Hard Choices

HUEY LEWIS & THE NEWS, "THE POWER OF LOVE",

CHRYSALIS... Anybody can have a hit. The lucky ones get a couple. But for the real heavyweights, the shots just keep on coming. When the label on his last went top 10, Huey became a bona fide Human Hook--so, take a tip from the sports pages and bet big when this prince of pop steps in the ring.

Y&T, "SUMMERTIME GIRLS", A&M

...I've always liked this guy's Hageresque vocals--and, as the tip sheets say, it's just been a matter of time 'til Y&T tied into the right track. Now these Bay Area Bombers say hello to Hitsville with one helluva car song. Crank the tape while you drive at least 55--and sing your seat belt off.

TIP

EURHYTHMICS, "BALL AND CHAIN", RCA... Does an act have to invite you guys over for tea to get that second track on the radio, or what? We highlighted this one in the album pick, and now that you've all gone out to dinner with Annie, and received your signed, notarized thank you note from Dave--take a tip from the Chain and get on the ball.

STING, "THE DREAM OF THE BLUE TURTLES", A&M

...When you get right down to it, Sting and Bruce co-chair the Cool Guy Club. His success comes from personality and immense individual talent--with no cultural ass kissing--and he hasn't faded one iota under the intense media spotlight... You know about the single--strong at #1, and from his sophisticated and jazzy LP we recommend "Love Is The Seventh Wave", "Shadows In The Rain", "Crusade" and "Black Seam".

CARLY SIMON, "TIRED OF BEING BLONDE", EPIC

...Carly's still the high priestess of yuppie ennui and, as expected, she shines at articulating the female point of view. She's a natural for this Larry Raspberry song, complemented by unexpectedly good dynamics courtesy of pit bosses G. E. Smith and T-Bone Wolk.

Chain Reaction

R.E.M., "CAN'T GET THERE FROM HERE", IRS/MCA

...The names and numbers say that R.E.M. has, in fact, arrived in a big way. The new single starts fast at #1 Most Added with 51--debuting at #55... Take it from these R.E.M. minds: Mark Miller, WJCK, "The hooks sink in instantly and it SHOULD be their biggest ever"... Bob Krane, WBCN, "If you're not a believer, then you shouldn't be in radio"... Larry Dunn, WLIR, "Their best to date. These guys are no longer a critics band"... Ron Diaz, WYNY, "The cassette has been in power rotation in my car for a week"... Russ Mottla, WAAF, "Welcome R.E.M. as a new core artist. This will do for them what 'War' did for U2"... Pam Edwards, KMET, "This weekend in LA they sold out at the Greek Theater and retailed 45,000 albums. That, combined with the strength of the 12", makes this an easy add"... And from Erin Riley, WQXR, "R.E.M. is as cool for you to play as U2. Your listeners know who they are."

JOHN PARR, "ST. ELMO'S FIRE", ATLANTIC

...Can't beat a three-song hot streak for firing up number four. "St. Elmo" grabs 31 for #3 Most Added and a #59 debut... From KGOV's Inessa York, "Sounds like a perfect crossover, real catchy"... XQRS' Wally Walker sez, "It's a well-produced rock and roll tune that will set you apart from your CHR competition. At least for now"... And from Rick Van Gil, WIOT, "John is on the way to becoming a household word, and this new tune is as deadly as an Abdul Jabbar skyhook."

BRYAN ADAMS, "SUMMER OF '69", A&M

...Some things just are, and that's the haps with our Boy Bry. Put it on--go to lunch. No problem. We're up to 60 fresh adds on the new single, with all the stats to match: Underlined 51-29 on the Song Chart, as the LP bounces back up 23-18, 25-16 Metro... And you'd be smart to take a hard look at the import 45 flip side "Diana", already on WRIF, WPLR, WDIZ, WLLZ, KLOS, XQRS, WDMF, CILQ and KSRR. New at #60.

TALKING HEADS, "ROAD TO NOWHERE", WB

...Join or die, as the saying goes. 15 adds, 75 on, and ups from WNEW, WSHE, WCCC, WRLS, KICT, WPCN and WHFS move "Road" 47-31, and 11 adds for "And She Was" bring it on at #96... Of their always unpredictable style, WHYY's Jeff Riccio notes, "It meant slow burn. It means curiosity calls. It means it will be around for a long time"... Bob Krane is ecstatic, "Stand up and shout it out loud. One of the most exciting records I've heard in a really really long time"... Again to Inessa at KGOV, "It's been a slow but increasingly delightful process of getting to know and like the album. This is going to be a wonderful summer"... From Roland West, KNAC, "America's best band of the last decade has again come up with something completely different. 'The Road To Nowhere' is paved with gold"... Back page action has the LP new at #23 Nationally, #30 Metro.

"WEIRD AL" YANKEVIC, "LIKE A SURGEON", SCOTTI

BROS/EPIC... Rock's reigning King of Cover Comedy sews up a quick 32, debuting at #84. We suggest the rest of you best flail it while fresh. Hey, it's not like you're getting married--this request line quickie is custom crafted for AM phones. And, when you run out of patients, you know they'll bust a gut over "I Want A New Duck."

RUSS BALLARD, "THE FIRE STILL BURNS", EMI

...That 54-36 Prime move hot enough for you? How about 25 new and 76 on after just two weeks? Already 4 or better emphasis at KSJD, WQFM, WYNY, WKDF, KZOK, KSRR, DC101 and WLAV--with increases coming from KSJD, WQFM, KZOK, KFMQ, KLPX and KISS... WQCI's Phil Manigki is impressed with the "great rhythm, smooth vocals and killer hook"... And WBLM's Tom Wallace feels, "Russ seems set to solidify the success he achieved last year. His subtle hooks never cease to amaze."

JEFF BECK AND ROD STEWART, "PEOPLE GET READY",

EPIC... Greg Gillispie sez his listeners are--"This is being accepted with open arms and ears, as it comes in at #7 Requests the first week out"... Also burning the wire at WHTF, WRLS, WSKS and WNEW, where Amy Grosser reports, "Unprecedented response; out one week and already pulling #3 phones"... It powers 16-10 Prime on the Song Index, with 18 at max and 23 increases. New on 16, now on 108.

RON JOVI, "IN AND OUT OF LOVE", POLYGRAM

...Adds and ups are the real deal--and John's in-the-pink with ups from KSHE, WNEW, WYNY and WRNY. With new air on WRIF, KKCI, WQFM, KSRR, WOUR, WPYX, WCCC and KXZL and 5 more. The increased major market activity is reflected in the 42-38 Metro Primer, as "In And Out" punches thru 99-71... Like the ad last week said, with trade charts in the mid-30's, it's selling better than half the stuff on your list--so give it a go!

Chain Reaction

SIGNIFICANT SONGS

HOWARD JONES, "LIFE IN ONE DAY", ELEKTRA... His start ups are never easy--but Rome wasn't build in a day, and his base broadens weekly...This report offers 11 adds, increased air on WSHE, max status at WLIR, KAZY and WLAV--and an 84-69 song Primer...We Checklist, and got 19 considering, 11 maintaining, and 11 building: WIOT, KAZY, WFYV, WHTF, WYDD, WRDU, WRXL, WQBX, WGRX, KMYZ and WXP.

BRYAN FERRY, "SLAVE TO LOVE", WB... You'll read ongoing comments from his always vocal Adventure Club fans, naturally, but at this point--all systems are go--12 more adds push the 4 week count to 72, as increases from KBCO, WGRX, WICN, WQHA and CFNY move "Slave" 45-32, doublepriming the lp 39-30 and 30-37...And the Checklist confirms with 24 builders, 15 maintaining, none dropping and 19 considering...Put it to work!

