





ANALYSIS

What a week for the MARY JANE GIRLS! There was a great migration of stations taking the record top twenty (Hit Factor of 64%). Most stations we talked to took it up five points or more. WAAY-Huntsville took it 21-12 and put it into their heaviest rotation. 'TIL TUESDAY is another barn burner, adding 44 new believers. We had a feeling about this record five issues back. Things did get better for HOWARD JONES as he crept into the top ten with MADONNA. We're told the record experienced a retail breakthrough last week. DAN MURRAY of WAGQ-Athens took it 16-8 and said he noticed strong positive reaction to the song at a club he was at last week. KITS/FM-San Francisco says "hot" and charts it 20-12. MR. ED at KWOD-Sacramento decided to add the DEPECHE MODE after he noticed amazing popularity from outside the confines of radio. He's in good company, along with 195-Miami, KZZP-Phoenix, Q96-San Antonio (NEAL HUNTER reported heavy phones), FM102-Sacramento, KWES/FM-Odessa, etc. PAUL YOUNG skips "Chartbound" and goes directly into the Top 40 at 39! It's been a heavy airplay push in the last three weeks. HENRY V. at CFTR- Toronto gives a hearty thumbs up to GINO VANNELLI's "Black Cars". HENRY sez sales are "phenomenal" and it charts 25-15! Canada leads the way. A warm welcome to two great programmers joining the Gavin Top Forty family: BILL SHANNON at

K104-Erie and JOHN WETHERBEE at WNAP-Indianapolis. PAUL HARDCASTLE update: The "19" (out this week) appeared on the national news (ABC, NBC) two Fridays ago. Get ready! (K104 took a head start and already added the record.) JOLENE BALLER at WVSR-Charleston, WV reports "wild requests and big sales" on JEAN KNIGHT's "Toot Toot". She claims it's not a quick burn-out. "Holding up beautifully" said JOHN RAYMOND at KIXY-San Angelo. SURVIVOR took a healthy jump. STAN MAIN at KCPX/FM-Salt Lake tells us the record did well on their Battle of the Hits show. He sees "good sales". GENE BAXTER of WAVA-Washington, D.C. told us about the latest movie soundtrack LP coming up! It's "Perfect" with John Travolta and Jamie Lee Curtis and GENE reckons it has a good REO track on it. It was a toss-up between AMY GRANT and THE PAYOLAS for the "Record To Watch". Check out AMY's story in the latest Rolling Stone. Canada's PAYOLAS had a dozen nice-looking adds, featuring WJZR, WKSP, Q101, WOAY, KQCR, WBNQ, among others. We feel a buzz. RICK DANIELS at WGGZ/FM-Baton Rouge moves GLENN FREY 20-10. He started playing it early on as an LP cut. STEVE SHELBY at KZ103-Tupelo takes it 12-9. Z100-New York charts JACK WAGNER's latest 25-19. Dave returns from vacation next week. As Bill used to say, Stay Well.



JOHN CAFFERTY & THE BEAVER BROWN BAND

FROM THE ROAD

by Ron Fell

Probably no band currently within the pages of The Gavin Report has spent more time on the road playing rock 'n' roll than have the guys in this band. In setting up the following interview we knew we'd have to catch up with John Cafferty on the road and sure enough

John called us from the one pay phone in a diner between dessert and a sound check.

Ron Fell: You are where and doing what as we talk on the phone?

John Cafferty: We're in Erie,

Pennsylvania. We're playing at a beautiful theatre called the Wharf Theatre right in downtown Erie, Pennsylvania. Right now I'm over at this restaurant. I wish I knew the name of it ...

RF: What does a future superstar eat for dinner before a show?

JC: We try to eat real, real light before we play. We just usually eat some soup. (laughs)

RF: Something that won't come up on you during the show?

JC: Well, during the show we play kinda long, we play a couple of hours. It's usually pretty physical. We're on the road so much we try to take good care of ourselves. We go to the gyms in every town we're in. We work out, lift weights. We do Nautilus to try to stay in top shape. It's like running. You don't want to eat a full dinner before you go out and run ten miles. But after you finish with the show

you're usually pretty hungry.

RF: I guess if I ever talk to a road band, you guys are it. You've been out for the last decade.

