NEW YORK — Capitol Records has signed a production and distribution deal with Cinema Records, a newly-formed company specializing in what it calls 'new progressive' music. Under the agreement, Capitol will distribute Cinema product, which will focus on a harder-edged brand of 'new wave' music that takes its cue from such '70's 'progressive rock' acts as Pink Floyd and Yes.

"There are millions of people who grew up on Genesis, Yes and the late-sixties and early-seventies art-rock movement and are now looking for the

next level of 'progressive' music," says Denny Somach, president of Cinema. "They want to be blown away the same way they were blown away when 'Dark Side Of The Moon' came out."

Capitol president Don Zimmerman echoes this assessment. "Cinema carries Pink Floyd and (progressive rock) one step further," says Zimmerman. EMI America and Manhattan Merge

LOS ANGELES—The long-rumored dissolution of EMI America finally took place last week. Joe Smith, vice chairman of Capitol Industries-EMI, Inc., announced on Thursday (June 18), that EMI America Records would merge with Manhattan Records.

The new label, now called EMI America/Manhattan Records, will be based in New York. Sal Licata, currently president of RCA-A&M-Arista Distribution, has been named chief executive officer and will report directly to Joe Smith. Bruce Lundvall, who headed Manhattan, will now become president of the new label, reporting to Licata.

Licata told *Cash Box* that he expects to begin his new position sometime toward the middle of July.

Jim Mazza, formerly president of EMI America, resigned his post and does not figure in the realignment. He is said to be pursuing "other interests"

according to a statement.

Lundvall was out of the office and could not be contacted. According to a company statement, his duties will be supervising the A&R and creative aspects of the new merged label, including the Blue Note jazz division.

Sue Satriano, director, public relations/communications for EMI Music, North America & Japan, told *Cash Box* that the futures of other EMI America executives and employees was still undetermined. "What has happened is that some people are being asked to move to New York," she said, "some people will be needed here in L.A. in the newly combined label. And some will, hopefully, be assimilated into Capitol."

The fate of EMI America's Sunset Blvd. headquarters is also not known. In addition to label offices, the building also houses a recording studio and (continued on page 18)

Plan Begins In '88

Mechanical Rate Tied To Consumer Price Index

WASHINGTON - A system for pegging mechanical royalty fees for the next decade to the Consumer Price Index becomes official July 15th and will apply to records made on or around January 1, 1988.

The system, accepted by The Copyright Royalty Tribunal and published in the June 15th Federal Register, is a result of negotiations that began more than six months ago among the Recording Industry Association of America, The National Music Publishers Association, and The Songwriters Guild of America. The plan gained the support of SESAC and Music Royalties, Inc.

In essence, the measure calls on the C.R.T. to figure the percentage change

in the Consumer Price Index every two years and to adjust the mechanical royalty rate accordingly. It also specifies that the adjusted rate shall be no greater than 25 per cent of the then-current fee, and no lower than the existing fee. It also calls for the adjusted rate to be rounded to the nearest 1/20th of a cent.

The first change is to be based on the percentage difference between the Consumer Price Index published for December, 1985, and that published for September, 1987.

Thereafter, the C.R.T. is required to use the Index published for September, 1987, and bi-annually to 1995 to determine the percentage change, and to announce (continued on page 18)

Atlantic To Begin Issuing Classic Jazz CDs

NEW YORK—This week, Atlantic Records will release the first titles in an extensive reissue program of compact discs culled from its enormous and influential jazz catalogue. 23 titles are due in June and July, with a projected 100 titles due by year's end. Nesuhi Ertegün, who produced many of the original sessions, is supervising the transfer to digital, with Ilhan Mimaroglu and Bob Porter active in the program.

"We're very excited at the prospect of having these great recordings now available in the brilliant sound quality offered by the compact disc," said Dave Glew, Atlantic's executive vice president/general manager. The discs will include the original artwork and liner notes and, where possible, additional tracks.

The first titles available will be: Ornette Coleman's "The Shape of Jazz" (continued on page 18)

UK BUZZ

Robert Smith thinks The Cure are the laziest, scruffiest pop group in the world. He thinks their new double albums, "Kiss Me, Kiss Me," is the best thing they have ever done. It is different because it has a lot of sitars on it, because he has been listening to Ravi Shankar.

It is different because The Cure have become more democratic. In the past, right up till "Head on the Door," Smith wrote everything—music and lyrics—on his own, and the band interpreted them like an orchestra.

With this album he insisted that all the other Cure members provide a cassette of music, and they all gave each other scores out of 20 to decide which tracks should be used.

The result is rich and exotic and accessible. The sado-masochism has been toned down to just the right blend of vulnerability and toughness. Smith is as excessive as ever, but claims it is in different ways.

"Nowadays, I'm much more in control. I feel more balanced in that I don't feel the desire to take drugs. Depending on your personality, you either take drugs to escape or to enhance. You can't say that drugs start a breakdown, one thing does not cause the other, but they tend to go hand in hand."

Smith is currently off to Ireland with a pile of *Watchman* comics and a volume of *Grimm's Fairy Tales* to catch up on essential reading. "One song on the album, 'How Beautiful You Are,' was inspired by a Baudelaire short story. It's about how you think you're really close to somebody, and you think you enjoy and see things in the same way, and suddenly something will happen which makes you realize this person thinks in a completely different way about things. It just proves no one knows anyone else or loves anyone else in the purest sense of the word."

Smith himself has had one love for the last 15 years. He met girlfriend Mary on his first day of high school. He fell in love with her because she reminded him of Betty Boop...

The long-awaited single from The Pet Shop Boys, "It's a Sin," is released this week. Derek Jarman, director of *Sebastiane*, *Jubilee* and *Caravaggio*, makes his video-directing debut. Although he did venture into doing a promo for The Smiths, they were very uptight with anyone who dared call it a promo. They preferred to call it an artistic interpretation of their songs and refused to be in it.

Neil Tennant and Chris Lowe, however, couldn't wait to perform acts of bondage in front of Jarman's camera. The song is a purging of Catholic guilt. Gothic angels swoon to a disco beat. Neil Tennant, of course, disagrees with The Smiths.

"I think promo video can be an art form. All the art elements are in our video. We chose Derek Jarman because we wanted the video to look medieval and beautiful. We thought he would be the ideal person to work with because of his expertise in working with costume and mood in *Caravaggio*." It is a brilliant tract, and whatever the video, it would be played to death...

Kate Garner, formerly of Hayzi Fantaysee, decided to make an impressive comeback with her new band, Deep Space. Jeffrey Hinton directed an extraordinary compilation video. It is a medley of eight songs in three minutes, but the low budget high psychedalia threatens to explode your television set and tamper irretrievably with your VCR tuning. The reason being, it breaks all the rules of luminance and chrominance, the colors are brighter than TV sets are built to take, and if it is possible to O.D. on color and brightness, then this is it.

