



# WEA and CBS the most charted firms in August

Toronto: WEA Music of Canada placed the most singles on RPM's charts during the month of August, with CBS Records listing the most albums

On the singles chart, WEA finished the month with a total of 116 chart listings over the five issues of RPM in August. It was enough to recover the number one position from July's top singles company, Capitol-EMI. WEA achieved that figure by averaging 23.2 singles per week on the chart. Capitol remained a strong contender, finishing a close second with 111, or 22.2 per week. CBS retained third place for the third consecutive month with a solid 103 total listings, or 20.6 per week, and PolyGram, while remaining in fourth place, closed the gap somewhat toward the three leaders with a total of 86 chart singles.

Behind the top four, MCA and RCA tied for fifth with 23 each, followed by Quality with 17 and A&M with 16. Quintessence Records rounded out the chart with five

listings.

On the top 25, WEA Music maintained its domination, placing a total of 35 singles in the top quarter, for an average of seven per week or 28% of the total top 25 listings. PolyGram moved up very solidly from its distant fourth position in July to capture second place with 27. It was enough to edge out CBS, who placed 25 singles in the top quarter, and Capitol, with 22. MCA, on the strength of Elton John and singles from the Xanadu soundtrack, finished a strong fifth with 15, giving those five companies 99.2% of the total. Only Quality, with one, broke the perfect record.

# Quintessence/PolyGram pact deal for UJ3RK5

Vancouver: The second EP in Quintessence Records agreement with Poly-Gram, to appear on the Polydor label in Canada, is by the Vancouver-based band UJ3RKS (you-jurk - the 5 is silent)

The UJ3RK5 is: Kitty Byrne, drums; Rodney Graham, guitar; Colin Griffiths, guitar; Dancie McLeod, violin; Frank Ramirez, vocals, synthesizer, saxophone; Jeff Wall, vocals, organ; Ian Wallace, bass; David Wisdom, backing vocals.

The band members have been together since the days of psychedalia, with the core of the members having

met on the campus of UBC.

The EP was produced by Andy Graffiti and UJ3RK5. All the songs are their own original compositions, combining unconventional music with satirical lyrics.

Three singles from two companies held the number one position during the month. Billy Joel's Still Rock & Roll To Me, which finished July at number one, held that position for the first two weeks in August. It was replaced the next week by Genesis' Misunderstanding (WEA), with another WEA-distributed single, Emotional Rescue by the Stones, topping the chart in the last two weeks.

On the album charts, CBS Records came on very strongly to replace WEA as the most charted distributor in August. CBS had a total of 121 albums on the chart, for an average of, 24.2 to open a wide lead. WEA slipped to a comfortable second place with 106 (21.2 per week), with Capitol and PolyGram retaining third and fourth with 98 and 68 respectively.

Three companies grouped together tightly behind the four leading companies. MCA moved from eighth place all the way up to fifth with a total of 30, displacing A&M, who

# Williams and Murphy to Grand's discery

Toronto: After seventeen years with CBS plus a stint with TeeVee/Cachet Records, John Williams brings his experience to his new post as Grand Entertainment's Vice President. Williams is well-known in the record industry having been responsible for the development of several Canadian and international recording artists.

Also to the new production complex is John Murphy, who has been appointed National Marketing Manager. Murphy is a veteran of the record industry in sales, promotion and marketing having been associated with Quality Records and RCA and, until just recently, headed up his own J. Murphy Music Marketing Services.

Along with Williams and Murphy, Grand Entertainment comprises Kenneth Walker as President; Chairman Thor Eaton, and National Promotion

Manager Frank Daller.

Initial signing to the new label is Nana Mouskouri, who previously released on the Cachet label. She is currently on a 30-day tour of Western Canada with dates already sold out. The tour began in Winnipeg where Williams arranged to have a special pressing of 5,000 albums of Mouskouri's new album, Come With Me. The albums were sold out within hours of release. The title cut is to be released as a single shortly and album product is now of primary concern for stocking of retail outlets throughout the west. A tour of Ontario and Eastern Canada is now being negotiated for the latter part of this vear.

finished sixth with 27. RCA ended up in a close seventh with 25, followed by Quality in eighth with 17. Pickwick, Moss Music and Disneyland Records were also represented in an unusual display of variety on the

On the top 25, WEA finished very strongly to achieve a total domination. The company pulled out of its first place tie to chart 40 records (32% of the total) in the top quarter. Poly-Gram again finished strongly here, moving up from fourth to second with 26, edging out CBS with 25 and Capitol with 20. The rest of the quarter figures were shared equally by RCA, MCA and A&M with five each.

