




The New Paper Chase, Part 2

Environmental awareness continues to spread like wildfire through the record industry.

On the heels of a decision by four Canadian companies to eliminate the CD longbox as of April 1, **Virgin Records** has announced the institution of an in-house policy wherein each office now has two trash receptacles, one for recycleable paper materials. Whenever possible, the label is also ordering and using recycled paper.

Since the program has been in place, Virgin staffers have learned the difference between recycleable and nonrecycleable paper materials. What can't be recycled: coated stock (like the rag you're holding, for example), colored stock, fax paper.

The industry's first paper recycler was **Warner Bros. Records**, which formally kicked off its program in March 1989, although the label has been informally recycling for several years. Virgin's program is based on the WB model. Expect other majors to follow in the footsteps of Warners and Virgin during the coming months, with an industry wide campaign to be initiated shortly.







ON RECORDS By Bonnie Raitt's Action

GRAMMYS: Not many surprises in the announcement of the **Grammy** nominations for this year. The categories of rock/metal and rap, which brought major controversy last year, seem to be better organized and under control this time around. And the major category of top album of the year contains most, but not all, of the year's top efforts. (Why not **Janet Jackson**? Your guess is as good as ours!)

ALBUM NOMINEES: Don Henley's moody masterpiece (Geffen) is the early betting favorite in a strong field that includes the catchy supergroup effort from the Traveling Wilburys (WB), the sensational melding of dance and Post Modern from Fine Young Cannibals (IRS/ MCA), the introspective solo effort from Tom Petty (MCA) and Bonnie Raitt's mixture of pop, rock and blues (Capitol).

JUST LIKE GRACELAND? It's Raitt's strong effort that is catching our attention right now. Credit the video channels (especially VH-1) for carrying the ball on this one and taking it past the 800,000 unit mark without the all-important hit single. Not unlike the scenario that occurred with **Paul Simon**'s "Graceland" project (WB), Raitt's album has not produced the big hit at the Top 40 radio level in its pre-Grammy lifetime. The album's first release, the rocking "Thing Called Love", ignited the album but did not cross to the mainstream. Then "Nick Of Time" was released, becoming an immediate VH-1 standard and an Adult radio hit, but failing to impact the Top 40 market. Now, with the Grammy spotlight shining brightly on Bonnie and her entire album, the label will attempt a post-Grammy breakthrough. Capitol has released and found immediate support on the Adult and VH-1 levels with "Have A Heart." And it is this hooky midtempo ballad that, combined with the current acclaim, has the potential to spread to Top 40.

Once again, timing is everything, and Bonnie Raitt's time should be now. Stay tuned as we follow this story closely.

STORM WARNING

Forty this year, Billy Joel is on a roll, with his hottest albumsingle action since the start of the decade, when he simultaneously headed the charts with the *Glass House* LP and the single, "It's Still Rock and Roll To Me." And he ends the '80s the way he started them — at the top of the charts with the Mick Jones-produced *Storm Front* and the single, "We Didn't Start The Fire."

Born at the crest of the baby-boom, Joel grew up in the cookie-cutter suburb of Hicksville, Long Island. He started his first band at 14 and racked up such a monumental absentee record in high school that he wasn't allowed to graduate with his class. It was the formative years of a superstar, first with Long Island's beloved Hassles, and then the less lamented Attila, a heavy-metal duo.

Signed to Columbia in 1973, he released *Cold Spring Harbor*. Next came *Piano Man*, the album and the single, and the hits just kept coming: "Just The Way You Are," "Only The Good Die Young," "She's Always A Woman," "My Life," "Tell Her About It," "Uptown Girl," and on and on...

A newsmaker as well as a hitmaker, Joel was the first U.S. pop star to bring a fully-mounted rock tour to the Soviet Union, which he did two years ago. His marriage to Christy Brinkley, one of the world's most beautiful women, is pure storybook. On the downside, there's his troubled managerial relationships, culminating in the current \$90 million dollar, very unpleasant lawsuit he's filed against former manager Frank Weber. What the future holds is anybody's guess, but there is the little matter of a massive tour behind *Storm Front*, which has Joel very excited. So excited, even HITS' own dark cloud Danny Fields couldn't put a damper on his good spirits.