Deep Space, which includes former Blancmange keyboard player Stephen Luscombe, is the first pop group to be marketed with a perfume of the same name, especially formulated to reflect their personalities. They have been described as "Abba on acid" and have been sending their tapes to the illustrious Bjorn and Benny in the hope they may be interested in doing some production work for them.

George Michael's banned-by-the-BBC and probably everybody else track, "I Want Your Sex," has still managed to fly into the charts at the number four position. His video is being re-edited and re-edited in the hope that someone somewhere will show it...

Finally, a cover version worth listening to. Trevor Horn has produced the Mint Juleps' cover of the Robert Palmer songs, "Every Kind of People." Any version is horribly infectious, but the 12-inch, with excerpts from Martin Luther King's speeches, comes highly recommended.

Petrillo, President of the American Federation of Musicians, to ban recordings as of December 31, was met by recording officials and executives throughout the nation with mixed feelings this past week. Several independent record executives queried were of the opinion that the edict would never come to pass; and also pointed out that should the ban be effected, it would almost immediately put the greater majority of independent record manufacturers in the country out of business. When questioned as to their beliefs regarding Petrillo's threat to put the union into the record business, figures in the industry scoffed at the idea and illustrated that such an enterprise would be a violation of federal anti-trust laws. It is well known that Petrillo's threatened ban on recordings came along with present labor legislation in Congress which would harm working agreements the union now has...**Columbia Records, Inc.** announced to the trade this past week the forthcoming release of many old jazz recordings, in line with their program to make the old jazz waxings available to the public once again. Included in the expected releases, are masters previously cut by several labels which were absorbed by the plattery through the course of years. 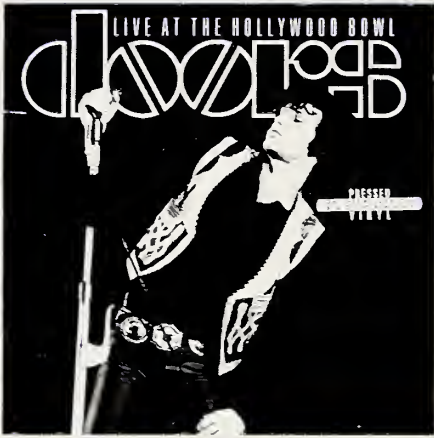

"As it gets tougher to break new acts, the demand increases for classic punk and new wave releases," Chameleon managing director (and owner of Posh Boy Records) Robbie Fields told *Points West*. He also said that the company is exploiting the Vee Jay catalog from the 50's and 60's. "Our philosophy is to keep classic titles in print," says Fields, "at the same time breaking new artists." One of those new acts is Private Domain, whose "Absolute Perfection" has become high rotation fodder at L.A. radio's notorious indie breaker, KROQ. Chameleon also recently signed Boston act The Buddy System, recent winners of MTV's *Basement Tapes* video competition with the clip to their 12" "Go Back to Hollywood." It may be difficult to break new acts on vinyl, but moving them on CD is even tougher, says Fields. Here again, catalogs come to the rescue. While CDs of new product that ships as much as 50,000 units on vinyl don't seem to do much, catalog CD releases move about as well as catalog records and tapes. "It's an interesting phenomenon," says Fields.

(at the door) will "probably" be around \$7, according to SST.

Billy Zoom on lead guitar. That's right, Billy Zoom. Formerly of X. Zoom replaces Michael "Hollywood Fats" Mann, who died last December of a heart attack. The Blasters will tour Europe this summer (with Alan Lee on sax), and go into the studio upon their return this fall.

Immaculate Fools are an English quartet who have just recently released their first stateside LP, "Dumb Poet" (A&M Records), which features the lead single "Tragic Comedy." Notice a trend here? "I like sticking odd things together, because I'm very much into the written word," explains Kevin Weatherill, lead singer/guitarist and principal songwriter for the band. "One of the ways I write songs is, I go through a dictionary and pick out words that I like the look and sound

acoustic covers with a few of Weatherill's originals thrown in. When they decided to expand into a full-fledged group, they recruited their own brothers, Paul Weatherill and Peter Ross, to play bass and drums, respectively. The line-up has remained intact since, and once a demo tape of the quartet's distinctive sound reached London ears, a record deal was soon in the making. Suddenly "there were all these little bits of paper being waved at us," Weatherill laughs, and a deal was struck with

of, write them on bits of paper, and shuffle them about. Sometimes when you do that, you're looking at a completely new situation, where you've got these two words that shouldn't really go together."

It is this spirit of paradoxical inquisitiveness that fuels the creative fires of this engaging new band. In fact, the band's name came about as a result of just this sort of juxtaposition of contradictory elements. "(This process) sometimes sparks some ideas, and that's where I got the idea for the song 'Immaculate Fools' (which appeared on their first LP). Immaculate fools could be mankind in general; the fact that we've got these perfect bodies and minds, which is a pure thought, and we mess it up with our lust for power, greed, etc....The song came first, and it was about that subject." That cut, which reached #51 on the British charts, remains their most popular song to date with English and European audiences alike.

The new LP, "Dumb Poet," is a bracingly honest and surprisingly varied collection of songs that has evoked comparisons in the British press to such acts as The Waterboys and World Party. Indeed, the sense of lyrical elegance and overall foresight elevates the material to a higher plane than most droning British mood-rock.

The band has a rather unusual lineup: two sets of brothers. Weatherill started the ball rolling while playing in a wine bar in Kent four years ago. He was joined by a friend, Andy Ross, on guitar, and they played

A&M Records.

This led to the Immaculate Fools' first LP, "Hearts Of Fortune," which, though well received by critics in Britain, fell short of the band's own lofty expectations. "The first record was done quite quickly and the producer wasn't quite right for us, but we were sort of new to the business and naive so we just went along with it. It didn't quite work out the way we would have liked it to," stated Weatherill. A&M brass evidently agreed, and decided not to release it in the U.S.. However, with

the quality and depth of their newest offering, the label was more than willing to push for wider acceptance.

Upon first listen, the most striking aspect of the band's unique sound is Weatherill's bluesy, heavily-accented vocal delivery, which he uses deliberately to enhance the honesty of the Fools' stance. "I could try to sing in an American accent, but it wouldn't be honest because I'm English," he maintains. "Eric Clapton was on British TV recently and he said that he couldn't take anyone seriously unless they sang in an American accent. I have to disagree with him. That doesn't mean that I don't like listening to Mick Jagger sing, but it's not me. I have to sing how I sing."