HEART, "WHAT ABOUT LOVE", CAPITOL... One of the year's strongest comebacks--say what! They top the week's play-up count with 19 (including KYYS, WQVE, WNEW, WCCC, WHJY, WCMF, WFYV, WPYX and WDIZ), as 34 max mentions and 29 "4" emphasis spins keep the Wilsons' working at #8, despite heavy product crunch...Inessa Turk puts it "in the 'going-to-be-huge' department," citing KGON's #2 phones, while "Love" leaps 16-10 Most Requested...The advance cassette has 'em raving about the tremendous depth--so dive in on delivery.

TEARS FOR FEARS, "SHOUT", MERCURY... Face it, Tears is the format discovery of '85--so keep "Shout" screaming and don't be shy when it comes to the "Big Chair's" other gems like the future international smash "Head Over Heels"... "Shout" primes 10-9, climbing on WFBQ, WQLS, KICT, WNEW, WSKS, WRKI, WAOX, KFMQ, KLPX and ten others, as the lp stays at #6 in the National league...WNEW's Amy Grosser: "The volume of requests we're getting is amazing. It's our #1 by far"...She's not alone, as Tears improve 5-4 Most Requested, and they're killing them in concert. New on 3, now on 87, two-thirds of which report "4" or "5" emphasis action.

DIRE STRAITS, "BROTHERS IN ARMS", WB... Their amazing 15-1 Most Requested move makes this the first time they've owned the phones since "Sultans"--as the lp primes 3-2 Nationally, gains 4-3 Metro; and "Money" marches 14-12 with 8 more ads and 7 ups...With this kind of public punch, we'd like to see the max plays gain significantly--they now stand at 21, with 26 more at "4"... "Walk Of Life" dips slightly 28-33 but, as TP sez, it ain't nothing to me. Bang 'em both.

ROBERT PLANT, "SHAKEN 'N' STIRRED", ESPERANZA/ATLANTIC... "Little" has #2 locked--with "Sixes And Sevens" the comer. It climbs 22-16, with ups from KSHE, WYNF, KATT, WQLS, KLPX and three more. 10 adds and 68 now playing...And shouldn't everybody take advantage of the #2 tune from the #1 album?

TOM PETTY, "MAKE IT BETTER", MCA... The 23-17 underline comes through courtesy of 8 on and 12 ups led by KSHE, WNEW, WSHE, WCCC, KATT, KZOK, KMET, KICT and KISS--with 14 max mentions including WMPR, WNOQ, KILQ, KZOK, KBCO, KLDL and WYNF.

RATT, "LAY IT DOWN", ATLANTIC... The single picks up another 5 to give it 76 to date--as top 5 phones follow thru at WLLZ, WCMF, WLVD, WHJY, WFYV, WSKS, KLPX, KISS, KFMQ, KXZL and more move it 4-3 Most Requested...And as noted by Tom Starr, the retail looks great, "#2 sales on a band's sophomore album is big news around here, and Ratt has pulled it off against all the heavy hitters"...WQVE, WNEW, WCCC, WOUR, KMET, KLPX, KISS and 6 more increases fired up triple primers: 24-22 for "Lay It Down", with the lp building 29-25 Overall, 32-25 Metro...Again--in terms of request and retail validation, this tops the chart of credible crunch.

U2, "WIDE AWAKE IN AMERICA", ISLAND... Radio's choice from the Ep earns the 32-24 underline, with 9 adds, 5 ups and 21 listing "4" or better emphasis play. It sneaks onto the Most Requested with WQVE, WRKI, WQIR, WICN, WYFS and WLIR topping the call roll. Up 22-17/27-19 on the back page...Meanwhile, WPDH's Pam Brooks speaks up for this week's #96 song debut, saying "It's still my pick, and still very strong on the phones"...And "Bad" hits at 100, with action on KTXQ, WMPR, WBCN, WBAB, WLIR, KFOG and several more.

BOB DYLAN, "TIGHT CONNECTION", COLUMBIA... "Tight" does right by the Checklist--with a very healthy 34 building and none dropping--ditto the air stats: up on 8 (WCCC, KATT, WBCN, WQHA, KLPX), none down, 41 steady... "Tight" primes 36-23, as does the lp 28-20/24-17 Metro...We're looking at top 5 phones from WQVE, WBRU, WQBX, KFMQ and KBCO...As WBRU's Lara Murray mentioned, "He's been #1 for three straight weeks now, with calls coming from all demos. Furthermore, I've passed at least five people singing the song on the street in the last two weeks"...WKQQ's Rob Ellis agrees, "This song has big upper demo appeal."

MEN AT WORK, "TWO HEARTS", COLUMBIA... Their subtleties may have raised a few eyebrows at the week one stage--but it seems to be working out as planned--witness the 37-27 Song Index underline and 27-21 Lp Primer. Four more adds make it 85 now playing, with XSJO, WGOR, KMET and KLAQ at max and 14 more at "4". Upped at WRIF, WAOX, KLAQ, WCMF, WPLR, WEZX and WCCC. And the Checklist is strong too--with KXCI, WLUP, KZOK, WCCC, WPLR, KLAQ, XSJO and WRXL among the 15 builders; only 2 dropping and 35 maintaining... The #2 track "Snakes And Ladders" goes 96-89.

COREY HART, "NEVER SURRENDER", EMI... It's really too early to expect phones, but Corey's latest has plenty of radio regard, as noted by WLVD's Lee Randall, "The Corey moves up to power. Limited calls, but I have great confidence"...Six adds, 72 total, 10 max (KYY5, WYFE, WFYV, WKQQ, WLVD) and 13 ups (KSHE, KYYS, WSHE, WYDD, WHJY, WAOX) motivate a 42-25 song underline.

FOREIGNER, "REACTION TO ACTION", ATLANTIC... "Reaction" rates a 43-34 primer, with 8 new, 56 now playing, and ups from WSHE, WSKS, WOUR, KLPX and KISS--with no decreases and 41 steadies. The airplay shakes down with 2 at max, 15 more at "4", 26 listing "3" and 9 more at "2"...The lp gets the 30-27 Metro underline, up 32-29 in the Nationals.

HELIX, "DEEP CUTS THE KNIFE", CAPITOL... After 5 weeks on the air, the Checklist looks great: Phones and sales are building at WQFM, CILQ, WYNF, WYFE, WLLZ and KLAQ. Phones are up at KISS, WIOT, WQCN, WOUR, WFYV, WQHA, WJYJ and WEZX... And, we've got 24 building to 14 maintaining, with 12 considering...The lp converts for debuts at 38/36 Metro, with a 46-42 Primer for "Deep". New on 6, now on 62--with increases at KLDL, KOME, WTUE, WQHA and KISS.

GEORGE THOROGOOD, "WILLIE AND THE HAND JIVE", EMI... George continues to assert his album identity as track #3 balls 50-43 underlined--with 8 adds, 6 ups (KSHE, WQFM, WSHE, WACK) and 53 now playing...The lp gains 36-33 Metro, 38-36 Nationally.

SIMON TOWNSHEND, "BARRIERS", 21/POLYGRAM,... WIOT's Rick Van Gil comments, "Breaking down the barriers of having a brother like Peter can't be an easy task, but the more I listen to Simon the more impressed I am. Forget the sophomore jinx, Simon is for real"...WAAF's Russ Mottla said, "Love the production!"...David Grossman, WCCC, felt, "He gets better"...Dana at KOME called it "A good song"...WKQQ's Rob Ellis reacted "Surprisingly strong"...KZOK's Larry Sharp said, "Nice--I'm impressed"...and from WRDU's Bob Walton, "I'd love to see it happen"...Early believers include WHJY, KPCO, WEZX, WHTG and three others... Also check out "Meet You."

