A majority interest in Great Southern Company, one of the three largest entertainment merchandisers in the world, has been acquired by PolyGram Holding Inc. through PolyGram Diversified Entertainment, it was announced by PolyGram International President Alain "Drove His Chevy To The" Levy and PDE President John Scher "And Share Alike."


Great Southern's clients include Bon Jovi, Faster Pussycat, Iron Maiden, Robert Plant, Slaughter and ZZ Top. Last year, sales of music-related licensing product reached \$1.3 billion in North America, with the top three companies (including Great Southern) earning 75% of that total. Ira Sokoloff will continue as President of the company.

When **Def American** first released the **Black Crowes** single, "Hard To Handle," at about the time it was making the shift from Geffen to Reprise, the album was at about 450,000 units. **MTV** jumped all over the video, pushing the album past Platinum and into the Top Ten, where it has lived all year. Still, only 50 or so Top 40s officially came to the party.

Since that time, Reprise has successfully pushed the cut "She Talks To Angels," which was embraced by Top 40s who were also discovering what some programmers refer to as "a secret weapon." It seems that while stations were playing "Angels," unreported airplay of "Hard To Handle" would generate massive phones and across-theboard demo success. "We started it as an 'attitude record' on our 'Five O'Clock Whistle' feature," said Z100 Ruler Steve Kingston. "It spread through dayparts, generating callouts and sales. The record simply outlived the company's priorities."

"I was looking for an explosive, cool-sounding record," said **WEGX** PD **Brian Philips**. "I heard the cut while I was on hold on the phone at Z100. It hits you right beContinued On Page 16



tween the eyes. We've gotten Top 5 calls from all demos. Teens and adults both like it. There are no negatives."

Burkhart/Douglas Top 40 guru Don Benson reports that "Hard To Handle" shows up positive in callouts everywhere. "We know this one's a hit, gotta run now and watch the Atlanta Hawks in the NBA Finals. Thanks for calling, Joel!"

Those words from three top programmers and sales in excess of 2.5 million units have Def American GM Mark Di Dia more than confident. "We think this one is going to explode for us," he stated. "Who knows how far this single will propel album sales?"

Reprise Sr. VP of Promotion Rich Fitzgerald is equally enthusiastic about next week's Top 40 assault. "This is the ideal set -up for the record," he "Programmers love it, the listeners love it, I love it, my wife loves it, my kids love it, my Uncle Herbie from Miami loves it, the vixen who Uncle Herbie is boinking loves it, the guy who was draining my septic tank loves it, Julia Childs loves it, Julia Roberts loves it, Kane Roberts loves it, Carol Kane loves it, Car-O'Connor loves it, roll Sinead O'Connor loves it....." Thanks Rich, we get the message.

"My Girl," died last Saturday in Philadelphia of an apparent drug OD at the age of 50. The Meridian, Miss.-born Ruffin was brought to a local hospital by a limousine driver who told officials his passenger had overdosed.

The singer originally joined the Temptations in 1962 a year after they were signed to the fledgling Motown label by Berry

crooner Gordy Jr. Ruffin went on to sing on such tracks as "Beauty's Only Skin Deep" and "Ain't Too Proud To Beg." He left the group in 1968 to pursue a solo career, then joined with bandmate Eddie Kendricks and Hall & Oates for a successful comeback in 1985 with a medley of Tempts tunes recorded live at the Apollo. In 1989, Ruffin and Kendricks rejoined the Temptations for the night to be inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

