Radio Mix Chart Follow Your Heart is in the mix with KALX/Oakland (Nate Copeland), WCKZ/Charlotte (Ronnie Mathews), WUSL/Philly (Don Mack), FM102/Sacramento (Ricky 'I Know Sacramento' Leigh) and WKDD/Akron (Sue O'Neil/Bobby G.). If you haven't heard this record yet, you can get your copy of SINMIX tm (it's on there). Be sure to listen to the new Definition Of Sound What Are You Under? remixes. Both the import and M.K. mixes were shipped via S.I.N. last week and should be in your hands now - so listen!

EMIRG's Rob Stone called into Street Source Central to give up the inside information on Spike Lee. The video to Spike's Revolution is being shot now in Brooklyn. Rob says the vid is an up to date 'message' video, dealing with issues like race and the cities. The Ya Kid K Let This House Beat Drop ships to crossovers this week. Get ready for this cut, Rob and the crew are excited about Ya Kid K, and will be looking for response soon. Stone also lets us know that EMF's They're Here is building a nice base in major markets like Philly, Houston, Chicago, Detroit, and San Francisco. While Arrested Development People Everyday continues to run up the charts, the next single, Mr. Wendel, is starting to pull in some phones at Q102/Philly (30-25) and it debuts (D-28) Q106/San Diego and keeps the #3 slot at Wild107/San Francisco. The <u>Rave Til</u> <u>Dawn</u> album has reached 100,000 in sales already off the club support of Ottorongo's Fuck You. And finally, EMIRG asks Who's Da Flava (hint - this is a tip), more later.

Over at A&M, the Krush Let's Get Together picks up 9 Radio adds this week from WCKZ/Charlotte (A-38), Y95/Phoenix, FM102/Sacramento, KKFR/Phoenix and WHHH/Indianapolis. Both B95 and Power 102 in Fresno are beginning to have success as Krush moves (D-30) and (32-26) respectively, and KMEL/San Francisco bumps it up (18-17) as well. This is a record that the kids on the eastside should take note of real soon. Also from Steve Bartels and company, Malaika So Much Love is making a solid base in the clubs and in the mix at radio. Malaika moves (17-12) on the S.I.N. Club Chart and (21-12) on the S.I.N. Mix Chart, (after debuting just two weeks ago!). So Much Love is in the mix with Satellite Music Network/Dallas (Chris Baraket), Hot 97, New York (Franco Iemmello), WFHT/Tallahassee (Carlos Fusaro), WUSL/Philly (Don Mack) and many more! This is the biggest mover on the S.I.N. Mix Show Chart this week.

Over at MCA, Shai If I Ever Fall In Love picked up another 12 adds at radio and is now on over 40 stations. Power Pig/Tampa, (A-21) Hot 97/New York, (A-32) KRBE/Houston, KKSS/Albuquerque and KCAQ/Oxnard all put it in as the action is heating up with debuts from KDON/Salinas (D-30), Power 102/Fresno (D-31), KTFM/San Antonio (D-22) and

Power 106/Los Angeles (D-19). Big moves come in from (20-11) WCKZ/Charlotte, WWHT/Columbus, (23-16) (24-12)KKFR/Phoenix, (11-5) 92Q/Baltimore and (3-1) The Box/Houston. Also from MCA. Wreckx N Effect Rump Shaker is starting to shake radio up a bit with adds from Hot 97/New York (A-26), WHYT/Detroit, WHHH/Indianapolis, and Wild 107/San Francisco (A-23). Rump Shaker is already a Top 10 record at Q102/Philly (14-8), KMEL/San Francisco (15-9), and KJMZ/Dallas (10-9), while it moves (19-11) The Box/Houston. it also caught on in the mix at radio, as it moves (30-22) on the S.I.N. Mix Show Chart. And, be aware of the Mr. Fingers What About This Love? which is making some noise in the clubs, as it moves (44-33) on the S.I.N. Club 50 Chart, and has many of our radio mixers

Mercury's Tommy 'Brett Weir' Nappi called in to the Street Source to give up the latest (after the Bon Jovi performance in North Jersey) coming up from the label. Look for the revisited edits on the Soup Dragons Pleasure out now to both radio and clubs. Take special note of the 'Apparently Hair Mix' one of the 'Tough Guys' 'favorites'. Vanessa Williams Work To Do continues to pick up adds across the country. This week 92Q/Baltimore, Hot 102/Milwaukee, The Box/Houston, KKFR/Phoenix are all present and accounted for (they added it) and it's now on over 90 stations. Here's a surprise; the Bobby Konders (WBLS spinner) Mack Daddy, which has been out for quite a while is Added this week at WPGC/Washington, and Boss 97/Atlantic City. Bobby Konders is currently the #3 song on Q102/Philly and is requesting like you wouldn't believe. Look for a major resurgence of this record in the coming Watch out for the Third weeks. World...Committed which moves (14-10) WPGC/Washington and debuts (D-26) Q102/Philly. On the tip, Jazzy Lonely will be coming up shortly. It's produced by Cajmere, the same guy who did Lidell Townsell's Nu Nu and Get With U, and follows in the same vein as the Crystal Waters sound.

On the Atlantic, Around The Way <u>Really</u> <u>Into You</u> got 10 Adds this week as Power 106/Los Angeles, WJMO/Cleveland, Hot 97.7/San Jose, KHTK/St. Louis, Power 102/Fresno, KZFM/Corpus Christi,

KDON/Salinas all give it the nod. Boss 97/Atlantic City debuts (D-34), as it moves (17-15) KS104/Denver, (22-20) KTFM/San Antonio, (24-21) KMEL/San Francisco, (26-24) Wild 107/San Francisco and (29-26) KKFR/Phoenix. A 'sick' Joey Carvello called in and said, "Sales are starting in markets where it's getting airplay." Well, the Goddess <u>Sexual</u> was added at KS104/Denver this week. Radio, watch out for this single, and the video is <u>Sexual</u>.

Yo Radio, be sure to catch Columbia artist Prince Markie Dee on the promotion tour which will take him from Los Angeles (Oct. 17th-21st) to Phoenix and Las Vegas. Then it's off to the East coast, where it's Showtime at the Apollo (Oct. 27th). From there, it's visits with radio and clubs in Philly for two days, before it's off to Dallas for a K104 club date on Halloween. You don't want to miss this tour, it'll be phat. Watch Columbia's Jerry Blair personally lead the charge at radio for what is sure to be a great new artist! Also from Columbia, Mad Cobra Flex grabs adds this week from Hot 97/New York (A-29), WHYT/Detroit, KMEL/San Francisco (A-30) and Hot 97.7/San Jose, while Flex is starting to perform at Wild 107/San Francisco (28-26), WCKZ/Charlotte (28-25) KJMZ/Dallas A big move reported at WPGC/Washington (23-12) and it goes Top 10 at Q102/Philly (12-10) and moves closer to the top at The Box/Houston (7-3). The label's John Strazza wants to add, "Watch out for Dan Hartman featuring Loleatta Keep The Fire Burning." This is a spinoff of the classic You Light My Fire. Martha

Wash continues to Carry On in the mix at radio as it debuts (D-24) on the S.I.N. Mix Show 30 Chart, behind spins from WCKZ;/Charlotte (Ronnie Mathews), WHYT/Detroit (Claude Young), WMXP/Pittsburgh (John Hohman), and Hot 97/New York (Franco Iemmello). Martha is also the Most Added record on the S.I.N. Club 50 Chart. Keep an eye on Sound Factory Understand This Groove which is heating up in the clubs (45-37) on the S.I.N. Club Chart. The Donell Rush is also doing well in the clubs as it moves (47-38) on the S.I.N. Club Chart, and moves (26-21) on the S.I.N. Radio Mix Chart with spins from WCRX/Chicago (Harold Bailey), Hot 97/New York (Franco Iemmello), Hot 102/Milwaukee (Fresh G), and KALX/Oakland (Nate Copeland). Watch for Symphony to continue to pound in the clubs and mix shows across the country.

