As you read this, those crazy, crazy folks from Capitol, EMI-Manhattan and Angel (CEMA) are gathering for three days of meetings, presentations, and performance at Los Angeles' beautiful (but smoggy) Registry Hotel.

"This is the year for Capitol/EMI-Manhattan to begin its move," Capitol Industries-EMI Inc. President and CEO Joe Smith told Hits (Your #1 Source For Telling Things To). "We're bringing our distribution and label people to L.A. this week to deliver the message that this is a great record organization with terrific people and wonderful music. And now we're going for it. Watch this space."

A number of performances mark the event including Pat McLaughlin, Da Krash, Pieces Of A Dream, Thomas Dolby and Dan Seals. Blue Note artists Michel Petrucciani and Diane Reeves will also perform showcases, with Robert Palmer highlighting closing night festivities on Saturday.


EZ Communications has signed on as one of the first clients of the company.



Bring On The New

GOODBYE OLD FRIENDS: Last year's onetwo blockbuster punch of Whitesnake (Geffen) and U2 (Island) are finally showing legitimate signs of fading away into catalog heaven. They have both dropped slowly after incredible runs at the top and what seems like a thousand lives on the way down. All concerned at both labels as well as creative and management people who have nurtured and guided these projects along the way must be congratulated. But, as the old say goodbye, they simultaneously make way for the new. And there now appears to be a strong bunch of new and developing product ready to fight for their right to party (OK, so I stole that line, big deal!)

HOT **NEWCOMERS** ABOUND: At the top of this new list, and nearly at the top of any list already, are hard rockers (no, I won't call them heavy metal because I always get abused for it) Iron Maiden (Capitol) and Scorpions (PolyGram) — both needing hits for longevity, but only the Scorpions showing real Top 40 potential.

Slightly, but not much, further down are Miami Sound Machine (Epic) and Pebbles (MCA) — both riding hit singles up the chart and ready for long-range selling sprees. next grouping developing artists is led by Midnight Oil (Columbia) about to bust loose behind a Post-Modern base and a breakthrough

Jive/RCA rappers Jazzy Jeff (with an exceptional video leading) and Kool Moe Dee and Ziggy Marley (Virgin) ---our pick to click, which is clicking faster than anyone could expect (and yes, there most definitely can and will be a reggae hit single).

And finally, the next grouping of upcomers includes Lita Ford (RCA) riding a hot single and hot video in her quest for chart magic --- 10,000 Maniacs (Elektra), a Post Modern staple and another of those term commitment projects which is selling because quality does sometimes win out, Eric Clapton's retrospective on PolyGram, which is a high-ticket winner selling big numbers —- but not expected to have longevity unless the label pops that surprise single with "Af-Midnight" (surprise, surprise) Cheap Trick (Epic), whose comeback album is on the verge of spawning a hit single.

Hard rock, MOR, rap, reggae, Post Modern and more. It's a strange field, but then again, the Top Ten includes Tiffany (MCA), Guns 'N' Roses (Geffen) and, of course, More Dirty Dancing (RCA)




Lakers Versus Celtics, What Else?







What were the major problems facing you when you arrived at Capitol?

Some of it was merely image and profile, but that can't be totally dismissed in this business- we're in an image business. Capitol just wasn't perceived as a hip label. That's not substance, but it can hurt. On a deeper level, I think Capitol was too much of a sales-driven company, and not sufficiently an A&R/promotion-driven company. For many years, Capitol had a wonderful distribution operation-they were in it, in terms of branch distribution, long before Warners, and that's always been a cornerstone of this company. In recent years, though, the focus had been too much on sales and not enough on talent. Of course, any change hasn't just depended on my coming here. It was already happening under people like Tom-Whalley, who'd signed Skinny Puppy before I ever arrived, the type of act one wouldn't have associated with Capitol, say, three years ago. That was an extremely important signing in terms of credibility and what it represents. So basically, I just expedited that change.

What was your main focus when you arrived?

I came in a year ago February as President of Capitol Industries-EMI, supervising areas like manufacturing, legal, finance and Capitol Canada, which all reported directly to me. But the labels did not— I was just "involved." I then joined the label last August, and it's been a much more comfortable role for me. It's also potentially a much more rewarding situation. The first thing I did was hire Simon Potts, so my focus from day one was going to be A&R.

Since then you've built up a whole new, young A&R staff, as well as promotion and black music teams.