TAXXI, "STILL IN LOVE WITH YOU", MCA,... Out about a minute and already on WLLZ, WNEW, KOME, KATT, KLPX and five more...Inessa York, KGON, feels, "Taxxi is sounding as good as they ever have and better with the neat little hook on "Still In Love"...WKQQ's Rob Ellis adds, "'Still In Love' is the surprise of the week. Check out the great sax work at the end of the tune"...From WNEW's Amy Grosser, "Even though Taxxi has only enjoyed marginal success up to this point, 'Still In Love' is so strong we feel that should change quickly"...Also be sure to put an ear to our office fave "Lipstick".

SUZANNE VEGA, "MARLENE ON THE WALL", A&M,... Sure, critical acclaim is wonderful but, as they say in South Philly, it don't pay the bills. However, in her case--we're talking equal parts class and commercial potential...KLAQ's Pepe Lopex sez, "Could be a surprise smash"...Bob Kranes calls it "Poignant, exciting, refreshing"...KBCO's Doug Clifton cites "Good adult appeal"...From WHFS' Bob Showacre, "Absolutely great"...WQBK's Peggy Apple agrees, "Cool, light, refreshing"...and KAZY's Zak Phillips expects "Major success"...And from WBLM's Tom Wallace, "Suzanne's album has been enjoying heavy rotation at home lately and it feels great to be on the air with the remix. She has limitless potential"... Note the #99 song debut.

TEXTONES, "MIDNIGHT MISSION", GOLD MOUNTAIN/A&M,...The add tempo picks up with 9--including WDHA, KSRR, KMET, KRIX, and KROQ--and with 32 now playing and WCCC increasing, they've got an 87-79 primer... Karen A. Small, WGIR, says, "The addition of Don Henley and the new mix does wonders for the song. It's good to have a socially conscious record around right now"...WOOJ's Charlie Keen adds, "I'm floored by 'Midnight Mission'. Highly reminiscent of the Eagles meets the Pretenders."

KATRINA AND THE WAVES, "RED WINE AND WHISKEY", CAPITOL,...The new 12" comes up for air at WBLM, WEZX, WRKI, KBCO, WOUR and KORX--and as the Lp holds in the low 40's, "Red Wine" debuts at #98...We're with WBLM's Tom Wallace, "I still find the Lp to be one of the most listenable records released in years. 'Red Wine' is the perfect choice for a second cut."

PAUL HARDCASTLE, "NINETEEN", CHRYSALIS,...Media types always burn out on issues, causes and hooks long before the people do--and response to this unusual offering would seem to indicate a surprising number of the upper demos are interested and wanna hear about it...As WKQQ's Rob Ellis told us, "We put it in for a smash or trash, and the results were overwhelmingly in favor of '19'. The lyrics are the real catch"...Be topical--play it and solicit response. It's working overtime on your competition.

GOWAN, "A STRANGE ANIMAL", COLUMBIA,... Nothing strange about the solid reaction they're getting on the Tears tour or these après concert raves: Bob Kranes, WBCN, "Once you see them, you'll be hooked. 'Animal' is the cut that's doing well for us in Boston. Gowan is an exciting performer who looks like Bono and handles the stage as smoothly as anyone I've ever seen"...Ron Diaz, WYNF, "I didn't know what to expect, but by the end of the set I was convinced that he will be a superstar. Very theatrical and almost Gabriellesque in his performance which created a feverish pitch in the audience"...We put the Lp to the Checklist jury and got positives from: Lex Staley, WFYV, "Great potential"...Dana Jang, KOME, "Sounds like Supertramp"...Rad Messick, WDIZ, "Plenty of potential"...Bob Walton, WRDU, "Love to see it happen"...John Derringer, CILO, "What can I say?...Karen Small, WGIR, "DeBurgh's footsteps"...Also put an ear to "A Criminal Mind" and "Keep The Tension On".

NIGHT RANGER, "7 WISHES", CAMEL/MCA,... Any major ranger knows the "Street" is certified--with 47 max, and increases at WLLZ, WNEW, WPLR, KSRR, KLAQ, KICT and several more. Still #9 Most Requested and up 7-6 in airplay...But the really big question is, what's next? We took it to the Checklist and --surprise, surprise--the title track, already on KSRR, WQFM, KILO, KLPX, KISS, KOME and more gets the nod...Meanwhile, back at the album, 9-8 Nationally, 6-6 Metro.

THE HOOTERS, "ALL YOU ZOMBIES", COLUMBIA,... Although the charts didn't change much--"Zombies" at 11, the Lp at 12 Nationally, 13-12 Metro--the calls are gangbusters, as are the play-ups with KLOL, KQRS, WNEW, KZOK, WRIF and WRCN among this week's 10 increases. 101 now playing, only one reporter decreased play, and 24 now list max rotation...From KQRS' Wally Walker, "This has been a great request item and is now beginning to test well. It makes a great exclusive for us in this market."

SUPERTRAMP, "BROTHER WHERE YOU BOUND", A&M,... This revamped cornerstone act continues to look the part with top 5 phones at WIUE, KFVY, KATZ, KESI, KXZL, WHTF and more. "Cannonball" rolls up another 8 play hikes (KSHE, KOME, KKEI, DC101). 4-4 on the Song Index, max status at 59, with healthy crossover activity...Meanwhile, "Better Days" inches 77-75, thanks to new air on KSJO, WWWV and KMYZ, and 24 adds to date. Now prepare for the 8:00 "Brother" edit desk-bound at this instant.

POWER STATION, "BANG A GONG", CAPITOL,... Mega-jumps from U2, Zimmie, Corey and the Men force the Station down a notch to #30--but will you look at these increases at KLOS, WIOT, WZZO, WGIR, KKEI, WMGM and WBLM--pretty impressive considering the hang time. Top 5 phones at WQMF, WCCC, WSKS, WYDD and WBLM also indicate "Gong" is still uptrending. KLBK, KLOS, KROQ, WSKS, WYDD, WIOT, WZZO, WLIR bang away at "5", with 14 more at "4".

JOHN CAFFERTY & THE BEAVER BROWN BAND, "TOUGH ALL OVER", SCOTTI BROS/EPIC,...With a #3 single and 13 play increases, it's still growing. I'd say that most of you are a little late in moving in early on guaranteed hits to be. No risk--great sound. How easy can it get? The Checklist says "C I T Y" is radio's next choice followed by "Voice Of America's Sons". Cut down on single wear and tear with one or both.

REO, "GOTTA FEEL MORE", EPIC,...The fourth cut is always tough, and we respect the growth curve here --there's another underline 59-48--and 8 new adds is noteworthy in this traffic; especially with WNEW, WAAF, WYNF, KLPX and WNOR on the list. You wanted a rocker--so...

“Getcha Back”

Joe McCabe, KYYS: “A new song with all the old flair and flavor of vintage Beach Boys music.”

Zak Phillips, KAZY: “We’ve been playing ‘Getcha Back’ in our hottest rotation for several weeks now. Phone response has been phenomenal and the song really helped kick off summertime in Denver.”

Dave Kane, WCMF: “‘Getcha Back’ has started the ball rolling as one of America’s favorites come cruisin’ back onto the radio with an album full of the familiar harmonies and good time music that made them so popular in the first place.”

Gene Romano, WZZO: “We have a lot of listeners between the ages of 25-40 and this is a perfect song for our radio station to give to those people. ‘Getcha Back’ is working better than we ever thought it would.”

“Maybe, I Don’t Know”

Buzz Knight, WRKI: “The Beach Boys’ harmonies have never sounded better. Perfect for upper demo summer appeal. The searing guitar work of Gary Moore on ‘Maybe, I Don’t Know’ adds rock credibility, while ‘It’s Getting Late’ is a good second cut.”

Lex Staley, WFYV: “‘Maybe, I Don’t Know’ is the progression I wanted to see in the Beach Boys for the past ten years. The addition of Gary Moore is the hook they were looking for and those great licks combined with those legendary harmonies make ‘Maybe’ a great song.”

Mark Chernoff, WDHA: “Need some summer harmonies and a great tune? Check out ‘Maybe, I Don’t Know’. This Beach Boys tune sure has the goods.”

