



Ienner joined Arista in 1983 as Vice President of Promotion, most recently holding the title of Senior Vice President of Promotion and Marketing. In his new post, he will have supervisory responsibility for Promotion, Sales, Artist Development, Publicity, Production and Creative Services.

WCI Listens To The Music

The recorded music division of Warner Communications Inc. (WCI) posted the highest quarterly earnings in its history, according to a first quarter earnings report for the giant conglomerate.

The company's recorded music and music publishing

units reported operating income of \$70.5 million, an increase of 50% over the \$47 million earned in the first quarter of 1987.

The WCI Music Group includes the WB family of labels, Atlantic, Elektra, WEA Corp., and Warner/Chappell Music. Following months of rumors, Al Teller has resigned his post as President of CBS Records Inc. No official statement about his successor had been made at presstime.

Teller spent the last sevenand-a-half years at CBS, most recently holding the post of President, CBS Records Division.

CBS released a statement last Tuesday morning that quoted CBS Records Inc. President and Chief Executive Officer Walter Yetnikoff saying, "While Al Teller ran CBS Records Division, they achieved the highest sales and profits in the company's history. His contribution was enormous and he will be sorely missed."

According to the release, Teller termed his tenure at CBS as "gratifying," noting that he is "looking forward to exploring new challenges and opportunities which have been made available."

While Teller's resignation leaves an obvious vacuum at the Records Division, insiders are saying a successor has already been chosen. And while CBS would not confirm or deny any speculation on the division's new President, insiders say an official announcement could be made as early as this week.

This story has just begun, so stay tuned folks, there's lot's more action on the way.



orking in a town and an industry famous for their "what have you done for me lately?" mentality, John Burns has fashioned a remarkable streak of longevity. His tenure at MCA goes back 15 years, beginning as a St. Louis sales rep in 1973. Since then, he has moved steadily up the corporate ladder—first, as midwest regional sales manager, then, to Los Angeles in 1979 as director of national sales. Burns was boosted to Vice President of Branch Distribution in 1980, Senior VP of MCA Distribution in 1983, then finally, Executive Vice President of Distribution and Manufacturing, his present title, in 1986.

While Burns will readily admit that MCA is not the biggest distribution operation in the business, he asserts "we want to have the best batting average." The company's last four years have all brought record sales plateaus, and after chatting with the man in charge, it is easy to see why.

Burns occupies an expansive corner office in MCA's Universal City suites, and it was here that the talented industry vet allowed himself a brief break to discuss his company's distribution system and some of the more pressing issues involving the record retail community-not including his stint at the recent NARM convention braving the chilly waters of Hits' "Dunk Your Distributor" booth.

How did MCA's distribution arm help make Tiffany a multi-platinum, number one record?


Larry Solters came to us with the proposed mall tour for her. We, in turn, tied in with the record retailers in these malls. Tiffany was an unknown act, but because of our relationship with these various accounts, we were able to get product into the stores. She did her performance, then

the first store, so we made sure there were more records in the next store, and so on as the mall tour developed. We had a leg up with retailers around the country. Then, once radio play developed, it was a pretty easy step to take it from this low, low level up to here. Then, one hit single after another, before you know it, you have a number one record. It was really a grass-roots kind of thing; we worked very closely on some-

thing that had never been done before. Because of our relationships with the mall retailers, we were able to put this thing together. It ended up working real well, and we had a great story to tell as the record started getting on the radio, because it had sold without airplay, just because of her performing in the malls. There was something here beyond the ordinary. It wasn't just a new artist with a record on the radio.

We probably have the closest relationship with our record label and with our distributed labels than any other company in the industry. Even our outside labels are, so to speak, part of the family. We work very closely with MCA Records in developing these plans, rather than just having distribution implement the label's strategy. We're involved in the organizational stage, and that's unique compared to most other companies. situation. We like to have our artists grow as we've grown, because every year for the last four years, we've exceeded our best year ever.

What's MCA's view on three-tier CD pricing?

