

Top recording acts firmed for CNE Grandstand

Toronto: The Canadian National Exhibition will be featuring what they describe as their "most star-studded lineup of recording artists ever" at the CNE Grandstand '82 Shows.

The theme this year revolves around the concept of "Number One". Each act scheduled to appear is either number one in their field or has amassed a great deal of number one hits.

To make the Grandstand Shows more accessible this year, more than a dozen new ticket locations throughout Ontario have been added permiting CNE visitors the opportunity to amone the first to purchase tickets for the performance of their choice.

Tickets can now be bought at Sam the Record Man out-of-town locations in Barrie, Peterborough, Kitchener, Belleville, Guelph, Orillia, Niagara Falls, Welland, St. Catharines, and at the Central Ticket Office in Buffalo, New York. In addition, tickets can be purchased at various BASS outlets, Zounds in Toronto, and A&A's Record store in downtown Toronto.

Kicking off the first show will be Blondie (Aug 18), followed by Dolly Parton (20), April Wine (21), Black Sabbath (25), Olivia

Devil's Lake Corral TV music show studio

Edmonton: Devil's Lake Corral, the ill-fated country dinner club that was reported to have gone into receivership in February after only one season, has been given a new lease on life as a Canadian television music show studio.

The key man behind the project is veteran Canadian television music show producer Doug Hutton and his Doug Hutton Television Production Company. Also involved is the Devil's Lake Corral, Alberta Independent Pay Television, and CITV Productions.

A series of 24 concert specials featuring international big-name performers began taping before a live dinner theatre audience July 2, and 3, starting off with Kris Kristofferson.

The series is being designed for world-wide distribution to Pay TV, Free TV, in-flight use, and in some cases, home video use. The show is estimated to cost \$300,000 per segment.


Helping to make the productions possible was the purchase of Canadian broadcast rights for the shows by Alberta Independent Pay Television.

The international stars are being featured in a concert format with the emphasis on production quality, including a stereo soundtrack, special lighting effects, elaborate staging and other elements.

The 2,000 seat club was apparently picked for the productions because of its accoustics, lighting possibilities, camera locations, and its state-of-the-art technical design.

With only one show to be taped each day, ticket prices, including dinner, will vary depending on the act, but will range from \$30 to \$60 with distribution through BASS ticket outlets.

Hutton's company reported that the acts being lined up are to represent "a variety of musical tastes offering something for everyone from country and pop, to classical and MOR."





"We're proud to be involved in this year's Grandstand series because we feel the talent at this year's Exhibition is probably the finest assembled anywhere," said CNE talent co-

Although many of the acts being looked at are for the most part, American, the series still qualifies as Canadian content for production in Canada by Canadians.

Possible future performers for the series include Captain and Tennille, Roberta Flack, Roy Orbison, Ginette Reno, Joan Baez, Sheena Easton, Linda Ronstadt and others.

The Devil's Lake Corral, located 30 miles northwest of Edmonton, was originally being considered as Las Vegas North, but it was felt that the ticket prices along with the considerable drive to the club was keeping customers away.

Although ticket prices had been lowered, plus booking of more local and touring acts the club closed its doors last winter, going into receivership with the Imperial Bank of Commerce as its receiver. ordinator Michael Cohl, also of Concert Productions International.

"All the acts this year have attained Number One status in their chosen type of entertainment and we've strived to provide a type of entertainment for everyone."

Handling promotion for the Grandstand shows this year in the Ontario region is Scoot Irwin, formerly Artists Relations Manager for Capitol Records of Canada.

Lighthouse reunion firmed for Forum finale

Toronto: After months of rumour and speculation, the Toronto-based, early '70s brass-oriented and jazz-influenced rock band, Lighthouse have finally been confirmed for their reunion dates.

The several-member group is slated to close the season at the Ontario Place Forum Sept 11 and 12 by performing two shows each day. The shows are also to be videotaped.

Several months ago there were reports of the band reuniting for a possible tour, but apparently there was some question as to who owned the name. However, with the announcement of the dates any problems, including getting the members of the 11-piece band back together, seem to have been solved. The only member reported to be in question is saxophonist and flutist Howard Shore.

Lighthouse formed in the late '60s by drummer Skip Prokop, formerly of the Paupers, and keyboardist Paul Hoffert, a composer of commercial jingles, films, and documentaries. Prokop is now an integral part of a gospel rock band while Hoffert is still in the jingle business.

The band was fronted by the strong vocals of Bob McBride and burst on the scene in the early '70s along with such other brassoriented bands as Blood, Sweat & Tears and Chicago.

