
Panama Red

Perhaps thinking it was the story of the New Riders of the Purple Sage, Rhino Home Video will release the Academy Award-winning documentary, "The Panama Deception: Exploring the Cover-Up," on June 16. Rhino originally put up \$40,000 of the film's \$100,000 budget, leaving the movie some \$70,000 in debt.

The controversy over the politically charged documentary heightened when PBS refused to air it, leading to producers **Barbara Trent** and **David Kaspar** accusing the network of censorship in their Oscar acceptance speech. Rhino is pairing the documentary with several old kinescopes of "Shindig" and "Soupy Sales" on a single tape.

Bust It Busted

An Oakland jury delivered a split verdict in the sexual harassment case brought against rapper **Hammer**'s Bust It Productions, awarding \$166,000 to a one-time female employee for the company's sexual harassment, but refusing to hold the company liable for an alleged gang rape which took place during a party for the 1990 release of the "Please Hammer, Don't Hurt Me" album.

The woman's attorney, Sara Mac Dwyer, said the decision was puzzling in that the jury found damages even though they didn't find anyone liable. She felt the award should have been a million. The former Bust It computer technician had sued for \$20 million.

Hammer was not accused of taking part in the alleged attack, but was sued as an executive of the company. The boys are back and the consumers know it.

After a long hiatus, Aerosmith returns to the streets and to the top of the charts as "Get A Grip" blows out of the stores in its first week.

"It's John Kalodner, John Kalodner and a great group of musicians," said Geffen/DGC GM Bill Bennett, referring to the A&R guru who sent the guys *back* into the studio *after* they delivered "Pump" the first time. John was unavailable for comment because he was being interviewed by *Billboard*.

"They've got a solid grip on our #1 spot," said National Record Mart's Doug Smith, employing the same cheesy verbage that our headline writers use. "It's more than 3 to 1 over our #2 seller."

Bee Mourned

Music industry legend Jimmy Bee, whose career spanned more than 35 years as an artist, promotion executive, artist manager and label consultant, died of a heart attack on April 22.

The Baltimore native began as a street-corner singer in the '50s, singing with the Flairs. During the '60s, Bee worked with Sam Cooke producer/arranger Rene Hall, Billy Williams and Brenton Wood. As a solo artist, Bee

had an R&B hit with "I Only Have Eyes For You" on Kent Records in the late '60s.

Bee went on to become a pioneer in promoting records, working with **Sam Bilius**, owner of L.A.'s largest onestop. He was instrumental in establishing such acts as **the Bee Gees**, **Quincy Jones**, **the Whispers**, **Melba Moore** and **Gladys Knight & the Pips**, among many others.

Bee and Maury Alexander established Bee/Alexander Productions in the late '80s, garnering a Top 5 R&B hit with **Robert Winters and Fall**'s million-selling "Magic Man." He also managed the Controllers and, most recently, MCA artists Mahogany Blue.



HITS interview Wim David Bowie BY ROY TRAKIN

hameleonlike David Bowie has shifted in and out of so many different personas, he's like

the proverbial boy who cried wolf. When he finally appears in the flesh and insists this is the real "him," you can't help but be a little skeptical, even if impressed by his mid-day attire of an elegant pullover sweater, pressed slacks and soft leather loafers.

It has been six years since David Bowie's last solo album, 1987's "Never Let You Down," but judging from his sold-out 1990 "Sound + Vision" tour, he still has a strong following, even if his fans didn't flock to his last three albums as "just another member of the band" with Tin Machine. Bowie admits the commercial success of 1983's "Let's Dance" threw him into an aesthetic quagmire. He was happier as "a large-scale cult figure," a restless, avant-garde pop enigma who had metamorphosed from the carrot-topped futuristic rock star Ziggy Stardust through subsequent incarnations as a "Road Warrior"-like survivor ("Diamond Dogs"), Las Vegas soul man ("Young Americans"), Thin White Duke ("Station to Station") and Brechtian minimalist ("Heroes," "Low"). His latest incarnation — as contented married man to Somalian-born model/actress Iman — is the subject of much of the new album, "Black Tie White Noise," his first for the BMG-distributed Savage label. Reunited with "Let's Dance" producer Nile Rodgers and Spider From Mars guitarist Mick Ronson, as well as newcomers like jazz horn-player Lester Bowie and R&B star Al B. Sure!, Bowie's new record plumbs his many past musical auises and reflects those "ch-ch-ch-anges" in a