JOHN CAFFERTY

JC: Pretty much. I think it's going to be thirteen years in the Northeast from Maine to Maryland, playing all the colleges and clubs and bars and stuff. We've pretty much done that for most of our career. Then, when we got lucky this last year and sold a few records, we were able to go out and play every major city in the country, which was quite an experience. RF: How did all you guys come together? JC: We have known each other since we were kids. We went to high school together, so we've known each other since we were about 12 or 15 years old, and played in various bands. I mean Rhode Island is a pretty small place, so all the musicians know each other. I guess when we first started to go to college we put this band together. And that really helps, you know. When you're all best friends and you've known each other so long. The fact that real nice things have been happening to us makes it extra special, because it's all the same guys. We're surrounded by guys who have been through it all together. So that's

RF: Were there periods of time during this training period that you had to take side jobs, or were you always able to live off of your music?

JC: We were very fortunate that people always came to see us play. It seems like in every place we've ever played in the last thirteen years, we were always able to make friends, always got invited back, always had a lot of places to play. So we never really had to get any other jobs. We didn't make a lot of money over the years, but we made enough money to keep going, to pay the rent. So we were very

lucky. RF: Approximately 1980 you were able to release your first music on vinyl. JC: I guess it was at a time when many bands were releasing independent singles, hoping major record companies would notice if they got any airplay. So we made a single on a label called Coastline Records. The single was "Wild Summer Nights" and the flip side was "Tender Years." We were hoping we might be able to get some local airplay, like in Providence and WBRU—the college station over at Brown, which we did. But what happened was, a station in New York City-WNEW/FM, which is probably one of the top rock 'n roll stations around, started playing the record. And within a couple of weeks it was the most played, most requested song at the station. Because of that, they (WNEW/FM) asked us if we would do a live broadcast. I think we were the first unsigned band to do a live broadcast from the Bottom Line over a major radio station. So we did that and the record started to get reported to the trades. We ended up getting airplay up and down the East Coast, in Boston, Providence, Connecticut and in Washington D.C.—a lot of places. RF: Some good rock 'n roll markets.

JC: Yeah, great.

RF: During this apprenticeship you were serving, much has been made of the fact that there was a circuit you played that went from maybe Virginia in the South, up to Boston, maybe further up the coast and a lot of bands, a lot of similar sounding bands were playing there, Southside Johnny and Bruce Springsteen. Did you guys pick up things from each other over the years? Obviously, Bruce was not too well known in those days, but what caused the music to sound the same? JC:: Well, it's really a two part answer. Number one. I think that with a lot of the bands in the Northeast, there seems to be an influence of the early rhythm and blues from the '50s and '60s, probably because a lot of that music came out of the New York area and we were close enough to pick up the New York stations. I remember I used to listen to WABC when I was a kid. We could get it in Rhode Island. I was living at the beach and it would come across the water. A lot of the great R&B bands came out of that area. New York was pretty much the center of rock 'n roll at one point in time. So a lot of the guys that are in their early thirties may have picked up on that influence. So what happens is you have bands like The J. Geils Band in Boston, Roomfull of Blues in Rhode Island, Beaver Brown in Rhode Island, Bruce Springsteen, Southside Johnny in Jersey, Hall and Oates in Philadelphia, all picking up on the rhythm and blues influence. I think that may have something to do with it. The other answer I think you may be looking for is that Bruce Springsteen and Southside Johnny and that New Jersey sound. When we first started out, I guess around 1973, we were lucky enough to meet Bruce and all those guys when they used to play up around our house in Providence and in Boston. We used to play in the small bars and we became friends with all the guys in their band. When we'd play the Jersey Shore, all those guys used to show up and get on stage with us. Bruce has given us a lot of advice and encouragement over the years, especially with me as a songwriter. When I first started writing songs I had a lot of questions about how to become a better writer, and he was always a great writer and he took the time to help. We'd just talk about our favorite records and what was a good song and why, so there was definitely a very positive influence. RF: Have you had that kind of contact with him the last couple of years? JC: Yeah. I see him every once in a while. When he's playing up around where we are, or when we're playing someplace where he is. We run into each other and he's real happy for us. Like I said, he was always very encouraging and he's glad that we got an opportunity and it turned into something real good. Certainly the feeling was mutual, because we're very

proud of the success he's been able to have

RF: From all I can gather from people who have seen you perform live, you put on as energetic a show as he does and you're about ready to collect your dues. Bruce spent quite awhile waiting for his to come in, so hopefully it's your turn now.

