

### Jingles...

There is an aspect of the songwriting business that is often overlooked by commercial songwriters and yet it can be the most financially rewarding. Jingle writing has become and is becoming a multi-million dollar business. How many times a day do you hear the McDonald's "You, you're the one" or "Have a Pepsi day?" Someone is making a lot of money off these jingles.

There are a few ways of using music for commercial jingles. One way is to use original music or music and lyrics to fit a particular product. An example of this would be the Hughes Air West "Top Banana" jingle. Another type takes a familiar tune and changes the lyrics to suit the advertising need. An example of this type is the Oldsmobile "Highways of your mind" commercial which is a variation of "Windmills of your Mind." These types receive 1/100th of an A.S.C.A.P. performance credit for all uses within any one-hour period and 1/1000th of a credit for all uses in the second. A.S.C.A.P. defines a commercial jingle as "An advertising, promotional, or public service announcement containing musical material (with or without lyrics) in which: (a) the musical material was originally written for advertising, promotional or public service announcement purposes or (b) the performance is of a musical work, originally written for other purposes, with the lyrics changed for advertising, promotional or public service announcement purposes with the permission of the A.S.C.A.P. member or members in interest."

A third use for music in advertising is background for a spoken message. An example of this is the numerous commercials using the theme from 2001 A Space Odyssey. A.S.C.A.P. defines this type as: "a musical work (other than a jingle) used in conjunction with an advertising, promotional or public service announcement. B.M.I., on the other hand, makes no payments at all to its' members for music used in promotions or advertisements

Ad agencies pay big money for two types of jingles. One is for the licensing of well known songs and two is for the creation of new jingle music and lyrics. It is not unknown for an ad agency to spend fifty-thousand dollars for the exclusive jingle right to a well known song. Of course, this fifty-thousand is a drop in the proverbial bucket compared to the money spent on the entire ad campaign built upon the jingle. The ad agency will gladly spend the fifty-thousand for exclusive rights to the jingle to protect it from being used by a competitor. There are legal hassles that can be incured if the jingles aren't licensed properly. The extent of licensed territory, exclusiveness, and the duration of the license are three important items when negotiating for a license.

Even if you're not a jingle writer, there is still money to be made in jingles. Singers get paid A.F.R.T.R.A. or S.A.G. rates depending on if the jingle is used on radio or T.V. and musicians get paid A.F. of M. scale. In conclusion then, jingles are a good way to make some bucks if you're good with little ditty bits and remember, Barry Manilow started this way.

### WHAT EVER HAPPENED TO THE BLA BLA CAFE?



The "Bla Bla Cafe" has been in existence since 1968. Their location until August of 1977 was in Studio City at 11059 Ventura Blvd., and they are presently located at 12446 Ventura Blvd, Studio City. The "Bla Bla" functions very well both as a restaurant and as a club offering good musical entertainment. The restaurant has a menu with an interesting variety of foods and they are now serving both lunch and dinner. The entertainment is also varied, consisting of singles, duos, trios, etc., and they change every night. The major emphasis is on musicians attempting to 'make it' in the music industry.

Albe Hora, principal owner of "The Bla Bla Cafe," can relate very well to performers attempting to 'make-it' in the musical realm. "I was an ex-performer myself and when I got the original place, I went up on the stage before it opened, (nobody was in the room) and I asked myself in front of a mic, 'O.K. Albe, your're a performer, what do you want from this club?' There were two things I wanted very much that I didn't get much of in my past. First, respect for my craft. I just didn't believe in 'freebies.' I don't care what you pay performers, give them something. Originally, I paid performers 20% of the house and it almost broke me.'' "The other thing I wanted as a performer was a good

### RIFKIN REVIEWS

BOOTLEGGERS, WEST L.A. DEC. 26, 1977
"ENERGY FORCE"

Keeping up with the promise that The Music Connection will support people in all facets of the music industry, I'm reviewing this week a dance troupe. I found myself a little skeptical at first but that lasted only until the first number after which I could not keep my eyes off them or stop tapping my pen on my pad of paper which made it difficult to write and later read my notes. Anyway, their name is "The Energy Force" and they have both. The energy is evident in every number and may the force always be with them as it was in one number titled "Magic Bird Of Fire" by the Salsa Orchestra, which comes off looking like a high adventure "Star Wars" dance. It was my favorite.

Their opening number "Jubileo" by the Fania All Stars is a great Latin piece that they do very well and their precision is almost flawless. The use of scarfs was very nice. Dennon Rawles along with his wife Sayhber Sares, also one of the dancers, act as the producers and choreographers. I found out this was the first time the troupe has danced on a round stage. Dennon said at times he found himself running out of space though this didn't seem to put a damper on things. They also do some nice work with a jazz tune by John Klemmer titled "Touch and Tender." The troupe also consists of Erica Jordan, Michael Cortez and Shelby La Branhe. They are all professionals and teach dance at The Steven Peck Studios here in L.A. They have individually performed with such names as Ann Margaret, Liza Minnelli, and Toni Basil (one of the greatest dancer/choreographers). This group is very sexy to watch and the animalism of the dancers at times is something else. At moments they take you back in time where you think you're watching an ancient ritual dance and expect a sacrifice at any moment as they slide or spin around the floor. Another nice number that spotlights all the dancers individually as well as together is "Sweet Lucy" by Raul de Souze.

