



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
Multiple Buyouts Mark Period Of Consolidation

MTV Ratings Up



ON RECORDS

EVERY ROSE HAS A SMASH: One of our recurring themes in this column has been what we call the Power Single. It is a song that is not simply a hit, but one that ignites the sales of a new or old album in the marketplace and sends it soaring toward the top of the chart. Now, in the midst of the exciting three way elpee battle for leadership between Island's U2, and Elektra's combo of soul balladeer Anita Baker and the Cocktail soundtrack, there is a story emerging which may prove to be the biggest of them all. Thanks to a smash hit single, the **Poison** project (Enigma/Capitol) is flying back up the chart and is on the verge of entering the select circle of winners for the all-important Christmas buying season.

The history of this album is simple. It was released during the summer, exploded in sales and shot right into the national Top Five. After peaking at #2 and delivering both a Top Ten and Top Twenty single, the album has been slowly descending into twenties nationally. the However, while the second single was developing, many in radio began hollering that there was a power cut on the album, what is now the current hit, "Every Rose Has Its Thorn." This song was pulling major phones in all demographics where tested and was also proving to be a winner in callouts. And now that it is released and flying up the charts, it has reversed the pattern of the descending

album sales and rocketed the elpee into the Top Ten in only a few short weeks.

And, since it is still relatively early in the growth pattern of exposure for this hot cut, we see no reason why it can't take the album to #1 and repeat the success that "Pour Some Sugar On Me" had for the Def Leppard project (Mercury). We look for some big smiles in the Capitol Tower in the coming weeks.

AND WHO'S NEXT?: The latest hot project to hit the street is the much-awaited first **REM** album for Warners. First week sales are strong, debuting the album in the Top Twenty nationally. These Post Modern and album radio giants have a large following; however, once again, it will be the ultimate success of a hit single that will determine just how big and just how much legs this project will have. 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DELICIOUS VINYL RECORDS MANC RECOLD

Interview By Hank Bordowitz

Joe Smith has been in the music biz for nearly 40 years. He graduated from Yale and went right into radio. He worked through the '50s as a d.j. in Virginia, Pennsylvania and Boston, though he really wanted to be a sports announcer. During the Golden Age of Rock 'n' Roll, he played Presley, Little Richard and Roy Orbison, running against the establishment, which didn't want to hear them.

Married in the early '60s, Smith realized he couldn't be a d.j. for the rest of his life, but the only thing he knew was the record business. "Being a disc jockey doesn't give you great training to do very much," he warns.

He took a job as a local promotion person, which kept him in the music industry. He went to Warner Bros. in 1961 as head of national promotion. He has been on the circuit ever since, as chief executive at Warners, Elektra and his current post as President/CEO at Capitol-EMI Music, Inc. The latest notch in Joe's belt is his debut as author of "Off The Record," a collection of interviews with a veritable who's who of rock and soul's founding fathers, just published by Warner Books.



The first thing *Hits* readers would like to know is, do you ever have trouble checking into hotels with that name?

Of course. The stories about dealing with my name are legend. Somebody says, "Is that your real name?," and I'll say, "Are you kidding? Who would pick that as a fake one?"

"Off The Record" is a pretty extensive tome.

It's not the kind of **book** you read cover to cover. Some**body** said it's a great bathroom book. It's the kind of book you pick up and choose the parts you want to read.

The book is practically an oral history of pop music.

I thought of it that way. Then I read Patrick Goldstein's review in the *L.A. Times*. He referred to it as an indispensable guide to anyone who is going to be writing about rock 'n' roll because it gives you a brief peek in the window at all these different personalities. I never intended this to be a reference book. It's more like a pop music version of Studs Terkel's "Working."

How long did it take you to write?

I have to say being who I am did me a lot of good because I don't know of any journalist who could eventually get to all these people. I squeezed all the interviews into two years and two months. But I had to apply constant pressure to get to certain artists.

What did you do for a living while you were working on the book?

I was the first paid President of NARAS. I had a movie deal with Paramount, developing pictures and doing some soundtrack work. I started writing it then. About half way through the book, I took this job at Capitol, which is a little more than a part-time gig, as you might imagine. Then it became more difficult to find the time. Some of the artists I talked to were not especially considerate of other people's time, either. While I was in London for ten days, I lined up all sorts of subjects, from Dave Clark to Elton John to Cliff Richard and Paul McCartney, and then I'd get a call from someone like Robert Plant asking if I could stay over a week and do it next Thursday. And I'd have to tell him I didn't live there and had to be back in the States. It could be excruciating. pulling up to someone's house and waiting for them to come home, stuff like that. But I got it all done in a little more than two years. When I started at Capitol, I felt like giving up, returning the advance and forgetting about it, but I knew I had to keep going. David Geffen stayed on my case to finish and so did the late John Hammond, who always told me, "You must do this book."

