



SHEBEL TO PRO-FM

Chris Shebel, who recently exited WDJX/Louisville after spending 8 years in the P.D. chair there, has been named P.D./afternoon drive host at heritage Top 40 WPRO-FM/Providence, replacing David Simpson, who exits the station. PRO-FM General Manager Mike Wheeler, referring to "Chris Hamilton," which will apparently be his air name in Providence, commented, "I'm confident that Chris can lead our station to the next level of greatness. He has the experience to continue the tradition of PRO-FM, and lead our staff into the future." Shebel added, "I'm excited about the opportunity to program a legendary station like PRO-FM. They've got a great history, not only in the marketplace, but across the country. I look forward to adding to the history." Prior to 'DJX, Shebel was an on-air personality at KZZP/Phoenix, and WLS AM-FM/Chicago.

Rich Davis (Joe Friday)

WAEB(B104)/Allentown M.D./night jock Joe Friday, a.k.a. Rich Davis, exits to take the 6-9pm shift at WYXR(Star 104.5)/Philadelphia. Davis had been doing weekend air work for Star. Chuck Knight, P.D. of the Pyramid Hot AC, said,

BOSS 97 (WBSS) Atlantic City (9/20/87-10/31/95)

-8 years-1 month-and 11 days. Broken down, 97.3 months!

Joe Mitchell (former GM): "It was what you got into radio to do!"

Nicky G. (First PD): "In its heyday, Boss 97 was a best friend to over 100,000 people in South Jersey"

Jay Towers (Current P.D.): "Boss 97 was a true Top 40 station that everybody loved."

Bob Burke: "Boss 97 was an era!... It was real people living real radio... It had a vibe, the attitude of a leader... It was about building something... something memorable. It was magic!

BOSS 97 was designed to be a current-driven, top-of-mind, fun-sounding, active leader in the market. It took chances and broke rules. It was what Top 40 in the 90's is all about. This formula put the BOSS and Atlantic City on the map as an industry leader. In the Fall of 1993, BOSS 97 finally broke from the pack to become the dominant Top 40/CHR in the market. BOSS 97 - in a word - was FUN!


On the final day, FMQB's **Bob Burke** (former BOSS 97 PD) made his first on-air appearance since leaving the station in September of '94, co-hosting the final hour of the Jay Towers show with many former on-air personalities checking in. Burke, of course, had to have the last words... "Jay Towers has left the building...(Towers/Burke)C-Ya!"

In the final 15 minutes, you heard **The Grateful Dead**'s *Big Boss Man* out of left field, for obvious reasons, and the definitive BOSS record: **Robin S.** Show Me Love, followed by the closing bar of Boyz II Men's It's So Hard To Say Goodbye To Yesterday, and then the final sweeper: "Radio Atlantic City...WBSS Millville-Vineland-Atlantic City... Digital 97.3FM... The Boss 97, South Jersey's #1 Hit Music Station" (echo out to dead air).

New owners **Press Broadcasting** started simulcasting their Talk/Oldies hybrid station, **WKXW(New Jersey 101.5)/Trenton** at midnight. Grapevine listened with great sadness as the once-dominant CHR said goodbye. As reported here last week, P.D. Jay Towers takes over the programming reigns of **WAKX/Grand Rapids** next week, flipping that station to Top 40.

DUNCAN ANALYSIS: DUOPOLIES CONTROL 40% OF RADIO RATINGS, 56% OF REVENUE

The following findings are from Jim Duncan's fourth analysis of the impact of duopoly upon individual radio markets. Markets included in this study are 139 Arbitron markets which are surveyed in <u>both</u> the Fall and Spring Arbitrons. The study uses revenue estimates for 1994 from *Duncan's Radio Market Guide* and audience estimates for Spring '95. Duopolies included in this report are those which were closed or announced by early August '95. The study assumes that those announced by that date will indeed close. This particular study <u>does not</u> include proposed triopolies and the announced Westinghouse/CBS deal. Since some of the duopolies were not in place throughout calendar '94 the revenue estimates are pro forma. This study does not include LMA's, SMA's, etc.

KEY FINDINGS

• The average radio market had 39.6% of the 12+ shares (Mon-Sun, 6a-Mid) controlled by duopolies. In February the figure was 35.1%. A year ago it was 28.3%

• The average radio market had 55.7% of the market's revenue controlled by duopolies. In February the figure was 48.5%. A year ago it was 39.2%

• The pace of duopolization has slowed in major and medium markets while remaining about the same in the small markets.

