The first day of fall came this week, though you'd never know it by the temperature at MCA, as the label soared to even higher airplay and sales heights.

MARY J. BLIGE moved over 175,000 albums in the last 5 days, making her the biggest selling new artist on the street. No stranger to radio, Mary J. secured adds this week at Z100, KRBE, and MTV, in addition to maintaining her top most requested standing at THE BOX.



BOBBY BROWN, following the path led by his #1 success at Urban, saw his "Humpin' Around" <u>single</u> hit platinum this week. With his appearance on "Saturday Night Live" this weekend, and his next single "Good Enough" already on over 30 stations 3 weeks in advance of the release, there is no doubt that Brown is due to stake his claim at the top of the charts for months to come.

PATTY SMYTH hit the 250,000 album sales mark this week to go along with her gold single for "Sometimes Love Just Ain't Enough." With 5 weeks atop the AC charts, the #1 slot at Hit Radio seems imminent.







On other Warners news, Tevin Campbell's Alone With You gets 3 more adds this week, including KUBE/Seattle and FM102/Sacramento and is on in other major markets like The Box/Houston, WPGC/Washington, and WCKZ/Charlotte. Meanwhile, Sofia Shinas The Message gets 19 adds this week including Power Pig/Tampa, WTIC-FM/Hartfordd, and KKRZ/Portland, and is now on over 100 radio stations. Start looking for the new campaign, Message In A Bottle, from the office of Greg Lee.

At Mercury this week, the new national crossover guy, Tommy Nappi, checked in with the Street Source with big news. Bon Jovi, that's right, Bon Jovi Keep The Faith, the first cut from the upcoming album, is on its way soon, with a twist! Mike Edwards of Jesus Jones fame is doing an Acid House mix of the single and it's due out and goes for adds on October 12th. D.J.'s, get in line for your copy of this 'unique' project. It's one you don't want to miss! By the way Tommy, how's the rollerblading coming Also be on the watch for new remixes by Larry Robinson on the Swing Out Sister Am I The Same Girl which will be arriving soon. Vanessa Williams Work To Do has picked up another 22 adds from stations like WMXP/Pittsburgh, KBEO/Kansas City, WZOU/Boston, WHYT/Detroit, and Power 102/Fresno (hey hey Rene), while it moves (23-18) Power Pig/Tampa, (28-22) KTFM/San Antonio, (28-25) WPGC/Washington, and (33-30) KMEL/San Francisco. Work To Do is also doing well at the club level as it moves (30-23) on the S.I.N. Club 50 Chart this week. It's the highest debut on the S.I.N. Radio Mix 30 Chart (D-19) as it's in the mix with KALX/Oakland (Nate Copeland), WMXP/Pittsburgh (John Hohman),

WPGC/Washington (Greg Benjamin), and many others. Keep an eye out for a white label 12" of Lidell Townsell's <u>The Dugout</u> complete with a new Homebase Mix. It's on the way.

Neneh Cherry's Money Love had a good start at radio this week with 15 adds out-ofthe-box. Adds came in from all regions of the country on this one; WMXP/Pittsburgh, WJMO/Cleveland, 92Q/Baltimore, KHTK/St. Louis, WFHT/Tallahassee, and both stations in Fresno, B95 and Power 102, while Power 106/L.A. debuts it at (D-23). With all the action at radio, S.I.N. has put Neneh on the cover as the Radio Pick this week. The Inner City Follow Your Heart is beginning to work in the mix with Harry 'The Blade' Bailey/WCRX (Chicago), Jeff Kovarsky/KDGE (Dallas), Patric Valero/B95 (Fresno), Ricky Leigh/FM102 (Sacramento), and The Hillbillies, Costa/Dittman/WWUH (Hartford), as it debuts (D-30) on the S.I.N. Mix 30 Chart.

There's a lot of wave-making over at Atlantic. First, you have the Nona Gaye (yes, Marvin's offspring) <u>I'm Overjoyed</u> (Third Stone/Atlantic Group) picking up 16 adds this week, and now on more than 45 stations. In this week, WTIC-FM/Hartford,

KBEQ/Kansas City, Hot 97/New York, and WHHH/Indianapolis. Let's count up the new adds for Smart E's Sesame's Treet (there are 7). New this week at WCKZ/Charlotte (A-34), Y95/Phoenix, KS104/Denver, Power 96/Miami, and more. Joey Carvello sez the sales picture is exploding in markets where airplay is reported. KGGI/Riverside's Larry Martino told Street Source the Smart E's "Went (18-3) in requests in one week." How's that for a reaction record, not to mention the way Sesame's Treet is reacting in the clubs and on the radio mix shows (25-20 on S.I.N. Club Chart and 22-14 on the Radio Mix 30 Chart). On a final note from Atlantic, the Goddess whose record is Sexual, previously on Epic, was signed by Atlantic last week. Joey C. tells Street Source that the buzz has already started in the Atlanta, Tampa, somewhere in Alabama, Omaha, Austin, and Kansas City markets for this single. We have been telling you about Around The Way Really Into You. This record is buzzing with many major market programmers.

