

Appreciation For The First Lady Of Song

Ella Fitzgerald, whose career earned her reverence as "The First Lady Of Song," died June 15 at the Age of 78. But her legacy echoes on through a musically rich stash of more than 200 recordings, and her spirit is indelibly imprinted in the memories of her peers and her worldwide legion of fans. Verve Records has just released her Love Songs: Best of Verve Songbooks, a condensation of the ballad material from her more than 16 songbooks released from the PolyGram label's vaults. U.S.-China Accord Lauded By Copyright Industries

PLANS THAT DERAIL a threatened trade war by promptly implementing last year's U.S.-China Intellectual Properties Agreement were widely hailed by the copyrighjt industries last week. Eleventh hour talks between the United States Trade Representative's staff and Chinese trade officials averted costly trade sanctions that the Clinton Administration and the U.S. Congress were prepared to levy on a June 17 deadline if China had not made an aggressive moveto stop piracy of copyrighted material such as CDs, computer software and movies, and to also renew its commitment to open its borders to U.S. copyrighted industries.

The Chinese government's action to close a number of pirate CD plants "convincingly demonstrate that China is capable of attacking the massive copyright piracy problem," according to a statement from International Intellectual Property Alliance, the Washington. D.C. based umbrella organization representing several copyright industry associations.

According to the USTR, China has closed 15 of the 28 known operational plants, and made the remaining plants subject to control of the police rather than regional agencies with ownership interest in, or relationships with, the plants.

"The U.S. recording industry is relieved and delighted that acting USTR Charlene Brashefsky and her team could resolve the critical issues regarding China's implementation of the 1995 Property Rights agreement, and we fully support USTR's decision to avoid sanctions," commented Jay Berman, chairman of IlPA member the Recording Industry Assn. of America (RIAA, who was in Beijing at the request of the USTR to serve as a consultant during the talks.

11PA member the Interactive Digital Software Assn. (IDSA) echoed such sentiments. "We are pleased that the recent talks between the U.S. and China have yielded significant progress in the campaign to crack down on copyright thievery in China," commented Douglas Lowenstein, president of the IDSA. Lowenstein said the announcements "bring us closer to the promised land of a fully legitimate software market in China."

The IIPA members were also satisfied that China was prepared to make a viable effort to wage intensive inspection of CD production facilities, implement title verification procedures for computer software as well as for sound recordings and motion pictures, and to ban further imports of CD production technology and facilities. The special enforcement period has been extended seven months, and foreign companies will be permitted to enter joint ventures in China for original creation, publishing and promotion of Chinese repertoire.

During the saber rattling between the countries over the trade issue, the Clinton Administration had threatened to revoke China's Most-Favored-Nation trade status and to impose \$3 billion in trade sanctions if China did not step forward on the piracy issue and other related matters. China vowed retaliatory measures.

NOUSTRY BUZZ

EAST COAST

CAUGHT IN A SKIFFLE: The Philadelphia-based Strapping Fieldhands are well-known revivalists of the mid-century British music of skiffle—a folk-influenced style that can be heard in early **Pink Floyd** and **Fairpoint** Convention. It has been so long since their last full lengther, and it seems that it was in the late '60s since their debut LP Discus was released. The wait, though, has been worth it as the group has taken a great leap with their sophomore attempt. Wattle and Daub, released by Shangri-La Records, which is based in Memphis, gives a greater depth to their music than on previous efforts. Though it still maintains that lo-fi feel that made them such critical fave, it is obvious that the four members are more comfortable in the studio. The Fieldhands' songs still maintain the shambolic catchiness that makes them instantly hummable like old seafaring tunes, but there is much more going on in the background than before adding an extra layer. Already out on Vinyl, the CD should be out later this month. If you see these guys stumbling down near your neighborhood give them a chance to sit down and play their instruments, you may find yourself dancing a jig.

MORE THAN JUST DELICIOUS: The sound of orchestra instruments can be heard more and more in precincts of alternative rock. Flydaddy's Richard Davies and Eric Matthews on Sub Pop both released albums recently that have revisited the territory blazed in the late '60s of lush sounding pop. Now you can add Yum Yum to the ranks of the bow and reed. The band is the brainchild of Chicago's Chris Holmes, who also leads the krautrock-influenced Sabalon Glitz. Yum Yum is as sweet as it sounds with songs about love set to the strums of violas and cellos. Holmes also pulls out one of the most difficult keyboard devices to play—the mellotron. Made famous in **David Bowie**'s *Space Oddity*, the mellotron uses tape loops to create the eerie, ethereal sound that fleshes out a number of the tracks on this CD. Wondering if you can try and match the sound? One problem is taken care of as all the chords are diagrammed with the lyrics so that you can strum along to Yum Yum's Dan Loves Patti on Tag Recordings. Who knows how long it will be until the London Symphony Orchestra is playing at Lollapalooza.

THAT ETERNAL QUESTION: Summer is a time for festivals and the What Is Jazz? concerts presented this year by the Knitting Factory and Heineken are always a favorite. Some of the highlights: 6/12 Don Cherry Tribute with Charlie Haden, Peter Apfelbaum, Dewey Redman; 6/23 Anthony Braxton Sextet; 6/26 Kenny Garret Quartet featuring Pat Metheny, Brian Blade, and Nat Reeves; 6/29 John Lurie & The Lounge Lizards; 6/30 Charlie Hunter Quartet; 7/1 David Murray Duo, Octet, Big Band. Almost all of the shows will be held either at the Knitting Factory or Town Hall. There's plenty of good music to knock back with your Heineken.

LAST WEEK'S COOLEST GIG was surely the Tibetan Freedom Concert, a spectacular two day event on the Polo Fields in San Francisco, with 50,000 folks playing with graffiti-festooned balloons and watching killer performances by crowd favorite Rage Against The Machine, along with Sonic Youth, A Tribe Called Quest, Smashing Pumpkins, John Lee Hooker and many others. The event was a benefit for The Milarepa Fund, organized in 1994 with the help of the Beastie Boys with the purpose of enlightening the public to the political situation and human rights abuses in Tibet and China. THIS WEEK'S COOLEST GIG—well, gigs, actually, include three celebrity-studded days of The T.J. Martell Foundation/Neil Bogart Memorial Fund 14th Annual Rock 'N Charity Celebration. June 27 will see the Album Network Celebrity Golf Classic, hosted by avid golfer Alice Cooper; the 28th brings Network 40 After Dark at Hollywood Park, which included a silent auction, a rockin' performance by Brian Setzer and, of course, horse racing. And on the 29th, The Hollywood Athletic Club presents Virtually Alternative Billiards Party and Casino, wherein celebrities have a chance to show off their bank shots. Those expected to participate in the events includ Stephen Baldwin, Johnny Gill, Pete Droge, Julie Brown and many others...

MISCELLANEOUS SIGNS OF MUSICAL LIFE: Tori Amos is the latest artist to go Unplugged for MTV (not that she was all that Marshall-stackcrazed to begin with, but...) The performance debuted June 25th...In other MTV news, the company is relocating its Western regional offices for VH1, MTV: Music Television, Nickelodeon/Nick at Nite and Nick At Nite's TV Land to Santa Monica. The big move takes place in March, 1997, so they have plenty of time to collect boxes and stuff...Holland's oldest independent label, Munich Records is celebrating its 50th anniversary with a two-day festival and promoting a sweepstakes with Pulse! magazine. Winner gets to fly to glorious Utrecht, Holland for the festival, which includes acts from Munich's large catalog of blues, folk, and other rootsy American music...Up-and-comer **Gravity Kills** has a hit with its self-titled disc and its radio smash, "Guilty." Now the group's snagged opening dates for the Sex Pistols...