THE END ZONE

The New York Daily News is reporting that Suburban New York Modern Rocker X107/Westchester is giving away tickets on the air to Z100/New York's holiday concert, the "Jingle Ball." Z100 has been teasing listeners about the event, which happens at the Byrne Meadowlands Arena on December 15th, and planned to announce the line-up on Friday 11/3. But X107 jumped the gun. X107 P.D. -Steve Blatter was quoted as saying, "Our phones have been ringing all day." The station also gave away tickets to the Zshow last year. Artists scheduled to appear at this year's event include Alanis Morissette, Natalie Merchant, **Blues Traveler, Sponge, Collective** Soul, Soul Asylum, Lisa Loeb, and more to be announced.

And finally, as if there hasn't been enough attention on L.A. courtrooms this year... Murder charges against **Snoop Doggy Dogg** and a co-defendant in a drive-by shooting might be dismissed to focus efforts against the alleged triggerman in the case. Snoop, whose real name is Calvin Broadus, is accused along with his bodyguard, McKinley Lee, and Sean Abrams, in the 1993 shooting death of Philip Woldermarian in a West L.A. park. Prosecutor Ed Nison explained the possible dismissal in the L.A. Daily News, saying, "The way (the statements) have been edited, we believe, compromises the people's case. We may be forced to dismiss against the two lesser-involved defendants in order to pursue the case in an appropriate fashion against the shooter." All three suspects have pleaded not guilty, claiming that the shooting was in self defense. Prosecutors say they believe that Lee was the actual shooter.

And a judge dismissed a case, on a technicality against a man accused of stalking **Madonna** and threatening to slit her throat. Prosecutors must now refile five counts - including assault, terrorism, and stalking charges - against **Robert Dewey Hoskins**, who was shot by a security guard at the star's Hollywood Hills estate. He allegedly told a security guard that he would cut the singer's throat "from ear to ear" if she refused to marry him.

IN THE RING WITH TYSON

Interview with WMXQ/Birmingham P.D. Jeff Tyson

By Dave Hoeffel

Jeff Tyson almost missed his radio calling. Unlike many of us who grew up with six-transistor radios stuck in our ears, Jeff went to school to be a dentist. But after stepping inside the campus radio station, he was bitten by the bug, and changed his major to communications. His first job was at the legendary 13Q/Pittsburgh in 1977. He drove the 13Q "Happy Honker" van around town, shuttling the jocks between appearances. He had the opportunity to do production, and eventually did part-time airwork for the station. From there it was on to another AM Top 40 in York PA, and then to AOR Rock 106/ Nashville. He crossed town to WSM-FM, then returned to Rock 106's AM station, WLAC. Next stop: Cincinnati, and Yes 95 for 7-midnight, and then it was on to Kix 106/Birmingham for afternoon drive, and crosstown Magic 96, before moving on to B106.7/ Washington, where he worked for Dan Vallie and the late Bob Kagen. Two years later, Vallie gave Jeff his first programming opportunity, at EZ's KFYE/Fresno. When EZ sold the station, Jeff was off to Miami to program Hot 105. A year later, the opportunity to return to his home town lured Jeff to the A.P.D./ M.D./afternoon drive position at B94/Pittsburgh, where he stayed for five years, and worked for five different Program Directors! From there, it was off to Greenville, SC for mornings at WFBC. One year later, the opportunity presented itself to program WMXQ.

The WMXQ position marks your return to the Birmingham market. How has it changed?

I spent four years here before going to Washington ... two years at Kix 106, and two at Magic 96. What had changed when I got back here was that there was no Top 40 radio station. 195 had become Mix, and was playing Michael Bolton, Phil Collins, and Chicago records, to try to compete with Magic 96, a station that had been here forever, and was very solid. Rock 99 was also very solid, despite having gone through numerous Rock format changes. WZZK, the heritage Country station, was still very strong here. WENN, the Urban station, was still doing very well. So the market hadn't changed very much, except for the fact that there was a huge hole for a Top 40 station. Everybody at our company, Dick Broadcasting, looked at what happened with Mix as an AC for about a year, and found that there wasn't much growth there, for a number of different reasons. We decided to take the station back to more of a CHR presentation. Since that's been done, we've gone up two shares in 18-34 persons, and 18-34 women. So the decision to return to Mainstream Pop was a good one, and I'm glad to be a part of that.