Interscope hit radio this week with the latest from Gerardo Love with 12 Adds including Power 96/Miami, KHTK/St. Louis, Power 106/Los Angeles, FM102/Sacramento and WIMO/Cleveland where Don Jackson says "Sounds like they took him into the studio and said don't sound like Gerardo. The C + C production really works on cut 2 of the CD pro." Also, check out what J.J. Morgan of KKSS/Albuquerque said about the record in the Street Beat Section. With all this action at radio, S.I.N. has made it the Radio Pick this week. You Gotta Believe Marky Mark is reacting everywhere. It's on over 90 stations with 3 adds this week from Y107/Nashville, KAKS/Amarillo and WFHT/Tallahassee.

The Street Source extends CONGRATULATIONS to Cutting records recording artist Giggles on winning Dance Single Of The Year at the New York Music Awards for What Comes Around Goes Around. David 'The Baron' Sanchez checks in this week to say, "Hey Rave fans...get ready for Arlene Read Between The Lines. It's a great rave cut with strong vocals. "Also watch for Oh Bonic Wicked with remixes from Bonzai of Oh Bonic. Look for both of these records in two to three weeks from Cutting.

Get ready for Lighter Shade Of Brown Homie. This is the cut that radio is screaming about from the album. It's already on KGGI/Riverside where Larry Martino sez "We're already playing this. It could be the hit for Lighter Shade Of Brown." If there are Hispanics in your market, you might want to try this out. Quality Records is pressing single versions of this track now — expect it <u>real</u> soon!

Radio, do not ignore this record, the buzz is turning into airplay for Hollywood Basic.

The next single Are You Ready To Fly? is the Highest Debut record on the S.I.N. Club Chart (D-29). Radio had better get ready for this song; it's already on Power 106/Los Angeles.

And finally, it's remix heaven from Warner Bros.! We have the brand new Masters At Work remixes of <u>Erotica</u> from Madonna! Though all 6 mixes slam, we side with the Underground Club Mix, and for kicks, the Madonna's In My Jeep Mix. The double 12" white label Deep Underground House remixes of Sofia Shinas are here and sound tremendous! Although the mixes aren't titled (000ps) we really like side 3 cut 2!

Up Close

SALT LAKE CITY'S CHR "FOUR"AY

Talk about radio wars! A minute ago, Salt Lake City had two CHRs, KISN and Q99, ready to battle it out for survival, as CHR KZHT made a surprise flip to the satellite-fed Z-Rock format. But wait--in the blink of an eye, Salt Lake City has become home to four--count 'em--four CHR stations. As KZHT gets LMAed with AOR KBER, the powers that be at KBER owner Divine Communications decide to flip KZHT back to its CHR presentation. And, just last week, Modern Rocker KJQN opted to join the foray in a decidedly Dance direction. We've asked KISN P.D. John Dimick to offer some insight on this phenomenon. Dimick is certainly well versed in market history. His in-market experience includes holding court as P.D. at AOR KBER and Country KOOL106.5. It's a no-holds-barred analysis of a tangled web of hits in Salt Lake City. Enjoy.



John, describe the Salt Lake City marketplace both demographically and psychographically.

Demographically, we have an interesting situation because of the religious nature of Utah and the belief in large families. This seems to be the norm. We have an incredibly young market. The market median age is just starting to climb, but right now it's right around 26 1/2 to 27.

There is a county along the Metro, Utah County, that's included in the Salt Lake Metro

that has an average of almost 25. It's slightly younger than 25, so demographically, it is a very, very young market. But psychographically, it winds up being a very old market, because you wind up with a lot of 20, 21, 22 year old females with at least one or two children. Once you get into the marriage motif, the psychographics change. You have 22 and 23 year old women who want to calm down instead of wind it up. I don't have any evidence to actually substantiate this, but the feeling is that a 25 year old woman in Salt Lake acts much like a 35 year old woman does elsewhere around the country. Having spent a couple of years in Los Angeles, I really agree with that, because you never saw 20 or 25 year old females with 2 and 3 children. In Salt Lake, that is definitely the norm.

Cite some examples. What would a 25 year old woman in Salt Lake be doing differently than a 25 year old woman in, say, L.A.?

A 25 year old woman in Salt Lake gets up at 6 a.m. because she's probably a housewife who has either a part-time job or a full-time secretarial/receptionist type of job, so she's up at six getting her husband ready to go to work. It's very much an atypical household. A 25 year-old female has got a lot of responsibility in this market. She arrives at work usually between 8 and 8:30, she works all day, comes home between 5 and 5:30, has to do the shopping, typically will pick up the kids from day care, fix dinner for her husband when he arrives, and probably will spend the evening at home taking care of their children. While there is an active night club scene in Salt Lake, it is not as active as, say, Sacramento's night club scene. Markets of similar size have a different night club atmosphere than what's available here because that audience is not that readily available, while a city like Los Angeles would have to have many more. Salt Lake has 3 or 4 and that's about what it needs to be. Those 3 or 4 clubs are always hopping and happening, but there's not much more than that.

Salt Lake City is unique in that a week ago there were two CHR stations. Today there are 4 CHR combatants slugging it out for survival. What CHR niche does KISN fill, and how does it compare with the three other players?

KISN definitely skews older. We're interested in that 25 year old female who has the children and the husband, who turns

on the radio to hear a lot of entertainment, to make sure she's up on what's going on, but she's got enough things driving her crazy in her life, she doesn't need the radio helping her go crazy. We definitely skew toward the upper end of the CHR spectrum. To use a phrase that's been bantered around lately, we consider ourselves an adult leaning CHR. We're very topical, we're very energetic, we're very light-hearted on the air, have a lot of fun, do a lot of interesting promotions, but we stay away from the slam-jam tunes that would make us considered more of a teen-based CHR than an adult-based CHR.



And what about the 3 other players?

There's an interesting situation in Salt Lake City. I'm speaking of the Arbitron metro of Salt Lake City, which includes 4 large cities and a bunch of small towns within those cities or around those cities. With the abundance of signals in this market, there are a few signals that only reach certain parts of the entire market. Two out of our three competitors fall into that area. KZHT is a Utah County licensed radio station, so they cover all of Utah County, which incudes Provo and Orem, and they cover a great deal of Salt Lake City. They don't get out into the Twilla County area and they don't get up into the Weber-Davis area. And KJQ, now KKBE, is exactly the opposite. They cover North Davis and Weber, and they have a couple of translators, one in Salt Lake and one in Utah County that cover 95.5 in Ogden, 92.7 in Salt Lake City, and 104.7 in Utah County. So based on their primary signal, they're definitely Weber-Davis and North Salt Lake County radio stations. KUTQ is a Salt Lake County radio station. It has a full-service signal. They're not on the big mountain that many of the radio stations are on, but their signal does very, very well, so they pretty much cover the entire Metro, as do we. The other 3 skew slightly younger. KZHT seems to be geared more to a straight-ahead CHR, very tight play-listed, always playing the hits. It's interesting to see what KUTQ is doing. They do a lot of dayparting. They are more like us during the day than at any other time, and at about 2 or 3 in the afternoon, they start introducing quite a lot of Rock

product into the mix. At night, they've got about a 50/50 mix between the Dance/Rap leaning product, straight-ahead CHR product, and AOR product. KKBE seems to be a Dance-leaning station. That's the market. Everybody's trying to live in this market and put on an original signal, expecially the fringe stations. If Dance is your thing, then you can listen to the Killer B, even with its lousy signal, without having to hear the AOR-leaning product that KUTQ would throw into the mix. If you're into a real straight ahead Dance/Pop CHR, then you'll listen to KZHT without having to listen to all the Rock product that KUTO throws in. If you don't like the Dance/Rap, but like the Rock and the Pop, then you've got KUTQ in the mix. It's a rather complex cluster if you sit down and do an analysis of the market.