past musical guises and reflects those "ch-ch-ch-changes" in a streamlined, up-to-date, funk/jazz/R&B/experimental album which represents his most personal work since the mid-to-late '70s Berlin trilogy with Eno. There are upbeat dance-floor numbers (the first single, "Jump They Say"), searing space-rockers (an update of Cream's "I Feel Free"), Philip Glass-like atmospherics ("Pallas Athena"), jazzy "Aladdin Sane" instrumentals ("Looking For Lester"), and even a couple of Anthony Newleyesque torch songs (including a wonderful payback on Morrissey's "I Know It's Gonna Happen Someday," itself an homage to Bowie's own "Rock & Roll Suicide").

Dapper as always, the elegant Bowie emerges from the restroom of his suite at the posh Peninsula Hotel, apologizes for his tardiness, then muses as to how he had just been staring at a painting of waterlillies for ten minutes and can't for the life of him remember its name. A lively discussion ensues in which it is agreed, when one is answering nature's call, it is perhaps the only time you can stop thinking and just enjoy the sensations. something David Bowie seems to be doing a lot these days... until HITS' resident pissant Roy "Fat White Dude" Trakin arrived.

record is the best thing you've done since the Eno trilogy. And while Nile Rodgers produced again, the record sounds nothing like "Let's Dance." Both of us have changed considerably since 1983, but we wanted pretty much the same things out of working together again. We sparked off the first time around a great deal of excitement in each other as to what we could do. And we refound that. I don't think there was any conscious decision not to remake "Let's Dance." If anything was reflected on this album from that period, there was a song called 'Ricochet' on side two of the "Let's Dance" album, which was a particular favorite of mine. And I felt at the time, it was somewhere we hadn't really explored. There were a lot of wind instruments and horns, with a slight jazz feel, but the writing

was very European in its sensibility. I felt we could go further with that. If anything, that was almost a springboard for where we went with this album.

The molding of the European sensibility and R&B has been a characteristic of your work since "Fame."

Having experimented with so many diverse kinds of music, I've got to a point where I can really utilize a lot of what I've done musically. And I feel as though I'm dipping very much into my own past. And my own knowledge of what I can do. Something that has a good solid foundation to it. Which is nice, because it means I'm not trying so desperately to break into new areas. I've done quite a lot, and it all becomes color that I can bring into the work that I'm doing now. I can really take advantage of my own experience. And it feels like me. Hopefully, it's not a retro sort of thing.

"I Know It's Gonna Happen Someday" is a cover of the Morrissey song. It's kind of incestuous inasmuch as

Mick Ronson from the Spiders produced the album that song is on. I heard it and realized they'd used

the chord pattern of "Rock & Roll Suicide." And I thought, if Morrissey is doing an ironic twist on "Rock & Roll Suicide," then I'll do Morrissey doing me, but I'll do it as I would've done the song in 1973. So it's like a glam-rock version of a Morrissey song. He came to the studio, heard it and said, "Oh, it's very grand." And grand it is. Morrissey is someone I always thought had taken his cue from at least one or two of your personas. He's a lot more personal than I would ever have been. I think he gives a lot of himself in his

songwriting, whereas I always felt I didn't. Possibly I did unwittingly. But he consciously writes about his first-hand experiences and takes his life to the stage. Which is actually the antithesis of what I do. There's something so British about what he does. Because he has a wonderful sense of irony. He is a very, very funny man. **"Pallas Athena" has that repetitive Philip Glass thing going through it.** The cumulative thing with his music actually influenced me a long time ago when I was doing the first album with Eno, a track called

album with Eno, a track called "Weeping Wall," which, in its own way, was an homage to Philip Glass because there was a repetitive theme that ran through the piece. I like that kind of chant feel. It's almost an Eastern thing, because Philip is a Buddhist. It becomes very much

part of sustaining some kind of transcendental state, which is a hard word to use these days.

l understand Philip Glass is doing a piece based on "Low."