The Reese Project tops the S.I.N. Club Chart for the second straight week. <u>Colour Of Love</u> also moves (10-9) on the S.I.N. Mix Chart with airplay from Matt 'The Brat' Bradley/Power Pig (Tampa), Nate Copeland/KALX (Oakland) and Willie Daniel/WNYE (Brooklyn).

Over at Tommy Boy, Mike Becce and the crew are crashing the club scene with two records, Information Society's Peace & Love Inc. is the highest debut on the S.I.N. Club Chart (D-35) and also debuts on the Mix Show 30 Chart (D-29) where WCKZ/Charlotte (Ronnie Matthews), WMXP/Pittsburgh (John Hohman), WOUI/Norfolk (Ross Wilson) and others are spinning it. Brace yourself for upcoming releases from Tommy Boy like House Of Pain's Guess Who's Back, RuPAUL Super Model, and Groove Garden You're Not Coming Home on the way, too.

A.L.T. & The Lost Civilization <u>Summer Breeze</u> on Atco/EastWest/Atl.Grp. had a good beginning at radio as it got adds from WWHT/Columbus, WWHH/Indianapolis, WJMO/Cleveland, KHTK/St. Louis, and KSOL/San Francisco. It appears the spinners will lead the way for both the Ten City <u>Only Time Will Tell</u> and Voyce <u>Here We Are</u>, which are both bubbling under on the mix chart.

The Utah Saints keep pushing their way to the top on the S.I.N. Club 50 Chart (9-6) and moves (12-11) on the S.I.N. Mix 30 Chart with spins in the mix from WRUW/Cleveland (Jerry Szoka), KDGE/Dallas (Jeff Kovorsky) and Power Pig/Tampa (Matt Bradley). Something Good is now crossing into radio with adds

from WPST/Trenton, WLAN/Lancaster, KFFM/Yakima, and debuts (D-30) KHTK/St. Louis. Sheer Bronze Walkin' On is heating up in the clubs as it moves (43-37) on the S.I.N. Club 50. Hey D.J.'s, be sure to get yourself a copy of this record from ffrr/London. There is a nice base building in the clubs.

You can catch Gang Starr on tour with Das EFX, EPMD, and the entire hit squad coming to your town soon. Ask Rob about the details. Hey D.J.'s, watch the mail for the new EMF They're Here, which is set to ship September 28th. Be ready for the Joey Baltram remixes on this cut as well as the B-side. We hear it's tremendous.

The Street Source has been telling you about the Treble & Bass My Sweet Senorita for the past few weeks. It appears that Relativity has a big record on their hands. Big adds come in this week from KSOL/San Francisco, Power 106/Los Angeles, and KKXX/Bakersfield. Getting spins in the mix from FM102/Sacramento (Ricky Leigh), Baraket Mastermix/Dallas (Chris Baraket), and WJMO/Cleveland (Don 'Action' Jackson and Eric Bass).

Something special is on its way to you from Motown. The Jackson 5 never before released Who's Loving You live version from Gary, Indiana. The single is set to arrive for September 22nd, so if ya didn't get a copy, you know who to call. A full length

album will ship October 20th to coincide with the TV miniseries 'The Jacksons: An American Dream', which will air on ABC on November 15th and 18th. Watch for the video; it's sure to be a mega-monster. Hey, even back then Michael was <u>Bad</u>, he was <u>Dangerous</u>, he was a <u>Thriller</u>. He was all that and Off The Wall.

It was a hell of a bash on Tuesday night at Planet Hollywood in New York. The party was for Marky Mark's new album and in attendance were Danny Wahlberg (his brother and producer), our own Vince Pellegrino, 'Marky' Mark Benesch (a rare appearance) and Hot 97/New York Program Director Joel Salkowitz. This is sure to be a winner for both Markys: Marky Mark and 'Marky' Mark Benesch.

This just in as we go to print; the ID crew of Steve 'Silk' Hurley and the production team have closed a deal with RCA Records. All marketing, promotion, and distribution will now be handled through RCA. Congratulations to the newly formed Dance Department of Michelle Santosuosso, Carmen Cacciatore, and Gary Richards, who have just added a hot street label to their arsenal beginning

with Donell Rush Symphony. Steve 'Silk' Hurley had this to say: "Donell's vocals are a symphony of soul, a breath of fresh air in the clubs and on progressive radio stations. Male voice of the '90s!" Speaking of hot product on RCA, D.J.'s look for the new Martha Wash Cany On coming on red vinyl. Already in the mix and doing well with these New Yorkers; Tony Humphries/WRKS, John Robinson/WBLS, Darryl James/WRKS, and it's the S.I.N. Club Pick this week. Look for a major crossover explosion at the club level on Martha's debut single. She's back, stronger than ever. Also stay on the watch for the next Me Phi Me Black Sunshine. Get ready for a major campaign from Butch Waugh and the promo staff on this record.

Congratulations from the Street Source goes out to Billboard's Radio Music Director Of The Year, Michael Martin, who now heads further north to take on the M.D. stripes at KSOL (Wild107) in San Francisco.

On a somber note, Bob Caviano, one of the original founders of LIFEbeat, has died this past week after a long battle with AIDS. Bob was a major force in breaking such artists as Grace Jones and Gwen Guthrie. He is survived by brother Ray Caviano of MicMac. Our sympathies to his brother. He will be sorely missed.