Two records shared the number one album position in August. Billy Joel's Glass Houses (CBS), number one in the last three weeks of July, held that position for two weeks in August. It was replaced by the Rolling Stones' Emotional Rescue during the last three weeks of the month.

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# Blaik Kirby dead at 52



Blaik Kirby, one of the most respected television/entertainment critics in Canada, succumbed to a heart seizure, Sunday August 31. He was 52.

Mr. Kirby graduated from the University of Toronto in 1948 and almost immediately began to carve a career and reputation for himself in the field of journalism. He worked for six Canadian newspapers including the Star and most recently the Globe and Mail. He was also, at one time, associated with Reuters News Services in London. His knowledge of the workings of a newspaper was exceptional from working as copy editor, photo editor, layout and makeup man to putting together a home handyman column for the Calgary Herald

Mr. Kirby became a giant in the writing profession because of his penchant for factual reporting, a rarity in the profession today. He added to this respect when he began reporting on the field of television where he became one of the harshest but most constructive critics of the CRTC. He did however, have a great deal of respect for the CRTC's first Chairman, Pierre Juneau, who, it was thought, fashioned many of his findings on criticisms levelled against the Commission by Mr. Kirby. Mr. Juneau, now Deputy Minister in the Federal Department of Communications, was also very fond of Mr. Kirby, as a friend and critic. He was quoted as saying, "I've always considered him to be a very fine and honest writer. He went to a lot of trouble to check his facts and even when he was criticizing you, you knew he was extremely sensitive. For a newspaperman, you can't ask any better."

Mr. Kirby also kept abreast of the popular arts, keeping close contact with RPM, attending the magazine's communication meetings and sitting on panels designed to create a closer understanding and communication between the press and the record industry. One of the first record industry functions he attended was the RPM Gold Leaf Awards presentations, to be later nicknamed the Junos, in February of 1970. One of the last was the Radio Programmers' Awards, last October.

Mr. Kirby is survived by his wife Margaret, a son David, and his mother. He had willed his body to the medical faculty of the University of Toronto.

# Pizazz release Cancon single by The Boss

Toronto: New Canadian act The Boss's single So Close, has been released by the Toronto Entertainment company, Pizazz Productions. Produced by Axe's Greg Hambleton, So Close is the first

release on the recently rejuvenated Tuesday label of Axe Records.

In the rush to release the single, the Cancon MAPL logo was inadvertently left off. The single was both produced and performed by Canadians.

The Boss comprises five veterans of the Canadian music industry, formed over the winter and spring of 1980. The band is scheduled to appear in many of Canada's top clubs and their first European tour is slated for December.

# Leonard elected VP of MIEA

Montreal: David Leonard has been elected Vice President of the American-based Music Industry Educators Association for the second year. As V.P. of MIEA, he will provide Canadian input and an international perspective to the field of education, training and professional development in the recording arts and sciences. Leonard is also the only Canadian accredited member of MIEA.

MIEA was formed three years ago in Nashville as the out-growth of a conference sponsored by the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences (NARAS).

Leonard is presently Executive Director of Tebas Institute of Recording Arts in Montreal, which provides a two-year program of seventy courses in the recording arts and sciences. The Institute is presently preparing a three-day professional training program for record retailers across Canada. The seminars will be offered in major

cities across the country starting next Fall.

# Gloria Kaye signed for TV song contest

Ottawa: Canadian singer, Gloria Kaye, will be starring in and co-hosting the Pacific Song Contest from the Ottawa Arts Centre, on Sept. 27th. Appearing in the 1978 contest, Miss Kaye won the Best Performer award for her presentation of the Canadian entry, leading to this year's TV assignment.