“California Calling”

Lin Brehmer, WXRT: “When I think of summer, I think of beach girls and beach boys. And I can’t help but hear ‘California Calling’ ’cause it wacks the boards.”

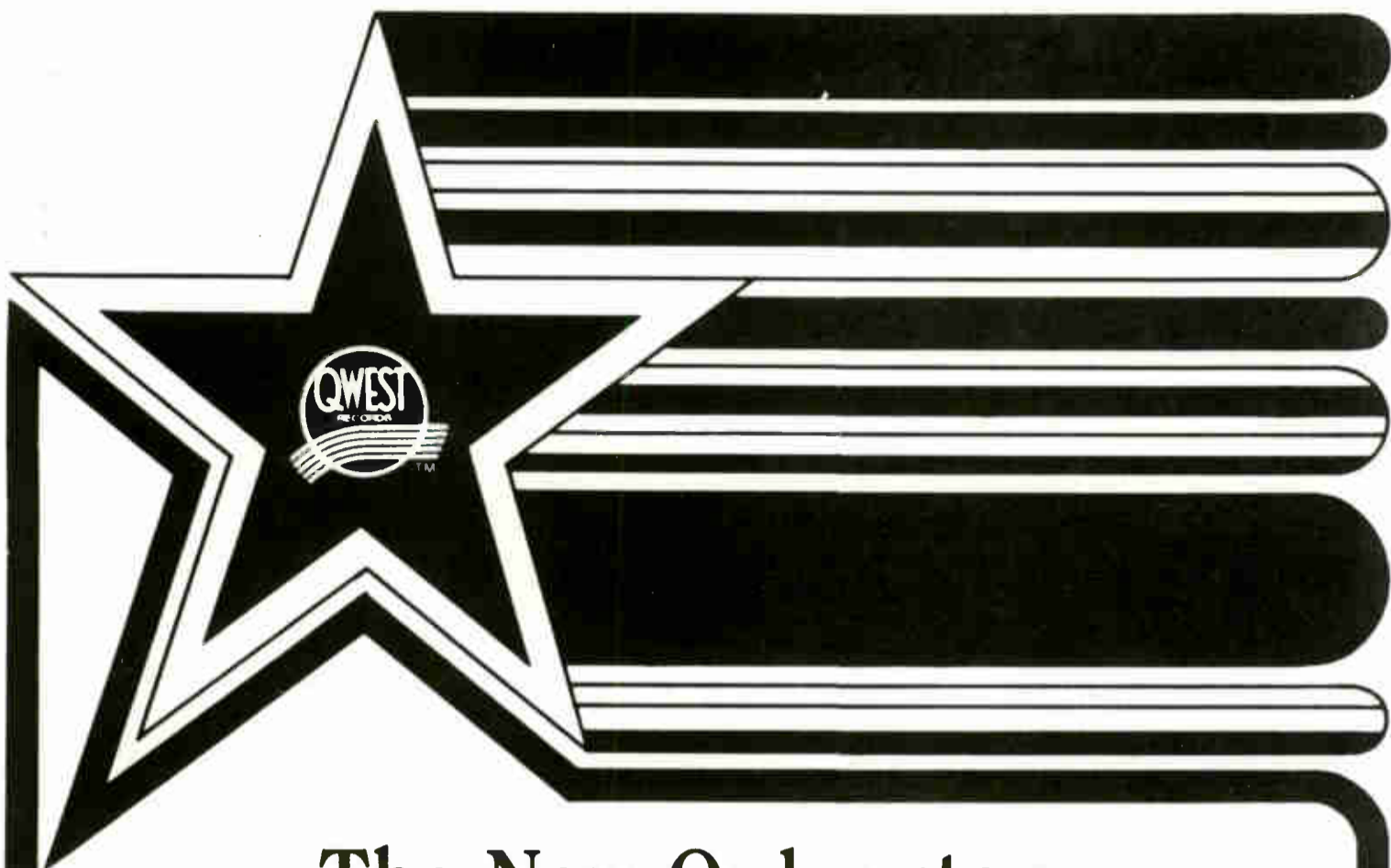

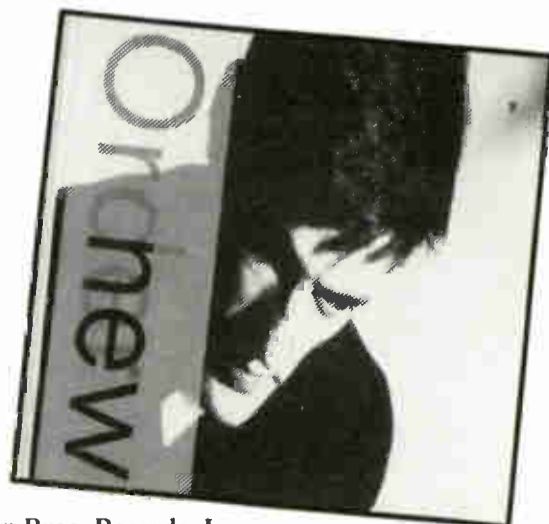

LIVE AID UPDATE

The blueprint for Rock's greatest hour continues to unravel as the entire planet buzzes about LIVE AID. Commenting on the July 13 international concert to benefit Ethiopia's famine victims, co-promoter Bill Graham told FMQB: "The positive obsession of Bob Geldof is reaching another level. Here's another example of the music industry rearing its positive head and showing what can be done with positive power. It seems like the negative aspect of our industry is always maximized, and the positive aspect is always minimized. Perhaps this will help give credit to those artists who continually say, 'we will support the worthy causes and the needy causes.' Many years ago there was one incident in Altamont and it's never been forgotten. Perhaps people will now begin to realize what the positive side of our industry can do and what the results of that can be, as is being exemplified by the execution of Bob Geldof's obsession."

Despite rumors to the contrary, Graham has confirmed that the WHO will reunite for the London concert, while some artists may play both venues by hopping a transatlantic flight on the Concorde.

MTV will carry both concerts, while ABC-TV will broadcast limited portions from 8PM-11PM. The ABC Radio Network will handle the 18 hour live radio broadcast, with the right of first refusal going to ABC Young Adult Network affiliates on a non-exclusive basis. The network tells FMQB that any station planning to participate in the broadcast will be asked to make a serious commitment to educating their audience about the elimination of world hunger, along with paying a rights fee.

The show will alternate between Philly and London so that the 90,000 fans at JFK will be able to watch the Wembley show on giant screens. It appears that Ticketron will handle the tickets--priced at \$35 and \$50. Organizers emphasized that there will be no comp tickets, no limousines, and none of the backstage excess typically associated with a concert of this magnitude. As co-promoter Larry Magid told us, "We have to figure out how we're going to accommodate the public first. The industry people will be the last ones we contact. We're not going to ignore them, but they're the least of our problems. They will be taken care of." Two LIVE AID hotlines have been set up to handle the flood of calls for information: 215-976-7699 and 215-988-9799.

Any misconceptions concerning AOR's image should be cleared up by the format's all-out commitment to this unparalleled project. Here's how reporting stations assessed initial audience reaction to the marathon project:

TIM DRAYER, WHTF: "Presently at STARVIEW 92, we are channeling all our efforts to tie-in with this concert since the concert is in our backyard and the Ethiopia problem is in our front yard. Response has been fantastic in Central Penna. People are waiting to find out about ticket sales. It is quite clear that this concert can be looked upon as the Woodstock of the 80's."

LARS MURRAY, WBRU: "There has been lots of phone response right off-the-bat, mostly about tickets which are a bigger concern than the artist line-up. It smells like the event of the century. Anybody who doesn't at least want to do a promotion is crazy!"

PEPE LOPEZ, KLAQ: "The buzz has been very h-o-t! The rumor about The Who reforming has been the key to their interest. And we will tie-in, if possible."