CRITIQUING ON-AIR TALENT: WHY IT'S A MUST AND WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR HANDLING IT.

constructive critiquing is actually a simple system that, when implemented and utilized properly, pays substantial product quality dividends.



Imagine it's 10:01 a.m. during a typical weekday at a radio station. The morning show is just getting off the air. Where is their next destination? For far too many, the next destination is not the Program Director's office when that's exactly where all of the morning

show's performers need to be headed.

Virtually everyone in the radio business agrees that mornings are the absolute key daypart, that mornings are critical to setting the pace (most importantly the revenue pace) for the entire operation. If there's total agreement in the adage "As the morning show goes, so goes the rest of the radio station," why is it that so little time is spent on the day-to-day process of guiding and directing the morning show?!? After all,

isn't "director" part of the Program Director's title? And if the Program Director isn't spending a minimum of one hour a day reviewing the morning show's performance and setting goals for future shows, then what is the P.D. doing?

No matter how many dollars a station manager is spending on their morning show, whether it's market size number 1 or 1000, one definite must is that there's a daily morning show meeting that's led by the Program Director. By the way, a morning show meeting is not a hallway affair in which the P.D. tells the morning people in passing, "Good show today." That doesn't cut it. We're talking about full-fledged. daily reviews of the goings-on in that day's show, plus setting the ball

in motion for things that'll be happening on upcoming shows.

Is there a reason why most Program Directors don't critique? No matter what rationale a P.D. may give for not spending true quality time bettering their talent, the real reason may be that they don't know how. From checking the talent's enthusiasm and energy, to monitoring how well and how often the station's unique market position is sold,

What about the other on-air personalities? I recommend at least one meeting a week with each other fulltime staff member, one meeting every other week with the part-timers. I strongly believe that critiquing of the air talent is one of the Program Director's most important duties and that any P.D. who isn't critiquing their air talent is flat-out guilty of neglect.

> Constant (not sometimes, not most of the time, but constant) teaching, molding, coaching of the air talent is a "must" duty of every Program Director, no matter how long the P.D. or the air talent has been in the business. Yes, radio is a bottom-line business (what business isn't?), but radio is also a business of heart, soul, passion, and compassion which must be nurtured on a daily basis. To be truly successful in the long run, the performers hire must be motivated, but even the selfmotivated need guidance and

direction from a leader who has vision. That's all a part of this wonderful process we call "life."

At Issue

What is your opinion concerning "Adult CHR" formats? Do you believe that the 25-54 demo can be a primary target for CHR? Do you see Top 40 moving back toward capturing younger demos? What is your station's sales philosophy concerning selling teens and the 18-34 numbers?

Every program in g scenario differs from city to city. The market environment and the programming lean of the station

dictate how successful an adult CHR can be. If an adult CHR station is not flanked by one or more 12-24 stations it should win teens by default, dominate 18-34 females, and be competitive in the 35-49 female demographic. If the competitive market matrix allows, an adult CHR can be a serious player 25-54 through dayparting, special programming features, service elements, personalities, community involvement, and other added value components. If the competitive matrix is more condensed, the window of opportunity for the adult CHR is smaller; however, I think the new FCC regulations will dramatically affect the future of radio, with LMAs, joint ventures and multiple property ownerships creating new opportunities for expansion up and down the demographic spectrum.

From a sales standpoint, almost every buyer wants 25-54 year-olds. That is why in almost every market you find at least one country, a couple of AC's, an Oldies station, a Classic Rocker, a Warm, a Lite, a Mix, a Touch, an EZ, and a Fuzzy. All claiming their psychographic niche in the congested 25-54 demographic. Since the 18-34 demo is a tougher sale, and only a small percentage

of money locally and nationally is focused on teens, the Power Pig sales staff has to hustle. They sell results, added value, and the fact our station is geared to be foreground and not background.


In certain market situations the "Adult CHR format" can win big. I believe you have to be in a large market with many signals that

force you to pick a clear definition. For the past 7 months WVIC was probably more close to an Adult CHR than a Traditional CHR, but with two A/C's, two AOR's, and an Urban in the market we found ourselves in the position of being forced to make a decision; what do we really want to be? We chose to crank it up.

Outside the Top 50 markets, you don't have to niche anymore. Getting back to the primary demographic (18-34) will help insure future growth and long term success. The 25-54 target is still very important to us. But we've realized it can't be programmed to, or the upper end of that demographic will force you into an A/C approach. Instead, we are not focusing on 18-34 and garnering adult numbers from our morning show. By concentration on the specific target of 25-34, this should carry over into the 25-54. More CHR's in markets like ours are going to have to consider this.

We don't sell teen numbers, although if a buy comes down we get it, since we are #1 teen with a 54 share. We do sell some 18-34. In fact, one of our major clients, "Coca-Cola," targets 18-34. The fact is, in this market, unless you're #1 or #2 25-54, sales and rates will be soft. When all else fails, punt!

