
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


Geffen Dumps DAR

Geffen Records, which had been growing more and more uneasy about its relationship with **Rick Rubin**'s controversial Def American Recordings, formally terminated its manufacturing and distribution agreement with Def American on Sept. 17.

The announcement closely followed the news that Rubin had made a deal with WEA to directly distribute the album that started the whole brouhaha — **the Geto Boys**' super-smarmy major label debut. WEA will also take over the manufacturing of Def American product. The deal hinges on a major to be named later.

In a prepared statement, Geffen Publicity head Bryn Bridenthal commented: "We find ourselves increasingly at odds with Def American's creative philosophy.... Because we believe both in artistic freedom and the freedom to choose the direction of our company, we felt it would be most constructive to encourage Rick Rubin to find a manufacturer/distributor with a greater affinity for the direction of his label. We wish Rubin continued success."

Who Cares?

ACLU Southern California chairman Danny Goldberg will debate Miami-based attorney Jack Thompson immediately prior to the Nov. 8 pay-per-view concert performance featuring Luke and 2 Live Crew. The 45-minute forum will be produced in front of a live studio audience, and viewers will be

able to dial a 900 number to express their support for either side. Both Goldberg and Thompson will wear only G-strings, and their bodies will be covered in oil for the confrontation. "Who would watch otherwise?" asked **Tom Coleman** of Choice Entertainment, which is distributing the special.

"What some observers are calling a hot streak is really a combination of long-range planning, highly focused marketing strategy, A&R involvement, being able to react immediately to the marketplace, and a lot of luck," said Columbia Records President **Don lenner**.

Whatever you call it, Columbia is definitely redhot as **five** of their albums rack up impressive weeks, each making upward moves within the Top 20 of the HITS Top 50 Albums chart.


Racking up the biggest numbers at the cash register is **George Michael**, who debuts at #5 this week. In its first week on the street, the Michael project racks up #1 reports from Music Plus, Wherehouse and Pro One-Stop, while notching #2 reports from Musicland, National Record Mart and Strawberries/Waxie Maxie, among many others.

The other red-hot debut comes from **Warrant**, whose "Cherry Pie" enters the chart at #17. Top ten reports for the project come from **National Record Mart** (#1), **Buzzards Nest**, **Transworld** and many more.

Add those two debuts to #3 Mariah Carey, #11 Michael Bolton and #12 New Kids on the Block, and you've got Continued on page 14

Stessel Makes Epic Move Remote

Larry "Don't Call Me Georgie" Stessel has been upped to the new position of Sr. Vice President, Marketing, at Epic Records by Dave "Elmer's" Glew, President of the label. Larry will be responsible for overseeing all activities of the marketing, media and artist development departments on both coasts, as well as entertaining our troops in the Persian Gulf amusing with anecdotes about his early years in vaudeville.

Glew praised Stessel's role in the development of many of Epic's major artists. "Some of these acts weren't even born when Larry did his shtick at the Concord as part of the legendary comedy team of Abbott and Costessel."

Stessel was most recently Vice President of West Coast Operations for Epic, involved in the careers of Gloria Estefan, Babyface and Michael Jackson. He began his music business career in 1972 as a college rep at the University

of Florida. He supervised the CBS Records college rep program before moving on to become Director, East Coast Product Management, and then Director, Marketing, West Coast. He was named Vice President in 1988.

Said Glew: "If **Joe Smith** is the industry's toastmaster, then Larry Stessel is its Pop-Tart." What?

RANTING AND RAVING

This column is not written by Lenny Beer! I am much better-looking and infinitely more intelligent — but then, so is a soap dish.

Nonetheless, I agree with a lot of what Lenny said last week in his "On Records" column about "Hot A/C" being radio's flavor of the month. This is a business of lemmings, and I'm afraid we're about to see a lot of well-respected programmers leap to their deaths.

Sure, we'd all like to grab a hunk of those choice 25+demos, but do we have to sterilize the airwaves to the point of homogenized blandness? There is another way to get the same results, as the truly great programmers have proven time and time again. Anybody remember Top 40?

