Easy Choices

JEFFERSON STARSHIP, "MODERN TIMES", RCA

Considering the age of this outfit, it's really quite amazing that arthritis hasn't set in. Just when you think the Starship is ready to be bronzed and put on the shelf, they come back with a record as incredible as "Modern Times". I guess the key is how well they juggle personalities. Mickey Thomas joined the band at precisely the right time to take "Jane" to the top of the Song Index, and make "Freedom At Point Zero" one of the most played LPs last year. Now, for the brand new album, they re-introduce Grace Slick, and lo and behold, if she and Mickey don't make a tremendous vocal team. Her inclusion on the tour and TV shots is icing on the cake. Factor in one of the nicest packages this year, songs like "Stranger", "Save Your Love", "Mary", and "Wild Eyes", and the only word that fits is "inspired".

BILLY SQUIER, "DON'T SAY NO", CAPITOL

Forget playing Billy's new one because "It sounds just like Led Zeppelin." Those Jap overtones on "The Big Beat" did help give the Capitol debut a long airplay ride, but with this excellent follow-up, Squier is certain to score big points for his singing, guitar playing, songwriting and production—all on his own terms. If ever a record had major league requests and retail written all over it, this is the one. I'm totally impressed. WMOR's Joe Bonadonna heard our exclusive advance cassette which was mailed last week, and said: "It's the hottest non-superstar album this year. The production was superb. A lot of very good songs. I listened to the cassette several times and just loved the whole record"...Based on our calls this week, I expect Joe's enthusiasm to be the order of the day. This record will knock radio on its butt. My favorites: "The Stroke", "In The Dark", "My Kinda Lover", and "Whadda Ya Want From Me" (great slide).

"CONCERTS FOR KAMPUCHEA", ATLANTIC

Our #1 Most Added LP with 94 reports...We're hearing a number of Woodstock and Bangladesh comparisons, and there is no denying that from an image standpoint, the package is a killer. It has variety, strong Chris Thomas production, and a number of playable songs, and all for a worthy cause. The Plant/Rockpile number leads comfortably, followed by the Rocketra/McCartney segment; then "Sister Disco" and the Pretenders. Radio Action: Nick Van Cleave, WMF: "It could very well be the best collection of artists for a benefit album since the concert for Bangladesh"...Jim Bedore, KZAP: "I see this as a huge success. Selections for the record are tremendous. There is something here for everybody—a lot of image and a lot of rock and roll"...Ray White, WLIR: "A class compilation from the Who fluffs, the sexy Robert Plant vocals, McCartney's moving 'Let It Be' to the Clash with the perfect reggae tune of the LP—it's hot!"...Robbin Bean, WLPX: "The concert is certainly diversified, so you can't help but find something for any format, esp. album rock"...Steve Rodio, WRNO: "A very high quality recording with no political overtones, no filler, and no dull spots. Each artist featured played their hearts out with the Who and McCartney shining the brightest"...From Dave Benson, WMET: "Receiving very positive phone response already. There's something for everybody—wavers, rockers, punkers and poppers."

SANTANA, "ZEBOP", COLUMBIA

Whether or not the new LP breaks any sales records, radio comments alone make it the leading contender for comeback of the year... "Winning" continues to chew up the Song Index, 16-13 with "Primera Invasion/Searchin'" segue ready to roll up the list...We look for this week's #2 Most Added start to convert to #15 on the Back Page next week...Comments: Phil Strider, KRPI: "The record is unbelievably deep. There isn't a weak spot on the album"...Joe McCabe, KYXS: "The seg sounds so alive on the radio, it's incredible. One of those records you can put on and turn up"...Bob Bittens, WHCN: "The rest of the album lives up to and surpasses the promise of the 12". With all the kiddie crunch around right now, it's great to have some adult oriented rock to crank out"...Says Frank Andrick, KSJD: "To say this could possibly be the best of Santana to date will prove to be no exaggeration"...From Michael Knight, KZOK: "I believe it's the band's best work to be compared with the first album and 'Abraxas'. The most interesting is that it's an ever-changing musical force. On 'Zebop', Carlos is at his best by presenting music that is white, black, and Latin"...Other raves from Clark Ryan, Ron Sorenson, Temple Lindsay, Charlie West, Mark Miller, Paul Heine, Jay Walker, Malcolm Gray, Lin Brenner, Ron Rizzi, Jim Kinney, Nick Van Cleave, Rob Roman, Tom West, Steve Sabantz, and Tim Smith.

CHAIN REACTION CONTINUED

AC/DC, "DIRTY DEEDS DONE DIRTY CHEAP", ATLANTIC

In the hard core AC/DC markets such as Milwaukee, Chicago, Florida, San Jose, Seattle, and Rochester, "Dirty Deeds" has been a workhorse classic, but my estimate is that no more than 25% of our reporters have played it. It may be old material, but it's safe to assume the majority of listeners will perceive it as super valuable new airplay... Robbin Beam of MLPX says: "Ever since we started playing the import last summer, we've had calls on 'Dirty Deeds'. With the domestic release, I expect listeners to treat this as a brand new record. 'Big Balls' is crass and limited to nighttime play, but I love those lyrics"... From WGRQ's Paul Heine: "With 'Back in Black' still charting top 20 in our retail, the timing on 'Dirty Deeds' is perfect. Most phones after just one week's play"... Rad Messick, WYVV notes: "As an import, 'Dirty Deeds' was easily the most requested song, and should be for the domestic as well"... Bob Majorsky, WYUS reports: "'Dirty Deeds' is by far #1 in phones. Their last LP is still top 10 in sales, and this release has the earth dogs wagging their tails in delight"... From Magic at WYFE: "Y95 has been playing the import for at least two years, and I know that Les Cook played it at WYMD before coming here. We have had phenomenal success with the record. 'Dirty Deeds' and 'Big Balls' are the station's most requested songs."

POINT BLANK, "AMERICAN EXCESS", RCA

Looking at 51 first workers on the LP, it's safe to assume that we're looking at top 20 play within the next couple of weeks... As stated in Easy Choice last week, there is a dramatic change in the sound, thanks to new vocalist Bubba Keith... Programmers are pleased with the change: Bob Roman, KLAB: "Good changes for Point Blank. Hurray for whoever is responsible for the new direction"... Mike Wolf, WYLL: "They keep getting better and better with each release. This is by far their best yet. Lots of polish, lots of good guitar hooks, but the best improvement is their vocal work"... Temple Lindsay: "They're a hard-working band and they deserve to do well on this album. I think the new sound is a definite improvement and they made the move at the right time"... Clark Ryan, KAIT: "They sound stronger than ever with their new lead singer. My favorite so far is 'Nicole', but this album is chock full of radio tracks"... Finally, the ultimate rave from Jay Walker, KSMH: "Excess food makes you fat, excess drink makes your liver quiver, excess drugs will fry your brain, but with 'American Excess' you can conquer the world. Hot damn! This is the one!! Glad to see it happening to some of the finest folks anywhere in rock. Instant heavy rotation."

OZZY OSBOURNE, "BLIZZARD OF OZZ", JET

With debuts from last week's 23 adds (including Level I stations), Ozzy landed at the #46 spot on the Index, and an even stronger #41 Metro. When debuts from this week's 37 stations roll in next week, we predict a move into the top 20... WCCC's Paul Payton just completed a heavy metal weekend, and with listeners voting on the heavy metal bands of all time Black Sabbath was first, AC/DC second, and Ozzy Osbourne third!! Here's more: Tom Nast, WSYR: "By far the hottest piece of product here. It's about time the album got released in the States. On my Friday night all-request show, it came up the #1 requested artist/group"... Janel Dolan, KZEM: "The album should be absolutely incredible. The phones have been very, very good, and I expect strong retail soon"... Rob Barnett, WAAF: "Ozzy jumps immediately to most requested here. He'll chew you up and spit you out and you'll love it"... Robbin Beam, MLPX: "Being such a huge Black Sabbath market, Ozzy has to be a natural for us. He actually sings on 'I Don't Know'--the most mass appeal cut, testing well with listeners. Sales debut at #22"... WJOT's new MD Buck McWilliams: "Good immediate phones from the strong cult following. It's the kind of balls rock and roll our market likes."

PRETENDERS, "EXTENDED PLAY", SIRE/WARNER BROTHERS

On the heels of strong import play for "Message Of Love", we're sensing near automatic status for the new EP. "Message" is the early leader, followed by "Talk Of The Town". #6 Most Added with 35 reports including 14 Level I reporters... Comments: Mike Wolf, WYFM: "They continue to grow in the range of the material the band tackles. The album is a more than suitable follow-up to their initial release"... Greg Gillispie, KATY: "I like the EP. Finally some of their greatest songs available in the U.S. 'Message Of Love' is the real standout"... Nick Van Cleve, WYMF: "The message from Chrissy and her Pretenders is that they have all the tattletale signs that the Police and Petty did in the early days. When the Pretender finally releases a second album, they'll go full blown. The EP is going to help spread the following."

WILLIE NILE, "GOLDEN DOWN", ARISTA

After last year's critically acclaimed and heavily played debut, Willie picks up where he left off. 27 stations total for #7 Most Added, including 8 Level I adds: WMET, WPLJ, WGRQ, WRIF, WJOT, WBCN, and WYYS... Also extremely active on the Indicator Level, with new air on: KZEL, WPDH, WYFM, WDBK, WILR, WYFS, WBRU, WOUR, and KTDI... "Poor Boy" leads followed by "Champs Elysees" and the title track... WYXX's Ron Benni comments: "I'm glad to see Willie hasn't suffered the second album syndrome. 'Golden Down' and 'Champs Elysees' give him a chance to develop into a major artist"... From home town fan Paul Heine, WGRQ: "Willie's second album has a warm full sound that wasn't on the first album, yet still retains the street sensuality that made the first one click. If 'Golden Down' doesn't make Willie a star, I'll drink a gallon of Love Canal water"... KRLE's Ron Sorenson adds: "Combine Springsteen, Loudon Hainwright, and Tonio K, give it vigor and drive of a thoroughbred and, Christ, this guy creates more intensity with an acoustic guitar and a single voice that Rush does with five semis full of electronics. It's Willie Nile; and with 'Golden Down', his time has come."

CHART MAULERS:

JUDAS PRIEST, "POINT OF ENTRY", COLUMBIA

The Priest claimed highest debut honors on the Back Page at #18, and was a bonafide Metro mauler 43-17... Last week's #1 Most Added came back with another 6 adds, for a three week total of 75 stations... Strongest play now on MLPX, KISS, and WCCC... On the Song Index, "Heading Out To The Highway" 48-24, "Hot Rockin'" debuts #98... Early retail: Joe Bonadonna, WMNR: "Retail on the Priest is #35, highest debut this week"... Dave Lange reports top 15 sales, and we heard about #19 debut sales and early calls from WYVV's Rad Messick.

HAWKS, COLUMBIA

This week a number of Hawks adds converted to regular airplay mentfont and blawno, the biggest Mauler of the week with a 47-33 14 point jump. We're looking at several Level II increases: WCCC, WPLR, KATT, and WRND as well as WYLL, and KLAB... "It's All Right. It's O.K." is up 61-41 on the Song Index.

FRANKE AND THE KNOCKOUTS, MILLENNIUM/RCA

Franke is basically stable in the major markets, but had an especially great week in the secondaries. Up 39-31 on the Airplay Index... 8 play increases: WCCC, WBLM, WLLZ, WZZO, WYFE, KRPI, KLAB, and WYMF... New play on: KDKB, MABX, KJMN, WYBB, WDTZ, and WSYR... This should make for a healthy Metro Chart gain next week... "Come Back" continues to gain on the Song Index, up 61-58.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION:

When reading the individual station report, please remember that there are three ways in which album rotations are tracked.

1. **PLAYS PER DAY** - This refers to the actual number of exposures an album gets between 6 AM and Midnight on an average day of the reporting week.
2. **PLAYS PER WEEK** - Most of our weekly play reporters go back over their music logs for the previous week, and those totals are relayed to us and printed up.
3. **AIRPLAY EMPHASIS** - Be careful not to confuse this with PLAYS PER DAY/WEEK. EMPHASIS is a system of relative scaling, based on 10. If the highest rotation album gets 8 spins per day, it receives 10 points. If another album gets 4 spins, it merits 5 points, etc. This allows a much more detailed rundown than the conventional light/medium/heavy system.

Check out: 'Fire' (Remember Arthur Brown?) and 'We Are The Band'...Thanks to everyone who made our 'Kampuchea' night in New York an evening to remember, and I hope everyone enjoyed the local parties and videos ('What! You're only playing 10 cuts! WPLJ is!)..Not to Lisa Richards: Some day the twain shall meet...Heavy Rotation At Home: 'Kampuchea'; The Who; Phil Collins; Adam & The Ants; The Who; Ozzy Osbourne; and The Who."