Everybody has their own way to go, they can do their own niche thing. If you can succeed being an adult CHR and make money in your market doing

it, go for it! I don't think that it's a format that I would particularly care to program or be a jock in. The 25-54 demo most definitely can be a primary target for CHR. That's our primary target here. We do exceptionally well 25-54, consistently top 3. And our sales are reflective of that. It should be the primary target of any CHR radio station. The trick is to get it without "selling out" the format. I'd like to see Top 40 move back to capturing younger demos. They're definitely an important factor of any contemporary radio station. The problem is that any station that tries to go exclusively after younger demos winds up having the GM/owner complaining that there aren't any advertising dollars for the younger demos, we want 25-54. So the pressure comes from the sales department to sell that 25-54 demo. But the programming department has to say, "hey we're delivering 25-54, but we also need the younger demos because they will eventually become the 25-54's. Lets get 'em now, so that when they reach the 25-54 demo, we won't have to worry about stealing them from another station." They will already be loyal customers.

I don't know that we have a philosophy for selling younger demos. Our sales department does a great job selling the entire radio station. We prioritize our sales strategy in this order: 25-54, then 18-34, and finally teens. But here again, the advertisers now are interested primarily in 25-54. There are virtually no teen buys coming down, maybe two percent of the business coming in is teen oriented. If the advertisers aren't buying teens, it doesn't matter what your philosophy is, or even if you have one. There just are not any dollars there.



Group W's New Tack in Philly -- Mix Sports and Rock on 'MMR

Legendary rock station WMMR Philadelphia is adding sports talk to its morning show beginning October 5 in the hopes of competing more strongly against WYSP's Howard Stern simulcast. WMMR has hired popular Philly sportscaster Howard Eakin away from WIP to join the morning show. PD Joe Bonadonna told RBR current morning show host John DeBella is expected to stay, although he is currently negotiating his contract. Bonadonna has no intention of adding sports talk to any other daypart. "Music will remain a major part of our mix. It's still the hook," he said. Once the market leader. WMMR's morning show now ranks fifth with a 5.5 in the latest Arbitron. Meanwhile, WYSP ranks second with a 10.0 rating.

RBR Observation: We believe this is the first time an out-of-town morning show has done so well against a local program. Will the story be repeated in other markets? As for Group W, if the sports blend works in Philly, will they introduce it on WNEW-FM New York, which also feels the heat from Stern's afterburner?

USA Digital Makes History: First In-Band, On-Channel DAB Broadcast

USA Digital demonstrated a first at the NAB Radio Show: an in-band, on-channel over-the-air DAB broadcast, using the existing facilities of a licensed FM station. The USA Digital transmitter was installed at the tower site of non-commercial station WWNO-FM, and the digital signal was actually transmitter "under" WWNO's standard analog signal. Those listening to the analog and digital simulcast at the convention center heard no interference to either signal from the other.

In addition, USA Digital demonstrated the digital section of its new AM DAB system. A transmitter was placed on the roof of the convention center, and transmitted to the demo booth, meaning the AM signal was an actual, off-the-air signal.

The new FM DAB system requires that the analog FM signal be simulcast with the DAB signal. Then, the analog signal is used to produce movement of 21 digital signals

within a standard FM channel. A special circuit then doubles the number of moving digital signals. At any given moment, the receiver can select from among both sets of moving digital signals to construct one perfect digital signal. This approach is said to reduce or eliminate multipath in moving vehicles.

Both of these in-band DAB transmissions in New Orleans were broadcast to receivers in stationary locations. USA's engineers plan to demonstrate the system in a moving vehicle at the NAB convention in Las Vegas next spring.

RBR Observation: So what did it sound like? The FM DAB signal sounded exactly like a compact disc; that is to say, essentially flawless. The AM DAB signal sounded better than most well-engineered FM stations. And well it should have -with audio response out to 15 kHz, and a signal-to-noise ratio far better than FM, there's no need for heavy processing. Even on the quietest passages, we were able to hear no ill effects on the analog signal as a result of the DAB signal "buried" underneath it. We also checked WWNO's analog signal on a car stereo, and heard no abnormal effects. We'd never have guessed a digital signal was being broadcast on the same channel.

Rumors Intensify of WIP Sales to Infinity

Several panelists at the NAB convention earlier this month spoke of the sale of Spectacor Broadcasting's WIP Philadelphia to Infinity Broadcasting as if the deal had been done. Adding WIP would give Infinity a Philly combo along the lines of its WFAN/WXRK combo in New York. The rumor has been around for some time, and may be coming to a head because of the duopoly rule changes. Infinity said nothing was official as of RBR press deadline. When asked if WIP had been sold to Infinity, an anonymous WIP executive told RBR, "We hope so."

TALENT TIPS

"Clutter

from the forthcoming "Handbook For Radio Personalities"

--by Jay Trachman

I think I know what "killed" Personality Radio. Clutter. Well, not clutter itself, but something more subtle: the inability of many programmers, consultants — and especially DJ's to tell the difference between clutter and worthwhile patter. Sometimes I think that there are only two types of personality jocks: those who think they're getting paid by the word, and those who have no idea that Time Matters. Both should be charged with felonious clutter.

Clutter makes listeners say things like, "I like their music, but the DJs talk too much." Surveys show that most listeners (under 55) prefer music stations where the personalities are kept on a tight rein.

