



DAT Foes Win Congressional Battle

NEW YORK — Opponents of digital audiotape (DAT) won a Congressional victory in their battle to restrict the use of DAT technology in the U.S. for one year. The House Energy and Commerce committee voted 24 to 18 to retain a trade bill provision that would require all DAT machines sold and manufactured in the U.S. to carry an anticopying device for one year.

The vote was a major triumph for the record industry, which lobbied heavily for rentention of the amendment in the trade bill. The Electronic Industries Association (EIA) opposed the provision, saying that it put unfair restrictions on a valuable new technology.

The battle, however, has just begun. The trade bill, called The Trade and International Economic Reform Policy Act (HR3), is currently in two House versions. The Commerce and Energy version includes the DAT provision. The Ways and Means bill does not. The House Rules Committee will ultimately decide which version of HR3 finally goes to the floor.

"Now the question is how these two bills get married up," said RIAA president Jason Berman, who strongly supports the provision. "I'm taking the process that would incorporate the Commerce committee bill with the Ways and Means committee bill, and hopefully get it past the House and on to the Senate."

"(DAT's) problem is that its copying potential will aggravate the already serious home-taping problem," says Berman. "When you end up with a perfect copy and your perfect copy can make perfect copies, you're not going to buy pre-recorded music. You're going to pay the blank tape manufacturers because it's cheaper. Because Maxell and TDK don't pay artists royalties, they don't pay music publishers, they don't pay songwriters. So it's cheaper to tape than to buy."

The record industry is already losing an estimated billion-and-a-half dollars a year due to home taping. The fear is that DAT will greatly multiply that loss, and cut in to the CD market as well. Because the technology to mass-produce pre-recorded DAT cassettes is still years away, the DAT machine would be used only to home-tape pre-recorded music. The inclusion of a copy code scanner in the machine, as specified in the bill, will make such duplication impossible.

"What we have here is a machine that takes our music without our authorization," says Berman. "And it takes it in an environment in which if we wanted to compete we couldn't because we don't have the process to put (our music) onto DAT. So, it's unfair competition."

U2's "Joshua Tree" Yields Fruit For Retailers

LOS ANGELES – The latest U2 album, "The Joshua Tree," sent waves of excitement through retail outlets across the country last week, creating exceptional traffic and sales.

While most retailers expected the album, the Irish foursome's fifth, to sell well, not many had anticipated the interest it would create.

"One of the things we really could not anticipate was what kind of immediate demand we would have," says Norman Hunter, manager of product development for the 130-store Record Bar chain based in Durham, North Carolina. "We had some stores sell out of their original shipment in two hours." Hunter said that although there hadn't been as much media hoopla over the album as their had been for the Bruce Springsteen live boxed set, they did have some lines of people waiting for the stores to open on the first day of its release as they had for the Springsteen LP. Referring to his title he laughed, "with a record like this, there's no kind of development involved. All I have to do is make sure there's profit. It is easily the number one record in our chain. Based on reorder pattern, right now a number one record for us is about 3,500 units after a week. I would say U2 is going to be above 5,000 and maybe above 6,000 so it is not only number one for us, there is a substantial gap between it and the Beastie Boys which is currently number two."

Indeed, for most retailers *Cash Box* surveyed, the Beasties have been dethroned. "I think it's really a case that the time has come for this particular group," says Lew Garrett, vice president of music purchasing for Camelot Record stores, a 190-store chain based in Ohio. Garrett estimates that *(continued on page 25)*

NMPA, SGA, RIAA Make Joint Royalty Rate Adjustment Proposal

W YORK — The National Music Publish-Assoc., the Songwriters Guild of Ameriand the RIAA jointly petitioned the pyright Royalty Tribunal to adopt their posal for adjustments to the statutory chanical royalty rate over the next 10 rs.

The proposal calls for the present menical royalty rate (five cents per tune) to adjusted in proportion to changes in the sumer Price Index every two years, bening January 1, 1988 and continuing unlanuary 1, 1996. Regardless of changes

Resulting royalty rates are to be rounded to the nearest 1/20th cent. The "overtime" rate (presently .95 cent per minute of playing time) would likewise by adjusted in proportion to the changes in the CPI.

The initial rate adjustment, which is to occur on January 1, 1988, would be based on changes in the CPI between December 31, 1985 and September 30, 1987. Thereafter, rate adjustements would be made every two years based on CPI changes from September through the September two years later, with the adjusted rates becoming effective on January 1, 1990, 1992, 1992, and 1996.

Language implementing the proposal was presented as a recommendation to the Copyright Royalty Tribunal for adoption as formal regulations. The CRT is authorized by law to review in 1987 petitioned changes in the statutory rate, which has prevailed at five cents per song since January 1, 1986. The next CRT review can occur in 1997.

The NMPA, SGA, and RIAA were the principal parties in the 1980 mechanical royalty rate adjustment proceedings before the Tribunal.

Counterfeit Label Indictment In MS, Tapes Seized In CA, KY

NEW YORK—James Lee Long of Tupelo, MS was indicted by a federal grand jury on February 17 on five counts of trafficking in counterfeit cassette tape labels. Each count carries a maximum penalty of five years in prison and a \$250,000 fine.

The indictment alleges that Long, doing business as Roadrunner Enterprises, trafficked in counterfeit labels from March, 1984-August, 1985. A three year investigation by the RIAA's anti-piracy unit, the FBI, and various state and local police departments showed the alleged distribution of counterfeit cassettes by Long in Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, and Florida.

Long, who was taken into custody by the FBI and later released on a \$10,000 bond, pleaded not guilty to all five counts.



According to England's *Melody Maker*, the latest buzz about **Michael Jackson**'s forthcoming album (release date? forget it) is that the Encino-based singer plans to make a video for each and every cut on the record.

PALACE SCUFFLE—There's something very non-violent about the Palace in Hollywood. Maybe it's those sweeping staircases and all the old Hollywood glamour of the place that makes it an unlikely setting for an outbreak of hostility (a Day of the Locusts crush, maybe - Altamont, never). Last week, during a show by funksters Klymaxx and Bunny DeBarge, around 1,000 people reportedly rushed the front door, crawling all over each other and assaulting security guards to get into a club that was already filled to its 1,200 capacity. What was the matter with these folks, anyhow! Sardines in an another life, maybe? (Incidentally, seems there were plenty of people just dying to get out while the unruly lot were just dving to get in, hence much of the confusion, according to reports). Phenominally, of the hundreds who reportedly ganged up on the venerable former vaudeville house and its staff, only three were arrested.