A similar sense of commitment pervades Weatherill's approach to his songwriting craft. The songs on "Dumb Poet" tackle issues of romantic disillusionment and social com-

WIRE recently played its first N.Y. show in 10 years, supporting its first full-length album, "The Ideal Copy" (Enigma), in eight. When last seen in N.Y., in 1977, Wire was fast becoming one of the most influential British bands to emerge from punk's second wave; later, with the addition of synthesizers, the band virtually invented post-punk. 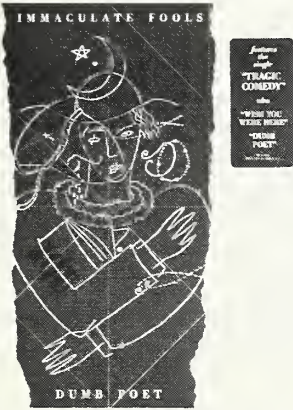

ness," and expand from that context into an eclectic mixture of tempos and textures that refuses to be cubbyholed into any convenient genre. "One of the nice things about the album is that we have license to try slightly different variations in style on all the different tracks," says Peter Ross, the Fools' drummer. "But fundamentally going through all the songs is a good song with a lyric that has content and which isn't something to be thrown away. It's something which you can take at face value, or you can investigate deeper and it can mean a lot more than that." As Weatherill adds, "We like to treat each song as its own entity and give it the best treatment we can regardless of what else is going on."

Immaculate Fools hope to be playing club dates in America by summer's end, and are looking forward to the challenge of taking their intimate live show to a much bigger audience. "We don't have a big, pizzazz-y light show - we try to make it a very intimate, interesting kind of show. We want a kind of party atmosphere, an involvement with the audience. I don't mean a 'come on, everybody, clap your hands' kind of thing, but we just try to bridge the gap." This crowd-friendly attitude bodes well for success in the American alternative market, and the Immaculate Fools are one imported band to keep an ear out for on this side of the Atlantic.

"The Ideal Copy," however, aims to shed the band's past somewhat — as do its concerts, which include none of Wire's early work. Of those early days, bassist **Graham Lewis** says: "We weren't part of that particular punk scene because it was a very short-lived thing, as far as we were concerned. It was like a few weeks in 1976, and after that it was every man for himself." Guitarist and vocalist **Colin Newman** puts it this way: "Basically what the Ramones did was take all the melodic structure out of the three chord bash. In hindsight, what we did was take that one stage further and just rubbish that whole rock 'n' roll history. It's not in awe of what came in the past; it's saying (makes a gesture)."

JON ASTLEY, who has produced records by the Who and Eric Clapton, now has an album he can call his own — "Everyone Loves The Pilot (Except The Crew)" (Atlantic). Astley got his record deal the old-fashioned way: it fell into his lap. "I was delivering some production for a Marilyn Martin record to (Atlantic president) **Doug Morris** and **Doug** said, 'I want to see you in my office tomorrow morning.' Very stern," says Astley. Ross, who founded the production company with **Cengiz Yaltkaya**, says that "what we're trying to do is find totally unestablished acts around the city and help them get record deals. I don't think bands really know how to approach record companies, and I'm not sure record companies really know how to find the bands. I'm trying to act as a go-between." Ross, who was **Quincy Jones's** studio assistant for two years, recently produced the debut album by **The Dig** for Atlantic. "(Mercy produces) r&b and rock 'n' roll more often," he says, "but we do the whole range of commercial music"....**The Replacements** play three shows at the Ritz July 23, 24, and 25. Hear they've been including "Battleship Chains" (the Ga. Satellites tune), assorted Repl'ments' oldies, and all the songs on "Pleased To Meet Me" except two.

Verve Records, displaying continued good taste, has signed

the wonderful vocalist/pianist Shirley Horn, long everybody's favorite but forever underrecognized. She recorded at L.A.'s Vine St. in May... minded Larry Willis is on both sides. The trumpeting is hot no matter how you slice it.

OUT OF THE BLUE LIVE AT MT. FUJI—Blue Note 85141—Producers: Michael Cuscuna, Hitoshi Namekata

The fresh-faced hard-bop brigade in a tight live date with plenty of blowing room. OTB, despite its prefab nature, plays like a band.

DANGEROUS GROUND—Ian Dogole—Cafe 737—Producer: Ian Dogole

A sizzling multi-ethnic (African to Indian to Brazilian to Javanese) multi-stylistic (from jazz to everything else) extravaganza from a talented percussionist and his cooking eight-piece band. A hard one to classify, but a good one nonetheless.

A nice, unpretentious date of standards by the classic instrumentation of guitar (Puma), piano (Hod O'Brien) and bass (Red Mitchell).

