Behind the success of the Disco format on radio is the music, the artist, and ultimately the record company. Unless the record industry supports Disco and believes in its saleability... radio cannot have a viable format. Here are some of the statements by leaders of the music industry.

Is Disco expanding? "Absolutely," according to Bruce Lundvall, president

## 81.6% Of PDs & GMs Believe Disco Growing

LOS ANGELES — A little over a fourth of the program directors and general managers in the United States, regardless of the format at which they work, think Disco radio is growing on both AM and FM. And 39.91% more believe it's growing on FM and 16.5% beyond that believe it's growing of AM.

In any case, 81.65% of all radio men and women responding to a survey (answered by more than 230) felt that Disco radio was growing.



• It was closer than a flea on a dog, but it appears at this time that CKLW in Detroit and XEROK in El Paso/Juarez will NOT simulcast night-time programming. ### Disco Radio Increases Sales

LOS ANGELES - Disco radio increases sales, according to over 80 radio stations programming Disco music. Seventy-six percent of the stations which responded to the Radio Report question: "Since you went Disco, has your advertising revenue increased, decreased or stayed the same?" said their revenues increased since going Disco. Seventeen percent said advertising revenue stayed the same, and seven percent reported declines in advertising revenue. Of those, one station said that revenues decreased initially but then went up; and another reported declines in national advertising while local sales picked up.

Success, however, is not unqualified. It is still very early in the development of Disco. The format has not been clearly defined and the hard data is not yet available. Buyers and sellers both are still taking a long, hard look at the format as a sales vehicle; and some of the things they are examining are its audience, its image, and its effectiveness.

One station which does have an unqualified success story is WKTU in New York. The station went on the air with a Disco format on July 24 of last Continued on page 4

### **Butterfly's Disco Soars**

"I sincerely believe that if we had had Disco radio when this label started, Butterfly Records would be 10 times the size it is now," Nancy Sain, executive vice president of Butterfly Records, stated in an exclusive interview with Radio Report. "We were ahead of our time. It is something we do not allow ourselves to dwell on. I'm just grateful that there is Disco radio now. Because it makes our job so much easier. We don't have to sit and chew our fingernails and hope that a DJ in New York will like our record. I can go to WBLS or WKTU and if it's a good radio record, it's on. If it sounds like it's supposed to be there, it's there. And our product is! Our product is very radio-oriented. Because we are!"

Nancy Sain describes herself and the president of Butterfly, A.J. Cervantes, as promotion people and "once you're a promotion person, you always have a commitment to radio." She has been in the record business for eleven years and spent seven of it doing national promotion. She now finds herself one of the few women in the industry who not only formulate record company policy, but is in the position to execute it. "I'm number two at Butterfly. I'm very organized, a good administrator, creative and I enjoy selling."

A.J. Cervantes agrees with her self-evaluation, but adds, "She has one of the best marketing minds in the

year and was an instant success. The station presently has advertising rates that could well be the envy of any major market station in any format. According to station manager, David Rapaport, they are now sold out a week or two in advance at \$250 to \$350 a pop.

But is WKTU a local success story or does it represent a national phenomenon? John Boden, president of Blair Radio, feels that "Disco radio is too new to pass judgment on. We don't know where it's going to go in programming." Jeff Dorf, vice president of Airtime, agrees. "The future is uncallable. Disco is not a universal type of format. From market to market and within markets, stations vary."

Dorf buys radio by format type. "Disco," he says, "is an element in radio, like all other elements in radio. You buy the appropriate station for the type of product you are selling." Under what conditions is a Disco station the appropriate station? According to Dorf, most people think through logic and not research that Disco people are mobile-type, fashion-conscious people. But, he adds, "the jury is still out on that." He, himself, believes that Disco radio is most appropriate for those clients who are looking for the fashionoriented, or younger skewing mobile type. For Dorf, psychographics can be an overriding consideration. A station need not be Number 1, 2, or 3 in a market; if the psychographics indicate that the station is the place to go to reach a targeted audience, he will buy more psychographically, than demographically.

Diane Witt, who buys radio time nationally for the 7/Eleven Stores, also looks at more than ratings. Of 200 stations on which she is currently buying time, at least 50, conservatively estimated, may not have top ratings. "I also look at the target of our particular product and the cost efficiency I need to achieve. If I'm looking for women pocket audiences, or minorities, Disco is in my opinion a source to consider." She adds that she has bought Disco stations. "It's a careful screening process of reviewing airchecks and critically analyzing the market."

J. Ray Padden, general sales manager of KIIS AM & FM, notes that advertisers require that you bring in numbers. And if you don't have them? "You bring in the numbers that you do have." Padden sells both creatively and with numbers. He says, "It's fun to talk about the eight different promotions running this month . . . and by the way, our c.p.m. is \$1.23."

But there is resistance. Says John Boden, "There is an image problem. But this is true of every format. Who listens to Beautiful Music? Rock is just for hippies. Contemporary is just for kids. Country is for the blue collar people. People can always find reasons not to buy. They are an ethnic audience. They don't spend money."

David Rapaport agrees. "We've had no problems with soft drink advertising, but we're not getting airlines, automobiles and banking." He has a 15 year background with Rock and Roll, and recalls the old days when national agencies and advertisers would stipulate 150 rating points for four weeks but no Rock and Roll. "No matter what the rating books were, the agency people felt that Rock was reaching only teenagers."

J. Ray Padden does have American Airlines and the Bank of America on the air. But his situation is somewhat unique because he sells KIIS-FM in combination with the MOR/Personality/Talk AM station. Nevertheless, he feels that Disco is the easiest format of any to sell, because it is the only format that reaches from the driving teen (16+) to the 65 year-old.

Padden feels that 99% of the resistance is personal and not businessoriented, and comes from buyers who say, "I don't like the format, I don't relate to Disco, and therefore my target audience doesn't like Disco music." Sales, he feels, became easier when more Disco product started crossing over. "When Rod Stewart and Cher start cutting Disco songs, you get new credibility."

Resistance takes many forms. David Rapaport talks of one client who had the fantasy that WKTU listeners didn't eat chicken. And, of course, there is the argument, albeit veiled at times, that Disco is ethnic and lower-income. Padden notes that the Disco audience spends \$8 billion in Disco-related merchandise. And both Padden and Rapaport cite the playing of Disco music in such bastions of establishment and wealth as Neiman-Marcus and Saks Fifth Avenue.

Jeff Dorf feels that Disco tends to deliver an audience that's an amalgamation of Black, White and some Latin. The extent to which the mix is effective is predicated on the market itself and on the competition in the market. The problem that he does see is not the mix but the pricing of some Disco stations, which he considers inordinately high. "Many operations without audiences are saying, 'Look at WKTU, WDAS and WBLS. We'll be as successful as they, so let's price like they do.'"

What, then, is the future? Jim Foley,

director of media for Coca-Cola, is open. "We're always interested in exciting promotions." But, he says, "there has not yet been put together a good exciting promotion in the New York franchise on a Disco station;

### It's A Different Kind Of Record

LOS ANGELES - Belt buckles and T-shirts have gone the way of the Nehru jacket that fancied the record industry - and thus the radio industry - a few years ago. Today, the "unique" record is king. And A&M has just released a Police single in the shape and color of a black and silver police badge. On one side is the new single "Can't Stand Losing You" and the other, their first hit "Roxanne." Wayne Newton is featured on a record shaped like a white star with a four-color computer picture of Newton in the center; the song is a Disco version of "You Stepped Into My Life" on Aries II Records.

The records come in white, pink (Dolly Parton's "Baby, I'm Burning" on RCA), silver (Triumph's "Rock 'N' Roll Machine"), clear vinyl, lavender, red, yellow, and on and on. And in crazy shapes like Bobby Caldwell's heart-shaped record, the green four-leaf clover of "Baby I Want You" by Horslips on DJM Records, and, of course, the star and the badge. "Magic Again" by RCA featured a picture of a pretty girl at bat. One LP featured a huge pair of lips.