PETTY PREVAILS-Gosh, those steel-belted radial people can be ruthless. B.F. Goodrich just couldn't take no for an answer when Tom Petty rejected their plan to make a tire commercial out of his song, "Mary's New Car." As is the norm when art meets big business, big business takes what it can't get by any other means. In the case of B.F. Goodrich, the company went ahead and used a sound-alike singer and a sound-alike song (a musicologist was brought in to officially determine this, though even the lyrics are shamelessly similar). ZAPPA ON ZAPPA—Word-wise and quick-witted **Frank Zappa** has finally decided to tell it all. The deliciously verbose Mr. Zappa has signed a publishing deal for an autobiography, tentatively titled *The Real Frank Zappa Book*, scheduled for Fall, 1988, from **Poseidon Press**. Says his publisher, **Ann Patty**, "Zappa has always made the scene before anyone else even knew it was there." A hip statement if there ever was one, and true, too.

SYNTHICIDE—Enigma Records has taken on a new dance music label, Synthicide Records. God only knows what "Synthicide" means (selfinflicted death by synthesizers?), but we are privy to the info that the label was formed by Enigma recording artist Jon St. James, promotion man Dana Muscato and label manager Dave Guccione. St. James is best known for his work on Stacy Q's debut album, which spawned the dance hits "Two of Hearts" and "We Connect."

NEW FACES TO WATCH

It's hard to believe that people aren't picking-up on Red Box's "The Circle and The Square" (Sire). It's got the clarity, magic, and accessibility of a major album, and a sense of songcraft that is simple but never easy.

Like the title of the record itself, "The Circle and The Square" reduces life to lowest terms, almost to nursery rhyme level. The music bounces along joyfully with such great lyrics as "tenkaio," "ya da dee yeh," "ah-li-ayo," (and especially) "urelei urelei USA!," not to mention "yeeooo ay da yeeooo ah," "hey ya hey ya you will go far," and "you can find a new leader most anywhere."

Julian Close explains. "The 'urelei urelei' doesn't mean anything. It was just sung when the tune was being written. Another example is our song 'ah-liayo.' At the end of the song everybody starts singing 'ah-li-ayo.' But, of course, you can't sell records that go 'ah-li-ayo'; you've got to put words in there that people understand."

"It's not a bad comparison to say our songs have a nursery rhyme quality because the nursery rhymes of the early days, like 'Humpty Dumpty' also carried news. They weren't just for children; there was a message in them."

Close formed Red Box after he left his native Bristol in 1978 to go to college in London. There he met the other half of Red Box, Simon Toulson Clarke, and they joined with other musicians to release a single on Cherry Red Records called "Chenko (tenka-io)." It didn't exactly sell well, but it did get them a cult following, some radio play, and a deal with Sire Records.

"Chenko" is included on the album, but it is surrounded by songs that are even better, such as "For America" and "Lean On Me." "Heart Of The Sun," with lyrics like "Ah! contrasting ceremonies/the circle and the square," is refreshingly elemental in a way that most pop music isn't. "The circle and the square are two opposite shapes and in Indian mythology the circle is a red man and the square is a white man. That song is basically contrasting different ceremonies. Imagine a British or American wedding in white in a church



andcompare it with an African weddi in the jungle where everyone's paint up and dances around. What could more different? Yet they're both doi the same thing."

Their tone is internationalist. The are hints of African music, Americ Indian music, Brit-synth, and Euro-po There are flashes of brilliance, a hooks by the score. There is a cover o Buffy St. Marie song, vocals coming c of the clouds, rhythms shaking t ground. And always, simplicity.

Though Close hasn't traveled o side of England much, he knows wh he would do on a world tour. "Say were in South America and there we a few neat-sounding drums; we'd g them recorded on our little Sony Wa mans or whatever....Peter Gabriel we around with his tape recorder to diff ent parts of the world taping sound That would be the ideal thing to do."

"It was important to us to make record that sounded different," he sa "The things on the British charts rig now all sound the same. They're rather electronic, dance crossov music."

"If you took the lead vocals off t top ten records, you wouldn't be able differentiate between them. So wanted to come up with a fresh sour ing approach."

Red Box is planning a trip and a p sible tour of the States, and thou they've never been here, they've w ten about it in "For America." "Ma zines and gasoline and made-in-Taiw western scenes/will you hear us in t heart of America?" they ask in 1 song. They'll soon find out.

Miller Genuine Draft Announces 21-Band Roster

LOS ANGELES—Miller Beer will participate in their sixth year of corporate sponsorship of country and rock music with the new affiliation of Miller Genuine Draft.

Twenty-one touring rock and country bands will be featured in the 1987 Miller Genuine Draft Band Network which recognizes the merger of the original Rock Network with the newer Country Network initiated last year. Both of those programs had operated under the Miller High Life banner.

Robert Cray: Putting The Rhythm And Blues Back Into Rhythm And Blues

EW YORK—Look, guys who win Gramy Awards in the Traditional Blues categoaren't supposed to end up with albums in e top 10 on the pop charts. Yet Robert ay has a freshly-minted Grammy for his '86 collaboration with Texas blues titans bert Collins and Johnny Copeland, howdown" (Alligator), and his own Merry/Hightone LP "Strong Persuader" is mly planted near the top of this week's p charts.

p charts. "I don't see any big new wave of new usic coming out," says Robert Cray, tryto put a finger on his success, "and synesizers have toned themselves down and und a place alongside of all the other inuments. And now...I don't know, I think ople are looking for something more real their music, more everyday situations. umbined with the fact that there are a lot oldies stations across the country now, d guys like Ben E. King are having their ngs reissued. I just saw Percy Sledge on / last Saturday, things like that."

What Robert Cray is serving up is a canand scintillating brew of American mus. Although he's been typed as a "blues tist" (I first heard him in 1984 in the lues tent" at a Dutch jazz festival, a "fine, cky, spiky singer/guitarist with charisma burn," I wrote in these pages after that rformance) he is quick to shrug off the

stoneground blues label.

"Blues is one of the many kinds of music that we do. We do some rhythm and blues, and it's tinged with rock and there's a little jazz to it. So I just like to call the music rhythm and blues, because I don't believe it's really any different from things that have been done in the past. People like Little Milton Campbell and Bobby "Blue" Bland have been doing this kind of thing for a long time."

Robert Cray doesn't even have a blues background-you know, growing up in an urban ghetto or on some dusty Southern farm. He was an army brat-being shuttled every couple of years from California to Germany to Virginia to Washington State (where he currently resides).

"I first started playing in '65," says Cray, who is in his mid-30s, "but it wasn't till about '74 that I knew what I wanted to do, and that was to play blues and rhythm and blues. That's when we started the Cray Band. Richard Cousins, my bass player, and I moved down from Washington to Eugene, Oregon, basically because there were no place for us to play, playing the kind of music that we do. The only thing you could do was play top-40. So we went down to Eugene, which is a college town and was open for that kind of music."

EAST COASTINGS

"My humor is about anger," said comedian **Bob Goldthwait** recently. "Sam Kinison's is about hate." The difference was fully evident at his March 19 Town Hall show, one of the best N.Y. performances by a comedian since **Steve Wright's** Beacon Theatre gig last year. His humor is a compassionate antidote for anyone (everyone) fed up with the mean-spirited antics of Kinison — and his imitation of **U2's Bono** is a damned wonder.