You've kept the Mix moniker. Was there any effort to somehow capitalize on the previous Top 40 heritage of the frequency?

When Dick Broadcasting bought the radio station, they looked at perceptuals, and



there was an incredible amount of negative baggage associated with I95. Rap music in the 80s, and a lot of the Hard Rock/hairband stuff really polarized the radio station, and put some negative per-

ceptions on it as being a teen machine. They did not want to go back to I95 for a couple of reasons. For one, our competition would have a field day, saying, "Here they go again" to the advertising community. And two, we didn't want the listeners especially the 25-34s - to think, "Oh no, here they come again with that teen machine... they're gonna play Rap and Hard Rock." So we kept Mix 94.5 as our logo, even though we switched back to CHR, because another change would have created more negatives for us, rather than positives. Musically, we've changed the station, but the presentation on the air is adult. Our focus is 18-34 females. By not going back to I95, we feel that we can hold on to some of the upper end, and keep them as part of us.



UP CLOSE

You would think that Birmingham would be a great CHR market, considering that not that many years ago, it was a CHR hotbed, featuring big battles between Kix 106 and I95.

Well, that's what I'm banking on! Now that there's only one CHR here, I'm hoping and praying that that philosophy and potential still exists here. and experience in programming from guys like these. The one thing that sticks out about Buddy is that he taught me how to stay focused on the big picture. As a program director, you're responsible for what comes out of the speakers, and you're responsible for integrity of product. To balance that with sales can be tough some times. Trying to please everybody in the building - from General Managers to Sales

How has the advertiser reaction been to the flip? How important is it for you to deliver upper demos?

I don't think that Birmingham is as fragmented as some of the bigger markets, like New York, L.A., Miami, and even Atlanta, where the pieces of the pie are very small. There are still only a handful of radio stations servicing the market here, so for us to just go after 12 to 24 is ridiculous. We don't need to do that. But we are very focused. The station is more focused on 20 to 32 females than it's ever been. The advertising community is welcoming a Pop radio station back into the arena. We still want to maintain some credibility with 25-34 females. Yes, our sales force is still trying to sell that, and we will continue to try to sell that. We're not giving that up. We've got to pick our niche, and really stay focused. The peripheral demos will come in time.

The fifth of your five B94 P.D.s was Buddy Scott. Under him, you were able to eliminate a crosstown competitor, and score some nice numbers. What did you learn from the experience? Does something like that make you into a better programmer?

Absolutely! There are a number of P.D.s who I look back on and think that they really helped my career. Dan Vallie is one. Jim Richards is one, Buddy Scott is one, and Bob Kagan is on that list as well. Although I've never worked with him, I've worked with a ton of people who have worked with Steve Kingston, and I've talked with him on a number of different occasions. I've drawn my knowledge Managers to sales people - as well as keeping Vice Presidents of Programming and your listeners happy... you can't do that and win every one of those different categories. As a Program Director, I've learned to stay focused on what my job responsibilities are, and that's the product... putting the best music on the radio station.

But how do you deal with the conflicts that naturally occur?

I think that there's always going to be a give and take, and a compromise situation between sales and programming, no matter what station you're working at, and no matter what format you're doing. And the more that I program, the more aware I become of what the bottom line needs to be. I'm aware of what sales goals are. But I'm not hired to get billing on the radio station. I'm hired to present a good product for the sales people to go out and sell. It's good to have managers who understand the goals of both the sales department and programming, and can play mediator. There's nothing better than having a General Manager who will go to bat for the Program Director in a sales meeting and say, "We've got to protect product, and integrity of product. Let the Programming Department do what they have to do." There's nothing better than that. So yes, there are occasional conflicts, but you do what you have to do, because that's what's best for the radio station in the long run. Sometimes you have to say no.

Who are your main competitors?

