



Tashjian Pleads Guilty

Independent Promoter **Ralph Tashjian** pleaded guilty last Monday to one count of making undisclosed payment to a radio station employee. In addition, Tashjian pleaded guilty to one count of suscribing to a false tax return and one obstruction of justice charge.

Under terms of the guilty pleas, other charges, including 168 additional payola counts, are being dropped by the federal government.

The conviction is the first in the government's longrunning, often chaotic investigation of payola, and its first-ever conviction under the 30-year-old payola statute.

Tashjian faces a maximum sentence of nine years in prison and fines of up to \$265,000.

No sentencing date has been set at this time.

"Since 'Yo MTV Raps' moved to a daily 4-4:30pm slot, rap sales have gone to another plateau altogether," said John Grandoni of Cavages. "We've noticed that the more affluent of a community that the store is in, the *better* the rap sales are. It seems to be a suburban white rebellion kind of thing."

Once again, the video generation has proven its influence by showing a marked increase in purchases of rap projects. The numbers on the eight rap albums currently on this week's **Hits'** Top Fifty Albums Chart tell the whole story: **#7 Tone Loc**; **#21 Slick Rick**; **#25 De La Soul**; **#27 NWA**; **#28 Too Short**; **#30 Easy E**; **#37 MC Hammer** and **#45 Rob Base**.

"The success we're having now with rap, parallels what we did with hard rock and metal," said MTV chief **Lee Masters**, who cited that the tremendous increase in rap sales has come with little or no radio support. "Yo radio, stop being dickheads," yelled Masters. "Play these records."

Incidentally, "Yo MTV Raps" moves to an hour format (4-5pm) beginning June 6. So, our advice to retailers is simple ... Yo, stock more records, it's getting bigger!



CAPITOL RECORDS **MONTH:** Now that May is coming to a close, it is time to look back, look ahead and evaluate the impact of the strong releases and aggressive marketing campaign showcased by Capitol Records. The releases and strong early showings by McCartney, Paul The Doobie Brothers, Donny Osmond. Great White and Bonnie Raitt are the strongest cards shown to date by the "new" Capitol and easily validate the aggressive stance shown by the label. Upcoming albums from Billy Squier, Queen, Peabo Bryson and the Beastie Boys will, no doubt, add to the momentum. So, let's take a look at each project and its impact.

The Doobie Brothers' comeback album is off to a sensational start. The first single, "Music Is The Doctor," has gained instant radio acceptance and is already pulling phones at most stations. But, this cut is merely the tip of the iceberg. The album is full of potential hit records, sounding instantly familiar and like a greatest hits package. We strongly suggest "South Of The Border" and "Time Is Here And Gone" as immediate follow-ups.

As for Mr. McCartney, one thing is instantly obvious. His pairing with Elvis Costello has added the needed edge. Paul's single has been welcomed with open arms by the usually skeptical Top 40 PDs. Now the public must react, and this reaction will be followed closely here. We are optimistic of success. So,

stay tuned!

Donny Osmond has gotten over the image hump, scored a Top Five single, and, more importantly, is on the verge of a quick follow-up. And, as for **Bonnie Raitt**, album sales and hot video play have already yelled, "winner." Her album is firmly lodged in the 20s and could climb higher with further exposure.

Finally, and perhaps most importantly, is Great White. This band "just missed" going mass appeal with their last album, and now is on the verge of exploding with their latest. The sales are approaching platinum as the "Once Bitten" 45 is proving its mettle at radio. If this single closes, and all the signs are there, Great White will take its place in multiplatinum metal heaven. which will give the label a home grown winner to crow about.

