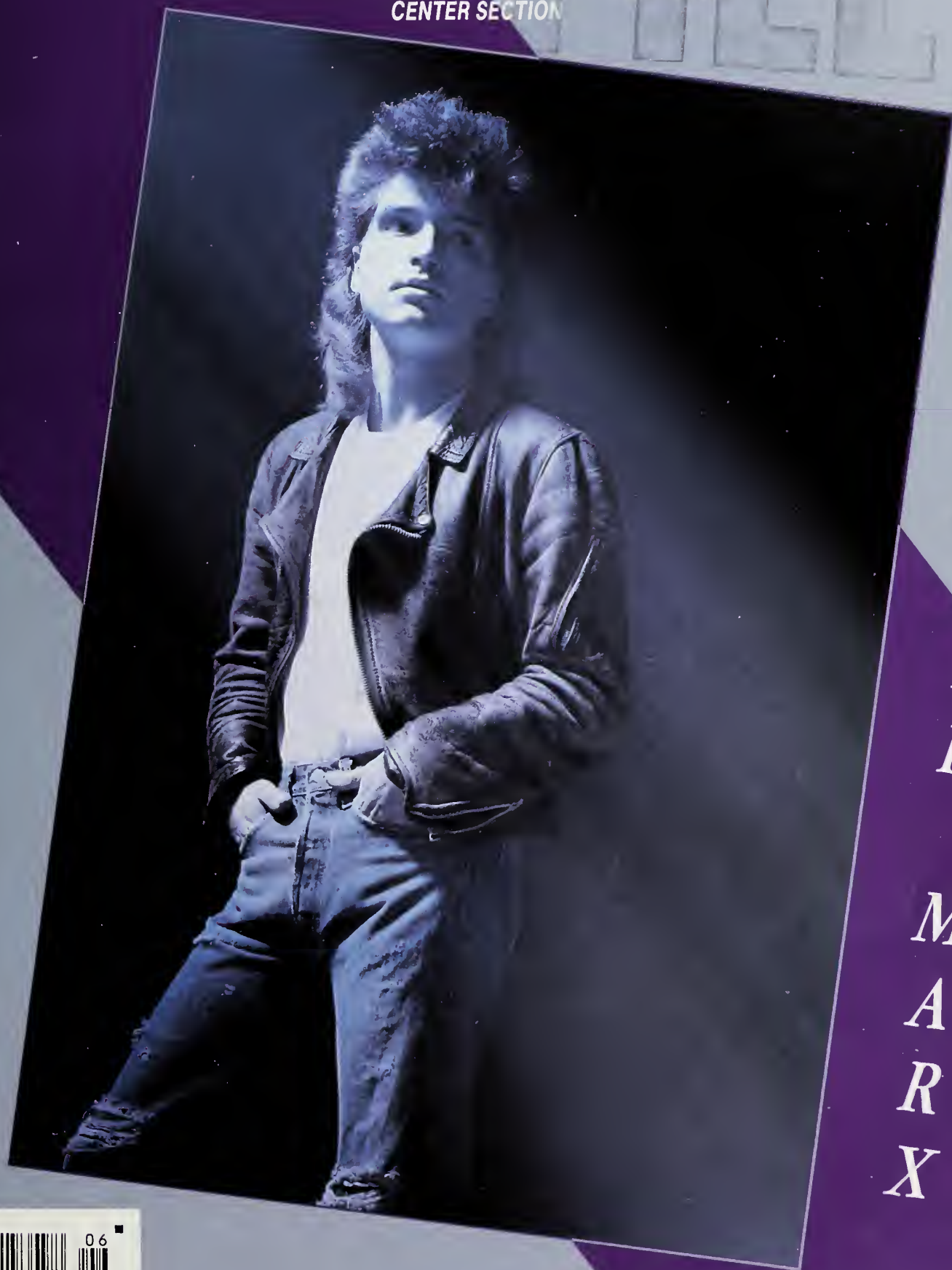

W/E/A To Rollout Cassette Singles

LOS ANGELES - The Warner/Elektra/Atlantic Corporation has announced the release of ten new titles in the cassette single configuration, joining RCA, A&M, Arista, MCA, and Motown in the initial rollout of the new format geared toward the teen and pre-teen consumer market.

In making the announcement, Russ Bach, executive vice president/marketing and development for the W/E/A Corporation, commented "this new format is not only designed to address the issue of the declining sale of 7-inch singles, it is a move designed to fill the changing needs of young or casual music consumers. This is the age of the Walkman and the car radio/tape player. It is a time where for many younger consumers the turntable is not a part of their playback equipment. Producing

and marketing cassette singles is the industry's way of keeping the younger consumer involved in our business."

Titles to be released in this latest wave include new or current product from Madonna, Motley Crue, Fleetwood Mac, Boy George, Atlantic Starr, Simply Red, Sammy Hagar, Stan Campbell, Randy Travis, and Dwight Yoakam.

The industry-wide push for acceptance of the new configuration appears to be beginning in earnest this month. To increase consumer awareness, Arista Records has designed a five-foot tall floor rack to be installed in the 1000 rollout stores participating nationwide. Leading retail chains involved include Wherehouse, Camelot, Tower, Record Bar, and many others.

NEW YORK—NARAS has announced the recipients of ten Lifetime Achievement Awards, for artists who have made outstanding artistic contributions to the field of recordings, and three Trustees Awards, special Grammys voted for non-performing contributions "of a broader scope than generally comes within the framework of the Grammy Awards."

The Lifetime Achievement Awards will go to Roy Acuff, Benny Carter, Enrico Caruso (posthumously), Ray Charles, Fats Domino, Woody Herman, B.B. King, Isaac Stern, Igor

Stravinsky (posthumously) and Hank Williams (posthumously).

The Trustees Award winners, all deceased, are the composers Harold Arlen and Jerome Kern and inventor Emile Berliner, "the father of the recording industry."

NARAS is currently considering the possibility of a two-hour television special this fall, to be produced by Grammy show producer Pierre Cossette and aired by CBS, dedicated to the Lifetime Achievement and Trustees Awards.

Westwood One To Acquire NBC Radio Networks

LOS ANGELES—Westwood One Inc. and the National Broadcasting Company Inc. (NBC) recently entered into a letter of intent relating to the acquisition by Westwood One of the NBC Radio Networks and related matters.

Westwood One will acquire the three NBC Radio Networks (NBC Radio Network, The Source and Talknet), including the long-form program unit NBC Radio Entertainment.

"This transaction will create a strategic network radio alliance, which will combine our individual strengths," commented NBC Radio

president Randall D. Bongarten, adding that Westwood One is a leader in network radio, both in terms of innovation and execution. Bongarten further remarked that this relationship will enhance service to radio stations and advertisers.