Can you tell us a little about how you got involved with the movie "Eddie and the Cruisers"?

JC: It's funny 'cause there's an old show business saying that goes, "You gotta be great, every night, 'cause you never know who's going to be in the audience." One night we were playing in New York City about six years ago. We were playing in a bar called "The Other End," in the Village. This guy came to see us. His name was

"O.K., maybe that's what rock 'n' roll is—the voice of our generation."

Kenny Vance and he just saw us playing that night. We never met him afterwards, and never had any contact with him until I guess it was about four years later when he got a job as the music producer for the film "Eddie and the Cruisers." When they asked him if he knew of any bands that he felt might be good ... that could play '50s-'60s style and also be able to write songs that would have that '50s and '60s influence, but would be also modern music, he said, "Yeah. I saw this band years ago called Beaver Brown from Rhode Island."

RF: You were just known as Beaver Brown in those days?

JC: Right. And he called us up and asked us if we were still together and if we were interested in playing some music for the film. We said sure. (laughs) Sounds like a pretty good idea. That's how that came about.

RF: Did you know when you agreed to do it that your music was going to be lip-synched?

JC: Ah... Yeah. Actually, one of the guys in the band, Michael Antunes, got a role in the film. He played the sax player. But they asked us if we could write some songs which actors would lip-synch. RF: It's interesting, last year both you and Dan Hartman had similar experiences. Dan's hit, from "Streets of Fire," was lip-synched by a black group.

JC: Well, there are really two ways of looking at it. I mean, we're a bunch of guys from Providence and we're like a working class band in every sense of the word. Every week we go out and try to make a living playing music. Trying to make a week's pay playin' music. We

were offered an opportunity to become involved in motion pictures. And it was very exciting for us to go out to Hollywood and to work in the studio and to be involved in the movie. That was very exciting. The other side of it ... watching actors lip-synching music is a little tough to watch. But, we looked at it as an opportunity that would maybe lead to something else. In retrospect, the good certainly outweighed the bad. It was a very positive experience and it certainly turned into a big break for us. RF: There's been a lot of talk that the whole timing on that movie's release the first time couldn't have been much worse. It was coming out right about Labor Day. But then you benefited on the flip side because the cable TV exposure was coming during the summer when the people to whom the movie was really targeted had more time to enjoy it.

JC: Yeah, it was really something. The record was basically over. For quite a few months it was off the air. It was not selling. Then all of a sudden ... when they put it on cable TV, it created an interest in the film and in the music. That's kind of what started it. Again, through the efforts of Scotti Brothers and CBS, and through the efforts of people on the radio, it became a real big hit ... top ten single and album. RF: You've also had the experience of having a song accompanied by two separate videos. The original video was clips from the movie and then you guys got a chance to do the same track with a performance video.

JC: At the time of the release of the film, the film company had a clip made up from the film to promote the movie and the record and had that on MTV and various others. It was really a promotional vehicle for the film. The Scotti Brothers and CBS asked us if we would like to do a video ourselves, so we said, "Yeah, great." We made a video and what happened was cable TV now had two videos of the same song. We ended up with the number one video on MTV for quite a few weeks. So even that turned out to be a real good thing for us.

RF: Well, we've got you up to 1985 and an album I know you guys have been working on for a long time. I guess it was originally supposed to be released last fall. Tell us a little about the experience of making this album what you learned from the first soundtrack experience.

JC: Well, when we completed the music for "Eddie and the Cruisers," I guess it was a couple of years ago, almost three, the record and the movie came out and again, neither one of them were initially big hits. We went back into the studio and recorded another record for Scotti



Brothers called "Tough All Over." We finished it around May of last year; we were slated for a July release. That's when HBO and various other cable channels put "Eddie and the Cruisers" on cable TV and the soundtrack came back to life. (laughs) So, everyone decided we should wait with this new record so we're not competing with ourselves. So, it's a good thing we did wait since we ended up having a double platinum album from it. We got a

new record is that the soundtrack record was written for the movie. It's a collection of moments from a film and it's really someone else's idea of what an album should be. On "Tough All Over," it's our idea that the songs work together as a whole piece. The songs are more cohesive, lyrically. There are more real-life situations... pretty much the way that I like to write. A lot of short stories on the record. Of the earlier songs that I had written, a couple of them, like "Tender Years" ended up on the soundtrack record, and that was a song I wrote years ago. A lot of the