So, all in all, the early signals point to a very successful May launching and a promising summer landing for the folks in the Capitol Tower. And, we can't help but root for them to revitalize this once-powerful label, strengthening the entire record business as they go.



biggest hit, *She's Not There*, broke a year after the group disbanded. It's an irony that isn't lost on former Zombie guitarist and present RCA West Coast Vice President of A&R Paul Atkinson. Atkinson didn't spend much time mourning the demise of the Zombies. though he served a brief stint as a computer programmer, where he helped create the original BBC chart program. From there, he moved onto publishing, then into A&R: first with CBS UK, then CBS International in New York. Six years ago, he arrived in Los Angeles at RCA ,where he's responsible for Mr. Mister, The Cowboy Junkies, Bruce Hornsby, Boy Meets Girl and many others. The key here, though, is remembering Atkinson began his career as a "zombie" and not as the well-dressed executive you now see.

You started as an artist. Do you miss that?

No. After the group had broken off, I did a lot of sessions around London, which I hated. It was really good money, but I hated it. You have to have the brain for it, the mental ability to focus really clearly. That's when I went into computer programming. I missed making records. I didn't ever really get a big buzz out of performance. There were exceptions, of course; it was always great to look out from the stage and see 20,000 people screaming. But I had done that for five years. It's

a great memory, and I didn't really want to tamper with that. I never was in another band before or since. I never felt the desire. In the five or six years of (its existence), I got to go around the world with the band and have a lot of hits. But I really wanted to be in the record business.

What about being a producer?

That was my first goal. I thought that being a producer was the coolest thing. I did produce a few records, and I discovered I was pretty bad. It's a totally separate talent from anything else. Some people fall into it naturally, but I found that I couldn't concentrate on one song for more than three or four hours; after that, I was worn out. Unfortunately, a producer can't afford to get bored and wonder where his tickets for the Lakers' game that night are.


So how did you get into A&R?

Producing got me in the door at a number of record companies, and I ended up discovering this great breed of people: A&R men. At the time, they were all men. They were basically one step removed from producer, but A&R people were involved with various artists in the course of one day. There was a lot of variety and activity. It was fun to hear a band, and then decide who should produce it. It's kind of what a film producer does: assemble the players.

You began in A&R at CBS International. What did that entail?

I was dealing mostly with international records that were coming in from Europe and elsewhere. It was my job to

decide which international records we should release. I would get tapes from European producers and publishers who were also looking for release in England. One of those tapes came from Dick Anderson, who was the Zombies' publisher, from a Swedish band. They sounded really good. It was my very first deal, the first act I signed. Their first single was a failure. Anyway, they came back with another one which was Waterloo. They were Abba. They went on to sell millions of records.

Eventually, you came to New York for CBS. There you were associated with a range of talent: Patty Smyth, Loverboy, Judas Priest.

When I got involved with Judas Priest, I wasn't really aware of heavy metal as a genre of music. I knew about Black Sabbath and Deep Purple, but I don't think the term "heavy metal" was even being used then. But they had made these two records for a little label called Gull Records, and were suddenly available. They were pretty underground, but they were really good. They first toured here in 1977, when their first record came out. We recieved an announcement from their manager that they'd

be coming over to tour the States, (CBS) told them they couldn't, that they weren't receiving any airplay - only three stations in Texas were playing the record — and we couldn't give them any tour support. They kept saying, "That's okay, we don't need any. Don't worry about it." We thought they were crazy. But they came over and played all through Texas and the South, and they sold out! The branch manager in Dallas called up to ask for more records, because the stores were *all* sold out. It was a new phenomenon selling records without any airplay, or spending any money.

You came to RCA in 1982 and signed Bruce Hornsby a few years later, after many companies had passed on him. A number of A&R people had seen Bruce and heard him before, perhaps he wasn't ready. All I did was be lucky enough to hear him at the point when he was ready. He'd been around town for a while when I met him. It had been very frustrating (for him). But after we signed him, and had success with "The Way It Is," I remember asking him about it. We went back to his house and listened to a lot of his early demos. After we listened to

them, he said, "You know, if I were an A&R man in 1980 and I'd heard that tape, I wouldn't have signed me, either." I'm lucky I didn't meet Bruce in 1981 or 1982. I met him in 1984, by which time he had improved and was ready. It depends. With Bruce, I had a demo tape of just him and the piano and a drum machine with four songs on it: "Mandolin Rain", "The Way It Is," "The Red Plains," and another song. I loved the tape. I kept that tape in my car forever. But, without sounding self-serving, I played it to a number of people who all said, "It's good, but what is it? Is it CHR, or AOR, A/C? What is it?" To them, my answer was, "I don't know, but it's good."