When you say things like these, you're cluttering: "It's Thursday, September tenth, and I'm Johnny Jock." "Joe Blabber with you onna Tuesday!" Any listener who doesn't already know what day it is needs more help than we can give him.

"Hi, you're caller six — what's your name?"
"Umm, Mary Jones." "And what city are you calling from, Mary?"
"Uhh, Mishawaka..."
There's five seconds wasted. Get the caller's name and city before you put her on air:
"On the line, Mary Jones of Mishawaka — here's your trivia question, Mary!" Take less time for the setup - so you can spend more time gushing genuinely when she wins.

The worst clutter generators are unprepared bits. All raps should be prepared in advance of airing: have your punchline or kicker firmly in your mind - before you open the mike. Here's a horrible example I wrote about a few years ago...

"Tastin', uh, just...a... bit of after-hours Jazz with David Sanborn from his Backstreet album, tune called 'I Told You So'; it's 3:17, hi, my name is Billy Brown and um, earlier we were talkin' about, you know, how dangerous it is, if somebody sneaks into your swimming pool or, uh, when you've got some beach-front property, you know, they go in there and drown — my friend Steve — he's got some great beach-front property -

- it's all fenced in, he's got his own private beach there, and it's really nice, but, again, if someone sneaks in and drowns, you know, he could be facing one major lawsuit... But he's got an answer — I love this guy — always thinkin' — I don't know where he found it — this is true — another Steven, a Steven Winkwork of London — he's got a five-foot fiberglass shark, it looks (chuckle), it looks so much like the real thing: it swims, it turns, it floats, it dives, it surfaces—

- all by remote control – 900 bucks. I mean which, really, is a small price to pay, for security... I mean, who's gonna go swimming at your beach place, uh, with a shark patrolling the fun — ain't gonna be me buddy and if, uh, while you're not looking, uh, the shark sinks and a real one comes along (chuckle)? I... gotten that far yet, I don't know..."

Total time for the rap: 62 seconds. Why? Several listener possible reasons, which I offer here not to make him squirm — I've already done that — but to review some of the processes that go into creating a good, efficient rap.

- 1. Understanding the importance of brevity. Your listener is probably not sitting there focusing his attention on you. The likelihood is that you're a buzz in the background, while he or she is doing something else. If your stuff is good, and he's found it worthwhile paying attention in the past, he may do it again. But the listener has other things on his mind. You are competing for his or her attention and the longer you go on, the more likely you'll lose it.
- 2. Editing skills. Ask yourself, "What's essential in here? How much do I need to make my point?" In this case, one person's clever way of avoiding lawsuits by inventing a mechanical shark. Not much more, in my opinion.
- 3. Understanding clearly where you're going with the bit. Lack of this causes more floundering around than any other mistake I've heard. The kicker determines how

you're going to get there. Anything that leads you toward it is good; anything that doesn't is wasted time.

Let's try the bit again: "If you have a pool or some beach-front property, you know you're responsible if someone drowns — even if they sneak in without permission; a guy in London has a solution: a life-sized mechanical shark — looks just like the real thing — swims, dives, all by remote control!

Not for me, thanks... What happens if it sinks, and you discover you're being chased by the real thing?"

Total time: 23 seconds. Of course, I was able to sit here and noodle around with it — but so should you. Because, if you can do a bit in 23 seconds — but you take 62 instead, then what do you call the other 39 seconds? "Wasted."

Any time you can cut a bit in half by dropping extraneous material, you've about doubled the odds your listener will hear it. And you've inserted your personality without causing clutter.

EDITORIAL

"More Music, Less Entertainment" by Bob Berglund, Consultant Media Images, Minneapolis

There's an off-shoot of the "much more music" era we're in that I don't think has been sufficiently addressed: the big money for radio personalities is falling into fewer and fewer hands.

It was back in the late sixties when I read a government report that said the American occupation with the highest average salary was broadcasting. Of course, the Johnny Carsons of the world were lumped in with the small market Chuck Roasts of the industry. That warped things quite a bit for those people making minimum wage for their eighty-hour weeks.

It was also true at that time that fully 70% of the people who went into broadcasting left the business within three years because although things were fun, they were financially implausible for any talented

person of ambition. And, because it was true "show business" at that time, the chances of moving up the entertainment ladder were tough.

But with the "65-minutes-of-music-everyhour" philosophy which has so permeated the business, there really is no "entertainment ladder: any more. With satellite services, simulcasts, Howard Sterns, LMAs, the out-of-control race to see who can play the most music and the like...what local station needs to pay high bucks to a

talented entertainer? What can he/she do for them to warrant it? (I can hear naysayers now saying, "A really good jock can be entertaining in seven seconds!" No, he/she can't, is my reply.)

Even in the Minneapolis-St. Paul market, there used to beseveral radio personalities making six-figure salaries (some well into six figures). But there are fewer and fewer, and they will be fewer and fewer so long as this "More Music, Less Entertainment" trend continues.

It's awfully tough for a listener to develop any involvement with or loyalty to "Thirteen Songs In A Row!" What I'm finding is that they are responding simply by not having much of an involvement with or loyalty to radio. I honestly can't remember the last time I heard someone say, "Did you hear him/her this afternoon/last night," etc.