Stated Norman J. Pattiz, chairman Westwood One Inc., "We are proud of this alliance with NBC and of the value it brings to both parties." Pattiz said the companies will be reviewing each other's operations and that he expects that contracts will be signed and necessary regulatory and board approval completed shortly thereafter. Teller To Poe: Let Creative Juices Flow

(The following is an excerpt from CBS Records Division president Al Teller's keynote speech to the Bobby Poe Radio Convention on June 26. The focus of his speech is the difficulty inherent in trying to run a creative business from a "bottom-line" point of view. He also touches on the specific problems facing radio and record company policy makers.)

It is this struggle between the demands of our art and the demands of our business that I'd like to touch upon today.

Over the years of my own struggle to balance the analytical and creative demands of our business, I've reached a simple conclusion: the basic key to success in the music business - or any creatively-driven industry - is through total, unshakeable, unwavering dedication, devotion and commitment to the creative process.

Despite the elegant simplicity of the basic principle, I am concerned that too frequently we lose sight of it and then suffer for it.

Ladies and gentlemen, music is rocket science; it's not mathematics; it's not reducible to a precise set of facts and figures from which absolute conclusions can be drawn. If we continue to insist that it is, we'll end up with nothing more than some modern version of medieval alchemy complete with wizards wielding magical formulas guaranteed to solve all problems and answer all questions. We'll also end up together in failure.

But we can all take heart, for a nightmare is not about to unfold. It won't because music is an extraordinary art form which ultimately defies and triumphs over all logic and analysis. It unfolds and develops

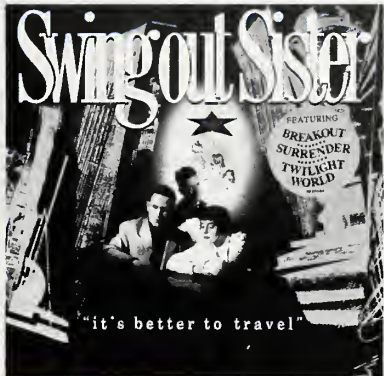

Recently we mentioned the circular building's peculiar architecture (resembling a stack of records with a needle on top), and the way its awnings went crashing to the ground in that rully, rully fab sequence in the movie *Earthquake* (while also mentioning the fact that label artist Steve Miller recently got a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame, which runs past the Capitol doorstep). Did we know, at the time, that Capitol was planning a party to celebrate the 31-year-old building's renovation?

Indeed, we did not. Fact is, the company staged a bash at its freshly restored digs last week, where such celebs as Peggy Lee, Martha Davis, Ima Sumac, Duran Duran and Ella Mae Morse (who had the label's first hit single in 1942, a ditty called "Cow Cow Boogie") were expected, as of presstime, to be in attendance. Aside from a lot of new paint, both inside and out, the face-lift extends to the editing suites, which, among other things, have new consoles; the windows, which were tinted gray; the Capitol signs - re-lit at the party - for which new molds were made; and the Tower's beacon (meant to resemble a stylus), which has beeped out the word "Hollywood" in morse code to passing air traffic since 1956, has been fully restored (since going on the blink in recent months). As far as the cost, the restoration is on-going, and no current estimates were available from the label. Incidentally, the Capitol Tower, which cost \$2 million to build in 1955-56, was the first air-conditioned high-rise office building in Hollywood. It's also said to be the first circular high-rise office building ever built. Class dismissed.

BLONDE BOMBSHELL-Sire recording artist Madonna has been getting damed good reviews for her

colossal "Who's That Girl" tour, which breezed into Anaheim last week like a hot Santa Ana wind from the nearby hills of the same name. And while most critics liked her others were equally concerned about the little Michigander's seemingly reckless request that some 50,000 fans, "Come here." I mean, she actually stood there on stage *said* "Could everyone, uh, come here? ... Those guys in the yellow jackets were just hired to annoy you." Annoy you, and keep you from trampling each other to death. Meanwhile, and might we say with perfect timing, the soundtrack to the Blonde One's perfectly titled film, *Who's That Girl*, has hit the streets. She co-produced, co-wrote and performs four of the album's nine songs. Also featured on the album are tunes from Club Nouveau, Scritti Politti, Coati Mundi, Duncan Faure and Michael Davidson. Numerous producers contributed, particularly longtime Madonna partners-in-hits Patrick Leonard and Stephen Bray.

Richard Marx Steps Into The Limelight

LOS ANGELES-"The irony of it all is that most of the songs on this record were on the demo tapes that I sent to every record company in the world, and they all said, 'You suck!'"

Richard Marx is on the phone from Cincinnati, one of the stops on his current club tour, discussing his self-titled debut Manhattan album, and addressing the crap shoot that most singer/songwriters are engaged in if they've got any aspirations toward landing a recording deal.

"I know a lot of struggling writers and singers read *Cash Box*," he continues, explaining why he chose this particular forum for his observations. "The idea that any one of those people should give up because they've been turned down - they should just remember that 90 percent of the people who make the decisions as to whether somebody gets signed could not hum a note of music if their lives depended on it."

Marx' words might have been an addendum to his current hit single, "Don't Mean Nothing," and its scathing view of Hollywood. Cynical stuff - harsh, even - especially for a 23-year-old. But his remarks, meant to encourage, more than scold, are qualified by a surprising number of years in the recording business. Would you believe 17?

Marx made his professional debut as a singer at age five, doing commercial jingles written by his father, Dick Marx, a Chicago jazz pianist-turned-jingle writer/producer (his mother, Ruth Marx, is also a singer). Singing spots for such products as Peter Pan Peanut Butter and Nestle's chocolate, he provided vocals for commercials until he was 17, when he began writing his own songs, and decided to get out of the jingle business.

A year later, Marx' demo tape caught the ear and interest of Lionel Richie. He then left his native Chicago

and moved to L.A., where Richie signed him on as a back-up singer on his debut solo album (he can be heard on such Richie hits as "You Are," "All Night Long" and "Running With The Night"). Marx then co-wrote "Crazy" and "What About Me" with Kenny Rogers, ballads which both went #1. Chicago's "Good For Nothing," Philip Bailey's "Love Is Alive" and Durell Coleman's "Somebody Took My Love" followed, and Marx' stature as a hit songwriter was established.

Trouble was, he had his own ambitions as a recording artist, but feedback from the labels was hardly positive. What he *wanted* to record was rock'n'roll.

"It just happened that the kind of music that I was involved with before doing this record, in order to eat, was mostly pop/MOR kind of stuff, and it was a great way to pay the rent, you know, but it was frustrating for me because there's writing *that* kind of music to survive, and there's writing rock'n'roll for yourself. I was going home every night and writing my little rock'n'roll songs, hoping that someday I'd get a deal. Finally, after five years in L.A., it happened."

