

MR. DES GOESTOTOWN

interview

Since 1982, Rick Dees has probably been the leading radio personality in America. His Top 40 show is heard on over 350 stations across the U.S., his American Music Magazine goes around the world via the Armed Forces Network, and he remains by far the dominant broadcasting presence in the nation's leading radio market, Southern California.

Originally from Florida, Dees first honed his talent at a series of small stations in the South before scoring big with a novelty record, "Disco Duck," and making the move to L.A. But after a disastrous start and a year of being told by program directors that he "just didn't have what it takes," he hooked up with KIIS-FM, and the rest, as they say, is Arbitron history.

Dees has now won the trade award as Radio Personality of the Year for five years running, the Gavin Report Media Professional Award three years running, and after seven smash years at KIIS, has just been signed to a new, extremely lucrative 5-year contract. He faces his biggest challenge yet as both Scott Shannon and Buzz Bennett are coming to town with guns blazing for what promises to be a Top 40 morning drive warzone. May the best man win and hock up his Laker tix to HITS.



You're the leading d.j. in the No. 1 radio market in America. What's your secret?

It's a God-given thing that's happened to me, because I feel I've always done the same thing, but at some point it started to kick in. I've always played the clown and liked to make people laugh, and twice in my career-once in Memphis and once here in L.A.— it all fell into place and just took off. It's a mixture of good timing and just being prepared, I suppose.

What's the major challenge of doing a morning show?

Getting up that early! And then having to sound bright-eved and bushy-tailed every day. Fortunately, I'm a morning person and I don't mind getting up at 4 AM. But I can also sleep late. I was fired from KHI when I first came to L.A. They decided to go country and they brought in a pair of boots and said, "If these fit, you can stay on the air".... but they didn't fit. Anyway, I was off the air for some time, and I began to sleep again, and I became less

and less of a morning person. It was quite an experience to stay up late again.

What time do you hit the sack now?

Oh, about 4:15 in the afternoon! No, but I do get to bed before my 10-year old son most nights. I go down about 9 and he goes about 9:10.

Doesn't that early bedtime cramp your social life?

Yes, there's very little partying, but you have to make a decision. If you want a morning show and a great social life, you have to give up something. But there are some advantages. If I want to see Michael Jackson, say, I can catch the show. which you can't do if you're on the air at night.

You always manage to sound perky in the morning, but there have to be days when

you're in a foul mood, or there's something pissing you off.

Oh, yeah! There are days like that. Fortunately, I have a great support staff on the show producer Paul Joseph, Liz Fulton, Charleye Wright- and at least one of 'em will be charged and excited, so even if my energy level's down a tad, they pick it up. Even if I'm sick and feeling terrible, I always force myself to come in. I've never missed a day so far. The other thing I can do is take a tape of a phone conversation from three or four years ago, say, "I gotta hit the phones" and boom— it's me at my best again.

The radio wars are really heating up in L.A., what with PWR106's Jay Thomas nipping at your heels and now Scott Shannon coming to town. How do you react to the challenge of staying on

teners (laughs)—that I haven't given it much thought. I enjoy what I do and I just like to concentrate on that. You know. I heard that one of our listeners has died, so we're down to just six now. So you can imagine the problems. But seriously, once we started being really successful, I knew people would try and take shots at us and try to dilute that success, but that's just big business, big radio. I have ideas, and secrets, in terms of reaction to not only Jay Thomas and Scott Shannon, but Buzz Bennett and the rest of the competitors who're doing focus studies etc. to see where our Achilles' heel is, but I'm not going to say anything 'cause they'll probably read it right here in HITS!

You don't sound too worried about the increased competition.

To be really honest with you, I'm not that worried, and I'll tell you why. I had fun when I was on the bottom, I had fun when I was on the top, and I'm

having fun now that I'm back on the bottom again.

Do you really think there's room in this town for Scott Shannon, Buzz Bennett and yourself?

Let them prove themselves like I had to. It's a thirteen million person market out there. We've got seven— or is it six of 'em?— so I guess there's room.

Are you going to change your show at all once these guys start up?

Sure, I'm going country. (Laughs) And if that doesn't work, I'm going Hindu. I want to be No. 1 at the 7-11's so I'm going all-Hindu from 7 till 8 AM, and then I'm doing all-Mariachi from 8 till 9.