You've always been annoyed at the propensity of the music business to put artists into slots and categories and formats. One feels you've transcended that, but still it exists out there. How do you deal with that, *if* you deal with it?

See, I love the Beatles. They took me through the great pop melodies, through thought-provoking lyrics to exhilerating crazy arrangements to basic skiffle rock. They covered the gamut, and that was what I loved about the Beatles. They took me all over the place, these two guys writing these songs, and once in a while, George would kick in a tune. Well, where would they put the Beatles nowadays? How would they format the Beatles? Or would they get played at all? Would they get tagged as a ballad group because of "Yesterday"? I may be naive, but I thought that's what you were supposed to strive for - to be as good as

they were. That's what my understanding was. Maybe that's why I'm doing what I do, because I'm trying to reproduce it.

The next single is "I Go To Extremes"? Here in the States. In Europe, it's going to be "Leningrad."

I'd seen it referred to as a personal song, about the craft of your art or the art of your craft, or something like that.

It's a song about me, and everybody else, I guess. Just the emotionally exhausting and emotionally uplifting process of writing is also something to write about. While I'm writing, I go from the depths of depression to the heights of ecstasy: the depths of depression when I'm empty and the height of ecstasy when I think I've got something great that I've just created. I see myself going through this, but I see other people having highs and lows also. I think it's a quite normal human trait. We may not all know how to deal with it; but, hey, if you don't like me today, hang on, I'll be different tomorrow.

What's happening with your business affairs now? You've said that you're going to manage yourself?

I have been for the last couple of months, and now we've got a number one record, so I don't think I'm doing too bad.

But how do you have the time? Isn't a manager the one who's supposed to be sitting on top of the record company, the agent, the p.r. people, the crews, everything? Can you do all of that and still be creative?

Well, I can't do everything: but I've got a pretty good idea of what goes on, and if I've got a problem, I can pick up the phone and make a call. I may not be wheeling and dealing like some of these sharks do, but my business is very lucrative. I'm doing fine - as long as somebody's not taking 20% of my gross. I don't have to be a brain surgeon, and just cutting that 20% out is making me a great deal more money. I found out that I haven't needed management for guite a long time. I just assumed that I did. Rock and rollers are not necessarily the brightest business people in the world. Now you're involved in a legal battle with someone who was your manager.

That is correct. **Are you fighting the concept of management, that he took 20% that he didn't earn, or that he took liberties or what? Can you sum it up for me?** There's too much to sum up. Let's just put it this way — I don't know what's going to be left at the end of the day. After all the success I'm supposed to have had, I may be just trying to dig myself out of a hole. And I'm pretty

bugged about it, but I ain't gonna let it ruin my life. Did this whole thing sour you on the business aspect of the business

the business aspect of the business that you're in?

No, no, no. I don't lump everybody into the same soup, but I do happen to think that there's an ethical wasteland out there. I think one of the poorer legacies of the '80s is that moral vacuum, in terms of ethics. I understand that people have to compete with some pretty nasty characters, but I hate to see people lose their morals. After all these years in the business. are you more, or less, comfortable with the way it works on those levels? If you don't do it, someone else is going to take it away from you, that's my philosophy right now. Unless you keep an eye on things, there's enough people out there who are perfectly willing to snip it away. That doesn't mean I'm going to be the best manager in the world. For better or worse, I may screw up, but I'd rather screw up on my own than have somebody take it away, because this is the third time this has happened to me, and I'm damned tired of it.

Do you think you've been too trusting? Of course I have. Trusting to the point of stupidity. That doesn't mean I've lost my faith in people. It just means, *certain* people.

These legal things are so draining when one is trying to get something creative done at the same time. How do you do it?

Yeah, it is draining, and it's taxing financially, too. The lawyers are probably the only ones who really make out in these things anyway. But it has to get done. And I'll tell you the truth, if I let it change my basic nature, as I said, my faith in people, or my basic trusting soul, then they win. If they actually change me, intellectually, emotionally, spiritually, then they win. And they're not gonna change me. I'd rather be in a good fight and lose than just lay down and die.