I went to the first performance of "The Low Symphony" and I was enthralled by it. He's talking very much in terms of doing "Heroes" next. And there's a slim chance we'll be collaborating on something in the near future, but I'm not sure what that is yet.

Are you going to tour on this record?

No. I've got a marriage to get on with. The worst thing you can do is make an album, get married, then go away for ten months. I don't think it would work.

Where are you living these days? Switzerland? The Caribbean?

Both. I have a fabulous house in Mustique I've literally worked on for six years now. But it's at an end and it's wonderful. I don't spend enough time there, only about six weeks a year. I've almost put it aside for my old age. My retirement home. Balmy breezes and splashing ocean. Absolute lethargy touched with resentment and boredom because I can't do anything else.

Let's go back to the first time I saw you live... 1973, Radio City Music Hall, Ziggy played guitar. Glam-rock just seemed so groundbreaking at the time, the first new movement since the hippies.

You should see London now. They're going through a '70s revival. It's unbelievable. Also, there are new bands as well. Two in particular. One's Denim, who are pure '70s parodists, and I guess won't be considered an important band. But there's another called Suede, who are really hot. like them an awful lot. But they're definitely informed by Roxy Music, T. Rex, New York Dolls, myself, that whole little genre. Because it was actually only a little genre... the real substantial music of that period was actually restricted to about six bands. It wasn't a big movement like the hippies or punks. Those of us who were involved in it quickly tried to shed being part of that '70s glam-rock thing as soon as it became apparent it was being tagged. The reason we got into it in the first place was that we didn't want to be classified. Because that was our nature. The first time we spotted it becoming a movement, it was time to move on.

Have you considered doing an MTV "Unplugged" for the new album?

[Laughs.] I've never been asked. My God, I wonder what I'd do. That's an interesting prospect.

It seems like a way for peers like Eric Clapton and Rod Stewart to reintroduce their greatest hits in a new context to a new generation.

I don't think I'd do that because I really have stopped doing those old songs. Absolutely, definitely, without a doubt. I can't conceive of a time when I would do them, unless it was for a charity organization, a fund-raiser for children or AIDS... I would definitely utilize them if they could be of some use. But for my own career, as an active performer, that's it. I'm never doing them again.

I'm in a very different frame of mind now. I don't think any of those characters would have come about had I not been not wanting to acknowledge myself too much. I wanted to virtually lose myself in

performance and the characters I was creating. Had that not have happened, I probably would have been a very different animal indeed. You weren't happy with yourself? Basically, yeah. Or not willing to know myself. Not willing to get to know me. That takes quite some time, to resolve what you really want out of life. And how much of it you want to stake on your own beliefs and spirituality and emotional life. But first you have to discover that emotional life, that spiritual life. And it takes time for some of us to come around to it. In many ways, you seemed the ultimate narcissist, in love with your own reflected images.

Quite the reverse, in the sense that the last person I wanted to be, or actually come face-to-face with, was myself. I think a lot of it was putting my own fears, paranoias or feelings of inadequacy onto somebody or something else. And if I created that, then destroyed it, I could walk away clean from it all and not have to worry. Instead of realizing all those things are incorporated as part of one's wholeness. When you get to the point where you can accept your own wholeness, things become more balanced. Your approach changes.

Would it be accurate to say you're starting to experience this wholeness since your marriage to Iman?

It's not an overnight thing. And because of that encroaching selfawareness over the last ten-twelve years, one finds one is in a position to undertake and see through a real commitment to a relationship, which leads me obviously to my present state of marriage. I think I had to be in a much better position to actually have been able to understand what it was I was taking upon both of us to make that commitment to a relationship. I don't think I could have done it before.

Even though you didn't intend Tin Machine as a commercial project, the lack of success must disappoint you.