WMJJ is the AC radio station that's been here for over 12 years. They're a well-pro-

grammed radio station, and they're consistent in their programming. They do a good job, and the longevity and heritage is definitely a plus for them. On the Urban side, WENN does well with teens. And Country WZZK does well with 18-34 females, as well as the other two stations. There's no direct CHR competition, but I can pull listeners from every format in this market. I think that it comes down to lifestyle. Country listeners aren't hillbillies anymore, Urban listeners aren't all Black, and AC listeners aren't all 35+ housewives. Given the lifestyle of 18-34 females these days, they touch on every one of these radio stations at any given point in their day. I'm trying to draw listeners back from all of those formats, and what I'm offering is not only different music, but also more things that fit their lifestyle.

Do you think that you'll ever have another CHR competitor in the market? Maybe a Rhythmic competitor?

I don't know if the market can support it. I hope that doesn't happen. On the other hand, when radio stations sign on and get competitive with you, it can only create better radio. So there are plusses and minuses to that happening, but I really can't see the market supporting another Top 40 right now. Of course, now that I've said that, someone will probably put one on next week!

Describe your music position. With 1 being Rock, and 10 being Dance, where does the station fall on the scale?

I would say it's a 5. We're playing the hits. We're playing TLC, Michael and Janet Jackson, Jon. B, The Backstreet Boys, and Ace Of Base. On the other hand, we're playing Gin Blossoms, Hootie & The Blowfish. Dave Matthews Band. Lisa Loeb, and Collective Soul. So I think we're right down the middle. We just did a music test, and one of the big categories that popped up was Pop Alternative, which more or less these days is Pop music, period. I don't think that you can call Hootie & The Blowfish and Gin Blossoms Alternative anymore. That's Mainstream music. We're not gonna be a radio station that plays a lot of Green Day and Pearl Jam. Nor are we going to be a radio station that plays any Rap music, or the real edgy Urban stuff. We're gonna play the hits right down the middle.

UP CLOSE

There is no Alternative station there... correct?

No, there's not. **The Bear**, which is a 3,000 watt FM, plays some Alternative music, and is a combination of low-end Rock and Alternative, but their signal is a big problem.

What artist is core for the station right now? What is the perfect record for what you're doing?

I'll give you some artists that fit the station very well. Sheryl Crow, Hootie & The Blowfish, Janet Jackson, Ace Of Director. Clients also love her! I wish that I had ten of her in the building. She does a great job off the air as well as on. I do afternoons from 3 to 6... one of the premier afternoon talents in America... at night, from 6-11, we have **John Michaels**, who has been with the station for over nine years. On overnights, we have **Nikki Stewart**, who has been in the market for awhile as well.

What types of research are you using? How much gut is thrown in for balance?

The Research Group is heavily involved in Dick Broadcasting, and there-

Base, Gin Blossoms, Seal, Toni Braxton, Boyz II Men... those types of mainstream artists. Records that don't work for us are the real hard Alternative records, and the real Urban leaning records.

What record is borderline for you? What's got you on the fence?

That changes. When **Green Day** first came out, this station was not ready to play them. When their record crossed over from Alternative to the Mainstream, this station could have played it, but didn't because of the evolution of the station, and the timing. Another record that has us on the fence is the **Bush** record. **Alanis Morissette** had us on the fence, but she became so huge that we had to play it. Those types of records.

Run down your airstaff for us.

The morning show is hosted by Jack Boston, John Bird, and Roxanne. Jack came here from North Carolina, and has been here for about a year and a half, and he brought John Bird with him. John's the Paul Schaffer of the morning show... great musical talent. Roxanne does news, and is also a part of the show. She's been in the market for years and, has worked for other stations in the market. Clients love her! Middays, we have Gail O'Brien from 10-3. Gail's also my Music Director and Assistant Program

fore our radio station. They do our music tests and perceptuals. As far as week-toweek music research goes, we are just starting to implement in-house call-out, and within the next 30 days, we'll have it up and running. I also talk to four of five different Program Directors every week about how songs are working in their markets... people like Don Benson at Star 94 and Buddy Scott, I talk to Dave Robbins occasionally, and Smokey Rivers in St. Louis every once in awhile, and occasionally, Lee Chesnut at VH1. I think that you've got to look at call-out research, SoundScan, data that you get from other Program Directors, and trade magazines, and take all of these things into the music meeting, and then make a decision based on what it all shows you, plus, your gut. All of the info is about 60% of the picture, and 40% is your gut. And let's throw in another 10% from my 8 year old daughter, and my wife, who is in the demo. She and my daughter are real Pop-type people who read People Magazine. If they're into something, I should be too.