Do you come home every day, with this like "Who needs it" attitude? Well, there's new things that come up every day. It affects every part of your life. It affects house construction, it affects everything. Every facet of my life has been in some kind of upheaval because of this. And every day those things come to light, and it's not easy to live with, and it takes a toll. But having a

number one record compensates; not that that number one is so important, but at this point, it's important to a lot of people who have worked with me for quite a long time. And it's symbolic of a lot of hard work to a lot of people. I appreciate that, and I'm gonna respect want to do it, if it doesn't work, it's dead, because those are the people paying the money. You never lose sight of that fact. The show is actually a little bit longer now, because we're talking about fourteen albums, as opposed to thirteen. There will be some chestnuts

that, and I'm gonna savor it. What are you looking forward to now most of all?

Actually, getting this damn thing started. I'm sick of rehearsals, I wanna play. Getting out of here, going to a gig and playing.

Is this an open-ended tour? Do you have a closing date, or are you going to let it take you along with its own momentum?

Well, the last album that we put out, *The Bridge*, came out in '86 and we toured for a year and a half on that album. That album did OK, didn't break any records, but it did OK. We toured for a year and a half, and our business went through the roof in terms of ticket demand. Now we're looking at an album that's already more successful than (the previous) album, and the ticket sales are going through the roof again, so I'm willing to tour with this album at least as long as I did on the last tour, probably longer. So if the demand is there, we're gonna play.

What do you do on the road to keep yourself physically and emotionally fit? Herbal teas or running machines? I do the show. That keeps me mentally very healthy, because it's two and half hours of catharsis and emotional outlets. I get off the stage after two and a half hours, and I go, "I'm OK now. I'm fine, I'm not mad at anybody anymore." It's sort of a form of insanity, I believe, performing. And also, it's a cardiovascular workout for two and a half hours. You gotta have lungs, you know. How do you balance the songs from your new album and the songs the crowd demands because they know them and love them? Can the new songs be as exciting as the more familiar ones?

Number one, the song has to elicit a strong response, or else it won't stay in the set list. We're not gonna pound people over the head with something that they don't want to hear. That's the law, that's rule number one. If it don't work, it's dead. I don't care how important it is. I don't care how much we that we won't do. We will do "Piano Man," but I don't think we're gonna do "Just The Way You Are." And if people come expecting to hear songs like "Just The Way You Are," or "Just The Way You Are," *just* "Just The Way You Are," I say "Don't hold your breath, and don't pay scalpers' prices for tickets." Are you ever concerned about the album-tour-album-tour rut? Suddenly ten years are gone, and you've been living by this pattern. Do you think you'd ever want to break it up, be in a movie or something?

I don't wanna be in a movie. I'm not an actor, I'm a musician. That's my job, that's what I do. Even before there were albums, the first thing I was was a player. An album is just a captured performance, that's basically all it is. I don't tour the way I used to. We used to tour every year, month after month after month, and there have been spells of a vear or two when I haven't toured. So I don't think I'm in the same rut I used to be in. You gotta want to go out there, to go out. The original premise to go out when you were 19, 20, 21 was, "Man, I'm gonna like play with my friends all over the world, man! And we're gonna meet girls!! And we're gonna play rock and roll!!" And that gets old. Then you have a family, and your reasons for going out become different. They become more career-oriented, and more substantial than just going out and having a good old time. And I've got a lot of that going now. But the new band is so good, it's kicking my ass. And that's the reason I'm doing this. I forgot at one time, "Why am I doing this?" And now I can remember why: because it's the closest thing to sex that you can get. It ain't sex, but it's damn close. What bugs you most? Getting ripped off bugs me. Having

my motivations questioned bugs me. Having my motivations questioned bugs rne. I get bugged by the same things that everybody gets bugged at, The Motor Vehicle Bureau, you know. Do you have any one consistent problem that's impacted on your career? Well, as a musician, I'd say, my left hand. I think my left hand stinks. I'm talking like a piano player now, and that's essentially what I am, after all. I think my left hand is a waste, the way I play. It should be much better. You spent a lot of time behind the Iron Curtain in '87. Did you have any idea that what's happening now was on the way?