According to what I've heard, there is even a reasonably popular station in this market that discourages its announcers from doing any personal appearances, because they want to down-play any personality!

The upshot of that philosophy is that there are more and more low-paid "announcers", and fewer and fewer high-paid "personalities." If stations aren't going to allow them to be entertainers, why pay them big bucks?

What that ultimately means is that fewer and fewer talented people will enter the industry. So when-if ever-the cycle reverses...there will be no talent bank to draw from. We saw that happen during the "liner-reader" seventies, and it's happening again.

embarrassing."

It's a sad time, and the future is bleak for those who may have as an incentive the opportunity to "make it big." Call it intense competition if you want; or call it big-time talent stifling.

Radio has always been cyclical and, if that's the case again, I venture that it will be

around the year 2000 that listeners get bored to death with today's kind of radio, and start to clamor for some entertainment again.

The problem is: where will the entertainers come from?

Isn't that a huge backward step for an entertainment medium? The question is rhetorical on my part, but it obviously still needs to be asked.

When there is less and less of a chance of turning pro...who's going to want to go to training camp?

Broadcasting schools and departments are even now finding that there are always some jobs out there for newcomers. But as one placement director tells me, "The pay is



The set, *Twice Upon A Time*, includes "Dear Prudence", "Cities In Dust", "Peek A Boo", "Kiss Them For Me", and their song from the *Batman Returns* soundtrack, "Face To Face". A video collection of all of the songs will follow on October 27th.



Maxi Priest

MAXI PRIEST: Maxi Priest checks in this month with his first release since "Close To You" became the first Reggae-flavored track to hit No. 1 two years ago. Priest's "Groovin' In The Midnight" will be out September 28th, followed by a new album, "Fe Real," on October 20th. Priest is planning a tour with his longtime band following the album release.

10,000 MANIACS: Former E Street Band member, Max Weinberg, filled in for the 10,000 Maniacs drummer on seven shows that the band recently played. Jerome Augustyniak is recovering from a broken collarbone which he sustained when a car hit the bicycle he was riding. He was wearing a helmet, and suffered no head injuries, so he'll be ready to rejoin the band when they tour in November.

ROB HALFORD: Rob Halford is in a tricky situation. He has left Columbia

Records after a dispute over his side project, Fight, but he'll still be working for the company on at least two more Judas Priest albums.

CROSBY, STILLS AND NASH: David Crosby has resumed work on his next solo album now that Crosby, Stills And Nash have concluded their summer tour.

GREGG ALLMAN: Gregg Allman and Harvey Mandel came to the aid of a homeless group in San Francisco recently. They performed a benefit for a community group trying to raise money to finish a film on homelessness. The feature is titled Chalk.

ICE-T: Ice-T is bragging to concert audiences that the Body Count album with "Cop Killer" on it is fetching \$100 "on the street."

SQUEEZE: Chris Difford of Squeeze has co-written a song with Ranking Roger's band, Special Beat, for an album that they're planning to release next year. The band, formed by members of the Beat, General Public, The Specials, and Fun Boy 3 is currently taking a break from recording for their fourth American tour — a 33 city trek which began September 10th in Baltimore.

COP KILLER'S ATTORNEY PLANS TO USE RAP MUSIC IN DEFENSE: Attorneys for a man awaiting trial for killing a policeman in Texas plan to claim he did so after being influenced by a Rap record. Nineteen-year-old Ronald Howard told authorities he'd been listening to Tupac Shakur's 2pacaplyse Now - when he shot the state trooper. Investigators retrieved the cassette from the car he was driving. Shakur, the star of Juice and Janet Jackson's co-star in the upcoming Poetic Justice was himself recently the subject of a murder investigation into the shooting of a six-yearold boy. His album contains half a dozen songs about killing cops. Howard, who has already confessed to shooting the officer, faces either life in prison or the death penalty. During the penalty phase of the trial, the defense in the case plans to introduce experts on whether violent entertainment can alter the behavior of impressionable young people. Shakur and his record label are also facing a civil suit filed by the widow of the slain police officer.

NEW RELEASE FROM GENESIS WILL BE THEIR FIRST LIVE ALBUM IN A DECADE: Genesis is planning to release their first live album in 10 years in early November. The still-untitled set comes from the We Can't Dance World Tour 1992. To coincide with the release, the band will do a special series of six concerts at the famed Earl's Court in London the first week of November.



EMF

EMF UNVEILS HARDER-EDGED, GUITAR-HEAVY SOUND ON NEW ALBUM IN NOVEMBER: EMF is set to unveil the harder-edged, guitar-heavy sound they've been perfecting for the past year when they release their new album, Stigma, Sampling is still rife in November. throughout, as it was on Schubert Dip. All 10 tracks were produced by lead guitarist Ian Dench, singer James Atkin, and Ralph Jazzard in Europe. The band is releasing a CD-5 single with three mixes of one track from the new album, "They're Here"; a non-Lp track, "Phantasmagoric"; and, a cover version of Traffic's "Low Spark Of High Heeled Boys". EMF are touring Europe, and are tentatively planning a club tour of North America for October and November.