KZHT recently flipped to the satellite Z-Rock format and then moved back to a CHR presentation a couple of days later. What's your view on that move?

If I were (Divine Communications' VP/Programming) John Edwards at (AOR) KBER, I would probably have done exactly the same thing. Z-Rock, with the proper marketing, would have taken off. John was able to keep Z-Rock out. The switch was just an attempt to get Z-Rock out of the market and help eliminate a direct competitor of KBER. At the same time Q99 has, by introducing a lot of their Rock product, stripped away a substantial teen chunk from KBER, and some of their 18-34's. John was able to get up in Waldron's face a little bit by putting on a real straight Pop CHR, and give KUTQ something to worry about besides the Rock product and perhaps force Gary Waldron's hand at going back to a very Pop, teen-based CHR. I believe Z-Rock was on the air for about 4 days.

The latest entry into the Salt Lake City CHR arena is former Modern Rocker, KJQN, now KKBE. What do you believe the motivation for the switch was?

Modern Rock in this area is good for about a 4 to a 5 share, and they are very loyal to what's going on. It's a very hip audience. They find the Modern Rock stations, but they also find the personalities that go along with it, and Mike Summers is an incredible Program Director with Modern Rock. Just watching what he's been able to do, I think he's probably one of the best in the country. But with two stations on, they wound up trading audience back and forth. But KXRK was the winner, just from being in the market a little longer and knowing what to do. By the way, KXRK is also a limited signal station. They do not cover the entire

Metro. So, faced with that, and knowing that they would be in a long, drawn-out battle and at best, get a 1.5 to a 2.5, I think they started looking at Q99's thirty share in teens. They're looking at it and saying, "Hey, we've got some teens and 18-24's available out there that have all clumped with KUTQ. Let's go out and see if we can grab 10 or 12 shares of that." That'll put you into the mid two's and low three's if you can get some time spent listening out of it. In a lot of ways, that might have been their philosophy. What they're planning on doing in marketing and stuff like that I don't know,

but they're going to have to do a lot of that to make this work. It's a very difficult market to do what they're trying to do.

The promotional wars among 4 CHR's could be unprecedented. What types of marketing have the other 3 players utilized in the past, and what has been your most successful marketing campaign?

We've all got the standard stuff. I've got to clear this. By "we", we've got Waldron and KUTQ doing the T-shirt angle and the bumper sticker angle, and they have been running a little television on MTV with this Pepsi "Gotta Have It" card deal. Most of their promotional ventures have been client tied in promotional marketing ventures where they're on the tube with a client. KZHT has used busboards for quite some time, and I don't know if we're going to see a change in that or not. My guess would be they would move more to billboards, because television in the market is rather expensive. KZHT has been calling themselves the People's Choice for probably

6 or 8 months now, and a lot of busboards are up, but not much more than that. As far as KKBE, I think they're still trying to get their playlist figured out, and get their air staff in place. They're not too worried about marketing right now. Our most successful marketing campaign is actually running right now. Television. We have an incredible amount of luck with television. We've repositioned the station to only stopping the music twice an hour and we're going after the "take us to work with you, take us to bed with you"; we play long stretches of music. That's what we're hounding right now. Television works very very well in this market if you're in a financial position to be able to do it. Fortunately, the owners and the Vice-President and General Manager of Sun Mountain Broadcasting have been very, very supportive that way. We're running a full-blown fall television schedule, and that always seems to work for us. We've always got the trinkets out there, the coffee cups, the t-shirts, etc., but we always use the morning show that is one of the best in the market, and tons o' television.

From a promotional standpoint, how have the record labels dealt with the large number of CHR competitors in your market?

They've been pretty good for the most part. Sometimes, there'll be attempts made to try and get you in on a record to do a promotion, but that's standard record stuff,

Their job is to get records played, and our job is to be promotionally active and get listeners to listen to the radio station. From a promotional standpoint, I know they are very, very conscious of walking the line. Very rarely does a station get an exclusive. To be honest with you, very rarely do we even try for one. I think there's very little benefit

in being the first station to play Madonna. If you beat somebody by seven seconds, who the hell cares? When you look at who our audience is and who we share cume with, that seven seconds is not that much of a

deal. The record companies play things very fairly. If we offer a promotion to them, we get it, and if another CHR offers a promotion to them, typically they get it. It's more of a programming battle to see who can come up with the most creative promotions and then work with the record companies as far as artist availability and things like that. It's a very competitive market and, in some ways, a very vindictive market. They do their level best to let us fight it out on our territory, providing equal ammunition to both sides. They're benefitting the most because we're banging the hell out of their records. They do a very good job in the market.

Who handles CHR wake-up chores in Salt Lake and how do they fare in the ratings?

KZHT in the mornings has a man named Dan Kennedy. Dan has not fared particularly well recently, but I believe it was due to some station problems that I must assume John Edwards is going to get fixed. KUTQ ran a two-man morning team called McCormick and Scottie. They're fairly new to the market. I believe Scottie has been here quite a bit longer than McCormick, but in this market you really don't pay a whole lot of attention to anybody who hasn't been here at least a year. The word "new" or anything new tests horribly in this market. I think they're still trying to find their niche. It's a struggle to get yourself acclimated to what the market expects. I can't figure out who the Killer B has on in the mornings because he never says his name. We're still waiting to find out. And our morning show is Fisher and Todd, and they do extremely well.

What sets your morning show apart from others in the market?

They've been here seven years, and that builds a lot of customer loyalty. They're very friendly, very light-hearted guys. They are out on the streets an awful lot. They like to be out meeting people and shaking hands. They're very accessible to the audience, both in the studio and in public. They're very today. They stay very topical with what's going on and they put a humorous or a silly twist on it.

How would Howard Stern fare in Salt Lake City?

Not worth a shit! First of all we've got a classic rocker, Z93, which has a very good morning show, John and Dan. They're a great male morning show and they push the limits of the envelope. Kind of rude and crude and a little slapstick. Sometimes

you'll kind of raise your eyebrows and wonder "Whoa, I wonder how many calls they're going to get on that comment." And K-Bear has a good morning show, Ron and Allen, that's younger demo humor with slightly satirical and off-beat humor. Rock 103 has Thomas and Morales, who do a lot of the same thing. All of those people are pushing the envelope as far as they can go, and none of them even come close to Howard Stern. It would not be surprising, if Howard Stern came on in the market, to watch advertisers drop off your station like flies. Stations in this market

that have a slightly left of center or right of center morning show spend a lot of time massaging clients who are continually being

offended or having their customers come in and say "I hate this morning show, and I heard your commercial on there, so I'm not going to shop in your store." And that happens quite a bit out here. As far as Howard Stern is concerned, there would be so much flack about putting him on in the market that a station would have to have some serious guts and be into it for a very long time. Personally, I think he's hilarious. I'd love to hear Howard on the air in the mornings here.

What makes a 25-35 year old male in Salt Lake City any different from a 25-35 year old male, say in Philadelphia, Los Angeles or New York?

Very, very little. I'm not saying by a long shot that Howard Stern couldn't come into Salt Lake City and have huge numbers. I think he would have immense numbers. I think what you would have would be a lot of clients, the people who pay the bills, refuse to advertise on the radio station that carried him, because of who he offended. No, I think Howard Stern would be a huge success. Financially, I think he'd be a huge disaster.

If you had to compete against Howard, what moves would you make?

