

Capitol's Hodges Takes National Posting

Capitol/Nashville has upped **Steve Hodges** to Sr. Dir./National Promotion reporting to newly minted VP/Promotion **Jimmy Harnen**. Hodges, who most recently served as Southeast Regional Dir./Promotion, started with the label in 1994 as Midwest Regional. His background also includes stops at KDDK and KIKX in Little Rock.

"Steve brings strong leadership and an astute understanding and insight to where this business is headed," Harnen said in a statement released by Capitol. "The best way to predict the future is to create it, and that is exactly what Steve, myself and the entire Capitol promotion team will do."

The move comes in the wake of Harnen's jump up from the National chair with the departure of Exec. VP/Promotion **Bill Catino**, who is expected to fill a similar role at Universal Music Group/Nashville.

Radio's Helping Hand

WXXQ/Rockford, IL raised \$212,001 during its 13th annual St. Jude Radiothon March 11-12. The total is a \$32,000 increase over last year.

KLUR/Wichita Falls, TX raised more than \$40,000 during its recent Children's Miracle Network Radiothon, the station's first. Morning team **Becky & Brad** hit the air for 36 hours straight during the event.

KLLL/Lubbock raised more than \$222,000 during its seventh annual Children's Miracle Network Radiothon Feb. 24-26.

WKSJ/Mobile raised \$171,800 during its March 10-11 St. Jude Radiothon, with Rebecca Lynn Howard, Amy Dalley and Little Big Town joining the station's efforts.

WKLB/Boston racked up \$680,000 during its March 10-11 Country Cares for St. Jude Radiothon. The station's 11th annual event enjoyed a \$200,000 increase over 2004. WBYT/South Bend, IN raised \$194,935 during its recent St. Jude Country Cares radiothon. That brings its nine-year total to just under an incredible \$2.1 million.

WWYZ/Hartford's 13th annual Quest for the Cure raised \$808,157 for St. Jude Children's Hospital during a two-day event that concluded yesterday.

Our weekly analysis of Country callout research is brought to you by Bullseye President **John Hart**. Here's a look at some of the biggest stories Hart looks at in next week's issue (March 18):

"Craig Morgan dominates Callout America for the fifth consecutive week, with 'That's What I Love About Sunday' as the No. 1 song overall in every cell male and female, as well as the No. 1 passion song in the sample. Brooks and Dunn's 'It's Getting Better All the Time' moves strong from No. 8 to No. 3 this week. Sugarland's 'Baby Girl' enters the top five at No. 5, up from No. 7 last week. 'What's a Guy Gotta Do' by Joe Nichols debuts in the top 10 at Callout America as the No. 10 song, up from No. 13. Newcomer Blaine Larsen continues to be strong, with 'How Do You Get That Lonely' going to No. 12 from No. 15. The big move this week is from Jeff Bates' 'Long Slow Kisses.'"

The station secured more than 1,200 Partners In Hope who are committing \$40 per month to the cause.

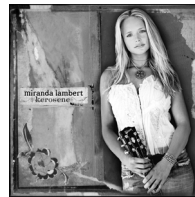

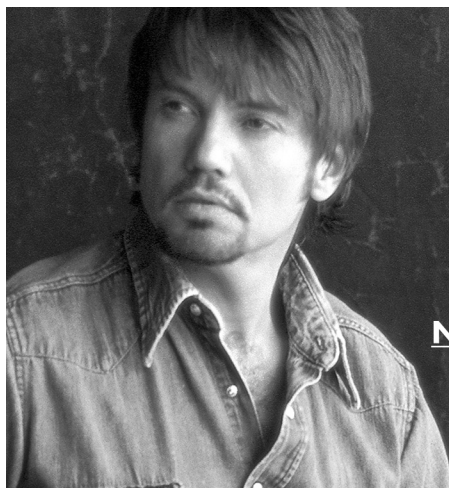