BRUCE MOSER, COULD BE WILD (716-885-5200): "U-2 continues to build. Two months into this project it still new stations are adding the record. Many stations are increasing rotation due to requests and sales, and their live show is awesome. 'I Will Follow' has just been released as a single which will have an unreleased live version of 'Out Of Control' on the other side. Special thanks to: Frank Andrick and Michele Robinson for their kind words about U-2...Tom Petty's new album ships the first week in May and is titled 'Hard Promises'. The cover shot has a picture of Tom Petty in a Mexican record store. A special note of interest is that \$9.98 is airbrushed over one of the record bins...Two debut acts that look like they're going all the way are: Franke & The Knockouts and the Hawks. Both albums have the depth not only to make it on album radio, but have Top 40 hits also...The Kim Carnes single 'Just Like Bette Davis Eyes' (written by Jackie DeShannon) is a smash. It's great to see two great artists combine forces to have a hit...Speaking of great female artists, the Rosanne Cash album is fantastic. I hope CBS Records and radio don't overlook this album. It's the album that Linda Ronstadt wishes she had recorded...Coming soon: A great follow-up album by 20/20...A&R departments call me if you want a copy of Visitor (could be the next Loverboy) or Dr. Goodfoot And His Toxic Sox with their Fabulous Shoehorns doing a great novelty song called 'Dig Me I'm A Pigmy'."

MIKE COOPER ON IMPORTS (404-627-2834 mornings), (404-355-8686 afternoons): "Tracks I've heard from the upcoming import album from Dexys Midnight Runners sound as strong, if not stronger, than the last LP...The current 12" from Lene Lovich of 'New Toy' is twice as catchy as the 7" version, and while spirited, is a bit more subdued than her previous material...The new Stranglers single 'Just Like Nothing On Earth' is, I believe, the first single that shows a sense of humor for the band. It's lighter than, but reminiscent of the old Who single 'The Relay'...Highly recommended is the new Dave Edmunds single, the John Fogarty-penned 'Almost Saturday Night.' (The same song found in the current Rick Nelson LP)...In Australia, 'Crazy In The Night' is the newest single from the current Sherbs album...Also, in the country, Adam & The Ants have reached the #1 position on both the album and singles charts...And finally from Down Under, a new Harry Nilsson album has been released there that's very entertaining, as well as boasting an impressive line up-of guests...Among independent singles out in the U.K. of note: New Order, the three surviving members of Joy Division joined by one member's girlfriend, with a single called 'Ceremony.'; Altered Images' debut single 'Dead Pop Star,'; and the last single from Essential Logic called 'Music Is A Better Noise'...Coming soon from the U.K. are new albums from: Roy Wood, Peter Green, Public Image Limited, Ken Hensley (ex-Uriah Heep)'s new band Shotgun, Whitesnake, and another ELO boxed set...To Bob Barnes: Welcome back to the U.S. Call me when you can."

HEAVY LENNY BRONSTEIN, PUSH (213-656-4787): "There is a generation gap in AOR programming and promotion that is not unlike the gap in popular music between the 40's, 50's and likewise the 50's & 60's. Unfortunately, those earlier gaps were not crucial to the ultimate success of a corporate bottom line, especially in respect to music programming in the 80's...When the integration of black musicians by Benny Goodman into big bands occurred, more than a few eyebrows were raised. But none of them were a confrontation to an 'educated' & 'aware' group of programmers. Helping to decide, devise, alter & shape the tastes of the American listening public.... They weren't a serious threat because no one understood or accepted them and they were consequently dismissed as avant-garde (to be kind). In 1981 the doors to our auditorium of musical awareness & experience are all open...It's not that there's nothing new under the sun or in the speakers. It's just that we've heard most of their origins & permutations and are thoroughly prepared for something new. Granted, we may not always accept or embrace it, but new musical visions have outlets to allow their growth & nurturing. So what is this generation gap? Well, it's those of us who lived through the golden era of the birth of progressive rock music, radio & concert halls. After watching 'Altered States', the amateurish, the well-intentioned laser show in San Diego and pulling out my old Fillmore East T-shirt, I thought it would be wonderful to go to a concert again with Pablo's or Joe's lights...The watercolor fantasy pulsating on the screens behind live rock acts. It was really a flash to be bombarded aurally & visually. The point is, while I don't believe in dwelling in the past, the past can teach us a lot...And there just aren't enough of us in the present who know about the past. This generation gap is not a serious felony, but a sad error of omission. There are some talented 'young Turks' in radio & promotion who have a 'better' way or feel they do. But many lack the soul and real intensity of desire & emotion to be part of the dream we all dreamt 15 years ago. There aren't many keepers of the flame left as time marches on. But to be replaced by the David Stockmans of the world who live by the pencil sharpener or press clipping is a slap in the face to many who toiled these 15 years to make album radio & its promotion a better place...While music isn't the only thing, it was the main thing that got us started & unified us. The other motive was our desire for a different, more intimate & less intimidating form of communication."

BILL MCGATHY, RCA (212-930-4095): "This week - the Jefferson Starship and 'Modern Times' - ending all doubt as to who the premier American Band might be! Check out, in addition to the single, 'Mary', 'Save Your Love', and 'Stranger'--all wonderful tracks...If you're not playing Franke and the Knockouts, you should throw in the towel! It's a great new band with great tunes, great singing and great playing, and oh-I almost forgot--they've got a hit record!...Till next week, cheers."

JOEL WEBBER, INDEPENDENT (212-255-7408): "I really l-o-v-e the 'Kampuchea' album--Not just for the good music on it, or the social concern it shows, but also for the great variety of the kinds of music on it. Surely someone who buys the record for Queen or the Who stands a good chance of getting turned on to Elvis, Pockpile, The Clash, or Ian Dury and the Blockheads. At the risk of being accused of fiscal favoritism, the Ian Dury track sounds like the most dynamic performance on the record...Be on the lookout for the American release of the Killing Joke album which includes the club smash 'Change'. Killing Joke could simply be categorized as one of the worlds first heavy/New Wave/metal bands and 'Change' is a great Led Zep dance boogie...New from Jem is a 12" single of Alan Vega's electronic rockabilly titled 'Jukebox Baby'. Be there, or be square...Bill's new concept of splitting up reporting stations into levels could turn out to be very interesting. I can only hope that the Indicator Level is there for the purpose of helping stations choose new records, and not for segregating more musically liberated stations from the stodgy pack."

MICHAEL PLEN, IRS (212-826-0430): "The Wall Of Voodoo tour has finished with great success. After ten dates on the East Coast, the band has firmly reached some established ground and has created a buzz about in every city they've played. There was a good follow-up with records despite the lack of airplay. It's not too late to go back to the 'Passenger' and 'Can't Make Love'...The Cramps new album 'Psychedelic Jungle' debuts this week. It's a cross between the 60's 'psychedelic' period and the rockabilly music which is vastly spreading here. Additional interest should be placed on songs 'Goo Goo Muck' and 'Green Fuzz'. It's an interesting change from the boring old rock that's being played now...Coming April 15th, tax day, is Magazines new album called 'Play'. Recorded live in Australia, it shows the bands professionalism and musicianship--their ability to perform as five individual members. Songs to look for are: 'The Light Pours Out Of Me' and 'Model Worker'...Just signed Klaus Nomi, the German rock/opera singer, most noted for his work with David Bowie. To be out on May 12th...Along with an album by Van Coover based Payola\$... Vejur Quote A.: Any shocking crime generates its share of high intensity."

JUDY LIBOW, ATLANTIC (212-484-6063): " 'Big Balls' equal big calls--Bill, where do you get your lines???... The 'Concerts For Kampuchea' Lp is off and running! It was nice seeing all the familiar faces at our United Nations gathering (even the 2 'screamers' in the corner)...Would like to recommend a track to listen to from the Phoebe Snow Lp in case you missed it--'Mercy, Mercy, Mercy' featuring Jackson Browne on vocals with Phoebe. It's got all the elements for album radio...In the 'who would have ever thought' department: Leon Redbone's 'Seduced' is fast becoming a Top 40 smash! If you've got a creative morning person or team, try this song out. At the very least, YOU might get a phone call!...To Jon Scott: 'Double Critical' is an understatement! Here's hoping my rhythms pick up!..P.S.: Think Ozzy can handle a parrot?...Final change on our bumper sticker--'Have You Hugged Your Promotion FERRET Today?' (I know that's one the Galliani Brothers didn't come up with!)"

BONNIE SIMMONS, WARNER BROTHERS (213-841-2400): "First of all, congratulations Mark Wallace from Pittsburgh and his wife, baby girl; Sue Brett from Seattle and her husband, baby girl; and Susan Costello, not a baby girl but diamonds are a girl's best friend...Down to business. The U-2 album certainly is taking off for us. Pl-e-ease go see them when they play your area. Their tour thus far has gotten nothing but rave reviews and the record is selling very nicely for us everywhere it's being played. (Get it? Everywhere it's being played)...The Ry Cooder pro should be in your hands by this time and I think it's terrific. Most of the Northeast has already added the record and we're starting to get adds in other parts of the country too. Lead cuts are 'Solid Rock', 'Send Me An Angel', 'Rather Be Blind'. Robin will also be touring extensively in the next few months...My rave concert review for this week goes to Prince. I've seen him quite a few times before, however his show at Flipper's this week was extraordinary. Please dig out either his last album or the pro we sent recently (which has an extra cut on it not on the Lp) and take a listen again. We all believe that Prince is the coming thing in multi-formats. For you preppies out there (yea, you too, Bill) if you think his costume is strange take a look at the first Jimi Hendrix cover. I was completely wowed by his show. Not only in Prince's performance but his band is one of the tightest I've seen in ages...Let's just say this is no social crisis, it's just another tricky day."

About the only good thing to be said is that there's a heavy dose of Spring in the air, as temperatures threaten the 80 degree mark...Musicwise we're hearing great things about 'No Turning Back' from SHERBS. Did you hear 'I Have The Skill' on network TV during the NCAA Basketball Playoffs? Certified 'mainstream'!...Jah Malla does a wonderfully danceable version of John Fogarty's 'Bad Moon Rising'...Coming very soon: Humble Pie's 'Go For The Throat'...Congratulations to the pros at DIR for landing three of their live King Biscuits on vinyl: 'When The Whip Comes Down'; 'Whip It'; and, 'Precious'...Personal to Gary Nixon: Nice job on the move. The snake head is in the mail."

MIKE BONE, ARISTA (212-489-7400): "Willie Nile--check it out! Try on WMET, WPLJ, WRIF, WMMS, and the LOOP for first day activity. Not meaning to rub a sore point, but the short kid from Buffalo is headed for top ten airplay and you can take that to the bank! Nuff said. The trax are: 'Poor Boy', 'Golden Down', 'Can't Get You Off My Mind', 'Grenade', and 'Champs Elysees'...Gino Vannelli on album rock? You bet. It's really good to have some easily identifiable music to play on the radio. I'm also quite excited about the new Pretenders and Robin Lane albums. The Pretenders new tracks show a continuation of that great debut of theirs last year...The Robin Lane album shows maturity towards a harder rock sound which may lead to greater acceptance for the band...The new Willie Nile is great. He has come so far from his debut of last year. 'Golden Down' will be around for months to come...Point Blank offers some good old power pop, a la Southern style...The double live Dead set is perfect for the Spring season...The new Robert Gordon also leans to a harder rock sound which may be good for Gordon...We finally got a chance to add the 'Shot In The Dark' album this week. Al Stewart's production shines through...Don't overlook the Cold Chisel album, a hot group in Australia. This is their third album. It's clean and sounds good...Who can guess what the 'Concerts For Kampuchea' collection is going to do, but it contains some of the best live tracks to be released in quite some time...The kids love the AC/DC. Let's hear it for the lower demos...The Who, of course, moved to #1 this week...Greg Kihn, Pat Travers, Manfred Mann, Santana, and Ozzy Osbourne made bounds this week... We've got the Fools live this Friday, I can't wait...Till next time, be good."

WAAL, BINGHAMTON, NY P.D.-ROBERTA HABER: "Adds: Santana, Point Blank, 'Concerts For Kampuchea', Willie Nile, Judas Priest, AC/DC, and Steely Dan 45...Hots: Who, Styx, REO. Steve Winwood, April Wine, Todd Rundgren, Journey, James Taylor, 38 Special, Eric Clapton, Hall and Oates 45, Rush, and Rick Springfield...Woe is me, what's the PD of an upper demo-oriented album rock to do when faced with AC/DC, Judas Priest and Ozzy Osbourne? Through the magic of dayparting, we managed to get to Judas and AC/DC this week. I actually don't mind 'Head Out To The Highway' by Judas Priest. It's a good warm weather-drive-with-your-windows-open song...We went with the title cut from AC/DC...Now for the things I liked this week: At the top of the list has to be the new Willie Nile. If you can get past the 'Darkness On The Edge Of Town' clone cover, there's some excellent music inside. Side 2 is the especially fine side. 'Golden Down' has all the freshness and energy of early Dylan, Springsteen, and Forbert, all rolled into one. 'Champs' is guaranteed to make you smile. I hope this will be a big one for Willie...The Santana came in this morning. All those pre-release raves were right on the mark. I had a hell of a time picking a cut to join the single. There's a great version of J.J.Cales 'Sensitive Kind' which segues into a hot instrumental. 'E Poppa Re' is a fine tune in the Latin Santana tradition. But when the dust settled we went with the rejuvenated Cat Stevens song, 'Changes'. The album has a wonderful dance-in-the-spring-sunshine feel to it...The Point Blank is strong, too. We added the single--better late than never...As far as the 'Kampuchea' album goes, how can you argue with a record that features The Who, McCartney, Queen, etc., and is for charity, too. We're putting 'Little Sister' in rotation and playing nearly all the rest of it open...I also listened to some good things this week that I couldn't get to. Check out the George Wallace record on 'Portrait'. There's a great song called 'Back At 17'. Terrific lyrics."