It was Bobby Colomby, founding member of Blood Sweat & Tears and a close friend of Marx, who introduced him to Manhattan Records president Bruce Lundvall, who signed him to the label last year.

It was just the break Marx had been hoping for. "Bruce Lundvall didn't want me to change anything, he just wanted me to do what I did," he remembers. "There were no expectations as far as hit singles or anything like that. He just gave me the room to do what I wanted to do."

Colomby was also instrumental in bringing Marx together with David Cole, with whom he wound up co-producing the album. "I was originally

That Petrol Emotion

That Petrol Emotion's "Babble" is turbulent, tuneful, angry, crashing, brooding, abrasive, and intelligent - in short, a smashing U.S. debut by one of the U.K.'s best bands.

The album captures the tension of oppression and political struggle on a personal level. Because most of the band members grew up in Northern Ireland, their battle-scarred view comes from the street, the bomb shelter, and even the morgue - not from the armchair or the academy.

"There were two people in my class at school who joined the I.R.A. and got killed in the last decade," says bassist Damien O'Neill. "It's very scary. You hear about it and say, 'jeez, I know him.' (pause) I *knew* him."

"We became very politically aware at a young age. And British troops came in, so it was in front of me all the time - all this shit, this bombing and stuff," he says.



"Everybody has some sort of story to tell," says guitarist Reamann O'Gormain. "Like my friends, they joined the I.R.A. and were actually killed."

But because politics is such a personal matter for them, they don't see TPE as political. "It's more humanitarian," says O'Gormain. "There's no sort of subjective opinion."

going to produce most of the album myself, and I was looking for an engineer. The more I hung with David, the more I thought, 'This guy's going to be a great engineer, but maybe I need somebody on the other side of the glass to really push me harder.' The best move I made was having him co-produce the record. We became a great team."

The result is a pop-inflected rock album featuring Marx' melodically rough-edged vocals, and including the songwriting input of the likes of Fee Waybill and Michael Omartian. It's first single, "Don't Mean Nothing," (an Eagles-ish-sounding tune, featuring Joe Walsh on guitar and Timothy B. Schmidt and Randy Meisner on background vocals) is already taking the *Cash Box* pop singles chart by storm.

The album's second single, a dance rocker entitled "Should've Known Better," is slated for a mid-August

release. A video for the tune, directed by Dominic Sena, was recently completed.

Meanwhile, Marx is doing a series of national club dates - his first time ever performing live. "All I can tell you," Marx says with enthusiasm, "is that I have so much fun with this band, that the audience seems to have fun right along with us." On August 7, he begins opening for REO Speedwagon.

Are other label executives eating their previous remarks? Maybe so. Marx has, after all, proven that given the proper support, artists with some of the best and most unequivocal rejections in the business can make it.

Even so, Marx' interest lies mainly in perfecting his craft, rather than simply capitalizing upon it. "My only goal in this whole thing is that this album do well enough so that I can make another record," he maintains. "Anything else that happens is icing on the cake."

THE BEST PART of the artists panel at the New Music Seminar (see previous issue for full report on NMS8) was when Al Green sang the lyrics "Why am I a happy man?" into the mike. Otherwise it was a lackluster panel with lots of predictable talk, despite the best efforts of moderator Gary Gersh and some rousing comments by Circle Jerks' Keith Morris. Things heated up a bit (to lukewarm) when they started talking about success. Robbie Nevil said he waited ten years for his "big break." Morris said he's waited eleven and still hasn't gotten it. "What is the big break? And what happens once you get it? The big break: is that a crack in ceiling where the money falls down?" said Morris, cupping his hands for coins. "We made our first album on a pot deal. We don't sit around waiting for the big so-called break. We make our own breaks. We go out and bust our ass, pile all the equipment in the back of a van, and let's just go do it." Gwen Guthrie remarked that getting a major label deal is just the start of a lot of hard work. "When you get your big break you still have to make things happen," she said. "The pressure to come up with a single like the one you came up with previously - I get that now. I'm in the studio mixing my upcoming album and the comments are like: if you could just find a nice song, like that 'Rent,' that 'Rent.'" Dion DiMucci, who first found fame as a teenager, gave a more sober view of stardom. "A lot of people have died over the last thirty years, never coming to a full knowledge of the truth," he said. "They think music is gonna save them or being famous is going to be the magic. And I've seen people stand in the spotlight and get fried. There's more to it than just the big break." Censorship also came up on the panel, with DiMucci and Morris, whose band is targeted by the PMRC, making the most forceful points. "I found out as time went on that the more freedom I had, once

Elsewhere on the censorship front, Charles M. Young's interview with PMRC topper Tipper Gore is in the current issue of *Musician*. At one point, Gore sounds a bit like *SNL*'s Church Lady: **YOUNG:** What's wrong with a song like "Sugar Walls"? All it does is depict a woman in a high state of sexual arousal. **GORE:** Which you think is perfectly fine. And many people think is perfectly fine. What about all those other people who think, "Wow, that's going a bit too far in the public domain." And we all own a little bit of the public domain. **YOUNG:** Those people can turn off the radio and not buy the record.

Elsewhere in the article, Gore argues that it's not censorship if the government does it legally: **YOUNG:** ...the FCC contacts the radio station, and the radio station has to obey, or the FCC will yank its license. **GORE:** Of course. **YOUNG:** That's censorship. **GORE:** I would not agree with that. **YOUNG:** The definition of censorship is the government's power to restrict expression. So the FCC is empowered to restrict expression. That's censorship. **GORE:** No, I don't agree that that's censorship. In the first place, whatever action the FCC would take has to be legitimate legal action, which is not censorship...If the FCC has the responsibility to provide the oversight function to the broadcast industry, we should encourage them to do it in the public interest. That's legitimate.

searching, about prevention of terrorism. Facts. About what's really going on," says Damien O'Neil, whose brother Sean is also in the band.

Adds O'Gormain: "There's a lot of sort of liberal-minded people (in Ireland) and they seem to leave, or they're forced out because their ideas don't fit in. There's a very conservative streak, especially because the country is dominated by the church as well."

TPE is as brave and strident as the Clash, as bristly as The Sex Pistols, and as brash as The Doors. And the band is anything but wimpy about its rock 'n' roll; as vocalist Steve Mack sings on "Creeping To The Cross," "I would rather be the devil than go creeping to the cross."

There's also an internationalist flavor to That Petrol Emotion evinced by their predilection for hip hop ("Big Decision") and the fact that they're an Irish-British band fronted by an American singer (Mack is from Seattle, Washington). It's this absence of cul-

tural coding that makes them prime contenders for breaking the U.S. market.

Their commercial prospects are promising. Their first album, "Manic Pop Thrill" (Demon) sold more than 30,000 copies, and was number one on the U.K. indie charts for six weeks. With Polydor's help, "Babble" may turn into the left field hit of '87. Indeed, they have already created a buzz in the U.K. and were perhaps the most-talked about band during the recent New Music Seminar in New York.