We're announcing a program on all our frontline CD's. Beginning with our May releases and excluding major artists, everything will be at a lower frontline price. In addiamount of sales on CD. If you have tremendous album and cassette sales, you're seeing the same thing on CD. The public is willing to spend more on CD's from major artists. That's not to say the major artist price on the Compact Disc isn't going to come down. What I think is going to happen is that the new frontline CD price will go even lower, as will the midlines and the budgets.

We've tried very hard to

CD package— because we do recognize the problems of theft— but also a package that's less expensive so we can pass our savings on to the customer. I think this is the third stage in the evolution of lower CD prices, and I believe it will continue. I still feel you're going to have two levels of CD prices, just like you have \$9.98 and \$8.98 albums. I don't know if you'll ever get to the point where you have a \$9.98 album, cassette and CD,

So you feel that this closeknit atmosphere is one of your strongest assets?


Our motto around here is "maybe we're not the biggest, but we'd like to have the best batting average." The last few years, in breaking new acts, we've had a very good batting average, and that's the key to it. We've been bringing back older acts who haven't been at the higher level for a while, like Elton John or Gladys Knight and the Pips, and combining that with breaking new acts at pop. We've also been extremely successful with black and country product.

We just put on a new group of people to handle our classical and alternative lines, which includes New Age and some of our jazz. We've put eleven people in the field to concentrate on the sales of these particular items so that we don't miss anything. It's a high-maintenance line, but also a very profitable one, and we feel that by putting these people out in the field, we can create a tremendous amount of sales. We're very hopeful that Narada and our Masters series can develop into a breakout

tion, in the month of April, we'll introduce our second midline, which is more like a premium midline, with some of our best catalog titles, like Elton John's "Greatest Hits," Steely Dan's "Aja," "Who's Next," "Pronounced Leh-nerd Skin-erd." We feel that the software price has to go down. It's been far behind the drop in hardware pricing. All the market research we saw, especially in black and country product and new and developing artists, indicates that there's definitely a reluctance to purchase the equipment because of the price of the software. So, all our releases, beginning in May and excluding major artists, will have a new lower frontline price. We'll continue adding to our budget Compact Disc/Compact Price line as well as feeding our premium midline with product. In general, our Compact Disc prices will be lower.

Do you still feel top-line artist CD's should cost more than vinyl or tape?

At the current time, we have not seen, with the major artists and the hit product, a low



find cost-saving measures, because we do recognize what's happening. The Compact Disc is wonderful for all record companies, but until you get your player penetration to grow, you're not going to get your business to grow. The first stage was midline or budgets, then came the premium midlines, now lower frontline prices, but I think that prices will continue to come down. We're trying very hard to provide not only a secure but certainly it will be closer.

Where is CD packaging headed?

Well, most record companies are in the 6x12cardboard box packaging showing full graphics, and I think some variation of that will continue, making either that existing package or something very similar more secure. We don't want to lose the full graphics. There are

some other packages we're looking at and other companies are looking at, but so far they're not automated to the point where it would make them cost-efficient.

What is the future of the vinyl disc?


Sales are definitely going down but they're still significant. The best thing is to phase it out in an orderly transition, not just throw the configuraconfiguration and make CD smaller, well, that's something we don't know at this point. It's certainly better quality than our current cassettes, although all record companies have made tremendous strides in the quality of pre-recorded cassettes. My concern is the publicity, because when I travel and meet people outside the industry, they're confused. They hear about how good CD is, then suddenly they're seeing stories about D.A.T., kind of albums. And now we're addressing the frontline price. So I think we've heard what the consumer has said.

Motown has undergone some internal changes of late. What do you see as that label's role within your network over the next few years?

We would like to see Motown continue in the tradition of breaking new artists,

What's in the future for MCA?

We want to continue to break new acts. I'm very excited that we are now into the heavy metal arena with Road Racer and Mechanic Records. It's an area we weren't quite in before. We're pushing very strongly this year in music video, which we have not had that many successes in, but which we are very much committed to. I think that's an area in which we could do

which they have done for a long time. I'm encouraged by what I hear from the new people in charge. They have one of the greatest catalogs of all time, and we continue to do extremely well with it. It's extremely complementary for MCA— if we're walking in with hot black product from both Motown and MCA Records, it just gives us a bigger market share.