I feel we've now got absolutely top-notch people here, like John Fagot and Step Johnson—they're major additions to the company, and part of that new focus.

HITS May 2, 1988

Looking back, what are the main differences between working at Capitol and Warner Bros?

I was at Warners for eleven years, and it was always a very artist-oriented company-by reputation and in fact-and that's something I absolutely insist on duplicating. At the same time, there are things about Warners that cannot -- and shouldn't -- be duplicated, and there are certain nuts-and-bolts differences that I am incorporating here, like having separate profit centers. Throughout the years, Capitol manufacturing, distribution and the label were all one profit center. We've now decentralized, and I think that's very healthy—there's more accountability. What's interesting about Capitol is its international focus, partially because we're ultimately owned by a British company, partially because the various EMI companies abroad are so old, 60-70-80 years old. So we have a major international focus which may not be duplicated at Warners. I think their philosophy is more one of having a very solid foreign operation to exploit their U.S. roster. It's a very American-dominated company. I think Capitol-EMI has a better balance.

With your new focus on A&R, what are the advantages of having a new young team?

Enthusiasm, energy, intensityqualities that more than compensate for their lack of experience. It's run by Tom Whalley, formerely of Warners, on the pop side, and Wayne Edwards on the R & B side, and most of the people are young, but passionate. It's also pretty eclectic, ranging from Tim Carr, who used to manage David Van Tiegham, to Rachel Matthews, whose roots are heavy metal, Claudia Stanten and Kenny Ortiz, who came from the dance area, and Tim Devine, who was a product manager at Warners.

How important is a new, adventurous roster to Capitol, with acts like Skinny Puppy?

Extremely. In the past, perhaps the company had a slightly stuffy, conservative image, but there's nothing stuffy about Megadeth, Mantronix, Fetchin' Bones, The Reivers, Grapes of Wrath. We're clearly widening our horizons, in black and country as well as pop.

In the past, Capitol's done very well with R & B acts like Freddie Jackson and Frankie Beverly and Maze.

Yes, but I don't think the department had enough autonomy. I don't view a black music department as a racial issue as much as a different categorization—it's no different to me than a "country division" or a "classical division." It's a recognition of the importance of black music. If

we wanted to seriously get into the jazz market, for instance, we'd have to set up a jazz department. [Since this interview, Capitol has done just that with the acquisition of Blue Note Records.] And we've already seen the benefits of having a separate department—five #1 records! I think Step Johnson and his team have done a great job already, and the future looks very promising in this area.

Along with all these internal moves, are you changing the image of Capitol's advertising and marketing campaigns?

For a start, we're using the symbol of the Tower much more. Let's face it, it's a landmark. And Bill Burks' "It Came From Hollywood" posters and cards are part of a new, hipper "look." Then there's our use of "Brave Music For A New World." You might say we're now "capitalizing" on our image.

You've also revamped the artist and media relations departments.

Again, it's a new, young, aggressive team, with Dorene Lauer, Judi Kerr, Byron Hontas, Vivian Piazza, Joan Myers, Darryl Minger and Denise Cox, and I think they'll be crucial in nurturing our new "alternative" acts that might not go straight to Top 40, but which the press often can help break.

You've got a reputation as both a creative music man and a strong businessman. How do you balance the two?

I was head of Business Affairs at Warners for eleven years and I never had any illusions about what was truly important in running that company— we worked for the artists, and the fact that it's perhaps trite and a cliche doesn't make it any less true. The creative side has to come first— without the music, there's no business to run. But, of course, it is also a business. Obviously we want to make a profit. I hope I do maintain some sort of balance between the two demands.

Running Capitol is your first

experience as a label President. Is it what you expected?

To be honest, I don't know what I expected. I'm having a great time, that's for sure. My experience at Warners was of a company that always aimed for a consensus. Neither Mo Ostin nor Lenny Waronker are hands-on or dictatorial. It was very much a "committee" approach, with Mo kind of staying above the fray and gently, but firmly, guiding it. I tried that approach here, but my personality is different and there's no way I'm aloof or above it! I'm right in the middle, getting yelled at like everyone else. But I don't purport to be a hands-on guy. I don't know how to pick a single, market a record or promote a record, but I hope I know the people who do, and my aim is to get the best people possible and let 'em run their departments.

Where do you see Capitol going in the next few years?

