Byrd Grounded

David Crosby was hospitalized last weekend following a motorcycle accident near his Encino, Cal. home that left him with a broken left leg, ankle and shoulder, according to the LAPD.

Crosby told police he was riding his 1987 Harley Davidson on a winding road near his house Saturday afternoon when the throttle stuck while going around a curve, causing him to lose control as the bike slid sideways on the pavement more than 40 feet. 

AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH JIMMY BOWEN BY HOLLY GLEASON



One thing about Capitol Nashville's head Jimmy Bowen — he knows how to get the job done. Since taking the heim of the once-beleaguered iabel iast spring, he has turned its fortunes around, in large part due to the success of Garth Brooks' self-titled debut album and his recently released "No Fences." But Bowen's just begun. This is, after all, the man who helped Reba McEntire cross into precious metai sales during his tenure at MCA. He also co-produced many of George Strait's classic works of the late '80s. Helping artists focus their musical vision has always been something of a priority for Bowen, who moved to Nashville 14 years ago to head up Elektra's country division, where he galvanized rowdy guy Hank Williams Jr.'s career artistically and commercially. It wasn't long before Elektra joined forces with Warner Bros. Nashville, and an important alliance was forged that made the Bunny one of the leaders in the new traditionalist movement that took root during the mid-to-late-'80s.

Bowen's own experiences as an artist — he broke into the business as coauthor of the Buddy Knox hit "Party Doll" and sang on its B-side, "I'm Sticking With You" — have given him the ability to communicate with other musicians. As a Reprise staff producer who recorded several members of Sinatra's famed Rat Pack — including the Chairman himself on the classic "That's Life" — Bowen learned a few key lessons about talent, most notably, "I never met a superstar who didn't know what they should sing." And, at the brave new Capitol, Bowen feels he has several untapped superstars with unlimited potential. In addition to Tanya Tucker — who Bowen feels hasn't come close to maximizing her audience — there's crystal-voiced Suzy Bogguss, Southern blues-beiter T. Graham Brown, newcomer Linda Davis and Southern Boogle boys Pirates of the Mississippi. The legendary Bowen is known as a riverboat gambler not afraid to take the big risk, but he finally lost his pants when he agreed to a little "skins" game with HITS' low-handicap Neobilly Ringer Holly Gleason.

Country's selling very strong right now. Do you think it's selling to more people, or are the same fans simply buying more music? For a country-based artist to sell gold or platinum, they've got to

gold or platinum, they've got to reach outside the core country consumer. They've got to get that consumer who buys a little of everything — if they like James Taylor, for instance, maybe they'll try Reba because they saw her on Arsenio Hall. Or they saw k. d. lang on VH-1 and decided to buy the record. Then they find out it's marvelous, and they tell everybody they know. It's a word-of-mouth situation. The adult consumer doesn't have the gnawing need to buy music. Over the last 20 years, you have consumers raised on Top 40 radio that can't relate to the format. In looking for music they like now, they're finding some of it on country radio. They'll listen until they hear something they don't like — then maybe they'll try the Adult station, because they can't find anything that'll hold them for an hour.

The Southern rock resurgence you're starting to see - with the Headhunters, Pirates of the Mississippi and several others - is going to cause even more people to hear country music. Country music is doing better than ever since I've been here --- and that's been 14 years. It's also because we're making a better 40 minutes of music. We've got producers in town, coupled with some neat new artists, who're causing some great music to be made quicker. Radio's getting better music from these new acts and discovering their ratings aren't falling. So they're consistently programming more new artists and things are starting to get real exciting.

Beyond making great music, what else must the record companies do to facilitate this new growth? You have to establish the artist at their base - radio and video. Once you've done that, you've got to take it to the masses. Having the music is the key, but then you've got to know how to get it in Musicland and available to the buyer, which is all about relationships, money, planning and pre-sell. We don't do point-of-purchase anymore because there's no room for it. You have to make the retailer and the rack buyer aware that they've got something

that's for more than just the country section. You've got to convince them to put Garth Brooks between Vanilla Ice and M.C. Hammer — and that doesn't happen for free. That's marketing. You can't cause it to happen, but you can expand sales once you realize you have something special.