Oh ves. I couldn't predict when it was going to happen, but the excitment was calpable when we were there. It felt like the '60s - something's gonna happen, they're ready for something to happen, there's big changes in the air here. People were not just gonna lie down and take it anymore. Everything was different. I would mention this when I was there to people, and they'd break into applause. I'd say, "I don't know, it looks like the '40s, but it feels like the '60s." Boom! Big applause, and they knew what I was talking about. When we left, they said, "Please, have other people come ... " You felt like Pandora's box had been opened, and it couldn't get shut again.

The song "Leningrad" was prophetic, and kind of an anthem, of what's happening now.

We got a lot of input from our European promotion tour to please put that out

there as a single. That's why it's coming out in Europe. They're the ones who want it. It wasn't my idea to exploit the situation. Actually, I don't know why I should be defensive about it. I did write the thing.

I think everyone knows you wrote it before the Wall came down. I can't imagine you'd be accused of exploiting a situation that happened after you wrote about it.

Frankly, I'm a little amazed at how blase people are over here about what's going on. My God, the Berlin Wall is down and the Cold War as we know it may be over! It was a cold war, but it was a war nonetheless, and it went on all my life. God knows I had a great deal of anxiety about it; you must have had it, too. When are we gonna get blown away, how many of my friends have to die in a war like Korea or Viet Nam? How many tinhorn dictators are going to bring the world to a crisis the way Castro did in the '60s? i mean, this shit might be over. My daughter may be able to grow up without that kind of anxiety. Now she's got to worry about the hole in the ozone — we're talking about a whole other apocalypse here. But that's what the real problem is, and I'm just amazed at how blase people are. 🔴

AN EXCLUSIVE HITS RADIO INTERVIEW WITH WABB'S LESLIE FRAM BY MIKE MURPHY

GOING MOBILE

How did you get started in radio?

(During) My junior year in high school, I did this little show on a local station through the school called "Platter Ladder." I knew then that radio was it. It was so exciting. When I graduated from high school, that same station hired me. So that summer I worked full time at the station. It was one of those AM daytimers with two jocks. One did 6 am to noon and the other did noon to 6 pm, and you did your production when the station signed off because there was only one control board. You know the kind (of station) where the General Manager was also the Sales Manager. It's a great way to learn, because you get to do a little of everything.

The music was everything from The Doobie Bros. to Petula Clark. And our morning guy was so un-hip, he called her "Pectch-ula Clark." I can remember thinking, "What the hell am I doing here?" **How did you end up** at WABB?

They called me and wanted me to run Casey Casem on Sunday mornings. I told them, "I can't leave this full time job to come work one airshift at WABB. I got a car note to pay!" They called me again about 3 months later to work midnight to 6 am. And I thought, "Wow, I'm in the big time now!"

So, I went to work for them, working midnight to 6 and then going to school from 8 am to 1 pm. I usually slept through my 11 o'clock class! **Tell me about the evolution of WABB since you've worked there.**

When I began, it was an Album Rock station. About '77, Mobile, Alabama's Leslie Fram is one woman who knows how to stand by her radio station. After starting out at WABB doing the midnight to 6 am shift, she's spent the last 14 years rising through the station's ranks. Today, not only does Fram call the shots as WABB's PD, she's also the station's VP. The last shot HITS' Mike Murphy called was an easy bank shot that he missed.

we went to a "97 Rock" Hit Rock format. The presentation went from really *laid back* to *super high energy*. Howie Castle was the PD then and he really taught me a lot about delivery on the air, how to be brief and still entertaining. Then around '83, we became a mainstream Top 40 station. **Do you think Top 40 radio** has changed much since you've been there? The biggest change has prob-

ably been the niche formats: The Urban-Dance, the Hot A/C and Rock 40 types of formats. The constant though is that

5 or 6 records they're working and you tell them that a particular record doesn't fit your station, they'll accept that. They won't try to hype me. Is that how you determine

the ones that you talk to and work with?

Basically yes. The people I have good relationships with are the ones that call me every week and we talk music. If I don't add a record for them for a couple of months, they won't hold it against me or the station.

Since you are an on-air PD, would you ever consider being part of a morning show instead of programming?

I think I could do that if it were a good sized market, because I love being on the air.