"Me and Steve went to the Cat Club last night and we didn't have our passes so we tried to get our way in," says O'Gormain. "We said, 'we're from That Petrol Emotion' and he said, 'yeah, great band, come on in.' So I think we're a bit known now. This is great."

That Petrol Emotion returns to the U.S. for an extended tour of club-sized venues in October.

KEY NOTES—What could be better than the 21-record boxed set, "The Complete Keynote Collection," that PolyGram put out last year? That's right, "The Complete Keynote Collection" on CD, and now, not surprisingly, PolyGram has begun releasing a good hunk of that collection on compact disc under the banner of "The Essential Keynote Collection." The first five sets have just been issued, with five more due in August. They are "The Complete Lester Young On Keynote" (which immediately takes its place as one of the most essential jazz CDs yet released), "The Complete Lennie Tristano On Keynote," "Early Bebop" (Red Rodney, Dave Lambert etc.), "Roy Eldridge and the Swing Trumpets" (dates by Roy, Charlie Shavers, Jonah Jones, Buck Clayton, Joe Thomas and Emmett Berry, and the only double-CD of the first issue) and "The Fabulous Ellingtonians" (dates by Johnny Hodges, Rex Stewart and other Ellington alumni). Much of this music, as I explained here last year in a review of the boxed set, is brilliant,

filled with a majesty and grace that is often breathtaking. The transfers (although, as always, when they crackled on record, *hoo-boy*, do they crackle on CD) are quite excellent.

Other recent jazz CD reissues include "For You For Me For Evermore," tracks by the Artie Shaw Orchestra with strings and a 21-year-old Mel Torme (Musicraft), and a pair of two-CD compilations from DRG's Disques Swing line: "Ridin' in Rhythm," featuring some exceptional early Coleman Hawkins and Benny Carter, and "Jazz in the Thirties," featuring, among others, Joe Venuti, Benny Goodman and Gene Krupa.

Ironic because not only has Dexter Gordon been in France numerous times since then but that, of course, is where he filmed "Round Midnight" and, to boot, where he was last year made a *chevalier* in France's *Ordre des Arts et des Lettres*, a highly-prized honor. In any case, after five hours of moping in the airport, Long Tall Dexter was loosed upon France. Dexter told the International Herald Tribune's Mike Zverin that next time he comes to France, he's going to be wearing his *chavlier* medal.

The honcho of the high notes and his seven-piece fusion band in a typically screaming, high-energy date.

It was only time before Stephane Grappelli, the master of the swing violin, went bow-to-bow with Vassar Clements, the master of the bluegrass violin. A fine jazzgrass blend.

BMG's First Fiscal Year Revenues Pass \$1 Billion

NEW YORK—The Bertelsmann Music Group's first fiscal year, which ended June 30, produced net revenues exceeding \$1 billion. BMG, part of Bertelsmann A.G., was formed after the purchase last September of the 75% interest in RCA/Ariola held by General Electric/RCA and the RCA Records Club from G.E.

BMG Music posted a second half revenue increase of more than 18%, with the RCA/Arista/A&M Distribution division posting the biggest 12 months in its history, and BMG International up 27% over the same period last year.

Scheduled for fiscal '88 is a continuation of the restructuring and re-evaluation of the non-creative and administrative systems of the company via the commencing of a productivity analysis in conjunction with McKinsey & Company. The analysis, which will run through the first quarter, will in-

volve studying all aspects of the Bertelsmann Music Group, including BMG Music, its RCA Records and Red Seal labels, BMG Direct Music Marketing, Arista Records and the home office functions of BMG Music International. The goal of the study is to "free up dollars presently tied to overhead."

In commenting on the fiscal '87 results, Michael Dorneman, co-chairman of BMG, said, "Bertelsmann has made a long-term, worldwide commitment to the music business. It is our belief that music represents strong, long-term profitability as well as being an exciting, vital and timeless art form. Our acquisition of RCA last year becomes the cornerstone for the Bertelsmann Music Groups' global activities which, with all divisions in place, puts us in the forefront of the industry for the years ahead."

The CISAC Working Committee on

Public Relations, a new entity, will hold its first meeting at New York's Parker Meridien Hotel, September 9-11. Chief among the topics to be discussed is public and media awareness of copyright.

The BIEM/CISAC Technical Committees are the Documentation, Distribution and Data Processing Committees and the Dramatic and Literary Rights Committee. They will be at Nashville's Opryland Hotel, September 15-17. Among the topics to be discussed will be data processing cooperation between performing rights organizations.

changes in its own time and in its own way. It does so despite all attempts to pigeonhole it, categorize it, or format it.

Artists will always be driven by their musical visions, not by the demands of record companies or radio stations. But we have the clear and basic responsibility to see that it does keep moving along, and then to follow it wherever it may lead.

Because of this responsibility, record companies and radio stations must not be held captive by one another. Each must exercise its own musical vision.

If we each hold true to our course, if we each pursue our own musical vision, our future will be assured; because by challenging each other creatively, we will foster growth and change. We will enable the musical cutting edge of today to emerge as the musical mainstream of tomorrow.

Let the bond which unites us be our love for the music. If we make that our bottom line, the other will surely follow.

For any of you who don't love the music; for any of you who don't truly get off on great artists and great

records, I have bad news. You are doomed to a career as an imitator rather than an innovator, and you'll always be denied the thrill of winning big in this arena.

I'd like to close with a few words for the younger players in the room. You are fortunate to be part of the most exciting business in the world. It's a very open, very fair, and very level field of play.

And since life can only be understood by looking backward, but can only be lived going forward, I urge you to learn everything you can about our business, to study its history well, and then to give us your best shot. Let your imagination and creative juices flow freely; be aggressive; take chances; push hard at all the creative boundaries; question all the conventional wisdoms.

Finally, and most importantly, always, always remember to listen to the music. Because the music is what the magic of this business is all about. And all true believers, all true music people, know in their hearts that they wouldn't want it any other way.