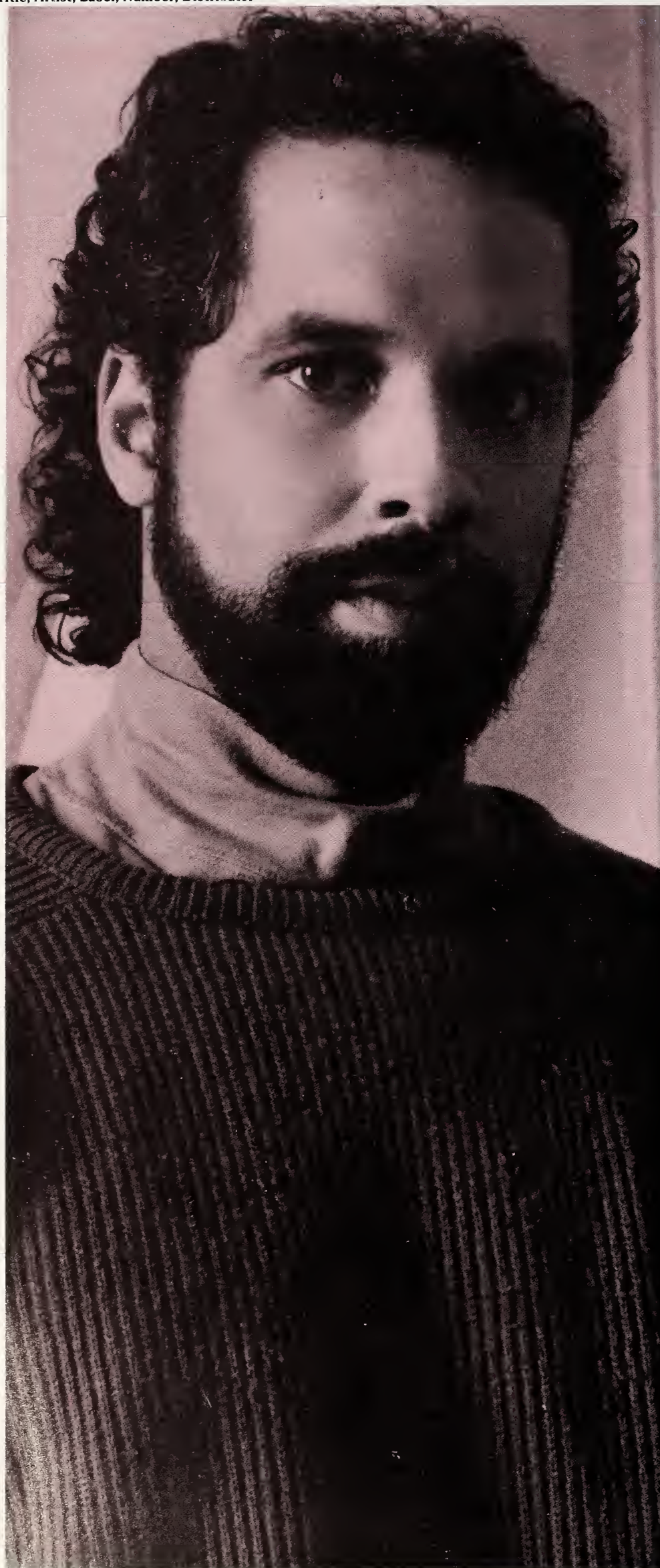

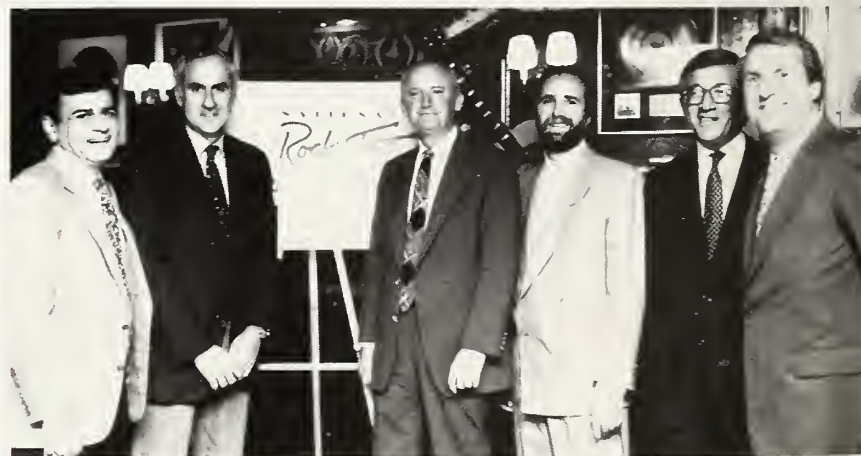

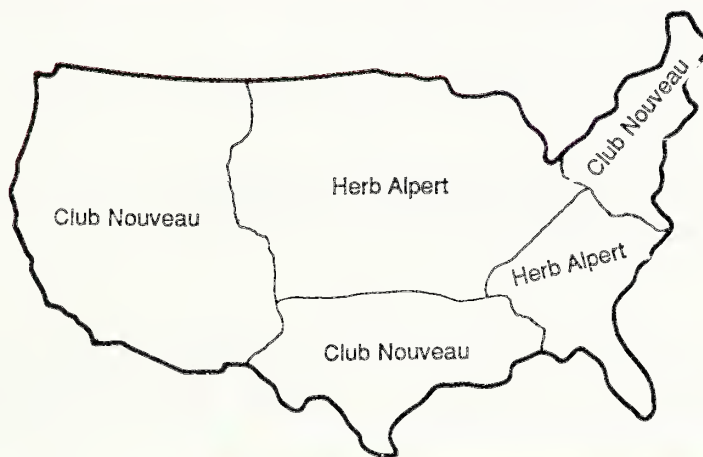

mastering lab. "I don't know if they've figured that out yet," Satriano said.

The artist rosters of both labels will be merged. Manhattan's roster includes recent successful artists like Robbie Nevil and the Partland Brothers. EMI America is enjoying the success of David Bowie and Peter Wolf. Also on the label are Kate Bush, Corey Hart and Kim Carnes.

"This is an extremely positive move," said Smith in a statement.

"Together, Licata and Lundvall form a strong team in both the creative and marketing fields.

Bhaskar Menon, chairman and chief executive officer of EMI Music Worldwide, commenting on the latest development said, "The merger of EMI America and Manhattan will considerably strengthen both labels and make it possible to support our artists with far greater focus."

nounce revisions in mechanical royalty fees beginning November 1, 1989, and every two years thereafter.

In the 1909 Copyright Law, the mechanical royalty rate was set at 2 cents a song. This was increased to 2.75 cents a song in the 1976 Copyright Law revision.

In 1980, the C.R.T. held weeks of hearings to determine whether the rate should be increased as sought by copyright owners and opposed by record manufacturers. In December that year, the Tribunal fixed the new fee at 4 cents a song (or 0.75 cents per minute of playing time for extended

compositions). The record industry appealed, but the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia upheld the C.R.T. ruling except for a plan that would have empowered the Tribunal to order yearly proceedings to take into account the effect of inflation. The court said this was beyond the Tribunal's authority.

However, the industry submitted a step increase plan to take into account inflation. This was subsequently approved by the C.R.T., which saw the rate move every two years to its present 5 cents a song (or 0.95 cents per minute for extended play).

cally without having to worry about airplay records and commercial hit singles and that sort of thing. Their creativity and musicianship run a bit further and wider in terms of scope than they ordinarily would."

Somach and artist manager Larry Mazer founded Cinema in May 1986 with the idea that it would satisfy demand for a '80's form of 'progressive rock.' Cinema went with Capitol partly because of Capitol's success in the early seventies with Harvest, a label that was home for Pink Floyd and other bands.

"It would have taken us a lot longer to launch it on our own instead of going with a major label," says Somach. "We chose Capitol because they had a label like this in the early seventies called Harvest, which was for progressive English music."

Zimmerman and Somach feel that the CD revolution will help spur the growth of Cinema, since many of the acts on the roster are ideally suited to that medium. "The technology will be of tremendous help to us," says Somach.

"Obviously Cinema's repertoire is perfect for CD," says Zimmerman. "The music is the most important

thing but the CD configuration enhances this type of music."

Cinema's initial roster includes such acts as Pcte Bardens, Michael Hoenig, Amin Bhatia, and Tony Kaye. Bardens, who used to play with the group Camel, says that "people are crying out for this sort of music, especially people who have CD players are looking for something which isn't...stuff they've heard before." Barden says he wants to tour behind his Cinema album, "Seen One Earth," which has just been released.

Disctronics Launches Australian CD Production

MELBOURNE - Disctronics, Australia's first compact disc plant, officially began production with its initial CD on May 21. The ceremony was presided over by Australian Record Industry Association (ARIA) Chairman and WEA Records Managing Director Paul Turner, who commented, "Australia now has its own CD plant which is important to both consumers and artists alike so that we can have simultaneous release on all formats."