The band recorded several albums and hit singles including One Fine Morning, Take It Slow, I Just Wanna Be Your Friend, Sunny Days, and Pretty Lady.

Downchild Blues vocalist loses fight to leukemia

Toronto: The industry was shocked to learn of the death of Downchild Blues Band's female vocalist Jane Vasey. The talented singer, who was also the keyboardist for the group, lost a lengthy battle with leukemia. She was 33.

Miss Vasey joined Downchild several years ago and became exceptionally popular with the fans in a very short period of time.

Funeral services were held in Toronto, Friday July 9, A request was made that in lieu of flowers a donation be made in the name of Miss Vasey to the Leukemia Research Fund, 3101 Bathurst Street, Toronto.



Shakin' Stevens breaking into North American market

"Could you do me a fayour?" he asked after I had completed the interview.

"Well, . . . what is it?" I asked him hesitantly since rock stars were not in the habit of asking me for favours.

"In the article could you call me Shaky?" he requested.



Epic recording artist Shakin' Stevens has left his mark in major countries around the world, that is in just about every major market except North America.

He has chalked up an enormous number of accomplishments in a relatively short period of time

Since January of 1981. Shaky has scored Top 10 hits in 15 or more territories including the U.K., Germany, Holland, Belgium, Austria, Switzerland, France, Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Finland, Israel, Australia, New Zealand, and South Africa.

The young Welshman signed with Epic Records in London in 1979 after more than a decade of unsuccessful recording for other labels. By the end of 1981, he had sold more than six million singles and three million albums worldwide.

Tax relief for artists in revised federal budget

Ottawa: After numerous complaints and the threat of many artists leaving the country. Canadian artists can now breathe a sigh of relief in view of the government's changes in tax provisions recently revealed in the revised budget.

When the November budget was handed down, there was much concern when incomeaveraging annuities were discontinued and replaced with forward averaging. The threat that some of the country's top recording artists would leave Canada for the U.S. loomed over the heads of the Canadian recording industry.

Prior to the November budget, artists could buy the income averaging annuities to reduce their taxes and provide retirement income. The income from their peak periods would then be taxed years after at a lower rate.

The Government received numerous complaints regarding the November budget and the Finance Department later produced a document trying to show that the artists were as well off under forward averaging as with the annuities, but those affected by the taxchange remained skeptical.

For the revised budget, Finance Minister Allan MacEachen has apparently indicated that forward-averaging provisions would be applied to all of a professional's income and not just part of the annual increase.

Under the tax provision, artists pay a high tax rate on their income while it's at its peak to build a tax credit.

When the artist retires and his income drops, he is taxed at a lower rate and can use the tax credit to reduce his tax bill.

CBS Records Canada is now confident that Shaky is ready for the North American market. In fact they're so confident they've launched a major campaign to support his first Canadian album and single of the same title, You Drive Me Crazy, containing some of his biggest hits.

"I was born in South Wales and make my base in London now." said Shaky. "My mother had 13 children, but my father who's dead now, was really into music. I think my dear old dad helped me out.

"My real name is Mike Barratt, When I left school I played on the street a lot. I was impressed by British groups like the Stones and Beatles. I got my nickname from a guy named Steven Vanderwalker. I had been looking for a name."

Deciding that he wanted to be a rock singer, Shaky and his band the Sunsets played the local Wales club circuit after he left school. In 1969 his luck began to change when he was asked to open for the Rolling Stones, but then it was back to the regular club circuit

The real turning point however, came in 1977 when he was asked to play the part of Elvis Preslev in Elvis an award-winning West End musical, a part that he first turned down until he found out that it was not a send-up. but a tribute.

His appearance in the musical won him critical acclaim and led to a role in the TV

Big band master Elgart on Canadian promo tour

Toronto: RCA Records Canada reports that the RCA and K-Tel release Hooked On Swing, a follow-up to Hooked On Classics, is showing early indications of following in the footsteps of its predecessor.

The album contains six medleys - Hooked

On Swing (also the single), Hooked On Big Bands, Hooked On A Star, Hooked On Astaire, Hooked On The Blues, and Hooked On Broadway.

Hooked On Swing was produced and conducted by jazz great Larry Elgart for K-Tel International. Elgart credits much of the success of the material to the "subtle interweaving of themes by arrangers Dick Hyman, Mike Abene, and Bobby Scott."

Hooked On Swing features Elgart and his Manhattan Swing Orchestra "playing the big

series. Oh Boy! Finally in December of 1979 he signed a management deal with Freva Miller, likely the key move in his career. After the partnership, the hits began to roll out, beginning with Hog Dog followed by Marie Marie, Green Door, This Ole House and You Drive Me Crazy. Some of his hits were covers of oldies.