### FM Goes Rock As New Q101

MERIDIAN, MS — WDAL, a 100,000-watt FM here that also serves parts of Alabama, is dropping its easy listening format and going live Rock under the new calls of WJDQ and will bill itself as Q101. New program director is Brock Broulette from WJFL in Vicksburg. Larry O'Neal from WMYQ in Newton, MS, joins as music director. Staff will feature Bill Loggins and Bob Benson from WJFL, Jack and Vickie Watkins from WMYQ, and Chris O'Connor from KMAK in Fresno, CA.

At the same time, WJDQ-AM will change call letters to WDAL and adopt Adult/Contemporary programming.

Q101 will program Top 40 singles, plus LP cut versions of some hit singles and Disco singles in certain dayparts.

Had lunch with Bill Sommers, general manager and vice president of KLOS in Los Angeles, and his new program director Damion. The station, as earmarked by the recent weekend broadcast of the Mike Harrison "Album Greats" documentary, is quickly moving toward a new position in the market. Sommers, who started his radio career as a midnight-6 a.m. air personality at one of the West's first stereo stations - KNJO in Thousand Oaks when it was owned by Sandy Koufax - pointed out that the station was making considerable profit — "the market is very healthy for radio" — and Damion said that he felt the station hadn't really been in tune with what was going on in the city musically. "While another station or two in the market might be as comfortable to listeners as a pair of old jeans, we'll be the jeans with a French cut. Sophisticated, aware of the sociological changes going on in the city." He likes to listen to a new record on cassette in his car and added that the music industry "has a totally captive audience at that point . . . you really can't listen to music well while working at something else. And you're always working at something else in the office. And listening at night at home is somewhat detrimental to the music." And anyway, he's often out in the local clubs or at a concert - keeping tabs on music in the market. His time spent in the car driving to work or to home or to a concert is actually his best listening period for new records - thus, the importance of cassettes.

Lineup on the Album Rock station now includes Frazier Smith 6-10 a.m., Joe Riley 10 a.m.-2 p.m., J.J. Jackson 2-6 p.m., China Smith 6-10 p.m., Billy Juggs 10 p.m.-2 a.m., Laura Davis overnight, with weekenders Terry Gladstone, John Leslie, Dion Jackson.

Sommers became manager of KLOS Oct. 2, 1978. Damion has been program director for about three weeks; he was previously an air personality at the station, joining it from WDAI in Chicago in June 1972. He is an 11-year radio veteran.

### Who Took Whom?

Herb McCord, general manager of CKLW in Detroit, and his music director Rosalie Trombley were dinner guests at the White House a week ago. Now it's true that Herb is one of the nation's great radio men and someday the president is going to pay recognition to the real broadcasters of this country who make radio happen

As director of research and adult contemporary station's link to Radio Report, perhaps you have encountered similar requests (pleadings) from other stations. Regardless, please know how much I appreciate the information each week and how very significant it is to the formation of the format here at WLLN. The series on home grown research is another example of the way Radio Report is helping our day to day operations. Research of the kind described in the last two articles was carried out on a small scale before sign on of the station and with the summer coming on, and listener habits changing, you couldn't have printed the material at a better time.

Thanks again for the help you've given this station. I hope to be hearing

more from you on the pages of Radio Report.

Let me add my voice of thanks to what will probably be a flood. The inclusion of the demographic call-out figures in the MASSurvey will probably bring you many subscriptions and renewals. For small market stations, it may be just the ticket for programmers when they go in to justify to their GM's the cost of your excellent trade publication.

Let me also thank you and Dr. Balon for the article on small market research technique. I might add, too, that in many small markets, there are 4-year or 2-year colleges offering courses in statistics and market analysis, and often times the colleges, and their computer departments, are happy to do the bullwork on such a project. At one station where I once worked part-time, a local college did a survey twice a year, and the impartiality perceived by the prospective sponsors was greatly enhanced!

Again, let me thank you and your staff for the one weekly trade I couldn't get along without!

# What Is This Thing Called Disco?

As programmers around the country grope to understand the meaning of the word Disco, questions abound. One programmer's concept is not the same as another programmer's concept. Is Disco fast? Is it slow? Is it sophisticated? Is it funky? Can you program it all day? Do you daypart it? In other words, just what is this thing called Disco?

The two words which most often attach themselves to any definition of Disco are dancing and happy. Jim Ryan at WDRQ says, "Dancing is an important part of it. If you call yourself June 14, 1979

Disco, it has to be music that is played in clubs, and there are so many different kinds of dancing." He continues, "The common denominator to the music is that none of it is negative. All of it is positive." And he compares it to the dictates of good weather reporting, "You never say partly cloudy. Always say partly sunny."
Matthew Clenott at WDAI-FM de-

fines Disco as "anything that can get played and get floor reaction in discos. It can be anything." But he warns, "Don't define the music in terms of the records, but in terms of what people dance to in discos."

Vince Pellegrino at CBS says "Disco music is dance music. It's something that has been around for years. It's happy music; it makes people feel

Radio programmer, Kevin Michaels says that "Disco is any form of music that can be danced to.

Arnie Smith at RSO characterizes Disco by the beat. "People must have that beat to dance to." He also cites the positive energy that surrounds Disco.

Issy Sanchez of Atlantic says simply, "Disco music is the same as always . . . danceable. It is actually not Disco music, it is dance music. A disco is only the place where people go to dance.'

Wynn Rosenberg at WDMT says "Disco is any type of music that's fun, up, alive and happy. It can be fast or slow." David Levine, at Talisman, echoes these sentiments. "Disco is any kind of music that will bring people up . . . both mentally and physically."

Levine feels that as late as seven months ago, before the trend to Disco radio, Disco music meant heavy, driving rhythm tracks with buried vocals and strong horns and strings. It was highly pulsating and driving. "Now, with radio trying to benefit from the overall audience response to Disco music, record companies feel that they have to produce songs that sound good in this new medium. To capture this market, a song needs to have identity; and record companies are starting to release product that is strong lyrically. The rhythm is still the same; they still can mix it in clubs, but the songs will have identity.'

Issy Sanchez feels that Disco radio is an outlet to reach massive audiences after the clubs have reached their audiences. He recognizes that Disco radio cannot program the way the clubs program, and that the music in the clubs is more progressive. While he would like to see radio play the same records as are played in the clubs, he admits that the Disco DJ can afford to be more progressive. "He can see people's faces when he plays a record; he can see what his audience likes and doesn't like.'

# Susan & Joyce

Colonel Parker stood behind Elvis. Brian Epstein was there for the Beatles. Robert Stigwood is there for the Bee Gees. And Joyce Bogart and Susan Munao are the two young women behind Donna Summer.

Joyce came from a television background; Susan from the publicity and public relations field. Even before becoming a team behind Donna, they passed the million-mile touring mark in their first team effort for KISS. "Publicity and live appearances were a major factor in the building of KISS. It was a visual show, with a visual image." They broke KISS without major radio airplay. "We also broke Donna without radio play via the discotheques.

"Today, radio's acceptance of Donna is phenomenal. She has five top ten hits in a row," they say fondly. But there were many frustrating years when they were told by the press and by radio that Disco was "a fad," that "Donna couldn't sing," and "it wasn't really music."

The concept of the long play was especially rough for radio. In the beginning, they would try to persuade radio to play the long version late at night and the shorter version in different rotations.

"Frankie Crocker was the first to play 'Love To Love You.' He played the whole 17 minutes in 1975," Susan reminisces. "It was very innovative!"

This year, NARM voted Donna Summer the Best Female Artist in a tie with Barbra Streisand. "Donna Summer is constantly expanding, and you can't categorize her simply as a Disco artist. Music is music. Categories make it easier for some people... but Disco is a combination of every facet of music: Pop, Country... it knows no barriers. The public doesn't categorize it. They don't buy Disco; they buy the artist."

In the home-like surroundings of Susan Munao Management offices, the two women sit and outline their views of management and their plans for Donna Summer. Their philosophy is Personal Management. "You become the eyes and ears for the talent. You see what the public sees and translate it for your talent." In addition, they both feel that "artists should only be responsible for what they do: singing, writing . . . It's up to us to control and coordinate all the other elements that surround the talent in conjunction with them." For them, the challenge and the excitement of management is that it's an all-encompassing job. "We deal with the artist; we critique performance and production; we deal with the record company people, publicity people, TV people, radio people . . . every area.'