Is being on the air essential for you as a programmer?

It is for me, because it keeps me in touch with what's happening with the listeners. I talk to a lot of people on the request lines. People here are very friendly and they don't hesitate to tell you what they like and *don't* like.

Who are some of the people that have had an influence on your career?

Definitely Randy Lane, who I've worked with since 1977, and of course, Bernie Dittman, who owns WABB. Those two guys have had the most influence.

Is Elvis dead?

No. Elvis is not dead! We have a Top of the Hour I.D. that says, "WABB-FM 97, Elvis' Favorite Radio Station." Elvis is still a giant in this part of the country. You can't say anything against him in this area. They take Elvis as serious as they do Alabama-Auburn football. ●



The Silencers, "A Blues For Buddha" (RCA): The second LP from the Scotland-based Silencers finds an increase in confidence that allows the band to fold the blues and traditional Celtic influences into their freewheeling rock-/r&b hybrid. Bagpipes, fiddles and a blaring horn section flesh out the band's

straight-ahead guitar-driven sound. "Razor Blades of Love," the first single, is a wry take on the perils of falling in love and it's the perfect counterpoint to the almost ethereal "Answer Me," which opens the aptly titled "A Blues For Buddha."

Dissidenten, "Out Of This World" (Reprise): Dance music riddled with swirling Middle Eastern melodies, covered with Arabic lyrics and drenched in rhythms that take control of the feet long before the mind kicks in sets "Out Of This World," the latest from German quartet Dissidenten apart



in the world music follies. Using many well-known Arabic musicians, including poet/activist Cherif Lamrani and The National Orchestra of Morocco, Dissidenten deliver music that defines the concept of musical adventurism.



Third Bass, "The Cactus Album" (Def Jam/Columbia): Edgy rap that's just plain bizzy is the order on Third Bass' Def Jam debut. Combining snippets of cultural reference points — from the original "Little Rascals" theme to Abbott & Costello's rap about "who's on third base" — and compelling issues

(racism, the state of the world), MC Serch and Prime Minister Pete Nice integrate def raps with ads, laughter, tv shows, movies and anything else that comes their way for a wall of sound that hits hard and stays with you.

Grant Hart, "Intolerance" (SST): Husker Du's Grant Hart goes it alone on a solo album for indie SST that's as unpretentious as it is compelling. Vocally, he's rough shod, but these songs cut directly to the bone and don't have an ounce of fat on 'em. The thrashing "Twenty-Five Forty-One" has a singular



sense of purpose, while the mostly percussive "She Can See The Angels Coming" is as much nostaligic sounding as it is thoughtful. Centering the LP around acoustic guitars and pained vocals, "Intolerance" shows Hart at his most essential.

Along with the squals of feedback, "Automatic" is powered by a thundering bottom created — like virtually all the sounds on the LP — by brothers **Jim & William Reid**, who also produced and wrote the album's 10 songs. Not for the meek, but not to be missed.

AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH THE SMITHEREENS BY DAVID SPRAGUE

The HEAVEN



He doesn't want you to know that he's just purchased a colorized copy of his all-time favorite flick ("The Thing"), but otherwise, Smithereens' frontman Pat DiNizio will regale you with strange but true stories about anything to do with him and his band. Pat's gregarious enough to let all three other Smithereens share the title "The Quiet One," but guitarist Jim Babjak, drummer Dennis Diken and bassist Mike Mesaros don't seem to be complaining too much. After all, Smithereens 11, their fifth disc (and first to be named after a Sinatra movie) is fixin' to create a beachhead for the lovable lads from Jersey. HITS' David Sprague beached himself long, long ago.

If you want to keep with the rat pack motif, you're going to have to round out your "11."

I don't think there's too many of those kinds of guys out there anymore — none that I'd have in my pack, that's for sure. Definitely no rock musicians. Jake LaMotta's still around, though, right? He could join.

As a veteran pop culture vulture, you don't find much that peaks your interest these days?

No. Well, I just picked up the CD of In Through The Out Door and I think that was released pretty recently. This tour, by the way, we'll probably be doing "When The Levee Breaks" as an encore. We love that stuff — that, Black Sabbath and Deep Purple are definitely as much a part of our history as the Beatles and Stones of the '60s stuff we're always accused of trying to emulate.