chance to go out on the road and meet a lot of people around the country that would come down to the shows. I got a chance to go down and meet radio people all around the country and bring things to a much more personal level. All the people I met on the road were very supportive and they're playing our record, and they're the ones that have to listen to it 10,000 times. (laughs) So it's really nice to be able to go in and say hello and say thank you. I'll tell you, a lot of the radio people I've met have become friends. They're people I have asked advice from and sometimes, if I have a new song, I'll call someone up and say, "Hey, what do you think of this?" It's like those people are as much a part of the business as anyone. There's a lot to be learned from talking to the people in radio.

RF: I have assumptions, tell me if they're correct. You're a mature rock 'n roller who's paid a lot of dues. You'd like a chance to express yourself. You seem to have a good vehicle to do it—kind of a look at blue collar America. What were you trying to accomplish with the album lyrically?

JC: Probably the major difference between the soundtrack record and the

songs are about looking back, and about reminiscing. What I wanted to write on the new record was probably more about how I feel about things right now, and about looking forward. So I wrote this song called "Voice of America's Sons." It was not a political statement. It is really my definition of what rock 'n roll is. I remember I said, "Well, let's bring it back down to basics, what does rock 'n roll mean to you? What is this stuff I've been doing all my life?" I thought about it and I thought rock 'n roll was always the way for a younger generation in American to say how they feel about some stuff, whether that be what makes you happy, what makes you sad, what you do for fun, what's romantic. So, I said, 'O.K., maybe that's what rock 'n roll is-the voice of our generation.' I said, 'Maybe, for the album I could have each song on the record be a different voice, a different character, a different situation.' When I took it one step further I said, 'Well, if it's gonna be a different voice in each song, maybe it could be a different American music style.' What we ended up with was being able to show a lot of our influences from the history of rock 'n roll. Anything from Detroit rock 'n roll (American Sons), to Country-Western on a song called, "Crystal Blue," gospel on one called "Dixie Land," New York-Philadelphia Soul on a song called "Small Town Girl," and a little bit of Motown influence on a song called "C.I.T.Y." What we ended up with was an album that shows a lot of our influences and also shows, hopefully, some real life situations. I just wanted to write some songs that will ring true to

RF: With the success you've had before, you have the opportunity to play larger venues. As songs the records from this album start to surface on radio, it's going to be harder for you to play the small clubs.

JC: We always looked at playin' a live show as an opportunity to spend a couple of hours with some people, say hello and hopefully become friends. And we always looked to each night as its own special event and reach out for the audience to become involved in the show. It's really kind of up to everybody in the room to make the night as special and as memorable as you can. When you look at playing live in that light, you find every situation comes to life, whether you're playing in a small club, a high school gym, a small theatre, or wherever you're playing. If you're reaching out for everything you can get out of that night and you're trying to make it as special as it can be. It seems like all the places you play turn into a lot of fun.

RF: You've paid your dues and I think it's time to collect a little. I'm sure there's going to be more money involved, but the greater satisfaction of knowing that people beyond the East Coast are exposed to you is going to prove to everyone's benefit. I think it's wonderful.

JC: We all think of success in terms of not how much money you make or how many times you get your name in the paper, but I think success is probably measured in how much of your life you get to do things that you like to do. And we got to spend thirteen years of our career doing exactly what we wanted to do ... playing music.

I think when you sell a few records and they play your songs on the radio, it opens up the doors and you have an opportunity to do more of the same things. So it works out real good and we're very, very appreciative of the fact that people like what we're doing and we're out here on the road trying to do our best to show our appreciation.

RF: I kind of had the feeling when we set up this interview you would be on the road. From what I've heard about you guys, staying at home is not as much fun as being on the road. I wish you well.