"I didn't go out of my way to cover old songs," he said, "The idea is to do it in your own style with an '80s feel. A lot of hands have covered old hits. The Searchers did it with Sweets For My Sweet. They thought it was a good song and so why leave it in the vaults? Many of our generation have never heard some of this great material."

Shaky has just completed a European tour with many dates posting sold out notices. His popularity on the continent goes without saving. He has totalled five straight Top 10 hits and two Top 10 albums in Germany and in Sweden his current album has sold in excess of 100,000 copies in only three months of release, while in France his single, You Drive Me Crazy has gone Top 5 with sales now nearing 400,000. Back home in Britain he has scored four No. 1 records and no fewer than seven Top 20 hits with his new album chalking up sales of more than a million copies.

Television has also been a major factor in spreading the popularity of Shaky, where he has appeared in 36 programs of the TV rock series, Let's Rock, which is seen nationally in the U.S. and is now being seen across Britain.

His accomplishments just go on and on but it's obvious that Shaky's biggest victory will be to shake up the North American market.

Retailers launch drive for Canadian NARM

Toronto: Six representatives of key Canadian record and tape merchandisers held meetings recently and decided that the National Association of Recording Merchandisers (NARM), should be expanded into Canada.

The meeting was organized by NARM Executive Vice President Joseph Cohen and Brian Robertson, President of the Canadian Recording Industry (CRIA).

The NARM Canada advisory committee apparently resolved to launch a membership drive with strategic local meetings throughout the country and a benefits brochure for mailings to more than 3,000 Canadian retailers.

In addition, the committee and CRIA are reportedly developing a system for detecting and reporting illegal records and tapes.

According to the report, NARM has indicated that particular emphasis will be placed on the Canadian importation of illegitimately recorded product from the U.S.

A NARM campaign that has already been in use is Give The Gift of Music. Programs being considered are the Bankcard and store bag programs.



Nine years later

The ninth annual Ontario Golf Tournament continues to be an ongoing success story. Instead of reading what the American trades are claiming or predicting, perhaps those AM programmers who are concerned should monitor the AM giants like CFRN, CHED, CKXL, CFUN, CFRB or CHUM.

In some cases these stations have lengthened their newscasts, which covers the information flow and a few have even allowed the return of the on-air personality, a major factor in the continuing success of CFRB.

Take the blinders off

The recording industry has come up against what could be a major problem with retailers. For some unknown reason, most retailers are frightened of or have no confidence in the sales value of cassettes. They've been prodded and pushed and plied with favours and discounts to take a much more aggressive attitude toward the sale of cassettes. Manufacturers have been supplying cassettes to retailers at the same price as albums for a couple of years. In fact, it costs less to manufacture a cassette than it does a record. but the retailer invariably tags an extra buck or two onto the price of the cassette and promptly locks them up. Capitol recently introduced a cassette bin, and other companies have similar type promotions, but the retailers aren't impressed. Perhaps if cassettes were more readily available and at the same time as the album, home taping might be dealt a blow.

The great Canadian joiners

It wasn't too many years ago when there wasn't much to join in this industry, except the ranks of the unemployed. In the past few years there have been associations, acadamies and societies formed for every aspect of the business. It's a joiner's world. You can trade company secrets, and many do. You can practice character assassination of your employer, and many do, and you might even find another job opening, but not too many have. I'm not a compulsive joiner but when I do become a member of a club or fraternity it better be a very important move. At the moment I'm a member of the Variety Club, and that's all.

Anyone for employer's rights?

It's becoming more and more difficult for employers to rid themselves of problem employees or to even reduce staff because of the economic situation, which has nothing to do with unions or contracted executives, but with people in the field. Apparently when employees believe they have been wrongfully dismissed, they can take action against their former employer, with the sanction of the government. Unfortunately, in a few cases, the original settlement offered by the company turns out to be what the supposed offended party receives from the court and on top of that, of course, there are the court and legal fees that have to be paid by both parties. Does anyone win?

First impressions are lasting, when it comes to this package of harder than the usual hard rock entry. The album cover artwork, illustrated by Martin Springett, lends itself beautifully to the contents. Anthem premarketed this album with a clever EP containing Devil's Deck, Stand Up, Hey Operator and Monkey Bars, along with a short recorded discussion by producer Kim Mitchell. The results were almost immediate with AOR programmers showing preference for Hey Operator which, incidentally will be the first single release. Much of the material was co-written by Coney Hatch members Andy Curran (bass and lead vocals), Steve Shelski (lead guitar and vocals), and Carl Dixon, the lead vocalist and guitarist of the group. The latter is also impressive as a solo songwriter on Hey Operator, Victim Of Rock, and You Ain't Got Me. The remaining member of the group is Dave Ketchum, a drummer who has an exceptional handle on English rock, which he comes by naturally. The guitar work throughout, captures the mood of

this hard-hitting quartet, enhanced by the punchy delivery of both Curran and Dixon. Produced at Oshawa's Quest Studios. Unfortunately there are no lyric references with the package. As well as those mentioned other favourites are We Got The Night and Love Poison.



