





Poison, Tesla Fuel Metalmania

The metalmania onslaught continues this week with the two latest derby winners: Enigma/Capitol's Poison and Geffen's Tesla.

That's right, the headbangers of America have once again united and made a concerted drive to their friendly neighborhood record store. And they're buying. Boy are they buying! This week Tesla rockets to #25 on the *Hits* Top Fifty Album chart, while Poison climbs to #38.

Account reports on Tesla are impressive. This week the album, "Mechanical Resonance" hits at #2 RTI One Stop; #2 Vinyl Vendors; #6 Sound Video; #8 Sea Port; #10 Harmony House, and on and on.

"Tesla is blowing out the door," said Vicki Olivera of Sea Port. "We've gone through 150 LPs and 800 cassettes in a three week period. Everybody's got to have it."

"It's the fastest selling record out of the gate so far in '87," said Kim Simmons of House Of Guitars. "It's definitely headed to the top," said Mike Clark of CML One Stop. "It's the first success story of 1987."

As for Poison, account reports list "Look What The Cat Dragged In" at #4 Sound Warehouse; #8 Camelot; #8 Central South; #9 Vinyl Vendors; #16 CML; and the list goes on.

"After having an extremely successful in-store with Poison on Friday the 13th, and after seeing the cross section of turnout, I am certain that this should not be poisonous to any programmer," said CML's Clark.

"I could sum it up in three letters — MTV," said National Record Mart's Doug Smith. "Poison will be in the Top Ten next week for sure and Tesla is right on its heels."

So chalk up another two for the power of MTV, and you can be sure that the metal onslaught will continue.

C o v e We're Waiting For U2

It's kind of hard to call U2's "The Joshua Tree" Lp, shipping March 9, the band's "breakthrough" album. Take into account that the band's last three studio albums sold in excess of one and a half million units each, and the group's EP, "Wide Awake In America," sold an amazing 600,000 units. Add to that the hysteria created whenever the band announces any tour dates in any city, and it would be pretty easy to give U2 the always popular tag of "superstar.

Still, with the release of the album, and the single "With Or Without You" (March 2), Island is hoping to break U2

wide open. We're talking multi-format, mass appeal action.

"The first run we really had with a single was with 'Pride In The Name Of Love," said Island's head of Promotion Bob Catania. "In retrospect, that single sort of predated the mass appeal impact this band really had."

Catania noted that "Pride" had pretty well run its course at Top 40 by the time the band began touring, and before all the notoriety of Live-Aid and Amnesty International. "What happened was that some of the Top 40s that didn't play the record took a look at their market and suddenly saw the

band selling out five nights and creating hysteria," said the Promotion exec. "I think we had a lot more airplay as a recurrent after the fact. Later, came Live-Aid and Amnesty International and the buzz around the band just continued to grow.

"At this point, I think the Top 40 guys feel it's a band they want to deal with if the music's right," Catania continued. "My ears tell me this is a mass appeal hit."

"It's a great album," said Island President Lou Maglia. "At this point in their career, the band has a lot of expectations to meet, and I think this record is all the things some-



body could expect from U2."

According to the company President, a special manufacarrangement has turing enabled Island to release 300,000 Compact Discs around the time of the vinyl and cassette release dates. And, as usual expect massive consumer press coverage including a Rolling Stone cover story on March 19.

Timmer demonstrated a five inch gold CD Video Single on a prototype Philips/Magnavox "Combi Player." That player accomodates the new CD Video Single as well as the existing audio-only Compact Disc and LaserVision discs.

"The beauty of CD Video is that it is a standardized system that is both backward compatible - able to play existing CD and LaserVision software - and forward upgradable. No optical discs playable on the CD Video system will ever be obsolete," Timmer stated.

The expected consumer launch date for both the hardware and the software is Fall 1987.

Goldman Blasts Reporting System

RCA/Ariola President Elliot Goldman took some serious swipes at the existing, traditional information reporting system during his keynote address at last week's NARM convention in Miami.

Goldman told the merchandising confab of his uneasiness with "your surprising willingness to accept a store reporting and charting system which not only doesn't reflect your own activity, but encourages attempts to distort and manipulate the existing reporting system."

Goldman's remarks were not directed exclusively to retail though.

"Are we manufacturers so uncertain about our companies' abilities to choose the right artists and to record comercially successful product that we feel the only way to have commercial success is to hype

our product by means that distort the reporting system at radio and retail?" Goldman queried.