Does the "Revivalist" tag grate on your nerves?

There are some obvious influences, but we wear them rather playfully on our sleeves to deflate people who can't get beyond a marketing tag they heard a few years ago. Of course, no marketing tag would've meant the band would never have been heard at all. But to take songs like "Blood And Roses" or "Blues Before And After" and compare them to the Beatles is...they owe more to "Paranoid" than anything else. I dunno — everyone else out there is influenced just as heavily as we are by the exact same things and they're claiming to be totally original. It's such a crock of shit.

Do you find it odd that your darkest songs: "Behind The Wall Of Sleep," "Only A Memory" and so on, have been your most popular?

It's pretty interesting, isn't it? We seem to be the only band around that can get away with writing songs in minor keys. Also, I don't see many people around who're exploring the darker sides of relationships. only write songs when I'm forced to by the record company. (laughs) No, that's not it.... I know, I'm an artistic genius who's compelled to write all the time, locked away in a fit of depression! (more laughter)

That's better than cutting off your ear.

But you don't know that I haven't tried that. I'll be fine as long as I don't cut my dick off.

You seem to be having luck with women, artistically speaking, of course. You've duetted with Suzanne Vega, Marti Jones and now Belinda Carlisle. What's the deal?

It's become sort of a tradition, hasn't it? I originally wanted to

Obsession comes up a lot in your songs.

"Behind The Wall Of Sleep" is obsession tinged with despair, while on a song like "A Girl Like You" (the lead track on *Smithereens* 11), it's a positive thing. That's about not resigning yourself to things.

To some degree, are you the "I" in those songs?

Quite a few are detached stories; "William Wilson" is me telling the story of a long-overdue father son reunion. But, it's told sketchily enough so that it's open for interpretation. "Yesterday Girl," on the other hand, is a classic example of a song becoming a psychiatrist. I wrote three sets of lyrics for that, as I did with just about every song on this album — just to see if I could. That set is, to a large degree, a reflection of my inner self — not to sound pretentious or anything.

I don't want to sound like your mother, but why don't you write any happy songs? That's a valid question. Um....I

work with Astrid Gilberto on "In A Lonely Place," but she turned me down rather brusquely, which in retrospect is understandable. Suzanne loved the song though, and she's a big admirer of Astrid, so that worked out. As far as Belinda, I wrote "Blue Period" for her, but it fell through the cracks on her album. She's a Smithereens fan, though, and came in to do it with us. She came in. and contrary to a lot of the shit that's said about her, she was great! She came in and did the track in about 40 minutes. And it's not double-tracked. Make sure you put that in, motherfucker! (Ed note: Ooh, testyl Testyl) It's just that she gets ragged on and doesn't deserve it. I could rag on tons of people, but they'll all end up as record company presidents and ruin my career.

Surely you can find time to nail one...

Nah — I'm just one of those people who loves everybody. They just all hate me. Well, my mother still loves me.... *

Back in September, Delicious Vinyl co-auteur Mike Ross told me that his favorite record of '89 was the debut of Def American/Geffen rock band Masters Of Reality, and it drove him nuts that the record had stiffed. "It really hurts the industry when great music like Masters of Reality is stifled by the system just because it doesn't fit into a category." Ross said at the time. "We're at a point now where, if we like something, we can get it played and distributed; then it's up to us to bring it home. I feel we have a *responsibility* to do everything we can to get this music out there and hopefully broaden people's horizons a little." Well, Ross has put his money where his mouth is —