"Most people don't understand what management is," Joyce points out. "It's looking at talent and evaluating where they belong in the entertainment world. Management's responsibility is to help the artist become more and more creative in anything the artist is involved in . . . to encourage the artist to reach out and expand."

"It's almost like a marriage," accord-

ing to Susan. "You ought to be a fan of your talent's ability, but also a fan of your talent as a person . . . and sometimes you have to help them find who they are as people." Susan also manages Twiggy, Sunshine and Brooklyn Dreams. Management, they both believe, is a gut feeling. "You see an artist just beginning . . . almost a diamond in the rough. And you see in your mind's eye where he could go . . . like a vision. And the question is, which way is the best way to go . . . stay Disco or expand into other music. The 'I Remember Yesterday' album was an expansion of Donna's talent; so was 'Once Upon A Time', which included many different kinds of music.

"Donna does everything with her act now. She designs her costumes, her own stage set, etc." She has found herself. At the beginning, it was a tremendous transition from European artist to American. Donna would break into German in conversations, she had been abroad for so long.

The management job at the beginning of an artist's career is tremendously educational. You are exploring, experimenting, and leading your artist along. Susan notes, "When you're singing, you see people, but you can't tell how they see you." Joyce adds, "What kind of appearance are you making? When you sing, what are your hand movements like? What do the lights do for you or against you?" Susan: "How does the music business work? Why is involvement with record

stores and radio so important?" You

must know this. Joyce: "You have to be able to choose the size of the hall that's correct for your talent. Some acts will get a major record out and they play halls that are much too big for them. We have been much more cautious with our plans for Donna. In the beginning, we booked small halls. You need to gain experience to play to 1,000 people, and then 18,000. It's like building a base. You need to build a base in popularity and within yourself as an artist to play to that many people and communicate." The caution paid off, because today reviewers are impressed that Donna can play to large audiences and the reviews rave that "It was as if Donna was right in their living room."

"If you go into management," Susan says, "you need to be a self-starter . . . someone who likes to take direction from someone else is not for this career."

"You need a lot of patience," Joyce adds. "You must be able to work on a concept that may not come to fruition for six months or a year. Donna Summer and I wrote Once Upon A Time' as a play first. Then Donna sat down and wrote the music - flushed out the whole idea. The first albums were more of a joint effort, a total concept. It's all Donna now . . . 'Bad Girls' was her sole concept. And if you look at 'Bad Girls', each song is a performance unto itself. Donna has a thousand voices. She acts each song ... some are even Country! We are reconstructing goals for Donna. We are planning movies. And in November, she has a TV special that will show another side of her .... drama, com-

edy.
"In fact, one of the characters that Donna will portray on the major entertainment special was invented by

Donna, because she found herself bursting with energy at 1 or 3 a.m. after a show and no place to go. So Donna started to make films on video tape while on the road. We'd all act in them and characters evolved.

Another asset in management is to be able to handle lots of details and to plan endless details. "For instance, the two women explain, "when we know we're going to be on the road or in Europe for a long time, we arrange the open interview and send it to radio stations. It is very successful."

Donna Summer is giving to the Brooklyn Dreams group the benefit of her experience. When the group first came to Los Angeles and had no money and no place to go, they stayed with Susan. One night, Donna came over to ask Susan several questions. Brooklyn Dreams was busy working on material. When Susan woke up the next morning, Donna was still there. They had stayed up all night writing. Donna gives them her ideas on structure and communicating with the audience. "Show your audience you love them. Show your love," she tells them.

As far as being women in the field, they see very little problem. "If you think it's difficult as a woman, then it becomes difficult . . . if you become defensive." And it's not true that you have to know more than a man or be better than a man, especially in technical areas. "Don't be afraid to ask what you don't know," Joyce says, "and to hire experts you can depend on." Of course, eventually you do get to know the technical side just by being involved. "I can light the stage . . . and it came in handy. In the beginning with Donna in Europe, something had gone wrong with the planes and her crew never showed up. The feeling generated by the management team, as well as by the record company, is one of a small family. "It's a little more difficult," admits Joyce, "now that the size of the operation has exploded. Four years ago it was 14 people. Today it's close to 200."

Both Joyce and Susan feel that "all the top artists have had to have (at least at the point when they were breaking) a great manager because there are so many elements. Is it just as hard for the managers now that Donna Summer is a superstar?

'Now the hardest thing we do is say 'no.' Donna would like to do everything. We do a lot of charities. SHARE, Cancer, Easter Seals, UNICEF. To be able to give back is very important . . . an obligation . . . and having to say 'no' is the hardest chore.'

As an area of music business activity, Disco (clubs, radio, records, etc.) certainly has its share of shortcomings, but publicity is not among them. Disco-oriented trade stories and sections are as ubiquitous as Disco departments at record companies, disco records by artists previously identified with other genres, night-feverish TV commercials and series, and since 1978 the "discovery" at several hundred radio stations from here to Honolulu of the disco format. This is all fine but what is beginning to emerge only now is the critical difference between publicity and information regarding our industry's latest trend and hottest topic. A lot of streets supposedly paved with gold are turning out to be blind alleys, or at the very least, expensive detours; many people are puzzled. 31/2 years as a participant in two enterprises that only recently established full relations have given me perspective on the few fairly simple realities that are running the show. Sure, the roots of disco are illusion and fantasy (i.e. fun), but if disco is your business in any way, shape, or form, the realities will serve you better, and what frustrates so many people these days are the unforeseen differences between disco and the rest of the biz. The big question: Why isn't the "normal" way of doing things as applicable to disco as it is elsewhere? Why do we have to learn new moves, and what are they?

Misconceptions about disco exist at every level, from the boardroom to the d.j. booth; to a record company conditioned by past successes and the security of dependably platinum superstars to direct its A&R, promotion, marketing, and related activities to-wards establishing acts, achieving a profitable level of artist loyalty, the obstinate reality is that (with a tiny handful of exceptions) artists matter much less than records, and consumers only hear one record at a time. A disco hit, even a string of them, means next to nothing if the new release doesn't deliver in a discotheque and won't sell; the other side of the coin is that artists like Leif Garrett, Paul McCartney, Blondie, or the Doobie Brothers, armed with a record that does deliver.

can reach the disco audience. Whether they need to or not isn't really the point—disco is a sound, not an industry category, and the name attached to any particular record is of interest only as long as the record itself is. Next time out, it's "show me" all over again.
Obscurity is just around the corner; and all too easily achieved. It ends instantly, though, with the right sound (see Gaynor, Gloria, or Starr, Edwin). Today, holding disco in contempt because of its monotony, mindlessness, lack of artistic content, insipid sex-and dance-based lyrics, simplicity, and so forth, is an attitude that takes you right out of the race. These characteristics, interpreted as rhythm, accessibility, pleasure-orientation, and predictability, are precisely what attract people to disco. Contempt for the music consumer ain't exactly a competitive advantage. Disco works on the merit system more than almost every other area of the industry, because it's the only area where no distance separates the product and the public: you simply can not promote people onto a dance floor, and no matter how important disco music is or will be in terms of business volume, the dance floor is where it all comes from.

Compared to Top 40 or AOR, how often do you hear music people say of a disco record, "It was a hit, but we just couldn't get it played?" Count up the small or even brand new labels who manage to establish a national presence with a bank loan and a two-room

# Disco Radio: New Approaches

office, just because they have the goods; then count the six-figure priority projects that fizzled because they didn't. The absolute best kind of promotion I've ever seen disco records get is the lightning-fast word-of-mouth communication between club d.j.'s; it's incredible when you realize the cumulative amount of scrutiny a piece of disco music gets in the first week or two of release, and when the d.j.s agree, they're right so often the rest of the industry should be jealous. Of course they resent a newly established disco promotion department's breathless form letter full of exclamation points; their attitude is "Where were you five years ago?," and once again,

"Show me."