So you're not going to comment on the situation?

No I'm not. I knew you were going to ask me about it, and all I'll say is, let's see what happens.

If nothing else, all the activity suggests Top 40 has never been healthier.

You're absolutely right. It's boom time. But then I feel it always has been. If you play the hits and do it well, people want to listen to you.

How did you get started in radio?

At a bunch of small stations in the south. I grew up in Greensboro, NC, and I was always the class clown in school, because I was a fat little boy, and that was my way of winning people over— instead of yelling "fatty," they'd call me funny. And fat. (Laughs).
Anyway, I learned an act, and it's taken me until now to really perfect it. I started at WGBG in Greensboro doing the Sunday morning tapes, so my first impression was of Billy Graham. I then had a country show, but that didn't work out, and went to WCOG where they made me change my name, which was really Rig— short for Rigdon.
My real name is actually Rigdon

and she came up with the budget— all of \$500 to do the whole thing!— and we cut it for Fretone Records, a subsidiary of Stax for all the bad artists. As fate would have it, the musicians we used had just come off the road with guys like Isaac Hayes, and they were so tight. So, for \$500 we cut this incredible rhythm track, but we couldn't afford to do anything else. I had to kick in \$100 myself, just to finish off the vocals.

Who did all the duck sounds?

A guy named Ken Prewitt who worked with me and did the greatest duck noises ever.

Were you surprised when it took off?

"I want to be No. 1 at the 7-11's so I'm going all-Hindu from 7 till 8 AM."

Osmond Dees III! But the P.D. forced me to use "Jay Howard," so for a whole year, I went on as Jay Howard. Funnily enough, I went back to WCOG last year and there's nothing there now, which is real sad.

"Disco Duck" was your big break. How did that record happen?

I was working at a station in Birmingham, AL, doing the morning show- ironically, it was opposite Scott Shannon, in 1973— and I was so bad, they were just about to fire me. But I landed another morning show in Memphis, and I was still bad until this guy, Art Wander, told me to just be myself and stop trying to sound like other people. The next morning was the first time I was just me, and it worked. So for the next year, I had a blast, trying out different voices and writing these little parody songs, and then I hooked up with Estelle Axton, co-owner of Stax Records, who suggested making a record. I came up with "Disco Duck,"

You kidding? I sent it to a bunch of friends in radio who started getting big requests, but my station wouldn't let me play it because they thought it was a conflict of interest. Anyway, I mentioned it one day on the air because by now it was doing real well- Al Coury and RSO had picked it up for \$3000 for all the rights, by the way. I just got a penny royalty from time to time, and I did all the shows like "American Bandstand," etc., to promote the record. Still, when I returned to Memphis, I was out of a

How did you finally make the move to L.A.?

RKO picked me up at WHBQ, which was the first station to ever play an Elvis song, and then RKO asked me if I'd consider moving to KHJ out here. And I thought I'd come out here and kill 'em, what with all the sucess of "Disco Duck" and its follow-ups, but it just didn't happen. So I know all about losing as well as winning.

Do you think there'll be another disco revival?

There already has been. They just don't call it disco. If you listen to "Flashlight" by Parliament back in the '70s and then Bobby Brown doing "My Prerogative," it's the same exact sound. Now it's called dance music. People will always like that dance feel and sound whatever it's called.

What's your feeling about shock radio?

I think if you say the f-word once today, you gotta say it twice tomorrow. I prefer to shock people with new ideas, like buying the Uzis and AK47's and challenging the mayor to a rowboat race across the Mississippi. I think foul-mouthed, dirty humor is just embarrassing to people after a while, and when they leave a personality like that, trust me, they ain't coming back.

What do you listen to at home?

I like R&B and dance music, and anything with tight harmonies. I also listen to KIIS a lot to see how the mix is working.

What music turns you off?

Too much rap. Hearing forty of 'em in a row gets me down. It also has to be a great country song to really turn me on.

Are you planning to do more television and film work?

Yeah, I love comedy acting, and that's basically what I do on the radio. So I'm going to keep doing my bit on "USA Today— The Television Show" and perhaps more parts like the one I did in "La Bamba." Of course, I'm also opening up a Herbal Life distributorship and Amway is a big winner for me.

