



HAS POST MODERN CHANGED? YUP, IT SURE HAS ...

ON RECORDS By Lenny Beer Changing Of The Guard

NOT JUST VANILLA ICE: The ascension this week of Vanilla Ice to the #1 position in the album world is not the only interesting development. After a relatively stagnant summer with little more than position-jockeying between the nation's leading sellers, action is now busting out all over as fall begins to turn into winter.

This week's Top 20 features the return of a legendary hard (and we mean hard) rock band in Atco's enormous AC/DC (scoring at #3 without the benefit of a single), the emergence of the latest Neobilly superstar in Garth Brooks (Capitol) (who not only has a sizzling new album in the Top Ten, but also boasts his debut set in the Top 50), the Vaughan Brothers (Epic) (which has been bolstered by the publicity surrounding Stevie Ray Vaughan's death, but stands on its own musically as well), the long-awaited new release from INXS (Atlantic), WB's dynamic justreleased albums from ZZ Top and Poul Simon (neither led by a hit single, but neither suffering), Iron Maiden's Epic label bow and Bette Midler (Atlantic), with a sizzling single converting almost immediately to LP activity.

AN ECLECTIC MARKET: But it's not just the Top 20 that has become interesting. The tastes of the American buyer lean more toward the eclectic each week. Today's modern country music is selling everywhere, with the aforementioned Garth Brooks leading the way for hot sellers from Randy Travis (WB), Clint Black (RCA) and Reba McEntire (MCA), alongside scorching new metal from Slayer (Def America) and Megadeth (Capitol), dance/hip-hopfrom-Deee-Lite (Elektra), folk throwback from Indigo Girls (Epic), contemporary blues from Robert Cray (Mercury), big band redux from movie star and piano stylist extraordinaire Harry Connick. Jr. (Columbia), Post Modern winners from Cocteau Twins (Capitol), Jane's Addiction (WB) and HITS cover boys the Replacements (Sire/-Reprise), a cappella gospel from Take 6 (Reprise) and perhaps the strangest companion to all of these in the classical tenors live set from Carreras, Domingo & Pavarotti (London) — which is already doing monster business around the world.

AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH JHERYL BUSBY BY LYNN BLADES

It isn't easy trying to follow in the footsteps of a record business giant like Motown founder Berry Gordy, who started the company with an \$800 loan from his parents and built it into the largest and most successful black-owned and operated company in U.S. history. If anybody's up to the task, though, it's veteran music industry executive Jheryl Busby, who took the helm of the fabled label last year — fresh from revitalizing MCA's black music division — to try to retool its hitmaking engine. Taking his cue from Motown's rich legacy, Busby has given the company a much-needed facelift, inking a slew of promising young talent like Johnny Gill, the Boys, Gerald Alston, Basic Black and Blaze and veterans like the Pointer Sisters to go alongside old standbys such as co-founder Smokey Robinson, Stevie Wonder and the returning Diana Ross. He revived and updated the old "Motortown Revue" concept with a tour that featured some of the new roster and entered the burgeoning rap market for the first time. He also retooled the company's executive staff, adding experienced marketing/sales exec Harry Anger as Chief Operating Officer of the label.

Motown is currently marking its 30th anniversary with the publication of "The Motown Album: The Sound of Young America," featuring a forward by Gordy, an introduction by critic Elvis Mitchell, historical text by Ben Fong-Torres and more than 350 rare photographs. In the middle of the celebration, Busby found himself hospitalized for two months after stepping on a piece of glass and ending up with a serious foot infection. But it's hard to keep a good man down, and Jheryl continued to work the phones from bedside while recuperating. Now that he's back at the office, he's more than willing to discuss his tenure at Motown as well as his hopes and dreams for the future — especially with a babe as foxy as HITS' own Deborah Norville wannabe, TV star Lynn Blades.

Tell us about that bum foot of yours.

That was a real frightening experience for me, especially having children and everything. What's that statement, "If you don't have your health"? For the first time, it made sense to me.