Now, this may sound like a radical thought in this nichedriven era, but it's obvious there's still room for "massappeal" radio. Done correctly, it works. The problem is so few programmers are willing to do what it takes to do it well.

Here are the keys to successful full-spectrum Top 40:

play rock, rap, dance and adult pop on the same radio station! The secret is in timing and dayparting. Watch your research carefully for signs of passive call-out smashes. When the indicators are there, go with them heavy. No need to be early on these; let the market expose and develop them for you.

The records to be early on are the street-level buzz records. Start 'em at night, or wherever appropriate. As tight as N.Y.'s **Z-100** is, I guarantee you they were first on every major "phone" record in the market.

Balance is crucial. Not only balance in your weekly rotations and library, but song-to-song flow every hour. The best programmers do not delegate this responsibility — they do it themselves!

2. Entertainment: In this quick-fix, instant-gratification age, let's not forget that we're programming to human beings. Just like them, our radio stations need to be emotional. We must touch their lives. Show biz, razzle-dazzle, fun marketing with flair, seizing the moment — all of these must be pursued with vigor every day. If you do it well, your station might actually mean something to the listener, and just maybe they'll remember your name when Arbitron calls.


3. The Morning Show: The great morning shows on the great Top 40s have always had one thing in common — their success has had little to do with what type of music they were playing. Yes, it's important to play massappeal hits in the morning, but the great morning shows transcend musical limitations.

You need to attract people who have no business listening to your station — people who maybe prefer country or public radio, but they come to you because your morning show is about *life*. Life in the community, life in the world, and an escape from those parts of life we need to get away from. Out-of-format, out-of-demo listenership is what swells the numbers.

Tough, yes. Impossible, no. Study and learn from the amazing success stories that Shannon/Mason/Randy had at Q105 during their 10-year run. Shannon/Shadow/Kingston did it/do it better than ever at Z-100. Randy Kabrich is doing it again at Y-95. Mass-appeal radio is not dead. It's just the hardest to do. How bad do you want it?






NEAR TRUTHS





Whenever it's Crazy Horse time, interest in Neil Young seems to pique a bit higher than usual. On his own, Young is Mr. Enigmatic, apt to turn out an album of blues or country or rockabilly or techno-rock — or even the individual mix of styles on last year's "Freedom," which is as close as he comes to having a trademark sound. When he works with Crazy Horse, however, we know what we're getting. Buzzsaw guitars. The whomp of Ralph Molina's drums. Garage rock sound. "Cinnamon Girl" and "Hey Hey, My My (Out of the Blue)" and "Tonight's the Night" and "Rust Never Sleeps." And some of Young's most challenging lyrics yet.

On "Ragged Glory" — Young's first Crazy Horse

On "Ragged Glory" — Young's first Crazy Horse project since 1987's "Life" — the Toronto-born singer-songwriter takes stock of living to find he's still "Rockin' in the Free World" as he turns 45. "Neil generally has a group of songs that fit the band," says guitarist

Frank Sampedro. "They're the ones with a lot of emotion, a lot of feeling and a good, rocking beat. There aren't too many acoustic or melancholy type songs." Adds bassist Billy Talbot, "We wanted to be real. Crazy Horse isn't meant to be all slicked up and slicked over. We captured as much of the real stuff as possible." HITS' Gary Graft went in search of the real stuff and caught up with Young and his Crazy Horse riders holed up at Neil's spacious northern California ranch. Before they realized who he was and tried to toss him out of the house, our man Gary "I Don't Take Graft" got the following exclusive interview.

I understand you wrote the songs for "Ragged Glory" in the barn where you keep your cars on the ranch. Why there? It's big and private. No one else goes in there too much. I just set up my amp at one end of the barn — which is about 150 feet long and 60 feet wide — turned it up like I would in a coliseum and wrote the songs like that, so I could feel the size of the music.

FOREVER

How do you determine when it's time to do a Crazy Horse album?