WWWV, CHARLOTTESVILLE, WV M.D.-PHIL KIRZYC: "The Boomtown Rats prematurely released 'I Don't Like Mondays'. It would have had more meaning to a lot of folks at RSO and the Republican party if released this week. It seems a lot of people are going to enlarge the unemployment line. Old Indian curses should never be taken lightly. Through it all, I still managed to subject my ears to some interesting beats and rhythms. Take for instance Santana. Old importwise, fresh domestically, especially with Bon cranking those Db's out over the airwaves...I see good things coming out of Great Buildings. We're starting with 'Hold On To Something'...And rounding out the list for this week: Pretenders and Greg Kihn."

WPYX, ALBANY, NY M.D.-RON NENNI: "Adds This Week Include: Santana; Grateful Dead; Willie Nile; Pretenders; 'Concerts For The People Of Kampuchea'; and, AC/DC...First of all, we're excited about the test pressing and the cover art for the PYX106 album--Albany's best rock and roll, produced in association with Big Music American. It sounds great. When the first shipment arrives, I'll make it available to all. Our local band, Visitor, is on the charts at #21. Look for 'em soon. The Who, Eric Clapton and April Wine all moved into Top 10 this week...We moved the Greg Kihn up in rotation, simply due to the fact that it's a great record...Adam and the Ants is pulling phone calls. We're gonna try and test it for negative response this week too...Finally, I am going to be out of town for a week and a half, in Acapulco for my honeymoon Pam and I thank all who have called and sent cards-- we appreciate it."

KGON, PORTLAND, OR M.D.-GLORIA JOHNSON: "Top five sales this week: Loverboy, Styx, REO, Rush, AC/DC... Requests: #1 Loverboy again, Judas Priest, REO, April Wine and Rush...Listened to a bunch of new records this week that ranged from horrible to mediocre. Some of which had good musicianship, but lousy vocals or versa. Most of which had one thing in common--lack of a great song...Cold Chisel merges as the one band with that hot tune, 'My Baby'. It's infectious, it makes you want to sing along right away. It defies stereo types or labels; therefore, anyone can play it. Dirty Pool Management has another winner on their hands...We officially added the domestic Ozzy Osbourne this week, although we played the import before. Thanks to Roger Lifeset for arranging the phone interview with Ozzy last week. Sabbath fans are already eating up the album. We're using 'Crazy Train' as it seems to have the most energy. And the last at the beginning and the end are fun...Sorry to report the imminent demise of the Portland Paramount Theater as a rock venue. City officials decided that the Civic Auditorium is not enough. They need additional space for a grandious performing arts center. A 19 million dollar ballot measure was approved yesterday allowing the city to condemn the theater, as the current owner refuses to sell, so they can renovate and turn it into a place where rock and roll acts will not be welcome. Looks like a 1981 Paradise Theater right here in Portland. That leaves us with a huge void for live rock...But, basketball is alive and well--Portland Trailblazers get ready to stomp Kansas City Kings in the first round of the NBA playoffs!"

WHCN, HARTFORD, CT M.D.-BOB BITTENS: "Kampuchea' is definitely the Woodstock of 1981. How can it miss with outstanding live performances by the Who, Rockpile, and Paul McCartney. Paul has the all time best rock and roll voice, hands down. No one else can do the ballads as beautifully or scream the rockers as scorchingly as he can. We get heavy response from our phones every time we play a track--and judging by the video I saw last week, the movie will no doubt be a major box office success...Kid Leo was right last week when he said that as far as the audience is concerned, Ozzy Osbourne is Black Sabbath. 'Blizzard of Oz' is our most requested new album. Running a close second request wise is AC/DC's 'Dirty Deeds'. I have a feeling that a couple of weeks from now, I'll wish I'd never heard of 'Big Balls', but for now it seems to be keeping the kiddies happy...We got the Santana album last week and sure enough the rest of the album lives up to or surpasses the promise of the 12". As you could no doubt tell from my comments last week, Carlos has always been one of my favorite musicians...With all the kiddie crunch around right now, it is great to have some adult-oriented rock to crank out. I was a bit skeptical last week about the Starships' 'Find Your Way Back' and so didn't add it, but after some additional listening, the song has grown on me. We'll add it this week, see what the audience thinks, and be looking forward to the new album...We're also testing out the new Robin Lane this week. WDHA, NORTH JERSEY, NJ G.M.-BOB LINDER: "I survived Washington--no attempts on my life yet! Maybe there will be after reading this. We were part of the NJ Broadcasters delegation speaking to Congressional leaders against the Performers' Royalty Bill, over regulation of radio, and the ill-planned FCC proposed reduction of space between AM stations from 10 to 9 kilohertz. Without protest, FM will be next! Record companies stand to benefit by 50% any revenue collected from a performers' royalty tax for on-radio stations. I'm sorry, we feel very strongly that without airplay, records would not sell. For over 10 years this bill has been re-introduced every Congressional session. It should quietly die. We in radio simply cannot afford 1% of our very hard earned gross revenue to give to record companies for the privilege of helping to sell their records by airplay. Seriously though, most of our legislators in Washington were duly impressed with the new heavy metal albums we played. They kroked for Krokus, born again with Ozzy Osbourne and electrified with AC/DC. However, Senator Williams, starting trial this week on the ABSCAM indictment, refused to be swayed by Eddie Money...Over the weekend we went to a listening party for the new Jim Simon album 'Bad For Good'. Mark says 'It took two years to complete the album, but the wait was well worth it'. The duet with Ellen Foley is tremendous as is the entire album. If you liked 'Bat Out Of Hell', you'll love this. Todd Rundgren plays his guitar and does much of the production. It was good seeing Matty Matthews and meeting Branch Manager Jim Uri. The album will have about 65 minutes of music (Lp plus Ep) but will sell for the price of one album. We were an early supporter of Meatloaf back in 1978, and helped push sales in North Jersey. It was a thrill to meet Jim Steinman in person! Meatloaf's album is also due shortly...Adds: Point Blank, Jags, Searchers, Kingbees, Santana, Ozzy Osbourne, Willie Nile, Grateful Dead, AC/DC and Chipmunks...Adding our comments to the many of last week, Santana's 'Zebop' is one of this year's best and a great balance for upper demos...The new Grateful Dead should sell well to dead-heads, but for more airplay, we're looking forward to the electric second part...Monday we had to conclude our reports on what-did-you-do-interesting-over-the-weekend, when one of our listeners reported live on the air that he got a good blow job. A digital delay unit is being ordered."

WWCK, FLINT, MI M.D.-MARK MILLER: "Leading off our list of adds this week we have the 'Concerts For Kampuchea'--lots of good stuff here, and we should get plenty of mileage out of it...The Santana album is a work of art; Carlos' guitar sends chills up my back. The 'Primera/Invasion/Searchin' segue and the 'Sensitive Kind' are the cuts we like...Heavy metal is making a dent in our playlist with AC/DC and Ozzy Osbourne. The only thing I wonder is why is this stuff coming out all at once?...Let me introduce you to our final add this week, Fast Fontaine. Doug 'Fontaine' Brown is Bob Seger's former mentor and he's got a real solid record. You can really hear where Mr. S. learned his licks. The real story on this one is a cut called 'Is Your Heater Hot'--a sleeper that could be the novelty hit of 1981. Feels great and gets excellent phones. For a few grins check this one out.. Rotation Changes: Phil Collins medium to heavy; Hawks, Gino Vanelli, all moved from Light to Medium and a quick note on cuts: If you haven't listened to 'Need Your Love' by the Hawks, or 'Womankind' by Greg Kihn, you should give them an ear. Although they aren't in the Cut 1 Side 1 category, they are, contrary to belief, the best album rock tracks...Once again, the Kingbees is a big sales mover. They've jumped 37-5 in two weeks, good for Top 10 status...Rush makes another impressive gain #11 to #3, REO holds down #1 again, Styx a close second."

WGRQ, BUFFALO, NY M.D.-PAUL HEINE: "Willie Nile's second album has a warm, full sound that wasn't on the first album, yet still retains the street sensuality that made the first one click. Willie, a Buffalo boy, hand-delivered the album to 97ROCK, and we did an hour show with him. If 'Golden Down' doesn't make Willie Nile a star, I'll drink a gallon of Love Canal water...AC/DC. With 'Back In Black' still charting Top 20 in our retail, the timing on 'Dirty Deeds' is perfect. Monster phones after just one week's play. Another triumph for the bad boys of rock...Santana's 'Zebop' marks a return to the percussive Latin Santana sound of the early albums. Easily their best in years. One listen to the Primera Invasion/Searchin' segue will convince you this man's got a lot left in him...Top Five Sales: REO Speedwagon, The Who, Steve Winwood, Rush, and Phil Collins...The 97 Rockathon for Easter Seals continues. Larry 'Snortin' Norton has been on the air for 13 days now. Two more and he breaks the Guinness World Record for longest continuous broadcast. Advertisers and listeners are sponsoring Norton, pledging donations to Easter Seals which so far total close to \$4,000.00."

KNAC, LONG BEACH, CA M.D.-JIMMY CHRISTOPHER: "Romeo Void is an interesting cross between modern rock and progressive jazz. It's a real nice to listen to album. It's gonna happen for them...The new Cramps sounds interesting...I like the Robert Gordon album, too...We finally got 'Magnets' by the Vapors. It's gonna be bigger than their debut album...Other than that, we're just rockin' and reelin'."

WOUR, UTICA/SYRACUSE, NY M.D.-TOM STARR: "Just back from a couple of weeks of sailing in the Virgin Islands, where the only rock was in the boat and the only roll was from the ocean. Lots of catching up to do. My feet are here now, the rest of me should show up in time for a real report next week."

KSHE, ST. LOUIS, MO P.D.-RICK BALIS: "There's plenty of hot supergroup product being released these days. Needless to say, the response has been tremendous to the likes of the Who, Eric Clapton, Santana, and Rush; not to mention Journey, Styx, and REO Speedwagon. But there's also a fair amount of groups we can't really call supergroups that refuse to be buried by the heavy hitters. These groups have released material that stands out and that deserve ample attention. They've got that certain something that points to potential...By now, the Sherbs unquestionably have name recognition in St. Louis--that name recognition that is a prerequisite to noticeable sales action. That same name recognition that could honestly go to only the frontrunners in the marathon of new product. 'No Turning Back' has already been widely accepted. 'Love You To Death' and 'The Skill' aren't shabby alternatives...A nice foundation is being laid for Franke And The Knockouts by 'Running Into The Night', followed by 'Tell Me Why'...It's All Right, It's Okay' and 'Right Away' are the cuts by the Hawks; 'Hold On Loosely' and 'Fantasy Girl' by 38 Special; 'Hold On' by Badfinger; and, 'In The Air Tonight' by Phil Collins...Albums demonstrating some good popularity holding power include: Steve Winwood, 'Arc'; Manfred Mann, 'For You', 'Lies', 'On The Run'; UFO, 'Chains', 'Lonely Hearts'; and, April Wine--just about anything on the Lp."

KTIM, SAN RAFAEL, CA M.D.-BELLE: "I can breathe!! No more unventilated studios, grate and view-shielded windows, and smoke-filled room--as was the case in our old building. Now we have the luxurious option of opening windows to let the smoke out. The sunshine has us sporting sunglasses; and OH, the day-dreaming! Shall we say that this is a conducive atmosphere for exciting the monster and the sleeping giant. That would be a fair hypothesis. The big payoff!!! See it does come to those who wait. I must have been real good these past few...The working environment is our newly innovated Victorian outside of San Francisco. The studios are on the second floor. 120 record boxes each at about 100 Lp's--we are on!! Great timing on the part of the record companies...Garnering our new crisp clean air sound are masterpieces by: Santana, The Dead, David Sanborn, The Dregs, Willie Nile, Sky, and Robert Gordon. Oh, and Spirit, legitimizing the musical and cultural atmosphere of the late 60's and early 70's--this the intended successor to Dr. Sardonicus...The Santana album is exquisite. 'Over And Over' is my immediate favorite... Another local favorite worthy of a mention, of course, the Dead, out with smooth floating acoustic offerings. Marin County can't get enough...Thanks to: Andy Partridge from XTC for christening our new studio with our first interview. Breaking new ground again!! A Virgin (artist)...Here's a tip: (Bill's not calling us Indicators for nothing.) 'Gone Tomorrow' is a phone bringer and 'Town Girl' is an audiophile's delight. Play them. Gerard, I will not let you down...Ghost Riders have been received very well at KTIM. We immediately moved it into Medium and will be doing a KTIM live show with them on the 30th. Sorry I wasn't able to get to all the new releases. But shit, how many times have you moved 10,000 records?...In The Wings: Cold Chisel, Straight Eight, George Wallace, and Billy And The Beaters... Also want to tell you about the open house (if you're in the area) the 14th and 16th of April, and the big street party on the 18th."