Is that enough? Don't you have to consider how an act will be marketed?

(Laughs) It was good enough for him. But yes, you are supposed to think about marketing. You're supposed to say, "I'm a professional." But I think it's more important for me to say, "I think this artist is great. I love him, and I will sign him and work with him because I think other people will learn to love him, too." Rather than say, "This guy is great. I like him a lot, but which audience is he trying to reach? How old are they? Are they 50% male or 50% female or what?" I'm making fun of that, but there is a certain element of importance in that. I do have to keep some balance between my personal taste and "The A&R Man's" taste, and the ability of the company to market that taste. Sometimes, not very often, I will pass because, although I think he's really good, the potential audience is so small that it won't be a good investment. But, if you love an artist enough, chances are that an audience will be out there somewhere. If you find an artist you really believe in and think is great, it's more important to sign them and make the record, and then find a way to market that record. You need to divide which are the best artists and which are the ones that you really believe are the most talented and appealing. And there is a slight difference.

The Cowboy Junkies for instance.

There's an example of an artist that several years ago, under RCA's old administration, would not have stood a hope. I've been here six and 1/2 years and the difference between RCA Records now and RCA Records then is unbelievable. It's hard to recognize the company. The attitude and the whole sense of priorities, from being a tiny part of a huge corporation which wasn't terribly interested in music to being a large part of a multi-national software company where music is the number one priority, is a complete turnaround. I'm delighted to see all these changes come about. And I'm delighted in having had a small part in helping it. Having some good artists makes all the difference. 

Indio, "Big Harvest" (A&M): Debut outting for Canadian songwriter Gordon Peterson finds the environmentally aware vocalist working his way through a collection of songs that mine African rhythms, spare production and an overall hypnotic feel for maximum effect. The acoustic guitar plays a in on ellum theory of songs that is in

highly evocative role in an album that's as suggestive as it is provocative. Stand-out cut: the striding, semi-contemplative "Hard Sun," which features vocal support from Brenda Russell and fellow Canadian Joni Mitchell.

"Two Nice Girls" (Rough Trade): Two Nice Girls is really three post-modern women from Austin, Texas who balance their biting cynicism with a strong sense of respect for influences like Jane Siberry (whose "Follow Me" is covered here) and Joan Armatrading. Indeed, Armatrading's paired with Lou Reed



for an enchanting medley of "Sweet Jane With Affection," recorded at Austin's KUT radio. On the original front, check out the slightly twangy "I Spent My Last \$10 (On Birth Control and Beer)," a post-feminist anthem if ever there was one.



Mary My Hope, "Museum" (RCA/Silvertone): Atlanta's Mary My Hope hits with a Jane's Addiction-like punch, awash in feedback drenched guitars that take distortion to a new dimension. The four-man group dwells on such brooding themes as life, death, religion and sanity - perfect fodder for

the angst-ridden everywhere. Recorded in Wales, the album's wide-open with possibilities, whether it's the metallic edge of "It's About Time" or the more introspective "Suicide King." But, don't stop there...

Third World, "Serious Business" (PolyGram): Buoyed by rubber bass lines and percolating rhythms, Third World applies a pop aesthetic to their always righteous reggae. With harmonies that suggest The Temptations, circa "Papa Was A Rolling Stone," Third World balances the politics of



love with social issues. Whether you dive into the throbbing "Reggae Amabassador," which paints a humorous picture of diplomatic entanglements, the strident "We The People," the hopeful "Take This Song" or merely the good fun of "Same Old Song," Third World's latest is **Serious Business**, indeed.