The first time Reba McEntire went on Arsenio Hall, two million people saw her and we felt the increase across the counter. They were intrigued enough to buy the album, and once they did, they were saying, "Y'know, I like that red-headed girl from Oklahoma," 'cause they're brand-new to it. John Schneider was down here with me after having four #1 country hits and he says, "Bowen, no one in the real world even knows I sing." That's true, because in New York and L.A., country music's way down on the totem pole. When he went back to Hollywood, people'd say, "What are you doing now?" When you're 8, 9, 10% of the business, you're always fighting to keep that space at retail, while at the same time trying to expand it. But all the marketing in the world won't help you if you don't have the music and the initial sales.

You have the biggest roster of any label in Nashville. Does that present any special challenges?

It's very difficult because a lot of these acts are either making a comeback or are brand-new. Radio gets 15 new records a week and they can add three. But I've always said, if you've got a great record, it will get

through. I want the artists I work with to pick music that represents them - then we can go after it. You never know - if I did, I'd stay in my office and just consult the industry. If people like something, they'll let you know. Glen Campbell had three stiffs before he cut a song called "Gone. Gone, Gone" that was a hit. People think we tell them, but that's not true; they tell us. All we can do is try to get it exposed so they can say yes or no to it. Suzy Bogguss was saying that when she made her debut album [the just-released "Moment of Truth"], you really put the onus of creative responsibility on her, and that it was a little bit scary.

Artists almost have a heart attack when they realize that's what the deal is. But if you've ever been around Hank Williams Jr., you know that you don't tell him what to do. And I learned this in the '60s when I was working with Frank Sinatra --- it's his music. He's just hired you to help him do it. Suzy's a unique situation, because she's developing. She's got a real shot, but there's only 50% of her on this record. You allow your artists to pick their own material, too. I never met a superstar that didn't know what they oughta sing. Once you connect with an artist, it'll happen over and over, I

G.'s shirt was so loud he couldn't hear him. think it's illogical for me to tell an artist what to sing. Especially women. I don't know what women want to hear because I'm not one — and they're the major music consumers. It used to be this real macho redneck world. Reba wasn't put in charge of her own music until I started working with her. Then I told her, "I can get great musicians who'll play for you and help you pick the songs, but if you don't know what you should sing, then you'll never sell records."

How do you reconcile artistic self-determination with commercial constraints?

I talk to my regional field promotion and marketing people every weekend, in addition to the people in the office, so I get an idea of what's going on out there. Then I tell my artists, "be yourself, but while you're doing that, give me three for radio."

How many artists are you involved in producing now? Six or seven. At Elektra, Warners and MCA, I was a lot more involved in production. Back then, we didn't have [RCA A&R VP] Josh Leo, Barry Beckett or James Stroud in town. Now we have people you can trust in the studio. It used to concern me

when some producers put their own ego trips on the artists and you'd end up with a half-assed record — half-artist, half-producer or half-engineer — and that's not the real thing.

Capitol's really turned around since you've been there. What kind of changes did you make? I had to change 90% of the staff. When you take over a company, you want to keep as many people as you can because they know what's going on. But you've got to keep the ones who can work within the system you're setting up. My attitude is, "This is your job description if we need to change it, let me know." Then I show all the departments how to interact with each other. I give them the big picture, how they plug into it and then I want them to do their jobs.

At Warners, we took Martha Sharp, who was a songwriter and my assistant, and made her head of A&R. We had Nick Hunter, who's still the best promotion man in town and who also has good song-sense. We brought Janice Azrak in from the West Coast to handle publicity. We built a team. At Capitol, I was fortunate to find Joe Mansfield, who has lots of experience and

wanted to move to Nashville. Bill Catino has been with me for six years, but he was head of promotion at Cleveland International when they had Meat Loaf.

The thing about labels is, how can you build slowly and not sacrifice the music that you've got? You can't. So, you've got to hit the ground running with the best pros you can find. This is the quickest I've ever had a label come together.