MY HAIRCUTTER used to play the Smiths every time I came over for a hair cut. Consequently, whenever I hear the Smiths now, I always feel like I'm getting a trim. While playing the Smith's new one, "Louder Than Bombs" (Sire), I could smell the shampoo, feel the spray, and hear the scissors clip. "Louder Than Bombs" is a 24-song double-record mix of B-sides, oldies, and (seven) newies that Smiths fans will probably kill to own. East Coastings's faves are "Oscillate Wildly" and the hooky "Half A Person," tunes which'll no doubt accompany my next haircut

LOS LOBOS'S Louie Perez talking: "We got into Tex/Mex norteno music (when we started). That easily lent itself to a lot of other American rock 'n' roll. We started playing old **Ritchie Va**lens tunes, old blues, and everything else. And **David (Hidalgo)**, because of the accordian, was really interested in Louisiana zydeco Cajun. We managed to get ourselves all mixed up in the garage one day. Mixing it up made perfect sense to us."

Perez was shocked when their debut album on Slash won a Grammy: "We thought it was really nice we were nominated but there was no way we were going to win anything. We weren't even home (L.A.) for the Grammys. Why stay home? I figured we'd all look silly in tuxes anyway - let's do some gigs. We were in Louisiana, and we just pulled into town, real typical. We were in the van - hairdos by Dodge - trying to find a ten dollar room and a shower. Got in and there was a message from the club to get hold of our publicist in L.A. And we called up the publicist and he said, hey, you won. We literally dragged David out of the shower and were all jumping up and down.'

As a drummer, he's learned to twirl his sticks: "Our stage manager actually drilled a hole through a drumstick and stuck a nail through it."

There is a growl in his voice when he talks about the wolf: "The wolf kind of found us. The name Los Lobos means 'the wolves.' For years, the wolf started taking on a more symbolic sort of meaning. The idea that the wolf, because of a lack of understanding, is being pushed to the brink of extinction.....Over a period of ten, thirteen years, life got complicated with family and wives and it became incredibly difficult at times to get by and keep our heads above water. So the wolf really seemed to mean something at that point." Perez writes about hope, faith, belie "All the people in these stories (on 'By The Light Of The Moon') are very resilient. They're heroes. They're courageous people. In spite of how hard things get, they manage to make it through with faith in themselves. And I think that's probably the theme of this record: faith in yourself, and believing you're important and you matter and there's a reason why you're here."

WHEN I WAS a teenager, after I had gone from Grand Funk to Led Zeppelin, taken a U-turn with Jethro Tull, and regained my senses with a stiff dose of "Blood On The Tracks," I hungered for mainstream bombast again. Foreigner helped fill the void, and when they finally matured with "I Want To Know What Love Is," so had I.

Lou Gramm of Foreigner has now stepped out on his own with a solo LP called "Ready Or Not" (Atlantic), which doesn't sound much like his old band. But frankly, he doesn't want it to. "I can't do much about the voice; it's mine and it belongs to Foreigner too," he says. "Anyone who gives it a serious listen will know that it's not Foreigner by any stretch of the imagination. I've done this on my own terms."

He wrote or co-wrote the songs on the album, and got them any way he could. "The chords I play on the piano are not really proper chords. When I play something, I see where my fingers are and I take a marker and 'X' off the keys. And even if they tell me it's incorrect, I'll tell them it's correct for what I'm after."

Who's arguing? The first single, "Midnight Blue," is top twenty, and the album is currently #38 bullet after only a month.

JOE JACKSON performed a piano composition from his new "Will Power" LP (A&M) to a small crowd of classical and pop music bizzers (3/19, RCA Studios), before playing a tape of the album ("It starts off softly and gets louder," he said). To these ears, it sounds like a soundtrack album in search of a film, and indeed film scoring seems to be the direction Jackson is taking. This LP should help him on his way.

The UK music industry has been delighted that the government has withdrawn the threatened "holding" tax. After representations from the BPI, Treasury Secretary **Norman Lamont** announced last week that record royalties would be exempt from the new tax.

BPI legal advisor **Patrick Isherwood** said: "This is exactly what we have been asking for, and the indications are now that artists visiting recording studios in this country will not be caught in the net."

The government's initial proposals would have meant 75 million a year would have been taken out of the music, sport and entertainment industries, and it was felt that could have closed many London studios and made many foreign stars reluctant to tour here...

The music industry is set to do a **Band Aid**-style single to raise money for families affected by the Zeebrugge ferry disaster. Once again, dealers will be asked to waive their profit margins for the single "Let It Be" by **Ferry Aid** (CBS).

The strength of public feeling around the tragedy and the array of stars on the record are almost guaranteed to push it to the top of the charts.

The line-up on the cover of the **Bea**tles song includes **Boy George**, **Mark Knopfler**, **Ben Volpeliere-Pierrot**, **Mark King**, **Mel and Kim**, **Pepsi and Shirlie**, **Nick Kamen** and **Bananarama**.

It is hoped that composer **Paul McCartney** will add his own contribution. The single was produced by top producers **Stock**, **Aitken**, **Waterman**...

The Scandanavian invasion continues with the current buzz around Danish group **Gangway**. Gangway sound like they are performing obscure **Madness** cover versions. But lush string arrangements and jaunty tunes hide a most sinister parody and richly ironic lyrics. They subvert from the inside. And, with their checked sports jackets and pipes, are more dangerous than anything **Sigue Sigue Sputnick** could come up with. They are on the Danish label Irmgardz.

Songwriter **Henrik Balling** says he gets some of his lyrical inspiration from unusually pathetic situations. "What's really pathetic is people creating scenes because they are drunk. I am attracted to people who are poor with no future. I am attracted to what is sad and diminished. *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf* is supposed to be a miserable play, but if I get in the mood I think it is really funny. 'The Funeral March' by **Purcell** is another thing I find strangely uplifting."

One song, "Once Bitten Twice Shy," is actually about a funeral. Euphoric melodies disguise lines like: "I was so pleased at your death/ and I was happy at your funeral. You are like a Sunday afternoon/filled with sadness, depression and gloom"...

Santa Cruz band **Camper Van Beethoven** have been causing a stir with their latest single on Rough Trade called "Take the Skinheads Bowling." They are over here doing a few dates to promote it.

Lead Camper **David Lowery** says: "I build abstract scarecrows out of fenceposts and wire because there have been so many sitings of UFOs near where I live. Lots of people have been taken into spaceships and examined by aliens, and I would hate that to happen to me."





THE STONE, SAN FRANCISCO-L.A.based rockers Idle Tears stopped into this North Beach venue for a powerful set of tunes, giving the Bay Area a taste of a sound perfected on the Chicago club circuit in recent years. With a new self-titled debut album on MCA, featuring Chuck Plotkin's (Springsteen) production skills, the band takes the no-nonsense approach to rock'n-'roll, greatly aided by Liz Constantine's electrifyingly high-flying vocals.