Has success spoiled Rick Dees?

Oh yeah!





THE LATEST ON UP AND COMING BANDS

It's spring tour time again First off, Elvis Costello, whose new "Spike" album on WARNERS is getting the customary raves, is doing a solo acoustic tour of East Coast colleges starting in Rhode Island on April 1st, before returning to England in May for four Sundays at the London Palladium, and then a return trip to the U.S., possibly with a full band Crowded House start their long-delayed North American tour in March and fellow Aussies the Go-Betweens, whose "16 Lovers Lane" album was one of the most underrated of last year, do likewise, kicking off in Vancouver March 9th. For the already-converted, the new 12" pro of the band's "Streets of Your Town" on CAPITOL contains four unreleased tracks on the B-side...... Underground dance band Moev are touring behind their major label debut on ATLANTIC with the title track, "Yeah Whatever," getting some attention...... XTC are starting out strong with "Mayor of Simpleton," the first of many great radio tracks from the upcoming "Oranges and Lemons" LP on GEFFEN Tanita Tikaram is also doing well, crossing over in many areas with the fine "Twist in my Sobriety" from her "Ancient Heart" album on REPRISE Fine Young Cannibals' "Raw and Cooked" album goes deeper than the first hit, but bet on "Ever Fallen in Love," the old Buzzcocks' classic, to make another comeback as the follow-up to "She Drives Me Crazy"...... SOLO CITY: Expect a Tom Petty solo album in April called "Full Moon Rising" on MCA; an acoustic Graham Parker work from RCA; and a Robyn Hitchcock solo LP later in the year, while his latest, with his band the Egyptians, is out this month on A&M Former Echo & the Bunnymen frontman lan McCulloch is working on his first effort sans band; and so is Tim Finn, brother and former Split Enz colleague of Crowded House's Neil Finn, whose album is out shortly on CAPITOL, produced by Mitchell Froom and featuring pop gems like "Not Even Close" and "Tears Inside"..... Kate Bush is also at work on a new album for EMI due for release later in the year RCA has picked up two East Coast bands with strong alternative pedigrees in the Brandos and the new look Del Fuegos. Both bands plan on spring releases And a correction: It was, of course, the Slammin' Watusis, not Screaming, which graced the Whisky last week with Pursuit of Happiness. Their new EPIC release is "Kings of Noise"..... Also mentioned last week, RCA's Irish hopeful Pierce Turner made a strong impression in his L.A. club debut before an attentive industry crowd. The always-wonderful Lucinda Williams opened the show with material from her ROUGH TRADE release...... The long-awaited Concrete Blonde second album, "Free," is finally scheduled for release in April on I.R.S...... Holly Johnson, former Frankie Goes to Hollywood singer, has a solo album coming on UNI featuring his UK hit "Love Train"..... Noted reggae producer Linval Thompson gets help from Sly & Robbie and the great horn player Dean Fraser on his own project on ISLAND, "Starlight"...... Criticallyacclaimed Canadian alternative band the Tragically Hip have been signed to MCA with a self-titled debut EP coming in April..... The crewcut troubador, who silenced a rowdy Smiths crowd a few years ago with her mesmerizing stage presence, is currently auditioning what several observers are calling stunning new material, most recently while opening for Clive Gregson and Christine Collister at McCabe's. No longer with Rhino Records and currently looking for a deal, Phranc may well be just too "frank" for an industry that prefers to tiptoe around the issue of homosexuality.

HARK THE HERALD: L.A. Herald's long-suffering Todd Everett has responded to Professor Sandow's shape-up-or-ship out ultimatum with a condemned man's zeal. Hey, the guy's even covering heavy metal acts and getting to the office by 9 AM (Even I wouldn't go that far to keep a job!!) wenty-four-year-old Manchester, UK native Andy Perry first formed Easterhouse almost seven years ago with his brother Ivor and several relatives. After a couple of indie releases on Rough Trade, the band debuted on CBS with "Contenders" two years ago, which they supported with a brief U.S. tour. For the new album, "Waiting For The Redbird," Perry assembled a whole new group of musicians with a polished sound, but his passionate interest in social issues has not been tempered at all on tracks like the title cut, "Hope And Glory," "Sweatshop" and the arena anthem, "Come Out Fighting." Perry hooked up with us from London, where he told HITS he's looking forward to communicating his radical perspective live to American audiences this spring.