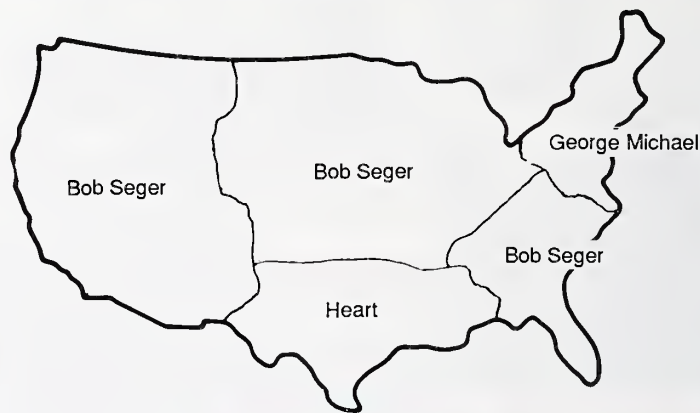

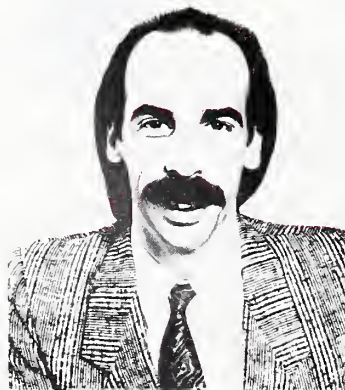

Pattiz**, chairman of Westwood One Inc. commented "We are proud of this alliance with NBC and of the value it brings to both parties. It allows us to provide the quality and tradition of NBC news to radio stations and advertisers." He added, "The NBC Radio Networks will maintain their identities in much the same way as the

Mutual Broadcasting System. We look forward to working with the excellent people at the NBC Radio Networks and expect that they will play important roles in the success of this new enterprise."

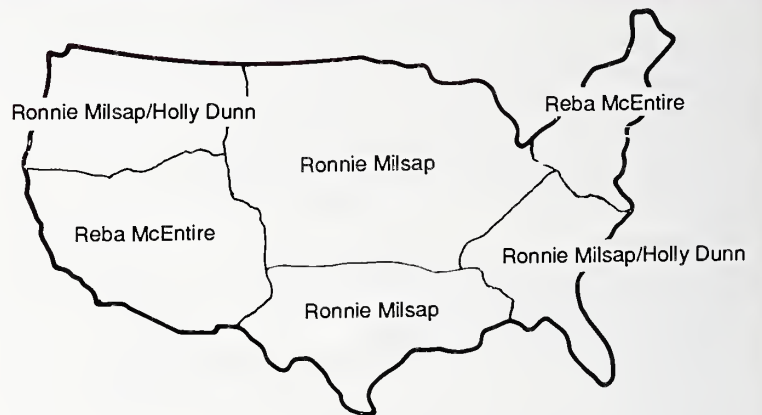

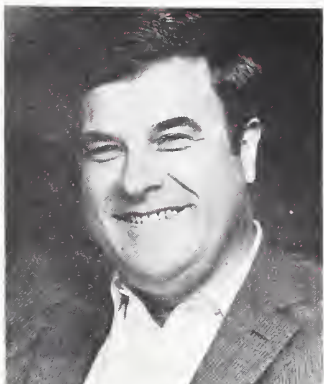

The contest officially runs from August 1 to 31, and is open to any amateur songwriter who has never had a song distributed nationally. To participate, entrants must submit an audio cassette recording of an original song, including both music and lyrics, that is less than three and one half minutes long. Entrants may submit as many different songs as they wish, but each entry must be recorded and mailed on a separate tape. Entries must be postmarked by September 2, 1987.

Entry cassettes must be rewound before mailing and marked clearly with the composer's name, address, phone number and song title. A written version of the lyrics, as well as a signed statement affirming that the song is original and composed by an amateur, must be included with the entry. In addition, an entry sheet with title of song, composer's name, address and telephone number (both work and home), must be wrapped around the cassette and secured.

Songwriters may enter through their local radio stations co-sponsoring the contest or send entries directly to KFC Songwriting Contest '87, Dept. N, 3688 Beverly Blvd., Los Angeles, CA 90004. No tapes can be returned. Composers of the ten winning songs will be notified by November 16, 1987.

The contest was initiated by Colonel Harland Sanders in 1976. The Colonel's vision, kept alive by the Kentucky Fried Chicken family, has become a reality for many past contest winners who have gone on to successful music careers.

Superstar Eddie Rabbitt has been named the 1987 guest artist of the 11th Annual Kentucky Fried Chicken Amateur Songwriting Contest. PASS IT ON!

On July 22nd, there was a real "guitar pull" at the Belcourt Theater in Nashville. It was not just another writer's night show. It was a night of super performances by some of Nashville's finest recording artists and songwriters. Literally "passing the guitar" were Rosanne Cash, Guy Clark, Rodney Crowell, Vince Gill, John Hiatt, John D. Loudermilk, Lyle Lovett, and Pat McLaughlin.

Each writer honored the peer who inspired them artistically and creatively during their careers. That, in itself, made a beautiful show. But, add to that the fact that the proceeds go into the Sue Brewer Fund of The Songwriters Guild Foundation to be used to fund scholarships for one Belmont College student and one Blair School of Music student.

The Sue Brewer Fund was started by Waylon Jennings, and is administered by the Songwriters Guild Foundation. It is used to benefit needy songwriters as a tribute to the memory of Sue Brewer. A songwriter's guardian angel, Sue Brewer befriended and supported Waylon, and many others, when they were struggling writers early in their careers. Sue Brewer passed away in 1981.

The theme of the guitar pull was "Pass It On!" This slogan was adopted from the song of the same name written by Diane Dickerson, Charlie Williams, and Steve Bivins. They weren't only "passing on" the guitar. They were passing on love and compassion.

Diane, Charlie, and Steve wrote the song because of an inspiration from an act of benevolency. You see, Diane had become a friend of a young songwriter named Steve Bivins. Steve was trying to make it in the music business and working as a local delivery truck driver. His wife had just had their second child. Rent and utilities were high. Medical expenses were extreme, and Steve's small wage just wasn't enough.

Steve Bivins was usually smiling and happy. When he wasn't himself one day, Diane asked what was wrong. After much prodding and questioning, she got Steve to admit that there was no food at his house for the babies, his wife and himself. Next day, Diane Dickerson called Steve Bivins under pretense of having him pick up a package on his route. When he arrived, Diane escorted him to her auto, which just *happened to be* loaded down with groceries of all kinds. Steve, near tears, told Diane that there was no way he could repay her. To that statement, Diane answered, "Pass it on!" Steve replied, "What an idea for a song."

On July 22nd, the guitar pull ended with Steve Bivins stepping on stage to sing the first few lines of "Pass It On" by himself. Soon, the rest of the writers and artists joined him. What an inspiring moment it was! Too, it was a constant reminder to those of us who witnessed it...Diane Dickerson surely knew, like Sue Brewer, that help and thanks come from the heart...not from the pocketbook!!

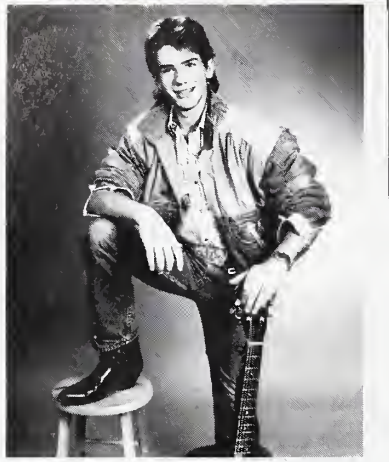

It's up-tempo, and country all the way!