I don't know that given the current situation, with him being a new entity in the market, and all else being equal, that the market would support him. I don't think I would make any moves because our morning show doesn't approach his style of humor. Our morning show is very much vanilla humor with, every once in a while, something that will make people say "I can't believe they just said that!" But, it is not anywhere near the level of humor that is used by Z93, John & Dan, any of the rockers in town, or even Howard Stern. We would watch him very closely to see what he would be doing, but I don't think from my station's standpoint that we would do anything.

What factors will ultimately decide the CHR champion in Salt Lake City?


There will be several factors. Finding your niche and super serving it will be one form. The days of seeing a CHR in Salt Lake City with a 10 share are over. Super-serve your niche, and stay with the program on a long term basis. Owners that come into the

market and want the Scott Shannon worst-to-first in 72 days, can forget it! That just doesn't happen in Salt Lake City. People here are very parochial; they stay with what they know, and it takes an incredible amount of money and a very long-term commitment to make anything really work. We don't consider anyone a competitor until they've been here a year. Because for the first year this market will suck you dry. Advertisers, especially local advertisers, are very emotional when it comes to buying, and they stay with what they know and with what works. The agencies, while they buy numbers, rely a lot on

long term relationships as well. You've got to spend twelve months here, spending a lot of time having doors slammed in your face, and keep going at people. If you're still around in a year, welcome to the party. Let's get down and get ready to go to the mat.

At Issue

Which new artists who have had hits during the past year have the best chance to develop into core CHR artists? How important is it for our format to develop artists with longevity? How can Top 40 aid in the process?

BILL RICHARDS, P.D. KIIS-FM/L.A.



"A couple of artists out right now who have the possibility to become core artists for the format might be Boyz II Men and Color Me Badd. But it's difficult,

isn't it? Part of the solution to the problems that the CHR format is suffering from right now is to develop more superstar acts that become long-term acts for the format, rather than a lot of these one-hit machines that we seem to have, these bands or individuals that come out with one hit, and then we never seem to hear from them again. This is a real problem with the format, one that needs to be worked out. CHR radio can help solve this problem by delivering support for the acts that we jump on, and really believing in them. We need to work with the record companies to develop these acts.

"Artists that have the best chance to develop into core CHR artists are artists with a strong label to aid in the development by picking the right tracks. For example, Ce

Ce Peniston had some strong dance tracks on her first album. However, the current ballad isn't working. I think it's just a matter of timing. Jon Secada is another example of a new artist who could turn into a core CHR artist. I believe it's very important for Top 40 to develop artists with longevity. That's how you get your Madonnas and Michael Boltons. Artists with a string of eight or nine hits. It aids in our format to be able to add a Michael Bolton record and

know it's going to be immediately recognizable. It obviously keeps the listener listening longer. Top 40 can aid in the process by taking the chance, playing the new songs, and trying to keep an open mind.

We need to recognize the raw talent. It would also be helpful if the labels would allow us to pick some releases as well. I'm not sure how often they do that. It would also be great, but impossible, for the labels to get together on release schedules and not release six ballads the same week. However, that's competition, so it will never happen.

"Jon Secada and Toad The Wet Sprocket have the best chance of becoming core CHR artists. It's extremely important for Top 40 to develop artists with

longevity, because although Top 40 radio has been known for playing what's currently popular and what the new rage is, and what the new trend is, we still need to have a stable of artists to go back to, to play in the recurrent and gold categories. That's where the Phil Collins', Michael Jacksons, and Janet Jacksons come in. However, they can't be our staple artists forever, so we've got to continue to find a few new artists a year whom we can consider our staples. I don't think Top 40 can really aid in the process. It's not really up to radio or the labels. It's really up to the public. We can't make someone be popular. The goods have to be there. The band has to have a great sound and be able to write great songs, and not be able to write just one hit. If the substance isn't there, there's nothing for us to develop. I believe artist information is a small factor in building an artist, however, all the information in the world and all of the excitement about the artist doesn't do any good if what's coming out of the radio and what's coming off the CD isn't exciting to the listener. You can have a wonderful advertising campaign for a restaurant, the waiter and Maitre D' can tell you how great the place is. If you dig into that plate and the food doesn't taste good, that restaurant won't be around for very long, will it?"

"When Elton John, Patty Smyth, and Bryan Adams end up on the top of the charts for obvious reasons, what does that tell you? We haven't developed as many artists as we

should have. We need more hits from INXS, Don Henley, Bryan Adams...the stars. To aid in the process, we need to be up front and honest with the record labels as to who's got the best shot."



"I can't really think of anyone in the past year that I would call a core CHR artist. Now, in the last year and a half, perhaps I could. I think it's great for the format when

an artist like Prince or Mariah Carev has something out that's working, but I don't think it's critically important, because CHR is more of a song driven format than an artist driven format. However, it's great to have an artist like Prince, who's not going to be played on AC or AOR stations. Or, more recently, Boyz II Men and Color Me Badd, who may have some Urban crossover potential, but will never go to AOR and, with few exceptions, won't go to AC either. I don't know that we can really aid in the process. It's really up to the act to do that. They need to have the material out, and have the people accept it. We can't force people to like something that they don't like. We can help by identifying the music. Tell people something about the artist. To that end, it's helpful when the labels give us information, especially about their new acts. More often than not, a station will add a song by a new act and have no bio information, and really have absolutely no information, except what the song sounds like. People relate to the song a little more if they know something more than, "This is ABC or XYZ!"



FCC Votes For Satellite DAB, NAB Vows Opposition

The FCC has taken the first step toward satellite-delivered, direct-to-the-listener digital radio. It voted to allocate 50 mHz of spectrum in the "S" band to satellite DAB, and expects to make the spectrum available by the first of 1997.

At present, no other spectrum is specifically allocated for digital radio. But from the Commissioners' comments in the meeting, it is clear that the FCC hopes "inband" DAB, using existing radio channels, will also be an active option for existing radio stations.

Broadcasters oppose the satellite spectrum allocation, both as a threat to local radio and because it could add additional competition in an already strained industry. Jeff Baumann, Exec. VP and Gen. Counsel of NAB, said the "prospect that satellite development might be placed ahead of terrestrial DAB is troubling."

FCC Chairman Al Sikes, himself a former radio broadcaster, discounted the idea that satellite DAB was a major threat to local radio, "Years ago, they said that tapes and CB radio would undermine local radio. They didn't, because radio brought listeners the time, the weather, local news, and a little humor."

Commissioner Ervin Duggan, while acknowledging a possible threat to localism, said that the public would best be served by a "hybrid" system of both terrestrial and satellite DAB. Both FCC Chief Engineer Tom Stanley and Commissioner Sherrie Marshall said that the public now demands high quality sound, as evidenced by the rapid acceptance of CDs.

The spectrum to be allocated is 2310 - 2160 gHz, frequencies generally regarded as all-but-useless for terrestrial radio transmission.

RBR observation: Fortunately for local radio, only one company is left with an active applicant for such a service — Satellite CD Radio. An earlier applicant, Radio Satellite Corp., has dropped out. This may not be the threat some think it is: direct satellite TV has been legal and possible for ten years, yet, as Chairman Sikes pointed out, there have been no takers.

Local radio would survive a satellite invasion, assuming anyone actually gets a service going. Local service is a mighty

powerful concept. The Chairman is right. Local service is why tapes and CDs haven't put radio out of business. Though satellite won't siphon away local dollars, it could slice into the listener pie. That will make it tougher for stations to deliver the audience to advertisers, which in turn, supports local radio.

King Of The Nighttime Heading For Days? Bet On It.