Your station production always sounds bright and tight when I hear it on hold. Overall, how produced is your station? Who are you using for voicework?

All of our people enjoy doing production, and our talent here is real quality-con-

scious. Our Production Director, Steve Atkins, is extremely quality-control conscious. He's got a great handle on making sure that the spots are produced well. We used John Pleisse out of Washington as our voice guy for awhile, and just switched recently to Sean Caldwell from Y100/Philadelphia. For us, he's doing that Generation X style of delivery, like Keith Eubanks does. When we decided to take the station back into a younger, CHR direction, we decided to change voices. The main reason to change voice guys is freshness. I generally change them every six to eight months, even if things are going well. It just freshens up the radio station. We're not using jingles at this point. We have one weather jingle, and that's it. We wanted to make a statement, and change the sound of the station for the first few months of this new direction, so we pulled all of the jingles off of the station. That doesn't mean that we won't put them back on down the road. I think that jingles sell excitement on the radio station, and I'm not opposed to putting them back on. But right now, we're just running Sean's sweepers.

What's the coolest promotion that you've done recently?

There was one that might not have been the coolest, but it got a lot of talk. When O.J. was released - and this reflects no personal opinion about his innocence or guilt, and absolutely was not meant to show disrespect to the families of the victims -everyone was discussing the verdict, and it was on everyone's mind. So we gave away gallons of orange juice, garment bags, and one-size-fits-all black gloves all weekend, and qualified winners to win a trip to Mexico. Then we screeched the tires in the promo, and said, "Wait a minute, he never did make it to Mexico." So we sent people to a Mexican restaurant, chauffeured in a white Bronco. We got a ton of calls and letters on that one.

When it's time to get away from the business, what's your favorite escape?

My kids, and my wife, and Seaside Florida, or a cigar at Armand's Restaurant.

PROG WINMING to NUSIC & THE PRODUCT LIFE CYCLE

by Tom Barnes

y now, many of America's programmers are using some sort of marketing and music research. While many articles have been written extolling the virtues of research, few have helped programmers understand the methods used to analyze their research and make real decisions about their music library.

While you are doing weekly call-out or periodic auditorium testing, you need to understand not only what the numbers mean now, but also what they will mean in the future. Research, like music itself, has a shelf life — what you learn from it today will not hold true forever.

Like any other product, the music you play has a life cycle. Introduction, growth, maturity, saturation and decline are the five stages of life for any product. Tracking each song's point in the product life cycle is extremely important in determining programming strategy. For example, a new product requires a strategy to encourage trial. A product that is in decline requires a "New and Improved" or line-extension strategy. (Baking soda in the refrigerator gave Arm and Hammer new life.) For programmers wishing to make the most of their music library (product), it is important to use the same sort of strategic thinking that product managers use in marketing consumer goods.

While your current music research may show positive, negative, unfamiliar and burn ratings, how do you use this information to track lifecycle or make music strategy decisions? Let's look at each stage of the product life cycle and see how research and strategy applies to each one.

New product introduction is the first stage of the life cycle. Remember this definition: Products are new if they are perceived to be new by the consumer. Your research will determine if your audience sees a song as new. It makes no difference how old a song is, low familiarity is the key. Time, record company priorities, and charts have little importance in determining whether a song is new. Don't forget the old adage that research cannot tell you what song to add to your current categories. Any song you test must have some familiarity in order for you to test it. However, here is the real story: Look at the positive rating on a song with low familiarity and compare it to the song's negative rating. Remember, in the introduction phase, approximately 25% of a new song's negative rating is really an unfamiliar response. If the song has a high unfamiliar rating and a high positive to negative ratio, you've got a great "new" record regardless of its age. Now get on the air, use your station's image to encourage trial through pre-selling the record, and build familiarity. It's important to remember that a song's particular industry history is meaningless with respect to your audience and your music. Track new music closely to see if it is moving toward the growth phase or if it will die. New music should make up no more than 15% of your hour. Any more than this will alienate your casual listeners.