Liust felt like it was time. L think I realized it after listening to the songs I'm going to use on the archives record. I was listening to all my old and unreleased sonas over a 28year period, and it was like a "Spinal Tap" type of experience [laughs]. They just said to me, "It's time to play with the Horse." It was time to let that out. I could feel my body wanting to play guitar the way I play the guitar when I'm with Crazy Horse. My solos with Crazy Horse are not really just me, they're

like... unh... us. Ralph's cymbals, the high sound of my guitar, Billy's bass rumbling underneath it it's just a big sound. As far as I can tell, it's a lot like classical music. It's like a Wagnerian kind of melodic thing, with different themes developing and all kinds of emotions sweeping through it. It goes off in tangents and then returns. There are no rules of the road here: there are places I can ao that I can't in the other areas I work in.

And part of the attraction is that things just happen? Right. It's very spontaneous, and it's set up to

be spontaneous. Sometimes the last verse or part of a chorus might be missing. Basically the songs are all [written] in one shot, and that's it. When I get Crazy Horse together, we start playing and developing the sound. By then, we're ready to stop until we're actually recording. Sometimes the recording process becomes part of the learning.

There are a couple of songs where the musical introduction just keeps going, well after you expect the vocal to start.
Right. Normally, someone would have started singing by now. That just

means we're having a good time. It might have been time for Englebert Humperdinck to sing, but not me.


"Farmer John" is a real chestnut. Where did that one come from?

Oh God, what a song. We had just finished recording the whole album and we were starting to feel like we might be finished after playing all of the songs once or twice a day for about two weeks. At the end of the process, we were standing around and no one knew what kind of song to play. The guys in the band said, "Why don't you do something that you did with your old high school band back in Canada?" So I started doing "Farmer John." They had never played it before, but they started playing it anyway. That was it — we only played it once. That's the wav it came out. Isn't there a high poten-

tial for disaster there? It doesn't matter. You can't lose. We started playing that song and everyone looked at my hands and followed along. If there had been one other chord change in it, we would have missed it. We don't care about flawless. The whole thing is for fun, because it's rock. And you know what? This is closer to perfection than anything I've been able to come up with.

Once you get past the crank-it-up rock & roll, the

AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH KHMX'S GUY ZAPOLEON BY DANNY OSTROW

THE ZAPOLEON COMPLEX

This L. A. native got a psychology degree from UCLA while working part-time at K-EARTH. Upon graduation, he became MD at KRLA in 1978, then moved on to take PD posts at KRQ in Tucson, B94 in Pittsburgh and KZZP in Phoenix. In '87, he was named Group, then National PD for the Nationwide chain, before seguing to KNRJ back in Houston as PD. After thoroughly researching the market, he turned the outlet from its energy format to KHMX/MIX98.5, an adult Top 40 hybrid. He finally met his Waterloo when he chose to accept a call from HITS' own spaced invader Danny Ostrow.

To what do you attribute the demise of straight-ahead Top 40 and the rise of fragmented formats?

Well, there's an old adage — I'm not sure who said it - that sometimes you have to go to extremes to come back to the center. Governments have to go through revolutions before purging themselves of the bad element. The Top 40 format always goes through cycles every 10 to 13 is center and plays the best of the pop, rock and black hits. But it shifts. For instance, back in 1969, Top 40 moved in a rock direction

years. Most of the time, the format



and ended up spawning Album Rock radio. Then it went into an extreme adult period with John Denver and Helen Reddy. In the late '70s, it went disco. From '78-82, Top 40 suffered probably its worst period, which was all Air Supply and Michael McDonald rip-offs. Unfortunately, no one would play black music because of the disco backlash. What we have to do is get back to the center again.

Is Top 40 moving back to the center now?

Radio is always a little behind the public. They're just now figuring out that they need more balance. That's why Don Henley and the Traveling Wilburys sell albums, Bonnie Raitt wins Grammys, but Top 40 doesn't play them. That was my feeling behind starting this format. This station is customized for Houston. We talked to 2,000 women between the ages of 20 and 40; 75% of that total were phone interviews in which we tested about a thousand songs. Looking for a place to live with my GM Clancy Woods, we got the best education of all. We literally talked to 100 different people in different households. We looked at their record collections and found Blondie, Petty, Stones, CSN, Concrete Blonde, Huey Lewis, Paula Abdul, Don Henley - a really wide variety of musical tastes.