Can Motown return to the kind of family atmosphere it had at the start? I think we're starting to. Again, if you're using the 30 years as a marker, you just have to reach back into your own history and pull up the things that have worked in the past. Do you feel a great deal of pressure?

I carry a great deal of responsibility, but this is a wonderful family of people. Most of them have bought the dream and are interpreting it for themselves. I hope Motown remains a company dedicated to the development of people. What can the industry expect from Motown in the near future? It's a label that must move into the '90s. There are three new businesses we hope to launch in the next year. Obviously, we have to re-enter the publishing business. We're also going to enter the licensing business. The Motown logo is like Disney. It's the only recognizable symbol in the music industry. As big as CBS and Warner Bros. are, they could not go to NBC and say, let's do a Sony or Warners TV special. It just wouldn't mean anything. The Motown logo is like a piece of merchandise. The

other area is the video business. Anything that would fit the lifestyles of blacks and our contributions to the entertainment business in a visual form could be marketed under a Motown video line. Those are the three immediate areas which are part of our overall game plan. Let's get to the sound of Motown. You've recently begun signing rap acts. Do you feel the genre's commercial future is strong?

I think it's part of the American musical texture. It has proven some basics that the industry seemed to forget. Rap has managed to develop its own marketplace largely without the support of radio. They realized their product didn't have to necessarily depend on airplay to sell. It was great to see young kids remind us of some of the first rules of this business we might have forgotten. Now, to see radio acceptance means that the rap community has marketed itself into the households of middle America. I think rap's here to stay.

Motown hasn't been nearly as successful with rap as I'd like it to be. We've released several rap-oriented soundtracks such as "Do The Right Thing" and "House Party," and we're not going to stop. I felt "House Party" was the first film to really capture the hip-hop era and document it. We got a great deal of visibility from our involvement in both those films.

M.C. Trouble is the first rap performer we've signed that seems to be coming out with a marketable image. We're far from excelling in understanding how to sell rap, but we'll keep forging ahead until we crack that one big platinum M.C. Hammer-type artist. ness of selling time. Tomorrow, if cracking eggs over a hot stove and recording the sound attracted an audience, they'd program it. They wouldn't care about the record business. Black music comes from black people. I hope we make good music that represents black America. I feel, if you do that, America will come to it.

How do you feel about crossover?

The words bother me a bit. I think it's important to be good at what you do, and if the end result is crossover which may be more of a marketing effort than anything else — that's great. Any comments about the censorship controversy which has plagued the music industry? Obviously, we have a responsibility. Still, as with any industry, we have to learn to govern ourselves. To have someone else govern you is a big mistake. What we seem to be doing through our trade associations is finding ways to make sure we're in charge of our own destiny. That's the important thing.

What responsibilities do you feel as a label toward black radio?

When I think of black radio, I usually won't use the word responsibility because I realize they're in the busiSpeaking of being in control of your own destiny, how's Motown's relationship been with MCA? There are three general partners in Motown an investment group called Boston Ventures, MCA and myself. MCA is both a partner and a distributor. That describes the relationship. They have members on the board, and this is a company that's run by a board. We've had no problems.

Why did you decide to bring in Harry Anger as **Chief Operating Officer?** I questioned bringing in a C.O.O. for a long time. I thought what we needed was more Indians, not another chief. In reality, what we needed was an organization and operations man who could take ideas and implement them throughout our system. He has brought in some quality people. I give him credit for our new sales staff, our new marketing people. We're on the verge of going totally automated. It wasn't until Harry came in that you could see, as long as things are operating well, you have a chance.