You were seventeen years old when you started Easterhouse. Why did you break up the group?

When you're young and getting started. you want to go ahead and just do it. As time went on, we achieved a few things we set out to achieve. I suppose we began to feel our differences a little more. I wanted to go forward, make the whole thing bigger and try to reach more people. Whereas, they didn't really have the drive to do that. You can only get by on enthusiasm and ideas for so long, then you have to start producing things a little more accomplished and mature. That was one of the things we argued about. The others thought it was viable to carry on the way we were, and I didn't. In the end, I had to make the leap and say, it's gotta be done this way, no matter what the cost.

You haven't toned down your political stance, though.

Just because the music is more produced, more controlled and more subtle doesn't mean you have to tone down your ideas. I think it has even more of an effect to put forward a strong political message without having the music be noisy or out of control. People

tend to associate left-wing ideas with noise and lack of musical discipline, but I just don't feel that's true.

Your records tend to deal with particularly English situations. Can they translate here?

I've decided to write about what I know

from the start, and you should never do that. The things I'm singing about are not just specific to England. They affect all of Europe and western society and that includes America.

One of the album's centerpiece songs, "America," seems to have an ambivalent attitude about the U.S.

It is a very emotional song and it does relate to aspects of American society. I don't hold to the idea that, if it's American, it's necessarily bad. The song isn't meant to be an attack. It's my means of communicating directly with the American people.

The title track is about the threat of nuclear annhilation.

I've lived with this notion of apocalypse now since I was born. Where I live, there's been such massive economic devastation, how much worse could nuclear war be than what we're going through now? That's what I was trying to say, with an element of almost black humor to it.


the realization that the whole set of assumptions we once held in common is bankrupt. Which obviously leaves more room for new ideas to emerge. And that's where the optimism comes in. When things are at their darkest, perhaps the dawn is just ahead.

Do you feel any contradiction in espousing those radical views for a multi-national corporation like CBS?

(Laughs) If it suits Sony to put out my record and it suits me, we have a common interest. At least for awhile. I feel it's positive that this large corporation is putting out music with a message that may well be the antithesis of what they stand for. I suppose there's some humor in that somewhere. Though sometimes I'm hard-pressed to see it.

Do you mind if people don't get the politics of your music?

If I do what I set out to do well, those ideas will be presented in a way that, over a period of time, can be thought about. Then people can make their own



best and I'm trusting those broader ideas we have in common with each other will come through in the end.

Would you like to see Easterhouse reach the amount of people, say, U2 does?

Maybe a few years ago, I wouldn't have, but now I do. If you're going to do something small, you set limits upon it

There are other parts of the record that are quite hopeful, though.

I do believe we're moving toward some kind of truth, not just in England, but the western world as a whole. More people are finding themselves face to face with evaluation. I'm not trying to win any ideological war, but I do want to present a certain perspective which I hope will have repercussions. If I do me job well, people will be able to come to those ideas, not under duress or fear, but as a simple, natural progression of listening to Easterhouse.

INTERVIEW BY ROY TRAKIN

Born and raised in Boca Raton, FL, Philips has had radio jobs in Charleston, SC, Orlando, FL and Cleveland, OH, before he settled in at his current post as P.D. at

KDWB in Minneapolis last March. His most recent claim to fame— discovering the Swedish hit by Roxette, currently breaking big-time at Top 40.

How did you find the Roxette song?