FEVER PITCH

Stevie Wonder and Spike Lee's relationship goes back to a song Stevie did for "School Daze," but their work on "Jungle Fever" is a true audio/visual collaboration, with Stevie's songs contributing a great deal to the atmosphere and narrative of Spike's sure-tobe-controversial story of an interracial romance between a black architect from Harlem and an Italian-American bluecollar secretary from Bensonhurst, Brooklyn. Given the twin parameters of time and theme. the notoriously slow 41-year-old superstar — whose last album, "Characters," came out almost four years ago — has created perhaps his most organic and relevant music since the brilliant mid-'70s quartet of "Talking Book,""Innervisions," "Fulfillingness' First Finale" and "Songs In The Key of Life." The movie's attack on racism — of all stripes - fits in with the rainbow philosophy Stevie himself has espoused in the past, though that hope is now tested by the bitterness of betrayal, hypocrisy and human nature. "Jungle Fever" is a complex film which offers no easy solutions closer to "Do The Right Thing" than "Mo' Better Blues" - and Wonder's eleven original songs evince a gritty lyricism reminiscent of his classic "Livin' For The City," which is, not coincidentally, also used in the movie.

On the Burbank set for the shooting of the first of three videos from the film Spike and Stevie will be doing that weekend (the single, "Gotta Have You"), the odd couple took some time away from the cameras to explain themselves to HITS' resident knee-jerk liberal, Senior Editor Roy "Don't Call Me Boy" Trakin, who tore himself away from the catering truck long enough to file the following exclusive (to him) report.



The incredible thing about this album is how you can spend four years in between records, yet write these eleven new songs in three weeks. Stevie Wonder: (High-pitched voice): How do you do that? I don't think it's a matter of either thinking wrong or taking too long. I just knew I liked the story of this film. I liked the fact it was aging to be controversial, that there'd be conversation and food for thought. There are issues covered in this film that bring us directly into the attitudes of the inner culture. And, as we all know, the artist only reflects what society is all about. How do you write songs for a film you can't see?

I read the script first, but even before I read the script, I began to work on some songs and put some thoughts together. Then I wrote some additional songs after seeing the film a few times. I remember going to see a movie with my sixth grade class in Lansing and being inspired. That's what happens to anybody at a movie. You get a sense of what's happening from the energy, the dialogue and the action. The things happening visually (cause) thoughts (to) come to your mind. It's no different than reading a book. You get a sense of it, a certain feel, by putting yourself in the story. You're not just one of the characters — you're on the inside looking in.

How does Stevie Wonder watch a film?

Someone once told me, when you really meet someone, it's not so much what you see that judges what you feel about them. It's their presentation, how they speak, which has a lot to do with what you see. What you hear is what you see. And that's what happens when I go to a movie. Obviously, there are scenes that you have to know what's happening visually. Probably the most challenging film I wrote music for was "Secret Life of Plants." A lot of that was just dealing with things like the process of a Venus Flytrap catching her food. In "Jungle Fever," I had to get a feel of the interaction between the characters. Like "Queen in The Black," which is about the only black woman in the neighborhood, just going into her mind.

The music in "Jungle Fever" functions as a way to communicate the characters' interior lives.

There's a scene in the picture where we use the song, "These Three Words," and it deals with the fact the

ones you cherish everyday can suddenly be taken away from you.
"When was the last time/That they heard you say/Mother or father/I love you/And when was the last time/That they heard you say/Daughter or son, I love you."
Many of the film's themes seem similar to your own expressed beliefs that the absolute truth goes beyond black and white.

That's what makes the marriage be-

tween Spike and myself work so well. I have dealt with the same matter to some degree, although not as blatantly as we do in this film. How do you feel about the issue of interracial romance and marriage? It's good for people to marry people, It's good for African-American men to marry African-American women. It's good for African-American women to marry white men. It's good for African-American men to marry white women, It's all about what those individuals feel in their hearts. If they can be themselves, bring both their cultures into it and love each other, maybe they can avoid the barriers of racism tearing it down. It's not an easy thing, just because of how society is. But there are people who say, hey, this is what I feel, this is where I'm at, she or he makes me happy. And, boom...

How do you feel about the current African-American renaissance in film, with directors like Bill Duke, Mathy Rich, Keenen Ivory Wayans, Mario Van Peebles, Charles Lane, the Hudlins, Charles Burnett and Robert Townsend working with black crews and tackling black subject matter?