Disco on radio is much newer, even in the case of WCAU/FM, stumbing into the wilderness in January 1976. Nobody knew anything then except to try fitting the round peg of disco into the various square holes of existing format concepts, and we learned by trial, error, and intuition that new assumptions involving a lot of rule-breaking were called for. We have made, I hope, every possible mistake. Disco music on the air was and still is a great attention-getting device, but the hard part was (and still is) sustaining listener interest. See, compared to the album rock, adult contemporary, Top 40, jazz, and soft rock musical inventories being aired everywhere, disco records have much more in common with each other—as the casual analysts put it. "It all sounds the same." That's too superficial to be true, of course, but the point is that listener stimulation (resulting in more listening) has to derive from more than a playlist and a rotation-pattern—the life expectancy of a record deliberately recorded and produced for instant accessibility is short: burn-out can happen overnight. Disco stations are under constant pressure to be increasingly interesting, because the public learns fast when the subject is simple, and it wants to move on. Fortunately, disco music is getting better all the time, and there are always many records that show promise. For Philadelphia listeners, we can't play it safe-they've heard too much music, too much excellent radio of all varieties, and demand too much entertainment for that approach to work, so we have to put a lot of trust in information that can be gathered quickly and just as much in gut response to a record's estimated value compared to current hits. Every record enters WCAU/FM with an equal chance at airplay, because there are no givens, no significant supply of brand name material. The only hard and fast rule that applies is one that all radio adheres to: a record (even a disco record) must also be a song to work for us on the air.

Disco-formatted radio is about to reach a watershed; the original furious wave of band wagon-ism that began six months ago has slowed, and the more cautious General Managers and P.D.'s (not to mention those who did change format) are waiting to collect a broader field of data than one much discussed book for one much discussed station in the acknowledged disco capital of America. Here and there the discovery is already being made that disco music is no more of a short-cut to real, long term ratings success than new turntables. It represents an opportunity, but is just a means to an end, a broadcasting tool that comes without instructions; it's not the quick fix it was cranked up to be. In the long run, in disco radio as in most other things, it's the hard worker and not the miracle worker who gets a good night's sleep.





### The Raes



"A Little Lovin' (Keeps The Doctor Away)" was brought to the Raes by their producer, Harry Hinde, who was a good friend of Freddie Perrin. And Freddie Perrin gave them a few of the songs he'd written. This week, the 12-inch version of "Don't Turn Around" will be released.

Cherrill Rae hopes it will be "a smash!" She sees a parallel between

the marriage team of the Raes and Disco music.

"Robbie was from England and Wales and grew up in the era of the Beatles, the Pacemakers and the Dreamers. I grew up in Thomas, Ontario about 100 miles from Detroit and I listened to Stevie Wonder and the Supremes. So I was very R&B oriented, and Robbie was British Pop

oriented. We had a real conflict in the beginning with sound. He wanted to keep his sound and I wanted to keep my sound. There was nothing you could point to as the Raes' sound for two years. Then a third element emerged... which turned out to be Disco. I feel that's what Disco is - a combination of White and Black music and I think 'A Little Lovin' proved it. It made the pop chart and the R&B chart. In the beginning, everyone thought we were Black. But we perform a lot, and it's a real out-and-out Disco show. We use smoke machines, bubble machines, chaser lights, smoke bombs, costume changes. We have two big Ryder trucks, a seven-man crew to set up, and an eight-piece back up. You have to have a good show because people are there to dance! So we really work hard on it! Before anything, we are entertainers!"

Last summer, the Raes filled in as a summer replacement on Canadian TV. It turned out they were the most successful summer replacement ever, and were given a weekly series. The Raes show is now a 24-week series coast-to-coast on Canadian TV.

As to the future of Disco, Cherrill says frankly, "There's Euro Disco and live Disco. We'll probably stay with the live disco. I like real musicians, not machines; I like the gritty sound where there could be a mistake. In the beginning, they said Disco would never survive. Now the question is, will anything else survive!"

### Gino Soccio

"Disco, unlike any other kind of music, is so young that you can let your imagination go when you're writing. There are no standards set yet. As a writer I can go crazy as long as I keep it danceable!" Gino Soccio, whose debut album on RFC records was 'Outline,' reflected. "What you do with it, the way you orchestrate it, what instruments you use... the range is endless. You can use a tuba if you want."

Gino is serious, laid-back, and reserved off stage. He seems more like the image of an AOR artist than Disco. "Now in lyrics," he explains, "you should deal with the body. Disco is a body philosophy. It's not mind-oriented... but what happens to your body on the dance floor."

An accomplished musician with an extensive Classical and Rock background, the Canadian-born Soccio describes himself today as "a Disco artist. I try to stay Disco!"

Asked whether Disco was a producer's medium or a live artist's medium, Gino thought "a little bit of both . . . you have to be somewhat of a



producer. I started out as a producer before I became an artist. Disco was originally just a producer's medium till there were so many record companies making Disco records they needed personality. Probably the need for an artist is what helped my career. If I had someone else cover the album, it wouldn't have been so successful."

Of all the songs on the album, he

prefers "There's A Woman." "It was a lot of work. I prefer listening to that one more than any one else. It was very, very different — very electronic — and took a lot of hours to put the sound together."

He has no management yet. "I get calls from managers who want to manage me but they want to manage me like a Rock artist, treat me like a Rock artist. Somebody has to re-define the whole meaning of a show because Disco is for audience participation and dancing and I don't think promoters and managers are aware of that yet."

He looks forward to performing, especially with the big budget that his label has promised him, and "I'm taking more time on the second album. It will be more sophisticated! On the first one, I had a deadline to meet. I'm going to work a lot on the lyrics. Also, the next album will be easier to perform live. The first was really a product of the studio."

Asked to define Disco, Soccio says he can't. "It's dance music but then so is the Bossa Nova. Disco is just special!"

Amii Stewart

Although a newcomer to the record scene, Amii Stewart has caught on fire with radio stations throughout the nation. In fact, "Knock On Wood" was named one of the three most exciting songs of the year in Radio Report's survey of program directors.

Amii brings to her singing career the poise, beauty, image, and style of the theater. A star in England's hit show "Bubbling Brown Sugar," she also helped direct and choreograph the

play.

As Amii Stewart leaps into a singing career, her dancing career will not be left behind. "I can't not use my dancing," she explains, "because dancing is a part of me. And I think it makes the show more exciting for me and, hopefully, the audience. Basically, so far, I've been doing things straight from the track but it will be a challenge for me to learn just how much dancing I can do in a live show. I did one live performance at a county fair in Florida, and it was fantastic because there were like five million kids screaming and hollering. I had so much energy . . . I was going all over the stage and singing at the same time. It was great! The thing is, I only had to sing three songs, and at the end of the third song I realized I was pooped! In a whole concert, I would have to slow down here and there; you couldn't have the fast songs back to back like that. I'd have to have a slow one to calm down. If I give a show, you can rest assured



there will be dancing. Dancing is part of my act... That's me, Amii! And to have people dancing when I'm up there... oh yes, I'd love that!"

She plans to put all her energy into her singing career. And all for Amii Stewart means a total commitment. When she started her dancing career as a youngster in Washington, D.C., it meant total commitment. She reminisces: "When I first started to dance... my body was so sore and tired that the bus driver would have to help me step down. I would sit right in the front seat next to the driver and he got to know me because I would take the same bus every time going home so my mother wouldn't worry. And there were times

when I was so exhausted, my mother would have to pick me up and put me in the bath." Amii comes from a military family. They encouraged her dancing, however. And music was always in the house. She grew up listening to the radio.

"I listened to WOOK, WOL, WHUR, all the Black Soul stations." She was a big fan of Nighthawk. "I guess I always was an oldie-but-goodie freak. I was born in the wrong era. They expressed themselves more in words than in music because they didn't have synthesizers!"

Amii has been living in England for the past two years. "Just as I'm feeling homesick, somebody comes over from the States to see me...my mother, brother, cousin, or childhood girl friend."

The hardest song for Amii on the album was "Light My Fire." "Vocally, it was hard to do. For some reason, they couldn't lay down the tracks ahead, but did it in sections later. Since the track wasn't mixed, I didn't know when the voice should get louder or softer."