The band is as strong on moody poetics as it is on reverberating power riffs. In a relatively brief showing as one of three acts on the bill, Idle Tears shook the hall as easily as it was capable of hypnotizing it with wrenchingly mysterious tunes, that mystery being particularly evinced by a song called "Paradise," delivered with a thundering down-tempo intensity. Percussionist Tom Crowley kept pace with a steady churn, creating a gut-felt rumble on this tune especially, while Constantine's thoughtfully delivered vocal furthered the song's swell and roll.

Liz Constantine is, in fact, one of the most exciting new voices to come along in years. Rare is the rock vocalist whose voice can soar as well as it can lament, and Constantine expresses both things with an actress's poise. There's real texture to her sound, whether it's a Martha Davis-ish lowreaching gravel or the kind of triumphant high-rising conflagration dished up by Pat Benatar. Constantine could give both women something to worry about.

The band's lack of gimmick or adherence to techno mania works much in its favor. Adept rock musicianship and well-written tunes are its calling card, displayed with apparent ease here, despite the club's rather limited stage space. The band seemed better suited to larger venues, and not just for the elbow room. Constantine, a performer of great charm and equal talent, was hemmed in by equipment, a sad trap for a singer who's obviously got the wits and agility to work an arena stage.

The band's engrossing moody side is contrasted with a power rock sensibility, spearheaded by lead guitarist David Resnik's resounding strumming. And while such a



rock cliche may best be avoided, a stroll or two with his surging guitar work, afforded by a larger stage, wouldn't have hurt. Still, Resnik's playing has sizzle, movement or no movement. Gregg Rich's keyboards gave sturdy support to the set, as did Erik Scott's ardent bass.

Guitarist and primary songwriter Dan Pritzker has provided the band with a dramatic edge that sets them apart. Coupled with Constantine's intelligent handling of his lyrics, there's much here to get involved with. Again, a larger venue with a better sound system would do them more justice, but for rockers who like a strong lyric sung by a powerful female vocalist, Idle Tears is a hearty meal.

THE RITZ, NYC — The wolf is a shy, mysterious and near-extinct animal that often starves itself for weeks before suddenly devouring twenty pounds of prey at once. Uncompromising rock 'n' roll, the kind that "makes you tremble," the kind that Los Lobos plays, is near-extinct too. But when a musical feast like a Lobos show comes around — a two and a half hour one at that — people starved by canned vegetables and TV dinners eat it up, demanding second and third helpings.

Let's not even talk about the fifteen minute blues jam at show's end, or a ripping "La Bamba" that almost caused a riot. Let's not talk about the *nortena* rave-ups, the polka work-outs, the Mexican acoustica, the California country-rock smeared in the history of blues and folk. That was just dessert — in the form of three sets of encores — for a crowd that was already tipping generously.

Let's talk about "Prenda Del Alma," which built in stages as each band member came on individually. Enter David Hidalgo, looking like he stumbled into stardom on his way to Carambas, like a genius by accident who romances every musical instrument invented, like he's bellied-up against a counter ready to order the spiciest thing on the menu.

Enter Cesar Rosas, rotund, gregarious, the quintessential wedding-combo master of ceremonies, the hit of every VFW social, scratching his goatee, aiming his axe, and leaning forward like he's ready to tell a dirty joke.

As Hidalgo and Rosas sang "Como quitar el brillo a las estrellas?" ("How can you take the brilliance from a star?"), Louie Perez twirled his drumsticks and kicked in, gazing at the crazed crowd, his mouth wide open like a stop sign. Meanwhile, Conrad Lozano, moody and bearded, steadily thumped away on bass.

Let's talk about "Is This All There Is?," as brassy and big as a '57 Buick turning the corner on a Mexico City street. Or "Shakin' Shakin' Shakes" which shook and shook and shook like a fault, and "One Time, One Night," a song about neighbors and dreams and a guitar solo closer to familial conversation than music.

And just as things were getting mournful with "Tears Of God," the lights came on like a harvest moon, a wolf banner unfurled, and Perez bashed the opening to "Will The Wolf Survive?" People dined on rare rock 'n' roll beneath the lights, howling, dancing and hoping it wouldn't be another two-and-a-half years before the next feast.

PASSING ON-I'd like to note the recent deaths of two important figures in jazz: Eddie Durham, who died March 6 at the age of 80, and Allan Jaffe, who died March 9 at the age of 51. Durham, an original member of the Count Basie Orchestra, was a noted trombonist, a pioneer on the electric guitar, and a widely-respected composer and arranger. Jaffe was the founder of Preservation Hall and a guiding force in keeping the traditional jazz flame alive – by organizing, and touring as a tubaist with, the Preservation Hall Jazz Band

REISSUING ON-Hoo-hah, have the reissues been coming hot and heavy lately. For those who doubted the genuiness of RCA's efforts in that department, the label has just issued a bundle of gems under the Bluebird banner. On double albums (single cassettes and, where available, CDs) are Dizzy Gillespie's "Dizziest," some of the bebop pioneer's finest recordings, notably the essential late-'40s big band work; Louis Armstrong's "Pops," the greatest jazz musician of them all in some prime material from '46-47; "The Complete Fats Waller Vol. IV," continuing the longdelayed series of several years ago that intends to reissue all of that piano giant's massive RCA output; and "Short Stops," the first in a proposed series that will issue all of the '50s RCA work of "cool jazz" pioneer Shorty Rogers. On delectable single albums are wonderful works by two of the tastiest soloists in jazz history: Paul Desmond's lovely "Late Lament," '61-62 sessions teaming the alto great with strings and Jim Hall's guitar; and "Triple Play," an album featuring three all-star 1967 sessions by alto colossus Johnny Hodges.

From Blue Note comes three prime examples of the Blue Note sound from the '60s: Academy Award nominee **Dexter Gordon**'s "Gettin' Around," McCoy Tyner's "The Real McCoy," and Lee Morgan's "Search for the New Land.

From Delmark, which has been quiet in the jazz department of late, we get "The Albert Nicholas Quartet," featuring the excellent traditional clarinetist in the company of Art Hodes, "All The Gin is Gone," a properly low-down session led by tenor saxophonist Jimmy Forrest (and including, among others, Elvin Jones and Grant Green), and "Bouncing with Bud," Bud Powell in Copenhagen, vintage 1962.

And from PolyGram's Verve and MGM vaults comes CD versions (most with extra tracks) of Ella Fitzgerald's "Ella at the Opera House," "Stan Getz and J.J. Johnson at the Opera House" (73 minutes of music on that one), Charlie Parker/Dizzy Gillespie's "Bird and Diz," Kenny Burrell's "For Charlie & Benny," Lee Konitz's "Motion," and three Clifford Brown albums: "Jams 2," "Best Coast Jazz," and "Clifford Brown All-Stars."

And, while we're on the subject, Co-

lumbia is beaming over its Jazz Masterpieces roll-out, claiming over a quartermillion units shipped on the first 12 releases, with another seven items due momentarily.