NEW PLAYERS

Bonnie Leigh...Long Island Country Girl!

Any of you readers under the impression that female country music singers are all farm girls or mountain maidens..think again! Undoubtedly, you haven't met **Bonnie Leigh**, if you think that way.

Bonnie records on the **R.C.P. Records** label. Her current single, "That's When," has done very well on the charts. But, Bonnie doesn't live down on the farm. Bonnie Leigh is from Northport, New York. Northport is located close to the city on Long Island. However, Northport is a small fishing village where, as Bonnie says, "You can still go to the movie for ninety-nine cents!"

She gives her mother credit for being the greatest influence on her career. "My mother traveled and sang all over the country. She traveled with the shows of such well-known country entertainers as Gene Autry and the Sons Of The Pioneers. She never got the chance to record, but she was a professional singer."

Bonnie Leigh had a natural talent and love for music. At age seven, her mother taught her to sing harmony in addition to lead. "About the first or second grade, other people started to approve of my singing. The encouragement strengthened my interest. I got a spot on Ted Mack's Original Amateur Hour when I was seven. At age nine, I was on The Italian American Hour television show. At fourteen, I started my own rock 'n roll band. I met, and was on the same venue with **Bobby Vinton** and **Johnny Tillotson** at WPRO in Providence. It was on a 'Bandstand' type show. And, we did a lot of Hootenanny shows at universities, on radio, etc.."

"My mother and father (who was the toughest boss Bonnie ever had) encouraged me, but they taught me the *important* things as I progressed. They taught me to be *humble*. They taught



me to *work with and learn from* others. And, they taught me that the audience *deserves* my best effort, no matter how I feel, personally, at the time!"

Bonnie Leigh loves to sing, but she is a very intelligent and business-minded individual. Along with working for her father, Bonnie has had great success at other positions. In fact, Bonnie was the secretary for the chairman of the board of Allstate!

In response to a question concerning why she chose to be a country artist, Bonnie replied, "Mother sang country. My grandfather played fiddle. The family had weekend gatherings, which were filled with country music! I was allowed to stay up and be a part of it. Rock 'n roll was a part of being 'cool' with my age group. But, country and the blues have always been my first loves. Stations in life have nothing to do with it; country music is for *all* people!"

Bonnie Leigh has done well. Bonnie Leigh will do better. She learned her lessons and her craft from excellent teachers with foresight. And, Bonnie Leigh has a *country heart!*

TALENT ON STAGE

The Cruzados

THE MUSIC MACHINE, L.A. - It was hotter inside than out, just after midnight on a muggy summer night in Los Angeles. Sitting nursing a Heineken, smoke from a Camel curling lazily back into my face, watching roadies break down some faceless haircut band. Waiting, waiting for the hottest young band of L.A. natives this side of Los Lobos to blow me away yet again.

And of course they did... The Cruzados hit the stage with the fury of a midwestern thunderclap, the flash of the Lone Ranger's silver bullet. The crowd, mostly mid-20ish, surged to the front and stayed there all night long, clapping, singing, dancing. It was a supreme rock and roll party for the late night crowd.

The set started with "Last Ride," an appropriately dangerous tribute to the band's outlaw style. The single, "Bed Of Lies," from their latest Arista LP "After Dark," also came early, and sounded tighter, louder, and harder than it does jumping off your radio dial in the dead of night. Vocalist Tito Larriva tucked his long black mane into a ponytail to get down to serious business.

"Flor De Mal," from their first (self-titled) LP, was the next highlight. Slow, atmospheric, building to the evening's first triumphant climax. Guitarist Marshall Rohner was spotlighted here, snaking his lead under and around Larriva's heartfelt tale of woe. Then came the anthemic "Young and On Fire," a balls-out rocker showcasing the guts of a truly tight group of musicians honed to each other's subtleties.

Rohner, leaning way back under the wide brim of his black hat, broke bad on a searing, bluesy solo that segued into "Rising Sun," a potent, aggressive cut from the first album. Drummer

Chalo Quintana never faltered, carrying the brunt of the action with his dynamic sense of timing and power. He is a masterful drummer, the thunder to Rohner's lightning, his deadly chops combining dexterous speed with the creative force necessary to anchor the rock solid sound.

The last song of the set was the tour-de-force "Motorcycle Girl," the band's energy coalescing with the crowd's spirit. Bassist Tony Marsico played off Rohner behind Larriva's tough, backstreet fronting, providing the two axemen a fertile substructure

from which to create their alternately melodic and menacing guitar stylings.

With the encores came time for a little fun with the hometown fans, as the band rauced their way through a bilingual massacre of "Secret Agent Man" and an all-hands-on-stage romp with "La Bamba." But the true message of this remarkable band is the incandescence of their black and white hell-fire, all jagged edges, sly smiles, and bootheels flying. They look good, they move well, they sound great.

New Music Seminar Week

VARIOUS VENUES, NY - There were more than two hundred acts playing New York area clubs during the week of the New Music Seminar (10-15), and a number of them stood out.

The first major show of the Seminar week was Mojo Nixon and Skid Roper's at CBGB's (7/11), which also featured Zeitgeist and Fetchin' Bones. Nixon played songs from his new album, "Bo-Day-Shus" (Enigma), his previous LP, "Frenzy," and assorted other gems. In the background was a picture of Elvis Presley, the inspiration behind "Bo-Day-Shus"'s first single, "Elvis Is Everywhere." Nixon electrified the packed club, thundering about Confucius and Chicken McNuggets and various forms of American marginalia, and even getting everyone to sing along to the anarchic "Burn Down The Malls" and the spirited "We Gotta Have More Soul." And this was just with an acoustic guitar and washboard; no telling what they could do with a full band.

Zeitgeist's gig was an ear-opener for anyone who had seen their showcase last year at the Cat Club and written them off as a mere rough draft of a real band. This time, there was something more definite and better defined about their sound, as they played with a force and energy that should make their Capitol debut (due September 9) even

better listening than "Translate Slowly."