At MCA, we want to be a total entertainment company, audio and video. We now have every type of music that there is. We would like to see the type of success that we've had in pop, country, black and jazz spread to classical and heavy metal. We want people to know that MCA believes in all types of music, not just one facet of the market.

tion away like we did with eight-tracks. We're still seeing about 15% of our sales last year in vinyl, so we're certainly not going to throw that away. Certain types of music are phasing out much faster. The classical business is almost non-existent in the album format, and country is very, very low. We're still seeing jazz and black at very high rates in LP sales, and initial sales in pop and rock are very strong, then fade quickly into cassette. But we must do it in. an orderly fashion, because, like I said, the CD hardware isn't out there in enough numbers. We can't just throw vinyl albums away. There are too many homes out there that still have turntables

As D.A.T. becomes available in this country, how do you feel it will impact this part of the industry?

Provided that we do it the right way, there's no reason that CD and D.A.T. couldn't co-exist. I don't see a flood of D. A. T. players on the marketplace. If we do it in an orderly fashion, D. A. T. will phase in as a configuration. Whether or not it's eventually going to become the biggest which isn't even really out yet, and it's clouding the issue. I think as an industry, we need to concentrate on CD before we deal with D.A.T. Hopefully, the hardware manufacturers will look at it in the same way. Why bring out another player and slow down the CD penetration? If I was a hardware manufacturer, I'd get one configuration off the ground before I introduced another.

What about the reports of CD sales reaching a plateau?

Early on, when there was a very short supply of CD's in the stores, people with players bought anything they could get their hands on. Then, when the supply caught up, they said "Look, I'm not going to pay this kind of money for a ten or twenty-year-old album." I think we've addressed that as an industry. Since we reduced prices and introduced budget CD's, we have had tremendous sales, far out-stripping the sales we had when they were at full price. So, I think we've addressed the portion of the issue- the catalog that did plateau and did slow down. I think we took another step with the midlines, the "classic"







"Tracy Chapman" (Elektra): The obvious comparisons for this female folkie from Boston are Joan Armadtrading and Joni Mitchell, but that doesn't do justice to Chapman's wide-ranging lyrical and musical ground. The first single, "Fast Car," tells the story of a doomed relationship from the inside-out, while

other topics include social change, racial tension and materialism. The uncluttered **David Kershenbaum** production gives reign to the myriad styles, from African and a capella to reggae and blues.

The Rave-Ups, "The Book Of Your Regrets" (Epic): Impressive work from L. A.-based quartet is highlighted by singer/songwriter Jimmer Podrasky's narrative rock nuggets. Band's major label bow after a pair of acclaimed indie releases shows group capable of tuneful, dramatic pop-rock in the classic



mold. Story-songs such as "Mickey of Alphabet City" and "Sue and Sonny" recall **Dylan (Bob** and **Thomas)**. Produced by **David Leonard** in crisp, radio-ready fashion.



Living Color, "Vivid" (Epic): Initial effort from red-hot NYC rock band headed by Hendrix-ian guitarist/activist/critic Vernon Reid leaves a scorched path in its attempt to become that rarity— a black act successful at Album Radio. Full-throttle smashers such as "Which Way To

America?" (one of two **Mick Jagger**-produced cuts) exist alongside funk vamps like "Funny Vibe" and even the countryrockin' "Broken Hearts." Producer **Ed Stasium** provides the requisite sonic canvas.

Soul Asylum, "Hang Time" (Twin/Tone/A&M): Major-league debut for another Twin City hopeful, these Minny maulers have cleaned up their white thrash act, thanks to producers Ed Stasium (again!) and Lenny Kaye, who have placed those ringing Byrds-y harmonic overtones front and center so



they catch and hold. First single, "Sometime To Return," is **REM** meets the **Buzzcocks** at twenty paces, while "Endless Farewell" shows the band capable of a stately mid-tempo rock ballad. Will their **PoMo** faithful follow them into respectability?



hat kind of name is Pebbles for a grown woman, especially this stunning, courtier-clad beauty? She sure doesn't look or act like a Flintstones character. By the time you are halfway through the interview, you are firmly convinced this woman has a shot at stardom, if sheer will can make it happen. At four, she knew what she wanted to do with her life. She took every class she could find to sharpen her talent, from opera to classical ballet. Pebbles has worked hard most of her teenage years performing and writing. She signed to Bill Summers' production company when she was sixteen and cried the first time she heard herself on tape. Now, at 23, with a performance on the "Beverly Hills Cop II" soundtrack that generated notice, she has a debut album and a crossover single with her down-to-earth slice-of-life called "Girlfriend."