Getting good songs is not a problem for Amii. "I can always find, in any song, something to do to make it my song." She depends on her friend Trudi Meisel to advise her on material. "Trudi started Donna Summer. She sees things within people that they don't even know are there."

What are Amii Stewart's plans for the future? "The second album has to be as good or better than the first one.

That is challenging!"

## Melba Moore

"A lot of people are just getting tuned into Disco and my music fits into the Disco format. They think I just jumped to Disco. But a lot of my material I've been doing for the last three, four or five years. My Disco hit songs are only two songs in my act." But Melba adds, "if Disco breaks me, I wouldn't reject it at all."

Melba Moore does not fit any of the molds. She is a beautiful woman whose album cover shows her playfully romping in baggy painting overalls. She started studying music at the age of ten; majored in it in high school; and studied piano and voice through college. After graduation, she taught school for a year in Newark, New Jersey. But she was not satisfied.

Melba broke into show business as a club performer in the resorts around New York, and got her first big break when she joined the cast of "Hair." But the thing that catapulted her to national fame was "Purlie" and the song "I Got Love."

Getting the song was somewhat serendipitous. The song she was doing in the show was "Purlie", and that was going very well. "I Got Love" was written for her. "I thought it was kind of a cute song. I was really glad to have it, but I was wondering 'was it too much.' I would rather knock 'em dead with one song, than take a chance with 15 songs and bore them."


Melba Moore is somewhat philosophical about life. "For every compensation, there's another thing you have to adjust to. And by the time you adjust to all of them, it's an equalizer."

But she is very specific about success. When asked if there were one song she would like to record, she replied, "the one that is platinum."

# Radio Looks At Disco

Disco music has come full circle. It has become acceptable and legitimate. The "Kings Of Rock n' Roll," The Stones, tagged their "comeback" to disco. Rod Stewart brought it home and, now, Andy Williams is pressing 12 inch singles, Ray Coniff is playing the Bee Gees and "Saturday Night Fever" is being played on your local, Beautiful music station. It's time to look at disco's place in Mass Appeal radio.

Disco is now "commercial" and the fantasy is over. You can no longer just plug it in and have it work for you. One must make an educated, music decision where, when and how often to play a disco song, since it is being played everywhere, even the AOR stations.

Where is the "hip" appeal that disco brought with it when it burst forth on

the air waves of America? It now seems its "freshness" has diminished as its newness wears thin and now some radio music research is indicating "disco burn." So, at this point, Mass Appeal radio has to be careful about which Disco records it decides to play, just as careful as it is about any song it puts on its playlist. Going on a bad "rock" record can be just as detrimental as going on a bad "disco" record. Disco's place in Mass Appeal radio is now just another music category and should be treated on an equal basis with all other musical categories. Disco will now take its place in the musical tastes of America alongside country, R&B, rock, novelty, ballads, etc. The astute music programmer will take advantage of all musical categories to shape the "sound" of his station to meet his audience requirements.

It's interesting to note that the average listener doesn't categorize songs as he or she listens to your station, but, instead, follows the flow. It is that flow that should determine your music decisions and not the "disco" label. Let the disco song being considered stand on its merits of demographic appeal rather than its descriptive label.

When the disco phenomenon started, there was a tendency for Mass Appeal stations to play "catch-up", to say, "hey, listen to us, we know Disco is popular, so, we're playing everything you hear on the dance floor." This tendency was one of "overreaction," overreaction to something that was quite ordinary. What could be so ordinary as a change of mind, a change of music taste in certain sections of your audience? We seem to forget that Mass Appeal radio merely reflects its listeners' tastes and mirrors their lifestyles. It is the radio station then that should tune in the listener. Mass Appeal radio should have been the vehicle to present Disco to America and picked up on the Disco-lifestyle much earlier than it did. It is ironic that Mass Appeal radio has been searching for that new and exciting music form and then when it arrives, misses the chance to expose it.

There is no other choice now. The question is not "should I program disco," but, "what disco songs will I play." Disco is now just another music style and is going to be with us for a while. Fortunately, all we in Mass Appeal radio have to worry about are

"the hits."

Whenever one speaks of how radio relates to a particular musical phenomenon it must include how the audience relates to it. I can only speak in terms of AOR and WLPX in Milwaukee. The end result is that most people listening to "AOR" or Rock and Roll radio want Rock, not Disco. They see Disco as an intrusion to a Rock format. I have found this is most prevalent in young men 18-24.

A radio station should reflect an image that reflects the tastes of its audience and cater to that image and audience.

Since the results of our Question of the Day a few weeks ago, WLPX has instigated a new vehicle for street talk that added muscle to our Rock and Roll image. It's "Disco Destruction." Disco Destruction is a time set aside once each Friday evening in which we literally begin to play a popular Disco hit on the air and then destroy it on the air by turning it on and off, playing it at 78, airing sound effects of a funeral dirge as we crack it into tiny pieces before the microphone. It's fun to do for the Jocks and the positives on the phone are enormous!

I can only speak from experience. . . Milwaukee is a Rock and Roll lover's town and LPX is a Rock and Roll station. Our increasing numbers reflect what our audience likes to hear.

Since Rock and Roll music has left a tremendous impact culturally over the past twenty five years, I would expect this "Radio Stance" to be viable in almost every American city.

Thought-provoking questions, to be sure...but ones that all of us in Country Music have to ask ourselves. To the stalwarts in our field, the hue and cry will be: We must keep our identity as a Country Music radio station and this is yet another way of diluting our Sound. To those who are not skewed totally in that direction, but have leanings toward it, the cry is emerging: We can accept some degree of cross-over, but how far can we go before we have an identification prob-

Still another camp has to propound the feeling: Cross-over is a way of life and people are being exposed to Country artists as they never have in the past. Country gains, rather than

There are shadings somewhere between all of the preceding platforms and they too have a position to maintain. As you can recall, disco itself when it emerged, was looked upon as a 'fad.' Today, it is a reality to contend with and not a mere passing fancy. It is reflective of many social happenings in our lives today and cannot be dismiss-

When Bill Anderson came out with "I Can't Wait Any Longer," the response was slightly traumatic to Country fans. There was probably a fifty-fifty type reaction. But as others followed, Country audiences mellowed some-what and, at best, treated the arrangements as novelties with a relatively fast burn-out factor. Ironically, when a Country artist adopts a disco beat, the arrangement has a musical feel to it that has a revitalized spark that doesn't have the same drone as a 'genuine' disco record. It's as if there is a layer of legitimacy placed upon the superstructure of the distinctive beat.

Disco may not be all bad for Country. . . but all of us programming Country stations should constantly question: If we're trying it, are we

really liking it???

R&B radio has had tremendous impact on the sales and national chart positions of AVI Disco records ever since they began programming Disco discs two or three years ago. About a year or so ago, when a few "pure" Disco stations came into being, some additional impact was felt. Since that time however, with the substantial increase in the number of Disco stations in most markets, a definite stronger impact had been felt — particularly with those Disco records (especially Eurodiscs) that R&B stations are not apt to program.

discs) that R&B stations are not apt to program. They have also been particularly helpful in going on new 12 inch discs right out of the box. No, radio is not making us more aware of their importance than pools. True, radio is an extremely vital force now in establishing Disco hits nationally, but the medium will never replace the Disco pools. Had the pools and individual DJs not formed in the beginning, none of us would have been able to bring Disco to the powerful force that it is today. The pools still test and prove out whether a record is a winner or not. Sometimes that "danceable" 12-inch disc is strictly a Disco hit and not a radio record; in which case, the company will sell 35 to 50,000 off the Disco play alone.

An interesting sidelight to the relationship of Disco radio to Disco pools and Disco DJs is now starting to evolve. This early Disco station airplay action has prompted many of the Disco DJs and pools to start programming 12-inch discs even earlier than normal in order to beat the Disco stations to the punch by introducing a 12-inch first. We believe they (pools and Disco DJs) want to maintain their reputation of being the first group to collectively break Disco hits.