Payola was a way of life back in those early days. It blew up for a moment in the '60s, when they had the congressional hearings, which I talk about in the book. Dick Clark was involved and so was Alan Freed. Everybody who was a disc jockey of any note was getting something. Freed suffered. He got nailed because he was the biggest. And it killed him. In the end, I had to lend him money. His house and salary were attached and he had nothing to live on. A few of us would take care of him by taking him to dinner, stuff like that.

As I say in the book, when I went to Boston, a couple other d.j.'s took me aside and said, "Listen, this is how it works here.

A lot of people in the book, like Jerry Wexler and even yourself, were very frank about subjects like payola.

Did you ever hear the story about the Music Director up at WINS when Alan Freed was there and it was a hot station? The guy was making \$125 a week and living on Sutton Place, wearing fancy suits, driving a big car, traveling to Europe. The station manager, oblivious to all this said, "You're doing a great job. We're going to promote you to the news department and give you \$200 a week." He begged him not to. "Please don't do that to me!" Don't undercut anybody." But what I found out was, in 95% of the cases, the best disc jockeys didn't play records for money. A distributor or label would give a d.j. \$500 or \$1000 a month and you would pick from their records. If there was nothing there, you didn't play it. Everyone was in such fierce competition for ratings and business that you couldn't make up a program of stiffs just because you were getting paid under the table.

Radio has changed a great deal since then.

What has happened is radio has fragmented to deal with special

audiences. It used to be that I and any other d.j. in the country could play anything from Bo Diddley to Doris Day, without ever considering that you were crossing unknown lines. You programmed hit records, and hit records seemed to have a commonality of interest. I was not looking for a black audience or a female audience or an adult audience. We picked the records, we programmed our shows and made them entertaining and we broke rock 'n' roll. No radio station owner wanted us to play Elvis Presley and Little Richard. "Keep it nice with Frankie Laine and Tony Bennett. Don't give us this wild-assed music." And we all did it anyway. We played rock 'n' roll and got an immediate reaction.

Now there are people who do a lot of research, phone-outs, phone-ins and narrow-banding to figure out their target audience and what to play. This narrowcasting the way programmers try to categorize listeners and put them in bags— is the difference from how it was back in the '50s.

That was the heyday of personality radio.

Personalities don't exist on too many radio stations anymore. They do it deliberately. They'll try to make the morning guy or team popular, but, during the day, they're relatively anonymous, because their music is mostly programmed upfront. There's very little lattitude. They have bites to deliver and that's the history of Top 40 radio. Album radio kind of drones along with a pretentious attitude as all these hipper-than-thou FM'ers pass judgement on the music they're playing.

You describe your radio career as going from "hot shit" to "half-assed" in the '60s.

When I moved to LA, it was the end of the earth as far as the music business was concerned. It was a sleepy town. And insular. Everything that happened beyond the Rocky Mountains we weren't really privy to. Now, the national people knew who I was, or had been, anyhow. I got offered jobs in the record business because I was a hot-shot d.j. When I said "half-assed," I was half-kidding. I was trying to get out of that world. There was enough interest in me as a d.j. that, in the first two years I was there, I worked on nearly every radio station in L.A. in one role or another. I remember doing the all-night show at KFWB, which used to be **the** rock 'n' roll station in Los Angeles. I'd do midnight to 6, then get up and promote records at 8 in the moming. That was a memorable summer.

There was a group of us in L.A.--- Jerry Moss, Phil Spector, Glen Campbell, Jan & Dean, Lou Adler, Herbie Alpert- who went on a "let's promote the West Coast" binge. Let's talk about the music we've got here, even though we didn't have much to talk about early on. It was Dick Dale and the Deltones until Phil started making records out on the West Coast. Then the Beach Boys, Jan & Dean and Herbie Alpert came along. And that was all in the first part of the '60s. With the disintegration of N.Y. as a place to live, people started packing up and coming to L.A. Also, with the tax problems in England, the Rod Stewarts, Elton Johns and George Harrisons began to move there and L.A. became an incredible place. Because when I first got there, it really wasn't. Back in 1960, we could knock off at 3:00 because nobody on the East Coast would call anymore and there was nothing else to do.

The interviews in the book tend to be fairly non-judgmental about what the people say or what they've done.

I didn't want to get too much of me in there. Every one of the people I interviewed had something positive about them, otherwise they wouldn't have been in the book. I tended not to be critical. My approach was, "Just tell us what it was like. Tell us a story."

Walter Yetnikoff takes a few shots at Clive Davis in there. Mary Wilson at Diana Ross. Martha Reeves talks about Berry Gordy. Some people *schpritz* other people. A lot of that came across, but generally, if somebody got really snide, I left that out. I was more interested in what it was like to make it, what it was like to fail.