Do you have a guiding philosophy?

It doesn't take genius to take care of music, just hard work. Genius comes in the music. I watch Galante — if he does something that works at retail, I'll do it. I don't care if I'm second doing it — if it works. I'll just change the name of it and do it. If I see Nick Hunter doing something in promotion, I'll do it. You have to be set up to move. When I came in, Capitol was spending all their money on Anne Murray and none on Garth. Somebody just wasn't paying attention, because in the Southeast, he was breaking out. His success hasn't surprised us — just the degree.

We're back to sales again.

Because we finally have a few artists who are selling like pop acts. There used to be Alabama. Then there was Randy Travis. Then came Clint Black. When Clint broke. I sent Galante a telegram saving, "Congratulations for all of us," because that kind of success makes retail more aware of the genre. Garth is doing the same thing right now. And the second tier is growing, too. You've got Travis Tritt, Alan Jackson and Vince Gill all going gold. It's great music, but it's also getting people into the stores. So now it becomes a question of continuing to make great music or going home. Where are you originally from? Dumas, Texas. In May of 1956, we had a band called Buddy

Knox. I played bass, Don Lanier, who lives and works here now, was our electric guitar player and we had a drummer. We went to Clovis, New Mexico, where we cut our first records. Buddy Holly and Roy Orbison were both recording there. The reason we went there was because we heard "Ooby Dooby" and went, "Wow! What a great record." We went over there and cut a song called "Party Doll" that Buddy and I'd written, and I ended up singing the B-side, "I'm Sticking With You." We sent it off to five or six labels and nobody paid any attention, so we got up a thousand dollars and got a guy from the Texas panhandle, who'd helped Orbison, to press up 1,000 records. The guy ends up

going to New York City and selling 'em to Morris Levy and Roulette Records. Somewhere right now, wherever the hell he is. Morris is grinning about it. We sold him the masters for three grand and two percent - and we thought we'd made a hell of a deal! The first television show we did was Ed Sullivan. The first gig we did was Times Square. We started at the top and worked our way down. But I'd just as soon go straight down as up and then down. That was back in '56, '57, '58, '59. Did you go directly from being an artist to being a producer? No, I went to Colorado Springs and back to being a disc jockey. Then I went to California and got into publishing. I figured I gotta eat, so I signed on with American Music as a writer. I produced demos and Glen Campbell sang on 'em, which is when I first met him. In 1962, Bob Marcucci hired me to run the West Coast for Chancellor Records and to start a country label. In November of '63, I went with Reprise. Why'd they pick you to start a

country label?

I have no idea. I guess they figured, if you're from Texas, you're country. But then, I was a rock & roller. Of course, I didn't like the Sinatra shit, either. So be careful what you don't like! I wound up really liking all that country stuff, though.

When I first came to Nashville, I was 38. I couldn't rock & roll anymore. And I found a lyric I could relate to. I fell in love with this music. I spent the first three years at Tompall Glaser's studio, and it was around the time Waylon was at RCA and getting away from the formula country shit. Tompall'd spend days saying stuff like, "This is what a fiddle sounds like!" or, "This is what a country guitar sounds like." He'd play me all these things and just keep sucking me in. And it worked. What do you see in the future for Neobilly?

The next thing you're going to see is strong women. Women buy the records, and if we put out records that have something to say to them, they're going to respond. *****

Frank started his radio career in the mid-'70s at age 15, as the youngest deejay in South Florida, working at the original 96X under such programming gods as Jerry Clifton, Joel Denver and Beau Raines. Frank was a 19-year-old APD when the station changed to Disco96, giving him his first professional exposure to dance music, and it was his job to hit the streets and find the dance hits. Frank left Disco96 and went to 195 to work for Keith Isley (with whom he now competes), and then moved to Y100 to work for Bill Tanner. After leaving Y100, Frank spent two-and-a-half years in San Antonio, first at KTFM and then at KITY, and in the mid-'80s, he went back to South Florida to program a small station called Rhythm98. "We were doing a cross between Black & Dance in the mid-'80s," he points out, "and it finally caught on nationally a few years ago." Tanner, who at the time was at Hot105, became a big fan of Rhythm98, and today Walsh is reunited with Tanner at Power96 in Miami, Fla., where he is APD. The two were rejoicing in their togetherness when HITS' radio loser Todd Hensley reminded them that even when things are going good, you still must deal with minor annoyances such as the slobs from magazines like this one.