The contest will be televised live and via satellite to 12 participating countries, including the United States. Miss Kaye will introduce the song and performer entries from each Pacific Rim country taking part in the contest. The Pacific Rim refers to countries bordering the Pacific Ocean. Each participating nation enters a song and a performing artist, with prizes issued in each category.

**DIANE HEATHERINGTON**

Heatherington Rocks - Epic PEC-80046-H Rock

A native of Winnipeg, Heatherington has been a fixture on the Toronto scene for several years. For the gravel-voiced rock chanteuse, this debut set is a very eclectic collection of material from far-ranging sources, all combining solid rock energy with a good listenability which should lead to solid FM airplay support. The songs range from Gene Pitney's He's A Rebel to the Beatles' Helter Skelter to Chapman/Chinn's In The Heat Of The Night (the Pat Benatar title cut) to Bruce Cockburn's Mama Just Wants To Barrelhouse All Night Long, plus two originals by Heatherington and her band. Altogether a strong debut. Produced by Keath Whiting at Sounds Interchange in Toronto.

Convicted - Nemperor NJZ-36502-H Rock

Debut album for this Toronto-based rocker also marks the first Canadian signing to the U.S. label. If initial action in the U.S. is any indication, this set should take off very quickly. The artist wrote all the songs, and handles all vocals and guitar. A comparison, both visual and in terms of musical energy, springs up easily between this artist and the Springsteen school of rock and roll. The songs range from the topical The Russians Are Coming and So You Busted Paul McCartney to the more fantasy-rock She's Not Gonna Come To You (one of the best cuts) and Follow That Dream. Produced by studio veteran Eddie Leonetti for 327 Productions. Cancon.

Make A Little Magic - United Artists LT-1042-F Pop

Over their 15-year history, the Dirt Band have always been somewhat eclectic, blending their country backgrounds with everything from bluegrass to rock to classics, only occasionally breaking beyond their own cult following into the mainstream. Now they are on a two-album winning streak. The country roots are almost totally subdued, and in their place is a smooth, tight pop sound. This set contains the title cut single featuring Nicolette Larson's harmonies, a sure-fire hit, plus a little more rock than usual. One of the two non-original songs, Cindy Bullens' Anxious Heart, is a likely follow-up single.

Landfall - Mustard M1002-N Pop/adult

Ruzicka is a veteran singer/songwriter who hasn't been heard from for a number of years. Best known for his oft-covered song Dirty Old Man, the 'singing dentist from Edmonton' remains a powerful singer/songwriter with a gift for cutting to the heart of human feelings, the material could be dubbed 'situation songs'. Ruzicka's pleasant voice and songwriting style remain unchanged. The set makes for good listening, and some of the cuts are worthy of airplay, particularly with AC formats. Produced by Ruzicka and Garry McDonall at Damon Sound in Edmonton. Strong sax work from P.J. Perry provides some interesting variety and texture on several tracks. Lyrics enclosed. Golden Oldie single now happening.

The computation of the records from 51 to 100 is based on early airplay, chart action and regional sales and breakouts. The chart is based on samplings from markets across Canada and indicates trends that may not be prevalent in all areas of Canada. Shaded numbers indicate a strong upward trend and gains in airplay or sales. This chart is offered as a guide to new product and an indication of trends in Canadian markets.

The RPM 100 singles and album chart (or any part therof) may be reproduced with a proper credit.

# Dan Williamson listens to the CBC

by Donny Burns

You are about to read an interview with one of the most effective and volatile men in the field of broadcasting today - Dan Williamson, of radio station 680 - CFTR, Toronto. Please read slowly and carefully; for between the double entendre, the zingers and one-liners, are some of the thoughts of an intelligent, sensitive professional. The interview took place in a downtown Toronto hotel lounge, which shall remain nameless (because they wouldn't give us a discount. Whatever happened to payola?). This is the first of several interviews I'll be doing for RPM, and I can say in advance, one of the most informative and entertaining - so please read on - and enjoy!!!

Williamson: Hello, this is an interview with Dan Williamson. Donny Burns will be asking the questions eventually. I just wanted to ask before we get started: Donny, where did you get the audacity to think you could write? And, by the way, you smell funny!