First and foremost, our job right now is to break new artists, which is both the hardest and most rewarding thing a label can do. We can't get where we want to be by just buying up major talent. If they're available, I'm in the marketplace. But Bruce Springsteen or Michael Jackson are not going to come shopping. So you have to grow almost organically. The good news is that we don't have an overloaded roster, and we have the time to nurture those new artists, like a Crowded House. They will get their shots. It took the best part of a year to break Crowded House, and Capitol was able to do it. If we'd been overburdened with 50 other acts, it probably wouldn't have happened.

What about the current state of radio? How far does it influence what kind of act you sign?

Hey, this is *Hits*, you want me to bury myself? (laughs). Basically, it's the kiss of death for any label to sign an act because of radio. Radio is fickle. You go from a disco craze to a country craze to oldies. You *cannot* build a label by anticipating what radio will play. You build a label by signing ar-

tists, and eventually talent will out. Talking Heads and REM started off as "alternative" acts with no Top 40 airplay, and as Tom Whalley is famous for saying, "Talent defines its own marketplace." So radio can be both a stumbling block— if they're not receptive— and a great help— when they get behind an artist. The fact is, we can't live without 'em, and we depend enormously on radio. When they're good, they're great. When they're bad, they're horrible!

Right now, are they the good or bad guys?

Hmm. That's a dangerous question. I'd say a bit of both.

What do you personally love to listen to at home?

Bob Marley. I even named my daughter after him.

What? You have a daughter named Bob?

(Laughs) Rebecca Marley

Berman. I have to confess that the day she was born, I left her and my wife to go catch Bob Marley at the Roxy. My wife couldn't believe it, but I told her, "Honey, I gotta go. Sorry."

Do you feel the music business is healthy right now?

By and large, yes. It's definitely healthier when it's not just a CBS/Warners world. I think it's better for the record business in general when we have a strong Capitol, a strong RCA, a strong MCA, a strong PolyGram, as well as strong independent labels, and it's more that way today.

Looking to the future, what are your feelings about D.A.T.?

It scares me. The opposition you're seeing from the labels is real and sincere. D.A.T. has the capability of taking home taping to a whole new dimension, and it's very worrying. One thing's for sure—the industry will fight it all the way.

THE LATEST ON UP AND COMING BANDS

What many are saying may be the last X album ever is a thrilling double live-set called "Live at the Whisky A Go-Go on the Fabulous Sunset Strip," released this week on ELEKTRA, containing some re-workings of our fondest X material, including "Blue Spark," "The New World," "Johnny Hit & Run Pauline" and "Los Angeles," practically the signature tune for L.A.'s music underground of a decade ago. For many years, X defined what punk, as music and culture, meant to much of America, and this document, recorded late last year, is a fine example of the band at its best-intelligent, provocative, demanding and ultimately positive- in short, music that matters. All four members of the band will no doubt have plenty more to offer with John Doe and Exene Cervenka involved in film projects, and various other musical endeavors. Doe is certainly one of the foremost singer/songwriters in rock right now......Another great rocker who never really had his due is Graham Parker, who returns with a new album on RCA called "The Mona Lisa's Sister," featuring "Don't Let It Break You Down" and "Get Started. Start a Fire." Other tracks to watch for are "Under the Mask of Happiness" and "The Girl Isn't Ready"......Advances of Camper van Beethoven's new album on VIRGIN, produced by Dennis Herring, suggest a major breakthrough for this West Coast college favorite.......Billy Bragg's new "Help Save the Youth of America" EP is a breezy selection of social tracts, all with the right idea and a wisdom beyond the years of most rock 'n' rollers, though with bands like the above-mentioned X or Midnight Oil, The Christians and 10,000 Manaics, among others, rock is becoming a real nourishing force for emotional and political growth where it counts the most - in the music.....Another remarkable performer that transcends the world of rock, while influencing many leading proponents of it, is singer/songwriter Leonard Cohen, whose new album on COLUMBIA has come out without a whisper, as usual. Entitled "I'm Your Man," it contains tremendous versions of "First We'll Take Manhattan" and "Ain't No Cure for Love," songs recorded last year by Jennifer Warnes for her Cohen tribute album "Famous Blue Raincoat." Frankly, the man is a musical treasure and deserves more attention from promotion and radio.....Speaking of Warnes, her company, CYPRESS, have moved their digs over to A&M and plan on upcoming releases by Michael Tomlinson, Gary Wright and Kenny Rankin under the new distribution arrangement......The Rainmaker's new single, "The Wages of Sin," from their "Tornado" album on POLYGRAM, has been touted as a timely release in honor of the year's socio-evangelical events.....RHINO artist Cindy Lee Berryhill has planned some West Coast dates, in Seattle this week, S.F. the 30th, then off to Chicago on May 6th and Detroit May 7th......Calpyso leader David Rudder has a new album, "Haiti," out on SIRE, the kind of uptempo dance-pop which eventually is going to find its way into the dance clubs in a big way......Reggae legend, two-time Grammy nominee and fiery vocalist Burning Spear releases a new album on SLASH called "Mistress Music" in June, and will be touring America through May and then again later in the summer. SLASH have more reggae in Vancouver-based band Sons of Freedom with an album slated for late summer......