YOU MIGHT NOT THINK OF THEM AS TECH HEADS but The Spin Doctors made on-line history when they debuted music from their You've Got To Believe In Something live over the Internet May 29th; with the combined support of Real Audio software, Sitcline technology, America Online and Much Music, nearly 320,000,000 bytes were transferred and 4,000 streams for simultaneous access to the show were made available for more than 60,000 fans.

An Appreciation

The First Lady of Song Echoes On

ELLA FITZGERALD, appreciated for her prodigious, indefatigable talent, must now be revered through her recordings and the memories of all who were touched by her music for nearly 60 years. She died June 15 at her Beverly Hills home at the age of 78. The Newport News, VA native's cause of death was not immediately released, but she'd been bedridden for several years with complications due to diabetes and congestive heart ailments. According to a family spokesman, a private funeral service was being planned. But there might be several musical tributes honoring her long and respected career, which earned her the designation ''The First Lady of Song.''

Impromptu honors for Ella started at the Playboy Jazz Festival, where the marquee at the Hollywood Bowl where the Festival held forth June 15-16 greeted jazz fans with the note: "Ella, we will miss you." Perennial Playboy Jazz Fest emcee Bill Cosby opened the first day with a call for a moment of silence, and the festival was dedicated to the singer's memory and spirit. Over the course of the two-day music fest, some artists worked tributes into their material. The ageless trombonist J. J. Johnson, who worked in several musical references to her songbook—including a wisp of her groundbreaking "A-Tisket, A-Tasket"—dedicated his galvanizing set to the late singer. Drummer T.S. Monk led a group that paused in memory by dedicating Clifford Jordan's "The Highest Mountain" to Fitzgerald. Saturday's show

"The Highest Mountain" to Fitzgerald. Saturday's show closer, Tony Bennett, performed an encore dedicated to Fitzgerald.

Ironically, Fitzgerald passed on the opening day of this year's Playboy Jazz fest. Her last appearance had been at the Bowl in 1992, when she performed with saxophonist/arranger Benny Carter, the man credited with helping to launch her career in 1934 after hearing her sing at Harlem's Apollo Theater on a dare, winning \$25 for her rendering of Hoagy Carmichael's "Judy." Verve Records, which holds the rights to many of her recordings in a variety of settings, is also calling a coincidence its release last week of *Love Songs: Best of Verve Songbooks*, a 16-tune album of ballads culled from her 16-CD songbook collection and featuring her working through songs by composers such as Cole Porter, Jerome Kern, Duke Ellington and others.

In fact, after Fitzgerald broke her career open fronting Chick Webb's big band in 1938 (in 1939 moving to lead the band for two years until launching her solo career), she earned the respect and reverence of her peers and fans alike with her insightful and spirited interpretations of songs from the songbooks of several composers of varying musical ilk. She recorded 250 albums in all and earned 13 Grammys, more than any other jazz artist.

She recorded several songs for Decca Records during the '40s and later firmly established herself as The Queen when she joined with Norman Granz's Verve Records (now an active label distributed by PolyGram) and Pablo Records in the 1950s. She had top-selling albums with *Ella Fitzgerald Sings the Cole Porter Songbook* in 1956 and the next year with the *Rodgers And Hart Songbook*. In addition to music by Ellington and Kern, she also recorded songbook collections by Johnny Mercer, Harold Arlen, George Gershwin and Irving Berlin, among others. She also recorded some landmark albums with Louis Armstrong.

In the 1960's she recorded albums with Nelson Riddle, Count Basie and Marty Paich and in the 1970s and '80s with her longtime musical director and pianist Tommy Flanagan, including a disc with guitarist Joe Pass.

Some of the other recorded highlights include:

—These Are The Blues

Verve checks in again with a 10-track CD featuring the singer during 1963 sessions with the rhythm section of Wild Bill Davis, Herb Ellis, Ray Brown, Gus Johnson and Roy Eldridge.

-For The Love Of Ella

A two-CD compilation on PolyGram drawn from recordings between 1956-1988, featuring music by and/or with Ellington, Basie, Riddle, Paich.

-The Complete Songbooks

A series of compilations released by Verve and featuring material from 1956-64, including *Ella Sings The Duke Ellington Songbook* (1957), a triple CD set featuring Duke, Ben Webster, Oscar Peterson, among others. All of the songbook CDs have been released separately.

-The Complete Recordings, 1935-39 (Affinity)

This is a three CD set of Fitzgerald's first recordings with Chick Webb, including sessions with Teddy Wilson, Benny Goodman, the Mills Brothers and her own Savoy Eight.

-Take Love Easy

This 1973 Pablo Records release features Fitzgerald plying gentle waters with guitarist Pass.

Fitzgerald's distinctive vocal instrument made dozens of songs memorable, among the most enduring being "Lady Be Good," "How High The

Moon' and her inimitable version of "Mack The Knife." But it may have have been a bit of scatting and a high note hit on a commercial for tape manufacturer Memorex that provided her the most shattering recognition.

She also appeared in films such as *Pete Kelly's Blues* (1955), *St. Louis Blues* (1958) and *Let No Man Write My Epitaph* (1960).

Fitzgerald shared her music on a world stage through vigorous international festival touring, concert hall engagements and club dates. While her voice changed over the years—the youthful zest giving way to a more sage, rough-hewn delivery—she remained distinctive because of her ability to present the essence of a song.


"Ella could really get inside a song and tell a story," says Grammy-nominated jazz vocalist Lorez Alexandria, who counts Fitzgerald among early influences on her career. "When you think of her, you think of her ability to give life to a song and add dimension to the composer's blueprint. I'm certainly going to miss her, but she lived a full, quality life."

In 1993, Fitzgerald underwent surgery to amputate both legs, the result of the effects of diabetes, and perservered through eye and heart ailments over the years. She was married twice, in 1941-43 to shipyard worker Benny Kornegay, and 1948-52 to jazz bassist Ray Brown, a union that bore a son, Ray Brown, Jr. She also raised a niece.

SINGLES REVIEWS By Daina Darzin

COWBOY JUNKIES: "Angel Mine" (Geffen CEF-PD-952A)

The Cowboy Junkies started out as the band that does depression and slowed-down angst better than anyone since the Velvet Underground (appropriately, the group had a platinum hit with 1988's *The Trinity Session* and its cover of "Sweet Jane," which was a Top 10 modern rock hit.) Still resplendent in very skewed country/folk influences, they've found a more intense, lively guitar-focused sound on its Geffen debut, *Lay It Down*, to good effect. Margo Timmons' vocals are stronger and less whispery; "Angel Mine" adds a beautifully spare, twangy lilt which could make this a fine crossover track for adventurous-minded country stations.

HARRY CONNICK, JR: "Hear Me In The Harmony" (Columbia CSK 8153)

Harry Connick's last disc, *She*, took a tour through his native New Orleans' funk-laced sonic history. It seems to have had a lasting effect: this, the first single off the Grammy-winning musician's upcoming *Star Turtle* disc, is centered around a jaunty, fluid groove, and a flourish of huge, soaring keyboards. A laconic, feel-good kinda track that's an automatic add for adult contemporary and mellow-rock stations.

■ TINA ARENA: "Show Me Pieces" (Epic ESK 8027)

In terms of career path, Tina Arena is Australia's answer to Alanis Morisette—a former TV child star, teen disco diva and recipient of a #1 multi-platinum disc in her native land while still in her early '20s. "Chains," the disc's first American single, made a significant impact on the charts. Her second offering, "Show Me Heaven," suggests Arena is more like Australia's answer to Mariah Carey. Her lush, gently crescendoing take on Maria McKee's 1990 hit should impact Adult Contemporary stations like that giant spaceship in the previews of *Independence Day*.