It'll probably be a done deal by the time you read this: Larry King, who has long "ruled the roost" of the late-night talkers, is heading for days late in October (first reported in RBR 8/24,p.6). Westwood One/Mutual plans a major blowout for the launch. King is inviting President Bush, Bill Clinton, and Ross Perot as first-week guests, one week before the elections. Still to be set is the exact time the daytime King show will be on.

RBR observation: Westwood One Chairman Norm Pattiz is moving Mutual's biggest marquee attraction to where the money is — daytime. This move also means that King will be in a time period measured by RADAR. With the rapid growth of News/Talk as a format, more stations have a bigger appetite for long-form talk from high-profile personalities. King is a big enough draw to make it attractive to big league affiliates.

Fritts' Finest Moment: Cable Vote Gives NAB New Clout

Here's what the NAB's big victory on the cable bill means for radio: It makes NAB - which lobbies for both radio and TV - more of a force to be reckoned with in D.C. Next time a big radio issue hits Capitol Hill, NAB will be carrying a bigger stick.

Here are samples of industry reaction: "It establishes NAB as a premier lobbying organization — a big league player in DC." said RAB president Gary Fries, who added, "The industry should be proud." NAB Radio Board Chairman Wayne Vriesman, of Tribute Broadcasting, which has both radio and TV stations, told RBR, "It's a great victory for broadcasting! NAB did one heck of a great job pulling out all the stops to prove once and for all they can do it when the chips are down." Vriesman also said "a lot of radio guys pitched in to get it passed."

RBR Observation: NAB pulled off a major coup here. They took on the powerful and well-financed cable industry, Hollywood, and the White House, and they won. Not only did broadcasting's lobby hand President Bush his first veto in four years, they got just about everything they wanted in the bill, including must-carry and retransmission consent.

This one isn't over. Sure, cable's going to court to appeal, but right now, no one can take anything away from NAB President Eddie Fritts, head lobbyist Jim May, and the entire NAB crew. Fritts' biggest victory comes ten years into this tenure at NAB. In a very tough job, not only has he survived, his stock is still going up. Maybe we should have headlined this, "Fritts whips Valenti," as in Jack, Hollywood's powerful man in DC, who has rarely felt the sting of defeat.

LOOKING TO '93:

The <u>continuing recession</u> and <u>station</u> <u>consolidation</u> -- those have been *RBR*'s top stories again this year. Here's a look at where radio is, and where we see it going this quarter, looking toward 1993.

THE RECESSION GRINDS ON

Will the election herald a change? When will consumers have more confidence? When will our friends in retail see increased sales? How long will it be until some of the biggest retailers burn off the mountains of debt they incurred in the '80s?

Outlook:

At RBR's Business Breakfast Panel in New Orleans, Will Donald of Standard & Poor's said ad revenue for all media is likely to grow only 2% to 3% over the next few years, and much of that will be nothing more than inflation. There will be increased competition over a dollar pool that will remain fairly static. What you see now probably is pretty close to what you will see, at least in terms of available dollars.

STAGNANT LOCAL RADIO REVENUES

If you're having a banner year, pop the bubbly; you have our permission to pat yourself and your people on the back, because you're bucking the trend. Local has seen a few good months in '92, but the overall trend is pretty lackluster. March and April were kind to many stations, but the

summer's been sluggish generally. The RAB says YTD revenues are up about 3%. Donald says that local could be up 4% by year's end if biz picks up a bit in fourth quarter.

Outlook:

At least the local numbers are positive. But, consumers are still hearing more about layoffs than about prosperity. Many fear for their jobs, so they aren't ready to stroke big note payments for cars, houses, etc. When that changes, we'll see big ad increases. Not until.

NATIONAL, NETWORK ON THE ROPES

They're not down for the count, mind you, but spot and network have certainly taken some body blows. "Hooked on Phonics" discovered TV. That softened net figures. Reps say that soft pricing at the local level cuts national off below the knees. Reps are moving more units than ever, but pricing is so low that the overall numbers look putrid. Donald says that national spot could end '92 down 11%; he expects network will slip 9% this year.

Outlook:

Hard to call! Is the current CPP structure the new reality, or is it a phase we're all going through? In any event, we predict that you'll see a bit more consolidation at the rep firms — perhaps more divisions of the big two may fall by the wayside, as reps find it less and less profitable to sell for stations with low CPPs. We'll predict that reps may become more involved in radio creative, since agencies don't seem interested. Look for ways to make radio easier to buy, such as unwired networks. They'll become more targeted, to take advantage of radio's trump card.

DUOPOLY: THE RULES ARE CHANGING

Operators in many markets are adding second FMs, and in some cases, a second AM. There's not an onslaught of applications thus far, but enough that many operators now face a tough choice: "Do or be done to."

Outlook:

Look for a continuing trend to multiple station "operating companies," with several stations run by one management team. The economies which can be realized by running three or four stations under one roof are too attractive to ignore. Caution: experience is showing that 1+1 doesn't always equal 2. It's more like 1.6 or 1.7. Many advertisers are "buying around" newly-formed combos, trying to show the stations who's boss. Over time, some of the earlier LMAs are dissolving because

the concept doesn't work well everywhere or in all situations.

Don't look for a doubling of your rates overnight. Rule of thumb for a duopoly deal to work: Cost savings should offset initial rate losses within a reasonable amount of time. Big duopoly operations could be like radio supermarkets—eventually making it easier for advertisers to buy radio.

STATION TRADING

Duopoly appears to be jump-starting the trading market. Look for more trading activity for the next few months as the companies with the greatest resources seek dance partners. Biggest question marks: How many owners will be willing to sell? Or really need to sell? If the answer is, "only a few," will that drive prices up, and if so, how much?

Outlook:

Even though the severe shortage of bank financing will limit the number of deals which can be done, duopoly will be a continuing trend over time, resulting in a more active trading market. Like-kind swaps could be a way to consolidate, and for some situations, a way to beat the tax man out of a few bucks. We keep hearing that some group mergers are in the works, but there's nothing solid on this yet. It would seem to make sense if the corporate chemistry between the groups is right.

DIGITAL AUDIO BROADCASTING (DAB)

1991's blockbuster issue has been on the back burner as the industry toughed it out through a difficult sales year. Digital sound quality may be a way to keep radio competitive with other sound sources into the 21st Century, but the industry wants an "in-band, on-channel" approach. approach would simply add a second signal on a station's existing channel. Those with digital radios would hear digital; those with regular radio, the same analog signal they know and love right now. The alternative is to put digital in a third band, which could cause an increase in the number of stations and threaten increased competition at a point when the industry isn't strong enough to absorb it.

Outlook:

DAB is still some years away, but a lot is going on behind the scenes. USA Digital (Gannett, Group W, and CBS) broadcast a successful inband, on-channel FM DAB signal over a local New Orleans station at the recent NAB show. It works.! They also had an impressive AM DAB demo. It looks very much like they will have a mobile (automobile) demo ready for the Spring NAB in Las Vegas. Meanwhile, the FCC is moving to allocate some spectrum for direct-to-the-listener satellite DAB, which would bypass broadcasters altogether. NAB will fight it.

LOCAL MARKET AGREEMENTS (LMAs) LMAs haven't gone away, and they won't for awhile. Our best educated guess is that about 250-300 LMAs in operation are out there, give or take a few. They come and go. Some work well; others have gone sour. Even with the new rules, some operators are finding it's cheaper to rent than to own.

Outlook:

As long as there is no bank money available for purchases, and as long as there are troubled operators who wish to be "taken out," LMAs will be around. Look for creative arrangements with management contracts and equity participation. Frankly, we're still surprised that more outside groups haven't done LMAs. You don't have to own a station to do an LMA. We wonder why more ethnic and religious groups haven't bought up all the time on some of the simulcast AMs out there.