ERIN RILEY, WMMR: "Well, obviously, being here in Philadelphia, it's mass hysteria! The kind of calls we've had are pure and total excitement. Most of them want to know how soon can they get tickets. Today we broadcast live from the Mayor's office the official Philadelphia Press Conference with Bill Graham, local promoter, Larry Magid and Mayor Wilson Goode. We're proud to have it in Philadelphia. How much prouder could we be? When you're in town for the concert, come to the radio station--we'll all have lunch!"

DAVE KANE, WCMF: "At this point in time, calls are mostly out of curiosity. I'm left with the impression that, as of this writing, the major portion is not aware of what's going on. Obviously, we are not going to let an event of this magnitude go by with just casual mentions. We plan on tying in with an entertainment transportation facility that we've used in the past, and put together a package deal that includes tickets and transportation. We'll survey the situation and decide how much more we need to do."

DOUG PODELL, WLLZ: "Reaction was very positive and we plan to send listeners to the show and do whatever else we can. It should be an historic event, to say the least!"

The Rock Report

WELL, THE BIG STORY THIS WEEK IS, obviously, LIVE AID -- the 16-hour benefit concert for Ethiopia. The shows are taking place at Philadelphia's JFK stadium and London's Wembley arena and will be transmitted via satellite to an estimated audience of 1 billion people. MTV has purchased the broadcast rights to LIVE AID and will air all 16 hours. ABC Television also plans to broadcast at least three hours of this historical rock and roll event. Scheduled to appear in Philly are: Bryan Adams, The Cars, Eric Clapton, Duran Duran, Boy George, Hall & Oates, Huey Lewis and The News, Mick Jagger, Waylon Jennings, Judas Priest, Kris Kristofferson, Billy Ocean, The Pretenders, Santana, Paul Simon, Simple Minds, Rod Stewart, The Temptations and Neil Young. In London the acts are: Adam Ant, The Boomtown Rats, David Bowie, Phil Collins, Elvis Costello, Dire Straits, Bryan Ferry, Elton John, Howard Jones, Nik Kershaw, Alison Moyet, Nils Lofgren, Sade, Queen, Spandau Ballet, Status Quo, Sting, Style Council, U-2, Wham!, Ultravox, Paul Young, Pete Townshend and John Entwistle. The Who will not be reforming contrary to previous reports. Between the songs "educational inserts" will be dropped in featuring Coretta King, Caesar Chavez, Richard Attenborough and soccer star Pele. An 800# will also be provided for donations by the viewing audience. The concerts begin at 7 AM London time and noon Phila. time. The first five hours will come from London, the second five hours will flip flop and the last six hours will come from Philadelphia.

THE ROCK REPORT SPOKE TO ELTON JOHN recently and he told us he is very excited to be part of LIVE AID. Elton plans to open his 20-minute performance with John Lennon's "Lucy In The Sky With Diamonds" as a tribute to John, who was one of our most socially conscious musicians. Meanwhile, in other Elton news, he has just completed a total of 18 tracks, enough for two records according to Elton, and plans to release his new album in September on Geffen. Appearing on some of the tracks are Nik Kershaw, who plays guitar, George Michael of Wham!, Sister Sledge, and Mel Gaines from Simple Minds. Currently Elton is enjoying British chart success with "Acts Of War", a duet he recently recorded with Millie Jackson.

MICK JONES, ONE-TIME GUITARIST FOR THE CLASH, is currently in London's Town House Studios mixing his first single for Columbia titled "The Bottom Line". Jones's new band, still unnamed, consists of Leo Williams on bass, Gregg Roberts on drums and Don Letts on keyboards. Look for the single sometime this summer.

JOURNEY HAS 8 TRACKS COMPLETED for their new album due sometime this fall. Steve Perry and Jim Gehn (Huey Lewis) are producing. Journey hope to tour shortly after the record hits the streets. After the Journey tour, Steve Perry will begin work on the follow-up to last year's "Street Talk", his debut album. Founding Journey guitarist and vocalist Gregg Rollie will also see the release of his own album in July being co-produced by Kevin Beamish (REO Speedwagon).

PAT BENATAR EMERGES FROM BATMAN'S CAVE where she just shot her last video to the song "Invincible" from the upcoming film "The Legend Of Billy Jean" starring Helen Slater ("Supergirl"). The tri-star movie will be released in July.

TREVOR HORN'S LATEST PROJECT IS ESQ - the group is led by Nikki Squire, wife of Yes bassist Chris Squire. She is currently in Sarm Studios working on their debut album for ZTT/Island due this fall. Also included in the band is drummer Andy Newmark.