My feeling is basically, it's amazing we even have to talk about it in this time and place. It's amazing that there cannot be hundreds upon thousands of films about African-American cultures, Hispanic-American cultures as well as every other culture in the world. It's amazing that our country — the land of the free and the home of the brave — is still trying to decide how we feel about that. It's unfortunate. It just goes to show that you are really the blind ones, not me.

It has to be a positive thing to bring these issues into the open, to discuss them and vent our innermost fears and feelings publicly.

The only way we can completely lead the rest of the world to where we're all supposed to be is for our

keep their relationship intact against the onslaught from their families and the two diametrically opposed neighborhoods where they come from. But this is not your typical Hollywood film - love does not conquer all. You've taken a lot of heat in the past for alleged racism and anti-Semitism. Can blacks and white intermingle as equals, or must we be separate before we can be equal? I definitely believe there can be interaction among the races. There always has been. But I believe black people as a whole have to get our own stuff a little more together before we can move forward as a people. I do think there will come a day when black and white can live together in peace. Of course, that day is not here. And since that day is not here, I don't think I should stick my head in the sand and go about pretending it is. So I'm going to keep attacking - not attacking, really, but presenting in

SPIKESPEAK

I think how Stevie felt about the project speaks well of the movie. It's the perfect marriage between film and music written for film. I encouraged Stevie to try to use musicians and make this as live an album as possible. I don't think a machine can compare to a great musician playing an acoustic instrument. But of course, nobody can dictate to Stevie what to do. You just make suggestions and hopefully, he'll listen and implement them.

Your movies have always put a great deal of importance on the music.

I pay as much attention to music as I do the scripts I write, the acting, the lighting, etc. I could probably trace that back to my father being a great jazz musician and being brought up in a household where music was played all the time. This film has "wall-to-wall" music. Aside from the Stevie Wonder songs, Terence Blanchard, a great trumpet player, wrote the score. He used an 80-piece orchestra and the Boys Choir of Harlem. Plus, we used three Frank Sinatra songs and four Mahalia Jackson songs and so on.

"Jungle Fever" is one of several movies suddenly dealing with the formerly taboo subject of interracial romance. Why? Interracial relationships have always been a part of America; they just weren't talked about. Nobody was writing in the papers about what the slave master was doing sneaking down to the slave quarters every night. We're just trying to deal with this openly. For me, this film is not a condemnation of interracial relationships or even marriages. If two people love each other, it's great. What we're exploring in this film is our belief that sometimes these unions do not come about solely because of love.

When we talk about film as sexual mythology, the number one myth is that the white woman is the epitome of beauty in the world and the number two myth is that the black male is the superhuman sexual stud. In this particular film, those two myths are the reasons why these characters get together. And the rest of the film deals with how they try to

my films the way I feel things are now.

But what about all those young lods in the suburbs whose role models are people like Michael Jordan, Arsenio Hall, M.C. Hammer and Colin Powell?

That's my point. You can be a racist, want to lynch every black person you see and still idolize Michael Jackson. Because those particular people aren't even perceived as black. At least black roles in film and television are

At least black roles in film and television are showing more diversity.

It's a start. We have to make sure that this so-called explosion of black films is here for the long run and is not just a trend that fades like

the blaxploitation movies did in the early 70s. The blockbuster mentality wiped those out. I mean, if you can make a film that everybody in America wants to see, why spend money making a film for a specific black audience? When you opened up your store in Brooklyn, there was a lot of criticism that you were selling out, commercializing yourself. The black folks were like, "Go ahead. We'll support you. Now we don't have to wear these fucking Mickey Mouse and Dick Tracy T-shirts all the time." I mean, everything in America is buy, buy, buy, But when black people try to do something for themselves, it's like, they're selling out. At the opening of the store, I had someone from MTV ask if I was going to contribute profits from the store to the community. Now, was that same asshole at the opening of the Tribeca Grill asking Bob DeNiro what he was going to do with the money he made from the restaurant? It's ridiculous, but it's the type of question I get all the time.