■ ENORMOUS: "Sweet Is" (A&M 3145402322)

Opening gigs with Bush, Better Than Ezra and the Toadies while Enormous was still working its indie disc has set the band up nicely for its major label debut, *Busman's Holiday*. "Sweet Is" is a quintessential modern rock track, with its jangly, quirky melody and Eden Unger's sweetly edgy vocals.

PICK OF THE WEEK



T YEAR BITCH: "24,900 Miles Per Hour" (Atlantic PRCD 6775)

7 Year Bitch have evolved into a downright ferocious band that occupies the turbo-propelled, punkish netherworld between L7 and Hole, but manages to distinguish its own sound by adding an almost metal guitar crunchiness, thanks to Roisin Dunne. Off the Atlantic debut, Gato Negro, "24,900 Miles Per Hour" gleefully depicts a person's drift into, um, dubious mental health. with Selene Vigil's vocals

disintegrating into a rant ("Those little voices, they're talkin' to me..."). A catchy and genuinely heavy track, "24,900 Miles..." could be equally at home on hard music and modern rock stations, and will no doubt be helped by 7 Year Bitch's spot on a summer tour package with Everclear, Spacehog and Tracy Bonham.

ALBUM REVIEWS by Daina Darzin

BARKMARKET: L Ron (American 9 43071-2)

Noise R Us and proud of it, Barkmarket do love 'em big, drony, doomy Sabbathy power chords, and use them at every available opportunity. An "alternative" disc that actually sounds like an alternative to something, L Ron features innovative production flourishes, like a little Jurassic Park ride of sounds (aptly, lead singer/guitarist/producer Dave Sardy is also a successful producer for other bands (Slayer, Helmet, Orange 9mm)). Sardy's edge-of-a-nervous-breakdown vocals give L Ron a loopy edge. This is a big, heavy record that will certainly appeal to Rage Against the Machine and Soundgarden fans; different tracks could work on heavy music or modern rock stations.

■ THE BLUE NILE: Peace At Last (Warner Bros. 9 45848-2)

A critically, well-regarded band with a small circle of devoted fans, the Blue Nile has only released two albums in its 12-year career, making this a real underground find, even though it's on a major label. "Happiness" is a song that's so elegantly, graciously relaxed, it could be sold as sonic Melatonin, while the surging, atmospheric instrumentation of "Tomorrow Morning" is at once shimmery and intense. "War Is Love" finds a percussive center that works out to a lush, ironically pretty groove, while "Soon" adds a soulful keyboard track.

FASTBACKS: New Mansions In Sound (Sub Pop SPCD 357)

Perennial Seattle cult favorites, the Fastbacks release their 47th album. Well, not really, but the band has been together since 1979, and has the rock thang down to a science (literally; guitarist Kurt Bloch occasionally takes time off to produce fellow Seattle-lites like Mudhoney, Tad and Gas Huffer). Originally aficionados of ultra-fast punk (and rave-ups like "555 part 2" confirm the ability to travel at a go-directly-to-traffic-school speed), the Fastbacks have evolved into the sort of raw but rootsy power pop favored by Joan Jett, with strong, soaring and very catchy harmonies. Many a cut on this accessible, fun record would find a happy home on modern rock stations, especially the slyly retro, thoughtful "Fortune's Misery," replete with Kim Warnick and Lulu Gargiulo's Connie-Francis-gone-wrong vocals.

■ GUS: Gus (ALMO/Geffen AMSD-80008)

Okay, he looks like another dorky, folksy guy but he's really not. Gus' self-titled debut is a clever and original-sounding melange of sad-eyed folk songs, with an almost-gothic, gloomy lilt and the occasional metallic guitar riff. (Old habits die hard: the Pasadena native admits to being a tcenage metal-



head who once took guitar lessons from Quiet Riot's Carlos Cavazo.) What makes this a special record is Gus' clever, non-cliche songs, which are both impeccably crafted and spontaneous-sounding. "Tomorrow Man," with its big, anthemic chorus and spare orchestration (vaguely reminiscent of Everclear's "Santa Monica") is a radio natural

PICK OF THE WEEK



SCREAMING TREES: Dust (Epic EK064178)

Screaming Trees return with the follow-up to its 1992 Sweet Oblivion disc, which sold over 300,000 copies. Combined with the band's Main Stage Lollapalooza gig this summer, this record could be the one that puts the group in the same league as its multiplatinum Seattle friends. With Dust, Screaming Trees is clearly looking to dispel any view of the band as just another grunge group, and it succeeds admirably. Produced by George Drakoulias (Black Crowes, Tom Petty) and mixed by Andy Wallace, this is an inventive, musically adventurous disc with a gorgeously lush, melodic quality, from the swirling haze of Middle Eastern rhythms of "Halo of Ashes," to "All 1 which sports a Beatles-y quirkiness to "Gospel Plow," which combines gospel music, tabla drums and other traditional Indian instruments and big-reverb loud guitar into an amazing, weird earphone-headtrip of a song. Several cuts, including "Look At You," and "Dying Days" have a plaintively folksy, affecting quality. The real killer track is "Sworn and Broken," a big, emotional, anthemic tune that could work on rock formats across the board. Guest artists on Dust include Mike McCready of Pearl Jam and Tom Petty's keyboardist, Benmont Tench.

Back with a vengeance after an earlier JVC project, Colour Club aims to rattle urban/pop radio everywhere with a concoction of AC-honed compositional skill and the vocals of new member Lisa Taylor. "Save A Little Love" continues the easy



listening vibe of the two instrumental auteurs, while Taylor shines on "All That Jazz," "If It's All Good," and the luminous ballad, "Pearls." Designed to make some radio noise, and avoid narrow airplay prospects. A respectable job, all told.

Scrap Dog and Mr. Slic have merged ghetto tales with funky, R&B melodies of the "West Coast" persuasion, as evidenced by its approach to "Gotta Make Those Endz," and "Deal Wit Tha Real." Sound effects on "Tha Holdin' Tank"

capture the essence of the incarceration experience. "Kinfolkatosis" is a danceable cut that's grafted onto part of "People Make The World Go Round." Kinfolk raps about "hard" subjects but coats its underground sound with mainstream touches.

■ POLYESTER PLAYERS: Double Knit Boogle (Polyjam PJR9601-2)) Producers: Greg Dalton, Fred Kharrazi

Harking back to '70s R&B, the Polyester Players are a weekly fixture of L.A.'s Luna Park nightclub, where they quote from R&B standards and lingo throughout their work as part of a retro



"fun" vibe. Core members Pretty Terry, Junior, Lefty, Payback, G-Mack, and Professor D don't sample, but keep it live in a brassy, urban gumbo of material. "Soul Sister" incorporates rap flavor, but the band's strength is its "old school" homage.

Mona Lisa has found a way to sound as full as the "big girls" she grew up admiring, simply by being herself. Best of the new tunes, "Keep Fallin"," "Sweet Memories" dip music fans into a vat of audible love. Her modulations are pleasant throughout, as are the sedate mood and tone of this debut.

THE KING OF POP, Michael Jackson is still juking mancuvers by Lavon "Billie Jean" Jackson, an otherwise nice, but obsessed woman who's been stalking him for 10 years. First tried in 1986, her "pathetic, disturbed" fixation became manifest in court. Ms. Jackson is completing a three month jail sentence imposed this year for her continual harrassment. Los Angeles city attorney Jim Hahn recently announced that a restraining order was issued forbidding her from approaching within 500 yards of Mr. Jackson's Encino, CA estate, those of his family, his business and other assorted properties.