To have an ewner who is concerned about the individual, and who is inclued in programming and trusts the programmers, is unusual these days. Anyone else you want to mention as long as we're stroking? And HITS Magazine is the absolute greatest...

(Ed. Note: Credible interview, huh?) Where did "Funk E." come from? When I was at 96X working for Jerry Chiton, I was a 15-year-old white way whose favorite groups were Earth, Wind and Fire, Ohio Players, and the Chi-lites. They said, "Frank, for a white boy,

What about Dance records?

If you really listen to everything - both on large and small labels - you'll have a better opportunity to find a few hits that no one else will. You also have to live a life similar to your audience. You can't say, "Well, I'll find out from these club d.j.s what's working for them." There is nothing like being in a club, or in a park where kids are playing boom boxes, or in a record store where people are buying the product. You have to be there - all the time. It's one thing to get people to tell you what they thought they saw; it's another to be there yourself and feel the crowd reaction. Some say disco came back and has died again, taking Top 40 radio with it. What do you think?

Disco, or dance music, is very much alive and healthy in this country. Look at the most requested songs at major stations. In Seattle, Deee-lite is huge; in Buffalo, 2 In A Room is a big record; Black Box is hot in Houston; Cynthia & Johnny O is happening in New York City and San Antonio. The records are still out there and they still work. The problem with dance music is oversaturation. One station in a market has

6

success with a dance format, and before you know it, there are three of them. Then stations try to outdance each other, and the audience says, "Stop! We like this stuff, but not that much of it." Then the reverse happens - programmers jump off the Dance boat and say that it's dead, and now they're jumping on the Adult boat. In Miami, we went from having three stations with a dance feel to one - Power96 - to eight stations that lean Adult. Eight stations in a market cannot all be successful playing Adult, so before long a few will come back and try Dance again. Some blame Rap and Dance for the down trend Top 40 experienced in the last book. Is this justified? Each programmer should take a look at their station individually if they're playing too much of any type of music rap, ballads, whatever. Ever since the "Disco is dead" thing, programmers have wanted to get rid of dance music once and for all, and now they're ready to jump on the Adult bandwagon. But which direction to choose has to be decided on an individual basis, station-

to-station and market-to-market. •







AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH AL B. SURE BY NEIL HARRIS

Al B. Sure is a changed man. The young soul rebel who killed the audience at the Apollo Theatre by inviting the ladies in the house onto the stage with him, only to bump 'em back into their seats with a single thrust of his hips, wants a little respect. His first LP, "In Effect Mode," seemed to be around forever, spinning off hit single after hit single, sittin' on the charts for well over a year. His reputation as a live performer is excellent. He is an in-demand producer and songwriter. But he doesn't feel like he has it all. Yet.

With the release of his second album, "Private Times... And the Whole 9!," Al wants to be taken seriously as a performer with a vision. The record is an introspective joint, but old fans shouldn't worry. The beats are still kickin,' and the hooks are still there. In fact, the most pressure on Al may be internal, as he waits to see how people react to his new style. Unfortunately, he talked to HITS' toadie Neil Harris, who doesn't have to worry because he has no style at all.

Where has the new album taken you that you haven't gone before?

I think this time I've gotten a chance to present my *real* self, my real personality. It's *me* on the album. For real. As opposed to just writing formula pop songs?

Exactly. It's very, very personal. Expressing myself is something that, even as a young fellow, I had trouble doing. It's very strange, because I wrote everything on the two albums except for a few songs. But writing wasn't something I loved, something I put my heart into. Now I love writing, which I didn't back then. It's amazing when you realize the power of expressing yourself on paper. Did you go through a maturation process which made you appreciate writing that much more?