WAAF, WORCESTER, MA M.D.-ROB BARNETT: "Ozzy jumps immediately to Most Requested here. He'll chew you up, spit you out, and you'll love it...I'm suffering the spring cold of all time, but lots of listening--and I'm watching for Rick Springfield on General Hospital...New product taking my attention away from the chicken soup: Considering: Cold Chisel, a non-hype credible sleeper. I found 'Turn To Cry' the last cut. It's fully formattable for album rock and it sounds like, or better than, a lot of similar cuts you're now playing...We added Robin Lane, and I'm just starting to live with the record. 'Pather Be Blind' is on the air here, but listen to it all. Gary Lyons has done a brilliant job...Santana's 'Winning' is airing out much of the new metallic merriment. I also like 'Primera Invasion/Searchin'... The 'Kampuchea' video was top notch. I just wish there was more. The Rockestra numbers include a priceless shot of Townshend goo-goo-eyeing McCartney. It's a side-splitter...Hey, the Academy Awards were real exciting. I'd like half a hit of whatever Carson was on. He probably deserves it, this was one rough week...Hey, Gail, am I making any more unknown enemies this week?"

WIMZ, KNOXVILLE, TN M.D.-KERRY LAMBERT: "On the sales chart: Prime moves this week: REO Speedwagon back on top with a 2-1 move, James Taylor 9-3, Jimmy Buffet 6-4, 38 Special 12-11, Robin Trower 15-14... Debuts include:The Who at #8, Stones #9, Judas Priest #12, Phil Collins #20...The new AC/DC is a certain smash, play it and watch your phones...Also, the 'Kampuchea' album has already been well received (phones), Point Blank sounds a little slicker on 'American Excess' and the band will be here for a club date soon. I expect this album to fare well in Knoxville...The new Billy Squier will probably be well accepted as a new Queen record. I played it around the office and asked people to name the artist. I would say 90% of them guessed Queen--I'm so excited about that one...Also, for April Fool's day. we cut our normal spot load down to minimal and featured tracks from the studio B comedy service. including zany commercials which we made no mention of. We just played 'em."

KBPI, DENVER, CO M.D.-PHIL STRIDER: "Congratulations to KBPI's General Manager, Toney Brooks, who has just been promoted to President of the radio division of our parent company, Sandusky, Inc. Toney's the finest GM I've ever been fortunate enough to work with, and we are all very pleased that Sandusky made such a smart move...Congratulations to Kevin Knee, Denver's new Columbia rep...The Santana record is unbelievably deep. There isn't a weak spot on the album. I particularly like their version of the Cat Stevens tune...I think The Producers were a surprise to even their own record label--bright, fun, and it's all there...Beginning to pick up calls on Franke and the Knockouts: also on Rick Springfield."

RADIO ACTION CONTINUED

KLOL, HOUSTON, TX ASST. P.D.-MICHELE ROBINSON: "Obviously, the first thing I have to say is congratulations to Susan and Neal on their impending wedding...Now onto business. First I have to comment about AC/DC's 'Dirty Deeds' album. It was added on his first day at KLOL--July 21st. Since then, AC/DC has had the #1 request position almost constantly. Also, one of our local record stores has sold more than 900 copies of the import. If you have any hesitancy about the potential of 'Dirty Deeds', stories like this should ease your mind. I want to take this time to welcome: Tom (Gary Nixon) Cale to our staff as part of our morning show with newsman Charles Weiss. We're all very excited about having Tom join us. Dave Barrett moves over to KRTH, our AM news talk station, where he'll concentrate on his first love, sports... Thanks to Pat Travers for coming in Tuesday night as guest DJ for four hours. It was done in support of his upcoming show, and it was great fun. Sales are up this week on his album--so is airplay. Thanks for setting up: Jerry Jaffe, David Hemmings, and Drew Murray...Strong Sales This Week On: Who, Eric Clapton, Phil Collins, and Judas Priest...Some early movement on: U-2, Great Buildings, and Adam & The Ants... And finally, where is it written that one has to like a record that one is playing? If I played only what I liked, I'd be working at MAGIC 102, our R&B station. Can't you just be happy with the airplay?"

WPLR, NEW HAVEN, CT M.D.-EDDIE WAZOO: "Spring is here! Why am I in a little room without windows? Now on to business...As far as this week's adds, a large part of airplay is being captured by the Grateful Dead. Like most Dead albums, this contains some strong material and some not so strong. We're having action on: 'Dire Wolf', 'Ripple', and 'Cassidy'...The Dregs are probably one of the best and most consistent fusion bands on vinyl. We're getting calls on 'Rock And Roll Park'. A very good record for upper demos...This looks like it could be the record for Point Blank. We've got about six cuts marked off for airplay. I'm putting my money on 'Nicole'...The Robin Lane record, I feel, is an improvement over the first album. That is, a little more spontaneity on the group. We'll start with 'Send Me An Angel'... Even though it was recorded in 1976, the AC/DC is fresh and current. Of course, 'Big Balls' is getting calls. We're just using that for nights right now. The title track also...'Too Fast' is our choice from the Robert Gordon Lp. I just wish he would put out an album of total rock and roll...Ant music for sex people! I love it and can't get enough. It is Springtime and this is a good record for jumping around and getting foolish. Two things we should all do in the Spring...The Hawks moved up slightly this week. The leading track for us remains 'American Girls'...Top Requests Are: Eric Clapton, REO Speedwagon, and AC/DC...Tip of the hat and thanks to: Alan Wolmark et al for a fungulishly good time at the 'Kampuchea' party."

WIOT, TOLEDO, OH M.D.-BUCK MCWILLIAMS: "Pleased to meetcha. I will be assuming music duties and calls along with staff member, Joan Major. Call me 10AM-5PM for information...There's a lot that goes on here, but these days not too much worth reporting...I like Ozzy Osbourne. Good immediate phones from the strong cult following of the old Black Sabbath around here, which should make it a success. It's the kind of 'balls' rock and roll our market likes...Promotionwise, Terry Sullivan is now in charge, and we've got some dynamite deals in store. Just finished a Grace Slick 'Wrecking Ball', the paper mache kind. It was filled with loot. Contestants were blindfolded and given a chance to smash the ball. Unfortunately, the promotion was much better than the album...Our long distance rock night in Michigan brought a full house by 6:30PM...We're planning a Who weekend in celebration of their new album...Sorry to hear about RSO, but we made our reservation in advance to get one of their floating cows. Hopefully, this one will not die the same pencil death the last one did...Looking forward to working with everyone."

KISS, SAN ANTONIO, TX M.D.-TEMPIE LINDSEY: "Yea for Santana!! Getting good phones on the new album. Very sensitive rock and roll. 'Winning' and 'Searchin' are the tunes...It's always wonderful to have another AC/DC to go on just when the last one is going out of hot rotation. We've got the balls to play 'Balls'. How about you?...I think the live Pretenders cuts may help the Pretenders become a reality in Texas. They've never done well here...Point Blank is a hard-working band, and they deserve to do well with this album. I think the new sound is a definite improvement, and they made the move at the right time...Current Favorites: The Who, Greg Kihn, Hawks, and Loverboy--doing really well here. 'Lady Of The 80's' is a track that should definitely be looked into...There appears to be a stock problem on U-2...Good phones on the Plimsouls, and a nice beginning in the stores...Rainbow doing pretty well here, with good phones on 'Surrender'. They're playing in town with Pat Travers tomorrow night...James Taylor is not moving like I expected considering the AM play alone. I still find him a comfort...Because of his lack of melody, Pat Travers is taking a little longer to make inroads to people's ears, but I still think it's gonna happen...We love the Robin Trower. The jocks are crazy about it. Phones and sales are medium... Considering: Still looking at the Phil Collins album and the Starship single."

WIOQ, PHILADELPHIA, PA P.D.-ALEX DEMERS: "I'd like to say thanks to the folks at Atlantic Records for the best junket in too long. It was also a great opportunity to meet and greet folks like: Jimmy Mack, the venerable Norm Winer, and the staff of WNEW-FM at the 'Kampuchea' preview party...There has been an incredible influx of fine material for stations like WIOQ. Albums like the Willie Nile, Phoebe Snow, James Taylor, etc, etc, are perfect for us."

WLVQ, COLUMBUS, OH M.D.-TIM SMITH: "Leon Redbone will be a good novelty for us. We're using it in the morning...'Kampuchea' is a good collector's item, since it has the last recording from John Bonham; and of course, the conglomeration of Rockestra, and those cuts are the tones we're playing--a good thing to talk about on the radio. The value of the record is more for talk than for music...Santana is beautiful. It's good rock and roll and it's so nice to see Carlos return to the style we heard on the second and third albums...We're gonna give Greg Kihn another shot. Seems to have a little more polish on this record, and the lyrics of 'The Breakup Song' should catch the ear of listeners who are reluctant to try anything new (They just don't write 'em like that anymore)...Southern rock has always been good and strong in this market, so we'll give Doc Holliday a try. Good trashy rock and roll--there's a need for that...Ozzy and Judas Priest are pulling very good phones. We've even had inquiry calls on an Ozzy Osbourne concert date for Columbus...A few calls on Krokus, but nothing really exciting...Getting requests for different cuts from Pat Travers...Considering: Pretenders, Point Blank, and Billy Squier...The production makes every song on the Squier cassette really catchy. Most of the songs got a little funky backbeat that makes you shake your ass. The sound quality on the cassette is outstanding. Best high end I've heard on a tape."

WMYK/WZAM-AM, ELIZABETH CITY/NORFOLK, VA M.D.-BILL SIMMONS: "The heavy metal/rock and roll airplay race is really heating up these days since the new/old AC/DC was released. This just shows these guys have the rock 'n' roll basic down pat for years. You can't miss with: 'Dirty Deeds', 'Love At First Feel', and 'Problem Child'. 'Big Balls' certainly has novelty appeal...Other rock and roll albums doing very well are: Judas Priest and Krokus. Krokus apparently has sold out stock the first week out with a Top 20 sales debut...Great phones on Ozzy Osbourne. Look for good sales next week...Something for everyone on the 'Concerts For The People Of Kampuchea' Lp. Right now, we're sticking with: The Who, Pretenders, and Wings."

KMOD, TULSA, OK M.D.-CHARLIE WEST: "Santana is back to the sounds of 'Abraxis'. A move in a positive direction...Production has finally given Greg Kihn a fair shot. He's always been very good, but now we finally get to hear it...Carl Wilson--The legendary performer definitely shows his experience on the new solo album. Several excellent cuts...Joe Ely--I must admit it took a few listens, but now I'm convinced there are some killer cuts on it...James Taylor--Very good sales, very good songs...38 Special has jumped real well in sales...Also Garland, after several weeks heavy airplay, has come around in sales...Real good phone response and good sales on: Sherbs and Phil Collins...Very, very good sales on Pat Travers... Good sales on Robin Trower...Some phone action on U-2."

WYFE, ROCKFORD, IL M.D.-MAGIC: "Good to see that Atlantic finally released 'Dirty Deeds' as a domestic album. Y95 has been playing that record for at least two years, and I know that Les Cook also played it at WAD before coming here. We played it and we have had phenomenal success with the record. The cuts 'Dirty Deeds' and 'Big Balls' are the station's most requested songs. If you played AC/DC in the past, and don't play this one, you are a fool...The 'Concerts For Kampuchea' sounds excellent. The cut with Robert Plant with Rockpile is a killer combination with a standout cut 'Little Sister'. 'Sister Disco' from the Who also sounds very good. I like some of the Paul McCartney stuff, but I really don't think Paul is singing up to par. We are playing 'Got To Get You Into My Life'...Point Blank sounds like they've got a hit on this one. We've been testing 'Let Me Stay' as a single since its release and it has met with very positive phones. I think the album should do well also...The Ozzy Osbourne sounds real good. The backup musicians work very well with Ozzy's voice, and should do very well with all the heavy metal fans in your audience...Santana is excellent. I did a seg today of 'Searchin' to 'Black Magic Woman', and it sounded like they were on the same album. Nice to be able to play Santana again, and feel good about it...Greg Kihn is doing very well. Phones are very good on 'Breakup Song', and we're thinking about putting in another cut...New releases we'll get to within the next couple of weeks: new Willie Nile, the production and songwriting is much stronger than on the last effort...Great Buildings sound like they have a hit also with 'Hold Onto Something'-- full of hooks, and enough rock to keep any rock fan happy...On sales: Phil Collins took a big jump this week, breaking into the Top 10. Travers is also selling very well...Garland Jeffreys is beginning to move well...Top 5: Styx, REO, Rush, Journey, and Who."