The company President then turned his attention to the retail community and asked, "Are you merchandisers so unsure of your ability to read or influence your customers with progressive forms of marketing that you are willing to take information from whatever source it comes, with no sense of the correctness of that information?"

To both questions, Goldman answered with a resounding, "I think not."

In a direct attack at the longstanding practices of the traditional trade publications, (continued on page 10)

The annual NARM Best Seller Awards were handed out in Miami last week. Each winner represents the NARM determined best seller in a given category. And the winners are:

Goldman inquired: "Are our trade publications so dependent on the income generated from reporting sytems that are easily influenced by the powerful and wealthy companies of our industry that they would not be willing to forego that income for a verifiably trustworthy sales reporting sytem?" Again the answer was, "I think not."

Goldman also brought the artist into the picture. "Talented people performing at superior levels that truly induce the consumer to buy their product should see their triumphs reflected in reporting systems that are accurate, reliable and accepted. Anything else cheapens us all."

Goldman blasted the current industry practice of rushing to gain as many station adds as possible in the quickest amount of time on any given record..... "Allowing a building time that is reflective of the audience's listening desire is not only a healthier situation for all concerned, but is exactly what takes the 'crapshoot' aspect out of our business," he stated. He further condemned what he termed the "175-stations-in-twoweeks-or-bust attitude" that he claimed was the haven of "the uninitiated, uninformed and irresponsible elements of our business."

According to the industry veteran, "The solution is obvious and simple..... It requires a commitment from manufacturers, merchandisers, trade publications and the media to establish accurate and verfiable reporting systems to a central and non-corruptible source, with appropriate penalties for those who choose to attempt to distort that system."

Goldman called for NARM, the RIAA, "the involved trade publications," and the NAB, "to begin the process of setting the timetables and goals to which we must commit ourselves."



Grandmaster Cassingle Fear And Loathing In Miami



NEAR TRUTHS

Just a few more notes on NARM '87: At the WEA product presentation, out strolled Elektra Marketing whiz Mike Bone in the loudest pair of Bermuda shorts, a clashing Hawaiian shirt, and of course a pair of shades. 





DIALOGUE



His training started at Fenway Standard Distributors in Pittsburgh in 1962 and his career proceeded with key promotion and management positions through the years in which he established himself as one of the leading executives in the industry.

One of Al Teller's first moves upon his return to CBS Records was to bring along Ray Anderson as VP, Promotion for Columbia Records. After a few years and a remarkable track record of breaking new acts and continuing the careers of the many superstars on the Columbia roster, Anderson was promoted in February of 1986 to the position of Senior VP of Marketing for Epic/Portrait and the Associated Labels.

In this conversation, Anderson talks about his transition, the label's accomplishments since his promotion (including multiple Grammy nominations and new artist development), and takes a look forward to the excitement of 1987. It's the year of the new Michael Jackson project, and Anderson feels he and his staff are ready for the challenge. In the past year, Epic has had a great run with developing new acts. To what do you attribute this success?

A complete marketing picture has come together including the elements of great talent, strong management and the consciousness of a record company with a long-term commitment to success. With everyone from developing acts like the Fabulous Thunderbirds. Miami Sound Machine, Don Johnson, and now Europe to artists such as a Luther Vandross, who we have taken to new levels of market penetration, we have made a commitment to much more than promoting hit singles. When we released these records, we believed very strongly that we would succeed. But the road to success needed to focus on marketing, promoting, advertising, touring and video strategies for particular artists with each having their own identity.

Let's talk about Europe, who seem to have burst upon the scene from nowhere in January.

A This is a pet project to me. Europe was signed domestically by Lenny Petze for Epic, but it started to happen first in their home country, Sweden and then in Germany. We realized that these are five young kids who not only have the looks, but play and sing their own material very well. We felt that video was the key to exposing and really breaking this band. We released the album and first video in the summer and began to develop some interest along with video play and requests from some of the smaller cable outfits. We

continued to work the project, increase rotations, pick up album play in selected pockets. Our staff in the field did an excellent job staying with the album, setting up promotions where there was interest and spreading our faith and belief. Then, MTV got involved, sales increased over the holidays, and we felt we were ready for the single and Top 40 radio. The key was, when we approached Top 40, we had laid a legitimate base for the band and the project was poised to take off. The rest, as they say, is history, with both the single and album surging up the charts and a new power force established in the industry.

Considering the success that video afforded Europe, what is Epic's overall position on video?