The first disc, "Whispering Jack" by John Farnham, was a special gold CD, made with pure ore extracted from the Kalgoorlie goldfields.

Disctronics, located in the Melbourne suburb of Braeside, was set up through the initial investment of over 40 million dollars by the company and its owners, Pro-Image Studios Limited and Quatro Limited. The result is a state-of-the-art facility, with digital mastering being added to the process to guarantee complete production from master tape to finished disc in a few weeks.

Full production runs at the plant have been online since March, and acceptance rates on many of the early CD runs have been high, reflecting the plant's commitment to stringent quality

standards. The clean air standards throughout Disctronics are Class 100, and the Australian-designed air system will enhance the efficiency of the plant's operation.

Production capacity for the first year of operation is projected at 25 million units, and major export markets are already in place for European and American distribution with major and independent record labels. Offices have been established in Sydney, London, and Los Angeles to facilitate the export traffic.

Disctronics Managing Director Roger Richmond-Smith, commenting on the commencement of official production, added "though our plant is now in production, we haven't finished yet with the improvements. With the installation of Sony laser glass cutters and total mastering facilities, as well as the clean air standards we will maintain at Class 100 throughout the plant, Disctronics intends to remain a world leader in Compact Disc manufacturing. Our research and development that is in place will continue to advance the state of the art and give us a quality edge as well as the pricing advantage we have over our offshore competitors."

The World Gets The Rhythm of

Gloria Estefan

And Miami Sound Machine



LOS ANGELES—Gloria Estefan and Miami Sound Machine? That's right, the name has changed, and so has the plan of attack for this Latin rocket of a band that zoomed into the American record market nearly two years ago with their second all-English album, "Primitive Love," an album that has since sold multi-platinum and spawned a series of chart-topping hit singles. Under the new monicker, the band recently released a third Epic album, "Let It Loose."

Why the name change in the midst of such windfall success? The most apparent reason is that age old marketing key: The Identity Factor. Identity, in this case, is lead singer Gloria Estefan - certainly the prettiest of the Miami Sound Machine (MSM) bunch - whose silky vocals have spearheaded each MSM hit. The name change, those in the MSM camp feel, brings more intimacy and personality to the band.

With the decision to highlight Gloria (dubbed the "Miami Voice" by the media) as the band's focal point also came the decision for her husband of eight years, Emilio Estefan, MSM's founder and former percussionist, to leave off performing with the band to better concentrate on the many business and personal tasks on the Miami

home front (the Estefan's have a young son) during this period of constant travel for Gloria and the band. Though he plans to rejoin them for a date or two during their current world tour, Emilio now serves primarily as the band's producer, while also producing other projects, such as a forthcoming album for Clarence Clemons. (Clemons also plays sax on the title track to "Let It Loose").

"I think the business man in the group is Emilio," says Gloria Estefan. "By no means am I completely stupid about these things. I've been in the business 12 years and I do know the right things to do sometimes and some things that you have to avoid doing. But definitely the guy with the business sense is Emilio ... He had a band

in Cuba when he was like eight years old! He was a bandleader already."

The cover art on "Let It Loose" features glamour shots of Gloria Estefan that do suggest a new phase in the Miami-based recording act's popularity. The band's recent success being anything but sudden (contrary to popular belief), there have, in fact, been many such phases.

Starting in 1974 with The Miami Latin Boys, a high school band formed by Emilio, drummer Enrique "Kiki" Garcia and former MSM bassist Marcos Avila, the outfit has built from an hispanic garage act (Emilio, Gloria and Kiki are all natives of Cuba), to local club favorites, to a South American sensation headlining massive arenas. Slowly, and quite accidentally, the band's dance appeal caught on in the Anglo market. "Dr. Beat," already a top U.S. dance single recorded for Discos CBS International, made a splash in Holland, and soon topped the charts throughout Western Europe. The tune lead to MSM's domestic signing, and was included on the band's Epic Records debut (and its first all-English album), "The Eyes of Innocence."

It wasn't until their second Epic outing, last year's surprise smash album, "Primitive Love," that Miami Sound Machine, by now a major draw internationally, attracted the attention of American pop radio in a big way. With the odds riding heavily against it, "Conga," a funk-inflected, high energy Latin dance tune written by Kiki Garcia, swing into action on the *Cash Box* pop, dance and B/C charts. Two more top ten hits followed (the snappy "Bad Boy" and the romantic Gloria Estefan-penned ballad "Words Get In The Way"), along with the recent A/C favorite, "Falling In Love (Uh-Oh)". The album broke traditional music marketing barriers in this country, making MSM the first act to bridge the Latin and Anglo markets simultaneously.

Since the success of "Primitive Love," the band has had songs included on the soundtracks to two of the top grossing films of 1986, *Top Gun* and *Cobra*. They also picked up the Grand Prize trophy at last year's Tokyo Music Festival.

When it rains it pours. Because of

their enormous Anglo-Latin crossover appeal, Gloria and the band were recently named spokespeople for Pepsi, for whom they recently did a "Conga"-based commercial. At the band's bidding, the commercial was shot in Miami and used Miami residents as extras. (It was this kind of home town boosterism that lead the mayor of Miami to change the name of the street where they live to Miami Sound Machine Boulevard several years ago - before the success of "Conga").

"Let It Loose," produced by Emilio and the Jerks (Emilio Estefan, Lawrence Dermer, Joe Galdo and Rafeal Vigil) the long-awaited follow-up to "Primitive Love," has a more focused, finely-honed sound than its popular predecessor, and includes several tunes composed by Gloria. The album's first single, "Rhythm Is Gonna Get You" (co-written by Gloria and Kiki), is a highly infectious Afro-Cuban dance tune shot full of the Latin flavor that gave "Conga" its novel edge in the pop market. Since its release the last week in May, the song has already bulleted steadily up the *Cash Box* pop singles chart, pausing, this week, at 21 bullet.

"We tried to give them (the audience) what they liked from Miami Sound Machine and our style," Gloria says of the new album, "but we've tried to move ahead a little bit and do a couple of different kinds of things so people don't get bored. We've always tried to do that on each of our albums - change a little bit and grow. And anyway, as people we do that ... We're not the same people this year as we were last year. We've spent a year touring the whole world and getting a lot of experience ... and I think it all shows on the album. It definitely shows."

Recently completed was a video to "Rhythm Is Gonna Get You." Directed by Kenny Ortega (Madonna, Duran Duran, The Pointer Sisters), the video has all the Afro-Cuban influences of the song, and was based on actual documentary footage of Afro-Cuban religious ceremonies.

Ortega also staged the band's current outing. Sponsored by Pepsi, the tour is now sweeping the orient, and begins a 70-city U.S. leg July 3.