WRXL, RICHMOND, VA P.D.-ILYSE GOTTLIEB: "Still more cries about gun control. It's always something. Sometimes I think society is testing the media. 'Okay News Directors, Okay P.D.'s, let's see you handle this one.' I'm frustrated by the cold realities of death and violence, but then brutalities happen daily. It's just that album rock decided that blood and guts doesn't fit the format. Geez, so music observes, interprets, and records society's existence...The Dregs give us 'Cruise Control' and 'Rock And Roll Park', their best yet. If you're a PD who shies away from instrumentals, reconsider-- 'Unsung Heroes' deserves your attention. The Dregs are here!!...The new Lp by the Cretones is glued to my turntable. 'Love Is Turning' tells it like it should be told...In Richmond the obvious prevails. Immediate reaction to 'Kampuchea', 'Face Dances', and Clapton...Speaking of RSO, if anyone's looking for an aggressive and creative promo guy, call Ted Zlaton in Baltimore. He should be more than a casualty...To Steve and Arlene: My office isn't that big, but it's home. Wanna move in?...To Libow: Listen to Phoebe and heed---something good may happen...To Al Wynn: Thanks for the tape of 'Home Cookin'. Richmonders were amazed that not all of Atlantic's music is a Hatchet or Skynyrd clone job. Alan Speed gets a grammy from me...And finally, if you got suckered into buying Girl Scout cookies from your receptionist's daughter, make sure she delivers this year's batch. FFV based in Richmond no longer bakes the mint cookies we all know and love, and as Buddy Bear discovered, not even FFV stays fresh for a year."

KZEW, DALLAS, TX M.D.-JANEL DOLAN: "I enjoyed meeting Point Blank and seeing Point Blank performing in Dallas and partying with J.W. Lone Wolf and Wayne McManners. A high time was had by all...I also enjoyed lunch with Pat Travers and the national gang...I'm crazy about the Dixie Dregs. I haven't taken the tape out of my car...The 'Kampuchea' is on, and it's gonna be a killer. Kind of like an 'Urban Cowboy' collection of live biggies. It should be tremendously successful...Robin Lane has one track that just stands way out, 'Send Me An Angel'. We added it immediately and Tom and I are crazy about it...Tom Dickie is also in this week. We've been considering it for some time, and we felt the time was right for the add...Ozzy Osbourne should be absolutely incredible. The phones have been very, very good, and I expect to see strong retail within the next couple of weeks...Retail this week: Top 10: REO, Rush, The Police, Loverboy, Steve Winwood, Who, Pat Benatar, James Taylor, and Eric Clapton...Increasing sales for: Outlaws, Phil Seymour (up a 20 point jump), Rick Springfield (a 12 point jump), have also noticed that where Phil Seymour, Manfred Mann, Rick Springfield, and the Sherbs are played in the stores, they increase sales nicely. Also we have moved the Sherbs from light to heavy rotation due to good phones, steady sales increases, and just an overall feeling about the record."

KAZY, DENVER, CO M.D.-GREG GILLISPIE: "Last night we had a listening party for the new Starship album, and all in attendance pretty much echoed my comments of last week. Thanks to: Jeff Nauman of RCA for helping to put this together...I had a chance to see U-2 in concert last Saturday night. Personally, I wasn't knocked out, although there was something there that points to the fact that this band may be something to deal with somewhere down the road. But I was amazed at some of the comments I heard from the audience. Things like: 'what a powerful show', 'great lyrics', and 'a dynamite stage presence'... I like the new Pretenders Ep. Finally some of their great songs are available in the United States. I think 'Message Of Love' is the real standout...Haven't been able to put my finger on it yet, but there's something about the Cold Chisel that's very intriguing to me. In my opinion, it's the best thing E/A has out on the street right now...Some in Denver are screaming left and right about the brand new AC/DC album. For those misinformed, here in the Mile High City, we've been turning the people on to the import for two years and will continue to utilize that...Charlie Daniels was in town Saturday night, and to commemorate the show, we handed out 107 customized Charlie Daniels KAZY cowboy hats. Also, I understand that Alligator Records has a 5 or 6 set blues release out currently. If somebody from Alligator could see fit, I'd love to have the series...Nice daytime response to Phoebe Snow...Still strong response on the Trower. As a matter of fact, stronger than I expected...Rick Springfield doing well--looking toward a rotation increase next week."

WLIR, LONG ISLAND, NY M.D.-RAY WHITE: "Thanks to everybody at Atlantic records, including Tunc, Danny B., Alan, and Bruce for a great time at the UN. Aside from being a totally worthy cause, the 'Kampuchea' record is a class compilation from The Who fluffs, the sassy Robert Plant vocals, McCartney's moving 'Let It Be', to the Clash with the perfect reggae tune for the Lp--it's hot!! My only concern with its release will be radio's possible misuse of the record. To stop playing or seriously cut down airplay of other new releases because of the 'Kampuchea' record, would be a mistake. By the way, the record was our #1 Lp of the week...As Sky mentioned a couple of weeks ago, Willie Nile has got himself a very strong record. I think his comparison with Dylan's 'Highway 61' were not all that outrageous... In other Arista news, long time Long Island favorites, the Dregs, and The Dead, met immediate favorable jock and listener response...I like the Dead's sneaky way of releasing a 4 record live set in these tight times--half now and the rest later...De Bella's screamer of the week is Robert Gordon 'Same Way Same Day'. Whatever you do, don't miss this perfect springtime tune. Robert's new vocal approach shows growth and change, giving him a different direction. Who knows, it may even be a hit...Big thanks to Roy Rosenberg of Stiff for turning us on to the Lene Lovich's new single 'New Toy'. The girl is hot and she knows it. Without a doubt, Lene's 'Toy' is my favorite new record of the week. Call him for a copy and play the hell out of it...To the gang at WAAF: I was quite surprised you never went on Elvis Costello's 'Trust', but beyond that, I'm totally amazed you are proud of the fact. Take it from us, play him for a couple of months. Elvis is really quite harmless and you might even find yourself humming one of his songs this summer...Thanks to all the great artists for interviews over the past week. They include Richie Blackmore, Dave Edmunds, Phil Proctor and Dave Ossman of Firesign Theater, birthday boy Steve Tyler, and Jorma Kaukonen. We had Jorma live in concert here on the radio last Friday, and he and the band were wild. Hey Jorma, you are a champ and this radio studio is behind you all the way."

RADIO ACTION CONTINUED

KATT, OKLAHOMA CITY, OK M.D.-CLARK RYAN: "Lots of good new music this week. Santana's new Lp is the best I've heard from Carlos in years. 'American Gypsy' brings back memories of their early work, and the single is also very solid...Point Blank sounds stronger than ever with their new lead singer on the album. My favorite song so far is 'Nicole', but this album is full of radio tracks...We're already getting phone response to Ozzy Osbourne. I don't know where they've been hiding, but the Black Sabbath fans are coming out of the walls for this one...One other point of interest, or should I say curiosity, is the new George Wallace song 'Stand Up'. (That's ironic.) I will not claim that this is necessarily a killer tune, but it's different enough for us to try it late at night and see if anything develops...An album that did develop with flying colors is 'The Skill' from the Sherbs. We put the song 'No Turning Back' in heavy rotation about three weeks ago, and it actually worked. We show Top 20 sales, and I think it's because we pushed 'No Turning Back' and not 'I Have The Skill'...Heavy Phones This Week On: Who, Rush, Phil Collins, and Steve Winwood...We moved the Hawks up to Medium due to decent phone response."

KZOK, SEATTLE, WA M.D.-MICHAEL KNIGHT: "The Pages album containing 'Hero' has a great hook. It sounds perfect for KZOK and sounds great on the air. Tight harmonies--a very effective tune...I raved about Carlos Santana and the band with the release of the 12", and I believe it must be the band's best work to be compared with the first Santana album and 'Abraxis'. The most interesting thing is, it's an ever changing musical force. On 'Zebop', Carlos is at his best by presenting music that is white, black, and Latin. Very cleanly done at the Automat...Three cuts on the Phoebe led by 'Mercy'. And then my money is on 'Gasoline Alley' and one of my favorite Frankie Miller tunes 'Cheap Thrills'. Best thing about this album is it's genuine, and there's a lot of life to it...Sales in Seattle pretty much reflect the hot songs across the nation: Eno-Byrne came in at #23 most selling album in our research. No other comment is necessary. My compliments to the audience."

WBRU, PROVIDENCE, RI P.D.-GEORGE BRADT: "Let's hear it for soft music! It's always a relief when a record comes along that can put all this chain-rock in its proper place without resorting to overweight amplification. Willie Nile comes to mind instantly. What a breath of fresh air. I like the way he's about as loud as a whisper but more powerful than 20 Judas Priests...Robin Lane's new one is excellent as well. Like Willie, Robin has transcended the Byrds fixation of her past work...Other good stuff on the quiet side is the new acoustic Grateful Dead album and 'Seven Year Ache' by Rosanne Cash. It took me a long time to hear this one, but now I'm sold. Thanks, Tom...Greg Kihn #2 airplay this week--still an amazing album."

WRNO, NEW ORLEANS, LA M.D.-STEVE RODIO: "The 'Concerts For The People Of Kampuchea' is the album making a lot of noise this week. A very high quality recording with no political overtones, no filler, and no dull spots. Each artist featured played their hearts out with The Who and McCartney shining the brightest. The Pretenders set is also a knockout, especially 'Precious'...With Loverboy and Point Blank in town this weekend, 'American Excess' is a very easy choice. Bubba Keith's vocals could be the edge this band needs. Good nitty gritty rock and roll without the abrasive edges...The Starship's new single, I feel, will be an across-the-board smash for them. Great vocals and some very tight playing. We're looking forward to the album...Gino Vannelli's latest is a definite woman-killer. All it took was one play to light up the phones. We're on 'Living Inside Myself' for right now...No doubt about Santana. 'Zebop' is a winner. His best overall effort in years. The single 'Winning' sounds a little like Phil Collins and Mark Knopfler jamming together. Some very catchy guitar and vocals on the album...Top Request Getter This Week: Rush, Loverboy, Eric Clapton, and Who...Also generating response: Hawks and Garland Jeffreys...Top Five Retail: Steve Winwood, Styx, Rush, REO Speedwagon, and Journey...Personal fave this week is: Greg Kihn and Cold Chisel."

WMJQ, ROCHESTER, NY M.D.-OREST: "The Rick Springfield is a great record, and it should do well in this market...Same with 'Kampuchea'. It should be a top seller and one of the most played albums nationally... Also getting good response on: Krokus and Phil Collins."

WILS-FM, LANSING, MI P.D.-FRANK SMITH: "'Kampuchea' offers a lot for everybody. A cross section of some of the industry's finest groups, with strong material that works well...After a few listens to the new Santana, I'm convinced 'Zebop' should attract a lot of attention...Our Cheap Trick/38 Special show was literally a few shy of a sell out. With the help of CBS and Cheap Trick, we put contest winners on stage with the band during their encore to help sing along. After the show, our air staff went to the local Easter Telethon and helped solicit funds. Many, many thanks to Rick Neilson of Cheap Trick who appeared with us...U-2 seems to be picking up in sales, and we're definitely considering moving that up to a heavier rotation...Considering: Judas Priest, Ozzy Osbourne, and James Taylor."

WFYV, JACKSONVILLE, FL P.D.-RAD MESSICK: "It's about time AC/DC gets the release here, and I think a lot of people are going to pick up things they might have missed in the past. 'Dirty Deeds', when it was on the radio here as an import, was easily the most requested song at that time and should be for the domestic album as well...Ozzy Osbourne adds some more metal to the current releases and should get response from Black Sabbath fans. It should be easy for them to recognize...Good week for Judas Priest here as they debut in sales #19. Starting to pick up early calls."

WCCC, HARTFORD, CT P.D.-PAUL PAYTON: "First Lennon, then the try on Reagan. Where the hell are we going, and does the volume race of the Spring heavy metal release offer us relief or lead us further down the highway to hell? Nevertheless, we are swept up in it, having just completed our three-day Heavy Metal Weekend, climaxed by the Ted Nugent/Donnie Iris concert and interviews. Nuge was his usual excellent self on stage and a gentleman in person. Donnie Iris is everything we hoped he would be and more. A gentle, superior musician, with a heavy duty band who reproduces the record excitingly and accurately. Two things: Donnie, please give us a live Ep or Lp; and, please put that energized version of 'The Rapper' on your next one. For those who have not yet done so, check out: 'You're Only Dreaming'. Now will Lifeset and Bone put down their hatchets and get back to music?...Cold Chisel gets requests...Pretenders Ep compilation is very useful...Re: 'Kampuchea'. The Who side complements a new album perfectly, and the McCartney side is the best in recent memory. Thanks, Bill Beamish, for the video party...I can't wait for the new Petty and Joe Walsh. Rock and roll for the wider masses who have their shit together...Congratulations to Belle and TIM on their move. Thank you for the kind words and may we all continue to deserve them...To Tom Nast: Since we are only a semi-reconstructed male chauvinist pig, can we please have one of your rock ladies calendars?...To Rob Lipshutz: Could you send us a COZ album, please? If it's good enough for BCN, it's good enough for us...To Bruce Youngblood: Hank Wilson? Someone remembers...Other heavy metal promotions include: Portable TV, AM/FM, 35 mm camera, a motorcycle, and a VTR. This is the year of rock video...Other Weekend Promotions: Eric Clapton, Robin Trower, Who, and Pete Townshend albums on an hourly basis. Thank you to all..."