POLITICS BRINGS BACK FOLK MUSIC, PETER, PAUL & MARY: The times they are a-changin' — NOT! Peter, Paul and Mary are on the verge of signing a new recording contract with Warner Brothers. Peter Yarrow says, "Folk music thrives on politics, and whenever political issues heat up, you can count on folk singers to be talking about them in music." Warners wants to remix and remaster the trio's existing works. Folk music is getting another boost from the new movie, Bob

Roberts, in which Tim Robbins sings his political messages. The success of singers such as Michelle Shocked and Shawn Colvin is also an indication that there is still interest in the genre.

TIME WARNER BENDS RULES ON **EXPLETIVES FOR NEW OUINCY JONES** PUBLICATION: This week's newsstand appearance of Vibe magazine, the new Hip-Hop publication from Quincy Jones Entertainment and Time Publishing Ventures, marks the first time that a certain 12-letter expletive has been printed in any magazine published by Time Warner. Their publications include People, Fortune, Sports Illustrated, Time, and Entertainment Weekly. According to corporate editor Gil Rogin, who ranks as the No. 3 man at the world's largest publishing company, the decision to allow Vibe's featured Rap stars to escape the censor's pencil was carefully considered. Rogin says that they finally decided, "The music is urgent and uncensored, and you can't write about it in a way that neuters it."

CALL'S BEEN CONTENT WITH DYLAN'S LEAVINGS: The atmospheric soundtrack to Paul Schrader's new film, Light Sleeper, was done by Michael Been of The Call. The music is winning praise from critics—even though Been wasn't Schrader's first choice. He first tried to get Dylan to do the soundtrack. Says Been, "Somehow it's okay with me. I'll play second choice to him anytime."

CLAPTON, SINEAD, MELLENCAMP SET FOR PAY-PER-VIEW DYLAN SHOW: The line-up for the Bob Dylan tribute scheduled for October 16th at Madison Square Garden now includes: Eric Clapton, George Harrison, John Mellencamp, Willie Nelson, and Sinead O'Connor. They will perform Dylan songs backed by an all-star band comprised of Booker T., Steve Cropper, Jim Keltner and Duck Dunn — under the direction of Saturday Night Live's bandleader, G.E. Smith. The concert, to celebrate the 30th Anniversary of the release of Dylan's debut album, will be telecast as a pay-per-view event in America, and tape-delayed for a prime time showing overseas.

"TALES" SPAWNS CRYPTTRACK: There will be a soundtrack released from the popular TV series, Tales From The Crypt. It will contain Danny Elfman's main theme, plus contributions from: Ry Cooder, Jan Hammer, Steve Bartek, and Jimmy Webb. ChuckII Booker, Janet Jackson's musical director on the Rhythm Nation tour, has written and produced "The Crypt Jam" — a Rap performed by The Cryptkeeper (which will be released September 29th). The soundtrack is out October 13th — just in time for Halloween. In its four year history,

Tales From The Crypt has attracted guest performers such as: Demi Moore, Whoopi Goldberg, Arnold Schwarzenegger, Tom Hanks, Michael J. Fox, Dan Ackroyd, and Meatloaf.

OUTFIELD'S "WINNING IT ALL" STRIKES A RESPONSIVE CHORD WITH ATHLETES: The league-leading Atlanta Braves have embraced "Winning It All" by England's Outfield. An Atlanta radio station has even inserted Braves play-by-play announcements into the song, and play it regularly. Now the station gets requests for "The Atlanta Braves song by The Outfield." The song, from their album Rockeye, was also used by the NBA to close out its NBC telecast of this season's championship finals. And it was also played during the Olympics coverage of basketball's "Dream Team" receiving their gold metals. CBS Fox Video also uses it on their Larry Bird home video. Plans are now in the works to make the song available to other sports teams who have a winning history - or are trying to achieve a championship season. It will be heard in an upcoming NFL Rocks video of football highlights and in race car driver Kyle Petty's home video (which is even entitled Winning It All).



Queen

ENOUGH MATERIAL LEFT FOR ONE MORE QUEEN ALBUM: A 10-year-old Queen's Greatest Hits album has been released. But band members say that there will be one more album of fresh material released by the group. Roger Taylor explains that they have some material left - because Freddie Mercury "was determined to work up to the last minute." Brian May is also recording a solo album for Hollywood Records.

SECOND ANTI-BUSH RECORD REARRANGES HIS WORDS: "Read My Lips", the record by A Thousand Points Of Night that has President Bush contradicting himself over a dance beat, has been joined by another anti-Bush disc, "Bushwhack". You could say "Bushwhack" highlights the administration's unspoken policy. While producer Don Was didn't doctor any of the president's lines on A Thousand Points Of Night's "Read My Lips", "Bushwhack", by

Tone Def, does just the opposite. Bush's words have been rearranged, resulting in lines like: "The American people have been lied to and they deserve it," or, "Pass my proposals, and it will mean higher taxes, fewer jobs, and, eventually, a system under complete government control." The record opens with a real Bush quote, though, his words to the families of MIAs, "Be quiet, would you please shut up."

