The last Active Rock chart of the year finds Maverick's Candlebox with a tight grip on the #1 spot for the second week in a row. Radioactive's Live moves two slots to 2*, with Epitaph's

Offspring falling in right behind at 3*. Corrosion Of Conformity (pictured) make a six-point leap into the Top 5, as "Albatross" lands at 4* on the strength of #1 Phones. Soundgarden round out the Top 5, as "My Wave" rolls in at 5*. Pearl Jam's "Better Man" captures the #1 Most Added belt and blasts nine spots to 6*, while STP rocket eight notches to 11*. Offspring's third track, "Gotta Get Away," grabs the 23* spot and #2 Phones. Alice In Chains make a big debut, hitting 25*, while Plant & Page get the Led out, landing at 26*. Danzig, Todd Snider, STP and Queensryche round out the Top 5 Most Added list.

The first time Melissa Etheridge played Vegas was in 1988, at a roadside bar called Paradise Alley, somewhat in a transition zone of rusting beer cans between the Strip and the Mojave. All-night showgirls, dealers and bartenders on their way home from the casinos crowded the place until dawn, then slept away the heat of the day in cool, airtight apartments. It was the year of her self-titled debut, a collection of rocking tunes by the native Kansan which garnered reviews "[that] could have been written by a doting relative," according to People. A female rocker whose music detonates with male energy, she bagged the

lesbian vote early on. In 1992, she finally blurted out her sexuality at the gay and lesbian Triangle Ball celebration during Bill Clinton's presidential inauguration. After that, Melissa was easy to package because she needed no packaging at all.

"Yes I Am" (Island) is the fourth platinum album in a row for the Al Gore of Grammy Award-winning lesbian recording artists (a nod, naturally, to President kd lang). Its title is a perfect manifestation of selfaffirmation, as was her performance of "Burnin' Love" at the pay-per-view Elvis Tribute earlier this month, a Don Was-does-Graceland production that included the

likes of Michael Bolton and Cher. Critics say Etheridge has gained an international following unparalleled by any female rocker, and is atypically mainstream for a gay or lesbian artist, with not one but two current tracks on the MPS charts. And she's back in Vegas. In the amorphous backstage space of the Moorish Aladdin Hotel and Casino, during a tour that will last through the holidays, Etheridge talks about being discovered in one of those sticky, beery lesbian bars, about Sly and the Family Stone, and her big thumb ring, while HITS' own bisexual surf goddess "Queen" Elizabeth Glazner laps it all up.

Oh yeah. I think coming out gave the mainstream press an angle on me because before, it was just the "woman rocker," and now it was something to talk about — it was a reason to go get the story. So I think I got more publicity because of that than I had before. And it's all been good talk.

Any bad talk?

No. You know — fear is a big part of coming out. Of course, there was the fear that what I had achieved to this point would just disappear, which is an unreasonable fear because I had achieved that on my own talent, and not because I was acting like I was something else. I never really did; I just wasn't openly talking about it. So, that fear was there, that "Gee, what if radio stations really stop playing me? What if they're really that prejudiced?"

scious or unconscious movement. Y'know, the '80s were very material. Now we're realizing that's not everything. There's more to it. You are filled with more when you work from the inside. And to me that's what happened at Woodstock. There was a lot going on, but I walked out in the crowd and I felt it. I felt it.

Are you sure everyone wasn't just high?
Our society, in general, really suppresses those tribal feelings, and this was definitely a tribal thing. You get these people together and you mix in a little water and mud... I was up there totally sober and I felt like I was high as a kite. I know that you are interested in playing Janis Joplin in a movie someday.

I really want to. It's tough because her estate is her family and they have control over it. And it's very hard to make a truthful movie when people won't let go of it, won't let it be. There are Hollywood people in charge of it all, so I'm just waiting. All the movies that have been made

How do you see your typical fan?

That's changing. If you asked me three years ago, I'd say a 23 year-old working woman, could be gay or not, kinda very hip. But now you go out in the audience and the ages are expanding. It's getting younger and older. The audience isn't so much just gay women — there are lots of straight women, lots of straight men and gay men. I used to never have any gay men in my audience. That was like the last frontier. What was Woodstock like? Did you share in the cynicism that big bucks were made off a festival

founded on peace and love? That's the hardest question I have to answer right now because it was so amazing. I went in with an open mind because I didn't really know what it would be like - whether it would just be this commercial sort of thing. I'm so glad it wasn't like the original Woodstock. Things have changed since then and what I'm used to in my career is a certain amount of security, a certain amount of sound and a certain amount of quality. And to do Woodstock now with that quality takes a lot of money... for myself, for Aerosmith, for these artists that were there. I'm grateful that the backstage accommodations were great, security was wonderful, everything was great, and that takes backing.

Did Woodstock II carry the same kind of message as the original?

Um, no. But that's OK. It carried a different message, a very '90s one. Twenty-somethings and thirty-somethings are the majority now... we are the mainstream. It was an expression that we can all get together, do this and have a blast. And that rock music is very important, and other kinds of music are very important, too.