The company decided a name change was needed to reflect the sweeping changes that have occurred at the company in the past five years. Since 1982, American Can has transformed itself from a predominantly manufacturing firm, to a services company with major interests in financial services and specialty retailing.

MGM/UA HOME VIDEO ADOPTS UPC CODES-MGM/UA Home Video has joined a growing number of manufacturers who have gone along with the recommendation made by the VSDA Packaging Committee in adopting the UPC product coding system on its VHS and Beta video cassettes and its Laserdiscs. "The first five numbers in the UPC Code," explains MGM/UA Home Video director of creative services, Ardis Rubenstein, "represent MGM/UA Home Video as the supplier and will remain constant. The next four numbers are the catalog number for the title and the final digit designates VHS (3), Beta (5) or Laser disc (6). In addition to its obvious utility as we move into the area of mass marketing, we believe the UPC Code will be of enormous value to us as a source of information retrieval. And it will become increasingly important to the more sophisticated retailers, suppling them with demographic information and a more efficient method to process orders. In the long run, these retailers will be able to check inventory and to take advantage of market trends as they develop."





REVEREND GREEN—The voice that captivated millions of fans around the warld during the 70s with o string of seven tap 10 hits including "Let's Stay Together" ond "I'm Still In Love With Yau" continues that outstanding musical mostery. At that time he was known as the "Prince of Love" nowodoys he is Reverend Al Green. Al continues to spread the message of lave and brotherhaod, however the message is fram a higher calling, in that Reverend Green experienced o spiritual re-awakening in October 1974. He jained the ministry, purchased a church building in Memphis, Tennessee ond was ardained pastar of the Full Gospel Tabernacle. His second A&M olbum titled "Saul Survivor" emplays contemporary techniques as well as his overtly spiritual interpretation of the "23rd Psolm." His current single "Everything's Ganna Be Alright" is receiving heavy radio exposure around the cauntry an secular and religious statians. His music career hos come full circle, a native of Forest City, Arkansas, he is one of nine children whase earlier exposure to music come fram the church. His father, boss player Robert Green, formed o gospel group known as the Green Brothers. Al joined ot oge nine, ond the group toured extensively an the gaspel circuit, first in the south ond later in the midwest, after the fomily moved to Grand Rapids, Michigon. At the age of 16, he farmed a oop group, Al Green And The Creations, with some high school friends. His professional career began in 1967, when the group now colled AI Green And The Soul Motes recarded a tune tiled "Bock Up Troin" an their Hat Line abel. Green was warking the "Chitlin' Circuit" ploying smoll clubs from Chicojo to Boton Rouge, when he met writerproducer Willie Mitchell in 1969. That collaboration was impressive to say he least ond included nine gold singles and seven gold olbums. His latest album

"Saul Survivor" finds Green in the campany of Billy Preston (who sings and plays argan on "You've Gat A Friend"), praducer-musicians Paul Zaleski and Errol Thomas (who produced the bulk of the album during sessions in Memphis) and athers. Whether the message is as direct as "Jesus Will Fix It" ar as apen to interpretation as "Yau've Gat A Friend" in fact, even the album title is a double entendre, there is no daubting Al Green's commitment. It is a commitment, pure ond simple to good, soulful music. SOUL TRAIN AWARDS-The first annual Soul Train Music Awards braught aut some of the industries top recarding artists, radia and recard executives. Comments fram variaus attendees that I spoke with had nathing but the highest af praise for the show. It seemed ta be a conscious opinion that the Soul Train Music Awords is samething that is and hos been needed by the recard industry in order to pay tribute to so many autstandingly gifted artists wha have been averlaaked an past awards shaws. On a camparative basis several attendees said this was the best awards shaw they had ever attended, stating specifically the way the shaw maved (time wise), praduction and the performances. A special salute to Don Cornelius, Steve Binder executive producers for same marvelaus production work and all thase affiliated with Tribune Entertainment Company. Dionne Warwick and Luther Vandross were simply magnificent as hasts. Quating fram the praducers message "we truly feel that there is omple raam within o medium such os television far o mojor tribute to block music. The impoct of block recording artists, producers, composers and musicians on the warld-wide music market has reached prapartians which almost demand farmal and exclusive recognition. Without disparoging the efforts of existing awards shows to give recognitian to the achievements of blacks in music and withaut intending to pramate separatism, we seek anly ta be specific in arganizing this supplemental celebratian. This musical celebratian is an the the world's mast impartant art forms, a celebratian to which all are invited regardless af race, calar, creed or cauntry. A Cash Box salute far a jab very well dane.

THE LEGEND LIVES ON-As we come to the third anniversary of Marvin Gaye's death, each af us as we remember Marvin will perhaps reflect an the memories of the times we spent with him. I will be daing the same, with the same amount of reverence as most people in the music industry. Those who knew Marvin know how much he laved children. His love for his own children was deep and real, a lave sa deep, he spent countless hours with them, even mentioning them by name an same af his records. For those wha knew that when he sang ``Save The Children'' he meant it sincerely. When warking with Marvin an the "Whot's Gaing On" album, I had na idea the album wauld be as significant as it is to the continuing problems of the warld taday. The album will cantinue ta be an everlosting manument ta Marvin as well as the Marvin Gaye Jr. Memarial Faundatian farmed by Marvin's sister Ms. Jeanne Gaye with the assistance af Ms. Connie Thompson and H.B. Barnum. I think it is time that the Marvin Gave Jr. Memorial Foundation be recagnized for the purpose it is intended, and that being to help problem children. So, on July 19th, 1987, AI Cleveland and Daryl Cleveland of Hitsburgh Enterprises will give a gala benefit at the Civic Arena in Pittsburgh, Pa. With partians af the praceeds gaing to the Marvin Gaye Jr. Memariol Faundatian, the offair will be co-produced by Paul Martha, vice president ond generol cauncil of the Civic Arena. We hope to attract those stars wha knew and loved Marvin to participate, because "The Legend Lives an."

CLEVELAND UPROAR-According ta variaus saurces the city of Cleveland, Ohia is in an upraar aver o reported promotion conducted recently by rodio statian WZAK. Sources told me that it was same type af spring-college promotion wherein listeners would be paid \$10.00 each (the pramatian was designed to only give away a tatal af \$100.00) if they came to a certain lacatian wearing their underwear on their heads, the repsanse braught out enough people whereby the statian gove away approximately \$1300. Saurces soy that most people feel the promatian was in very bad taste considering the number of unemployed people in that area, that people who ore faced with certain circumstances will da olmost anything far maney. The fact that WZAK is a black farmatted statian, it was most demeaning to the black citizens. Reportedly a city cauncil person is trying to get the F.C.C. invalved to the extent of trying to take the statian aff the air. Efforts to reach the statian's monogement have been unsuccessful as af this writing.