The boom in Disco radio stations has helped Polydor sell more records. We have taken records like Gloria Gaynor's "I Will Survive" and Peaches and Herb's "Shake Your Groove Thing", and crossed them over from Disco club hits, to Disco and Black radio hits, and finally to Pop radio hits. The Disco radio stations helped sell enough records to get store reports for adds on Pop stations. Another thing Disco radio stations can do is take a record that is big in the area's clubs and make the rest of the public who don't go to the clubs aware of it. It also has become a source of

Information for someone who heard a record at a club but didn't know the artist or title.

The first negative that comes to mind is that some Disco disc jockeys are now saying, "The song is on the radio so it doesn't need my support anymore". This is a misconception on their part, and it's difficult to make them understand how important it is for them to be playing the record whether the radio is on it or not. However, for the most part, Disco radio has helped Polydor expose more Disco product to the public.

Basically, radio stations have to consider the records that will work for them the best and the records that contain the best songs. With the records that contain the best songs. With the growth of radio we find there are records that are radio records which don't get played in clubs, and there are records that are good in clubs but not right for radio. So the aim is to get the two to meet, so you can have the success you are looking for ... a club record and a radio record. I still feel the clubs are very important. Clubs are still vital and one reason is because the majority of DJs in clubs have an even greater sense of enthusiasm about have an even greater sense of enthusiasm about researching new records. The ideal situation is for the program director and DJs to develop a good working relationship together. Program directors should visit clubs and DJs should go to radio stations and talk to program directors.

Arnie Smith agrees that radio is the vehicle for getting Disco music to the masses. "It is easy to listen to the radio." He also feels that we will see Top 40 Disco and Progressive Disco in the future.

Wynn Rosenberg says, "a radio station is not a Disco. We are not programming to a Disco audience only; we have to program to the masses. We have to educate the masses and make them feel comfortable with Disco." He does that by programming familiar artists like Wings and the Electric Light Orchestra next to St. Tropez and Carrie Lucas. He feels that stations that play 132 b.p.m. 24 hours a day will die.

Vince Pellegrino thinks that radio in the past has relied on the Disco DJs and pools. Now that radio is more aware and more knowledgeable, it will begin to program music differently, and it should. "People in a disco are there to dance. People listening to the radio are not necessarily dancing, and you do not have to create the same atmosh

atmosphere."
Matthew Clenott says "Disco Radio is radio that plays music that people dance to in Discos." But he does not automatically play those records. He uses the information he gets from the clubs as a tip sheet, checks record sales, and "then I make my own judgements."

Jim Ryan feels that Disco is the new

mass appeal radio. "There is a song on our station for everyone. Even 18-24 year old men dance sometimes." The common denominator of all the music is that it is played in clubs.

Gary De Maroney at KFMX feels that "Disco is subject to the same evolutionary and geographical interpretations that progressive formats felt before the advent of the generally accepted term Album Oriented Rock (AOR)," and he suggests that "programmers take Disco and put it into proper context; that which it really is — Rhythm Oriented Rock (ROR). De Maroney feels that Disco radio cannot narrow airplay product to only that of the clubs. "Club input is necessary, but it cannot be the only component."

One of the biggest arguments about Disco radio seems to be over the ballad . . . and the ballad everyone points to is Peaches & Herb's "Reunited." Issy Sanchez says "it's not a Disco record. It is a ballad." Kevin Michaels says "of course that's Disco. People can dance to it." Matthew Clenott has chosen not to play ballads on his station. Vince Pellegrino, on the other hand, suggests that in order for radio to grow in the future it will have to start programming slow records. "In AM Drive, people don't want to hear 137 b.p.m., but will listen to Wings and Peaches & Herb." Wynn Rosenberg did play "Reunited"; Jim Ryan did not. Ryan expresses much of the quandary in which Disco radio found itself: "If Peaches and Herb had come out later in time, we would have played it. "Re-united" is a Disco record; it is played in the clubs as a ballad. But we had been Top 40 for so long, and we were trying

to establish an image of a Disco station. Now the door is open for ballads, and in the future we will play them. But they must be strictly Disco, happy ballads."

What does the future hold for Disco besides slow songs? Vince Pellegrino sees the music splintering and going in three directions: 1) the Euro-Disco influence with its lush orchestrations and total concept albums will continue to grow; 2) the funky R&B Disco sound will also continue; and 3) the love ballad will start making headway in the clubs.

Kevin Michaels finds Disco today more Rock oriented, and feels that the major influence now is Top 40 artists cutting Disco product. He says Disco will be around in some form or another indefinitely. "As long as people have two feet, there will be Disco."

Issy Sanchez sees Disco going back to the R&B influence that was originally exerted in the early seventies. He sees Disco as becoming more funky. The European sound will still be played, but it will not be in the minority.

What was the watershed that catapulted Disco to mass appeal? Sanchez credits the Rolling Stones. "They were the biggest Rock and Roll band in the world and had the top selling Disco record ever." This he feels is the influence of Rock on Disco...the Rock artists making Disco tunes. Musically, he believes, it has no effect.

Matthew Clenott says, "Disco is eclectic. It has borrowed from many styles. Born out of R&B and Latin rhythms, African and Jazz, now there are no influences that don't affect it." All of this is testimony to its strength.

good balance of Adult Contemporary, Top 40 and Disco is a good even sound."

But guys like Scotty McCormick, music director and production manager for KRPM in Puyallup, WA said, "Hopefully somebody will find a cure for Disco."

Only 11.93% of the about 230 program directors and general managers and music directors who responded to this question thought that Disco radio had leveled off — holding steady — while just 6.4% thought the format was fading (even less than those who thought Top 40, A/C, and AOR were fading).

Robert A. Waeltz at WMEK said, "I fkel before a station changes to Disco, it should research the market to see how popular Disco is; Disco will give Top 40 a fight, but I feel Top 40 will hold its own, due to the many good

programmers in the format...like Les Garland at KFRC and Clay Gish at KRBE and Bill Tanner at Y100."

Ron Wiley, music director at the Duke (KDUK) in Honolulu, said that, "Disco will only fade when people quit going to nightclubs to dance . . . some radio will always specialize in dance music "

It should be noted that most of those deeply involved with Disco radio, such as A. Duncklee, music director of WBOS in Boston, thought it growing on FM.

Jerry Alan, music director of WDLB, Marshfield, WI, which mixes A/C and Disco on AM, and WDLB-FM, which features Beautiful Music, thought that as the "average age of the population increases, A/C will become more popular, especially on AM radio. But Disco is adding real life to radio, giving stations an up-tempo sound that attracts listeners. Disco is here to stay." He was one of the 25.23% who felt that Disco was growing on both FM and AM.

Lee Barr, music director of KIUL in Garden City, KS, which features 60% Disco and 40% contemporary in its format, also thought Disco growing on both FM and AM. "I think it's time we stopped fighting Disco," he said.

But Chuck Kelly, operations director of Disco-formatted KSET (Disco 95) in El Paso, TX, pointed out that Country radio with so many Pop crossovers is not a distinct format anymore in most markets. Programmers of Top 40 are over-reacting to Disco and thereby killing Rock and Roll... Disco is not for everyone, so why try to make it mass appeal?"

J.J. Whitehead, program director of Disco-formatted KCFX added that "there are many formats which are sort of in between," thus it was even difficult to tell which specific format was growing, which was holding steady or fading.

George Kerry Lambert, program director of Disco-formatted WKGN in

for 93 sets of keys, only two of which fit a brand new Camaro Z28.


#### Pardon Me Is Someone Sitting There

hence, I can't say I've had good experience with Disco so far."

John Boden feels, "any radio format can move product. The question is the degree the format can move it. We'll have a better idea about Disco with the next ARB around June 29."

Pat Schirmer, vice president of Western International Media, expresses a different point. "This is a gut feeling. I have no research to back it. I don't think Disco moves product. I treat it the same as Beautiful Music; because quarter hour is inordinately high for the format, it leads me to believe that the station is turned on and left on as background music."

J. Ray Padden disagrees. "You cannot listen to it without it having some effect on you physically. If music physically affects you, how can it be a background sound?"