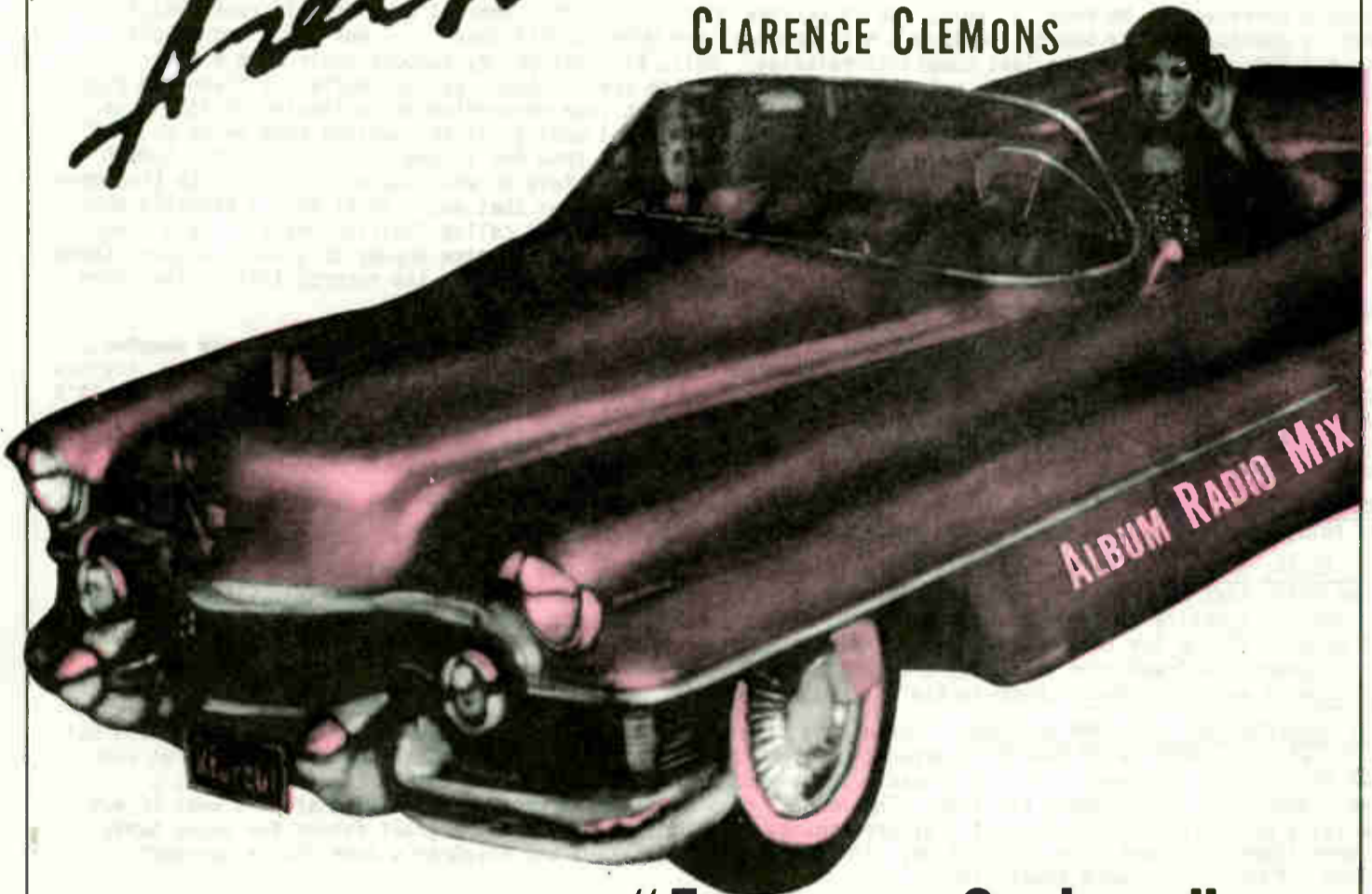

WYNF, TAMPA/ST. PETERSBURG, FL M.D.-RON DIAZ: "The cassette of R.E.M.'s 'Fables Of The Reconstruction' has been in power rotation in my car for a week. Not being an R.E.M. fan at first (OK, so I missed one!), I really wasn't all that worked up about it. After repeated listenings to the whole cassette, I am excited about R.E.M. 'Driver 8' and 'Can't Get There From Here' are killers! 'Fables Of The Reconstruction' will fly out of the record stores. Hey, Plen, for once we agree!...Huey Lewis has another s-m-a-s-h. 'Power Of Love' will be one of those instant hits, ya know-fat hooks, beefy guitars, and let's face it, Huey is a media hero...I believe it was back in the Fall of '84 when Bob Kranes mentioned how tragic the situation in Ethiopia was getting-- (the first film clips were just getting on the nightly news). The following week I mentioned that maybe a benefit concert ala Bangladesh would be something to think about. Well, we've had Band Aid and everything in between, and now coming, the Live Aid concerts. I never dreamed the relief effort would have gotten so massive. Just great!...P.S.: Bo Sox Kranes: 8 in a row! Wow, what did you do?"

KGB-FM, SAN DIEGO, CA ASST. P.D./M.D.-TED EDWARDS: "Greetings from KGB-FM, the only State Home for the electric guitar in San Diego, CA! The key word this week is quality...Corey Hart 'Never Surrender'. This is the first time around for KGB-FM on Corey Hart. Although his last effort was obviously strong, programming and saleswise at the same time, it wasn't what we were looking for--Or more precisely, it wasn't what our audience perceived to be rock 'n' roll. We do believe they'll like this one. I sure do! It really kicks me where it counts. In the heart, you know...Nils Lofgren 'New Holes In Old Shoes'. I was a big fan at one time but lost interest in the last couple of releases. Well, Nils has got my support again with his outstanding effort. I realize this tune is not the one that's getting the big push, but do yourself a favor and check it out...U2 'The Three Sunrises'. Sometimes great tunes fall on lame ears--Mine in particular in this case. But we hear it now and humbly put it on-the-air. (All right, so I made a mistake--whadya want me to do, kill myself?)...Additional tracks and re-adds: Phil Collins 'Only You Know And I Know'; Don Henley 'Not Enough Love'; Robert Plant 'Sixes And Sevens'--our 4th cut and my personal fave on what happens to be the Lp I've gone back to most often in the past few weeks...And once again those guys on that small label that I probably push a little too much, the mondo Beat Farmers. We're spinning a tune called 'Selfish Heart'. It's a real rocker! Even though Rhino can't afford to take you to dinner, do take the time anyway to give it a spin--(Even if just for the novelty of the experience)...P.S.: Remember, if you don't like the records that I like, then you suck--but you look mah-velous!"

KYYS (KY102), KANSAS CITY, MO P.D.-JOE MacCABE: "Let's do short comments, ok?...Heart and Hart are smashes... Record, song, track, etc., etc., of the week is John Parr's 'St. Elmo's Fire'...People are calling for 'the new Rod Stewart' -- better put a big sticker on the Beck record...Graham Parker may be stalling initially, but it's working big here...Dire Straits 'Money For Nothing' is the song lyric of the year. You know the line I'm talking about...Can't wait to play the sixth song from Don Henley. We'll play that one independently...Russ Ballard has another radio smash. Is that two smash references in one paragraph? Fire me..."

WSKS, CINCINNATI, OH M.D.-MARTY BENDER: "I like the Taxxi...I want a Tom Rush album...And I just wanna know one thing--is Ant Music going to catch on or what?"

KMYZ, TULSA, OK M.D.-P.D. WITT: "It's one hell of a lot of fun and one hell of a lot of work building a new radio station. To some people, thanks a lot. To others, can we talk? Our number is 918-665-3131... Our musical identity is still growing. So far, we say be careful with 'Nineteen'. Don't go too long and let others fall in the trap...Beck, Dire Straits, Supertramp and Robert Plant are asking for depth but we don't ignore the fresh ones that keep a balance like Bryan Ferry and Fiona...Howdys to former compadres Lee Roberts and Chris Ryan...Reep kockin'."

WAQX, SYRACUSE, NY M.D.-AMY DAHLMAN: "Spend some time with the new Heads Lp and 'Stay Up Late' will stand out as the winner...Real solid sounds reverberating from the R.E.M. album. 'Can't Get There From Here' has even made Ed an R.E.M. believer...It's a pleasure to re-add the Bon Jovi. 'In And Out Of Love' was always a fave - should go the distance for them...The Hooters show significant promise retailwise after a week as our specially priced pick. In the past a strong showing as a pick has predicted a great future for young bands ...Good times last week with Arista's Jay 'I'm the new guy' Ziskraut and PolyGram's John 'Got a quarter?' Weston...Mama's Boys were great live."

WAAF, WORCESTER/BOSTON, MA M.D.-RUSS MOTTLA: "Welcome R.E.M. as a new core artist to AOR radio. 'Fables Of The Reconstruction' will do for R.E.M. what 'War' did for U2. Sure I play Phil Collins a lot, too, but it's songs like 'Can't Get There From' that will keep AOR a vital and alternative format--with mass appeal."

WBLM, LEWISTON/PORTLAND, ME M.D.-TOM WALLACE: "If early reaction is any indication, this new R.E.M. album will be their ticket to mass acceptance. Simply stunning stuff...Russ Ballard seems set to solidify the success he achieved last year with his new tune. Russ's subtle hook never ceases to amaze...I still find the Katrina And The Waves Lp one of the most listenable records released in years. 'Red Wine And Whiskey' is a perfect choice for a second cut. Go Katrina!...The Suzanne Vega album has been enjoying heavy rotation at home lately and it feels great to be on-the-air with the remix of 'Marlene On The Wall'. Suzanne has limitless potential...The new album from Men At Work is already selling very nicely in these parts, so we went with 'Man With Two Hearts' in addition to the single...In the request department, Ratt is still burning up the phones, and calls for 'that T-Rex remix' are building nicely."

WYFE, ROCKFORD, IL M.D.-FRED BRENNAN: "I'm going to be so bold as to state that Mr. Mister's new single, 'Broken Wings', is a potential Top 10 AOR s-m-a-s-h! It has the same feel as The Hooters 'All You Zombies', but I think 'Broken Wings' is more melodically solid. I've had a lot of respect for this band since their pre-history days when they were known as Pages. I hope this one puts them over the top. It's the first time we've gone out-of-the-box with a relatively unknown band in almost two years...I'm really looking forward to the Cubs prevailing over the Mets on 'Monday Night Baseball'. Go Cubs!"

WRCN, LONG ISLAND, NY ASST. P.D./M.D.-JOHN GRAPPONE: "The Style Council--yeh!...The track to start the album off for the Talking Heads 'Little Creatures' is 'And She Was'."

WOUR, UTICA/SYRACUSE, NY M.D.-TOM STARR: "Rodent Rock Rules Retail. Well, not quite. But a #2 sales debut on a band's sophomore album is big news around here, and Ratt has pulled it off against all the heavy hitters!"