NOT KANSAS OR TOTO: Hot new pop import is the British girl group Dorothy, including former members of pioneering post-punk female outfit the Raincoats, with a first album on CHRYSALIS, "The Sweetest Pain," that combines the velveteen sheen of the Supremes with a serious dance beat and contemporary savvy that may well conquer both the funky chic cognoscenti into riddim diva Neneh Cherry as well as the mainstream dance/pop audience of Bananarama. Due in August Tim Finn put on a tremendous show at the Roxy, even outdoing his new CAPITOL album and serving notice that he'll be a singular pop force to be reckoned with Another great show was that of VIRGIN artist Sam Phillips, a wonderful singer who wowed an SRO club audience with her moving lyrics and engaging manner The Cure's summer tour, behind their current "Disintegration" LP on ELEKTRA, is rumored to be their last, after bandleader Robert Smith fired co-founder and keyboard man Laurence Tolhurst for alleged excesses Album not to be missed is the second effort from contemporary Texan rockers drivin' n' cryin', "Mystery Road," on ISLAND, full of lively eclectic hooks, rural passion and expressive lead vocals from frontman Kevn Kinney GLOBAL PACIFIC RECORDS, a new music label distributed through CBS, has an interesting and varied sampler, "Global Voyage." It features tracks from recent albums by David Friesen, Tor Dietrichson and Joaquin Lievano as well as a couple of pieces from world dance combo Doah's new album called "World Dance" and from Brian Melvin's Nightfood LP that includes contributions from the Grateful Dead's Bob Weir, plus Merl Saunders and the late Jaco Pastorius More World Music: Los Van Van, Cuba's leading salsa/pop dance band, have an introductory retrospective LP, "Songo," debuting on MANGO, who also have a number of other world beat releases just out including folk music from Guinea courtesy of Jali Musa Jawara with his "Soubindoor" album, and remarkable Algerian songstress Chaba Zahouania whose "Nights Without Sleeping" is a collection of her native "rai" urban folk music. SHANACHIE has also released "Prince of Rai" by Cheb Mami, another leading proponent of the sinuous North African rhythm. Meanwhile OPAL, Brian Eno's label, has "Zvuki Mu," a collection of modern songs from Russia, and duduk-player Djivan Gasparyan's "I Will Not be Sad in This World," an incredible document of Armenian folk rhythms..... On ROUNDER comes two Southern delights in "Gatorhythms," from Austin blues belter Marcia Ball, and "Bayou Cadillac," the latest from the excellent New Orleans combo Beausoleil ARE WE STILL NOT MEN ?: A new Devo double-disc set on ENIGMA called "Now It Can Be Told," recorded live at L.A.'s Palace late last year, neatly chronicles the band's decade of de-evolution, including two new tracks, "Somewhere With Devo" and "It Doesn't Matter To Me"...... Also from ENIGMA comes a new release from Wire, "It's Beginning To and Back Again," with the single, "Eardrum Buzz," already catching radio attention Two top local bands have finally got major label interest- the powerful rock trio The Havalinas, led by songwriter Tim Scott, are set to ink with ELEKTRA, Jimmy lovine slated to produce.

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Back in the summer of '85

a young hip-hopster billed as MC Ricky D teamed up with Doug E. Fresh to release the monumental hip-hop epic, "The Show" on S.F.-based Reality Records. "The Show" was on every boom-box and MC Ricky D, now dubbed Slick Rick, could be heard rapping about his attempt to pick up a sexy girl on the D-train, sounding more like some English aristocrat than a Bronx homeboy.

Now 23, "Slick" Ricky Walters was born to Jamaican parents in London, where he spent the better part of his teen years, which explains the posh accent. Rick grew up listening to "hard reggae," and got into rap while an art major at NYC's High School of Music and Art. He graduated in 1983 and hooked up with Doug Compshi about a year or so later. Slick Rick's hit debut Def Jam/Courtbia LP, "The Great Adventures Of Slick Rick," was recorded almost entirely in his North Bronx basement studio, where he has lived for the last 9 years, and is filled with controversial ditties such as "Treat Her Like A Prostitute." Slick Rick took some time out to chill with Hits' honkie Jesse Nash about dis and dat.