producer John Leckie (early XTC, Stone Roses), has been chosen to produce the Geffen debut album of the Posies. Big Dipper's first for Epic will be produced by Steve Hagler (mixer of the Bob Mould and Pixies LPs) in Charlotte's Reflection Studios. And Dave Jerden (Jane's Addiction) will handle the production on Columbia's Alice in Chains Also at Columbia, former Vicky Hamilton assistant Keith Bailey has signed on as the label's L.A. street scout.... There's one less empty office at Capitol with the arrival of young turk John Axelrod from Atlantic As for the new kids in town, Rachel Matthews has some company at Hollywood with the arrival of Laura Ziffrin from Disney's film-music dept. and Steve Jones (alias John Henry Jones) from the Unforgiven. And though Irving Azoff's A&R team officially remains at just two - the previously reported Brian Koppelman and Danny Keaton — there are several other appointees waiting in the wings.... Mea culpa: The Beasties have not been dropped by Capitol after all. That may have been the only widespread rumor of '89 that didn't turn out to be true.... But Capitol has dropped critical fave Pat McLaughlin rather than releasing his Mitchell Froom-produced second album which manager Tim Neece is shopping Is Squeeze on its way from A&M to WB?... By the time you read this, Coconut Teaszer booker Len Fagan may well have a job as a talent scout with a major. What's more, that label will allow him to continue booking the Teaszer. Look for Len on the 23rd, at the club's first AS-CAP-sponsored Best Kept Secrets showcase - featuring the Gin Blossoms, Spencer the Gardener and School of Fish and ask him for a business card Finally, what logo will be embossed on Tom Whalley's new business cards?

I worked MOR radio down there for a little while, then ended up in Corpus Christi, Texas as production director for KNCN radio or CD-101, I think it's called now. Nine months later, the ratings came out and everybody there got fired. I went back to Florida, was doing fill-in radio work and I started packing records at the warehouse for Tone Distributors. That's how I got into the record business. I was probably the worst disc jockey in the history of radio. So I was involved in the record business down there, and I moved back north in 1980. I worked with Crazy Eddie for about seven-and-a-half years and I've been at the Wiz for two-and-a-half years. I take it the retail business is a lot more secure than the radio biz.

Sure. But I had a lot more fun as a disc jockey! When I was doing the overnight shift at the jazz station, I used to play



The big buzz at retail is the likely sale of Torrance, Calif .based Wherehouse Entertainment. Rumored suitors include Live Entertainment, Super Club, HMV, Musicland and Shamrock. Live would like to add a West Coast oulet to its Strawberries-Waxie Maxie East Coast acquisitions, while Super Club has stated its intention to expand its retail holdings substantially by 1991. Informed sources say HMV and Musicland are long shots, while Shamrock has shown keen interest, to the extent of offering a high-ranking Wherehouse position to an unrelated East Coast industry figure in a finance/controllertype slot. If the deal goes down, Shamrock will have a huge lock on the Southern California market, with Music Plus already in the fold. While acknowledging interest from "several parties" and the fact that Wherehouse "has engaged outside advisors to field offers," Wherehouse VP of Advertising Bruce Jesse says, "Any speculation at this point would be premature." Wherehouse's star has been on the rise since CEO Scott Young took the firm on an expansion tear in 1989, opening 49 of 50 proposed stores, including eight

in December and four in January.... At the Winter CES Show in Vegas, Music Plus Director of Purchasing Mitch Perliss reports a hot topic of interest was Dolby S. According to experts, the new noise-reduction feature "will give DAT a run for its money." Says Linda Lukas, owner of Dave's Video, The Laser Place, "We saw some new laser disc players from Panasonic which read both sides and should make Panasonic the second manufacturer falong with Pioneer] in the laser disc field." Lukas also notes that "more and more software studios are doing simultaneous releases, with Paramount's upcoming "Indiana Jones And The Last Crusade" coming out simultaneously on seven formats, including 8 mm and Super VHS."... While some retailers were singing the blues over the holidays, other hipper outfits were profiting from it. Sales on the MCA/Chess boxed sets were happening at several key locations. Lee Negip, new-release buyer for Area-based Rainbow Bay Records, says, "We can't keep enough in stock; blues is very hot right now." Negip specifically cites the Muddy Waters box as a hot seller. At Tower Records Sunset, Product Manager Howard Krumholtz says he's sold "over 100 of the Muddy Waters and over 200 of the Willie Dixon since their release, and MCA should get a Howlin' Wolf out as well." The next official release is a Bo Diddley box due this summer, according to MCA Director of Alternative Music Joel Hoffner, who also mentions that the boxes have produced a tremendous amount of written responses to the inserts included in each boxed set. They've received over 1,000 responses from 36 countries, including the Soviet Union.