What is the most difficult aspect of being a new artist in today's music business?

I guess breaking into any new field is difficult. It's like being a teenager no matter how old you are... nobody treats you like you're worthy, nobody takes you seriously. Everything you say is just dismissed.

It's hard to take anyone **named** Pebbles too seriously.

Absolutely, and we thought of switching back to my real name, which is Perri McKissack, but MCA already has an act named Perri. Then too, I had been working in and around Oakland for quite a few years and had built up a following from the shows I had done under the name Pebbles. But I hope in all the interviews I'm doing now, people will begin to see that I'm not cutesy, but rather a complete businesswoman.

It's interesting that you say businesswoman rather than artist.

Of course, I'm a performer, an artist, but I know, to succeed in this business, you've got to know how to take care of all sides. Yes, I'm an artist, but I also produce and write and I have to take it all very seriously to show that to the world, despite whatever my name is.

How does a 23-year-old woman with no track record get to coproduce her debut album?

Reluctantly, and through a set of unusual circumstances. When I came to MCA, I had a production situation that had turned weird and I found myself trying to pick up the pieces, hire a staff and become the producer— doing all the paperwork with the unions, hiring all the musicians. But all the yelling and the sweating I had to go through was probably the best thing that ever happened to me because the next time around, I'll be ready for it.

You seem truly excited about the producing aspect.

I take a hands-on approach to the whole recording process and I have very definite ideas. I can't wait until I can produce other people. The studio is a special place. Magic happens there if you have planning and patience. I truly enjoy dealing with other singers, trying to get the best possible performances out of them.

Tell us about the first single, "Girlfriend."

What do you want in life?

As much positive stuff as I can get. I want to grow as a singer. I want to grow as a producer. I want to develop a workshop for people who are trying to get into the business. I want to have a place where anyone who wants to can find out about this businessabout marketing and developing career strategies, about videos and studios. This industry can eat you up, both emotionally and physically. I'm also very concerned about teenagers and drugs and completely opposed to drugs of any kind. I have never done drugs and I believe that is the only way to succeed and keep on succeeding. I think that message is not

It was written by two friends of mine who are producing everybody right now-L.A. Reid and Babyface. They did the Whisper's 'Rock Steady.' The song is real. All the songs on the album are about keeping away from the fake stuff that's out there, about taking your time and finding out what is real, what is true to life. In all my songs, I skip the sexual and try to deal with situations that have happened to me or to my friends, with a message to hang in there, be positive and you have a better shot at what you want in life.

getting out there enough, despite all the various "Just Say No"-type programs.

Is being pretty an advantage or a disadvantage?

In music, it's an advantage; in life, it's a disadvantage. That sounds funny, but beauty can be a curse. Things happen to you that the average person never has to confront. If you are pretty, you grow up faster. Men and women come at you differently. Men see you as a target, women as competition. You learn to be wary.

isa Tonacci, Brenda Kay and Leslie Fram are three female P. D.'s in the largely, male-oriented world of Top 40 radio. N. Y. native Tonacci worked at WPLJ (now WWPR) in the city for a total of five and a half years, the last two as Research Director and M. D. Sacramento, CA-born Kay was an Air Force brat who grew up in Dover, DE, before getting her first P. D. job at KNIN in Wichita Falls. Fram, from Fair Hope, AL, has been at WABB in Mobile for more than ten years, working her way up from the position of overnight disc jockey, then M. D. She has been P. D. at the station since 1983.

What made you want a career in radio?

Leslie Fram: I wanted to be a journalist originally, but my experience in Fair Hope was just so exciting. I grew up listening to WABB. That was my pastime on weekends, listening to the radio all day and calling d. j.'s asking for Paul McCartney records. I knew back then it was what I wanted to do. The first thing, though, was love of music.