How did MC Ricky D become Slick Rick?

Doug E. Fresh kept screamin' it when I was on-stage and he kept screamin' it when I was in the studio recording. If Doug E. Fresh says I'm Slick Rick, then I'm Slick Rick.

Has a show like "Yo MTV Raps!" been helpful in popularizing the form?

It definitely has helped give rap music greater expesure. It has even helped get some rap videos on MTV's regular rotation. It is responsible for breaking many rap acts. But as far as I'm concerned, mother nature will take its course no matter what you do. It's not nice to fool with mother nature.

How do you feel about the violence that has so often been

associated with rap music? I have to say that violence comes from the lack of security at some of the places that hold these rap concerts. The people promoting these shows know what's needed but they would rather think about how much more money they can put in their pockets by hiring less security people than thinking the safety of those in attendance. And that ultimately gives rap a bad name. You know what I'm saying?

Your songs "Indian Girl" and "Treat Her Like A Prostitute" are chock full of sexual innuendo. Don't you feel you're setting a bad example for the youth of America?

No. I'm not trying to set an example, even though everyone's very AIDS-conscious. I'm just trying to be myself, funny and humorous. At the end of "Indian Girl," I still end up catching crabs, you know what I'm saying? It's not like I'm promoting having sex with just anybody. I'm really showing what the consequences can be when you start running around having sex with someone without really caring who that person is. It's not like I'm saying, "Don't wear condoms! Don't have safe sex! Just go out there and wild out!" I never said that.

Aren't there some people who might be offended by your candor?

To the people who take offense, I

say don't because it's not supposed to be offensive. It's supposed to be very funny. When they're lying on their deathbed that's probably when they'll cator the joke. When they're healthy and thinking they own the world, they try to tell everyone else how they should live. They're just snobs and they shouldn't take my music so seriously.

You're kind of like the stand-up comic of rap.


Call me anything you want, Jessboy. All I know is that I want the money. You know what I'm saying? Give me the fucking money!!! (Laughs).

Why do you constantly dis women in your songs?

I don't dis nobody, male or female, that don't deserve it! I only dis people who fucking deserve it. I'm no male chauvinist pig. When they get a hit record, well, then they can dis me back. Until then they have to shut up and take it.

Do you feel rap music is for everybody?

Race and color got nothing to do with appreciating the music. There are black people who appreciate rock. So what's to say a white person can't appreciate rap? Rap is equal opportunity music. It's available to everybody. Rap music began orithe streets as part of the Spanish and black man's culture. It has always been our way of having a good time and having fun way before people were making records about it. It represents the realism of the ghetto and trying to survive. Too many people take that lightly. I don't know if I'll change anything but maybe we can all learn something by it. Only time will tell. We'll see what the future Z brinas.

BJ-105 Program Director and Nationwide consultant Brian Thomas is finding things are better the second time around, as he returns to the Orlando-based radio outlet, following a stint at Baltimore's B-104. Prior to joining Nationwide's Orlando station in 1985, Thomas served as p.d. at L.A.'s KMGG and Ventura's KCAQ, spending two years at each. An MSU grad, Thomas has come a long way from his first gig at WIDL in Lansing, Michigan - and Hits' own radio geek Danny Ostrow is happy about that fact.

What characterizes a Nationwide program director?

Each one of the program directors in the company has different talents. I think a few of our guys, like Dave Robbins in Columbus, are really great on the big buzz promotions that get you talking. Some radio stations can give away all the money in the world, but it's the crazy stuff that we've come up with here, like Dunk the I.R.S., that gets more talk than all the money you can give away on a radio station. Other PDs, like Guy Zapoleon and myself, are really good musically. We're into ballads, post modern. currents and recurrents ----and that's one of the main reasons people listen to our stations. The great thing about this company is that every Monday, we have a conference call and put all those minds together. And I humbly say, it's bad enough competing against one of us. but when you have all the minds in the company together - Mark St. John,

Dave Robbins and Guy Zapoleon — that's a tough combination to beat.