Schirmer would like to see Disco tested as a medium to move product; for example, an advertisement done only on a Disco station that called for response. However, she says, "I would definitely recommend the Disco format for record companies with Disco product."

Diane Witt also expresses skepticism about the format. "I buy radio stations that I feel are right for the market and will do the best job for our clients. The switch to Disco is a quick way to turn some bucks, but consider your audience. Sure, you'll probably get the cume numbers . . . you might even get our organization to buy time . . . but for how long?" She feels

that Disco will remain a giant "until the 18-24 male adult, most likely a minority, finds some better things to do with his social life than frequent discos. True, he is most likely not the target of the Disco station... but in my opinion, he is the pacesetter. He sets the trends for our products."

Jeff Dorf does buy Disco radio, but he feels that it is difficult to measure its effectiveness. "Our buying tends to be multi-station. And radio is just a part of a total media mix, including TV and outdoor. It is difficult to isolate the contribution of one element."

One success story can be isolated. It is the advertising on WKTU for the Taggart Driving Schools. William Taggart, chairman of the board, commented: "We go for the residual advertising but also the direct response. After the spot goes off WKTU, we have ten lines coming in and all the buttons light up. We got a better response than on TV. In the past we never had a great direct response from radio in general, but we did on WKTU and also on WBMX in Chicago. We advertise on other formats and get direct response, but never to this extent. The quality of the lead (the customer that calls) is very high. We enroll a very high percentage, perhaps 70%, of the calls. WKTU has good listening at drive time. It surprised us. We open at 7 in the morning and we get calls. I can't understand why people want to listen to Disco at 7 in the morning, but they do!"

Success won't make it easier, according to John Boden. "Every format has a sales problem, no matter how

successful. Even if you're the number one station with top ratings, it should not be an easy sale. Not if you're priced properly!"

business. We make a good partnership. We're strong in promotion and marketing. We're close and good friends."

Stan Layton, vice president of MCA Records, marketing, finds her "a delight to work with. She is involved in all facets of the industry. She has follow through. Whatever she starts, she completes. She is a real asset at Butterfly."

statement . . . looking back now, I would say it was impossible. Looking back now, with the education that I've gained, I would say it's impossible. But we got lucky with the first St. Tropez, 'Je t'aime', and lucky with 'Two Hot For Love'.

The company, which was formed in 1977, decided at this point to concentrate on Disco. "It's extremely expensive to promote Rock and Roll, much

Her first introduction to Disco occurred when she was working with Neil Bogart. "I was national secondary radio promotion. Neil had brought Donna Summer, who was on Oasis Records, out of Germany. It was prep time. He was planning how he would market this product. This was way before she was released. Neil said, "Check out this Disco pool and DJ thing and start getting some lists together. I worked with Marc Simon who is now vice president and getting his own label at Casablanca."

Casablanca was a wonderful experience for her and definitely helped in one of the most beneficial relationships of her career — relationships with the discotheques and the DJs. "I was the only female on the Casablanca promotion team . . . with Larry Harris, Cecile Holmes and Buck Reingold."

At United Artists Records, Nancy Sain moved up from national secondary promotion to national singles director. The first time they had ever had a female in any kind of executive position.

"All young people talk about goals, ideals. One of the things A.J. Cervantes and I would discuss was our own label. I watched a lot of people doing business and felt I could do it better. So we had ideas about how we could start a company undercapitalized. Undercapitalized is an under-

more than Disco. You can sell 200,000 Disco records in New York and just spend a minimum amount of money, if the music is good. You can't do that in Rock and Roll."

Her key job at Butterfly was to line up the distributors. Ira Helicher, whom she had met through Neil Bogart, agreed to handle the fledgling record company if she promised to let him know if anything went wrong. She gave him her word and set out to woo distributors the way a promotion director woos a radio station. Only instead of saying, "I have ABC, I said I have Ira Helicher! It was the distributors who taught me, like wonderful, tough Lenny Radcliff, we didn't know what a quarter buy was or half buy was on singles. They taught me about discounts. John Horn gave me an idea of when to give discounts and timing. And they all taught me about their local markets... and advertising in the local markets." And whenever she got way over her head, she knew enough to phone Sal Licata at Chrysalis.

Sain did know retail promotion. She had worked with Macy Lipman on a project for 20th Century Records years before. "I gave Macy a list of secondary markets in retail and he gave me major market retails and also helped me stop smoking cigarettes."

Of course, now with MCA handling promotion, overseeing market distribution, and their added financial push, much of the old effort with distribution is no longer needed.

The Disco industry is not just growing, it is penetrating. Sain explains. It is a nine billion dollar industry including clubs, equipment, record sales, and off-shoot products. Japan is into Disco, Australia is into Disco.

"The only radio play we received when we started out was from WBLS. Frankie Crocker. I don't know," she says enthusiastically, "if anyone has given him the credit that he deserves. Because that man brought Disco out. He put it on the airwaves in New York. He took the music from the street, put it on the air, and made it work... he formatted it. He helped us with everything. He played THP Orchestra's "Two Hot For Love"; he even gave Je T'aime the first album shot."

# Disco Experience at KIIS-FM

#### **SWITCHING TO DISCO IN** THE LOS ANGELES MARKET

We've been Disco since November 15, 1978. The Los Angeles market is so spread out that we were slower to catch on than New York's WKTU. We did not do a great deal of advertising for the first three months. After a while, we put up billboards. People took a longer time to find us. Right now, we are number one in cume in Mediastat and our quarter hours are increasing rapidly. In the beginning, everyone cancelled us. Now we're sold

#### PROGRAMMING DISCO IN L.A.

The station is Disco radio for Los Angeles, which is different from any other market. Los Angeles Disco is extremely commercial . . . not the Theo Vaness or the Peter Jacques Band, which goes well in New York and sells tons of product, but not out here. Here, it's "Da Ya Think I'm Sexy?", "Hot Stuff," "Le Freak" . . . the very Disco . . . either commercial-based Pop or R&B based.

I see Disco radio as music that is popular in the discotheques. Record promoters will come in and say "it's not a Disco record, it's a radio record." But if it's not happening at a Disco level, it's not Disco. Gloria Gaynor could have become the Donna Summer of 1970. She had a record called "Honey Bee," but Black radio would not play her because it was too Pop. Pop radio would not touch her because she was a Black artist. But she was played like crazy in the discotheques. She wasn't R&B, she wasn't Pop, she was both ... she was Disco.

It is 18-24 or 30, female and male equally. But you get spilovers into teens and adults. They are an active audience and you get requests from 30, 40, 50 and even 70-year-old ladies. We're sharing the audience with a lot of different radio stations, not just the one or two you automatically assume.

#### **NEW PRODUCT**

When we first started, we were turning people onto way too much new product. We've started slowing down. June 14, 1979

We're feeding them the cream of the crop a little at a time. But still way ahead of Pop radio. Records take off much faster.

Our jocks were very progressive sounding. The audience complained. They wanted jocks more into the music. Our jocks were into the music, but had been told not to sound that way.

#### THE KIIS SOUND

No ballads. Our format is peak hour discotheque music. If you were to walk into a discotheque when everyone was out on the floor partying, that's the kind of music we play here at KIIS-FM. We play records that are proven crowdpacking records. So, for example, we would not play a "Reunited" by Peaches & Herb as beautiful a record as it may be. It's up music, very fun and lively 24 hours a day. It's 100% pure Disco.

The format can hold on to an audience a long time because of the instrumentations of Disco music. There is variety. Because of the USA-European connections and the Voyage cuts and the beautiful instrumentations and ballad intros such as on "I Will Survive", you get variety within the Disco music.

#### THE DISCO RADIO STATION AND PROMOTIONS

On Top 40 radio, the concept is "come and win." Contests on Disco have to be a little more sophisticated and have to be big to interrupt the station's momentum. The album giveaway is not a good concept. We've had a Disco Fair at the Palladium which included entertainment, Disco clothing, nail polish, makeup, fashion show and all the record companies. We've had Disco roller skating night, which was very successful. Dance contests are out. All you get are the professional dancers who enter every contest . . . and don't care about the station. The best concept is "A Night On The

Town". They win dinner at the best restaurant in town, a Donna Summer record collection, and go to three top discos that night.