WIOT, TOLEDO, OH M.D.-RICK VAN GIL: "More quality tunes out this week, and leading the list is John Parr's 'St. Elmo's Fire'. John is on his way to becoming a household word and this new tune is as deadly as an Abdul Jabbar skyhook!...Breaking down the barriers of having a brother like Peter Townshend can't be an easy task, but the more I listen to Simon Townshend, the more impressed I get and I applaud his work. Forget the sophomore jinx! Simon Townshend is for real...We'll test A-HA. The Innocent and Taxxi this week. All three of these bands have ear-catching tunes...We've been air-testing a band called Xeron for over a month now with some pretty decent response. Take time out to listen to 'Visions' and 'Does Anybody Hear?' These are the groundwork to some good sounding rockin' from a possible band of the future."

WRXL, RICHMOND, VA M.D.-PAUL SHUGRUE: "Big 'hello' to Tim Scott of KSRR in Houston and his new baby from the XL staff, a truly minor achievement. Congratulations!...On a different note, Chrysalis 'Say It Isn't So'. Al Twanmo is a first class record rep. You guys are making a mistake that will come back to haunt you! Good luck, Al...Tom Evans is heading out to see Bryan Adams tonight, thanks to Eva at A&M. He and I are thinking of taking a road trip to Philadelphia for 'Live Aid To Ethiopia'. What a line up! It's like Woodstock, California Jam and the US Festival all in one. I wouldn't stoop so low as to ask for tickets, but does anybody know where to BUY them?...REO is coming to town at the end of the month; and, to promote the 'Wheels Are Turnin'' tour, we're giving away three Yamaha motorbikes--ridden on stage by our morning team, Dick and Dixie (well, actually, they'll probably walk them up, but it sure sounded good!)...R.E.M.'s 'Can't Get There' surpasses 'Radio Free Europe' as their best song. If you consider your station to be anywhere near the cutting edge of new rock, you should be playing both."

KLAQ, EL PASO, TX M.D.-PEPE LOPEZ: "Dear Blabby Sez: Listen up all you AOR types. If you are the trend-setters you are supposed to be, you won't even think twice about adding R.E.M. This band is a format exclusive (for now). Musically, the album is solid. If you don't like 'Can't Get There' check out 'Driver 8'. Take Blabby's word for it, this band is America's U2...Personal to Dave Fleischman: You tricky rascal you. Pretty sneaky sending me an unlabeled record so I would get my curiosity aroused. Of course we added it! The tune is killer!...Address all correspondence to: Dear Blabby c/o this publication. Blabby will answer any and all questions about anything and everything - and then some."

WBRU, PROVIDENCE, RI M.D.-LARS MURRAY: "In a week that has brought both a Talking Heads and an R.E.M. Lp, my comments could fill a small book, but I'll try to be concise. I raved about Talking Heads last week and I see great potential for 'Roads' to go big, based on requests the first week. Also, 'And She Was' harkens back to '77' and 'More Songs...', 'Stay Up Late' is great fun, kind of like Tom Tom Club with a funectomy. Not just a critic-pleasing record... 'Can't Get There From Here' has what, for my money, is R.E.M.'s best hook ever. Funky guitar, Michael Stipes' almost intelligible snarl, not to mention great background vocals could make this their biggest song to date. A song as infectious as this can't be regarded as a risk. It's this week's Master Blaster... Bob Dylan always warrants heavy rotation and once again he's proven why. He's been the #1 request for three straight weeks now with calls coming from all demos. Furthermore, I've passed as least five people singing the song on the street in the last two weeks... This week has been overwhelming in terms of new quality product and the Sting record hasn't even arrived yet!"

WPDH, POUGHKEEPSIE, NY M.D.-PAM BROOKS: "You can't beat a week with a new offering by Huey Lewis And The News. The All-American team wows us with their next huge hit. The 'Power Of Love' shows that the boys have a massive career planted firmly in those rock and roll sneakers... U2's 'Love Comes Tumbling' is still my pick from 'Wide Awake In America' and still very strong calls on that track. Of course, our listeners want to hear U2 in every way, shape, or form, so how can we miss?... Thanks again to Plen for the chance to let my ears spend the last month in a state of ecstasy with the new R.E.M. PDH proudly unleashes 'Can't Get There From Here' to our listeners this week. As I said before, take this American band to heart. They are a big part of our musical future... Well, I'll admit it, I'm a 'Slave To Love'; and thanks to Bryan Ferry, we all can enjoy hearing about it on the airwaves. I've always been a slave to the sound Bryan created with Roxy Music, so 'Boys And Girls' warms my soul... In closing, shout, shout, shout, shout!!!"

KATT, OKLAHOMA CITY, OK M.D.-SCOTT DOUGLAS: "(Refer to last week). . . Yo mama!"

KZEL, EUGENE, OR M.D.-VINCE MERTZ: "Sting. Wake up those blue turtles!"

WKQQ, LEXINGTON, KY M.D.-ROB ELLIS: "We put the Paul Hardcastle in and immediately did a Smash Or Trash - the results were overwhelmingly in favor of 'Nineteen'. The lyrics are the real catch... Dylan's 'Tight Connection' has the big upper demo appeal... Surprise of the week is 'Still In Love' from Taxxi. Check out the great sax work at the end of the tune... I swear it's got to be the tour of the summer, I had a chance to see Tom Petty And The Heartbreakers' second show in Columbus. Unreal!! Don't miss this show... Also Epic Records has a hot one with 'til tuesday. They opened the show for Petty and really won the hearts of the crowd... Thanks to Shelley Mori of Epic, also the MCA combination of Michael Steele, Don George and Mike Salsinger for the tickets."

WHTF, YORK, PA M.D.-TIM DRAYER: "First off, I was at the Hooters show at the Tower Theater last Friday night (6/7). These guys know how to perform! This is the last time that Pennsylvania can actually say that they own the Hooters because they are now a national act. Congrats, guys!... Secondly, another Pennsylvania band, The Sharks, have also done well this week. They murdered the other band in the MTV Basement Tapes and they, too, will be a national act... Special thanks to Bobbie Silver of PolyGram Records for all her help with the Bon Jovi show Thursday night (6/13)... The two hottest albums in Central PA: Hooters 'Nervous Night' and 'Wide Awake In America' from U2... Have a great week!"

WWCK, FLINT, MI P.D.-MARK MILLER: "Every time I hear a new R.E.M. record, it takes me a few listens before it sinks in. This band is a master of the subtle hook. We usually get around to adding their stuff in a few weeks or so, they sell a few records, get great calls, and I sit around scratching my head wondering. Lo and behold, R.E.M.'s new record is out and ooohh, baby, baby, I ain't wonderin' no more! No sir! - This here's the goods, the real thang, if you will. 'You Can't Get There From Here' literally boo-ga-looed me right out of my chair. I love it. The hooks sink in instantly and it should be their biggest ever. 60's soul lives with the Eurythmics, Tom Petty, Graham Parker, and now R.E.M. Could the Soul Survivors be far behind?"

WCMF, ROCHESTER, NY M.D.-DAVE KANE: "I hate to say I told you so, but - most folks have 'gone for soda' now and seen that it's a hit. Now it's time to keep the ball rolling with 'All We Are'. The ballads don't come any better than this. This guy belongs to our style of radio and we can bring this one home if everyone believes. I wouldn't lie to you; this tune has huge potential... And while we're on the subject of the Great White North, apparently the 'next big thing out of Canada' (besides Kim Mitchell) is Gowan. His debut American release really caught me by surprise - it's an intelligent and well-crafted collection of songs. And with Peter Gabriel's house band working on it, you can't go wrong. Each of the songs is almost a mini opera. Take it home with you and listen to it without interruption... The newest album from Taxxi has this band poised and ready to strike as contenders for most deserving album of the past few months... And the new Scorpions album, which is really a Greatest Hits/Live package, will make a great addition to the library for live options. This is what state of the art metal is all about."