It's one strange story. I had a kid named Dean Cushman drop by the station who visited Sweden with a student group. Of course, Roxette is enormous over there, on the radio all the time. Dean brought it back home to Mankato, MN., where the only radio station is K-DOG. By the way, K-DOG hasn't added Roxette-they're kind of hanging out to see if it's going to happen—but we are. This kid drove in all the way from Mankato, came up to the radio station and said that he was told, to get a record played on KDWB, he had to see Brian Philips. And he wouldn't leave. He said he loved the station and wanted us to have the record. Finally, I agreed to listen and get back to him when I was through. A couple of days later, I finally got around to putting it on and the first cut that came up was "You Got The Look." Everyone around the station kind of liked it, which is kind of a dumb reason to put a record on when you think about it. It reacted quickly enough for us on the air, but I really wanted more feedback so I sent it to Todd Fisher and also to Bob Case, who bicycled it around to the other stations in the Nationwide chain through Guy Zapoleon. Pretty soon X100 is talking about it and I hear it on the KIIS listen line and I think, maybe there is something here. EMI hustled to get it and I hope that it does real well. It's exciting for us and it's exciting for Dean Cushman.

Where's Dean Cushman now?

He is a computer science major, but he is now considering a job in the record industry. Honest to God. A VP of promotion who shall remain nameless, said that anybody that can go sit in a radio station and not leave until he sees the PD to work him on a record he had no personal interest in, was



born to promote. I've seen Dean Cushman more than I've seen certain salaried local promotion people here the last year.

Do you feel that the new Arbitron diary is responsible for the drop that a lot of Top 40 stations had in the fall book?

It's a little different problem than Arbitron has typically had with radio. Arbitron has found itself in a little bit of a no-win situation, where radio collectively campaigned to have something done to stop the overall decline in listening levels. And as listening levels shoot up, certain formats, Top 40 in particular, get hurt. It puts them in a delicate position. Which master are you going to serve? Is there going to be a strong Top 40 lobby against a soft diary? Top 40, Album Radio, everybody has an axe to grind with this thing. I mean, what's the alternative? Are we going to ask them to knock listening levels down? Make more modifications in the diary? The fact is, we said we wanwe've got it. It just doesn't happen to be falling into our format. We may just have to face the fact that

reality has shifted.


Why does it seem that, with all the P.D. changes at a lot of the majors, you keep hearing the same names? Why aren't more good young P.D.'s from smaller markets getting shots?

That subject has come up with a lot of programmers I talk with. Can you believe all the money out there for people who can program Top 40 successfully? There are several factors involved. If you have an important radio property worth \$20 or \$40 million or \$70 million, you have to make sure something happens. And the safest way to make sure you will have an immediate impact is to hire someone with a track record. I read something recently I thought was interesting. It said the total purchase price of KIQQ, including Scott Shannon, was \$70 million. Now, Scott is the best there is, but I was surprised to hear him treated like a piece of real estate. Somebody once said, the thing about radio is the assets take the elevator and go home very night. Stations are looking for people with high profiles who have a reputation for building good radio stations. There are a lot of stations out there looking for a quick fix.

It's just real tough for a young guy to crack that market. It's a slow process. Often it can come down to just finding one good mentor who can open doors for other people. Take Chuck Beck in Detroit, for instance, who has obviously, even though I'm not intimately familiar with the market. done a good job. Here is someone who was able to hook up with Buzz Bennett and, as a result, get a shot at a major market job. I talk to M.D.'s at other stations and am impressed that someday they'll make good programmers. There will always be a new crop.

native of St. Paul, MN, Mark attended the University of Minnesota where he worked at the college station, WMMR-AM. He spent a few years in Minneapolis, doing research at KDWB, where he eventually moved to director. Mark joined KPKE in Denver as an Assistant P.D., before moving crosstown and taking over as Operations Manager at Y108, a post he's held since 1986.

How have the new Arbitron diaries affected your ratings?

It's really too early for us to tell the exact impact of the new diary vs. the old diary. In Denver, we have bigger areas of concern in that our samples have been reduced from 2100 in fall '87 to 1474 last fall, which is a dramatic reduction. Denver has always been a highreturn diary market. We've seen a lot of fluctuations in the market and some odd numbers we're still trying to evaluate. We've seen stations go from 1st to 10th to 1st again. We've seen individual demo cells and individual dayparts go from a 6 share to a 24 share. We see a lot of those things happening and they are areas of concern.

The other big change was adding "office" as a response to "where do you listen?"

What are you doing to alleviate the problems these changes have presented?