These same rules hold true with music in the growth stage. This is music for your "A" rotations. You will see higher familiarity and will want to focus more on back-selling to get more image reflection from the cut. Now is a great time to proclaim "exclusive." This is the music everyone in your audience is talking about and listening for: a short term favorite. The music in the growth stage differs from music in the introduction stage in terms of listener awareness. Most of your listeners should be aware of this music and like it (modern familiarity, very low negatives, high positives). This is the music that should be working <u>for</u> you by building your hit image and your audience. Of course music in the growth stage won't be your best music forever, so you must continue to track it. This music should make up at least 20% of your hour.

Imagine you are managing a forest. You have trees of different ages and the older, stronger ones are harvested for money. To continue generating income, you must continue to plant seedlings or your forest will become a desert and there will be no more revenue. You must plant and grow seedings constantly. This analogy holds true for <u>every</u> format. If you are Classic Rock or Oldies you <u>still</u> can play "New" (remember the definition) music. You don't have to burn-out your entire library and end up with a desert. Encourage trial of new (unfamiliar) music when you are least vulnerable, during non-drive times and at night.

The next stage in the life cycle is maturity. Music that is mature is completely familiar, highly positive, hardly negative with moderate to low burn. This is your safest music and should make up at least 60% of your hour. This is the music that defines you. Mature songs are your audience's long-term favorites. This is the music that should come from your core artists. When people think of you they should think of this music and when people think of this music they should think of you. Watch your perceptual research to confirm this. Hopefully by now you can see the way your image and music have a reciprocal relationship. Invest your image in new product to help it grow and harvest your image from mature product.

The last stages of the product life cycle are saturation and decline. They are marked by high burn and increasing negatives. This is dangerous product, but there are strategies for these songs as well. For example, you can take these songs and rest them for a year or more and bring them back. We have seen many records burn terribly only to freshen back to mature status. Music is organic. Most titles heal themselves if given sufficient time to rest. We also have seen that music degrades; its resilience decreases every time it returns in rotation. The lesson here is not to throw a song away forever after it reaches unacceptable levels of burn and negatives. If you believe in a song or it has tested well for you in the past, keep testing it. Wait for it to heal.

Think about your library as an inventory. Think about each song as a brand. Use different imaging strategies for each brand based on its stage in the life cycle. Balance and rotate your stock based on your consumer research, and, make sure you always have plenty of the product your consumer is looking for in stock.



Lisa Loeb

LISA LOEB HAS A COUPLE OF NEW STORIES ON TAILS TOUR: Lisa Loeb left for Europe where she's opening the Tails tour with a couple of new stories. Making their debut in Nine Stories are drummer Ronnie Crawford and guitarist Mark Spencer, replacing Jonathan Feinberg and Tim Bright who played on the album. "In the recording process I realized that there were some changes that needed to be made," says Loeb, explaining that she wanted a guitarist with a heavier style. Loeb, who begins her U.S. tour in Atlanta on November 11, says that doesn't necessarily mean a heavier sound onstage. She describes it as "pretty similar to the record." But she adds that there will be no strings accompanying them. Loeb had a couple of movie offers after Reality Bites made "Stay" a worldwide hit, selling more than 750,000 copies. But writing a song with Carole Bayer Sager for Junior didn't work out as planned, nor did another song for a Warren Beatty movie. Loeb is now staying away from film songs to establish herself as a recording artist, songwriter, performer, and bandleader - although "Stay" does close the album and is included in her show. "Do You Sleep" was written six years ago while Loeb was in her senior

year at Brown. Both songs are based on personal experience. But, Loeb says that she's not the type who can finish a song in 20 minutes after something has happened to her. Sometimes it takes years until it feels right.

NILS LOFGREN: Nils Lofgren, who just released a new album, *Damaged Goods*, is planning a two-week East Coast tour to begin in mid-November.

PAGE MAKES L.A. CONCERT DEBUT, RELEASES NEW SINGLE:

Martin Page made his Los Angeles concert debut at the House of Blues in Los Angeles. "Light In Your Heart," a song that Page and Bernie Taupin wrote at the same time they penned Heart's hit "These Dreams," is being released as Page's next single. Whitney Houston and Bette Midler both asked to record the song - but Page turned them down, knowing that he'd record it for an album of his own someday. "In The House Of Stone And Light," meanwhile, is expected to end up as one of the year's most played songs.