ATLANTIC PACTS WITH BLACKGROUND: Atlantic Records' sr. vp Craig Kallman and Blackground Enterprises CEO Barry Hankerson inked a long-term global pact. Hankerson simultaneously ended a three-year old joint venture with Zomba Recording Ventures, Inc. Seventeen year-old debut artist Aaliyah will release her first Atlantic/Blackground LP in August. Aaliyah's 1994 Jive Records debut LP sold over a million copies, spawning a pair of RIAA Gold singles. For her freshman project, Aaliyah will team with producers Sean "Puffy" Combs (Notorious B.I.G., Faith Evans, Mary J. Blige, Total) Kay Gee (Zhane, Queen Latifah), Jermaine Dupri, Organized Noize, Jay Dibbs, Vincent Herbert, Allstar, Jamie Jazz and Track-Master Z. Atlantic/143 recording artist Jordan Hill is making cross-format inroads with her "For The Love Of You" single, from her self-titled debut LP. It's garnered R&B, pop, dance and AC chart action since its May 21 release.

HEAVY METAL: The biggest selling soundtrack of 1996, is the Kenny "Babyface" Edmonds-produced Waiting To Exhale project, now certified at 6 X Platinum. Each single released from the LP exploded from Gold to Platinum at radio and retail: "Exhale (Shoop, Shoop)," (Whitney Houston); "Sittin' Up In My Room," (Brandy); "Count On Me," (W. TONI BRAXTON: "You're Makin' Me High/Let It Flow" (La Face 73008-24160-2) Producers: Babyface, Bryce Wilson.

Toni oozes sensuality with her phrasing on "You're Makin' Me High," mated to tight, cascading backup harmonies, and a crossover-capable baseline. She projects allure sufficient enough to perpetuate her sultry, waif-like mystique. This cut joins the Gold quest of the Waiting To Exhale track, "Let It Flow," a showpiece of Braxton's radio-friendly facility for endearing pop ballads, enjoying increased airplay.

SOVORY: "Did You Mean What You Said" (Polydor PSAD 00183) Producer: Sovory, Marc Antoine, John Ryan

The best of three cuts on this single release from Sovory's self-titled disc, awaits embracing by an audience hungry for tunes that elude easy categorization. To start, Sovory's blues-laced rock ballad comes across fresh and alternative enough to nudge into Seal's territory. Its originality is more evident with repeated plays, as is the refined caliber of Sovory's passion. Eclipses companion cuts "Midnight Sun," and "May Not Be" by leaps and bounds.

HORACE BROWN: "Things We Do For Love" (Motown 374631486-2) Producers: Andre Harrell, Lewis Tillman, Edward (Eddie F.) Ferrell

Fred Wesley couldn't have imagined a better reincarnation of his grooves on this personable mid tempo cut, a riveting framework for vocalist Brown's soothing, inspired intonations. Four mixes reinforce the enchantment of an artist to be watched. He wields his gift well.

ALLIANCE PROMOTES, CONSOLIDATES: Alliance Entertainment Corp. recently announced a set of personnel promotions designed to facilitate consolidation. Acting COO Ian Henderson has announced that David Toole has been promoted to COO of Alliance's One Stop Group, which includes Sante Fe Springs, CA-based Abbey Road Distributors, Miami's Bassin Distributors and CD One Stop, also in Miami. Toole moves up from his post of chief financial officer of the Group. Peter Blei takes over Toole's old job, moving up from vp of financial and business analysis. Prior to joining Alliance in 1995, Blei was vp/CFO/treasurer at Spec's Music, Inc., the Miami-based retail chain with 60 stores in the U.S. and Puerto Rico. And Susan Homans has been appointed dir. of financial planning and analysis, having first joined the company in January of this year.

ICHIBAN RECORDS has made a series of moves to broaden its market impact. In early June the Atlanta-based company launched new imprint Altered Records, a label that will feature alternative and rock music signings. Ichiban had established its niche with urban music including blues and rap. And Ichiban's blues artist, Jimmy Dawkin, will switch to the international label.

"I believe we had good product... I believe we underachieved or over-anticipated on some of the other projects," comments John Abbey, Ichiban president. "Compared to what we're used to at Ichiban, this first year of Ichiban International was not what we anticipated and we needed to regroup."

Ichiban is calling Deadeye Dick, who released "New Age Girl" three years ago, the "casuality" of the renewal. "I think we'll be taking a more realistic and conservative approach to everything," Abbey says of the international imprint. "We want to retain our indentity and utilize the same basic approach to the Ichiban International label that has helped us achieve some measure of success through the independent network.'



L.A. alternative music pioneers Fishbone stopped in at New York City's Hit Factory for a unique recording session with Argentina's Los Fabulosos Cadillacs to do an equally unique ska/punk/polka version of the Tom Jones evergreen "What's New Pussycat," which will be on the compilation Red, Hot & Latin, to be released in December by Jellybean Benitez's H.O.L.A. Records. Produced and arranged by both bands, Fishbone frontman Angelo Moore and Los Fabulosos singer Vicente are featured. Fishbone made the stop while out on tour to support their Rowdy/Arista album Chim Cim's Badass Revenge and the Argentinians are touring the states in support of their Sony Latin album Rey Azucar.



MARLENA SHAW: Dangerous (Concord Jazz CCD-4707) Producer: John Burk.



Marlena Shaw uses song to instill a sense of place beyond the given lyries, personalized by her astute perspective. Her adept, masterful handling of jazz material was marginally hinted at on her famous R&B cover of "Go Away Little (Boy)," which she recast into a humorous fable of a staunch woman pitted against her man's self-indulgent charms. On her new Concord Jazz, release Dangerous, it's Marlena's talent which proves disarming, mated to a rhythm section consisting of bassist Peter Washington, pianist Dave Hazeltine and timekeeper Cifford Barbaro. Altogether, an engine of highly tuned jazz sidemen float her choice modulations into low earth orbit, on the aptly named "Out Of This World,""The Nearness Of You," "Give Me One More Chance," a quick-paced "Whisper Not," "Dim The Lights," and "Blackberry Winter." Selected tracks from this project appeared on Concord's retail CD sampler last month. The label is also promoting the LP in the July issues of Downbeat, Jazziz, Jazz Times and Tower Pulse. Ms. Shaw herself will grace the Blue Note in NY, 7/16-23, and clue in jazzheads at festivals in Port Townsend, WA, San Jose, CA and Necnah, Wl in August. (Peter Miro)

A BIG voice and lots of chops. That's the signature of Jesse Austin, bluesman extraordinaire. If you've got swingin' on your mind then put this CD in your ear. Well-produced by Joe Roesch, he has allowed Austin to exhibit a free flowing blues style that



makes one want to dance to the music. The rhythm section consisting of Arti Dixson on drums, Scott Spray on bass, and Tim DeHuff on guitar play with complete commitment and reckless abandon. Add Austin on Hammond B-3 and the result is pure dynamite. Guesting on cuts 1,2,and 3 are The Blues Brothers Horn Section, "Blue" Lou Marini on saxophone, Alan "Mr. Fabulous"Ruhin on trumpet and Birch "Slide" Johnson on the trombone. Fred Scerbo on saxophone, Mike Smith on trumpet and Drake Smith plays trombone on the rest of the album. If you've got kids, play them "Giving Mama And Papa The Blues." It's a great comment on what's happening on our streets today Most of the tunes are written by Austin and all are well performed. Naird '96: One Man's Journey From Square One

IN THE TURBULENT SCRAMBLE for the consumer's entertainment dollar, and in the aftermath of last years's confusing and somewhat dismal retail season, it's encouraging to hear that an individual can still make modest but steady gains in the record business. That was a recurrent message at the conference held by the National Assn. of Independent Record Distributors (NAIRD) in Baltimore in late May.