COMPUTERIZED OPERATION

It's a trend. The slickest computer-based units control local-to-network switching and interface with satellite-delivered programming. Some stations use them for only part of the day; others, for the whole day. Many are using a computer-based system to control satellite programming at a second or third station. It's one of the ways to realize significant savings with consolidation. Systems can be set up to "cherry pick" from several different talk or sports networks in the course of a day.

Outlook:

These systems are spreading through the industry. They could become as common as computerized traffic and billing systems.

CHUCK TISA/ WEGX: Brian Phillips and myself. We listen individually and collectively. About 30 minutes per day.

LORI CAMPBELL/ B94 M.D.: Just myself and Buddy. We listen both separately and together. I probably listen to music at least an hour every day.

RICK McCAUSLIN/ WYCR O.M.: Myself and my P.D. Davey Crockett and Jeff Roteman (M.D.) get together and listen. I'll spend between 1 - 2 hours per week.

MARK WILLIAMS/ WHTO P.D.: All of them, but not to a final say. I welcome all input. I listen to new music about 8 hours per week.

DAVE McCALL/ WPRR P.D.: Me and only me. I listen by myself...at least 3 or 3 1/2 hours a week.

LIZ JORDAN/ WQGN P.D.: Myself and my GM, Franco. We listen to music collectively. I spend about 5 hours weekly with new music.

BILL O'BRIEN/ WWKX P.D.: The M.D., my night jock, the office girls, and myself. I listen to everything once,t hen go back and listen again. I listen to new music about an hour every day.

JIM MEECH/ 93Q M.D.: Myself and Dave Edmunds, our Program Director. We listen to new music individually and then collectively. I probably listen to new music about 4 hours a week.

MIKE MORGAN/ FLY92 P.D.: My M.D. and myself are involved in the music making process. We listen to new music individually here. I spend about 30 minutes per week listening to new music.

ERIC ANDERSON/ WZOU M.D.: Myself and my P.D. We listen to new music both individually and then collectively. As far as time spent listening to new music I would say whatever it takes.

LARRY HUGHES/ 95XIL P.D.: The consultant and myself. I listen individually about 30 minutes to an hour per week.

JAY BEAU JONES/ WKSS P.D.: Generally Kandy and I make the decisions, but any good station should always have its door open to other staff members. We listen together, separately, at home, at work or in the car all the time.

PETE COSENZA/ KC101 P.D.: Asst. P.D. Steve Wilson, M.D. Mike McGowan, on-air personalities, and myself. We listen both individually and collectively; 3-4 hours a week.

ERIK B./ WQXA M.D.: My P.D. and me, and usually our 22 year old female receptionist and our middle-aged midday guy. I weed out the bad music individually, then we do the music collectively. I listen to music 2 hours a day all week.

SCOTT SHAW/ WNNK M.D.: The P.D. and M.D., and we listen alone, then together. Time spent listening is relative to how much new music there is. I try to listen to everything at least twice.

MIKE BROWNE/ WRFY M.D.: My P.D. and me. I listen first and make a determination of what songs fit our station, then I play them for Al (P.D.). I listen 6-10 hours a week.

JOE HOVANSKI/ 103CIR P.D.: Myself and the M.D. We usually listen collectively, but we also listen individually. If I'm lucky, I'll get in about 4 hours per week listening to new music.

WALLY McCARTHY/ WYYS O.M.: Every on-air staff member is invited to sit in on the music meetings and they usually do. I listen to everything and then choose what we will listen to collectively in the meeting. I would say I spend about four hours per week listening to new music.

SKIP CARR/T102 P.D./M.D.: Just me and I spend as much time as I possibly can.

BEN BARBER/ W100 P.D.: Generally myself, but I will confer with other staff members and I usually spend about 3 hours a week.

DANNY HUTCHENS/ WRON M.D.: Just me, and I spend 2 - 2 1/2 hours a week. TOM MORGAN/ WQKX P.D.: The M.D.

and I listen to new music together as much as possible. We spend as much time as we can listening to music.

STEVE McKAY/ WSBG M.D.: I basically do it myself. I listen a lot, maybe 3 or 4 hours a week.





I feel like I'm stuck in a fifties sitcom: "Morning Personality, Where Are You??"

Until I talked to you this morning, Jay, I never thought of writing a letter to *One to One* to explain my situation. I need a person who already believes in the power of Sharing, someone who is willing to immerse him-or herself in this market and Share the good things about our community. Someone who can project positive vibrations in times that aren't always sunny.

I don't need a liner reader. I really don't need a "Stern-o-matic" shock jock. I need a

personality who can simply communicate *One to One* with an audience of adult listeners.

KUBA is in Yuba City, California (market #235). Think of us as a mid-size market. Yuba City is forty miles north of Sacramento, which means we take on major league talent every day of the week. The thing that sets KUBA apart, and allows us to be the top-rated AM signal and #3 overall in the Yuba City ADI is our belief in being "The Yuba City Radio Station." That means broadcasting high school sports, broadcasting from the county fair, broadcasting local festivals, putting on community fund-raisers throughout the year.

This is not a job for a newcomer; it requires someone with above average intelligence, someone who can be sophisticated and funny but not a rib-splitting, knee-grabbing stand-up comedian type.

I know somewhere out there is just the person I'm looking for. I'll be honest: this is not an easy job. The station is undergoing a growth spurt right now, and that means work for everybody. Everybody works hard.

You may be in the rating period, but my "book" is behind me. After all these months of compiling, re-writing, editing, polishing, and laying-out, the "Handbook For Radio Personalities" is done. BOB DYLAN: Bob Dylan's first all acoustic album in 28 years will be out October 27th. Good As I Been To You will contain versions of old Blues songs and English folk songs -- but no new Dylan compositions. His last acoustic album was 1964's Another Side

THE VIBRATORS: English Punk pioneers, The Vibrators, have re-recorded their British hits for a compilation album, *The* Power Of Money, and began a 40 city North American tour. The Vibrators date back to 1976 when they opened shows for the Sex Pistols. Since then they've recorded 10 albums. Their "Best Of" compilation is being released October 20th on Continuum Records.

SIR MIX-A-LOT: Sir Mix-A-Lot has a new home video out. *Miconomics* will contain the uncensored version of "Baby Got Back", "Swap Meet Louie", "My Hooptie", his version of Black Sabbath's "Iron Man", and two other clips — plus interview footage in which he shows off his house, studio, and collections of firearms and exotic cars.

SMOOTH GUNS N' ROSES SHOW COULD LEAD TO MORE ROCK AT ROSE BOWL: A Guns N' Roses concert at the Rose Bowl got good reviews not just from the press, but from the neighbors too. The head of the homeowners group in ultraconservative Pasadena which had opposed the concert, had to admit that the event went as smoothly as anything attended by 62,000 fans. Efficient traffic and security measures were praised, and the only complaints came over a fireworks display just before the midnight curfew. Pasadena officials were understandably apprehensive about the show because of the riots at G N' R shows in Montreal and St. Louis. They viewed it as a trial-by-fire for Rock concerts at the Rose Bowl, because more concerts are one way of enriching the city coffers.

BROOKS BEGINS EIGHT MONTH HIATUS IN DECEMBER: Instead of allout retirement, Garth Brooks now says he'll start with eight months off after his final concert of the year, December 12th in Auburn Hills, Michigan. The hiatus means that he's scrapping plans for a world tour, and is postponing his second NBC TV special. Brooks says that when he resolves the problem of being away from his family so much to make music, he'll return and go at it "110 percent".

PUBLIC ENEMY, SUGARCUBES TO COMPLETE U2 TOUR: Public Enemy will remain on U2's Zoo TV Outside Broadcast tour through the final date. The rappers originally joined for the period September 13th through October 14th, but Bono says, "As different as they are from us, they've made a strong connection with our audience." The Sugarcubes also joined the tour October 16th in Dallas. They will also be on the remainder of the American dates.