Burns: Thank you. Williamson: Is this going to be ver-

Burns: O.K., first of all you should tell me how you got started at a 500 watt

radio station? Williamson: Well, so far you're clever. Moose Jaw, had about 250 watts,

CHAB. It's a lovely town. Burns: Right, now you're going to try and get out of that aren't you?

Williamson: No, I would never try to retract it - it was a lovely town. I was deflowerd there.

Burns: Deflowered in Moose Jaw? Now, isn't that a rather dubious achievement?

Williamson: In Saskatchewan, you don't mind getting chapped lips.

Burns: Moose Jaw was really where it started?

Williamson: Right - CHAB.

Burns: Where's your hometown? Williamson: Vancouver - St. Michael's Hospital - 1952.

Burns: So what's that make you, let's see. . . . !

Williamson: An old Vancouverite Burns: 27?

Williamson: 28 . . . I was an afterthought. Most babies are. As a matter of fact, I started in Vancouver at the National Institute of Broadcasting. The instructor had enough faith in me to hire me as an operator in the station, one floor above. His name was Frank Callaghan.

Burns: Frank was the Programme Director wasn't he?

Williamson: Yeah, and N.I.B. was in the basement of CKLG. It was fantastic. I had it going on right upstairs above me. I owe a lot to Frank.

Burns: He has a rather interesting sideline doesn't he?

Williamson: I never asked Frank about his sex life however, he does like quarterhorses.

Burns: Quarterhorses???

Williamson: He'll laugh about this too - I hope. Actually I think he's at CHKC, as working Programme Manager, morning man and all around nice

Burns: All around nice guy?

Williamson: Well, anyway, he's a nice

Burns: Fine, let's continue. Williamson: Whatever!

Burns: I've known you for a few years now, and it comes as a surprise to me that you went to broadcast school. To be honest, you are the first successful (Writer's note: please underline "successful") graduate of any school of broadcast theory. I'm sure there are many, but your case surprises me. Williamson: Huh?

Burns: Sorry, were you taking a nap? Williamson: No, I was taking a shot. Burns: Did N.I.B. get you the job at 'LG?

Williamson: Callaghan got me the job. I suspect there are more closet cases than you or I know about.

Burns: The idea - closet graduates!

Williamson: Fine - I think that any

learning institute has failures, so I can't pull them apart for that.

Burns: Is it possible that they take the tuition fee knowing full well, in some cases, that that student doesn't have a hope in hell?? And I'm not directing this statement at N.I.B.

Williamson: Good idea - cover your ass! I think they're a waste of time, because two to three years in a college situation could end up with the same results.

Burns: Let me pose it another way. Do you not feel that natural talent (writer's note: please underline "natural") is an absolute necessity to a successful jock?

Williamson: The progression is, that the more you can utilize natural talent and put it on the radio, you will be a better broadcaster, and the more people will listen to you - and the more money you will make. Burns: O.K. I'll accept that.

Williamson: You have to virtually do it better than anyone else can, Donny? Burns: Yeah?

Williamson: You and I are announcers and I would say very proficient, at our trade. We can not only say that from listening, but also from what we see as an end result.

Burns: Unfortunately, so can Revenue Canada. How about Moose Jaw, did it teach you more than broadcast

### school?

Williams: Of course. Anytime you end up in a practical situation, you're going to learn more than you would in theory, and that's exactly what happened. The Institute gave me formal training though - they taught me how to read, which you and I do a lot of every day, on spots, and then, of course, you must add that personal

Burns: How much of your income is based on freelance work?

Williamson: At least 50%.

Burns: O.K., so here we have Dan Williamson, the West Coast wonder, from Moose Jaw to TO . . . .

Williamson: Thank you!!!

Burns: You and I spent a helluva year together out on the Coast, and the night I'll remember most is when you were to emcee three hot-shot blues bands at the Cave, and for three hours you had to try to explain to a rather unruly mob why they weren't there yet. I thought we were going to kill each other that night.

Williamson: Yeah, well I was mad, and you were the first person through the

door.

Burns: Speaking of the Cave, as I recall, you seem to have left that establishment, on occasion, from some rather unorthodox exits.

Williamson: If some of this tape shows up in RPM, there's gonna be a real problem.

Burns: Like through glass doors that are locked?

Williamson: Do you know the meaning of the term . . . law suit???