I'm not sure, because it's resolving what I really wanted to do. I had to re-evaluate why I wanted to make music in the first place. Coming to a new understanding of what I wanted out of life had a lot to do with why I entered into Tin Machine in the first place. If I had gone into it with a conception that it had to be seen and accepted on a grand scale and at the time, we felt what we were doing was fairly inventive and exciting - I would have felt the whole thing was nonsense. I had to get into that band for my own artistic delivery.

But David Bowie can never just be "another member of the band."

We knew we had that going against us from the beginning. I was quite aware that it was going to be, at the very least, an uphill struggle. I think it always will be. I remember telling [Tin Machine guitarist] Reeves [Gabrels] particularly --- that we shouldn't expect any kind of acceptance for some time. It has to keep going only if we're still enjoying it. The tour that we did was thoroughly successful inasmuch, in a time when touring was going very badly, we were doing very well indeed. We ended up doing all of Japan, Europe and North America and there was no slackness in any of the audiences.



If you go back and listen to the first Tin Machine album, I think you'll find that it's probably grazing at the gates of what is now called "grunge metal." It's probably as sonic and more aggressively opinionated of itself than many, many of the bands that are out there right now. Our heroes were groups like the Pixies and Sonic Youth. You've always been ahead of your time. The difference is, these days, I don't let go of things just because I feel I've done them. Maybe it's because I'm older, or perhaps my thought processes have, hopefully, expanded a little more in terms of a new kind of maturity. I can stay with things now. I feel comfortable with that. I almost made a principle of never repeating myself once upon a time. I'm not so cast in that die anymore. I like the idea, if something's really interested me, I'll follow it further than I maybe would have done a few years ago.

Critics have suggested you have had trouble evolving from a rock maverick to an elder statesman.

The notion of being an elder

statesman is horrifying. I've never expected my audience to follow me through each new phase. I'm honored that I have anybody out there listening to what I'm doing. The decision to put myself in that position of constant change was, ultimately, mine, and whatever comes with the territory. One thing is a continually expanding and deflating audience. Because not everybody is going to like everything you do. I had to resign myself to that very early on, that there would be periods when I'd be totally unacceptable and other periods when people would like some of the things I was doing. Can David Bowie sell records?

That's been a continual problem with me ever since I started. That's the one thing that was always asked of me. Because, you see, I've never sold records. I mean, Tin Machine outsold some of my early albums.

But I've always had a huge live audience. It didn't matter whether it was economically bad or good times... if I went on tour, I sold out. I played to over two and a quarter million people with the "Sound & Vision" tour, with no album and no singles. I really do enjoy putting together the aspects of a show. Notice I said putting it together. Actually executing it for more than a few weeks is mindless.

It must be a kick to see your influence on other artists.

Of course. One likes to feel as though you've had some impact on the texture of the profession you're in.

And yet you've said in past interviews you wouldn't accept a somination into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame.

I'm completely indifferent to it. To see Bob Dylan going up to accept a lifetime achievement award from who? His betters? I think the whole thing is inconsequential and has absolutely nothing to do with the reason I started making music.

Do you miss being at the epicenter of the pop universe, with the media waiting on your every pronouncement?

Earlier, when I felt that it was necessary to make some twist on what was happening, I strived very hard to plunge myself into taboo areas, to break down any fence I could see, even if it had nothing to do with me. I like making trouble in an artistic fashion. By the time I'd moved to Berlin in '77, things had changed a lot for me. I was getting out of a very, very heavy drug addiction. And I was really trying to find a reasoning and a stability in my life. From that point, a lot changed.

What did you think of your ex-wife Angle Bowie's book, "Backstage Passes"?

I read it in 1981, when it first came out. I had nothing to say about it then and I have nothing to say about it now. And when she recycles it again in another five or ten years, I'll probably have nothing to say about it again.

So you will not comment on you and Mick Jagger being in bed together? Not until I write my biography. That's one I'd like to ghostwrite. [Laughs.] Believe me, there are a million people who'd like to write that one. And somebody will get that chance one day.