Suggested Cuts

"Rush Hour" is the first cut that they're chasing at Top 40, but there's a bunch more on the album to follow.

Label Comments:

According to VP of Pop Promotion Jack Satter, the initial reaction to the single has been fantastic — very positive. We did a three week prepromotion tour at radio, and it seemed to have really paid off. It's a home run across the country." According to the Promo exec, "Rush Hour" is the first of three hits on the album. "This one's a smash," he exclaimed. "We're extremely excited about this artist."


Another former Go-Go takes center stage as the leader of an engaging duo. Gina Schock with songwriter/bassist/vocalist Vance DeGeneres for a slightly quirky, driving pop project. Schock provides both the vocals and the backbeat, while lending her lyrical prowess to all but two cuts on the album. Still at the Alternative and College level, it looks like the first cut to Top 40 will be "Middle Of Nowhere" featuring the background vocals of Marshall Crenshaw.

Suggested Cuts

"Middle Of Nowhere" is an obvious radio winner, but give "Walk In My Sleep," and "Never Be Enough" a good listen.

Label Comments:

"The stations that are playing this record are getting a lot of reaction," said Capitol's National Director of Progressive Rock Promotion, "Dirty" Harry "Don't Call Me Harold" Levy who cited such killers as KROQ, WBCN and 91X currently playing the record. "She's not just a straight-ahead pop act," said Levy. "Her voice is slightly quirky, while still being very accessible."





Through the years, Joni Mitchell's daring music has defied classification. She has moved from acoustic folk to pop-rock to jazz, from emotional, confessional folk ballads to narratives with jazz-influenced harmonics and rhythms. It has been a twenty-year, 14-album journey that has challenged her fans, radio and critics to grow with her.

If a segment of her audience yearns for another "Both Sides Now" or celebrates her '60s anthem "Woodstock," others revel in her confessional era, such as the 1971 album "Blue." She reached a large mainstream audience with her 1974 best-selling masterpiece "Court and Spark."

But when many would take such a success and clone it, Mitchell daringly explored new territory—jazz—with 1975's adventurous "The Hissing of Summer Lawns." Her writing went into strong narrative forms on 1976's "Hejira." She also embraced African influences on "Hissing" and 1978's "Don Juan's Reckless Daughter." In her bravest experiment, she worked with jazz bassist Charles Mingus on an album she admits was a career disaster—1979's "Mingus."

In the '80's, she has returned to some pop-rock styles with the joyous "Wild Things Run Fast" and 1985's socially-conscious, high-tech "Dog Eat Dog." With her just-released Geffen album, "Chalk Mark in a Rainstorm," Mitchell has created her most accessible recording since "Court and Spark." Radio should embrace it with equal enthusiasm. In this wide-ranging chat, Joni reflects on a circuitous career and her current direction.

I hear a lot of songs on "Chalk Mark in a Rainstorm" that should appeal to radio.

So far it's been very good. Album Radio has picked up on the song "Snakes and Ladders." But I really don't understand this complex labyrinth that surrounds the release of an album. It used to be a simple horse race. There was the chart. You released a single. It was like a thermometer. It's rising, it's rising. Or it's falling, it's falling.

How did people like Peter Gabriel, Willie Nelson, Billy Idol, Don Henley and Wendy & Lisa come to work on your album?

Everybody just happened to be at hand, with the exception of Billy and Willie, whom I sent for. I was in England with my husband when Peter Gabriel finished his last album. He offered his home studio to me and I had time on my hands to use it. He came by and he sang on "My Secret Place." It's like the Song of

Solomon in the Bible, where the gender keeps changing in the middle of paragraphs. I like that. It makes it like one spirit instead of a duet singing at each other.