Do the words "free time" mean anything to you? What's that? I'm a single parent with three children. That takes up a lot of my free time right there. My biggest and most important awards of last year were being named Parent of the Year by my kids' school and Brownie Parent of the Year. Beyond this, I'm a parent. As life goes on, I guess I'll evolve into other things, too. I'm actually kind of a homebody. I find a lot of tranquility in simple things. o

AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH RANDY KABRICH BY MIKE MURPHY

RANDY

This University of North Carolina grad studied the radio, TV and motion picture business as well as political science after launching his radio career as a part-timer at WZOO in Ashboro, NC. He worked for a variety of Carolina stations such as WCBX, WSML, WSGH (now KZL), WAIR, WRQK, WDNC and WBBB before seguing to El Paso and his first MD gig at KROD/KLAQ. In 1978, he went over to WGCL in Cleveland, then crosstown to WZZP, where he was MD and Assistant PD. He earned his first programming stripes at WZUU in Milwaukee then went over to G105 in Durham as PD. He was PD at WAVA and WAYS/ROQ, then introduced his much-imitated Adult Top 40 format at Q-105 in '85. He was Operations Manager at L.A.'s Pirate Radio in 1989, then hooked up as station manager at Y95 in Dallas, where he remains today, up until the moment he agreed to talk with HITS' bumbling broadcast bozo Mike Murphy.

A great many people credit the concept of Adult Top 40 to what you established at Q-105. How did that station compare to today's "Mix" format?

Q-105 was the first Adult Top 40 of the '80s. If you listen to Orlando and Columbus, you hear the same adult oldies that were mainstays on Q-105 since 1986. Brian Thomas admitted to studying Q-105 for several years. The difference between the Nationwide "Mix" format and Q-105 was that WRBQ continued to play the active spike songs at night. Q-105 could have continued to make a lot of money into the 21st century as an Adult Top 40 in the face of WFLZ, but 12+ egos got in the way. With the current popularity of the Adult Top 40/"Mix" format, a great many PDs will be faced with management wanting to jump on the adult bandwagon. How can they deal with that?

As the median age of the country continues to grow, Top 40 has to find ways to appeal to upper demos. Otherwise, the Top 40s of today will be the beautiful music stations of 1980. By the year 2000, there will be no room for more than one Top 40 station per market. Group owners have publicly stated they want out of Top 40.

You have to understand where your GM is coming from. As the nation's media age grows past the mid-30s, sugar-based soft drinks are falling out of grace and diet drinks are in. Top 40 receives major revenue from the soft drink and beer industry. Now they are avoiding stations with teens. Even the record industry has abandoned Top 40. As New Kids and rap have killed off adults at Top 40, we see a shifting of assets. Top 40 stations have become worthless as record companies experience record-breaking quarters. The record industry has abandoned Top 40?

Ten years ago, the record companies spent thousands in the major markets every week on radio advertising. Now that money is spent on newspapers.



has abandoned Top 40.

We're the #1 Top 40 in Dallas and I don't think we've had three record buys this year. If the record companies are putting their ad budget in other areas than Top 40, and they are the ones that will suffer most from Top 40's demise, then why should other advertisers want to buy on Top 40 stations — especially when they're after demos Top 40 doesn't deliver?

How can Top 40s get adult demos? The magic word is dayparting. Most record people and many radio people don't want to hear about it. Either programmers will learn to daypart intelligently — which is an art — or they'll be the first Top 40 in their market to be forced out. If a GM is determined to be an Adult Top 40, it's his job to define what the programmer and station is to deliver. He has to look for the long-term value of the station by learning how to get adults or find a new job. Are Y-95's owners, Evergreen Media, committed to Top 40 in Dallas? Luckily, we are determined to be the survivor here. Evergreen owns the Loop in Chicago, which is the #2 biller in the city, and the Beat in L.A. With both of these powerhouses bringing in elephant dollars, we'll make Dallas work and be here in the year 2000.

What's the difference musically between Y95 and KEGL?

Since August, there has been no difference. We have proven we can force the Weasel on records, but they can't force us on songs. Head Weasel Joel Folger has started using the BDS system and is playing our list song-for-song. This has thrown rock listeners to Q102 as the recent Arbitron shows Q102 picking up the exact audience share Weasel 97 lost. It's interesting to be able to program two stations in the same market. Could it be that's what someone resorts to when they run out of creativity? Can you challenge KVIL for the contemporary lead?