BJ105 has been playing more Post Modern tracks lately. Where does Post Modern fit into your plan? Our company has markets like Phoenix, on the West Coast, and Orlando, where we can play a lot of new music. We're the leader and a winner in this market because of new music. We're not afraid to go early on Love & Rockets: they were #1 phones for us here last week. While they're a progressive group, there's

nothing offensive about the record and we like to step out. I think that's what separates us. We've also been ahead in the market on the secret weapon records like Synch, UB40 and Benny Mardones. Right now the rest of the country is picking up on the new music craze that started in California back in '82: a lot of these records - Real Life, Q Feel - are coming back, too. The Cure are going to be a mainstream band. We're having good success with The Replacements, FYC and Elvis Costello. That's the future. Urban music works really well for us, too; but, Post Modern is going to be the next boom.

Are the individual programmers within the Nationwide chain given autonomy over their respective stations? If you listen to any of the Nationwide stations, you'll hear similar ideas, but none of them sound like a clone of the others. We use each other's good ideas, but, song for song, the powers are never dictated to us. We tailor the stations to our own markets. Love & Rockets isn't on in Columbus right now, but by the time this runs, it might be. And some pop adult records that work well in the Midwest and Columbus, we wouldn't be on yet. It works both ways. We do have the autonomy to program the stations to fit

the market.

Do you see big audience differences between L.A.. Baltimore and Orlando? I think L.A. is the ultimate active audience. You have the Hispanic base, so a lot of the Urban music works really well. You have a big audience that loves the Post Modern stuff - Love & Rockets, The Replacements, The Cure. Baltimore, I think. is just the opposite: they treat radio very passively. A lot of times, you know that records are doing really well in LA, Orlando or Phoenix or other active markets, and it just takes them forever to click in Baltimore. It's just the way people are trained, they don't look to the radio to hear new music. They go to other sources. Then when you come to Orlando, there's a lot of the Midwest records. the softer records like Bette Midler and Cher/Cetera which do really well. But, on the other extreme, you have this active audience here that makes Love & Rockets #1 phones after two weeks of playing it. Records like The Replacements work well here, and so do a lot of urban records like Stevie B., Milli Vanilli, even rap does really well here. You have the active audience, both for Urban and Post Modern here. It's not quite as conservative as the Midwest; but, it's not as active as LA.

Do you really think any given audience can be trained?

I think whatever they're used to is what they'll expect. Orlando's been a pretty aggressive market. It helps that the #1 state for people moving to Florida is New York. The sunshine here helps, too; everbody wants to feel young, you know. When the weather is gorgeous everyday, you just want to feel young.

The road to the top wasn't easy

to travel for Brooklyn-born Cyndi Lauper, but the colorful pop songstress intends to stay there for awhile. Since her debut album "She's So Unusual," five years ago, she has sold more than 32 million records, becoming one of the most recognizable pop icons in the world. Her new album, "A Night To Remember," is packed with emotion and surprisingly sad. It plucks beart strings and wrenches guts, but it still leaves the listener with a sense of hope. "It's everybody's story," explains Cyndi. "It's about love won and love lost. I've beard every one of these tales, and lived through most of them, too."

Lauper spoke about the new record, her current state of mind, relationships and all that good stuff with our own yenta, Jesse Nash.

You wrote most of the songs on the new record.

I co-wrote all but three of them. Billy Steinberg, Tom Kelly and I wrote "Like A Cat" with Christina Amphlet from the Divinyls. Diane Warren wrote "I Don't Want To Be Your Friend" and I co-wrote "Insecurious" with Desmond Child and her. In fact, she called me up and said, "I don't know, this could be crazy, but what do you think?" And then she sang it to me over the phone: "You say I'm insecure, I say I'm just curious. I guess I'm just 'Insecurious." And I said, "God, that's great!"

She coined a new word!

It was really an accident. She and Desmond were talking, and she accidentally said, "I guess I'm insecurious." And she laughed and said, "That's for Cyndi. That's for Cyndi!" So they came over and I helped write the verse and the chorus.