HOOKED ON SWING - Pop Larry Elgart & His Manhattan Swing Orchestra - RCA AFL1-4343-N

With more and more North American radio stations turning to the swing era, this package is timely, particularly being that it was produced by Larry Elgart, the master of the big band sound. We are now going

through a confused era of Hooked On, Switched On, The Original Hooked On, and Turned On - everything from the classics to Broadway. To end some of the confusion, RCA (U.S.) apparently wasn't too happy with the musical performance on the previously released Switched On, so assigned Elgart to this project and he in turn used the arranging talents of Dick Hyman, Mike Abene and Bobby Scott, resulting in a major U.S. chart item. This package gives you Hooked On Big Bands, Hooked On Astaire, Hooked On The Blues, and Hooked On Broadway. From In The Mood, Come Fly With Me, The Way You Look Tonight, to Birth Of The Blues and Luck Be A Lady - solid proof that the old days were the good days, depending on how honest you are about your age.

All Dressed Up - Elektra XE1-60127-P With the release of the single, Boys Of Autumn, taken from this set, the recording career of David Roberts was immediately established. The album has become an impressive salesmaker for WEA, from a newcomer's standpoint. 



Toronto: The Freedom label, distributed by RCA, recently released the debut self-titled album by the Pape Gang, an LP that features several of Canada's finest musicians.

Many of the musicians involved in the project are former members of the now disbanded Madcats and Max Webster.

While some of the songs have captured the old Toronto sound which combines rock, soul and R&B, other tracks feature a harder, tougher edge. The LP also contains some satire.

The composers point out that the material on the album expresses their feelings about various topics.

"Pete and I are old friends and lived in the Pape/Mortimer area of Toronto," said Blake. "Our friendship together stretches about 22 years. After the Madcats broke up I wanted to get together with Pete and some other friends to do some jamming. What we did was immortalize the district we grew up in."

"It's really self-actualization," explained Patio. "Critics say that you can't praise your own area. The album really has nothing to do with Pape other than the fact that we grew up there."

Blake explained that the cover of the album was made from a photo of the corner of Pape and Queen. Artwork was then produced, based on the photo. The only thing added was Sarnia Road instead of Queen, since it features members of Max Webster, most of whom are from Sarnia.

Patio pointed out that when using so many good musicians the result is spontaneity and competition, which he felt was a plus.

"We paid for all this ourselves," said Blake. "The songs were first composed for a play. We had all these songs but no funding. Finally we put out an EP which contained the song Whalehuntin' At U.W.O. but there seemed to be some stigma attached to EP's at the time."

The band then got a deal to release an album on the Freedom label. The single from the LP is the track Living On The Fringes Of Adultery with Take Your Pants Off on the flip.

"Most of the musicians that worked on the LP had a history of working together," said Blake. "Gary McCracken of Max Webster used his friends and Pete and I used our friends."

"It was great to have all these guys on the album," said Patio. "The enthusiasm was great, but if we were to do it again we'd probably cut it down."

There is also the possibility of a live version of a Pape Gang making live appearances if there's enough interest, but as Blake explained, it would be hard to pick the band lineup, however they would like to feature cameo appearances by some artists.

Single taken from Eikhard's new album

Toronto: Shirley Eikhard has released a new single on her own Eika Record label titled Never Giving Up On You with Good News on the flip.

Both songs were penned by Eikhard, who also produced the single along with Greg Roberts. The single will be included on her forthcoming album.

The new single marks her first recording in four years, during which time she has been writing, performing overseas, plus taking part in numerous TV and radio shows.

At 13, Eikhard caused quite a stir at the Mariposa Folk Festival. At 15 she received her first recording contract and since then has won two Juno Awards as well as three BMI Songwriting Awards.

Now 26, Eikhard has three albums to her credit. Those recording her compositions include Kim Carnes, Anne Murray, and Catherine McKinnon.

Anthem releases EP from Coney Hatch's debut LP

Toronto: Prior to the releases of the debut self-titled album from the Toronto quartet Coney Hatch, the Anthem label has shipped a 12-inch promotional EP to radio, containing the forthcoming single, Hey Operator, and three other tracks, plus a conversation with producer Kim Mitchell, ex of Max Webster.