Was it those 100 people who told you to play 80% recurrents every hour?

We play — depending on the daypart — five to six current records an hour, two to three recurrents an hour and the rest are oldies. And of course, the percentage goes up or down depending on how many commercials we have that hour. What do you have to say to

fellow programmers regarding the "Mix" format?

I think each PD needs to think about their own marketplace and what niches are being filled. Top 40 is my favorite format - it's what I grew up listening to. But it needs to be right in the center. It has to play the best of all music whether that's dance, rock, pop or Post Modern. That's what makes a great radio station. The key is balance. Right now, there's a huge number of baby boomers who haven't had a radio statton to call their own in 20 years.

But isn't the goal of Top 40 in any market to grab the teens?

Top 40 radio should be for everyone. Every market should have a station catering to 12-to-24, but at the same time, there should be a mass-appeal radio station with something for everybody. That's what we're trying to do here. How you do it depends on the marketplace. Here, we lean a little more rock. We take the best elements of pop, adult and rock and put them together. Top 40 shouldn't necessarily appeal to 50-year-olds, but it shouldn't just appeal to 12-year-olds, either.

What's your goal in Houston? When we talked to all those women in Houston, they told us they wanted a station that would pick them up and make them feel good. And that's what Top 40 does best — it picks up spirits and makes people feel good. The other thing they asked for was a contemporary radio station far adults. So that's what we are an upbeat contemporary radio station for adults. In closing, I'd like to quote Keith Naftaly in San Francisco who said, "If Top 40 means high-profile attitude jocks rotating the market's best-testing mass-appeal currents and oldies, then yes, KMEL is Top 40. If Top 40 is hyped-up jocks rotating the back page of R&R, then I'd have to confess, we are not a Top 40 radio station." Ditto!





Miller London grew up in Detroit, "just down the street" from the Motown building. Like most black youths coming up in the Motor City in the early '60s, Miller dreamed of working at Hitsville because "Motown was the thing." He got the chance in 1969, quitting his gig at a local car dealership while still at school to take the job, "even though it meant a \$200 a month cut in pay!" But Motown was his dream, even though Miller still harbored serious thoughts of eventually becoming a teacher. His first job at the House That Berry Built was Regional Sales Manager for eight-tracks. In '72, he moved with the label to L. A. as Singles Sales Manager, and in '76. was promoted to National Sales Manager. The upward mobility continued in the '80s, with Miller assuming the title VP of Sales, adding Marketing and Distribution a little later and even serving as acting GM for 18 months. After many "temptations" by old Motown pal Skip Miller, London finally took the balt to embark on "a new kind of adventure" as VP of Product Development, Black Music, for RCA Records earlier this year. HITS' retail bozo Joe Medwick's idea of an adventure is changing the laces on his hockey skates.

What was it like going from a traditionrich R&B label like Motown to RCA?

We may not have the R&B catalog, but RCA as a whole has a tremendous history, especially in country product and Elvis. The black product has mostly come from our distributed labels.

in terms of distributed labels, Jive has really been smokin' lately.

Boogie Down Productions is the hottest thing that's out. Jonathan Butler and Glen Jones are starting to happen, Ruby Tumer has been a success, and of course. D'Nice has come out of the box like gangbusters. These are all projects I've been involved with since I came over.

What kind of marketing plan did you have for D'Nice?

The record actually started in New York on WRKS. We were forced to release it a little early because of the response, but the plan was ready. We had a video ready, we had the single on radio, it really just developed from the street. We just took the airplay that we had and worked the areas in which it was happening without trying to build a big charttopper. Radio supported us by playing it, but a lot of the rap stations didn't report it. You've got a great many acts right now that are selling half a million units that never got total exposure at radio. There's a very strong network of kids into rap out there who are making things happen.

Are you breaking dance acts in the same way?

Dance is a little different because clubs are still a major factor. You can hit the charts with the help of clubs and there are some stores around the country that will buy from those charts. One act like

that for us is Black Box, which started Dance, but we recognized the kind of record we had early on and went for Urban radio at the same time. We were able to break it in a more traditional fashion. But we've got danceoriented records like Deskee, D.J. Pierre and Wee Papa Girls, which developed through the clubs and, in many cases, crossed over to Top 40 instead of Urban radio. If you can get one that hits in all formats like Black Box, you're in good shape.