Burns: Let's move along. No matter what town we work out of announcers have one thing in common . . . greed. But the ability to freelance decreases with the population doesn't it?

Williamson: That's an unfortunate

Burns: Seriously?

Williamson: Yes, that's true . . . it's a lot harder for a jock in a small town to make any great amount of, shall we say, extra-curricular monies, due to the fact that the big agencies are based in the larger centres, and primarily, right here in Toronto. I'm doing fairly well here, and a lot of it thanks to a good demo tape that was put together by a guy named Dick Abbott at Little Mountain Sound in Vancouver. Dick, if you're listening, thank you very much. (Writer's note: doing fairly well, is, at the least, an understatement!).

Burns: Agreed. Thank you also Dick, your production genius got us both a lotta work. Since I've known you, you have always been a bit of an entrepreneur . . . I understand you're into income property these days???

Williamson: Anybody wanna buy a

Burns: Would you like to talk about the thousands of beachballs and cute little umbrella hats you had big ideas for?

Williamson: No!

Burns: Did you ever unload them? Williamson: I said I don't want to talk about it.

Burns: You were brought to 'TR by a guy, who for the moment, is the head honcho at CJBK in London, right?

Williamson: You know more about me than I do. Yes, Leslie Sole, one of the best damn broadcast people I've ever met. He was the reason I left CKLG after six great years.

Burns: Did you start to feel like you

were marking time?

Williamson: I kinda worried about that, but I was involved in the radio station and I was doing a lot of promotion work and . .

Burns: I was there - I know you did some fabulous promotion.

Williamson: It worked out O.K. It all started with ideas, but it's still execution that's the most important. It's called takin' care of business, and you should know that better than anyone.

Burns: CFTR has treated you well, and God knows, you've more than reciprocated - you're a pro, and it

shows.

Williamson: You're repeating yourself, but that was a nice thing to say, again. Burns: You're either the world's greatest actor or you're actually incredibly happy on the air . . . which

Williamson: Both. Right, coming to CFTR was a very important step for me . . . I think it's important to make progress in your career, no matter what you do. I do what I do because I love it. It's a lot of fun to be somebody's friend and you don't even know it. You can even talk about things that are important to you, and that's a huge privilege, when you realize that most people in this world don't have that opportunity. If you figure that announcers make up probably less than .01% of the population, we've got a whole lot compared to others.

Burns: For example?

Williamson: Take the weather. . . you can say, "It's going to be sunny today, cloudy tomorrow, and it's 12 degrees celsius . . ." you can say that, so that it slips right by their ears, or you can perform it, so it becomes entertainment, as well as information. Let me be even more presumptuous. What we are doing 24 hours a day is taking things in with our ears and minds and spitting them back out on the radio in edited forms. Every pro is mentally preparing his or her show, 24 hours of every day. Burns: I'm sorry I asked.

Williamson: On a more personal level, you, as an individual, turn that silly machine on and, all of a sudden, someone is sticking something in vour head.

Burns: Sticking it in your ear, I

suppose . . . Williamson: Radio, through words, expression and emotion, allows a listener to create their own images. Radio has it all over television, because it allows you to create your own sensory environment. It lets you use your imagination and live it your way. If you were to put a camera on me, my flaws would be terribly apparent, at least from a physical standpoint.

Burns: So you don't mind if your listeners think you're tall, dark and handsome?

Williamson: Lord no;;; I hope that's

90% of my audience.

Burns: How much ego, and I don't mean that in the negative sense, do you feel is necessary in our profession?

Williamson: You have to be pretty sure of yourself. You have to say, "O.K., the image I'm projecting is mine", and if people trust you, they will actually listen to what you have to say. But I don't feel you need anymore ego than anyone else, and I'm not being presumptuous.

Burns: Has booze or drugs ever created any problems in your career, and if it didn't, by all means say so. The reason I ask is that I'm thinking of the kids just starting out in radio, and maybe we can save them from becom-

ing a bunch of misfits!

Williamson: There's alcoholism, drug addiction and marriage breakup in our business, but no more than in any other. It's up to the individual. The difference is that if Dan Williamson or Donny Burns get busted, the whole world knows about it. But if the guy at the supermarket does a little blow, nobody seems to care.