Were the new lyrics for the Sons of the Pioneer's classic "Cool Water" the result of your involvement with the clean water issue?

Yes. Stevie Nicks, Don Henley, myself and a bunch of others did a benefit. It didn't take much of a rewrite, just a line here and there. Willie is just perfect for the song. My husband and I have always been Willie Nelson fans. His phrasing, the timbre of his voice. He sings a little like a jazz singer. Miles Davis is a Willie Nelson fan.

Why did you name the album "Chalk Mark in a Rainstorm," which is actually a line from the song "The Best of Black Wings"?

It went back and forth between "Chalk Mark" and "Snakes and Ladders." I al-

ways liked Tennessee Williams' titles. They were so visual. "Chalk Mark in a Rainstorm" was the most Tennessee Williams of the titles I could come up with.

Do you enjoy collaboration more than writing alone?

Larry and I collaborate well. He builds the tracks, then I build melody and all the

"The very new... always makes people nervous."

Do you enjoy working with synthesizers and machine programming?

Yes and no. They can speak my voice, but I don't know how to turn them on. My technical ability is limited. On this album, my husband [bassist Larry Klein] helped me set up the sound.

How do you write songs?

Generally, I come up with a chord progression on guitar or piano. Then, I may sing.
Usually, the melody comes right off the bat. Then I begin to parquet the language to that melody. Part of the standard of my craft is to have the language against the melody with the same inflection as if it were spoken.

choral arrangements. So, what you really have is the music of two artists running parallel. "Snakes and Ladders" was a track he had built for Robert Plant. I heard it and a melody came. And I said, look, this is going to make me sing differently. Can I have this one? So, I snitched it. Robert knows. The first interview I did, the guy had just talked to Robert. And Robert sent a message to me through him. Something to the effect, "Hey, give me my songs back.' (laughs) I nipped all the pieces that were heading in Robert's direction. I think they stretched me. It gave me a good kick in the butt.

"The Hissing of Summer Lawns," "Mingus" and "Don Juan's Reckless Daughter" pre-date the jazz work of Sting and the African influences of Paul Simon by more than a decade, yet you didn't get the critical accolades those two did.

The very new, and those were very new ideas at the time, always makes people nervous. Nobody wants to buy an Edsel, that's what it is.

How do you react to Prince's public adulation of your work?

It's always pleasing that something you do communicates to anyone. The Do you ever listen to your older records?

When I'm about to tour, I go back and review, in order to learn the material again. Sometimes, I stumble upon them being played in a restaurant or in someone's home. There are things I would change. Some, I feel, are pretty good. I like "Court and Spark." It has momentum that keeps charging. "Blue" is a very pure album, emotionally and stylistically. It's honest emotion. "Hejira" is more complex. I haven't listened to "The Hissing of Summer Lawns" in a long time. I remember it taking a critical



Charles Mingus worth the critical beating you took from it?

In terms of musical education, absolutely. In terms of a career, it was disastrous. Radio had begun to break into demographics and "Mingus" didn't seem to fit anywhere. So, I lost my airplay. "Mingus" cemented my title as a jazz singer, which was erroneous, I think. Those WAVE-type stations that play instrumental music and contemporary jazz by people I've worked with-like Pat Metheny and Wayne Shorter-program "Mingus" sometimes.

Do you think radio has given you a fair shake since "Mingus"?

I've been kind of a musical misfit in that I incorporated broader kinds of music than were generally acceptable. It's not a matter of fair or unfair.... or is it? I think radio just changed and I didn't fit in anywhere. I can't blame radio. Radio should be able to play

me now. Stations where Sting's projects are being played should open a pocket for me, since what he is doing and what I am doing are compatible.

Your album cover paintings often seem to reflect the music inside. Do the two overlap?

Yeah, they do. During the time I was considered a folk singer and my songs were sparse, I was drawing. As I began to use overdubs, I began to add a little bit of color to the drawings. As I moved into jazz, the art became more abstract, improvisational.

What is the biggest misconception people have about you?