The only thing we can do is try to play the Arbitron game, understand how it works and how these things can affect us. We've got to focus our attention on doing whatever we possibly can to score some of those points and negate the additional problems we face with a new diary totally beneficial to those in-office stations. We've always targeted ourselves towards the in-office person and the housewife with free lunch promotions. We're not going to change anything dramatically. It's going to be harder to do well when the background music stations certainly seem to be in a position of advantage right now. We just have to do the best we possibly can to get as many offices and businestion or lean that way. I have to be something else by finding a niche that isn't being served as opposed to competing with them directly. But we do share audiences and it's a good way to find out whether a record is working or not, which we can do pretty quickly.

How do you feel about Post-Modern music's chances at Top 40 success?

The way I feel about it is, give me anything halfway decent. 1988 was not a banner year for music. I'll look at any of these records if they have the sound that fits my radio station and people want to hear them. There's a place in Top 40 for this music just like there's a place here for rap and hard rock. Eighteen months ago, people would've heard Guns N' Roses and said, no way. We'll play it if it's right.

What is unique about the Denver market?

We have the most radio stations in the country here. There are close to 45 stations serving a market of 1.5 million. It's tough, because you Interview By Danny Ostrow

Changing the emphasis from what radio station did you listen to, to what radio station did you hear will certainly benefit those stations programmed and designed to be used in an "office" setting. Album Radio and Top 40 aren't going to get a lot of in-office listeners. In the fall book we saw an increase in "in office" listenership for our midday area. We have one of the highest percentages of audience listening in the office or away from home. But it's still going to benefit the softer stations, those that businesses feel more comfortable with in an office environment.

How does Album Radio's success in the Denver market affect the way you program Y108?

I've always shared pretty well with the Album stations. There's a high percentage of sharing in Denver because there are so many radio stations. If I was the average listener out there, I would want a lot of stations to listen to, also. Even though it's an Album Radio town, with the variety of those kind of stations, I can't be an Album sta-

have a tremendous amount of sharing and not a lot of loyalty. Economically, Denver is depressed and the radio economy isn't any better. And since we're all fighting for business, that causes many changes. Denver is also a real melting pot for the country. We not only get the kids off the farm in Nebraska, we get a great many easterners and west coast people with different psychographic profiles and personalities when it comes to what they want to hear in music. All this makes it difficult to know exactly what is preferred here musically.

An exclusive HITS interview with C O W B O Y J U N K I E S



If the Velvet Underground had played blues and country music, they might have sounded as cool as the Cowboy Junkies. This highly-touted Canadian band has brought a sense of mystery to pop music, a strength that relies on a sparse "less is more" musicianship. The mesmerizing vocals of Margo Timmins reveal new sides to old standards, while making group originals refreshingly familiar. No one since Hank Williams himself has made "I'm So Lonesome I Could Cry" so darn lonesome nor startled you more than Lou Reed did on "Sweet Jane." She makes every note count and sound as necessary as a heartbeat.

The rest of the Junkies— Margo's brothers Michael and Peter and their friend Alan Anton— mirror her voice with moody, evocative music that makes the Cowboy Junkies a shared vision. The ethereal songs of the "The Trinity Session" pull at the heart and tug at the emotions like nothing this side of Nashville or New York. The recording's superlative sound is a tribute to the past and to today's modern technology of recording. It was cut live at Toronto's Church of the Holy Trinity with one microphone direct to two-track digital and no overdubs. Kinda like this interview.

Vorld Radio History

How and why was "The Trinity Session" recorded the way it was?

It started with our first album, "Whites Off Earth Now!!" We knew it would cost a lot to get the sound we wanted in a studio. Recording live seemed to answer both issues. Our producer, Peter Moore, had recorded the Toronto Symphony in the Church of the Holy Trinity for its pure acoustics. We trusted him.

How could a four-piece band record in such a large building?

Peter measured the room mathematically, figured where to put the microphone, and arranged us around it. We played a song, he listened and moved us around some more. This went on for seven hours. It got hairy. We were afraid it wouldn't work. The church was so big and airy, the music wouldn't join. Finally, we were at the front door and it worked. We played a song, he moved us around to get a balance and mix and we played and recorded. Peter depends on us to find our own dynamics for a particular song. For example, it was up to me to sing louder as I thought it needed to be. Once we found the spot, we spent about seven hours getting the songs done. It flowed so smoothly, though.