AUDIO/VIDEO

TOP GUN, TOP SELLER—We might have expected this. Last year's top-grossing theatrical release, *Top Gun*, propelled by a massive, \$8 million ad tie-in with Diet Pepsi, has far out-stripped every video on the market in reorders. To begin with, **Paramount Home Video** shipped 1.9 million of the tapes. That was the first record breaker. Since the tape hit the streets March 11, it's been selling at a rate of something like 120,000 units a day, with reorders already

topping 600,000. According to Paramount Home Video president Robert Klingensmith, virtually all of the company's distributors have completely sold out of their original inventory. Simple addition tells us that Top Gun has already moved 2.5 million units - that's over a million units more than the previous record-holder, Indiana Jones and the Temple of Doom (another Paramount title), which sold nearly 1.5 million units. Top Gun sales are expected to hit the 3 million mark next month - a thing believed impossible in today's market by many video suppliers. And all this for a tape that includes a fulllength Diet Pepsi commercial at the beginning. Will Americans pay to be sold? (Well, considering the amount of advertising seen on basic cable channels, Americans already are) The deal with Diet Pepsi brought the price down, and at \$26.95, seeing the ad is worth the affordable price.

FIRSTS—CBS TV, Columbia Records and rock band Journey debuted a first for all three last Friday, Journey's music special Raised On Radio - A Rockumentary. The one-hour special was directed by Michael Collins and featured interviews with Steve Perry, Neal Schon and Jonathan Cain, plus performances. So far, so good. But what's the big deal? The show marked the debut network television production for CBS Records. The show was a first for the band because, well, they've never done a rockumentary like this before. And it was the first hour-long rock oriented profile ever aired by CBS, which has about as much experience with airing a rockumentary as Journey has in appearing in one and CBS Records has in producing specials for TV (the last CBS special we can think of that comes close was Paul McCartney and Wings Wings Over America and that must've been more than ten years ago). So far, nothing definite has been decided as to the show's fate beyond network TV (where insiders at the label say it'll air again if the numbers are right). The word is that MTV wants it, though no deals have been made, and home video is still under consideration. PROVEN WINNER-Britain's venerable Top of The Pops program, the music show that's been airing on the BBC since 1964, is getting an American link as of this fall. A two-way satellite feed will be used to hook the BBC half-hour with a locally produced halfhour, featuring live performances plus U.S. pop, black, rock and country chart countdowns. The show is being produced by Entertainment Television Network (TEN), in association with Lionheart Television and BBC-TV. The hour-long version seen in the states will include showcases of new acts as well as retrospectives from past shows. It will appear in weekend/late fringe time slots, with many major market network affiliates already signed on, including KABC/Los Angeles, KPIX/San Francisco, WBZ/Boston and KDKA/ Pittsburgh. The program is being sold on a barter basis. SUPERFIGHT—Quantum Media,

The program is Marvelous Marvin Hagler vs. Sugar Ray Leonard: The Superfight. The fight takes place April 6 at Ceasar's Palace in Las Vegas, and then goes into exclusivedistribution by QMI, available April 21.

And that was it — Robert Cray hasn't really scuffled a day since then.

"I mean, there were times when Richard and I were saving bottles to get something to eat, and hitchhiking up and down the road, but once we got to Eugene we started pretty much working. And we've been doing it ever since."

The Robert Cray Band hasn't looked back since.

"I'd been looking to see what was going on in the music field," says Cray, "and I just thought if we just kept on working we could work our way in there somehow, you know. Doing the kind of music we did, we knew we had to travel to do it. So once we got established in Eugene, we started going up to Seattle and Portland, and eventually down to San Francisco, and we started getting a steady stream of cities to work from Vancouver down to Los Angeles and out as far as Wyoming.

"Back from 1976-78 we had the chance to work with Albert Collins, but after that we just continued working by ourselves."

At the 1977 San Francisco Blues Festival, Robert Cray met Bruce Bromberg, who, along with Dennis Walker, has produced every Cray album – from the 1978 "Who's Been Talkin" (Tomato, now reissued on Atlantic), through the three Hightone albums, "Bad Influence," "False Accusations," and "Strong Persuader." "Strong Persuader" is the first Cray album on a major label.

"Since you saw us in Holland in '84," says Cray, "we had our album 'False Accusations' go to the top of the independent charts over in England. And I think that got the attention of a bunch of other record companies to sign us to a deal. So Poly-Gram got involved with our Hightone deal and released our current record."

Simple as that. Well, not quite: since '84, the Cray Band has roped in a number of W.C. Handy Awards, won wide acclaim for its live shows, and attracted the attention of, among many others, Huey Lewis (for whom Cray is currently opening), Eric Clapton (for whom Cray is about to open), Tina Turner (whom Cray is going to open for in England this summer), and Keith Richards (who showed up to jam with the Cray Band at the Bottom Line a couple of months ago, and who involved Cray in the Chuck Berry birthday extravaganza). It's a long step from the blues clubs of Oregon to smack dab in the middle of a basketball stadium.

"Well, the kind of music that we play is better suited for smaller venues than we're playing right now," says Cray, during a break in the Huey Lewis tour. "But we're getting over pretty well, we're getting a good response from the audience and we're getting a lot of younger people to pay attention to what we do now. I think that's being helped out now by the fact that there are a lot of other bands playing more rhythm and blues and more roots music."

The future looks so bright that the Cray Band must be stocking up on Ray-Bans. About the future, Cray points to several things beyond the obvious getting-ready-tostop-being-an-opening-act-and-doing-a-bonafide-Robert Cray Band-tour. He says that some movie scripts have been rolling inlooking for soundtracks, not actors-and he's thinking about that. He mentions a few people-the James Harmon Band, Curtis Salgado, Little Johnny and the Nightcatswhose careers he wouldn't mind giving some sort of boost to, and he's thinking about how he can do that. But, he says, his main concern at the moment is "trying to write some real decent songs for the next record. I still don't think I've gotten very good as a songwriter yet, so that's one of my big ambitions, to get better at that. And the band is becoming more involved in songwriting now, too, and what we hope to have happen is to really come out with a Cray Band sound, so we're really working on that now."

And does Robert Cray – after 10 years on the road – feel any special pressure now that he's a pop star?

"Well, the thing is to just go out and work hard every night, and that's pretty much the only pressures that are on me. But that's something we've been doing for quite a while now, so it just worked itself right on in."



"It's selling extremely well," says Evan tsky, president of Danjay Music & Video, 185-store franchise based in the Western of the country. "The reorders have en terrific. I can honestly say, with the ception of the Beatles CD's which is a ecial kind of case, for a normal type of lease, this has had more interest than anying this year so far. We had more people king and expressing interest ahead of ne than any other release this year."

"The Joshua Tree," debuts this week on e Cash Box top 100 albums at #16 and e first single, "With Or Without You," nich debuted last week at #42 on the *ish Box* top 100 singles, jumps to #32 is week. The Cash Box Radio Report cites whopping 82 percent add rate for their porting stations this week.