Brenda Kay: In school, I was part of a group that was invited to visit our favorite station. They let us read copy and showed us how the station operated. They felt I had potential and helped me make a tape. I took it to KKQV and Mike Edwards hired me parttime the summer before my senior year in high school. By my first year in college, I was working full-time.

Lisa Tonacci: I knew, since I was 15, that I wanted to get into radio because of the excitement and fun. I've always been a radio junkie and I was surprised that you could make such a nice living doing something that was so much fun. N. Y. is a great place to grow up listening to the radio.



How did you get your first P. D. jobs?

Lisa Tonacci: I had applied for several jobs and had been second choice a few times. I kept wondering if part of the reason was because I had never programmed before and I was interviewing for positions in larger markets than Austin. I often wondered too if part of the reason was because I was a woman. I interviewed for the WHYT job that Rick Gillette got. The station he left, FM102 in Sacramento, was part of the group run by Marty Greenberg, who I knew from ABC. So, I called about FM102 and he said they were going to promote from within, but they had a start-up situation in Austin. And all I could think about were rednecks and cowboys, but it turned out to be a beautiful place and the station really took off.

LF: Randy Lane came to WABB to be V. P. of Programming and we went from Album Rock to Top 40. He cleaned the station up musically. He felt I was already acting in the capacity without the title, so he decided

I should be the Program Director. I learned everything I know about programming from Randy.

BK: I was made Music Director here at KNIN by Chuck Beck when he was Program Director. I held that position for several years and then about a year and a half ago Chuck left for Y95 in Dallas and recommended that I be made P. D., which happened.

I always said that I didn't want to be a P. D. because there were just too many problems and hassles. Being called in the middle of the night. No time off. I had decided to just remain as an M. D. and air personality. I felt that was much more creative and fun. When Chuck left, he suggested I apply for the position. I realized I knew about as much about this market as anyone. I also felt I might not get the same opportunity again for a long time.

Did being a woman ever hold you back professionally?

LF: No, because Bernie Dittman, who owns the station, has never felt that women shouldn't be on during the day because women don't like listening to other women. He has never believed that. When I went to the day shift, it was no problem.

LT: No, because the G. M.

at B93 is a woman, Gayle Shaw.

BK: It really hasn't Wichita Falls is a very friendly community. I've been here a few years and have gotten to know a lot of people and they've all been supportive.

Why aren't there more female Program Directors at Top 40 radio?

LF: I had a conversation with Dan Vallie and Don Anthony about this. Don felt that a lot of women didn't really aspire to the job. That they are really happy being good Music Directors. I don't really know that many women who want to be P. D.'s. Some that do that I have talked to in other markets seem to have problems with the fact it is a male-dominated business and the men are resistant to them being P. D.'s. So, I think it's probably a combination of the two. Not enough aspire to the job and those that do run into male resistance. I'm lucky. I haven't run into that situation. But I'm disturbed that there are only three women Top 40 P. D.'s I know of.

LT: Women probably go through the same frustrations I did in the sense that G. M.'s come from an old school that think of women as secretaries. I would think a lot of women probably interview well, but that it is tougher for them to be given a shot than it is a man because of the mentality that they are not going to be strong enough to deal with the many egos at a radio station.

BK: I wonder if part of it might be that some companies, especially smaller ones, might still be feeling some bias against women. I know there are more and more female sales managers. I think women are proving themselves. A lot of it, and this is pure speculation, might be that some women feel they don't want to handle the job. Perhaps a lot of women just weren't brought up to think in terms of someday being a responsible manager. But I believe that's changing more and more. Women are realizing they can do any job they want to.

Any advice for hopefuls out there?

LF: Be forceful. Tell your G. M. or V. P. of Programming that being a P. D. is what you want to do and give them a timetable. There are a lot of companies out there looking for female P. D.'s I've had calls from, so I know they're out there.

LT: Be honest with your Program Directors about your aspirations. Everybody needs to grow. There comes a time when you are ready for a move. Be up-front about it and ask for their help.

BK: Learn as much as you can. Put in as many hours as it takes. Don't look at yourself as being a woman Music Director or a woman Program Director. Just look at yourself as a good P. D. or M. D. That's the way to go. Don't classify yourself. Just do the best job you can and let it go from there.