All I've done is present my work over a period of time. I really don't understand "image." I think images get in the way. They fix things. Then you can't see things for the image. Anything that is fixed about me is inaccurate. Some people think of me as that folk

singer from the '60s. People still want to talk about me in the context of Judy Collins or Joan Baez, whom I have very little in common with in the first place. After 20 years in my musical journey, I wonder where they are coming from that they would still associate me with those women. That folk singer from the '60s is an image a lot of people don't want to let go. They'll never see me past that. I have people come up to me and say "that's not your music." There is an assumption that "Dog Eat Dog" is not my music. It is. I picked all those sounds. I'm a poet, I am an antenna of this culture. I'm everything about it, the worst and the best.


How do you feel the influences from various phases of your career?

My phrasing, having been

pulled through the dye of jazz. is different than a pop-rock singer's. On "Chalk Mark," I'm singing a little crunchier than I ever have. In that way, I think I'm back more in the pop field. In a way, all of my work is very theatrical. When I'm singing, no matter whether I'm singing a character or something that I wrote from personal experience, it is method acting. You draw those words up like you never heard them before. Jazz affords greater freedom for that kind of phrasing than rock does. In that sense, I think I became a jazz singer. I took my direction from hom players, how they placed their melody. Miles Davis was a big influence on my singing. The only jazz singer I love that I can think of is Billie Holiday, and you can hear a little of that from time to time. I also love Annie Ross.





What made you want to get informatio?

He had all those records and I was just fascinated by all of it. At the ripe age of 7, I bought my first 45, "Witch Doctor," by David Seville and the Chipmunks. That was followed by "Purple People Eater." It got a bit more sophisticated after that. I've been into music ever since.

I grew up in San Diego, where

there was a McLendon station and up the coast, we could always hear KFWB, KRLA and KHJ when "boss radio" came along. So, I was influenced by that. Then the Drake format came into San Diego at KGB, and, of course, KCBO had always been a great station all those years. I was really lucky to grow up in an area with great radio. And, since it was a beach community, every summer all the stations bombarded the beach with promotions. I learned subliminally that powerful radio stations get out and get in front of

How did you land your first radio job?

My first break in radio was given to me by (now B100 M. D.) Gene Knight. He's been my best friend all during my career. A high school buddy, who went to college with Gene, said that a pal of his was a d. j. at the local country station and he'd introduce me. Gene and I hit it off right away. He sat me down in the production room in 1969 and made me do several

heaks with Top 40-type music.

He said, here's your tape and believe me, you'll get a job with it. About twenty-seven stations later, I landed a job in Corona. Gene and I have been friends ever since. We still talk at least once a week.

You've worked in Sacramento both as a jock and a P. D. How has it changed for you?

Sacramento itself has changed. It was a smaller, more agricultural, government-oriented type of city ten years ago. It has grown moderately since then. It looks very hopeful that it will get even bigger and stronger in the future. The feel of the place has grown. It has a more cosmopolitan feel now. People from the Bay Area have moved here because real estate is cheaper. People from the midwest are moving here instead of L. A. or San Francisco. The suburbs have also stretched out compared to ten years ago.

Who are some of the people you talk to on a regular basis?

There's a handful around the country. Gene Knight at B100, Rick Torcasso at WMJI in Cleveland, Rick Upton at KITY in San Antonio, Rick Gillette at WHYT in Detroit and Mike Mc-Vay, our consultant.

Tell us a little about the music scene in Sacramento.

This town is interesting in that it's not as ethnic as some of the other California markets. We only have a 5% black population, 10% Hispanic and about 5% Asian, which means it's just about 20% ethnic. But we have a tendency, at least at FM102, to lean a little more on the urban side, a little more of the dance product and urban-sounding ballads seems to work here. I think that's because the anglo population here is much more susceptible to it than it is in some midwestern cities. This city is into a lot of different styles of music. Country music is real popular. Classic rock seems to work here, being Northern California and all. So, a lot of different things work here. We have a tendency to position FM102 as an urban-leaning type of station. Because the other two Top 40's are pretty straight-ahead.

Does Post-Modern music fit your mix?

Yes. Some of the energy is the same as in some of the dance music out there. The Cure, the Alarm and Depeche Mode have been successful for me. Right now, my number one most requested record is "Route 66" by Depeche Mode. Some of the cuts fit in with my format, at least at night.

Do you buy the urban backlash theory?

No, because I've been doing this format on and off for a good number of years. It all depends on the product available to us from those particular artists. Some years, there are a lot of urban crossovers and some years there are less. But I don't see any kind of backlash from burnout.