You sound almost angry on "I Don't Want To Be Your Friend." How many times have you ended a relationship? You're so angry, but you still go on. That's the way it happens. By the end, she's humming to herself and she continues, as we all do. After each relationship, each experience, we continue.

You used some intriguing guest musicians on the album.

There's Steve Feronne from Duran Duran, who played drums. Bootsy Collins played bass on "Insecurious." And Eric Clapton played guitar.

Are you really crying at the end of "My First Night Without You"? You can't cry and sing at the same time. Your jaw'll close up. But, yeah, I was crying on the inside it's a sad song. "Heading West" always makes me cry, too— it's very much a part of me.

The album seems to work as a whole— from the individual song themes to the order of the cuts.

I took a long time making it— I only did it twice! I mixed it once and I

wasn't happy with it and neither was the record company. And thank God! If "Hole In My Heart" had taken off, I would never have had a chance to hear my music like this because I wouldn't have re-mixed everything. And I wasn't really happy because I was being rushed, rushed, rushed! I had this and that to do for the movie. So, this was an opportunity to make something really special.

Will we be seeing a different

Cyndi Lauper this time? No, it's me. I've always been myself. I go through changes. You know, I get bored very easily— I don't like to keep the same hairdo, so to speak. I still have blonde hair,



with a spot of black on it for good luck.

Who are your fans?

I hope everybody! You know, just regular people. I have no idea. You make music and you put it out there, and whatever the response is, the response is. I don't sit and think about who's going to listen. I do think about who's going to listen in relation to the things I say. I try and strike a common chord in myself that will be a common chord in everyone — things that are very human, that we all experience.

Do you feel Post-Modern outlets will support the new album

despite your massive success? Well, I like college radio. I think it's quite innovative — radio still sounds like radio. What commercial radio has become is very disheartening for college kids. I mean, the art of being a DJ is different — it's changed. They still have a chance to be a little creative at college radio.

Were you disappointed in the reaction to your first movie, "Vibes"?

Well, for one thing, there was no story. Also, I think people were prejudiced against another rocker doing a film. It was just destined to be doomed.

Didn't you read the script before you did the movie?

They said they were going to change it. Famous last words. But once you're in it, you're in it.

Do you feel the film's poor showing was responsible for the failure of the song, "Hole In Your Heart?" Yes. I think it was all connected. It

was definitely a bad time. It really did hurt me a little bit. In the long run, those kinds of things don't bother me — you just get back up and do it again.

Are you and your manager David Wolfe going to finally tie the knot at some point?

I don't know. I I get, uh, very tom by the fact that I'm an un- conventional type of person. Sometimes I want conventional things, but they don't go together. Honestly, I'm still learning. I want to grow in leaps and bounds, both as a person and as an artist.

Can do that with another person?

I don't know. You have to give it your best shot, though.

Do you want to have children?

Yeah. I think about it sometimes, yeah. I'll probably try to get pregnant after this album.... or maybe after another movie. At the end of the movie.

Do you plan on being married when you do?

That I don't know. I don't have to be. I have enough money to raise my own children. I can live any kind of life I want.

Isn't it important that the child have a father around?

I think it's important for the child to have loving people around it, to have quality time and good communication. It's not critical who the parents are. I think you have to be close to your kids. I know a great many married couples whose kids don't see the father, and the mother is always telling them to "Go play outside. Go play with your brother. Go watch TV." I'd rather have my kids travel with me everywhere---what an education! Can you imagine? We'd be able to see everything together. The Eiffel Tower, the Louvre, Rome, Venice. We'd be the best of friends.

Your first hit was "Girls Just Wanna Have Fun" Are you still having a good time?