FROM PETER COLE: "Side 1 of Willie Nile has to be the best music I've heard yet this year, with Side 2 close behind...On the Rate-A-Record Trail: Ozzy Osbourne 98.1 (sounds like a punk 45 played at 33-1/3); Cold Chisel 8.5 strong showing--one listener said it's a cross between Doug And The Slugs and Bob Seger); Robin Trower 7.6; and, Franke And The Knockouts 6.5 (strong women)."

WMAD, MADISON, WI M.D.-RON PHILLIPS: "Carlos must have been in close consultation with his guru to come up with an album this choice. When I first heard the comparison to the 'Abraxis' days, I thought, 'yea, sure.' But by God, those words really hold truth. Even the single sounds much better in the context of the entire set. The 'Invasion/Searchin' segue is easily a first choice, but there really is room to go a lot deeper...Nice harmonies from Phoebe Snow and Jackson Browne. It'll help balance out the Krokus that also went in this week...Willie Nile sounds very good on first listen. I got real close to the first one and 'Golden Down' looks like a natural progression...The 'Kampuchea' set I find a bit lackluster. The performers are there, but I'm not sure the performances are...David Sanborn sounds excellent to those delving into mainstream jazz. Very smart of Warner Bros. to come with an Ep...P.S. To Jayne: I'd like to hug my promotion person too...We just sent an 8 by 4 foot get well card to Eric Clapton. His final concert was here in Madison, so we took the card to local malls and record stores and got thousands of signatures. We're waiting for a reply."

WYMX, AUGUSTA, GA M.D.-MARY PILLINGER: "To begin with, AC/DC sure knows how to get their dirty deeds done. The local earth dogs are eating up the phones with requests. The title track is 'TNT' all over again...And as usual, there is more metal in the market, but at least Ozzy Osbourne's 'Crazy Train' and 'I Don't Know' grind it out in good taste...Our hometown favorite, the Dixie Dregs, have locked into 'cruise control' on the Augusta airwaves. 'Unsung Heroes' is a fitting description for the Dregs, especially Steve Morris, a musical mastermind unfortunately not yet nationally appreciated for his insight into beefing up a well-blended jazz/rock approach suitable for album radio play...Off 'Kampuchea', we're using the leading album radio image cut with Led Zeppelin in limbo. Robert Plant and Rockpile, 'Little Sister', is a sure stroke...Other Adds Include: Judas Priest and Point Blank albums...Increased Sales: The Who, Eric Clapton, April Wine, and Rush...Increased Airplay: Jefferson Starship, Rush, Judas Priest, Doc Holliday, Pat Travers, Rainbow, Greg Kihn, and Garland Jeffreys. We've been doing our Spring cleaning...One final note: The best of luck to: Tommy T. and Long John."

KSMB, LAFAYETTE, LA M.D.-JAY WALKER: "Excess food makes you fat, excess drink makes your liver quiver, excess drugs will fry your brain. But with 'American Excess' you can conquer the world. Hot Damn! This is the one! Glad to see it happening to some of the finest folks anywhere in rock. Instant heavy rotation...Put the needle down anywhere, 'Kampuchea' is a natural. Rockpile meets Robert Plant and the explosion is heard for miles...Greg Kihn has by far his best yet...What a comeback for Carlos. The 'Searchin' segue is great...Racing to the front of the considering section is: AC/DC (when I get it), Judas Priest, Phoebe Snow, James Taylor, Gino Vannelli, and Doc Holliday...The Billy Squier is a mutha."

WQBK, ALBANY, NY M.D.-LIN BREHMER/P.D.-JOHN COOPER: "Just a quick word of thanks to Atlantic Records for the 'Kampuchea' reception at the U.N.. The videos of the live performances are truly outstanding. I hope everyone gets to see them at some time. A pleasure to see: Alan Wolmark; Judy Libow; Jack Hopke; Roxy Myzal; Steve Leeds; the diplomatic Ron Rizzi (or was that Nenni?), old Syracuse University alumni, John Sykes and Dan Neer; Eddie Wazoo; John McGhan; and the list goes on and on...A couple of new albums have caught my fancy: Willie Nile's second album is all I hoped for and more. Many of the songs were performed by Willie when he was in town last year. 'Poor Boy', 'I Like The Way', and 'Les Champs Elysses' are exceptional...The new Santana album is not only immediately enjoyable, but will stand up to the test of time like the first and second albums have done. 'Primera Invasion', 'Searchin', and 'Over And Over' lead the way...Finally, Garland Jeffreys has yet to come out of the tape deck in my car. It's quite simply the best album to come out so far this year. I can't wait to see him live again...Congratulations to: Harvey Leeds, Tom Starr, and Ed Levine on their respective marriages. If their marriages are anything like mine, it'll be non-stop ecstasy...P.S. Looking forward to the Killing Joke album. We've received consistent requests for 'Change' since it's been out as an import single. (Okay, Webber?)"...
LIN BREHMER: "Sure you got everybody, John?...A new Grateful Dead album released in Upstate New York is, for many of our listeners, a religious experience...The new record from the Dregs is hot out-of-the-box... A hot tip for Ron Nenni, who is too nice a guy to miss this: Lock Ted Utz in a closet and get the Dregs album on the air. You won't regret it...Alan McKinnon, our morning person, has discovered a recorded parody of the Village People's 'YMCA' done by Adam And The Ants. It's very funny...Finally, since being one of the first to introduce the Pretenders to the Western world, our support of that band has been nothing short of fanatical. So the new Ep is already quite familiar to the people here."

WBLM, LEWISTON/PORTLAND, ME M.D.-JOSE DIAZ: "I've been listening to the Robin Lane album this afternoon, and there is some definite improvement. Perhaps it's her material, perhaps the production by Gary Lyons, but cuts like 'Send Me An Angel', 'Imitation Life', and 'It Better Be Blind' make this album worth considering beyond the Northeast...The Santana album is genuinely exciting. It's super well done. The songs are real tight; the playing is strong; and who knows, 'Winning' might get played beyond album rock...The new Grateful Dead album might present a problem for most rock stations nowadays, 'cause you can't deny the audience. We're starting off with: 'Dire Wolf' and 'Cassidy'...The Ozzy Osbourne album is surprisingly subtle in some places. It's not the bang-your-head-against-the-wall music that I sort of expected. Who knows, maybe Ozzy will outlast them all...Meanwhile, the kings of the heavy metal genre provide new fodder in the form of 'Dirty Deeds' with AC/DC. Nowadays, the sky's the limit...It might take me a while to get into the new Point Blank on the basis of the new sound. Although I'm sure the single is the most playable thing they've had yet...If a station has ever played the 'Not Fade Away' riff, which is in a lot of songs, then you can easily give a shot to the title track on the Joe Ely album...Krokus 'Winning' is doing well, but AC/DC ripoff criticism on some of the other tracks...Good to see 'Sweetheart' from Franke doing well, 'cause I can hardly wait for 'Come Back' to become the mass appeal hit it is...Greg Kihn--I have to pinch myself to make sure that I'm not dreaming when I see the reaction that Greg is getting nationally. We upped the play this week, and I'm flipped out. Much more than 'just another Greg Kihn album.'"

WTUE, DAYTON, OH M.D.-JIM KINNEY: "Adds this week: AC/DC, Santana, 'Kampuchea' and Greg Kihn...Now that AC/DC is so big, I can't help but remember when Bob Clark of Atlantic turned me on to these guys when I was in Beaver Falls, which was four years ago. I can't help but think that one of the main keys to this band is the beat. Try to think of a time when you've really been listening to one of their songs and you haven't found that all of a sudden your foot is moving whether you like it or not. They're simply the best at what they do. Title track went in out-of-the-box...Santana is a great album too. I can't say that it's better than the last, like a lot of people, because I thought that was great too! We're on 'Winning' to start...The Plant/Rockpile song is the most interesting on the 'Kampuchea'. I don't know if it's a great album, but it's definitely a nice package to have in your collection. We're 9 cuts deep. I wish the Who segment would have some more recent tunes rather than a 14th version of 'Babba' and 'See Me Feel Me'... 'Can't Stop Hurting Myself' by Greg Kihn just flat knocks me out. One of those songs where the volume is always louder when it's over than when it's started, no matter how loud it was when it began. I just love when a band that I never really thought was gonna get past the one or two O.K. cuts per album stage comes out with an Lp like this. I don't know why, it gets the blood pumping a little more or something...We switched some tracks this week. Todd from 'Healing' to 'Time Heals'. I sure as hell hope that 'Compassion' is the next single...Sherbs from 'Skill' to 'Turning Back'..And Collins from 'Behind The Lines' to 'Missed Again'.. Biggest jumps in sales this week are: 38 Special to #9, Phil Collins to #13, Clapton to #16, Todd to #19, Travers to #23. Springfield to #27 and Badfinger and Franke and the Knockouts."

WCOZ, BOSTON, MA M.D.-ROB LIPSHUTZ: "Lipshutz to radio: Robin Lane And The Chartbusters have an album with at least five able radio songs on it. You blew it when you missed the first Lp; 'When Things Go Wrong' is one of our all-time successful songs. On this new album, there's a much fuller sound. Try: 'Solid Rock' for openers...Don't forget fellow Boston rockers, the Rings. If you played 'Let Me Go', 'My Kinda Girl' is worth serious consideration. They're real exciting in concert, too...Phil Collins and 38 Special are storming up the Boston sales charts with April Wine and Rick Springfield emerging...Finally, let's hope they never show 'Taxi Driver' on TV."

KYYS, KANSAS CITY, MO M.D.-JOE MCCABE: "Another very consistent album from Point Blank. I haven't heard the 'Mean To Your Queenie' song on this Lp yet, but I do hear one good cut after the other. Early faves are: 'Restless', 'Getaway', and 'Nicole'...'Kampuchea' is obvious--just play it. Keying in on the Plant song with Rockpile...The 'Primera/Searchin' segue from Santana sounds so live on the air, it's incredible. One of those records you can put on and turn up...If you think Ozzy Osbourne is no longer a happening act, just put his new album on the air and watch the phones. Ozzy's name is as familiar as 'Iron Man'... Still real good calls on the Judas Priest...Hawks is the 'picked on' record. When people call asking me why I'm not playing their records, they always seem to say, 'But--you're playing the Hawks.'...Krokus building very nicely, plus they're coming to town for a \$1.02 show."

WZZQ, JACKSON, MS M.D.-STEVE KELLER: "Bill was right on the money for the shots on the Point Blank and AC/DC. Point Blank blows me away with how far they've come in such a short time. We plan on hitting 'The Way You Broke My Heart' and the single...I'm impressed with 'Kampuchea'. When I first listened, I thought the quality was very poor. But when I put in it on the radio, it seems to come alive, which allayed quite a few of my fears. The Queen sticks out to me, along with all the McCartney stuff--in fact, that's some of the best live stuff he's ever done...Ozzy Osbourne is pretty much a natural for all the requests we constantly get for Black Sabbath...I'm glad this AC/DC album finally got here and that there will be a major national push. I've had the import at home, and I'll finally get to prove to myself that 'Problem Child' is a smash record...Gino Vannelli is taking off. This is G.V. country anyway. And when I first got the record, I remembered the four or five concerts I've seen him do. There were too many women grunting loudly for me to ignore it. So far, the male requests have kept up with females--a good across-the-board record. Thank you, Clive, for signing up a man that needs to be on vinyl...Personal to Bone: Is it true that you were seen on a New York ghetto street corner pulling a shell game? Do you have to work that hard on Saturday and Sunday--or is it just a natural extension of the weekdays?... We do have a job opening for a nighttime jock. Good production and experience is required. Good working conditions. We need tapes and resumes. Send them to: David Perkins, P.O. Box 2171, Jackson, MS 39205."

KTXQ, DALLAS, TX M.D.-DRAKE HALL: "POINT BLANK IS BACK BIGGER THAN EVER. Saw 'em live the other night, and Bubba and Mike add a new charisma to the band that was lacking before. These boys are gonna be mo-fos. 'Kampuchea' is interesting. Charities are getting old, but what the hell. We're using the Plant/Rockpile tune and getting great phone response. The kids can't believe that is Plant singing. Bobby's voice finally changed. And can you believe the off key singing from Roger Daltrey? Look for big sales here (For that you need a crystal ball, right?)...After Marty Schwartz has worked his butt off for Greg Kihn for years, finally Greg comes up with a good record. We're really proud to be playing it and hope it works for your sake, Marty. Gotta do something to offset the Cretones and Plimsouls, right big guy?...Also pleased with the Santana record. It's just such a fine record, but no one knows it's Santana. Very interesting. It will be their biggest record since 'Abraxis', easy...Increased Play: Phil Collins (incredible phone calls--really amazing), Krokus, and Rainbow."