A I would say that selectivity is the overall position. With Europe, we felt we had all of the pieces. A hit song, a hit act and a hit video to expose it. We'll test most developing bands, go out and get a feel from radio, and our people. If we see a record starting to show positive signs in the way of sales, a re-order pattern developing and a station getting requests, then we know we're on to something. Then we start talking video. Don't forget, our budget on just accepting or putting an album into production is anywhere from \$125-200,000. When you throw in an average cost of another \$75,000 for a good video, it starts to add up. On the other hand, with an established act or one that has been built to the 3-500,000 sales level, we will more or

less go out of the box with a video. We feel that it's a good investment.

Could you talk a bit about the label's game-plan for Luther Vandross?

The key strategy for us has been to establish Luther as a major force in the pop marketplace. We've taken our advertising that way, we've taken our marketing that way, and we've taken our videos that way. We placed him on "Ruthless People" the soundtrack in the company of Bruce Springsteen, Mick Jagger, Billy Joel and other pop stars. Luther's single, "Give Me the Reason," is up for a Grammy nomination this year. And now, through a concerted effort, we have our breakthrough pop hit. Luther's prior four albums have all gone platinum plus, but none of them ever really saturated the pop market until "Stop To Love" broke. We have always felt that Luther is a mass market crossover act that should dominate Top 40 radio. With this LP, we took the approach to attack Top 40 radio from the get-go. We delivered the single simultaneously to both pop and black stations and found immediate acceptance on both levels.

Where do you go next? Luther has been very cooperative; not only has he done every major press interview and key television show,

view and key television show, but he has not forgotten his base audience at black radio. The marketing and promotional thrust will include both black and pop audience potential to insure his long-term growth.



What does one do to market Michael Jackson?

A First of all, let me say that the music is absolutely unbelievable. Michael is a perfectionist, and he is conscious of the demands on him to please. His manager Frank DiLeo and CBS Records are looking to make history again with Michael. We have to go out with that attitude, but we also know that it was a phenomenon to sell 30 million units. All systems are go now. Martin Scorsese has shot the first video. We have some incredible artwork done and in house to make a statement with point-of-purchase material. And there will be a lot more surprises to come that will take us through '87 and 1988 with this album. I really can't say anything more.

A How is Epic structured now? How is it different from Columbia

"Just talking to the people in stores is a great start to grasping the bigger picture."

A We have a structure similar to Columbia in that the head of A&R, Don Grierson and a head of marketing (myself), both report to Al Teller, President of the Records Group. Below me, we have Walter Winnick, our VP of Promotion. Walter and his staff have done great work with our roster of new artists in the past year, as has Dan Beck, who heads our marketing staff. Both go hand in hand. Both labels have created a new position in VP of Sales. Jim Camparo, who comes to us from the field, assumes this position. The main difference is our responsibility for marketing the CBS Associated Labels, which Tony Martell runs and runs well. Tony Martell has been a big part of our success this past year, starting the year with the Rocky IV soundtrack and continuing with Survivor, the Thunderbirds and now Joan Jett. The CBS Associated Labels give a consistent flow of hit product.

I'm sure in your position at CBS that free time is not one of your most obvious assets, but when you do have some time..... what's Ray Anderson like?

A On a personal level, I find myself relaxing and living comfortably with my wife. I'm not a recluse; we like taking that free time and spending it with each other. I enjoy Broadway shows, swimming and taking long walks. We can go down Madison Avenue and look on both sides of the street and every window is like two record companies fighting each other for positioning on the charts. They're all going after the attention of each passerby with the finest in-store marketing you'll ever see. I've been fighting the record battles for 25 years, and have really learned to relax and enjoy my spare time at a slower pace. But maintaining that balance is my key.

Finally, if someone asked you to suggest a good proving and training grounds for people in the business, what would you say?

A I started at a record distributor that encompassed all the elements-distribution of product (marketing & promotion), sales (the one-stop) and recording (the Vogues)----under one roof. I was very fortunate to work in all aspects of the music business. Being on the ground floor seeing what the customers are buying seeing the variance in age groups. Just talking to the people in stores is a great start to grasping the bigger picture. I just talked to everybody and asked questions. From there, you get a lot of ideas as well as ground level promotion and merchandising concepts. You begin to recognize public attention, capitalize on these ideas and develop creative marketing concepts which will enhance consumer demand. Bottom line, my son is working at Tower Records in El Toro, CA. I think that's as good a place to start as any.







If we are to believe our less-than-expertpanel, Steve Winwood looks like the big winner, with Sager/Bacharach, Cyndi Lauper, Bruce Hornsby and Peter Cetera also showing strength in their respective categories. And where else do you get this kind of poop 'cept for *Hits*, your #1 source for the wit and witticisms of Donny Osmond. See you soon, when Mister Rogers, John Davidson, Mariette Hartley and Josephine the Plumber give *Hits their* 1987 Oscar picks.