The group can be seen on Thursdays for the next two months at Destiny II and I believe one time in January at Bootleggers. Call and check the date. They also have plans for Las Vegas and are getting a 23 minute show together as an opening act. Watch for them, they really are quite a troupe.

Bootleggers is a great place for hard-core disco dancers as well as for people just out for fun. There is a good size round dance floor, a nice bar and disc jockey, Jack Barrett, keeps things moving at a good pace. Normally, there is no live entertainment here but 2 or 3 times a month they present specialty acts such as "Stan, A Tribute to Elvis" and others. Thank you Paul Joseph (the manager) for the warm welcome and assistance you provided. Thanks to everyone who keeps singing and dancing their way into my heart. Good luck to you all.

sound system. It took every dime I had to buy one."
"The Bla Bla" presently splits the entertainment charge with the performers and has an excellent sound system.

Albe originates from New York City, where he worked in night clubs and acted in musicals and dramas on Broadway. "I came here because a friend of mine, working for CBS, told me he could help me out. I came in late '68 when the bottom fell out of Hollywood but I refused to go back."

"The Bla Bla" was originally called "The Purple Hag Cafe," mainly after hours, and Albe was a waiter. "I did what I had to in order to survive until I could find some work entertaining. Every place I went to they didn't want to pay. I was a pretty good personality on the floor. I used to draw the whole place. I had fun. I made it a theatre for myself."

Two women bought out "The Purple Hag," the food was bad, and it wasn't successful. Albe went to another place and the crowd went with him. The women ran out on their notes and the previous owners begged Albe to buy it. Albe resisted for a long time as he saw himself as a performer and not a club owner. He also had very limited funds. Albe finally agreed to make the purchase, and the owners sold it to him at a very reasonable price. Sebastian, the original chef, came back from New York to assist Albe with the restaurant part of the business.

"I had a dream two years before I came to Calif., that I was going to own "The Bla Bla Cafe," which was going to be a stepping stone for new artists. The dream came to me when I went to the printer and had to come up with a name for the place, (notice Bla Bla spelled backwards)." The "Bla Bla" has served its purpose well. Al Jarreau, Leslie Gore, Peter Allen, Ronny Blakely, etc., all had their beginnings here and "they all still come back. When I see the performer get signed up, I tell them to leave and make room for the new artists." The "Bla Bla" originated from a dream and has fulfilled the dreams of many entertainers.

Upon entering the new "Bla Bla," located in Studio City, I felt the same atmospheric warmth as I had felt at the previous location. "We had to leave the other place as the lease had been up for eight months, and the landlord needed the space. When I first walked into the new location, I had a feeling, without a doubt, that this is the "Bla Bla."

The new 'Bla Bla' was supposed to open its' doors in September and didn't open until Dec. 12, 1977, with the entertainment to begin New Years Eve. What happened?

"A law came down in March of last year, for new restaurants opening up, called "The Conditional Use Permit" law. The law consists of the restaurant owner paying \$1,500 to the city for them to investigate you. One then has to wait 100 days for a hearing date, and then an extra two or three weeks for the date to come up. We are talking about four or five months, paying \$2,000 a month rent, before the restaurant owner





knows whether or not he can open his doors. Do you start hammering nails into the walls? The law has put the ABC (Alcoholic Beverage Control) laws into the hands of the private citizens who aren't professionals." In the case of the "Bla Bla," rumors were going around the neighborhood that an acid discoteque was opening up. The citizens were invited to come, see the place, and talk (the old "Bla Bla" was still open) but they wouldn't come. This all began in June of last year. At a preliminary one man hearing, the judge turned them down to serve beer and wine, specifying that it was a cocktail bar with dancing, which is a lie.

Albe was fearful that the "Bla Bla" would have to close it's doors. He went to Joseph Benti and Christine Lund, good friends of his, and they advised him to see Ted Goldberg, who is the president of the Studio City Chamber of Commerce. Ted wanted to know what "Bla Bla" was all about and Albe invited him in. "He came in with six other people and had a ball." He told Albe he would support him.

Ted Goldberg sent Albe to Howard Raphael, who is Joel Wach's Field Deputy. "Howard came in and fell in love with the place. He was coming in three or four times a week and he said he would support us. Howard was our ray of hope."

"Bla Bla" appealed the judges' decision, and they had a tremendous amount of support at their second hearing; The City Council, Chamber of Commerce, The Police Dept., and The Alcoholic Beverage Control, to name a few. The Restaurant Association sent their legal department to hear what was going on. The "Bla Bla" has a good, clean, background for the past seven years, so their support was well deserved. A strong case was prepared which cost a fortune. They even had their own court stenographer.