#### WHAT MAKES A DISCO HIT

The same ingredients that go into a Top 40 hit go into a Disco hit. It should be something catchy, something people can sing along with, something a little different, plus a nice melody. "Boogie Woogie Dancin' Shoes," "Ring My Bell," "Knock On Wood," "I Will Survive"; none of those records sounds like every other Disco record that comes out and that's why they are hit records.

There are a lot of Disco records that are very good to dance to, but when it comes to listening on the radio they don't hold up. The discotheques can play fillers. They don't want to play hit after hit after hit. On radio, you've got to play hit after hit after hit. You're creating a mood. If you have an ear for Top 40, you have an ear for Disco. The music is similar.

#### THE FUTURE OF DISCO

Before Disco, everyone went to parties, were laid-back, smoked and sat around . . . it was boring. Now with Disco, people are going out. The water shortages, the gas shortages all help make people want to get out and have fun at a low cost. Disco will get more and more popular. I pity Top 40 radio. Top 40 can't help but become Disco. And AOR radio sounds like radio of the past. Disco is music of the

The music will become very futuristic. Disco is very studio-oriented. It will become very spacey-sounding with Disco beats ... but very polishedsounding lyrics and lots of instruments you never heard. Giorgio Moroder, who made it happen (along with the Bee Gees) produced Donna the queen. And more and more, as in the case of Cher, great producers in Disco will be bringing artists up to their potential. I personally love Disco music. I love our radio station. I like commercial music of all types before they become hits.

of Columbia Records. "Not only is it expanding within its own art form, but into Pop, Rock, Punk and Country and Latin & Fusion - becoming more

integrated in every category."
"Most definitely," believes Bob
Siner, MCA president. "We were late getting involved in Disco. Many of our acts have already produced successful Disco records and we will continue to build on their success.

"We are the daddy of Disco," declares Henry Stone, president of T.K. Records, "even though I never called it Disco. But 'Rock Your Baby' started it all. It's growing tremendously. I can remember when if there was the word Disco on the record, we said maybe we better take it out because it won't be played on the radio.

"Yes, it's growing," says A.J. Cervantes, president of Butterfly Records. "Six months ago we made the comment that Disco was going to be bigger than Rock and Roll. The top eight selling records today are all Disco. Our prediction has been fuluilled.'

"Disco as we know it," says Dennis White, vice president, marketing, Capitol Records, "is probably not growing, but music that is danceable is definitely growing because of the June 14, 1979

impact of Disco. Disco is now being assimilated into the mainstream of Pop music."

Asked what percent of their product was Disco, Bruce Lundvall, president Columbia Records, says, "We can't answer that question because we don't peg our artists as Disco artists . . . like Paul McCartney and Wings who have had success in Disco. Conversely, there are Dan Hartman and Cheryl Lynn, and Gary's Gang, who have hits in the disco, but their popularity spreads far beyond the Disco market.

Bob Siner, whose company is just moving into Disco, points out that Debbie Jacobs' single "Undercover Lover" has already charted and that they expect Lenny Williams' "Doing the Loop De Loop" to do very well. MCA, he notes, now distributes Montage Records and Butterfly Records.

Henry Stone, president of TK, says he doesn't go in to make Disco records, but dance records that are happy. The T.K. sound is getting stronger and stronger . . . a very happy up sound. "Since T.K. works with new artists, we have to go to Pop stations with a basis from R&B and Disco stations. The K.C. record, Anita Ward, Peter Brown are all happening."

A.J. Cervantes says all of his product is Disco. The second St. Tropez, Bob McGilpin and Denise McCann and the new Tuxedo Junction will be coming soon.

Dennis White, vice president, marketing, at Capitol, points out that "we have just expanded our Disco activity by establishing a Disco marketing department with representatives on both coasts."

# Parikhal On **Rock And Disco**

TORONTO — One of the attractions of Disco and discotheques is that they provide people with a place to go and dress up. But it is just this aspect that will repel others, according to John Parikhal, a lifestyle analyst and social scientist whose company Joint Communications consults radio stations across the United States.

"Disco has been presented as a flash and glamor phenomenon, and many people would feel like slobs if they were forced to compare themselves to some of the Disco "models." Parikhal suggests that there will be great teenage peer pressure this summer against Disco.

While it is a common practice to polarize Disco and Rock, Parikhal questions its accuracy. "A lot of people who like Rock and say they don't like Disco, like to dance and dance to Disco. Rock and Roll is beginning to bring out more danceable tunes.'

Knoxville, TN, also thought the format was growing on FM and AM.

But Gary W. McKee, music director at KNAS-FM in Nashville, AR, said, "I see Disco as a threat to the entire existence of creativity in recording artists. Sure, it's lively, but it's also very monotonous when played in heavy rotation. Wish my thoughts ran with the majority, but apparently they don't.'

Bob Christy, program director of WHDH, Boston, said that Disco was very strange in Boston and hesitated to say whether it was growing or staying still.

Chris Angel, music director of WTOB, a Top 40 station in Winston-Salem, NC, said, "Top 40 and Disco will grow in markets with more FM penetration . . . Disco will fuse into Top 40 after a while and there will be no more exclusively Disco stations."

Bob Roberts, program/music director of KXLF in Butte, MT, said, "A/C, Top 40, and Disco — only way to go. He also thought Disco was growing on both FM and AM.

Suzanne Benson, music coordinator of Country music-formatted WMAQ in Chicago, felt that disco was very market dependent. "Disco appears to need a Latin and Gay and urban demographic situation to be a challenge to established formats." Steve McKee, music director of QV93 in Harrisburg, PA, a Top 40 station, believed that Disco was growing on FM, but, "I June 14, 1979

believe that each market will probably react differently to each format.

Jeffrey Jay Weber, operations manager of Z96, a Top 40 station in Lafayette, IN, voiced the opinion that "Disco is growing, but the next 18 months will show how long it will be able to hang on and whether it will be a viable format or not. I believe it will fade away, leaving a mark on Top 40 radio."

Jerry Mason and Mike Walters, program and music director at WYEN in Chicago, an A/C station, thought that because of "the wide audience acceptance of marketability, the A/C and Disco formats will be even more acceptable to the audience of the future."

Joe Benson, a programmer and producer with the Wm. B. Tanner Co., Memphis, said that Disco is fading due to increased recognition by virtually all formats. "It's not as unique as Rock and Roll was, though I like Disco personally.'

Rick Roberts, vice president and program manager of WCEC and WFMA in Rocky Mount, NC, said that he thought more and more stations were programming to the adult. "Disco is hot, but will cool off eventually (to one station per market).'

Randy Taylor, program director of CJOR, an A/C station in Vancouver, Canada, said that because Top 40 stations were playing Country music and Country music stations were playing Adult/Contemporary songs Disco stations were now more promin-

David P. Franco, operations man-

ager of WRFY, an A/C station in Reading, PA, said that Beautiful Music and Disco stations will continue to grow in the larger markets. In "smaller markets, however, more mass appeal formats must be the rule.'

Mark Tomlonson, music director of WAYT in Wabash, IN, an A/C station, said, "Disco will be popular for a time, then fade without leaving a major mark on popular music like Big Band and Rock did. It hasn't really caught on at all here.

Paul Nathan, program director of CKDK in Woodstock, Ont., Canada, an A/C station, remarked of Disco: "Snobs won't play it," and this in regards to why it was growing on AM instead of FM in his market.

Randy Sanders, program director of KOBE, an A/C station in Albuquerque, NM, said, "the Disco stations seem to be holding steady . . . I almost detect a decrease in Disco involvement.

Mark Lennartz, program director of KTHO in Lake Tahoe, CA, said that he felt Disco/A/C are on the upswing and in the future will merge closer . . . perhaps into one format. Personality will prevail in each format, whether it be Disco, Country, A/C, or whatever."

Greg Lance, music director of A/Cformatted WRTA in Altoona, PA, said, "Disco is definitely gaining. Stations that do badly in the ratings are more prone to get on the bandwagon with something new, even changing their entire format, than stations doing well with present formats.'
