Everyone's Feeling Platooned

Now that Director Oliver Stone's had his night in Hollywood with *Platoon* taking top honors in Tinsel Town's annual network extravaganza, is it possible that that crazy little guy named Oscar could actually sell some records? With three different Promotion departments pushing three separate singles, we think it's a good bet.

The album "Platoon" is on Atlantic, and according to preliminary post-Oscar reports, starting to pick up steam. Atlantic has also released Percy Sledge's "When A Man Loves A Woman" which has been perched high atop the charts in the U.K.

When you add the impact of Motown's release of Smokey Robinson's "Tracks Of My Tears," as well as Jefferson Airplane's "White Rabbit" on RCA and you've got three different Promotion staffs pushing three different singles from one album. According to executives at Atlantic, all three labels have been working closely together on the project.

"Platoon" also marks a vic-

tory for Executive Producer Bud Carr who has already begun work on Oliver Stone's next film about a different kind of jungle, *Wall Street*.

Fagot To Capitol

After much speculation, John Fagot, who rose from Regional Promo Whiz to something bordering National Promo deity, will be assuming the position of Vice President of



Promotion for Capitol Records. He vacates the position of Vice President of Promotion for Columbia Records.

Fagot is a respected (we're talking some serious respect, folks) Promotion exec who rose

through the ranks of CBS to assume the Promotion Vice Presidency. Fagot will relocate to Los Angeles and Capitol's Hollywood headquarters and if you know of a hot piece of property not too far from the Vine Street tower, give him a buzz.

Though no official announcement was made by the label, Fagot's appointment ends weeks of interviews and meetings between Capitol topper Joe Smith and various members of the Promotion community. Though he was always considered the frontrunner, Fagot's final decision to make the move to Capitol was uncertain until just a few minutes before presstime. It remains uncertain whether Joe Smith's Laker tickets were the deciding factor in the decision.

Capitol's current hot streak which includes Top Ten breakthroughs for Poison and Crowded House should be bolstered by the addition of Fagot.

Neither Fagot nor Capitol would comment on the deal until final details had been worked out and a contract signed.

Expect an official announcement soon.



Benesch Takes Columbia Post

Flash (we're talking major FLASH) — at presstime it was learned that Mark Benesch has been officially appointed Vice President of Promotion for Columbia Records.

Benesch is another in the line of hot Promotion executives who have risen through the ranks of CBS. He is the hand picked choice of CBS President Al Teller and Senior Vice President Marketing Bob Sherwood. Benesch has served in various capacities at the label, most recently as Director of National Singles Promotion.

Benesch has been closely allied with the recent string of success stories at the label including the Beastie Boys and Bangles projects and should have no trouble maintaining the current momentum on key records such as the Psychedelic Furs, Lisa Lisa and Eddie Money.

Official statements from the label and Benesch himself are expected next week as well as formal announcements of other internal promotion restructuring (read promotions from within).

According to Mascolo, "Since he joined us, Butch has been a tremendous asset to the company. He has accomplished an incredible amount in the Southeast and Southwest as a Regional Promotion Director, and we're very excited about his contributions in the future."

Waugh, who resided in Atlanta, will relocate to New York with his wife Belinda and his two children.

Speaking of, the Jagger-Beck pairing is just another example of an interesting trend which has included such new teams as Cyndi Lauper and Rick Derringer, David Bowie and Peter Frampton and the latest May-September twosome, young ex-Duranie Andy Taylor and new management stablemate Rod Stewart, who have formed a group and are currently recording.

B.A.D. TO THE BONE: I was pretty much impressed with the improvement shown by **Mick Jones** and **Big Audio Dynamite** at their Roxy shows last week, but even they couldn't compete with a B.A.D. groupie in a tight rubber dress who kept (ahem) blocking my view. Didn't matter, though. I contented myself with watching the vintage clips from **Scorsese** films, "Zabriskie Point" and "Ten Commandments" which provided an ironic counterpoint to the music.

Hits Salutes The MCA Pop Promotion Team

MCA Records

The past few years have seen some remarkable changes for the Pop Promotion staff at MCA. Irving Azoff's team of Senior VP Talent Acquisition and A&R/President Black Music Division, Jheryl Busby; Executive Vice President Promotion and Marketing, Richard Palmese; and Senior Vice President Promotion Steve Meyer have made MCA's roster a major Top 40 force. Finding new talent, devising new strategies and hiring the best there is, has resulted in a continuing stream of new hits, and has made the MCA Pop Promotion team one of the most respected in the business. Here are some examples, both inside and out of the company, of industry respect.

"What I have today is one of the hardest working Promotion teams I've ever worked with," said MCA's Richard Palmese. "You don't want people who are just going to make phone calls to radio stations, you want people who are visible and will visit the stations."

Palmese and MCA are currently riding a wave of four Top 10 singles: The Ronstadt/Ingram duet, Ready For The World, the Jets and Boston. Now, there's a bumper crop of potential Top Tens following right behind: Jody Watley, Breakfast Club, Night Ranger, Kim Wilde, Patti La-Belle (off the *Miami Vice II* soundtrack) and the new Boston single, "Can't Cha' Say."

Things are looking good at MCA.

"I really credit Steve (Meyer), Bill (Ben-



nett), Billy (Brill), and Frank (Turner) for understanding what radio wants," said Palmese. "They are able to motivate our people in an intelligent and proper way so they have the respect of radio, and I really think they do." "They are very much involved in our creative process," said I.R.S. President Jay Boberg of the working relationship between the MCA Promotion team and his MCA Distributed label. "The relationship is such that they use us as a tool to get records started as well as being architects to bring them all the way home."