ROSY RECORD SALES FIGURES QUES-TIONED: Figures released this month by

the Recording Industry Association of America showing that the music business was doing better than expected this year were greeted with some skepticism by industry observers. The RIAA figures showed an 11 percent increase in dollar volume on shipments the first six months of this year over 1991. But analysts warn that the \$3.8 Billion figure for the first half of 1992 is shipments only. They also point out that the comparison is based on 1991, a particularly bad year for record sales. The figures actually reflect a substantial drop in shipments from the same period in 1990. Other experts warned that extremely sluggish sales in late summer could further diminish the year-end tally. The head of one record chain responded to the figures, saying, "Everybody should be dancing in the streets, so why are they all crying the blues?"



Alice In Chains

ALICE IN CHAINS SINGER NOW LAYNE IN WHEELCHAIR: Layne Staley is doing shows on the Alice In Chains tour with the aid of crutches and a wheelchair. The day of a show in Oklahoma City on September 25th, Staley was riding a three wheel, offroad bike when he tried to use his foot as a brake to stop before he crashed. The rear wheel went right over his foot - breaking it in three places. During surgery, doctors inserted pins in his leg and foot. But he still has some floating bones, and he flew home to Seattle on a day off to consult an orthopedic surgeon used by the Seattle Sonics. Staley comes out and performs the opening song on crutches before getting in the wheelchair, and he alternates between the two during Alice In Chains' set on the Ozzy Osbourne tour. He'll have a rippled abdomen before long because he finds singing sitting down is doing some great things for his stomach muscles.

BOBBY BROWN, MARY J. BLIGE, ELTON GAVE MCA A RECORD BREAKING MONTH: According to MCA Records, the company posted the highest monthly sales total in its history in September. New releases by: Bobby Brown, Mary J. Blige, Vince Gill, Patry Smyth, George Strait, and Trisha Yearwood —coupled with continuing success for: Elton John, Jodeci, Wynonna Judd, Lyle Lovett, Eric B. & Rakim, Reba McEntire, The Commitments, and Sass Jordan awakened the sleeping giant. The total came to over \$50 Million in U.S. sales. MCA is expecting its hot streak to continue with new releases coming from: Bell Biv Devoe, Trixter, Patti LaBelle, and B.B. King.

"NAKED LUNCH" AUTHOR WITNESSES BIZARRE MINISTRY, JIM ROSE RITUAL: It's only been a month since the Lollapalooza tour ended, but Ministry's Al Jourgensen and the Jim Rose Circus Sideshow were so happy to see each other again, they toasted their reunion in Lawrence, Kansas by raising a glass of bile. During the Lollapalooza tour, against Rose's advice, it became a rite of passage for the Red Hot Chili Peppers, Soundgarden, Pearl Jam, and Ministry to drink the liquid brought up from the stomach of Matt "The Tube" Crowley after he had taken it in through tubes inserted in his nose. And who better to chronicle such an event that "Naked Lunch" author William S. Burroughs who was with Jourgensen in Lawrence making Ministry's new video? Substances pumped into the tubes range from mayo to beer, whatever's handy.

AIRPLANE BOX A HANGAR FOR 22 PREVIOUSLY UNRELEASED RECORDINGS: Twenty-two of the 50 plus tracks on the Jefferson Airplane boxed set begin released October 27th are previously unreleased. Among the unreleased material is a Marty Balin solo, "I Specialize In Love", recorded three years before the Airplane was formed. It is being released as a single. Other rarities on Jefferson Airplane Loves You are three never-before-heard songs, including one Grace Slick wrote with Frank Zappa, "Would You Like To Snack?" There are also live tracks taken from a 1967 concert - and "Plastic Fantastic Lover" and "Uncle Sam Blues" recorded at Woodstock. In related news, members of the Airplane and Starship continue to fight among themselves. Slick and Paul Kantner have filed a Federal lawsuit against Mickey Thomas and Craig Chaquico over use of the name Jefferson Starship. Chaquico sued Kantner two months ago.

SOUNDGARDEN'S CORNELL, FANS HELPED FLOTSAM & JETSAM WITH "CUATRO": The Flotsam And Jetsam album just out could surprise a lot of people

by becoming their breakthrough. Appropriately titled *Cuatro* because it's their fourth album, it features one song, "The Message", co-written with Soundgarden's Chris Cornell. It's also the album that contains answering machine messages from fans who phoned in their advice for the song "(Ain't Nothing Gonna) Save The World". The Phoenix-based band says *Cuatro* is the traditional Mexican spelling of the word, not "quatro" as in Suzi.

SMYTH PLANNING NEW YEAR TOUR; BURTNIK IN BAND: Patty Smyth is now tentatively planning to begin touring after the first of the year. When she does, Glen Burtnik will be in the band. The former Styx member co-wrote "Sometimes Love Just Ain't Enough" with Smyth. Smyth says that she would have asked Burtnik to form a band with her, but she just assumed he was a solo artist. "I never asked him and then he joined Style," she said. "Of course I couldn't have offered him what they did at that point." Smyth isn't too pleased with Burtnik's Styx association. She said, "I love him and support him. Whatever he wants to do, I understand it. But to hear people say 'Sometimes Love Just Ain't Enough' was written with Patty by Glen Burtnik of Styx is just not cool."

DOCUMENT SHOWS EGO, NOT "RESPECT", KEPT DIO OFF SHOWWITH OZZY: Although Ronnie James Dio has stated that it was "respect" for Ozzy Osbourne that made him decline Ozzy's invitation to Black Sabbath to be on the bill at two Southern California shows next month (14 & 15), correspondence obtained

from Sharon Osbourne's office reveals Dio also had other reasons. In a letter to Black Sabbath management late last month, Dio's manager, Wendy Dio, stated flatly, "Ronnie has not supported anyone in American in the last ten years. He and I feel that this is a bad career move for him to start now." Ms. Dio went on to fax other such statements as "Ronnie James Dio will not support Ozzy Osbourne now or ever." According to the operator of the 18,750-seat venue where the Ozzy/Sabbath bill will take place, the last time Dio played there in 1990 fewer than 4,000 tickets were sold.

ELTON JOHN GIVES ROYALTIES FROM NEW SINGLE TO SIX AIDS CHARITIES: Elton John has pledged the royalties from all of his future single releases in America beginning with the new single to AIDS charities. His label, MCA Records, is so sure "The Last Song" will be a hit, it has already contributed an initial \$100,000 advance against the proceeds. pediatric AIDS foundations will benefit, as will: AIDS Project L.A.; Hollywood Supports; The Gay Men's Health Crisis. Inc.; and, Project Open Hand in Atlanta (Elton's adopted home town for now). Fans can also make a donation and get a three song cassette by calling 1-800-695-AIDS. Elton and his partner, Bernie Taupin, wrote the song about a son, dying of AIDS, who makes peace with his father. Elton said that this is something he's been doing in England for quite a while, and it's time that he started making similar contributions in America.

MICK JAGGER HAS ENOUGH SONGS FINISHED FOR TWO ALBUMS: Sources close to Mick Jagger were surprised to hear that none of the Blues tracks he recorded with the Red Devils will be on his new album, Wandering Spirit. Producer Rick Rubin told the Los Angeles Times it's because the sessions turned out differently -- and better - than expected. Rubin said they originally planned to do only two songs - but did 14, all cut the same day, with Jagger averaging three or four takes. The possibility that there's now enough material for another complete album prompted one Jagger associate to speculate that the notoriously thrifty Rock now has two albums for the price of one - and a live album could complete a three disc deal with Atlantic Records. Wandering Spirits November 16th release means that Jagger will be the third Rolling Stone to release a solo album this fall - following Ron Wood last month and Keith Richards on October 20th.