MTV NEWS—The initial line-up for the 1987 *MTV Video Music Awards* has been announced. From Republic Pictures Home Video next month comes *The Best of Bonanza*, volumes III & IV. *Bonanza* in case you've forgotten, stars Lorne Green, Dan Blocker, Michael Landon and Pernell Roberts. Suggested retail price is \$39.95, VHS and Beta.

THE RICH GET RICHER—The parent company for The Musicland Group, Primerica Corporation, recently issued their quarterly report for the first quarter of 1987. Let's look at some numbers: at the close of the quarter, net income for the chain was up to \$1.3 million, compared to a net loss of \$.5 million for last year's first quarter. Last year the chain added 68 new outlets, and plans to net 25-50 more in 1987. After going public in February, investors purchased approximately 18% of stock (@ \$20 a share), with Primerica retaining 82% ownership, and stock recently hit a high of \$26.50 per share.

Compact discs and video movies were cited as two categories significantly contributing to revenues for the quarter, with CD sales more than doubling the '86 level. "Movies For Sale" accounted for 6.4% of Musicland Group sales, and grew by more than 60%, with the \$26.95 release of "Top Gun" a major factor. The most recent additions to the Group are eight stores purchased from Marathon Music and Video, with five stores located in Oregon and three more in Anchorage, Alaska. The Alaska locations represent Musicland's first venture outside the contiguous U.S. of A..

FOR THE BENEFIT OF MR. KITE?—Owing to unexpected consumer demand, Capitol is planning to release the British configurations of the first eight Beatles' records on

LP and cassette July 21. The original eight, including the recently-released-on-CD "Sgt. Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band," have all sold strongly in the CD mode, with five of them in the Cash Box Top 40 CD Chart. Consumers without CD players have displayed interest in the British versions, and this prompted Capitol to reverse their original CD-only intentions. The first four will be released in the controversial mono mix mode, which is sure to spark more debate between recording purists and audiophiles, and "Sgt. Pepper's" will be digitally remastered for the LP and cassette shipping. (It will be stickered to reflect this remastering.) Seems the four lads from Liverpool keep on ringing cash registers...

THE STATE OF THE VIDEO UNION—The results of the 1986 Video Software Dealers Association surveys are in, and they hold some interesting information. Overall, 90% of VSDA members say business was up compared to two years ago. Upon further scrutiny, 95.4% report higher dollar volume in sales compared to last year, while only 89.5% say they had higher dollar volume in rentals. Is sell-through beginning to impact? It would appear so. Also, in total number of transactions, 96.2% reported more sale transactions, while only 88.2% claimed more rental transactions. All in all, a healthy report card. One more note—did the Meese Commission witch

hunt reach the Video industry? Must be some explanation, because stores carrying adult product dropped from 83% to 77%. Hmmmmmm...

DISC MILESTONE—Terre Haute-based Digital Audio Disc Corporation, a wholly-owned Sony subsidiary, recently commemorated the pressing of its 50 millionth disc. DADC is the first compact disc plant built in the U.S., and this landmark is but one more indication of the continued growth of our latest technological baby. By the way, the 50 millionth disc? Barbara Streisand's "One Voice." (Good trivia...)

TALENT ON STAGE

Hoodoo Gurus

VARIETY ARTS CENTER, L.A. - Australia's Hoodoo Gurus raised the roof of the venerable Arts Center June 5 with a spirited, if somewhat underdone, garage rock binge guaranteed to please their growing legions of young male fans.

The Gurus' guitar-based pop attack has started to attract a wider audience with the release of their latest LP "Blow Your Cool!" (Elektra), which contains their familiar blend of Aussie good humor and powerful hooks that drive the sing-along choruses to a manic pitch. The new material leads the band down a slightly more mainstream path than their earlier efforts and it went over fairly well with Friday's mostly white, college-age crowd. However, it appeared to be the older, better-known songs from the band's two previous records, "Stoneage Romcos" and "Mars Needs Guitars," that elicited the greatest reactions on this night.

Lead singer Dave Faulkner is easily the main focus of everything the Gurus do onstage. He possesses outback good looks and a rough but expressive voice with enough range to carry the best of the Gurus' songs to their inevitably

raucous conclusions. Between songs his good-natured banter of crocodiles and "that Dundee fella" lent a Down Under flair to the evening's festivities.

The Gurus' new, more commercially aware direction was evidenced early in the set with "Out That Door," arguably the best cut on the new LP. The band seemed comfortable with this type of material and the more melodic style suited them well. Shortly thereafter when the Gurus broke into "Good Times," the hooky first single from "Blow Your Cool!," the play-it-safe tone for the first half of the show was set.

Amidst an orgy of feedback and magenta saturation, the second half began much more energetically with "I Want You Baek," the blistering rave-up from the Gurus' first LP. The crowd's level of involvement appeared to pick up considerably with this number, with its wide-open spaces and curt guitar fills. Continuing in this vein was one of the highlights of the set, a searing rendition of "What's My Scene?," a new song that had the crowd dancing in the aisles. This tune, a veritable blueprint of vibrant, heady rock and roll, was one of the few recent cuts able to stand alone and measure up to the Gurus' standards.

Ironically, the last five songs the band played, including encores, were all from the first two albums. The energy level was sustained throughout, but never threatened to go over the edge of control. The crowd certainly seemed to enjoy themselves, especially during "Like Wow- Wipeout," and the sublime tour-de-force "Bittersweet," but many left complaining about the show's brevity (less than 70 minutes, including encores).

To this reviewer, it appears that Hoodoo Gurus have made a conscious effort, both musically and mentally, to break away from the Alternative Radio level of success and move up to mainstream AOR. Unfortunately, they have had to make some sacrifices along the way, and some of their unique humor and avant-garde credibility has been lost. In fact, during this show, Faulkner made repeated efforts to stifle the rowdy elements of the upfront crowd, many of whom undoubtedly are among the band's original supporters.

At one point he asked for "no slam dancing or passing people over head, because you don't know where you might end up - maybe in a hospital bed." It was precisely this spirit of reckless energy that was missing from the band's overall performance, however, as the show came off a little too perfunctory, predictable, and, well, safe for this writer's tastes.

Michelle Shocked

demonstrating outside a Republican convention, and how her "other guitar is a Gibson." Like her name, some of her songs have a time-release effect, and may not hit you immediately.

Opening here for Loudon Wainwright III (6/13), she played talking blues, story songs, and original tunes that often recalled Phranc, Billy Bragg, and Ferron. But her songs about Anchorage, Alaska, brush fires in east Texas, and New York graffiti were quite unlike anything I've heard before.

"Making Trouble For The V.F.D. (Volunteer Fire Department)" told how she and her friends would throw matches on dry grass, "close our eyes and count to ten," and then try to stamp out the fire. In another song she wonders "what was so great about the Great Depression." Shocked's songs are often humorous, even if she sometimes overdoes jokes and overworks puns.