During the opening day of NAIRD '96, participants in the "Crash Course" were presented with mini-panels on record industry issues ranging from signing an artist to printing and pressing the record to marketing and distribution. Each set of expert panelists hit the high points on his or her topic. Then audience members were invited to ask questions, which moderator Susan Piver (Upaya Records) suggested should contain enough detail to be relevant to other listeners. Sometimes the answers were comprensive; sometimes, well...

During the fourth section, "Selling Your Recording To The Consumer," one gentleman took the floor and reminded everyone of the true spirit of independence.

Bob Griffin of To Go Records told the tale of creating his one-year-old label, "due to the fact that I couldn't get my foot in the door any other way," and of his willingness to make whatever deal was necessary to get the music before the public. He built up his own distribution network among "liquor stores, ice cream stores, gas stations and grocery stores." From a base of 10 such spots, selling two or three units each which returned \$300 a month,

he has developed over 70 outlets in the last 12 months, improved sales with point-of-purchase displays and gained airplay on at least one local station, giving his band the momentum to widen its market.

His postscript was the most revealing, however: "A guy that lives right next door to me, at the same time last year signed with a major label. They had a #6 hit; they toured the whole world, and they're \$55,000 in debt right now." The neighbor has taken a few lessons from Bob and is starting his own thing.

The crash course discussions underlined the inherent difficulties in getting music out. The market has changed dramatically over the past decade. Technological advances have led to a glut of product (anyone can produce a CD these days), as well as an abundance of competing forms of entertainment, which, as Ms. Piver pointed out, will ultimately shrink the retail shelf space available for records. Product buy-ins usually require expensive co-op advertising and end-cap rental, which carry no guarantee of sell-through. Retailers increasing reliance on point of purchase barometers such as SoundScan has led to a shorter shelf life for most titles. And "turnover" has too often become "turnaround," as many indie distributors and labels are paid in returns.

In light of all the grim statistics, Bob's experience was especially refreshing to hear. He took a careful look at what he wanted to accomplish and what he could afford to do and chose to begin a long and difficult journey the old fashioned way: one step at a time.



Another release on deck is Ghetto Style DJ's Bass, Volume 001, Bass' greatest hits. The urban label has also purchased the bulk of the Luke Records catalogue and its publishing interests including the Hangin' With The Homeboys Original Soundtrack.

WAYNE/JAYNE COUNTY: Jayne County (Royalty ROI-105)



TOP UK SINGLES: Hanging in first is the Fugees' "Killing Me Softly" and Peter Andre/Bubbler Ranx's "Mysterious Girl" jumps up to second spot making way for newcomer Mariah Carey's "Always Be My Baby" on three. Baddiel/Skinner/The Lightning Seeds' "Three Lions" is growling on four and Celine Dion's "Because You Love Me" is singing as she reaches five. Newcomer Let Loose "Make(s) It With You" on seven and Pianoman's "Blurred" moves down to eight, and also moving down is Ocean Colouring Scene's "The Day We Caught The Train." Rounding out the chart is Tony Rich Project's "Nobody Knows."

The UK's top Album is **Bryan Adams**' 18 Til 1 Die with top music video seller the Live Cast Recording—Les Miserables still holding on top.

In the video field, top rental is Goldeneye and top sale is X-Files-File 3 - Abduction. Megadrive still reports Toy Story as top rental and Super Nintendo's top rental remains Donkey Kong Country 2. At the boxoffice, Up Close & Personal is dragging them out of the house. U.S. Gold label's Duke Nukem 3D tops the CD-ROM field.

Newest books published in the UK in the music field include Ciaran Carson's Last Night's Fun: Irish Traditional Music from Jonathan Cape Books. Oxford comes up with W.S. Gilbert: A Classic Victorian and His Theater by James W. Stedman. General hardback bestseller is SAS: The Soldiers' Story by Jack Ramsay from Macmillan. Fiction hardback leader is Terry Pratchett's Feet Of Clay, published by Gollanez. General paperback top is Eric Lomax's The Railway Man by Vintage and fiction paperback bestseller is The Horse Whisperer, the Nicholas Evans novel from Corgi.

In Europe, Los Del Rio's "Macarena" is number one at the shops, leading in Germany, Holland and Croatia. Fool's Garden's "Lemon Tree" is picking up the fruit in Iccland, Latvia, Norway, Yugoslavia and Israel. Metallica's "Until It Sleeps" is wide awake in Finland, Denmark and Sweden, while Mr. President's "Coco Jamboo" is being saluted in Austria and Switzerland. Take That is finding out "How Deep Is Your Love" in Lithuania and Macedonia.

In Europe's album market Metallica's Load is loading up the money in Austria, Germany, Denmark, Norway, Finland and Switzerland. Eros Ramazzotti's Dove C'E Musica (Where Is The Music) is finding out in Italy, Sweden and Spain. In Spain, the Spanish-language version is in second place. Alanis Morrissette's Jagged Little Pill is being dropped most in Ireland and Holland.

EVERYTHING'S COMING UP PLUSES: Thorn EMI at £18.45 is up 1.1% and **Rank Organization**'s £5.13 hits 0.8%. **PolyGram**'s NLf 101.40 (£38.43) is up 0.3%.

PRETTY POLY - GRAM: After last year's disappointing profit figures released by PolyGram, blame is being put on the lack of important record releases, losses in PolyGram's film division and the strong Dutch currency. However, the market is looking for an improved profit report this year. Among the expected big moneymakers for the company are new albums by The Cranberries, Sting and Bryan Adams as well as U2's latest effort due before Christmas. The company's music division is expected to raise profits by some 8.5% this year. Meanwhile, PolyGram is reportedly the only European company in the battle to purchase Hollywood's MGM.

THORN-Y WEATHER: NO. Last week it was assumed that Thorn EMI had a 27% increase in pre-tax profits for the year, an increase from £423 million to £539 million. At the same time, the market was told that the company will issue normal demerger proposals to its stockholders on July 22. As previously reported, this will involve separating the Thorn rentals division from the EMI Group by giving one Thorn share for each Thorn EMI share. Market mavens expect EMI Group to be valued at £13.50 a share, making the company worth some £5.9 billion and Thorn at £5.00 would be worth some £2 billion. Sir Colin Southgate, chairman of Thorn EMI said EMI Music ended the year with 30 albums hitting more than one million units each. And this year was off to a great start with George Michael's Older selling 2.5 million in three weeks. Also expected to bring smiles to the company is the new Beatles release due this autumn. EMI Music, together with HMV. the retail record chain and Dillons' bookstores will, after the demerger form the EMI Group. The Thorn division, in the meantime, is continuing to expand into the rent-to-buy furniture and personal computer markets and HMV is also building new outlets in Asia and North America. Meanwhile the grapevine reports that the News Corp., Viacom, Disney or Seagram will mount a takeover bid once the demerger is official and both companies are listed separately on the market on August 36th.

GOING MY WAY: Which is what HMV executives are learning to do. What with some 231 outlets in seven countries, there are different customs to be found everywhere. Usually most people in Europe enter a store, then turn right.

However, in Australia they walk to the left, which means local stores had to be re-arranged to suit this local custom. Then in Japan, European HMV officials were shocked to see handwritten notes offering the sales clerks' personal comments and reviews of records pasted all over the stores. However, when it was explained to them that in Japan personal opinions are very highly valued and appreciated by the customers, the HMV people gave in, but insisted that the notes be printed, instead of handwritten.