The following rockers *will not* be collecting an Oscar this year: Madonna, Prince, David Bowie, Sting, Vanity, Gene Simmons, David Byrne, Ozzy Osbourne, Tom Waits, John Lurie, Wendy O. Williams or Ray Davies. Even though each one appeared in a major motion picture last year. Still, the Academy Awards, once strictly offlimits to rock 'n' rollers, has softened its stance in recent years, allowing the likes of Prince and Bette Midler to sneak in, albeit through the back door.

This year's list of nominees has a strong musical bias, with veteran jazz saxophonist Dexter Gordon leading the way, earning a Best Actor nod for his debut as an expatriate musician living in Paris in Bernard Tavernier's elegiac 'Round Midnight. With movies like Mona Lisa, Blue Velvet, Stand By Me and Peggy Sue Got Married taking their names from popular song titles, motion pictures borrowed heavily from pop iconology to create their atmospheres. Those four films accounted for a Best Actor candidate (Bob Hoskins), a Best Director nod (David Lynch), a nomination for Best Screenplay Adaptation (Stand) and one for Best Actress (Kathleen Turner). Martin Scorsese's The Color Of Money, with its rock and blues-suffused soundtrack, received nods for Best Actor (Paul Newman), Screenplay and Art Direction. On the other hand, critically-acclaimed musicoriented flicks which didn't receive any nods include Alex Cox's Sid & Nancy, David Byrne's True Stories and Julien

Temple's Absolute Beginners.

The Academy membership is notorious for its conservative leanings over the years. In the past, they've systematically ignored nominating rock songs in any of the musical categories, though things have gotten much better recently. This year, the original song category included three Top 40 hits in Peter Cetera's "The Glory Of Love" (Karate Kid, Part II), Linda Ronstadt and James Ingram's "Somewhere Out There" (An American Tail) and Berlin's "Take My Breath Away" (Top Gun), as well as one that probably should be, Levi Stubbs' great "Mean Green Mother From Outer Space" (Little Shop Of Horrors). The other choice is a throwback, Henri Mancini's "Life In A Looking Glass," from the little-seen Blake Edwards comedy, That's Life. The main trouble with this category is the voters rarely choose a song from a dud movie, which may well explain the absence of Madonna's "Live To Tell" from husband Sean's flop At Close Range.

The big problem with the Oscar's two major musical categories is how they eliminate the most important usage of music in films today..... a soundtrack composed of non-original material, the kind you hear in almost every movie from *Top Gun* to *Stand By Me* to *Hannah and Her Sisters*. This explains why a brilliant score like *Platoon*'s mixture of Georges Delerue's doleful classicism and '60s pop psychedelia or Jonathan Demme's exotic third world backdrop to *Something Wild* could go completely ignored. Their soundtracks were not specifi-

cally composed for the film, but used preexisting songs. This is why you won't find Stand By Me, Pretty In Pink, Ferris Bueller's Day Off or The Color Of Money nominated in the Best Original Score category where veteran composers like James Horner (Aliens), Leonard Rosenman (Star Trek IV), Ennio Morricone (The Mission) and Jerry Goldsmith (Hoosiers) hold forth with newcomer Herbie Hancock for 'Round Midnight (and didn't Herbie merely adapt old tunes?). The Academy should adopt a new award immediately for a soundtrack based on music from another medium; it's the only way to reward those movies like Platoon or Something Wild.





It's English progressive rock with assistance from Nikki's husband Chris Squire and producer Trevor Horn in the mixing stages RHINO is at it again, signing ex-Byrd Gene Clark and ex-Textone Carla Olsen to record an album together with Michael Huey producing Cruzados have finished up their second LP for ARISTA which should be coming out anytime now and guess who's back with an album full of hot, buttered soul ? Isaac Hayes returns with a new album on EPIC called "U-Turn".....ADD COMEBACKS: Former Kiss guitarist Vinnie Vincent is making some noise with his latest project on CHRYSALIS entitled "Vinnie Vincent Invasion" and the band has been ruffling some feathers on their Midwest tour, where parents have not been whole-heartedly in favor of rock and roll in general, and Mr. Vincent in particular The Cure has also had to cave in to pressure from supposed civil rights groups reacting to their ten year old song "Killing An Arab", the misinterpretation stemming from jingoist, Yankee dj's fueling the current anti-Arab sentiment in this country.