Voice Of Ame. ica's Sons/C-I-T-Y/Tough All Over/More Than Just One Or The Boys-JOHN CAFFERTY & BBB (Scotti Bros.) On record, actor MICHAEL PARE can't get away with lip synching, stealing JOHN CAFFERTY's role as frontman. Now JC & BBB are a band all on their own, pretty much out of the shadow of you-know-who. The music included is a variety of American styles that is, at times, economically political. As typified by "Voice" and "Tough All Over", this is tough urban east coast working class music that's been embraced all across the nation. Check the interview in this week's issue. Black Cars/The Other Man/Hurts To Be In Love-GINO VANNELLI (HME/PRA) BLACK CARS, the LP, is , as SLY STONE once moaned, a family affair. It's also an example of charged modern pop utilizing recent technology and age old emotional chutzpah. The playing is an interesting combination of the VANNELLI BROTHERS with the odd guitarist, bassist,

or drummer. Instrumentally concise, the material features keyboards that hang like ominous shadows. There is also space between the instruments allowing each song to express itself and breathe. The next big hit after "Black Cars" will probably be the killer ballad, "Hurts To Be In Love", a song played to death around here already. ANALYSIS

As expected, EURYTHMICS climb to the top of the stack, beating out the ALTERNATIVE chart by a week...GRAHAM PARKER: GP is one of a half dozen elite Album/Alternative artists not receiving the burn treatment via Top Forty. Graham's LP exploded last week and could challenge MICK

JACGER, who stands guarding the gates of the Top Five. ROBERT PLANT: PLANT's change of direction takes a 17 point jump. Once appreciated in the context of the entire LP, airplay will grow even more. HOWARD JONES: Lodged at nine, "HOJO" will be the subject of next week's GAVIN interview.

TIL TUESDAY: As predicted, TT enters the Top Ten. The video certainly helped gather steam. POWER STATION: With play concentrated on "Bang A Gong", plus a myriad of press, PS moves back UP. PRINCE: So far, still moving healthy, selling briskly. JOE WALSH: Look for "Rosewood Bitter" to overtake the title track in a couple of weeks. LONE JUSTICE: Here's one higher on our chart than anywhere else. Collecting rave reviews across the US, LJ leaves this week to play scattered European dates. JOHN CAFFERTY & BBB: Much much stronger than its 22-19 jump implies. Once the gap between 12 inch play and album conversions solidify, that's when the LP lets loose. A strong and sincere effort. SUPERTRAMP: Only two or three cuts deep until the title track is successfully dissected into chewable parts. CERTIFIED this week alongside another big LP, DIRE STRAITS. DS's three airplay-sized trax out-of-the-box is something MR. KNOPFLER hasn't achievedduring the first half of this decade. Enthusiasm is already brewing for their first tour headlining concert halls. PAUL YOUNG's ballad style seems to be reaping Album Radio airplay just the same. I think the format is well convinced of his talent. GINO VANNELLI: Lodged at 30, but underlined because of the jam-up from numbers 24 thru 30. Still quite strong now that the LP is released. PAYOLAS: Expect the PAYOLAS to take their time reaching the Top Fifteen. There's lots of potential for longevity...Strong debuts next week include NIGHT RANGER and MEN AT WORK...If you're a RICHARD THOMPSON fan, make sure you dig out the live 12 inch version of "When The Spell Is Broken"...stay well.........KZ.

Our CERTIFIED choice, THE BOOMTOWN RATS, are no strangers to Alternative airwaves. They've established a firm base and now have a built-in audience within this genre. Combine the core audience with a great song ("Rain") and you have a successful Alternative act.

While changes were occurring inside the Top Ten, things were turbulent at the lower end of the chart too. We rarely have more than a few new entrees, but five new albums debuted this week. The most significant of these are THE MINUTEMEN, with college stations lining up to play it.

Look for a very high debut next week from our MOST ADDED album, "Low-Life" by NEW ORDER.



P.D. NOTEBOOK by Eric Norberg



he last couple of columns updated the strengths and weaknesses of the Arbitron ratings. I should also note Arbitron's penchant for charging for anything additional, like advances of the ratings you've already purchased. Other rating services give you telephone advances at no extra charge. Not only does Arbitron charge, but there now seems to be more of a delay between when the advances are available and the book mailed.

The only thing keeping Arbitron's rates from getting even higher is Birch. The industry agrees--there must be competition in radio ratings. And as Trac 7, Burke, The Source, and Ram all fell by the wayside, the Birch survey was learning from the mistakes of others and was publishing a strong regional base, refining its methodology and published report, and gaining ad agency acceptance. It became "the competition for Arbitron". Since then, it has become much more than that--a truly viable alternative.