So that's the '90s theme?

It's more an emotion, a feeling. Not a touchy-feely kinda thing, but a subcon-

about rock & roll figures — it's all male. But Joplin was such a huge force, so I really want to bring her to the forefront. You're like her in one way and totally different in another.

I'm not on a self-destruction course the way she was. She had the passion — the love of the blues and the intensity to sing it with a rock & roll soul, yet her pain at the time was too great. I have my own pain. I just think I had better tools to deal with it than she did. She found drugs and an excessive lifestyle, went there and lived it. I found other things.

I understand you are an ACACA [Adult Child of Adult Children of Alcoholics].

I'm definitely aware of what can happen when you have alcoholic parents because my parents had alcoholic parents. I know what happened to them. I saw my father close down and just want to make everything OK because he grew up in such hell. And my mother closed off to the world. And I grew up with that. Even though they weren't alcoholics, I grew up with the result of alcoholics and so I had my own mountains to climb and bridges to cross.

Do you think you'll ever sing a duet with Bruce Springsteen?

No. He's married to Patti [Scialfa]. Before this interview ends, I have something to tell you. I am homo. Can you say something to my mother? OK. Your daughter is very happy in her lifestyle. Her lifestyle is not a reflection on you or anything you've done wrong. We all understand that your fears are huge because that's what you were raised with and that's what was ingrained in you. It is a different world and there is nothing to fear and most of all, your daughter is happy.

Thank you. By the way, my girlfriend says you once sent her a rose at the Executive Suite in Long Beach. Can you explain this?

I sent a lot of roses. What is her name?

Your name is really small on the marquee. Paul Anka has a really big name next door. Such are the iniquities of Las Vegas. Do you enjoy playing here? I have very mixed feelings because it represents all the things that make me cringe about show business. The schmaltzy stuff that I grew up going, "Eeee-www." But it's all about show business, and all I do is entertain. I know you're a vegetarian. How do you survive in the red meat, all-you-can-eat capital of the world? We just had dinner and it was all fried. All brown. All one color. Why is that? I guess I'm supposed to ask you a bunch of lesbiantype questions, but I kinda want to just take for granted that you're a lesbian and get on with it. Well, I certainly answered all the questions. It's funny how some reporters will ask questions, then they come out to me.







For those who don't want to lose portions of their audience during the holidays, it's important to maintain a balance between artists and tempo. You also need to serve the total audience. Remember, lots of mature teens and young adults will be home from school and available to listen. They'll be looking for songs like Arrested Development's "Africa's Inside Of Me" (Chrysalis/EMI).







The Year In Retail 1994 doesn't really have an easy handle. There wasn't one single issue that defined the year. No "used CD war" that galvanized people into action. No major lawsuits, relatively little mudslinging. Y'know, all the stuff that HITS really thrives on. There are some themes that were emerging last year and have been expanded upon this year, the key word being "expanded." Obviously, the big are still very interested in getting bigger. Most retail chains have continued to go the route of gonzo-mega-huge stores as well as increasing the number of those outlets and expanding their regional market share faster than at any other time in history. It doesn't take more than a quick look at chains like Blockbuster Music, Best Buy, Musicland's Media Play stores etc., to realize that they are taking the "bigger is better" theme to its natural conclusion. These stores owe more to IKEA and Sharper Image in design than to any record retail chain that came before them. Then, of course, you also have chains like Tower opening some very small stores aimed at a specific regional demographic in a kind of micromarketing approach. Also, there are some "new" players. For one, Circuit City is taking a page out of Best Buy's book and making

the transition from hardware to software seem relatively easy. Although "Cirque Du City" still seems to be using its loss leader pricing to sell appliances, whereas Best Buy appears to be emerging as more of a bona fide music store. And what about the success story at Borders Books (now Books and Music) with their very unique slant on reaching those people that are always hanging around chatting in Dockers commercials (better known as demos... Espresso anyone?)? But if there is one new issue or one new retail bogeyman that has finally started to come out from underneath the bed to join the party, it would have to be the Information Superhighway. Yes friends. Info-baun is starting to take real shape as a music delivery system. New "Cyber-Stores" are popping up, with next year promising to yield about as many of these newcomers as there are 1-900 sexlines right now. With no storefronts or warehouse space to worry about, it's a very enticing way to do business. By next year, there will also be "virtual money." The CyberCash company is already making a strong move into "virtual credit cards" that will work on the Internet. But actual cash going from your bank to a cyberstore without a money trail for the bank to follow is about to be a reality, with a new company called DigiCash. You can call them at e-mail info@digicash.ni for details. Or check out NetCash at e-mail netbank-info@agents.com for another slant on the same subject. Direct delivery is now being embraced by many of the major retail chains as well. But in the meantime, holiday cash registers in regular old record stores are ringing more often than ever. Sales are up, and HITS is on vacation for two weeks. What's not to love?