SONY TO SELL \$200 MILLION IN BEATLES MEMENTOES IN 2

YEARS: Sony Signatures announced that it has acquired exclusive worldwide licensing and merchandising rights to the Beatles. Sony would not divulge financial terms of the deal - but they expect to sell \$200 million worth of Beatles paraphernalia during the next two years. The San Francisco-based Sony Corp. subsidiary plans to put the Beatles name and image on everything from t-shirts and posters to limited-edition lithographs and reproductions of 1960's collectibles. Sony has begun acting as agent for Apple Corps. Ltd. Apple Corps.' previous deal with Determined Productions expired October 31.

311 TO TOUR WITH KRAVITZ: 311

will open the Lenny Kravitz North American tour beginning right after Christmas and hitting 40 cities through the end of January. The tour will help continue the momentum for the band and — leader Nick Hexum hopes — add more credibility to the Rap Rock genre. 311's video for "Don't Stay Home," directed by Mark Kohr (who has done clips for Green Day and Alanis Morissette) is on MTV's *Alternative Nation* — and their latest album is over the 100,000 mark in sales. Hexum admits that he's enjoyed their underdog status. "Mostly we're totally underground," he says. "We're doing it through live shows and word-of-mouth. Maybe someday that will change. But, it's kind of cool knowing that we're basically doing it all ourselves - just through the fans."

GOD LIVES UNDERWATER TRAV-ELS ROUGH ROAD ON FIRST TOUR:

A concert that got out of hand in Rochester, New York last summer continues to haunt God Lives Underwater as they tour to support their debut album, Empty. They are out with K.M.F.D.M. through November 5 in L.A., then leave for Europe with Filter before returning to North America to begin their first headlining tour. The video for "All Wrong" debuted on 120 Minutes. Charges of inciting a riot are still pending against singer David Reilly. Reilly, who once nabbed shoplifters when he worked as a department store detective, was arrested along with 12 fans. He is trying to reschedule his next hearing - which is set for when the band is in Europe. He has also been told to be available for a trial which may last 10 days. Police have accused him of encouraging fans to beat up officers, which he insists he never did. According to Reilly, an employee of the Rochester radio station that promoted the concert, told him before he went on stage, "Do whatever you want - and get the crowd crazy," and that he would take care of it. There are no videos showing what actually did happen. Reilly claims that he was taunted and ridiculed while he was jailed. He says that the incident has also led to increased security at their gigs. Drummer Adam Kary has already been roughed up, handcuffed, and maced by officers without provocation.

In addition to the single "Like A Rolling Stone," released on October 23, the album also features live versions of such rarely heard early **Stones** numbers as "The Spider & The Fly" and "I'm Free" plus covers of **Robert Johnson**'s "Love In Vain" and **Willie Dixon**'s "Little Baby." The video for "Like A Rolling Stone" features a cameo by actress **Patricia Arquette**.

Another round of the **Blur** vs. **Oasis** battle looks set to break out next month, when both release singles from their new albums. **Blur**'s will be "The Universal" while **Oasis** will go with "Wonderwall." It's thought that the release dates are unlikely to fall on the same Monday. **Oasis**, meanwhile, are reported to be considering donating the profits from their forthcoming Earls Court shows to the Terrence Higgins Trust, following **Noel Gallagher**'s recent outburst against members of **Blur** (ROL News, September 29). Interviewed in last week's *NME*, **Gallagher** denies that he ever said **Oasis** would split after three albums, saying "I see **Oasis** as a long-term thing, at least until the year 2000."

Meat Loafs Welcome To The Neighbourhood album is set for October 30 release. It includes his new single "I'd Die For You (And That's The Truth)," out next Monday as a duet with **Patti Russo**, who sang on his last world tour. Longtime **Loaf** collaborator **Jim Steinman** collaborates on some tracks, while other tracks are written by **Diane Warren** and **Van Halen's Sammy Hagar**, with **Meat Loaf** himself writing one track.

Coming from RCA is the much-publicised, newly-discovered Elvis Presley song, his version of "The Twelfth Of Never," due as a single on October 23 as a trailer for the boxed set *Walk A Mile In My Shoes* - *The Essential '70s Masters.* The track is a rehearsal performance recorded on August 16, 1974, recorded on cassette. The single will also include "Burning Love" and "Walk A Mile In My Shoes." Another supposed **Presley** "discovery" given much press coverage of late, "Let Me Make Believe A While," may not be genuine: RCA's **Presley** specialists **Ernst Mikael Jorgensen** and **Roger Semon** are unconvinced that the recording may feature **Elvis**' voice.