What seemed to interest the audience most was her sense of Americana, her ambitious attempt to update Woody Guthrie in such songs as "Anchorage" and "Fogtown." It worked best with "Anchorage," the best-received song of the evening, which is markedly original if only because no one has really written a song about Alaska before, much less with the idea that it is truly part of the U.S.A. "Fogtown" used more conventional imagery in describing San Francisco, though it too hinted at a nascent vision taking shape in her music.

Other songs were less successful. The bluesy "Graffiti Limbo" could have benefited from a backing band, a couple story-songs sounded a bit like Arlo Guthrie-style hippie rambling, and a tune about "makin' strawberry jam" proved that she hasn't yet weeded all the novelty items and inconsequential stuff from her repertoire.

But Shocked is developing rapidly; her first album, "The Texas Campfire Tapes" (Cooking Vinyl), was recorded only a year ago and yet she's already moved miles from it musically. The album and this show ended with one of her best songs, "The Secret To A Long Life (Is Knowing When It's Time To Go)," which left us with the feeling that she's a folk cult-giant in the making, potentially as powerful as any of the singers I've compared her with in this review - except perhaps Woody Guthrie himself.

During Fan Fair week, highly successful independent label recording artist, **Rusty Budde**, dropped by the Nashville Cash Box offices. Rusty was in town to do some promotion work on his new single "I Always Will", which has been getting a lot of acclaim amid the music industry. In fact, Rusty has been on an extensive promotional tour. Put on your dancin' shoes and get ready for Dan Seals and "Three Time Loser"!

NASHVILLE NOTE-ABLES

THE PRIDE IS BACK! I stood at the back of the stage, during the 16th Avenue Records show, at Fan Fair '87 in Nashville. I watched thousands of faces staring at the performer on stage. Some of those faces had experienced long years. Some were in the prime of life. Others wore the glow of youth, and some were too young to know the man on stage. Something caught my immediate attention, as I looked at those faces...they were all *smiling* as the man sang his songs. They were all filled with happiness, because the man on the stage was giving them a great show!

He sang songs that made the folk with grey hair nudge one another and smile with approval. He sang songs that made the middle-aged group stand and applaud. His brand new song brought the youthful members to join in the cheering. And, those young children, who were there with their parents, were caught-up in the total excitement.

I looked to my right, where his wife stood watching his performance. I didn't have to look too closely to see that her eyes were filled with pride...Charley Pride! Earlier, she had commented about how happy Charley has been lately. It can't be easy to be the spouse of a performer. My own wife can testify to that. But, **Rozene Pride's** attitude made me know that she is a "good-hearted" woman, who talked about the good times they've had and all the good times to come. At the end of Charley's show, the standing ovation, and the calls for two encore numbers, let everyone know that there are plenty of good times ahead for Charley and Rozene.

Charley Pride's release of "Have I Got Some Blues For You" went to #1 on the Cash Box Top 100 chart recently. The song stayed #1, for weeks and weeks, on the Cash Box Independent charts. **Richard (Tony) D'Antonio**, director of Cash Box's Nashville operations, had the honor of presenting Charley with his #1 award plaque on the stage during his show. And, Charley's reaction showed his pleasure, when he accepted. The Mississippi-born country music star should be an inspiration to all entertainers. When he didn't have songs in the charts, he didn't complain or make bitter comments about "contemporary" country music. He didn't hurt his reputation by striking out, verbally, about those who were riding the crest of the new wave crashing on the beaches of country music. He showed patience (which he says came from his strong faith in his Maker and himself) and, most important, he kept honing his craft. Charley Pride is a wise man, and he is a veteran who know the music pendulum is constantly swinging back and forth. Charley is one man who is very much aware of the fact, knowledge without wisdom can be extremely dangerous.

There are some performers who built country music's reputation. They are looked upon as "founders" by their fans and their peers. If **Hank Williams**, **Lefty Frizzell**, **Jim Reeves**, and **Ernest Tubb** had been on that stage, they would have brought the same crowd reaction. However, that's not to say that it is a common reaction. Rather, it's to prove that Charley Pride is a living legend.

Charley Pride has been blessed. He was very young, when he became a superstar. Now, in the prime of life, he has recaptured the coveted position. He is an exceptional man, with a talent to match. Traditional country music is on parade again. Marching, proudly, up-front along with the youthful **Randy Travis**, **George Strait**, **Dwight Yoakam**, **Ricky Skaggs**, and **John Schneider** is the familiar face of Charley Pride

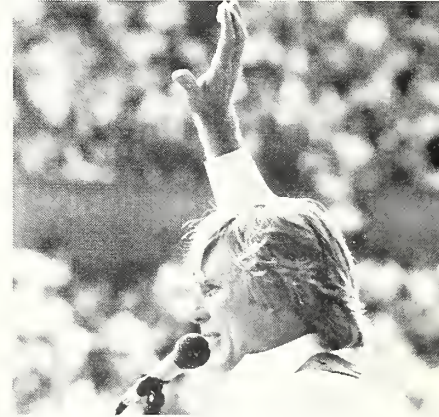

Over 101,000 Attend Summer CES In Chicago

CHICAGO—The International Summer Consumer Electronics Show (CES), which concluded its four-day run on June 2, attracted 101,576 trade attendees who flocked to Chicago to review the newest products and make buying decisions for the second half of 1987.

High resolution-VCRs, compact disc video (CDV) systems and digital audio tape (DAT) recorders were among the thousands of new product introductions at this 21st annual Summer Show and 36th CES since its inception in 1967. More than 1,400 companies occupied 742,000 net square feet of exhibit space at the expanded McCormick complex as well as the McCormick Center and Americana Congress Hotels.

The consumer electronics industry will generate more than \$30 billion in factory sales this year, a senior industry executive told the show's keynote session. Frank Myers, president of Arvin Electronics and an EIA industry vice president, cautioned, however, that this is a "time of tough conditions and even tougher decisions, of finding new ways and means of maintaining volume and, even more important, profitability." According to EIA forecasts, industry-wide factory sales will expand 4.5 percent this year and 5.7 percent in 1988.

Like its Winter counterpart in Las Vegas, the Summer consumer Electronics Show is sponsored and produced by EIA's (Electronic Industries Association) Consumer Electronics Group, whose members in-

clude the major manufacturers of audio, video, home information and telephone products for the consumer.

Thomas P. Friel, EIA group vice president for Consumer Electronics, described the just-concluded CES as "a decidedly upbeat show featuring a number of exciting new products. The fact that virtually every major manufacturer and marketer either exhibited or had a corporate presence in Chicago proves once again how essential CES is, even during a time of some economic uncertainty."