You seem to have the best of both worlds—
the freedom of an independent, with the backing of the mainstream studio system.
It's true. I'm an independent filmmaker who gets his financing and distribution from Hollywood. I have one of those Walter Alston contracts, and I think that's the best way to work. One film at a time. If I'm happy and they're happy, well then we'll work together again.
We're not bound by contract.

You see this a lot of times in music and film, where you get one black person society says, "OK, this guy is really good." And then everybody expects that one individual to cover every single issue, every emotion. I mean, it's impossible. If more people were given the opportunity to tell their stories, then you'd understand there is a whole society of people out there that have a different way of dealing with things. Think about George Washington Carver and what he did with the peanut. I mean, there were uses for the peanut people never thought about. If you give people the opportunity to express themselves for the better, then things come out to help not only them, but everyone else.

That's the only way it can happen. And when America is really ready to deal with that, then it'll be time for me to get into politics.

At one time, you were at the absolute center of the pop universe. Do you mind being away from the media alore these days?

There's a part of me that just wants to do what feels right. I worked hard making a national holiday for Martin Luther King a reality, and after that, we did a few things, but doing this movie has been one of the thinas I've felt most excited about in recent years. I'm also real excited about my next album, "Conversation Piece." I've written about 60 songs for it, and If I can't do them all in my lifetime, I'll get my children to do them. How do you keep pace in a constantly changing pop music universe? I just listen. The only way you can find out about the world is by keeping vour ears and eves open. So being that I have a little trouble seeing with my eyes, I just use my ears as my third eye and keep them open along with my heart. There's no way of getting around change. You gotta be influenced by it, as long as you're alive and listening. With the dominance of rap and sampling, do you feel melodies and songs have taken a back seat to the beat?

You've got people like Johnny Gill

gospel, but in a modern way, with jazz progressions. I like rap and sampling. I use both on this album. I know children have a lot of youthful spirit, but i act like a child myself. I just want to enjoy the world for as long as I live in it. You have a choice. You can be miserable or you can give thanks to God that you're allive each day to enjoy it.

Where are you musically right now, compared to where you were in the '70s and '80s?

People will always have their opinions and, you know what opinions are like, because we all have one.

is your approach to a soundtrack

much different than doing your own album?

The difference is, you have a theme to deal with. But even with "Songs In The Key of Life" and "Stevie Wonder Introduces Syreeta," there were themes. With "Conversation Piece," I'm working with a theme again. The thing with "Jungle Fever" was, y'know, I told Spike I was gonna do it and we're friends. I just said, you give me a great movie, I'll give you a great soundtrack.

You've been very much involved with this movie on a creative level, even to the extent of filming three videos for it. Why?

This is my ass, too. 🎇

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



THOU SHALL NOT STEAL: It's said that imitation is the sincerest form of flattery. However, many artists who have had their songs or sounds sampled, or in some cases taken hook, line and sinker, are NOT very flattered. It's ego-deflating to hear a song that bears your creative efforts and not receive writing credit on the label. It's even more troubling to not be rewarded FINANCIALLY. The proper compensation of an artist whose song is sampled is professional courtesy, and will soon become legal necessity, but it is a practice that is overlooked far too many times. I recently received a call from Betty Wright, who ROCKED the charts with "Tonight's The Night," and was obviously upset about her omission from the writing credits of Color Me Badd's "I Wanna Sex You



The long-and-short of it is she and her publisher are in negotiations to work everything out, and I trust that she will get what she deserves. There's nothing wrong with sampling, and I feel that meshing the New Jack sound with classic R&B hits has helped to bridge the gap in the musical tastes of different generations of record buyers. This is good for the industry. But remember — if you dance to the music you HAVE to PAY the piper. Later.