Before I review Marti Jones and Don Dixon's show at the Bottom Line (7/15), I should say up-front that Marti Jones was kind enough to wish me happy birthday from the stage and to later present me with the official international t-shirt of Canton, Ohio (her hometown). So if this affects my journalistic neutrality, let's say right off that I've never been neutral on the subject of Jones and Dixon: Jones is simply the best female interpretive singer of the '80's, and Dixon is one of the decade's great singer/songwriters. Together they've got amazing chemistry, an even more amazing batch of songs, and a pair of voices that held this SRO crowd rapt. Backed only by acoustic guitars, the purity of Jones' vocals came through - every whisper and understated ache and sob - as she sang a haunting "Crusher" ("Match Game"/A&M), a sensual "Walk Away," and a version of Dixon's "Inside These Arms" impassioned enough to evoke an extended ovation. Dixon meanwhile played it soulful and gritty, growling "Dreams To Remember" and Stax-popping his

way through "Southside Girl" and the title track to "Most Of The Girls Like To Dance (But Only Some Of The Boys Like To)" (Enigma). They also showed a wonderful sense of humor on stage, with Jones doing a imitation of Dixon's singing, and Dixon stopping in the middle of "Praying Mantis" to joke about the song's hooks and chord changes. Dixon is so refreshingly playful and experimental, one senses it's only a matter of time before he writes Jones a song that's going to make her as big as Linda Ronstadt was in the seventies. Her voice is a thing of real beauty, capable of killing softly without hardly trying, and her time is gonna come.

Steve Earle, on a quadruple bill with K.D. Lang and The Reclines, Dave Alvin, and Mark Brine at the Cat Club (7/14), played one of the best rock 'n' roll shows of the Seminar week. Though Earle calls his music country, he captures the edge and beat and soul of rock 'n' roll better than most rockers, and sings about an America that has more to do with Springsteen and Mellencamp than Waylon and Willie. He opened the show with "Nowhere Road" ("Exit Zero"/MCA), which is sort of like an '80's version of "Lost Highway," and then sang a verse of Springsteen's "Racing In The Street" before breaking into "Sweet Little 66." Indeed, Earle's U.S.A. is a land of cars and highways that lead to the heartland towns where dreams run out of gas and love is a fleeting thing. On "Getting Tough," he sang, "I was born in the land of plenty/now there ain't enough." On "The Rain Came Down," he sang from the point of view of a dispossessed farmer telling a sheriff "you can have the machines but you ain't taking my land." And the way he plays that song on stage is quite clever; when the defeated synth-strings of the chorus come in, Earle throws back his hair and hunches over like an exhausted farmer. The filmic element in his music is further enhanced by his actorish vocal sensibility, typified best by his had-it-up-to-here delivery of the last chorus in the melodramatic "Goodbye's All We Got Left" (not performed here). Earle ended his 75 minute set with The Rolling Stones "Dead Flowers" and an encore of "Guitar Town" that reaffirmed his status as one of the most promising rockers of his generation.

Catching the tail end of Scruffy The Cat's show at Nirvana Club One, as part of the Relativity Records showcase, reminded me of how magically the elements of this band mesh together, particularly the vocal harmonies. An extended review of Scruffy's show with the Replacements will appear in the next issue.

Also of note, was the debut performance of Hege V (pronounced Heggy Vee), who played with his four piece band at the Manhattan Brewery (7/12). Doing songs from his Mitch Easter-produced "House Of Tears" album (MTM), Hege's set of rhythmic folk-rock marked him as a debut act to track.

FAB FOUR FROM SONY - Sony Video Software has the Beatles waiting in the wings for its holiday promotion, set to commence November 6 (October 5, pre-order). Five titles - two of them new - are included in the promotion, which has been dubbed "Sony Salutes The Beatles."



BE HER BABY-Ronnie Spector is featured along with a multitude of top female recording stars from the 60's and 70's in *The Legendary Ladies*, on Cinemax this month.

The first of the two new titles is *The McCartney Special*, obtained by Sony in a recent deal with Miramax Films. The tape is an hour-long retrospective of Paul McCartney's career A.B. (after the Beatles), and features rare performance footage of such tunes as "Jet," "Maybe I'm Amazed," "My Love," "I Saw Her Standing There," and, from his most recent album, "Press." Also included are interviews, covering such topics as his musical roots, why the Beatles were successful, and why the band broke up. Suggested list price is \$29.95. Second of the new titles is *An Orchestral Tribute to the Beatles*, an hour-long tape featuring the Royal Philharmonic and the Royal Choral Society performing Beatles classics at Royal Albert Hall - with Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth in attendance, no less. The tape is hosted by *Dynasty* queen Joan Collins, and includes such Beatles standards as "Penny Lane," "Eight Days A Week," "Got To Get You Into My Life," "I Want To Hold Your Hand" and "Norwegian Wood." Suggested retail price on this one is \$19.95. From the Sony Beatles catalog, the promotion further includes *The Beatles Live*, the RIAA Platinum-Certified concert tape, reduced from \$16.95 list to \$14.95 for the promotion's duration; *John Lennon: Live In New York City*, another Platinum-seller (previously released concurrently with a Capitol Records album, a *Showtime* special and a Pioneer

lazerdisc), reduced from \$29.95 to \$19.95 during the promotion; and finally, *John Lennon: Imagine*, a Gold-selling companion video to the famed John Lennon album, also reduced from \$29.95 to \$19.95 during the promotion. Needless to say, Sony is planning a major push, including a volume incentive program for the company's rackjobber, distributor and direct accounts, plus cooperative advertising opportunities, not to mention merchandising one sheets, brochures and ad slicks for in-store promotion.

OLLIE ON VIDEO-MPI Home Video appears to have gotten a jump on everyone else in the business in capitalizing on the Iran/Contra hearings - specifically those most eagerly awaited and voraciously watched segments, the testimony of Oliver North. Barely two weeks have passed since Ollie was on live, and this company's got the goods! Atari 'APB'

High speed chases, dangerous arrests and shoot-outs are brought to life, with a touch of humor, in Atari's new "APB" video game, where the player portrays Officer Bob in his action-packed pursuit of common lawbreakers and hardened criminals. By definition, an APB or All Points Bulletin, is released to alert all police officers to be on the lookout for a particularly dangerous criminal and to use any means necessary to bring said criminal to justice.



As play begins, Officer Bob is driving his police car in hot pursuit of lawbreakers. The levels of game play are measured in days and, in order to progress to the next game level, the player must arrest a daily quota of law breakers or arrest the APB criminal of the day and return to the police station.

There are multiple objectives to challenge both novice and experienced players and these include making the

daily quota by arresting the offenders (litterbugs, drunks, dopers, honking taxis, hitchhikers, bikers, speeders and others); sending APB criminals (Sid Sniper, Juan Fingers, Freddy Freak, Hans Oop and many more) to jail; or collecting bonus time, extra fuel and police car enhancements.

Demerits are given for not arresting the day's quota of criminals, for shooting innocent vehicles and for crashing the police car and running out of gas; and when the player obtains too many demerits, the game is over.

Numerous detailed animation sequences, such as the antics of Officer Bob and the various APB criminals, add humor to the game while involving the player with the many characters portrayed throughout play.

Multidirectional scrolling allows the player to drive in all directions on the screen and players are encouraged to explore the streets and back roads of Bob's beat during the constant, action-packed pursuit of the law breakers.