What is it about this album that attracts people?

Our record has a human sound. There are mistakes. You can hear vocals breathing and feet stomping. It intrigues people. Peter's commitment to live recording started when he got his CD player several years ago. He listened to Dire Straits and liked it, but he thought old Billie Holiday recordings sounded better and figured out why. It was because they were done live in the studio. Peter uses advanced technology, but without overdubbing. There is no mixing. A lot of people are afraid of that. In our world, mistakes aren't allowed. People have come to believe recordings are supposed to be perfect.

The ambience of "The Trinity Session" almost makes it sound like a single uninterrupted piece.

One writer described it as "an unfolding story." That was our inten-



tion, in a way. We play because we like to. Coming from the perspective of a Canadian act that was an independent, with no hopes of any more than that, we could approach the music as it felt good to us, even though it isn't the most marketable sound.

How much did these recordings cost to make?

About \$200, \$150 of which went to rent the church. We gave the caretaker a little extra because we ran overtime. We ordered pizza. Our first album cost about \$50. That was for food. Peter has his own equipment and the musicians played for points on the album. So did Peter. That way, we all share in the album's success.

How do you select cover songs?

We want cover tunes to guide listeners. I think that makes it easier for them to hear our songs. We were listening to Hank Williams a lot when we wrote songs for "Trinity." "I'm So Lonesome I Could Cry" is one of the most beautiful songs I've ever heard. I wanted to do a Patsy Cline song, but I didn't want to be another female trying to sound like her. On "Crazy" for example, I couldn't break away from her. The boys started a 12-bar blues and we tried "Walking After Midnight." I felt I could make that work. I'm a big Waylon Jennings fan. "Dreaming My Dreams" is so romantic. We chose these songs because they struck us. We work long and hard on covers, more than the originals. If you're about to redo a Hank Williams song, you better do it well. I can't improve on his version. I wanted to bring these songs into 1989 and reinterpret them, with my own influences and experiences, so

people could feel it meant something to them, too.

Will your next album reflect the same approach?

We will record five sessions in five rooms, using each room as a different instrument. For example, a song like "Mining For Gold," which was sang a cappella, is best in a room with a dreamy sound. So we'd go to the church. If we want a wooden sound, we'd go to a wooden room. There will be at least three covers, one of which is Neil Young's "Powderfinger." We've also been singing Springsteen's "My Father's House" a cappella.

Who came up with the band's name?

One of us, but we don't remember who. We weren't sure what it meant, but we liked it. We named the band to get attention, so people would be curious. When they heard the music, they were really confused. Radio people tell us listeners do remember our name, where they don't some other acts. I don't think the name is a negative. Junkie is kind of a buzz word..... there are political junkies and junk food junkies. We're not drug junkies. When you see us, we're the kids next door. There was no pressure from RCA to change our name. When other labels were interested, they asked us to change it and we did consider it. We tried to think of another that would fit, but we felt it would change the music. We felt the music was more important than the name.

Lou Reed says your version of his song "Sweet Jane" is the most faithful he's ever heard.


were. We approach other people's songs with total respect. I hope people respect my songs as much when ours get covered. If Willie Nelson would record "Misguided Angel," I'd be a rich woman! I'd also love to hear Emmylou Harris sing "To Love Is To Bury." I totally respect her.

What other singers do you admire?

I love Waylon Jennings and Merle Haggard. They are very honest about music. I think they approach music the way we do. If it sounds good to them, they'll do it. In rock, I love Bob Dylan, even though he isn't honest all the time. But I really liked his last album. It was like he was playing music for himself. I'm a huge Bruce Springsteen fan. I couldn't get "Tunnel Of Love" off the turntable. "Nebraska" is one of my favorites of all time. Those men write from the heart.

Do you anticipate any changes in the band's style for the future?

I'm not ready to belt a song yet, but I will when it's time. I'm growing that way. Someday I can see us doing a quality pop album like "Rumours." Right now, we're still into country. Our new music is fuller. "To Love Is To Bury" points in the direction of our newer music. I'd like to have the kind of careers my heroes had Springsteen, Randy Newman, Leonard Cohen. They don't put out lots of albums, but their records are all quality. They change as you change. I admire people who have guts to try new things.