Everything But The Girl will have the **Todd Terry Club Mix** of their Italian #1 hit "Missing" released in the UK next week. The track has also charted in Holland, France, Spain and Belgium and will be available on CD with further mixes by **Alex Natale** and **Chris & James**, plus the original version from the duo's *Amplified Heart* album. Having left blanco y negro, **EBTG** are now close to completing a new deal with Virgin Records. Meanwhile, RCA is stepping in to the "Missing" story by releasing its version of the song by **No Mercy**.

Cher's new U.K. single, her first since signing directly to WEA in the U.K., is her cover of Marc Cohn's "Walking In Memphis." It comes out next Monday, produced by Chris Neil, whose credits include Mike & The Mechanics and Celine Dion. Remixes include one by Shut Up And Dance, whose own "Raving I'm Raving" in 1992 contained a sample of the Cohn original and became one of the shortest-lived major hits ever, reaching #2 in a two-week chart stay before Cohn had the record injuncted. Cher's new album *It's A Man's World* follows on November 6 and includes the single among 14 new tracks, also including the title number, a cover of the James Brown song, and compositions by Paddy McAloon of Prefab Sprout, Paul Brady and Trevor Horn, the last of whom is another of the set's producers, as is Greg Penny, the producer of albums by k.d.lang and Elton John.

Alanis Morissette, who played a packed gig at London's Subterania recently and returns to the U.K. for three further shows starting on the 20th, has "Hand In My Pocket" released on Monday as the followup to her #22 hit "You Oughta Know." Both songs are on her album *Jagged Little Pill*, which recently topped the U.S. charts and has now sold two million copies worldwide.

Jaz Coleman, best known as a member of Killing Joke, is producer and arranger of Us & Them, a new album of the music of Pink Floyd performed by the London Philharmonic Orchestra, out next week on Point Music. The LPO are conducted by Peter Scholes on the album, the cover of which is designed by Roger Dean, famous as the man behind the classic artwork on Yes albums. Dean will also supply the graphics for a concert of Pink Floyd music by the LPO at London's Royal Albert Hall on November 30.

Erasure's self-titled album will be out on October 23 featuring 11 tracks recorded mainly in Dublin, all written by **Vince Clarke** and **Andy Bell**. Production is by **Thomas Fehlmann** of **The Orb** and **Gareth Jones**. **Saint Etienne**'s new single, out on October 30, is a remix of "He's On The Phone," co-written with French star **Etienne Daho**. It previews their "Too Young To Die" best of, which follows on November 13.

Simply Red stayed at #1 in the singles chart with "Fairground" in an unchanged top three, with Smokie moving up again to four. The highest new entry was Def Leppard's "When Love & Hate Collide" at seven, a position they have only bettered twice in their 16-year British chart career. Louise's "Light Of My Life" climbed into the Top 10, 12-8, while Nick Cave and Kylie Minogue's "Where The Wild Roses Grow" was new at 11 and "Camden Town" by Suggs at 14. "U Krazy Katz" became PJ & Duncan's latest hit at 15, the Levellers' "Fantasy" arrived at 16 and Bobby Brown's remix of "My Prerogative" at 17. The Bluetones scored their second Top 40 hit, and first Top 20, with "Bluetonic" at 19. Wild Colour's remake of Fleetwood Mac's "Dreams" came in at 25, Todd Terry Project's cover of Class Action's '80s dance hit "Weekend" at 28 and "Suffer Never" by Finn, featuring brothers Neil and Tim, at 29. A club remake of "American Pie" by Just Luis entered at 31, M People's "Love Rendezvous" at a much lower than usual 33, and the Lighthouse Family made their Top 40 debut with "Ocean Drive" at 34.

On the album chart, as expected, **Oasis** crashed in at #1 with (What's The Story) Morning Glory, arriving ahead of **Janet Jackson**'s Design Of A Decade which came in at two. **Mariah Carey**'s Daydream thus fell to three and **Michael Bolton** to four, with All You Can Eat by **k.d.lang** new at seven and The X Factor at eight for **Iron Maiden**, the 11th Top 10 album of their career. **Garbage**'s self-titled debut album entered the chart at 12, and **Brian Eno** and **Jah Wobble**'s collaborative Spinner edged into the listings at 71.