WHEELS & DEALS

A&R 101... OF BEING AND BUZZING, PART I: With all the high-profile signings and signing battles raging of late, we thought it might be a good idea to examine a few of them a little more in depth. The derby for the highly touted Green Day, who were the talk of SXSW without even performing, came down to three major players who all had a legitimate shot at nabbing them. WB's Rob Cavallo edged Gary Gersh and Craig Aronson of DGC and Columbia's Benjie Gordon, who was there at the beginning, despite very concerted efforts. Only the band and management really know what sealed the deal, but the birth of the buzz can be traced back

to a couple of regionallypopular indie records which sold more than 30,000 copies on the Berkeleybased Lookout label. In this case, only the band in question was picked up, as the label itself was not in a position of sufficient power (due to lack of enticing roster talent or locked-in contract) to stipulate Matador-like arrangement. Even when a major does elect to take on the entire label, that isn't necessarily a guarantee that the small label's hottest properties will be included in the deal.

Such is the case with the Matador/Atlantic deal. Everybody's favorite current flavor, Matador's Bettie Serveert, has completed its whirlwind sweep through the States only to retreat to Holland to consider the 12 or so deals on the table and think of ways to spend all that money (like it or not, it's going to be huge). Matador's patron is forced to slug it out for Bettie's services just like everybody else. Superchunk and Pavement have satisfied the terms of their Matador deals, and will be fielding Bettie-sized offers in the very near future. Again, the buzz on each was born on the strength of smashing indie records that set the ears community on fire. The best and brightest A&R folks are poring over mountains of obscure indie product in an attempt to be first under the wire. But does it even matter? Probably not. Due to the clever maneuvering of management and attorneys (and nosey, annoying trade mags), as soon as the buzz begins, a call goes out to all. The deal is then usually done on the strengths of personal relationships and cold, hard cash. All that hard work and all those late nights may not ever pay off, but do you have another choice? Well, no. You make the big bucks and you define the taste of the label - you do what you must. Next week, we'll look at two left coast battles that have a different spin - Orange County's Water and L.A.'s Clover... 'SUP: Katell Keineg's Sin-e show in New York drew well over 20 A&R execs. Unfortunately, only four were seated inside as the tiny club was deluged with spectators... BMG lands the Posies' publishing ... L.A.'s Yesterday's Tear signs in with Elektra, and have changed their name to Drown... BUZZIN': That Dog, Loungefly, Nick Terzo.



Someone said your live performances were notoriously neurotic.

MARK EITZEL: It depends on how long we've been on tour. Every time we play in Los Angeles, it's always been for A&R people, God bless their cold hearts, but I mean it's not a good crowd. They act like they've seen it all. So you're doing all these things you hate and it's really hard to be real. Whenever people see me, it's like well, I don't know whether to thank them for their patience or apologize. The audience runs a real risk. We can be the best band in the world or the most boring band in the world. BRUCE KAPHAN: Audiences want blood and bile. VUDI: Like Gwar. When I saw Gwar, I was with Ann Magnuson and we were laughing the whole time. We were like, yeah this is the best thing we've ever seen. I pushed myself as close as I could to the front and all the people around me were dead serious, getting off on the violence.

BRUCE: That's show business.

All the songs on the album seem to be love songs of redemption and loss.

MARK: Anytime anyone reviews an album, it's always, "Despair and ecstasy... redemption and loss." I saw this interview with Michael Stipe on TV and he was saying how he always used to hate love songs. I felt that way when I was about 14 because I used to listen to Yes.

BRUCE: There are all these buzzwords attached to the band. For me, a song has to reflect a reality and a moment, and moments and realities usually aren't

redemptive. When I write a song, it has nothing to do with those issues. If there's redemption, it's because I was raised Catholic; it's part of the language I grew up with.

MARK: You make more connections with people through pain than you do through joy. I've always felt more connected to people who've felt some pain in their life. I mean, this isn't heaven we're living in. It can sometimes be a little phony when you try to pretend that it is. So as far as making a joyful, happy record goes, I think this one is. There's not a single song on here about suicide and there's not a single song that says life is a terrible thing. They're all observations on life.