Corcoran expressed satisfaction with McCormick North, which he described as "a first-class expansion facility that will help Chicago maintain its leadership in the trade show industry."

CES enjoys the stature of an industry convention with its nearly 40 hours of conferences and workshops, special exhibits and services, publication and trade association exhibits, hundreds of company sales meetings, and national press coverage by a media contingent of 1,900 reporters.

Plans have already begun for the 1988 Winter Consumer Electronics Show, to be held Thursday, January 7 through Sunday, January 10 in Las Vegas.

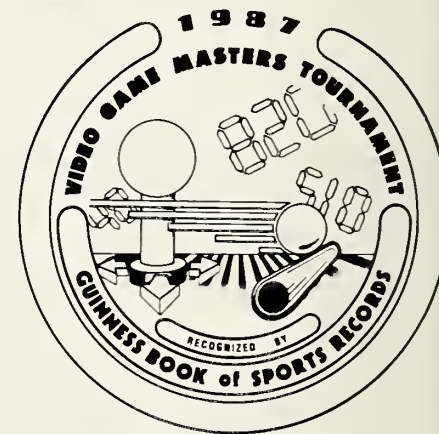

The Dollars And \$ense Of Business Promotions - Part V

In the last installment of this series, we discussed some of the options and approaches available for running promotions on various video games. Even with all of the hype surrounding pinball machines and other arcade attractions, video is still the mainstay across the board, not just in sheer numbers, but also in earning power.

However, this doesn't mean that the games can stand on their own forever, especially some models which can benefit from a promotional boost when it suits your purposes and timetable. And, although the focus last time was primarily on sports games which tend to lend themselves, most easily, to different competitions, you can still profit by trying the same programs with many other types of video games currently on the market. In fact, there are no real barriers or boundaries to staging an event on any video game.

The only warning, as always, is to tailor an activity that is simple enough to carry through on your terms—which is the case for everything we have discussed and will be discussing in the future. Obviously some machines, such as golf, football, tennis, soccer, basketball, baseball, racing, or a two-player wrestling, boxing or karate/kung fu can provide a direct means for staging mini-tournaments. The winners advance and the losers don't until you get a champion. But what about the diversity of other video equipment that might be more of a shoot 'em up or a seek and destroy type of scenario?

Interestingly, games such as a Contra, Arkanoid, Sky Shark, Lock-On, Danger Zone and the list goes on and on can pose some initial problems because players can master these games and you run the risk of having the skilled individual stay on a machine for literally hours—which can knock the stuffing out of the best intentions. In the case of these machines and even some of the older favorites, you do have a very real opportunity to design a promotional competition that is equitable for everyone and also fair to your own business.

The solution is simple and something that has been done in the past successfully. First off target the machine(s) that you would like to center an event around. Set up the schedule that will be the best and least intrusive on your regular, day-to-day business. And, finally, put up some signage at the location announcing the tournament and have a sign up sheet ready for interested players. Also, establish what your prize structure is going to be, whether you're giving away a coin-op machine, some specialty items you've picked up at the trade shows, or some other products that you might have secured from a local merchant. (And the techniques for getting

prizes is something we've discussed before in this series).

But what about the games, you might be wondering. Simply stated you can set up the competition based on time. How many points can the player score in five minutes? You will be surprised how the time limit affects a player's approach to a game he/she may have mastered in the past. Suddenly, the objectives become far different, as does the risk taking for maximizing time and scoring potential.

By setting up a tournament in this way you've taken out the chance of having someone sit on a game level after level and, more importantly, you've added another control in your favor so that you can precisely figure out just how long the competition will take. And, if you find that some players are tying in points for the five minute threshold; lower the limit to four minutes or even three minutes to determine your champion.

No matter what the game is, other than the sports simulations, you have a pretty good opportunity to run a competition based on time and have it be successful. Players will even welcome the challenge because you've served up a twist on a familiar theme that is going to have them rethink their approach and strategy for playing.

But despite the homogeneous mix of video, by and large, this time limit isn't always going to be necessary. There are those games which have a finite limit already built in. Many of the car racing games are based on time, or at least laps to some end point. In this case you can base your competition on pure scoring to determine a winner. Or the amount of time spent to reach the end of the game. Any quantitative number is going to serve the purpose of establishing winners and losers.

And, as always, you're the one controlling the competition and setting up the parameters. So whatever the rules might be or the guidelines, players will have to adhere by them, as long as what you've done is fair and capable of determining true champions. What you don't want to risk is "turning off" your players with a competition format that is confusing or seemingly "off-the-wall" to the potential participants.

But normally, you will find that coin-op players are an extremely agreeable group of people who are willing to accept almost anything, especially if there is a challenge that might take the best features of a given game and showcase them; even if they are taken out of context. In terms of time games, players may have previously focused only on their point totals; which you may turn around to minutes and seconds.

For longer timed machines, the prospect of running a tournament

within fixed limits is going to be appealing because it will cause, across the board, players to change their playing strategy in order to go for the points. In fact, the old television game show, Starcade, used to set up the playing portion of the program in much the same manner because of the constraints posed by a half-hour show. So their is precedence if you are mildly concerned about how players might react to this framework.

What's important to remember is that video of all types can be the target for any kind of competition you would like to attempt. And that your audience will tolerate, with open arms,

the challenge that you present to them. With other categories of coin-operated amusement machines, you will have greater latitude in setting up tournaments, and those we will cover in future installments of this series dedicated to giving you suggestions and directions for staging promotions that will benefit your business and help to draw in players above and beyond normal business.

Colorful posters will invite players to participate during the competition on their favorite games. For a one-time registration fee of four dollars, players will be given a special contest identification card entitling them to record scores on any of the competition machines. Aladdin's Castle managers will supervise the contest and act as official witnesses, making sure that all games are played on competition settings and that no illegal tricks are used.

When asked about the promotional value of this tournament, Harris stated "The exposure which results from extensive media attention in each hosting city, as well as the publication of the

Guinness Book of Sports Records (which has a circulation of over 50 million worldwide), benefits the entire coin-operated amusement industry. Bally's Aladdin's Castle amusement centers provide an excellent atmosphere for this type of tournament, which not only provides the public with a much needed incentive to play, but also re-establishes the fact that video games and related coin-operated amusements are excellent forms of entertainment."

New titles added

In conjunction with the '87 tournament, the U.S. National Video Game Team announced the latest additions to the list of competition machines that are being featured at this year's event. The titles are: Road Blasters, Night Stocker, Ikari Warriors, 720 Degrees, Power Drive, Rygar, Arkanoid, Out Run and Life Force.

"The new additions to the Video Game Masters Tournament lineup represent some of the best new games to be released in the past year," said Harris. "These games not only display the necessary competitive elements required to be included in the Masters contest, but they have received widespread player acceptance as well, making them excellent additions to the competition."