Boberg cited such recent examples as Timbuk 3 and the new Concrete Blond project as good examples of the I.R.S./MCA machinery in motion. "MCA was behind us on the Concrete Blond project from day one," said Boberg. "Together, we've made a great effort at the Album Rock level and we're proceeding full steam ahead."

I.R.S. Promotion executives Barry Lyons and Mel Delatte take part in MCA's weekly Promotion meetings and Boberg couldn't be happier with the way the relationship has worked out. "It's been quality time at MCA," he remarked. "Everyone works really well together."

Though Quantum Music has yet to release a record through its agreement with MCA, anticipation is running high for the future. "I've worked with several members of the MCA staff in the past — Don George, Pat Martine, Sharon White and Frank Turner," remarked Quantum Music's Executive Vice President/General Manager Dick Williams. "In addition, Steve (Meyer) and I worked at Capitol for a number of years and I've always admired his enthusiasm and his attitude in getting product out. We are looking forward to breaking a lot of new artists through our partnership with MCA."

Williams also expressed his respect for R&B Promotion Vice President Emie Singleton and his staff, which has made incredible gains on the Black Contemporary and Urban formats, and has laid the groundwork for many of MCA's Pop hits. "The R&B department is equally impressive," said Williams. "Emie Singleton and his staff have an amazing track record for breaking new artists."

One of the artists that has broken wide

open on the Black Contemporary level is Jody Watley. Her single, "Looking For A New Love," is being worked hard at Top 40 by the Pop Promotion staff. The result: The single is going through the roof. "The thing about MCA that has been so enjoyable is the level of enthusiasm and excitement about the project," said Bennett Freed, Jody Watley's manager. "Richard and Steve have shown what the Promotion staff can do. The results have been sensational."

Freed noted that it was the draw of MCA's attitude and enthusiasm that initially brought the former member of Shalamar to the label. "It really came down to commitment from the record company," Freed remarked. "The MCA Promotion team has shown incredible commitment. You give them the ball — they love to play with it."

"We've always liked and respected the MCA Promotion staff," said Larry Fitzgerald and Mark Hartley, who manage Glenn Frey (among others). "We've always worked well with them in the past. But now that Glenn has a new album coming out, we seem to like and respect them even more."

Equally high spirited is Jeff Dorenfeld, manager of Boston. "What can you say about a Promotion staff that is able to get two Top Ten hits and a #1 album," said Dorenfeld, who anticipates a third Top Ten hit shortly with "Can't Cha' Say." "I've never seen a more musician oriented company."

Dorenfeld explained that MCA never



pressured the band for its first record in eight years, a fact that surprised the manager. "They just asked us how it was going and when we did bring it in, they did the job. They knew how to do it. They took the product, got it out there and it was like Boston never disappeared."

Steve Meyer is looking forward to the future.

In this case, the future means the summer of 1987, which could very well find MCA where it was in the winter of 1987 — firmly ensconced in the Top Ten.

After scoring Top Ten hits with Linda Ronstadt, Ready For The World, the Jets, and Boston (twice), the company is poised for another go at it with a new batch of hit singles. This time its Breakfast Club, Jody Watley, Night Ranger, Tom Petty, Patti La-Belle and the soundtrack to *Beverly Hills Cop II* which looks to be chock full of hits. The groundwork is being laid now, and by summertime, it appears a bumper crop of hits will be ready to harvest.


"Anytime you come off a streak like we've had, and you've got good records like the ones in this next batch, then the staff has reason to be happy," said the Promotion VP.

That happiness Meyer refers to has spread through the Promotion staff from coast to coast and there's really no sign of a letdown. "Without sounding cliche, this really is like a family," said Meyer. "The feeling is extremely positive and everyone really enjoys the music they work. It's a strong working unit."

Steve began in sales before moving to promotion at Capitol Records in 1970, when they began a promotion/marketing department to work "underground" radio. He did regional promotion for them in New York and Florida before coming to Los Angeles in 1976 as their National Promotion person. In 1983 he came to MCA to take his current job. Steve believes he has an inherent love of music, and feels that promotion is the best way to get other people involved with music. The highlight of his career, he says, has been joining MCA in his current position because of the opportunity to work with Irving Azoff, Richard Palmese and Myron Roth, as well as with the professionals on his team like Frank Turner and Billy Brill. When he isn't working records, he spends his free time with his 10-year-old son, listening to music and watching films.



Following that, Billy went to PolyGram Records, after sending Arnie Geller a sweatshirt reading "Polydor Needs Billy Brill." From there he moved to Ariola Records, before shifting to Mercury in Chicago. Billy then spent two years on television, as the music host for P.M. Magazine before coming to MCA six years ago. His most satisfying projects so far have been the School Spirit promotions with The Jets, where high school students submitted millions of postcards asking The Jets to perform a free concert at their schools. Billy believes that it's important to have direct contact with radio, and to that end doesn't have a secretary, gives out his home phone number (213-457-2569) and spends alternate weeks on the road, going to radio stations.

Frank Turner


Director National Promotion



National Dance Music Director Local New York Promotion Manager






Nan Fisher






Wayne McManners










Mike "Friar" Rose

After working for a number of one-stops he started in promotion at Capitol and then moved to Elektra, and spent three years at Epic. From there he went to ABC/Dunhill and finally settled at MCA. He says one of the best parts of his job is "getting new projects started, and seeing records happen." Fred feels that his most successful and fun promotion was one he did for "Miami Vice I" in conjunction with KUBB and Z100. Winners received tshirts and were flown to the set of Miami Vice, where the two stations did several days of live remotes. In addition, there was a party for 700 winners from each station. When not working, Fred spends his time with his wife and three-year-old son.




TOP FIFTY ALBUMS