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KVIL is not the focus of our attention. Their median listener is a 40.2-year-old female and growing, so they're really not a young contemporary station. Our challenge at Y95 is to make our median listener a 26-year-old female, so you can see we're not really competing for the same listener. We just want to be the young adult's KVIL and we're happy they let us broadcast in the same market.

How many people do you talk with on the phone in a typical day? At last count, as of 3 pm this afternoon,

1,239. I mean, how many people besides Charlie Minor have three rollover numbers on their private line? How do you think you're perceived by the record community?

A cross between Saddam Hussein and the grinch that stole Christmas.

What's been the biggest surprise you've had about the Dallas area? The real shock was that this market is so slow to accept new music as hits. Steve Kingston and I readjusted the library the first weekend we arrived and then just let nature take its course. I had always perceived this area as a haven for new music. There have been a few songs we've broken on a national level — such as Vanilla Ice, Nelson, Faith No More, Slaughter, Depeche Mode and the Vaughans — but overall, the market is very slow to react.

What is this Heather Locklear/ Deborah Norville thing I keep hearing about?







TIME FOR A CUP OF JOE AND A DOUGHNUT WITH BRIAN ENO BY DEIRDRE O'DONOGHUE

"Wrong Way Up," the collaboration between Brian Eno and John Cale, marks Eno's long-awaited return to pop music — his first vocal record since "Before and After Science" 13 years ago. The two first worked together in 1974, when Brian produced John's "Fear" LP. Then last year, the two traveled to Moscow where Eno recorded Cale's "Words For The Dying," an orchestral and choral adaptation of the poetry of Dylan Thomas. They co-wrote three songs, one of which, "The Soul of Carmen Miranda," was included on the album.

Brian Eno is widely regarded as one of the most influential and enigmatic figures in music today. His early work with Roxy Music, his own pop and ambient solo LPs and his remarkable productions for the likes of David Bowie, Talking Heads and U2 are marked by an unconventional, experimental, wide-ranging imagination. HITS managed to obtain a transcript of the following interview KCRW-FM's Deirdre O'Donoghue did with the genius, cut it up and rearranged it in a way that makes no sense at all.

The new album is the first time you've sung on a record in 13 years. I saw a flier today that said something like, "Éno's first singing record since before the French Revolution." I quess it's my first vocal record in 38 years. What prompted you to go back in the studio and work in this manner again? I just felt like it. It doesn't mean I've suddenly changed direction and turned my back on whatever else I was doing. For a long time, I just didn't feel like making song records. And then this year,

I did. How much time did you spend working on this record?

I decided in advance that it ought to be done very quickly. I really didn't want one of those overcooked pop records — that sort of style of gloss and polish. It was done relatively simply, actually quite primitively in a way. The equipment is the same stuff I've had in my studio for years. It was out of date when I bought it and it's even more out of date now. But it's reliable old stuff I know how to use.

put the emphasis on what the singing is doing, rather than what the structure is doing. What are you up to now? I might be doing some work with Annie Lennox. I've also iust started a new line of work which involves slide projectors. I've also been doing a lot of writing lately, theoretical stuff mostly. I'm supposed to give a talk at the Museum of Modern Art in New York later this month and I'm real nervous about it. I always get nervous before everything; it's the sense of having once again bitten off more than you can chew. Then the time comes when you actually have to do it and you realize you could really lose face, which is the only penalty, really, in being an artist. And that's not too dangerous.

Has that ever happened to you?

Of course. What feels bad is abusing people's trust. I know

could have had something to do with Public Enemy. Why did you work with John Cale on this album? I've worked with him a great deal in the past. I first worked with him on "Fear," back in his inflatable doll-stabbing era. It's always a bit of a shock when you're trying to concentrate on your little synthesizer in the corner and suddenly, a blood-stained carving knife flies across the stage.

Do you think you'll tour with this album?