Many of the stories interconnect.

That's deliberate. All the Motown stuff is together- Eddie Kendricks and Levi Stubbs, Mary Wilson and Lamont Dozier, and out of that I hoped you would have a pretty good sense of what Motown was about. When my wife read the book, she said, "God, I would've loved to have seen that house [Hitsville, USA]." You have a sense of what that house was, the house band, and all these people coming in. Lamont Dozier recalled how Berry Gordy, who had worked at a Ford plant, wanted them to punch a time clock when they came in. Can you imagine songwriters punching clocks, sitting in a little

on each. We opted for the first approach, but there's so much more material that's on those tapes, because I talked to everybody for 45 minutes to an hour. We distilled it into just a few minutes of those conversations. For instance, Herbie Hancock's stories about working with Miles Davis are phenomenal. Miles gets out into space city every once in a while.

John Fogerty told an interesting story involving you and his solo album.

That's one of the most fascinating tales in my whole career. I'd just moved to Elektra-Asylum, and, the second week I'm there, John

office, writing four hits and punching out?

Then you've got Wexler, Ertegun, Ruth Brown, Ben E. King, who form a circle that interconnects. It's fascinating. This is not a world of seven billion people. There have been a few thousand individuals who have been in the music business from the start until today, so you're bound to find connections. The English part of it is fascinating. I think I talked to everybody who ever mattered over there, from a Beatle to a Stone, a Who, a Moody, a Floyd.

One of the problems with the book is I had so much material I couldn't use. We had to make a choice of doing two or three pages on this broad spectrum or cut it down to 50 people with ten pages

Fogerty delivers his album. I sit down to listen to the record and I don't hear a single hit. I told John, for somebody else, this is a pretty good album, but for John Fogerty, it won't stand the test. I suggested he go back and work on it a little more, maybe cut a couple more songs. He got very upset and stormed out of my office. Three days later, he calls me and says I've done him the biggest favor in his life. He realized I was right, so he was going back to work on the record. Only problem was, it took him nine years to finish it. I'd call him every two months and ask him if it was something I said. "Was it the inflection of my voice?" The irony is, in 1983, when I left Elektra to head up the sports division at Warners and Bob Krasnow took

over, Fogerty called me extremely upset. "How dare you leave me?," he said. And I said, "What do you mean leave you? You haven't made a record in seven years. Call Krasnow." Well, Krasnow wasn't interested in John Fogerty at the time, but I knew Mo Ostin and Lenny Waronker at Warners were, so I called John and asked him if he minded if Lenny came up to talk with him. Lenny did, John made "Centerfield" and it turned out to be the #1 record in the country.


You actually got started in this business because you wanted to be a sportscaster.

There's a natural affinity between sports and music. There are such incredible stars in sports today the money they make, the amount of attention paid to them. Basketball seems to be, at the moment, the sport of choice in major cities. It's very music and show businessoriented. The NBA has capitalized on this with their promo spots and use of music. In Los Angeles especially, Irv Azoff, Jerry Weintraub and myself all have floor seats to the Laker games. We're all identified. Of course, we pay some suicidal price for these tickets, and, obviously, if we couldn't afford it, we wouldn't do it, but it's become my other persona. I'm identified by as many people as the Laker guy in the highlight films as I am the head of a record company. People stop me and say, "Oh yeah, I saw you on TV last night at the Laker game." We make fools of ourselves and travel with the team.

Why did you really write this book?

After all these years in the business, it gave me a chance to go through my life and an opportunity to talk with the likes of a Bob Dylan or a Woody Herman, which was fantastic. In the past, the relationships I've had with artists have always been across a desk. This was a great odyssey for me. In one day, for instance, I interviewed Tex Beneke, Bo Diddley and Linda Ronstadt, three people who I don't think had ever heard of each other. It's an interesting and fun book to read. Anyone who has anything to do with pop music will find something in there.





What was the inspiration behind naming the group New Kids On The Block?

On our first album, we had a rap tune called "New Kids On The Block" and at the time we were called by the name Nanuk. What does Nanuk mean? Who knows? It was made up by our producer but we didn't like it either. So one day we all agreed to change the name of the group to New Kids On The Block after the song and it seemed at the time to be the logical choice. As you can see, we made the right decision.

Did you all know one another before getting involved in the group?

We really weren't a group. Donny

Wahlberg and I had gone to school together. We were best friends, sort of, even before we got in the group. And we knew Jordon and Jon Knight, who are brothers. We all took part in the auditions, so we're real lucky to be able to work together.

Did you consciously attempt to crossover to a pop audience with this new LP?