WHAT CIGARETTE ARE YOU FLYING? Well, you'll soon find out. Newest trend in flying will be in the skies later this year. Irish independent airline, Ryanair has started selling advertising to be painted on the outside of its Boeing 737s, with two deals reported ready for the signing line. Ryanair chairman, Tony Ryan, said the first 'advertising' jet should be airborne within a couple of months.

HIT THE HIGH NOTE and open a classical music agency. While agents normally take 10% of earnings, the trend is toward the 20% figure. And there are few low notes in the business with the top six UK agencies having a turnover of more than £75 million a year average. And where does the money come from? From fees paid to top performers like Pavorotti, Carreras, Domingo, Zubin Mehta and Itzhak Perlman among other stars. And who pays the fees? Well, it's likely to be you and me, even though most of us won't be caught dead at the opera house or concert hall. Opera houses and concert halls and symphonies want these guys (and gals) to top their bills, and to get them they have to pay top dollar. Only problem is, they don't got the bucks. So, appealing to the government's pride and prestige in having these stars, the almost bankrupt venues come up with government funds to bring 'em in. Only problem is that, with shrinking government funds, there's less money to go around, and since the stars aren't taking pay cuts, it's the smaller groups, dependent on government funds, that are finding themselves out in the cold and more and more cities are losing their local opera companies and symphony orchestras.

SORRY PAUL, LINDA AIN'T NO LADY: All because the Queen passed him by when handing out titles in her annual honor list, Paul McCartney was overlooked but Beatles' producer George Martin, who was with the group from the start, got his title, as did Harvey Goldsmith, the UK's best known promoter of pop concerts. Also making it into the Knight was Van Morrison, the North Ireland singer who sang at the rally for Clinton in Belfast last year and George Shearing, the blind jazz pianist.

I WANT I WANT: Well, Richard Branson is going to make sure you get it. Virgin Airlines, on their upcoming new London-to-Washington flights will have power points for laptop users. The trial run, in association with Matsushita will offer on-demand audio and video entertainment to individual users. If successful, Virgin plans to expand the system eventually to all its flights.

THREE CHERRIES COMING UP at most of the UK's 9,000 betting shops as new laws come into effect this week, allowing them to install up to two machines at each venue. Initial reports are that some 10,000 are waiting at the warehouses and by the end of the week the one-armed bandits will be pulling away. Jackpots, however, will be limited to £10 (\$15). Ladbrokes, the UK's top bookmaker, which has some 1,900 shops expects by the end of the year to have profits of £6 million from the slot machines. The current estimate of slot machine money, without taking in the new betting shops, is £9 billion a year, making it the UK's second most popular form of gambling, beaten out only by the National Lottery. GIMME MY MONEY - NOW!: That's being heard almost daily now by the UK theatrical agents. Currently, all monies due talent are paid to the agent, who usually takes out his 10%, then banks or forwards the money to the talent. However, last week, top agency Sharon Hamper filed for bankruptcy leaving more than 140 unpaid creditors, mainly television actors. One of the leading losers is Carolin Quentin, star of the comedy series Men Behaving Badly (currently an American version is being filmed) who is out £400,000. Talent unions are reviewing current pay systems, with many people demanding payments made directly to the artists involved. However, many agents fear they would be losing out on their percent-

IS IT MORE MONEY OR LESS MONEY?: That's what members of Equity, the actors union, will be trying to figure out when they vote on a new system of payments for cable and satellite screenings. The change is to switch from royalty to residual basis. Under the royalty system, talent is paid 20-100% of their original fee. Residuals pay a flat fee for reruns, based on a percentage of the cost of the show. Equity claims the new system means more programs will be sold, thus more money for its members. Cable and satellite companies have complained costs are too high and have opted for more foreign shows. Terrestrial broadcasters will continue paying royalty.





Disney's Hunchback's Good 'N Edgy

The bellringer Quasimodo, not just another pretty face from Disney.

AUTHOR VICTOR HUGO'S oft-told tale of the kind heart hidden under the frightening visage of malformed human flesh continues even in animation to fascinate.

Perhaps the author did, in 1830 or thereabouts (Notre Dame De Paris was first published in 1831-the Hunchback was added to the title in its second English translation in 1833), intend his now-classic tale as a defense of the Gothic architecture of those Parisian times but the story is so richly layered with its metaphorical themes of man's inhumanity to man, obsession, cruelty and the indomitability of spiritual love and kindness that it never fails to compell-at least it hasn't for the past 166 years.

And apparently everyone connected with the project has gone back to Hugo's original work to draw inspiration from within their own particular area of expertise. Tab Murphy constructed the first animation script adaptation from Hugo's book and subsequently-following credited writers Irene Mecchi, Bob Tzudiker & Noni White, and Jonathan Roberts, as well as animators returned to it. Will Finn, Story Artistic Supervisor, found in reading the book that Hugo has referred to Quasimodo as believing that the stone Gargoyles surrounding the Cathedral belltower were alive and treated them as his brothers and sisters. From that original thought came a trio of animated friends known as Victor, Hugo (get the tribute?) and Laverne, who aren't too far removed from Timon & Pumbaa of Lion King. Still, it serves to relate that original authors can occasionally contribute something in Hollywood.

Disney's Hunchback Of Notre Dame continues the studio's stepping out of total fantasy, fables and princess subservient to prince, i.e., male-dominant pieces. Also, as in last year's Pocahontas, not only is this year's heroine Esmeralda perfectly capable of standing on her own feet, she is strong minded and also will

never be mistaken for anything other than a beautiful and desirable woman, artistic construction-wise. Even obsessive villain Frollo sings of her desirability and his haunted wish to possess her in an impressive sequence contrasting the dual sides of Esmeralda's appeal to each of their spiritual interiors "Heaven's Light"/"Hellfire." It also forwards the Disney use of computer generated animation co-mingling with traditional hand drawing to open up sequences to a level of vista-like proportions that would frighten the budgets of live-action features into closing the books. The aerial sequences above the city of Paris are toe-curling while the colorful mosiacs inside the cathedral are breathtaking.

The score by Alan Menken, with lyries by Stephen Schwartz advance both story and character and explore the dark and soft sides of the people, impressively opening with "The Bells Of Notre Dame" which serves as a set-up for the following story and reaches almost operatic proportions. "Out There," Quasimodo's touching desire to be able to go amongst the people in the square serves to bring the gentle beauty out of the misshapen exterior well enough that, especially from that point on, one never thinks of him as ugly again. "God Help The Outcasts' is Esmeralda's plea, performed in the vast cathedral is impressive and succeeds in adding strength to her character as sung by Heidi Mollenhauer, furthering the theme of cruelty by the powerful to the common citizen. "Heaven's Light" and "Hellfire" go directly to the heart of all that matters, contrasting Quasimodo's inner compassion and love with his darker exterior and Follo's powerful, ramrod straight dignity carriage with his twisted, murky and diabolically cruel interior. Story and character- wise it is progressive and powerful. This is some of Menken and Schwartz's best and deepest work.

The voice talents are all impressive with Quasimodo vocalized and voiced by Tom Hulce; Demi Moore's smoky tones speak for Esmeralda while Heidi Mollenhauer sings; Tony Jay brings a powerful mien, chilling and rolling to the character of Frollo; Kevin Kline adds humor to the heroics of love interest/soldier Phoebus, and Paul Kandel is solid as narrator/puppeteer Clopin. The Gargoyle pals of the Hunchback liven up the humor via the voices of Jason Alexander, Charles Kimbrough and the late Mary Wickes—this was her last job and serves as a terrific memoriam. David Ogden Stiers voices the Archdeacon.