Home Market Update: Nintendo Continues To Lead The Way

CHICAGO—If the recently past Summer Consumer Electronics Show in Chicago accomplished nothing else, it dramatically reaffirmed the forecasts that home video is, indeed, back; and that Nintendo is still dominating the growing market. In fact, Nintendo announced during the proceedings that its sales results during the first quarter of this year were approaching an unbelievable 300 percent increase in unit/volume sales compared to 1986. And this is during a traditionally slow sales period for consumer electronics in general.

In regards to current conditions and projections for the coming months, Minoru Arakawa, president of Nintendo of America, stated that "the industry is healthy. We estimate that 4.5 million home video game units will be sold in the U.S. in 1987, as compared to 1.4 million units in 1986."

Even industry experts and analysts, who are quickly discovering that the home market is once again on the upswing, have come up with their own estimates regarding the size of the "new generation" home video game systems. In 1986 this category brought in \$430 million at the retail level. And Nintendo alone was estimated to have realized sales of \$300, or approximately a 70 percent market share. Projections for 1987 sales are conservatively estimated to reach more than \$825 million, with Nintendo's share approximating \$650 million.

In putting the numbers into a perspective of actual product movement, Peter Main, Nintendo's vice president of marketing offered that "the sales of three million Nintendo Entertainment Systems we are predicting to sell for 1987, will be complemented by sales of nine million Game Paks for the system." And it is in this

support for the system, via quality titles and products, that Nintendo is reinforcing its leadership role and creating some extremely strong licensing relationships in the process.

With an impressive booth at CES Nintendo was able to showcase its growing line-up of companies producing software for the NES (Nintendo Entertainment System). Many of the names are going to be extremely familiar to those in the coin-operated amusement game business; as are the titles which have been announced for release during the summer and early fall.

Some of the leading licensees include Capcom, which has come out with a vengeance in the coin-op and is now parlaying its hits for the home market. The library from this company alone is filled with some very recognizable names such as Trojan, Commando, 1942, Ghosts 'N Goblins and Section Z. Upcoming from Capcom include Speed Rumbler, Side Arms and Gunsmoke.

Data East is another coin-op giant in the Nintendo camp making the most of its arcade success with Tag Team Wrestling, Karate Champ and even the classic Burgertime providing the first group of releases for this company. However, before too long, Data East will be blitzing NES home owners with Ring King, Karnov, Breakthru and Kiki Niki; hoping to play off of the visibility of these games on location with similar impact in the home.

Konami has been extremely visible in the home market, going back to its strong support of the ill-fated MSX computer system of only three years ago. However, this time around the coin-op force is mobilizing some ir-

Konami's 'Boot Camp'

Anyone who has served in the military can relate to this new, dedicated upright video game from Konami and those who haven't were exposed enough via the movie and television screens to fully appreciate it.

The game, a 2-player, is called 'Boot Camp' and the player is an army recruit trying to make it through the grueling courses of boot camp. The tough drill sergeant shows no mercy as he barks out orders and insults at the recruits to provoke them into action.

In order to qualify as the best soldier, the player must complete the various phases of basic training including the obstacle course (which means scaling walls and clearing the bars as quickly as possible), the firing range (which has the recruit shooting as many targets as possible within a time limit), the iron man race (where the player dodges mines and other obstacles that test strength and agility in order to reach a boat and row across the river, racing against time to reach



the goal), arm wrestling, a one on one physical confrontation with the drill sergeant, and, finally, chin ups.

As if this isn't exciting enough, the player must also be prepared to face other unknown challenges in the game.

For control, the game employs 1 trackball and 2 buttons for attack and jump/shoot.

pressive hits that have also begun to find a home in the Play Choice 10 and Vs. Systems across the country. These include the likes of Gradius, Track & Field, Rush 'N Attack, Castlevania and the soon to be available Double Dribble.

And if these three companies have tended to lead the way to date with product in support of Nintendo, they are far from being alone as evidenced by the presence of a dozen more toy and game giants. As *Cash Box* reported in an earlier feature on the home market explosion (*Cash Box*, 3/28/87) Bandai America has been very much involved with a number of projects specifically designed for the NES. However, above and beyond its initial Family Fun Fitness accessory system, Bandai has also released such game paks as M.U.S.C.L.E. (a very good wrestling game tied into the popular toy line), Ninja Kid and Chubby Cherub.

Also drawing considerable attention at the CES exhibit were a number of other familiar names from the coin-op world. Irem has joined the Nintendo bandwagon and is scheduling two releases, *Spoon* and *Kung-Fu II* this fall and winter. SNK Corp. has readied *Ikari Warriors* as well as *Athena*, with *Victory Road* and *Psyco Soldier* coming by September to the home. Sun Corporation has an interesting title in the works, *Spy Hunter*, while Taito is lining up *Elevator Action*, *Legend of Kage*, *Arkanoid* and *Renegade*. Rounding into the arcade manufacturers in the Nintendo camp are Tecmo with *Rygar*, *Mighty Bomb Jack*, *Solomon's Key* and *Star Force*. Romstar, meanwhile, has been announced as a licensee, although the company has held off revealing any of their upcoming offerings.

From other fields, specifically the software and toy arena, Nintendo is gaining great support from Broderbund with *Lode Runner*, *Spelunker*, *Deadly Towers* and *Raid on Bungeling Bay*. And LJN is coming with heavy movie

tie-ins, including *Jaws-The Revenge*, *Gotcha* and *Karate Kid*. But there's still more as Activision, a long time power in the home market during the original video game boom, unveiled its plans for five titles by the fall for the NES.

But despite all of this activity, Nintendo hasn't diminished its own efforts to make the NES a more complete system. The company showcased six new titles of its already massive listing of games. These included *The Legend of Zelda*, *Kid Icarus*, *Metroid*, *The Adventure of Link*, *Punch-Out!!* and *3-D Racer*. The latter is interesting in terms of its introduction of new 3-D glasses. There are two types planned for release; one utilizes LCD shutter-type 3-D technology, the other the more conventional blue-red lens method of 3-D optical simulation. All adding to the expectancy of some intriguing products for the future.

In addition, the company added to its peripheral line-up with something they are calling the NES Advantage joystick which features two turbo adjusters and rapid fire action buttons along with a slow-motion feature that will be incorporated on some upcoming games.

All in all, the Nintendo Entertainment System has risen from the pack of competitors to stake its claim on first place with an Action Series of games, Adventure Series, Arcade Classics, Educational, Light Gun, Programmable, Robot and Sports Series with more than three dozen home grown titles to go with the growing list of third party supporters that should poise Nintendo for a very strong third and fourth sales quarter in 1987.

Whether the success will have a complementary effect on the arcade-inspired games remains to be seen. But, for now, Nintendo is gaining more and more attention in the consumer marketplace as the new wave of home video game playing continues to make its mark and reawaken a long dormant sector of the leisure time electronics industry.
