thousand dollars worth of free art services to the U. S. Government. He is the man who secured from the Chicago Building Trades Council a donation of one hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars to buy a light bomber for the Air Forces and to construct what is generally considered to be the largest patriotic display in history, namely the murals and assembly of five thousand miniature airplanes in the concourse of the Union Station, Chicago.

The Public Relations program of CMI will be addressed to creating a better public understanding of the nature of coin machines and their services to 130 million Americans.

Greene Hails Future Of Vending Biz At NAMA Convention



ROBERT Z. GREENE

CHICAGO—A three-fold increase in retail sales through vending machines during the next ten years was predicted by Robert Z. Greene, President of the National Automatic Merchandising Association, in his keynote address at the opening session of the Association's tenth anniversary convention at the Congress Hotel in Chicago this past week.

Basing his prediction on the progress made by the industry during the past decade, Mr. Greene cited the development of automatic merchandising from a small-scale business to a large industry which today has a sales volume of over half a billion dollars per year. Ten years from now, he prophesied, it should be perfectly reasonable to expect the industry to attain at least three times this volume.

Automatic merchandising, Mr. Greene said, endured during depression and war and has emerged stronger and better equipped than ever before.

"As a result of our efforts," Mr. Greene told the Association members, "the public now knows better who we are and what we are. It is acknowledged that our industry is an important part of American economic life . . . We have made great strides in mobilizing public opinion in support of automatic merchandising. It is now generally recognized that merchandise vending machines offer an efficient method of self-service and that they sell merchandise of standard value and high quality . . . In the past ten years we have come of age."

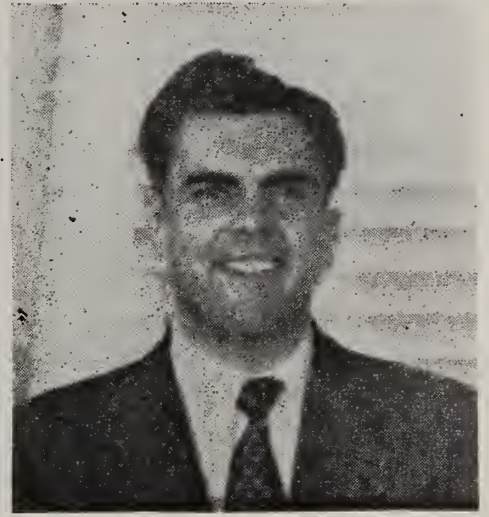
Looking ahead to 1956, Mr. Greene predicted that the National Automatic Merchandising Association will have developed into "one of the largest trade organizations in the country. During this time, automatic merchandising will have become firmly entrenched in our economic life as an important method of distribution."

Advocating that members of the industry restrict the display of their equipment exclusively to exhibits of merchandise and service machines, Mr. Greene stressed the difference between automatic merchandisers and operators of other types of coin-operated equipment. He said, "We operators are merchants. Our profits are not made on machines, but on