LENNON OSCAR TO BE AUCTIONED: The Oscar John Lennon won for The Beatles' 1970 film, Let It Be, will be auctioned off at New York's Sheraton Centre Hotel on October 5th. Dealer Herman Darwick, representing an unidentified collector, expects the statuette to fetch at least \$100,000. There have only been a few Oscars on the market in the 65 year history of the Academy Awards. Darwick handled one Oscar sale earlier this year when a man who won his award for the 1946 film, The Best Years Of Our Lives, sold his for \$60,000 to pay his wife's medical bills. Lennon's Oscar has been in a bank vault since it was sold at a charity auction for \$600. The Beatles won Oscars in the "Best Original Song Score" category. The "Best Song" award that year went to "For All We Know" - which was a hit for The Carpenters.

INDIAN COLLEGE FUND FEST POSTPONED: Red Dawn '92, the threeday music festival to benefit the American Indian College Fund, has been postponed from next month until May 21, 22 & 23. Robbie Robertson has agreed to continue his involvement, and will be the primary host next spring. Organizers hope that Ian Astbury, Ozzy Osbourne, Nelson, Dan Fogelberg, Rita Coolidge, Richie Havens, Al Kooper, Dave Mason, Lou Diamond Phillips, and all the others who agreed to participate will be also available in the Organizers said that the spring. postponement was necessary in order to give prospective sponsors more time to coordinate their advertising and promotion efforts.

BAND'S DEBUT ALBUM TRIUMPHS OVER PRODUCER'S PERSONAL TRAGEDY: Not many young bands get the opportunity to work with two top producers on their first album, but Ocean Colour Scene did on their self-titled debut. They originally recorded most of the album with Jimmy Miller, who has worked with everyone back to Traffic and the Rolling Stones. But then they re-did a lot of it with Tim Palmer - whose credits range from: Robert Plant, David Bowie, and Tears For Fears - to: Mother Love Bone, James, The Mission U.K., and Pearl Jam. Ocean Colour Scene's Simon Fowler says that the change was because Miller was going through a difficult time. "His wife was dying

of cancer, and his son was in America getting into trouble," Fowler said. "He was drinking too much. It wasn't helping us, because we were going down to the pub at 11 in the morning and we'd stop drinking when we'd fall over. It really was horrific, and it just got to the point where it was obvious that if we carried on that this band would not make an album." Miller's wife died but Fowler happily reports that the legendary producer contacted them recently to tell them that he'd "had his hair cut, his teeth done, cut his mustache, and is very well." Says Fowler, "He's losing weight, and he's feeling really inspired to start work again, so I think that we'll hook up with him when we're back in London."



Metallica

METALLICA TOUR LOSS PUT AT \$2.5 MILLION: The injury James Hetfield sustained from fireworks at a show in Montreal could end up costing Metallica as much as \$2.5 Million. That covers the cost of keeping 150 crew members on the payroll for the three weeks that their tour with Guns N' Roses was delayed. A clause in the contract stipulates that the band responsible for any delays must pick up the costs. Industry experts predict that the loss will wipe out any profit Metallica would have made. They say that even if more shows are added now the band will just break even.

TELEVISION REUNION IS THEIR TYPICAL TEST PATTERN: After a 13 year break, Television is releasing its third album on October 6th. Their two albums, Marquee Moon and Adventure have always been available through the lengthy break testimony to the band's influence. Cofounder Richard Lloyd admits it's difficult to say why they broke up - why they got back together - or how long Television will last this time. He denies that there were any hard feelings when they split up. He insists that it was just a question of "finally getting around" to starting a third album after 12 years. When they did get together again, they agreed to use the same approach that had worked for them in the studio back in the 70s: experimenting - and just allowing the music to happen. "Things haven't changed very much in the internal dynamic of the band," says Lloyd. "It's an adventure because we have played together for a number of years, and have developed a certain intuition and telepathy among ourselves as to what the music is asking each of us." Lloyd says that the lack of long-term plans beyond European and American tours is also indicative of how they've always worked. "We look at it as an experiment," he explains, "it always was. Every time I think I know what the future is about, it's completely different."

TOP GUITARISTS PROVIDE SOUNDTRACK FOR NEW BOOK: Rv Cooder, J.J. Cale, Phoebe Snow, Neil Finn, Elvis Costello, Don Was, and Stephen Bishop are among the 20 artists on a new CD coming out in November. The CD is being packaged with a book on guitars being published by Harper/Collins And Callaway Editions. Luthier or guitar maker Danny Ferrington has made guitars for all of the artists and dozens of others, including: Kurt Cobain, Eddie Van Halen, Eric Clapton, Jackson Browne, and Pete Townshend. The book will contain photos of the guitars which he has made for 37 performers along with text about the specifications they wanted. Although many of the specs of course relate to sound, some artists have very clear ideas about how they want the guitars to look, too. Car enthusiast, Michael Anthony, wanted flames along the top to make it look like a hot rod - while Stephen Bishop brought a shirt and pair of socks to Ferrington's workshop so the instrument would match his wardrobe. 

Showcasing over 200 rare photos, the book sports such entries as a "Blond-O-Meter" which details Madonna's changing hair color and image, the Madonna/Marilyn chart, plus a look at the world of Madonna memorabilia.