The residents in the area were also complaining about the parking situation. Mort Allen, Realtor, got them forty parking places. Six of the major homeowners finally gave their support to the "Bla Bla" and the decision was reversed.

There is a valuable relationship between Albe and his co-owners. Eddie Massa is the handyman and night time manager. "He knows how to handle the nonsense things." Jack Arsenault is the Sec.-Treasurer and responsible for all the bookkeeping. Sebastian Massa is in charge of the food preparation. Todd Cooper did the art work. I especially noticed the mural he did of the old "Bla Bla." It's great!! There are padded seats now and the wooden seats from the old "Bla Bla" are used for wall trim.

Originally, the cost of the new "Bla Bla" was supposed to be \$20,000 and it is now costing \$70,000. "I would have never done it if there wasn't a lot of faith and love. The theme of the "Bla Bla" is "magic." All employees love working here. We are all equals. We give love and respect so our performers give their best shows and they are all 'magic."

I missed you "Bla Bla" and I'm glad that your delightful doors have finally opened.

#### **DEMOS - Part 6 CHOOSING THE MUSICIANS**

One of the most difficult aspects of doing demos is choosing the right musicians, because one of the properties of a good demo (directed at publishers and producers) is to be able to suggest possibilities for arrangements without actually doing a full arrangement. It requires musicians with an ability to exercise restraint, control their ego and control the desire to "Show off all their chops." Sad to say, it's a rarity in young musicians who are still too wrapped up in the process of learning their instrument to be able to direct their creativity toward playing something simple that fits and COMPLIMENTS the whole arrangement or SUPPORTS a vocal. For instance, it's more important in a rock demo to get across an infectious, danceable rhythm FEEL than to feature a great guitar solo. You want whoever you're pitching the song to, to be able to say, "Man I could really do a wipe-out solo there!" Always try to suggest just enough for them to think it's THEIR idea. The ideal in choosing musicians is that you've had an opportunity to work with or listen to the work of a lot of musicians and can afford to pay them \$20.00 or \$25.00 per tune, which is a common demo rate. You'll then choose them according to the style of songs you're recording and the way you'll predict that they'll each play and interact with other musicians when left to their own creativity. The result is that you'll need to exercise a minimum of direction and get maximum creative contribution from each of the musicians.

Anyway, let's assume that your problem is the most common one. You don't have any bread and don't know any musicians, in which case you can't afford to be choosy. You should know that there are a lot of musicians around looking for something to get involved in and would be willing to do sessions for the experience or 'on spec' (on the speculation that if and when YOU get paid, THEY get paid). Make signs explaining your situation and the type of music you're into. Put them in music stores, etc. Advertise in this magazine. Trade your own services as a musician, singer, or whatever. You're bound to go through some trial and error to find the right people but that's what you need to be willing to do. When you find them, rehearse with them as much as possible before doing the session. It'll save you lots of money in studio time. If you can afford to pay musicians, agree on the bread before the session and pay them promptly. You'll feel much better about directing them and psychologically, you'll eliminate the possibility of bad vibes and have an eager team working with you.

When I decided ten years ago to be a singer/songwriter, I believed the most important thing for me to know was how to change a guitar string quickly on stage. Since that time I've learned there is more to know and that the more we know, the better off we are.

I have been produced by producers known in the industry who would have mixed my tapes the way I wanted them if I had only known at the time what I wanted. I have signed agreements with publishers whom I could have gotten to see my way of thinking, if only I had known what to ask for. I have also passed up a good publishing deal when I didn't know it was in front of me. Chalk it all up to experience? Yes, I suppose so. But there is something more.

Only within the last few years I have taken the time to learn what a good publishing deal is. Further, I have worked with an investment banker on tax shelter records and now am familiar with what it takes to put a record together--from the writing of the material to the merchandising of the finished product. I have also been working as a secretary to an entertainment lawyer and have become familiar with what makes a good contract, and what a good lawyer or agent can get for you that you can't. All of this is very useful information. I don't have to know any of it, but I feel more in control of my destiny since I do.

Since joining the Organization of Women In Music, I have learned even more because the group contains; songwriters, performers, recording engineers, publishers, independent producers, agents, managers, recording studio personnel, record company personnel and news media people. What I learn at the meetings is always instructive. The Organization is growing into an incredible network of people who are helping enhance one another's careers. Aside from one another, we learn from music industry people in general who are guest speakers.

If you are in the business, perhaps you should check with Women In Music to see what we are doing. In addition, learn how to read a contract, to deal with a manager, what publishers look for, and how to hold your own when you're in the right. There isn't a top performer around who won't have some war story about getting wounded due to lack of knowledge. Learn the business for your own protection. It isn't difficult and it might save you time and money in the long run.