Amazingly enough, U2 have never had a p 10 hit although most retailers agreed at their catalog sells quite steadily. Retails also agree that "The Joshua Tree" will obably afford the band several hit singles. expect this to be three or four singles up and have a long catalog shelf life just the the rest of their catalog," says Rick aring, buyer for Danjay. "I expect we'll be ling this record for a long time." Giering ys that while couple of tracks on their last lease, "The Unforgettable Fire" may have en "too abstract" for a huge audience, e compositions on the new LP are more traight ahead."

Response to "The Joshua Tree" has en more dramatic than any of U2's previsly releases. "Out of the box, it's a whole ferent ballgame," says Mitch Perliss, ditor of purchasing for Show Industries rich owns the 43-store free-standing chain usic Plus. "There was in no way, shape, or m the excitement about the last one that ere was about this one. This is their shot the limelight. Their time has come."

Many predict the album should dominate les even as far ahead as this summer. "With some artists, their new releases come out and they flash hot for two weeks and then they cool off," says Record Bar's Hunter, "whereas with the U2, I anticipate seeing it going to number one and down to two and back up depending on what else comes out. I expect it to be in our top five at least until June. We haven't even done any advertising on the item yet and we've gotten this kind of response. When the advertising kicks in, there's no telling what it'll do."

Most retailers said they began receiving phone calls and in-store questions as to the album's release after radio began playing "With Or Without You," and after MTV aired the video. "That's why I'm assuming that a lot of consumers who aren't necessarily U2 fans, but just record consumers who just became aware of the band through the new single and video, are buying the album," says Hunter. "U2 were still considered a cult band even though they had fairly impressive sales for their last couple of records. I would be comfortable in saying that this record demonstrates that they are far beyond the cult status now and have to be considered a super group...at least right now they are."

Although the core audience for the album, in demographic terms, centers mostly between the ages of 16 to 24, depending on the retailer, the range has extended from 14 to 40. "A lot of that core is right in that high school-junior high age," says Peter Johns of Harmony House Records based in Detroit. "They're almost getting like Duran Duran was."

With the growing number of compactdisc only stores as well as CD consumer, retailers applauded Island for the simultaneous release of the LP and CD. Mike Dovsky, manager of a National Compact Disc franchise based in Southern California says the new disc has sold well. "Every time we play it in the store, we sell some," he says. While the CD-only store tends to cater to an older audience, that hasn't made a difference in the scope of age range according to Dovsky.



Statistics tell us that female vocalists don't sell as many LPs as male artists, because "women don't buy records by lother women." Well, fighting statistics may be like fighting City Hall, but if "Girls Ride Horses Too," "I Want A Love Like That," "What's A Broken ieart" and "Love Is A Winding Road" don't set female ears on fire, I'll eat my petticoat. In one way, Annie's time machine goes further back than any of the boys this week, but in another, it only goes as far back as the Bonnie Raitt sounds of the '70s. Unique acoustic instrumentation is an integral part of the country/blues/folk sound here.

NASHVILLE CHATTER

NEWS BITS: The dying gasp of Monument Records sent shock waves through Music Row back in 1983 when the 23-year-old, independent record label went bankrupt, owing \$7.3 million to 659 creditors. Now, with the sale of its master tapes to CBS Special Products (a division of CBS Records in New York), the spirit of the giant will finally be laid to rest. The record company's building was the first to go-MTM purchased it in 1985. Next, the Entertainment Music Company bought the Combine Music publishing firm, Monument's principle asset, for \$7.5 million. The last vestiges of the company, its master tapes (which CBS hopes to acquire for \$810,000) include songs by Kris Kristofferson, Dolly Parton, Roy Orbison, Jeannie Seely, Tony Joe White and others.

Dolly Parton, Chet Atkins and Gary Morris are all heading to TV land, although the neighborhoods will differ. Morris, no stranger to network television series as a guest star, will be the focus of a 60-minute special on TNN April 18 called Gary Morris: A Portrait. Chet's visit will be to the set of Cinemax cable network's Sessions series. The eclectic group of musicians and singers who will perform with the guitarist not only epitomizes his versatility as a musician, it also shows the level of respect Atkins' commands within the musical community. A partial list includes Willie Nelson, Waylon Jennings, Mark Knopfler, Emmylou Harris, the Everly Brothers, Michael McDonald, David Hungate and Steve Lukather.

Dolly's visit to television will be of longer duration than that of the two men. She will be hosting a new musical variety show on ABC-TV beginning this fall. This will be the network's first variety series since 1980.

The winners in the instrumentalist categories of the Academy of Country Music Awards have been announced by Bill Boyd, executive director of the ACM. They are: Bass-Emory Gordy, Jr.; Drums-Larrie Londin; Fiddle-Mark O'Conner; Guitar-Chet Atkins; Keyboard-John Hobbs; Speciality Instrument-James Burton (dobro); Steel Guitar-J.D. Maness; Non-Touring Band-Nashville Now (Jerry Whitehurst); and Touring Band-Ricky Skaggs Band.

Charlie Daniels Celebrity Golf Classic to benefit the Starkey Developmental Center will be held in Wichita, KS.

We release 'Beautiful Body' in the spring when women all over the country are starting to see results from their shape-up-for-summer programs."

Men, you can listen in, but only if you want to hear the things a woman who's been hurt *wants* to say, but often can't. Beth gives them a catharsis with her writing style (she wrote all but one cut). The one, however, that stands out as being different is the between-the-lines message cut, "Mama's Song."

CLAY BLAKER and the TEXAS HONKY-TONK BAND—Sooner Or Later—Texas Musik TM-383— Producers: C.Blaker, S.Morgan

Clay's band has a clean sound, and he gives a good performance on some of these cuts, such as Haggard's "Here In Frisco," his single release "South Of The Border," Cash's "Big River" and the honky-tonker "Green Snakes On The Ceiling." Others could use work in the area of vocal tone, and the two selfpenned cuts need some reworking lyrically.





However, we can pass long a few preliminary observations and, nost importantly, the attendance figures. otal registered attendance was 3577 thich reflects an increase over '86 (last ear's figure was 3380) and the operator ount this year was 1219. Operator attenance proved to exceed most of the estinates made on the convention floor during te course of the 3-day show. Two of the nost popular pieces at ACME were Atari's Road Blasters" video and Williams "F-14 'omcat'' pinball machine. As Williams sales hief Marty Glazman enthused, "For Wilams, this was a most spectacular convenon!" The trade was anxious to see the first ntry from the recently organized Data East inball. Inc. and it was revealed at ACME 37. The new pin is called "Laser War" and ve heard good comments about it. There's lot more to report on the show, so keep uned to next week's issue.

Joe Dillon departed his post as vice "esident and assistant general manager at Villiams on March 16. However, he told us is intends to remain in the coin-op indusry – as someone with his outstanding cretentials should. Good luck to you, Joe.