ARETHA JOINS ARRESTED DEVELOPMENT ON "X" SOUNDTRACK: Although Spike Lee has his own record label, on November 17th Quincy Jones' Qwest Records will release the soundtrack

to Lee's film, Malcolm X. Aretha Franklin has recorded a new version of the Donny Hathaway song, "Someday We'll All Be Free", with producer Arif Mardin. And, as reported earlier, Arrested Development is contributing their new song, "Revolution". Both songs will be played over the credits. The rest of the soundtrack reads like a Who's Who of African American music, with songs by: Joe Turner, Lionel Hampton, The Ink Spots, Billie Holliday, Erskine Hawkins, Louis Jordan, Ella Fitzgerald, John Coltrane, Ray Charles, Duke Ellington, and Junior Walker And The All Stars.

SECADA SAYS HE'S A SONGWRITER FIRST, SINGER & PERFORMER SECOND: Jon Secada is starting to get requests for songs from other artists - after the success of "Just Another Day" and "Do You Believe In Us". He's happy about it, because that's how he started. "I really wanted to be a songwriter," he says. "The past two or three years I've been working on my craft as a songwriter. Songwriter first. singer and performer, second." "Do You Believe In Us" came out of the same sessions that produced "Just Another Day"..."They're very autobiographical in nature," he explains. "They all came about from conversations I had with my co-writer." Secada has just released a Spanish language version of his album, Otro Dia Mas Sin Verte, with three new tracks.

ROXETTE: AROUND THE WORLD IN 16 TRACKS: It's unusual for a band to write and record a new album while they're on a 16-month world tour, then release it just two

months after the tour ends -- but that's what Roxette has done with Tourism. Per Gessle says they got the idea to do it after they'd completed the first leg of the tour, just before last Christmas. Gessle and his partner, Marie Fredriksen, don't like live albums. They only included Roxette's hits "The Look", "It Must Have Been Love", and "Joyride", because they are totally different from the studio versions. "There was a certain tightness and energy in the band that hadn't been there before," Gessle explained. "We're all very good and very old friends. We always hang around playing guitar in dressing rooms anyway, so we figures we night as well play some new stuff, record it and see what happens." Gessle was writing songs on the tour bus as they crossed the Swiss border, and recording sessions were held worldwide -- including Room 603 of the staid old Alvear Palace Hotel in Buenos Aires - where the drummer wrapped suitcases in towels and played because he could hardly set up his drum kit. Going right into the studio to put the finishing touches on Tourism wasn't a problem because Gessle still felt the momentum.

N.P.G. RAPPER TONY M. DENIES MICHAEL JACKSON REFERENCES IN PRINCE SONG: Much has already been made about "thinly veiled references" to Michael Jackson in Prince's new song, "My Name Is Prince". But according to N.P.G. Rapper, Tony M., the lines "Don't wanna be king 'cuz I've seen the top and it's just a dream - big cars and women and fancy clothes - will save your face but it won't save your soul," weren't even written by the Purple Poet. The Rapper says he wrote them, and he didn't have Michael - or his face - on his mind. Says Tony M.: "The media tried to make so much of this Michael Jackson and Prince situation. It's funny because when I wrote the rap I didn't think about Michael Jackson - Period! I took the situation as me getting a chance to brag and do a little talking myself." Tony says he hears people all the time claiming, "I'm King of Rap," "I'm King of Stage", "I'm King of this", or "I'm King of Pop". "People just narrow it down to the Michael Jackson thing," he said, "and I didn't mean a pun by it at all, I don't really care what Michael does." Reminded that a little controversy can be beneficial, Tony replied with a laugh, "I think he has enough controversy. We just kind of laugh about it." Both Prince and Jackson have already declined comment on the song.

NEIL YOUNG releases Harvest Moon, the long-awaited follow-up to Harvest, on October 27th. Young is supported by THE STRAY GATORS, the original backing band for Harvest

comprising bassist TIM DRUMMOND, drummer KENNETH BUTTREY, BEN KEITH on steel guitar, and SPOONER OLDHAM on piano. JAMES TAYLOR, NICOLETTE LARSON (who sang on Harvest) and LINDA RONSTADT make guest appearances. The ten tracks were recorded at Young's home studio, Redwood Digital, and include the cuts "Unknown Legend", "Natural Beauty" (a ballad about the environmental crisis recorded live in Portland, Oregon), "War Of Man", "One Of These Days", "Such A Woman", "Old King" (an ode to Young's late dog), "Dreamin' Man", "From Hank To Hendrix", "You And Me", and the title song.

Updating last week's story on the new MICK JAGGER solo Lp, Wandering Spirit, we've obtained some more info about the record. Along with such new cuts as "Don't Tear Me Up", "Wired All Night", and "Bill Withers Use Me" featuring a duet with LENNY KRAVITZ, Jagger has also recorded a scorching cover of the JAMES BROWN classic "Think". During sessions for the record Jagger cut 14 to 15 seminal Blues songs with L.A. local band THE RED DEVILS that may come out down the road. Look for Jagger solo tour dates to be announced shortly.



AC/DC

The world's loudest band, AC/DC, return October 27th with AC/DC Live, their first live collection since 1978's If You Want Blood - You've Got It. The collection is available in four configurations -- a special collector's edition double CD and cassette with poster pullout and single CD and cassette which will comprise the band's greatest hits. Tracks

include such bone-crunching classics as "You Shook Me All Night Long", "Hell's Bells", "Back In Black", "Money Talks", "For Those About To Rock", "T.N.T.", "Whole Lotta Rosie", "Dirty Deeds Done Dirt Cheap", "Let There Be Rock", "High Voltage", and "That's The Way I Wanna Rock N' Roll". The CD and cassette single

will feature perennial concert standard "Highway To Hell" backed with "Hell Ain't A Bad Place To Be", a track not found on the live record.

Who Killed That Bird Out On Your Window Sill -- The Movie is the title given to THE BLACK CROWES' first outing in the world of laserdisc. Running 90-minutes in length, the release will capture 32 tracks in new and more familiar videos, TV appearances, live concert footage and exclusive behind-thescenes action never before seen. Tracks include: "Jealous Again," "She Talks To Angels", "Remedy", "Black Moon Creeping" and "Sometimes Salvation". Don't despair VCR owners, the package will also see retail in VHS format. The whole thing hits the street November 24. Congrats to FMQB alum MARK DiDIA on nabbing Executive Producer credits on the release.

In other Black Crowes news, the band has made no secret of their disdain for so-called heavy handed security types who man-handle concert goers. The latest incident comes to us from the stage in Houston where lead singer CHRIS ROBINSON repeatedly stopped the show over the rough handling of audience members. On top of that, after only one song, two speakers toppled from the stage and injured five people in the first row. The show was put on hold until the band was assured that the injured fans were given proper treatment from paramedics. In the end, the band pointed to the "powers that be" for not providing the proper environment for the show. "This is our night," proclaimed Chris from the stage. "Our fans came here to hear some music and to have two hours of freedom. This isn't a Guns N' Roses show. We have all come here to have a good time." Feeling that that mission was a failure last Monday night, Robinson vowed that he and his band would come back for a free show, "an evening revolving around freedom of expression and staying away from the reins of discipline that the security personnel in Houston attempted to force upon our fans."

MTV faithful will be treated to a sneak preview of Bon Jovi's new album on October 29 when the cable rock network airs Keep The Faith: An Evening With Bon Jovi. The band's performance will be carried to the world as they offer acoustic and electric renditions of songs from the new album and previous faves. Now through October 22, however, MTV is qualifying viewers to win a trip to New York City to be in the audience for the performance.