WMMR, PHILADELPHIA PA M.D.-JOE BONADONNA: "The Billy Squier cassette--the hottest non-superstar album this year. The production is superb, a lot of very good songs. I listened to the cassette several times and just loved the whole record...I think it's refreshing to hear 'Hold On To Something' from Great Buildings...'Kampuchea' is an obvious record! The live stuff is all superb. Pretenders 'Wait' is outstanding and one of the high points is 'Little Sister' with Plant/Rockpile...A damn good rock and roll record from AC/DC. Already immediate telephone reaction!..We've been playing the material on the Pretenders Ep in import form. People have always thought it was the new Pretenders Lp anyway, so I'm glad it's now available in domestic form...The retail on Judas Priest is Top 35, the highest debut this week...Starship single doing well, and I really do like the Santana album a lot. I think 'Winning' has the potential to be a big hit single...Greg Kihn still sounds great on the radio. 'Girl Most Likely' leads, followed by the 'Breakup Song'...Excellent reaction to Phil Collins 'Missed Again'...And no other exclamation point except for Garland Jeffreys 'ROCK' doing very well--good phones and Top 20 sales in Philadelphia. 'Back In Black' is third followed by Police, Top 5 since November."

WDVE, PITTSBURGH, PA P.D.-DAVE LANGE: "Almost a banner week for new albums. How could we not add the new AC/DC?--Lead track 'Dirty Deeds'...Just as Bill has been saying all along, this Santana is really good. We've had a number of good albums lately from people we thought were too old to rock and roll--Witness the Who, Clapton and now perhaps, Santana, using the super segue, and of course 'Winning'...'Kampuchea', there is a lot of stuff on this album. I really enjoy the Robert Plant/Rockpile track the most, since just about everything else we've heard before. The concert is well recorded...Been watching U-2 for an extremely long period of time and felt that it was now-or-never for the record. We'll be using 'I Will Follow'...Sales pretty strong on Judas Priest, showing Top 15...Nugent sales beginning to slow down--his fans run right out and get it. He has to catch his secondary audience real quick. 'Lip Lock' is getting good phones all over...Other retail movers: Phil Collins getting close to Top 10... Increased Play: Who, Phil Collins."

WLRS, LOUISVILLE, KY M.D.-JOHN SIMON: "Compliments to the Styx band for their recent concert here. It was a superior performance. We're looking forward to the Robin Trower, Rainbow, Travers and Krokus concerts...I like 'Love At First Feel' by AC/DC."

KLBJ, AUSTIN, TX M.D.-JOHN LOGAN: "Let's talk about good bets for a change. There is one I can't believe is not breaking the walls down--Joe Ely. Hey, just because Ely is from Texas doesn't mean he's country. Dunaway calls it 'First generation rock', but whatever you call it, it's just plain old good rock and roll. Listen to the title track of 'Musta Notta Gotta Lotta' and see if you don't sear your ear drums. This is 'dues paid' stuff. I think this record is a built-in way to get upper demos back and not drop your energy level. My God, all those people grew up with Berry style roots rock, and the sound is still branded in the brain. Go to a bar some time and find out how many times 'Johnny B. Goode' or 'Memphis' or 'Carol' is punched up on the juke and you'll have your answer...Another good bet is Gerard McMahon. 'Gone Tomorrow' has been hooking phones here for several weeks...Ozzy Osbourne has the same effect as dry ice--it smokes when exposed to the air...Gino Vannelli has some good simple guitar leads to beef up a few cuts and is definitely worth a listen...Ali Thompson's second is a gem. Rhythmic, smooth and intelligent...Point Blank is covering new ground since their last, and the bridge between country, rock and the blues should wire them up for good rock and roll types and then some...Robin Trower is up this week. However, you slice it, the vinyl has the goods...Greg Kihn and Phoebe Snow both getting good reaction already...KLBJ co-sponsored the Southern National Disc Championships. We had an incredible Texas Spring day. Parks and Recreation quoted the attendance at 20,000...Chris Cross came home last week to about that many in concert. Excellent music, tight band, and the boy has some guitar chops. Thanks to: Warner Bros. Fred Meyers."

WMMS, CLEVELAND, OH M.D.-KID LEO: "I'm on vacation this week and the organization will be handled very capably by my fellow capo di tutti capi, G-man."

KOME, SAN JOSE, CA M.D.-DANA JANG: "An incredible record from the Starship. It just blew me out!! Good songs and a strong energy level--even the cover is good. Songs? I like 'em all, but 'Stairway To Cleveland' is the one that generates the most talk...First day sales on AC/DC are just blowing out the door. Phones of course from the sizeable cult. They all probably have the import, too...The Cretones get better and better with each listen. I like: 'Empty Heart', 'Love Is Turning', and 'Hanging'...I really like the sound of Fast Fontaine--a great boogie sound and a rawness I really enjoy...On 'Kampuchea', let's say that the record has generated a lot of talk. Record stores are getting requests many days before the release, phone response has been tremendous for all the cuts, and the jocks are finding it hard not to play the record every day...I think this is one of Robert Gordon's better albums. 'Some Day Some Way' is our leader...Finally added Rick Springfield...Retail This Week: Far and away the leaders: REO Speedwagon, Styx, Who, Journey, and Blondie...Showing Increases: Greg Kihn and Loverboy...Phil Collins is also improving nicely...Steve Winwood has definitely made a significant increase...Best Calls For: Phil Collins; Greg Kihn; Loverboy; Police; REO Speedwagon (now phones switching over to 'Take It On The Run'); Rush; Styx; 'Hold On Loosely' from 38 Special; Robin Trower; 'You Better You Bet', Who; 'Concert For The People Of Kampuchea'; Santana; Pretenders; Jefferson Starship; and starting to get some phones for John Cougar's new single...U-2 continuing on with steady sales."

WYSP, PHILADELPHIA, PA P.D.-DICK HUNGATE: "Things are the best here at WYSP!! Lots of activity. This is Denny Somach's last week on the air full time (10AM till 2PM). I'll be doing his show beginning Monday. Somach is an extremely valuable member of the team and will stay on to produce specials for both WYSP and the Source network. In addition, he is working on a couple of incredibly exciting new projects that he'll announce within weeks...WYSP presents a rock auction on April 29th at the Tower Theater with proceeds to the Philadelphia Police Athletic League...The amateur hour concept has never been tried here, so we kicked it off last Sunday night, drawing one post card from a huge pile. They loved it!!...Tonight is the first annual WYSP All Fools Day Party at Ripley's--a great new club here. We invited all fools from across the Delaware Valley down to the club to prove how foolish they are. We did Music Industry Week and our guests included Kal, the legendary record man Matty "nice day" Singer, local concert promoter Steven Starr, local rock critic Matt Damsker, and two of our best record men, Al Cafaro of A&M and Bob Catania of RCA...Musically, we're high on the Point Blank, the just received Starship album (at least 4 good cuts on it), AC/DC, and a new one by Straight Eight...I personally like Greg Kihn's 'Can't Stop Hurting Myself' cause it sounds tougher and less pop than 'Valerie' and 'Sheila'...'Kampuchea' album's 'Little Sister' slays me ... Krokus is burning the phones out at night...Don't let Mr. Kendall or anyone else con you into thinking that WYSP, or for that matter WIOQ, are strickly into 'retro rock' and not exposing new music. We all know Charlie is very careful about his image with the record people and constantly tries to score points with them, but I've always thought that if we are listening carefully to the new stuff and breaking our share of tunes the record company support will naturally follow. Coincidentally, they've been very good to us, and for that I'm very thankful."

WSYR, SYRACUSE, NY M.D.-TOM NAST: "By far the hottest piece of product today is the Ozzy Osbourne, 'Blizzard Of Ozz' album. It's about time the album got released in the States. On my Friday night All-Request Show, it came up the #1 most requested artist or group...The Santana album will be huge here, considering Santana will be the first Dome show in town. They sold 6,100 tickets in one day...Not since 'Bangladesh' has there been an Lp like the 'Concerts For The People Of Kampuchea'. We've gotten great response to it. Hard to believe Mr. Costello turning nice guy...Look for great things to happen to Point Blank. Rusty Burns is one of the hottest gee-tar players around, and this Lp should do it for him... The 'Breakup Song' on the Greg Kihn is pretty catchy. We'll try that for now. I only hope that Elektra is behind this one."

WLUP, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-SKY DANIELS: "Record Of The Week: Rockpile and Robert Plant, 'Little Sister'. Sure, sure, sure, it's obvious, right!!! But it's painfully obvious!! First of all, it's the song best suited for Robert Plant's rapidly deteriorating vocals that you and I have heard in some time. Face it. The last time you went into a Led Zeppelin concert when they burst into 'Rock And Roll', didn't it hurt when he started singing? Hey, I don't blame Robert, that's a lot of years of Marshall amps to bark over. So finally we come up with a song that he's clearly infatuated with, a band who's sympathetic to the treatment, and all of it on an album that's for a good cause...AC/DC, 'Dirty Deeds' is a must. 'Big Balls'. Holy Moley!! Put it on the air one time and we get 200 calls from the PTA. 300 calls from the CIA!! And 1 call from the RIAA saying, what are you doing playing that? We've gotten approximately 10 times that many from the audience saying, 'Yea! Say Yea!...The Level System of reporting: I hope nobody's feelings out there are hurt by being in Levels 2 or 3, and I certainly hope some of you lucky undeserving stiffs who are in Level 1 don't let it go to your head...And remember, like Mark Vos, like Sean Scott, (I ain't gonna mention Dave Benson) you're entitled to tell me to kiss your ass. That doesn't mean I will...The high point last week: (I'm not sure if it was mine or his) Did I really see Kid Leo agreeing with me, finally, in print? For a long time, Leo and I have held mutual regard and understanding behind the scenes. I'll be out front and say that I think He's the greatest, and thanks for the tip of the hat."

WLPX, MILWAUKEE, WI M.D.-BOBBIN BEAM: 'AC/DC--ever since we started playing the import last summer, we've had calls on 'Dirty Deeds'. With domestic releases. I expect listeners to treat this as a brand new record. 'Big Balls' is crass and a nighttime cut only for us--but I love those lyrics...Pretenders 'Message Of Love' is a great rock and roll smash hit single to my ears ..Ozzy Osbourne--Being such a huge Black Sabbath market here, Ozzy has to be a natural for us. He actually sings on 'I Don't Know', the most mass appeal cut. It's testing well with listeners...The 'Concerts For Kampuchea' is certainly diversified, so you can't help but find something for any format, esp. album rock. I like the 'Little Sister' cut with Plant doing vocals. We'll probably get the heaviest requests for that one. Sales: Ozzy Osbourne debuts at #22, Judas Priest in top 10, Krokus #24, Greg Kihn #25, Robin Trower #16 and Garland Jeffreys is in top 20 (they should push '96 Tears' more)...Also. I would like to stress that 'For You' should be rush released as the new Manfred Mann single "

WMET, CHICAGO, IL M.D.-DAVE BENSON: "WMET adds for the week: First of all AC/DC 'Dirty Deeds Done Dirt Cheap'--We've been playing this Lp since January. The conversion to the domestic release is long overdue. Hopefully, sales can match requests... 'The Concerts For Kampuchea' has received very positive phone response already. There's something for everybody--wavers, rockers, punkers, and poppers on this album... Santana's 'Zebop' has my complete confidence. If this isn't the most commercially successful Lp in years, it will be radio's fault!...We're Rockin'rollin with the 'Breakup Song' from Greg Kihn...We've also put the Pretenders Ep on the radio. (Teuber thinks there may be backlash in the stores-if it isn't made very clear that this is not a complete Lp)...Before I run out of steam, let me just say that 'Golden Down' is everything we could hope for in a second album from Willie Nile. 'Poor Boy' is our cut to start with. (Warning--this is not a test--)...And finally, Ozzy Osbourne's 'Blizzard Of Ozz'. Sabbath remains a constant Top Ten request getter at WMET, and Ozzy is bound to satisfy...In honor of our Mayor Byrne's well publicized Ghetto hopping, we've re-added the Bus Boys 'There Goes The Neighborhood'. Also, look for a new Budweiser jingle featuring the Bus Boys very soon...In sales, its Styx, followed by REO, and the Who in a two-way tie for second."

KSJO, SAN JOSE, CA R.D.-FRANK ANDRICK: "Is it true that record companies time release together so radio can feel intimidated by the stax of unadded product on their desks? Probably not. But the 'I don't know, I've only heard it once or twice' file is growing. Still working on separating the weak from the chaff...Onto the music. Apparently, the Ozz himself needed new blood to bounce off of. These Blizzard boys do the trick! Good to see Bob Daisley (ex-Widowmaker) on the prowl again. The writing combo of Ozzy, Daisley, and guitarist Randy Rhodes lends a bright smoothness that brings a balance to that crunch that kills edge. 'Crazy Train', 'I Don't Know', and 'Mr. Crowley' lead the crunch quota. The live Ep with 'Mr. Crowley' has been a high request number for six weeks at KSJO, and the album's market-ready profile will blaze a trail of retail sales...Well, it was in my back yard, but it fooled me. Bill Graham, a record producer? Par excellence!! Most people wish their best effort to be this good, let alone their first. Tom Mix had no problems finding seven tracks to start with on Santana, including: 'Searchin', 'Changes', and 'Invasion'. Since the excitement of the early days, no album has projected and presented Carlos Santana in such a light. To capture the subtleties and nuances of this man's complexities on vinyl is no mean feat. To say that this could possibly be the best of Santana to date will prove to be no exaggeration...In support of Devo, de-evolution and live Eps, after seeing Devo live from the Mabuhay Gardens, the Old Waldorf, the Warfield Theater, and platinum status (cover your ears, they'll burn), it's fuck'n' great. It's great to see this band in the coveted must-add status. Remember when some people lost jobs over radical groups like Devo, the B52's, and Blondie, etc, etc? Maybe he who laughs first, only thought they had the joke. It turned around and bit them hard!!...Other Adds: Pretenders. 'Talk Of The Town' was a turntable hit, and the import single of 'Message' is already in heavy rotation at KSJO. So, extract singles and insert Ep. Thanks again, Warner Bros., this add's on me...Lene Lovich 'New Toy' on Stiff Records found a new home with KSJO's 'Modern Humans Show'. Aired to good response, Roy Rosenberg cops another coup. I'm looking for Any Trouble real soon, Roy...Sales are the same this week, with requests in parallel...New action excitement with: Ozzy Osbourne, Santana, The Who, Teardrop Explodes, U-2, and Greg Kihn."