I just had a hard time with it. I don't know when the transition came from it being a chore to being a pleasure. It just happened. Now it's my favorite thing to do.

Were you more concerned with being a performer before? That always seemed to be your strength.

Not really. I was into the production end, learning all I could about putting records together. I do everything with Kyle West, Eddie F. and Heavy D. You can learn a lot from those guys, and I really enjoyed putting records together with them.

What do you want people to get from the album?

Basically, I think of this album as a bridge. It bridges the gap between a number of situations, relationships in particular. It touches on subjects that people are afraid to talk about with each other. I want people to hear it on the radio and identify with it because it touches something inside them.

You're not really projecting the heavy attitude you did when you were younger.

Not at all. I think I've shown a lot of growth. Sometimes you cover things up with attitude, which I certainly have done. This record shows a lot more maturity. It's deeper all around. Do you think you'll still connect with the kids? Will they be able to relate to the "new" you?

I hope so. I still have some pretty hype beats on a number of tracks. A lot of other people have hype beats too, but they're not saying anything over them. I was guilty of that. I hope people will see I've changed. My motto is to do things that feel good. I love to go to clubs to dance and have fun, so I try to make records for that purpose as well.

I've also done my homework vocally, which I hope shows. No matter who you are, you can still learn about your work, still have room to improve. I'm still in school.


Have you been flexing your production chops lately?

Chaka Khan and Tevin Campbell have approached me. I work with this group called Jodeci, four guys from North Carolina. They're coming out on MCA and they're going to hit really hard. They're young and very talented. I let them do their thing and showed them how to maximize what they've got. You can be the greatest singer or the greatest player, but if you can't put it on tape, you're screwed. They rocked it hard and then we sorted it out in the mix later.



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

Brian Ritchie, "I See A Noise" (DALi/-Chameleon): Brian Ritchie's third solo album is yet another superb enhancement of the vast scope of Ritchie's musical abilities and influences. His talent is incorporating traditional instruments and Eastern arrrangements within the context of his and Peter

Balestrieri's songs, many of which display their keen sense of humor. OK, so maybe Mercy Seat won't be covering "Religion Ruined My Life," which is why this particular glimpse into the mind of one of the 'Femmes' founders is so fascinating.

Danielle Dax, "Blast The Human Flower" (Sire/WB): Danielle Dax' second domestically released album reunites her with guitarist/keyboardist David Knight and Karl Blake, both of whom she's been collaborating with since the days of the Lemon Kittens. Her dazzling beauty and gliding vocals



have often overshadowed the frightening intensity of her lyrics and the wide range of her musical eclecticism. That juxtaposition is what sets Danielle Dax in a league beyond the visionary and into the realm of the spiritual.



Happy Mondays, "Pills 'N' Thrills And Bellyaches" (Elektra): Since their first U.S. appearance on the soundtrack of "Lost Angels," the Happy Mondays have been consistently producing PoMo hit after hit. "Step On," included on this album, was one of the biggest hits of the summer, and all signals indicate that 'Kinky Afro," with its throwaway "Lady Marmalade" chorus

will fare much the same. "Pills 'N' Thrills" is a veritable cornucopia of guitar-affixed danceable pop, for which we give thanks. (Hey Jon, I didn't mention Manchester once!)

Horse Flies, "Human Fly" (MCA): This Ithaca, NY quartet have made a brilliantly bizarre debut album that is kinda how Poi Dog Pondering would sound after art school and too many cold winters, illustrated in "I Live Where It's Gray." Judy Hyman's violin provides a repetitive groove throughout the album,





providing a celtic feel, which when combined with minimalist synthesizer produces a hypnotic effect. Any band that can segue from the Cramps' "Human Fly" into the traditional lullaby "Hush Little Baby" is certainly a band worth watching and embracing. Look for a new album this spring!





AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTERVIEW WITH JOYCE CASTAGNOLA BY MICHAEL AMICONE

Describing herself as "the yenta from hell," Joyce Castagnola, Vice President of Sales for Virgin Records, takes the business of selling records very seriously. A veteran of the distribution/sales wars, Castagnola won her industry stripes during a nine-year tenure ('77-'86) with Record Factory, a major Bay Area retail chain. She eventually worked her way down the coast to Wherehouse's central office in Torrance, California for a brief stint as Director of Advertising and Product Marketing, before Virgin came a-courtin'. Whether directing her regional and local field staff or working with Virgin's distributor, Atlantic, Castagnola makes sure that her label's eclectic roster of artists — Paula Abdul, Lenny Kravitz, Steve Winwood, Iggy Pop, Soul II Soul, UB40, etc. — get their shot at the retail spotlight, as she explains to one guy who's better left in the dark, HITS' resident dim bulb Michael Amicone.

JOYCE TO THE WORLD

How do you ensure that Virgin's artists get a fair shake in the marketplace? By being in the branches and the sales offices, talking to the singles specialists, the in-house marketing reps, the sales reps, sales managers, field soles manager... there's a ton of people. If my staff gets the WEA system excited, three-quarters of their job is taken care of.

How do you keep your staff motivated? [Laughs.] I beat them, I yell at them, beat them again and make them carry my bags when I go on the road. They call me "Driving Miss Joyce." Virgin is very much known as an artist

development-oriented label.

Our reputation is excellent because we stand behind our records. We don't give up. An example of that is what we're doing with UB40. This record came out almost two years ago and it's just now starting to hit home. In the beginning, the retail community embraced UB40, but radio didn't. Now radio has and we're enjoying a lot of success with them. That's our job as the sales force — to go back and say, "Hey, Mr. Retailer, Mr. WEA, we're starting to get a nibble at radio, let's bring this record back up front and support it with some ad bucks." What methods do you employ to help a new and developing act?

I'll give you an example with Lenny Kravitz. We had to turn on the retail community and WEA. We sent out advance casseties and told them it was something special they had to listen to. I personally sent out notes. And they just loved it they begged for in-store play copies. I believe that's how we broke Lenny Kravitz. **Obviously, you can't do that with** every debut artist.

We don't cry wolf. If they get a letter from me or from the WEA in-house marketing reps every single week, it wouldn't mean anything. It has to be something special. We're going to do the same thing with the Divinyts, which we feel very strongly about. We want to try to get the record into the hands of as many people as we



con and turn them on to it. The key is turning on the clerks in the stores and the WEA sales reps. You've really got to get to the people who sell your records. Virgin achieved great success with Paula Abdul's album, which didn't exactly fly out of the box.

We had to work that record. We were very fortunate. The record wasn't doing that great with the first single, "Knocked Out," until a couple of radio stations picked up on "Straight Up," and the rest is history.

You put a great deal of emphasis on instore placement. Does it really make a difference to the casual record buyer? My retail background tells me it does. Hit records account for 80% of total sales, so the others have to be positioned in the right place. If you go into a supermarket consideration the problem of theft. Does Virgin get involved with "buy it and try it" programs?

Yes, very much so. But we don't just do them haphazardly. It's only when we have a record that we feel very strongly about. Some work and some don't. You have to use your head. It has to be more than just Joyce Castagnola and Virgin feeling that it's a great record.

Who bears the brunt of the financial obligation with these programs? The retailers. We can go to a retailer and say, "We really lave Joe Blow and The Midgets," but they have the final say because it's their obligation.

Virgin contributes co-op advertising dollars, though.

There are advertising campaigns that run with it — and that's what we support.

just to buy milk, I guarantee you'll walk out spending \$40. Go into a record store, and the same thing will happen to you. Once you pick a record up, you usually walk out the door with it — hopefully, you pay for it, too.

Which brings us to the CD longbox issue. Retailers insist security's a problem without it.

We're going to have to come up with an alternative for the longbox that takes into Some of the records are discounted, and some aren't.

Can a marketing compaign that works in Kansas work in L.A., too?

Absolutely. Why not? It's just takin' it to the street. It's going back to the basics — turning on the clerk in the store. There are a number of components — including MTV, radio, in-store play, press — and if you can get them all working at the same time, you've got a home run.