I'm not a spontaneous type of performer. I couldn't just get up and do it. It takes

time, y'know, to get the blood capsules to burst at the right time. Got to get the bats in, that sort of thing. *

A lot of musicians use technology as a crutch. It has to do with being frightened you have't explored every possible option. The whole synthesizer terror is, "Maybe I didn't get the very best sound I could." There is no very best sound. What you play is related to what sound you have and that must relate to what song you're in. When I'm in a studio, I dread seeing a synthesizer come in, because I

know a lot of time is about to be wasted. I'm a real simpleton, composition-wise, because, as a songwriter, I if I make a record, people expect something of it, a particular attention to quality. I can't just do things whimsically.

Are you aware of how much of an influence you've been on other musicians and artists?

It's very flattering. It's nice to know that one is part of an ongoing discourse. For instance, somebody told me the other day the guy who produces Public Enemy said "My Life In The Bush of Ghosts" was a big influence on the way they work and I thought it was great to think I

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TIME FOR A CUP OF JOE AND A DOUGHNUT WITH ULTRA VIVID SCENE BY DAVID SPRAGUE

Kurt Ralske straddled the London/N.Y. axis for a few years, making the scene at the British clubs, then returning to Jersey to play noise guitar for beatnik poets. And then — he became a band. The first batch of Ultra Vivid Scene releases (including a brilliantly understated, self-titled LP) were well enough received that major labels were sniffing around 4AD's offices, eager to sign the band. Only trouble was, there was no band — just Ralske and his bag o' stuff. That changed for "Joy: 1967-1990," Ultra Vivid Scene's Columbia bow, which featured a somewhat permanent line-up stabilized by touring. In time, of course, that will undoubtedly lead to traveling in five separate buses — but in the meantime, Ultra Vivid Scene's Kurt Ralske is ready to party down with HITS' resident pigfuckskronknoise fan David Sprague.

It's more energetic than the first. I'm just hoping it's more of a record people could play when they're cleaning house or getting ready to go to a party. Have you enjoyed your first stab at real touring?

We did two months in England, which were the first headlining dates we'd ever done. It was good for the band to see that we actually have fans — fans who give us flowers, crush each other at the front of the stage and knock my glasses off. Are you interacting with crowds any more comfortably? I don't want to pander to anybody, but sometimes it's cool. There's this one quote from Mick Jagger, "Sometimes I look out in the front row and I want to fuck every one of

you." I can understand that. Since you've been on MTV, do you enjoy being recognized?

No, I don't, really. I'm not doing this because I want to be adored or admired. I think I have something to say. That can create an admiration factor from people I have nothing in common with. Just because people fork over eight bucks for one of my records, that doesn't mean they're my friends. If they sent it to me directly, maybe they'd be honorary buddies.

What stuck with you from the period when you lived in London? I went over mainly for the music scene. I starved and got to meet a bunch of people who were doing things that had an interesting approach. Bands like Jesus & Mary Chain and My Bloody Valentine look to the '60s for inspiration, but are very much a product of the times they live in. They're not on nostalgia trips, which is something I aspire to. The less things are familiar to you, the more you're challenged. The more distance you have from the circumstances of your life, the closer you are to the actuality of your life. What do you do for comfort?

I don't like it. It's too easy. You sleep eight hours a day —that's comfortable. The rest should be — I dunno — a waking nightmare.

You've recorded the song "Crash" a few times, and it was also the name of your previous band. What gives? It's also a novel by J.G. Ballard about a guy who has a psychosexual obsession with car crashes. I find that sort of thing attractive, I guess. What's the significance of the LP title?

It's either totally flippant or totally serious. It can sound either like a compilation record or a tombstone. It's that kind of answer that'll pigeonhole you as a sensitive artist type.

You're right. I'm getting out of introspection, actually. I just wanna party from now on. ${\ensuremath{\mathfrak{S}}}$

Were there any government reprisals for your "pirate" radio broadcast in London?