BRUCE: Or on whatever was outside Mark's window. MARK: Disturbing was a word Mitchell [Froom] used more than any other as to how he wanted things to turn out. The problem is, we try to be disturbing and we end up sounding like Chris DeBurgh. **VUDI**: To me, any piece of art that's worthwhile has this attachable emotional impact. There aren't enough words in the language to describe each and every emotion that you can feel. That's what a good song does. It puts me in an emotional state. MARK: If you make a commitment to write something in the first person, your basic relationship with the subject has to be of a compassionate nature; otherwise, you're taking no risks. Some people have compassion naturally. I don't. I have to work at it. Tell me about the collaborative process.

BRUCE: It's kind of what you'd expect. Mark brings

a song in and we destroy it.

MARK: I don't think we've ever really gotten down to shouting matches.

TIM MOONEY: [Laughs.] Not that I've been involved in. Why did you name the band American

Music Club?

MARK: So people would confuse us with the movie chain or the AMC Pacer. It's a great car. TIM: It does sound like we should have harmonicas

or something.

MARK: So they'd think we were friends with Huey Lewis.

BRUCE: I've heard they're the three worst words ever to use in a band name and I must say, I agree.

You've been called a torch singer, Mark.

MARK: You have to be true to the song. If it's a torch song, you have to sing it that way. I like that tradition. I like jazz singers. I saw Jimmy Scott when he was in L.A. last time. He was stunning. I also like Sinatra. But in no way, shape or form am I trying to imitate them. There are things about singing that I am slowly beginning to learn about from these people. I used to get into that lead singer bullshit rolling around on the ground and stuff — but now my whole thrust is to move away from the song, let it breathe a little bit.



EVERYBORIES AND SMAKES WITH STONE TEMPLE PILOTS

n a matter of three weeks, the Stone Temple Pilots played plenty of basketball and ping pong with producer and friend Brendan O'Brien, experimented with some antique equipment, pounded on some pots and pans and still had time to record their debut album "Core," a powerful set of tunes addressing a wide range of social and political topics and running the gamut of emotions. microcosm of the lyrics, it is about date rape. But the idea and philosophy are really much more broad. What do you think brought out your sensitivity towards women and minorities?

It bred a lot of sexist, racist and homophobic attitudes, and I just didn't fit in. Although there was a time when I tried to fit in just to have cute girlfriends and popularity. After awhile, I didn't really care about what those people were about anyway. And I met other people more like myself, people I played with in different cheesey garage bands.

"Creep" seems like such a sad song.

"Creep" is the reaction to feeling alienated or pushed out for not being so cool and the anger and sadness I experienced from that kind of situation.

You mentioned that you don't want to be considered a Los Angeles-based band, because you're originally from San Diego.

We never wanted to associate ourselves with the L.A. scene because it was typically so anal retentive and homogenized with no real originality. Although there are good bands, it's so scoured and raped by the whole music industry that it isn't real anymore. San Diego was close enough that we could still play gigs in L.A.

How do you feel about being compared to the Seattle groups?

Every band that has distorted guitars with lyrics that are somewhat real are compared to that scene now. The music industry has been notorious for setting up these cookie-cutter categories and stuffing people into them. Now it's grunge. What is grunge? Distorted guitars? I read an article where they were calling the Lemonheads grunge with a pop sensibility. In the '60s or '70s, every band that was somewhat artistic was acid-rock. Then it was glam-rock. Then hard rock became heavy metal because "hard" wasn't hard enough. I just don't buy the whole thing.



The Posies, "Frosting On The Beater" (DGC): The Posies construct the sweetest close two-part harmonies since Paul and Art, and are such gifted students of leftist pop history that they may be the most direct and authentic, yet completely distinctive, connection to PoMo Grandaddy Alex Chilton's Big

Star. There's no shortage of expressive, careening overdriven guitar on what may be the Album Of The Year. When you're talking pop sensibility, you're talking The Posies. Savor "Flavor of the Month" and the bask-worthy "Solar Sister."