Things change. My career's become more serious, although that was a great time, and it really did bring a great many women together all over the world. I've seen three generations of women come to my shows. Young girls, mothers and even grandmothers, and the young girls always dress like me. The mothers had a little something on--- like their hair brushed back, with a little pink on the sides. The grandmothers would have their antique jewelry onrhinestones with a little pink in it. Some of the grandmothers even had pink in their hair. I noticed that for the first time at one of my shows. I never saw it before and it's something I never expected. It was a wild thing and it made me cry because, like, a lot of times I say I'm going to give it my all, my best, and hope it will do something good, and mean something. Then when you actually see it doing just that, it changes you a little bit. It turns your head and makes you say it was all worth it.

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RAPPIN^I THE NAIL Interview by Jesse Nash

With New York City

generating most of the hottest rap groups, a new presence is now being felt from the West, particularly the Bay Area. From that fertile R&B turf has emerged a man who is attempting to bridge the gap between the coasts— his tag is M.C. Hammer, and he's a true rapmaster of ceremonies. Once the batboy for the Oakland A's and a baseball prospect himself, the man now does his hammering on his debut Capitol Records LP, "Let's Get It Started," which is currently taking the charts by storm. Our own resident whiteboy Jesse Nash took on M.C, whom he found gleefully hip-hopping all the way to the bank.

Why do you consider yourself a rap band from the wrong coast?

Before us, all the hit rap groups have been from the east coast. Since we're now goin' over the top, we're one of the first from the west coast. Hey, this is only our debut and we're gonna probably sell two to three million records. I've just got this to say, "We'll put to rest... that only the best... come from the east... and not the west!"

To what do you attribute your success?

Plain and simple, we're different. Not only musically, but visually, as well. We have a completely choreographed show. Traditionally, rap performers would get on stage and pace back and forth from side to side. That would be the whole show, and most of them didn't have any charisma at all. They were a bunch of characters, and so, to have rappers performing and, most important, entertaining you, was something that was really needed. Our music is up-tempo, full of energy, and we know how to put on a show. That's a fact! We understand the word, "entertainment." Even when we slow the music down, we slow it down with energy. We're playin' for the mainstream— crowds that most rappers haven't played to before. We're appealing to everybody, not just rap audiences.

You started your own label, Bustin' Records in 1987, which was instrumental in getting you signed to Capitol Records.

It's my label. I went to a couple of Oakland A's baseball players and asked them to loan me some money to start my own label. Dwayne Murphy and Mike Davis, who've since been traded, loaned me the money. I used to be the batboy for the A's, so that's how I knew the guys. I tried out for the Giants in '83. I wanted to be a ball player.

Have you got any baseball raps?

Yeah, I've got a few. I used to travel with the team as Charlie Finley's personal broadcaster. He lived in Chicago and he couldn't pick up the ball games a lot of the times. I used to rap out the ball game to him over the phone: "I remember my days ... with the Oakland A's ... Vida Blue ... was on the mound ... whoever was at the plate ... he'd knock 'em down!" That's enough!

How was it working for Charlie Finley? Was he the tyrant everyone made him out to be?

I would never say that. When I first started working for him, I was 11 years old. And I was from a very, very large family with little money. And he let me travel around the whole country with the ball club. All I had to do was pick up the phone and say, "I wanna go," and I could go. He bought me a motorcycle and he kept change in my pockets all the time, just out of the kindness of his heart. I could never call him the things that other people called him.

Who were your earliest musical influences?

James Brown and George Clinton. From a performance standpoint, I'd have to say Michael Jackson as a dancer, in particular. Prince, too. These guys inspired me to put on the kind of stage show I do.

Rap is really starting to be embraced by the Top 40 mainstream.

Pop radio is smart enough to look at things from the business aspect, and they see that rap appeals to a certain audience. And these people spend money. From an economic standpoint, they're playin' rap music 'cause it's good for business. It's also appealing to young teens. I never hired anybody to do marketing and retailing for my album on the pop side, but yet my album shot to the Top 40 with hardly any effort at all from the label. There's no hype involved.

Let's get what started?

We're talkin' about getting a party started and havin' a good time on the weekend, you know, after you've worked all week. And for people who didn't believe rap could come from the west coast— "Let's Get It Started!"