Directors Gary Trousdale and Kirk Wise have succeeded in bringing an eloquent vision to the screen, in keeping with its predecessors. A terrific piece of work.

WB's Eraser, Action-Comedy In Y'Facer

Arnold anoints Vanessa Williams into the world of action—and the lady has a whole new career open to her.

IT'S A GOOD THING no one connected with the making of Eraser took it seriously. As a reality-based piece of drama, 1 mean. It goes without saying they took, and do take, the quest for boxoffice bucks seriously Eraser should rub Cable Guy out of first place, at least during its opening

weekend. It has Arnold, action, and...well, that's what Arnold-action fans go to see. And there's the most wicked weapon—a ray gun that sees and shoots through brick walls, but not overturned refrigerators—which all the hullabaloo is really about. Ming the Magnificent began working on that in the movies back when Buster Crabbe was Flash Gordon, but it's taken Arnold, FX and computer generation with digital sound to really blow it up big. You gotta see this to believe it; this thing has more twists than the tails of frantically swimming sperm.

Alright, Arnold's the *Eraser*, meaning he removes the pasts of federal witnesses and gives them a clean new life. Course, all the bad guys are in the government so he's pretty much fighting a losing battle. But he's a hero—that classic definition being given, you understand, to he who can dodge countless rounds coming at him from automatic weapons while making each of his single

shots count. And here he's taking care of Vanessa Williams, who's just turned stoolie on a secret weapon that *everyone* is after. Don't ask who all, I don't think even the committee of writers know. So, now the chase is on, semi-climaxing in a holocaust at the docks where Arnold is shown as at least half mortal; he bleeds, but he's impervious to pain. That's all you need to know. But don't leave after that, there are a few more chuckles during a inisunderstanding between a governmental limo and a speeding train after that.

Director Charles Russell struck it big with his helming of The Mask.

Russell and writer committee members Tony Puryear and Walon Green (Screenplay), Puryear, Green & Michael S. Chernuchin (Story by) search valiantly for a good catch phrase for Arnold but don't come up with a really good one. And there's an attempt to give his character human tenderness in assuring Williams he'll take care of her early on but, come on, guys, this is Arnold-Action, not Kindergarten Cop.

There are some fun performances throughout the piece; notably James Caan as the Eraser's crooked boss (suppose that could have been filehed from Mission's Phelps character?—Nahhh); James Coburn as...well, some high secret muckety muck; and Robert Pastorelli as one of Eraser's past successes. All of them capture the fun feeling and show what "acting experience" means. God, I love performances from old pros. Check out Joe Viterelli also as waterfront Union head Tony Two Toes. Just a delight.

But the breakthrough performance of the film is Vanessa Williams. She jumps in with both feet, keeps her attention precisely on what's going on around her and rolls with the rhythms of the fun just like one of the old pros she's working with. Director Russell and director of photography Adam Greenberg also took care to show her to best advantage.

City Of Angels

Up above the stage I saw the silhouette of a piano player outlined with the swooning sound of a saxophone and sharply edged by a lamenting trumpet. My heart pounded with the bass and percussion and I had the eerie feeling if I jammed a Lucky between my lips and downed a shot of rye l'd be back at the bar with Hammett and Chandler, listening to the exploits of Marlowe and Spade. Yeah, it was a moment as beautiful as the brunette in white sheer satin caught mid-stride and backlit by a klieg light.

Actually it's the Studio

Theatre Playhouse presentation of the Colony production of City Of Angels and it's a good one. No, make that superb. It just opened and has already been extended into August.

For those who don't know City Of Angels has its book by Larry Gelbart who's written for all the visual arts plus radio, but who'll probably be historically remembered for developing and co-producing M*A*S*H for TV. Cy Coleman, Broadway and film composer, did the music and David Zippel brought in the lyrics. All three took Tony Awards for City Of Angels, which is a remembrance of Film Noir Hollywood; a film within a play spiced by the peccadilloes of filmdom players, insightful and delightful with laughs and nostalgia offered up in one of the best theatre packages you're going to find in L.A.

City Of Angels lends itself wonderfully to the intimate theatre situation that is The Colony. The highly imaginative set and lighting design by Richard D. Bluhm (Design Consultant) and Ted Ferreira respectively, makes delightful and sometimes near awe-inspiring use of space to keep dark time for changes down to bare seconds—there are 21 scenes in Act One and 19 comprising Act Two—never impeding the show's flow. And working within that, gilding it with focus-pulling direction and musical staging which often gives the impression we're indeed watching one of those wonderful film noir classics, are the knowledgeable hands of Nick DeGruccio & Todd Nielsen. When we're watching the participants, Filmland lives. The '40's period costumes are colorful and H'wood-ish, Babe, and during the film's story line we're seeing various shades of B&W and greys. All this and music to boot.

And not *just* music. From those musicians behind and above stage to the vocalists *on*, these are first-rank pros. Broadway and Shubert Alley on Riverside

Robert Stoeckle and Todd Nielsen head the cast as Pl Stone and his writer/creator Stine. They're the only two who don't do double duty in both the film and studio time of the play since they truly live within one another and their duet "You're Nothing Without Me" is a dialogue every creative writer lives with, and it's performed marvelously. Stoeckle especially captures his character's timbre vocally, visually and attitudinally. Blaise Messinger as a studio head/director and Lego Louis as a fey actor playing tough cop both stand out. Same with Barbara Passolt, who even delineates her characters musically, and Michelle Duffy who sparkles as a ditzy do-anything starlet and sultries up the stage as her film character. Colleen Fitzpatrick is a solid leading lady type in her dual turn, while Lon Huber delineates characters neatly as a studio barber and a faddish H'wood guru type. Doing terrific vocal duty, especially with as sharp a show opener as can be found are Gary Howe-Scott, Theresa Layne, Ryan Smith and Chris Thomas. Others, all solid, include Jan Pessano, Kurt Boesen, Dean Arevalo, R.A. Mihailoff, David Holladay, Brian Fenwick, Judith Goldstein and Ed Lavelle.

Superb musicians include Conductor/Piano Laurence O'Keefe, Brad Ellis; Jon DaVersa on Trumpet; Ian Dahlberg, Sax; Pablo Motta, bass, and Takashi Kawai, percussion. Vocal direction is by David Holladay. The show is excellently produced by Barbara Beckley. The Saturday (6/15) performance was dedicated to the late, great Ella Fitzgerald who passed that day.

Panamanian singer Camilo Azuquita is one of those rare personalities who have travelled this planet in search of the true meaning of life. For this artist, it's all in one world: Salsa. Having played for the past several decades with greats like Tito Puente, Roberto Roena, Rafael Cortijo, Tipica 73, and others throughout the Salsa kingdom, Azuquita

delivers his latest work. From his home base for the past 17 years, the feeling on this album is definitely European as in "París de Noche." For the more nostalgic fans, "El Pocta" will bring back the Azuquita of yesteryear. The projected hit song is undoubtedly "Mañana Es Domingo," a definitely jumping dance club favorite.

JENNIFER Y LOS JETZ: *Dulzura* (EMI Latin, 38242) Producers: Abraham Quintanilla, Jr., Brian "Red" Moore. TEJANO-MEXICAN.

The late Tejano singer, Selena, has certainly inspired many young female singers throughout the Americas. Jennifer Peña is certainly one shiningexample. Her debut album, dedicated to her idol, feels like what Selena what've sounded like 5 or 7 years ago. Co-produced by the late vocalist's husband, Jennifer and her studio team render a well-produced



project. But will that magic translate into acceptance on a live stage? History will only tell. Watch for the wistful "Tonto" to be an immediate favorite.



of Robin Williams as the voice of the Genie character. Other original voices returning are Scott Weinger (Aladdin), Linda Larkin (Princess Jasmine) and Gilbert Gottfried (Iago). All new characters created for this episode of the successful franchise are Jerry Orbach and John Rhys-Davies. Along with the original voices the Academy Award winning team of Howard Ashman and Alan Menken have created five more original songs, plus a special reprise of the popular "Arabian Knights."