World Party, "Bang!" (Ensign/Chrysalis/ERG): Musical supergenius Karl Wallinger, with his stunning virtuosity and deeply spiritual interpretation, has become a sort of PoMo Prince—and we mean that in the nicest way possible. Wallinger weaves his global tales on a personal level, disguis-



ing significance in a kindly smile and laconic verse. With more groove-oriented songs and experimentation than on previous Party records, the album is never stiff or pretentious. "Bang!" advances World Party to PoMo hegemony.



Madder Rose, "Bring It Down" (Seed): From the palpable desperation of "Bring It Down" to the straining punk rock of "Lay Down Low," Madder Rose amazes. This Brooklyn quartet is steeped in the bands that define "New York Cool" (with a decided Feelies bent), yet offers a completely unexpec-

ted down-home friendliness. Mary Lorson's breathless voice seems to tell us to come on in and take a load off, and *really* learn a little something about pain. Somewhere Edie Sedgwick is listlessly blowing smoke rings to Madder Rose.

Porno For Pyros, "Porno For Pyros" (Warner Bros.): There's little doubt that Perry Farrell's musical vision was formed by the dark and seamy images of his Los Angeles. His gift for translating these images to music makes for a disturbing and captivating trip through a bad town on a bad night on bad drugs.



Holding up a mirror to alleged societal norms, Farrell examines issues of race, sex and economic determination in unedited form, free of politcal correctness and rife with lunacy and phobia. Jane's Addiction fans will revel in the harsh angular tones and new-found psychedelia.



Sure am glad I make all my extra cash by waxing Lenny's car (Ed Note: Mark, you missed a spot) because the heat is really being turned up on the used CD business. CEMA's Russ Bach has joined ranks with WEA's Henry Droz in pulling all co-op advertising from anyone that's selling used CDs. So far, no others have followed suit, although unconfirmed talk on the street (is that vague enough?) has Sony joining later this week. BMG has opted against it (at least for the time being), having already suspended its current return policy (making it less inviting for retailers to sell their used CDs). Eddie Gilreath says Uni is "looking at the overall picture to see if we can approach this problem in an equitable way" (is that careful enough wording for you?) and David Blaine of PGD says, "We just don't think it's a big enough problem." WEA has given all stores until May 16 to comply, but CEMA has made it "effective immediately." And, even though, according to Roman Kotrys at Repeat the Beat (three stores, Michigan), CEMA stopped ads that were already booked. Joe McFadden says, "Our intent is to not authorize any further advertising, not to pull ads already agreed to." It was common knowledge at NARM that CEMA

had three drafts of a letter on the subject. The first was the cessation of co-op dollars, the second was supposed to have stopped discounts and the third was allegedly threatening to stop business altogether with offending accounts. McFadden had "no comment" on this. Carl Manifest Singmaster of Records, SC, said that his fivestore chain will stop giving WEA and CEMA in-store play, display space and front-line product positioning, with many other chains saying they will follow suit. "These are businessmen." said McFadden "who have to make decisions based on what is best for them [as we must do] and we understand that. We understand their right to protest but we are going to enforce our policy." However, unconfirmed rumors are also flying that certain labels may break ranks with their distributors and furnish co-op ad dollars to ensure that their key releases will get positioning. There is a widely held belief that Wherehouse precipitated this action by being the first major chain to have a used-CD section. "We do not want this to be charactarized as Wherehouse against the distributors," says Bruce Jesse. "This is an industry-wide issue. We are responding to the competition in the marketplace. There are lots of people with more experience in this field than we have." Most stores (including Wherehouse) have yet to remove any used CDs. "It's a small percentage of our total business," says Mike Fratt of Homers in Omaha, "but it represents a high-profit margin. That doesn't mean we won't eventually eliminate it, but it brings in foot traffic and we don't believe that these dollars will shift from used CDs to new CDs. These are dollars that just won't walk in through our door." Is a compromise on the horizon?