No, not really. We're going to be doing another one in a couple of weeks' time, one that's a little more technically together than the last one. It probably won't be more fun though. For the last one, we didn't get on the air until two in the morning — but the party was good.

Why did you decide to make this new release a collection of dance remixes?

The germ of the idea had been there for quite awhile. Last year, particularly when we were touring in America, people were asking us why our 12inch singles were almost always immediately deleted and cost so much to find. We thought, why don't we put them all together on a budget-priced album, and the people who want to buy it, will.

You've taken an interesting approach, using a number of engineers to create the remixes.

It was almost like we've made an album without really being there. It's the first time I've relinquished control to this degree. I was very nervous, but I'm delighted with what's gone on. Some of the remixes are so radical, it sounds almost like a different band. There are a lot more screaming guitar passages on this record. It was the first time I ever allowed Porl



There's a lighter side to the Cure which accounts for singles like "Lovesong," "Let's Go To Bed" and "Just Like Heaven," but somehow the notion of this group releasing an album of dance re-mixes seems incongruous. With Robert Smith at its helm, the Cure's music is marked by intensity, introspection and often, downright gloom. So turn your head around with "Mixed Up," an album of 12 remixes that recasts the Cure — musically, at least — as a group dedicated to tight grooves and searing guitar solos. The quintet has apparently gotten into the spirit of this release, previewing it last month in London with a "pirate radio" broadcast that was celebrated despite the fact — because of technical difficulties — it didn't get on the air until the wee hours. During a quick phone conversation from his home studio, the lucid and lipsticked Mr. Smith gave HITS' own garter belt aficionado Gary Graff some grooming and make-up tips.

[Thompson] to do a guitar solo on record. He had been badgering me to do something heavier ever since the last tour, especially since some of the songs were turning into epics onstage. When we did "Never Enough" (the album's first single), we were jamming for about 15 minutes, so I said to Porl, "Go do a guitar solo, and play as much as you want." Most of the wah-wah is Porl — a lot of my stuff got lost in the final mix.

Does the approach you took on this record foreshadow what future Cure records might sound like? I don't know, but I doubt it. I don't think this has much bearing on what we're going to do. After "Pomography," the next thing we did was a bunch of pop singles, like "Let's Go to Bed." With "Disintegration," after taking a year of making the album and doing all those concerts - which was completely draining physically and emotionally - everyone in the group just wanted to do something that was a bit more upbeat.

You said "Disintegration" would be the last Cure album and tour. Did you mean it?

Sure. I mean it when I say those things. Until we make another album, "Disintegration" is the last album. I'm still convinced we won't tour again. We played 13 festival dates this summer around Europe, but that was just places we've always wanted to go, like Czechoslavakia. The rest of the group is itching to do something, but I like to wait until I know what we're going to do is good.

Giving up the Cure would seem commercially foolhardy.

The only need we've ever had to make records is an internal need. It's something that doesn't cater to the audience. Once in a while, I might worry about what people think of it, but the initial impetus is the desire to write and record music. If that's not there in a or fail based on the time it's released, so I'll just keep it for awhile. It's a purely acoustic record, with very little on it — at most, there are three instruments on a couple of the tracks. I don't want it to get in the way of what the Cure's doing by introducing an

From SOUPDRAGONS to NUTS

Undisputed darlings of the vicious, fickle and powerful U.K. press, the Soup Dragons are breathing fire all over these days with their version of the Stones classic, "I'm Free," featuring a guest appearance by Jamaican toaster Junior Reid and a gospel choir, from their label bow on Mercury, "Lovegod." The group was hatched in a Glasgow garage in 1986, recording a debut album for Sire, "This Is My Art," two years later. After leaving the label, they cut a second LP for indie Big Life Records called "Crotch Deep Trash" before re-upping with the majors for their latest effort, a volatile mixture of psychedelic pop and acid-house dance flash. The Soup Dragons' vocalist/guitarist/sleaze fan Sean Dickson took some time out from the band's current 25-market tour to talk salmon mousse and crayfish cakes with HITS' own veteran lowlife Danny Fields, who vainly tried to make out the man's Scottish burr.