WQBK, ALBANY, NY M.D.-PEGGY APPLE: "Want to spread the word on Suzanne Vega. Don't ignore this record! It's a refreshing change of pace that deserves a good shot at your station... The Truth's 'Exception Of Love' has the makings of a sure Summer hit in Albany... And how about those Talking Heads?"

WLIR, LONG ISLAND, NY M.D.-LARRY "THE DUCK" DUNN: "There are no doubts in my mind that the new Talking Heads album rates as my top three faves of 1985. The Heads, to me, defy predictability. Their style changes from album to album. I love 'And She Was'. It just baffles me that such a proven and established band as the Heads still meet resistance on the airwaves. Album in a word: Brilliant!... I think the R.E.M. single is the band's best to date. These guys are no longer a critics' band. Nothing like building phones and a great hook to whet the old musical tastebuds. Our audience has been in love with R.E.M. since day one. If you've never played R.E.M.-- this single is the perfect place to start... Can everyone please give Bryan Ferry a shot? Thanks to Gillian of New Order for phoning in... By the way, Weird Al--Thanks for some good laughs... Screamer-Of-The-Week: Shriekback import, 'Nemesis'."

WDHA, NORTH JERSEY, NJ P.D.-MARK CHERNOFF: "John Parr and 'St. Elmo's Theme' will be a multi-format G-I-A-N-T. Who cares about the movie?... Also, Top 5 phones for: Gino Vannelli's 'Black Cars'. Males and females in their early 20's keep calling for it!... Also, many thanks to FMOB's Kal Rudman for appearing at our big charity game for Cystic Fibrosis (Kal was D.H. and grounded out). We raised over \$10,000 for Cystic Fibrosis."

Already the #2 most requested song, 'Road To Nowhere' is once again, going to be big, big, big...On the Canadian scene, we have Gowan. It's pretty hard to take one's word on this act, but once you see them you'll be hooked. 'Strange Animal' is the cut that's doing well for us in Boston. Gowan is an exciting performer who looks like Bono and handles the stage as smoothly as anyone I've ever seen...We are playing Rogue Male and it's starting to attract some phones. 'All Over You' is the cut. With all these so-called power ballads coming down the pike, some good old hard driving rock and roll is important...I also have been enjoying Cock Robin's 'When Your Heart Is Weak'. It's one of those songs that continually grows on your mind...If you are not an R.E.M. believer, then you shouldn't be in radio. I know that sounds like a Michael Plen quote but the band is real important. Needless to say, their sound is fresh and exciting. 'Can't Get There From Here' is the lead track and 'Driver 8' is going to be following real close behind...Thanks to 'til tuesday for their live on-air interview...Also Corey Hart and Kim Carnes for stopping in...Get your hands on the Bryan Adams import of 'Diana'. It's about Lady Di and it's a great song...What's this I hear of bands releasing videos way ahead of the record? It sounds like it happened before and it's happening again. Is a trend about to get started? Watch this space for more on this subject."

WDVE, PITTSBURGH, PA P.D.-GREG GILLISPIE: "The countdown for Jeff Beck's 'Flash' is on. 'People Get Ready' is being accepted with open arms or should we say ears - as it comes in at #7 requests the first week out. I understand this record is a smoker, and audience anticipation is high...I heard a cassette of the Sting record and this record, lyrically, is perfect for 1985. Anybody who wants to promote making the world a better place for the children and does it through classy music is alright by me...The new Talking Heads record leaves me feeling a little odd. I was a huge fan of the last album, 'Speaking In Tongues', but I haven't found anything as intriguing on this album. However, the song 'And She Was' does have Beatles or Kinks-like phrasing and that could make it viable. Whatever the case, these 'Little Creatures' have great clothes...Taxxi has always been close, but I don't think they've ever gotten over the top. I still think they're close, but I'm not sure this is the one either... R.E.M. has given us their most accessible album yet, but by no means is it mass appeal. At least you can understand the lyrics this time out...We tested Russ Ballard last week and the response was just 50/50 at best. I don't think this one has the hooks that 'Voices' had...I heard the new Huey Lewis today and this guy is what we've needed for a long time, as straight ahead blues-based rock and roll is where it's at...The U2 record is doing extremely well. It debuted Top 5 phones; and initial sales on the Ep are very, very strong...And once again, for the fourth week in a row, the Hooters are our #1 requested song...Next week we'll see if Bill will print the winner of our morning guy's contest of what is a hooter."

CFNY, TORONTO, CN ASST. P.D./M.D.-DON BERNS: "Hey, programmers! Anybody out there got balls? If so run, don't walk, to your playlist and play Andreas Vollenweider. This artist (and I do mean artist) is the #1 selling jazz musician in Europe. His albums (available on CBS Masterworks) represent the new phase in music. The sound stands out as totally unique and can only benefit any radio station that prides itself on playing real music. Don't be fooled by the fact that Vollenweider's music is mellow. It creates immediate positive listener reaction. They appeared here in Toronto two weeks ago to a sold-out house. The promoter said he could have sold a few thousand more tickets the day of the show. The audience was mesmerized. Not only did they give Andreas the requisite standing ovations, but they refused to leave when the house lights came on! We're talking about virtuoso musicianship, craftsmen, and true artists of a new form of music that is stunning. It's working for us."

KGON, PORTLAND, OR M.D.-INESSA YORK: "I think what caught me off guard about the new Talking Heads album is that it's not hip. It just is. And so it's been a slow, but increasingly delightful process of getting to know and like the album. No big tricks here if you're looking for them. This is going to be a wonderful summer album...I'm glad to hear Taxxi sounding as good as they ever have and better with a neat little hook on 'Still In Love'...In the 'it's-going-to-be-huge' department: Heart. #2 on the phones...As for Dire Straits, with the combo of content and the reputation of the Straits themselves, it makes this our biggest phone item in a long time. #1 again this week...John Parr's 'St. Elmo's Fire' sounds like a perfect crossover; real catchy."

WHJY, PROVIDENCE, RI M.D.-JEFF RICCIO: "If it didn't take getting used to, it wouldn't be a Talking Heads record, which is great. It means slow burn. It means curiosity calls. It means it'll be around for a long time...Who's buying all the Bon Jovi records? Better yet, who's playing Bon Jovi to get people to buy all the Bon Jovi records? Well, we are in heavy, and 'In And Out Of Love' is the tune we feel most comfortable with. Unlike 'Only Lonely', I've got no second thoughts about this one...Time to start playing a second 'til tuesday cut, folks, or will you wait for a second video? At least three cuts warrant airplay. We'll start with 'Maybe Monday' for now...Huey Lewis' new one is a killer. Another artist who can do no wrong. I'll tell you, when things start to go as right for an artist as they seem to be for Huey, I start to get worried. Something negative is bound to happen sooner or later. But in the meantime, we'll be playing the hell out of 'Power Of Love'."

KBCO, BOULDER, CO M.D.-DOUG CLIFTON: "Sting continues his role as ambassador to the world delivering his message thru his music. He's made a smart move with the release of his new album 'The Dream Of The Blue Turtles'. There is a fusion of sound that separates Sting from his work with the Police and it's the result of his selection of musicians backing him up on the record. The songwriting, as always, is superb...Talking Heads have been a favorite at KBCO since their early days. With the release of 'Speaking In Tongues' they became more accessible. Now a record for everyone to get behind. 'Little Creatures' offers as much, if not more, than the last release. This record is heavy metal at its very best...Warning: The Surgeon General has determined that not playing Motley Crue's 'Smokin' In The Boys Room' will be dangerous to your health!"

MICHAEL PRINCE/PAUL BROWN, ATCO (212-484-6400): "Quirky, exciting, different, strange, great, adventuresome, innovative, daring, fun, attention getting, hip, and state of the art--These are comments we've received in the last week about the Voices 12" of 'I Can See The Night'. Album radio, this is a band you can break...Since you did, thanks for reading!"