RCA has broken a few black acts lately. We've been very fortunate. We had a good run with a new act called Domino Theory, and needless to say, Tyler Collins has had two Top Ten records and a Top Five Pop record with "Girls Nite Out." and we think the third single is going to be equally big. We have other developing rap acts like 415 out of the Bay Area, who are starting out as a kind of

underground-type hit. How does your division work with other areas of RCA and BMG in getting these new acts out to retail?

It works out great. The best part is everyone gets excited about a hit piece of product, no matter what format it's in. There's a great deal of interaction in our marketing meetings, so we all know everything that's happening. In fact, with

Boogie Down Productions, we have a project that our Album Rock and Alternative people are both excited

The Brothers Figaro, with album now out, played a lively weekend set at the new and trendy Blak and Bloo club, which ended with delighted Geffen staff members and labelmates Shadowland joining them onstage for a manic finale.... And personal local favorites Far Cry are now no longer a secret, as a bevy of anxious industry folk attended last week's Lingerie showcase.... The Bonedaddys played an unusual gig last week — a birthday party for Jack Nicholson's daughter, who turned a tender 17 Kate & Anna McGarrigle's latest for new label Private Music was produced by Pierre Marchand, the remarkable protege of Daniel Lanois, and includes "I Eat Dinner," the saddest and most haunting song since Sinead's "Nothing Compares 2 U."



This is stuff which came out of that dark hole we were in at the time. It was an exorcism, just as each of our records has been, I tend to have material like that at the end of a tour, because that's when I'm most depressed. I've been doing some singing with other people and really enjoying it because I'm not so emotionally involved. I'm trying to get that kind of relationship with my own material, where it's not such a knock-down, drag-out, gutwrenching experience. I started writing in the first place to escape the problems I had at home. It was someplace to go. I never had my own room. I had to share everything with five other kids. But I was able to shut all that out. Music has always served that purpose for me.

What led to the personnel changes which made you a threepiece again, with you once more playing bass?

We didn't want to be just another rock band. I wasn't very happy because I felt I didn't have much to do with the music anymore. I felt like the group was growing apart. Jim [Mankey] and I are pretty much loners. We're not into the rock & roll myth. I was at the

point where I wanted to get better at what I do. The very people that came to our gigs and came backstage to meet us were the last people in the world I wanted to hang out with. I was miserable. I knew when we left for London to record this album, our heads were not where they should have been and it made me nervous. Then, the very first day in the studio, Harry [Rushakowsky, the former drummer] just picked up and left. We were lucky Paul [Thompson] was able to step right in.

sional accountant, take a look at our books and she found all these double bank accounts. I don't know what a nervous breakdown is technically, but I'll bet I had one. I was in miserable shape Drinking like a fish. And flat fucking broke. There was no money coming in at all. And by this time, the offer from I.R.S. was sounding pretty good.

Do you manage to maintain any romantic relationships?

My situation, traveling around and not being here, is unique. I see a

But I don't want to get fucked up. And you're not doing me any favors offering it to me. I won't be treated as some stupid rock star. I'm past worrying that people won't think I'm feminine for standing up for myself. There are a whole legion of kids who really like the way I am. I'm a very soft person under here, but very protective. We're the most boring band in the world on the road. We don't like getting arrested or telling jail stories. That rock & roll lifestyle kills people.

You lost a great deal of momentum with the legal struggles which ensued between "True" and "Free," your second album. The group even declared bankruptcy at one point. We were bankrupt! So I fired the manager, revoked power of attorney, froze our assets and went to Australia. I had my sister, who's a profeslot of people who are married sit on their asses together every day and never even see one another. I think people really need their own space. Most people get together for all the wrong reasons - because somebody looks good on your arm at dinner or you're afraid to sleep alone at night. All my adult life, I've been striving for normalcy. That's why I take my cat on the road with me and cook my own meals. It's strange because rock & roll is an outlet for rebellion, that glorious '60s myth people still cling to. I don't see the