The premiere of Aladdin And The King Of Thieves has been announced for August 13 with the major awareness-building campaign including national TV, print and outdoor advertising and consumer savings opportunities from Disney and General Mills taking place between now and then. MCA Launches Hip-O And Twisted Records

MCA MUSIC ENTERTAINMENT GROUP is expanding its empire with the formation of two new labels. Twisted Records is a new dance music-oriented label headed by the executive team of Rob DiStefano, Mark Davenport, Charles Nobles and Nicholas Mitsakos, announced MCA president Jay Boberg, who'd previously collaborated with DiStefano and Davenport in forming Tribal Records in the early 1990s. (Twisted Records/MCA evolved directly from the 1.R.S.-distributed Tribal; Boberg was formerly President of 1.R.S.)

"Our mission is to be a truly independent label and never to abandon the idealism and attitude that brought us to this point," stated DiStefano. "With MCA, we've got the best of both worlds—the autonomy we want and the financial support we need." Adds Boberg, "MCA Records is incredibly fortunate to enter into a partnership with such visionary entrepreneurs," citing DiStefano and Davenport's stellar reputation in the dance music community. Twisted will release a wide variety of underground House and Dance music. Premiere signings to the label include former Tribal artists Danny Tenaglia and Club 69, as well as Funky Green Dogs/Murk.

Hip-O Records is a new label devoted to the creation of compilation and catalog-oriented packages, announced Bruce Resnikoff, exec. vp/GM, MCA special markets and products. Covering all genres of music, Hip-O makes its debut in July with the release of a Steve Earle best-of double CD. Other initial releases will include two '80s hits packages, two love-song collections, a pair of CDs devoted to R&B instrumentals, as well as collections from The Impressions with Curtis Mayfield and classic movie themes performed by Roger Williams.

Resnikoff announced that Hip-O releases will be bolstered by an aggressive marketing approach. "Hip-O is being launched to provide consumers with a new and reliable source of great music, creatively designed and competitively priced," he explains. "Whether it's the quality of the music, the artwork and packaging, or the sales and marketing, our intent is to reach an audience hungry for catalog product of historical and aesthetic significance. We plan to market Hip-O releases with the same spirit of creativity that goes into the marketing of current product, (making) these releases extremely visible and accessible to the consumer by providing support and incentives to traditional retailers and by capitalizing on newer non-traditional channels of distribution."

Resnikoff also promises a strong commitment to retail from the label. He concluded, "We are going to provide the tools necessary to help retail sell

COUNTRY MUSIC NEEDS AN-OTHER AWARDS SHOW (just kidding). While frantic fans raced around the fairgrounds to meet their favorite artists, Fan Fair week was also the time of the year for country artists to rack up various awards at two different ceremonies—the TNN Music City News Country Awards and the Country Radio Music Awards.

During the live TNN broadcast on June 10, the following artists were bestowed with honors at the Grand Ole Opry: Alan Jackson, Male Artist of the Year and Entertainer of the Year; Lorrie Morgan, Female Artist of the Year; Sawyer Brown, Vocal Band of the Year; Jeff Foxworthy, Comedian of the Year;

Bryan White, Male Star of Tomorrow; Terri Clark, Female Star of Tomorrow; Brooks & Dunn, Vocal Duo of the Year; The Statler Brothers, Vocal Group of the Year; Ricky Van Shelton, Christian Country Artist; Vince Gill, Patty Loveless & Ricky Skaggs, Vocal Collaboration of the Year for "Go Rest High On That Mountain;" and George Strait, Single of the Year for "Check Yes Or No" and Album of the Year for Lead On. 'Valley Gold' Regionals Completed—Next Stop, Vegas!

CHICAGO—With the completion of regional qualifiers, hundreds of winners are making final plans for the trip to Las Vegas where they will compete in the July 11, 12 and 13 "Valley Gold" North American Championships. Champions will compete for a place on Team U.S.A. and the opportunity to go on to Europe for the international competition this fall and bring home the Valley World Cup.

The final round of regionals were held in the following states:

Neon Amusement of Leavenworth sponsored the Kansas match at the Holiday Inn in Kansas City, with 400 entrants and a purse of \$5,400 in cash and prizes plus \$800 in merchandise. The Florida regional was staged at the Firehouse Bar & Grill in Tampa and it produced six winners who will be bound for Vegas. Forty-eight players competed in the Idaho match, sponsored by Coin Machine Service in Boise.

Final event in this series took place in Canada, under sponsorship of Wal-Mac Amusements of Edmonton, Alberta. A total of 21 players competed for \$315 in cash plus an assortment of other prizes.

LAUGHTER WILL BE THE MEDICINE dispensed by the "Laugh Factory Funhouses," a joint venture announced this week by multi-media entrepreneur/record producer Quincy Jones, partner David Salzman and Jamie Masada, founder/president of the famed Hollywood comedy club The Laugh Factory.

Each "Funhouse" will be part of a nationwide chain of comedy-themcd restaurants—in effect a mini-theme park incorporating computer games, joke databases, holographic comic scenes, different comics each hour, an on-line web site, and the traditional Laugh Factory open mike nights. Added flourishes are a Comedy Hall Of Fame ride, displays of items from the Laugh Factory's comedy artifacts collection, an extensive store with "the world's funniest merchandise" and a laugh-filled menu.

Plans are for the first "Funhouse" to open in Las Vegas, with subsequent sites targeted for Atlantic City, New York, Chicago, Los Angeles, and major theme park locations. Construction will begin early in 1997. "The 'Laugh Factory Funhouses' will be the next generation of the live entertainment experience, the repository of the world's laughter, the theme park where comedy is always the theme," commented Jones and Salzman. Adds Masada, "This venture will take comedy to another level. It will be a 'Funhouse' for the next century, a place to spend 20 minutes or 5 hours."

Teaming in 1993, Jones and Salzman have formed a broad-ranging, multi-media company which encompasses programming for current and future technologies, including theatrical motion pictures and network, cable and syndicated television. Among their properties are, *The Fresh Prince of Bel Air*, and *VIBE Magazine*. The duo produced the 68th Annual Academy Awards telecast, and have several films under development with Warner Bros. Pictures. Masada recently formed Laugh Factory Management, to guide the careers of exceptional comic perfomers and writers.

'96 Asian Expo A Big Success

CHICAGO—With expanded floor space, more exhibitors and a 9% increase in total attendance, the 1996 Asian Amusement Expo continues its position as the leading show in Asia for the amusement industry, according to 1996 Show Committee Chairman John Wood of Sally Corporation.

AAE, in its third year in Hong Kong, doubled in terms of exhibit space with 210 booths compared to 105 last year. Noticeable on this year's exhibit floor were displays by major ride manufacturers, many of whom had a presence without product at last year's exhibition and many exhibiting for the first time.

Plans for 1997 include a return to the Hong Kong Convention & Exhibition Centre, with dates to be announced. Simultaneously translated presentations in Mandarin will be a prime consideration in planning next year's educational program. Increased promotion and marketing at big emerging markets in Asia which include Indonesia, The Phillipines, Malaysia and India will be a top priority.

The Asian Amusement Expo is sponsored by the International Association of Amusement Parks & Attractions (IAAPA) and the American Amusement Machine Association (AAMA).