Burns: Then you don't feel that there's any more abuse in our busi-

ness??

Williamson: No . . . people who have problems will always have problems.

Burns: The four hours a day on the radio . . . are they real to you? Williamson: Yes, absolutely.

Burns: No Alice in Wonderland - just people in radio land? Williamson: Right - although there are

times when I wonder if maybe I'm just talking to myself.

Burns: I have experienced a lot of problems with "the folks upstairs", namely management, over the years. a lot of it, admittedly, self-induced, but I'm curious to know what mistakes are made by the desk set.

Williamson: Money! They're not paying their people enough money. I think that our business is one that deserves a greater sharing of the wealth. I am not at all referring to my present employers - they pay a good rate. Because when you're talking radio in Toronto, you're talking radio in Southern Ontario, which means the most densely populated area of this country. They can afford it.

Burns: The owner of a successful radio station in any market has a license to print money, but due to a rookie's inexperience, they take advantage of him?

Williamson: Yes, they do. Management in small to medium towns ask for their talent to be whisked away, because they don't spend enough to develop and keep these people. Owners and management should realize that every time they skim dollars they're asking their best people to leave town. I've talked to a lot of American jocks and I've gathered from them that unless you make it to the obvious biggies, like New York, Chicago or L.A., the majority of U.S. markets don't pay any better. I do very well, but I don't do as well as some of the tops. I'd be presumptuous to think

Burns: Give me a list of your favourite broadcasters.

Williamson: Daryl B. (Burlingham), Don Harron and Barbara Frum.

Burns: Explain, please.

Williamson: I love rock radio and I love to hear the best in the business, and in my mind he's (Daryl B.) one of the best. I've worked with Daryl and against him.

Burns: You'll get no argument here concerning Daryl B., however, you're telling me that Dan Williamson, hot shot rock-jock, listens to Don Harron and Barbara Frum? I'm not trying to take anything away from two obviously talented people, but I never pegged you for a CBC listener. Why?? Williamson: Information.

Burns: Don't you get information from your own radio station?

Williamson: Yes, but not the same kind. With the CBC it's more specified. For example . . . say, there's this farmer, and he wants to know

how to cure a festering boil on the ass of a chicken. I find my whole field broadened by that sort of thing. Burns: Do you like CBC better than

your own radio station? Williamson: It's different. You see, I know what's going to happen on CFTR - I just get a different insight from the CBC. I know what songs are going to be played on my radio station . . . I know what kind of incredible people work on it and for it . . . I know the writers, the salesmen, the janitor, production people, and the folks in the front office who put that day to day operation together.

Burns: So what you are saying is that you gleen information from the CBC to use on your own radio station? Williamson: You know what it is Donny, I don't feel badly about taking 'ideas from others, because we converse on the radio with other human beings in a one-to-one situation. There's another human being sitting there, right next to you, and you're feeding him information.

Burns: Does it not bother you that the guy that does afternoon drive at the CBC is getting paid as well, if not better than you, has one-tenth the listeners, and the horendous taxes you fork out goes to pay his salary?

Williamson: No, not at all.

Burns: Case dismissed! What percentage does the CBC appeal to? Williamson: I don't know.

Burns: We should form a club. One last question, what would you like to do besides talk on the radio or go back to Moose Jaw to check out that chicken???

Williamson: Yeah, I have a head for business. I know that from knowing you personally.

Burns: Softly, the government's listening too!!! Do you want to talk about those cute little umbrella hats? Or maybe you could go into beachballs again.

Williamson: Nah, beachballs are inflated.

Burns: You have no shame. Well, I'm running out of tape and money, so. Williamson: I want to say hello to

Stinky. Burns: O.K.

Williamson: Hi Stinky. And to everyone in Moose Jaw, including the chicken, and a special hello to the staff of the Hurwood Hotel who gave me a beer belly.

Burns: Oh, God no!!!!

So, that's how it went. I might add that 75% of this interview could not be printed. Between Dan and I, we brought a whole new universe to the chicken joke (boil or no boil). When you're in 'TO, be sure he "sticks it in your ear". He can communicate more in 10 to 14 seconds than a politician with a whole referendum, Dan Williamson - weekdays from 2 to 6. on 680 CFTR.