WBCN, BOSTON, MA M.D.-JIMMY MACK: "One dollar plus one dollar equals two dollars. That's it. There is nothing new or startling to corporate mentalities. Corporate callousness and indifference to human suffering in the name of profit is a reality of life. The music industry is no stranger to that reality, yet the cold-blooded manner with which the Robert Stigwood organization terminated the entire staff of RSO Records this week struck like a surprise kidney punch. My condolences and support for those victims of the liquidation. It is a simple case of deceit, and it effects everyone from Al Coury to our own local representative, Tony Marino. No use crying over spilt milk, I suppose, but I better not hear any stories about severance pay that never arrived,..... Now briefly about records. Robin Lane has once again done Boston proud. Gary Lyons provides the bottom and power this group has always had and none of the band's intricacies are sacrificed in the process...And ya'll may not know it, but Tom Dickie And The Desires were local scene-makers as well. Tom fronted the band Susan (a Providence outfit) and John Macey and Michael Roy headed up Foxpass, one of Boston's first New Wave aggregations. 'Downtown Talks' has all the makings of a classic. It's the kind of riff people will be stealing in a couple of years. As a matter of fact, it's the Big Mattress Song Of The Week, next week...A large pox on those of you ignoring the Fools. Top 15 sales here aren't chicken shit...Double pox on those ignoring the Rings. But as I said earlier, no use crying over spilt milk. Your lack of airplay will come back to haunt you one day...In Heavy at BCN, such notables as: U-2, Ellen Foley, Fabulous T-Birds, Adam & The Ants; and surprise, such mainstream artists as: Styx, 38 Special, Eric Clapton, and especially Journey ('Party's Over' is also our most played song this week.)... As I missed the last two weeks' comments, I should mention that Greg Kihn was BMSOTW with 'Can't Stop Hurting Myself'; and, Mr. Laquidara's selection from the week before was the Fabulous T-Birds, 'I Believe I'm In Love'...We had on-air interviews that included everyone from: Ted Nugent, Fools, Donnie Iris, Dave Edmunds, and Pearl Harbour...I just got the Starship album, I'm a very happy guy...Last but not least, as Ken Shelton puts it, 'The Santana album does not have one bad cut on it.'"

KWST, LOS ANGELES, CA M.D.-TED HABECK: "When Sammy Hagar got off his bad motor scooter, he parked it in front of Billy Squier's house, and Billy has been riding it ever since. 'In The Dark', 'The Stroke', 'Lonely Is The Night', and 'Whadda Ya Want From Me' are all killer rock and roll cuts. This guy is the most unknown, underrated guitar player in rock and roll today. When your Capitol man brings this one around, don't say no...Some good power pop rock to check into: The Producers--'Who Do You Think You Are' is the outstanding track, 'Life Of Crime', 'You Go Your Way', and 'The End' are also fine cuts...Cold Chisel--I look at this Lp a lot like the very first 'Live Wire' album, and I hope it will not get overlooked the way that one did. The cuts: 'Never Before' and 'My Baby' stand out...Point Blank is finally on the street. If you're one of many stations who have never played Southern rock before, don't just toss this one aside without listening to it. This one covers all variations of the rock format...You don't have to be a Grateful Dead fan to appreciate the relaxing potential of the latest release. Kick back and relax with some fine musicianship...A couple of weeks ago Beth Rosengard (good to have you back, by the way) gave me an advance cassette of the second album from Robin Lane and the Chartbusters---much better than the first. Check out the guitar on the back jacket...The sick puppy of the week award goes to Marko Babineau for his Ronnie Reagan joke that Ronnie has hit 70 with a bullet (gee, I thought he lost his bullet!!)...To John B.R.Scott: Why didn't you warn me I'd have a bad night Sunday!...Adam and the Ants had another great week in retail--#14 to #11...Biggest retail mover this week, U2-50 to 35...#1 on the phones is Ozzy Osbourne."

KZAP, SACRAMENTO, CA M.D.-TIM BEDORE: "Things have been a bit hectic here with the changes going on in the past week and I haven't listened to as many records as I'd like to. So, all I can really comment about is the 'Concerts For Kampuchea' Lp. I see this as a huge success. Selections for the record are tremendous. There is something here for everybody--a lot of image--a lot of rock and roll. A good strong appeal for a lot of different tastes. The performances are terrific. Right now we're on Wings and Rockestra and the Who cuts, but I think you can go much deeper than that with this record."

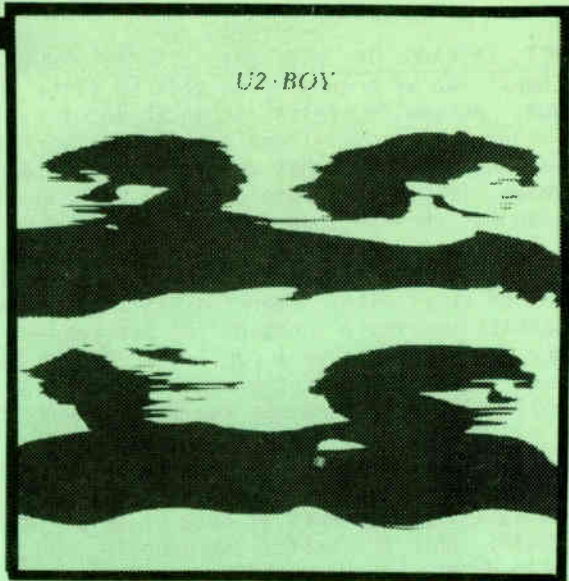

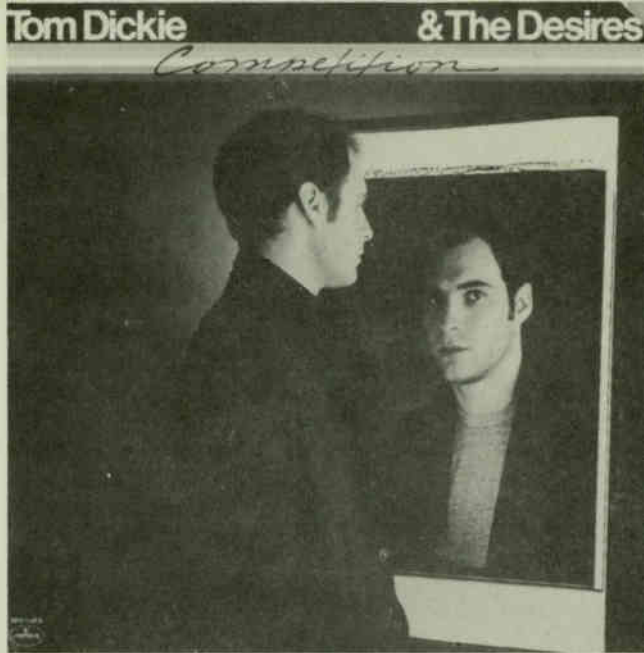

QUESTION CONTINUED

JOE MCCABE, KYYS: "From a personal standpoint, I like it. The particular stations I key in on are readily available. I do like the Indicators, since they tend to be true leaders in musical trends. Let's face it, we run a very tight list as do most of the other Level I stations. This makes it easier for me to gather relevant airplay information."

TIM BEDORE, KZAP: "I think that it's very important because you have to have that separation to know what type of station is playing what. It does me no good to have an overall chart with soft rockers, jazz album rockers and adult oriented, all lumped together--you end up with Velveeta cheese. The market size grouping is good. There will always be a difference in what breaks in the secondaries and what the major markets go with."

STEVE KELLER, WZZQ: "I think it's great, but what's this Level III bullshit? I feel like I've been relegated to some kind of federal bureaucratic low-income housing project. I've got a better idea, Bill. How about different stratas of bullshitters, on relative jumping and screaming on records that never make it? If you compiled the number of screams per person over a month's time, we'd have a much more accurate indicator of who's breaking records and who's got ears...Seriously, I agree with the system. It's a needed innovation."

STEVE RODIO, WRNO: "I like it. I think it organizes things a bit more. Before, everything you found was where it was. This way, you have kind of an index that you can turn to and know what is going to be there... The market grouping makes sense, because whether we like it or not, we are all grouped by market size."

PAUL PAYTON, WCCC: "I like it, it seems fair honest and equitable, which is more than you can say for most shit in the world today."

CHARLIE WEST, KMOD: "I like the system and think that it's an advantage for people like myself who look at other stations' charts, which I do a lot of. It gives you a quick reference on similar markets and is an organization change in a positive direction."

BOBBIN BEAM, WLPX: "I think it's fair and a good way of giving record companies a barometer of how their records are doing...Face it, you're talking market by market. You're going to be reaching more people and selling more records with play concentrated in the bigger markets."

GREG GILLISPIE, KAZY: "I think it's a good idea. Basically, because you're grouping powerful stations in large markets in the Level I category, strong stations in the secondaries in Level II, and obviously the Indicators are the ones willing to take a chance on a lot of new product. Level III is king of the stronger stations in the smaller markets. I would compare it to R&R's Parallel system. I think it makes it much easier to compare stations in similar markets."

LARRY BRUCE, KGB-FM: "I think the new system will be a productive one, at least I trust it will. I think that the information that I'll find most useful will be a comparison between how a record is charting with majors and how it is doing in the secondaries, on the assumption that the old precept of records breaking from smaller markets into larger ones still functions, at least some of the time...As for accolades, I think it's a great idea and I hope that results are as productive as the concept seems to be."

RICK SPRINGFIELD, "WORKING CLASS DOG", RCA

After a couple of weeks in the mid 30's, Rick catches fire with a 33-28 Prime Move. As "Jessie's Girl" continues to smoke Top 40, album rock gains are expected...Also note the tremendous jump on the Level I Metro Chart--up 41-29 with play increases on: WCOZ, WZZQ, WTUE, WAQX, and WAAF. "Jessie's Girl" moves 24-23 on the Song Index.

DOC HOLLIDAY, A&M

ROBIN LANE AND THE CHARTBUSTERS, "IMITATION LIFE", WARNER BROTHERS

As expected, strong Northeast action out of the box for Robin--WRNW, WPDH, WBLM, WCCC, WCMF, WPLR, WGIR-FM, WHCN, WQBK, WAAF, WCOZ, WBRU, and WBCN, and 13 more for #5 Most Added. Overall, I say this album is significantly stronger than the debut...Jose Diaz agrees, "Perhaps it's her material, perhaps it's the production by Gary Lyons, but it is a definite improvement. Cuts like 'Angel', the title track, and 'Blind' make this album worth considering beyond the Northeast"...Eddie Wazoo, WPLR says: "A definite improvement over the first. This has a little more spontaneity"...From Rob at WCOZ: "Lipshutz to radio--Robin and the Chartbusters have an album with at least five airable radio songs on it. Heavy on the Indicators: WRNW, KZEL, WPDH, WQBK, WLIR, WHFS, WXRT, WBRU, WOUR, and KTIM..."Ripple" and "On The Road" lead with "Dire Wolf" my personal fave...Comments: Ted Habeck, KWST: "You don't have to be a Dead fan to appreciate the relaxing potential of the latest release. Kick back and relax with some fine musicianship"...From Karen Andersen, WGIR-FM: "The package is an excellent collection of the classic Dead acoustic live set they've been incorporating into their shows for years. This Lp has the relaxed feel of old friends just sitting down to play and have fun making music together."

RECORDS TO WATCH:

GEORGE WALLACE, PORTRAIT

Love the production on George's debut--very Rundgrenesque. There are a million things going on in his songs, but for some reason they don't sound at all cluttered...Nice changes, and a unique, almost Tonio K, feel to the songwriting...Give a listen to "Back At Seventeen", "American Dream", and "She Gives Away".

LIVE WIRE, "CHANGES MADE", A&M

Frankly, I can't place any of Live Wire's previous music, but find the vocals and guitars on the new one interesting. Could almost be a cross between Police and Dire Straits. Try "Running" and "Child's Eye".

STRAIGHT EIGHT, RCA

The media havoc last Monday tended to limit add activity to majors this week so I expect to see a nice pickup on Straight Eight when things get back to normal in our next report period...WYSP and WHFS added this week...Listen to "Will You Love Me" and "Christine".