Are you a rock group or a dance group now?

You can dance to a lot of different styles. Dance is defined as moving your hips, so why should it be categorized as a particular style of music? I like to dance to groups such as Suicide, who are hypnotic to the point of being hallucinogenic.

The British press talk about something called the "anorak crowd." What's that?

It's a fashion accessory, similar to a kagoo, a jacket with a hood.

Do you feel trapped by all the trendiness over there?

Our group's been doing the same thing now for five years, recording for what's predominantly a dance label. Suddenly, everyone tries to put us down for doing things that have been natural for a long time. People who've followed us from the start can see the progression's been natural.

What's going on these days in Glasgow?

You've proven it's possible to have hit records without moving down to London.

We wanted to survive in a realistic setting. Going down to London is just business, and that's something which doesn't interest us. Anytime we feel disillusioned, we can always go home and not have to deal with the paparazzi and all that. It's a good space to live in. Were there other groups from Glasgow which made it easier for you to succeed?

None that I know of. There are always bands that come from everywhere. It's usually just an error of geography where a group comes from. Ever since the Beatles and that Merseybeat scene, everybody's tried to find that again. *How are you attempting to break*

the American marketplace?

Just do what we've been doing all along — make records and play live. As soon as we get to the point of not enjoying playing and making good records and videos, that's when we'll finish.

How do you like New York City?

There are a great many things about N.Y. culture I've always liked, going back to Andy Warhol and the Velvet Underground. I also love trash culture stuff like John Waters, Russ Meyer and all that degrading street-life sort of thing. To me, the '70s were the epitome of what New York was about. Uptown is boring. What I like is the "Taxi Driver" side of New York, Greenwich Village, Ray's Pizza — that sort of thing.


I hope so, because we're only 23 and I think we've put the same energy into it as they did back when they did it. What do you like least about



NEOBILLY PICKS

Clint Black, "Put Yourself In My Shoes" (RCA): Nothing like a year on the road to really strengthen one's vocalese, as evidenced by Clint Black's sophomore LP. Featuring more twists and bends than any singer this side of John Anderson, Black emerges as a consummate stylist

capable of merging rural blues, hardcore honky-tonk and outright crooning on "Put Yourself In My Shoes." Not as simple as its predecessor, "Shoes" takes chances, closing the gap between **Haggard** and **Jones** for the affable Texan.

Dwight Yoakam, "If There Was A Way" (Reprise): Pete Anderson's seek-and-destroy guitar parts and plaintive, Appalachian-influenced vocals make Dwight Yoakam's first LP in nearly three years a compelling one. "Turn It On," "The Heart You Own" and "Sad Sad Music" are true



country laments. "It Takes A Lot To Rock You Baby" is Elvis filtered through hardcore, while "Dangerous Man" rocks hard, too. And there's "Send A Message To My Heart," a sobbing duet with fellow Kentuckian Patty Loveless.



James House, "Hard Times For An Honest Man" (MCA): James House inhabits the role of serious young man with an unselfconsciousness that minimizes the inherent pretensions which often plague people with something to say. "Hard Times" deals with the difficulty of having ideals in a corrupt

world, while "Here's To You" is a contemplative moment celebrating one true love. Ditto "You Just Get Better All The Time." Also, check out the wild card — the thumping "That's What I Like About You."

Cheryl Wheeler, "Circles & Arrows" (Capitol): Cheryl Wheeler doesn't look like a party-doll country singer because she's not. Having penned Dan Seals' Grammy-nominated "Addicted," she writes from an intelligent perspective, with evocative melodies and a sensuous vocal that glimmers.



Produced by Kyle Lehning, "Circles" is the kind of standardsetting singer/songwriter LP that cuts across formats — especially "Hard Line To Draw," the finger-pickin' "Aces" and the Joan Armatrading-ish "Soon As I Find My Voice." r and the second s