Hi grandpa! Cash Box felicitations to Chiago operator Kem Thom of Western Automatic Music who just became a grandather for the first time! Christopher is the name of his new grandson. Proud parents are Jim and Jackie Thom - and to them we also extend heartfelt felicitations! . . . On be subject of business, Kem told us 1986 vas a good year in terms of collections and ie feels that 1987 will be even better for the operator. He did have a couple of suggesions, though, to convey to manufactur-Ors—one being that they keep the cost of quipment in line with what the operators an afford to pay. He also thinks it would be good idea if the factories would put bill cceptors on games as standard equipment help generate a better pricing structure or the operator. As Kem pointed out to us. here are a lot of ops who are reluctant to crease pricing on games and need an extra tle nudge to help them out. With regard to nusic equipment Kem is high on Rowe's combo unit which offers both 45's and compact discs programming — for more flexibility at the location level. "I think Rowe's idea is excellent," he said. "It gives us the best of both worlds actually. Depending upon the patron's musical taste, you can program 45's from the 50's or 60's, if that's what they want to hear, along with the current material that is available on compact discs."

As reported by AMOA, over \$1 million dollars in rebate checks (at the rate of \$10 per jukebox) were issued to licensed jukebox operators in January of this year by the ASCAP-BMI-SESAC rebate fund. This was done in accordance with the agreement reached between AMOA and the licensing societies in May of 1985. Ops who are entitled to a refund but have not as yet received it may contact **L. Welcome aboard to **Larry Thrasher**, who recently joined the Williams team as general manager.

Compact disc jukebox update. Chicago op Ed Velasquez of Velasquez Automatic Music, put his first Seeburg Laser Music System c.d. jukebox out on location in August '86 and it's been maintaining consistent earnings of \$150-\$200 per week. He has since added about 5 or 6 more models to the route and is realizing increased earnings in just about every case. He recently replaced an \$80-90 per week earning juke with a Seeburg c.d. machine, programmed with 100% Latin music and upped collections to \$260 in the first week. Ed's route is predominantly Spanish, so Latin music is a dominant factor in programming; however, he's also enjoying success with models that have 20% Latin and 40% English c.d. programming. Ed's employing the 3 plays for a dollar pricing and it's working out very well for him. As the frosting on the cake the c.d. machine brought in three new locations for him! Needless to say, Ed Velasquez is confident that the compact disc jukebox is the way to go!

Bally's Coin-Op Division Reorganizes Engineering Groups

HICAGO – Maury Ferchen, president of he Bally Coin-Op Division, announced that he company is reorganizing to substantially acrease the size and output of the research nd development groups within the organietion. The move is expected to increase oth the quantity as well as the quality of moducts being introduced by its Bally Midvay and Bally Sente subsidiaries.

Pinball engineering responsibility will renain in Chicago. It is expected that the size of this staff will increase in order to develop greater number of pinballs and maximize throwation and quality of the product line. This move will give us greater flexibility to nsure introduction of top quality products," Ferchen explained. The new pinball development group will be headed by Jim Patla. In addition to pinball development conducted inside the organization, Ferchen stated that affiliations with independent designers will also be considered.

This group will be responsible for video game development for both Midway dedicated games as well as Sente System games.

As part of this move, Ferchen says the company will dramatically increase the size of the California staff in order to increase the number and quality of games being developed. The Dollars And Sense Of Business Promotions— Part III

By Roger Sharpe

(Editors Note: This is the third in a continuing series that will be appearing in Cash Box on a regular basis, the purpose of which is to provide operators with guidelines and suggestions for improving their business.)

One of the most difficult facts to recognize in the the coin-machine business is that often it is not enough to put in new equipment and move out old in an effort to keep a certain level of earnings. As with other fields, you really have to begin by treating your business as a *business* and borrow proven techniques and programs which have been successful time and time again. After all, your day-to-day affairs are established to vend entertainment — no more, no less. When you can additionally offer value and incentives you're on the road to appealing to a far greater audience than you might, initially, think.

In the previous two installments of this series we discussed a number of options that are available for little, if any, capital investment on your part. Also, the concern was to minimize the amount of work you would have to set aside in order to begin a given program.

When looking at the average, or at least typical location, it is obvious that a great percentage of machinery might be classified as 'ancient.' They have no real value in the trade-in market, and fill a void on the floor. In addition, you probably have some faithful followers who come in specifically to play these games and you know approximately what the earnings are going to be from week to week. This might be considered your 'hardcore' staple attractions that will remain until they fall apart or you close down. They're the Pac-Mans, Defenders, Donkey Kongs, and others that have become classics in the world of coin-operated amusement game entertainment.

These machines are the backbone of

your business and the only decision is probably one of pure numbers and physical space. Can you get by with less than five different Pac-Man games and only one Centipede? And once you have come to a determination and factor in those machines that you use for strict conversions; you probably still have a few odds and ends that are viable for your location and for some reason, sentimental or otherwise, you still have them in operation.

It is here that you can begin being much more aggressive with your pricing policies as a way to offer some 'specials' on the floor. You might want to offer two plays of a single coin, or run some promotions based around these old favorites. In fact, this type of program are also fair game for this. Run special giveaways based on these machines, whereby players can compete over a predetermined period of time – such as a week – with the top player winning a t-shirt or some other prize that isn't going to cost you too much.

It bears repeating, but the premiums given away at the trade shows by all the manufacturers are an incredible resource that you should not ignore. For people in the industry, as well as those on the outside, many of those baseball caps, shirts, posters, etc. have real value. So take advantage of the direct link you have through your local distributor or even the manufacturer and stock up on items that can be used in connection with any number of special promotional activities where you want to offer 'prizes' back.

The company itself is going to benefit by having more exposure for their name or the name of a specific game and your location is going to get some increased attention by the local players who are going to want these momentos for their own. Admittedly, a tournament structure of some shape and *(continued on page 34)*

form lends itself to this kind of payback for entrants and qualifiers, but all too often, tournaments are limiting to the number of people you can actually reach and influence.

However, tied into some different pricing on equipment—which should be boldly posted so people can see that it exists—you might want to try monitoring those older games—pinball and video—to see what the response is for the prizes you have made available. If the turnout is solid, then the next logical extension should be a tournament.

The mere mention of tournaments tends to intimidate or turn off many operators, which is why the suggestion this time around is to try a program that is very similar in scope out first; with the older games to generate some excitement and attention. The risk and downside is negligible and, in the case of pinball, you might be getting more favorable feedback if you move from three ball play to five ball play on some older machines, or even two plays for a coin depending upon how you have established your basic policy.

But the pricing issue is only one small part of this option. You have to team up a way to *incent* the players. As we mentioned earlier you can appeal to the public on the basis of value or some other intangible incentive that might best be described as recognition as the 'best player' on a given game, or the winner of some token prize that they value because of what it represents.

Start at this fundamental point and next installment we will discuss the movement up to staging your own tournaments on all types of equipment; from pinball to video, shuffle alleys and even skee-balls.