Birch and Arbitron share some weaknesses. Both are telephone-based (Birch also buys its designated sample from Metro Mail), and thus systematically exclude non-phone homes. Birch changes the final digit of all telephone numbers provided in a specific way, to further randomize the sample, and thus presumably reach unlisted phone homes in reasonable proportion to the population; yet Birch, like Arbitron, has difficulty persuading someone in an intentionally-unlisted home to reveal name and address, let alone personal data, to someone who called without knowing who they called. So the unlisted homes included in the sample, as in Arbitron, tend to be the ones who intend to be listed, but

who got their phone after the current phone book was printed.

Birch has in most other ways a superior method, however. Only one respondent is used per household (and a system is employed to obtain a demographic cross section in the course of phoning, rather than just interviewing whoever answers the phone); thus the number of persons and households is the same (compared to Arbitron, where the number of diaries in the sample is approximately twice the number of households), thus providing a far superior sample base, even if the number of people surveyed were the same, which it usually isn't. Birch usually has a larger sample.

Birch recruits local interviewers, but provides training as well as instructions, and systemically calls back a small fraction of the persons interviewed to check the accuracy of the work done by interviewers. Telephone interviews are kept short to improve response rate, and deal in detail only with listening the previous day. This is a proven, reliable way to survey radio. Birch has always tried to avoid weekly cume questions, apparently because of the decreased reliability of memory over a longer period of time (although Pulse, which developed cume this way, had very stable results), and the loss of cooperation of the interviewee when the phone call goes on too long. (It also would increase costs of the survey by reducing the number of calls per day per respondent.) However the industry has demanded weekly cumes, and Birch has found a formula that allows them to project their daily cume data into a reasonably reliable weekly cume figure, in their opinion. By providing this figure, Birch has considerably increased its acceptance at agency and station levels.

Birch found an effective position for itself with its monthly ratings approach in larger markets; Arbitron has attempted to respond with monthly ratings of its own, accomplished by lengthening the survey period while maintaining the same sample size. This has resulted in rather small monthly samples, and proportionately greater instability of the data; and that, combined with the additional cost, has kept Arbitron's monthly reports quite unpopular. Birch has established leadership in the monthly report. And is overcoming another problem caused by Arbitron; variations between the two surveys used to be thought of as weaknesses in Birch. Now, as the industry has become increasingly critical of Arbitron, these variations are increasingly being interpreted as being more accurate in Birch than in Arbitron, which statistically is much more likely to be the case.

Birch has built its base of station acceptance well, is making major gains in acceptance at the agency level, is keeping its prices quite low compared to Arbitron, and is now pioneering new types of data available in the book--such as cume duplication by demographic, and out-of-home listening broken out between automobile listening and other listening. At this point, Birch is not only a healthy company and a viable alternative in radio ratings, but it appears poised to give Arbitron a run for its money in a battle for leadership in radio ratings.

Next week--a third rating service comes up with an innovative approach. ■

Dire Straits "Brothers in Arms" (Warner Brothers) The title of the album might trick us into thinking this is WE ARE THE WORLD, Part II. noooo!! Mark Knopfler sometimes sends us up the river with no paddle. Thus the title of his band. He takes calculated shots, laced in irony and cleverly concealed in ditty form so as to be digested by intellectually numb programmers and their equally witless listenership. Dire Straits demands attention. The titilator is Knopfler's reality check, MONEY FOR NOTHING. It's a blistering attack on the false idols created by video-mania, this year's industrial disease. The single, WALK OF LIFE, with its Zydeco feel, is faithful to a form from which rock 'n' roll was born and tells the tale of another sultan of swing. The remainder of the tracks, though provoking, none the less cover familiar territory designed to covet previously earned endearment.

Gino Vannelli "Black Cars" (HME/PRA)

Amazing how much quality material an artist like Gino can accumulate in a four year lay off. His last LP, for Arista was in 1981 and was a mere shadow of his mid 70's successes, I JUST WANNA STOP and LIVING INSIDE MYSELF. Rather than risk drifting into Englebert Humperdinck territory, resplendent in gold chairs under silk shirts open to the belt line, Gino pulled out to re-group. "Black Cars" is sleek, but not showy. It's economical, but not cheap. The lead track, BLACK CARS, is off to a fast start with Top 40 and Album Radio and plenty more mileage will come from HURTS TO BE IN LOVE, a classic ballad complete with plush interior design and sensitive cruise control. Other tracks of merit include: JUST A MOTION AWAY, HOW MUCH and THE OTHER MAN.