The first album was more of an experimental project than anything else. We didn't know too much about the business. With this record, we were able to be ourselves and do more of what we wanted to do. We all participated creatively. I engineered most of the album and even co-wrote a song on it. We even got a chance to choose ſЦ

Angin' Tough" is the second album on CBS Records for New Kids On The Block, sort of Boston's answer to the Beastie Boys, except more well-behaved. They had a hit record with their first single, "Please Don't Go Girl," a surprise Top Ten smash, and now they've just released the follow-up, "You Got It (The Right Stuff)." The Kids were discovered and put together four years ago by Maurice Starr, the brainchild behind New Edition, who held a city-wide search for five guys under 18 that could sing, dance and rap. Six months of auditions fanded Donny Wahlberg as the first member of the group. Donny found Danny Wood and Jordon Knight who, in turn, brought older brother Jon on board as well. Joe McIntyre, who replaced the original lead singer when his parents refused to allow him to be in show business at such a young age, completed the line-up. A savvy, streetwise Danny Wood took time out of his busy schedule for one of those exclusive Hits interviews (which appear everywhere else) with Jesse Nash.

the songs for the album with Maurice Starr.

Tell me a little bit about your professional relationship with Maurice Starr.

He's our big brother. Our best friend. He's as close to each one of us as you can get. We tell each other everything.

What made you want to get off the streets?

I remember one time I was at this club in Boston and a whole bunch of fights were breaking out and carrying over to the street outside the club. I saw this guy I knew...well, I wasn't really friends with him or anything like that, but I had seen him around the neighborhood. And he just pulled out a gun and started shooting at this guy across the street who started shooting back at him. I crawled undemeath a car and prayed that I'd get out alive. Everybody hit the ground. It was sick! After that I never went to clubs much. It was

How does your family feel about your involvement with New Kids On The Block?

Well, at first they were a little skeptical because at the time that we were recording the second album, I got a scholarship to Boston University but I really wasn't in to going to college because I was engineering the record and doing so many things on it. I was learning more than I could ever learn in school. Even my professors said I should stick with the group and that, if I wanted to, I could always go back to school later in my life. Hey, it was a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity and I wasn't about to blow it. My parents wanted me to stay in school but now everything has worked out fine since we've had a hit record.

How are you handling success?

I think I'm handling it quite well, thank you. I define success as the fact that we have hit records. New Kids On The Block is selling lots of records.....that is success for me.

just around that time I joined the group. I said to myself, "Self...I've had enough!" I had to do something constructive with my life. All of us in the group had the confidence that we would make it one day. This gives us a chance to do another album. People listen to you when you have a hit record. Success has given us a lot of respect from people, particularly in the record industry. And we like that most of all.

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

The Waterboys, "Fisherman's Blues" (Ensign/Chrysalis): Scottish bard Mike Scott's the temperamental genius behind this highly-touted Ireland-based outfit, and he comes through with a stunning amalgam of "into the mystic" lyrics and a traditional Celtic sound, spiced with jig-inducing fiddles. High-

lights include the **Dylan**-esque title track and a shimmering version of **Van Morrison**'s "Sweet Thing," which magically turns into the **Beatles**' "Blackbird." More than a surfire PoMo pick, this is one of the albums of the year.

Nick Cave & the Bad Seeds, "Tender Prey" (Mute/Enigma): Aussie psychobilly and ex-member of seminal noisers Birthday Party, hooks up with fellow crazies Mick Harvey (Crime & The City Solution), Blixa Bargeld (Einsturzende Neubaten) and Kid Congo (Gun Club) in a veritable PoMo



all-star squad. The result is a cultural stew which melts down no wave, blues, country, punk and lotsa attitude, with nods to Jim Morrison, Lou Reed and Bertolt Brecht. The '60s garage anthem, "Deanna," should be a Post-Modern mainstay.



Ofra Haza, "Shaday" (Sire/WB): At times, this Israeli superstar singer/songwriter comes across as a Yemenite Madonna ("Take Me To Paradise") or a Hebrew Sade ("Face to Face"). It's when she uses that high-tech sheen on haunting, traditional folk songs like "I'm Nin'Alu," the Bible-

derived "Love Song" or the title track, that Haza's "Middle East meets West" synthesis is most uniquely expressed. With the current interest in "world music," her Semitic disco hybrid could well make inroads at both PoMo and dance outlets.

"National Velvet" (EMI): Toronto-based quartet's atmospheric gothic-rock, highlighted by dark beauty Maria Del Mar's husky, siren-like vocals and wall-towall guitars (as on the lead track, "Flesh Under Skin") recalls such forebears as Siouxsie and the Banshees ("Equus"), but also more mainstream acts



Jefferson Airplane ("Change My Mind") and the Pretenders ("Pacifist at Risk"). There are some nice psychedelic production touches by John Naslen, as well as a sense of theater that should translate well live.
